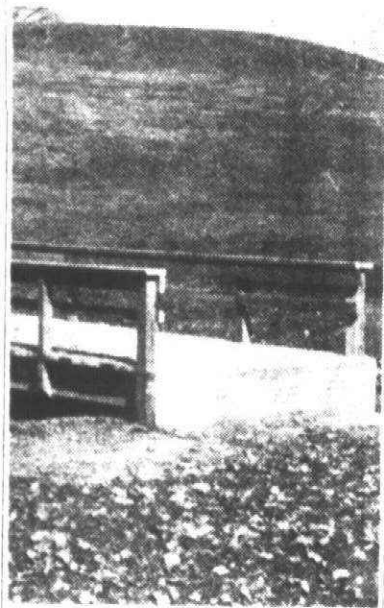

Witch guilty of defrauding widow

An admitted witch who leads a Michigan coven of 13 women has been found guilty of defrauding "a superstitious woman" out of \$4,500 by taking the money for downpayment Dec. 30 on a mobile home that had been sold three days before.

The defendant, Mrs. Lois Umerska of Canton Township, claims the \$4,500 check she received from Mrs. Anna Groves of Romulus and deposited in a bank was in fact a repayment of a cash loan to the woman Oct. 20, 1976.

After hearing final arguments by both lawyers, Wayne Circuit Judge Irwin Burdick declared the defendant "guilty on all counts: larceny by conversion and obtaining money under false pretenses." The larceny charge was dropped by mutual consent of the judge and the prosecutor—leaving the higher felony, "obtaining money (more than \$100) under false pretenses," which carries a maximum 10-year sentence.

Mrs. Umerska, 40, goes by the name "Lady Athena" when working professionally as a witch and in her associations in a group called the Church of Wicca.

To supplement her income, Mrs. Umerska does Tarot card readings at fairs and private parties. She sells a terrarium with the readings to stay within the law.

SHE APPEARED close to tears as she gathered around her family and

followers after the decision was announced. She said her unorthodox religious beliefs hurt her chances of receiving a fair trial and prevented the judge from believing her testimony.

A high-priestess in the New York-based Temple of Pandora, Mrs. Umerska said after the ruling, "I can't

believe this has happened. I can't believe anyone would believe that woman's story."

The case started last Wednesday and was tried without a jury. After the attorneys presented their closing statements, Judge Burdick explained that he attempted to find "what makes sense" in both sides' arguments.

Burdick claimed the victim of the crime, Mrs. Groves, was "taken in" and "defrauded" when Mrs. Umerska manipulated "a superstitious woman."

The motive for the crime, Burdick theorized, could be that the Umerskas moved into a \$55,000 new home in Canton in February and discovered they were taking a loss in the sale of their mobile home.

There was a wide disparity between both sides on just when the defendant met Mrs. Groves. Mrs. Umerska claims she met the Mexican-American woman "around July or August" of 1976 when the woman came to her previous home in Belleville for a card reading session.

IN COURT, Mrs. Groves said the first time she met Lady Athena/Mrs. Umerska was Halloween or Nov. 1, days the ad for the mobile home appeared in the Detroit News.

It was impossible for Mrs. Groves to have met her on Oct. 31 or Nov. 1, said Mrs. Umerska, because she was in Toledo, Ohio, during those "high holy days" in the Church of Wicca.

In fact, she told the court, she

brought a voodoo charm to the Halloween religious service that was given to her by Mrs. Groves to be tested for presence of a curse.

Mrs. Groves admitted to giving Mrs. Umerska a bag—which was supposed to be a good luck charm—that she had carried around with her since 1964, when "a Puerto Rican friend" gave it to her to bring good luck. But Mrs. Groves claims she gave the voodoo charm to Mrs. Umerska in late November, not before Halloween.

"It was supposed to protect me from anyone doing evil to me," explained Mrs. Groves. But when her husband died, and his will became hung up in probate court, and she suffered a ner-

vous breakdown, she suspected that maybe the charm was the cause of her bad luck.

The charm was examined at the temple by the witches, said Mrs. Umerska, and the "foul-smelling bag" was found to contain "dead things" such as bugs and leaves. The test for a curse proved negative, and the bag was burned.

IN HIS DECISION, the judge said Mrs. Umerska preyed on the widow's belief in supernatural powers and used it to control her and tell the woman how to handle her finances.

The defense repeatedly asked why it

Thumbs down on medical complex rezoning attempt

Mel Stein packed up his movie projector and \$4,000 scale model Monday night when the Canton Planning Commission denied his company's request for rezoning of 10 acres south of Meijer's Thrifty Acres to permit construction of a three-phase, \$30 million commercial medical complex.

Stein vowed to return to the Canton Township Board of Trustees at a future date to discuss plans for a medical center. But the vice-president of Great American Building Corp. snapped at a member of the press after the rezoning denial, saying, "It was a mistake to talk to you people. You've done more harm to the people of Canton than good."

STEIN MAY have been referring to reports from this newspaper and other local papers which quoted executives in two hospital planning agencies—the Greater Detroit Area Hospital Council (GDAHC) and the Comprehensive Health Planning Council (CHPC)—as saying that it would be nearly impossible to gain a certificate of need from the state necessary to build a general surgical hospital or nursing home. One hospital planner calls the area "wildly overbedded" at present and warned against possible resale of rezoned commercial property.

Stein, no relation to Canton Supervisor Harold Stein, said he felt factors such as the growing population of Canton and the "archaic" operation of the Wayne County General Hospital would cause the state to take another look at the hospital needs of the Plymouth-Canton area. But Lawrence Gareau, county public information coordinator, responded to Stein's comments by noting that the hospital received the highest accreditation possible from the

National Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals.

PLANNING COMMISSIONER Bart Berg made a motion to approve the corporation's rezoning request after the chairman of the planning body, Robert Padgett, informed the audience and board that an affirmative vote to rezone would not constitute site plan approval of the medical complex. Berg's motion was defeated 6-1.

Canton Planning Consultant George Peek said the present R-IBC zoning on the piece of property may not be ideal because the land is located behind Meijer's parking lot at Canton Center, south of Ford. But Peek said any rezoning to commercial south of Ford Road on Canton Center would be a precedent.

WHAT I'M SAYING is this is one piece of property with a significant effect on other pieces of property in that area," Peek said. "We should look at other pieces of property and try to determine what will happen to them if we rezone for commercial here."

Gus Matzo, planning commissioner, thought it might be appropriate to rezone the front of the parcel for medical office buildings and zone the rear of the 10-acre lot multiple residential to provide a buffer between commercial and residential areas. Other board members thought Matzo's idea had merit and deserved further consideration.

Canton Supervisor Harold Stein said Tuesday he remains a supporter of the project because of the estimated \$100,000 tax revenue the project would generate if all three stages were built—including a 200-bed hospital and 200-bed nursing home.

Isbister parents told no money for a teacher

A fair number of Isbister Elementary parents attended Monday night's Board of Education meeting to hound school board members about the unequal treatment their children are receiving in the classroom.

It marked the second time Isbister parents have directed a formal plea to the school board to hire one additional teacher to resolve overloaded class sizes for the first and second grades.

Betty Griffith of Plymouth Township, who serves as the group's spokesperson, submitted a petition, signed by 240 parents, calling for an additional teacher to Tom Yack, school board president.

Bruce Vance, appearing on behalf of the Isbister PTG, told the board his group supports the hiring of one new

teacher to alleviate class load as opposed to switching extended school year tracks.

But the school board responded to the parents' complaints exactly the way it did two weeks ago by expressing its sympathies and refusing to act because of the district's financial woes.

"IF THE BOARD were to act on this concern, we would open the doors for other situations similar to yours," Yack told the Isbister group.

Said Trustee Richard Arlen: "We have to deal with the whole district, not isolate one school from the rest. There is a lot of merit in what you're saying, but there are other schools sharing similar difficulties."

Supt. John M. Hoben said there were 26 classes in the district that exceeded

class loads of 33. The Isbister class size in question currently stands at 32.

The school board's explanation, however, did not satisfy the irate parents.

"Is there no meaning to that petition?" asked Marlene Kuhns of Plymouth Township. "That's why we're here. My child has to go in the hall to study because the teacher can only handle so many kids. Parents at other schools may not be concerned, but we are."

Said Louise Townley of Plymouth Township: "My daughter is suffering in her class. My taxes are more than \$3,000 a year and I expect more for my money than that. Maybe we should re-examine where the money's going and change our priorities a little."

THE SCHOOL BOARD approved the hiring of one teacher Monday night for Smith Elementary from funds that were secured by the resignation of an educator in a different school.

After the meeting, Hoben said a study in New England has found that there is no optimum class size in terms of either pupil achievement or teaching processes.

"I don't know where they came up with 32 as the magic number, but we have much more serious problems than Isbister," Hoben said.

Mrs. Griffith said her group has come up with a new idea to subsidize the cost of a teacher and will approach Yack with it. "Since they won't be getting the \$10,000 raise, we're asking Mr. Yack to put a proposal to the board using that money for a teacher's salary."

"I honestly don't believe the story about no money being available. I think they have it somewhere," Mrs. Griffith said.

The school board has not heard the last from the Isbister parents. "We're not gonna give up," Mrs. Griffith said. "We're going to keep the fight going, get some new blood involved and keep going to every meeting."

International duo's pay fluctuates daily

The next time you look at your paycheck and curse the inflation rate, think of Edward Henrie and Joseph DeLauro.

They've got more than inflation nipping away at their weekly income.

Firemen go to nursing home twice

Canton fire fighters were called to the Dion Nursing Home, 43825 Michigan Ave., twice last Sunday.

Early that day a woman in the convalescent home phoned in a report that she smelled burning wires in the auditorium. Canton fire fighters discovered a short in the main panel and by Monday the defect was corrected, said Fire Chief Mel Paulin.

At about 5:20 p.m., a fire broke out in the laundry room of the nursing home.

"A girl put a mop inside the dryer that was oil-treated," explained Nick Delmese, assistant administrator at Dion Nursing Home. "It caught fire but it wasn't serious. The aftermath of the fire was more trouble, the sprinkler flooded the area around the dryers."

While the fire was extinguished, Lt. Arthur Winkel moved the residents of the home into a cafeteria.

Although both men live in the Plymouth-Canton community, they work at the University of Windsor in Canada. Each time they get paid, they have to convert their wages from Canadian to U.S. currency.

And that's where the rub comes in. The Canadian dollar ain't what it used to be. In fact, each man loses 10 cents on every dollar he converts.

"The conversion rate is really heavy," commented Henrie, "but I guess I'm willing to ride it out. My question is where does it end?"

DeLauro, however, expressed less concern over the 10 per cent loss. "It's only money. It's a pain in the neck to lose it. But I'm not going to get too excited."

HENRIE HAS been with the university for a little more than two years. When he first started teaching in the finance department, he said he was making money on the conversion.

"It wasn't much, but I actually came out a little ahead in the change to American money. It didn't really start to hurt until last summer."

Henry said that in July of last year, he was only losing one to two per cent on the conversion. Then it started creeping up and by this September it was a flat 10 per cent loss.

"Last Friday when I cashed my check I got 90 cents on the dollar. That's the lowest the exchange rate has been in 40 years."

Although the drop in the Canadian dollar is cutting into both men's life-

Canton may test kids' candy

Make-believe witches and goblins who live in Canton Township may be spared an unpleasant end to an evening of trick-or-treating by running their goodies through a metal detection device at the Canton police station.

Police officers will man the machine from 5:30 to 10 p.m. in the trailer behind township hall on Geddes between Canton Center and Michigan—as long as a township attorney says Canton is not liable for contaminated candy undetected by the device.

If the attorney gives the go-ahead,

parents must sign a waiver releasing Canton Township of responsibility for the candy before goodies are sent through the machine.

Canton officials say they will not run the program if parent-signed waivers will not eliminate the possibility of lawsuits against the township.

"I THINK THIS is a great idea, unless the attorney advises us to say out of it," said Police Chief Walter MacGregor. "Running candy through the device is a good dose of preventative medicine. Hopefully, if there is anything in the candy, we'll find it."

