Bradley hunts down ambulance run debts

Canton's treasury has been fattened by about \$3,000 since last April, when Treasurer Anne Bradley first set out to recoup overdue rescue run bills.

The delinquent payments stem from as far back as 1971 when the fire department transported traffic accident and drug overdose victims to emergency rooms in area hospitals.

Although Mrs. Bradley and Constable Irene Murphy have collected about \$3,000 from more than 100 persons so far, Mrs. Bradley says the township will probably never receive another \$3,000 in delinquent rescue run payments.

CANTON residents receive the ambulance service for free; non-residents are billed \$35 for the service. Before 1975, when the rates were changed, non-residents were charged

only \$25 for an ambulance run.

According to Mrs. Bradley, the township tried once before to collect the delinquent payments, but only a small percentage was collected.

"I just thought I'd try once again," she said.

After receiving approval from Supervisor Harold Stein and Clerk John Flodin, Mrs. Bradley hired Mrs. Murphy for the collection job. The constable receives \$7.50 for each delinquent payment she collects.

Almost all of the persons owing money have been contacted, but only about half have paid up.

"Some of the people have been really snotty," Mrs. Murphy said, "but most of them say they forgot and they're sorry. A lot of the people thought their insurance covered the ambulance service."

Mrs. Bradley says the township is not trying to collect delinquent payments from the three or four families who lost relatives in accidents that occurred in Canton over the last few years.

"I don't think the heartbreak you might be giving someone would be worth it—especially after a year or two have elapsed," she said.

From now on, township officials will bill non-residents for ambulance runs shortly after the service was performed, she said. A second billing statement will be mailed two weeks after the first, if the first bill isn't paid.

The treasurer called the drive to recoup some of the delinquent rescue run payments a success.

"That's \$3,000 the township wouldn't have if we hadn't tried to collect them."

Nickles used to nudge consumer agency bill

When Kathleen O'Reilly graduated

from law school, the last thing to which she aspired was the life of a bureaucracy-fighter. But after experiencing the monotony of processing corporate legal work ("There are only so many ways to walk in front of a moving bus"), she has never regretted the move, albeit accidental, to her present position.

Testifying before Congressional committees, fighting the financial fists of big business, and flying to major cities to wage media campaigns—all are a part of Ms. O'Reilly's new life-style as executive director of the Consumer Federation of America (CFA).

Ms. O'Reilly, whose parents Jim and Lillian live on Joann Lane in Plymouth, doesn't call herself a bureaucracy-fighter, but she might as well be. Her role as CFA director pits her against some of the most powerful men in the country; both in business and government.

The top priority of the CFA is to fight the creation of a federal consumer protection agency. Ms. O'Reilly says such an agency is badly needed because of a lack of consumer representation in the governmental decision making process.

SO MS. O'REILLY'S GROUP is making an all-out pitch to persuade Congress. An identical bill to set up an agency was introduced in 1969 and passed both houses in 1975.

The bill, however, never became law. It never reached President Gerald Ford's oval office because of his

repeated threats to veto it, according to Ms. O'Reilly. "He was responding to his golf buddies," Ms. O'Reilly said of the former president. "It was an example of peer politics in the worse sense of the word."

This time, though, the CFA has the support of the administration. President Jimmy Carter has gone on record as saying he is in favor of the establishment of a consumer protection agency "to focus the consumer's inter-

State act isn't saving farmland

Michigan's Farmland and Open Space Preservation Act was originally designed to preserve farmland and to take the pressure off farmers to sell their land to developers and speculators by providing them with a number of tax advantages.

But three years after the act was signed into law, it's not working, according to Robert Ward, Eastern Michigan University geographer and advocate of land use planning.

"Farmers are not flocking to the program in droves," said Ward. "Only one and one-half to two percent of the state's 80,000 farmers are participating in the program, with only one and one-half to two percent

of the state's farmland tied up in the program."

According to a recent study by Ward entitled "Farmland Preservation Through Tax Benefits: the Michigan Experience", following World War II Michigan had 190,000 farms that comprised 18,400,000 acres, or about half of all the land in the state.

Thirty-one years later, statistics indicate that Michigan now has 69,000 farms with a total of 11,900,000 acres.

The reasons for the drastic decline in agricultural land are numerous according to Ward.

"THE MAIN REASON for the decline in agriculture is the increased

tax pressure on the farmer. Property taxes drive most of the guys out of the market. Special assessment taxes levied for sewer lines, water, roads and education—coupled with the inflationary costs of fertilizer and equipment—put a lot of farmers out of business."

Ward is particularly disappointed in Public Act 116—designed to preserve farmlands and open spaces.

But Brown's bill hasn't been passed yet and Ward explained what he felt is wrong with the existing Act 116.

Under the act, Michigan farmers transfer development rights to their land to the state for a minimum of 10

years and receive tax advantages in return.

Farmers would be less inclined to sell to developers and speculators who offer high sums based on the potential value of the land.

"The most frequent complaint by farmers," said Ward, "is the lengthiness of the agreement they have to sign with the state."

"The fact that farmers are encouraged to commit their land to 10 years of agricultural use by the state is often viewed in an economic context. They are businessmen who realize the history of land values in their immediate vicinity and frequently express uncertainty about the future feasibility of their farm operation."

According to Ward, the major enticements of Public Act 116 are twofold:

"First, farmers are not vulnerable to special assessments for such urban amenities as sewer and water mains on land covered by the development rights agreement."

"The second tax advantage focuses credit against farmer's state income taxes. This credit is for the amount of property taxes on the land and structures used in the farming operation, including the homestead, that exceeds seven per cent of the household income from all sources. If this is greater than the state income tax, the difference is refunded to them without interest."

The future for the preservation of farmlands and open spaces in Michigan isn't bright, Ward said.

"Realistic projections show staggering statistics. If the trend of land use pertaining to Michigan farms is projected in straight line fashion, only 2,000,000 acres of crop land would remain by the year 2000."

Even handcuffs get recorded

For the first time, Canton officials believe they know the whereabouts and value of every typewriter, fire hose, gun holster and handcuff the township owns.

Treasurer Anne Bradley ordered the inventory at the recommendation of the Seidman & Seidman accounting firm about a month ago. An inventory list of township equipment never existed until now, Mrs. Bradley said.

"Hey, if something had been stolen, no one would have even known what it was," she said. "You keep buying new equipment. How do you even know what's covered by insurance without an inventory list?"

Canton resident Shirley Hamilton was hired about a month ago to conduct the inventory. Mrs. Hamilton, who performed inventory work for Holiday Inn, has been recording serial numbers of typewriters, desks and handcuffs ever since.

According to Mrs. Hamilton, all township equipment, except supplies for the DPW and the new fire station, has already been recorded.

"This is something that's never been done before," said Mrs. Bradley. "So it's quite a job."

Can 1949 television set still pick up Uncle Miltie?

Whoever heard of the Firestone Tire Company making television sets? Nonsense, right?

Wrong. The Firestone emblem actually appeared on early television models and Canton Township Dog Warden John Swalley can prove it.

Swalley is the proud owner of a 1949

Firestone television set which antique collectors would surely relish. What's even more amazing is that all the local channels operate with strong sound and a clear porthole picture.

"I bought the television at a garage sale up north last year for \$5," Swalley said. "It was the first thing that caught my eye."

"At that time it had sound but no picture. I figured if I couldn't get it to work, I wasn't out of that much money."

The dog warden promptly took the set to Rick's TV on Ford Road and asked if it could be repaired.

"I told Rick to take his time with the repair," Swalley said. "He did all the research in getting the parts and returned the set to me last week in working order."

"The bill was only \$71."

RICK MADEAU, a Plymouth resident who owns the TV shop, said it took six months to find the right parts. He found most of them from a dealer in Detroit.

"We had to replace four old deflecting capacitors and some worn-out bearings," the repairman said.

"As far as the TV is concerned, it should work for a long time. The picture tube is in good shape."

"It's a remarkable TV."

Madeau explained that the Firestone was one of the first "Electrostatic Deflection TVs" ever made. The first TV was made in 1946.

"The TV was probably worth around \$185 when first bought."

Madeau said it was hard to estimate what the Firestone was worth today to an antique collector—but he guessed around \$250-\$300.

Swalley called Greenfield Village and found that the museum didn't have such an item.

"I was thinking of donating the set to Greenfield Village," Swalley said. "They told me I could get a lifetime pass to the museum and my name next to the TV."

"I really enjoy the set and it's got to be worth something."

One thing is for certain. For \$5 plus repairs, Swalley couldn't have made a better buy.

Computers creep into township hall

Computer printouts of water bills, taxes and monthly budget reports may soon be ready at the flick of a switch at Canton Township Hall.

Canton board members Tuesday endorsed what one accountant called a "creeping commitment to computers" when they agreed to lease computer terminals for township hall by a 5-2 vote. Trustees Robert Myers and Brian Schwall voted no.

Under the \$750-a-month lease agreement with the accounting firm of Seidman & Seidman, the terminals will hook up to the company's main computer system in Rochester. After six months or a year, township officials may decide to buy their own terminals for an estimated \$41,000.

