

# Construction firm fine reduced \$10,200

A \$10,400 fine levied against a construction company stemming from a fatal crane accident in Canton Township has been reduced to a \$200 fine by the Michigan Department of Labor's construction safety division.

The construction worker, Chuck Kennedy, 23, of Livonia, was the second son in his family to be killed while working with a crane operated by Acitelli and Peterman Poured Wall Co. of Farmington. In July, Keith Molin,

director in the department of labor, charged the company with "willful" violation of state safety standards in the June 17 accident.

However, Nate Nordin, review officer for the construction safety division, said that in reviewing the case, it was decided that the penalty levied was too high.

The charge, "willful" violation of Michigan Occupational Safety and Hazards Act (MIOSHA), was changed

after the company appealed to a "serious" violation of the act.

The company accepted the new decision, Nordin said, and paid the \$200 fine.

**THE REDUCED** charge and much lower fine was ordered, in part, Nordin said, because state investigators erroneously based some of their findings on the poor safety record of another construction company in Flint

which is also named Acitelli.

The MIOSHA regulation which Acitelli and Peterman of Farmington didn't comply with was a 1975 stipulation that the swing radius of a crane's counterweight must be roped or barricaded to prevent anyone from walking into its path. Kennedy was crushed when he walked between the rotating counterweight and the frame of the crane.

After the accident, a labor department official said that the company had been cited previously by a MIOSHA inspector for failing to shield other moving parts of the crane's machinery. However, Nordin said that a check revealed no inspection had been made at an Acitelli and Peterman site since the MIOSHA requirements went into effect in 1975. As a result, a \$400 fine for the alleged violation was dropped.

Because there were no inspections made until the accident occurred and because of the company's small size, Nordin said, it was decided that a \$200 fine would be sufficient.

Kenneth Kennedy, father of the fatally injured young man, still works for Acitelli and Peterman. When informed of the reduced fine, Kennedy said he had no interest in the proceedings.

## Will apartment zonings halt new development?

To many subdivision residents and Canton planners, "multiple zoning" has been a pair of dirty words.

Homeowners have fought tooth and nail against the construction of apartment buildings near their subdivisions and township officials have jumped on any opportunity in recent years to change zoning from multiple to single-family use.

A recent decision of the Canton Planning Commission, however, indicates a change in the township's anti-apartment attitude may happen in the interest of balanced development and possible control over the township's mushrooming growth.

Last month, the planning commission unanimously refused developer Dominic Mocer's request to rezone a 31-acre parcel in Stonegate Subdivision from multiple to single-family use.

**ALTHOUGH THE** commission's decision may not stick, four commissioners told the Observer the decision may represent the beginning of a new zoning trend.

Bart Berg, a planning commission member for 17 years, said it's the first time he can remember township officials refused to rezone land from multiple to single-family.

The commissioners say the new attitude is based on retaining multiple-zoned land as one way to control township growth and lighten the burden on already crowded schools.

More school-age children live in single-family homes than apartment buildings, commissioners maintain, so construction of apartment buildings would not create as heavy a burden on the schools.

They also point to the poor marketability of apartments, townhouses and condominiums at the present time.

"In the present state of the economy, it's either development of single-family homes or non-development," said Trustee Brian Schwall, the township board's representative on the planning commission. "No one's making money on apartments right now and I see multiple zoning as a way to slow development."

The planning commission's rezoning denial involves a 31-acre parcel in the Stonegate Planned Unit Development (PUD) near Palmer and Lilley. The PUD includes an area of already-constructed single-family homes and undeveloped parcels zoned for commercial and multiple use.

**ROBERT RAYMOND**, consulting engineer for developer Mocer, appeared before the township board last week to appeal the planning commission's refusal of single-family zoning.

Residents at the meeting called the commission's decision "inconsistent" with past zoning decisions. They pointed to lawsuits filed to fight apartment construction in some areas, like the recent court battle between the

township and Slavik Development Co., over a proposed 153-unit apartment complex near Windsor Park Subdivision.

Township board members voted 5-2 to send Mocer's rezoning request back to the planning commission for a public hearing and reconsideration. Schwall and Trustee Lynne Goldsmith voted against the action. The public hearing has not yet been scheduled.

Mocer wants to build 100 single-family homes and a three-acre park on the multiple-zoned land. According to Raymond, the zoning change is requested because of the poor marketability of apartments at the present time.

Raymond said Mocer will not develop the land if the zoning remains multiple.

"You never get any objections to a decrease in density," said Raymond. "We were just totally lost for words when the planning commission voted against rezoning this land."

**AT LEAST SOME** members of the commissioners, however, believe township officials have acted too hastily in the past to rezone land from multiple to single-family use.

"You have a situation where the planning commission is looking at these things more skeptically," said commission chairman Robert Padgett.

"This is brought on by a deepening

## Daley ends a career of crimebusting

That old still-smasher Gene Daley retired from the Wayne County Sheriff's Department last Thursday without regrets or future employment plans.

Daley, who is also a Canton Township trustee, spent a total of 22 years in the sheriff's department after working eight years in the county home for the retarded. Counting his six years in the Navy, the 54-year-old lieutenant figures he's spent the past 37 years in public service.

And, with the recent retirement, Daley said Tuesday he'll now be able to devote more time to local issues.

Many political pundits in Canton speculated that Daley would be named to a supervisory post in the Canton Police Department once he retired from the sheriff's department. At present, he is one of three township board members who comprise the police commission. But Daley said joining the Canton Police Department is just about the farthest thing from his mind at present.

"No way, don't even mention it," Daley said. "That's just a rumor somebody started."

"At this stage of the game, I've got nothing planned. I reached the point where it was costing me to go to work

when they got through taking the deductions out. So it's cheaper to retire."

"Will I miss it? Not right now. Right now it's like a vacation. (Canton Police Chief Walter) MacGregor keeps telling me 'Six months from now you'll be climbing the walls' but we'll give it a try and see what happens. The first thing I've got planned is cleaning out my garage."

**IN ADDITION** to Daley, another Canton resident, Det. Sgt. Kenneth Young of the sheriff's department, is retiring this month.

He, Daley, Inspector Robert Sulli-

van, Inspector Frank Van Wulven, Lt. Donald Sherman, Inspector Leonard Newlon, Det. Jack Hopkins and Sgt. Robert Ruelle will be honored by the department at a retirement party scheduled for Thursday, Dec. 1 at Livonia's Roma Hall. Tickets are \$12.50 per person and cocktails will be served at 6 p.m.

Daley reflected on his police career last Tuesday—a career that included work in the county jail, road patrol, rackets squad, organized crime task force and, finally, lieutenant in charge of Metro Airport's detective bureau.

Unlike the police sagas on television, Lt. Daley never shot anyone in the line of duty and never was shot at.

**THERE WAS** one time in 1958 where Daley came close. He and his partner, Ptl. Anthony Shannon Sr., came up to a house in what was then Dearborn Township to find a man holding a handgun to his sister-in-law's head.

The man had been drinking and threatened to shoot his sister-in-law, his wife, himself and any police officer that got in his way, Daley said. A group of sheriff deputies kept the man's attention while he was standing on the front porch. Daley and his partner slipped in the back door of the house.

"I came out on the porch and hit him in the arm with my shotgun, which knocked the gun out of his hand," Daley said. For his calm work, he received a department citation.

Daley also talked about his work on the rackets squad which often involved breaking up stills in neighboring Sumpter Township.

"I remember sitting in a pig pen for a week. That's where our observation point was, in the corner of a pig pen. And it was weather like today—rainy and cold. The guy finally came and

## Anita Bryant has Brown's support

Two state legislators representing Plymouth and Canton Township have sponsored a resolution congratulating Anita Bryant for her campaign against homosexual rights.

Rep. Thomas Brown (D-Westland) and Rep. Roy Smith (R-Ann Arbor) were among the 50 representatives who supported the house resolution urging Miss Bryant to continue her anti-gay efforts.

But both Brown and Smith contend the resolution is meaningless and unimportant.

"When anyone does anything, someone draws up a resolution to commend that person," Smith said. "I was asked to sign the proposal by the sponsor (Rep. Mark Siljander of Three Rivers). He told me the essence of it and asked if I was interested."

Although Smith downplayed the resolution, he expressed disgust on the issue of gay rights.

"I CAN'T SUPPORT queers," he said. "I live by the Bible and refuse to support that philosophy."

"A woman is made for a man, not a man for a man—that's basic humanities. I don't know how a man can marry another man. They speak of basic rights—I don't know what they're talking about."

When pressed for clarification, Smith said: "All your questions can be answered with common horse-sense."

A part of Smith's district includes Ann Arbor, a liberal community for gays where the house resolution has been attacked. Smith said he has received little feedback from constituents on the resolution.

"People can't write on something they don't know about. But I have received two or three unsigned letters and a few phone calls from Ann Arbor."

The resolution claims Miss Bryant's

# Flexibility is goal Schools unravel annuity puzzle

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education acted Monday to cut a slice through the number of companies that want to offer tax shelter annuities to school employees.

By a vote of 7-0, the trustees approved a resolution authorizing payroll deductions for employees only if evidence was shown that 10 or more people were interested in joining the particular program.

"This will give us more flexibility in

dealing with these companies," said Trustee Richard Arlen, the resolution sponsor. "We'll be able to work within a frame of reference rather than judge each one as it comes along."

The question of what to do about the increasing cost to the district of providing payroll deductions for its employees enrolled in annuity plans has been before the trustees since early this month when the Michigan Education Association (MEA) asked

to offer its own tax shelter annuity. The MEA is the bargaining agent for all the teachers in the district. A spokesman for the association said it could offer higher returns at lower cost than any other plan or program.

When MEA asked for the chance to offer its annuity program, Tom Yack, board president, argued against approving the request.

"We cannot just add the MEA to the authorized list and let it go at that," he

said. "What will we say to the next firm which wants to do business with our employees?"

In 1974 the board placed a limit on the number of companies which could enroll district employees in a tax shelter annuity plan in an effort to reduce clerical costs.

However, the board felt that limiting the programs by size instead of number would be a more equitable way to handle the problem.

Richard Saunders, Schoolcraft's director of fine arts and conference chairman, said more than 100 humanities instructors and administrators are expected.

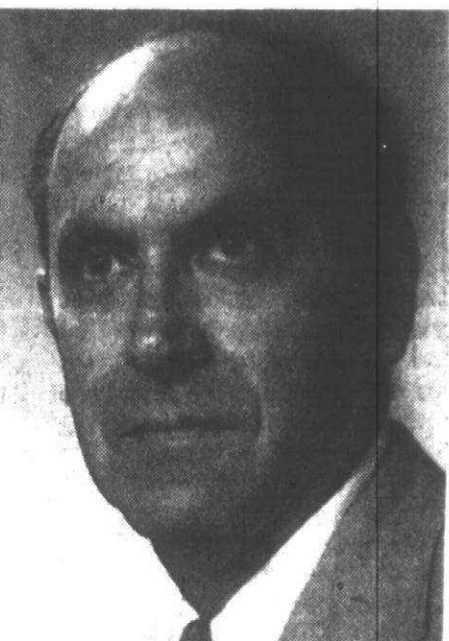
Saunders will lead one session on summer arts festivals, drawing on his experience as director of Schoolcraft's summer music festival.

# Miller claims ZBA is defunct deliberately

An ousted member of Canton's Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) claims township administrators are sitting on an opinion from Wayne Circuit Judge Neal Fitzgerald that would reinstate him to the idle zoning board.

Robert Miller, who was appointed to the ZBA as the planning commission's representative by former Supervisor Robert Greenstein, believes administrators are stalling on his reappointment to the ZBA until his present term on the planning commission expires Dec. 31.

Unless township board members reappoint Miller to another term on the planning commission, he will have no claim to the ZBA seat given to planning commission chairman Robert Padgett after Dec. 31.

"It appears that (Supervisor Har-

old) Stein, (Clerk John) Flodin or (Treas. Anne) Bradley have decided not even to bring this matter up to the township board so that the trustees can decide what to do," Miller charged.

"I want to be reappointed to the planning commission, but I think that's out of the question. They're not going to reappoint me, because that would aggravate the whole ZBA situation."

**MILLER IS A MEMBER** of the ZBA appointed by Greenstein, then dismissed by Stein last winter. The action was taken at the advice of township attorney William Sempliner, who ruled that Greenstein's ZBA was improperly appointed. After the ZBA appointed by Greenstein was dismissed, Stein

appointed five other people to the zoning board.

Court battles and a dispute over which ZBA was "legal" followed Stein's action. Last May, Judge Fitzgerald ruled that neither ZBA was legal because the township's zoning ordinance was never properly amended.

Township board members amended the zoning ordinance and reappointed members of "Stein's" ZBA to the zoning board.

In September, Fitzgerald issued a temporary injunction prohibiting the "Stein" ZBA from meeting at the request of Miller's attorney, Daniel Burress. Burress argued that Miller was removed from the ZBA without "show of cause," and Fitzgerald agreed. Unless Miller is reinstated to the ZBA, it cannot meet.

But township board members have failed to reconsider Miller's reappointment to the zoning board. Stein says that fact does not mean he's stalling any ZBA decision until Miller's term on the planning commission runs out.

"That's not my intention," the supervisor emphasized. "I'm not going to settle this issue that way. There are a couple of unresolved things about the court order, and I've pushed the whole thing right to the attorney."

**ATTORNEY SEMPLINER** hopes the whole ZBA controversy will be over by the time Miller's term on the planning commission expires.

"The township is hurting so badly for lack of a ZBA that it can't wait until Dec. 31," Sempliner said.

"We hope to upset Judge Fitzgerald's ruling by the first of January.

We're going to go back to him for a hearing or file a petition for a hearing with another judge."

Sempliner said he has advised the township against reappointing Miller to the ZBA because of two conflicting state statutes.

A state zoning statute says any member of a municipality's planning commission may serve on that community's ZBA, he said.

But a state planning statute says the planning commission's representative on the ZBA must be chairman of the planning commission.

Although Miller once served as planning commission chairman, Padgett has since taken over that post.

"That's why I advised the township to appoint the chairman of the planning commission to the ZBA so they

can avoid any future problems," Sempliner said. "I feel Judge Fitzgerald's ruling was wrong."

**SEMPLINER SAID** he is also examining a contention of Miller that the township should pay for his legal fees in the ZBA court case. Burress has charged Miller \$3,425 for his legal services.

Miller maintains that the township should pay the fees, because he was involved in the court case as a township official (planning commission member)—not a private citizen.

"He just threw a shotgun at us—who pays for Burress' legal fees?" said Sempliner.

Township officials have taken a "no-action" stance on the bill.

## Citizen's lobbying guide is free

State Rep. Perry Bullard (D-Ann Arbor) has prepared the second revised edition of a "Citizens Guide to Lobbying" for this session of the Michigan legislature.

The booklet is now available and contains information to make it easier for citizens and citizen groups to work for reform in Lansing and Washington.

Published originally by Bullard as a guide to the 1975-76 state legislative session in Dec. 1975, the new edition includes advice and suggestions for effective citizen lobbying, as well as names, addresses, offices, telephone numbers and pictures of all members of the House and Senate.

The booklet also shows maps and descriptions of all House and Senate districts; lists the members of House and Senate standing committees, subcommittees and joint committees; explains how a bill becomes law; gives the addresses, telephone numbers, and directors of state departments, and contains other useful information on state and federal government. The revision contains 94 pages of information.

In an introductory note to the guide, Bullard comments that "There is a great need for an increase in general citizen impact on the decision making process between elections... individual communication on specific legislative proposals at the appropriate time does have an impact. Organized community and citizens' groups can multiply the impact of

that individual effort. Organizing citizens' groups in your area of concern is extremely important.

"Regular, informed input from such a group can carry weight in a decision-making situation, particularly if

it appears that the group or organization will still be in existence during the next election. The intent of this citizens guide is to provide some of the specific information needed to get in touch with the right people at the

right time to make your concerns heard."

Editor: Apathy has become the major ingredient in Canton's political scene since the summer recall election.

It is time for the divided concerned citizens of Canton to stop licking their wounds of their losses in the last two elections. We must start working together to save what can still be a great township in which to raise a family.