According to MacGregor, the

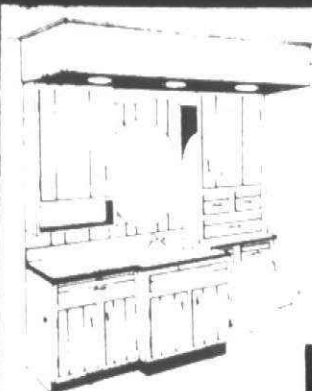
machine is unable to detect metal in candy that is wrapped in foil nor can it detect non-metal contaminants.

ITT Industrial and Automation Systems in Plymouth has agreed to loan Canton Township the metal detection device for free. MacGregor said But the company has refused to guarantee the machine can detect all contaminated candy.

The chief said police reserve Louis Stevens and his wife, Karen, came up with the idea.

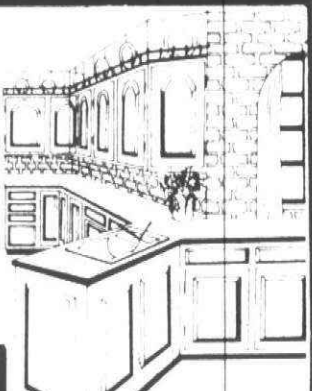
MacGregor said he knows of no reports of contaminated Halloween candy in Canton in past years.

Churches rent; schools pay?

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education Monday approved leasing Hulsing Elementary School to the Mt. Zion Lutheran Church in Canton, but also sounded a warning to other church groups.

The school district presently leases its buildings to a number of church groups for Sunday morning worship services for a fee of \$23 to \$30 per hour to cover the cost of utilities.

But there is growing suspicion among school officials that the church services are costing the schools more

in utilities than the amount of money received from the leases.

Supt. John Hoben confirmed there was a \$3,000 difference in utility bills between two different school buildings with the only visible variation being the church services. Although Hoben said he doubts the services account for the extra \$3,000 by themselves, a study will be done to evaluate the source of the extra utility costs.

"If this type of function is running beyond the cost of rental, then we better look into it," Hoben told the school board.

Fund for library is getting fatter

Money in the fund to establish a Canton Township library wouldn't exactly make a millionaire blink.

Grand total in the account at the Wayne Bank is now up to \$145—a substantial increase over the \$10 account first opened by Supervisor Harold Stein last month but far short of the minimum \$263,000 needed to start a local library.

Although township officials have asked for donations to the account, only one club and three private citizens have contributed money so far.

The United Democratic Club of Canton fattened the account with its \$100

donation Tuesday night. Other contributions have come from Stein, Canton resident Sue Mundo and deputy treasurer Mike Gorman, who lives in Westland.

STEIN FIRST asked for donations to the library fund last summer as an alternative to a library millage. But no one had donated anything until last month, when Stein marched over to the bank with his own \$10 contribution.

Although township officials do not expect donations to reach \$263,000, they say a "hefty" library fund could offset the amount of township funds needed to establish the facility. Start-up costs not covered by donations would have to be financed by the general fund. The level of donations needed has not been set.

According to a feasibility study conducted by the accounting firm of Seidman & Seidman, Canton could operate its own library on the third floor of the new administration building for less than the township now contributes to the Dunning-Hough Library in Plymouth.

Canton could operate its own library for \$100,000 a year, according to the accountant's report. An additional \$163,000 would be needed to purchase a minimum supply of books and shelving materials. Township officials would have to spend another \$110,000 over the first five years of the library's operation to increase the supply of books and materials to a level deemed acceptable by the Wayne County Federated Library System.

Board hoses down car wash

Traffic congestion on Ford Road Tuesday prompted Canton Township Board members to deny a rezoning request that would have permitted construction of an automatic car wash on the north side of Ford between Sheldon and Canton Center.

The board denied Wilbur N. Lokey's request for a commercial C-2 zoning out of fear that the car wash would generate more traffic on the already-congested road.

Robert Nulty, Colony Car Wash on Ann Arbor Road in Plymouth opposed the rezoning, saying his business is smaller than the facility proposed by Lokey and it can handle 105 cars an hour.

Lokey's property next to the Super Bowl is now zoned highway-oriented, a zoning that allows construction of hotels, theaters, lumber yards, restaurants and recreation centers.

Board members voted 4-2 against the proposed rezoning. Supervisor Harold Stein, who owns a car wash in Westland, abstained. Clerk John Flodin and Trustee Eugene Daley voted in favor of the rezoning.

Doctor asks for new trial in sex crime

A Westland physician who was sentenced to prison this week for sexually assaulting one of his female patients has filed a motion for a new trial.

Dr. Chelliah Thangavelu, a Canton Township resident, was convicted last month of first-degree criminal sexual conduct. A female patient had testified that he had fondled her and engaged in oral sex with her when she took her children to his office for examinations.

Wayne Circuit Judge Irwin Burdick Monday sentenced Thangavelu to three to 10 years in prison. According to a court spokesman, Thangavelu's motion for a new trial will be heard Dec. 2.

Last week the state Medical Practice Board suspended Thangavelu's license to practice medicine. The board will hold a hearing Nov. 4 to determine whether his license should be revoked.

Before Burdick passed sentence, Thangavelu's attorney submitted a petition signed by approximately 130 of Thangavelu's patients who asked that the judge be lenient with the doctor.

Thangavelu is a citizen of Singapore and a resident alien in this country.

Witch says she's innocent

took Mrs. Groves almost three months to report the alleged swindle to police. Judge Burdick said that fearing repercussions, Mrs. Groves "would have washed floors at the Umerska home if it would help to get her money back."

But, after helping the woman move into her new Canton home, the judge said she was finally forced to take the matter to the police to be paid.

Defense Attorney Richard Monash argued that if anyone "was an easy mark" for a swindle, it was Mrs. Umerska, the defendant. "Because of her beliefs, her credibility was worth little," he said.

Mrs. Umerska added that the prosecution agreed to drop the case if the money was paid. But she says she decided to "go public" about being a witch to fight the charges. On Monday afternoon Mrs. Umerska vowed to appeal the guilty verdict but her attorney said he'd meet with his client next week to decide what will be done.

MONASH SAID he thought the

defense had raised enough serious questions that there would be "a reasonable doubt" that his client defrauded the woman.

First, he said, if his client had intended to swindle Mrs. Groves, why wouldn't she have demanded cash which couldn't be retraced?

Secondly, the defense attorney called the independent testimony of Wayne Bank teller Keith Dolker "pathetic." Dolker told the court he remembered hearing something about money for a mobile home when the two women came in to the bank Dec. 30.

"Mr. Dolker has the sheer audacity, under oath, to claim that as of Tuesday and Wednesday of last week, something triggered his photographic memory, allowing him to recall (what was said) some 10 months before," Monash said in his closing plea for acquittal.

Monash mentioned that Dolker testified that he was wearing a blue shirt, blue pants and blue jacket on the day

of Dec. 30, when the alleged swindle took place. "That is the biggest farce of anything laid before this court," Monash said.

Most damaging to Mrs. Umerska's case, said Judge Burdick, was the fact that she had no receipt for the \$4,500 she supposedly lent to Mrs. Groves on Oct. 20.

Mrs. Umerska produced a receipt book at the trial which she filled out, noting "repayment of debt" and dated Dec. 30. But Mrs. Umerska said the only record of the \$4,500 cash loan was an I.O.U. written by Mrs. Groves that she says was returned to the widow Dec. 30 when the loan was repaid.

The judge said he cannot believe that a college-educated "business-woman" like Mrs. Umerska would have failed to keep a record of a \$4,500 transaction with a woman she had only known for at most a matter of months.

Sentencing of the mother of six has been scheduled for 9 a.m. Dec. 6.

styles, neither one is considering moving their families across the border.

"I lived in Canada before," said DeLauro, who now lives with his wife and daughter in Canton Township. "I've been back here for 10 years now and I'm going to stay."

DeLauro teaches in the art department, and he said he is able to supplement his income by selling his art work. "I have just recently completed three large commissions which help out quite a bit. If I didn't have those, I'd feel the pinch a little more."

In addition to his daughter who is

living at home, DeLauro's wife and two sons are in college. The tuition payments he said, are beginning to be noticed.

HENRIE, WHO HAS two young children, said his savings have been suffering along with the Canadian dollar.

"We can still pay our bills. But there's less left over to put away. We have to use more and more of our income to just meet expenses."

Henrie's wife, Nancy, also said she was able to manage the day-to-day household expenses but had to stay on a tighter budget. "It hasn't been that bad yet," she commented, "but there's

not a whole lot of money left over for extras."

As part of a general economy move, Henrie said, he and his wife have cut down on their entertainment. "We don't go out to dinner as much as we used to. Lately we try to go out for lunch instead—it's a little cheaper."

However, he was firm in his decision to stay this side of the border. "Sure, you think about moving. But we've lived in Plymouth Township since 1966. Our kids have gone to school here and our roots are here. I would be very difficult to just pull up and go."

Besides, both Henrie and DeLauro agreed that even with the low exchange on the Canadian dollar, it was still cheaper to live in this country. Housing, food, and the cost of living in general, they said, were much higher in Canada.

"As long as the conversion doesn't dip too much lower, I think we can ride it out," said Henrie. "A move would be a long-term decision. I'm hoping that this is a short-term problem."

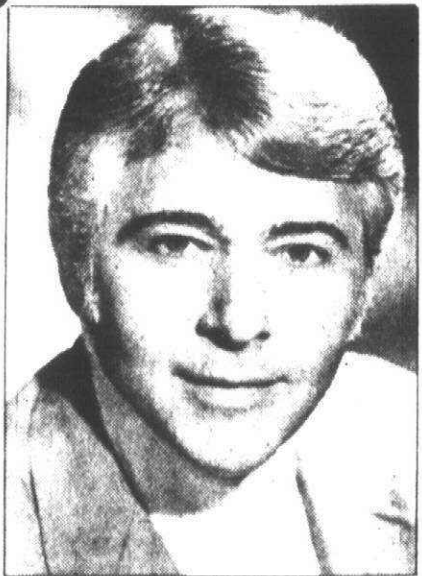

Goals spark mild debate

A goal based curriculum teaching model, expected to easily pass at Monday's Plymouth-Canton Board of Education meeting, was questioned by several board members and will have to be re-considered at a future meeting.

The school administration is proposing goal based curriculum as the basic model for the school district for "program planning, curriculum development and instructional improvements over the next three years."

Goal based curriculum has been in the planning for the past year and thoroughly explained to the school board in numerous workshops and presentations. The intent of the goal based approach is to enable the school district to:

- Make program changes based on the learning needs of students.

- Foster the integrity of sound instructional programs.

- Clarify the purposes of education at the local level.

- Provide a yardstick for program evaluation.

- Develop meaningful and effective programs and services.

- Establish a basis for long-range planning and systematic educational development.

- Make available to instructional and administrative staff a tool to aid them in making decisions with respect to what is being done, as well as might be done.

"How does this differ from what we're doing now?" asked Trustee Joseph Gray of the goals. "I would hope we have been implementing most of these for quite some time."

"I'd like to vote 'no' on this but considering the circumstances, only four board members were present, making it impossible for any measure to be approved without unanimous support. I won't," said Richard Arlen, school board vice-president.

"I see this as a general statement that leads me up in the air waiting for the next landing spot with no road map to get me there," Arlen said of the model.

"I'm shocked," was President Thomas Yack's response to Gray and Arlen. "We had a presentation from Dr. Michael Homes and not two questions came from this board. Since then, numerous communications have come from Homes with dollar figures attached."

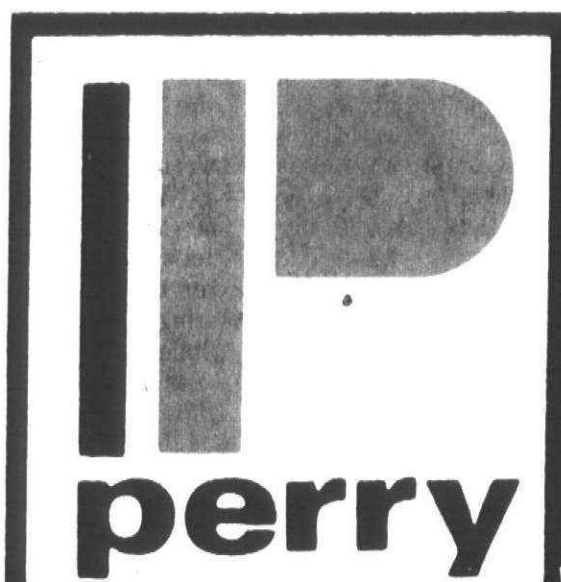
"And here we're leaving the impression we're unsatisfied without giving specific directions for the administration to come back with."

