Constraints illegal-Burgoyne New building ban fizzles

The already "over-taxed" sewers in Canton Township are not likely to get any relief, unless board members can come up with a way to slow down subdivision construction.

Two months ago, the trustees discussed the possibility of enforcing a moratorium on subdivision platting until more sewers were built. But township attorney Bert Burgoyne says they don't have the legal power to make the moratorium stick.

In a voluminous legal report, Burgoyne concluded that the "Charter Township of Canton does not have the power or authority to prohibit or place a moratorium on the approval of all new residential subdivisions effective until the availability of new sewer capacity in the manner proposed."

Although Supervisor Harold Stein has been charged with being "pro growth," it was his idea to try a moratorium. At the time he called the proposed ban a way "to buy time until we formulate some kind of workable master plan and zoning map."

Some trustees argued about the effectiveness of the moratorium on new

subdivision platting, and Trustee Lynne Goldsmith argued that Stein's proposal did not go far enough in establishing a growth management policy for subdivisions already planned.

However, the final board vote was 5-2 to send the matter to Burgoyne for his legal opinion.

NOW THAT BURGUYNE has pulled the rug out from under the idea, board members will have to either abide by his decision or plan a

different attack.

Stein holds the belief that the board will have to accept the legal advice and let it go at that.

"What else do you do?" he asked. "The board didn't want to take action on my motion until they got an opinion. Now they have it."

"Some of them don't like to follow legal advice, so there's a possibility that one of them might want to try a moratorium anyway. But that doesn't make much sense to me. Personally,

I'm going to abide by what the attorney said."

Stein also said the township would be putting itself in a bad position if it ignored legal counsel. "I don't know about the rest of the board, but I'm not going to waste the community's money on lawsuits. And that's just what we'd be doing if we throw Burgoyne's recommendation out the window."

"The developers who were affected by a moratorium would be lined up to get us in court."

School board weighing possibility of pay raise

Although a vote isn't scheduled in the near future, members of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education are informally discussing a change in state law which would allow them a pay raise of \$19 per meeting.

The school board can now pay themselves up to \$30 per meeting, thanks to a recent amendment to the Michigan school code passed by the state legislature.

Under the new provision, which became effective June 29, school board members may compensate themselves up to \$30 a meeting for no more than 52 sessions a year. If the school board did vote for the pay increase, the change would mean a maximum cost of nearly \$11,000 to local taxpayers.

The seven members of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education now evenly divide \$2,000 among themselves each year (\$11 per meeting), according to Supt. John M. Hoben. The \$2,000 figure was approved by voters several years ago and is charged to the general operating fund.

THE ISSUE OF compensation isn't expected to receive light treatment from local board members, some who are for and others against receiving pay.

Tom Yack, vice-president, said he knows of a couple trustees who oppose the measure and anticipates a close vote if one were to be taken.

Yack himself said he doesn't yet know where he stands on the board compensation issue. "I've got mixed feelings. Sometimes it's difficult to look at other elected officials knowing they receive compensation. No one expects full pay but at my house, I've got four small children and a wife

who ought to receive some small tangible benefits from my involvement."

"BUT WE'VE MANAGED without compensation for so long and people already assume we're getting paid. If you bring up the issue, people will say you weren't paid before, why now?" People are always looking for excuses to defeat millages other than high taxes and this could be one.

"There's certainly no rush to make a decision. I'd like to take a long look at it, have a public hearing and find out where the people are coming from on this," Yack said.

Marcia Borowski, new board president, is not nearly as apprehensive as Yack about approving compensation for herself.

"I am strongly in favor of paying board members because we should never have a situation where only the well-off should be able to serve."

"Being a board member has been a real financial drain on me and I don't believe it ought to break someone. Transportation expenses, phone bills, paying a babysitter—it all adds up. I shouldn't have to keep an eye on the clock at every meeting to see how much I owe the babysitter."

Ms. Borowski estimates she spends \$7,800 in actual expenses each year. The board is scheduled to meet twice a month, excluding special sessions, which would result in revenue of approximately \$750 annually.

HOBEN SAID SUBSIDIZING board members for their efforts "is warranted and long over due." The superintendent pointed out that for all the driving board members do and the expenses some must bear, the proposed pay scale is a pittance.

E.J. McClendon, who served on the school board for four years before

stepping down last week, feels compensation is appropriate. "I was once against receiving pay on the grounds that the job should be voluntary and if 'compensation' produces bad candidates. But if you look at what being a member does to people's time, some may find it economically impossible."

"By paying board members, the citizenry can expect some level of accountability, whereas in the past, this wasn't necessarily so. I would just hope there would be some control of the number of meetings, because the board has had a tendency over the years to hold far too many special sessions."

Stephen Harper, board treasurer who replaced McClendon, said he felt very uneasy about the issue and would probably vote against it. "Giving all of us an across-the-board raise is for the birds, but you can't choose to ignore those who need it. We need some sort of policy change to permit some board members to receive compensation."

But state law does not allow board members to elect individually whether they should receive pay, Harper said.

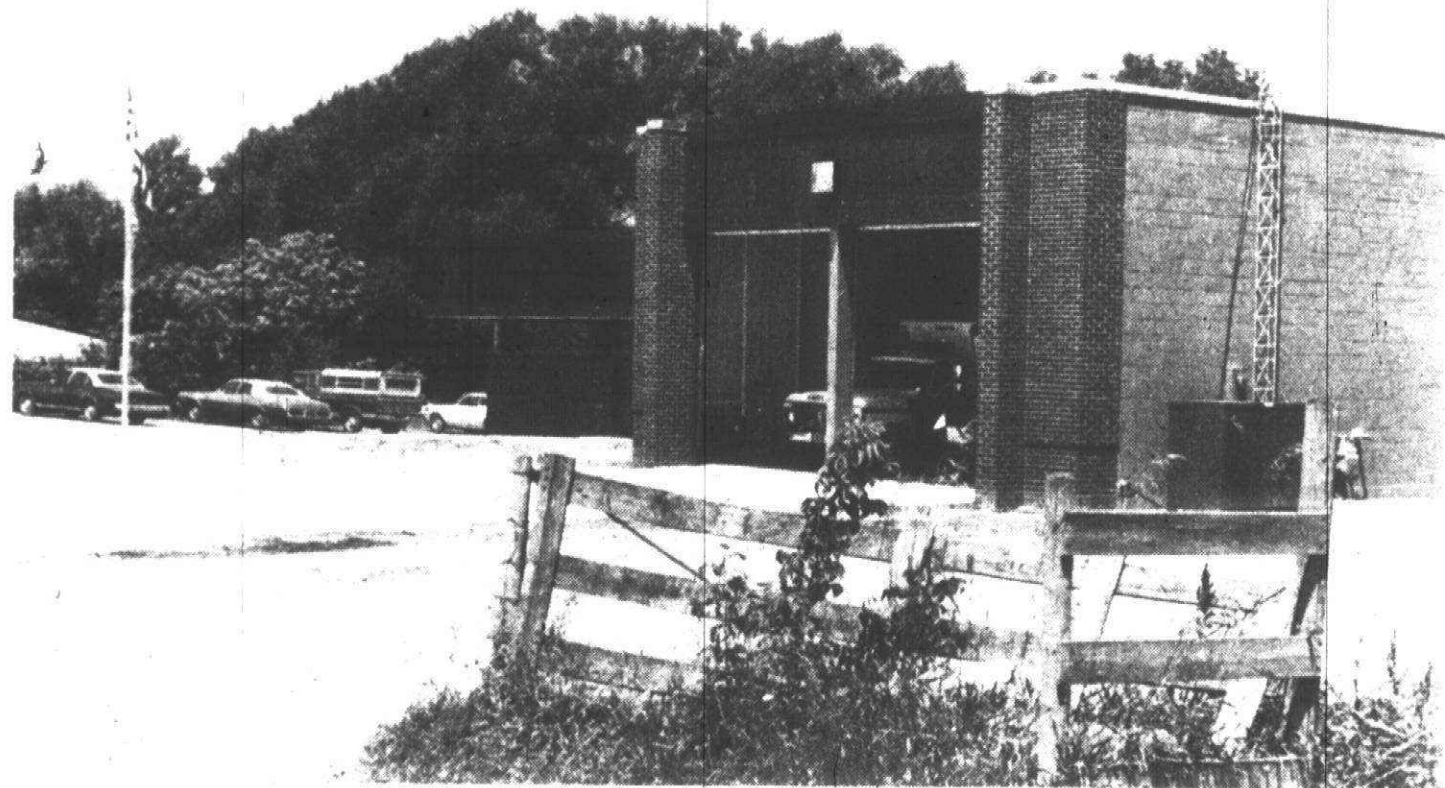
"We've got to come up with a position that will satisfy the state requirements and at the same time, not force all board members to accept compensation."