CURRENTLY, township officials contract various firms to calculate water bills, tax assessments and payroll on computers. Total cost of the contracts is \$1,000 a month, according

to Robert Wiar of Seidman & Seidman who recently completed a study of township office procedures.

Under the new computer system, the bills and assessments will be calculated at township hall. Month-by-month breakdowns of the township budget or itemized expenses could be presented to township board members upon request.

"You can just ask that little rascal for anything you want, and there it is," Clerk John Flodin said of a computer system already used by a neighboring township.

Flodin says township employees will be trained to run the computer system.

"Frankly, I don't think we'd eliminate people with this system," he told other board members. "I think maybe you'd just stop expanding payroll and free people up to do some other things."

Kids like horses— farm's ok

Go out Ford Road far enough and the cornfields start outnumbering the new subdivisions. A mile or so more and there's only the corn, with farmers on tractors in the fields baling hay under a July sun and high-rising smoky dust left by cars down dirt roads.

Right about there you'll find the Children's Farm and Riding School. It's a strange farm. They don't grow anything, so there's pasture surrounded by the corn other farmers planted. But every summer morning at 8:30 children from five to 16 go there to learn about a world that won't be around much longer.

The subdivisions get closer every year, but the kids—from places like Garden City, Westland, Livonia, Canton Township, Redford Township and Plymouth—just have a good time and don't seem to notice it.

Most of them particularly like to ride horses—and most of them never have before—but Jessica Handley, 8,

of Garden City, has a different kind of favorite thing.

"I like cleaning out the pigs," she said on a recent afternoon, her T-shirt stained an odd color. "I like getting dirty."

Oh, well. Anyway, most of the other kids like riding horses.

Jennifer Easton, 5, and her brother Marc, 8, both do. Marc talked excitedly about riding—especially about riding bareback with another kid on the same horse.

His sister interrupted: "I got to stand up on Mr. Marts' shoulders."

"What a luck out," Marc replied.

Jack Marts and a staff of one instructor for every 10 pupils run the farm. They keep jackasses and chickens and calves, as well as the horses and pigs. There's 41 acres on the farm, and in all that space what they attempt to achieve, Marts says, is "perfection."

"We demand perfection. We demand imagination and initiative. It's

not like the schools. Every kid can hold the horse's reins right, and we demand that they do."

Marts, who was once fired by the Plymouth school system—he says a court has recently found in his favor and ordered the system to pay six years back salary to him—has some unusual ideas about education.

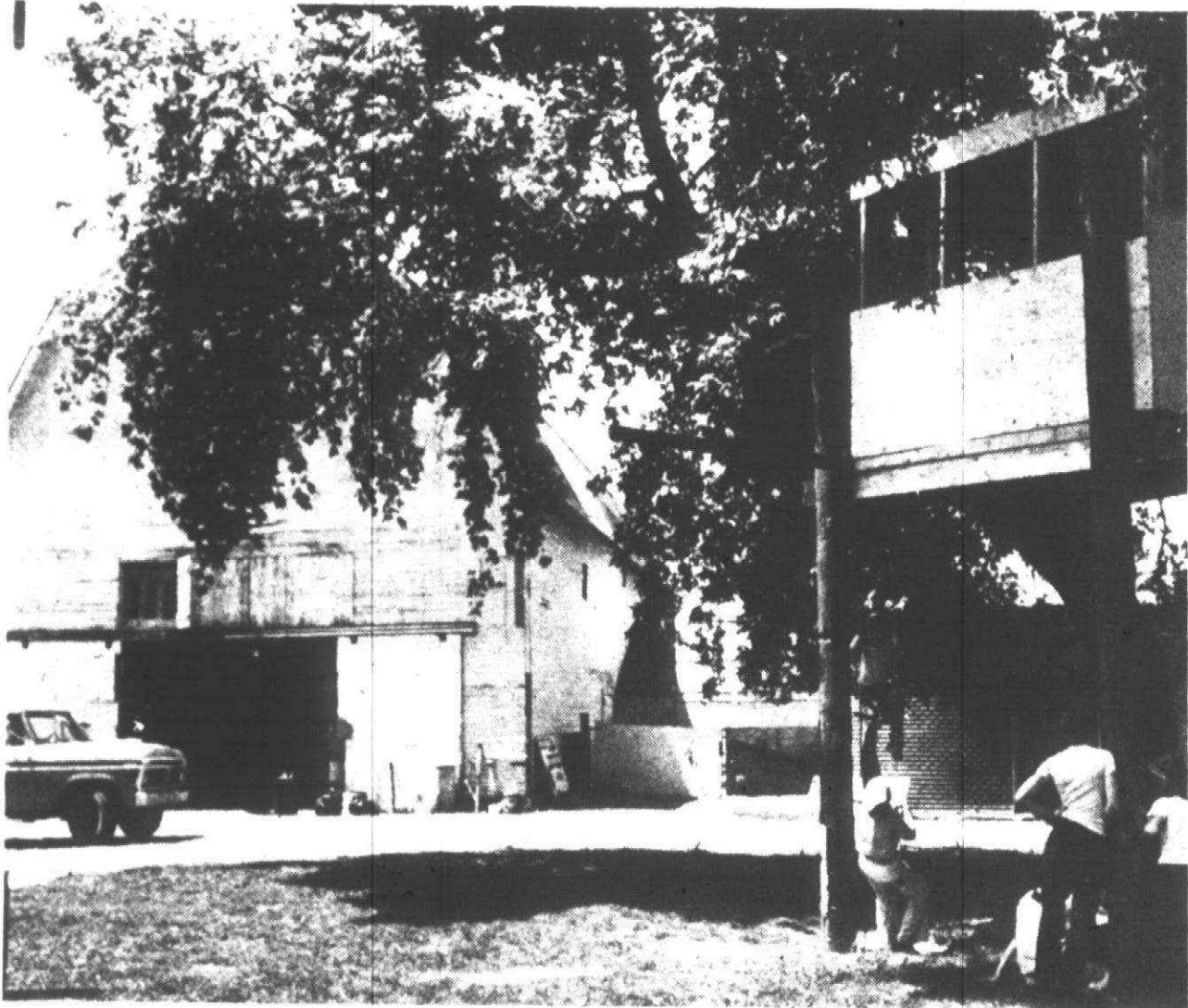
"Teachers," he says, "are dumb as hell." And "not every kid needs to learn to read or write, not today with television and college graduates who can't find work."

His farm seems like a nice place.

Michelle Lamarato, 11, of Canton Township, seems to think so. She used her "birthday money" to pay the \$55 weekly tuition.

And at the farm, about 40 minutes from downtown Detroit, David Hustad, 8, of Westland, has a good time too.

"I like how soft the horses' noses are," he said.

She's nudging Congress with nickels

est in one agency as much as possible."

The only opposition is big business, which, according to Ms. O'Reilly, wants to protect its dominant relationship with federal regulatory agencies. And Ms. O'Reilly says business opponents are pulling out every stop, spending record amounts of time and money to kill the consumer agency bill.

TO COUNTER the expenditures of

its opposition, the CFA has started a "nickel campaign," reflecting the annual cost per citizen for the operation of a consumer champion in Washington.

The nickel campaign published a target list last week of the names of 78 congressmen who have not publicly supported the consumer bill. The CFA is asking consumers to send a nickel to their Congressmen as a symbolic vote in favor of the bill.

The campaign has already influenced a pair of representatives

from Tennessee and Florida, who both declared their support of the measure after their offices were barged with nickels.

Included on the target list is U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), who, Ms. O'Reilly said, should receive more than 500 nickels this week. She is working with local volunteers through Saturday in front of Plymouth shopping centers urging persons to write Pursell.

Phase two of the nickel campaign will begin next week and focus on a

different set of representatives, including William Broomfield (R-West Bloomfield).

THE REASON WHY representatives are not supporting the consumer bill is because they are responding to the needs of major campaign contributors, not constituents, according to Ms. O'Reilly. The problem is particularly severe with freshmen and sophomore congressmen, like Pursell, who have never dealt with an issue before involving such pressure from big busi-

ness, Ms. O'Reilly said.

Pursell could not be reached for comment.

Ms. O'Reilly says she expects the bill to win handily in the senate. She says U.S. Sen. Donald Riegle (D-Mich.) supports the measure, while U.S. Sen. Robert Griffin (R-Mich.) "is hopeless."

Other supporters of the consumer agency are Ralph Nader, Common Cause, the United Auto Workers and the National Council of Senior Citizens. Opponents include Exxon, General Motors, Proctor & Gamble, Gulf Oil and the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.

The purpose of the proposed consumer legislation is to present a consumer viewpoint in crucial cases coming before federal regulatory agencies such as the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Because the cost of representing one party at a typical FDA hearing runs around \$40,000, Ms. O'Reilly says such consumer representation has so far been unaffordable.

The consumer agency will not be vested with the power to ban any products, but only to be a legal advocate for the consumer interest, Ms. O'Reilly said. It also would represent consumer concerns about high prices, harmful products and dishonest business practices.

