Borowski is board president

Marcia Borowski was elected president of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education—by a unanimous vote—at Friday's night organizational meeting.

In fact, the vote went 7-0 for all offices, as Tom Yack was elected vice-president, Flossie Tonda secretary, and Steve Harper treasurer.

The unanimous balloting for each officer came as a surprise to school board observers who had anticipated a 4-3 vote for the chairmanship.

By remarks made afterwards, it became obvious trustees are intent on attempting to work together in an atmosphere of trust despite obvious differences among them on issues.

MS. BOROWSKI was nominated for the presidency by Joe Gray, outgoing president, and supported by Mrs. Tonda. George Lawton then moved that a unanimous ballot be cast and that request was granted by a 7-0 vote.

"I would like to thank the board members for their confidence in me," Ms. Borowski began her acceptance remarks. "I certainly appreciate it."

"I hope and pledge to do my darndest to keep us all working together. That hope shouldn't be construed to mean that we are all in agreement—happily we are not. We do represent different viewpoints and that's the way it should be."

"I will do my best as board president to see that each of our separate views can be fairly presented in public."

Gray told the Observer after the meeting that he was pleased with the selection and voting. "Being board president is something each member should have a crack at if they want the position. This will be Marcia's last year on the board before she faces reelection so it's a good time for her to serve as president."

"It's a well-known fact Marcia and I very often disagree on things, and we probably always will. But she deserves a chance at the presidency, and I'm glad to support her in that endeavor. I'm sure all other trustees will also."

Ms. Borowski had sought the presidency last year when Gray was elected to the post. She lost by a 4-3 vote

with Gray, Dick Arlen, Mrs. Tonda and outgoing trustee E.J. McClendon in the majority.

The exit of McClendon and replacement by Harper was seen as four solid votes for Ms. Borowski this year.

One trustee noted after the meeting: "Sure, there could've been three 'no' votes this year, or maybe somebody else could've got elected. But why? Member Borowski was interested in the position and deserves it."

IN OTHER ACTION, the board voted to:

- Hold regular meetings of the school board on the first and third meetings of the month during summer months in the board of education offices on Harvey in Plymouth, with the location for meetings to be reviewed in September.

- Named Mrs. Tonda as the board's representative on the Inter-governmental Committee; Yack on the community school advisory committee; Lawton on the rural life committee; and Ms. Borowski on the Title IX Committee.

'Pool communities for police funds'

After returning from a four-day junket to Washington D.C., Canton officials believe they know how to obtain the largest amount of federal funds for the township's police department.

John Lucey of the federal Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA) told Canton officials to combine their law enforcement efforts with those of nearby municipalities to obtain the maximum amount of LEAA funds, according to Supervisor Harold Stein.

Stein says he will inform officials of several local municipalities including Belleville, Sumpter, Van Buren and

Huron townships of Lucey's advice.

STEIN SAYS Lucey's suggestion is the most valuable information gained from the annual Washington conference sponsored by Rep. William Ford (D-Taylor).

Representing Canton at last week's conference were Stein, Treasurer Anne Bradley, Trustee Lynne Goldsmith, Trustee Brian Schwall and deputy treasurer Mike Gorman.

The five Cantonites and other officials in Ford's 15th congressional district attended a series of seminars on federal revenue sharing programs.

Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA) funds and other federal projects. Speakers included F. Ray Marshall, secretary of the U.S. Department of Labor, and Sen. Donald Riegle (D-Michigan).

Stein, Mrs. Bradley and Gorman scheduled the private meeting with Lucey to discuss Canton's chances for LEAA funds.

"The LEAA is in kind of a turmoil right now," said Stein, noting President Jimmy Carter's efforts to reorganize the government and close 10 LEAA regional offices. "But, according to Lucey, they're stressing stand-

ardization of police cars and uniforms and eliminating duplication of effort.

"HE SAID we'd have a better chance of getting federal funds with a larger police department."

Stein believes a grant application submitted by Canton and four other municipalities for a common dispatch system could serve as the base for future law enforcement coordination.

Canton, Belleville, Huron, Sumpter and Van Buren submitted the application for the \$100,000 grant, earmarked for construction of a dispatch tower in Belleville. Word on the application's approval or denial is expected in August.

If the application is approved, Stein suggests formation of a common record-keeping department or joint crime task force to obtain more federal funds.

"I just think we'd have greater clout as a group," he said.

Canton taxpayers spent about \$1,750 to send the five officials to the Washington conference. The township paid \$440 in plane fares, \$800 for hotel rooms, \$185 in registration fees and \$320 for meal and transportation allowances.

"I think it's a worthwhile conference, and I think we should continue to attend," Stein said. "There are just so many things you learn."

Recall election set for August

It's official.

A recall election to decide the fate of three members of Canton's board of trustees has been tentatively scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 27 by Wayne County Clerk James Killeen.

Deputy Clerk Orville Tungate announced Thursday that a check of the recall petitions received by his office June 24 had a sufficient number of valid signatures to force scheduling the first recall election in Canton Township history.

A minimum of 1,251 valid signatures are needed to force a recall election of any elected official in Canton.

Tungate said 1,267 signatures were submitted against Supervisor Harold Stein; 1,528 valid signatures were submitted against Treasurer Anne Bradley and 1,520 signatures were counted calling for Trustee Gene Daley's ouster.

While the clerk's office has requested that Canton conduct the recall election on Saturday, Aug. 27, Tungate said the date will not be finalized until the Wayne County Election Scheduling Commission approves it. The election scheduling commission meets next on July 13.