"This is the first time we have had a road map in black and white that will take us somewhere," said Treasurer Stephen Harper. "From what I've seen, goal-based curriculum has been successful in other districts and will work here."

Homes, obviously upset by the negative reaction to the model, offered to spend three hours with the school board and explain goal based curriculum in detailed fashion.

"I don't think you can get much more specific than this program," Homes said of his curriculum model.

"This program is clear as can be and is not fuzzy as charged," Yack added.

Training undergoes transition

Enrollment in Dale Carnegie courses is not only increasing but the training program has made some unusual changes in its format.

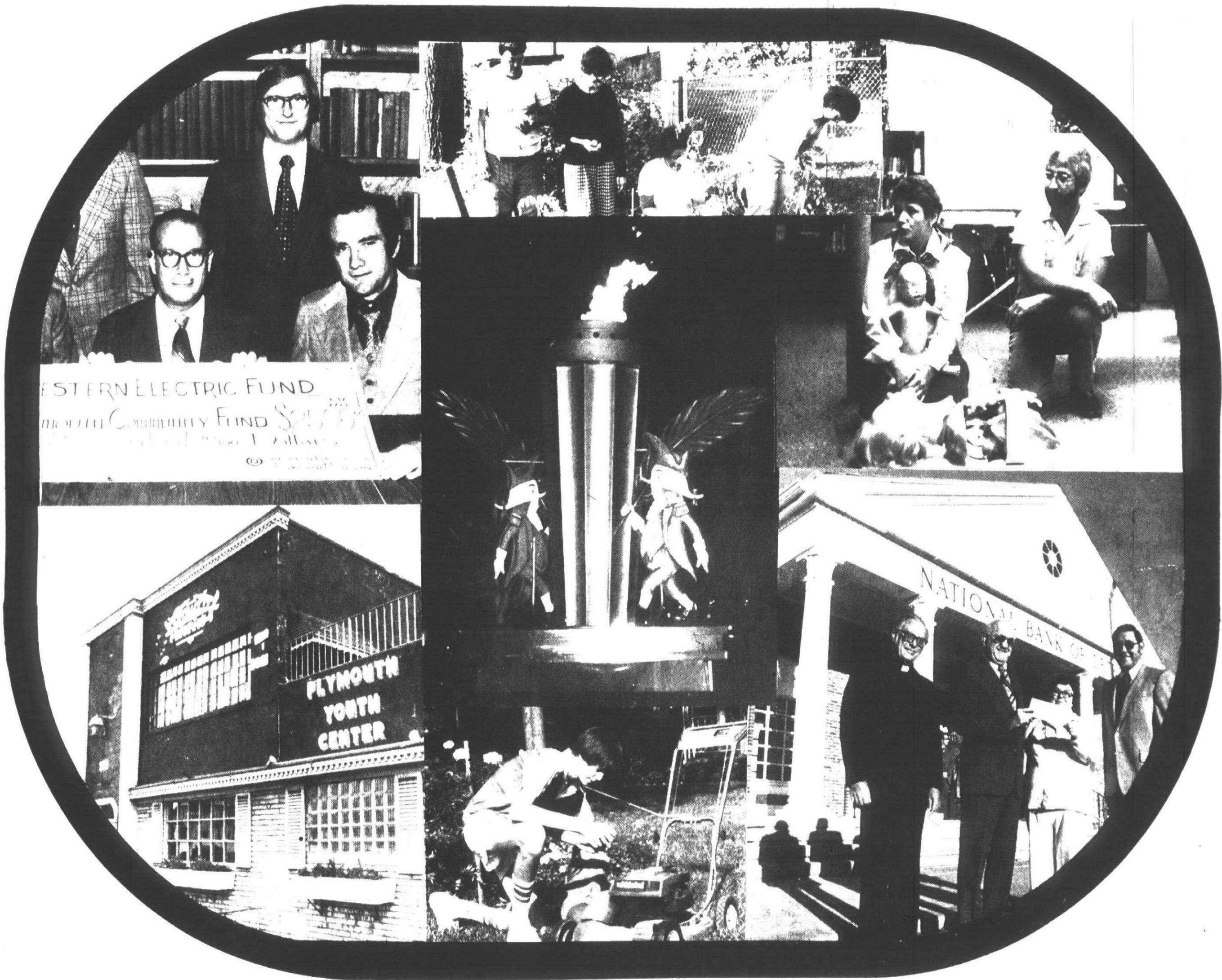

West goes abroad for reunion

When Earl West and his wife Chloe left Plymouth two months ago to visit their daughter in Colombia, they thought they would be getting away from inflation. Instead they ran into more of it.

"When we arrived in Cali, our daughter's home town, we learned that the inflation was up 48 per cent over a year ago," Earl said. "That was bad enough, but the rate is up 148 per cent in Argentina."

The Wests had a dual purpose in visiting South America. First, it would be a grand vacation. Second, they would be babysitting for their daughter Mary Jane, who is making quite a name for herself in socio-biology and was on a speaking tour of Europe.

"Things are a lot different this time," West said, "than they were when we were down there two years ago. Everything is about twice as high in price as it is up here and yet, some things seem to be lower."

"You can get a filet mignon dinner

for \$6.50, but it is a different type of beef. The folks down there don't age their meat. And while the filet seemed cheap, sugar was scarce, if you can imagine that in a country where it is grown."

West explained that most of the sugar is exported for higher prices and very little is left for home consumption.

"In the markets we found eggs at 90 cents a dozen, which is more than we pay at home. And Kellogg's Corn Flakes were seven cents an ounce, which also is double what we pay in Plymouth," said West.

He added that gas is subsidized by the government and that most people down there ride buses.

"Those buses are something different," he said. "The passengers are jammed in all the interior space and then fill up the outside rails, while pigs and produce are carried on the top."

"If you wanted to drive your own car," he continued, "the price of gas is 30 cents a gallon now. It was only 15

cents a gallon two years ago."

The Wests were fascinated by the bus system, which serves the city of one million inhabitants, 250 miles southeast of Bogota, the capital.

"When I saw a bus with a sign reading black and white," he said "It bugged me. It was their way of handling the integration problem. Later, I found, that for the benefit of persons who can't read, the buses are painted different colors for different routes."

"If a fellow wanted to, he could ride all over the city just by selecting right color."

While the buses fascinated the Wests they also found something even more surprising.

"You don't need a prescription for

any kind of medicine in the drug stores," Earl went on. "I felt that I was would need some of my regular medication and wondered not only if I could get it but what it would cost."

"My daughter then told us that there is no prescriptions needed for any kind of medicine and the druggists are well stocked with everything."

Earl also recalled his surprise at how Columbians use beef. "Most of them eat rice or some other South American dish. There is little beef. They never age it. When they butcher an animal it is cut into pieces that are sold right away. The people are told to keep it refrigerated for several days before they attempt to prepare it for a meal."

Resident commands military war camp

An Army Reserve prisoner of war camp, commanded by Lt. Col. Gordon C. Krinke of Plymouth, recently assumed control over two Army Reserve units in Jackson.

The 301st Military Police Prisoner of War Camp has taken over administrative control of the 303rd Military Police Company and the 323rd Military Police Detachment (criminal investigation). All three units are subordinate to the 300th Military Police Command, which is headquartered on Schoolcraft in Livonia.

The wartime missions of the units include operation of prisoner of war camps as well as other military police functions. The command's members hold down fulltime civilian jobs but participate in weekend drills, periodic training camps and occasional tours of active duty.

The command change substantially expands the responsibilities of Krinke, of Caprice Dr., Plymouth.

THE SHIFT increases the number of soldiers under Krinke's charge by almost a third, from some 250 to almost 330. And it triples the number

of subordinate units he must supervise.

Formerly, besides the 301st's own troops, only Saginaw's 357th Military Police Company (guard) came under Krinke's supervision.

Purpose of the change is to reduce the "span of control" for the 300th and Fort Wayne headquarters.

Krinke has been 301st command for a year, and also is the unit's staff administrative assistant, the fulltime civil service employee who runs a reserve unit's day-to-day business.

Krinke, who grew up in Detroit and attended Wayne State University, served for two years as an Army enlisted man in the Pacific in World War II. In 1949 he joined the Army Reserve in Detroit and became part of the 300th a decade later when that unit was formed.

Before assuming his civil service post, Krinke was a member of the Detroit Police Department. The colonel lives in Plymouth with his wife Sylvia and their daughter Tracy, a student at Plymouth Canton High.

The 300th MP Command comprises 28 units and more than 1,400 reservists in five states.

SEMCOG strips self of power

Reversing the position it has taken for months, the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments has stripped itself of almost all power to appoint members of a new Area Water Quality Board which it is setting up.

authority in all policy decisions of the seven-county voluntary planning agency, voted 48-21 at the Oct. 20 meeting to take away its own power to appoint municipal and township representatives to the 27-member water quality board.

Instead, those appointments will be made by caucuses of cities, villages and townships within each of the seven counties.

The general assembly, in a 4-1 show of hands, then approved the water quality board structure for which SEMCOG will make only three technical appointments. The preliminary plan, approved by the general assembly in July, had SEMCOG making 14 appointments.

"AT THE LAST general assembly meeting," said Southfield Councilman John Marcovsky, "the structure was approved the way it should have been."

Marcovsky noted the early structure called for caucuses within counties to nominate three persons, one of whom would have been picked by the general assembly to serve on the water quality board.

"Any one of those three would be satisfactory to us in Oakland County," Marcovsky told the general assembly. "But they should also be acceptable to you."

Marcovsky's amendment to return appointing power to SEMCOG failed in a show of hands.

Lathrup Village Mayor Richard Cogger replied that public hearing comments indicated strong sentiment "that no one agency should control the AWQB. Remember, SEMCOG is a planning body. You (Marcovsky's amendment) have set up a system where you're watching over yourself."

"Fifty per cent of eligible governments don't belong to SEMCOG," Cogger went on. "And if you (SEMCOG) make all those appointments, you could find yourself with 50 names to choose from."

"I ATTENDED a hearing," answered Livonia Councilman Jerry Raymond. "The numerical count was for SEMCOG alone to make appointments, with a strong minority for what Mr. Marcovsky proposes (14 of 27)."

"Mayor Cogger is wrong when he suggests the AWQB would not be checking on ourselves. Rather, we should be checking to see if the plan is going to be implemented."

That was the heart of the matter. Delegates like Raymond, Marcovsky and Oakland County Commissioner Larry Pernick (D-Southfield) argued that if SEMCOG's water quality plan were to be implemented, then SEMCOG must appoint the board which is to carry it out. Otherwise, they said, a board answerable to purely parochial interests would fail to carry out the areawide plan and be hesitant about carrying out coordinating functions with uncooperative local units.

Cogger, chairman of SEMCOG's Council on Environmental Strategy, and delegates like Oakland County Commissioner Robert Page (R-Birmingham) reversed themselves since the July meeting and took a different approach.

Said Page: "Since then, we've done some soul-searching. We support the cities, villages and townships in their desire to directly appoint members of the AWQB."

RAYMOND RAISED a legal question: Would not SEMCOG be creating—in the countywide caucuses—another layer of government? How would that new layer hold its AWQB appointees accountable if it had no officers, no structure, no offices?

Afterwards, Raymond admitted: "We just didn't have the votes. We knew it."

The AWQB structure is the first part of a plan to achieve goals of the 1972 federal Clean Water Act. The federal law calls for an areawide plan.

From SC to buckwheat pancakes

Chester 'retires' to grist mill

By JACK W. HOFFMAN

Lots of people retire. But not a whole lot of them "retire to a mill."

Leonard Chester of Livonia smiles, pushes back his chair and savors his own comment. It rolls off his tongue, sweet as a buckwheat pancake, and he likes the taste.

He's lived with the thought of this unusual retirement day and night since taking a bold and admittedly impulsive step six Christmases ago.

The Schoolcraft College instructor went out that Christmas week in 1970 and bought himself a grist mill. And now, after two careers, he's preparing to retire to a third—nursing Millbrook Mills in central Michigan.

