## Survey: No to building, Yes to expanded ESY

Community support for spending tax money to construct more school buildings is at a dramatic low even though awareness of growth in the district is fairly high, a recent survey indicates.

Instead, a high percentage of the people polled favored expanding the extended school year (ESY) program—which is currently in use at five elementaries and one middle school—to handle increases in student population.

The survey, which was sponsored by the board of education and conducted by volunteers from the American Association of University Women, was geared toward finding out how taxpayers feel about a bond issue for new buildings. Last April, voters denied a construction bond request by a 2-1 margin.

Slightly more than 28 per cent of the people interviewed said they would support a bond issue, while 40.9 per cent said they would turn it down. A whopping 70.6 per cent, on the other hand, indicated they would like to see the ESY schedule expanded to other schools if necessary.

THE SURVEY sample was comprised of 381 people chosen at random

from the registered voter file. They were contacted by telephone between Nov. 18 and 21.

According to Florence Bier, community relations administrator for the board, 58.3 per cent of the sample were parents, and 50 per cent of the respondents had lived in the Plymouth-Canton school district nine years or less.

"Now that we know people are generally impressed with ESY," she said, "we are going to survey parents of children who are currently on an extended school schedule to see how those who are involved with the program feel about it."

However, Mrs. Bier said she did not feel that the people who were polled represented the feelings of the district as a whole.

"All we can say about this survey is that on the day these people were contacted, this is how they answered the questions we asked. I don't think we can generalize any farther than that. This is just one more piece of information for the board to use when it makes a decision."

One of the surprising things the survey revealed, according to Mrs. Bier, was a substantial drop in support for

new buildings since a similar survey was conducted last February. At that time, 36.1 per cent of the sample indicated they were in favor of a bond would vote against it.

In both surveys, the percentage of people who were aware of increased growth throughout the district was identical at 85 per cent, Mrs. Bier said.

"We have to assume that since people know that we are growing rapidly and don't want to spend money on new building, they are telling the board to find other alternatives."

Other survey findings were:  
• 64.8 per cent indicated support for a bond issue to finance school building repairs, such as new roofs, insulation and wiring. Against such a bond were 17.6 per cent.

• 53 per cent favored using available buildings in other school districts to house student overflow. Those not in favor of going out of the district numbered 32 per cent.

• 16 per cent said they would be in favor of increasing class sizes while 69.6 per cent were opposed to it.

• 31 per cent indicated support for split or double sessions, while 48 per cent said they were against them.

## Ordered to repay widow

## Witch put on probation

Lois Umerska, also known as Lady Athena, high priestess in the Temple of Pan-Dora, was sentenced to two years probation last week on a charge of obtaining money under false pretenses. She was also ordered to repay a Romulus woman \$4,500 and \$360 in court costs after allegedly defrauding the widow in a mobile home swindle.

Mrs. Umerska has 60 days to make the first installment of \$2,225 to Mrs. Anna Groves or appeal the verdict. She said Thursday she has already contacted an attorney to contest the ruling on civil rights grounds—claiming she was persecuted, prosecuted and found guilty because of her offbeat religious beliefs as a follower of the Church of Wicca, a religion of witchcraft.

Wayne County Circuit Judge Irwin Burdick said that since it was Mrs. Umerska's first offense, he agreed to place her on probation. However, he said, if Mrs. Umerska falls behind in her payments, she will be jailed. Burdick said he has "not the slightest doubt" that Mrs. Umerska defrauded a "superstitious" Mrs. Groves out of \$4,500 by accompanying her to the bank and telling Mrs. Groves that the money was a downpayment on a mobile home that the Umerskas had already sold.

BEFORE THE TRANSACTION, Mrs. Umerska had done Tarot card readings for Mrs. Groves, and reportedly examined a voodoo trinket that

the widow thought may have been the source of a run of bad luck.

But Mrs. Umerska, or Lady Athena as she's known at carnivals and in the church, said she befriended the troubled Mrs. Groves and lent her \$4,500 in cash. Lending strangers money is something Mrs. Umerska said is part of her religious nature.

Mrs. Umerska lives with her husband Bernard and family on Shadowlawn Drive in Canton Township. She presently leads a Michigan coven of 13 women, and as "high priestess" in the church, she recently wed a pagan couple in a witch ceremony at the Romulus Ramada Inn. In the weeks following her felony conviction, Mrs. Umerska has hardly kept a low profile.

In fact, next month she plans to lead a band of witches "in full dress" to Lansing for an open forum on battered wives. They'll represent the Congress of Continental Witches and Covens in America "because we're involved in people rights," Mrs. Umerska explains. "We back Indian rights, we back gay rights, we back black rights."

The thought of not repaying Mrs. Groves "because I did nothing wrong" and going to jail has occurred to Mrs. Umerska.

"BUT I'VE THOUGHT again that it's dumb to be a martyr." Instead, she said, she has decided to appeal the conviction.

"I'll appeal it every way I can," she said. "You only have your good name. When they take away your good name, they take away everything. My validity—and witches' validity as being good people—is being challenged. Witches reputations are back to what they were years ago. Because that's what this trial was—a witch hunt. I mean, asking people on the stand if they were witches."

Judge Burdick called Mrs. Umerska's claim that her religious beliefs were violated "a lot of nonsense."

The judge said a businesswoman such as Mrs. Umerska would have kept a receipt if, as she claimed in court, she loaned the widow \$4,500 in cash that was later "repaid" and placed in Mrs. Umerska's bank account with both parties present.

Besides, said the judge, it is inconceivable that Mrs. Umerska would lend a woman with "no source of income" \$4,500 after only knowing her for a few months.

"I don't care what a person's religion is," said Judge Burdick. "She can believe whatever she wants to but she can't use that as a badge of immunity either."

## Is pinball a menace to youth?

Any 11-year-old pinball wizard would have to be accompanied by his mother or father if he wanted to flip the flippers legally in Canton Township, should a proposed ordinance pass.

The would-be ordinance, modeled after a Westland law, sets licensing and regulation requirements on any amusement parlor operating in the township.

An annual \$500 license fee would be required from any establishment that houses pinball machines; plus a \$50 fee for up to four pinball machines and \$25 for each additional machine.

At present there is no "arcade" specializing in pinball located in Canton. There are no licensing fees or regulations either.

Also in the proposed ordinance is a section which states that no one under the age of 16 would be allowed to play pinball after 10 p.m. and no one under the age of 17 would be permitted to play after midnight.

Clerk John Flodin said the ordinance was drafted in an effort to prevent minors from frequenting a "hangout" where pinball is played. Flodin said that from his own observation, many pinball parlors attract undesirable individuals and activities and should be regulated, but not banned.

## 2nd snow storm strikes, dumping six more inches

Just when the Plymouth-Canton community had finished digging itself out from under Monday's storm, another blizzard screamed through lower Michigan Thursday, covering the ground with an additional six inches of snow.

Although most of the main highways in the area were cleared by Friday morning, all school classes in the district were called off for the day.

An informal survey indicated that while many Friday appointments with doctors, dentists and veterinarians were cancelled, beauty shops had very few cancellations.

Most retail stores open Thursday evening and were opened at the regular time Friday morning, but, as on Monday, there were very few shoppers out and about.

"There were only about two people in my store Thursday night," said one Plymouth merchant, "and they just stopped in to get warm. Friday morning was even worse."

THE LARGER stores in Canton Township, however, fared somewhat better in the customer department. "It was very slow Thursday night," said a spokesman for Meijer Thrifty Acres. "But by Friday morning we were on our way to a normal amount of shoppers."

Sgt. Gary Sauer said the Michigan State Police post in Northville got "a million calls" between Thursday afternoon and Friday morning.

"There weren't very many accidents," he said. "Mostly people just wanted to find out about road conditions and the weather." He said that six minor accidents were reported from Thursday at noon to Friday at noon which he termed a "moderate number."

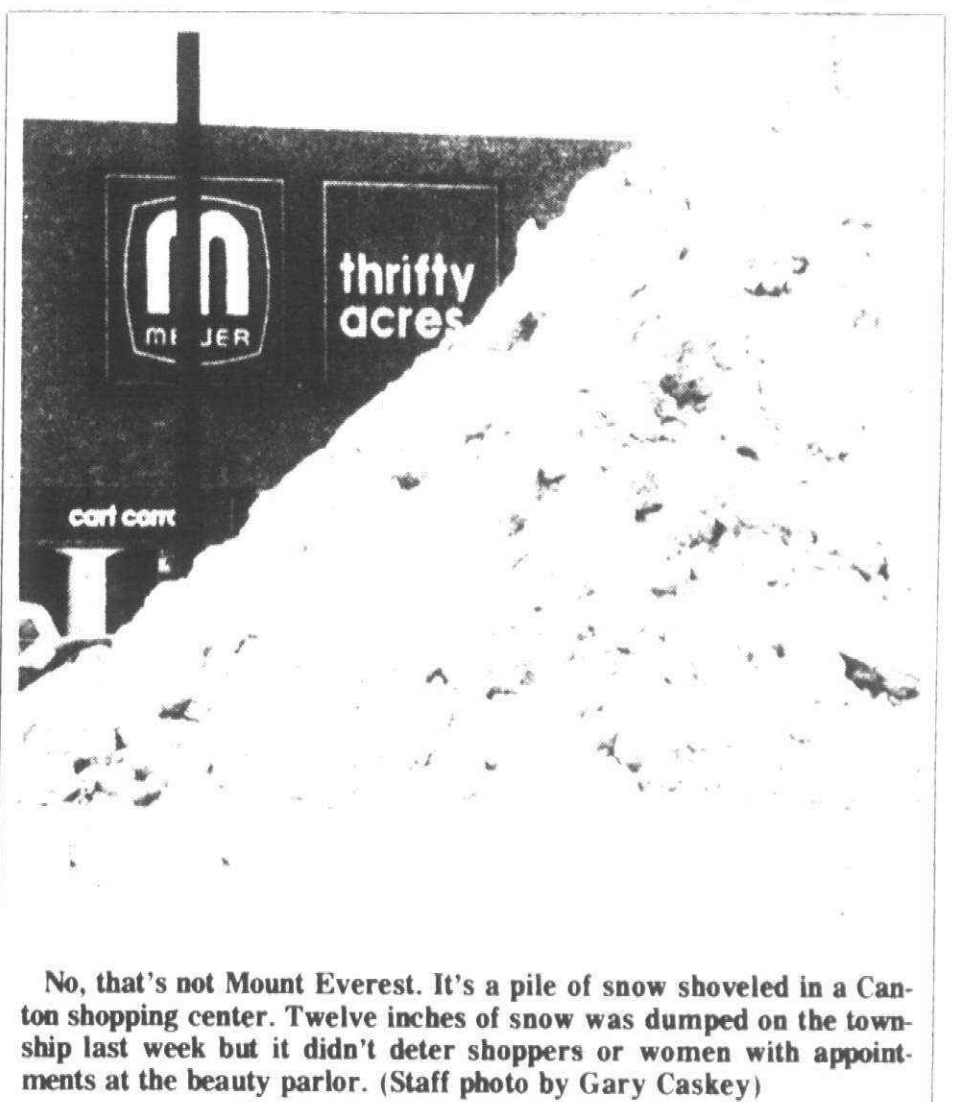
Canton police reported no big accidents, but responded to a heavy number of calls from stuck and stranded motorists. "That's all we've been doing," commented one officer. "Our roads are very bad out here."