SUPERVISOR HAROLD Stein didn't appear surprised and unimpressed upon learning that the recall election was a certainty.

"Oh yeah," said the yawning supervisor. "I thought they had enough petitions."

Cindy Monks, co-chairman of the Stein recall group, said the next step for her group will be to meet with Linda LaBell and her supporters, who organized the later drive which expanded the recall to include Bradley and Daley.

Ms. Monks said she believes both recall camps will conduct a combined effort and strategy.

"We might as well share the costs if we want to get this recall over with," said Ms. Monks. "We'll have to coordinate things like lawn signs, and bumper stickers. My own personal feeling is that the sign should read: 'Vote Yes on Recall.'"

Mrs. LaBell supports the idea of recalling all three officials, but Peter Gabbert and Peter Bundarin, who

worked on the Stein recall drive, have said publicly that they only wanted to see Stein recalled.

Gabbert had said previously that he "wouldn't mind" seeing Treasurer Bradley dumped in addition to Stein, but said that he couldn't see where Trustee Daley had done anything that warranted his removal. Gabbert has been quoted as saying that ousting Stein would be sufficient and that the recall of any more officials "would look like a bloodbath and we don't want that."

Stein, Bradley and Daley have said all along that the two separate recall camps have been working together. The three officials who face the possibility of recall believe that Bundarin and former supervisor Robert Greenstein are behind the whole recall campaign. Both Bundarin and Greenstein were edged out by Stein in a three-way race for the supervisor's seat last November.

Stein, Bradley and Daley all ran on the "Stein Slate" in the election.

Stein said that factor may be detrimental to him in a recall election.

"That slate thing could kill me," Stein said. "If one of us goes, we all will. We ran on a slate for financial reasons not because we all think alike. It costs a lot of money to run for office so we figured there would be strength in numbers. Misery loves company. But we were unknown at the time and decided to pool our efforts. Anyone who has been to a board meeting knows we don't vote as a slate."

The major charge against Stein and Bradley is that they are encouraging, rather than discouraging, new home construction in the rapidly growing township. The recall backers also claim that Stein and Bradley oppose the concept of saving agricultural land which was outlined in the 1976 master land use plan.

"Daley," who also works for the Wayne County Sheriff's Department, is accused of a conflict of interest in Canton police matters. It is charged that he wants to see the sheriff's deputies patrolling Canton on a contractual basis, rather than expanding the part-time Canton police force.

Daley said he wants the voters to decide if the size and hours of the local police force should be expanded.

Study compares cost to develop or retain farms

In an effort to set Canton's future course concerning land use, township board members have allocated \$40,000 to study the economic pros and cons of retaining agricultural land.

With Trustee Lynne Goldsmith absent, board members unanimously agreed Tuesday to direct the consulting firm of Wade, Trim & Associates to begin the six-month study and submit a progress report each month. Board members placed a \$40,000 ceiling on the study's cost.

In the study, the consultants will determine the cost to taxpayers of purchasing development rights to some 6,000 acres of agricultural land as a means to preserve farmland in the western section of the township.

Those costs will be compared with costs of providing the land with urban services should it be developed. Potential tax revenues from developed farmland will be compared with tax revenues from undeveloped farmland.

OUTCOME OF THE study could make or break a recommendation of the township's land use study com-

mittee that endorses preservation of agricultural land in the township's western sections. Township board members have unanimously supported the recommendation.

Although land use committee members say township residents will have to finance the farmland retention program through purchase of development rights and a reduced tax rate for farmland, they have not estimated a cost for the proposed program.

If the cost of retaining Canton's farmland is not unreasonably high, township officials will ask residents at the polls if they're willing to pay the cost.

Township Clerk John Flodin believes officials can begin educating residents on the issue before the Wade, Trim study is complete. Officials have proposed informal seminars chaired by land use study committee members.

"If the study comes to us in stages, it would seem it would behoove us to move quickly and begin educating people," Flodin said. "It seems to me there's a degree of urgency in this."

Abduction fears unfounded

Parents' fears about a possible child abduction attempt were calmed late last week when state police officers determined that the three people who invited youngsters to a backyard "fun fair" were actually inviting children to attend a neighborhood bible class.

State Police Trooper Michael Knuth investigated the complaints and discovered that the youngsters were approached by young adults who were out on the streets trying to increase attendance at a Baptist church-sponsored bible class and fun fair.

The church group was soliciting on Hanford, east of Sheldon June 27 when the children were approached.

Rev. Headley Thweatt, pastor of the Main Street Baptist Church at 9451 Main, Plymouth, told state police that a youth group was out on the streets

that day inviting youngsters to attend the "fun fair, bible school."

"It was something that was done very innocently," said a state police spokesman. "by people who didn't realize the implications of their actions."

"Since they learned the problems it caused, they will change their method of operation. The bible group is legitimate. But the procedure they used was very questionable."

Tensions are high concerning children's safety in the wake of four fatal child abductions within the past 16 months in metropolitan Detroit.

Plymouth Township charter vote's set

Plymouth Township voters will get the chance to turn thumbs up or down on becoming a charter township before they vote on whether to become the city of Plymouth Heights.

The specially requested charter election will be held Sept. 13, according to Clerk Helen Richardson. The Plymouth Heights question will not hit the ballot until August, 1978.

Although both proposed changes in governmental structure have the goal of preventing annexation of the township by the City of Plymouth, officials are more serious about taking the step to charter township status.

The annual vote on incorporating into Plymouth Heights has been used for the last seven years as a legal tactic to thwart any plans for annexation the city may have had.

"It has been a real standby for us," laughed Mrs. Richardson.