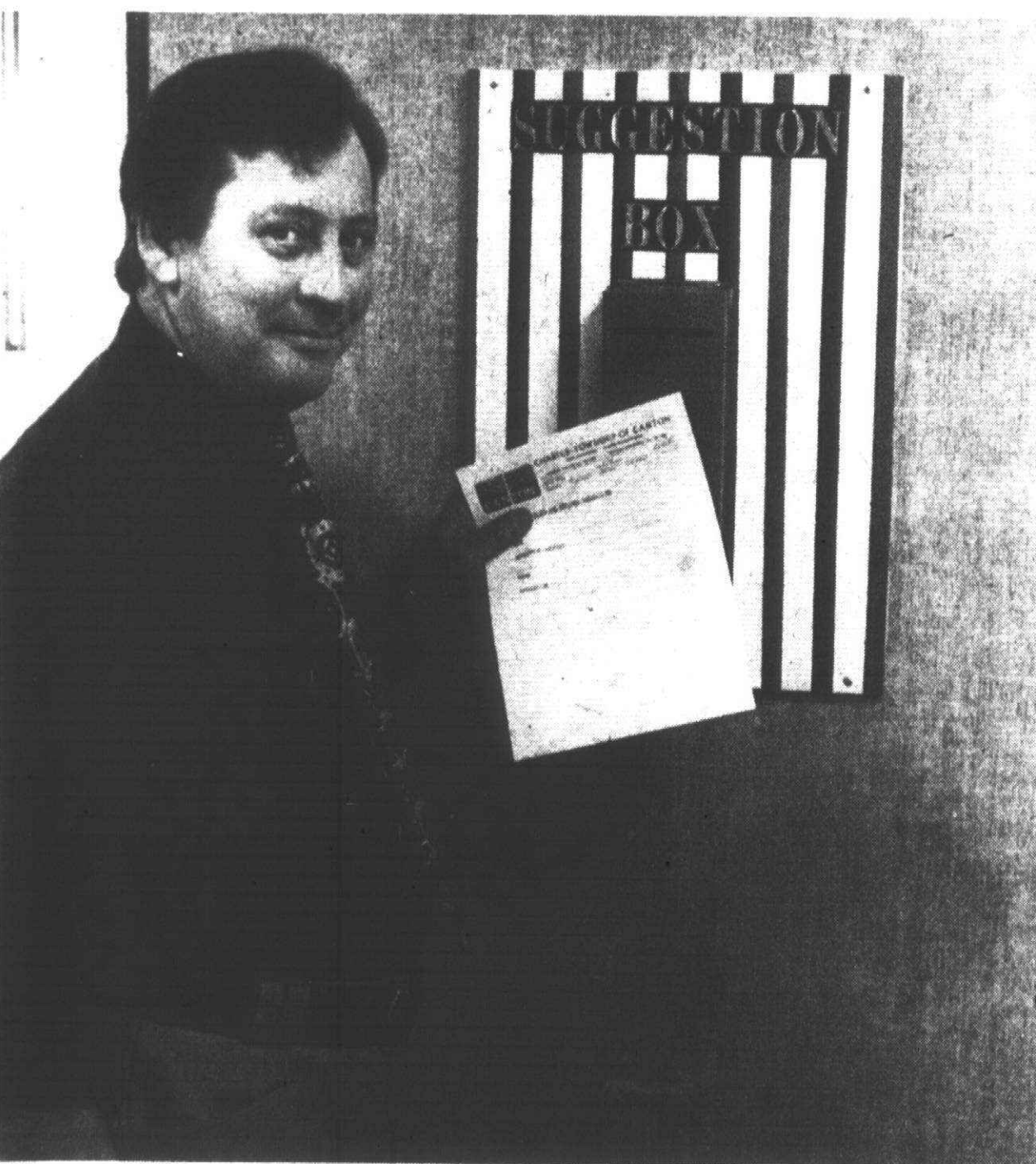

concern about growth and the need for balanced development.

"A PUD is supposed to be a balanced community with single family, apartments and commercial use," he said. "To the extent that you alter PUD agreements, you alter that. In my opinion, a community that's nothing but single family homes is not a balanced community."

Berg said six developers have requested single-family zoning PUD amendments in the last few years, and

all but Mocer's have been granted.

**MOST OF THE TOWNSHIP'S** 16 PUD agreements were signed by Canton officials and developers during former Supervisor Philip Dingeldey's administration, Berg said. Township officials agreed to the multiple zoning within the PUD agreement in exchange for parks that developers promised to build in the middle of single-family subdivisions.

When former Supervisor Robert

Greenstein took office, township board members took an increasingly negative view toward multiple zoning and voted to sign no more PUD agreements.

Their anti-apartment attitude was based on the belief that rented apartment units deteriorate quicker than single-family homes and that homeowners don't want to live next to apartments.

According to Berg, only three or four developers have constructed

apartments in the township's 16 PUDs showing the marketability decrease.

"But I don't think you should rezone land just because apartments aren't marketable right now," said Padgett.

Berg said he hopes the planning commission sticks to its decision to refuse all single-family zoning in the Stonegate PUD.

"But it all depends on how much stress people at the public hearing put on being consistent," he said.

efforts "resulted in scorn by a non-representative national media—a massive, biased and shameful attack that resulted in blackmail."

ON THAT CHARGE, Smith said he was unfamiliar with the precise wording of the resolution and concerned with only the essence of it. "When you put more than one word together, some may be out of place. I'm not concerned with that."

Brown called the media claim "just words."

The resolution also mentions the Dade County election, which overwhelmingly supported Miss Bryant in her campaign to deny homosexuals

equal rights in housing and employment.

"The people of Dade County, having been given the opportunity, have spoken for all Americans and said, enough of moral decline and destruction of values," the resolution reads.

"At the time it was presented, the resolution seemed proper," Brown said. "Many things have happened since then, however, that no longer make it a subject of further consideration."

"The intent was that the lady had the nerve and the facility to fight what she thought was right, which is the process of this country."

Brown and Smith said the resolution "isn't going anywhere." It has been forwarded to a committee on house policy, chaired by Rep. Joseph Forbes (D-Oak Park), where it is expected to die.

Smith's district includes the City of Plymouth and most of Plymouth Township. Brown's district includes all of Canton and a section of Plymouth Township.

then took off running through the woods.

"I fired a couple warning shots but that only made him run faster. He got away but we arrested him later in his house in East Detroit."

Investigating blind pigs almost got Daley into big trouble once.

"I was looking through a window of a blind pig, only to see another pair of eyes looking back out. Luckily the lookout had a pair of glasses this thick and I don't think he saw me."

On another occasion, Daley said he entered a gambling joint using the name of the operator of the club. But when he said so-and-so-sent-me, he didn't realize he was talking to so-and-so. Other officers behind him didn't make that mistake and while Daley was not allowed to gamble, the other officers were and they made the arrest.

Some of the people found in those blind pigs and betting houses were "upstaging people in the community," according to Daley.

"You'd find judicial people, police officers, lawyers and politicians in a lot of these gambling joints."

"Hell, human beings are human beings. Usually, you kicked the cops out the back door; you didn't want to bring embarrassment to their police

department.

"If there was a judge or politician involved, somehow or another in the confusion of the arrest he got away," Daley said frankly.

Police officers were mainly concerned with arresting the operators of the club, not the patrons, Daley explained. In spite of the back door justice afforded to gambling police officers, Daley said he never had any use for "a rotten policeman."

"I'll never condone a rotten policeman. If you can't trust a policeman, who the hell can you trust?"

Daley, who's lived in Canton since 1960, has raised six children with his wife Sophie. The couple has two grandsons, two granddaughters and "two unknowns."

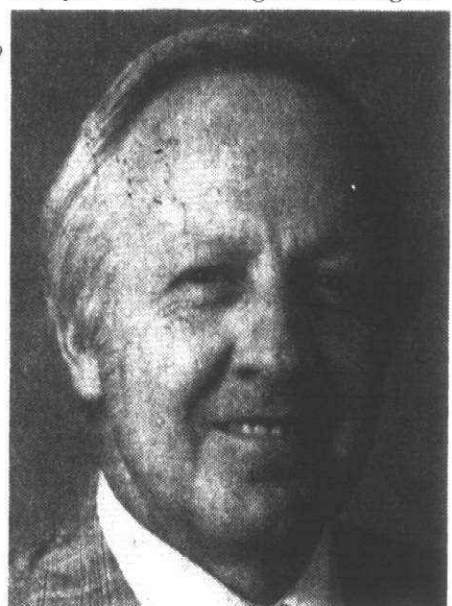

# Direct foreign investments are light in Plymouth area

There are only two firms in the Plymouth area operating with direct foreign investment.

That is the finding of a survey conducted by the research division of the graduate school of business administration at Michigan State University.

Foreign direct investment, as defined by the U.S. Department of Commerce, is those investments with a "direct and-or indirect ownership of 10 per cent or more of the voting securities of an incorporated business enterprise or equivalent interest in an unincorporated business enterprise."

Based on that definition, the MSU survey showed only two firms with foreign direct investment in Plymouth—Howmet Corp., and Specialty Coatings, Inc.

Howmet, with French investors, produces metal products and employs 3,000 persons in Michigan. Specialty Coatings, with investors from the United Kingdom, is engaged in chemicals and employs 35 persons at its Plymouth facility.

ACCORDING TO the MSU survey the value of plant, property and equipment located in Michigan and owned by foreign companies or their U.S. affiliates was about \$1½ billion, or 3.3 per cent of the U.S. total at the end of 1974.

Petroleum based companies accounted for 40 per cent of the Michigan total; manufacturing, 31 per cent; banks, retailers, hotels, 29 per cent.

Michigan affiliates of foreign companies employed about 37,300 workers or one per cent of the total number employed in Michigan. Wages and salaries of these firms totaled \$436 million, or 3.8 per cent of the national figure.

In the number of foreign owned manufacturing plants, Michigan ranked seventh among the states with 84 following New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, California, Illinois and North Carolina.

The countries who own the most plants in Michigan are: Canada (18), Germany (14), United Kingdom (12), Netherlands (11), Japan and France, nine each.

Among the major firms are Total-Leonard refinery at Alma, Massey Ferguson, Baker Perkins, United Biscuit, BASF which controls Wyandotte Chemicals, Hoover Ball Bearings, Yamaha Musical Products, Hitachi Metals, Voltek and TSK.

Nearby firms with direct foreign investments include: Argus, Inc. and Hoover-NSK Bearings Co., Ann Arbor; Perkins Engines, Inc., Farmington; Schuler Presses America, Southfield; Perkins Engines in Wayne and Wixom; and Celasto, Inc. in Ypsilanti.

The survey was conducted by Zahir Ahmed Qureshi, research assistant in the graduate school of business administration at MSU and by Mushtaq Luqmani, assistant professor in the marketing department at Western Michigan University.

Saturday the eyes of all sports fans will be focused on Ann Arbor as the Wolverines take on Ohio State for the Big Ten title, or at least a piece of it.

In recent years, the Big Ten title has gone down to the wire to the final contest between U-M and OSU. In fact, these two teams have really dominated the Big Ten to the conference's detriment.

This year, however, has seen the rise of the MSU Spartans who have built a strong team while living out its prohibition from participating in bowl games or being on national TV for recruiting violations. They are finishing strong this year, and will certainly be in contention for 1978.

WHICH IS A good thing because a healthy league should have three or four teams in any given year which are strong enough to have a crack at the title.

Beyond that, the Spartans' rise is pleasing for personal reasons. Some

may not remember, but the Wolverines and Buckeyes were not always one-two at the season's end. There was a time, before Bo, when MSU was the team to contend with, with the Buckeyes and Wolverines assuming the role of challenger.

In those days, for me at least, Ann Arbor was an academic center and if you were interested in good football teams East Lansing was the place to look. I'm talking of the period from roughly 1955-60 when the best Big Ten football was played in Spartan Stadium.

At that time I was living in a rural area near Bridgeport, which is near Frankenmuth and Birch Run. The young people in the area were quite active in 4-H, which had a close relationship with the MSU Agricultural Extension Service.

Because of that relationship, once a year our local 4-H club received free tickets to attend a football game in East Lansing. We'd charter a bus, pile


into the stadium, enjoy the game as much as possible, regardless of our limited understanding of how it was played, and head for home.

So as a young boy, I developed some intense loyalties for the Spartans. And not just because of the free ride, but because they had some pretty good teams in those years. I still remember Dean Look scampering around the field, Sam Williams grabbing a pass with those big hands of his, and what's-name kicking the game winning field goal in a Rose Bowl contest.

There were other stars too, but I won't enumerate all of them—primarily because I'm no longer sure of the spellings, and I've lost track of which MSU stars played on the same teams.

ANYHOW, my introduction to college football was with the Spartans, not the Wolverines or the Buckeyes.

For years I continued to root for MSU; actually until my family moved to this area in 1959. For a few years I



continued to follow the Spartans closely but soon became aware that people in these parts were interested in U-M and U-D.

My first detraction was when I began following the Titans basketball games. And then, gradually, I began to be aware that they played football in Ann Arbor also.

About the time Bo took over the Wolverine football machine, my loyalties shifted from East Lansing to Ann Arbor. Now the transition is complete and MSU is only a memory.

But that's why I'm glad to see the Spartans putting together a good football program. I'd like to pull for both teams, particularly when they play OSU. But, when they face each other, I'll be behind the Wolverines all the way. That's what the passing of years, and switch in geographical domicile will do.

So my eyes will be turned toward Ann Arbor this Saturday, and for many weekends in future years. But I've got a soft spot for MSU which I'm certain in the near future will cause serious conflict as the Spartans build a strong team capable of beating U-M any Saturday of the season.

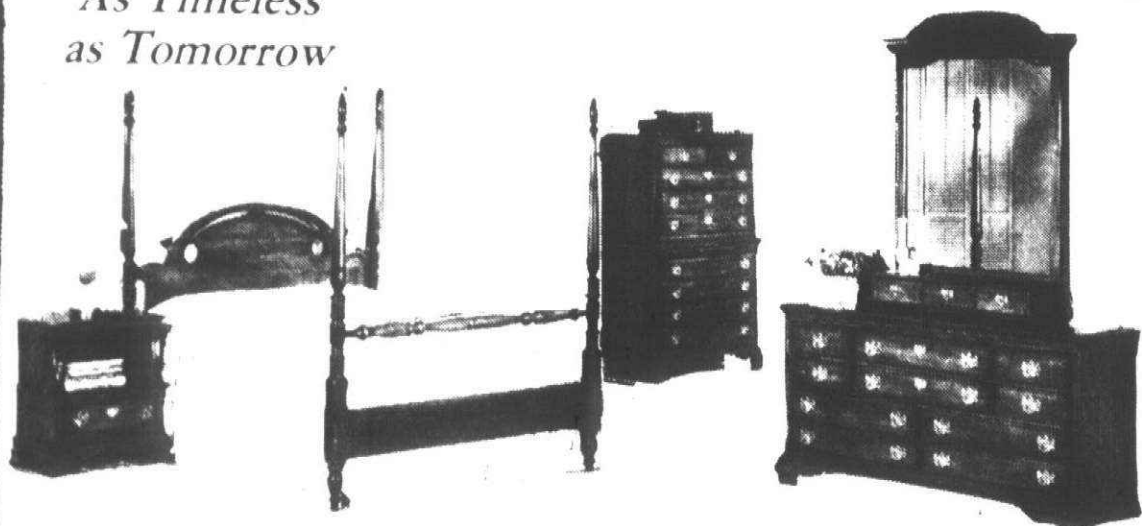

## Schools show off Phase III

Plymouth and Canton residents Monday got acquainted with the athletic and music facilities available in the new Phase III building at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park.

The music-physical education facility, opened last spring, was built with monies from the 1974 bond issue. The first athletic contests were scheduled in the facility this fall and with construction completed, an open house was held Monday.

**THE PHYSICAL EDUCATION** building includes ten teaching stations with a combined area of about 70,000 square feet.

The largest area is an open gymnasium which can be divided into three

smaller gyms of equal size for teaching purposes.