Plymouth Police Chief Timothy Ford, however, said conditions were much better in the city. "We weren't hurt by this at all. Our streets are in good shape." He did admit, though, that traffic was "moving very slowly" during Thursday's rush hour.

By Friday afternoon, the Automobile Club of Michigan had received more than 4,000 calls for tow trucks in the

metropolitan area, compared with 3,000 calls during last Monday's storm. Even at that, a spokesman for the club said it was by no means a record. "We've had close to 10,000 calls before. We're busy but not anywhere near capacity."

Perhaps Canton Township Supervisor Harold Stein's secretary, Rose Bretzlaff, had the last word: "I had 30,000 irate phone calls Friday," she said. "It's not our fault. God dropped the snow, and the county road commission is supposed to pick it up."

## Mail moves well despite the rush

Although Christmas is almost here, Plymouth Postmaster John Mulligan says there's still a good chance cards and packages mailed within the next few days will get to their destination on time for the big day.

Despite a record increase in the volume of mail being handled by postal workers, Mulligan says that mail delivery is running more smoothly than ever before.

"I don't have an exact explanation," he said. "It just seems that the system is working better. We've had two day delivery of letters mailed in Florida and New York."

However, judging from the number of people who go into the post office each day, there aren't too many who have put their mailing off to the last minute.

The flow of customers in the office on Penniman Avenue has been steady for the last several weeks, according to Mulligan, averaging somewhere between 500 and 600 people per day.

Even though last Christmas season was a record breaker for the postal workers, this one is on the way to topping it.

Mulligan said that last year's mail figures were 15 per cent above normal for the holiday rush, and that this year's are higher still.

"Our sales figures are way up, too," he observed, "but that could be partially due to the fact that stamps are more expensive."

Although he could not come up with an exact number, Mulligan guessed that post officer workers were handling somewhere between one-half and three-quarters of a million more pieces of mail than on a regular monthly average.

On an average day, slightly more than 22,000 deliveries are made in Plymouth and Canton. And this year the number of individual delivery routes was expanded from 40 to 50.

In addition, Mulligan said he hired six temporary employees to help sort and process the unusually heavy volume of mail. They will also be manning extra service windows in the office to keep lines moving quickly.

"We are definitely staying on top of it," Mulligan stated. "There are some delays and some lags, but when you consider the volume, we're not doing badly at all."



# Lorenz roasted by Rotarians

Ralph Lorenz, the genial host at the Mayflower Hotel, was roasted Friday shortly after noon.

Richwine recalled the time when the Mayflower was on the verge of bankruptcy and was looking for someone to pull it out of the financial wasteland. It was then that Richwine came across Lorenz and had him appointed manager because they thought he was strong enough to shoulder the 20-year mortgage.

Sincok took his good natured jibe at Lorenz by recalling his meetings with the city commission to get the proper layouts for the changes he needed to make the hotel a success.

Hudson took his turns by implying that he had photographs of Lorenz with his "friends on the city commission and those who keep him on the jump over the parking lot problem."

Edgar pointed out that Lorenz was emulating "the man up there" who fed the multitudes with two loaves of bread and a few fish back in biblical times.

He pointed out, to the delight of the Rotarians, that Lorenz has gone one better by putting one chicken under crust and feeding chicken pie to the 90 members at the Friday meetings.

He noted that the lunch served on Friday was turkey roast and allowed that Lorenz was taking a tip from "The Twelve Days of Christmas" and now was celebrating "Two Weeks of Thanksgiving."

## Cider mill gutted by morning fire

Although fire completely destroyed the building plans are already underway to rebuild Parmenter's Cider Mill in Northville.

The cider mill, which has been a landmark in Northville for the past 106 years, was destroyed by an early morning fire Dec. 3 which officials believe may have been arson.

By the time a Northville police car spotted the blaze shortly before 4 a.m., there was virtually no hope that the wooden structure—which housed Northville's second oldest continuous business—could be saved.

The cider mill, a popular fall attraction for many Plymouth and Canton residents, is located just inside Northville Township on Baseline (8 Mile), east of the railroad.

first time since the township department formed in July that the two units have actively fought the same fire.

City firefighters, who were delayed while enroute to the mill by a train, were released shortly before 6 a.m. after the fire was under control. The last township firefighters left at 9 a.m.

The Base Line Road area near Northville's east city limits now had three unsolved building fires in the past five months.

A June fire burned most of an old lumberyard, also owned by Bodker, which was used mostly for storage. Two weeks later, a portion of the nearby Northville Lumber Company was damaged by another blaze.

The Saturday morning fire is believed to have started in the rear portion of the building, where the heat and electricity had been shut off since the mill's season ended on Nov. 20.

Bodker will meet soon with architects to plan a new building although construction won't be able to start until next spring. He predicted Parmenter's would be serving cider and doughnuts by fall.

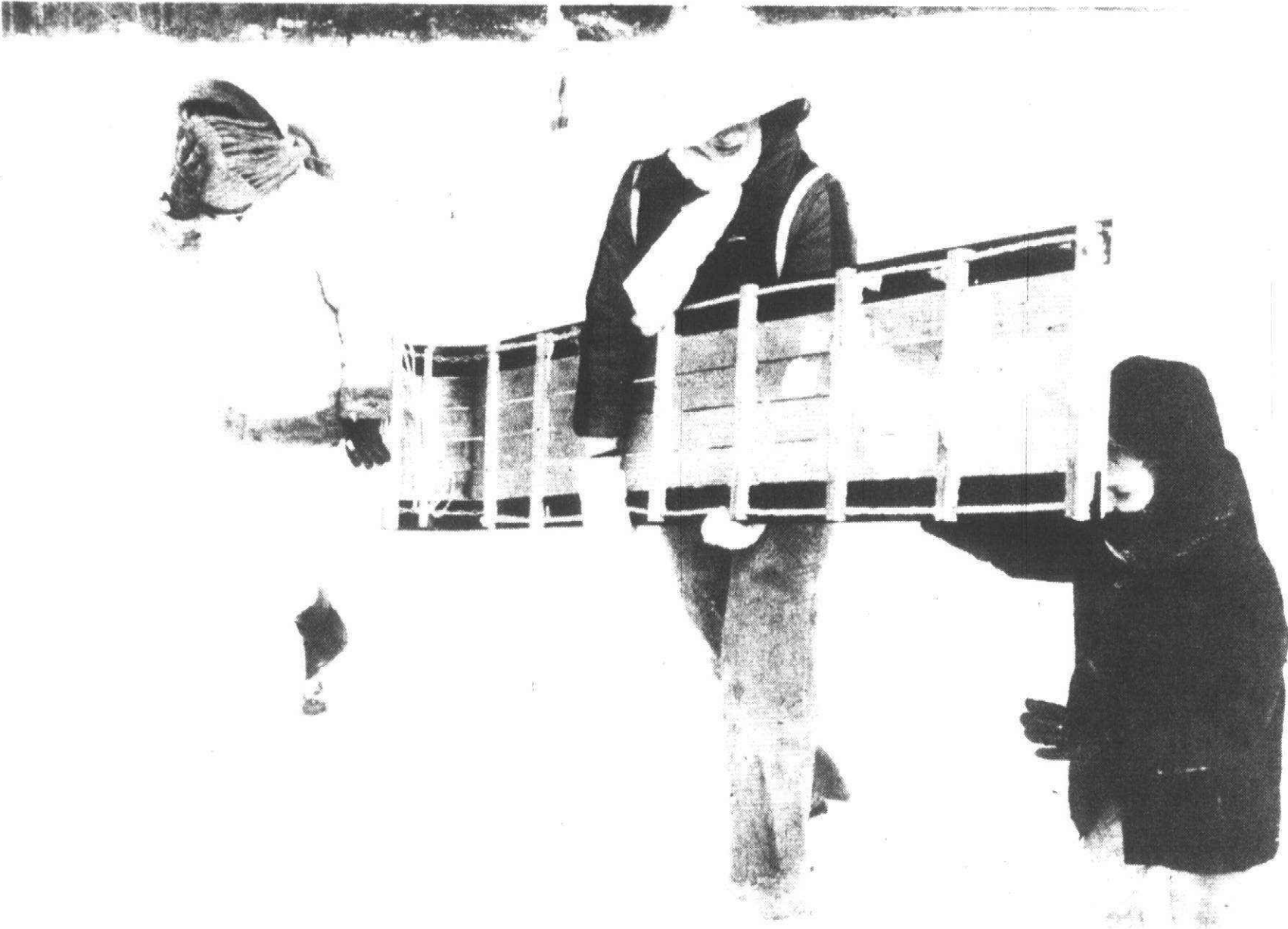

## If you play it safe, winter can be fun

Cobing with a Michigan winter, especially in light of the recent icy onslaught, demands knowledge of how to handle the snow and ice safely.