There appears to be widespread public support for this legislation. A recent Louis Harris poll revealed an overwhelming 63 per cent majority in favor of the bill. Ms. O'Reilly says she expects the bill to reach the house floor before the August recess.

Unions hope to rise up in the South

The Michigan employment picture could improve if a bill in Congress and supported by labor unions is passed, according to Farmington Hills resident Aldo Vagnozzi, editor of the Michigan AFL-CIO News.

Vagnozzi made his statement after it was announced that President Jimmy Carter and organized labor unions have agreed on a labor law reform package designed to strengthen union organizing efforts.

While designed primarily to boost union organization efforts in the south, the legislation would aid Michigan workers in the long run because businesses would be less compelled to migrate south in search of non-union workers, according to Vagnozzi.

He estimates thousands of Michigan workers have lost jobs in recent years because of businesses fleeing to the south in search of less expensive labor.

But it will be a tough getting the bill through Congress, because business groups are planning to fight the legislation.

"Even in Michigan, employers hang tough," says Vagnozzi. "In the building trades, firms are brought in from the south to do jobs."

THE LEGISLATION, to be introduced by Sen. Harrison Williams (D-N.J.) and U.S. Rep. Frank Thompson (D-N.J.) would speed up the process that allows unions to represent workers. Presently, union representation is gained by signing on 30-50 per cent of the workers (depending on the trade) and then petitioning the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) to conduct a secret ballot.

The problem, as it now exists, says Vagnozzi, is that businesses presently can drag out the process in court. The delays can last for years.

"In some cases the process has been delayed for so long that many of the original employees have left the company or have been fired for union activity," he says.

"It's our feeling that the intent of the Wagner Act, which gives workers a right to chose a union, has been eroded."

The Wagner Act was instituted to give workers the right to join a union.

Under the reform plan, the NLRB would be forced to decide whether a union has qualified for an election within a given time. If the organization is uncontested it would be within 15 days and 75 days if the organizing effort was disputed.

One of the provisions in the reform act would increase the size of the NLRB from five to seven members and allow two members to hear a case and make a recommendation to the entire board.

"As it is now, all five members must hear a case and if one or two members are missing, the process is slowed down," said Vagnozzi.

Other stipulations in the package would grant back pay of an employee who has been fired illegally for engaging in union activities and would deny federal contracts to businesses which obstruct valid union organization attempts.

A prime example of how an employer abuses labor organization attempts is the J.P. Stevens textile factory located in the south.

"Once a union has won an election, there is no compulsion for the company to bargain. At the J.P. Stevens Company an election was won more than a year ago. But all Stevens has to do is go through the facade of bargaining," says Vagnozzi.

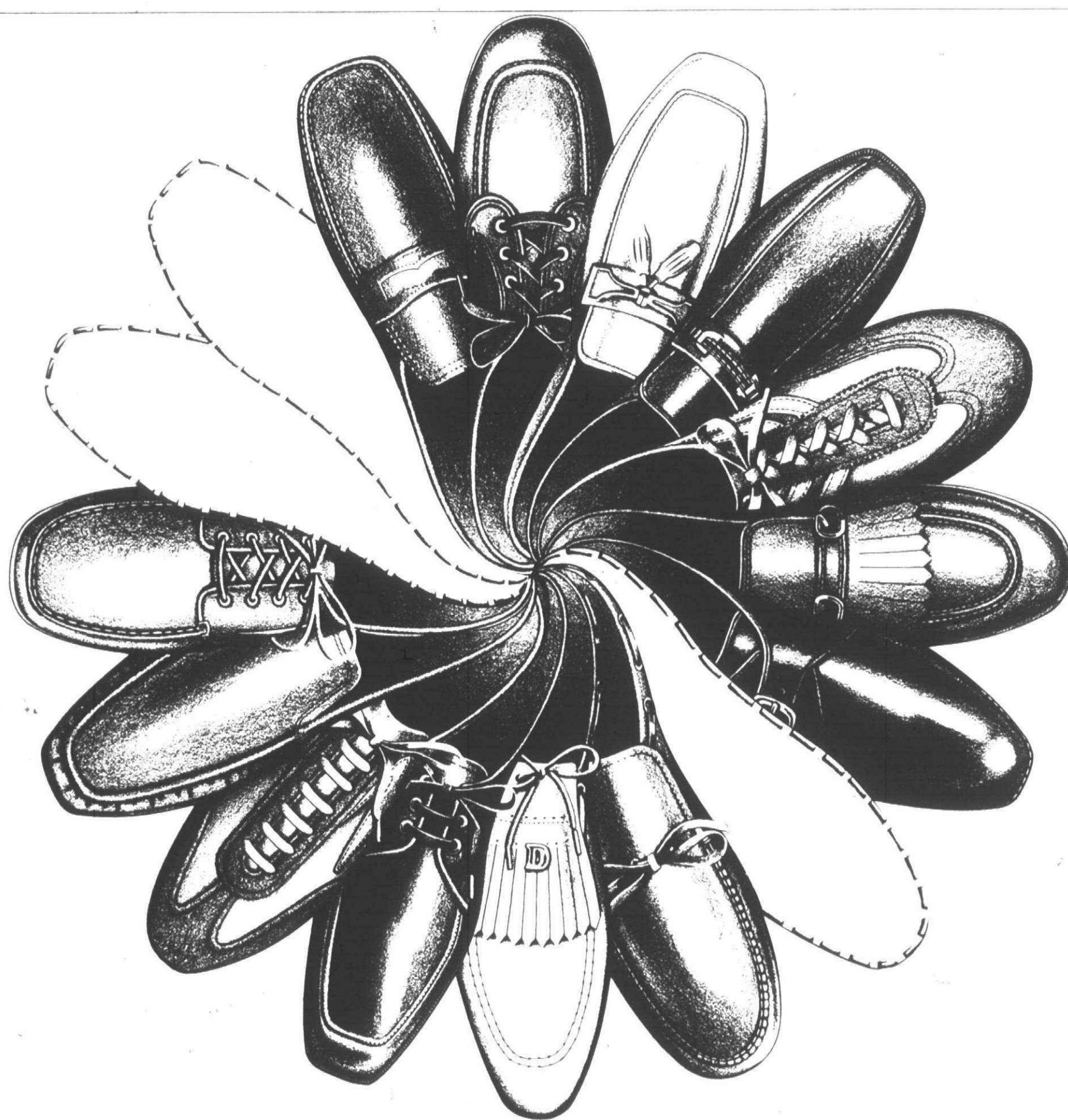
A company has a right to appeal each issue in a contract, he said.

Although pleased that the coalition between the President and unions has been worked out, the labor organizations didn't get everything they wanted from Carter. He refused to support union wishes to repeal state right-to-work laws which allow states to ban union shops (shops where all the employees must be union workers).

The unions also abandoned a proposal which would have permitted unions to be certified as bargaining agents without an election if a majority of workers involved signed representation cards.

Although defeated on these two points the AFL-CIO has raised \$800,000 in extra union assessments to form a task force to lobby in Washington D.C.

Supporters hope for passage in 1978.

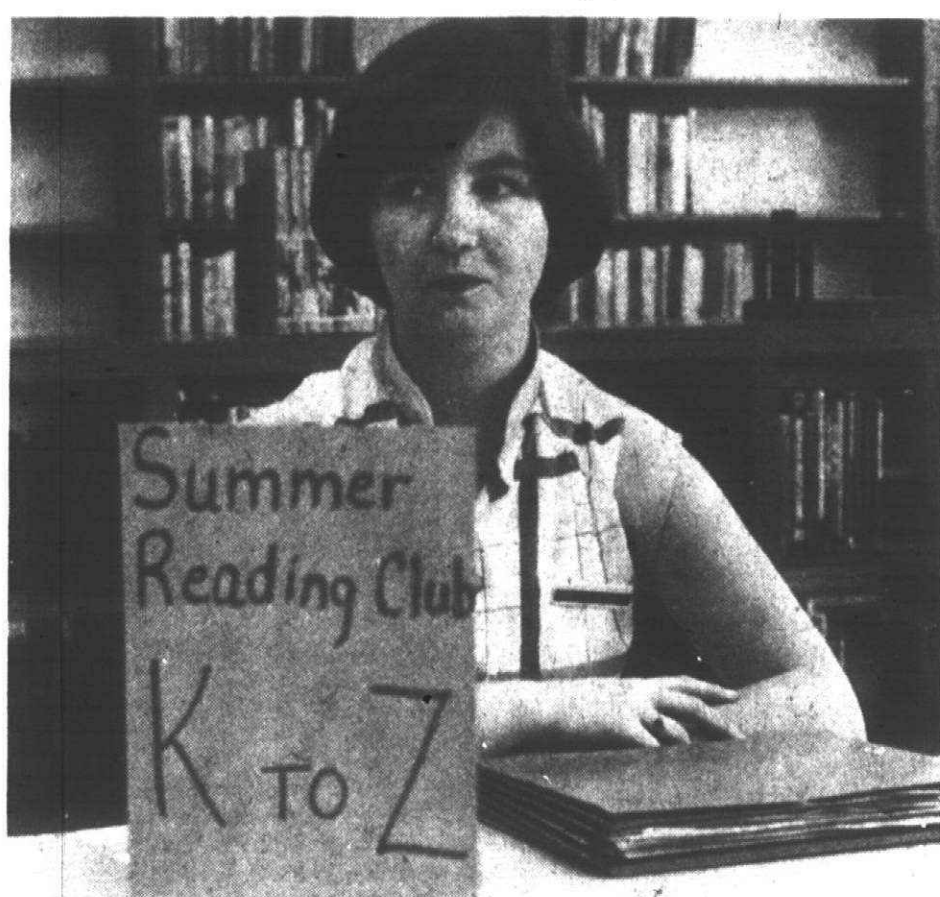

Plymouthites more content than Cantonites

People in the Plymouth-Canton community are fairly satisfied with where they live, but in most cases have a few things they'd like to see changed to the quality of life better.