"In fact, I understand several other townships have used the plan. We have been a model for them."

Nine new commissioners for Plymouth Heights were elected last February. They finished writing a charter for the proposed city last month and submitted it to Gov. Milliken for approval. Mrs. Richardson said it would take at least a year for the governor to sign the charter.

Because there will be no election scheduled until 1978, by the time the governor's decision on the Plymouth Heights charter is known, Mrs. Richardson said, the township would wait until then rather than schedule another special election.

THE ISSUE OF changing from a general law to a charter township is far from a political ploy, however. Supervisor Thomas Notebaert suggested

the change when he first took office in November.

At the time there was a bill in the state House which, if passed, would have prevented piece-meal annexation of charter townships. A city wishing to annex would have to take the whole township or nothing at all.

Even though that particular bill died in the Senate in December and a subsequently introduced bill is reportedly "having trouble" getting out of committee, township officials are very much in favor of adopting the charter form of government.

The committee Notebaert appointed to study the pros and cons of charter townships said it was "the next logical step in township development."


The trustees felt so strongly that the charter was the way to go they mandated the change by a vote of the board. However, after receiving several requests from residents to allow citizens to vote on it, the board bowed to the pressure and scheduled the special election.

The board's thinking at the time it rescinded its original decision was that because a charter township had more money-raising power than a general law township, the voters had a right to be heard.

In addition to being able to levy up to five operating mills, a charter township can buy and sell property, and float bonds without going to the voters for approval.

A general law township can levy only one operating mill, and needs voter approval for any land acquisition or sale. Also, all bond issues require citizen sanction.

Plymouth Township currently levies 3.35 operating mills, 2.35 of which was voted by township residents.

Hulsing nature trail will be oasis

"That is one beautiful piece of land," Fred Burger said, slowly stripping a weed he had picked from the ground. "I'd hate to see houses on it."

The land Burger was talking about is a nine-acre piece of dense woods directly behind Hulsing Elementary School in Canton Township.

If things go the way he wants them to, it will be turned into a nature trail, complete with pathways and markers to identify the various species of plants and trees.

But for right now, Burger admits, there are more problems than solutions.

In the first place, the land is owned by Canton Township. And it is valuable land indeed. Burger estimated that a developer would be willing to pay close to \$100,000 for it.

"We're talking about prime commercial property. I'm just afraid we'll get going on the nature trail, and the township will want to sell it," And Burger doesn't want that to happen.

The Canton Jaycees, of which he is a member, have already allocated \$2,000 for initial grading, leveling and marking of the nature trail.

"I already have the township's permission to build the trail, but I've been thinking about having the agreement put in writing just to be sure."

The Jaycees also have approached the school board to see how it felt about cooperating with the civic club and the township in the planning and development of the site.

"So far, the response has been

great," he said. "The school is in favor of it. And there is even the possibility we might get some federal money to use for the trail."

"If that came about, it could be used by any school kid in the entire country. And I'd like to see that happen."

However, another obstacle in the trail is how to arrange upkeep and maintenance responsibilities, with three separate groups involved. Burger fears there could be some difficulty.

"I know we (the Jaycees) would be willing to supply some manpower to keep things in shape, and I think Hulsing would help out with a few people. And it would be nice if the township recreation department could donate some men and equipment."

Despite the numerous details to be arranged and possible conflicts to be avoided, Burger is optimistic about completing a preliminary trail by the time school starts this year.

Last week Burger invited Joe Luel-

len, of the U.S. Department of Agriculture Soil Conservation Service, and Irv MacFarland of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources out to the woods to give him some advice on what kind of things could be considered for the trail.

"We've got some steam built up, and I'd like to think we could get started on the first steps by the middle of July. Hopefully, we'll have something for people to use by September."

Trustees' pay called too low

Canton officials can't decide how much money township trustees should make.

Motions and counter-motions over the four trustees' wages ended in a tabling action Tuesday night, after two motions on a wage increase died for lack of support and an earlier motion to table was defeated by a 3-3 vote. Trustee Lynne Goldsmith was absent.

"I'll be out of town the first week in July," joked Trustee Brian Schwall. "I think we should just table this until then."

Trustees in Van Buren Township made \$2,900, trustees in Brownstown made \$3,000, and trustees in Redford made \$4,700, he said.

"Based on these, I would have to say we've got to have a raise," Myers maintained. "I don't know whether I'll run again. But I do know the job takes a lot of time and involvement. If you're going to get qualified people to serve, I think you've got to have a decent wage."

Other board members rolled their eyes when Myers moved to give trustees an \$80 paycheck for each meeting they attend. The 100 per cent pay hike would increase trustees' annual wages to about \$3,200.

BUT MYERS' motion died for lack of support.

"I think a 100 per cent raise is unreasonable absolutely," Schwall said.

A compromise motion introduced by Clerk John Flodin for a \$60-per-meeting wage also died for lack of support.

"I think it's too high," reiterated Schwall, who introduced the third motion of the evening to table the matter. Unlike the tabling motion made earlier by Trustee Eugene Daley, Schwall's motion passed.

Two weeks ago, board members approved an eight per cent pay hike for the township supervisor and clerk by unanimous vote.

More deputies requested

Hines Park's main problem is overuse

The newly-formed Hines Park Task Force met for the first time last week and heard that law enforcement in the increasingly crowded park is now too big a job for the 29 sheriff's deputies assigned to patrol it.

Lieutenant Terry Sherk, director of the sheriff's park patrol, told the group that arrests doubled in two years, from slightly more than 1,000

in 1974 to some 2,000 in 1976. By April 1977, Sherk said, about 625 persons already had been arrested in the park.