An 11-lap indoor track surrounds the open gym, and roll-away bleachers seat about 1,000 spectators.

Adjacent to the gymnasium are a gymnastics room and a wrestling room.

A six-lane, 25-yard swimming pool ranging in depth from 3 to 4½ feet serves an instructional purpose as well as meeting intramural and inter-scholastic competition needs. The area also includes a diving well, and roll-away bleachers to seat about 200.

One unusual feature is a multi-purpose dance and handball area—two 40 by 40 foot rooms divisible by moveable walls into four 20 by 40 foot handball courts. Also available is a weight

training room for students and staff members.

The music section of Phase III includes a large instrumental music room, a vocal music room, instrumental locker area, workroom and storage areas and individual offices and instructional areas.

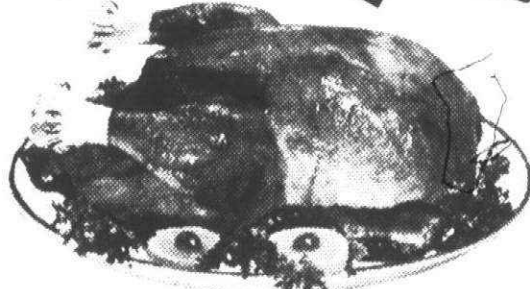
**PHASE III WAS** built for \$3.8 million with \$140,000 invested in equipment.

Physical education activities which can be played in the facility include basketball, volleyball, tennis, badminton, indoor track, handball, racquetball, and gymnastics. Another unique feature is an indoor pole vaulting facility.

Architects were Wakely-Kushner Associates, Inc. of Warren and the general contractor was Fordon Construction Company of Farmington.

# Jeffries opening ignites numbers game

Next Monday's opening of the I-96 (Jeffries) freeway in western Wayne County will cause several highway number changes in the western suburban area and in southern Oakland County.

Sign changes, now under way, are expected to be completed by December, according to the State Highways and Transportation Department.

These changes will be made:

•The Jeffries, which follows the route of Schoolcraft Road through Detroit, Redford Township and Livonia, will take the designation I-96.

•The I-96 Business Spur, which parallels Grand River in Farmington, will lose the I-96 BS designation and become M-102.

•Grand River in Farmington, Redford Township and Detroit will lose the I-96 Business Loop designation and become M-5.

•Eight Mile Road west of Grand River will lose the M-102 designation. (East of Grand River, it will remain M-102.)

•Plymouth Road will lose the M-14 designation east of the I-275 freeway. (West of I-275, Ann Arbor Road, as it is called there, will remain M-14 until that freeway is completed in 1978.)

**CEREMONIES MARKING** the Jeffries Freeway completion—five years behind schedule—will begin at 9:30 a.m., Monday, Nov. 21 on the west-bound lanes east of Inkster Road, the border of Livonia and Redford Township.

The highway itself will be open to traffic later in the day.

Band music and a parade of old and new vehicles will herald completion of the 12-mile section built at a cost of \$126 million, 90 per cent federally funded (\$113 million). The state paid for the remaining 10 per cent.

The Jeffries link completes the 193-mile freeway from Muskegon to downtown Detroit.

It is named for the late Edward Jeffries, mayor of Detroit from 1938-48.

I-96 also marks the end of a 35 years of freeway construction in Wayne County that began with the World War II-era Detroit Industrial Freeway, now known as I-94.

**THE NEW I-96** has eight lanes, four in each direction, divided by a concrete barrier. It parallels an old Indian trail from Detroit to Howell, Lansing, Grand Rapids and Muskegon known as the Grand River Trail.

It was one of the first major routes in Michigan to be taken over as a "state highway." The old Grand River Road for years carried the designation of US-16.

Its first freeway sections were opened in 1957 west of Grand Rapids and between US-23 (at Brighton) and Farmington. With the opening of the new section, the entire Grand River Road is now paralleled, and replaced for intercity travel, by freeway.

**DEDICATION REMARKS** will be delivered by Congressman Carl Purcell, (R-Plymouth). Attending the ribbon-cutting will be Major Edward MacNamara of Livonia, Supervisor Patrick J. McDonald of Redford Township and Mayor Coleman A. Young of Detroit.

Master of ceremonies will be Peter Fletcher, of Ypsilanti, chairman of the State Highway Commission.

Welcoming guests will be Ms. Michigan Transportation—Gloria Crafton of Lansing.

State legislators, county and local officials and representatives of the Federal Highway Administration will attend.

## Act will help home owners

The Housing and Community Development Act of 1977 could be good news for home owners and home buyers alike, according to a savings and loan business spokesman.

John A. Hardin, president of the United States League of Savings Associations, said that

although federal regulatory agencies still must write the implementing regulations, the Housing and Community Development Act "will become a very important piece of legislation, one that will significantly aid the entire housing market."

The new law raises the

maximum amount savings associations can lend on residential mortgages and on home improvement loans, expands the community development block grant program and exempts FHA graduated payment mortgage plans from state usury laws.

The United States

League is the primary trade association serving the \$430 billion savings and loan business. Savings associations are the nation's chief suppliers of home mortgage credit and the second largest suppliers of home improvement financing.

Hardin said that an important portion of the

legislation extends for three more years—the community development block grant program initiated by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development in 1974.

The extended—and expanded—program devotes more attention to communities.

Tips for pricing funerals

Funerals, understandably, are a subject most of us prefer to avoid.

But whether we like it or not, funeral arrangements present us with some of the most expensive consumer decisions we are forced to make as adults. One recent survey in Oakland County revealed that it's not unusual for funerals in this area to cost in excess of \$2,000.

And according to the Federal Trade Commission, which recently completed extensive hearings into the funeral business, the high cost of dying often results from practices that are "exploitative, unfair, and deceptive."

Here are some questions we have received at the Michigan Citizens Lobby concerning funeral practices and costs:

QUESTION: Why have funerals become so expensive?

ANSWER: The single most important decision governing the cost of a funeral usually is the selection of the casket. Prices range from a few hundred dollars to elaborate caskets costing \$3,000 or more. Frequently funeral homes promote their more expensive models by displaying them more attractively or even by refusing to stock less expensive caskets.

Another factor that inflates funeral costs is the practice of quoting a lump sum figure for the entire funeral. Requiring the home to itemize the various goods and services being sold—professional services, motor equipment, casket, etc.—gives the consumer the opportunity to reject some parts of the package that may not seem necessary, and to save some money.

QUESTION: Most funeral homes promote the purchase of caskets even

in the case of cremation. Does the state require that persons be cremated in a casket?

ANSWER: No. The state only requires that the body be burned in a suitable container, which can mean a \$50 cardboard or fiberboard case. Unfortunately, too many people don't know this and end up purchasing an expensive casket for a cremation in the belief that the law requires it.

QUESTION: Is embalming required by law?

ANSWER: Embalming is only required when the deceased had a

communicable disease or when burial or cremation will not occur within 48 hours after death. Again, many people believe embalming is a legal necessity in all cases and spend the \$100 that is the approximate cost of embalming.

QUESTION: I have often heard that memorial societies offer a less expensive alternative to regular commercial funeral homes. What exactly is a memorial society?

ANSWER: A memorial society is a group of people who have joined together to "obtain simplicity and economy in funeral arrangements through advance planning."

# Johnson retiring after 2 decades as asst. police chief

The familiar face of Loren L. Johnson, assistant chief of the City of Plymouth police department for almost two decades, soon will be missing from behind the desk.

Within the next few weeks he plans to doff his stiff-peaked cap and the gold badge to live a life of ease and travel up and down and across the United States to visit places that he has dreamed about since his youth.

Now 62, Johnson confided that he

was leaving his familiar post because he thinks the time has come for a younger man to take the desk.

"I have had my thrills on the job and loved every minute of it," he said. "But now I think it's time I turned to other things to live a life of ease."

OVER THE YEARS the assistant chief has lived an unusual life. Born in Dennis, Kan., most of his youth was spent on a farm.

"There was just nothing else to do in that country, but it was a good start."

He spent part of his younger years in the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC), preparing him for some of his activity later on.

Like many other veterans who finished their military service and found themselves out of a job, he turned to other fields and finally landed in Michigan.

"This may surprise you, but I went to work for a man named Lester Shore, who operated a greenhouse on Plymouth Road on the site of the Burroughs parking lot. As a matter of fact I helped to build the greenhouse."

"From there I went to the Allen Industries on Junction and remained there until 1942 when I joined the city police force."

AT THE TIME, Charlie Thumme was the police chief and the entire force consisted of six men.

"I've seen that force grow to 19 men, aside from the desk staff, and I have seen the city grow from a small community into the thriving city we have today."

As he recalled his days on the force

he confided there were the memories of two events he would take with him into retirement.

"I was on the force in 1967 when the National Bank was robbed. That was a day of real excitement. But we finally traced the burglar through finger-

prints. We captured him to crown our efforts of solving a small town bank robbery. But it was a big time."

The other memory is that of the Plymouth woman who killed two of her three boys in 1958 and then took her own life.

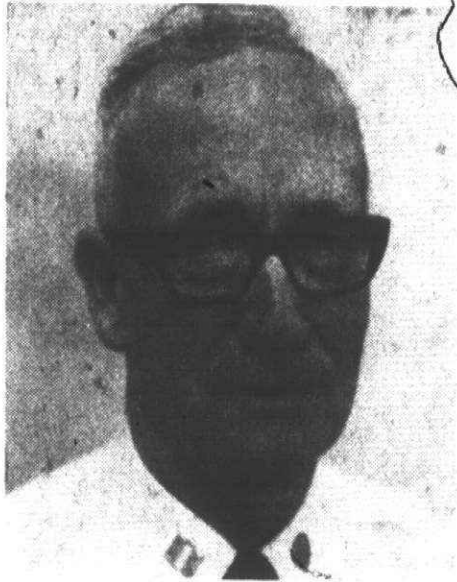
"From what we could find out that day, the two boys had been carried into the house after being kept in an automobile in the garage. They were filled with monoxide gas. The third boy was still living."

After the boys were taken into the home, she then went back to the garage and let the gas take her life.

"That wasn't a pleasant task, but it was all part of the job. Now it's time to turn the badge over to a younger man and let him experience some of the duties of the police force."

Johnson is married and the father of two children. His wife, who is employed by Burroughs, also is retiring to join the assistant chief in the swing around the country "to see many of the things and places we always wanted to see."

They'll be carrying many memories with them, but the police desk in city hall won't seem like the same place without him.

## Home loan rate slips

Only Washtenaw County, among the four principal metropolitan Detroit counties, registered increases in September in residential mortgages as both dollar volume and number of loans declined moderately from August peaks for the year.

Yet home lending remained at a strong pace, indicating healthy sales of new and used homes, to give September the second highest dollar volume of the year, at more than \$260 million on the basis of 8,911 mortgages.

The August figures were 9,675 loans worth \$287.4 million. September's volume surpassed June's \$259.6 million to oust that month from the second spot, although the number of loans fell short of June's 9,100 at 8,911.

The figures were released by Edward A. Bly, vice president and Michigan manager for Lawyers Title Insurance Corp.

Wayne County's 3,801 loans were worth \$90.8 million, while Oakland with \$99.4 million led the four counties in dollar volume on 2,799 mortgages. Like Wayne's and Oakland's, Macomb's totals slipped slightly, to 1,688 loans worth \$48.4 million from 1,833 loans aggregating \$50.9 million.

Washtenaw recorded 623 loans worth \$21.7 million, up from 572 totaling \$20.3 million.

Among mortgages above \$100,000, normally considered to be on properties of a commercial nature including multiple housing, September also saw a decline in the number of such loans, 235 compared to 269 in peak August.

In Wayne, 60 of the larger mortgages totaled \$65 million. Oakland recorded 120 loans worth \$53.8 million. Macomb's 29 loans involved \$15.6 million and Washtenaw's 26 loans were worth \$17.9 million.

## Deer, car encounters number thousands

There were 14,349 deer-car accidents in Michigan during 1976 which resulted in two persons killed and 862 injured, according to reports of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and the Michigan State Police.

The hazard of a deer-car accident is paramount in the months of October, November and December—and in both the upper and lower peninsulas. In fact, the greater number of deer are killed in the southern lower peninsula.

# Maybury Park users must buy motor vehicle permit after Jan. 1

You'll need a motor vehicle permit to enter Maybury Urban State Park after Jan. 1.

The state Department of Natural Resources says park usage has increased enough and the park is developed enough, to warrant the checking of permits.

Prices are \$1 a day or \$5 for a year.

Maybury is the former Detroit tuberculosis facility in Northville Township. The entrance is from Eight Mile Road. It boasts some of the most extensive bicycle trails in the state, both newly constructed asphalt paths and old concrete roads from the TB san days. It's a nice hiking spot, too although it has no lake or stream.

THE HURON-Clinton Metroparks people are taking good care of the cross-country skiing enthusiasts, thank you.



Add Hudson Mills, west of Plymouth; Lower Huron, near Belleville and Willow, near New Boston, to the list of spots which was headed by Kersington Metropark last year. Hudson Mills has no specially devel-

oped trails, but groups of people will take care of that in short order. Hudson Mills, located where the Huron River crosses North Territorial Road, also has a roaring rapids and rolling terrain that are just right for winter photography.

Lower Huron is easy to reach, now that we have I-275 to take us south. The park entrance is on Hannan Road, a quarter-mile south of Huron River Drive.

Three natural rink surfaces are provided at connected ponds. There are also lights, wood for rinkside fires and heated restrooms nearby.

Willow, downriver from Lower Huron, has no special runs for toboggans but with good snow the Chestnut picnic area hill is excellent.

THE STATE Natural Resources

Commission has voted to keep a trapping ban at Proud Lake Recreation Area, north of Wixom, but will continue to allow trapping in the Rochester-Utica Recreation Area.

Its parks division reported that because of extensive physical developments and public use at Proud Lake, trapping would cause conflicts, if permitted.

But the parks division said it would be feasible to permit trapping at Rochester-Utica.

DNR NETTERS came up with 150 coho salmon "jacks" off Belle Isle, where 300,000 coho smolts were planted last spring. The jacks, immature salmon, weighed between one and three pounds. Planting site was near the Detroit Yacht Club channel.

## McQuesten backs jobs

Mark McQuesten of Canton, a member of the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees, has issued a statement clarifying his position on job training at the community college.

McQuesten objected to a headline in the Nov. 10 edition which said he was "losing Schoolcraft battle against job training." The article pointed out that he thought the college should be "more than a training ground."

"I am not against job training per se, but am concerned with the quality of job training to be offered by Schoolcraft. It is not enough merely to teach students specific job skills."

"What I am against is the type of job training which excludes types of learning experiences beyond specific job skills. A student on a job training program needs exposure to other subjects, such as speech, communications, political science or physical education."

"As a college Schoolcraft must provide to vocational students the educational background which will help them meaningfully perform in a work situation, and not just learn specific skills which may change very quickly."

Students who want to pursue a technical occupation should have little trouble finding a job in southeastern Michigan, according to a study compiled by Schoolcraft College.

The latest outlook reveals a broad salary range, from \$550 monthly to \$1,400 monthly, for entry level positions. The salaries, of course, depend on the field and the employer. The employment outlook for a majority of the occupations was rated "excellent."

He said much of the data was obtained from the instructors teaching Schoolcraft's applied sciences courses. "They're pretty knowledgeable (about the job situation) within the Detroit area. Our students are being hired all around the Detroit-metropolitan area," he said.

Those seeking an associates degree in business face a bright employment outlook. According to the ratings, there are jobs available in the eight occupations in the category. Entry level salaries range from a low of \$550 for a clerk-typist to a high of \$1,200 for a real estate agent.

• Accountants face an excellent employment picture with monthly salaries ranging from \$750 to \$1,050. SC defined the position as a person who compiles and analyzes business records and prepares financial reports. Accountants may, however, specialize.

•Clerk-typists will probably have to hunt for a job. They may wonder if salary is worth it, because their entry level pay is the lowest of the 29 occupations examined. They expect to earn \$550 to \$675 a month in the beginning.

• Data processing programmers seem to be in demand. Their entry level salaries range from \$800 to \$1,000 monthly. "A programmer operates computers utilizing established programs or programs under development," said the report.