In a random sample of residents of all three municipalities, the Observer found out that residents of Plymouth and Plymouth Township were generally more positive about their communities than Canton people. Those who lived in Canton liked it, but had more things that irked them.

In Plymouth, people were especially pleased by the smallness and old-fashioned nature of the city. People in Canton felt that the political

squabbles and rapid growth kept the community from being ideal.

"I don't like the closeness of the homes in the suburbs here," said Dian Harrison of Canton. "If the building would slow down, there wouldn't be so many of them." She said the one thing she really liked about Canton was its fire department.

Marilyn Nail, who has lived in Canton for three years, said she felt the location was excellent, but the township government was unresponsive to citizen concerns.

"The politicians don't care too much. You can't get them to do too much," She said the people in her neighborhood were opposed to the

newly-proposed recreation complex at Ford and Haggerty Roads.

"If that huge building goes up, the noise and traffic will be terrible," She said the township administration could do more in terms of installing lights in the township and improving roads.

ASIDE FROM THE growth, Barbara Stefureac "likes Canton just fine. I've lived here for six years, and so far it's been nice. I just wish that it wasn't so crowded."

Karen Etienne, who moved from Jackson, Fla. just a little more than a year ago, wasn't too fond of the weather. But she admitted that would be a problem anywhere in Michigan.

The thing she liked the most about Canton was its location. "We're far enough away from Detroit that we don't have a lot of problems. But we can still go there when we want to." She said her main objection to the community was the amount of political in-fighting and back-biting.

In contrast, none of those interviewed from Plymouth or Plymouth Township thought politics was an issue one way or the other.

"I wouldn't make any changes," said Hubert Smithson, a township resident. "I've lived here for 27 years and I'm very satisfied with everything."

Peter Tillotson, a city-dweller, liked the fact that Plymouth has remained relatively unchanged over the years.

"We're still a small town, with a small town atmosphere. We have a sense of community here, and I think that's good."

Norman Leonard agreed with Tillotson's assessment of Plymouth as a small town but with a different slant. "It's just a little backward, but it's nice."

His major complaint was the lack of senior citizen housing and vandalism by some youths. "I sure would have liked to see the senior highrise go up on Wilcox's property. And as far as the vandalism, there's not much you can do. It's going on everywhere."

High taxes were what bugged Ray Gaddey, and he felt the schools had

more to do with that than the city. "The district is too big. If Canton would just split off, people in both communities would pay less taxes."

Lorri Goebel, who has lived in Plymouth for 20 years, also liked the old-fashioned atmosphere in the city and the "quaintness" of the surroundings. She did, however, feel that there weren't enough good jobs.

"Maybe if there was a little more business and industry around there would be more job opportunities," she commented.

Maybe the most telling observation belonged to one old gentleman who was sitting in Kellogg Park. "It's not the best place in the world. But I've been in worse ones."

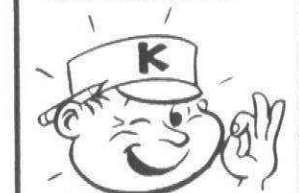

It was during one of these periods when The Stroller's career took a turn.

It was about 4 a.m. when his top machine hand walked into the little cubby hole office and, with chin down to his chest, remarked, "I just spoiled that job".

"You just what?" The Stroller asked as though he had been hearing things.

"I just spoiled that job," the top machine hand repeated.

"What happened?" The Stroller asked.

"I dozed off a bit," came the answer, "and didn't notice that the cutting tool became loose and dug into the metal fairly deep."

Sure enough. On inspection the cutting tool had dug a long spiral into the costly metal.

A hurried survey of the sight, another look at the blue prints, and measuring the depth of the spiral was convincing enough that the job had been

spoiled. It certainly wouldn't be shipped that morning as planned.

Having often dozed off himself when he was operating machines, The Stroller could not find fault with his top machine hand. He gave him another job to do.

But on the way back to his little office, there in the corner of the shop, The Stroller got to thinking. Regardless of the fact that he had nothing to do with the spoiling of the job, as the foreman on duty, he would have to take the blame from the forces higher up.

THEN CAME the great decision. The Stroller very calmly gathered up his tools and placed them neatly in his well-worn tool box. Once they

Schools spend \$ 'reluctantly'

Spending \$118,000 to store equipment at the Centennial Educational Park and an additional \$50,000 for metered lights on the CEP's tennis courts is not the wish of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

Board members learned Monday night, however, they have no choice in deciding whether to spend the funds.

Both expenditures, plus dozens of others which are yet unspent, are a part of the voter-approved 1974 bond issue. All must be completed if the board would like to spend any surpluses earned from interest rates, according to school legal consultants.

Although the present board feels some of the expenditures earmarked

in the bond issue are unnecessary and unimportant, it cannot funnel the monies into other "more worthy" projects, the school attorney said.

The school board, however, can drain the remaining funds of the '74 bond issue on items such as roof repair, which were approved without specific dollar amounts, according to Supt. John M. Hoben. By spending the remaining dollars of the bond issue on such items, there would be none left for tennis court lights and other less crucial items in the eyes of board members.

Once the monies allocated in the bond issue are spent, the board will be free to spend the surplus wherever it chooses, Hoben said.

