Deer hits daughter, then car lands in pool

By anyone's standards, Thanksgiving weekend was not a lucky one for the Zolten Vegh family of Canton Township.

Zolten and Mary Vegh moved in to their home on 44020 Southampton the day after Thanksgiving still shaken from the news that their eldest daughter had received 20 stitches from an antler wound she received the day before.

That's right an antler wound. It seems that a deer ran into the side of her husband's car near Kalamazoo while the couple was heading to Canton to help the Veghs unpack.

Despite this worry, by Saturday night Vegh had completed most of the heavy moving and sat down to a well-deserved rest in his new surroundings. Mrs. Vegh was out shopping. Vegh's repose didn't last long.

From out of the blue, at about 10:55 p.m., Vegh heard the horrible sound of metal crashing into metal. Immediately he ran to the front door to see what had happened. Nothing was amiss in the street. It took a neighbor rapping on the rear doorwall for Vegh

to realize that an unexpected guest had dropped in. In his backyard swimming pool.

THE 16-YEAR-OLD driver of a Ford LTD and his 15-year-old girlfriend were spinning their wheels in a vain attempt to back out of the above-ground pool. The impact of the crash buckled the walls of the pool and sent more than 7,000 gallons of water rushing down Boniface Street. Salt trucks were dispatched to melt the ice that had formed.

State Police Troopers John McAllen and Dale Garrow noted that the street was clear Saturday night, before the Sunday snowfall, and theorized that the youth spun out of control after doing a "lawn job" on the property across the street from the Veghs. A small tree across the street was side-swiped by the youth's car, sending the car careening across the street, through a security fence and into the pool.

Mrs. Vegh said she doesn't believe the boy's intent was malicious lawn vandalism.

"I felt sorry for the kid," she said. "I think maybe he was trying to get the girl home before 11 and took the corner too fast."

Mrs. Vegh said the fence was worth \$200 and the pool \$7,000. She said that she and her husband were excited about moving to Canton from Garden City but they got "a little more excitement than they bargained for."

IT SHOULD BE noted that the Veghs troubles did not end with the pool mishap. On Monday, when a reporter from the Canton Observer visited them, he pressed what he thought was a doorbell at the side door.

That "doorbell" set off the automatic garage door closer, and the family's new snow shovel happened to be leaning against the garage door hinge. As the door closed, the shovel became caught in the hinge and the shovel handle was snapped off.

"Man alive, what a crazy weekend," said a laughing Mrs. Vegh. "What's next?"

ZBA case shut, but board can't meet until 1978

Canton Township is still without a zoning board to hear a backlog of building variance requests, but by Jan. 2 that board may be back in business.

On Monday Wayne County Circuit Judge Myron Wahls dismissed a lawsuit filed March 21 by Canton Supervisor Harold Stein which asked the court to choose a legal zoning board—either the one appointed by his predecessor, Robert Greenstein, or the one he appointed to replace Greenstein's board.

Wahls, who took over the case from Judge Neal Fitzgerald, reiterated his predecessor's view that neither zoning board was legitimate, leaving it up to the township board of trustees to appoint a new ZBA.

In his remarks from the bench last May, Fitzgerald said, "You haven't got any zoning board of appeals out there now. One of you (Stein) didn't do it right and the other fellow (Greenstein) did it without even trying to put in an ordinance. And the other one (Stein, again) that tried to put in an ordinance didn't do it right."

Because the township board went back and properly amended the ordinance and reappointed Stein's board on Aug. 23, that is the board which is scheduled to meet Monday, Jan. 2, barring an appeal.

In dismissing the lawsuit, Wahls made the stipulation that a temporary injunction prohibiting the Canton Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) from meeting be extended through Dec. 31. Robert Miller, who claims he was illegally removed from the first zoning board and illegally excluded from the second, holds an appointment to the planning commission until Dec. 31.

TO COMPLICATE matters further, Miller sat on the ZBA as the planning commission's delegate until Feb. 8 when he was removed by the township board. Under the old state law, the president of the planning commission automatically was a member of the ZBA. But in 1976, the same law which forced Canton to appoint five members to the ZBA instead of three, also stated that any member of the planning commission could sit on the ZBA. Gary Sands, chairman of the planning commission, is the commission's delegate on the zoning board.

MILLER WANTS the township treasury to pay the legal fees he's incurred in fighting for his reinstatement. He recently submitted a bill for \$3,425 to the township board of trustees, and his legal expenses are still mounting.

Judge Wahls Monday refused to rule on who should pay Miller's legal bills, saying that was not an issue in Stein's lawsuit.

Stein says that since he is personally paying the plaintiff fees in his lawsuit that Miller should do the same for the defense.

"They (the township board of trustees) aren't paying my legal expenses. Why should they pay his?" Stein said. "If they pay his, they'll pay mine."

The supervisor said he's "happier than hell" the judge dismissed the lawsuit and considers it "a victory" the judge didn't order Miller reinstated.

BOTH TOWNSHIP attorney firms—Sempliner, Thomas and Guth and Travis, Warren, Nayer and Burgoyne—have represented Stein in court privately. But Miller's attorney, Daniel Burrell, said that since the lawsuit was instituted by Harold Stein in his capacity as township supervisor and Gary Sands, chairman of the second ZBA, the dispute is hardly a private matter.

School holiday hours are told

School vacation schedules for the Christmas and New Year holiday periods have been set for Plymouth-Canton Community Schools. Some dates have been changed from the calendars published earlier.

The last day of school for teachers and students on a traditional nine-month calendar will be Dec. 22. Schools on an Extended School Year (ESY) program will be in session through Dec. 23.

All schools will reopen on Jan. 3 except Track B of ESY which will return Jan. 23. Track A holidays begin on Dec. 12 and return on Jan. 3.

The school administration building will be closed from Dec. 24 through Jan. 1. A few administrative staff members will be available on Jan. 2.

Because Miller was forced to appear in court to try to keep his official appointment, Burrell maintains that the township has an obligation to pay for his legal fees. George Ward, counsel for Stein at Monday's hearing, said he believes Miller was not a member of the ZBA when he was brought to court and therefore should not be reimbursed for his legal costs.

Burrell indicated Monday that he will appeal the judge's ruling which states that the first board was illegally appointed by Greenstein because the local zoning ordinance called for only a three-man board at the time. Burrell said he will ask the appellate court to reinstate the first ZBA consisting of Miller, former supervisor Greenstein, Robert Burdick, Jim Donahue and Tom Quinn on the grounds that state law superseded local law. He said he will also demand that the township pay Miller's legal fees.

Members of the second ZBA scheduled to meet Jan. 2 are Gary Sands, Kathy Prince, Robert Padgett, William Gilmore and Trustee Eugene Daley. They were "legally re-appointed" as the ZBA on Aug. 23, according to the court.

Teen sent behind bars for shootout

William Guethlein, an 18-year-old Canton youth charged with stealing a cache of guns from his father's home with a 15-year-old accomplice and firing at pursuing police, plead guilty Tuesday to four felonies in a plea-bargaining agreement.

In exchange for the guilty pleas, one of the original charges against Guethlein—assault with intent to commit murder—was reduced to felonious assault.

Guethlein also plead guilty to possession of a firearm in the commission of a felony, a crime which carries a mandatory two-year sentence in Michigan, and two breaking and entering counts. One B&E charge was for breaking into his father's home Sept. 30 to steal 10 guns; the other B&E charge was for breaking into the Bedford Villa condominium rented by the 15-year-old's father where Guethlein was apprehended later that day.

The 15-year-old, who was arrested in the woods next to Eriksson Elementary School two hours after Guethlein was arrested.

Wayne County Circuit Judge James Canham accepted the guilty pleas after questioning the soft-spoken youth. He asked Guethlein to describe the events leading up to his arrest.

"ME AND A PARTNER went into my dad's house, broke in and stole some guns. A helicopter came by and told us to stop. We both ran into the woods and separated and then I fired at the helicopter." Police shot Guethlein once in each leg, but the injuries were minor.

The judge asked Guethlein how his father will feel knowing his son is going to jail.

"It wouldn't matter to him," Guethlein replied. The judge then asked the defendant how he got into his father's home if he no longer was living with his parents. Guethlein said that he and his friend broke a window to enter.

"You weren't supposed to do that, were you?" Canham said. "You weren't allowed to do that, were you? In fact, they'd probably (rather) not have seen you around there again. Is that true?"

"Uh huh," answered the youth.

Guethlein then told Canham that he fired at police flying in a helicopter above the woods with a .45 caliber automatic he'd stolen from his father's home. When Guethlein replied to a question about his age, the judge remarked, "Sort of a sad commentary on family life in America."

Guethlein has already served nine months in the Indiana State Prison for car theft. Beyond the two-year mandatory sentence for using a handgun in a felony, he faces concurrent sentences of 2½-4 years for felonious assault, and 7½-15 years on the B&E charges.

Guethlein's 15-year-old accomplice is still being lodged in the Wayne County Youth Home, according to Wayne County sheriff deputies.

Lawn mutilations may end with posting of stop sign

Who can get excited over a red and white stop sign?

Canton resident Barbara Timmerman, who said she was sick of cars tearing up her front lawn and mutilating her mailbox.

She was elated about the stop sign the Wayne County Road Commission placed near her home last Friday.

"It's been a real fun corner," Mrs. Timmerman said of the bend in Carriage Hills Subdivision where Gloucester and Westminster roads meet. "People hit that bend at 25 miles an hour and it's a real car screecher. They fly down the street and sometimes end up on my front lawn."

Since the Timmermans moved to their home on Gloucester a year ago, three motorists have sped around the corner too fast and landed up on the front lawn. One of them rammed into a tree and mailbox last winter, and another smashed into the repaired mailbox last spring.

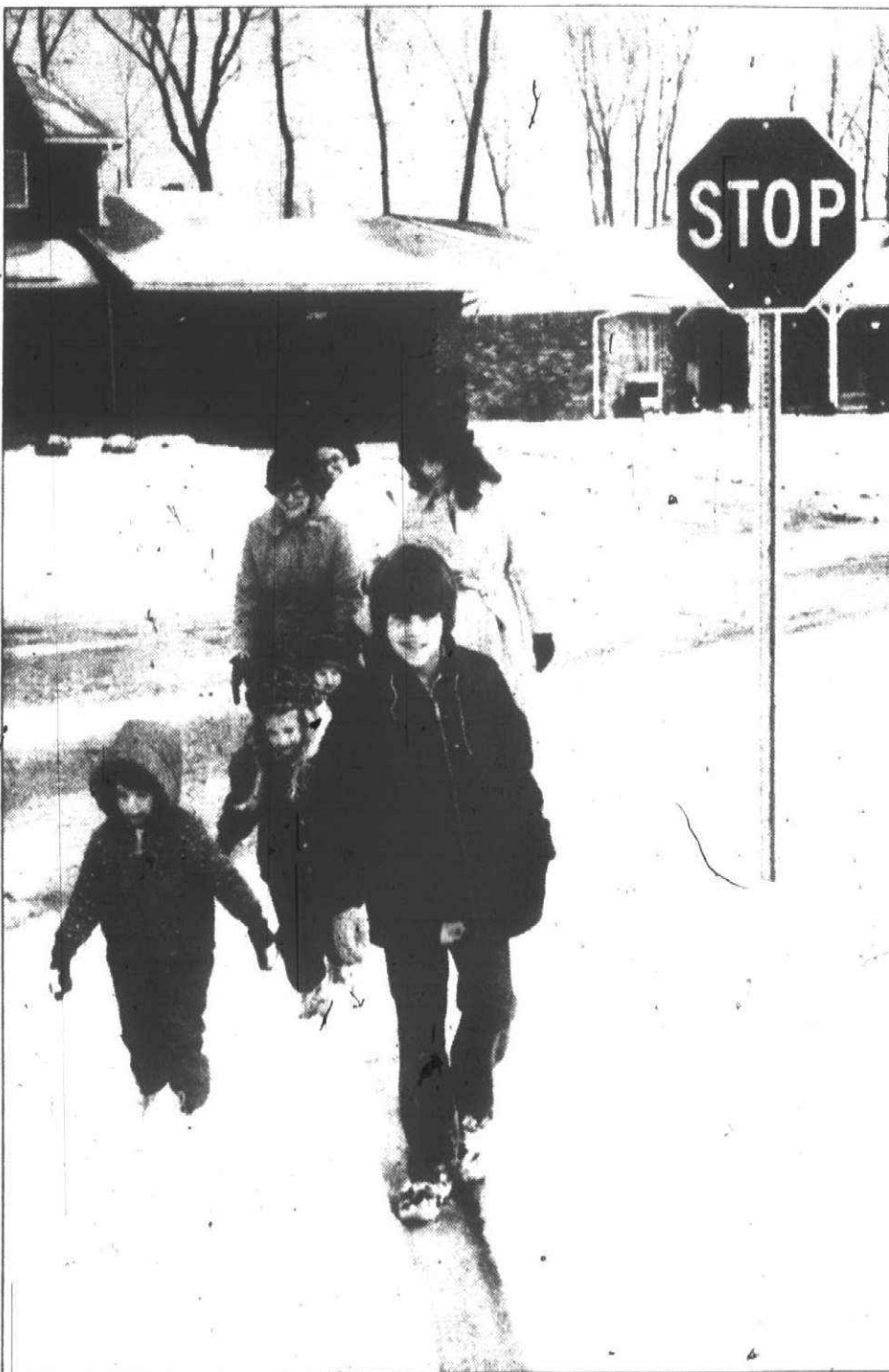
Mrs. Timmerman and her neighbor, Bunny Gumber, even took turns guarding their property against speeding motorists when their small children were at play.

"We were afraid they'd jump the curb and kill one of the children someday," Mrs. Timmerman said. "I thought the whole thing was ridiculous."

Mrs. Timmerman placed a call to the Wayne County Road Commission a few months ago to push for a stop sign at the Gloucester-Westminster intersection just east of Sheldon between Warren and Ford.

But it wasn't until township Clerk John Flodin and Police Chief Walter MacGregor and the rest of the department got into the stop sign campaign that the road commission heeded Mrs. Timmerman's plea for help.

"Mr. MacGregor called me and said I'd get a call from the road commission," Mrs. Timmerman said. "I got the call, and a week later the sign was up."

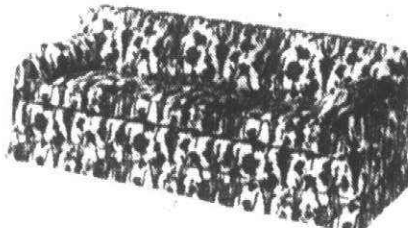

'77 graduates tell weaknesses, strengths of English and math

If they could turn in their matriculation cards and take high school all over again, last year's graduating seniors now in college would sign up for more math and English courses.

That was one of the key findings of a survey of June 1977 graduates of Plymouth Canton and Plymouth Salem high schools now in their freshman year in college.

The survey reports results of interviews with 120 college freshmen at six different colleges and universities in the state. The interviews were conducted by members of the guidance department at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park (CEP).

Each year, the survey is conducted of graduates in their first year of college to get their responses on the value of their high school experience.

FRED LIBBING, of the CEP guidance department, summarizes the 1977 survey findings as follows:

"Generally, our graduates seemed happy with their high school experience and were doing quite well in college. A significant portion were quite enthusiastic, even though more than 90 per cent had some comments

on how to improve our program or made suggestions for change.

"Despite the fact that we required three years of English, our graduates were quite vociferous about their lack of reading and writing skills, and gave reasons for this deficiency. Some were not aware that they did not have the requisite writing skills for college level work; some chose not to take the higher phase English; some did not heed warnings to take additional English beyond the minimum, especially if it was clear (i.e. grades, ACT scores) that they needed this extra preparation; and many felt that much more emphasis on basic skills should be stressed—in all classes and throughout the four years."

MICHAEL HOMES, Ph.D., assistant superintendent for instruction, said he wasn't particularly surprised by the results.

"Students get a different feeling about their high school experience after they are out of school for a while and look back in retrospect on what should have been done differently. This is particularly true when you have students in their first semester of college work, faced with new requirements, looking back at their high school years."

"But in the survey I do see a clear need for more work to be done in the language arts and math areas. But I don't find that especially surprising either when I look at some of the college curriculum students now are getting into."

"I agree with the assessment that most individual students surveyed were satisfied with the programs at the CEP. Some of the criticisms may represent some individual feelings as a result of adjustments made to college life."

Homes added that more than 4,000 students had graduated from the CEP

last June, and the survey results were from 120 of those former students.

"The 120 probably are very representative of that portion of the student body who went on to college, but it is a select group and may not be representative of the entire student body's assessment."

SOME OF THE questions asked in the survey, and responses received are:

•Q. Give your impressions and short evaluation of modular scheduling?

•Positive responses were given by 88 per cent, negative answers by 12 per cent. Of the 88 per cent positive towards modular scheduling, three-fourths felt the major advantage was that modular scheduling helped them budget their time and become more self-directed.

•Q. Do you feel that your high school prepared you adequately for college level work?

Sixty per cent answered "yes" and 11 per cent "no." The response of 29 per cent was "in some ways." Among the comments, 30 per cent felt they needed more English in high school, 15 per cent more required courses, and 13 per cent felt there was a lack of depth in high school courses.

•Q. Which department helped you the most?

Math, 33 per cent; science, 16 per cent; English, 17 per cent; social studies, nine per cent; no comment, 11 per cent.

•Q. Which department helped you the least?

English, 36 per cent, no comment, 49 per cent.

•Q. If you could change some things and or make some improvements in high school, what would they be?