There is a split among board members on exactly what the new state legislation calls for, according to Yack. Some feel it pertains to all meetings, while others feel it excludes workshops, Yack said.

Board members will have plenty of time to settle their differences, Harper said he doesn't expect the issue to surface until late August or early September.

At school board tonight:

Plan to split CEP bands

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education will be asked to approve the establishment of separate concert and varsity bands at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park.

Under the proposal put to the board, the marching band and symphony band will remain as singular units for both high schools.

The meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m. Monday in the Administration Building at 454 S. Harvey, Plymouth.

The school board also will be asked to appoint an assistant principal for Miller Elementary, discuss use of the old Canton Center School, and discuss the status of unspent funds in the 1974 school bond issue.

THE BAND PROPOSAL going to

the board calls for development of a concert band and varsity band at Plymouth Salem High and a concert band and varsity band for Plymouth Canton High.

The marching band, symphony band, and stage band all would remain as CEP bands serving both high schools.

The plan calls for Jim Griffith to direct the marching band and be in charge of the symphony band plus the concert bands at Canton and Salem high schools. An associate director would then be hired to handle the varsity bands and assist Griffith with the concert band.

Michael Endres, orchestra leader at the CEP, will be given released time to work at the middle school with the

strings program. Griffith also will be given released time of two hours per day to coordinate the district's music program.

The marching band will be per-

Road prompts platting denial

The Canton Township Board of Trustees Tuesday denied a platting request for a proposed subdivision, because the developer refused to concede land for a proposed cutoff road between Sheldon and Canton Center.

The board unanimously denied developer Milton Rottenberg's platting request for Hampton Court West Subdivision, proposed for the east side of Canton Center between Warren and Joy. Trustees Lynne Goldsmith and Brian Schwall were absent.

Platting is the process of dividing land into lots.

The Wayne County Road Commission plans eventual construction of a cutoff road from Canton Center to Sheldon through Rottenberg's land to ease traffic congestion near Joy and Canton Center.

According to Township Clerk John Flodin, the road commission must still acquire about seven acres to construct the proposed road. Rottenberg and other landowners would have to concede the land.

Although Flodin said he would favor condemnation proceedings to acquire the needed land, he said the road commission has not taken that route.

"I feel we can't approve this request," Flodin told other board members. "I think construction of that road is critical to our township."

School window vandalism a constant, costly problem

Along with the epidemic growth that has buffeted the Plymouth-Canton school district has come a rapid increase in vandalism, particularly window breaking.

One school maintenance supervisor says that he spends the first hour of every morning with a broom, sweeping up the broken glass.

Last year, the district paid approximately \$5,000 to a private contractor to replace broken school building windows. And the contractor estimates that figure will double for this year.

Dick Anderson, manager of Plymouth Glass Company, said the bigger bill for window replacement reflects higher installation fees and use of costlier, but harder, laminated safety glass.

"We don't do all the work for the schools. On some of the smaller, less complicated windows, the maintenance staff at the individual buildings makes the repairs."

In addition, he said, his figures did not cover broken bus windows. In any event, it would be hard, he said, to determine whether they were broken by vandals or during the course of regular use.

SCHOOL OFFICIALS are not overly anxious to bring the exact extent of the problem out in the open.

Ray Hoedell, business manager, said his office does not keep records on the total amount of money spent annually on window replacement. He acknowledged, however, that the dis-

trict paid about \$5,000 to Plymouth Glass last year for that firm's services.

"We don't carry it as a line item in the budget. We contract some of it, and some of it is done by our own people."

Although some buildings are hit harder and more often than others, few are safe. Several weeks ago, the board of education offices on Harvey Street were the target of vandals.

A rock was tossed through the window of Supt. John Hoben's office, and two windows above it were shattered.

Farrand Elementary School in Plymouth Township had 27 windows broken in a nine-month period, according to one source.

However, several schools report little or no breaking. "We've had only one window shattered in the last year," said Barbara Moran, mainte-

nance supervisor of Field Elementary in Canton.

"And compared to some of the others, we are real lucky. I think the kids here have a pretty good feeling about the school."

At the Centennial Educational Park window breaking was characterized by one official as "a constant problem."

BECAUSE WINDOW breaking is so widespread and ever-present, not many incidents are reported to the police.

"We don't know anything about it," said Plymouth Police Chief Tim Ford. "I can't remember any reports. And besides, there's not much we can do about it after the fact. This kind of hit-and-run vandalism is hard to stop."

THE WAY IT WAS

When Earl West and his brothers opened their business in town, Forest Avenue was nothing more than a dirt road. Since then, of course, Forest is paved and both sides are lined with businesses. West recalls the days when he was in business and had very few commercial neighbors. See Page 5A.

Patricia Eblen joined the ranks of ecstatic numerologists who were celebrating the once-in-a-century lucky day 7-7-77. Mrs. Eblen, who lives on Newbury Port in Canton, took home one-third of \$14,000 last Thursday in the Michigan Super Drawing TV show.

Mrs. Eblen came in second on the show to Edward Polez of Detroit who collected \$109,000 and will compete again in next week's Super Drawing.

She represented the Wee-3 Lottery Club which consists of her, her father, Donald Forsburg of Livonia and brother, Craig of San Francisco.

The Wee-3 club purchases four to six weekly lottery tickets each week, according to Forsburg. At home

Anatomy of a civil servant

From a 'job' to a lifetime career

Around Plymouth City Hall, she oftentimes is affectionately referred to as the encyclopedia of city government—and for a good reason.

No one is more familiar with its workings than Mrs. Linnea Salow, the deputy city clerk who now

is the oldest employee in point of service. "I guess I should know the answers by this time," she said with a wry smile. "I have worked with six city managers and 21 mayors before I became deputy clerk."

President Franklin D. Roosevelt was in the White House when she reported for work Sept. 30,

1942, and she has been a tower of strength to all the officials in every department since.

ASKED WHAT had attracted her to city government, she answered, "I wasn't attracted to it. I just needed a job and the city was conducting examinations for help. I took the exam and got the job."

At the time, Clarence Elliott was city manager and L.E. Wilson was the mayor.

"There were only two girls in city hall then," she recalled "and I worked with Rosemary Like, who now is dead."

"Because there were only the two of us, we had to know our way around. So we became acquainted with the police and fire departments along with the Department of Public Works. It was interesting, and we got the background and the workings of the entire city. That experience has helped a lot through the years."

Recalling her early experiences, she explained that when the fire alarm was given either of the two girls on the job had to race out to the fire department and write the site of the fire on a large blackboard. In that way, firefighters lost no time before they headed for the blaze.

DOWN THROUGH the years, Linnea, who has taken the minutes of the city commission sessions for years, has gathered many fine memories—some of which were real exciting.

"I was here in 1948 during the recall, and that was quite a time. The city manager, Harold Cheek, fired Lee Sackett, the police chief, and that started the excitement. Four members of the commission sided with the city manager, and were recalled from office."

Another exciting period in her career was provided by the attempt to annex the Burroughs property, a plan that never materialized.

"I also was here when the new city hall was built, and those were exciting days, too."

"But for real excitement, the centennial in 1967 was about the tops. The Centennial Week was exciting because we had the Lord Mayor of Plymouth, England, and three members of his cabinet with him. That was a great week."

One of the oddest moments she recalled came on the day Willoughby's Shoe Store on Main Street caught fire.

"Every one around here became so excited that we all went to the fire. The only one we left behind was the city treasurer. But that never will happen again."