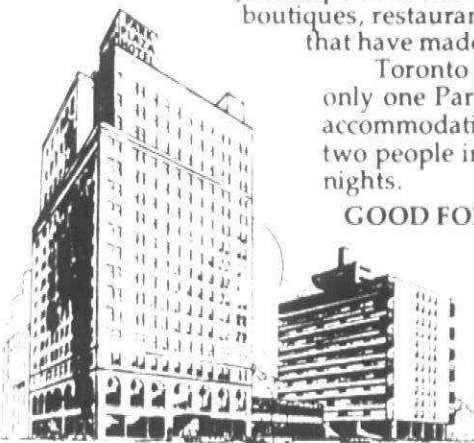

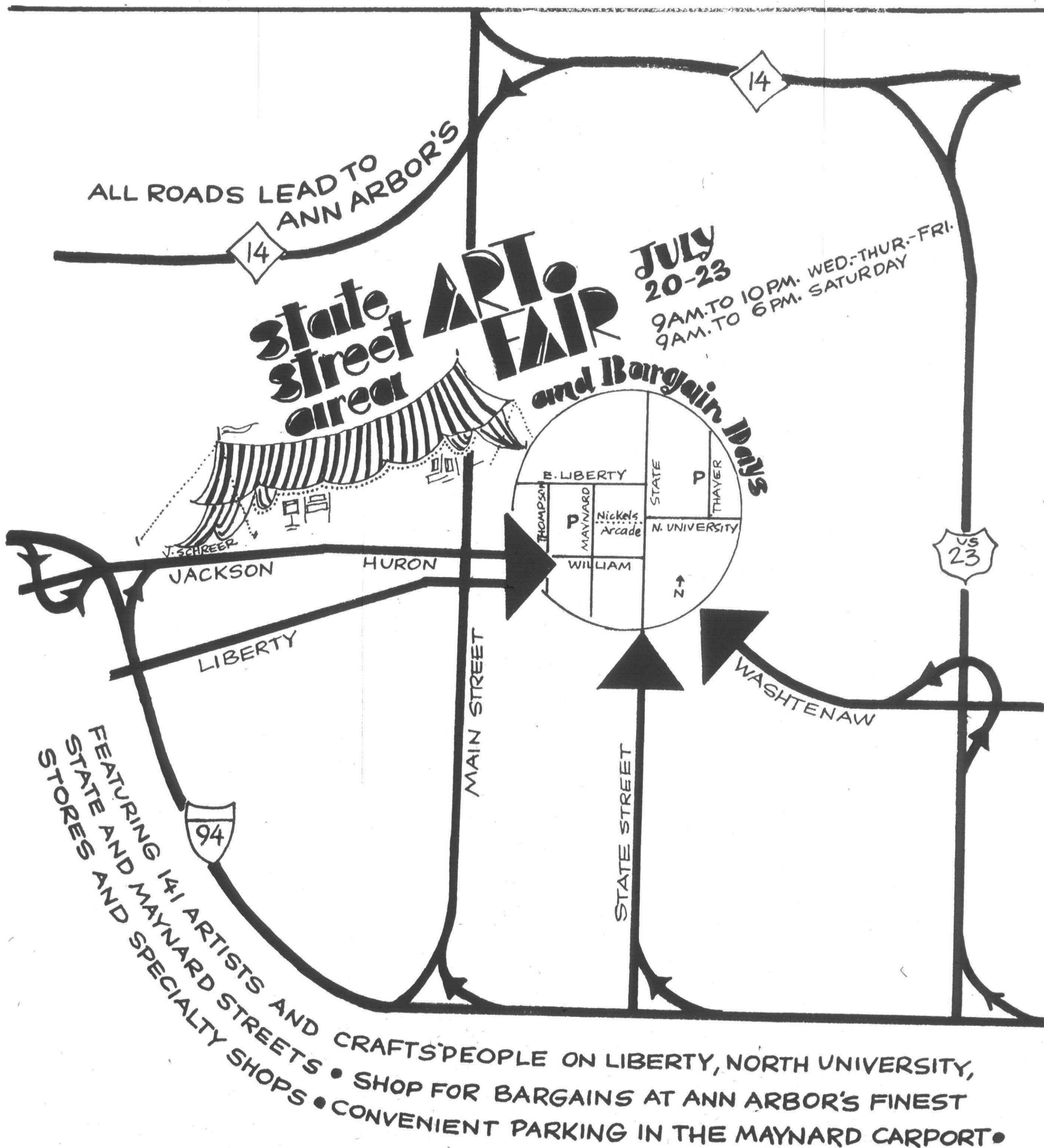

It happened on the 21st day of December in 1947 high on Palomar Mountain in Southern California.

The event was a great milestone in man's age old quest for greater knowledge of the universe. It was on that historical day that the curious eye of man first peered through the great "Hale Telescope" to penetrate far deeper than ever before into the fathomless depths of the universe.

The telescope was so powerful that it made the moon appear as though it were only 40 miles away. The colossal "Giant of Palomar" was the result of many long years of research, of careful planning and toilsome labor on the part of a great many people. Its creation involved a host of problems and tasks of enormous dimension.

But the greatest of all was the remarkable feat of engineering which produced the giant reflecting mirror. THE MIRROR WAS CAST at the Corning Glassworks in New York. It was 200 inches in diameter, nearly 17 feet, and it weighed 20 tons.

When the molten mass was poured from the ladles it was so hot that it had to be left in the mold to cool for a whole year before it could be removed without danger of serious damage. When the huge casting of glass was lifted from its mold it was carefully

Eleven years passed before the polishing was completed and during that time they ground and polished away more than five tons of powered glass, about two and one-half times the weight of an average sized automobile. At last the great mirror was perfect and the dreams of the powerful telescope had become reality.

The beginnings of the Chamber of Commerce movement are traced back almost 6,000 years to the city of Mari in Mesopotamia.

The evolution of the modern Chamber began in 1599 when merchants in Marseilles, France, formed an independent voluntary organization to represent commercial interests of the port. During the 18th century Chambers were established in other French cities and in England and Ireland.

The first American Chamber was the Chamber of Commerce of the State of New York (essentially an organization representing the businessmen of New York City) which was organized in 1768. Five years later, the Charleston, S.C., Chamber was formed.

By 1801, Chambers had been organized in New Haven, Conn., and Philadelphia; and, by 1870, there were Chambers in 40 major American cities.

A group of Ohio businessmen organized the first state Chamber in 1893. Today there are 40 state and regional



Chambers in the U.S.

As a result of a suggestion by President William Howard Taft that some system of national cooperation between business and government be established, the Chamber of Commerce of the United States was created on April 22, 1912.

It was a new step in commercial organization—a representative federation with autonomous Chambers and trade associations from every part of the country and from every type of industry as its controlling and directing force.

By 1970 the National Chamber's membership had grown to include more than 2,700 local, state and regional Chambers and American Chambers of Commerce abroad, 1,100 trade and professional associations and 39,000 business members, representing an underlying membership of more than five million people.

Our neglected children—Part II

One of our hangups in discussing national day care programs is the American myth that only mothers can provide for their children. (Some of the more liberal among us hasten to add that fathers, also, can care for children.)

While parents are important in child-raising, they don't have an exclusive warranty for success. One point which Urie Bronfenbrenner stresses is that there is no appreciable difference between day care and home care provided two conditions are met: First, day care must be quality care and, therefore, much be financed at a higher level than at present; and, second, the persons involved in day care must have a personal dedication to children.

Whether parent or not, Bronfenbrenner stresses, every child needs to spend "a substantial amount of time with somebody who's crazy about him."

"I mean there has to be at least one person who has an irrational involvement with that child, someone who thinks that kid is more important than other people's kids, someone who's in love with him and whom he loves in return. You can't pay for an irrational commitment. And yet a child needs that. He needs somebody who will not just be there certain hours and then say 'I'm off now. I work nine to five.'"

A child needs other experiences as well as "irrational" love. Each child needs some mothering, some fathering, some day care, some coolness. But instead of providing the mixed experience children need, far too often the environment is very limited.

Bronfenbrenner isn't too surprising when he argues fathers are just as adept at child-rearing as mothers, but adds a twist when he states: "It's the children you know, who teach us how to care for them."

It was Bronfenbrenner's tour of Russia which turned him on to the importance of day care and mixed experiences for children, especially the potential of models, peers and groups in affecting the behavior and growth of children.

WHILE SUGGESTING that children lack an "irrational" love, he doesn't point fingers at parents.

"There are grounds for believing that parents today, far from not caring about their children, are more worried about them than they have ever been in the course of recent his-

tory. The crux of the problem is that many parents become powerless as forces in the lives of their children.

"In today's world, parents find themselves at the mercy of a society which imposes pressures and priorities that allows them neither time nor place for meaningful activities and relations between children and adults.... producing 'a situation in which a child often spends more time with a passive-babysitter than with a participating parent.'"

In making that observation, Bronfenbrenner insists that any successful day care program must involve parents and other adults in planning and daily activities. This is especially true because of a pattern he describes as age segregation.

"Children are deprived not only of parents but of people in general. A host of factors conspire to isolate children from the rest of the family. The fragmentation of the extended family, separation of residential and business areas, disappearance of neighborhoods, zoning ordinances, occupational mobility, child labor laws, abolishment of the apprentice system, consolidated schools, television, separate patterns of social life for different age groups, the working mother, the delegation of child care to specialists....

"Children need people in order to become human. The isolation of children from adults simultaneously threatens the growth of the individual and the survival of society. To relegate children to a world of their own is to deprive them of their humanity, and ourselves as well."

A peculiar problem of age segregation is our insistence that children play with youngsters their own age, so that older children often don't know how to handle younger kids, and vice versa. "You can live through the first 16 or 17 years and rarely know another human being of an age different from your own. You won't know many older people either."

"Again, we have moved away from certain traditional family structures without instituting new ways of doing all the things families used to do."

THE DAY CARE programs of today often are effective, Bronfenbrenner says, because they do involve parents and other non-professionals—something which other agencies, including schools, need to consider.

"Like Project Head Start, day care programs can have no lasting constructive impact on the development of the child unless they affect not only the child himself but the people who constitute his enduring day-to-day environment in the family, neighborhood, and community."

Unfortunately, one of the major differences between day care programs and kindergarten is that parents are seldom encouraged to become involved in the public school day in the same manner as at cooperative nursery schools.

Parents should be recruited to help out at school, to show up for a day, or just for a visit of an hour or two. And not for the benefit of that parent's child, but for the positive advantages of having adults intermix in a classroom setting with other adults.

My daughter's teacher happened to be one who encouraged visits from parents, on any day, at any time. The school also was very receptive. The time I spent there was mostly with other youngsters, not my daughter, who were pleased to see an adult male visitor who wasn't the principal, assistant principal, gym teacher, or anyone else connected with the world of education.

I left convinced that dads ought to spend more time in the classroom. Far too often we view parental involvement in the school as having mothers stop in to help pour Kool-aid at Christmas parties. But it's important for adults just to be present, to demonstrate in the smallest ways that they are interested in what other children are doing.

Children receive rewards from parents at home often enough that it may not mean as much as mom and dad might think it does. But it means something to a young kid to have another adult walk into class, even a complete stranger, and nod approvingly at the day's project.

Positive reinforcement from a parent is very beneficial to a child, but it's just as important—if not more so—for a child to receive a word of encouragement or just a smile of caring from an adult who isn't a parent or teacher.

I'm convinced as much as Bronfenbrenner that adults should become involved in the lives of other children. And all we need to let them know is that we care. That's not asking much. Anyone can care.

Meanwhile, Brill Srock, a former all-star bowler who now runs Northfield Lanes in Rochester, has signed a contract with the Ladies Professional Association for one of its tournaments during the coming season.

Whether it will be held in January or May depends on the TV networks. But, at any rate, the top women bowlers in the land will be here.

Along with these two events, the pros also are certain to return to Hartfield Lanes in Berkley, where they have held forth for several years.