Officials from many western Wayne County communities were on hand, including representatives from Plymouth Township, Westland, Livonia and Garden City.

Also on hand were task force organ-

izer State Rep. Robert Law (R-Livonia), an assistant Wayne County prosecutor, and members of both the Wayne County Sheriff's and various local police departments.

Police representatives, including Lt. Russ Gregory of the sheriff's department, agreed the primary problem in the park now is "not much abuse as overuse."

"The park was never designed for the amount of population you've got there now," said Gregory.

Sherk, who said he's already requested an extra 24 deputies and two sergeants be assigned to park patrol, said: "With double the size of the patrol I've got now, I think I could improve the situation."

The park rangers would be upper-level college students paid with federal funds and equipped with two-way radios to be used in notifying police of lawbreakers. The rangers wouldn't carry weapons, and wouldn't have any powers of arrest.

Although nearly all agreed a relatively small "bad element" is responsible for most park problems, there were horror stories about the park, too.

Sherk, asked what age group was primarily involved in police-related incidents in Hines Park, said, "We've seen 12-and-13-year-old prostitutes out there, and 40-year-old drug dealers, so that's the age group we're talking about."

"All we really have to do is be there and everybody shapes up, but if one of my men arrests somebody, they'll be off the street at least an hour."

Sherk and Gregory reported that police work is hampered in the park by a general unwillingness to cooperate among many young park users with police seeking out drug sellers and other lawbreakers.

A VOTE ON FUNDING for the sheriff's department is scheduled for the next meeting of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

and you come out there once a year and pick a few up and that's it."

Sherk said beer hill is lower on sheriff's department priorities than the more heavily used stretch of the park running through Westland and Dearborn Heights.

Grier and Sherk also disagreed on whether police should attempt to encourage youthful partiers to congregate in small areas or whether they should attempt to break up large groups. Sherk argued it was more desirable to attempt to isolate young people.

Livonia Police Chief Robert Turner expressed some sympathy for the bulk of the youthful party-goers, saying: "They have to have some place to strum their guitars and stroke their girlfriends, or whatever they're doing."

Nearly all emphasized that, in the words of one, "a few young guys getting together and drinking beer is a perfectly legitimate use of the park. That's what it's there for."

2 restaurants wait for final liquor OK

Stelios "Steve" Stylianou will be serving wine with his shish-kababs by the end of the summer if the Michigan Liquor Control Commission (MLCC) approves the liquor license application granted him Tuesday by the Canton Township Board of Trustees.

The township can grant six more liquor licenses until the 1980 census.

Stylianou is the proprietor of the Cyprus Gardens Restaurant in the Harvard Square Shopping Center on Sheldon at Ford Road.

Another restaurant in the shopping center, Ming K Garden, received liquor license application approval from the Canton board two months ago. Their application has not been approved at this time by the MLCC.

Both liquor license are Class C, per-

mitting the sale of beer, wine and spirits consumed with a meal.

Business neighbors to the Ming K Gardens restaurant have been questioned by MLCC investigators. Stylianou says he told MLCC investigators that he supported Ming K's application "and I hope they'll do the same for me."

Sue and Nor Kwan who owns Ming K with her husband, Ming Chu Kwan, said she saw no problem in having two restaurants located close to each other serving liquor.

"They are two different types of businesses," she said. "One is oriental, Chinese food and the other is Greek, Italian and American."

The Kwans have been operating the restaurant since October, 1975. A liquor license would improve business greatly, she said.

A VARIETY OF WAYS of increasing police protection in the park were discussed, including special state funds earmarked for the purpose, a "collective security pact" allowing local police departments to patrol the park in the day so more deputies are available at night, and the adoption of a "park ranger" force.

DeHoCo women's jail moving to Ypsi. Aug. 5

Plymouth Township will lose at least 500 residents this summer, and it's not the high property taxes that are driving them out.

The City of Detroit is closing down the women's section of the Detroit House of Correction, located on Five Mile Road, on Aug. 5.

About 400 of the women prisoners will be sent to a new state prison in Ypsilanti, according to William Rucks, director. And last week, about 40 prisoners were transferred to the Kalamazoo County Jail.

However, there are still about 60 inmates

who, as of now, have no place to go. These are Wayne County prisoners who are serving shorter sentences for misdemeanor offenses.

"I don't know where the county is going to put them," said Rucks. "It's not the city's problem. We should have gotten out of the prison business a long time ago."

The other 450 women are felons sentenced from all over the state of Michigan, Rucks said.

Although the men's division of the House of Correction will continue to operate, Rucks said that a peculiar situation has existed with the

Credit cards are here for better—or for worse

Some people love it, some hate it, and some have been ruined by it. The credit card. It's been around at least since 1923, when Sears, Roebuck & Co. issued their first one. But it was just 10 years ago that the form of credit card most recognizable today, the national bank card, was introduced as BankAmericard, recently renamed Visa.

Since then, the impact of credit cards is difficult to exaggerate. Total credit card purchases were so huge in 1976 that if you didn't use a credit card to buy \$250 worth of goods and services for every member of your family, then you used your card less than the national average. One estimate puts the amount of interest owed as a result of 1976 credit card purchases at more than \$5 billion.

In effect, when you use a credit card you're taking out a loan. There's an advantage to the loan, in that most credit card companies charge no interest on their money until a certain period of time, usually 30 days, has elapsed. There's a big disadvantage, too. If you don't pay off the loan within that time period, in Michigan and all but a handful of all other states, you pay 18 per cent interest on the balance.