Thirty-one per cent answered more college preparatory courses required, 27 per cent more in-depth writing courses with emphasis on basics (grammar, punctuation, vocabulary), more English required, 10 per cent would change to traditional schedule, eight per cent would seek better career guidance.

•Q. What advice regarding college would you pass on to people still in high school?

Twenty-six per cent advised students to take all the college preparatory subjects possible, 20 per cent suggested math and English—and to have firm knowledge of how to read and write, 20 per cent advised students to learn how to study, nine per cent said to have some idea of majors and minors before applying, and eight per cent advised learning to budget time carefully.

WHEN ASKED what their present career choice or major field of study was, only nine per cent were undecided with the remaining respondents having made decisions.

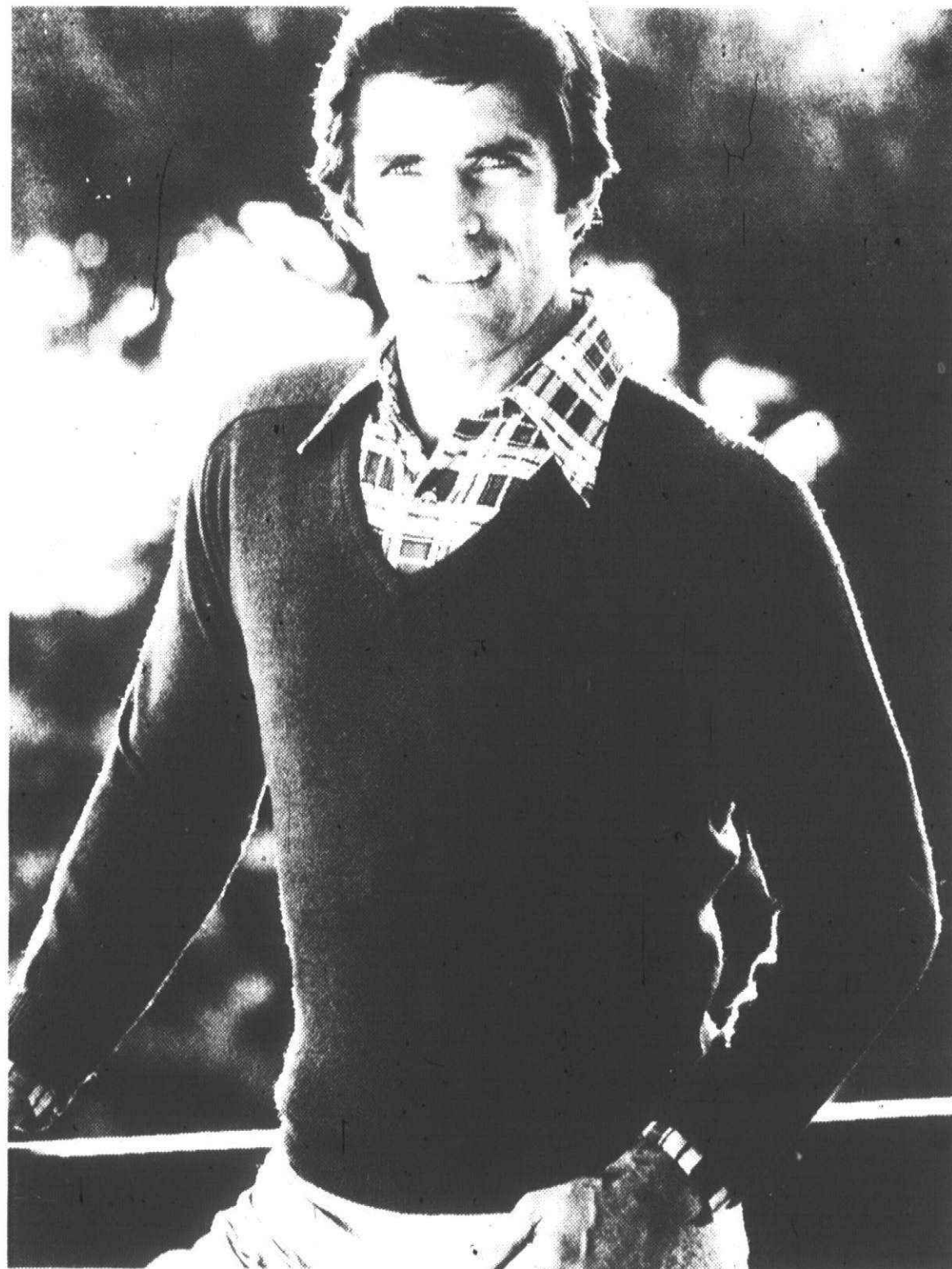

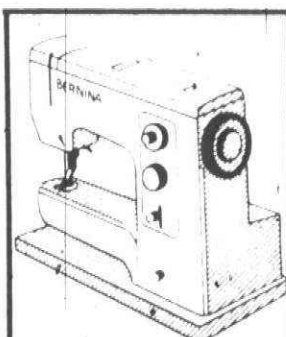

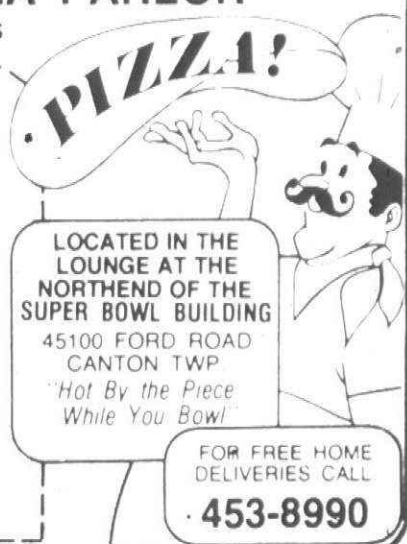

Reading skills stressed in middle school classes

A call for a more ambitious reading program in Plymouth-Canton middle schools—including mandatory spelling instruction—is being considered by the board of education.

If the proposal is adopted, the school administration would be asked to come up with a new middle school reading program for next fall, which would extend reading classes through the eighth grade and establish spelling curriculum in all middle school English courses. Currently, reading classes stop after the seventh grade.

On Jan. 9, the board will vote on the move, proposed by Trustee Joe Gray. He sought a vote on his motion Monday night, but he could enlist the support of just one of his colleagues, Flossie Tonda. A counter-proposal to postpone the vote was passed instead.

"The majority felt curriculum changes should not be directed in haste, as it was put. They cited an upcoming workshop on reading and spelling curriculum Dec. 19. The motion to postpone was approved 4-2 with Gray and Tonda dissenting and George Lawton absent.

10-year-old hangs self after a spat

Ten-year-old Brian Ireland of 6887 Brookshire, Canton Township, was found hanging from his closet door Sunday night by his 12-year-old sister, according to Det. Adolphus Allen of the Wayne County Sheriff's youth bureau.

Deputies could not determine if the strangulation was an accident or a suicide.

Allen said the incident occurred after the boy was sent to his bedroom for arguing with his sister. Twenty minutes after being sent to his room, Det. Allen said, the boy's sister went to see him and found her brother lying on the floor with the embroidered edge of a blanket wrapped around his neck.

"We think he jumped from the closet," Allen said. The boy was dead on arrival at St. Mary Hospital in Livonia. The youth officer said school officials and classmates at Allen Elementary said the boy had a good record and "showed no signs of despondency."

reading in the seventh grade, instead of in the eighth," said Gray in explaining why he made the motion. "If a student cannot read, I can't see sending him out to the Park," he added, referring to Centennial Educational Park, the district's dual-high school complex.

"Maybe we can cut down on the number of students who need to go to the alternative school program if we make sure they can read by the eighth grade. We also should insist they know how to spell and write a sentence."

Trustee Richard Arlen said he agreed with Gray's sentiments, and asked whether the assistant superintendent of instruction, Dr. Michael Homes, had any ongoing plans to improve reading or spelling programs.

Homes, who noted there now are reading programs in the middle schools, said boosting reading skills is an important part of the goal-based curriculum program now in progress.

"I wonder if we need a specific motion on this issue if we've already covered it in a general motion previously adopted," commented Arlen.

"We've been discussing reading for a long time now," responded Gray. "I'm just saying it's time for the board to set direction on this by setting a date when administration must be ready to implement a program. I'm not saying what the program should be. But set the date and we'll get started."

TRUSTEE STEVE HARPER commented: "I had assumed changes to improve reading programs would come back as part of the goal-based curriculum effort."

"Also, one problem we face is to identify those sixth graders who have reading problems which will require special attention in the seventh grade, and then determine the cost. If we are going to provide remedial reading to all to bring each student up to his grade level, it will cost plenty and maybe we don't want to pay that price tag. Right now it's deemed acceptable if a student reads at two levels below the grade he is in."

Gray said that coming within two grade levels may be acceptable as long as reading programs continued in the middle schools. "Elementary teachers can identify pupils in the classroom who have reading problems without an extensive testing program. And we don't need to spend a lot of money coming up with a new program; we can follow programs which have proved successful in other districts."

Arlen said the board needed to consider specifically what was wanted. "Do we want students to just learn spelling or also punctuation and other basic writing tools? Personally, I think the principle rules of language usage should be applied at all grade levels for all subjects."

TOM YACK, board president, commented: "I don't think this is the way curriculum is built. I don't think the board wants to add an item to the agenda and approve a curriculum change the same evening."


Liquid protein is still marketed here

Despite the linking of liquid protein diets to a number of deaths nationwide, the food supplement can still be found on the shelves of most pharmacies in Plymouth and Canton Township.

Only a handful of local druggists have banned liquid protein, the subject of a federal investigation and possible nationwide ban.

In recent weeks, at least 10 and possibly as many as 26 deaths, including two in Michigan, have been linked to the liquid protein diet.

Two of the pharmacies that are no longer stocking the substance—Wiltse's and Woody's of Plymouth—never did reach the late-summer sales peak enjoyed by their competitors.

"In the beginning, I discouraged it but a lot of people bought it anyway," said Woody Burbank, pharmacist at Woody's.

"We could have sold a lot more but we didn't push it. We told our customers to seek a medical opinion first."

Sav-On Drugs in Plymouth Township, was one of the first retailers to cancel the supplement.

"We stopped ordering it two months ago because at any time the FDA (federal Food and Drug Administration) could demand a recall and we'd get stuck with it," the store manager said. "We're talking about a large order of 400-600 cases. It's too volatile a situation."

THERE ARE a reported 30 liquid protein manufacturers, producing as many as 50 different brands of the substance. A variety of manufacturers supply local pharmacies.

Byer, Rexall Drugs on Ann Arbor Road only carries Pro-Linn because "it is supposed to be the best," according to pharmacist Stanley Klein. Pro-Linn is the original liquid protein recommended by Pennsylvania osteopath Robert Linn in his book "Last Chance Diet."

K Mart pharmacy in Canton stocks only "Your-Life" pre-digested liquid protein. Meijer Thrifty Acres pharmacy formerly sold three brands—PDP, Health-Rite and Slim-Fast, which was the subject of an FDA recall two months ago because of contaminated bottling.

PDP is the only brand carried by Meijer's now because of its "better price," according to Chuck Przekop, pharmacy buyer. Richardson's Pharmacy in Canton sells two brands—Nature Made and McKesson & Robbins.

One area druggist said regardless of the adverse publicity, the recent slack in liquid protein sales was inevitable. "The quickest way to make a buck is to invent a diet. This one has been the most successful to date."

"We had the Canadian Air Force Health Plan, the grapefruit diet and the KLN6 diet. They're all fads that last a few months and then die off. This one's no different."

LIQUID PROTEIN is different in that it can be deadly if taken without medical supervision.

Dr. William Ross, D.O. of Plymouth, has counseled several patients on liquid protein diets. He says persons taking liquid protein should be healthy, obese and monitored very closely in terms of blood chemistry.

"Patients who are obese with no

medical history have not suffered any adverse affects from this diet. All they did was lose weight," Dr. Ross said.

"The principal use of liquid protein was to get patients to decrease dietary intake—to keep them from eating. In other words, people were starving themselves and probably died of the secondary complications of starvation."

It is important to get off the liquid protein diet properly. Because the digestion process is sensitive, a person must adjust to full-time eating with small amounts of food.

The FDA recently requested liquid protein manufacturers to place warning labels on their products. The labels would warn buyers to see a physician before using the diet. The federal agency is continuing its investigation of the product.

Congress is considering tougher action against liquid protein. Sen. Charles Percy (R-Ill.) has started a move to ban the product nationwide.

Although none of the brands stocked in local stores carry the FDA warning, they are expected soon with a new shipment of goods.

Faust wants senate to vote on appointments

State Sen. Majority Leader William Faust (D-Westland) has introduced a joint resolution proposing a constitutional amendment to change the way in which gubernatorial appointments take effect.

The change proposed by Faust, whose district includes Westland, Garden City and Canton Township, would require that appointments be specifically approved by a majority vote of the Senate before they can take effect.

The state constitution now stipulates that appointments made with the advice and consent of the Senate automatically take effect unless they are specifically disapproved by a majority vote within 60 days of the date of the appointment.

Faust said that direct input and examination by the Senate "will result in the appointment of the best qualified individual and will more fully realize the constitutional goal of the senate playing an active role in advising on appointments."

He added that the proposed change is in keeping with the philosophy underlying the recent legislative override of the governor's veto of the administrative rules bill.

"The effect of that override was to implement a bill requiring proposed administrative rules to be approved by the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules before they can be put into effect by the state agencies," Faust said.

If the Faust resolution is approved by the Legislature, the proposed constitutional amendment could be placed before Michigan voters in the 1978 election. Approval of the governor isn't required to place the question on the ballot.



Snowmobile class registration open

Youths between 12 and 16 in the Livonia and Plymouth School Districts can participate in snowmobile safety training classes Dec. 6, 8, 13 and 15.

The classes, co-sponsored by the Livonia and Plymouth School Districts, will meet from 7-9 p.m., in the Canton High School Auditorium, Joy and Canton Center Roads. A \$3 per person fee will be charged.

In the past, these programs have been offered free of charge by the Wayne County Sheriff's Department and Plymouth and Livonia each had separate programs. Budget cuts by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners forced the elimination of the program, a spokesman said.

According to Officer Gerald Boyne, class instructor for the sheriff's

department, the state requires all persons from 12-16 have a snowmobile safety training certificate.

The certificate can only be acquired after successful completion of the state prescribed snowmobile safety class.

Boyne said Michigan has more registered snowmobiles than any other state, more than 382,000 and the most recorded snowmobile fatalities.

Last year 23 people died in snowmobile mishaps throughout the state. Most of the fatalities involved crashes with motor vehicles.

Last year's figure represented a 19 per cent drop in snowmobile deaths. This was with an increase in the number of persons involved in snowmobiling. Boyne attributes the improved safety record to the better training and education young people receive. This, coupled with the development of off-the-road trails, may be the key to further reducing the number of accidents and fatalities.

To continue the educational programs in Wayne County, Boyne has agreed to conduct the safety training classes on his own time. Interested Livonia public schools residents should call the C. E. S. Department, at 422-1200, extension 334, to reserve a place in class.

Interested Plymouth school resi-

Geake votes to close county party caucuses

Unless Gov. William Milliken vetoes an amendment to the state open meetings law, county-level party caucuses may be closed to the public. These meetings had not been exempted from the law passed last spring.

The amendment would allow Wayne and Oakland County commissioners, along with county commissioners across the state, to conduct any kind of business and discuss any topic at private party caucus meetings.

Only state legislative party caucus meetings have been exempt from the law. But last month, the state senate, by a 28-4 vote, passed a set of amendments to a more specific version of the open meetings law which included exempting county caucuses.

The house concurred and only a Milliken veto would prevent the law from taking effect next March.

Those voting for the senate amendments included: Sens. Donald Bishop (R-Rochester), Daniel Cooper (D-Oak Park), William Faust (D-Westland), Bill Huffman (D-Madison Heights) and Robert Geake (R-Northville).

In the house the bill, as amended, was approved 56-45, even though that body had originally said county party caucus meetings should be open.

Those voting to exempt the county caucuses included: Reps. Robert Law (R-Livonia), Roy Smith (R-Ypsilanti), Wilbur Brotherton (R-Farmington), James Defebaugh (R-Birmingham), Joseph Forbes (D-Oak Park), Richard Fessler (R-Union Lake) and Ruth McNamee (R-Birmingham).

Voting against exemption were: Reps. John Bennett (D-Redford), Thomas Brown (D-Westland), William Keith (D-Garden City) and Sal Rocca (D-Sterling Heights).

Rep. Jack Kirksey (R-Livonia) did not vote.

Supporters of the measure said county-level caucuses should follow the same policy as the already exempted state-level caucuses. The rationale was that only party and organizational matters are discussed in the caucuses.

Those opposing the bill said that while party and organizational matters might be the only things discussed by the state caucuses, policy matters were discussed and often decided in county caucuses.

Forbes, the house Democratic floor leader, an exemption supporter, said the two parties needed someplace out of the public eye where they could decide strategy.

"Party caucuses are not devious," he said. "It's not the smoke-filled type room. But we might drive it back to the smoke-filled rooms if we keep the caucuses open."

"What can possibly be discussed in an open caucus?" he asked. "Some-

where we've got to plan our (party) strategy."

In Oakland County, Commissioner John McDonald (R-Farmington Hills), chairman of the Republican majority caucus, said that no decisions have been made. He said he would go back to confer with the caucus should Gov. Milliken fail to veto the amendment.

"I have a feeling that on certain items they'd want the meeting closed," McDonald said, such as organizational and party matters.

However, he recognized that at the county level many policy measures were hashed out in caucus. Closing the meeting "would depend on just how delicate the policy matter was," he said.