All of this action means that the Detroit area, long known as the Bowling Capital of the World, is being finally recognized by the professionals.

A STUBBORN No. 7 pin that wobbled but wouldn't fall cost Dick Beattie \$500 last Wednesday at North Hill lanes.

The Detroit all-star was leading by 40 pins going into the final game of the Stroh-Bonanza roll-offs and seemingly was headed for victory. He had won his first eight games with an average of 244.

Then, his opponent, Lee Beebe, of Maumee, Ohio, put on a rally with a string of nine strikes after a washout in the first frame. From then on the match was a toss-up and finally Lady Luck frowned on Beattie when the No. 7 pin wouldn't fall and he lost 267 to 647.

At that he picked up \$750—not bad for a few days work.

YOU WOULDN'T think that the captain of a team that finished 16th in a tournament would be proud as a peacock over the showing of her team. But then you haven't encountered Midge Poshka, one of the day managers at Westland Bowl.

"Don't forget," she said very proudly, "it was the women's national tournament. Just remember—16th in the nation—that's really something to be proud of when you consider our team was composed of the girls from just around here."

Iraq objects displayed

Ancient gold jewelry carved stucco figurines, bronze tweezers, silver coins, and cosmetic pots are among 180 objects on display through Sept. 15 in the University of Michigan Kelsey Museum of Ancient and Mediaeval Archaeology.

The exhibition entitled "Seleucia on the Tigris" includes objects which date from 319 BC to 215 AD and were uncovered during U-M excavations in Iraq during 1927-32 and 1936-37. Most of the items are being exhibited for the first time.

Conceived and organized by U-M graduate student Elizabeth Savage, the exhibit is in memory of U-M classical art and archaeology Prof. Clark Hopkins, who directed the university's final season of excavations at Seleucia in 1936-37. Hopkins died in 1976.

A former Rhodes scholar and alumnus of Yale and Oxford universities, Hopkins helped initiate the Great Books Program at the U-M, served as host for three series of U-M television programs, and was a member of the President's Commission on Aging. In 1973, the Kelsey Museum published his book, "The Architecture and Topography of Seleucia on the Tigris."

'The Spy Who Loved Me'

More kiss kiss, bang, bang action

"The Spy Who Loved Me" (PG), the latest film caper of Agent 007, James Bond, opens with some spectacular acrobatics on skis. Running true to form, this action opening is followed by the flashy, innovative main titles accompanied by sultry-voiced Carly Simon singing the title song.

Thus assured of the producer's and director's commitment to observe the established style for Bond movies, viewers can settle down to munch popcorn and watch the kiss kiss bang bang action.

Only the title of Ian Fleming's book was used for this movie. The screenplay is an original script; it's neither better nor worse than the novel, just different.

England's Roger Moore plays the well-groomed, libidinous agent for the third time. His almost constant companion in "The Spy" is Barbara Bach who plays a Russian agent, Major Anya Amasova.

THIS ANGLO-SOVIET cooperation is prompted by the evil hijinks of Karl Stromberg (Curt Jurgens). Stromberg, a kinky Nordic millionaire, has obtained a microfilm copy of a submarine tracking system which he has used to locate and capture a Soviet and a U.S. submarine.

Bond and Major Amasova are, so to speak, hot on the trail of the tracking system and the missing subs. They head for Stromberg's lair, Atlantis, a gigantic marine laboratory and manor off the coast of Sardinia. Stromberg's a Captain Nemo type with a lust to kill. His webbed fingers may have something to do with his preference for an aquatic environment.

The characters are the usual one-dimensional variety; even so, Jurgens is disappointing as the villain. If there is any movie in which an actor can give free rein to every means of developing a villainous character, it's a James Bond movie. Jurgens ignores this opportunity and plays Stromberg straight and undistinguished.

The movie does have more than its share of picturesque locations, both on land and underwater. Some early sequences in Egypt showing the great pyramids at Gizeh and the ancient temples at Thebes provide a handsome mini-travelogue. However, Bond movies aren't known for their educational content, but for their sexy women, fast action and mechanical marvels.

"The Spy Who Loved Me" abounds with all these components and boasts a new and novel array of weapons and gadgetry. The most notable piece of equipment is a sleek sports car. A customized Lotus "Esprit" was modified to navigate under water as well as on land.

THE REAL SCENE stealer, though, a character we're likely to see again since he was still swimming at the movie's end, is a man-giant called "Jaws." Played by 7-foot 2-inch, 315-pound Richard Kiel, Jaws is so-called because he has a mouthful of steel teeth. They look like they came from an auto collision shop—the kind that doesn't stay in business long.

Viewing the remains of one devastating encounter with Jaws, Major Amasova asks Bond, "What happened?" "Oh," replies the facile Bond, "he just dropped in for a bite."

The movie is brisk escapist-adventure with plenty of double entendres thrown in for laughs. Now if they could just find a James Bond who doesn't smirk all the time...

Egloff gets a shot at the pros

The chance to accomplish a life-long dream has been given to former Plymouth High School football star Ron Egloff.

After completing his college career at the University of Wisconsin this past spring, Egloff's high hopes of being drafted by a professional football team never became a reality.

But recently, the 1973 Plymouth graduate was given new inspiration when he was signed as a free agent with the Denver Broncos of the National Football League.

The 6-5, 232-pounder who played tight end for Wisconsin on a four-year

scholarship, will join the Broncos at the squad's pre-season training camp next month with ambitions of landing a spot on the team.

EGLOFF WAS headed for success after a most productive high school junior year as offensive end and line-backer for the Plymouth Rocks.

In his senior season at Plymouth, Egloff was overshadowed by the new wishbone rushing offense which head coach Tom Moshimer incorporated that year.

Egloff still managed to catch 25 passes that season and landed all-Observerland, all-Suburban Eight

League, and all-Metro team berths for a second-straight year.

After landing a scholarship at Wisconsin, Egloff became the Badgers' regular tight end in his junior season when he started all but two games. He caught eight passes for 78 yards in that season.

Egloff started every game his senior season and caught 20 passes to gain 308 yards and four touchdowns. That season gave Egloff a spot in the annual Blue-Gray all-star game.

Egloff had perhaps his finest day as a collegiate when he caught three passes—one for a touchdown—against the University of Michigan Wolverines.

The Plymouth griddier had another thrill in a game against the University of Nebraska.

Egloff caught one pass his entire sophomore season, but that was a nine-yard touchdown grab on national television which spelled the difference in a famous 21-20 upset victory over top-ranked Nebraska.

EGLOFF HAS two brothers who played college football, Randy at Yale and Dick at Arizona State.

His parents, Doug and Irene Egloff, are former Plymouth residents who recently moved to Sarasota, Florida.

Martucci, a resident of Plymouth Township, also played hockey for the Plymouth Hockey Association during his high school career.

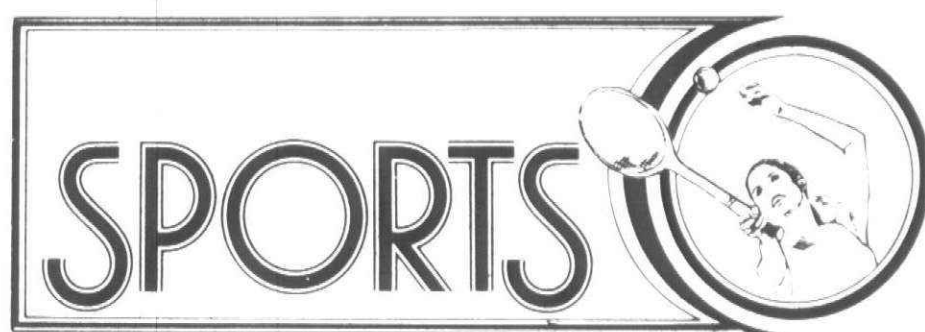
The 1975 graduate enters his junior year at the Wolverine school this fall.