• Marketing and applied management graduates should have no problems finding a job. Pay will range between \$700 and \$1,000 monthly. SC said a graduate in this field should be "a well-trained individual who works in the distribution of goods and services." •

General secretaries, those who "perform duties for top-level executives or managers," will also be in demand. Monthly earnings fall in the \$800 to \$950 range. •

Legal and medical secretaries may have to hunt around, but according to the report, jobs are to be found in the region. SC also warns that the pay range in these jobs is just slightly lower than for general secretaries but fringe benefits may be less.

- Those in real estate may have to look around for a position, but monthly

- Licensed practical and registered nurses are reportedly in great demand. Salaries range from \$750 a month to \$1,075 for a registered nurse. A registered nurse, according to SC's definition, supervises nursing care among other things, and a practical nurse gives care under the supervision of a registered nurse or physician.

• Medical records technicians are also given excellent chances at finding employment. Again, salaries fall into \$800 per month range. "In three to five years, a successful employee will earn \$13,000 to \$15,000 a year," the report said.

•Occupational therapy assistants, with only a "fair" employment rating, have fewer hopes and a less lucrative salary. Upon being hired, they can expect to be paid \$550 a month. A certified assistant works under the supervision of a registered occupational therapist who plans treatment programs.

**GRADUATES PLANNING** to pursue a career in the three public service areas will see the full range of possibilities. Employment outlooks are "fair" and "moderate." The pay scales range from roughly \$600 to \$1,100 a month.

•Those hoping to be child care workers will have to scout around for jobs, which will pay about \$600 monthly.

•Industrial security, according to Schoolcraft's findings, is a "rapidly growing" field which offers moderate employment

• Biomedical equipment technicians, those who maintain and service medical electronic equipment can look forward to an excellent employment outlook and a \$1,500 monthly salary. Their salaries are also bolstered by added fringe benefits such as the use of a car, according to the SC outlook.

• Civil technologists, who serve in supporting roles to engineers, may have trouble finding a job after they leave college, the report warned. If one does get a job, though, opening pay will be about \$800 a month.

• A climate systems technician, a person qualified for employment in the refrigeration, heating and air conditioning industries, can expect an open job market and a monthly salary of \$1,000.

•The culinary arts curriculum has a waiting list and the excellent employment outlook could help explain it. Those hired right out of the program can expect to earn between \$1,000 and \$1,400 a month.

•Graduates in the electronics curriculum can expect to find a job in a "wide range of diverse industries," according to Schoolcraft's survey. The entry level salary is approximately \$1,100 per month.

- Mechanical design technicians also face an open job market and can expect to earn \$850 a month.

- Metallurgists must be trained in the physical structure of metals and alloys. They can expect to have little

• Tool design technicians, likewise, have an excellent job outlook. Training for the position, which pays about \$750 a month, stresses possibilities. Salaries, again, fall into the \$600-per-month range. According to SC report, industrial security firms are "seeking trained personnel to administer their increasingly complex programs in such areas as factories, hospitals, banks, schools and airports."

- The law enforcement field paints a "fair" employment picture. Opening

**THE TECHNICAL** careers, the largest category of SC's survey, likewise covers the entire employment and salary spectrum.

• Architectural technicians, the highly-trained, semi-professional employees who work in direct support of professional architects and engineers, are in moderate demand. The pay is also moderate—\$600 to \$650 per month. The technician helps to prepare architectural, structural and working drawings.

•Auto dealership service managers are also in demand, according to the SC outlook. The normal opening salary would fall into the \$600 to \$800 range. The General Motors, Ford and Chrysler test laboratories, however, will start new employees out at \$800 to \$1,200 a month. mathematics and physics which are essential to tool layout and detailing.

- The curriculum for the industri-

ally-oriented technicians in welding technology and industrial fabrication is designed for those who will have "application and supervisory responsibility," according to SC's survey. Students in these fields face open markets on which to peddle their skills. They can expect an annual salary of \$12,000.

•Geology technicians, who are trained through the college's petroleum technology curriculum, will be prepared to work as assistants to petroleum engineers and geologists. The career has an excellent employment outlook with an annual salary which approaches \$12,000.

# Conference to explore retreat from political, social concerns

"Executive Wanted: self-centered, self-serving, able to place personal needs above those of others. Applicants should be free of personal relationships and other social commitments."

An unlikely advertisement? Yes, but not an unlikely description of the person who may be best suited for success in an increasingly complex, impersonal society.

"Many social historians are alarmed at what they see as a rise in self-centered behavior," reports Howard Shevrin, professor of psychology and of psychiatry at the University of Michigan.

"They are observing a retreat from political and social concerns as people turn inward, pursuing self-improvement and other personal goals."

The trend will be explored in a conference entitled "Narcissism in Modern Society" Nov. 16-18 at the U-M. Co-sponsored by the university values committee and 10 other U-M departments and programs, the free sessions will be held at Rackham Auditorium and are open to the public. Programs are available through the U-M office of ethics and religion, (313) 764-7442.

Shevrin and other speakers will discuss the origins and repercussions of "the new narcissism," what aspects of modern society are fostering this behavior? How is it related to changes in family structure, religious movements and work settings?

The '70s have seen an intensified interest in psychic self-improvement, "expanded consciousness" and personal growth. Is it a fad, or the beginning of a new phase of civilization?

"Ego-centric, self-serving people have always been with us," Shevrin

points out. "Their personalities are recognizable in the Iliad, medieval Japanese writings, and the Bible."

"But social historian Christopher Lasch and others believe society is producing more of these types of people."

The social critics decided to compare notes with psychoanalysts, many of whom also noticed increasing cases of patients with narcissistic character problems. The patients did not display bizarre behaviors or neurotic symptoms—rather, they had severe difficulties in forming relationships.

"All theorists tend to agree that the deficit very likely traces back to childhood, although they differ as to what causes it," Shevrin says.

"Infants, for example, are born with a readiness to attach themselves to a consistent caretaker, usually the mother. Later, that attachment evolves to a sense of 'relatedness.' Ultimately, the maturing child perceives that the feeling of relatedness to others is essential to his sense of well-being."

"But the narcissistic person never makes this transition," Shevrin explains. "Other people are important only insofar as they help him maintain or return to a state of well-being."

The seeds of narcissism take root in infancy, Shevrin believes; thus it is the family, the "cradle of personality," which determines their growth.

But the U-M psychologist is cautious about linking narcissism with the demise of the nuclear family, rising divorce rate or changing parent roles. "Infants may vary in their capacity to tolerate disturbance, as parents may vary in their sensitivity to the infant's needs. In fact, I would believe these constitutional or genetic factors are probably much more significant than any social influence on the early ties."

"However, social institutions can work to select certain personality types which, once formed, will best prosper within their precincts. Certainly the sheer growth in size and bureaucratic complexity of such major institutions as corporations, universities and government create fertile ground for the kind of de-personalized behavior that narcissistic individuals favor," Shevrin said.

But are Americans, en masse, becoming totally preoccupied with their own welfare? Shevrin reserves judgment. "Narcissistic people may exist in no greater proportion today than they did in the past," he observes. "Rather, it could be that modern society has brought them to the fore."

The social critics are not wholly in consensus as to whether narcissism is a bad thing, he adds. Some applaud it as a great awakening, a cultural breakthrough.

But Shevrin opposes those exercises in expanded consciousness which, taken to the extreme, may negate all sense of participation in a social world. "Whether sought through quasi-religious experiences, drugs or other means, their purpose is to reject a sense of personal relatedness in favor of some magnified state of well-being," he believes.

"To the extent that this assault on personal relatedness succeeds, to that

extent we are all in danger of weakening our adherence to each other and lessening our conviction that we need one another."

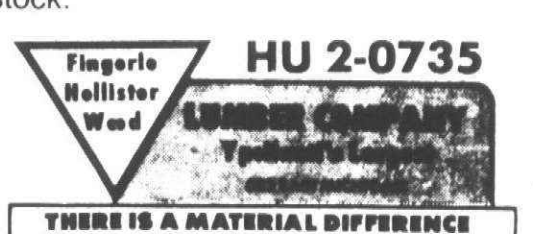

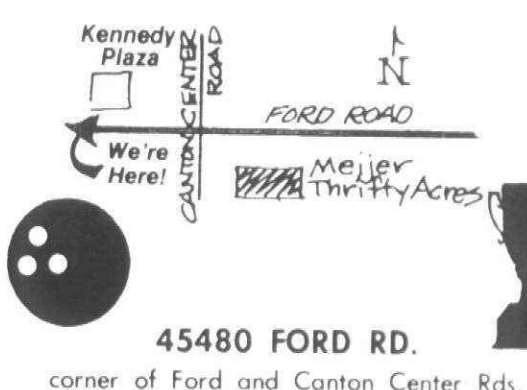

# Youth must understand consequences of crime

Regular subscribers to the Observer, or even our most casual readers, can't help but be aware of the alarming number of serious crimes committed by young persons this year in the communities of Canton and Plymouth.

Before anyone becomes indignant and proclaims, "Why not talk about all the good things young people are doing," let's make it clear that we regularly applaud the constructive contributions young people are making. But to ignore the destructiveness of a few young people would be to gloss over a problem that must be dealt with directly.

Juveniles aren't coming in from out-of-town to commit these crimes; they're coming from local family rooms. In the past year, we've seen local juveniles charged with arson, two instances of armed robbery, car theft, and numerous home and apartment break-ins.

In one instance this summer, a gang of seven teens, ages 13 through 15, were apprehended by state and local police and charged with almost 100 home break-ins. The alleged ringleader was a 33-year-old man who escaped arrest.

**EVEN SOME** of the crimes listed as having been committed by an "adult," were done by persons who are just over the legally-liable age of 17.

Probably the most hair-raising crime of the year was allegedly committed by a 15-year-old Canton boy and an 18-year-old accomplice, William Guethlein, who were arrested after police said they were fired upon by the youths.

According to police, the pair had 10 stolen guns in their possession—guns taken from Guethlein's father's home earlier that day.

**ON OCT. 28**, Canton Chief fans were trying to cheer their team on to victory. The team lost the game—and their wallets, which were taken from the lockerroom while the team was on the field.

Explanations for youth crime and solutions to reduce it are difficult to formulate. Many people say that the trouble can be blamed on the recent, rapid influx of newcomers. But some of the youths arrested this year come from families with roots in the community that go back 50 years.

Police claim that youths commit many crimes because they know they cannot be charged as an

adult. But, judging from the recent crackdown on the alleged "roof raiders" who broke into five different shopping centers in Canton, that bravado may be short-lived. A stint in the juvenile home is nothing for a 15-year-old to look forward to.

But the threat of incarceration is always a poor approach to crime prevention. Young people must learn harmful consequences of criminal acts—not only to others but to themselves. This is done mainly through parental guidance and a sense of purpose. This Thanksgiving, let's consider spending more time than just the holidays with our family.

## Dad can be a pal or change the world

The other day as I was shaving, I looked into the mirror and saw my father.

It was an unexpected shock. My father was very successful in his chosen field of law, but I always thought of him as an older man. The person in the mirror was graying; his face was lined.

I never really got to know my father until after I married. He was my father and I was his son. He never subscribed to Dr. Spock's theory of being a pal to one's children. He believed in discipline and respect for elders.

He was the man with whom I spent my life competing. He didn't know it, but like every boy I had to prove to my mother that I was just as good a man as her husband had been.

**I COMPETED** with my father until he died, proud of my victories, taking credit for them as if I had no help. After he was gone, I realized that he had been my best friend, my security blanket, the person who set the pace.

## Young's world still 'us versus them'

A year ago, Daniel T. Murphy started his second term as Oakland County executive with a pledge to end the "us versus them" attitude toward the City of Detroit.

Murphy pointed out the county, with a population of a million, was nearly as large as Detroit. It deserved to be treated as an equal partner in southeast Michigan's progress, he said, and it would recognize its obligation to help Detroit with its urban problems.

Murphy received much praise for his new attitude and has continued to avoid a strident tone toward the folks south of Eight Mile.

**LAST WEEK**, Coleman A. Young was elected to a second term as Detroit's mayor. There was a

pledge to end the racial polarization within the city, and lord knows that would be a great achievement. Unfortunately, from there on it was downhill.

Young still talks of a rapid transit system as if it were going to be "Detroit's" and not the work of

the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority. This blunder plays right into the hands of the opponents of rapid transit such as the Oakland County Road Commission and State Rep. Tom Brown (D-Westland).

Young says he wants to establish a Detroit city government powerful enough to resist being "horsed around" by the suburbs and state government—whatever "horsing around" means.

Actually, whenever the state legislature has acted it has always passed two laws—one for the rest of the state and one for "cities of more than one million population." Young sees many in the white power structure who want to "castrate black political power" through regionalism.

Young still talks about Detroit's big investment in its bus system, although the truth is that federal and state money has paid for this big "Detroit" investment that Young wants to sell to SEMTA.

**YOUNG'S TENURE** began on a sour note as far as regional cooperation is concerned. The Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) invited him to be featured speaker at a 1973 general assembly dinner meeting. That was an olive branch if anyone ever saw one.

Well, Young didn't show. He blamed a staff error in his schedule making. He never has appeared as a SEMCOG speaker.

Young is one of Detroit's official general assembly delegates to SEMCOG, a voluntary but official planning agency in the seven-county region, and is a member of its executive committee. In four years, I cannot recall seeing him at any SEMCOG meeting I covered, and I cannot recall seeing his name in the minutes of any meeting I didn't cover. While the suburbs send mayors and township supervisors or other elected officials to SEMCOG meetings, Detroit sends the mayor's administrative assistant or a department head.

**YOUNG HAS** can turn over a new leaf. Today he is scheduled to be at a transportation conference sponsored by SEMTA. He is scheduled to speak in the same portion of the program with Dan Murphy.

But the last word I got was that Young wouldn't show up. If this is so, then it's clear he has no intention of acting as a partner in any regional endeavor. It will be apparent Young thinks of Murphy and the suburbs as subordinates, not partners.

It looks like four more years of the "us versus them" attitude coming out of Two Woodward Avenue. If I'm wrong, I will apologize in this space next week for underestimating Mayor Young. I fear I will be right.

## At long, long last!

A local politico once said, with only a slight exaggeration of the truth, that the Jeffries Freeway through western Wayne County took longer to build than the Panama Canal.

Next week, a full five years behind schedule, the Jeffries' final 12-mile segment will be dedicated and opened between I-275 and the Southfield Freeway (M-39).



### The Stroller

#### Reflections after 80 years on life's trail

In a few more hours, The Stroller will be passing another milestone on his journey along life's trail.

As he awaits the arrival of Father Time on Saturday to admit him into the society of octogenarians, he can't help realizing what a wonderful stroll it has been.

Little did he think, when he left the little frame house in the 12-foot "alley" back in the Dutch Country to make his way in the world, that the day would come when he would be the proud possessor of a two-acre "estate" in the midst of a thriving city. But that is exactly what happened, and today it stands as a symbol of the good fortune that has followed him all along the trail.

Little did he think, either, when he walked into the office of the little four-page weekly newspaper back home on that wintry morning, that he was taking the first step on the road to the metropolitan dailies or that he would some day be sports editor of the Detroit Free Press and later a columnist in the strongest group of suburban newspapers in the state.

It has been a grand and colorful journey, made all the more enjoyable by the inspiration of his helpmate, Leona, who also came from a small town to join him almost a half-century ago to meet

the challenges of a big city.

And now, as he sits here awaiting the arrival of the old gent with the scythe and hourglass, it is even a surprise to The Stroller when he recalls all the things that have happened to make the world a better place to live in since he arrived on the scene, just before the turn of the century.

The country has gone through five wars—the Spanish-American, World War I, World War II, and the wars in Korea and Vietnam—along with two Depressions, the stock market crash of 1929 and the present inflationary spiral that is taking us to God-knows-where.

**WHEN THE STROLLER** started his stroll along life's highway, there were no automobiles, no concrete roads, and if anyone had told you that man would someday fly through the air and to the moon, you would have branded him mentally unbalanced.