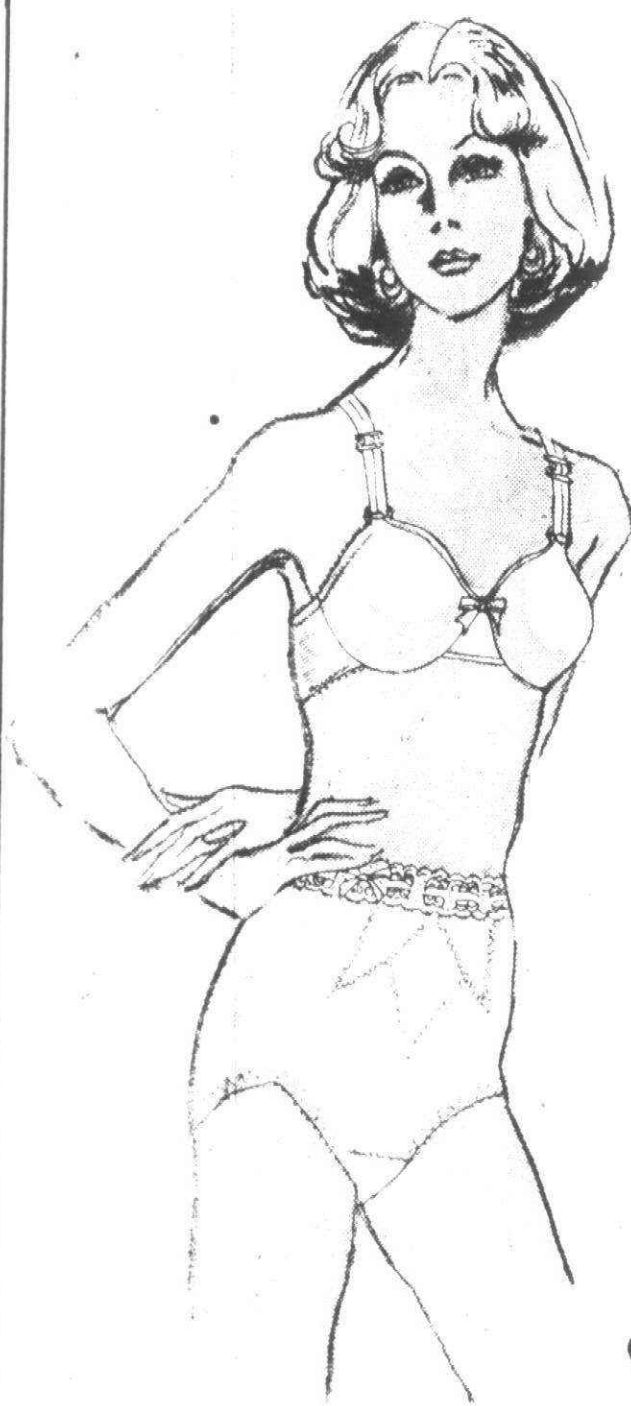
ASKED WHAT problems were encountered on the job, she didn't hesitate in answering. "Parking and the railroad crossing—the same as we have today."

She didn't mention the proposed Loop Road, but she has worked through the many hours, weeks and months it has been discussed at the commission table.

Since that day—Sept. 30, 1942—when she settled down to her job, Linnea, now the wife of Everett Salow, longtime employee of the Wayne County Road Commission, has watched the long parade of city officials pass in review.

Acquainted with them all, she is the one they still come to when information of bygone days is sought. She always has the answers.

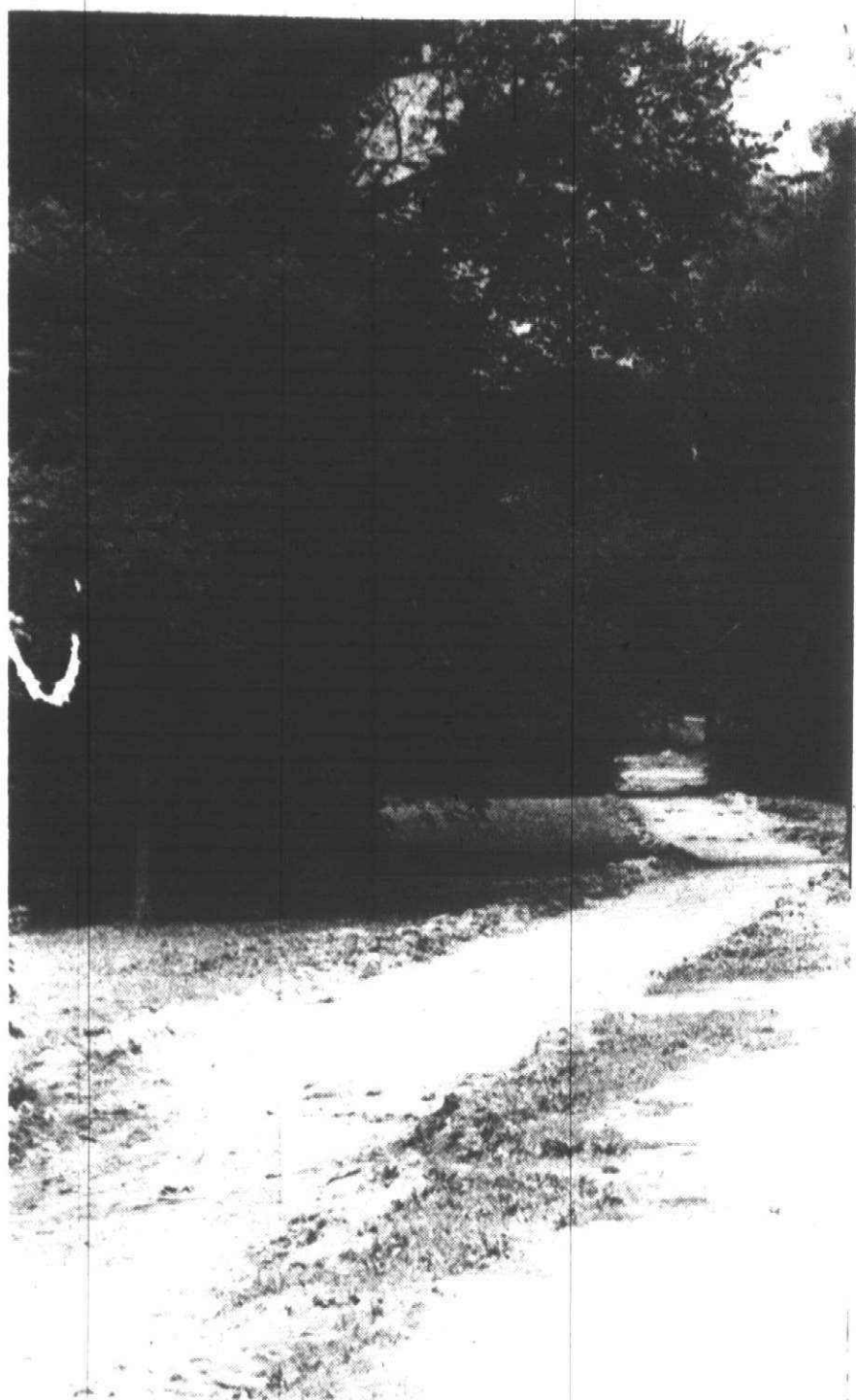

forming at all home football games for both Canton and Salem high schools, while the pep bands will be provided for half of the home basketball games.

The above changes, if approved by the board tonight, are scheduled to take effect for the 1977-78 school year. A recommendation has been made to the central administration that for 1978-79 separate marching bands be created "in such a way to enable them to perform singly and as a marching band representing CEP." This would require more money for additional uniforms and overlays for Canton and possibly for some added "color" instruments.

Supt. John M. Hoben, however, isn't recommending separate marching bands for 1978-79 at this time. "We want to evaluate the changes for the coming year and see how they work before making any recommendations for the following year."

THE BOARD will be discussing what should be done with the \$300,000 remaining from the 1974 bond issue.

"In almost every case, the original amount budgeted for specific projects has been exceeded in terms of the cost of labor and materials," notes Hoben. "In some cases, such as Gallimore, the original costs budgeted were \$29,900—the project today has expenditures of \$101,934. A number of un-

foreseen items, such as the replacement of the boiler, entered into this accelerated cost."

The 1974 bond issue was used for three new elementarys, Phase III at the CEP, and other projects.

Hoben said the board could decide to reapportion contingencies and money earned from interest to beef up individual projects yet to be completed, or to complete existing projects and spend the balance on projects within the bond issue where further work could be done.

Other projects the board is expected to discuss are a storage area and metered tennis courts at the CEP and roofs and paving projects. The board also might consider petitioning the state for permission to re-allocate funds for new projects, such as air conditioning for schools going on the Extended School Year calendar or for a bus wash rack.

To date, the school district has earned about \$1 million interest from the \$9.9 million bond issue approved in 1974.

Earl West recalls automobiles sales days on dirt road

Looking down Forest Avenue in Plymouth the other afternoon Earl West, the retired auto dealer, said, "You wouldn't believe that this was a dirt road only 30 years ago."

As he spoke, Earl was looking at the building which is now occupied by auto repairmen, and continued, "I ought to know about the street, for it was in that building we conducted the auto dealership."

As he recalled the days when he and his brothers—Bill, Dutch, Joe and Stan—switched from farm equipment to automobiles, he said: "It doesn't seem possible, but it is just 30 years ago that we moved into the building. It wasn't on the Fourth of July, but just a few days later. And we had the big searchlights of those days helping to call attention to the opening."

While the memories came rolling back, he recalled that the opening

was one of the big events of the month in Plymouth.

"It wasn't just one day, the celebration lasted three or four days. We had vaudeville acts, street dancing and all that went with the old time opening day celebrations."

WEST SMILES about it now, but he and his brothers were among the auto dealers in the country who tried desperately to sell the ill-fated Edsel Car—the only Ford that ever was considered a flop on the market.

When the West brothers decided to take an auto dealership, it was to sell the Nash car. This later became the American Motors product. They followed the Nash with the Edsel and finally took on the Mercury dealership—now located on Ann Arbor Road, just east of Haggerty.

Reviewing his mental picture on the Forest Avenue of 30 years ago, he envisioned again the Cloverdale Dairy of that time and smiled as he told how Herman Backus, former Cloverdale owner, sold ice cream cones with five flavors of cream for a nickel.