"It's a situation where if it's not an open caucus, it looks as though we're trying to hide something. It leaves a bad taste in everybody's mouth."

"People have a tendency to hold back if the meetings are public," he said. "It's kind of like fighting with your wife in public—you just don't do it."

Commissioner Lawrence Pernick (D-Southfield), who heads Oakland County's Democratic caucus, said a return to the closed caucus would mean a return to the days when elected officials would come into a meeting and "browbeat" commissioners into decisions.

Referring to the Republican caucus before the open meeting law was in force, he said, "People were browbeaten into accepting a party line. There's no question about it in my mind."

"They would sit in committee and vote one way and come out of their caucus and vote in a way that was 180 degrees from their position in committee,"

"People intimidated, browbeat and otherwise influenced commissioners to change the position their conscience dictated. Daniel T. Murphy (Oakland County executive), the prosecutor (L. Brooks Patterson) and other elected officials, when they didn't get what they wanted from the board of commissioners, went into caucus and got it," Pernick charged.

However, Pernick agreed that the caucus could legitimately be closed when the party was discussing organizational matters such as deciding who would be appointed to certain committees.

The debate of closing the county caucuses may be far from over, though.

Rep. Edgar J. Fredericks (R-Holland) has introduced a bill which would open the meetings of the state legislative caucuses and Rep. David Hollister (D-Lansing) has indicated that he will introduce a bill which would re-open the county caucuses if Gov. Milliken fails to veto the pending bill.

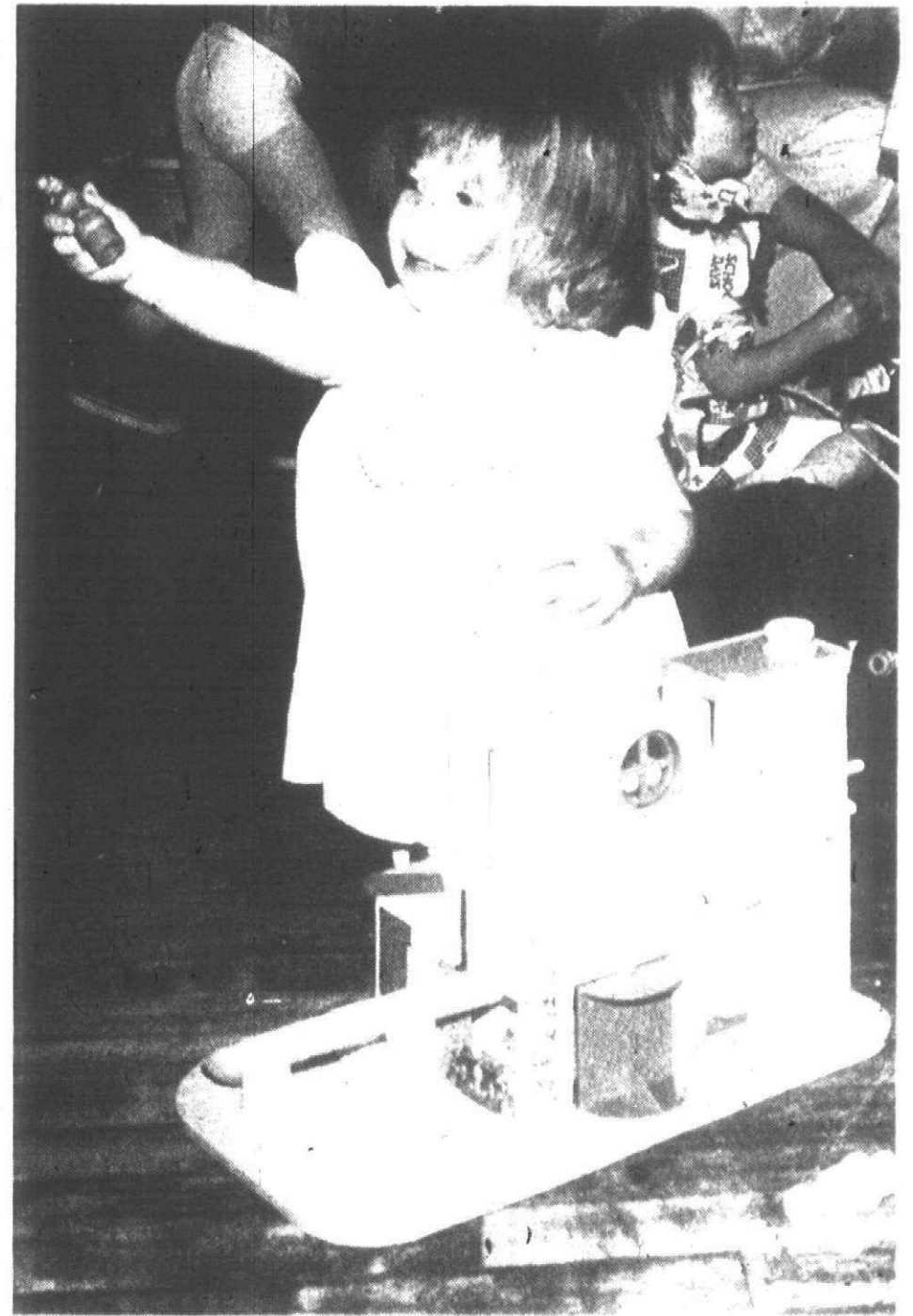

Symbol of past gets new beginning

It is amazing, sometimes, what a little imagination can do.

For the past several decades the old C&O freight house in Plymouth has stood like a ghost across the tracks from the deserted railroad station, but now is an unusual gift shop—another diamond in the crown of Old Village.

The gift shop, the brainchild of Saul and Adrienne Star, opened this week to help the community usher in the yuletide.

The new shop has a line-up of gifts which run in price from \$1 to \$60 and everything from a holiday greeting card to china, glass, wicker, candles and everything else found in modern gift shops.

Before taking over the old freight house the Stars operated The Fig Tree in Canton Township. But when they set eyes on the freight house and the possibilities it offered, they put their imagination to work and the community now has a special addition to its list of specialty shops.

THE TRANSITION to a gift shop is another chapter in the odd history of the freight house.

A few years ago it was considered an eye-sore that blocked the vision of oncoming trains. At the time, Cal Boles had plans to offer the community a "railroad restaurant" on the site.

With the possibility of the restaurant, the C&O moved the freight house across the tracks and on the east side of Starkweather.

Since then the dream of the railroad restaurant became a nightmare. Boles, the dreamer, reportedly went bankrupt and the restaurant building and the embellished passenger cars were left to the vagaries of the weather. Only recently the cars were moved again.

All the while, the old freight house stood as symbol of by-gone days, almost unwanted and left to sink into ruins.

For a time it was being considered for law offices, but like all the other ideas the notion died in infancy. That is, until the Stars came along and transformed it into a gift shop.

The transition has brought back many memories of the days when the freight house was one of the busiest places in the area.

ONE OF THOSE who recalled the old days was Clarence Moore, former president of the Plymouth Historical Society.

"This is the same old floor," he said the other afternoon while paying a visit. "And the big scales were just about here."

Looking toward the ceiling he mentioned that the sprinkling system was new but the rest of the place was just like the old days.

Moore recalled the days when he was with the Plymouth Stamping plant when all of the orders were shipped by freight.

"There were very few trucks back in 1932 so everything was shipped by freight. But I just can't believe the many changes that have been made."

As he walked around the long rectangular room, recalling the old days, Moore turned and said: "You know when something like this happens it benefits the entire community. It sure is a welcome sight, and the old eye sore is now a bright spot in Old Village and a great replacement for the old freight house."

Daniels Den

The first heavy snow of winter draws different responses from each of us. For me that first downfall evokes memories of an experience which confirmed my belief that there is basic good in human nature.

In 1967, when blizzards covered the midwest with six feet and more of snow, I was serving time with the U.S. Army Air Defense Command at Arlington Heights, Ill., northwest of Chicago.

My wife was living with me in a housetrailor on a pig farm near Wheeling, about ten miles from the 45th Brigade headquarters site which was my place of employment for two years.

OUR TWO-YEAR residence there offered friends and relatives a good reason for travelling to Arlington Heights for a week or long weekend for a personal visit with us and to tour the windy city.

And we encouraged as many visitors as wanted to come because it was great entertainment to take people down to Chicago. I have been told there are great cities in America, some of which are allegedly better than Chicago. But no-one has convinced me yet that there is a better city in America than Chicago.

But we cannot now digress too far in expounding on the glories of Chicago because today's column is not about the windy city but the basic goodness in human nature. And in the winter of 1967 in the windy city, human nature was much more preferable than mother nature.

Particularly on the weekend my wife's sister was scheduled to arrive for a long weekend's visit. Weather conditions were normal when she left Plymouth in the early morning hours to catch a train in Ann Arbor. In fact, everything was normal in Ann Arbor also.

But after the train began its westward journey, the storm began—a mammoth blizzard which hit Michigan and Illinois with a fury. The train Linda was on, unbeknownst to us, got stranded somewhere near Benton Harbor. A large truck had gotten stuck at a crossing and the train was delayed a couple hours until a tow truck could arrive and clear off the track.

The train was loaded with passengers and it soon became apparent there wasn't enough food on board. The two-hour delay hadn't been planned. And so stomachs emptied during the long wait and there was nothing available to whet the hunger.

ABOUT 5 P.M. that day I stopped by the office my wife was working in to pick her up for the trip to the train depot.

It had taken a longtime to get to downtown Arlington so we decided to take the commuter train to Chicago instead of driving. And we made it downtown with little difficulty, even though the commuter was slower than usual. We arrived an hour late, expecting to find Linda there waiting. But, of course, she wasn't.

But in an hour the rendezvous was made and we boarded the commuter for the trip back. We arrived in Arlington Heights about 10 p.m., found our car, and began the ten-mile trip home. But we never arrived that night. By this time, snow was drifting over the roads and the few cars still trying to get somewhere were getting nowhere. By midnight we were out in the country, about four miles from home without any hope of getting home. There were five cars lined up when the driver in front spun forward that final inch. A couple of us got out and tried to push her car forward, but were out of luck.

After assessing the hopelessness of our situation, we marched towards the only home in sight with lights on. We tried first to call a tow truck but found out none would be available for hours. The couple who owned the home suggested we stay for the evening as there was no hope of the plows making it out until morning.

As the only alternative was to spend the night in the car, with howling winds and sub-zero temperatures, we accepted. By 1 a.m. the others outside had all straggled inside—16 in all. Next to the last to come inside was a young couple, obviously unmarried, who had intentions of spending the night in their car. The last to join us was an man in his late fifties who lived only a mile from where we all were stranded. He had tried to hike home,

got only a quarter of a mile down the road, and headed back for his car. I still remember how white the color of his skin was when he walked through the door. We were certain he had had or was about to have a heart attack.

BY THIS TIME coffee had been made and cups passed out to 16 very cold and wet people.

Before we knew it, there was the sound of sizzling grease from the kitchen and the smell of eggs and bacon. "I'm sure most of you haven't had supper. It won't be much but let me fix you something to eat." Not much! Only plates and plates of ham, eggs, bacon and toast.

After eating, the older gentleman was talked into going upstairs to get some sleep in a spare bed. The rest of us curled up on the livingroom floor, in chairs or on the coach, and got some much needed sleep.

Before we had woke up in the morning, our host had gotten up and taken some meat out of the freezer to thaw. When we awoke and looked outside, all we could see was our radio antennas peeking out of the snow. And no sign of plows anywhere.

About 2 p.m. we were invited to the table again, all 16, for porkchops, fried ham, American-fried potatoes, and apple pie. By 4 p.m. the snowplows finally crept by and we slowly left our host for the cold outside to unbury our cars.

By 5 p.m. we were crawling forward again, and by 7 p.m. made it to the main intersection in Wheeling. The road to the farmhouse where we lived was covered with snow, so we had no choice but to park the car and begin walking the last mile.

Temperatures were still below zero and the wind was gusting across the open fields. We got about half a mile when the cold became unbearable. And so we walked up to another farmhouse to ask permission to warm ourselves inside. We were invited into the kitchen and warmed up with hot chocolate and homemade cookies.

We finally made it home about 9 p.m. Saturday, and before Linda's frostbite had healed it was noon Sunday and time to think about getting her back to the train station in Chicago.

Drowning in sea of words

There are more books, articles, lectures and seminars on motivation than on all the other management functions combined.

There has been so much information disseminated about motivation that most managers are drowning in the wake of this sea of words. So here we are 50 years after Freud's original story of motivation and still confused about answers to questions such as:

Does money motivate?
Does sex motivate?
Do reward and punishment motivate?
Is survival the ultimate motivator?
Does pleasure motivate?
Does pain avoidance motivate?
Does the satisfaction of human needs motivate?
Does fear of death, sickness or financial ruin motivate?

SIGMUND FREUD, B.F. Skinner, and Abraham Maslow are regarded as the super authorities on motivation. Each in his own way has made a substantial contribution to our understanding of motivation.

Dr. Frederick Herzberg goes one step beyond them in relating motivation to the job scene. His research deals with the kind of employment factors or conditions which cause workers to be motivated on the job. He sparked a great deal of controversy some years ago by suggesting that the rate of pay, had little to do with keeping employees motivated.

Money, according to Herzberg is merely a hygienic factor. If you don't earn enough you might get "turned off" by your job or quit. But if you are overpaid or paid more, it won't provide any long lasting incentive to perform in an outstanding fashion.

Herzberg's research indicates that workers are more "turned on" by things like interesting and challenging work, recognition, involvement in decision making, assuming more responsibility, opportunities to learn and advance, etc., than they are by salaries and fringe benefits.

While Herzberg's sample group was



made up of white collar workers, there is a growing sentiment among his followers that his conclusions apply equally to blue collar workers. But the problem with all the theories regarding the psychology of motivation is that when you try to universalize or broadly apply the theory, gaps, holes or exceptions begin to appear because people are different. We don't all respond to the same stimuli or even respond with the same degree of commitment to any given stimulus.

MOTIVATIONAL RESEARCH is at best an effort to explain the underlying or root causes of human behavior.

The simplest definition of motivation I have ever heard is that motivation is anything that serves as a basis, inducement or incentive for human action, i.e. Love, anger, hate, fear, greed, need, pride, envy, competition, rewards, recognition, righteous indignation, etc.

With that as a working definition, let's look at what the key authorities have to say about motivation, understanding that we can't get into the depth of their work in this short and simplified treatise.

Freud, the father of psychology, says that the underlying causes of human behavior, reduced to simplest terms, are man's instinctive impulses

to survive and procreate. His followers are referred to euphemistically as the sex and survival school of psychology.

Skinner, on the other hand, says that man fundamentally acts out of a need to be physically comfortable and to avoid pain. His followers are called the pain and pleasure, reward and punishment or behavior modification school. His research, done largely with mice and pigeons, has been sometimes challenged because people are said not to behave like mice or pigeons.

But Skinner's work remains highly respected. His greatest impact has been on the educational establishment and in the field of penology.

Maslow, the leader of the humanistic school says man acts on the basis of a hierarchy of need satisfactions: physical-physiological needs like food, shelter, leisure, and reproduction; safety-security needs; affection and belonging needs; esteem and finally at the pinnacle of the hierarchy, self-actualization or self-fulfillment needs, i.e. realizing one's human potential.

THE INTERESTING thing about the three schools is that they provide some insight into the mystery of human behavior.

Yet none of the three is a total or universal explanation of human behavior. A single unified and thoroughly tested theory has not been developed. But we certainly are in better stead than we were before their research was conducted.

Perhaps the lesson to be learned here is that treating people on a mass or collective basis isn't sensible. We are truly individual. We act out of any number of instincts, impulses and needs at any given time. We do not respond individually to the same stimuli to the same degree. And while all pigeons, mice or dogs may push a lever, ring a bell or follow a maze in order to get food, we can't seem to say the same for people in general.

There are always enough exceptions to challenge the rule, and while that may frustrate us when we would love to know in advance how people will act or react to a situation, it's what makes life so scintillating and unrepentive.

Legislature considers streamlining court

There will be a change in the state's probate code; that much seems certain. What is uncertain, however, is how far revisions will go in streamlining the probate process.

Of the two probate reform bills pending in the state legislature, the senate version, would completely streamline probate. The house version, on the other hand, would allow some streamlining but would still give the probate court supervisory powers.

SB-12, the senate bill, would, according to probate experts, establish a totally "unsupervised" probate. The bill is based solely on the Uniform Probate Code, backed by the American Bar Association. The code has been accepted in total by two states, Alaska and Idaho, and in part by 10 others.

Many probate judges, including Wayne County Probate Judge Ernest Boehm, Oakland County Probate Judge Eugene Moore and Clare County Judge Alexander Strange II, said the Senate version would not adequately protect heirs from unscrupulous estate administrators.

While the judges said that in 40 per cent of the probate cases there are no problems, they maintained individuals need the court to protect their interests.

Boehm, who worked on drafting the house version for 2½ years, roundly criticized the senate bill.

"There can be secret filings (by those wishing to administer the estate). It'll just be a race to the courthouse," he said. After the necessary papers are filed, the administrator would be left to do as he saw fit.

"It's strictly an individual process," Boehm said.

THE HOUSE version, a three-bill probate-revision package, would allow for "unsupervised" probate only in cases where all heirs agree.

The package was approved unanimously by the house and gained the full support of the Michigan Probate Court Judges Association, of which Boehm and Strange are influential members.

The judges recognized a need to reduce both the amount of time spent in probate and the cost, they said. But they believe there is still the need for court supervision to protect the interests of all parties.