RETAIL CREDIT, which includes but isn't limited to credit card debts, is a closely-watched stock market indicator. The disastrous Wall Street slump of 1974 was foretold, to investors with the eyes to see it, months earlier through the retail credit index. Many more investors first noticed the connection about 1975. The three largest credit card companies today are Visa, Mastercharge and the privately-owned Sears credit system.

A spokesperson for the San Francisco-based Visa, while willing to argue over whether Visa or Mastercharge was actually bigger (one verdict: too close to call between them), had no qualms about conceding the top spot to Sears.

Actually, Sears is third on the list. But Sears stores last year sold more than \$14 billion worth of goods and services, and 53 per cent of that total was purchased with Sears credit cards.

Mastercharge is owned by Interbank, a New York holding company. Visa has two divisions, Visa U.S.A., with more than 30 million card holders, and Visa, International, with about 14 million card holders, most of them in Britain, Canada, and South Africa.

The company is controlled by Bank America, but in Britain and South Africa the cards are administered by Barclays, Ltd., a name familiar in the United States only to those who've bargain-hunted for traveler's checks.

In addition to the 18 per cent interest against unpaid credit card balances, the companies also charge fees ranging from three to six per cent to the retailer who sold the goods or services charged on the card.

MERRILL, LYNCH, Pierce, Fenner & Smith, Inc. is planning to issue a credit card this fall to any margin ac-

count holder in three test cities who has the money to get one.

A final amount hasn't been decided on, but a New York spokesman for Merrill, Lynch said a margin account balance of \$5,000 is now being considered as a minimum for issuance of the card. If so, it will be the most exclusive credit card in the world.

There are now three basic types of credit cards; national bank cards, retail store cards, and what members of the trade call "T & E" cards—travel and entertainment cards.

Those include American Express, Carte Blanche, and Diner's Club. Taken together, one expert estimated they comprise less than five per cent of the total market. American Express is the biggest of the three. Many of the outstanding cards are owned by corporations.

Some financial experts are convinced that credit cards represent only the first step toward a "moneyless economy," in which all transactions will be recorded via computer terminals and charged against bank accounts.

Local merchants report that the importance of credit cards to their businesses is widely varying. Credit card use seems related to the expense involved.

Bob Evans, manager of the men's clothing department at Hudson's Westland store, says credit card purchases are three times greater in frequency than cash purchases.

ASKED IF customers ever came looking for a \$5 tie and left with a \$50 wardrobe, Evans pointed to a salesman and said, "Sure, that's their job."

At Sweeney's TV repair in Garden City, however, technician Don Judson estimated credit card purchases at "maybe 10 per cent of the total."

"But I'll tell you, they charge you

18 per cent, they charge us five per cent—if you own BankAmericard you can't lose."

Dan Weeder, manager of the Action bicycle store in Livonia, said credit card purchases account for about 20 per cent of total sales there. The cards are most often used for large purchases, but Weeder said discounts on the sticker price for bicycles are only offered to cash customers.

"It's just not worth it after we pay their service charge," Weeder said.

The Yankee Clipper barber shop in Redford Township has anywhere from 10 to 25 per cent credit card sales, depending on whether you talk to employee Arlene Moore or owner Dave Johnson.

Ms. Moore said customers "older than their mid-20's" tend to charge the \$13 haircuts more often than younger people. Johnson, who said he's glad to have the cards, put total trade at "call it seven to 10 per cent."

Del Moergely, director of Client Services for Credit Counseling Centers, Inc., a non-profit debt management company, said that "about three per cent of credit card holders can't manage it."

SURPRISINGLY, Moergely said impulse buying isn't the big problem.

"You can't say the credit card caused the crumbling," Moergely says, "but it certainly led to it."