"He had special cones made," they had a hole or a pocket at the top and then four smaller ones around the edges, and he put a different flavor in each cup. It was quite a cone."

OTHER MERCHANTS on the street included Ezar Penny, whose house was on what is now the Weideman parking lot, and Dick Kimborough, an appliance dealer whose store was lat-

er the Stop and Shop, one of the most popular places in the downtown area.

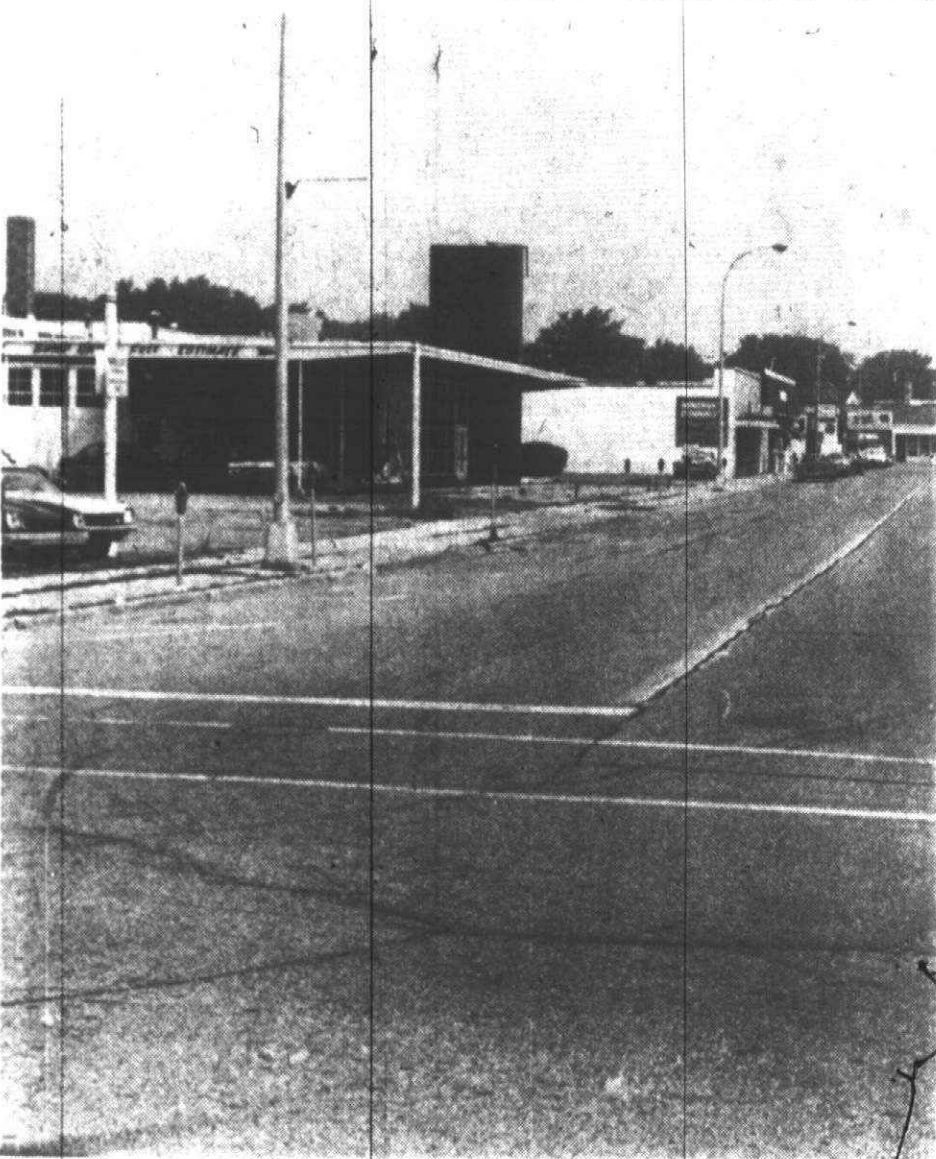
The building that was once their pride and joy is still standing and West is hopeful that the day may not

be far distant when it will be taken over by some energetic firm that will give it the prestige it once held when Forest Avenue was a dirt street.

Many of the merchants of those

days have now left the scene. Several have died and Backus, like West, is retired.

But the memory of the old dirt road lingers on.



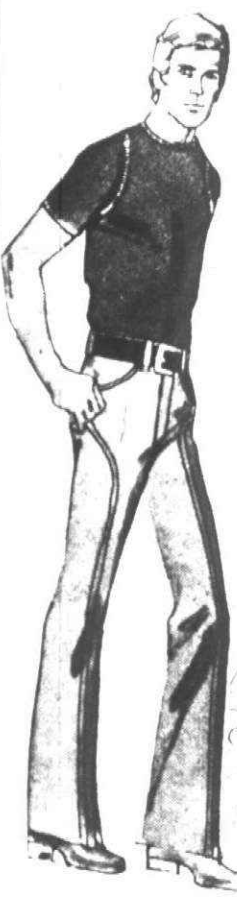
A bump shop operated by Dave Geddes now is in business where the West dealership once thrived, Forest is paved, and the remainder of the block developed. (Staff photo)

'Rollercoaster'

Up, down and around thriller

Amusement parks never seemed very amusing to me. Scary? Yes. Amusing? No. "Rollercoaster" (PG) is a movie for those of us who want the security of being safe combined with the excitement of being scared. It concentrates on the thrills, white knuckles and hold-your-breath aspects of amusement parks.

George Segal, in the kind of low-key role he plays so well, is a safety inspector (Harry Calder) whom everyone tries to ignore. He sports a thin, tight mustache that does nothing to enhance his appearance or prestige. It would be hard to find a more lackluster hero.

Timothy Bottoms, also cast against type, is a fiendish extortionist with the face of a choirboy. After giving a convincing demonstration of his destructive capability, he threatens to plant bombs on rollercoasters all over the United States, unless park owners kick in \$1 million.

Like so many movie villains, he is an evil genius. He has an expert's knowledge of explosives, electronics, engineering, business and police procedures. If some distant, future generation were to reconstruct our history based upon our movies, they might conclude that we were a generation of master criminals, probably with Ph.D.s from M.I.T. or the Harvard Business School.

THEY ALSO might conclude that all the dropouts became law enforcement officers. Richard Widmark plays the Federal agent (Hoyt) in charge of the case. It's a cut-and-dried role, shored up by Widmark's commanding voice and presence.

Hoyt is a fatuous know-it-all who puts down or ignores the humble Calder's suggestions. Hoyt plants dozens of agents and security men in the amusement park to catch the extortionist when he attempts to pick up the million dollars. Each agent stands out like a vegetarian at an ox-roast.

All the happy-go-lucky park visitors are in jeans, shorts, tank tops and sport shirts. The inconspicuous Federal agents who mingle with the masses are in dark business suits, white shirts and ties—real swingers.

The big thrill, visually, aurally and tactually, is the rollercoaster ride. The movie camera, apparently fastened to the lead car, captures the upward chug, the screeching descent and the whiparound curves with all the stomach-churning sensation of the real thing.

The Sensurround sound reinforces the sensation with its big-output speakers strategically placed within the theater. Their volume sound and vibrations reach out for everyone in the audience. The simulation is real enough to give one vertigo or, at least, reason to pause before eating more popcorn.

THE MOVIE HAS its share of deficiencies, especially the character stereotypes, but it also has small, nice touches of humor. This is a quality often absent from melodrama and thrill movies. Calder's ever-failing efforts to quit smoking and his inane conversation with his ex-wife are little human touches that are a welcome respite from the overwhelming impact of the rollercoaster and Sensurround.

In terms of the medium, the photography is particularly pleasing. Not just the rollercoaster sequences, which one expects to be first-rate, but many of the panoramic shots of amusement parks viewed against a gentle background of callo music are equally effective.

Rollercoaster is a fun movie, if you're not averse to noise or heights.

Tiller still holds the team record for the longest punt return which he ran back 67 yards for a touchdown against Lavonia Bentley at the first game of his senior season.



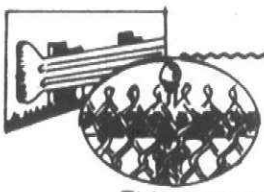

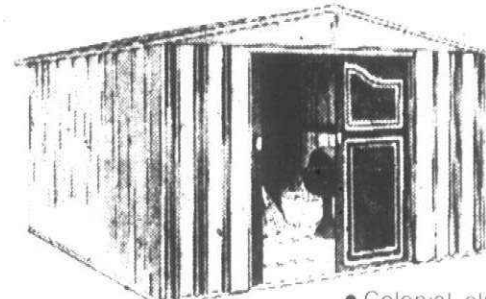

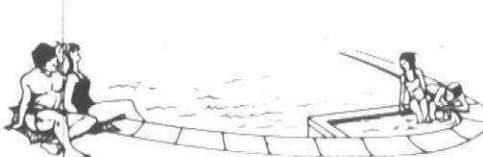

Local rivers fairly clean, index reveals

If the French have a word for everything, Michigan scientists now have a number.