"I'll live there in the old house and spend my life with my hobbies," said Chester, who counts among those hobbies the restoration and operation of Millbrook. "Nothing commercial, mind you, just grinding a little flour to show visitors how the oldtimers did it."

Chester will move to his mill at the end of this school year after 12 years at Schoolcraft as a manufacturing instructor.

Before joining Schoolcraft, he had worked for 26 years in the tool and die trade. But at the age of 39, he decided to go to college. The day his daughter graduated from high school, he picked up his college diploma. And along the way he also earned a master's degree.

But back to the mill.

Chester's been an old engine buff most of his life. One day a fellow member in the Saginaw Valley Steam Club mentioned he'd heard about an old mill for sale 129 miles out of Mt. Pleasant.

He visited the place—the little village of Millbrook—and found decaying

old buildings—the mill, a blacksmith shop and a farmhouse.

Milling equipment had been removed, destroyed or broken; the water wheel was missing, the dam and millpond were gone. Weeds and brush had grown up around the buildings. What's more, the mill building "sort of leaned" into the weather, just a shadow of the once proud structure erected in 1908—on the site of an earlier mill built in 1868 and on the site of a still earlier shingle mill.

In short, Millbrook Mills was a sorry sight.

But, impulsively, Chester bought it. "It wasn't a very smart thing to do," he admitted. "What I bought was a lot of work."

Yet, Chester didn't suffer any "post-purchase blues."

The mill occupied most of his spare time—summers and weekends—in the back-breaking task of restoring it to life. Today, Millbrook is a handsome, working reminder of Michigan's early history; and Chester's understandably proud of it.

"You can't imagine what it takes to restore a mill," he said, explaining that he knew next to nothing about milling at the time. While battling the brush and making repairs, he launched an intensive study of mills. He visited most of the active old mills in the East, carefully examining equipment and milling procedures.

In Michigan, he visited the few remaining mills, including those at Parshalville, Argentine, Hodunk and Podunk.

And along the way, he purchased old parts and old equipment to replace those missing from his mill. Even so, he had to make many of the parts himself.

Fanning mills, polishing mills, separators, belt elevators, milling stones, water wheel and a lot of other equipment and parts had to be purchased or built—not to mention rebuilding the dam and the millpond, cleaning and the mill race and the tail race, and literally straightening up the leaning building.

He designed and fabricated the giant steel waterwheel at Schoolcraft.

He bought three pairs of millstones out of the South, cementing the mill's original stones into the masonry fence next to his house at Millbrook.

He poured 94 gallons of paint ("the wheat germ just soaked right through it") his savings and his college salary into the mill. He figures it's cost him \$40,000—including the purchase price.

Last year, he reached a milestone in his hobby.

"It was July Fourth, of course. What better time to celebrate the occasion," said Chester. His ex-wife at his side, Chester cheered as the wheel began to turn for the first time since Millbrook ceased operation in 1941.

can't tell you how exciting the

moment was for me. It was a dream come true."

What do people of Millbrook think about his hobby?

"Oh, they're friendly enough. They come over now and then to watch and visit, but they're really not too excited about it. Most of them are over 70. Most of them (about 85 in all) were around when the mill was really humming, so the mill's old hat to them."

That's not the case for others, however. Tourists from nearly every state in the Union already have visited it; school children have toured it; and now and then one of Chester's friends from Schoolcraft pops in to take a look around.

Come next summer when he takes to operating the mill in earnest, there's no telling what might happen, he said.

Waterwheel mills were a rarity even back when the state boasted 511 registered mills. "Today, there's only about 11 mills left, but I think the one at Argentine is the only other one besides mine using stones."

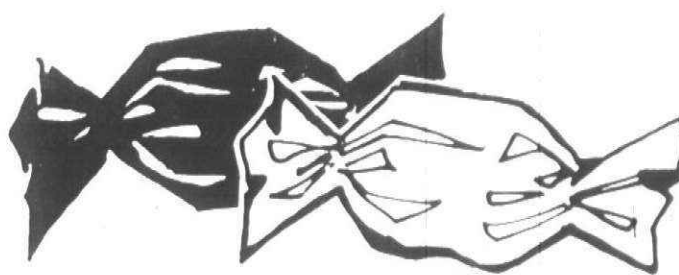

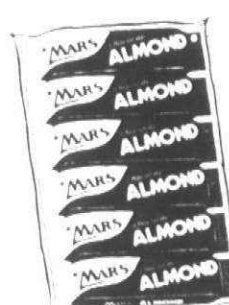

Forecast could have area effect

The decision which will be made inside the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments next year sounds like so much bureaucratic gobbledeygook. But it could have a major effect on how fast the outlying areas of the seven-county region grow—and how much Detroit and the older suburbs decay.

SEMOG's executive committee will pick one set of numbers, from a list of six alternatives, to use in something called "small area forecasts," according to Executive Director Michael Glusac.

Recently there was the first shred of evidence that some outlying communities which favor major growth will be unhappy with SEMCOG's work. A Monroe County delegate registered an objection when Glusac said his staff plans to use, on an interim basis, a set of figures labelled "local plans as modified by SEMCOG policy recommendations."

SMALL AREA forecast figures "are used for all kinds of planning—transportation, water quality, land use, sewage, recreation and open space," said Dan Snyder, SEMCOG staff planner.

Those forecasts—of population, households and jobs—will be used when federal aid is parcelled out. Clearly, if growth projections for a now-rural area are small, then less federal aid for sewers and parks and the rest will be forthcoming.

So far, said Glusac, SEMCOG's computers have run off only two sets of figures. But those sets are enough to illustrate how planning can alter federal aid and growth patterns.

One thing the sets will have in common. They will all forecast a regional population of 5.2 million by the year 2000 (compared to the 1970 census figure of 4.7 million) and some 2.6 million jobs (compared to 1970 employment of 1.7 million).

The difference is in how those jobs and people are distributed.

ALTERNATIVE 5, for which computer figures have been run off, is known as "local plans, unmodified." Alternative 6, the one SEMCOG staff will use in the interim, is called "local plans modified by adopted SEMCOG policy recommendations."

Here is how each would affect the central city of Detroit: In either case, Detroit will show some decline, but Alt. 6 foresees less shrinkage.

Alternative 5 (local plans unmodified) will see Detroit's population dropping from the 1970 level of 1.5 million to 910,000; Alternative 6 (modified by SEMCOG policies) will put the population at 1.1 million in the year 2000.

Detroit's 1970 job level was some 631,000. Under alternative 5, this would increase to 650,000 jobs, but under alternative 6 it would rise to 671,000 jobs. Thus, with implementation of adopted SEMCOG policies, Detroit would have some 21,000 more jobs.

SUBURBAN Wayne and Oakland counties would register growth in either case, but they would grow differently under alternative 6.

Suburban Wayne had a population in 1970 of 1.15 million. Under alternative 5 this would remain about the same, but under alternative 6 it would rise to 1.2 million in the year 2000.

Suburban Wayne employment was 420,000 in 1970. Under alternative 5 it would grow to 507,000 by the end of the century; under alternative 6, it would grow to 523,000. Thus, suburban Wayne stands to be nearly 16,000 jobs better off under alternative 6.

Oakland County, with a census population of 907,000, would grow to 1.14 million under alternative 5 and to 1.07 million under alternative 6. Thus, it

would grow less under the implemented SEMCOG policies.

Oakland's employment, just under 300,000 in the last census, would rise to 465,000 if local plans were unmodified. But it would rise only to 444,000 if SEMCOG policies were implemented.

So the thrust of SEMCOG policies would be to slow the decline of Detroit, the Wayne suburbs and some of the older Oakland suburbs, and restrict growth in outer Oakland County and the outlying counties.

HOW YOU VIEW such a phenomenon depends on your point of view.

In general, public officials in outlying townships tend to plan for, expect and want much growth. This will mean more local tax revenue for their governments and schools. It will also mean improved land prices for them and many farmers and landowners who want to sell at a profit to a developer and retire.

Many residential property owners, however, would prefer to "preserve the rural environment."

This classic confrontation is precisely what occurred when many Commerce Township homeowners joined

with environmental groups to oppose building an M-275 freeway across western Oakland County.

It is a confrontation that is likely to be repeated many times in the generation ahead.

TAKE LIVINGSTON County, for example.

Its population in the last census was some 59,000 persons. Under alternative 5, local plans unmodified would give Livingston a population of 312,000 by 2000. But local plans modified by SEMCOG policies would yield a population of 215,000.

Either way, Livingston grows, to a great extent at the expense of Detroit and the older suburbs. But with modified plans it doesn't grow as much.

SEMOG planner Snyder said only those two sets of alternatives—"they are all sets of policy constraints"—have been run through the computer, so it is impossible to say what alternatives 1-4 would yield.

One other alternative is called "preservation and conservation." Said Snyder: "You'd try your darndest to keep farms, wetlands, etc., and have high-level public transit."

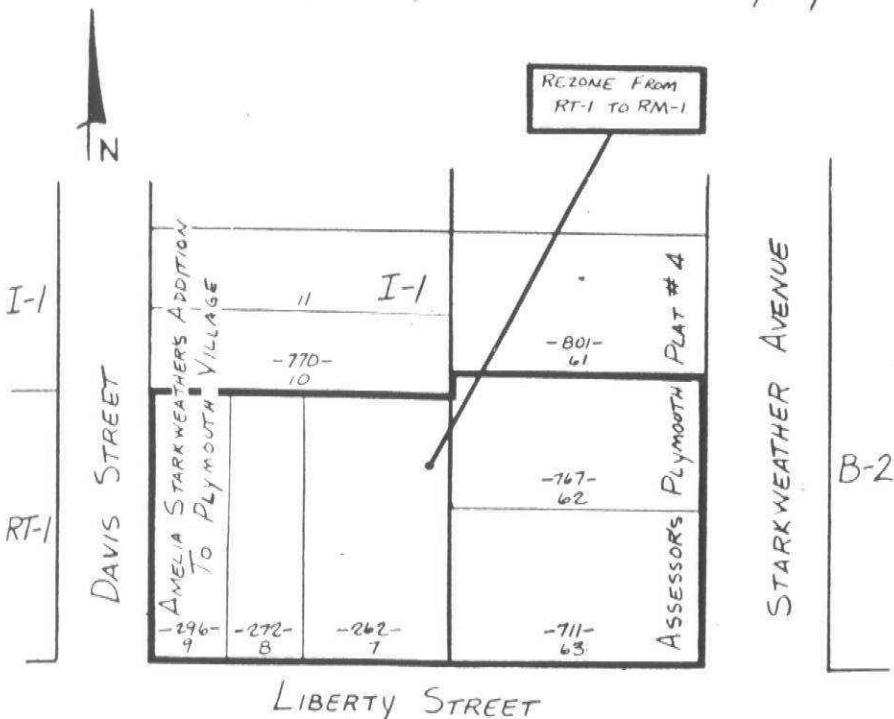

Report on rentals unsettling

READERS' FORUM

Over-restrictive "singles" and "drinking" regulations? It is undoubtedly true that such do exist, in some places. In my view, however, neither is necessarily a problem; per se. The important consideration here is the individual(s), as always. I have seen some outwardly shy, quiet, alcohol-abstinent couples raise more than W.C. Fields ever portrayed at his cantankerous worst and imaginative best.

As for Plymouth properties commanding a premium over those of neighboring communities, I seriously question the source and the validity of such information. Apartment-owner acquaintances have often commented to me that our same buildings, if situated in nearby areas such as Rochester, Birmingham, Royal Oak, Utica, etc. would rent at a 15 per cent higher level; and perusal of the Observer's weekly "apartment for rent" columns will quickly confirm this.

THERE IS, further, a widely held misconception as to the present profitability of apartment ownership.

In the context of income type realty analysis, there are several commonly used methods of measuring the return on one's investment of savings; however, the concept of "cash return" or cash flow (net cash in hand after all expenses), expressed as a percentage of committed funds, is a good enough standard and, on this basis, it will be found that a return of between 6 per cent and 8 per cent is not uncommon. Not a lot better than bank savings rates, considering all.

However, the fact of inflation suggests reasons as to why those who can not look forward to the "corporate employment umbrella" benefits of pensions, etc., must direct their efforts toward ownership of productive tangibles, instead. This goal of partially offsetting the effects of inflation, through proper maintenance of a physical property is, indeed, the prime motivating force for the majority of smaller-scale owners of multiple dwellings.