Anne Donnelly, of the Southeastern Michigan Chapter of the Red Cross, reminds people that just because it has been below freezing for weeks, that doesn't mean that all iced-over water bodies are safe to walk on or drive on with a snowmobile.

"Out door skating is generally safer on small bodies of water such as ponds, shallow streams and small lakes," she said. "These freeze more quickly than larger bodies of water and the ice formed is usually smoother and more durable. Ice formed over swiftly moving water or where the water level changes often is likely to be unsafe no matter how thick it becomes."

A thickness of at least four inches is recommended for ice sports.

Ms. Donnelly says that contrary to popular belief, if a person falls through ice, he should not attempt to climb out immediately.

HE SHOULD kick his feet to the surface and the rear to avoid jackknifing the body beneath the ice rim," she said. "Hands and arms should be extended forward over the unbroken ice. Kick to nearly level position and attempt to work forward onto the ice. When the victim reaches firm ice, he should roll away from the open area and distribute his weight over the weak ice."

If you are near someone who has fallen into the ice, a plank, pole or rope can be extended to the victim. Or rescuers can form a human chain, using the lightest person at the head of the chain, with rescuers holding on

to the skates or ankles of the person ahead of him.

If possible, immerse the person in warm, not hot water (102-105 degrees F). Early symptoms of frostbite are a change in skin color to white or grayish-yellow, and the exposed portion of skin may feel intensely cold or numb.

## Centennial Park symphony hosting concert tomorrow

# Reaves heeds the call and dons his Santa suit

Peering out of the window of his Westland home and seeing the freshly falling snow, Gene Reaves, who has played Santa's helper for almost half a century, heard the call again.

"I was planning to retire," he confided, "after I landed in Canton Township in a helicopter. But I heard the old gent with the whiskers call for me again. This time I'll play the role at the Plymouth Center for Human Development on December 22."

At the moment, Santa's helper, who is now crowding 75 years, is badly in need of help for the journey to the Center.

"I'm not going with an empty bag," he sighed. "But right now I need a lot of gifts. I need mittens and sweaters and the kind of gifts the folks at the center would appreciate for Christmas."

As he spoke of his needs, Gene also recalled that he has been playing the role of Santa Claus in many places throughout Wayne County, but the times he liked best were the 10 straight years he rode in the J.L. Hudson Co. Thanksgiving Day parade.

Reaves was the jolly old man in the red suit who climbed the stairs at Hudson's downtown Detroit store from 1935 to 1945. That's what gave him his start. When the decade passed, he played Santa's role at Grinnell's Music Store on Woodward Avenue for two years and spent another year at the Farmington Plaza.

"I thought it was about time to retire then," he said, "and I told Santa. But every now and then he still calls on me and I never would turn him down."

"Along with going to the Plymouth Center, I have taken on several other parties for guest appearances. But each of them plays a role in making the Yuletide a merry one for the kiddies."

Gene got into the Santa helper's role in a rather peculiar way. From childhood he had been an autograph collector and now boasts the greatest autograph collection in the world. While Reaves hasn't counted them lately, he claims that the number would be 21,000.

"I can't tell you the correct number now," he said, "because the books are over in Pennsylvania. When I can't go to some of the places that invite me, I send the book instead."

While collecting these autographs and noting how pleased folks were when he visited, Reaves decided he'd get into charity work. When the occasion came he took the role of Santa or Santa's helper.

Forgetting the snow accumulating outside, Gene looked back to the first time he got an autograph. His father had taken him to see the late Henry Ford and Thomas A. Edison. They autographed a book for him. Those signatures are now joined by the autographs of kings and queens of sports along with royalty of nations.

Obtaining signatures is a year-round job for Reaves though he has slowed down in recent years. He has been honored in many areas of the land with his collection.

But when the countryside takes on the aura of the Yuletide, he forgets that he wanted to retire from the role of Santa's helper and goes back to work.

"I just love to do it," he smiles, "and I only hope I'll get the gifts I'll need for my trip to the Plymouth Center on the 22nd."

Like old soldiers, Santa's helpers never die.

# Tax for jail considered

Wayne County voters are likely to see a proposal for a 1.5-mill property tax increase on the ballot in the near future if the county's 27 judges are unable to process criminal cases more efficiently or trim their budgets.

The Westland jail annex, which was intended to be used as a holding facility for prisoners awaiting trial, is at the center of the new controversy. The annex was budgeted to handle no more than 70 prisoners, but now houses 253. Sheriff William Lucas said he needs \$3.5 million to continue to operate the facility.

The millage increase would raise more than \$21.5 million. To the person owning a house with a market value of \$40,000—assessed for tax purposes at \$20,000—the increase would cost about \$30 a year.

COMMISSIONER Richard C. Manning (D-Redford) earlier said either parts of the criminal justice budget would have to be trimmed and the money reallocated to the annex or else the Westland facility would have to be closed Jan. 9.

Last week he tempered that ultimatum. After meeting with representatives of the sheriff's department, prosecutor's office and judicial system, Manning asked for recommendations to keep the system, including the Westland annex, intact.

"We're asking them to re-examine the system and make it more efficient. We're asking them to consider reallocation—where it hurts the least. We're attempting to resolve differences and find out where we'll do the least damage," Manning said.

"We're hoping that they'll see what the whole problem is, rather than being privy just to what their budget is," he added.

"It inevitably has to come back to the commissioners. And there it's the If, however, those units making up

the county criminal justice system find it impossible to increase efficiency or cut, Manning said most representatives favored asking for additional millage.

matter of a stroke of a pen (to cut and reallocate budgets). But that damages the internal structure of the justice system."

Chief Judge James N. Canham, who had previously been critical of Manning's statements, supported the notion of additional millage.

"The law requires the county to maintain the courts, a jail, a prosecutor's office; it doesn't require the county to maintain a hospital," he said.

Canham said he would support a millage proposal only if the commissioners decided they could not cut back on non-mandated county services.

"One thing's for damn certain," Canham said, "people capable of doing great bodily harm, not just ripping off your CB or stereo, will be back out on the street" if the annex closes.

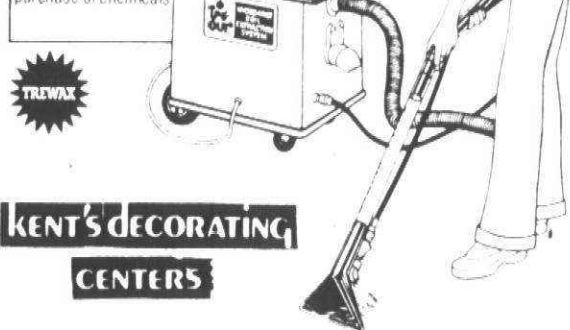

# County mounties recruiting for Star Ship Command

Citizens' band (CB) radio operators and sheriff's deputies used to be adversaries. The air-waves were filled with "smokey reports" giving truckers and other drivers the low-down on the whereabouts of the "county mounties."

In Wayne County, though, things are changing. The sheriff's department last week unveiled "Star Ship Command," a county-wide CB emergency and road-condition communications network which will hook up CBers on the road to the sheriff's dispatcher.

"This will provide constant communications with the dispatcher. In many cases it will save three or four minutes in response time. That can make the difference," said Jim Dennett, one of the program's coordinators.

STAR SHIP COMMAND, encompassing more than 70 mobile "star base" or satellite units, 80 sheriff's road patrol deputies and 60 volunteers manning the two units at the "command base," began operations last month and became the darling of the sheriff's department brass. Last week Sheriff William Lucas officially announced its formation.

The purpose of the program is to take advantage of the ever-increasing use of legal CB operators who have

mobile units in their private automobiles and trucks," Lucas said.

Since the program began in November, Star Ship Command volunteers have logged more than 200 reports from its mobile units, and other CBers.

The volunteers at the command base, located just a few feet away from the dispatcher and his massive control board, monitor CB channels 9 and 19, for traffic information and emergency calls.

BUT MORE THAN just monitoring the calls, the organizers of the command are trying to recruit CBers to join the communication network's ranks. CBers who witness an accident or a crime which is in progress can jump on Channel 9, the reserved CB emergency channel, to get in contact with Star Ship Command, whose call letters are KAMY 5694.

According to the sheriff's department, individual CBers may either contact the command directly, or one of the base stations whenever they come across the scene of an emergency or a motorist in distress.

In many cases, the sheriff's department said, the volunteer command operator may put the sheriff's dispatcher in direct communication with

the CB operator on the scene of an emergency.

The Star Ship Command, though a new service, is costing the county nothing. Equipment has been donated by many groups, including the Romulus chapter of the Highway Emergency Life Patrol (HELP), the Cobra Division of Dyanspan Corp. and Communications Unlimited. The Star Ship Command has also received help from a number of area CB groups, including ALERT and REACT. The command's coordinators, Deputy Kay Daley, Jim and Judy Dennett and Bobbie Garrett, said they think the concept will go statewide in a matter of time.

"WE WANT to get as many CBers as possible. There are 1.8 million CBers in the state of Michigan, and if it spreads like we hope it will, the sky's the limit," Daley said.

The command is manned by volunteers from 7 p.m. until 4 a.m. daily, but there are hopes of expanding it to a 24-hour operation as more volunteers join the ranks.

The organizers have even gone as far as getting a special toll-free phone number, 800-462-5575, giving interested persons a direct line to the command.

### Act will help owners

The Housing and Community Development Act of 1977 could be good news for home owners and home buyers alike, according to a savings and loan business spokesman.