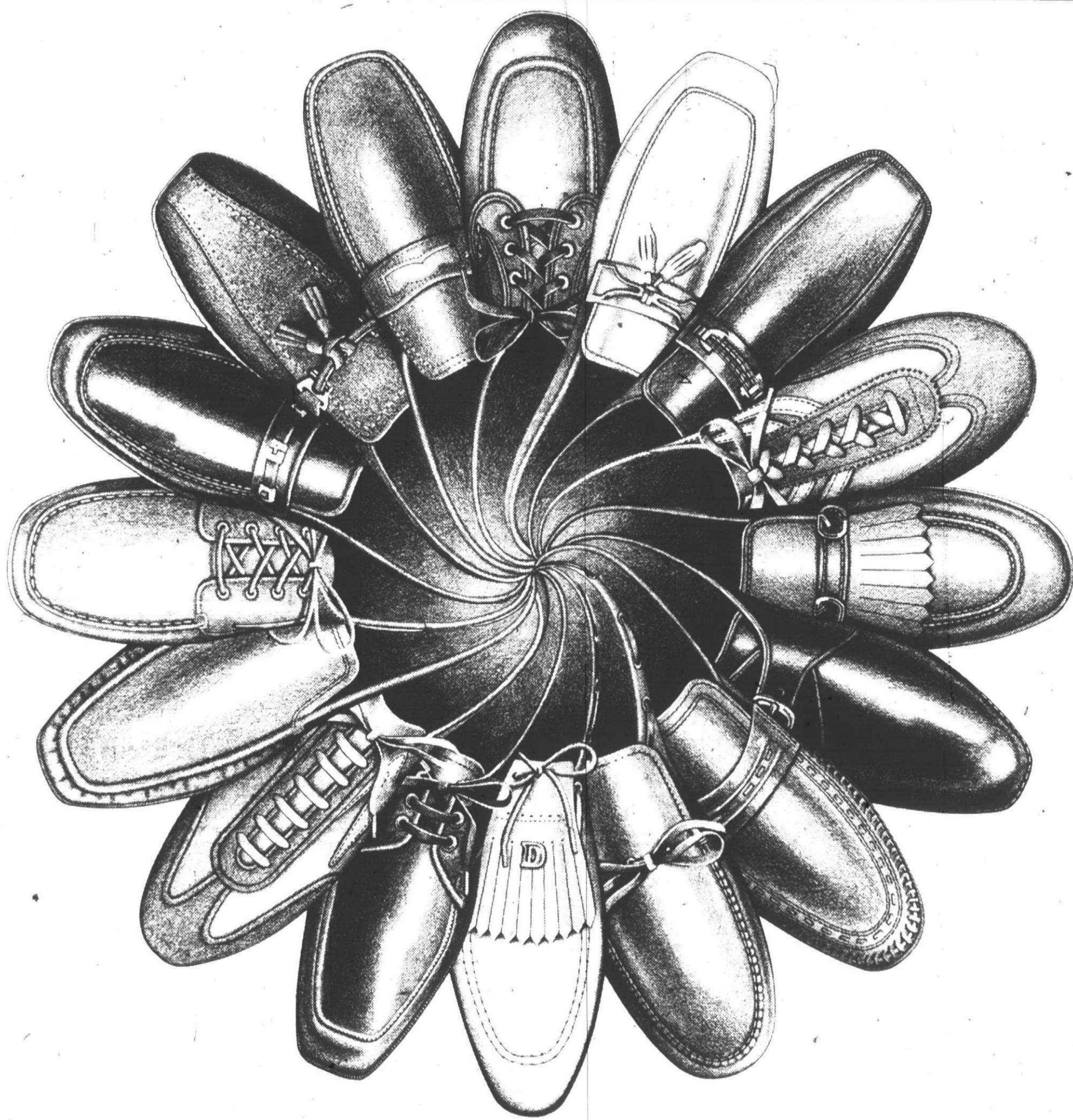
"They've overbought and not made any plans for that perennial rainy day," is how Moergely explains how most people fall into deep debt.

"They'll spend the whole check, come to depend on that overtime, the 48-hour week, and then all of a sudden they don't have that anymore and they don't have anything to fall back on."

Moergely says young people in their early 20s and even teen-agers seem, as a group, more financially responsible than those who are 10 to 15 years older.

"The younger generation is taking a more realistic approach at having a little more cash before they purchase something," Moergely says.

So, if you handle it right, the credit card is a convenience.

The Stroller Memorable Fourth

Few holidays have brought back more fond memories for The Stroller than the Fourth of July.

And each year as the day comes along he is reminded of one of the wildest and scariest moments of his life, a few wild seconds in which he thought the world was coming to an end or that he was caught in the midst of another World War.

It happened on July 4, 1956 when, by force of circumstance he was in Honolulu and, up to those few moments, had been enjoying one of the finest vacations of his life.

At the time he was serving as executive secretary of the Bowling Proprietors of Michigan and was representing them at the annual national convention.

FOR SEVERAL DAYS we had been wined and dined by the Hawaiian proprietors who figured it was a great compliment to them when we were named hosts of the annual get-together.

For several days we had seen the beauty of the islands, the thrilling sights at Waikiki Beach and the surf rolling in on the sand beaches of the Royal Hawaiian Hotel—a nightly sight that was a joy to watch.

Then came one of the real treats. As guests of the U.S. Navy, we were given a special tour of Pearl Harbor that included a lecture by one of the well ribboned officers. He explained how the Japs had studied the harbor from the mountains and how they schemed to get a complete layout of the harbor and the location of every

one of the U.S. warships.

Most of us choked as we came to the battered hull of the USS Utah that still was sticking up out of the water. We were told that it was trying to escape just at the mouth of the harbor when it was hit.

It was the same when our touring craft reached the USS Arizona where so many of the boys gave their lives. The smoke stacks still were sticking out of the water (this was before the new national monument was erected). It seemed so close to shore that The Stroller wondered out loud why the members of the crew did not jump overboard and make a dash for the shore.

The be-ribboned officer who was our guide just stared and said, "Son, only rats leave a sinking ship. Not only that, but the bomb went down the smoke stack and they never had a chance."

The tour of the famous harbor in which the U.S. Navy was sunk on Dec. 1, 1941, left indelible impressions in each of our minds. It was all we talked about the rest of the day and the evening of July 3.

YOU MIGHT IMAGINE the mood we were in when we retired for the night. Little did we know of the scare and thrill that lay ahead.

It came about 4 a.m.—just at daybreak over there—when we were aroused by the deafening sounds of a fleet of bombers flying very low.

Everyone jumped out of bed screaming, "Are we being bombed? Damn those Japs, why did they wait for a holiday?"

Folks in the hotel were running around the halls in their night clothes, many of them too scared to talk. Pandemonium reigned at our hotel on the

beach. Many screamed. Many were too scared to talk—it was a moment of fear that never will be forgotten.

It wasn't until several hours later that we learned the bombers were from our own Pacific fleet. They were paying tribute to those who had made the supreme sacrifice at Pearl Harbor by flying low over Punch Bowl cemetery where they are buried.

They didn't drop bombs. They tossed bouquets of flowers, hoping they would hit their mark. They did.

It was a fine tribute—but at that time of the morning it seemed most unusual and left all of us with the memory of a few moments that can never be forgotten.

July Fourth always has been The Stroller's favorite holiday since the days of his youth when he was taken to Independence Hall in Philadelphia by his elderly aunt who had him place his hand on the Liberty Bell and say a prayer for our country.