In those days, no one would have dared to prophesy that we would receive world news at our breakfast tables through the medium of radio and television, or that we could watch an event taking place anywhere in the world on the screen in our living rooms; or by the simple twisting of a dial, we could jump from coast to coast or even to for-

eign countries and watch an activity simply by pressing a button.

All these things have happened since The Stroller started his stroll, and now that he can look back and recall some of them, he can't help smiling at the thought of the two occasions in which he fooled old Father Time—two occasions when it seemed the journey was coming to an abrupt end.

**THE FIRST** came when The Stroller was a lad of 16. He was stricken with appendicitis and ordered rushed to the hospital. There were few ambulances in those days. The only vehicle available was the hometown undertaker's car.

At high speed, he made the trip to the hospital, and after leaving me in a small admitting room, the undertaker forgot, in his excitement, to bid me good-bye. Suddenly he came rushing back, out of breath, and said, "Take it easy and I'll be down to get you in a few days."

"That was nice of him," my nurse said.

"Yes, if you forget that he is the funeral director."

The funeral director was never welcome in the hospital after that, and even though The Stroller was bedfast for 55 days, he never came to visit.

**ON ANOTHER** occasion, years later, The Stroller was stricken while covering the Golden Gloves boxing tournament in the Chicago Stadium. At intermission as he walked to the men's room, he fell flat on his face. Cussing the step, he was surprised to learn there was no step there.

Keeping the incident to himself, he watched the remainder of the bouts but was struck with a chill as he awaited a cab for the return trip to the hotel. There it was decided on a quick trip to the hospital with the best chest specialist to be on hand.

## Tinkering around Let's hear it for noisy kids

Years ago, it was a sign of prosperity to have a large brood of children packed into a wood paneled station wagon. Passers-by could always look at each other and comment how nice it was to see a growing family.

Now, after years of zero population growth philosophy and an economy that makes it difficult to raise a large family in relative comfort, the sight of mom and the kids can raise a few tsks comments about how could she think of raising that many children.

I daresay the ZPG people were right about overpopulation. And I realize that a family's size doesn't always bear broof of a great love of children. It's a healthier attitude to believe that children aren't for everybody. But slowly, I'm beginning to see subtle hints that insinuate that children aren't a good thing for anybody.

SEVERAL SEMESTERS ago, when the school board was considering the future growth or decline of the student population in the cities, it was pointed out that one of the reasons children aren't as numerous nowadays is that many of the apartment complexes have very limited, if any, space for children.

At a time when it's becoming more difficult to buy that dream house, young couples are settling down in apartments and townhouses which are more within their financial reach. Once they start apartment shopping they realize that children are about as welcome in complexes as a 50-pound St. Bernard with a nasty habit of frothing at the mouth.

Some complexes are not open to the idea of having little ones cavorting about the grounds. To keep the noise level down for those without children, management companies have come up with a great compromise called the children's building. These little enclaves of family life are usually located in some remote corner of the complex. I assume that's so the wee

ones won't disturb everyone else.

I wonder when the owners will rise up to the fact that while some of the regular apartments sit and wait for renters, there's a waiting list at the family buildings.

AS FOR THE noise level of children—they can't be worse than adults. The only problem is that adults tend not to listen to the noise they make with the same annoyance that they exhibit at the sound of kids acting their age.

Ever since the Puritans dressed their offspring in miniature adult costumes, the grown up world has been trying to get the small fry to grow up early.

If there's one thing I've noticed about my apartment complex, it's that the grouping of childless couples and singles into buildings separate from those containing children is an artificial environment. It hurts the community by discouraging young families looking for a place to put down roots. Communities, like every other living entity, need to renew themselves or face stagnation.

Showing young families to one side also helps to destroy whatever community-like feeling can be generated in an apartment complex. I hardly think that the stilted, pointless social gatherings sponsored by the complexes does anything toward creating a sense of community. (They're good for a few drinks and for sizing up whichever couple has decided to get together this month, though.)

IT WOULD be nice to mix the young and the old together again. I harbor the rather unfashionable feeling that if persons saw what each age was like, there would be less fear of growing older and less distrust and dislike of the young, who grow up believing that there must be something distasteful about childhood, starting the cycle again.

irresponsibility. I certainly can't exempt myself as a participant in the mass slaughter of the English language, much as I would love the idea.

SPEED IS the essence of journalism, and accuracy and liveliness often take a back seat. The chase to scoop grows to meet the public demand to know, as well as the competitive spirit of the business.

With haste at your back, it's easy to compromise your values, but we've reached the point where we have to step back and examine how our lack of expertise with the language affects the populace.

If journalists can't speak or write with sophistication and accuracy, how can we expect them to analyze and digest the various arenas they work in?

If the language is sloppy, does the reader or listener have a right to assume that the material may be just as sloppy?

Perhaps the public's expectations of journalists have taken a nosedive. If the public assumes, as Spiro Agnew did, that the media is out to get whatever makes a good story at the expense of anyone and anything, it also may be inclined to disregard the media's veracity and objectivity.

But we also have the problem of little constructive criticism. Most people won't bother to write a letter to a paper or a news station. Yet if we lack public comment, we have only ourselves to judge our work.

Granted, no one welcomes criticism, especially the ranting and raving kind, which is the form criticism most commonly takes. We get the phone calls or the nasty comments when we're out in public.

There may be a distinct correlation between the public's acceptance of mediocre journalism and the general decline of the language. After all, we're there in the forefront with the words.

If we can't make them work for us, who can?

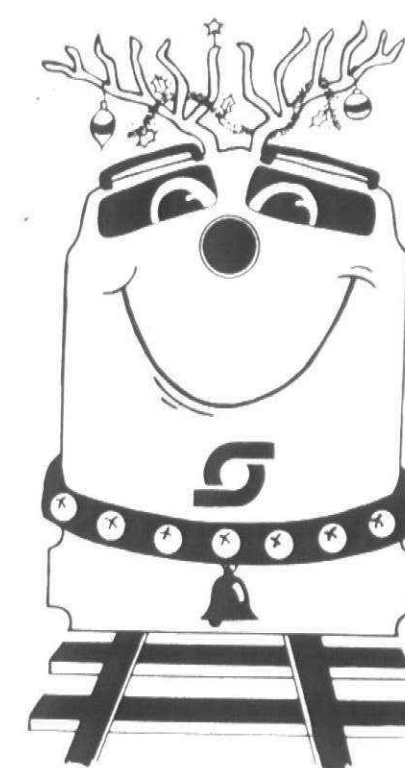

## Food stamp eligibility broadened

Families and senior citizens who applied for food stamps since Aug. 5, 1974 and were not eligible may now be entitled to buy food stamps, says the Michigan Department of Social Services.

Persons who were ineligible since then because they were receiving rent subsidies from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), should contact their local food stamp office. These persons may also be entitled to additional food stamps to make up for benefits lost because their application was denied.

Other persons were found eligible but were charged too much for their food stamps because of the HUD rent subsidy. These persons should also contact their local stamp offices. They may be eligible for a cash refund.

The broader eligibility and retroactive compensation was ordered by a federal appeals court which ruled last year that the HUD rent subsidy was erroneously classified as earned income.

## Month to have starry nights

end of the month," she observes. "At that point we have only about 15 minutes to go until the shortest day in December."

However, the stars that come into view this month persist through winter, Losh points out.

"Rising in the far northeast at about sunset is the bright star Capella. This member of the five-sided figure Aur-

iga dominates the eastern sky in the early evening," she reports.

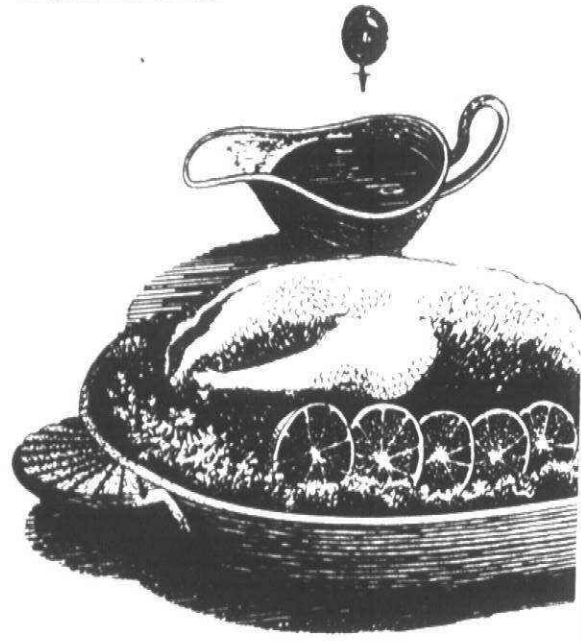
"Farther in the south is the constellation Taurus, made up of the star groups the Pleiades and the Hyades, a large V-shaped figure.

"Aldebaran and four fainter stars form the V, with Aldebaran at the lower end of the prong. This reddish star is known as 'The Follower'.

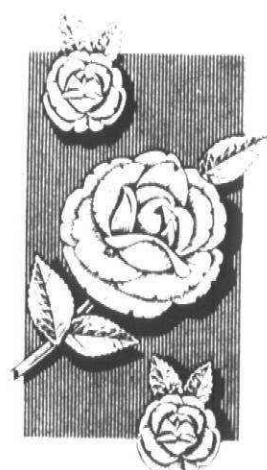

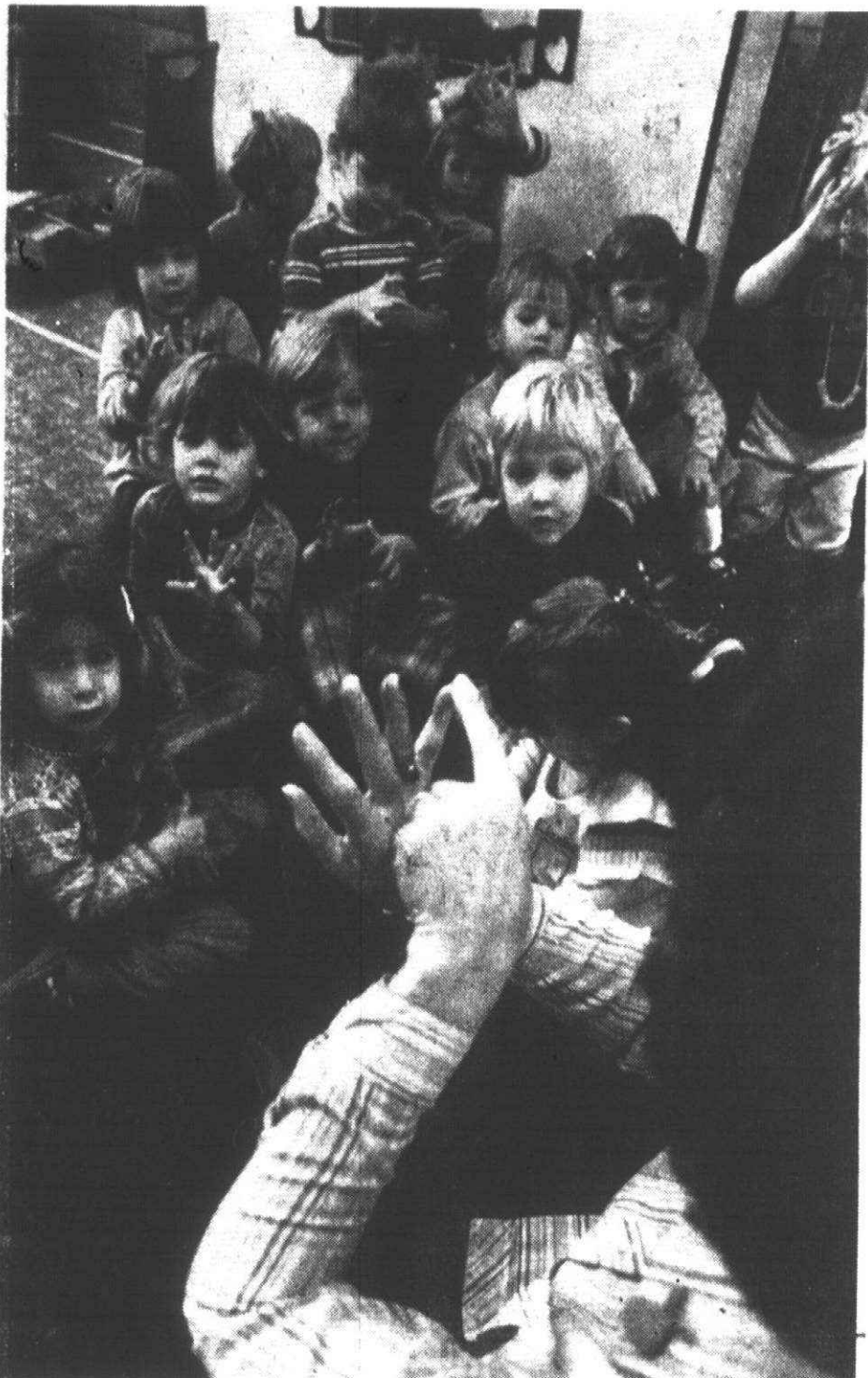

## Kids learn Indian lore and culture

Mary Sue Deyo thinks American Indians are the victims of television sensationalism, and she's doing what she can to change it.

Part of her effort to change stereotypes and misconceptions is to present programs on Indian culture to schools throughout the metropolitan area.

This week she came to the Plymouth Children's Nursery on Warren Road to speak to five separate classes—more than 110 children.

"In dealing with youngsters this age, the biggest problem is getting them past the TV image they have of Indians, which is really distorted," she said.

Mrs. Deyo is part Cherokee, and she draws on her heritage to tell children about Indians. "I talk to them about Indian history and show them Indian artifacts."

She said many of the artifacts she uses have been in her family for years, and she has been collecting them since 1962.

Mrs. Deyo has been giving her Indian presentations for almost 10 years. She also was a member of a parent committee which was instrumental in getting a federal grant for Indian education in the Wayne-Westland school district.

Although she charges a small fee for her program, all the money she collects is donated to clubs and groups that further Indian awareness.

# Women visit Houston for national confab

Amidst some apprehension of controversy, disruptions and unbalanced media coverage, eight area women, who will be attending the National Women's Conference this weekend in Houston, have hopes pro-equal rights forces will prevail.

They hope the event will serve as a forum to inform the government and the people of many serious concerns on the minds of U.S. women.

Attending are Laura Callow of Livonia, Charlotte Adams and Cathy Aerni of Westland and Evelyn Fitzpatrick of Garden City.

The four residents of Plymouth attending are Joan Silver, Irene Picone, Sally Posthill and Loretta Ross.

The women represent Business and Professional Women's clubs (BPW) and the National Organization for Women (NOW).

"It's the biggest event in the struggle for women's equality," said Ms. Ross, vice-president of the Northwest Wayne County NOW.

"There may be a lot of controversy, but I hope the feminist viewpoint will prevail. We want to tell the country that there are women out here who believe in equality."

Charlotte Adams of Westland said the women from this area will be among 20,000 gathered for the conference. Attending as observers, the area women are not part of the 2,000 official delegates elected at state conferences during the summer.

"MANY FEEL THERE is going to be a great deal of violence," said the Garden City BPW member. "We are

worried about disruptions. They (the conference organizers) are taking additional security precautions because anti-ERA forces like the Ku Klux Klan have been talking about demonstrations.

The anti-ERA and anti-feminist forces represent 25 per cent of the delegates.

"I'm hoping for peaceful discussions of issues," Ms. Adams said, "not interruptions from a lot of wild-eyed women running around yelling against something about which they have failed to grasp the real meaning."

"We feel they have misunderstood the intent of the Equal Rights Amendment. They are being stirred up by emotionalism. I mean the claims about co-ed toilets and not having husbands support their wives."

"We say that over the past 200 years women have not been equal in salaries and many other things. The law says they will be given an equal chance. If a woman has to support herself, she will have the benefit of equal opportunity."

Joan Silver of the Plymouth BPW said she hopes the conference will bring about a meeting of minds. "I hope we can work out our differences through discussions and learn to understand each other," she said.

LAURA CALLOW, co-chair of Michigan ERAmerica, is concerned about media coverage of the event.