John A. Hardin, president of the United States League of Savings Associations, said that although federal regulatory agencies still must write the implementing regulations, the Housing and Community Development Act "will become a very important piece of legislation, one that will significantly aid the entire housing market."

The new law raises the maximum amount savings associations can lend on residential mortgages and on home improvement loans, expands the community development block grant program and exempts FHA graduated payment mortgage plans from state usury laws.

The United States League is the primary trade association serving the \$430 billion savings and loan business. Savings associations are the nation's chief suppliers of home mortgage credit and the second largest suppliers of home improvement financing.

Hardin said that an important portion of the legislation extends for three more years—the community development block grant program initiated by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development in 1974.

Salem missed three close-range field goal attempts during the last hectic minute which could have pulled the Rocks within two points before Burgess' clinching bucket.

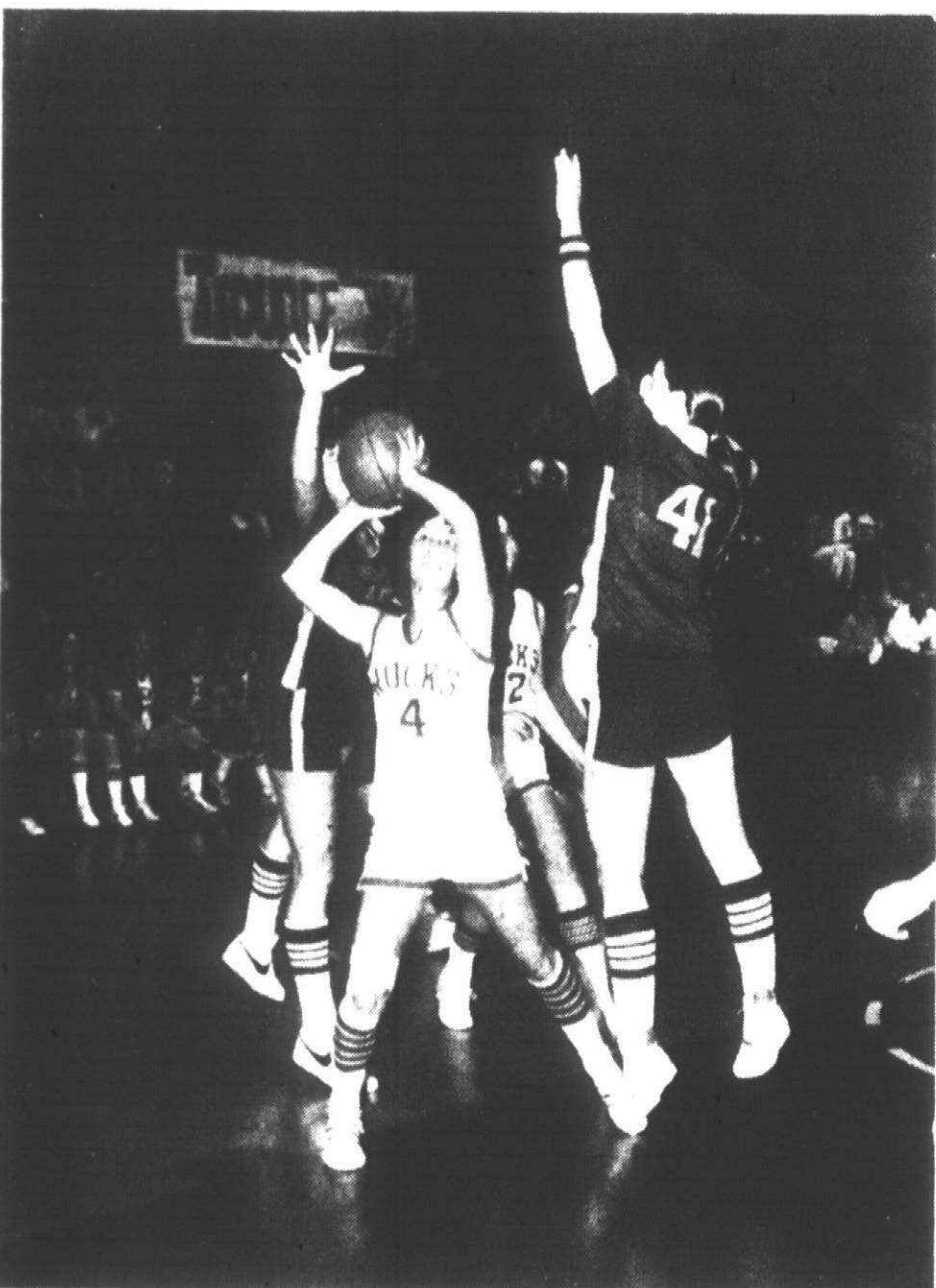
"We were patient all the way," said Bentley coach Tom Lang. "We didn't want to get out of our zone early because we were afraid we'd get tired at the end."

Canton swimmers were supposed to open their season at Farmington Harrison in dual meet competition.

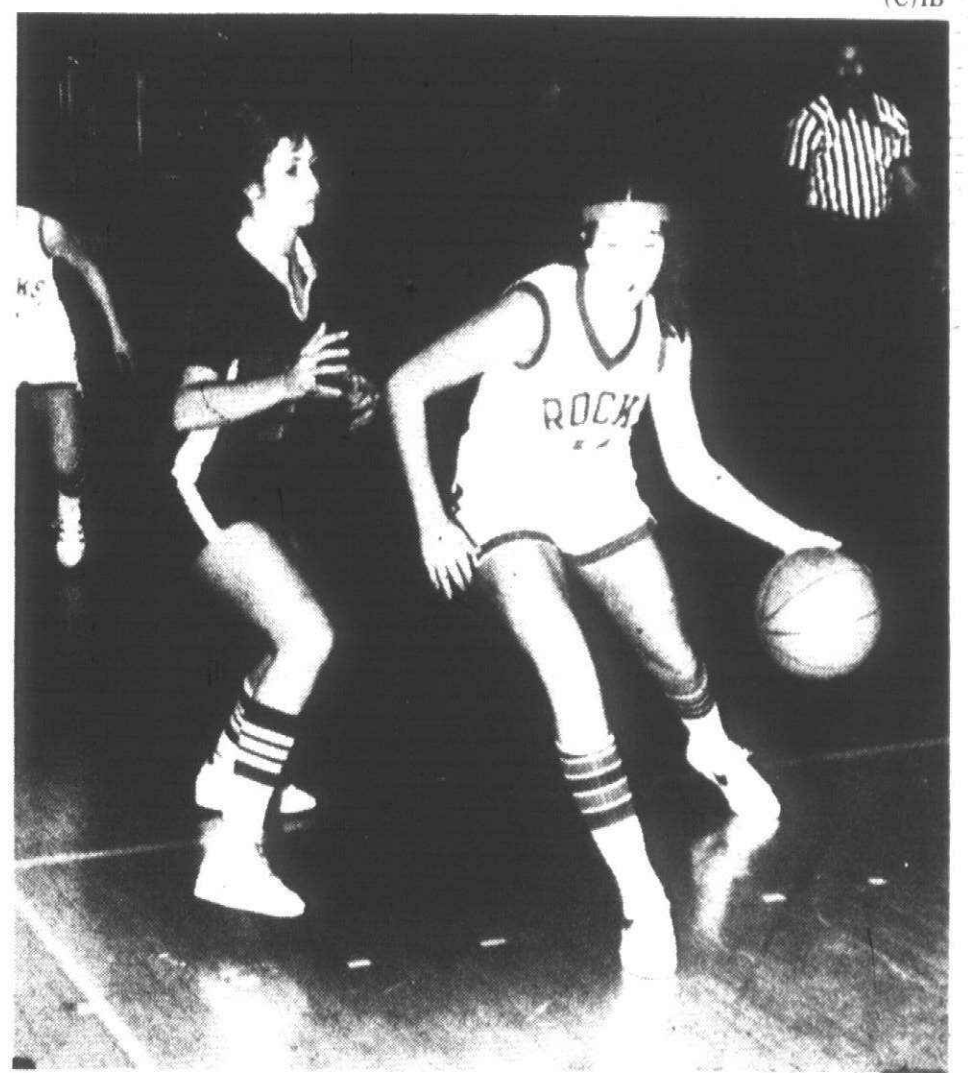
Salem tankers were scheduled to host Northville in their annual non-league grudge meet.

# Egloff gallops for Broncos

When Ron Egloff graduated from Plymouth High School nearly four and a half years ago, who expected he might be playing in a football game worth a cool twenty-five grand to the winner?

It could happen for the former Plymouth end who now plays on the specialty teams for the Denver Broncos of the National Football League.

The Broncos, one of the surprise pro football teams of the year, have already won a berth to the American

Football Conference playoffs and could finish as the Super Bowl champions—which brings in a sum of \$25,000 to every member of the winning team.

Egloff, a graduate at the University of Wisconsin in 1976, was by-passed in the original NFL draft last spring but was invited to the Broncos training camp as a free agent.

The 6-5, 238-pound tight end made the squad and plays behind Riley Odoms. Egloff has seen action on the specialty teams, however, accounting for two tackles and four assists.

The 22-year old has caught one pass

this season, a 20-yarder against the Buffalo Bills.

Egloff gained statewide attention after an excellent junior year with the Rocks in 1972, under the direction of the present head coach, Tom Moshimer.

Egloff caught only 25 passes his senior year when Moshimer began the Wishbone offense, but his overall athletic ability earned him a four-year scholarship at the University of Wisconsin.

The last of a long line of brothers who graduated from Plymouth, Egloff gained national attention in his soph-

omore year with the Badgers when he caught the winning touchdown of Wisconsin's stunning upset of the number-one Nebraska on national television.

The Plymouth product started his senior year at tight end for Wisconsin and caught 20 passes for 308 yards and four touchdowns. He also caught three key passes against the University of Michigan that year.

After his senior collegiate season, Egloff was invited to play in the Blue-Gray all-star game before turning his attention to Denver.