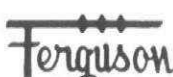

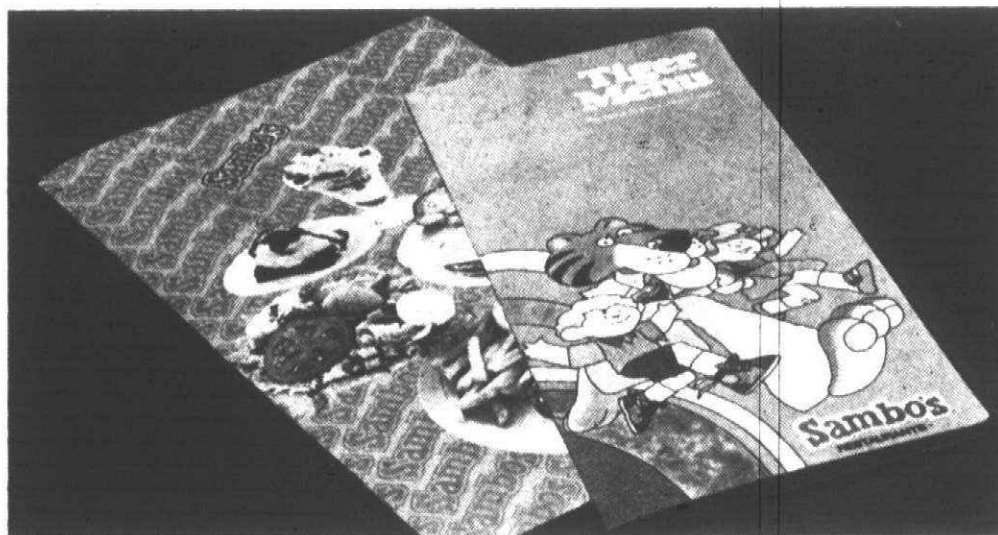

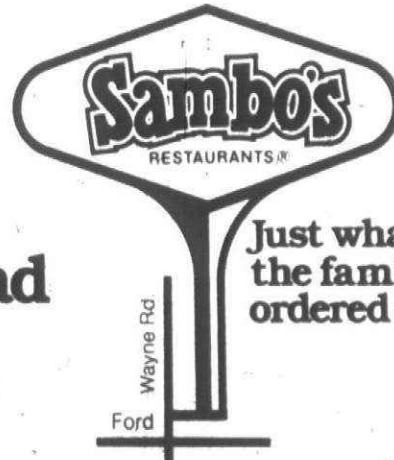

Skateboarding: a growing sport

Kick-turn, wrap around and 3-60 may seem like strange terms to the average person, but to a skateboard enthusiast they are a way of life.

"Skateboarding has become very popular and widely accepted throughout the United States in the last few years," commented Bryan Beardsley, who has accomplished national fame

for his performances on the skateboard.

Beardsley, 19, recently made an appearance at the Livonia Mall to help promote skateboarding and show area residents just how safe it can be.

Born in Akron, Ohio, Beardsley moved when he was seven to California and credits the change of scene for his success.

"I got started like everyone else. When the surf wasn't up I would hop

on the skateboard. Pretty soon, I just forgot about surfing and took up skateboarding."

Beardsley won fame in 1975 when he won the National Skateboarding High Jump championship with a world record jump of 42 feet. He was unable to attend last year due to knee surgery.

The popularity of skateboarding has boomed in the last few years, and Beardsley contended one of the major factors has been the safety associated with the sport.

"I always tell the kids to be sure to wear knee pads, elbow pads, a helmet and gloves," he said.

Another factor may be the dramatic changes in the skateboard. The wheels are now made of hard rubber and can turn with easier mobility. The sides of the board are turned up at an angle, making it easier to do stunts.

Skateboarding has become so sophisticated that a state legislator in California indicated he will introduce a bill which would ban motorized skateboards in the state.

Area stores report a tremendous sales increase this year on skateboards. "We could have sold a 1,000 skateboards but we didn't get our shipment in," said a representative of Griswold's of Wonderland.

Locally there is a skateboard park at Beech Daly between Six and Seven Mile. Areas are set aside for boarders to compete in various areas such as freestyle, speed racing or slalom.

Opportunity has knocked at Beardsley's door thanks to his boarding accomplishments. He landed a part in the movie "High School" in which he plays a heavy who causes trouble with his skateboard. The movie is being released this month by Universal Pictures.

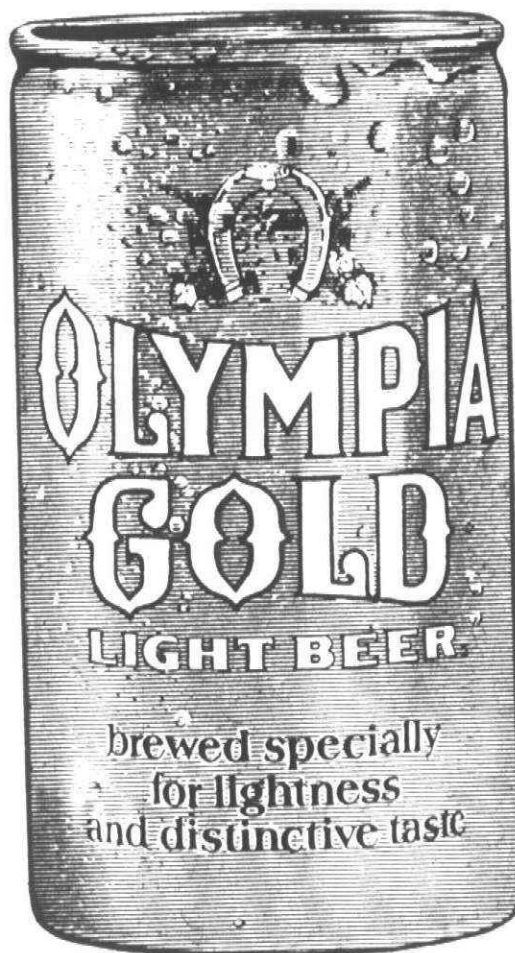

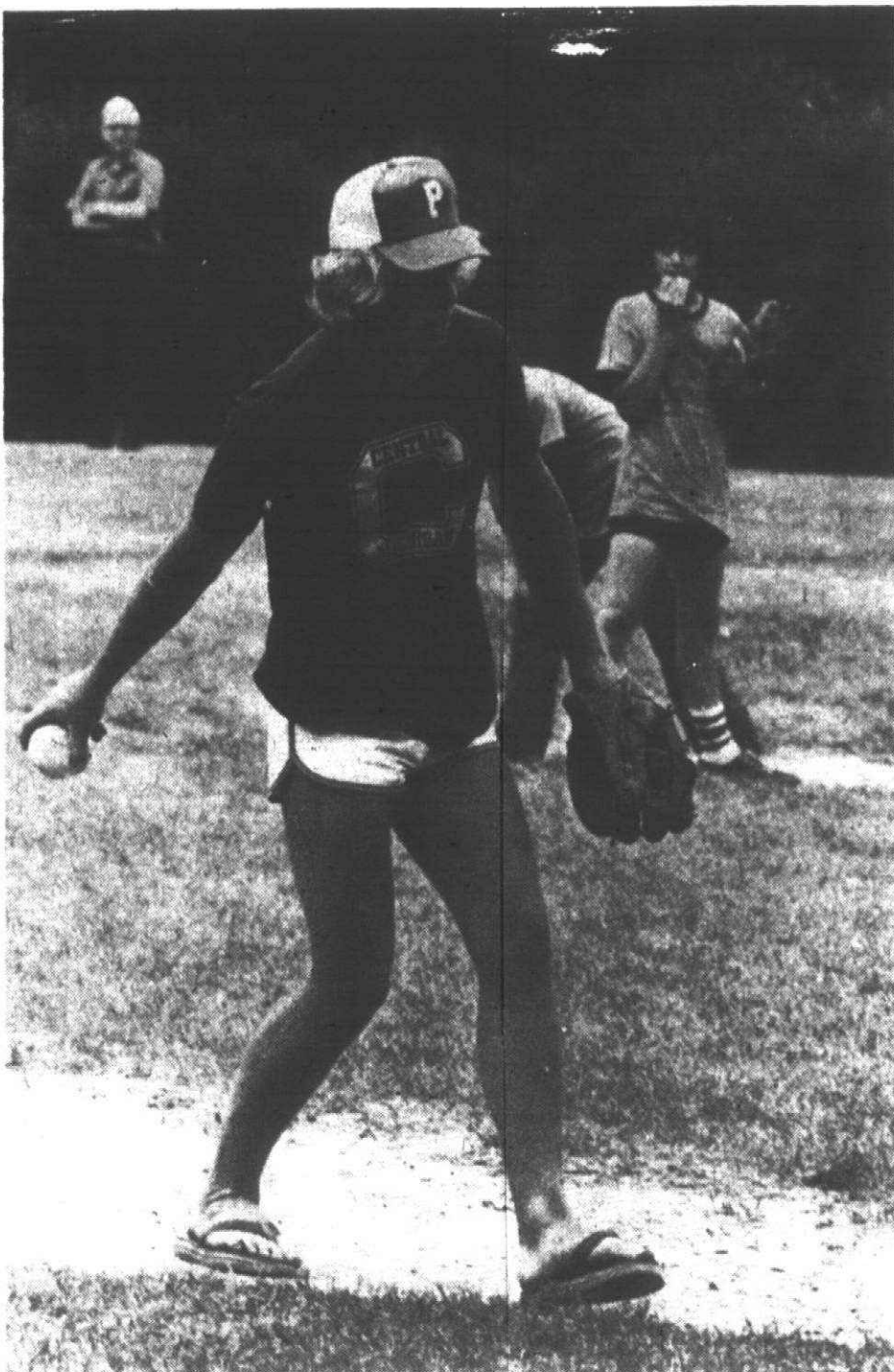

Playgrounds end 'nothing to do' blues

The summer vacation plaint, "What can I do? There's nothing to do around here," becomes a thing of the past once Plymouth youngsters investigate the activities at summer playgrounds sponsored by the city's parks and recreation department.

Each summer the city-owned parks are activated.