"My worry is that the media will spend more time on the possible disruptions than on the real substantive issues," she said. "That would be unfortunate. The anti-ERA forces were very disruptive in Lansing (last June) when the Michigan delegates

were selected. Elaine Donnelly, chair of the Stop-ERA group, disrupted a meeting chaired by Mrs. Helen Milliken.

"The anti-ERA groups are very good with the media. But the Lansing conference clearly demonstrated they don't have the numbers to justify the media coverage they get."

"I hope people who watch TV will recognize there will be a violent element there personified by the KKK and some far-out groups."

One of these groups meeting in Iowa, Mrs. Callow said, claimed that women must take responsibility for rape because of the way they dress. She added that others have characterized shelters for battered women as merely places where women can vacation at government expense.

"In presenting both sides, the media can give the illusion that both sides are equal in numbers," the Livonia feminist continued. "This is not the case. All the polls demonstrate that a large majority in this county support ERA."

"The anti-ERA forces in Michigan made a concerted effort to bring women out to vote against a resolution in support of ERA at the Lansing conference. They failed miserably. Women showed up four to one in favor. That is why they were reduced to merely being disruptive."

MRS. CALLOW hopes the media won't just concentrate on the big names such as Bella Abzug, Gloria Steinem and Betty Friedan. "They should concentrate on the people themselves," she said.

Anti-feminist forces testified in Con-

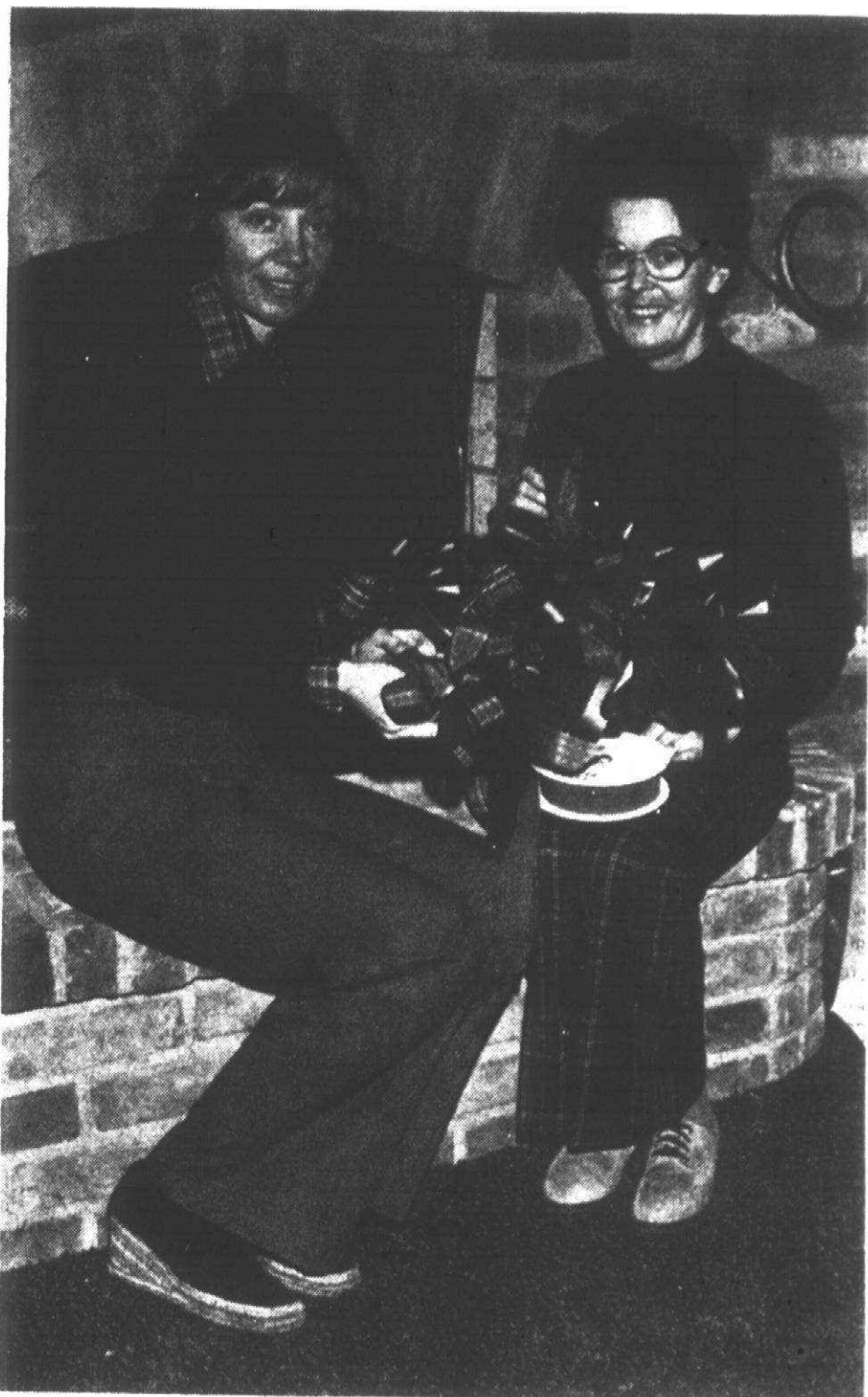

gress against the conference, Mrs. Callow said, and tried but failed to obtain a court injunction against it. Then they disrupted "practically all of the state conventions," she said.

"In Mississippi, men with walkie-talkies told women how to vote, and some men from that state were elected as delegates. Yet they would have prevented the conference if they could have. I call that tyranny."

Each state is represented at the conference by a formula based on two times its number in the U.S. House of Representatives plus 10. Michigan will have 48 delegates at Houston.

"The guidelines were strict," Mrs. Callow said. "It was required that delegates be chosen on the basis of race, religion, national origin, age and economic status to assure representation by a broad spectrum of the population."

"They wanted to make sure working woman and homemakers were represented, along with a cross-section of Indians, students and others."

Why is she going?

"It's an historic event," Mrs. Callow said. "It may not happen again this century, nor in my lifetime."

CATHY AERNI is "absolutely excited," about attending the conference.

"Some of us got part-time jobs (to earn money) to go," she said. "I am going to find new ways to approach the problem of domestic violence, an area of special interest to me. I plan to attend a workshop on this subject to pick up ideas that can be applied toward the establishment of a shelter for battered women in western Wayne County."

Evelyn Fitzpatrick, a nurse and president of the Garden City BPW, said "they haven't had this big a collection of women together since suffrage days."

Local BPW chapters were encouraged to attend by the national BPW convention.

"Our club raised money to help pay for the plane fare," she said. "Our club believes in women helping women."

# Monologist makes'em laugh and cry at pathos of human drama

"When you think about those close to you, you know them so well you don't have to concentrate on becoming them."

The speaker is Betty Jo Hawkins, actress, monologist and the guest performer at Thursday's Northville Town Hall lecture at the Plymouth Hilton.

Mrs. Hawkins presented a series of four monologues, written by herself, and had the crowd laughing and crying along with her.

The first, entitled "Trilogy and Postscript," "takes place in the past, present or future; however you look at it," said Mrs. Hawkins.

She played a woman who goes from 20 to 80 years of age. A simple prop, an old hat, a pair of glasses, a knit shawl—made the transformation complete. The lilting voice of a young girl gave way to the slow halting speech of an elderly woman as she recalled her life.

The second monologue, a poem called "Children Aren't Children Anymore," examined how times have changed and how children grow and know about things their parents and grandparents never heard about until their adult years. The poem involved a mother who faces the problems of drugs, sex, abortion and other changes in morality through her children and sadly accepts the fact that "children can't be children anymore."

**THE THIRD** monologue, the only humorous one, was a story with a twist, depicting a woman giving her 6-year-old twins answers to "the big question," only to find out they'd learned all that in hygiene class.

The last and perhaps most powerful, was a story based on historical fact. Col. and Mrs. Burkhart had lost their children to Indians when they had strayed outside the fort. The colonel engaged an old German woman, who had a similar experience, to talk to Mrs. Burkhart.

Looking the picture of a pilgrim, Mrs. Hawkins' characterization of the emotional old woman was memorable. The slight shaking of a hand, the carefully spoken English, her belief in hope

and the everlasting goodness of man gave life to the character.

Not a sound emerged from the audience as she finished.

"There's a part of me in each of the characters I play," Mrs. Hawkins said to the crowd. "I don't think you can separate us."

Her characters can take up to two years to perfect, she told the group. "I think of characters through an expression I might hear or something someone I know did or said," she said.

**MRS. HAWKINS**, whose credits include performances with the New York Theater Guild, stage and television roles, and the leads in "The Glass Menagerie," "A Streetcar Named Desire," "Blythe Spirit" and

"Showboat," put her career in moth balls while her children were growing up.

**MANY MEMBERS** of the audience commented on Mrs. Hawkins' performance as being so easy to relate to because of the monologues' subject matter.

Said Pearl Adams, "Her characters were mirrors of yourself. She showed faith, hope and charity in so many ways."

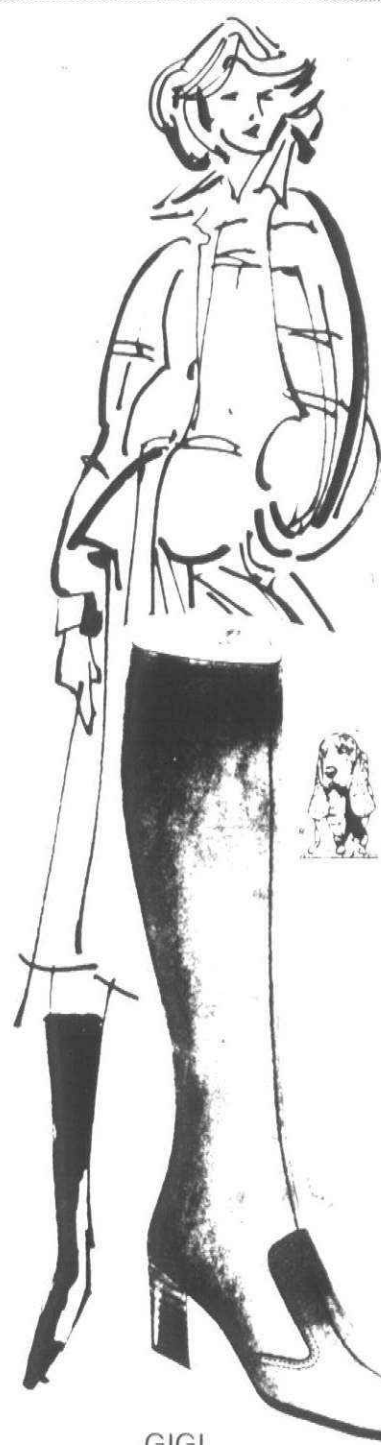

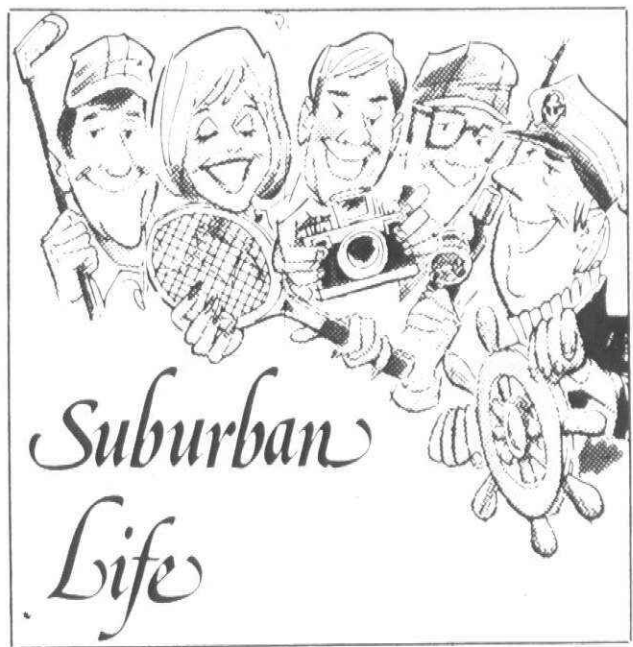

# PSO: Doppmann will dabble in Rachmaninoff 'horrors'

Audiences tend to favor Rachmaninoff's Piano Concerto No. 2. Pianists tend to favor his "Rhapsody on a Theme of Paganini."

William Doppmann likes them both. "The second piano concerto is an absolutely first rate piece of music," he said, and then added: "But it's played so much. The rhapsody has more changes."

Doppmann talked about music history and performance in an interview after rehearsing the rhapsody with the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra, with whom he will be soloist at 4 p.m. Sunday in the auditorium of Plymouth Salem High School.

RACHMANINOFF based the rhapsody, written in 1934 and one of his later works, on Caprice No. 24 by the spellbinding 19th century violinist Niccolò Paganini. The rhapsody is a set of 24 variations on the main theme.

Other composers worked with the theme, Doppmann said. "Schumann and Liszt, also, worked with them, but theirs are essentially transcriptions for other instruments. Brahms actually wrote variations on the theme. They're extraordinarily difficult—pianistic horrors," he said. Lutoslawski wrote a set for two pianos, but Rachmaninoff's version is standing the test of time.

Some of Rachmaninoff's variations blend into one another, so the listener can hardly detect the differences. "But there are about four or five breaks (giving the effect of the movement of a concerto). In the early part, the balances (in lengths of variations) are kept, but in the latter part there is a more continuous development."

THE RHAPSODY theme is stated in the strings, with the pianist adding

only an odd punctuation note here and there. In the second variation, the piano begins taking over the melody.

Rachmaninoff gets further and further from the main theme. In variation seven, he introduces the "Dies Irae" theme, taken from the Catholic mass for the dead, recognizable as seven, heavy, minor key chords.

"He stays in A minor for the first 12 variations, then moves into other keys. By number 18, he's as far out as he gets. That's in D-flat major; it's the one with the hummable tune." Doppmann said, referring to the romantic tune that became a theme song for the movie "Story of Three Loves."

DOPPMANN IS a great favorite of Plymouth audiences, and conductor Wayne Dunlap calls him "the closest to a big name we can get."

The rumpled pianist has a clear, no-nonsense tone and easy manner. This year he has added a beard not visible in last year's publicity photo.

After earning degrees in music in 1966 and '68 at the University of Michigan, Doppmann appeared as soloist with 60 major orchestras in the U.S., Europe, Japan and Hong Kong.

Currently, he is artist in residence for the Michigan Orchestra Association and pianist in residence at Grand Valley State College. His Plymouth performance is underwritten in part by a grant from the Michigan Council for the Arts.

OTHER WORKS on Sunday's program will be Beethoven's Symphony No. 7, a favorite of conductor Dunlap because it was the first symphony he ever played as a young trumpeter in the Dallas Symphony, and three Greek dances by Nikos Skalkottas.

"This is the first time we've had any Greek music on the program," said Dunlap. "It's contemporary; it's exciting; it's a good curtain raiser."

It's also difficult. One line in the score Dunlap pointed to had measures in three-quarters, five-quarters, two-eighths, three-eighths, five-eighths and two-quarters times.

"These dances are based on traditional tunes, dressed up somewhat," Dunlap said. "Friends of Skalkottas got together and published them."

# Lazy, hazy days in Plains, USA

## ...in which Miss Lillian assesses Warhol and Mr. Billy just grins

A visit to Plains, Ga. Would it be complete without meeting Billy Carter and Miss Lillian?

Meeting the President's down-home brother and his straight-talking mother is becoming less likely for tourists to Plains, since Billy and his wife have moved out of Plains and Miss Lillian spends more time at the Pond House, even further in the country.

But just a few weeks ago, I met these members of the famous Carter clan, plus Billy's wife, as part of a group of travel writers participating in a Stay and See Georgia contest judging.

I was one of five writers (the others were from Chicago, New York and Springfield, Mo.) who were traveling through Georgia hosted by the Georgia Chamber of Commerce.

WE VISITED a number of Georgia cities and towns, to pick the ones we thought did the best job of improving their communities and tourist attractions.

Seeing Plains was a bonus, as was a stop in Sea Island, Ga., and was the final day's highlight of the trip. Right now, in Plains, the small town's quiet charm co-exists along with buses offering tours of the town and ever-increasing souvenir wares.