The contest flows and ebbs, taking good turns for one team, then suddenly slipping over to the other squad. It is almost like a battle. Tactics are discussed, players briefed and once again the two teams collide, fighting for every inch of the court.

Injuries are sustained, tempers flare and, all in all, the two teams give everything they can to know that sweet smell of victory. The end comes, however, as one team walks off the

court the victor, the other, the vanquished.

Basketball is a great game to watch for every single movement, every shot, every fast break. It can and does offer the excitement that makes any sport popular.

Last year, Titan fever took control of the area as the University of Detroit basketball team enjoyed a fine season, making the NCAA college playoffs only to be knocked off by the University of Michigan.

The fever is still strong this year, as the Titans roll to victory after victory, four in a row, with the likes of John Long, Terry Tyler and Kevin Kaseta leading the way.

Kaseta, a Livonia Franklin graduate, will be right there with the Longs and the Tyters, keeping alive a tradition of excellent basketball at U-D.

Kaseta, who won a starting job on the squad this year after recovering from knee surgery, will hold down a forward position and should be an important part of the Titans' tactical game plan.

Kaseta won a starting position on the U-D squad in his second year, after turning in a solid first year, playing in 17 games and scoring an average of five points a game. In his sophomore

year, he proved himself against Marquette and scored eight big points to win a starting role. After that, he started the last 12 games of the season.

In that year, Kaseta pumped in an average of seven points a game which would tally to a 68 per cent shooting mark for the then sophomore.

"It was a great season for me. I learned a great deal about basketball," said Kaseta.

Last season proved to be a heart-breaking year for Kaseta, as he played in first five games, only to suffer serious knee damage his sixth game when he battled for a rebound. The injury called for extensive operations which sidelined Kaseta for the rest of the year.

Although sidelined, Kaseta was right there with the Titans on the bench during the NCAA tournament.

"I think if that injury hadn't come along I would have had a solid season. It was a great letdown to know that I couldn't prove myself that year," Kaseta said.

According to former U-D coach Dick Vitale, Kaseta had put in a tremendous rehabilitation effort in an attempt to prepare for this year.

The rehabilitation program has paid off, as Kaseta won a starting position on the U-D squad and has started in all of the Titans contests this winter.

"It was very difficult at first to feel home on the court because of the knee trouble but as practice progressed

things seemed to loosen up," said Kaseta.

"Kevin has made a 100 per cent improvement since the injury. He is an outstanding basketball player who has contributed to the team in many ways," said Vitale.

Last season, Kaseta averaged six points a game with a rebound average of five. He made his shots at a 47 per cent clip from the floor and 65 per cent from the free-throw line. His playing time averaged 23 minutes a game for the Titans.

"Kevin is regarded as a good defensive player who can also score 10 or 12 points a game. His strongest asset is that he can and does hit the long jumpers—that with excellent defensive abilities gives Kevin a key spot on our team," said new Titan coach David Gaines after he took over for Vitale.

Unfortunately, Kaseta has been plagued with various minor and major injuries in his four years with the Titans. Besides the knee injury, he has sustained a broken foot, various sprains in the hand, bruised ribs and other injuries that make it tough on a player during the season.

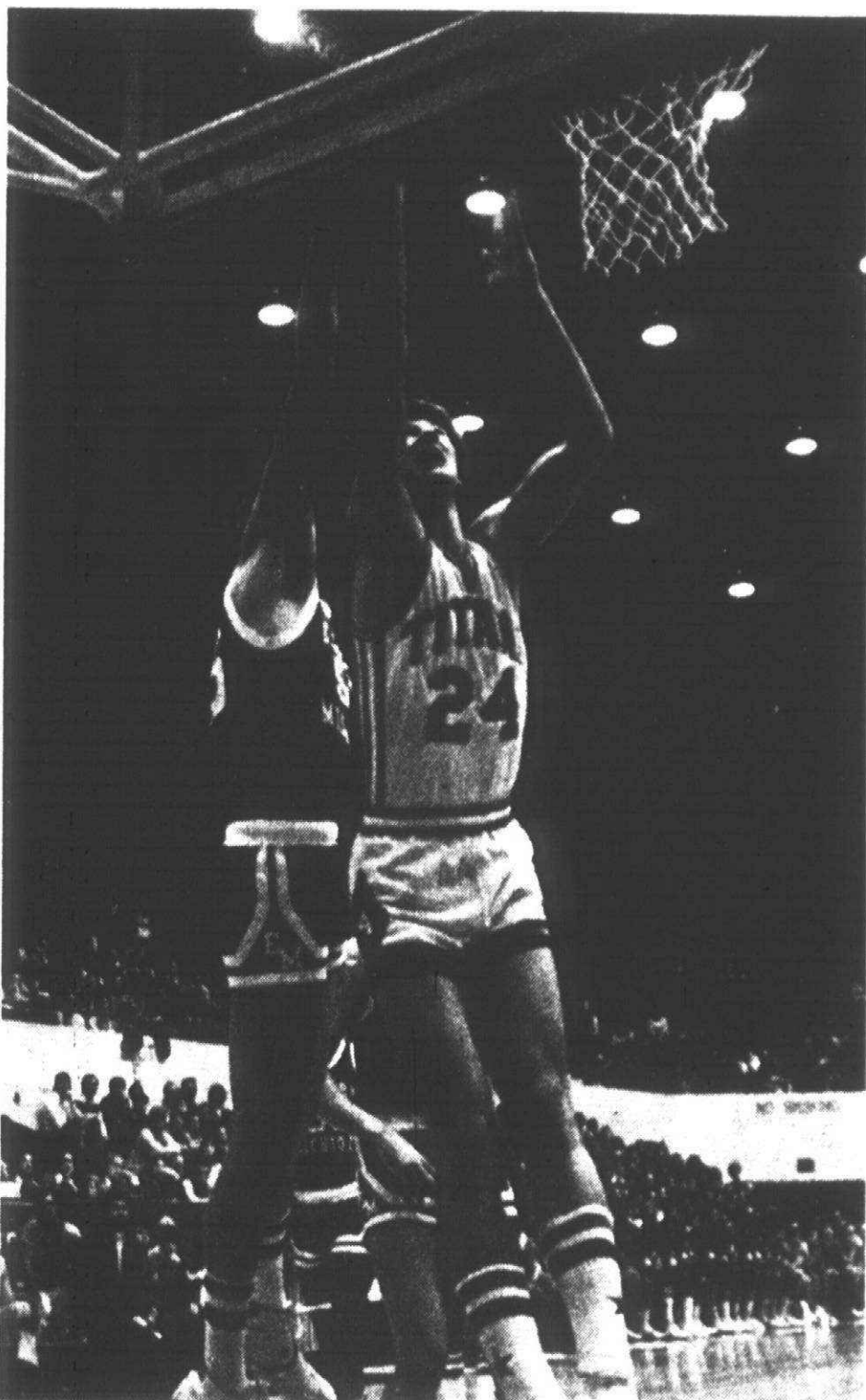
So far this year, Kaseta hasn't had any injury problems except those related to the knee injury suffered last year. "Building the knee into shape wasn't as hard as it would seem. However, I have a tendency to worry about it," Kaseta said.

Kaseta started playing basketball as a child and his interest in it slowly grew to the point where he wanted to play basketball more than any other sport he had been involved with.

Kaseta turned in three solid years of basketball at Livonia Franklin. He scored well over 1,000 points with the Patriots and was one of the team's leading rebounders for the three years he played on the varsity squad.

According to former Franklin coach Bob Visser, Kaseta was one of the leading contributors to help push Franklin to two district titles and one league championship.

"Kevin was an all around player. He was always first on the court for practice and the last one in the lockerroom after practice was over," said Visser.

# Hunter guilty of killing elk

A game-law violator from Livonia is more than \$500 poorer today, and the man who turned him in is \$500 richer.

Gilbert Kuehl, who pleaded guilty to killing a bull elk last month, was ordered by Montmorency District Court Judge John Mach to pay a \$500 fine, plus \$250 in restitution charges and \$100 in court costs. He was also given a 30-day suspended jail sentence, and had his hunting privileges revoked for three years. His rifle and scope were confiscated.

It is illegal for hunters to kill wolves,

moose or any animal on the Michigan endangered species list.

Michael Thayer, the Clarkston resident who provided the tip, was hunting deer near the Canada Creek Ranch in Montmorency County when he saw a three-man party driving a pickup truck out of an area in which he had planned to hunt.

When he entered the area, he found a 12-point elk that had been shot just yards from the road. Thayer took pictures of the carcass, recalled the license number of the truck and turned the information over to Department of Natural Resources officers.

Thayer got his \$500 reward from the

Michigan United Conservation Clubs, which offers the rewards for those supplying information resulting in the conviction of persons killing animals on the endangered species list.

The animal shot by Kuehl was one of four elk killed in the state during the past deer-hunting season.

**HUNTERS AREN'T** the only sportsmen needing reminders.

The recent blasts of Arctic air may have had you snuggled in front of the fireplace, and you probably weren't thinking about working on your boat. But, according to some experts, that's just what you should be doing.

Richard V. Warden, president of the Raytheon Marine Co. of Manchester N.H., said now is the time for one last look.

All easily removed electronic equipment should be unshipped and taken home to a warm, dry place for the winter.

Electronic equipment works best and lasts longer when kept dry, Warden said. When the equipment is in use, its own internal heat is enough to keep the circuitry dry, but winter disuse invites problems for the next season.

Electronic equipment depends on electricity, so check out all wiring, connections and fuse clips for breaks and corrosion. If your wires grew warm during the past season, it's a warning to replace with larger size lines to handle the increased load.

Remember, one of the most important pieces of electronic gear aboard any boat is the radiotelephone. Check the antenna—keep it free of paint—and stand-off insulators.