Moore said that under the house bill the court could intervene and review the proceedings at any stage, even if the heirs had previously agreed to an "unsupervised" probate. "There is a need to protect the individual and that's what the house bill would allow," he said.

THE HOUSE revisions would require only four basic processes: filing a petition with the court to open the estate; preparing an inventory of estate assets to be distributed to interested parties; publishing one notice for creditors and filing a closing statement with the court.

These steps are required of lawyers handling an estate under the state's present probate law. The revisions, in both cases, would make it possible for the average person to go it alone without a lawyer's representation.

There are other matters than the issue of court supervision, though.

BONDING, which protects heirs in cases of illegal law practices (like the lawyer skipping town with the estate), is jeopardized under both versions. Administrators in "unsupervised" probate would not be required to bond.

But probate lawyers wonder: even if bond were required of independent probaters, will bonding com-

panies be reluctant to provide bond for inexperienced individuals?

The Oakland County Bar Association is against the revisions. Michael Zipser, a member of a Farmington Hills law firm, said, "The bar association is opposed because the supervision the probate court provides is important. If the wife is the only one who receives the property and no one objects, then maybe it's not a bad situation."

However, proponents of the Senate version argue that the probate judges and lawyers are only acting in their own selfish interests when they oppose a move to "unsupervised" probate.

"YOU'RE NOT going to find a lot of probate judges and lawyers in approval of our bill," said Michael Zagaroli, a legislative aide to Sen. Anthony Derezinski (D-Muskegon), a sponsor of the senate bill.

"Any probate reform, especially SB-12, that makes it

easier to probate, works against their interests. It takes away business from the legal community, there's no doubt about it.

"There's no doubt that when you streamline probate, you run the risk of fraud. Tough probate laws are designed to minimize fraud. But there's more than one way to skin a cat."

"Experts agree," he said, "you can have a much simpler probate process and minimize or eliminate the risk of fraud." He did not say who the experts are.

Zagaroli said that in the instance of a contested estate, the probate code could still provide strong procedures to insure that all sides are heard by a court.

Adding to the uncertainty and conflicts surrounding the two revision proposals are the matters of inheritance taxes and other special provisions of the senate bill.

Even under "unsupervised" probate, the administrator will still be required to pay the federal estate tax and the state inheritance tax. The gross estate, including all assets held jointly, is subject to the federal estate tax. The state inheritance tax, meanwhile, covers only those assets that pass through probate.

Life insurance and jointly-owned property are exempted from the state tax.

Boehm pointed to a specific provision of the senate bill which he said will be "detrimental to old people."

He contended that under SB-12 someone interested in the estate could ask that a guardian be appointed for an elderly primary heir.

"They could have a guardian appointed because of their age," he said, "just because they think you're too old to handle your own property."

Learning disabled to be Schoolcraft course topic

A new course to help individuals understand learning disabilities will be offered by Schoolcraft College during the winter semester in February.

Are more folks singing early retirement blues?

Are Americans retiring earlier and enjoying their retirement less?

Some evidence in support of these conclusions has been reported by Richard Barfield and James N. Morgan of the University of Michigan's Survey Research Center (SRC).

The study of individual retirement planning, ongoing since 1966, reveals that more Americans are planning early retirement now than were a decade ago, largely because of improved financial prospects.

The study also found that retirees expressed more dissatisfaction with their life since retirement than they had eight to 10 years earlier. The researchers say they suspect the dissatisfaction is due largely to widespread health problems and the high rates of inflation in recent years.

Barfield and Morgan say that a majority of men and women now retire before age 65, in part because Social Security benefits are available after age 60 or 62, and because many private pension plans have early retirement provisions which make it

financially feasible to leave work before the traditional age, 65.

The latest SRC study of individual retirement plans (1976) revealed that 40 per cent of working family heads, aged 35 to 63, planned to retire before age 65. Of those between 35 and 59, one out of four planned to retire before age 62. Both proportions were somewhat higher than any reported in the preceding decade.

Finances continue to be a major consideration in early retirement decisions, the study notes. Responsibility for children and mortgage payments tend to inhibit early retirement, while higher current income, availability of private pension funds to supplement Social Security, and ability to estimate retirement income encourage early retirement.

The researchers found much greater uncertainty about details of expected retirement income in 1976 than in earlier studies and suggested that it may be due in part to current public controversy about un dependable private pensions.

Higher incomes appear to encourage wives to retire early, while an important incentive to husbands is having more than one private pension resource.

Very low income also correlated with plans for early retirement. Barfield and Morgan theorize that such low income may reflect long-term employment difficulties, leading to plans to escape into early retirement, affording a low, but at least stable, income.

Marital status also was associated with plans for early retirement. Single men and, to some extent, single women both were more likely to plan on retiring early than were married men, with or without working wives.

Age appears the single most important factor in early retirement planning. Ten years ago the proportion of people expecting to retire early decreased steadily as age increased.

In 1976, however, people near age 55 were more likely to plan early retirement than were some younger people.

Barfield and Morgan suggest that these attitude differences reflect different historical experiences: "People 55 years old today were in the labor market after the Great Depression and World War II and got secure jobs before the baby boom and the large number of women in the market increased competition for jobs and advancement; they had a chance to accumulate savings and retirement equities before inflation made it difficult; and many were receiving substantial wage increases while unemployment was hitting younger, older, and less educated groups."

Further research, they add, will be necessary to see whether a given generation's economic history continues to influence retirement planning.

In the latest study, retirees expressed more dissatisfaction with

their lives since retirement than they had eight to 10 years earlier. Although the small scale of the investigation precludes full understanding of this apparent trend, the researchers suspect that it is due largely to widespread health problems reported in 1976 and the high rates of inflation in recent years.

Among the factors, identified by earlier studies as contributing to satisfaction with retired life are: finding retired life as expected; retiring as planned rather than because of health or disability; enjoying good health; having a retirement income of at least 60 per cent of pre-retirement income; suffering no unexpected savings decrease; and enjoying a standard of living equivalent to that before retirement. Respondents also indicated satisfaction with greater involvement with volunteer, social, and leisure activities.

Utility pricing may be changed

How far would you go to cut your monthly electricity bill? Would you put off using your electric dishwasher or washer and drier until after 9 p.m.?

Proposals now before Congress and test programs some electricity producers might result in a change in the charges for electricity which would make waiting worth your while.

There are two types of electricity—the expensive, that which is produced during heavy use periods; and the less expensive, produced at night by the most efficient generators.

President Jimmy Carter, among others, favors restructuring the utility rates. It ideally would mean lower rates for consumers who put off their electricity usage until non-peak use hours.

The proposed rate system would function much like the Bell System's rate structure for long distance phone calls.

"If a local resident places a call to Denver at 3:30 p.m. and talks for three minutes, he owes the telephone company \$1.24. But if he can wait a half hour, placing the call at 5 p.m., the same conversation will cost him only 81 cents—a 35 per cent reduction," illustrated Charles Warren, director of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

"CUSTOMERS LIKE the system for obvious reasons," he said. "The telephone company likes it because this shifting of calls from the peak daytime hours to off-peak evenings allows it to handle more business without installing more equipment."

Warren, who spoke earlier this month at a University of Michigan-sponsored energy conference, said, "Current rates offer no incentives to shift to off-peak hours. But if home owners knew that electricity were cheaper after 9 p.m., they might delay some appliance use until then."

"Commercial users," he added, "might reduce daytime lighting, keep a stinger eye on air conditioning, or shift some production to off-peak hours."

WHILE WARREN contends individual residential savings might be considerable, some industry representatives say that, in fact, they would be negligible.

The Wisconsin Electric Power Co., which serves approximately 600,000 residential customers in Milwaukee and southeastern Wisconsin, has made the transition to time-of-day pricing. The first phase of its conversion included having only 475 of its largest residential customers going directly onto the time-of-day rate structure.

"For most of our customers it really isn't practical to go to time-of-day use," said Dennis Kois, spokesman for Wisconsin Electric Power. Most of the company's residential customers would save enough to even cover the monthly \$2.50 charge for the special meter which must be used.

"After a two-year test we discovered that it wasn't until you got into some very untypical usages that there were substantial savings. Maybe if somebody weren't home throughout the day, but was home at night," he said.

ule to better reflect its revenue picture.

Under the new structure, Kois said,

customers would be given the opportunity to change their patterns for using electricity, but they would not be forced to change.

"If they do not alter their usage pattern, the increase in their monthly bills would be no more than six per cent," Kois said.

Under this system, though, no special meters would be installed to measure the amounts of electricity used during the on- and off-peak periods.

ANOTHER WISCONSIN company, the Madison-based Wisconsin Power and Light, made the transition to time-of-day pricing in January. While the new rate system affects only its industrial customers, the savings have been dramatic.

Wisconsin Power and Light's largest customer, Kohler Co., has saved an estimated \$464,000 on its annual electric bill. It achieved these savings by moving 250 foundry workers to the 10 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. shift to increase its off-peak usage and cut the peak-hour consumption.

IN MICHIGAN, Consumers Power Co., which serves most of the metropolitan area outside the City of Detroit, has begun testing the time-of-day concept.

It has established special time-of-day rates and installed special metering systems for 755 homes, farms, commercial establishments and industries in its service area across the state. The experiment was proposed in March but did not become operational until the summer. The program was designed as a two-year study so preliminary results will not be available until at least next summer.

Michael Blombach, a spokesman for Consumers Power, said the idea of time-of-day pricing is not a new one. It has been in use for years, he said, but has been limited primarily to industrial customers who use large, concentrated amounts of electrical power.

Others, including the president, contend that this has not been the case. Instead, they say utility companies offer industrial users cut rates to promote electricity usage.

Walter Kowalczyk, department of highway safety, and Ray Hillen, director of Catholic Youth Organization, will be speakers. The program will include a demonstration of the effect of alcohol.

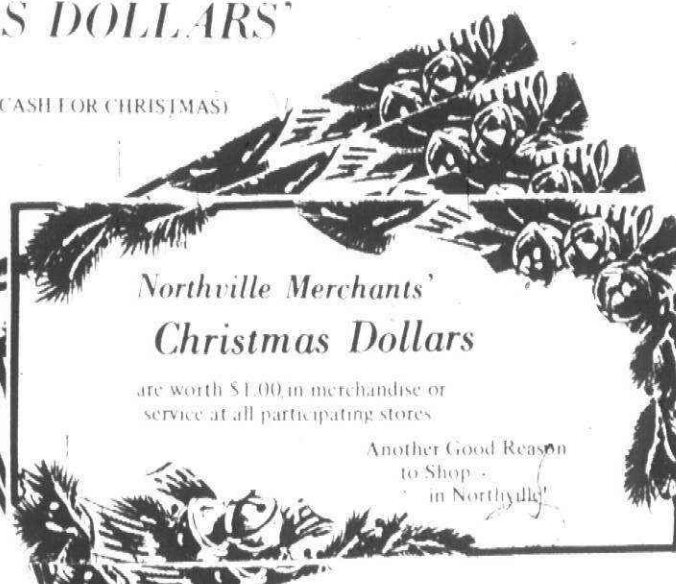

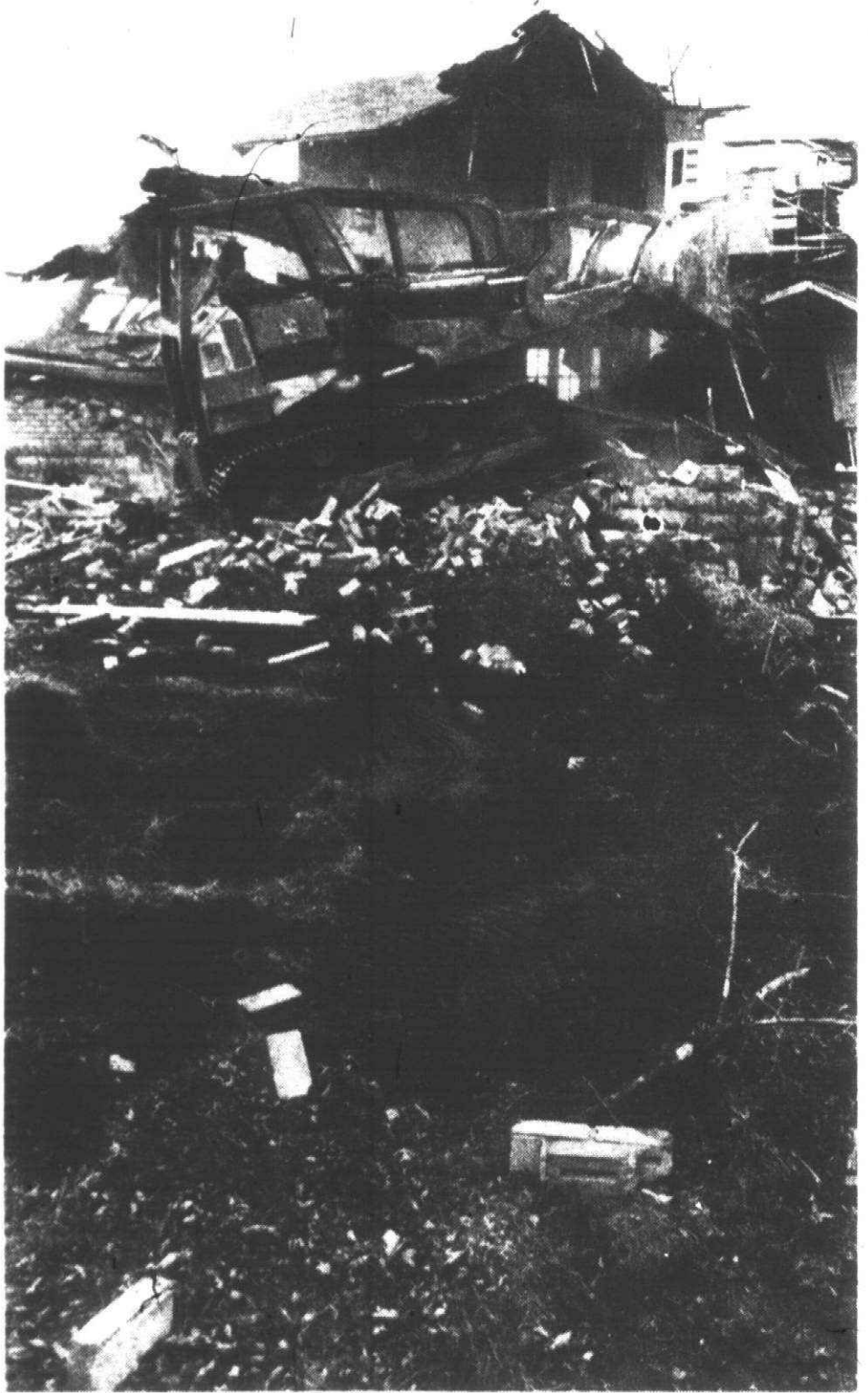

Grad critique of CEP laments lack of 'basics'

If you think students don't know what's good for them, think again. Survey results just announced show that students, assessing the shortcomings of their educational experience, come up with very similar answers as educators.

That is borne out in a survey of 1976 seniors who graduated from Plymouth-Canton Community Schools—about 120 students now attending six colleges and universities. Their answers are revealing.

Before looking at the results, though, we should keep in mind that the 120 young people are now in their first year of formal college academic training. Their measurement of high school is based on a personal evaluation of their success or failure as college freshmen. There are no answers from graduating seniors who didn't attend college.

BUT LOOKING AT the college freshmen, we find that 60 per cent felt high school at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park (CEP) had prepared them adequately for college level work.

Almost one-third, though, felt they could have used more English in high school. Significant numbers also felt they would have benefited from more required courses and felt there was a lack of depth in their high school courses.

A lesson learned

Back in 1969 when the new Wayne County Board of Commissioners was being organized, there developed a major issue over whether the 27 board members should be full-time or part-time policy makers. The answer would determine the sizes of their salaries.

The board went into a secret session that wasn't even held in Wayne County, and they called it a Democratic caucus because all but one or two commissioners were of that party.

The upshot was that commissioners secretly worked out a deal that gave them nearly full-time jobs and big salaries.

We thought the state had learned a lesson, and when the 1977 Open Meetings Act went into effect, partisan caucuses of county boards were covered. But the advocates of secrecy got to work and recently pushed HB 4707 through the Michigan legislature to exempt party caucuses from the "Sunshine Law."

If Gov. Milliken signs it, the Wayne County board—along with 30 other county boards overwhelmingly or totally dominated by one party—will be able to make its biggest decisions in secret, going public only long enough to rubber-stamp the secret deliberations of a caucus.

We urge Gov. Milliken to veto HB 4707 and our local legislators to uphold the veto.

Mayor ducks out

Young's one-way streets

Metropolitan Fund, the southeast Michigan research and education foundation, has a fascinating annual meeting. The business end—approval of minutes, budget and officers—is handled with a swish of the gavel and prompt "ayes."

It's the main speech and the get-togethers afterwards of merchant princes, industrialists, union chieftains, and politicians from several counties that makes the MF gathering fascinating.

MF is the outfit that spawned, bankrolled and provided early staffing for the Transportation and Land Use Study, the council of governments, New Detroit and the regional transportation authority, as well as provocative discussions of "new towns" and regional governance.

If you equate MF with regionalism, you've got it.

THIS YEAR'S speaker was a man who admittedly "regards Metro Fund with a certain amount of well-justified suspicion," Mayor Coleman A. Young of provincial Detroit.

It was good that Young finally got around to speak to such a body with so many persons who have such impact on Detroit and the rest of the region, and it was good that Young could quip, "Now that I'm one of you..." to much laughter. It was bad that it took him four years to get around to it.