The state Department of Natural Resources has a new water quality index (WQI) to express the quality of every river on a scale from zero (low) to 100 (high).

On that scale, it's surprising how many of our rivers rate fairly well. Water with a quality of 50 or less can be considered poor; 51-70 is medium; 71 and up, good.

Naturally, a stream's quality varies throughout the year. What's reported here are averages.

ON THIS SCALE, the Rouge River in western Wayne County had the lowest rating in the state, an overall 51. The

Flint River wasn't much better at 53.

The interesting thing is that the Carp River in Marquette County, in our unspoiled upper peninsula, rates an overall 60 but has a low rating for the year of just 39.

Highest rating of 86 went to the Tahquamenon River as it flows into Lake Superior in the UP. Others scoring in the 80s were the AuSable at its mouth, the Boardman in Grand Traverse County, the Menominee, the Muskegon, the Presque Isle (Ontonagon), the Sturgeon (Houghton County), Thunder Bay and Whitefish (Delta County).

THE HURON to the west of us got a surprisingly good 77 above Ann Arbor and 75 below Ann Arbor.

To the near north of

us, the Clinton rated 74 above Pontiac and 65 below Pontiac. The Raisin in Monroe County stood at 64.

The WQI was developed by the National Sanitation Foundation in Ann Arbor after scientists and water quality experts across the country were polled on what constitutes good or bad water quality.

The WQI takes into consideration nine different measures. Most important are dissolved oxygen, which is what fish need to breathe, and fecal coliform, which is bacteria from intestines and indicates raw sewage that could contain disease organisms.

Other measures are BOD, for biochemical oxygen demand (organic matter in water that absorbs dissolved oxygen),

nitrate, phosphates, temperature, turbidity and total solids.

The WQI is seen as a good way to tell the public with a single number how good a stream is. But it's not usable as a technical or legal tool because it fails to take into account such toxic materials as DDT, PCB or mercury.

THE SUDDEN blast of hot weather will send



fish into the depths to find cool water, and fishing is a little unpredictable, according to area game warden reports.

When the DNR officers start using words like "some" or "a few," you know only a small proportion of anglers are showing up with even satisfactory creels.

So the report this week said: "One 48-inch, 15-pound muskie was reported taken on a small lure from Woodland Lake (near Brighton). A few northern pike are being taken on live minnows on Ore Lake."

Incidentally, the Huron River chain of lakes in Livingston County, the Huron's westernmost point, showed up frequently in this

week's report, indicating fishing is either pretty good or that DNR officers are checking it more thoroughly.

Some nice largemouth bass are being taken from Woodland and Crooked lakes on lures and night crawlers. Nice bass 15-20 inches were checked taken on crabs from the Huron River.

Fishermen are having some success on Bishop Lake for bass and bluegills with crawlers and worms.

The Huron River chain was giving up

some small bluegills for those who had the "know-how." Some nice bluegills were taken on worms and crawlers from Kent Lake in the Island Lake Recreation Area (south of the I-96 freeway) and Woodland Lake.

Bluegills are being taken on red worms and poppers from Ore and Big and Little Crooked lakes. Fishing is fair on the Huron River chain and Woodland Lake for crappies with minnows.

The Huron River chain includes Straw-

berry, Gallagher, White-wood and Base Line lakes. You can get in only by way of the Huron River; most of the land is in cottages.

BELLEVILLE LAKE, despite the primitive quality of the public boat launch site and the chopiness of the water due speed maniacs, continues to show up in the fishing reports. Although it's generally slow, quite a few small walleyes are still being caught along with some bluegills and crappies and a few channel cats and bass.

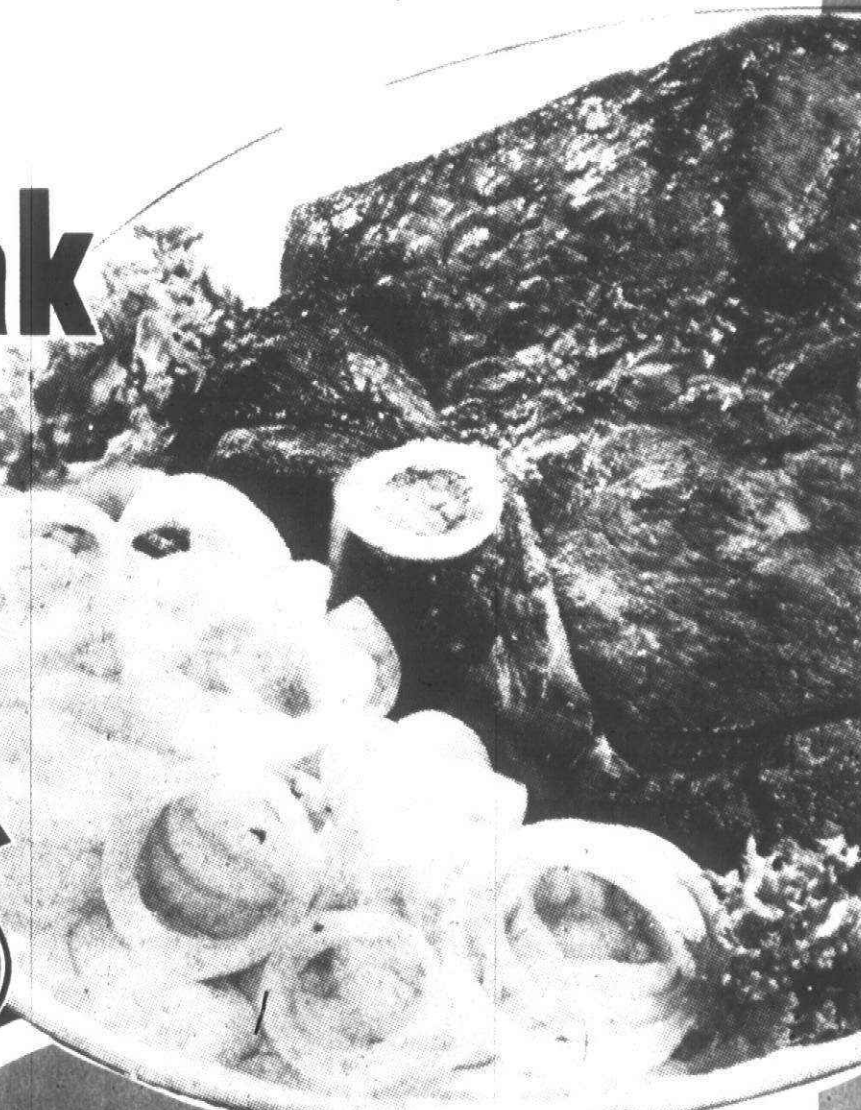

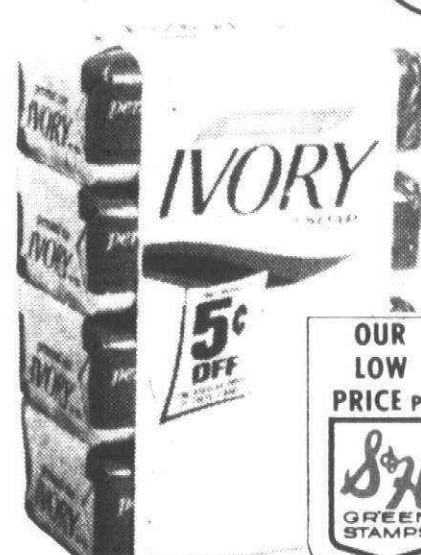

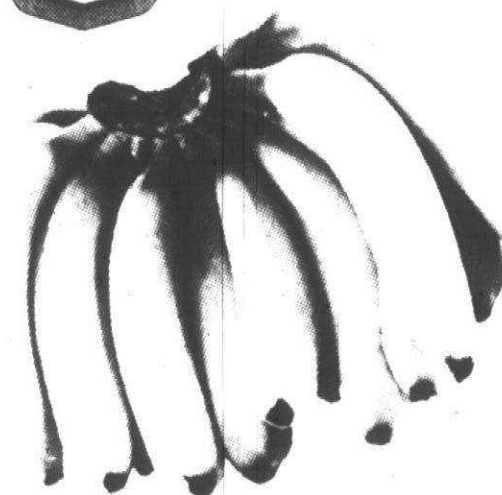

AAUW sets priorities for '77-79

JANET AND PERRY Richwine and Mrs. Richwine's son Brad Roberts returned from their European tour with the impression that the "Old Countries" are trying to retrieve a good chunk of the last \$5 billion they borrowed.

"The country was beautiful but the prices are out of sight," said Richwine referring to the \$125 a day for a room and \$60 for lunch for three people.