With crystal sets, each radio channel must be verified for proper frequency and with the newer synthesized, all-channel sets, only the basic frequency must be verified. This is a job for a professional technician who has the proper instruments, know-how and the required Federal Communications Commission's technicians license.

# Grid record shows it Rocks dominate stats

While Plymouth Salem's perfect regular season football record this past fall was the most important statistic of the nine-week stint, a host of supporting individual and team numbers were recently released showing the dominance of the Rocks all season long.

Teamwise, Salem recorded 16 more first downs than their opponents, 106-90.

Although the Rocks were once again outdistanced by their opponents in the passing statistic, 670-280 yards, Salem's potent wishbone attack out-rushed its opponents almost 3-1.

The Rocks totaled an amazing 2,405 net yards on the ground to only 880 for their opponents. This means Salem recorded an average of 270 yards on the ground per game while yielding an average of only 98 yards to the nine rivals.

Salem's punting and kickoff averages were longer than opponents', although the Rocks trailed in return yardage. The Rocks were penalized 29 yards more than opponents, 409-380.

Individually, Kurt Lewis led all receivers with seven catches. John Broderick followed with four. Lewis also led the Rocks with six interceptions. Scott Kappler added four and Mike Genrich stole three.

All-state quarterback and Salem's Most Valuable Player Rich Hewlett led the team in rushing with 901 net yards. Fullback Doug Rowe rambled for 472 yards and halfback Chris Ritchey added 458 yards.

Reserve quarterback Paul Dillon accounted for 287 yards while halfbacks Jim Booker and Bob Waite added 134 and 110 respectively.

Place kicker Dave Basierbe converted on one field goal and made 23 of 26 points after touchdown.

Defensively, linebacker Doug Agnew

led the Rocks with 186 points (two for a solo tackle and one for an assist). End Tony Vitale was second at 107 and safety Lewis added 105.

Tackle Bruce Piper was fourth with 98, Scott Kappler fifth with 90, Mike Skone sixth with 85 and Bob Dasher next with 83.

Dasher, an all-state offensive lineman, led the Rocks in blocking percentage with a score of 90 from his center position.

Individual coaching facts about Salem boss Tom Moshimer shows his record at 40-15 over the past six years—since running the Wishbone offense. This record includes two undefeated regular seasons and two Suburban Eight League championships in the last four years.

The Rocks' last regular season victory over Farmington Harrison was the 100th victory in Moshimer's coaching career at Salem and Dundee High Schools.

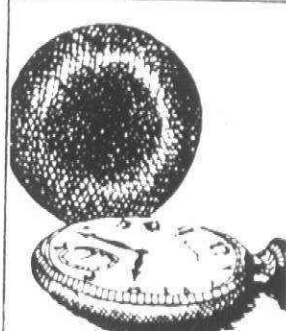

**SEMTA considers fare adjustments**  
By TIM RICHARD

The public will be asked its reaction early next year to a lowering and simplifying of bus and commuter rail fares charged by the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority.

SEMTA General Manager Larry E. Sali told the governing board there are inconsistencies and complexities in the present system, set up as SEMTA acquired several private suburban bus companies over the last decade.

"A mix of equity and simplicity" is the goal, in the words of SEMTA staff member John Sajovec, who analyzed five different rate structures.

Basic assumptions, said Sajovec, are: "For every one per cent decrease in fares, a 0.17 per cent increase in ridership occurs." And on park and ride express lines, "for every one per cent of additional cost... we would accomplish a two per cent increase in ridership."

**THE SEMTA STAFF** has made no firm recommendation yet, but is pondering these alternatives:

- A zone fare structure with a maximum charge of \$1. Base fare would be 50 cents, good for two zones, and fares would increase 10 cents for every additional zone. (There would be reduced student, senior citizen and handicapped fares.) Commuter rail premium would be 20 cents.
- Detroit would be Zone 1, such nearby suburbs as the Grosse Pointes and Dearborn would be Zone 2. Moving north and west on the map, Zone 3 would begin at Eight Mile and the Redford Township eastern border; Zone 4 at Eleven Mile Road and Inkster Road; Zone 5 at Fourteen Mile Road and Farmington Road; Zone 6 at about Wattles Road and Haggerty Road; and Zone 7 at South Boulevard and Canton Center Road.
- Elimination of the 10-cent surcharge at park-and-ride lots. This option was viewed coolly by the staff because: The public is willing to pay the premium for the 15-40 per cent time savings; the runs are costlier; the premium is a good way to recoup the cost of parking facilities; and it is considered unfair to charge general run passengers the same amount as park-and-ride passengers who are getting a better service.
- A flat fare, no matter where in the region one starts and stops. Sali came back from a trip to Atlanta enamored of this idea, but staff members oppose it here: "Flat fares, because of their simplicity, are an attractive fare structure for public transit systems. In the SEMTA service area, however, flat fares are not being recommended by staff due to the size of the area and the fact that flat fares are inequitable when trips of long distances are involved." A 50-cent fare would cause a revenue loss of more than \$1 million but boost ridership 4.4 to 4.8 per cent. A 75-cent fare would reduce both revenue and ridership, staff estimated.
- A system of two or three zones. The problem here would be persons who take short trips but cross. This would require a system of "overlap" zones that could be a confusing night mare for drivers and passengers alike.
- A seven-zone fare with a maximum charge of \$1.25 for the longest ride.

**SAJOVEC'S** analysis report of the SEMTA board concluded:

"Staff does not object to the expenditure of additional monies for fare reduction. However, it is our opinion that service expansion has a greater impact on improving ridership than does fare reduction."

It cited the success of expanded park-and-ride services from Birmingham and West Bloomfield to downtown Detroit in the case for expanded service.

"However," the report said, "considering the potential for increasing fares at a future date, it is recommended that public hearings be held on the zone fare alternatives."

"In addition, staff would present the service increases that could occur for the cost of lower fare structure."

## The Stroller Recalling Sonja

For many years The Stroller looked forward to winter. It wasn't because he loved the snow. Neither did he await the revival of the old-fashioned sleigh rides with keen anticipation. He was long passed the stage of going "belly bumber" down any of the hills in the area.

But winter held a peculiar fascination because when the snow fell he knew that the time was close at hand when Sonja Heine, the little blond Norwegian skater, would grace the ice at Olympia and thrill the many thousands who came from miles not only to see her skate but the manner in which she would capture the gatherings with her dimpled smile.

The Stroller never missed an ice show. There were some years when he saw it twice.

**BUT THIS YEAR** he didn't attend the Ice Follies.

Why? Because during the past several years, as he sat in the big ice palace down on Grand River when the skaters were putting on their colorful extravaganza, he kept waiting for the little blond to come from behind the curtain and do her fancy stepping on the blades. It wasn't that he didn't think the stars such as Peggy Fleming and this year's star, the daughter of the show's owner, had the ability. But he was seeing the ghost of the little Norwegian who started it all some years ago.

It mattered little that Sonja was in that valhalla where all good skaters go. It was just that she had so indelibly written her name in the Ice Follies, that they just didn't seem the same without her.

And maybe it was because The Stroller knew her when she was at her peak and learned to respect her for her business ability as well as her skating.

**THE STORY OF SONJA** and the Ice Follies is one of the finest chapters in the history of sports and show business. And for those who never heard it, or don't remember it, it bears retelling.

After she had won the Olympic title a half dozen times and there were no more worlds to conquer, she decided to try her hand at the movies. She invaded Hollywood with her manager,

a fellow named Hugo Quist, one of her countrymen, who had helped Paavo Nurmi, the great Finish runner, make a fortune—even as an amateur.

Like most newcomers to Hollywood, the movie moguls would have none of her. Most other girls would have left in disgust. Not Sonja. Instead she rented an ice rink out on the coast and invited the movie moguls to be her guests. She wanted to show them her talents. They came. They saw. What's more, they wanted her.

But Sonja wasn't easy to get now. She informed them they would have to pay the price. And she made it high enough. Once she had convinced them and shown her ability, she conceived the idea of an ice show playing across the country.

With that in mind, she signed with Arthur Wirtz, then the man who controlled all of the big ice palaces in the country that were owned by James Norris, the wheat king out of Chicago. She skated in his rinks exclusively—for a price. It often has been said, though never proven, that she got 50 cents of every admission at every show, and she played to capacity houses year after year.

**IT WAS THAT CONTRACT** that brought her to Olympia and gave The Stroller the opportunity to meet her and discuss a charity deal.

It was just before the holidays, as it is this year, and The Stroller, then the sports editor of the Detroit Free Press, conceived the idea of Sonja putting on a matinee for the poorer kids in the city under the annual Ruth Alden drive at the Free Press.

With all the charm she could muster she listened to The Stroller's plan that would not only include a matinee but a Sonja Heine Doll for each of the youngsters in attendance.

After The Stroller presented his plan she smiled her most captivating smile and then said she was sorry, but she just wouldn't be able to do it.

She pointed out that she put so much of herself into each show that a matinee for charity would take too much out of her and it would show in her work that evening.

There was no curt refusal. But she was a business woman who had been brought up by the man who got Paavo Nurmi return steamship fare back to Finland each time he ran. And one week he ran in Chicago, Detroit and

Cleveland on successive nights.

That afternoon in Olympia we parted on the best of terms and there wasn't a year The Stroller didn't make it a point to sit in the Olympia and watch her skate.

There was only one Sonja. There may have been better skaters in recent years. There may have been better artists on the blades. But none of the combined it all—and with the most gracious smile and twinkling eyes the Ice Capades ever have known.

That's why The Stroller didn't attend the Ice Follies this year. It may not have been fair to the performers. But he would have been sitting there waiting for Sonja to come from behind the curtain and lift the crowds to its feet. And not seeing her would have cast a shadow over the entire performance.

## Lobbying bill in Senate

A controversial bill requiring registration of all legislative lobbyists who spend more than \$1,000 a year and quarterly reports is being considered in the Michigan Senate.

The Senate Judiciary Committee scheduled a full day of testimony Dec. 14 on the bill sponsored by Sen. Gary Corbin (D-Clio).