What he said showed little statesmanship.

In the same way he saw decentralization of industry "as a union-busting plot," Young viewed urban freeways as an invitation to people to decentralize—a bad thing to him.

He saw no need for a regional government system to sell water because Detroit could do it. As far as governing the Detroit Water Board is concerned, "I say one gallon, one vote, and how many gallons you guys got?"

Young thought that was pretty funny, ignoring the fact that Detroit is getting its water from Port Huron these days, and further ignoring the fact that suburbanites can let their factory smoke blow into Detroit and let their sewage drain down hill to Detroit, if they choose.

The present system of one city of 1.3 million con-

When asked which subject helped them the most in college, a third answered math, 16 per cent selected science and 17 per cent English.

When asked what improvements they'd make in their high school experience, almost one-third said they wish there had been more college preparatory courses. Some 27 per cent desired more in depth writing courses with emphasis on basics such as grammar, punctuation and vocabulary, and more English required.

When asked what advice they would give to students in high school, the three overwhelming answers were: take all the college prep subjects you can; take math and English—have firm knowledge of how to read and write; and learn to study.

THESE ANSWERS ARE even more interesting when compared to the summary observations of the guidance and counselling department at the CEP.

"Despite the fact that we required three years of English, our graduates were quite vociferous about their lack of reading and writing skills and reasons for this deficiency: some were not aware that they did not have the requisite writing skills for college level work; some chose not to take the higher phase English; some did not heed warnings to take additional English beyond the minimum, especially if it was clear (i.e., grades, ACT scores) that they needed this extra preparation; many felt that much more emphasis on basic skills should be stressed—in all classes and throughout the four years."

The first thing the survey findings suggest is that it's very easy to be objective and constructively critical when your high school career is over.

Secondly, there's some truth in the saying "You can lead a horse to water but you can't make him drink."

Third, "We get too soon old and too late schmidt."

Finally, there is value in continuing to examine very closely the performance of public schools in building reading, writing and arithmetic skills. And that examination must go beyond the assessment and testing stage and enter the heart of curriculum—are we really imparting the knowledge our classes are designed to impart?

Again, however, we must recognize that these answers are from '76 seniors now in college. We have not heard the answers of '76 graduates in the work field, or the answers of dropouts who couldn't find a niche in the system. We also need to hear their answers while assessing our educational goals and accomplishments.

trolling the water supply of a region of three million is plainly crazy, and Young intends to keep it that way.

YOUNG REWROTE history, professing to see a "traditional American" value in very local government. One could have referred him to the Federalist Papers Nos. 34 (Hamilton) and 39 (Madison) to show that unity is the name of the game when it comes to finding strength to solve big problems.

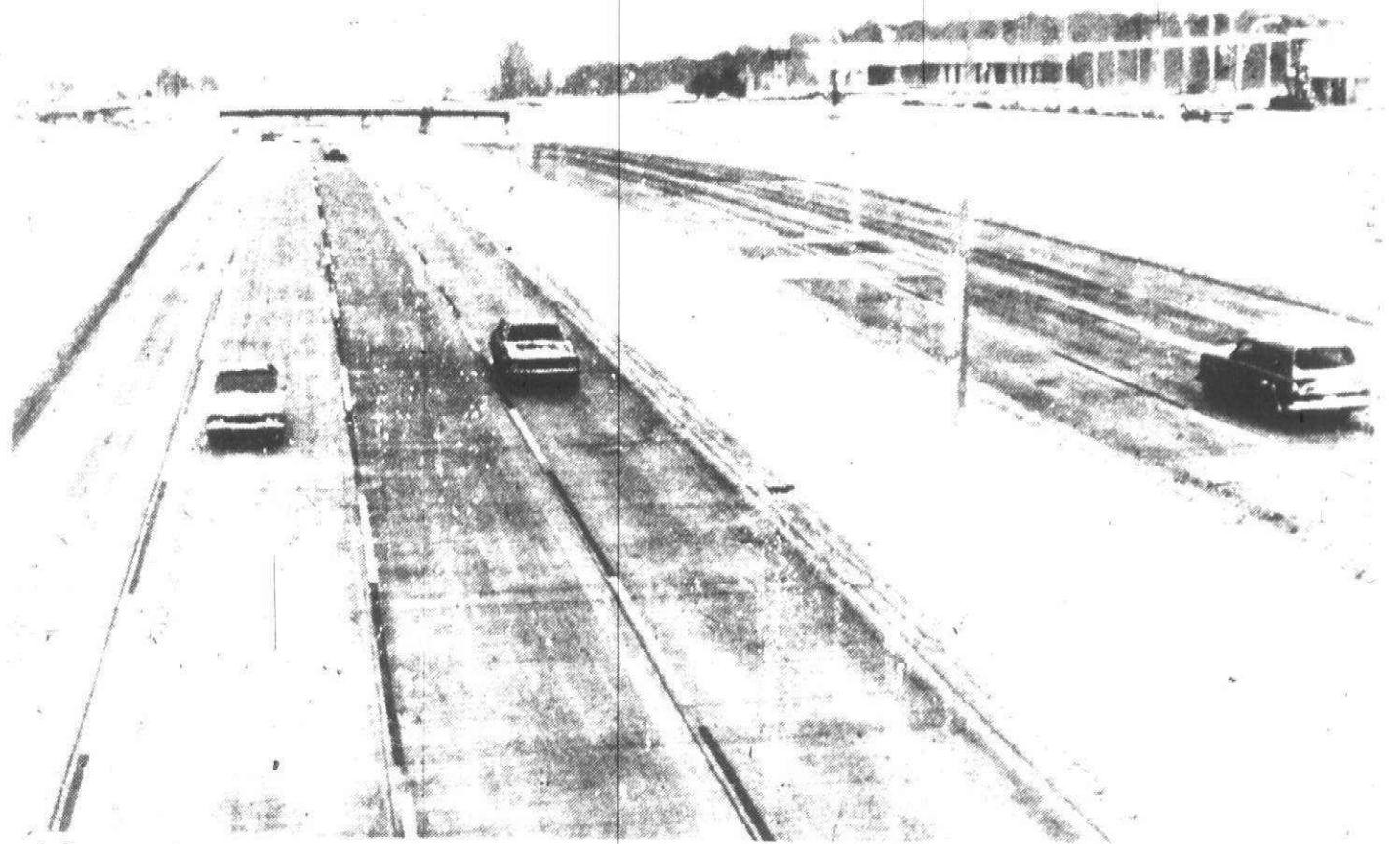
Young plainly has contempt for SEMTA, the transportation authority. Of the \$600 million the federal government promised SEMTA, he said:

"The City of Detroit was the impetus for that \$600 million. It was for the city, not to be spread all over the region." In other words, it's OK to collect taxes "all over the region" to build a rapid transit system, but all the money and all the private investment associated with it are to go inside Detroit, in Young's view. His raging selfishness boggles the mind.

After Young spoke, Kent Mathewson, MF president, made a brief report in which he referred to "the real city." By this he meant the entire, interrelated, urbanized area of southeast Michigan. Only when one thinks of this "real city" can one begin to wrestle with the problems.

But Young didn't hear Mathewson. Young didn't hear what the rest of us had to say about his narrow views of water and sewers and transportation.

For as soon as he was done speaking, Young and his entourage walked out of the room. Communication to him is a one-way street, with the words flowing outward. Cooperation to him is another one-way street, with the money coming inward.

Old dream comes true

Years ago when the Stroller was a kid in short pants and experiencing his first exposure to what the Pennsylvania Dutch called "book learning," he was handed a book which was designed to aid him in writing.

It was what the teachers called a "copy book." It was about the size of a letter-head. At the top of each page was a famous statement, and the remainder of the sheet was just a series of lines.

We were told to copy these sayings in as nice a Spencerian hand as we could. And we would be graded on how close we came to matching them.

Among these model sayings that come to mind are:

"He who runs may read."

"The wheels of the gods grind slowly."

"Make haste slowly."

TWO OF THESE came to mind the other morning when the State Highway Commission officially opened the Jeffries Freeway through Detroit, Redford Township and Livonia. It will connect with the coming M-14 Freeway at Jaggerty Road and continue to Ann Arbor and points west.

The one that caused the Stroller to smile said,

"The wheels of the gods grind slowly." He smiled because back in the days when he was copying that line in his school book, nobody in Pennsylvania ever had heard of the Michigan Highway Commission. If they had, it is just possible that it would have been given the line in the school books. For nothing the Stroller has seen compares with the record of the highway lads in the building of the road that now cuts through the heart of western Wayne County.

During the ribbon-cutting ceremonies that opened the new road, it was stated that an apology was due because the opening was two years over due.

Two years???

Would you believe the road was in the minds of the commission 25 years ago?

The memory of an evening in the spring of 1952 came though the mist of years.

AT THE TIME the new City of Livonia was celebrating its second birthday. The chamber of commerce, eager to make a name for itself, decided to show off a bit. It decided to invite all the utility companies, highway groups and business moguls

to a meeting with the idea of letting them know that the new city provided great opportunities for them. It so happened that the Stroller was secretary of the chamber and, with the other officers, looked forward with enthusiasm to the meeting.

Came the big night. Much to our surprise, each of the groups sent a representative. But even more surprising was what happened after we made our presentation.

With an opportunity to give their view of the city, these representatives almost put us to shame. They knew more about Livonia and what lay beneath the surface than we had ever dreamed. They told us how the utilities would be installed, where other things would be placed—in fact, they had the entire 36 square miles of the city laid out.

When the meeting ended, the Stroller sought out the representative of the State Highway Commission and asked, "When are you fellows going to do something to Plymouth Road between here and Ann Arbor, just as you did on the other side toward Jackson?"

"Never," came the reply. "There are too many hills and curves in it. It would be too costly, especially when you have another road."

BY NO STRETCH of the imagination, the Stroller replied, could you be thinking of Schoolcraft Road. Then he added, very firmly, "It doesn't start anywhere and it doesn't go anywhere."

To which the highway commission representative smiled and said, "It could."

The Stroller replied, "I should live so long."

Mind you, that was 25 years ago, and when the highway book for the year was published, mention was made of the possibility of using Schoolcraft as one of the expressway arteries.

You can imagine how the Stroller felt the other morning when the official ribbon was cut and traffic started flowing along the a superhighway that was once the median of Schoolcraft Road.

It was ironic that the highway opened during the week of the Stroller's 80th birthday, for it was a victory on both sides—the highway commission had given some prestige to Schoolcraft, and the Stroller had lived to see it.

Then, as the traffic went speeding by, he remembered the other line in the copy book, "Make haste slowly."

One worthy but small lobby costs everyone a lot

When we talk about special interest groups, we usually visualize Big Labor trying to convince Congress that special labor laws should be passed, or Big Business trying to get special tax concessions, or oil barons trying to protect their depletion allowance.

In reality, most special interest groups are organizations we equate with motherhood, so whether special interest groups are good or bad depends on whose ox is being gored.

For example, the biggest special interest group in Michigan is education. They are always looking for more dollars from the legislature, and their lobbyists are school teachers and local school board members.

We are supposed to be a democracy where the majority rules. Special interest groups rally their forces to see that the minority is not forgotten and, in most cases, try to get special privileges not given to the majority.

Because of the nature of these groups, every time you say something that isn't supportive, you are accused of attacking something precious by honorable local people who are working hard for a worthwhile project. This ability to cut down their opponents is probably their greatest strength in getting special recognition.

TAKE THE HANDICAPPED, for example. They amount to less than 10 per cent of the population, and within this category you have all kinds of people with everything from hearing problems to being confined to bed.

A very few are confined to wheelchairs. Because of intense lobbying, parking spaces are now required to be reserved in prime spots in every public area. Most of the time, these spots are empty because there aren't enough handicapped people driving around to use them.

Municipalities are spending billions of dollars—for curb cuts so that the handicapped can cross the street, for elevators instead of stairs in buildings the handicapped never use, and so forth.

Public transportation companies are being

forced to spend an extra \$10,000 per bus for wheelchair lifts, yet few handicapped persons who need these lifts use buses. This is about 10 per cent of the cost of a large bus and means, on a limited budget, fewer buses will be purchased.

It is not that we shouldn't be sympathetic to those less fortunate than the general populace.

Campaigns to hire the handicapped are good because they encourage making productive people who might otherwise be a financial burden on society if they didn't have a job.

BUT THE NEW requirements smack of overkill. Because the lobbyists for the handicapped have achieved a certain momentum, anything they ask for seems to be given without consideration of priorities.

Instead of being reactive to every demand, a much more reasonable approach should be taken to satisfy the needs of the handicapped.

If government were to spend the same amount of money it is spending for this special interest group on every worthwhile group that has needs, it would be bankrupt very quickly.

Special concessions should be meted out in relationship to real need, not on how loud the voice is espousing the cause.

The handicapped as a group may be large in number, but they are small in percentage, and only a small percentage of their groups are getting the benefits of all the spending.

If we keep up on these programs, there will not be enough for other worthwhile programs.

Lifespan speaks on birth control bill

Editor:

The passage of House Bill 4425 by the Michigan Legislature Nov. 9 authorizing local school districts to teach contraceptive birth control in the public schools, culminated a triumphant campaign waged in concert by all segments of the media. The win-some refrain was that dissemination of birth control information would cure teenage pregnancy and venereal disease.

Yet until this bill, Michigan and Louisiana were the only states where it was illegal to teach birth control in the schools.

Statistics show that the number of teenage pregnancies did not soar above that of other states as it should have if arguments of H.B. 442 were correct.

Michigan Citizens for Life, which contains thousands of members in the metropolitan Detroit area, has mem-

bers in many denominations and takes no stand on birth control and contraceptives. But it is committed to a firm stand against abortion. There is no way for H.B. 4425 to operate, with abortion kept a secret. You cannot muzzle a teacher in her classroom nor effectively monitor all classes. Either thought is repugnant.

Sen. John Wellborn introduced an amendment to H.B. 4425 that would make fetology a required course in presenting the subject of contraceptive birth control.

MCL supported that move because without the subject of fetology being taught in conjunction with birth control, the bill is a fragmented educational requirement. To deal with the subject that pertains to preventing a pregnancy without saying what a pregnancy is (the dwelling of one human being within another) is being dishonest with young people and giving inadequate information about their sexuality.

This amendment lost by one vote in the senate, two in the house. Therefore, the bill now reads that they "may" teach fetology, but it will not be automatically included when contraceptive birth control methods are taught.

Parents, however, do have some options. The bill states that:

•Parent must be notified of the class in advance and given opportunity to review the materials.

•Pupil may be excused without penalty if parent requests this in writing.

•An advisory board is to be set up in each school district in which parents will be included. This board will periodically review materials and make recommendations.

We encourage parents to become actively involved in the advisory boards.

In addition to being firmly opposed to abortion, MCL is equally committed to strengthening the family.

We are outraged at recent Supreme Court decisions which stated that minors may obtain an abortion without their parents' consent, and which permits distribution of birth control devices to minors without parental knowledge. Without the wise and prudent counsel of responsible advisory boards, the above conditions, meshed with this bill, could add to further assaults on the family.

When active teenage sexuality is confronted, the all-purpose mechanistic solution to suppress its results is sought rather than an attempt to seek its causes.

Giving a teenage girl the pill will not firm her will power or solve her social or emotional problems. Her society's pressures insist that sexual relations outside marriage are good and she is being led down the path of permissiveness while her parents stand by in anguish, letting the state take over. Hopefully, she will sense this specious offering. Surely there is more to adolescence than the pill, pregnancy, VD and abortion.

If we do not involve our teenagers in moral discourse, if we do not strengthen our families which are the cradle of our nation, if we can do no more than propose technological solutions to an issue that concerns human life, what does this say about us?

'Born again' movement demands 'non-thinking' subjection, prof says

The old taboos against self-admiration and self-indulgence are being broken by a new wave of religious movements says a Menninger Foundation professor.

"I think we have here the beginnings of a rising cult of self-centeredness in which many young people assume the world has been waiting for them, the past having been only a prologue to their birth," said psychologist Paul Pruyser, director of the interdisciplinary studies program, Menninger Foundation. He spoke recently at the University of Michigan.

"They have been taught to believe

that action—especially spontaneous action—is superior to thought, and to equate tactile sensations with feelings. They see no formal boundaries to sharing the 'good life,' often defined in jarringly hedonistic terms."

Pruyser was a featured speaker at a conference on "Narcissism in Modern Society." The meeting addressed what many observers see as a new social trend in America: people turning inward, seeking personal growth instead of social change.

While other speakers discussed "the new narcissism" from the perspectives of sociology and clinical psy-

chology, Pruyser spoke on its relation to contemporary religion.

"The traditional faiths have long been vigilant against self-serving attitudes and behaviors," he observed. "But narcissism has become manifest in many forms on the contemporary religious scene."

"One example is the pill-induced, instant mysticism—a kind of reverie brought on by a chemical alteration of the mind. Achieving this state requires no strenuous soul-searching, no theological background or supervision." This often leads to addiction, Pruyser noted, while the psychological prob-

lems remain unsolved.

"The Charismatic Movement centers its life and activity on that elusive religious symbol, 'the spirit.' It is so easy to excuse oneself from accountability and responsibility by attribut-

ing one's feelings to the indwelling of the divine."

The weeping, shouting and loud singing of some charismatics may amount to a deification of themselves, Pruyser said.

"One should also ask why so many 'born again' believers beat the drum so loudly about their alleged rebirths and are so prone to hard-pressure,

intrusive salesmanship methods in proclaiming their faith to the world. How far can one identify himself with the divine without becoming grandiose?"