Our tour of Plains was aboard a Carter Country Tour bus. Fliers describe this as "the original tour of Plains—the only tour with 30 minutes of narration which many compare with the work of Mark Twain."

The two women driving the bus and conducting the tour were folksy and friendly, and both proudly recalled having been invited to Jimmy Carter's inauguration as President of the United States.

The driver had a natural-sounding delivery of the facts about Jimmy and Roslyn and their family life in Plains. It was simple but sophisticated patter, told with tongue-in-cheek humor.

FIRST STOP (and we didn't have to go very far—just down the main street of Plains) was a mobile home, which Billy Carter uses as an office. He doesn't sit around at Billy Carter's filling station across the street anymore, we were told.

Billy and his wife came out to greet us and chatted amiably about themselves, answering any questions we asked. Billy was relaxed and cheerful. He was likable, and so was Mrs. Carter, who stands about a head taller than Billy. She explained they had to move out of Plains because, although most tourists were pleasant, some just came to the front door and walked in without even knocking.

The two Carters were good spirited, and Billy was more easy and clever than I had expected him to be, even though I had always anticipated he would have a warm manner.

There was no stiffness in the atmosphere, the Carters and the tour guides laughing self-consciously.

But one questioner asked Billy politely what was the subject of the talk he gave when he was on a speaking engagement throughout the country.

HE ANSWERED in one word, "BS," although he spelled it out. Somehow we all laughed at that, too. The comment seemed so much a part of his candid personality.

The tour took us through town, where we could see a sign on the lawn of Miss Lillian's lovely white home: "No visitors. No trespassers."

Our tour guides took us down a red

Georgia clay road—the first time a tour bus had been allowed down there—winding to the Pond House where Miss Lillian would greet us.

She came out of her house, dressed in casual sportswear separates. Her hair is a snowy white cap, luxurious; her eyes are soft blue. Miss Lillian likes to talk with her hands and because I was sitting by the door of the bus, she kept patting me on the knee during our visit.

She told us how she goes fishing in the pond outside the house. Someone sent her one million fishing worms, and they were all over the floor when she opened the box.

IN OTHER OPINIONS, she told us she doesn't even like peanuts, didn't know the family was trying to sell the peanut business until she read about it in the newspaper ("Nobody tells me anything") and "I don't care what Jimmy does."

The last remark was in response to the question, What did she think about Jimmy's interview in Playboy magazine? She added, "Nobody ever asked me that before."

Miss Lillian talked about how she had met artist Andy Warhol, who asked her to autograph four copies of a picture he had made of her. He gave her a large version of the portrait and said it would be worth a lot of money someday.

She thought the portrait was so ugly she rolled it up and put it in the back of the closet. "Would you like to see it?" she asked.

We did, so one of the tour guides ran in and brought it out. It looked more like George Washington than Miss Lillian.

SHE DESCRIBED Warhol as, "You know what he looks like, like he's from outer space." Miss Lillian said she met a man who told her he bought the four small portraits of her from Warhol.

"He said he paid \$60,000 for them. I didn't believe him, but he showed me a receipt."

Miss Lillian, like Billy, was also genuinely amusing in her conversation. Willing audiences undoubtedly spark their humor.

After farewells, Miss Lillian went back into the contemporary frame house. A lazy hammock swung in the trees beside the glassy pond.

The Pond House is the dwelling described on the tour as where Miss Lillian stays "to get away from the hectic city life of Plains."

### 24 m.p.h. Rocket

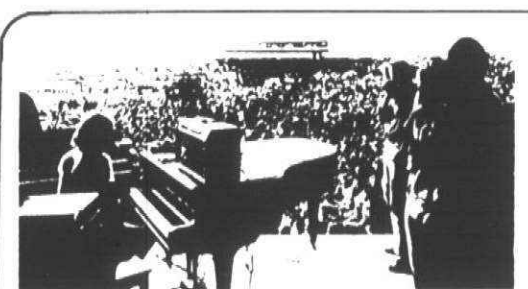

The occasion is the rollicking Neil Simon comedy, "Come Blow Your Horn." It starts tomorrow, (Friday), and runs to Jan. 28.

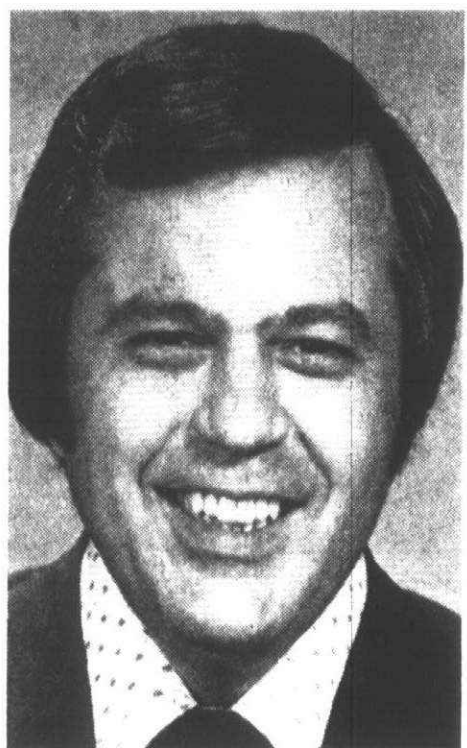

## High priest of pot due in Livonia

Everybody smokes pot. The Beatles said that, and while it's obviously a bit of an exaggeration, even the U.S. government figures millions of Americans have given the weed a puff on at least one occasion. The National Organization for the Reform of Marijuana Laws (NORML) says there are more than 13 million marijuana smokers in the U.S. today. They are doctors, lawyers, judges, cops, teachers, salespersons, blacksmiths, sewer workers, in a word, everyone.

Many medical authorities feel marijuana is safe for human consumption, while others disagree, just as states and cities disagree over how to handle pot law violators.

Enough people were arrested for marijuana violations last year to fill the

entire city of St. Paul, Minn., according to NORML.

NORML's executive director, Keith Stroup, brings the group's marijuana information campaign to Schoolcraft College next Friday, Nov. 25, at 8 p.m. in the Waterman Campus Center. Stroup, 31, will be presenting a film; lecture program which will explore

the historical, medical, social and legal aspects of marijuana use.

NORML is a non-profit, public interest lobby which surprisingly supports a policy of discouragement for all recreational drug use, including alcohol and tobacco.

NORML believes, however, that use

of criminal laws in drug prevention has been harmful to both society and the individual, economically wasteful, and most ineffective as a deterrent.

As Stroup told "Playboy" magazine last February, "We would like to see some serious study undertaken to develop and analyze various potential legalization models so that states in the future will have the information they need, should some of them decide to take this step. But for now, we view such change as premature. Our immediate goal is decriminalization."

Stroup, a lawyer, knows of what he speaks. He was busted earlier this fall at a U.S.-Canada border crossing as he was on his way to Ottawa to spread the NORML gospel.

# It's 25 eventful years for Norwayne Baptist

Sunday, Nov. 30 will be a red letter day for the Norwayne Baptist Church, Grand Traverse and Venoy in Westland, when the church celebrates its 30th anniversary.

Residents in Wayne and Westland and former residents of the Norwayne subdivisions may join the celebration, which includes a worship service at 11 a.m. and an afternoon program at 2:45 p.m.

The afternoon events include a concert, followed by an open house and the showing of an historic film.

The Rev. William Bowman, executive minister of the American Baptist Churches of Michigan, will preach at

the 11 a.m. worship. At 2 p.m. the Chancel Choir of the Court Street United Methodist Church of Flint will present a special concert of church anthems, under the direction of Thomas R. Jones, minister of music.

Following the concert at 3:45 p.m. the church will host a reception and open house. Refreshments will be served, and photographs, newspaper advertisements, brochures and other artifacts of the World War II era will be on exhibit.

The activities will culminate at 4:30 p.m. with the showing of "The Time Capsule," an award winning film depicting the early days of the Norwayne subdivisions.

The film was made by John Pursak, teacher at Lincoln school, and students in the Lincoln and Jefferson schools.

NORWAYNE Baptist Church was started during World War II. At the time a housing project was built in the Norwayne subdivisions to house workers in defense factories, specifically the bomber plants at Willow Run.

In order to meet the spiritual needs of the people in the project, the Comity Committee of the Detroit Council of Churches asked the American Baptist Churches-USA (then the Northern Baptist convention) to start a community church for all denominations.

The church was started in Jefferson school. When the war ended, the Baptist denomination built the present church building and the congregation moved in during the fall of 1947.

In 1958, the constitution of the Community Church was revised and the status of the congregation changed from a community church to an American Baptist church. In 1976 the constitution was again revised.

The open membership policy was reinstated, allowing members of all Christian denomination to be members of the Norwayne Church based on baptism in their own denomination.

THE CHURCH has an activity ministry in community service, including an emergency food service and crisis counseling. The congregation has been involved in local housing issues, and is currently working on a community coalition to provide a shelter for abused wives in the western Wayne County area.

Theatre Guild opens with biting social comment

The Plymouth Theatre Guild got the fall dramatic season off to a funny start last weekend with the biting social satire, “6 Rms Riv Vu,” a contemporary comedy.

The entire action of the play takes place in a large “rent controlled” apartment in New York City, a real rarity in that neck of the woods.

The characters are the people who are vying with each other to get first crack at renting the place. Two of them, Anne and Paul, get to know

each other better when they find themselves locked inside the empty apartment.

In just a short while the pair have heard each other’s “life story.” Anne is a bored, early-thirties housewife with two young children. Her husband is an architect who is fairly regimented in his life and sits up very straight in chairs.

Paul is a bored, early-thirties advertising copywriter. He always wanted to write the “great American Jewish

novel,” he tells Anne, but then Phillip Roth came along and that was that. Now, we presume, he has to content himself writing about industrial toilet cleaning products.

SINCE ANNE is bored with her life and her husband, and Paul is bored with his life and his wife (who happens to be into women’s lib), the natural thing to do is have an affair. Right? Right.

They do—after talking about it and talking about it—and they feel very

guilty, which they also talk about. And since both Anne and Paul were raised in the 1950s and are college graduates, talking is what they do very well.

They find it difficult, however, to quit talking and actually get out there and do something. To be sure, some of the talk is very funny.

Paul, for example, thinks his generation is silent and wishy-washy because things were far too easy for them. His parents at least had the depression. “To help them build character,” he says.

Anne thinks that if she has an affair with a strange man, she will at last have something exciting to tell the checkout clerk at the grocery store.

Through the long, and sometimes tortuous analysis of their lives, Anne and Paul touch on a little bit of everything and everyone. If you are part of the gret, white middle class, it’s easy to recognize parts of yourself.

FAR AND AWAY the evening’s best performance was given by Ron Samuel, a new face in the PTG. He had an easy stage presence and fit the char-

acter of Paul perfectly. Christina Opaleski—also a new Guild member—plays the squeaky-clean sexually repressed Anne with real conviction.

The supporting cast did a good job of bringing a little pace and diversion to the play when the dialogue got wearisome. The set was crisp, clean and well put together.

If you missed the first weekend performances, the play will be presented again this Friday and Saturday at 8 p.m., in the Central Middle School cafeteria.

Players on the all-Observer football teams keep getting bigger, faster and better. With so many of the 14 area teams having successful seasons, it was no simple task for the coaches to select the premier players in the area.

Plymouth Salem, Suburban Eight League champion, went undefeated in nine regular-season games and advanced to the Class A state playoffs. Clarenceville, Metro West Conference titlist, just missed the Class B playoffs with an 8-1 mark.

Westland John Glenn, 7-2, and Livonia Franklin, 6-3, shared the Northwest Suburban League championship and Livonia Stevenson, 6-3, again proved to be the class of the Inter-Lakes League.

Redford St. Agatha, Redford Bishop Borgess, Redford Union and Garden City East all had winning percentages of .630 or better. RU won its last five games, East, its last four.

If so many teams had such excellent seasons, they must have had the talented personnel to do so. Following is the 1977 all-Observer football teams as selected by area coaches:

## FIRST TEAM OFFENSE

**Bob Dasher, Plymouth Salem, interior lineman.** The 6-3, 235-pound senior, a two-way player, co-captained the Rocks this season.

Dasher recorded a 90 per cent blocking grade for his work during the campaign and received Salem's "Bones Award" for the best hit of the game four times this year.

"Bob combines size, speed and execution to be one of, if not, the best center in the state of Michigan," said Salem coach Tom Moshimer. "He's a blue, blue, blue chip major college prospect."

**Paul Greis, Redford Bishop Borgess, interior lineman.** A three-year starter for the Spartans, Greis was named the Most Valuable Offensive Lineman in the entire Catholic League this season.

The 6-3, 235-pound senior served as a co-captain this fall after winning all-Observer honors last year.

"Paul is a devastating drive blocker and blast blocker," said Borgess coach Fred Mushinski. "He's a major college prospect."

Greis was the second-best vote getter for the offensive dream team behind Dasher.

**Tom Jurewicz, Westland John Glenn, interior lineman.** The Northwest Suburban League's Outstanding Lineman of 1977, Jurewicz, also a defensive standout, was a unanimous all-conference choice both last year and this year.

The 6-5, 205-pound senior, one of the Rockets' tri-captains, runs the 40-yard dash in 4.9 seconds.

"Tom's offensive line play has been characterized by great consistency during his two years as a starter," said Glenn coach Chuck Gordon. "He's very coachable and has good football sense."

**Mike Broome, Livonia Franklin, interior lineman.** The only time the 6-2, 212-pound senior ever came off the field was during kickoffs and kickoff returns. Broome was instrumental in making the Patriots' veer offense work.

Broome, an all-Northwest Suburban choice on defense, was credited with 19 solo tackles and 82 assists.

"Mike is a very consistent offensive lineman," complimented Franklin coach Armand Vigna. "He is quick and mobile."

Broome, also a good student, carries a 3.0 grade-point average.

**Mike Nyhus, Plymouth Canton, interior lineman.** A three-year varsity performer and an all-Western Six League pick this season, Nyhus was graded at 82 per cent in blocking efficiency by the Chiefs' coaching staff.

The senior, 6-2, 202 pounds, also played defense and figured in 36 first hits and 45 assists in nine games.

"Mike is one of the best offensive linemen I have ever coached," said Canton's Dave Schuele. "He has some of the best blocking techniques in the area."

**Mike Petsch, Redford Union, end.** Petsch, a 6-6, 225-pound senior, snared eight passes for 386 yards this season. He was dangerous as a receiver, passer and runner.

Petsch also played defensive safety and handled all of the Panthers' kicking chores. "Mike's an offensive threat all the time," said RU coach Harvey Heitman. "He's much improved as a blocker."

Earlier this spring, Petsch was selected the Observer area's best track fieldman of the year.

**Bruce Alderman, Redford Thurston, end.** The tri-captain caught 19 passes this fall and 37 over the past two seasons for an average of 12 yards per completion. His longest this year was a 74-yarder against Stevenson.

Alderman, a 6-1, 185-pound senior, was a two-year starter for the Eagles on both offense and defense. He is a B-plus student.

"Bruce is an excellent blocker on the off tackle and the wide veer and he are-blocked well on the strong safety," said Thurston coach Don Riehl. "He also caught the ball in heavy traffic."

**Rich Hewlett, Plymouth Salem, quarterback.** The all-Suburban Eight selection, Hewlett ran the Rocks' option almost as well as he could have been expected. The 6-1, 192-pound junior ran for 901 yards in 90 carries in seven conference games.

Hewlett, who suffered a broken collarbone during Salem's eighth game, completed 15 of 31 passes for 205 yards and five touchdowns.

## FIRST TEAM DEFENSE

**Chuck Roy, Livonia Bentley, down lineman.** The Bulldogs' Most Valuable Player, Roy had 70 solo tackles, 65 assists, eight sacks of the quarterback, caused three fumbles and recovered one for a touchdown.

The six-foot, 205-pound senior was named to the all-Suburban Eight defensive team. Roy also averaged 5.4 yards per carry and scored five TDs as a running back.

He was used primarily as a blocking back out of his fullback position on offense.