Thoman's quoted statement as to the need for apartment owners to realize considerably higher than present rentals, if they are to keep their heads above water, is a point well taken; and, to quote a recent editorial from another newspaper, "... rentals, in fact, may be one of the last remaining bargains, relative to other costs of living, and to the costs of single-family residence ownership, in particular."

A final comment: Apartment owners are something of a first line of contact between the community and new residents. My experience has been that the City of Plymouth does enjoy a good reputation, and that newcomers tend to be favorably impressed with what they find upon actually relocating here. This undefinable quality is an asset which deserves and requires both nurture and preservation. It should never, repeat never, be merely taken for granted.

Let foods cool partially before freezing. Try to keep the freezer filled, but don't overfill it.

Manually defrosting models should be defrosted once ice build up reaches one-quarter inch thickness. Heavy frost hinders efficient operation and wastes energy.

The lost art

Why talk if nobody will listen

We spend about 70 per cent of our waking hours communicating, i.e. talking, listening, reading or writing. But recent studies will tell you "Johnny Can't Write" either.

Listening, that greatest of all communication skills, is becoming a lost art too. Apparently the only communication form which is not an endangered species is talking. But if nobody can or will listen, why talk anyway?

ANY NUMBER of theories have been advanced to explain our failures in communication: TV, phonics, permissive parents, etc.

Whatever the cause, it seems to be paradoxical because we happen to be living in the "age of communication." The greatest advances in science and technology during the past 50 years have been in the communication and transmission of sounds, images, words and numbers, e.g. radio, television, telephone, radar, sonar, computers, and communication satellites.

It is possible that with all this advanced technology, man's need to express himself more clearly in words and symbols is no longer as great as it once was? The authorities in commu-

nication doubt it. They believe the need has never been greater.

The media choices we have today were designed to expedite and facilitate the communication process not to replace it or restrain it. But in truth, if I had a choice of telephoning you to exchange pleasantries and friendship or writing a letter, I would most likely use the phone because it saves me time. And yet I realize that writing is a practiced art. If I don't practice it for a substantial period, I won't improve and may even lose some part of the talent I now have.

GOOD LISTENING is probably in shorter supply than good writing. "Everybody wants to talk but nobody wants to listen." We have all heard that expression before. So let's "talk about listening."

Listening, like writing, is a practiced art. You can't do it well without doing it often. But what stands in the way of good listening?

One of the barriers to good listening, and I might add good reading, writing, and talking, is our own language. Did you know the 500 most commonly used words in the English language have no less than 14,000 separate meanings? That's a ratio of 28 to 1! The word

"round" has 73 different meanings in the dictionary I use.

It is entirely possible that my choice of words to communicate a thought, idea, concept or a cordial feeling may

be misunderstood in whole or in part by you. The problem may lie with me if my vocabulary range is too narrow.

Another likely cause could be a human unwillingness to feedback critically when we fail to understand the message or don't agree with it. Sometimes the message doesn't get through because we are distracted and too embarrassed to admit it. And sometimes we are distracted and too embarrassed to admit it. And sometime we hear only half of the message and fill in the rest because we jumped to the conclusion, e.g. "Don't confuse me with the facts, my mind is made up."

Good listening, therefore, must mean that we should at least lend our attention to the speaker (assuming he or she is not an absolute bore). Listen to the words and vocal inflections and observe the speaker's body movements. Feedback if you don't feel you fully understood the message. Tell the speaker, "This is what I heard you say...Is that right?" Feedback does a couple of things. It lets the speaker know he or she is in fact understood and also that the listener is really interested in the message being transmitted. What better way can you offer friendship than by mutual understanding?

Is beauty so valueless it may be left to happenstance?

Ten years ago the City of Plymouth instituted a tree planting program to beautify residential neighborhoods. The plan has been very successful in insuring the establishment of "second growth" trees to be ready for future generations as old trees die out.

During the past decade, commercial and residential growth pressures have arrived in Canton and Plymouth townships—drastically changing the landscape of the Plymouth-Canton community.

The townships also have instituted measures to secure and preserve a beautiful atmosphere for future generations, through such measures as sign restrictions, berm requirements and open space planning.

IN ALL THREE municipalities there has been a common commitment to maintaining a physical environment which is pleasing to the eye, and will become a pleasant place in which to live and work in future years.

But in all three municipalities, the steps to require beautification have been evolutionary over time and directed by a variety of agencies with varied priorities and responsibilities.

And, in fact, there has developed many beautification projects generated by private individuals, using private funds, without any direction or coordination from the governmental units.

The progress made is commendable, and residents can be proud of beautification efforts made

by both government and private investors. But that is not to suggest that past projects could not have been done better—more economically, with greater coordination, with faster results, and with more expert advice to make sure those things which are done will last for a long duration.

THE PROBLEM HAS been that some beautification efforts have sprung out of a planning commission. Others have been generated from the department of public works. Others result from the central administration, spurred by availability of federal or state funds. And other beautification changes result through interaction with building inspectors and engineers as new developments enter a community.

In each instance, those directing the improvement are well-meaning individuals who did the best they could given the limited scope of their authority and limited expertise they possessed. But, in each instance, there was no single coordinating force attempting to have all beautification efforts work towards a single purpose.

Fortunately, Topsy has performed well. But she may not do as well in the future.

THE THREE GOVERNMENTS in the Plymouth-Canton community should give serious consideration to establishing a beautification committee.

Other communities with beautification committees have successfully developed a coordinated, efficient, economical scheme to improve their physical environment. These communities are doing many of the same things being done here, but the difference is that they have a long-range plan and know more precisely the direction being taken.

The beautification committees are advisory agencies, usually charged with reporting directly to the city council or township board of trustees. The membership includes residents, businessmen or professionals with expert knowledge in botany, forestry, the ecology, landscaping, architecture, etc.

Thus cities with beautification committees receive advice, free of charge, from experts who have a vested interest in the long-range appearance of the community because that is where they live or do business.

Because our beautification efforts and suggestions are funneled through the committee, there is an important coordinating function being performed. And it is being performed by persons who are experts in the field, rather than by persons who are experts at coordinating because they are administrators.

There is a danger for any government in establishing too many boards and commissions. But boards and commissions are established because there are certain important functions—such as planning or pension administration—which require expert advice and long-range perspective. Among such functions should be beautification.

Maybe the reason such a committee doesn't exist locally is because "beautification" has become an old-fashioned term. Maybe, instead, we should establish an environmental commission or a council on the ecology.

And if "environmental" is substituted for "beautification," than maybe it makes more sense to establish a joint commission for the three governmental units as our physical environment goes beyond geographic boundaries.

Automatic economy with a stick

The solons of the United States Congress seem annually to get into a ruckus over what kind of fuel efficiency requirements to impose on Detroit—"Detroit" being a synonym for the now far-flung automobile industry.

The argument rages over what sorts of equipment to require, yet all the while there is a solution which will save five to 16 per cent of the fuel a car burns, depending on the kind of car.

This solution involves no new technology. It requires no special equipment. It will cost most car buyers no more—it will actually save them money.

The solution is to make cars with manually-operated gear shifts. In other words, the "stick" shift.

FEW CARS get as good gasoline mileage with an automatic shift as with the stick shift.

One of those exceptions is the American Motors Pacer 232-cubic inch, six-cylinder model with a single-barrel carburetor. Either stick or automatic version of this engine in the 1977 model would have brought you an average of 20 miles per gallon (18 city driving, 23 highway).

More typical are Chrysler Corp.'s Dodge Aspen and Plymouth Volare (the same car, but you pay more for the Aspen). The small six with a stick shift will give you 23 mpg average (20 city, 29 highway), according to EPA tests. The automatic shift cuts you to 20 overall (18 city, 24 highway).

Say you're a conservative person who drives only 10,000 miles per year. In that automatic-shift car, you will need 500 gallons of fuel. With that stick shift that gets three miles a gallon more, you'll burn up only 435 gallons. You've saved 65 gallons of gasoline a year.

A FORD customer who purchased a '77 Maverick could choose between a 200 and 250 cubic inch six-cylinder engine, and the results would have been the same.

With a stick shift, you would get an average of 24 mpg (21 city, 28 highway). With the automatic shift, you'd drop your average to 20 mpg (18 and 24).

Put that in percentage terms, and four fewer miles per gallon means you burn one-sixth more gasoline, or more than 16 per cent extra, with the automatic.

An Audi Fox with a 114 cubic inch four-cylinder engine would yield you 21 mpg (18 and 27) with a manual shift and only 19 (17 and 23) with an automatic shift.

General Motors' engines are another story. Incredibly, most GM automatics get better mileage than the stick shifts. The clear answer is to require all GM car buyers to get automatics. In fact, California actually does limit sales of some GM models to automatic shifts.

CONGRESS would, however, be playing with fire if it were to consider such an entirely logical law.

Until World War II, virtually all autos had stick shifts. And most driving was done by adult males.

After World War II, "Detroit" learned not only that males liked the convenience of the automatic shift; it also found more females would consider learning to drive. More female drivers meant more car sales.

In the '60s, it became fashionable to purchase third, fourth and fifth cars for the teenagers. Automatic shifts suited them, too.

But the honorable members of Congress know their constituents. Their constituents simply aren't convinced there is an energy shortage; or, if there is, they are willing to dig into their pockets for more gasoline money. And they will continue to pay the oil cartel's incredible prices.

Caught between inflation and taxes

I don't know why, but for some reason it really struck me. I was sitting there paying bills when the newscaster said that the cost of living had gone up .003 per cent in September, bringing it to 6.6 per cent for the last year.

He went one step further—he said that this means it will cost you \$106.60 to buy the same amount of goods or services today as you were able to purchase for \$100 a year ago.

Over the last 10 years, the cost of living has gone up 84 per cent, which means you need \$1.84 to buy what you used to be able to buy for a dollar.

Now, if your family's wages have been going up at least in line with the cost of living, you think you're no worse off. That is not necessarily true, because the federal income tax is based on a graduated rate, and if by chance you are moved into

the next tax bracket because of your increased wages, the government can be taking a larger share of your income.

For example, married taxpayers filing a joint return on a taxable income of \$20,000 would pay \$4,380 plus 32 per cent of any additional taxable income. If your income increased 84 per cent you would have a taxable income of \$36,800 and your

tax would be \$10,700, plus 45 per cent of any additional taxable income or a 144 per cent increase in taxes on an 84 per cent increase in wages.

On top of that, social security taxes have increased substantially, cutting into your disposable income.

This means you've got to do better wage-wise than the cost of living increases just to stay even.

Consider the people on a fixed income, people who retired on an adequate income 10 years ago who see their lifestyle shrinking away through no fault of their own.

It looks like the economy is softening and that we may have some sort of a mini-recession at the end of next year.

To avoid this, politicians are now gearing up to stimulate the economy by spending more federal money and reducing taxes.

When the federal government spends more money than it takes in (deficit spending) it is inflationary, because it is the same as printing more money. The treasury bills they issue are used by banks in lieu of money for their reserves.

If more money enters circulation and goods and services don't increase, then the price for goods and services goes up under the principle of supply and demand. Hence, the cost of living goes up.

Back in the fifties and early sixties, the government wasn't trying to manage the economy by overspending and giving tax relief, and our cost of living was only going up 1 1/2 per cent a year.

If our hard-earned dollars are to mean anything, inflation must be slowed tremendously. To stimulate the economy to increase jobs creates inflation, which in the long run will make our dollar worthless.

To stop inflation we went through the deep recession of 1973-74. We paid the price. Now let's not throw it all away and start the inflation spiral again by governmental stimulation.

In all the years he has known Old Jim, The Stroller has yet to hear him called "stingy" or a "tightwad."

He figured he never got an extra bonus for providing the daily service he was asked to do. So why should a waiter or waitress be paid extra to carry his meal to him in a dining room?

the 15 per cent at that sitting."

"If I purchase a drink before dinner at the bar, I pay only a straight price," he grumbled. "But as soon as I sit at a table, I am expected to pay the waiter an additional 15 per cent just to have him or her place the drink on the table. Is that right?"

Seems as though Old Jim has hit upon one of our puzzling economical problems.

Geake named to hospital panel

State Senator R. Robert Geake (R-Northville) has been named by the Senate leadership to an ad-hoc joint appropriations subcommittee on hospital cost containment.