"And if anything characterizes the current religious scene to me, it is the naive indulgence with which large numbers of people accept the obtrusive narcissism of the self-styled leaders of new movements. They demand total, non-thinking subjection to their dictates and go without any scruples to the pocketbooks of their flock."

"I'm afraid it is based on admiration of the lordly, manipulative manners of

these leaders and the public hedonism of their lifestyles. Manipulation, like other forms of fraudulence, is a two-way street," Pruyser said. "Manipulators always find people who want to be manipulated because they have basically the same disposition for deceit."

"The tragic weakness in contemporary religion is the retrenchment in most churches and sects from concern about social justice and corporate human woes," Pruyser concludes. "Evangelical concern with the individual and his soul is the watchword today."

Anchor Inn license may be revoked

Owners of the Anchor Inn bar in Livingston County, which served seven Plymouth-Canton area teens before six of them were killed in a car crash last summer, did not contest 14 charges against them in a Tuesday hearing before the state Liquor Control Commission (LCC).

LCC Commissioner Edward Weist is expected to decide within the next two weeks if the bar's liquor license should be revoked.

The charges were included seven counts for selling alcohol to each minor and seven counts for allowing the minors to consume alcohol on the bar's premises.

Under state law, Weist could revoke the owner's liquor license, suspend the license, or order the establishment sold. He could also fine the owners up to \$300 per count.

Asst. Atty. Gen. Thomas Gianchino said the state was prepared to offer testimony from people who had seen the seven youths drinking inside the bar. But when the bar's attorney, Carl Ramo, refused to contest the charges, the testimony was unnecessary.

The lone survivor of the car crash, Donald Gulau, 16, of Canton, attended the hearing along with the parents of some of the victims.

Killed in the July 23 accident were the driver, Bradley Wilson, Douglas MacGregor, Brian Stout and William Cook, all 17-year-olds from the Plymouth area and Eric Corey, 16, of Fort Smith, Ark.

Pension for vets?

An open meeting is being held Dec. 1 on whether Congress should approve legislation providing pension for veterans of World War I.

The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. Dec. 1 in the American Legion Post No. 46, 1035 S. Main, Ann Arbor.

U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), who is supporting the proposed pension, will discuss the legislation and how it will affect WW I veterans and widows. The public is invited to the session, sponsored by the Washtenaw County

Council of Veterans—an organization comprised of the 16 veterans' groups in Washtenaw County.

Thomas E. Hugel of the council reports a majority of congressmen are behind the pension, which is expected to cost \$245 million for the first year.

Legislation calls for the pension program, if approved, to begin Oct. 1, 1978, with WW I veterans or widows receiving \$150 a month. Safeguards include a provision that anyone drawing another pension couldn't draw a veterans' pension.



Several new items also have been added to the African unit which is popular at middle and high school levels.

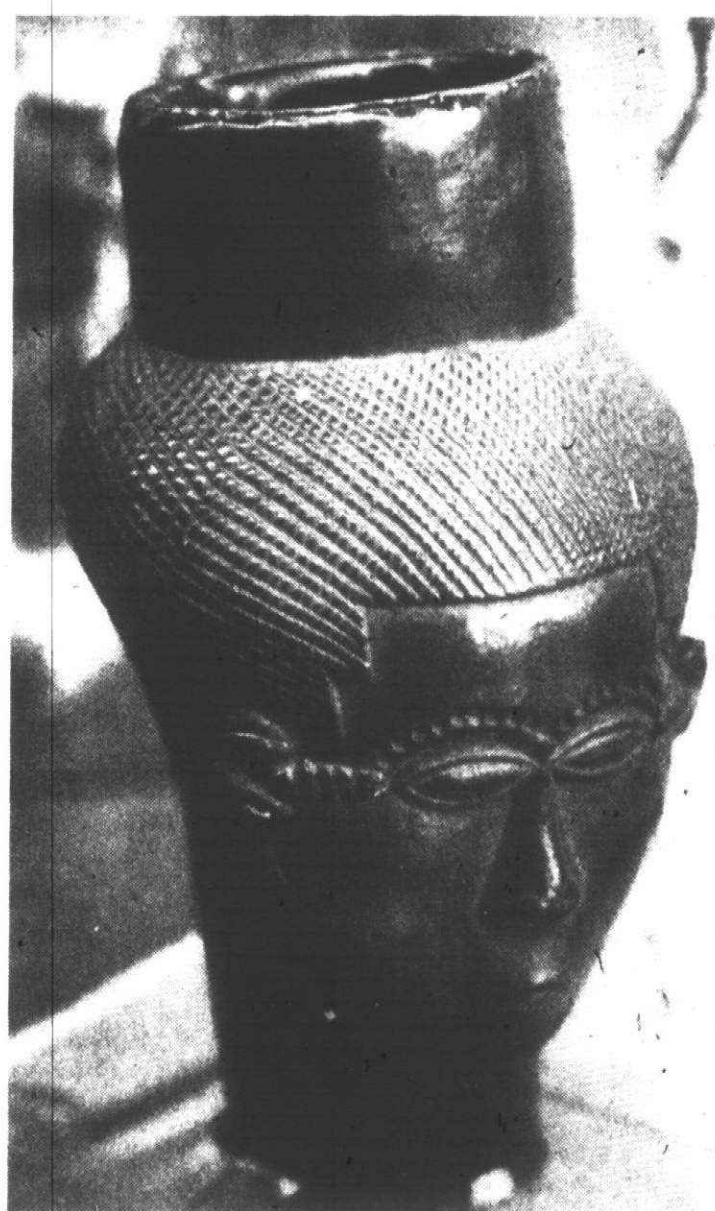

Task force formed

Members of a task force seeking to provide assistance for victims of domestic assault confirmed recently what they have been suspecting all along: Household violence is no stranger to Westland.

In assaults reported to the Westland Police Department during three months of 1977, domestic assaults accounted for as many as 52 per cent or as few as 27 per cent of the cases each month.

Included in the study and defined as domestic assault were cases in which the victim and assailant were involved in a primary relationship, including married, divorced or separated, and boyfriend-girlfriend.

The task force is gathering statistics to demonstrate the need for temporary shelter, counseling and rap sessions for victims of domestic assault. They plan to apply for a grant to help fund the project.

"Sob stories just don't work," said Mary Ann Pinkerton of Plymouth. "We need facts."

In Plymouth

Bill Henry of Our House is a member of the task force. After Tuesday morning's meeting he said, "It is a going group. I have been very pleased with the progress."

The survey of domestic assault statistics in the City of Plymouth revealed that from January to October of this year 24 per cent of the reported assault and battery cases were in the domestic assault category. There were just two felonious assaults which were domestic. Out of a total of 14, this was just 15 per cent.

Henry said, "We have been very fortunate with the calls we have received at Our House. The Salvation Army has come through with shelter for the mother and her children. One of the top priorities of the task force is to find temporary shelters for victims of family assault in western Wayne County."

The task force hopes to complete soon its survey of family assault statistics for Plymouth and Canton Townships.

Ms. Pinkerton is co-chairing the project with the Rev. Doug Hodges, pastor of Norwayne Baptist Church in Westland. Other members of the task force or support groups include members of the Northwest Wayne National Organization for Women, of which Ms. Pinkerton is a member; the Norwayne Family Community Services; Westland Council President Justine Barnes; the Salvation Army and the Our House Crisis Center in Plymouth.

Of the 214 cases reported during April, July and October, in only six cases were the victims male. The rest were female.

In April 1977, 52 assaults were reported, of which 27, or 52 per cent, were domestic.

The most frequently used weapon was the fist. There was one case in which a telephone and a bottle were used, two cases in which a gun was used, and two cases of pulling hair and kicking.

In July, 38 of 80 total reported cases of assault or 47.5 per cent, were domestic. The method of attack included punching, bashing heads on the floor, choking, pulling hair, and hitting with knives, baseball bats, and beer bottles.

In October, 22 cases of domestic assault accounted for 27 per cent of the 82 reported cases. Assailants most often used their hands, fists or feet against the victim.

Often petty disagreements triggered the attacks. "One fight started over who picked a tomato," said Ms. Pinkerton.

According to statistics compiled by the Women's Resource Center of Schoolcraft College in Livonia, in many cases the battering man is drunk. Both victim and assailant may have been beaten as children or witnessed violence between parents, and violence will increase in frequency and severity as the relationship continues. Women who stay in an abusive relationship tend to be passive, lacking self-confidence and have no economic options for supporting themselves or their children.

Battering occurs at every social and income level.

"MANY CALL police as a last resort," said Ms. Pinkerton. "Many don't want their husband arrested, or

a divorce. They just want the beatings to stop."

Westland City Atty C. Charles Bokos defines the degrees of assault, as outlined by law.

Assault and battery is unlawful touching, or contact, without a weapon. This would include pushing, shoving, kicking or punching with a fist. It is a misdemeanor, punishable by 90 days in jail, or a \$100 fine, or both.

Aggravated assault is a "high misdemeanor," said Bokos. It includes assaults where the injury requires medical attention, such as a broken

nose, visible cuts and bruises. Aggravated assault carries a penalty of one year in prison.

Only misdemeanors come under the jurisdiction of the city attorney's office, said Bokos.

Felonious assault is assault with a deadly weapon such as a gun or a knife. In one case, a broomstick was considered a deadly weapon, said Bokos. Under felonious assault the intent or use of the weapon is sufficient grounds. It is a felony punishable.

Assault with intent to do great bodily harm less than murder covers

serious injuries and carries a penalty of 10 years imprisonment.

"ABOUT 90 PER CENT of the cases change their mind about prosecution," said Robert Sage, of the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office. "This is part of the problem."

As a result the prosecutor's office allows a "cooling off period" of about a week, said Sage. Then, if the victim still wants to prosecute the case is processed.

"Getting the woman to prosecute is the biggest problem," said Sage. "If she will stand fast, it will help her more in the long run."

After its first performance, Life magazine predicted it was "likely to become America's most enduring contribution to Christmas lore since 'A Visit from St. Nicholas.'" The New Yorker called it "a wonderful thing to see and hear."

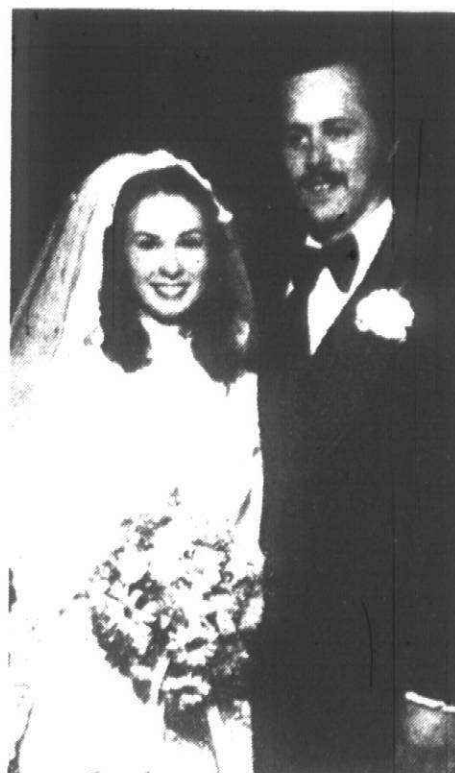

Hanuka starts evening of Dec. 5

Jewish families throughout the area and throughout the world will light the first Hanuka candle on the evening of Monday, Dec. 5.

Called the festival of lights, the eight-day celebration honors an important event in Jewish history. It marks the recapture by Judas Maccabeus and a small band of Israelites of the temple of Jerusalem in 164 B.C. from the armies of Antiochus IV, the king of Syria.

After the Maccabees seized the temple from the Syrian army, it was purified and dedicated to God with festivities that lasted eight days.

Although there was only enough lamp oil for one day's ritual, the flame burned miraculously for the entire eight days.

Hanuka is observed by the lighting of an eight-branched candelabra called a menorah. The ritual starts with one candle on the first day and, as each day passes, another candle is added until all eight are lit.

According to Rabbi Louis Newman of New York City, "The Maccabean spirit of the Hanuka festival belongs

not only to Jewry and Israel, but to all freedom-loving peoples."

He added: "The preservation of the Jewish faith by the Maccabees made possible the birth of two other religions, Christianity and Islam."

Foods traditionally served during the festival include latkes, or potato pancakes; kugen or potato pie, and a loaf of bread called challa.

Because Hanuka is a time to receive guests, as well as family, Jewish homes are often decorated with candles and flowers to enhance the festive atmosphere.

A recipe for latkes calls for two cups of raw grated potatoes, two eggs, a pinch of baking powder, 1½ teaspoon salt, one tablespoon of flour and bread crumbs or matzo meal.

Peel large potatoes and soak several hours in cold water. Grate and drain. Beat eggs well and mix with the rest of the ingredients, adding a little pepper. Drop by spoonfuls on a hot, well-greased frying pan, in small cakes.

Turn brown on both sides. Serve with applesauce.

Pastor to talk in Portugal

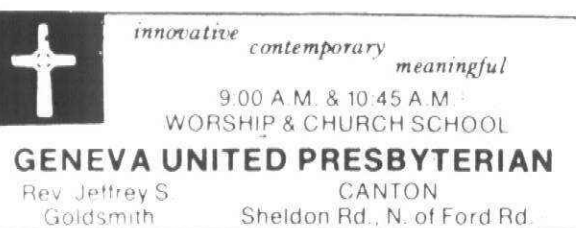

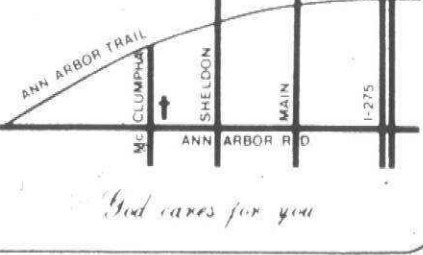

A rare treat

Shortly after he wrote the musical setting to "A Midsummer Night's Dream," wealthy Berlin composer Felix Mendelssohn-Bartholdy staged a complete performance of the Shakespearean play, with dancers and chorus, on the lawn of his own estate, impressive for its natural setting. That was in the 1840s.

The late Jesse Bonstelle would stage annual performances on Detroit's Belle Isle—the full play and Mendelssohn's musical setting. That was a half-century ago.

A suite from Mendelssohn's score is common concert fare and a popular selling record. Rarely in a lifetime, however, does one have a chance to see "A Midsummer Night's Dream" the way Mendelssohn himself staged it.

THAT GAP will be filled at 4 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 4 in Southfield-Lathrup High School, 12 Mile west of Southfield roads, in a multi-media production of several scenes of the classic comedy-fantasy about quarreling fairies, enchanted young lovers and country bumpkins.

It will involve 101 persons: Forty five members of the Oakway Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Francesco DiBlasi, who had the idea

express the fantasies and dreams of Shakespeare's characters. "The dancers are the thoughts of the characters," Mrs. Henderson said.

For example, while the two young couples—Lysander, Helena, Demetrius and Hermia—are asleep in the forest, Puck puts a love potion into the eyes of the wrong man. The result is considerable, and entertaining, confusion.

DAVE JORLETT deliberately picked 10th graders for the chorus. "Older singers would have had too mature a sound," he explained.

"They're almost like a Greek chorus," Jorlett said of the singers' function. "They're adjacent to the stage. They comment on the action and sing the words the fairies say."

"Multi-media is really a new experience for the singers. Normally they sing their parts and are off. They approached this kind of thing. But it has been a challenge for them. An exciting."

Solo parts will be sung by first soprano Leslie Sklar, a voice major at the University of Michigan, and second soprano Carol Gagliardi, a senior at the high school.

To help defray production costs, ticket prices for this Oakway performance are up a bit: \$4 for general admission, \$2 for students and senior citizens. Tickets are available at Hudson's in Northland, Westland and Oak

for Oakway's biggest production to date.

- Twenty pantomime actors from Will-O-Way Playhouse, directed by Celia Merrill Turner, who will narrate.

"WE ARE doing two scenes," said Mrs. Turner, who as a child participated in the Belle Isle performance—"the ones centering on the rude mechanics—Quince, Bottom, Flute and the rest—rehearsing their play."

"We're using pantomime in full costume patterned from the Old Vic production. There'll be a certain amount of pageantry."

Mrs. Turner explained the production theory: "In opera, you know, there are recitative and aria. The recitative tells the action. The aria expresses the mood—the thinking, the suffering."

"Lin Henderson, with her dancers has taken the aria role. She has choreographed it especially for this production."