"Except in London," he said, "where you can get a good plate of sandwiches in a London pub for \$2 or \$2.50."

They spent a full week in London, three days in Amsterdam, three days in Paris, three days in Zurich, three days in Vienna and three in Budapest. They also spent some time in East and West Berlin.

THEY FOUND West Berlin busy and prosperous and East Berlin clean, and immaculate with people out of work.

"I asked our East Berlin guide, 'Exactly what happened here?'" said Richwine.

She explained that when the Russians marched in from the east, they took over that part of Berlin with three per cent of the industry. West Berlin had 97 per cent.

"But they are building," said the Plymouth attorney. "The Japanese are erecting a multi-million dollar building there."

He said the only real difficulty was in Budapest where they saw people lined up for food and the army very much in evidence.

The twin cities of Buda and Pest straddle the Danube with many fine bridges, and people use the river as a means of transportation. "There are two fine hotels, the new Hilton and the new International. It is an interesting city."

"Vienna was prospering and wonderful with music and concerts."

But, he believes they "rule the people out" on the continent. This was after looking at the price tags on new cars—\$25,000. "They want them to ride bicycles and street cars."

"THEY HAVE AN HONOR system on the streetcars," Richwine said, "even in Switzerland."

Passengers get on the streetcar, either at the front or back, and are on their honor to deposit the correct amount of money. "If you do buy a ticket, it is good for an hour. We saw the same thing in Czechoslovakia several years ago. Teachers and government employees would wave their passes to the other passengers to show why they weren't paying. No one seemed to care, but they showed their passes."

The Richwines rented an apartment for their London stay—two bedrooms, a living room and kitchen and bathroom.

"It was very nice but it was 10 to 16 feet underground," said Richwine. "If you stepped outside and looked straight up you could see a patch of sky. I told them the place was a regular firetrap. The rent was \$300 a week, and hotels are filled at \$100 a day."

He visited the London office of National Bank of Detroit and discovered a young man from Detroit among the staff of 10.

He had been in London three years, was married and had a new baby. They don't handle money there; it's strictly for reference. There is a whole street of American banks, I saw a Manufacturers and City National bank too."

The trio traveled through Europe by train and noted that everyone had a vegetable garden. "The people grow their own. They have to—the prices are out of sight."

BESIDES THE REGULAR street of shops on the main floor of the Plymouth Historical Museum, an exceptional collection of dishes and glassware is on display on the lower level.

Visitors will have an opportunity to visit these special exhibits until Aug. 9 when they will be removed as the museum is readied for the Plymouth Fall Festival.

There are two cases of Meissen china, German dishes, Haviland china, Majolica and a set pink and white china made in 1879.

All the exhibits are on loan from private collectors.

Among the glassware are examples of satin, amber, cranberry, ruby, Bristol, blue and white milk, purple slag, vaseline, green and depression glass. One case displays nothing but cut glass and another has 17 fairy lamps.

A private collection of bride's baskets is on the main floor near the Victorian room.

Judy Stone, president of the Plymouth branch of the American Association of University Women, attended the five-day biennial AAUW convention in Minneapolis. Mary Uhl, state legislative chairman, and Carol Davis, first vice president of the local branch, completed the local contingent.

In a major address, AAUW President Dr. Marjorie Bell Chambers of

Colorado told the 2,000 delegates and visitors meeting in the Radisson Downtown Hotel:

"If we're interested in advancing women and in social change that enables women to be in equal partnership with men, then educated women cannot get bogged down in perpetual analysis of alternative action and endless consideration of pros and cons of issues."

"They must take affirmative action to change the system which has resisted women's advancement in all areas of decision making."

NEW PROGRAM thrusts for 1977-79 were listed as "The Politics of Food," "Refining the Goals of Education," and "Women as Agents of Change."

Delegates received in-depth exposure to each of the new topics in a

series of workshops.

With an eye to helping shape national food policy and working for a consensus on citizen expectations on education, the workshops included action strategies.

They discussed how to analyze community power bases, strategies for citizen participation, coalition building, practical steps in identifying those who control the politics of food, and food policy here and abroad.

AWARDS AND GRANTS for 1977-78 totaling more than \$803,200 were announced by the Educational Foundation of the AAUW.

More than half the sum was awarded in fellowships to 95 American women for post-doctoral research, completion of the doctoral dissertation or final year of law, medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine and architecture.

In addition, 50 international fellowships were awarded to women from 29 other countries for advanced studies in the U.S. or a country other than their own.

Research and projects grants amounting to almost \$87,000 were awarded to 120 AAUW members.

branches and state divisions for public service projects, special research, and for renewal of skills toward career advancement.

THE 1977 ACHIEVEMENT award of \$3,000 was presented to Dr. Gisela Konopka of Minneapolis, director of the University of Minnesota Center for Youth Development and Research.

Dr. Konopka was cited for her definitive study of the adolescent girl in conflict. She is a refugee from Nazi Germany who has authored more than 200 articles and 10 books.

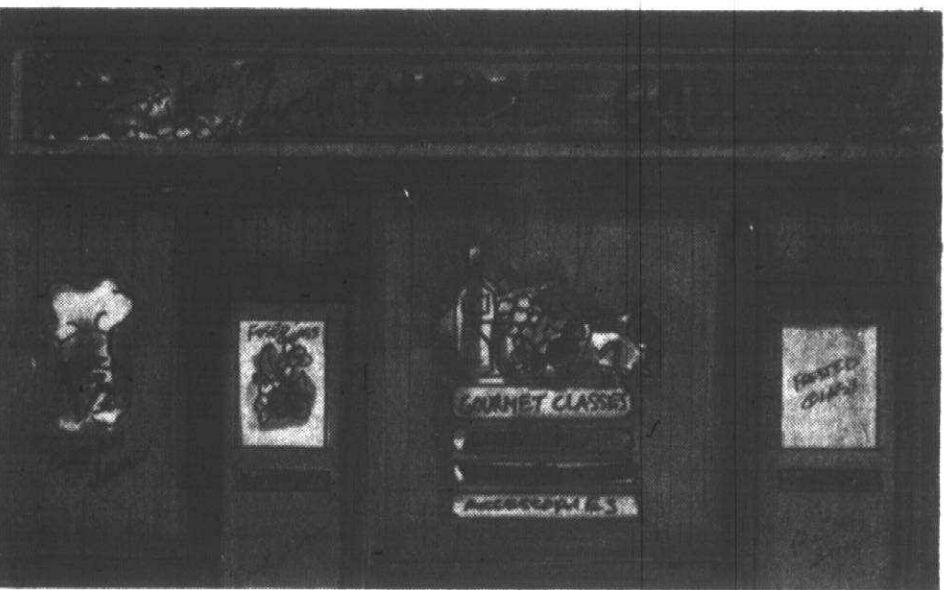
The \$1,000 Recognition Award for Young Scholars was presented to Dr. Sarah A. Woodin, assistant professor of marine biology at Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore.

Her doctoral dissertation is considered the first experimental proof of competition among organisms in marine systems at the bottom of the seas. In 1974 and 1976, she coordinated the annual Benthic (sea bottom) Ecology Conferences.

The AAUW cited her for her potential as a major figure in moving the scientific and lay communities toward global planning to ensure ecological balance of water environments.

New store fronts spruce up 'The Trail'

It soon will be a case of "look to your laurels, Penniman Avenue"; the Ann Arbor Trail business section is undergoing a sprucing up too.

Famous Men's Wear has its new front. Next door, in the building which formerly housed Bonnie Discount, Larry and Diane Janes have been hard at work getting ready for the opening of Gourmet Gallerie. They have set a target of July 29, in time for the annual sidewalk sales.

The exterior decorations—both front and parking lot facades—will be real eye-catchers. They were designed by architect and woodcarver Don Hoo-genstyn of Traverse City, longtime friend of the Janeses. He carves then

paints the designs.

Examples of his craft will be inside the store. There will be a series of kitchen cabinets, each with a different ethnic design—Italian, French, oriental and Middle Eastern.

The wheels of the canopied salad cart will have carved fruits and vegetables. His carvings have almost a della Robbia effect.

"THE OTHER MERCHANTS and business people have been so friendly and helpful," said Diane Janes. "They have stopped in with doughnuts when we are too busy to go out to eat."

"Wilma Halliburton of Alphabet Gallery is painting a big old table for the library section."

The library will feature a collection

of cookbooks and Larry's own recipes, created during his 10 years as a chef and instructor.

"The books will be for sale, but the library also is for browsing. Persons can sit there with a cup of coffee and look through the books. If they find something they want, they can copy it," said Janes.

"We are not catering to just gourmet cooks," added his wife. "He will be happy to discuss a bride's first dinner party and other suggestions. He also will help experienced cooks who want a new recipe for a cocktail party."

Cooking classes will be geared to men and children as well as women.