The committee, composed of five senators and five representatives, will be examining a plan contained in HB4491 to phase out surplus hospital beds in the state.

"This basically is a negotiating committee," explains Geake, whose 14th District includes Livonia and Plymouth. "Our task will be to work with health care providers and hospital administrators to reach a compromise on the most efficient and effective way of eliminating our already substantial surplus of beds in Michigan hospitals."

Geake, a member of the Senate Committee on Health, Social Services

and Retirement, reports the State Department of Management and Budget projects that by 1982 there will be about 7,000 excess hospital beds in Michigan out of a total of more than 40,000.

"We need to take action to eliminate these excess beds. First, it is costly to staff and maintain these beds when they are empty for a substantial period of time. Second, an excess of beds has been shown to be associated with excess utilization of hospital facilities and high health care costs."

House Bill 4491 contains a plan for identifying overbedded areas and then eliminating the surplus within five years.

Geake also is involved in a project studying Medicaid and health care cost containment. That study is expected to be presented to the legislature late next spring.

Holiday Park gets high rating

Many area residents find that living in mobile home parks suits them right down to the ground.

They are enthusiastic in describing the advantages—it's inexpensive, and the homes and small yards don't require much maintenance. They like the sociability they have with their neighbors. In fact, those interviewed said a mobile home met most of their particular needs.

Yet hanging above this seemingly sunny picture of mobile home life is a small cloud. A few mobile home residents said they fear the management of their particular park.

The parks visited include West Point Trailer Court and Big Trees Mobile Home Park in Westland, Long's Mobile Home Court in Redford Township and Royal Holiday Park in Canton Township.

At the West Point facility, while two residents living in the newer, more spacious part of the court were willing to talk freely and have their pictures taken, several others refused to give their names because they feared what they said might "get back to the management."

ONE RESIDENT thought the court ought to have more recreational activities, and several others said they felt oppressed by the closeness of the homes.

Their dwellings were installed before a state law requirement of at least 10 feet between mobile homes.

When asked questions, several residents at At Big Trees said, "Does the manager know you're here? I didn't think he would let anyone in."

In fact, when the manager discov-

ered the reporter in the park, he demanded that she leave.

The residents at Royal Holiday Park and Long's Mobile Home Court felt free to talk to the press, and several said the management was satisfactory.

At Royal Holiday Park, the contrast was noticeable. Park residents were at the club house joking with Doris Ramage, manager for the past four years of the 436-home park.

She explained that the lots rented by mobile homers are 40 by 80 feet and that the smallest home is 12 by 55, and the largest, 14 by 70 or 24 by 46 (called a double). The park was started in 1968 by Nationwide Mobile Homes.

The club house is a focal point of many park activities. Social events are scheduled there, such as the Tuesday senior citizens meetings. A large percentage of the residents are retirees.

Laundry facilities are also located there.

Like all mobile homes, each home has its own electricity and plumbing. Unlike many other parks, where mailboxes are set in a row, mail at Royal Holiday is delivered house to house.

"At first people brought their homes in," explained Ms. Ramage. "But now most of those who leave sell their

homes. It is rare for a home to be moved."

She added that renting the lot for a mobile home costs from \$105-\$110 a month depending on the location of the lot. Those wanting to leave must find a buyer, but the management must OK the purchaser.

This is typical of most mobile home parks, and is perhaps one of the reasons some fear the management since the manager could delay or prevent a resident from selling a mobile home by not approving of the person buying the home.

Also adding to the tension between residents and management is in some cases, residents asked to leave stand to lose a considerable investment if they have added to their mobile homes. For example, many homes have a metal awning rooted in concrete. Some even have added extra rooms. If the resident has to haul the home away, he would have to leave behind part of the investment. Few mobile home owners look forward to the hassle of moving and relocating.

RAY EDMONDS purchased his home at Royal Holiday for \$12,000 which included a 10 by 20 porch, air-conditioning and three bedrooms in

The red and white begonias, and deep red salvia against a background of varied evergreens were real eye-catchers for passers-by.

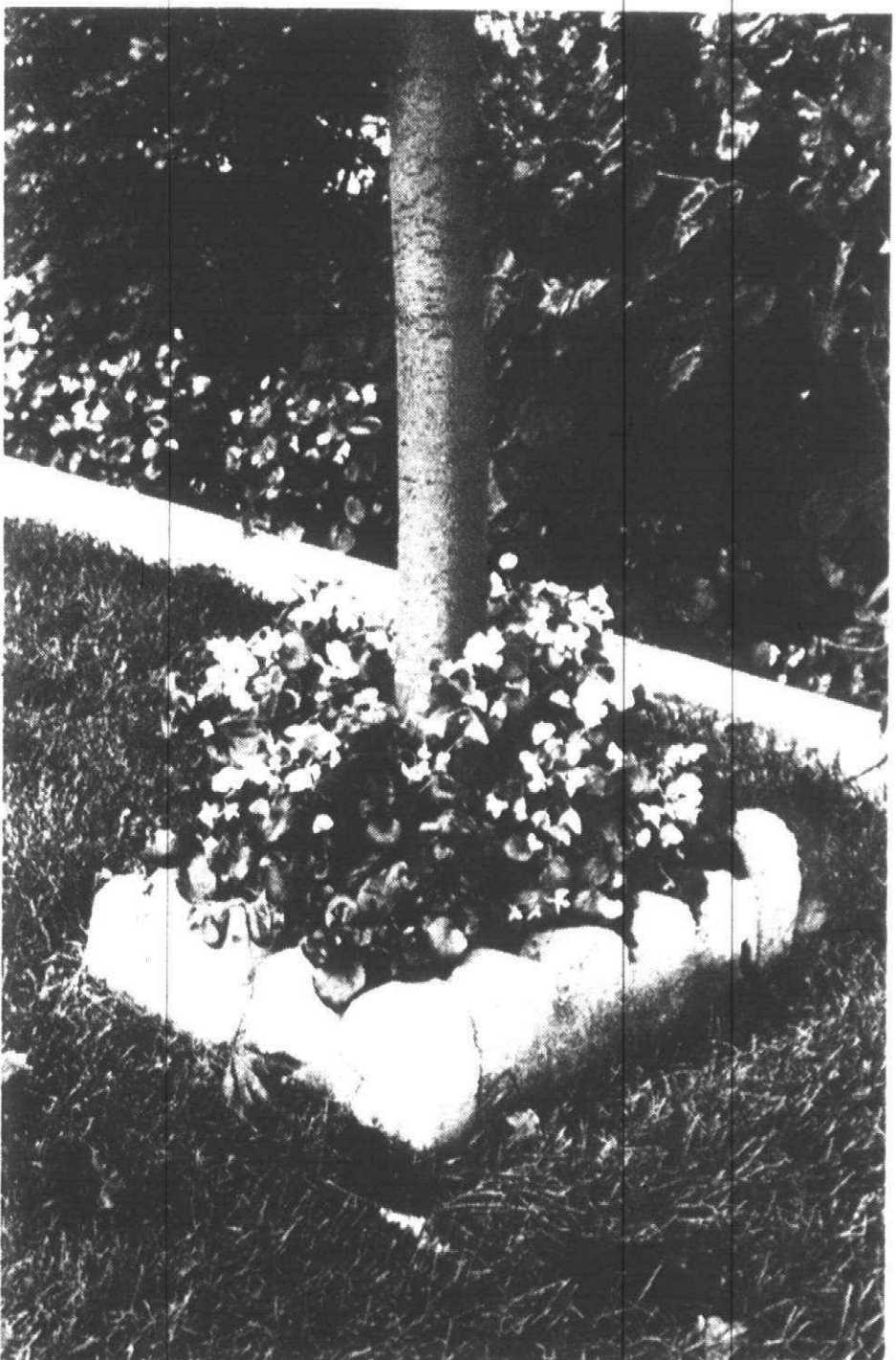

Life in a mobile home? It varies

addition to the usual amenities. The same price included "quiet at night and clean country air," he said.

Mrs. Marie Werton moved in last May with her retired husband, Clifford, and said, "We like it real well." She added: "Before we had a home with an upstairs and downstairs. This is a lot less work, and everyone is friendly."

Faith Hall, a former Livonia resident, said the park provides quieter living than an apartment.

"You can come and go as you please, and can plant flowers if you want to," she said. Her only complaint is that residents aren't allowed to wash their cars in the park, but added, "We don't pay a water bill here."

Mrs. Carol Tudor and her husband are among the few in the predominantly senior citizen park, who have children. "It's not hard to have kids in one of these homes if you have a big enough one," she said. "If you have more than one, I'm told it is very hard. There is no place to play."

"Matt is the only child right around here, although I have heard there are two more toward the back of the park. I have nice neighbors and they don't mind him." The Tudors, live in a trailer that is 14 by 70 feet.

MOST MOBILE HOME parks ban dogs and cats. Some, like Long's Mobile Home Court in Redford Township, also ban children if most of the park's residents are senior citizens.

Mrs. Mamie Lucier, who manages Long's, is considering moving from her comfortable apartment above the court's office back into a mobile home.

"I think people come here because they want to," she said. "Who wants to keep up a big house and pay taxes?"

The main outdoor maintenance court residents have to do is cut their tiny lawns. "Some don't even want to mow these lawns," she continued. "What would they do if they had a big yard?"

Living at Long's, says Pearl Butts, is a good life. "It is a problem for older people to keep up a home," he noted. "There's not much work to these."

"I think people in mobile homes are more closely knit than people in neighborhoods. They are not so much alone. There is more freedom here. You can sit out on the patio or plant flowers. I can't see being cooped up in an apartment with nothing to do."

Nora Danforth enjoys the fact that there is less work to mobile house-keeping. "We have good neighbors, and it is quiet here," she said.

LOUIS STIDHAM in the West Point Trailer Court, pointed out the spacious interior of his two bedroom home.

A bachelor who is retired from the Fisher Body Plant on Plymouth Rd. in

Livonia, he finds he has plenty of room to put up friends or relatives from out of town.

"It is easy to maintain and clean, and is simpler to take care of than a home," he said.

But not all mobile home residents are elderly. Pat Stark, a young woman, and her husband put \$1,500 down a year and a half ago on a four-year mortgage for their mobile home. They pay \$150 in monthly mortgage payments plus \$80 a month for the lot. "That includes water and taxes," she said.

"It is very little trouble to get a mobile home. We decided one day and were in the next. We gave them our money and that was it."

She is also sold on mobile homes as opposed to apartments for the following reason. "In an apartment you spend all that money for rent and walk out only with a receipt," she declared.

Her average fuel bill is \$40 a month during the heating season, and the fuel for cooking costs them about \$18 "every three or four months."

The oil heat comes up from the floor in heating ducts, and they have their own washer and dryer.

"The managers are very good," she added. "They get down on you if you don't cut your lawn or shovel the snow on your walk."



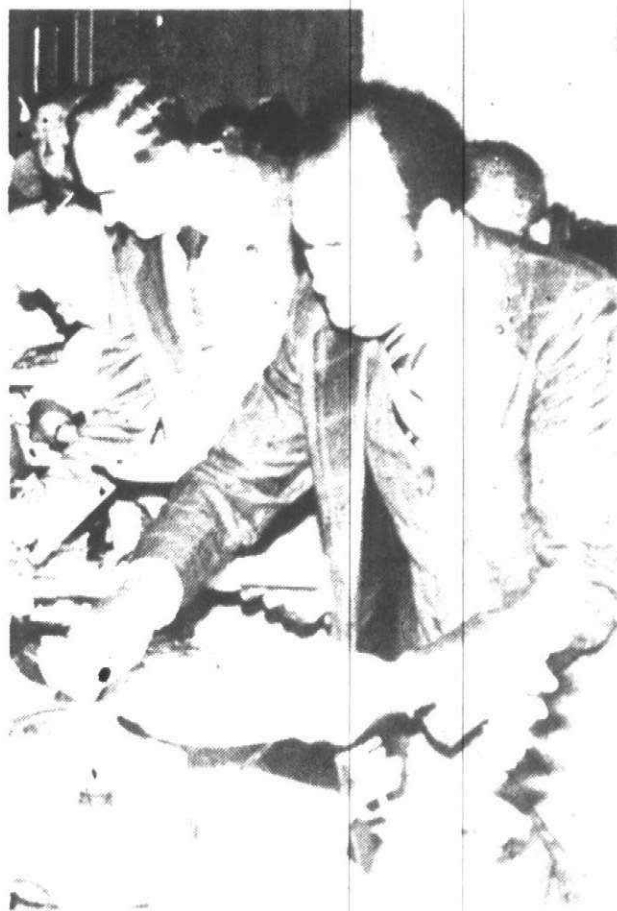
planning for the automotive body division.