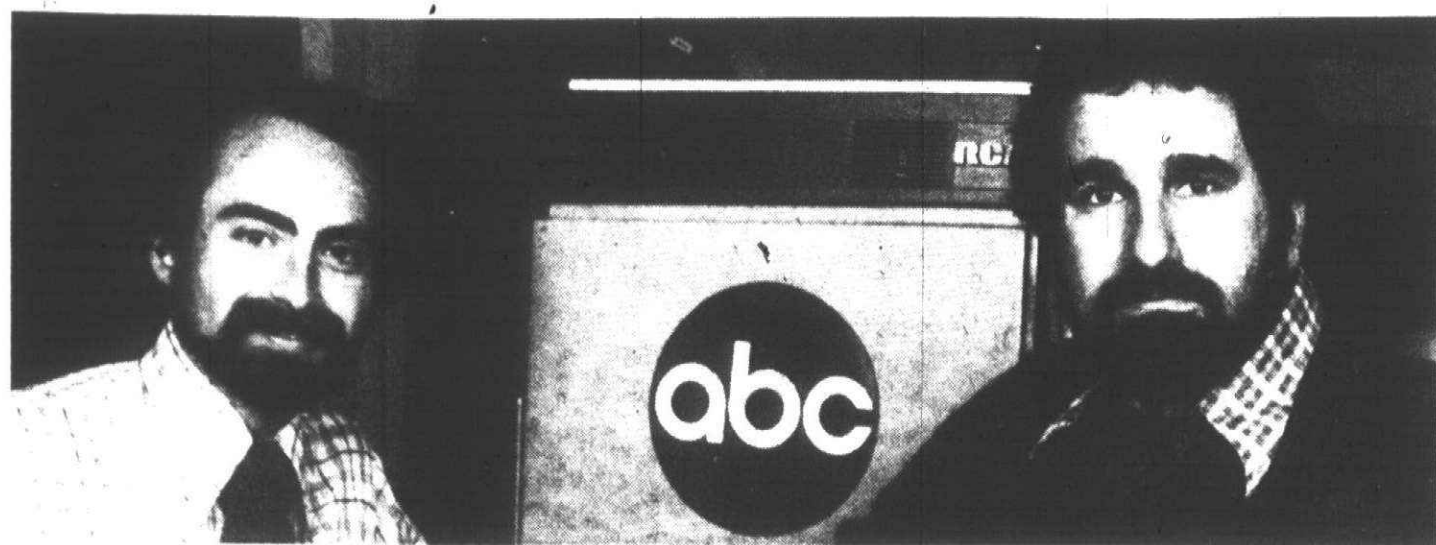

Detroit can show you that Motown is not a no-town

"Visit Detroit—it's a riot." That's not much of a joke to many persons, but it's a saying that symbolizes an uneasy feeling—often justified—about the city that many out-of-towners hold.

But Detroit boosters tell us things are changing. The crime rate is down, the Renaissance Center is up, and the recently-opened Jeffries Freeway is paved and ready to whisk western Wayne County residents downtown in less than 20 minutes.

There's a lot to see and do, of course, as the two young film makers pictured at left found out. But more about them later.

For starters, how about Detroit's fifth annual "Noel Night?"

On Wednesday, December 7, from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m., one of the most interesting blocks of Woodward Avenue—the cultural center area—will be closed to traffic and the Christmas spirit, in the form of music, drama, entertainment, workshops and refreshments, will take over.

Organizers will set up an information booth at each end of the closed Woodward block, but here is a short sample:

To get there, hop on the Jeffries, go east on the Ford Freeway, south on the Lodge Freeway, and exit at Forest, the first exit on the Lodge. Then follow the signs.

NOW, ABOUT those film makers. Their names are Bill Pace and Harvey Ovshinsky, and they produced a documentary for WXYZ channel 7 that has topped two prestigious international awards.

Its title is "Revival" and its theme is Detroit and life in our neighbor to the east.

The documentary, divided in four segments, is hosted by urban architect Alex Pollock. The four vignettes show a behind-the-scenes look at the Four Tops in recording session, Palmer Park residents organizing to fight crime, a team selling Detroit to nervous out-of-towners, and Congregation T'Chiyah, a new downtown synagogue housed St. Mary's Catholic Church in Greektown.

Rock cagers demolish lowly Franklin, 81-35

It's too early in the boys basketball season to use the adjective "perfect" as a description for any one team's performance.

After viewing Plymouth Salem's 81-35 non-league slaughter over Livonia Franklin, however, it was definitely hard to find things wrong with the Rocks' style of play.

McIntyre added that his club "would be back" and they "could only improve" on this initial performance.

Salem head coach Fred Thomann was pleased with his team's performance and saw an improvement in defensive play from last week's 23-point victory over Walled Lake Central.

"We definitely played better defense," Thomann said. "We forced

them out of what they wanted to do on offense."

"In my judgment, we are further ahead defensively (at this point of the season) than in a long, long time. We had good court relationships out there."

Thomann felt having the first game under their belts was an advantage for

Salem defeated the host team 35-23 and rebounded with a narrow 30-27 victory over respectable Willow Run.

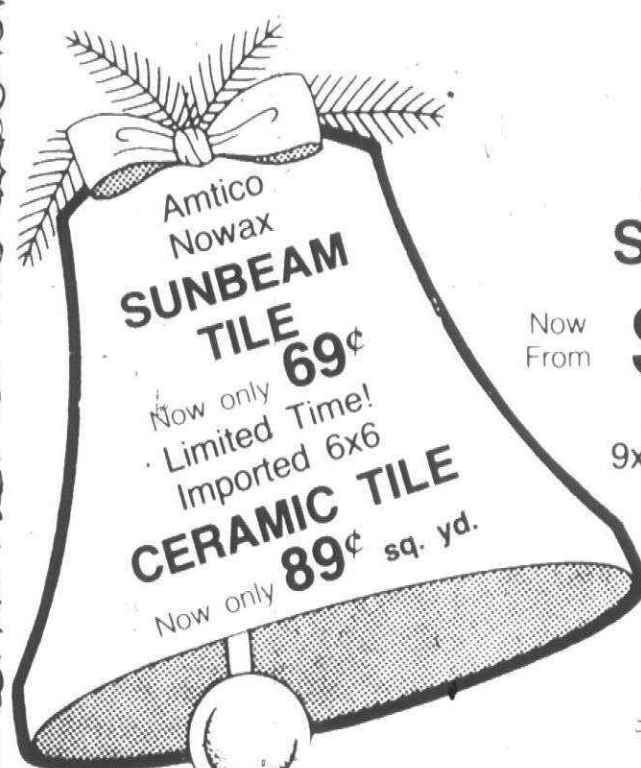
The Rocks' third victory came over an injured Ann Arbor Huron squad 59-10. Huron had to default three matches against Salem because of injuries.

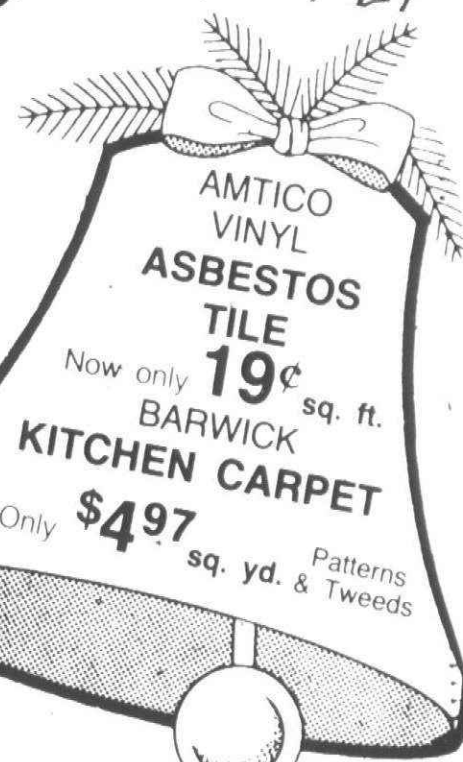

The Salem boys start their regular dual meet season tonight (Thursday) when the Rocks host Thurston in non-league competition starting at 7 p.m.

Although this is his first season with the boys on the varsity level, Olson is familiar with the program working as the junior varsity coach under ex-varsity mentor Byron Williams.

Olson ends his commitment with the girls squad this Saturday but he has been "living" at the Salem pool with double practice sessions this past month.

"I think the boys have really been good about me spending time with the girls," the Salem mentor said. "They've been very cooperative."

"The boys have followed through well with workouts. I'm really pleased with their attitude."

Two transfer students who should help the Rocks are junior Bob Simone, a breaststroker from Northville, and senior Jeff Harris, a freestyler and backstroker from Thurston.

Both of these transfer tankers competed against the Rocks last year.

Two juniors which have been impressive so far this year are Barry Lee and Rod Henry. Lee is a versatile swimmer while Henry is a freestyler.

As always, the Suburban Eight League swimming competition will be among the toughest in the state.

Dearborn and Dearborn Edsel Ford head the list of top competitors and both are considered top teams in the state.

Belleville, Bentley and Trenton are also expected to be strong representatives.

Despite the stiff competition, Olson is encouraged by a good sized team of 36 swimmers and hopes to have a successful year.

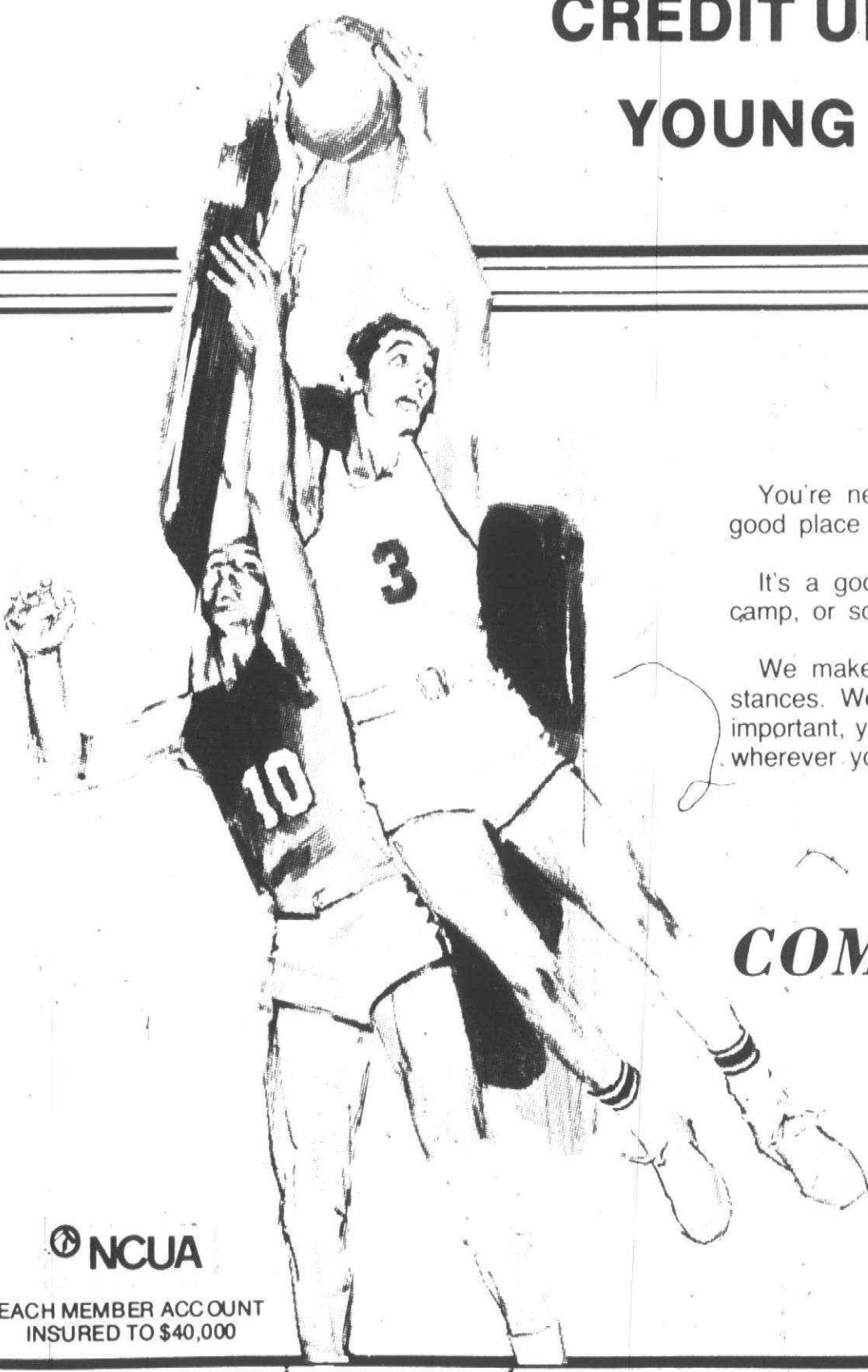

to five key losses in his starting lineup which occurred last Monday.

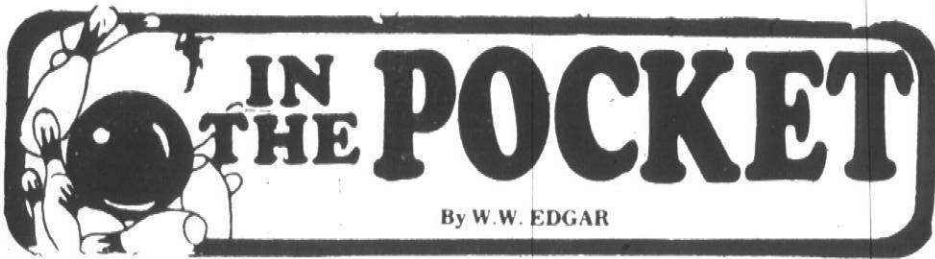
Leading Salem's attack was junior Randy Vippermann, who was a triple winner. Steve Ernst added a 2-0-1 appearance on the day.

No reserved bus lane on I-96 due to 2-year snarl, politics

Something was missing when state and local officials last week opened the final 12 miles of the I-96 (Jeffries) freeway in Livonia, Redford Township and western Detroit.

There was no dedicated lane for express buses.

The story of how the western suburbs missed out on being the first place in Michigan to have one freeway lane reserved for buses and, possibly, car pools is a tangled tale of technology, a lawsuit and old-fashioned city-suburb politics.

Psychologically, drivers of cars and trucks need to become accustomed to seeing one lane of a new freeway used for group or mass transportation from the beginning. If the State Department of Highways and Transportation attempts to "take away" a lane at some later date, experience shows there may be a massive driver rebellion.

WHEN I-96 was in the building stage, Gary Krause, transportation planner for the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments, had begun working on the idea of a dedicated lane.

He had called it "a good bet." An energy-saving idea, a dedicated lane would presumably make auto drivers envious of the speed and freedom of buses and carpools. It was seen as a way to promote use of public transportation.

Tied to this was the idea of using sophisticated traffic control methods that would warn motorists of freeway jam-ups. More public transportation and better traffic control are seen as ways to avoid building more freeway lanes and parking lots.

"A RESERVED lane is still our preference," said Larry E. Salci, general manager of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority.

He holds out hope it may come yet.

The twin answers to why the lane wasn't marked on opening day are 1) SEMTA couldn't get the buses and 2) the City of Detroit refused, for policy reasons, to take on the project of express bus service along the Jeffries, he said.

Bus construction was held up two years, Salci said, because of a suit filed by AM General, the bus-making arm of American Motors Corp., that blocked two other manufacturers, General Motors and Rohr, from building their "advance design buses."

The federal government's Urban Mass Transit Administration had been working on an idea called "Transbus."

"AM General put all its eggs in one basket" by pumping \$25 million or more into Transbus, said Salci. When UTTA didn't go ahead with Transbus

specifications, AM General "complained they were being forced out of the market and had been misled by the federal government."

FINALLY, the new secretary of transportation, Borock Adams, this year, approved the GM RTS2 and Rohr 870 advance design buses until 1979.

In the meantime, SEMTA's bus acquisition program was held up. "We couldn't buy buses for two years," said Salci.

"I've got 189 advance design buses on order now. The first ones are due in mid-March, the others in about late June. Most are targeted as replacement vehicles, but some of the old ones will have to be kept on," the SEMTA manager said.

SEMTA by law is a regional authority covering seven counties, but in practice it is a suburban service because it has yet to absorb the Detroit Department of Transportation (D-DOT).

SO SEMTA turned to D-DOT for help on the Jeffries freeway plan.

"The city wasn't enamored of it," said Salci. "They never put their position in writing, but their policy came out in negotiations."

"They don't want to make a bus rapid transit project look good."

Detroit, under Mayor Coleman Young, has held out for an underground rail rapid transit program, the Cadillac of public transportation. Young has fought anything less, even an at-grade (surface) light rail idea.

Money is so short that one option open to SEMTA is an all-bus system, with express buses on dedicated lanes taking the place of rail transit. Indeed, bus rapid transit is slated for the Jeffries corridor even if rail lines go into the Woodward and Gratiot corridors.

Thus, Detroit's position seemed to be that a successful bus rapid transit program in the Jeffries corridor on a dedicated lane would harm the chances of getting the underground rail lines on Woodward and Gratiot.

A STATE HIGHWAY department spokesman, Charles Fisher, said, "The Jeffries was designed and built to accommodate reserved express lane. But there's no real operating plan for one," he added, pointing to the inability of SEMTA and D-DOT to provide the service.

But he said a lane could be dedicated later on.

He cited the case of Los Angeles, however. "The Los Angeles 'diamond lane' was added after the highway was opened. There was a horrendous rebellion among motorists."

"There was complaining and a lot of violations. Police issued tickets, but it's a terrible thing to try to police. There were mass violations," and so it is an open question whether one of the lanes of the Jeffries freeway will ever be dedicated to public transportation.

Milliken's 'total package'

How metro area benefits

Gov. William G. Milliken is making an intensive bipartisan appeal with State Rep. William Ryan (D-Detroit) for legislative passage of a \$188 million "total transportation package."

For road purposes, it would bring the tri-county metropolitan area (Wayne, Oakland and Macomb) some \$27.8 million annually in new money. This would amount to an increase of 24 per cent, according to figures supplied by the governor's office.

Those funds would go for county roads, city and village streets.

Oakland County would get an increase of \$6.6 million, to a new total of \$33.8 million.

Wayne County is slated for an increase of \$17 million a year, to a new total of \$87.8 million.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION would get a boost averaging nearly \$26 million a year over the next four years, Milliken said. Among the beneficiaries:

- Commuter rail—\$15.4 million, matched with \$61.8 million in federal funds. New locomotives, rail coaches and related equipment would go to SEMTA lines from Detroit to Pontiac and Ann Arbor.