"THERE WILL BE special classes for college kids the last week in August."

"I will show them how to cook a complete meal in the dorm—with just an electric coffee pot and an iron."

The classes will run a complete gamut.

During the hunting season, a butcher will show how to cut up and fillet a deer. There will be cooking demonstrations for wild fowl and meat.

There will be men-only classes which will feature omelette and souffle cooking.

Another specialty class will be the "midnight munchy" scheduled in the evening, from 9-11 p.m.

The session will answer the question: "What happens when the crowd comes in at 1 a.m. They've been skiing or skating and they're all hungry?"

History and cooking will be combined in some of the classes which will include medieval cookery. There will be classes in ethnic cooking—Austrian, Polish, Italian, etc. Pastries and bread making classes also are planned.

THE COFFEE BAR with its thatched roof will have coffees and teas from all over the world and accessories for serving and brewing them.

There will be tea balls, espresso and cappuccino coffee makers.

The kitchen area will be the demonstration center. It is there that complete lines of the utensils which will be for sale, will be demonstrated and tested.

"We want to be able to stand behind everything we sell," said Diane. "We know we will handle the Cuisinart

food processor. It's like having a second chef in the kitchen. It makes everything from bread dough to peanut butter and if anything goes wrong with it, the customer gets a new one right off the floor."

They plan to handle an unusual line of gourmet foods, hard to get items like scallions, truffles, snails in shells. "But we are not just a gourmet food store," Janes repeated.

They plan to take advantage of the children's play lot next door. They will schedule morning and afternoon cooking classes providing refreshments and attendant for the children in the play lot while their mother takes the class.

As Diane scrubbed away with oven cleaner on two old stoves, which will

be used to add the decor—not cooking—she said, "Once school starts, Larry will be on his own during the week." She teaches the trainable mentally retarded in Harrison School, Livonia and will be back on the job.

"This has been a dream for four years. We believe we finally found the right spot for it. We've been working here since June 17."

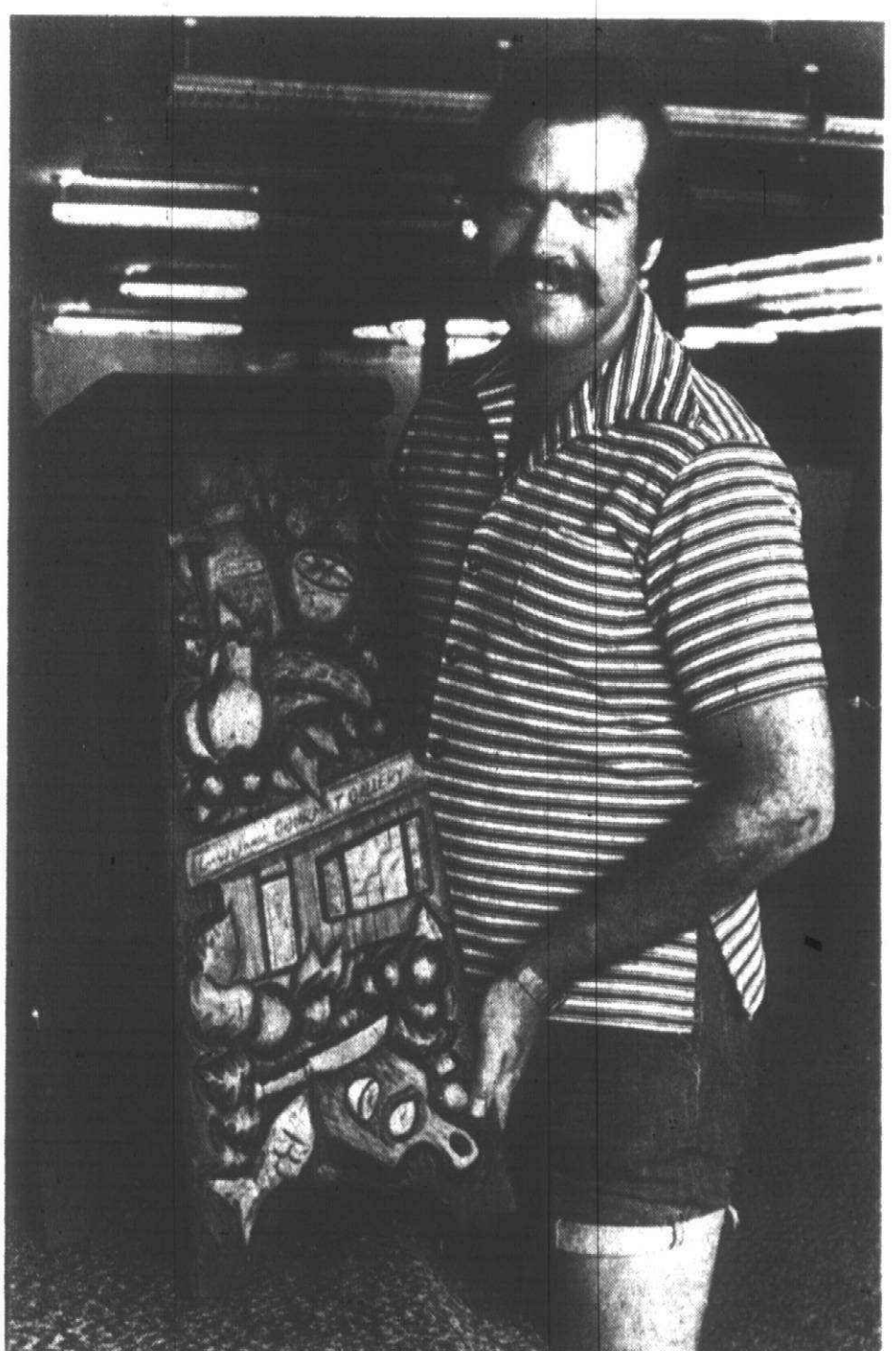
"The old black stove is about 75 years old. I got it from Marge Yocom. Isn't it great?"

Probably the most salient feature of your handwriting is your very backhand slant. This tells me you are a re-

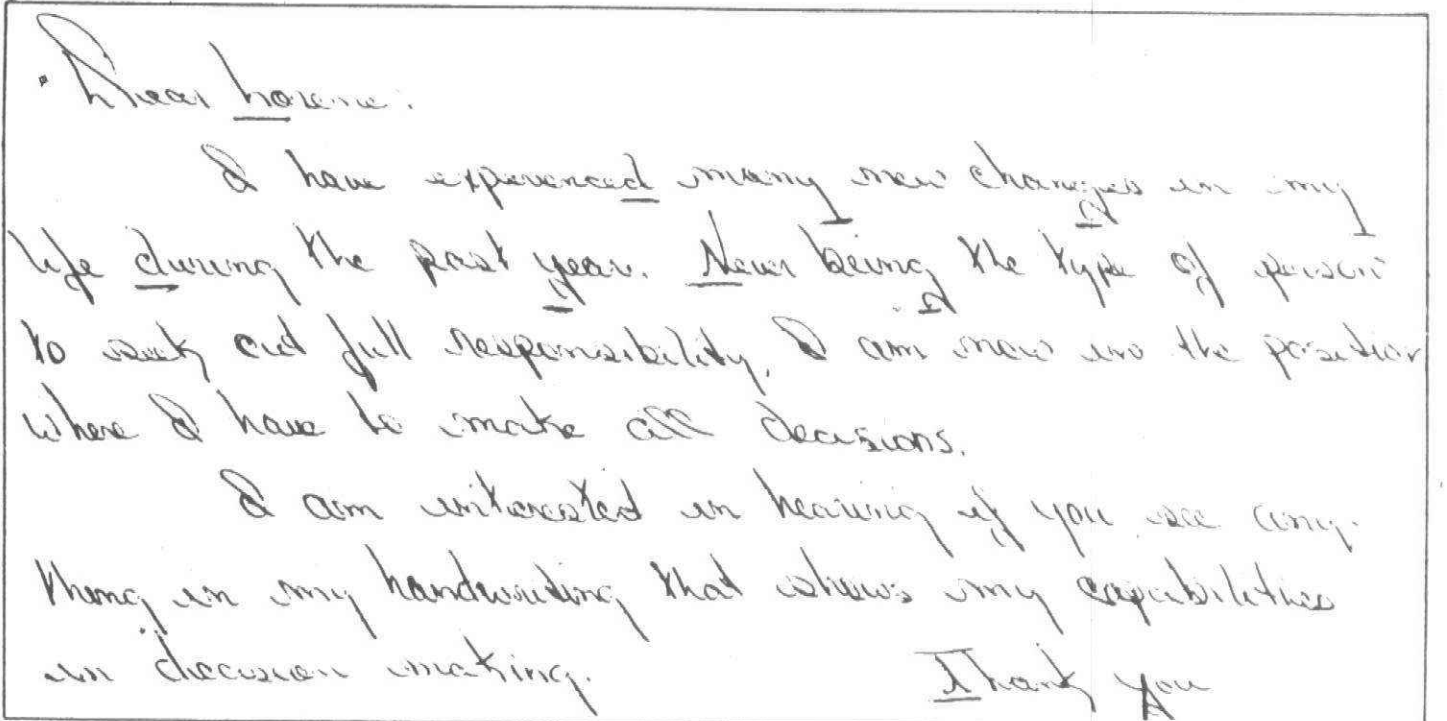
served person, somewhat introverted when in the company of people you do not know well. You do not always need to be surrounded by people, and enjoy time by yourself.