He lives in Cambridge, Ohio, where every summer he portrays the leading role in "The Living Word," an outdoor passion play. Before building a permanent amphitheater, he presented the play in Cincinnati's Riverfront Sta-

dium as a dramatic demonstration of interracial and ecumenical brotherhood.

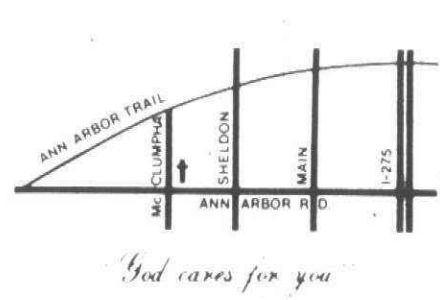

Susan is a normal teenager — but just give her a violin!

Susan Synnestvedt is a gifted violinist who also happens to be a 14-year-old teenager.

She is tall and attractive, quiet and unassuming with a smile that reaches out to even a stranger. She acts and looks quite ordinary. Just a regular teenage girl until the violin is cradled under her chin and the bow is touched to the strings.

MISS SYNNESTVEDT will be the featured guest artist with the Oakway Symphony Orchestra at Oakway's second subscription concert Sunday, Oct. 30 at 3 p.m. She will play the Tchaikovsky Violin Concerto.

The performance will be at the Dondero High School auditorium in Royal Oak located at Washington north of Eleven Mile Road.

Susan is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Peter H. Synnestvedt of Royal Oak. She began her study of the violin at the Detroit Community Music School and entered the Suzuki-type program when she was four.

Even at this age her talent for the violin was obvious and she was given a full scholarship. By seven, she performed the Bach A Minor Concerto with an orchestra. She received a scholarship to Meadowmount School for Strings during the summer of 1973 and later attended the National Music Camp at Interlochen. Last year, as the youngest recipient in its history, she

was awarded the Zerounian Award for Strings.

OPPORTUNITIES TO OVERCOME stage fright have been numerous for her. She has appeared as a soloist in a special concert at Mercy High School, with the Port Huron International Symphony and with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra. And there are still more solo performances scheduled this season in Kalamazoo, Port Huron and Toronto.

As a freshman in high school, Susan is an outstanding student. She is in the G-Seminar where students are involved in individual interest projects.

She has chosen to write a composition for two violins as her project plus carrying a full academic subject load.

BECAUSE OF HER MUSIC she must keep a more rigid time schedule than many young people.

She said she is usually finished with practicing and homework before dinner "so there's still time to do all the normal things kids my age like to do—like football games and dances and parties."

Susan's musical interest goes beyond classical. In the high school acapella choir she sings soprano. She said, almost as a modest afterthought, "I'm the only freshman in the choir this year."

She enjoys soft rock, particularly the

music of "Chicago" and was thrilled to have attended their last concert at Olympia Stadium.

A scholarship award makes it possible for Susan to study privately every two weeks with Mr. Cerone who is a member of the Cleveland Institute of Arts faculty and a member of the Cleveland Symphony. Her former teacher, Roy Bengtsson, is with the Detroit Symphony.

EVEN WITH A SCHEDULE like this, Susan still has time to look to the future and dream of "attending Curtis or Juilliard" or of "becoming a concert violinist and performing with major orchestras."

There is also time to look back and exclaim, "Playing with the Detroit Symphony as a soloist last March was the greatest experience of my life. It was so exciting and personally rewarding. It was something very special to me."

Angel Reyes, her teacher at Interlochen, said "Susan is a lovely, sweet child. She has stolen my heart."

By some miracle (plus dedication) this young girl who wants "first, to be known as a normal person and second, as someone with special talents" possesses the giftedness and spirit to become the finest of violinists.

It is because of who and what Susan is that Oakway is presenting her debut performance in this part of the metropolitan area.

'Oh! Calcutta!' —much to-do about nothing

"Oh! Calcutta!" the daring musical revue, opened Tuesday night at the Birmingham Theatre to an almost-full house of 900. The eagerly anticipated show (would it be funny, bold, brash, crude?) wasn't really funny, was not very bold and was decidedly brash and frequently crude.

The skits ranged from mildly amusing to some that were tasteless. Not that I was expecting "Oh! Calcutta!" to be in positive "good taste." If you're going to be shocked or entertained by sketches that satirize human sexuality, one awaits the lewd and lascivious.

But some of the dialogue was more notable for its use of words that are common expletives than for its clever humor. That's not to say the show was "dirty"—can anything be "dirty" anymore in these days of frank conversation?

But the level of the comedy seemed disappointingly low. The program (a free one was not available to the audience, but you could buy the "biggie" at \$3) lists noted authors including Jules Feiffer as contributors to the show. It's hard to believe that this is the best these writers could create.

MUCH OF THE show was surprisingly clothed. In some, the skits started out with clothes and ended up without them. There was lots of simulated sex, and at times the episodes did merit a laugh.

The show's opening skit about two swinging couples meeting for the first time had a few bright spots, but on the whole was more exaggeratedly explicit than witty. You could not call this show subtle.

While the actors in all the sketches performed reasonably well, a real sense of comic timing was missing, and they didn't seem too excited by

their material. Who could blame them?

There was your money's worth of nudity (tickets went for \$9.50 and \$8.50), with members of the cast in the opening number wearing clothes, which they doffed and hung on hooks, then donned bathrobes emblazoned "Oh! Calcutta!" After that, it was a sexual tease, if you will, with the males and females exposing parts of their bodies and covering themselves.

In the finale, they again came out clothed, then took their clothes off to cavort with simulated exuberance.

IN THE CURTAIN RAISER, I counted eight men and women, but at the finale there were nine; counting naked people is not the easiest task, especially when they are moving around so much.

One of the problems with "Oh! Calcutta!" appears to be that the comedy routines could be performed by an average night club comic who uses blue material. Or, cheaper yet, at the right bar where language is basic, you could pick up the same quality of humor just by listening.

There were several references in the show to the City of Birmingham, its mayor and even the Eccentric, because of the city's opposition to the show through a fire-law violation (which was overruled by the courts so the show could go on).

The first reference on stage that the show was "brought to you by Broadway Productions, the American Bar Association and, last but not least, the Birmingham Fire Department"

brought applause from the audience.

BUT IT IS hard to cite "Oh! Calcutta!" as an innovator of sexual frankness vs. the fuddy-duddies. I did not find the show obscene or totally vulgar, and if people want to see it, why not? It is not particularly high level, however.

There was one nude dance sequence that was more sensitive or erotic and well done than much of the rest of the show. But the country folk song that

went with it didn't seem in keeping.

A vocal number, "Spread Your Love Around" sung by leggy Ednah Holt in a red dress, was one of the better segments.

Musical accompaniment for certain portions of the show was provided by an on-stage combo that played loud and with verve.

A routine about a Victorian gentleman (John F. Patrick III) who attempts to violate the virginity of an outwardly proper English girl (Mari-

lyn Faith Hickey) had the best satiric moments in "Oh! Calcutta!"

But doctors, nurses and patients in a skit about a sexual experiment was low burlesque. And a skit about two Tobacco Road characters and a song about a country band were equally uninspiring.

ANOTHER SEQUENCE featured color slides flashed on a giant screen. These seemed bizarre rather than erotic but in either case didn't add vis-

ual impact to the live production.

"Oh! Calcutta!" is booked through Sunday at the Birmingham Theatre. It's the first live stage show to be presented in many years in the theater that was last a movie house.

Another production group had attempted some months earlier to offer Broadway shows designed to appeal to the whole family. That group's efforts fell through due to financial problems.

The Birmingham Theatre has come a long way to "Oh! Calcutta!"

Battle of quarterbacks

It's Dearborn's Scala vs. the 'Deuce'

Two of the best quarterbacks in the state compete against one another this week as Plymouth Salem travels to Dearborn High School for its Suburban Eight League finale Friday afternoon starting at 3 p.m.

On the homefront, Plymouth Canton celebrates homecoming when it entertains Garden City East in a non-league battle at the Centennial Park field Friday night at 8 p.m.

THE ROCKS continue to rank among the top teams in the state with their 7-0 record. Salem copped the Sub-8 crown last week with its easy 28-6 victory over Livonia Bentley.

Although this league finale means nothing in terms of the loop standings, there is a lot of pride at stake between the opposing quarterbacks—and an undefeated season and state playoff berth for Salem.

Dearborn's Dennis Scala and

Salem's Rich Hewlett are the heart of both their team's respective offenses.

Scala, a senior, is being recruited by many major colleges around the country. He is a standard drop back passer who runs a balanced Pioneer attack.

The saying around Plymouth is "The Deuce is on the loose"—referring to Hewlett's (who wears No. 2 on his jersey) running ability.

Hewlett, only a junior, is a different kind of quarterback who sparks the running-oriented wishbone offense.

Salem coach Tom Moshimer admits his squad isn't a passing team but is quick to defend Hewlett's passing abilities and his talent for throwing the touchdown pass when the big play is needed.

And after Hewlett's performance last week against Bentley, which included his sixth straight 100-yard-plus running day and a 30-yard touchdown pass, many of the Sub-8 coaches have nothing but respect for the young prospect.

With the Sub-8 title under their belts, the Rocks are now thinking undefeated season and state playoff berth as their second and third goals this season.

The Salem-Deardorn battle was earlier thought to possibly determine the league crown, but last week's surprising Edsel Ford victory over the Pioneers 28-14 gave the Rocks the outright title.

"This only forces us to talk state playoffs one week earlier," Moshimer said. "Now we can talk about it since we have the league."

Moshimer said his squad has a lot of respect for Dearborn despite the Pioneers' up-and-down season which finds them with a 5-2 record.

"They've got some great people," Moshimer said. "Looking at personnel alone, they are the best team we've played so far."

But Dearborn has been plagued with noticeable inconsistencies which has hindered its season.

The Pioneers lost their early state

ranking when they were upset by Redford Union 19-14 during the fifth week of the season.

Dearborn proceeded to crush a respectable Trenton squad the following contest but fell flat on their faces against Edsel Ford last week.

"It's Dearborn's turn to be up this week," Moshimer warned.

PLYMOUTH CANTON

Canton head football coach Dave Schuele hopes it will be a happy homecoming for his gridders who have yet to win this season. The Chiefs also haven't won a homecoming battle in the first four years of the varsity program.

Canton's opponent this Friday is a 4-3 Garden City East squad which has won its last three games.

The Chiefs have had great success against the Panthers in the past two seasons, winning both non-league battles.

East Middle School's seventh grade football team won its second game of the season Wednesday afternoon, defeating West Middle School, 6-0.

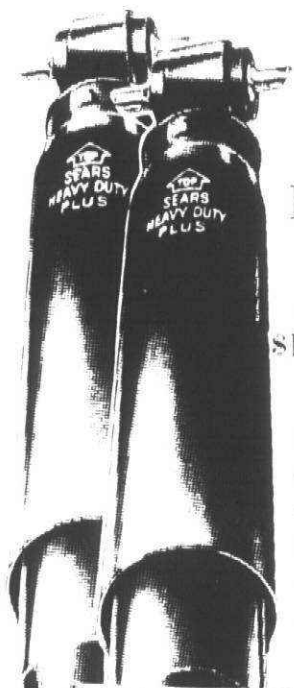
The Rockets' record currently stands at 2-3 for the year.