Through the years he has spent the day in places like Bar Harbor, Maine; Jasper National Park in the Canadian Rockies; Havana, Cuba; Puerto Rico; Yosemite Valley and many of the nation's top resort areas.

They all have left memories, but none like the memory of that morning in Honolulu when the U.S. bombers paid tribute to their departed brothers in service.

You wouldn't have forgotten it either, had you been there and been awakened by the roar of the bombers close by Pearl Harbor.

The top officer is paid as is the staff working with him. In some smaller communities, the manager may be a volunteer or part-time employee.

WHAT DOES IT DO?

The variety of a Chamber's activities is virtually unlimited, depending on community needs and the desire and ability of the Chamber to meet those needs.

Its overall mission of community development is determined by its program—its goals, usually called a program of work, blueprint for action.

Our neglected children- Part I

Much has been written about neglected children, but most often the topic has been centered on child abuse or "underprivileged" children.

But we must learn to accept the fact that all children in America, to a degree, are neglected and underprivileged. As a society, we haven't treated youth as the valuable resource it is and have assumed that families, somehow, can manage by themselves.

As a result, we have left the responsibility of child-rearing almost entirely with the family and have never seriously considered whether the family is capable of handling this awesome task alone. By intuition, and tradition, we leave the family to fend for itself—in spite of the drastic changes which have occurred in our society since World War II.

We need to re-assess our attitudes about families, about children, and about the role each of us should assume. I happen to think this need is so important that a series of columns will be devoted to the discussion. Hopefully, by the time the series ends, we all will have given some serious thought to children in America today and family life.

•The illegitimacy rate has more than doubled in the past 30 years.

•Suicide is a leading cause of death among young people.

•At least as many as 200,000 youngsters are physically abused each year by parents or guardians.

These figures suggest that the family as an institution is in trouble. What we must accept, if we aren't already aware of the fact, is that many of the pressures bearing down on parents are often beyond their control. This Mondale recognizes when he notes:

"For all inherent strengths, families are also deeply affected by changing social patterns and conditions—by the increasing urbanization of our society, by increased mobility, by changes in patterns of work, by economic conditions, by the mass media, and by government policies.

"We need to begin examining the impact of these changing social conditions on family life. We need to begin shaping a society that doesn't just tolerate family life, or pretend to be neutral toward it. We need, instead, a society that nourishes it and helps it grow strong.

"We can't afford any national crusades to 'save the family.' We don't need or want any new bureaucracies intruding on the privacy of family life. This administration understands that we are a diverse and pluralistic nation, that there is no single, ideal model for family; and that government must not try to impose one."

WE HAVE HEARD much of the decline, since World War II, of the extended family and its replacement by the "nuclear family" of only the mother, father and children. Today, however, even the nuclear family is in decline.

More than 17 per cent of all children in America today are living in single-parent families. That single par-

ent usually is a woman who works full-time. And this trend is growing because, despite birth control, the number of unwed mothers is growing dramatically.

In spite of our wealth, America is the only developed nation in the world which doesn't have a national program of child care for working parents, minimum family income, and health care for families with young children. That is neglect, intentional or otherwise.

Another trend is the increasing number of children coming home to empty houses. "If there's any reliable predictor of trouble it begins with children coming home to an empty house," writes Bronfenbrenner, "whether the problem is reading difficulties, truancy, dropping out, drug addiction or childhood depression."

"Hardly a school in the country doesn't have a problem with vandalism and violence. Think what that suggests. A major institution, charged with preparing the next generation for adult life, is a focus of aimless destruction."

MORE WOMEN are working now than in past years.

The problem, as Bronfenbrenner points out, is "we keep the old male work rules, nine to five, 40 hours a week, and if there's overtime you do it or you don't keep your job. Neither man nor women can combine working and parenting under those rules. We need new ways of working."

The responsibility of employers will be looked at again in a future column of this series. The point to be understood now is that it's gross oversimplification to blame parents for problems their children are being faced with. In weeks ahead, we will look at schools, business, neighborhoods, urbanization, community planning, small town life, television, self-responsibility, and the critical issue of age segregation.

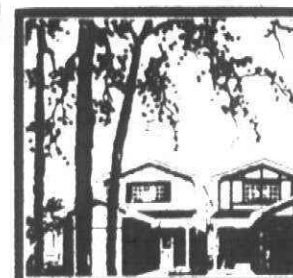

Young violinists in tune for Suzuki workshop week

The 4- to 10-year-olds in the Plymouth Suzuki Violin Association ended the season on a high note. Celia Weiss who founded the Ann Arbor Suzuki Institute in 1972 came to Plymouth for a series of workshops.

Mrs. Weiss now teaches in a satellite school in Seattle, Wash. She has traveled to Japan twice to study under Dr. Suzuki, originator of the Suzuki concept of teaching youngsters to play the violin.

Matthew, 11, and Martha, 9, accompanied their mother on the tour which included workshops in Ann Arbor, Toledo and Munroe. The Weiss children have been playing the violin since they were four years old.

Suzuki explains his philosophy in his book when he writes, "We teach them to talk, don't we? We teach them to speak, why not teach them to play a violin, to take care of it, to appreciate it?"

Parents accompany their children to the lessons and learn to play with them. There also is an album which can be used for home practice.

ALL THE CLASSES meet the first Monday of the month in a portable classroom at West Middle School for a group lesson.

They are divided into age groups for their lessons on the other Mondays.

During the year they performed at West Trail and Hendry convalescent homes, and at several area schools—Our Lady of Good Counsel, Smith and Isbister elementary schools, and Central Middle School.