Women find new horizons

"Hey, it's time for me."

This is a sentence Shirley Emerson likes to hear from men and women. To her it means they've become interested in developing themselves and are starting to grow.

Dr. Emerson spends most of her time as a counselor at Schoolcraft College, talking to those who need academic, vocational or personal advice.

On Wednesdays, she heads for the Women's Resource Center, south of campus, to offer counseling services. While most of her clients there are women, she encourages men to take advantage of the counseling as well as the other resources of the center.

"Women's lib should be people's lib," says Dr. Emerson, who earned her doctorate in counseling at the University of Michigan. "When individuals develop, whether male or female, everyone around is enhanced."

THE MAJORITY of those she meets in individual counseling sessions—in the center or in a class she leads called New Horizons—are women at the crossroads of their life.

"They have been at home many years," she says. "The last child has gone off to school, and they find time on their hands. They want to start developing themselves."

"They may decide to do it by going to school, volunteering or through personal growth experiences. Or they may prefer a job or career."

"In the New Horizons classes they start to share experiences with other women. I hear them saying, 'It's nice

to find people who feel the same as I do; I thought I was crazy.'"

Dr. Emerson hopes the class and the counseling will give them the feeling that it's OK to develop themselves, and thus help them gain confidence.

"It's acceptable now for women to be people," she says. "I find that many women have trouble believing that about themselves. They have been trained for a life of service, and too many of them have put themselves in the role of slaves. I don't think men really like a slave. I think they'd like a partner."

"As they get permission to be people, they find they can be a person without stepping on anybody."

MANY of these women have turned up at Schoolcraft courses in human potential, transactional analysis and assertiveness training.

"We are learning that more and more depends on whether we think we can do something," she stated. "If we think we can't, we'll never accomplish it."

Dr. Emerson says the study of human sexuality may soon sweep the country as the human potential movement did recently.

The college, which has offered human potential and assertiveness training as part of its community services program, is prepared to give two hours of credit in the fall for courses

in this field. One is called "Human Development"; the other is "Strategies for Life-work Planning."

The Women's Resource Center will continue to offer its seminars and workshops. One that will start in the fall, called "Self-guided Career Search", has been prepared by John Webber, the director of counseling.

He will be looking for volunteers in August to serve as leaders for the workshop.

AS A WOMAN who went back to school twice, Dr. Emerson identifies strongly with those who launch themselves into new fields as they approach middle age. When her children were young, she studied for an MA in English. Years later she returned to college once more to become skilled in counseling.

"As an English teacher at Henry Ford Community College, I used to read a lot of student papers," she began. "People put a great deal of themselves and their troubles into their writing. But as an English teacher I could only help them to a certain degree. So I took up counseling."

To these women, who she says are at the crossroads of life, she would offer encouragement about the possibility for success.

"It is being done," she maintains. "It does work. There are jobs for middle age women. And no wonder—we make good employees."

The Stroller On Horatio Alger

Any time a fellow sits down to lunch with a member of the legal profession or the law enforcement agencies he can expect the conversation to make most any kind of a turn.

For instance, the other day The Stroller was privileged to enjoy a dish of soup with former Judge George Bowles, an old friend who has discarded the robes of the bench to return to the practice of law.

We had been chatting about the sad condition in which we find the world today and the fact that the news, both in the newsprints and on the tube, deals mostly with crime—murders, muggings, thievery and the use of knives to the extent that was almost unknown a generation ago.

IN THE MIDST of the discussion the good judge asked a most interesting question:

"Whatever became of the American Story? You know, the story of the poor boys working and striving and finally reaching the top."

For a few seconds no one at the table answered.

Then a portly gent spoke up. "We haven't heard much of this since Horatio Alger died. He sure could steam up the young fellows with his wonderful tales of conquering adversity."

"That's what I mean," Judge Bowles said. "There seems to be something lacking today and now that you mention Horatio Alger, it is the absence of fellows like him that has helped to bring about the present con-

ditions—and we have lost the American story."

The name of Horatio Alger may mean little to the youth of today, but there was a time when every young fellow followed him and his stories from one month to another.

Such fictional tales as "Tom the Bootblack" provided the incentive for the young lads of the time to go and do likewise.

In his novel Horatio had Tom rise from the shoe shine stand to a man of affluence in his community. And each of his novels carried much the same theme.

"Every young fellow was eager to learn to read so he could enjoy Alger's books," our friend the Judge, pointed out.

And while he didn't bluntly blame the present lack of reading ability in the public schools he inferred that there are no magazines or novels today that would cause a student to struggle in class until he mastered the art of reading.

Mention of Horatio Alger brought back many fond memories to The Stroller. He was a devout follower of the Alger tales in his youth. And when they started to pass from the scene there was another called The American Boy that was printed in downtown Detroit.

The American Boy is best remem-

bered because it was written by our gourmet friend, portly George Pierrot, who came here from the west coast to gain fame, first as an editor, and later as the producer of the Adventure series that attracted thousands to the tube several nights each week.

When he left another editor used The American Boy to reach fame and fortune. He was Clarence Buddington Kelland, a reporter on the Detroit News.

Kelland attracted nationwide attention with his writings and it wasn't long until he was one of the most prolific writers ever engaged to fill the pages of the Saturday Evening Post, back in the days when it was sold for a nickel and was the most widely read magazine in the country.

"If we had magazines such as that today," one of the remarked, "things would be a lot different. The kids would have an incentive, they would want to master the art of reading and thus eliminate one of the major problems in our schools today. And with that incentive they would want to get ahead, too, and we would have less crime."

"Today they have things too easy. They are allowed to leave school even though they can't read—and they have no incentive to get ahead. Our welfare programs and unemployment and other handouts take care of that."

All agreed and it was further proof that even the chatter over a bowl of soup can be interesting.

Twp. to hear sewer plea

How much responsibility does local government have in paying for and maintaining sewers for private businesses?

That question will be a major issue at the Plymouth Township Board of Trustees 8 p.m. meeting Tuesday.

The meeting will be in the township hall at the corner of Ann Arbor and Lilley roads.

Warren Smith and G. David Whitmore, owners of S&W Hardware and Pilgrim Party Store, respectively, are asking the township to construct a storm sewer on their property on the southwest corner of Ann Arbor Road at Main Street.

Stanley Jaroh, new owner of the L&D Party Store on Ann Arbor Road at Ridge, has offered to pay for his own sewer but wants the township to accept maintenance and repair responsibility for it upon its completion.

From all preliminary indications, the trustees will turn thumbs down on both requests.

Smith and Whitmore have appeared before the board before asking it to authorize paying the cost of extending the present storm sewer which stops at Ball Street. They, in turn, have offered to pay for the cost of paving about 170 feet of Ball Street.

The township claims that when the original sewer was installed, it was stopped at Ball Street because officials could not get an easement to go on the businesses' private property.

Smith says he was out of town at the time and was never asked if he wanted the sewer to run on his land.

"If we go on their property and pay for the sewer, it will be a dangerous precedent," said Clerk Helen Richardson. "We made the Clock Restaurant and the other businesses on the other side of Main Street pay for their own sewer. I think Smith and Whitmore should, too."

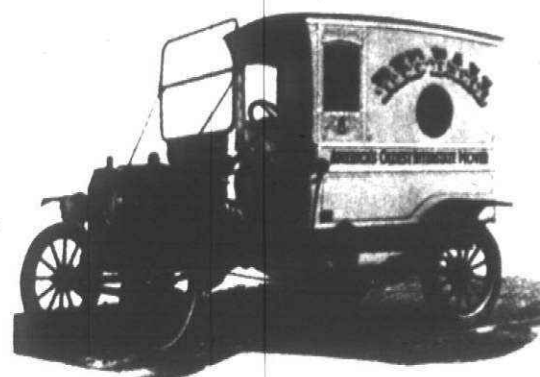
Mrs. Richardson also said there could be some reluctance to approve Jaroh's request because of the size sewer pipe he is planning to install.

"It's pretty small. I think the township could be opening up a can of worms if it accepts dedication."

IN ADDITION, the board will hear a request from Brian Kidston, assistant principal of Central Middle School, to put more sidewalks in the township to cut down on traffic hazards.

Kidston specifically has a complaint about the Ann Arbor Road "corridor," from Sheldon Road east.