- Detroit's "people mover"—\$6.5 million for a 2.3 mile downtown loop. The federal government would contribute \$26.1 million.

- "Intermediate" level bus system—\$19.2 million in state funds matched by \$80 million federal for a total of \$99.2 million.

- Light rail rapid transit—\$75.2 million in state funds and \$301 million in federal funds for a total

of more than \$375 million by 1981.

- SEMTA regional bus expansion capital funds—\$5.8 million state plus \$23.2 million federal for a total of \$29 million.

- Two new intercity passenger train terminals in western Wayne and Oakland counties.

- Port improvements at Detroit—\$38.2 million in capital and \$14.8 million in operating funds over the next four years.

- I-696 in Oakland County—expediting construction of a 7.9 mile section. Total construction cost is pegged at \$81.7 million.

A COMPROMISE package between Republican Milliken and Democrat Ryan asks a two cents per gallon increase in gasoline and diesel fuel taxes, increases in vehicle license fees averaging \$7 on the average personal passenger car, and \$42 million from the state's general fund.

The Milliken-Ryan package is in political trouble in the Michigan Legislature. A rival package has been pushed by the county road interests in a

Said Milliken: "Passage of a comprehensive transportation plan is necessary to assure continued economic growth for Michigan and Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties during the latter third of the 20th century."

"Resources are becoming more scarce. Energy costs are rising. It is imperative that Michigan move forward with a thoroughly modern and totally comprehensive transportation system if our future growth is not to be restricted or, worse yet, reversed."

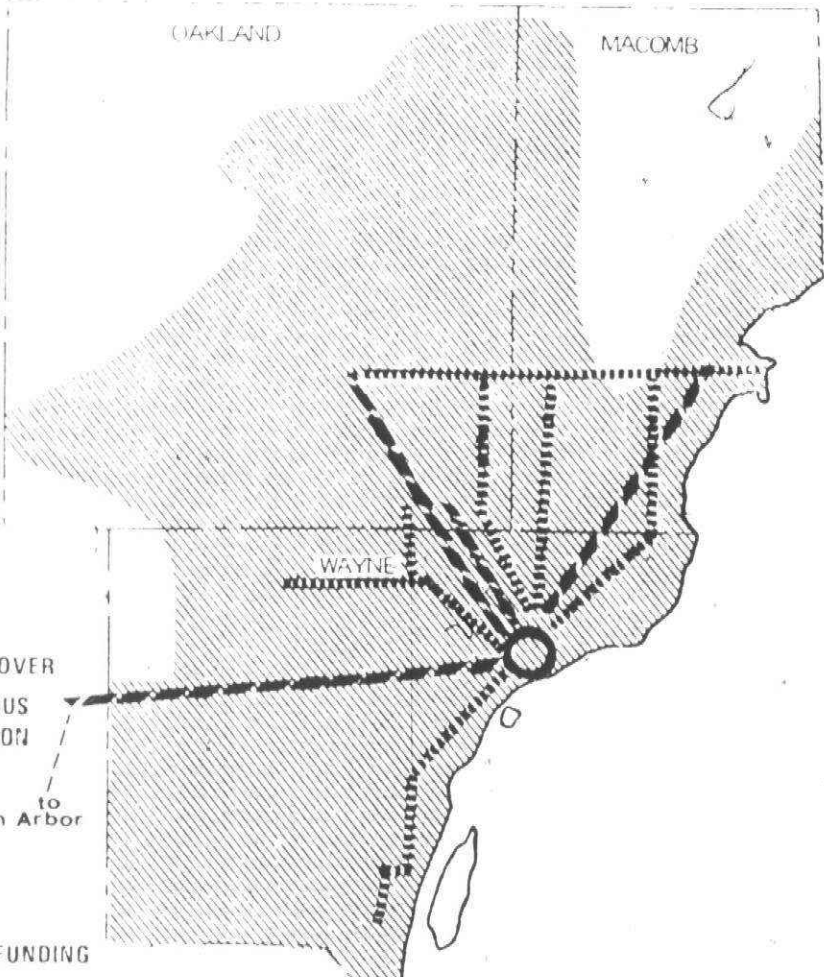

Bernstein's Watergate stories 'simple, basic'

Carl Bernstein said his investigative reporting of the Watergate scandal was nothing more than any good reporter would do, certainly nothing out of the ordinary.

But his means of getting to Troy recently to address a crowd of about 400 persons was perhaps unique.

Bernstein, who arrived about an hour late for his speech, part of the Troy Town Hall series, said he missed his plane from Washington D.C. when the taxi in which he was riding collided with another car.

He tried to get a seat on the next plane leaving for Detroit, but discovered it was booked. After an unsuccessful attempt to charter his own

plane, Bernstein used a little ingenuity—he scalped a plane ticket from a willing passenger.

"I figured if you can scalp a basketball ticket, you must be able to scalp a plane ticket," he said, adding that he paid "an outrageous amount of money."

"That guy is having the weekend of his life in Washington," he said.

Troy comedian and ventriloquist Eddie Jay, who was in the audience to hear Bernstein, entertained the group at Athens High School until the reporter arrived.

INDUSTRIOUS reporting by Bernstein and his colleague at the Washington Post, Bob Woodward, was credited with unraveling the Watergate scan-

dal, which eventually toppled the Nixon administration.

But Bernstein told the Troy audience that he and Woodward did only what good reporters should do.

"Basically what we did was the most simple, basic kind of empirical police reporting," he said. Because he and Woodward were on the city staff rather than the prestigious national staff, they didn't have high-level contacts in the White House.

So they started at the bottom, interviewing clerks, secretaries and working their way up.

In contrast to the FBI, which interviewed many of the same people and found no irregularities, Woodward and

Bernstein interviewed people at home in the evenings where they were more relaxed and willing to talk. The FBI also made a "presumption of regularity," he said.

"We made no such presumption nor did we harbor any prejudicial idea that there were any irregularities."

As the investigation proceeded, Bernstein said he was puzzled at the break-in's emerging connection to the White House. "We were thinking, 'This is so stupid, the White House couldn't really be involved in this,'" he said.

He was even more puzzled by the fact that no other newspapers picked up on the story for several months.

"We were pretty much alone," he said.

A letter from one of the men charged with the Watergate burglary to federal Judge James Sirica drew a connection between the break-in and the White House. Immediately after that—and after revelations by Donald Segretti of planned "dirty tricks"—the New York Times jumped on the story.

"Up until that point, it was very lonely and we were very bothered by it," he said. "I was never so glad to see the opposition paper have a story ever."

THE INVESTIGATION brought down the President and his top staff, but Bernstein said it has had an adverse affect on the reporting field.

The press, he said, is engaging in an

orgy of self-contratulations primarily as a result of its role in Watergate."

Rather than encouraging a trend in "serious saturation reporting," Bernstein said he fears the episode has encouraged a reliance on gossip and what he called "celebrity journalism." He believes the result has been increased prying into private lives rather than professional lives.

During the Watergate investigation, the White House was able to discredit the press by criticizing it. Bernstein said that if the press had taken closer look at itself, the White House might not have been able to discredit the press.

"That attitude might not have existed if we had been doing our job a little better," he said.

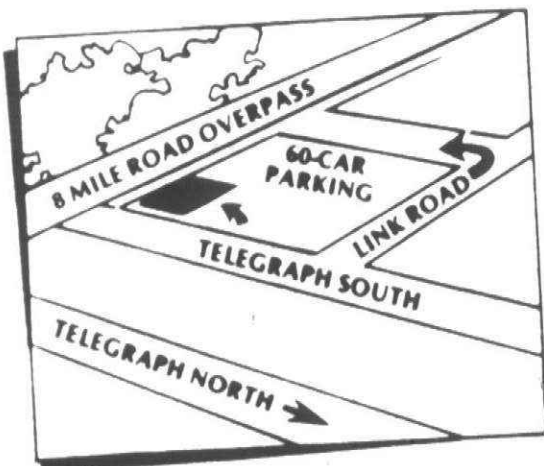

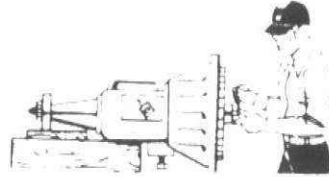

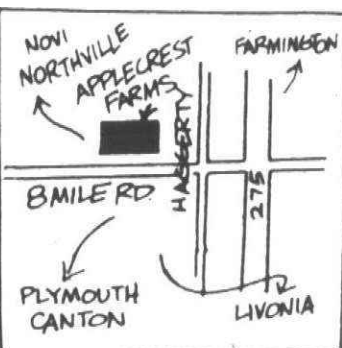

New kit for safe pregnancy tests to be marketed locally

A newly developed test kit women can use quickly, easily and safely at home will be marketed as early as January and possibly in February, say spokesmen for the Perry Drug Co., which has stores in Oakland County.

Believed to be the first means ever to become available for women to discover for themselves early pregnancy, the kit's findings have been proved 97 per cent accurate and will sell for under \$10, according to the company.

A product of the Warner-Chilcott division of Warner-Lambert, the EPT (early pregnancy test) identifies, when present, the pregnancy hormone HCG in a woman's urine.

Spokesmen for the new product explained that a woman's body starts manufacturing the hormone as soon as she becomes pregnant. By the ninth day after a missed menstrual period, there should be enough concentration of the hormone in the urine to permit the EPT kit to give an accurate reading.

The contents of the nonreusable kit will include a vial, which contains sheep red blood cells and rabbit anti-serum, a small tube of purified water,

a dropper and a test tube, all of which are packaged in a transparent cubicle through which the test result can be seen. To do the test, a woman mixes a sample of her urine with the contents of the tube. If, after two hours, a dark brownish ring appears at the base of the tube, she can assume that she is pregnant.

It is particularly important, say spokesmen, that she wait until at least the ninth day before doing the test. Otherwise, the result could be inconclusive.

During testing of the product, studies indicated that the EPT kits will be of significant psychological benefit to women who are reluctant to visit a physician when they suspect pregnancy. Buying the kits will not require a prescription. The Pontiac-based drug chain intends to give the kits top-of-the-counter display in all pharmacy sections.

Presently, the chain has ordered all of the EPT kits which Warner-Lambert will be able to deliver. Anticipating that there will be a more than moderate demand for the product, Perry spokesmen said that the kits are likely to be in short supply during much of 1978.

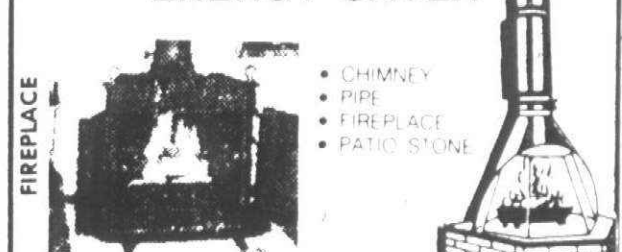

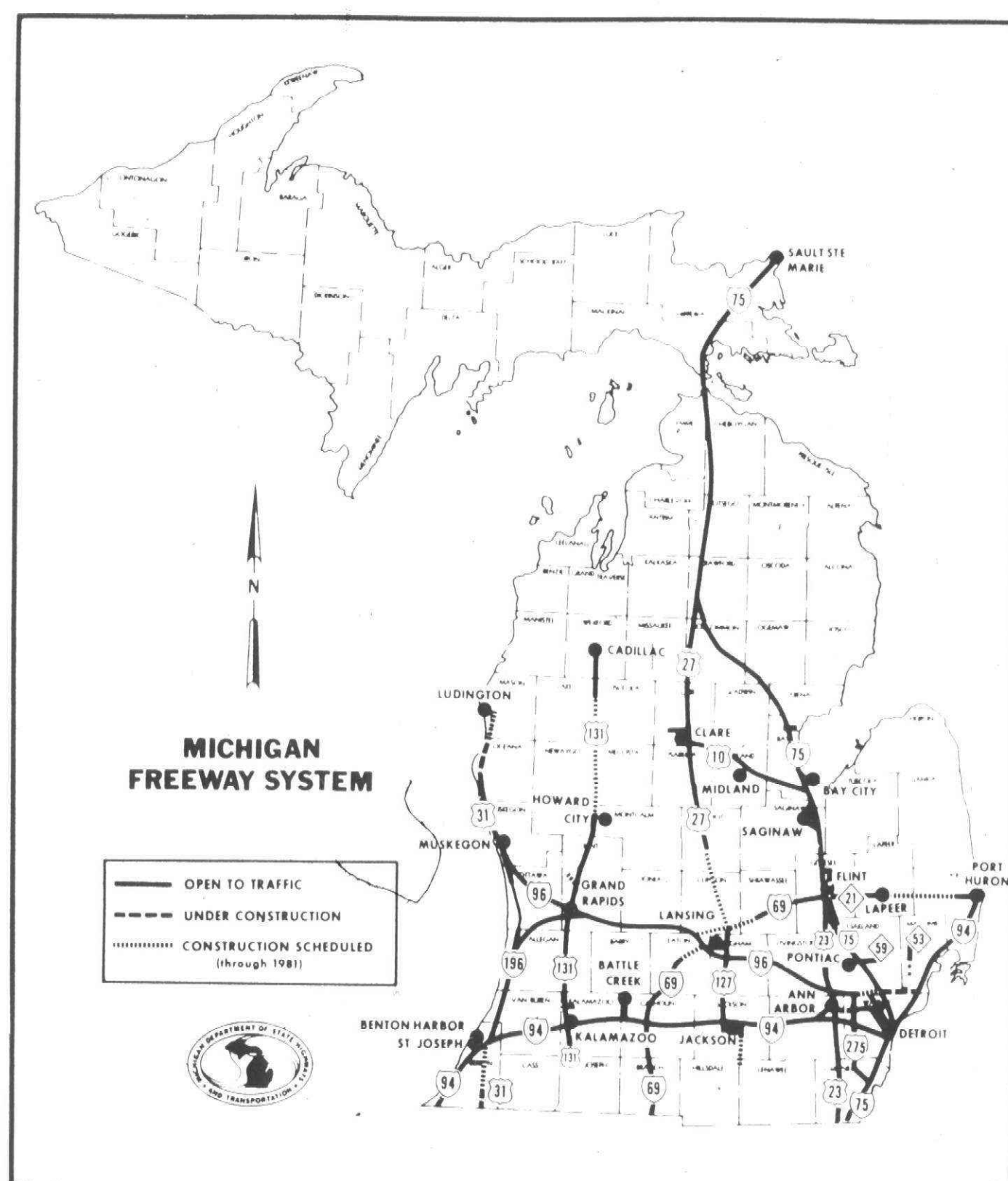
State freeways now and future

There must be ways to slice your taxes

Year-end efforts to cut income taxes depends on whether you plan to itemize your deductible expenses or take the new standard deduction.

That decision, according to the Southfield-based Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants (MACPA), will determine which of a number of tax planning options are available.

The CPA organization points out that the standard deduction for 1977 tax returns is no longer a percentage of income. It's a fixed amount—\$2,200 for individuals and \$3,200 for married couples filing joint returns.

Thus represents a \$200 decrease in the maximum deduction for individuals and a \$400 increase for couples. CPAs suggest that taxpayers whose deductions are near the standard deduction should reexamine their method of claiming them, computing taxes both ways to determine which is better.

If you're paying alimony, you'll now be able to consider taking the standard deduction. Alimony has been changed into an adjustment, which means it's no longer affected by your method of taking deductions.

MACPA ESTIMATES that an individual with income of \$14,000 or more, and average deductions, may find it better to itemize. The same goes for married couples at almost any income level who also have average deductions for their income brackets.

Sometimes, CPAs say, taxpayers benefit by taking the standard deduction one year and itemizing the next, bunching as many deductible expenses as possible in the years in which they itemize.

If this is your year to itemize, CPAs advise that pre-paid interest can no longer be deducted entirely in the year of payment, but only as it would come due if paid over the life of the obligation.

However, according to MACPA, there's nothing to prevent you from having necessary medical or dental work done and paying for it right away. You can also make planned 1978 charitable or religious contributions

now or pay some state and local taxes in advance.

If you're not covered by a pension or profit-sharing plan where you work, and you decide to set up an individual retirement account, you can defer taxes on as much as 15 per cent of 1977 income. This is done by putting up to \$1,500 into your individual account before Feb. 14, 1978.

AS LONG AS you don't exceed the 15 per cent limitation, you can now put an extra \$250 into your account for a non-working spouse. If the spouse is employed and also qualified for an individual retirement account, the two of you can contribute a total of up to \$3,000 into separate accounts.

If you're considering selling depressed stocks or other assets before year-end in order to offset gains or other income, remember there's been a change in the holding period. To create a long-term capital gain or loss, an asset must now be held for more than nine months. In 1978, it goes to more than 12 months.

Up to \$2,000 of ordinary income can be offset by capital losses in excess of capital gains. This is an increase from \$1,000 in 1976. From 1978, the maximum income which can be offset increases to \$3,000.

If your employer underwithheld taxes from your salary this year and you expect to owe Uncle Sam substantial added amounts, see if you can have extra taxes withheld from your final 1977 paychecks. This could help you avoid a penalty.

MACPA further advises that you begin now to gather full documentation to support your deductions—especially those having to do with business travel or entertainment. Internal Revenue Service is now taking a hard line against the use of estimates for travel and entertainment expense deductions.

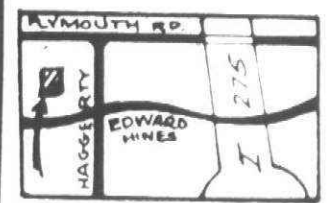