**Keith Wesner, Redford Bishop Borgess, down lineman.** A two-year starter, the six-foot, 185-pound Wesner was selected as the Most Valuable Defensive Lineman in the Catholic League.

The co-captain was the Spartans' leading tackler.

"Verve, intensity and desire are Keith's trademarks," said Borgess coach Fred Mushinski. "He's the best defensive lineman I ever had."

**Jim Boysel, Livonia Churchill, down lineman.** Boysel, six foot, 180 pounds, was a three-year letter-winner for the Chargers. This season, he had 60 first hits and 47 assists. Those stats earned Boysel a place on the all-Western Six team.

"Jim is a good kid, a very aggressive football player," summarized Churchill coach Ken Kaestner. Roger Frayer, an assistant coach, described the senior as a terror.

**Tom Piette, Redford Union, end.** A three-year varsity starter and a two-way performer the last couple seasons, Piette was termed RU's "best defensive player" by Heitman.

Piette, a 6-5, 220-pound senior, captained the team.

"Tom is a hard hitter and a game, smart defensive player," said Heitman. "He's a great one-on-one player, a great option player with super pursuit and outstanding strength."

**Gordon Wheeler, Livonia Franklin, end.** An all-Northwest Suburban honoree, Wheeler was credited with 15 solo tackles and 63 assists during the Patriots' campaign. He also played offensive tackle this season.

The 5-11, 190-pound senior has been a defensive starter the past two falls. An excellent student, Wheeler sports a 3.8 GPA.

"He has tremendous pursuit and quickness, good football sense," said Franklin's Vigna. "He reads the play quickly and reacts fast."

**Doug Agnew, Plymouth Salem, linebacker.** An all-Observer pick last year as a junior, Agnew was Salem's premier defensive performer throughout this season.

Co-captain of this year's state-playoff aggregation, the 6-2, 185-pound senior had 46 first defensive hits and 33 assisted tackles. Agnew seemed to have a nose for the ball, as he recovered three fumbles and picked off one pass.

"Doug is quick, hard-hitting and an extremely coachable young man," said Salem's Moshimer.

**Jerry Cook, Westland John Glenn, linebacker.** A two-year two-way starter, Cook, one of the Rockets' tri-captains, averaged 12 solo tackles per game this season.

The 5-11, 185-pound senior combines both strength (bench presses 315 pounds) and speed (4.8 seconds for 40-yard dash).

Cook, also an excellent wrestler, carries a 3.5 scholastic average.

"Jerry is extremely dedicated and very unselfish. He ran our defense and played with intensity at all times," said Glenn coach Chuck Gordon.

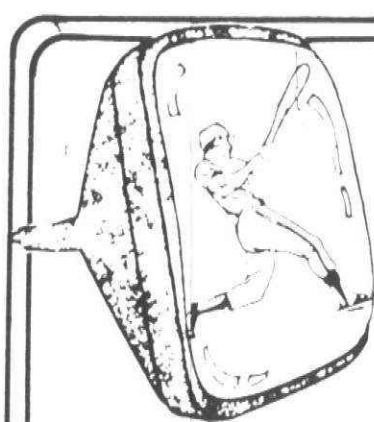

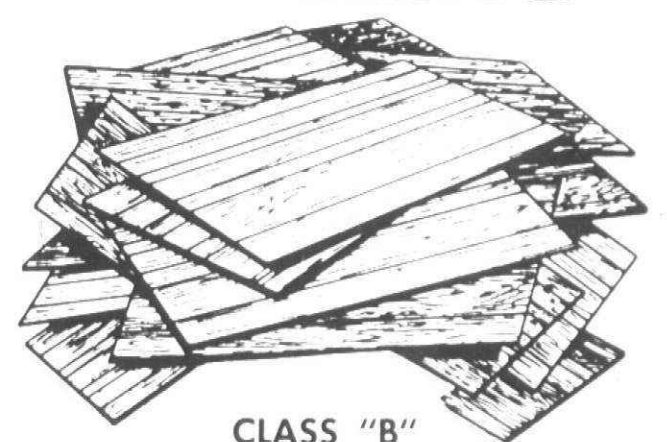

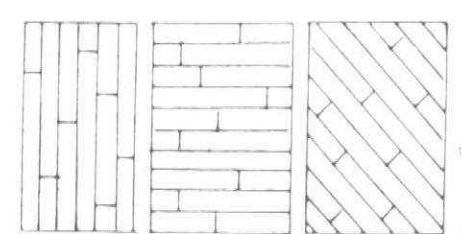

Everyone's number-one ranked team in the state, Flint Southwestern, was also upset by East Lansing, 15-14.

I honestly believe both Salem and Southwestern played poor football in the quarterfinals because they were looking ahead to playing each other in what was supposed to be the big semi-final showdown.

I don't want to take anything away from Portage or East Lansing, but I'm still not convinced they are one of the top four teams in the state.

The two best teams in the state will be watching from the sidelines, and, unfortunately, won't have a chance to prove it.

They blew their chances last weekend.

NOW THAT the weather is getting colder and the football season has been ushered away, it's time to look to the winter sports scene with boys basketball, wrestling and swimming, along with girls volleyball and the new sport of girls gymnastics.

And let's not forget the league and state meets for girls swimming next week, and the state district play for girls basketball.

One most interesting happening which should occur over the next few months, however, is whether Plymouth Salem head football coach Tom Moshimer will reconsider his resignation of three months ago.

Moshimer resigned in late August for "personal reasons" which are believed to be conflicts with the school administration over his scheduling of classes. Moshimer wants his last hour of the school day off to help ease the time demands of coaching.

Administration won't give him this last hour off and immediately accepted his resignation "with regrets."

Since that time, Moshimer led his squad to a second 9-0 regular season in the last four years and a berth to the state playoffs.

Ever since the issue of Moshimer's resignation, the coach and administration have been silent to me in regard to what has happened.

I know there has been a lot of talk and speculation around the community about next season but nothing has changed.

Moshimer has resigned.

A parents' group circulated a petition urging school administrators to give all coaches the last hour off but there has been no response.

The issue even came before the school board at a workshop but was indefinitely suspended until all the coaches were present.

WELL, the Salem football season has finally ended and the hectic sched-

ule of the grid coaches has ceased.

Now it's time for both "sides" to sit down and constructively talk things over—and get this issue settled once and for all.

I know things can be worked out for the best for everyone concerned. What is the best solution?

Keep Moshimer. He's too damn good as a coach to let him go.

I know that Salem administrators believe this deep down—and some will even admit it privately to me.

I admit throughout this whole episode Moshimer's ego has grown. But hasn't it grown justifiably?

Not only has Moshimer led two undefeated seasons in the last four years, but he is well-liked and respected by players and parents.

Administration has got to bend a little for Moshimer. He's done too much for athletics in this community to let him go because of one silly little hour at the end of the day.

I know administration is tired of hearing me say this—but some things have to be repeated.

Both parties must sit down now, before this thing gets out of hand. Both parties must let by-gones be by-gones. And both parties must hear one another out and come to an agreement that will keep Moshimer coaching for Plymouth Salem.

This is the best solution for the kids, parents and the overall athletic program in the community.

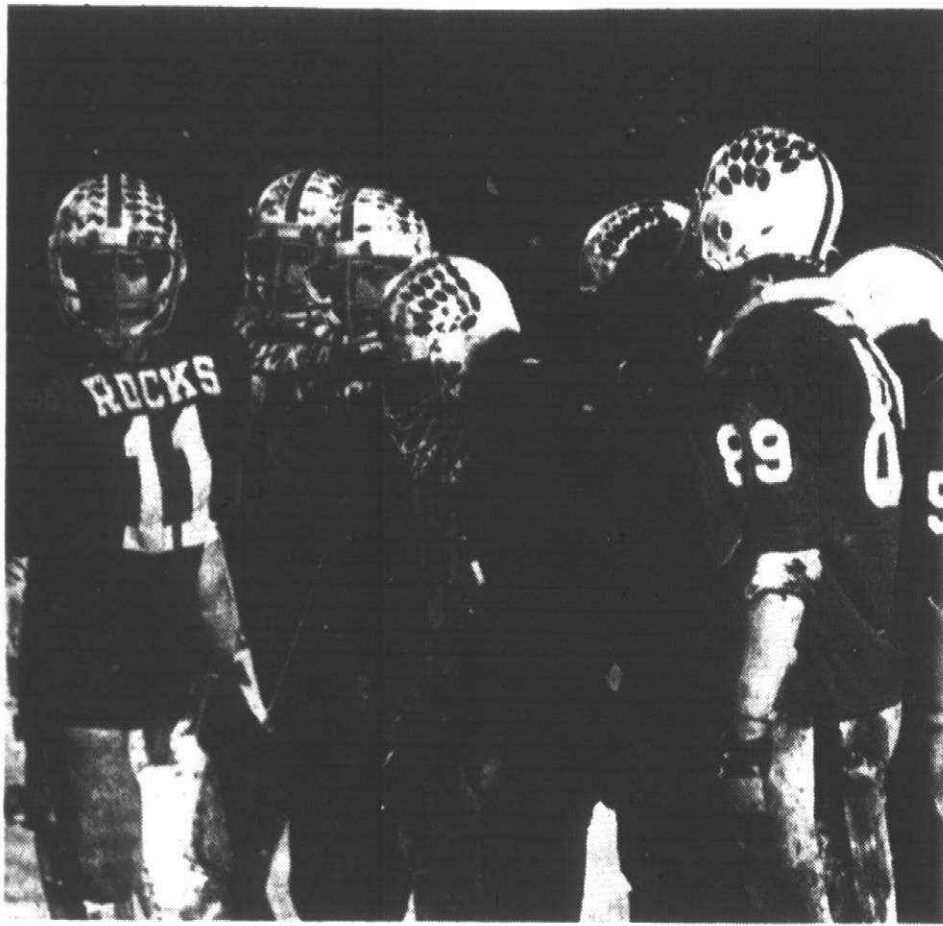

# Schoolcraft spikers eye jr. college crown

For most people the Thanksgiving weekend means parades, football and lots of turkey. But for the members of the Schoolcraft College volleyball team it means a battle for the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) championship.

Coach Tom Teeters' team will be traveling to Cantonville, Md., for the competition by virtue of a sparkling, 12-3 performance in the NJCAA

regional tournament last week.

The Ocelots swept through the opening round undefeated, 8-0. Their opponents: Jackson Community College, Kalamazoo College, Lakeland (Ohio) Community College and Grand Rapids Community College were no match for the girls from Schoolcraft.

Jackson Community College was the only team to present a stiff challenge. Schoolcraft downed them 15-12 in the

toughest game in the round.

Through their eight games Schoolcraft outpointed their opponents 120-56. The Ocelots' opening round performance was good enough to seed them third in the elimination round behind second-seeded Lake Michigan Community College and Kellogg Community College.

In their first match in the elimination bracket, Schoolcraft met a

fired-up St. Clair Community College team. The St. Clair squad surprised the Ocelots 12-15 in the first game, but SC came back to take the next two games, 15-7 and 15-8.

In the next match SC faced the favored Lake Michigan squad.

Lake Michigan jumped out to a quick 11-3 lead. But Schoolcraft held them to just one point thereafter and went on to a 15-12 victory.

"They were over-confident," said Teeters. "Our net and service play was just overpowering," he added.

The Ocelots went on to eliminate Lake Michigan with a 15-7 win in the second game.

In the battle for the regional championship SC met the first-seeded Kellogg team. Teeters, who said his team was tired, saw the Ocelots ripped 8-15 and 7-15.

The top two regional teams, however, advance to the national tournament.

Teeters said the play of co-captains Cathy Johnson and Ann Schwallier were instrumental in getting the team to Cantonville for the championship tournament.

Schwallier, a graduate of Plymouth

Salem, had eight scoring hits in the scoring barrage which brought SC back from the 11-3 deficit against Lake Michigan. She was named to the all-tournament team.

Also named to the all-tournament team was Johnson. "Our offense is designed around her. When she's in the front row we go to her as much as possible," Teeters said.

Teeters said his team should fare well in Cantonville. The Ocelots are no strangers to the NJCAA championship tournament—two years ago they placed third in the nation.

"How we do will depend on the luck of the draw and how well we play. But we should do well. We're probably in the strongest region in the entire country," he said.

## New freeway delights DRC

The opening of the Jeffries Freeway (I-96) through Livonia and western Wayne county has made not only area legislators and commuters, but Detroit Race Course officials very happy.

The opening of the freeway, which runs directly north of the track, has been a key point for DRC officials for five years. During that time attendance and mutual handle have dropped consistently during thoroughbred meetings.

Meanwhile, at Hazel Park Race Course, an exact opposite trend has developed since the opening of I-75 which runs within one mile of the track.

"This will increase our access to patrons immensely," said DRC general manager Richard Wilson. "I don't expect things to pick up in the remaining two weeks of the season this year," he said, "but next year."

The next year the DRC officials have anxiously awaited since 1973 will finally materialize next April.

Racetrack officials are counting on the freeway, which will cut travel time, eliminate much of the stop-and-go frustration related with making the trip to DRC down Schoolcraft Road or any of the major arteries nearby, to attract more fans to their turnstiles.

In a test run, a track official, traveling the 55 mph speed limit, made the trip from Inkster Road to Cobo Hall in

downtown Detroit in just under 17 minutes. He traveled more than 15 miles.

And to help celebrate, DRC's "Free-way Opening Parade," which was originally scheduled for spring, 1973, will take place in the vacant west-bound lanes of the Jeffries at Inkster Road Nov. 21 at 9:30 a.m.

According to DRC officials, the parade "will not make anyone forget the Thanksgiving Day festivities that will welcome the jolly old gentleman with the long white beard but it will be a genuine event, nonetheless, replete with marching bands, unicyclists, and, of course, race horses."

Livonia Mayor Edward McNamara and Detroit Mayor Coleman Young are also expected to be on hand.

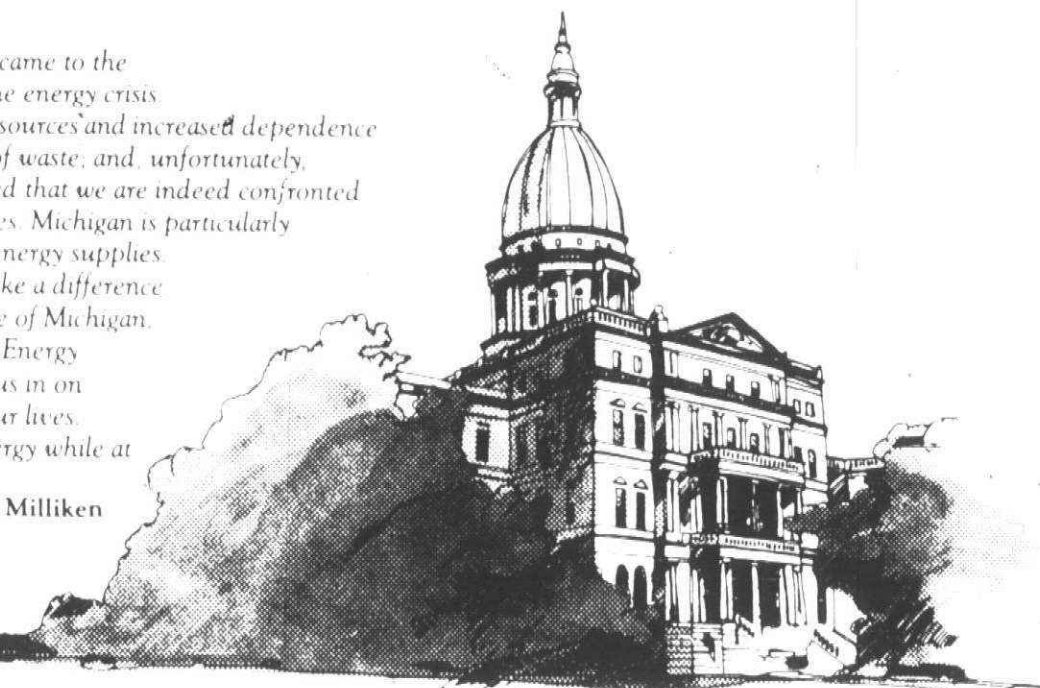
## Caesarean birth is topic