The bill is strongly attacked by a spokesman for government advisors and just as warmly defended by Common Cause, a citizens lobby.

George Bushnell, past president of the State Bar Association, who represents a new group called the Institute of Government Advisors, declared the bill is the product of a "paranoia" gripping the nation in the wake of Watergate.

"The everyday notion is 'No one is to be trusted,' 'Everyone's on the take,' 'Let's take a good, hard look at them.' It makes McCarthyism look pretty tame," Bushnell said.

**MAJOR PROVISIONS** of Sen. Corbin's lobby reform measure include:

- Registration of all lobbyists who

spend \$1,000 or more to lobby in a year.

- Quarterly reporting of all lobbying expenditures.

- An itemized listing of all purchases of food and beverages for public officials, if the value is \$1 or more.

- A prohibition on gifts worth \$10 or more in any one month.

- A prohibition of lobbying by public officials of the body in which they served, for two years after leaving that body.

- Strict penalties, including fines and imprisonment, for violators.

Bushnell said the bill would deny "free and open access" to the legislative process. "It's an inhibiting thing," he said.

Bushnell said that while the intentions of the bill may be good, it would prevent neighborhood groups, civic groups, environmental groups, and health groups, from having any real input into government.

He said he would favor "reasonable action" but could not define what such action would be. He proposed, however, having not only lobbyists file expenditure reports, but having legis-

lators file reports of how much had been spent on them.

**COMMON CAUSE**, a citizens' lobby which has supported the Corbin bill from the beginning, said, "The lack of an effective lobby law in Michigan has allowed lobbyists to operate in secret, and has kept the public in the dark. The public often suspects the worst, and the process of government suffers by the distrust of its citizens."

The Michigan group bolstered its statements by quoting these findings:

- Last year in New York, reports filed with the Secretary of State showed that more than \$3 million was spent on lobbying legislators in Albany.

- In Idaho, nearly \$250,000 was spent on lobbying in the first three months of 1977.

- A comprehensive study of lobbying expenditures in Maryland revealed that nearly \$1.4 million, including the salaries of 66 registered lobbyists, was reported in 1975.

- In 1973, one lobbyist based in California's capital, Sacramento, spent \$27,557 on his clients for food, drinks and entertainment.

## SEMTA orders 189 new buses

Bus riders of SEMTA can look forward to seeing new coaches on about one-third of their rides in 1978.

General Motors Corp. told the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority it will begin production Feb. 20 on its so-called "advance design" buses, of which SEMTA has ordered 189. Total purchase price is \$18.2 million.

The first 70 will go to the Detroit Department of Transportation (D-DOT), which operates with SEMTA funds under a purchase of services agreement. Those are due about March 20.

**THE NEXT** batch of 62 buses will go to SEMTA runs in the suburbs.

"The remaining 56 wheelchair lift-equipped buses do not yet have a firm production schedule," said SEMTA General Manager Larry E. Salei.

SEMTA staff has requested proposals for inspection and quality control services during the production of

the 189 advance design buses," he added.

Altogether, D-DOT will get 111 buses to replace old ones in its fleet of 948 vehicles.

SEMTA will get a total of 78 buses as replacements in its fleet of 240. Thus, 32.5 per cent of the fleet will be new.

The 62 buses without wheelchair lifts will run nearly \$109,000 each. The 16 with lifts at the side rear doors will cost a little more than \$116,000 each.

SEMTA will retire eight buses built in the 1950s, 13 built in 1960, 25 from the 1961 model year, 13 from 1962 and 19 from 1963.

Those were acquired when SEMTA, formed in 1966, purchased several privately-owned and unprofitable suburban bus companies.

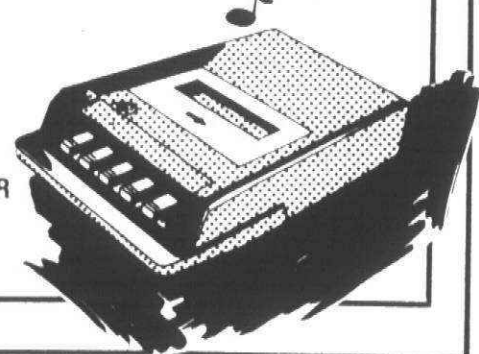
Meanwhile, SEMTA continues to negotiate the acquisition of D-DOT so that all public transportation in the region will be under the wing of a single operator.

## Attorneys dislike new probate bills

If you die without a will (intestate), what happens to your money and possessions?

Does the average person need a lawyer's services to get an estate through probate?

What kind of taxes do the heirs of an estate pay?

These questions, as well as a multitude of others relating to probate law, have been tossed around for more than two years by a state house judiciary subcommittee, the end result being a three-bill revision package passed unanimously by the house.

Many attorneys across the state are taking a dim view of the probate revisions; the Oakland County Bar Association is opposed to the revisions as passed; and one Farmington Hills attorney has reservations about the new code as he understands it.

"Does the average lay person know how to handle the tax implications involved in an estate?" Michael Zipser asks, somewhat rhetorically.

Zipser, a probate and tax attorney with Faintuck, Shwedel, Roether, Wolfram, McDonald, and Zipser, a Farmington Hills law firm, believes some of the probate code revisions will

have far-reaching implications for those involved in probate.

Labeled by some as the most important feature of the bill is a new "independent" or "unsupervised" probate, which would enable a person to legally handle an estate virtually free of court supervision if all heirs consented.

This procedure would require only four basic processes: filing a petition with the court to open the estate; preparing an inventory of estate assets to be distributed to interested parties; publishing one notice for creditors; and filing the closing statement with the court.

All these steps are required of lawyers handling an estate under the present law. The revision would make it possible for the average person to go it alone without an attorney.

That sounds fine, until you consider the implications, Zipser says.

"The bar association is opposed because the supervision the probate court provides is important," he says. "If the wife is the only one who receives the property and no one objects, then maybe it's not a bad situation."

## Should Plymouth learn from Canton?

## Youth's torment vividly shown

"Equis (R), the film version of Peter Shaffer's award-winning play, has been brought to the screen at full intensity by director Sidney Lumet.

Richard Burton plays Dr. Martin Dysart, the conscientious English psychiatrist. His long-accumulated self doubts and professional qualms are catalyzed by a 17-year-old schizophrenic brought to him for treatment because he blinded six horses.

Peter Firth recreates his London stage role as Alan Strang, the strange, tormented youth.

The unique ability of the motion medium, as opposed to the stage, to jolt one with vividly realized scenes and realistic deceptions accounts for two of the movie's outstanding sequences.

Here, the realism, in contrast to the symbolism of the stage performance, is so unnerving as to interrupt the viewer's concentration and cause one to shrink back from gore.

Moreover, the physical repulsion that is aroused weighs against a dispassionate consideration of the values in question. Burton as Dr. Dysart forcefully presents the issues in a discussion with Hesther (Eileen Atkins), the magistrate who directed Strang to him.

Dysart confesses that he envies Alan's real passion and ecstasy, and that he only experiences these feelings vicariously by reading Greek mythologies and visiting the legendary sites like so many other dull tourists.

Basically, Dysart is questioning the pedestrianism of normality. How can he take away the boy's private world, he wonders, when the best he can offer in exchange is a public and ordinary one?

THE LIQUID amber voice of Burton as Dysart makes his arguments persuasive. That they don't convince has nothing to do with Burton's performance; it is excellent. However, the realism of the film assaults the viewer whereas the formalism of the stage production maintains more of an aesthetic distance. This is a matter of overall artistic interpretation; each has its virtues.

As for individual performances, only Jenny Agutter's misses the mark. She appears too attractive and too sophisticated to be credible in her advances toward the stable boy.

The other performances are all solid and supportive. Joan Plowright is especially noteworthy as Dora Strang, Alan's mother. She wins sympathy for a character whose starched values might otherwise discourage it.

By the end of "Equis," Alan, Dysart and the audience are left limp. It is a spell-binding and open-ended film that leaves us with the problem of the healer obliged to heal the patient of his sickness, even when that sickness is more fascinating than health.

## 'Table Manners:' A deft comedy

How the British look at love and life is explored in "Table Manners," a deft comedy by Alan Ayckbourn continuing through Dec. 18 at Meadow Brook Theatre.

A fine cast of six players share the stage, with the story centering around Annie (Mary Gallagher), the plain, unmarried sister who cares for an ailing mother in the family's lovely, old country home.

All of the scenes take place in "Annie's dining room," where Annie is joined by her brother and his wife and her sister and husband, plus the local, unmarried veterinarian. The mother is never seen.

"Table manners," or "company manners," never last long when a family gets together, despite Sarah's (Barbara Sommers') efforts to keep everyone acting at their civilized best.

ANNE IS MOST comfortable in jeans and sweater, and Mary Gallagher gives this portrayal an easy, down-to-earth approach. She performs with a naturalness that is appealing, even when she jazzes up her appearance with a flowered dress and high heels.

"Tarted up" is how Sarah describes this look to husband Reg, but then you never can win with Sarah. Ms. Sommers makes a nice progression in her role, with Sarah first appearing strong and firm, gradually displaying edginess and fussbudgetry that can be exasperating to everyone, particularly Reg.

As Reg, Michael Cullen is hearty and blusters in what we have come to expect is typical English fashion. He seems a good-hearted bloke, is nice to

Annie as well as Sarah, and doesn't appear to deserve his wife's nagging.

Annie is pining away for Tom, the vet, who is another English character we all know and love. He's a dense fellow always so cheerful he's hard to get mad at. Handsome Peter McRobbie does him well, in hacking jacket and jodphers.

Norman is one of those people everyone knows, who never behaves sensibly. He's an annoying cut-up, somehow is tolerated and manages to get his own way with surprising regularity.

ERIC TAVARIS comes on strong as Norman, and you can see the wheels spin in Norman's head each time he manages another bit of mischief.