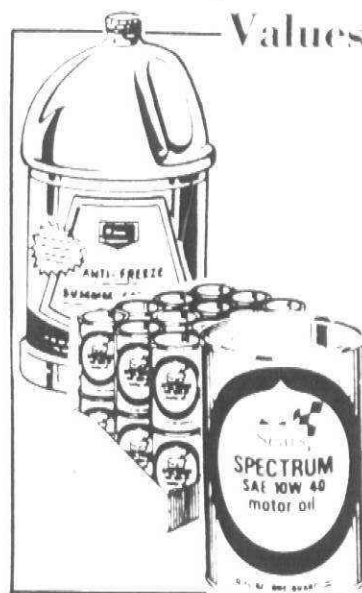

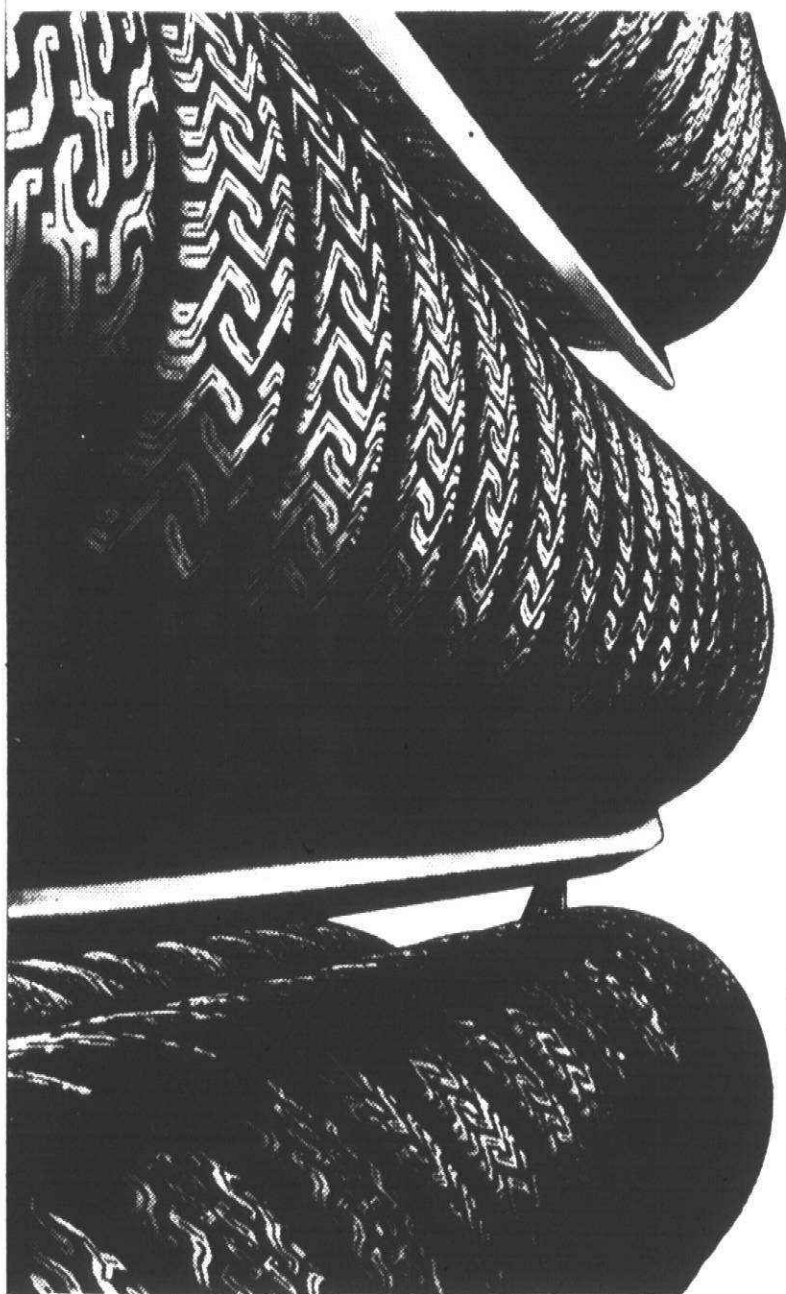

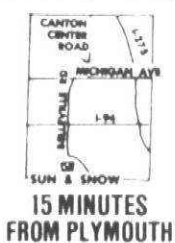

Catalano honored at DRC

Wayne Catalano, the jockey who would need a pocket full of identification to get a drink or make a vote, was named Detroit area horseman of the year by the March of Dimes Saturday at Detroit Race Course.

The award, only the third ever given in the horseman category in the long history of the Dimes Awards, honors the 21-year-old New Orleans native who will finish the year re-writing Detroit area jockey records.

Catalano will end up in second place to New York apprentice sensation Steve Cauthen in the national jockey standings.

"Naturally it's great to win a prestigious award like this. But I don't think about awards or honors when I go out on the track. I think about the horse I'm on and giving it the best ride I can," Catalano said.

The disaffection with awards is no more put on than Catalano's other

reaction to the news. He immediately decided to donate his earnings for last Saturday to the charity—no small sum for the big earnings day of a jockey whose income this year will stretch well into the six-figure bracket.

"It was just something I wanted to do. There are a lot of people less fortunate than me. One day of riding is no big thing. Other people are doing a lot more," he said.

Catalano began the year riding at the Fair Grounds in New Orleans and made the swing northward when Hazel Park Race Course opened in February. After running away with the jockey title there, he made the switch across town to the Livonia track.

On the eighth day of the DRC meeting, July 27, Catalano rode the winner of the first race. That started a national record string of consecutive winning days that stretched to Sept. 14 when he was shut out on a muddy track.

ORDINANCE NO. 77-14

CITY OF PLYMOUTH, MICHIGAN

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL CHAPTER 74 AND ADOPT NEW CHAPTER 74 OF TITLE VII OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH.

THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

Section 1. Chapter 74 of Title VII of the Code of the City of Plymouth is hereby repealed and new Chapter 74, adopted to read as follows:

TITLE VII - BUSINESS AND TRADES CHAPTER 74 TAXICABS

7.70 **Authorization to Operate.** No person shall operate or permit to be operated one or more taxicabs within the city, without first obtaining an appropriate license from the City Clerk.

7.71 Definitions.

- "Taxicab" shall mean a motor vehicle regularly engaged in the business of carrying passengers for hire, having a seating capacity of not more than 9 persons, and not operated on a fixed route.
- "Taxicab Company" shall mean the owner, lessor, or the person, firm, co-partnership, corporation, or other organization having possession or control over the taxicab or motor vehicle.
- "Driver" shall mean any person who drives a taxicab or motor vehicle for carrying passengers for hire.

7.72 **License Required.** No taxicab company shall be permitted to operate taxicabs on the streets of the city without first being licensed by the City Clerk. Application for said license shall be made on forms provided by the City Clerk under the rules prescribed by the City Manager. All information required by said form shall be complete and accurate and made under the oath of the applicant. Applicants must be at least 18 years of age.

7.73 **Driver's License.** No person shall be permitted to drive a taxicab in the city without first obtaining a license from the municipality in which the taxicab is primarily licensed to operate. Applications for City of Plymouth based license shall be made on forms provided by the City Clerk's Office. All information required by said form shall be complete and accurate and made under the oath of the applicant. Each applicant for a City of Plymouth based license shall submit together with the completed form, a certificate from an accredited physician stating that the applicant is not suffering from any contagious or infectious disease and two pictures of himself suitable for attaching to the license card. All applicants for City of Plymouth based taxicab driver's licenses shall be 18 years of age or older.

7.74 **License Fees.** At the time the license is issued, the City Clerk shall collect a fee for each taxicab company license and for each City of Plymouth based taxicab driver's license as specified in Chapter 72.

7.75 **Term of License.** All licenses issued under the provisions of this ordinance shall expire as of midnight on the 31st day of December of the year of issue, unless sooner revoked for cause.

7.76 **Suspension or Revocation of License.** The City Commission may, upon its own motion or upon the recommendation of the City Manager or Chief of Police, suspend or revoke any taxicab company or taxicab driver's license for failing to comply with the rules and regulations set forth by the Police Department pertaining to driver conduct and motor vehicle standards, or for failure to provide satisfactory service, or loss of insurance required by this ordinance, or other causes deemed sufficient by the City Commission.

7.77 **Notice and Hearing.** No license shall be suspended for more than two weeks, except after notice to the licensee and a hearing at which the licensee shall have an opportunity to be present and present his case or defense. At such hearing the City Commission may set aside the suspension or continue the suspension in force for any length of time or revoke the license.

7.78 **Insurance.** Every application for license to operate a taxicab must be accompanied by a policy or certificate of insurance. Said insurance shall be issued by a company authorized to do business in the State of Michigan. Insurance is required in the amounts as specified in Chapter 72.

Said policy or certificate shall contain a clause requiring the insuring company to give ten (10) days' written notice to the City Manager, prior to cancelling the policy.

7.79 **Taxicab Rates.** The rates to be charged for taxicab service are to be metered based on a schedule of rates established by resolution of the City Commission.

7.80 **Police Department Approval.** The City Clerk shall submit all license applications for taxicab and taxicab drivers to the Police Department for approval or rejection. Said approval or rejection shall be made within a reasonable period of time with any rejection accompanied by the Police Department's reasons therefor.

7.81 **Additional Penalties.** The suspension or revocation of a license shall not prohibit the institution of criminal prosecutions for the violations of the provisions of this or any other law or provisions of this Code. Neither shall the institution of criminal prosecutions, for any such violation or the acquittal or conviction of any person thereunder, prevent the suspension or revocation of a license or licenses by the City Commission hereunder.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall become operative and effective on the 8th day of November A.D. 1977.

single game honors by rolling a 264.

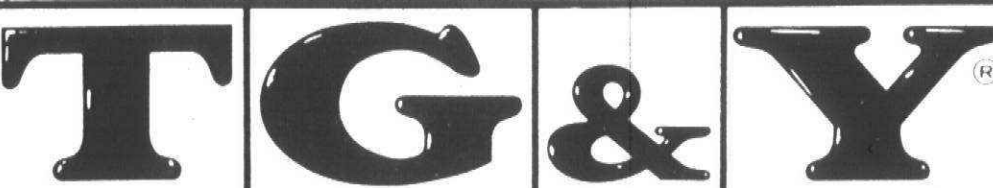

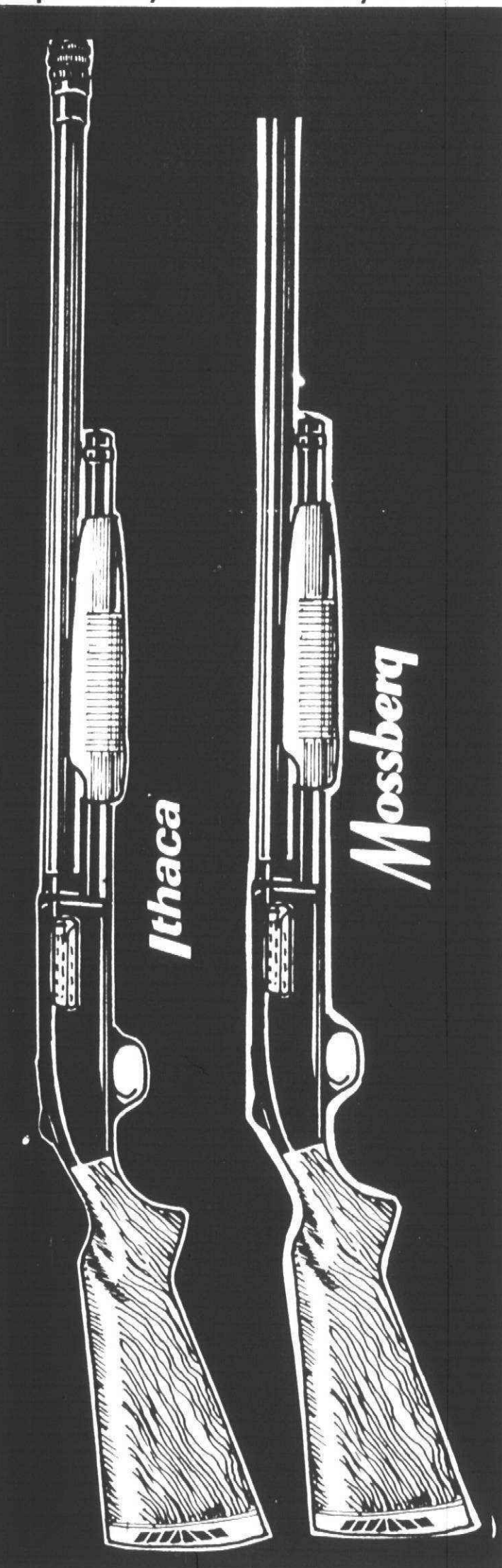
When the final pin had fallen, Lou Izqueik earned a place with the leaders with a 659 series.