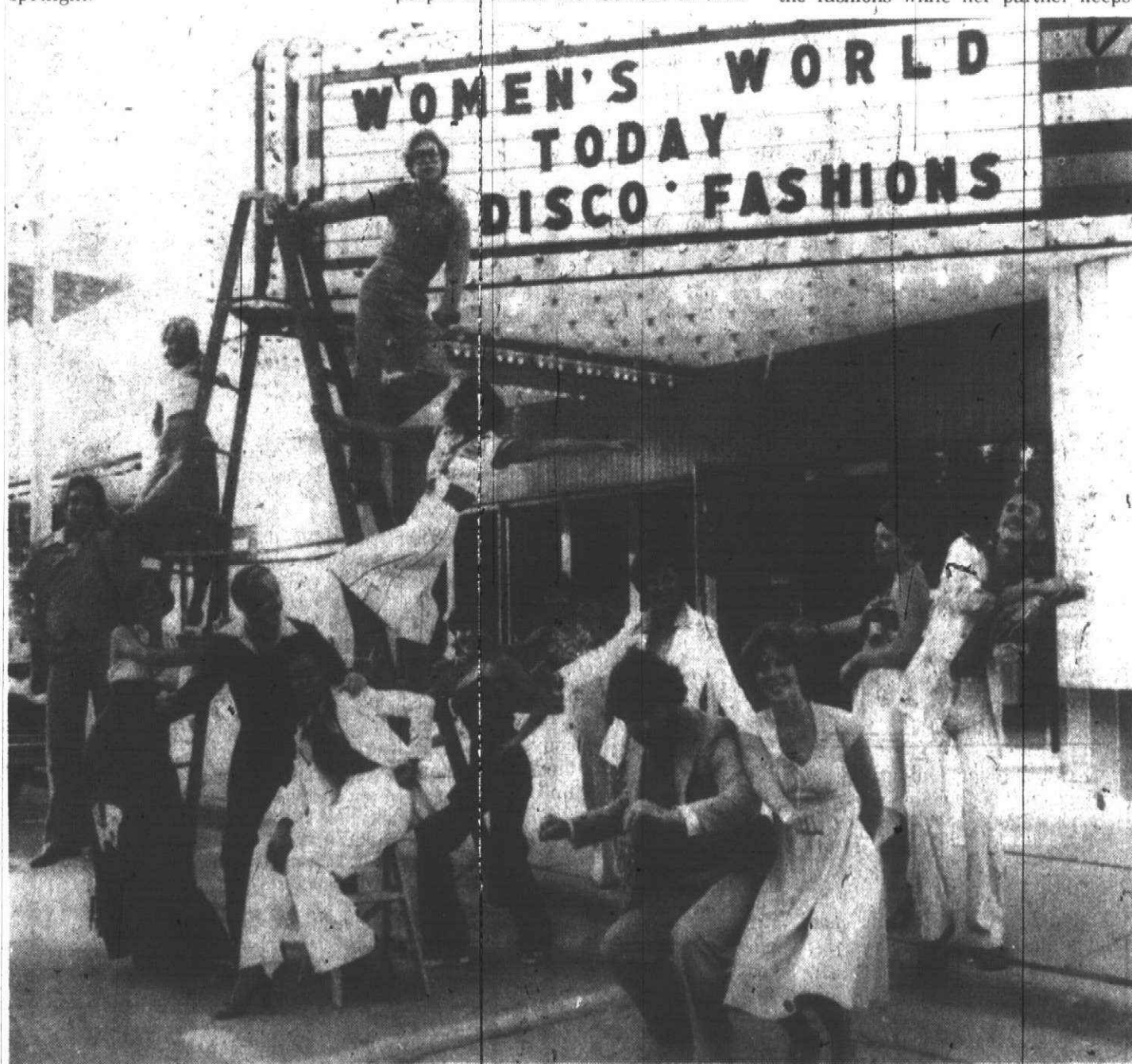

Crissey named area's top coach

Plymouth Canton's Fred Crissey has been selected as the Observerland baseball coach-of-the-year. It marks the second time in the past three years that the Canton mentor has won this honor.

Crissey is the original baseball coach at Canton where he has compiled a phenomenal overall record of 97-24 during the school's short four-year history.

Dunn's Borgess runners placed fifth in the state meet which was the top finish of all the Observerland squads.

THE SELECTION of Crissey as coach-of-the-year marked the fourth time this season that a Centennial Park coach has been selected for such an honor. Crissey is the only member of Plymouth Canton staff to gain the recognition.

Plymouth Salem's Fred Thomann (boys basketball), Debbie Hatcher (girls basketball) and Brian Gilles (girls volleyball) were the other local coaches honored this past school season.

There will be a track competition held Wednesday, July 20 beginning at 7 p.m. on the Central Middle School track.

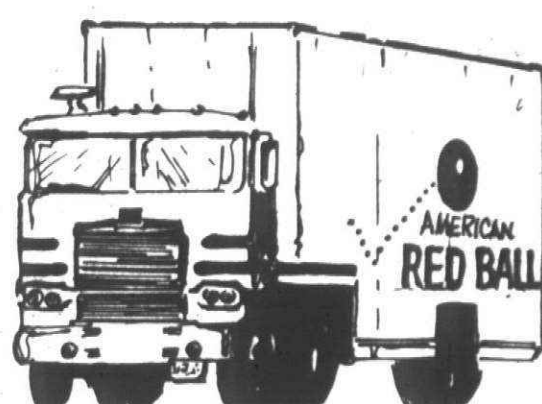