Norman is an assistant librarian, supported by his smart, bitchy wife Ruth (Marion Bransch), a businesswoman who knows him through and through.

Ms. Bransch gives the most keen-edged portrayal in the play, making us understand some of the reasons she keeps Norman around.

At times, the characterizations seem a little out of synch. The men, Norman, Tom and Reg, all are broadly played. The women, Ruth, Annie and Sarah, are more realistic and incisive.

But together they make harmonious comedy. The plot's about an illicit weekend Annie has planned to spend with Norman. Not wanting to give the plot away, enough said.

Much of the discussion and comedy takes place at the family's meals, and there are lots of jokes about serving soup and eating salad. These are bits that are amusing, if not devastatingly funny.

## Juvenile justice code change suggested

A message is being carried today to state legislators in Lansing that Wayne County commissioners oppose removing status offenses—running away and truancy—from the state juvenile justice code.

Delivering the word will be Mary Dumas of Livonia, a member of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

In preparing the resolution, commissioners were responding to a suggested change in the code made by the Juvenile Justice Service Commission. The majority of the state commission members want to remove status offenders from the authority of the courts and turn them over to social service agencies. Any services given to these youngsters would then be voluntary on their part, with parents and school not permitted involvement.

Judge Y. Gladys Barsamian of the juvenile division of the Wayne County Probate Court has said that removing these offenses from the code would "undermine the family unit and end compulsory education as we know it today."

"We are concerned that if there isn't some sanction of the court involved in these offenses, that those most in need of help won't be reached," said Mrs. Dumas, who went to Lansing to address the subcommittee of the judiciary committee of the house of representatives.

"We recognize the need for revision of the code, but not in the status offense portion. We also know there is

a need to provide alternatives for status offenders that would not involve secure detention."

**MRS. DUMAS** HAS already delivered to an ad hoc committee a tape containing remarks made by county citizens at five area hearings on the proposed code changes.

At the hearings held at Schoolcraft College sponsored by the county commission, most speakers avoided altogether the parts of the code changes dealing with the establishment of a separate department for children and youth. Nor did anyone speak to the recommendation for setting up a family court.

Instead, those giving testimony to commissioners honed in on the status offense question, all of them opposing the new plan to make it voluntary on the part of truants and runaways to accept or reject counseling or rehabilitation.

"Many times when we deal with a runaway or truant," reported Patrolman Barry Sherman of Livonia police, "we talk to the parents and find there is a problem at home."

"So we recommend that the child go to Hawthorn Center for a counseling evaluation. Parents are more inclined to seek counseling for their children if it is suggested by the police as an alternative to becoming involved with the court."

In an interview after the hearing, he said police would not be able to arrest a child for these offenses. Instead the youngsters would be turned over to the state Department of Social Services, and it would be up to the child himself

to decide whether he would participate in any counseling or rehabilitation.

"Under the proposed change, the police would have nothing to do with runaways and truants," continued Sherman, "and the child would be free to leave home and school at any age, and go anywhere."

He noted: "It would eliminate compulsory education. There would be a tremendous increase in illiteracy. Most kids require that extra push from the compulsory education law to finish school."

Referring to the commission that offered this and other suggestions for the juvenile justice code, Sullivan said: "It is beyond me how a commission appointed by the governor and made up of responsible adults could spend so much of the taxpayer's money to combine their wisdom and experience, with the end result being a 600-page recommendation of garbage."

**ALSO PRESENTING** testimony at the meeting was Sherman's fellow Livonia policeman, James Pardo of the Youth Bureau. In his talk and in an interview that followed, Pardo indicated that at present the judge of the juvenile court has the authority to exhaust all possibilities of counseling and rehabilitation before he is required to turn the child over to the department of social services, which then has sole control over him.

Pardo said he finds the social service department unresponsive to situations of this kind.

## PCAC awards grants to 4 area teachers

Four Plymouth Canton school teachers have been awarded grants by the Plymouth Community Arts Council through the Teacher Projects Assistance Program initiated this year. Sandra M. Lanse, Carol Guregian, Ruth Tonner and Christopher Gabel each received \$250.

The aim of the program is to encourage teachers to devise arts activities for general curriculum development and to explore existing resources in the school and the community. Teachers were invited to apply to the PCAC for funds to be used in implementing innovative arts activities which would be impossible without financial assistance.

Applications were reviewed by a committee consisting of Kathy Wood, staff administrator of the PCAC; Dorothy Magee, former president of the council; and Sam Ulsaker, administrative assistant for research program and federal projects for Plymouth Canton schools.

"**THE DECISION** was a difficult one," said Mrs. Wood, committee chairman. "Fifteen applications were received and most of them had a great deal of merit. We were very pleased with the response for the first time."

Sandra Lanese, a learning specialist at Fiegel Elementary School, plans to use her grant money for a project involving photography and poetry. A small group of students will produce approximately 20 high-quality photographs of various subjects in the Plymouth community.

"These students may then choose to write poetry to complement their photos, or invite other Fiegel students to do so," Ms. Lanese explained. "The end product will be a booklet of poetry and photography."

Photography also is involved in Christopher Gabel's plans for his grant money.

Gabel, an art teacher at Pioneer Middle School, will make use of cinema in helping students explore light, line, color and movement. The students will design and produce a 30-second to one-minute animated sequence.

**CAROL GUREGIAN**, a math and science teacher at Pioneer, plans to incorporate art with nature study by sponsoring a schoolwide contest for sixth grade science students.

According to Mrs. Guregian, the PCAC funds will help provide materials "for drawing, painting and clay modeling of plants or animals."

Ruth Tonner, humanities teacher at Plymouth Salem High School, will use her grant money to purchase records and tape recordings to be used in conjunction with courses in the humanities.

"Recordings also are needed for programming 'Echo: Humanities on the Air' which is a weekly one-hour program featuring discussion on the arts, readings from plays, poetry and the novel and examples drawn from almost every musical genre," Mrs. Tonner said.

"Children are looking for discipline and guidelines, and we must maintain our control over runaways and truants."

**A REDFORD** Township woman, whose child had been made a ward of the state, said the child was then turned over to the department of social services.

"They did nothing for him," she said in an interview. "They said he didn't have to go to school if he didn't want to, and he kept running away. The courts didn't screw me, the department of social services did."

The individual who has probably spoken more often than anyone throughout the area on the status offender question was also at the hearing. Judge Barsamian reiterated her position against the code change.

The Plymouth resident said she serves on the commission which made the recommendation to drop status offenses from the juvenile code.

"I am one of the members who filed a minority report," she said. "Our report doesn't dispute the need for a change in the code. We dispute a plan that is based on speculative data. Data was totally undependable."

"The removal of status offenses would have the effect of no longer requiring a child of any age to go to school."

She added that a transfer of authority from the court where there is accountability, to services that are voluntary is not the solution. "Accountability is the key factor here," she declared.

# Elderly life doesn't have to be lonely

"Women have a longer life expectancy than men," says Carol S. Hollenshead. "But this means they are also far more likely to be widowed during their later years, and they have fewer options for remarrying," says Ms. Hollenshead, development coordinator of the Institute of Gerontology at the University of Michigan.

"The majority of men over the age of 65 are married, according to the national census, compared with only one out of three women at that age. However, these years alone can represent new freedoms and opportunities for women to establish their own identity and independence," she reported in an interview in the December issue of "International Altruism," a monthly magazine for business and professional women.

"Women tend to devote much of their lifetime to caring for other people—first, their own children, and during the middle years, often their own parents," says Ms. Hollenshead.

"In old age, these responsibilities decrease, and they can begin to pursue their own interests. They can be selfish, in a healthy way."

TO ENSURE their independence, women should look into what their incomes will be from social security, pensions, insurance policies and the like, says Ms. Hollenshead.

If their husbands are covered by a pension fund, they should investigate whether they are included under survivors' benefits. An effort should be made to pay off large bills before retirement, and to practice living on a reduced budget.

"In addition to an adequate income, the most important prerequisite to an enjoyable retirement is good health," she notes. "Many diseases and disabilities common in old age can be checked if they are caught early enough; others can be controlled and compensated for."

It is as essential to maintain good mental health as physical health, Ms. Hollenshead notes. Quoting U-M gerontologist Woodrow Hunter, she advises retirees to "adapt to changing circumstances; compromise when necessary and look forward to the future."

"Whether or not you have problems is not the issue; it is how those problems are handled: with a sense of personal responsibility or a tendency to

blame others; with a feeling of confidence or a premonition of certain defeat.

"There are many resources in most communities to help persons with major decisions," Ms. Hollenshead said. "Organizations of older people, social workers, churches and synagogues; legal aid societies and community mental health centers are only a few."

"AND FINALLY, don't withdraw from activities or people. Develop new interests and share them with young as well as old friends."

Finding and maintaining friendships can be difficult for the older woman who lives alone, Ms. Hollenshead concedes. For many working people, the job is the center of most social contacts. How does this resource get replaced after retirement?

"Before they stop working, women might assess their own interests and look for new ways to explore them," Ms. Hollenshead says. "Perhaps they have a special talent or skill that might translate well into an important volunteer capacity. Private non-profit agencies, political parties and candidates, hospitals, libraries, churches and cultural organizations all have need for a wide variety of volunteer services."

"Older people have much to teach as well as learn. In many communities, retired women are teaching traditional crafts such as quilting, needlework and bobbin lace making. Some schools have enlisted the help of retired persons as tutors. And the rising interest in genealogy has awakened a new respect for the elderly in some quarters and a desire for preserving one's own heritage."

"In sum, today's generation of retiring women have far more going for them in terms of social outlets, medical care, learning opportunities and other resources than did their counterparts of a decade or two ago," Ms. Hollenshead says.

"And reflecting on what a woman in her 60s has experienced—four wars, the Depression, tremendous technological advances and the dramatic economic and social changes which have transpired with each decade—we would have to conclude that such a woman is extremely strong and adaptive."