From 10 a.m. until 3:30 p.m., five days a week, neighborhood children gather at the playgrounds for games and crafts supervised by trained personnel.

There are baseball games, checkers and croquet tournaments, swimming, handicrafts, and side trips. Last Friday a busload visited the Detroit Zoo. Along with permission slips, the children handed in \$1.50 which was the total cost of transportation and admission. Most took sack lunches and a little spending money for refreshments at the zoo.

Some trips are just a walk uptown for icecream, but the youngsters and their leaders respond with enthusiasm.

"We're going to see Mark the Bird," announced one small girl at Hamilton Park.

THE CITY SUPPLIES supervision at six parks.

Sharyl Pelley and Meaghan Ford are at the Vest Pocket Park downtown on Ann Arbor Trail. This is a short-time facility for the youngsters of persons shopping in the downtown area.

Playground programs are planned and supervised by Don Lloyd and Shawn Bredin at Auburn, Greg Rosenquist and Julie Vick at Elm, Bob Smith and Peggy Cunningham at Hamilton, Mike Mullen and Barb Tatzka at

Sutherland, and Phyllis Cunningham and Steve Morman at Starkweather.

The supervisors are either college students or recent high school graduates. Their training includes first aid and procedure to follow in case of injuries.

They are responsible for the safety and cleanliness of the playground. They take care of the play equipment provided by parks and recreation, sports and crafts equipment.

Their lunch hours are staggered so there is always someone in attendance for the children who bring their lunches to the park. They know what to do in case of storms. Weekly Monday morning staff meetings coordinate activities in the five parks and the planning of one special event each week to whet the children's interest.

A LATE MORNING tour of the playgrounds revealed a spirited softball game in progress at Hamilton.

Bob Smith, playground supervisor, was pitching for for both teams and letting them hit.

With 11 players on each team and everybody hitting, the fielders were getting a good workout. Paul Sincok, a college student who works for the parks and recreation department during the summer, stopped by check equipment and fix the tetherball.

Youngsters at Starkweather had made vases out of pop bottles, masking tape and shoe polish in a crafts class under the direction of Sharon Uekert, a college sophomore who is an elementary education major.

Steve Morman was in charge while his partner was at lunch.

Danny and Kim Tarrow's parents had come to the playground to have

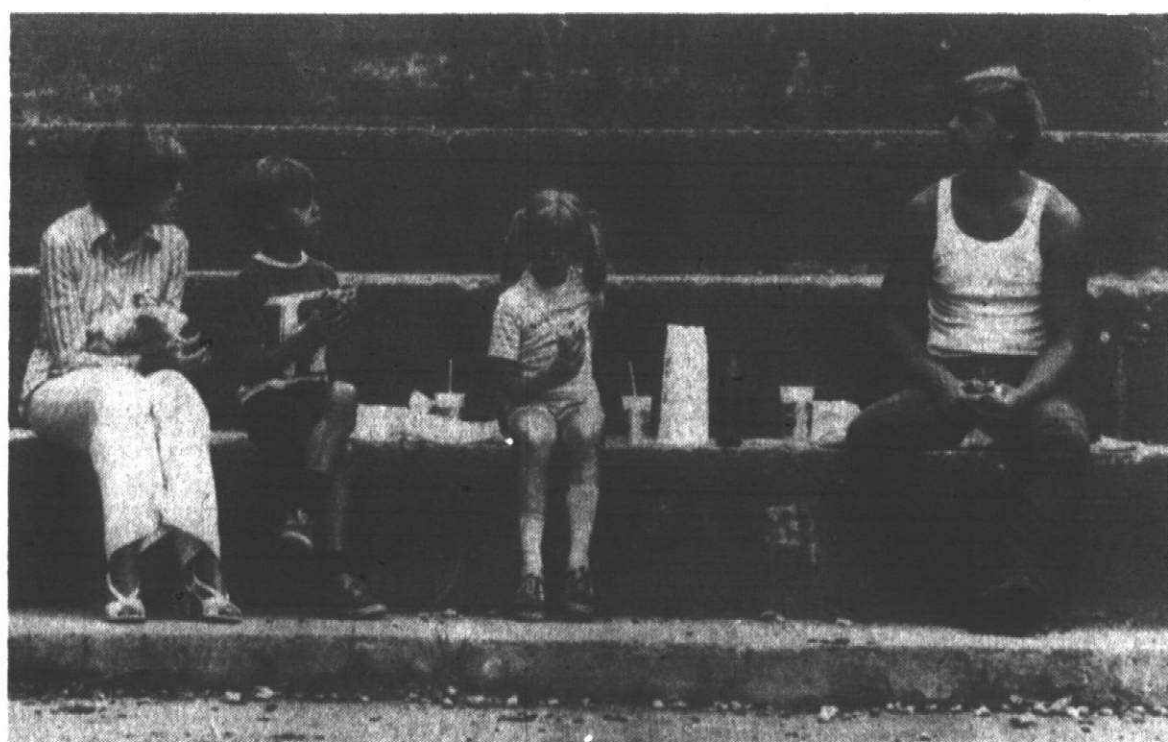

Time for students to ready arts, crafts for PCAC show

Where can an 11-year-old girl earn \$33 in just two days?

At the students' art booth in the annual arts and crafts show sponsored by the Plymouth Community Arts Council. The 1977, now a traditional part of the Plymouth Fall Festival, is scheduled for Sept. 10 and 11 at Central Middle School.

Each year the PCAC hosts a special booth where Plymouth-Canton students, kindergarten through 12th grade and June graduates, are invited to display their artistic creations. There is no charge for exhibiting, although the arts council does receive a 10 per cent commission on all items sold.

Students are encouraged to display small items which may be purchased by children who shop on allowance budgets. Prices for past booth items have ranged from two cents to \$50, with the biggest sellers falling in the 25-cent to \$2 range. Items displayed have included paintings, macrame, weaving, bookmarks, decoupage plaques, cloth play blocks, finger puppets, sand painting, sea-shell flowers and Christmas ornaments.

THE 11-YEAR-OLD who earned \$33 was Lynn Hasley who sold macrame hangers two years ago when the popularity of hanging baskets began to peak. This year Lynn, now 13, will be exhibiting in her fourth PCAC show. Her mother, Krys Hasley, will be chairwoman for the student's art booth.

Many students, like Lynn, have be-

come arts and crafts show regulars and the number of exhibits has increased.

Students' art profits were just \$89 at the first show in 1972. Last year, the income was \$475. Martha Vorech, 16, sold \$91 worth of small crafts ranging from painted rocks and paper bracelets to baby dolls.

Mileage magic rarely real

Be wary. The big worry over energy and the drive to increase car gas mileage may spawn an assortment of "miracle" additives and gadgets, warns the Automotive Information Council.

Generally, these chemicals or devices may appear to have great potential in theory or in the printed word but somehow lose their magic when put to the test.

For example, decade years ago, one manufacturer was forced to refund the purchase price to unhappy customers of its gadgets. The company had to stop selling the product. The product was an ignition coil with a fancy housing that did nothing for economy. It was sold as a replacement for the original equipment coil.

More than 40,000 had been bought over a three-year period for \$85 a set.

A CALIFORNIA firm extensively promoted a gadget with claims of 15-50 per cent improvement in gas mileage. A Sacramento newspaper asked university researchers to investigate. They found the unit had "only a minor impact on mileage, maybe none at all."

The manufacturer said the device worked by adding vapor from a special fuel to the carburetor. It not only claimed better economy but smoother operation, reduced engine wear and reduction of hydrocarbon emissions.

Tests also were made by the Environmental Protection Agency with similarly poor results.

Another company offered a gadget that would help propel a car across six states on one tank of gas—the company was indicted on 85 counts of mail fraud by a federal grand jury. The ads claimed New York to Chicago could be driven on two or three fill-ups. Don't count on such dramat-

ics. The quickest way to better economy is through weight reduction, and that is the biggest effort going on in the auto industry today.

Though we will be driving smaller and lighter cars, more V6 and four-cylinder engines than V8s and will probably settle for less variety of nameplates in the years ahead, the market for optional equipment will continue to be strong.

THE AUTOMOBILE can do a national transportation job without some of the extra-cost equipment, but people will continue to insist on creature comforts, according to industry forecasters.

Proof that comfort and convenience still sell is reflected in recently published figures on optional equipment sales. Three of every four cars sold in 1976 came with factory-installed air conditioning, and another 800,000 air conditioning units were installed by owners after the cars were shipped to dealerships. No one can argue that air conditioning uses more fuel, but a cool, comfortable car also makes for a safer driver.

Radios, another option, are expected to continue their popularity. More than 82 per cent of the 1976 cars sold with radios, and 13 per cent of the customers chose stereo tape units.

IN 1976, more than 92 per cent of the auto buyers went for automatic transmission. Another 70 per cent ordered a V8 engine.

The proportions on those units are expected to drop dramatically as more four- and six-cylinder power plants are introduced and manual transmission production is stepped up, all to reduce fuel consumption.

There are some things motorists just won't do without. They proved it in 1976 and undoubtedly will again in 1977.
