## Boom is lowered on Anchor Inn

The owners of the Anchor Inn Bar in Pinckney, an establishment where seven minors were served alcohol on July 23 before six of them were killed in a car crash, have had their liquor license revoked by order of Liquor Control Commissioner Edward Weist.

The owners of the Anchor Inn, Robert Welch and John Wuestenberg, have until Jan. 2 to appeal the license removal. Under the LCC order, it is possible for the bar to reopen if the license is "transferred to person or persons approved by the commission" within 90 days of Dec. 12.

In a separate action, the bar owners have been named co-defendants in a \$2 million lawsuit filed by the parents of one of the teens killed in the car crash.

Jack E. Cook of Sheridan in

Plymouth—father of the late Bill Cook, 17—filed a civil complaint last week that seeks damages from the bar owners and parents of the car's driver, Bradley Wilson, 17, of Plymouth, who also was killed in the accident.

The civil suit seeks \$1 million in damages from the bar owners and \$1 million from the Wilsons, plus court costs, interest and attorney fees.

IN THE LAWSUIT, it is alleged that Mr. and Mrs. Wilson "negligently entrusted vehicle to Bradley L. Wilson, who defendants knew... or should have known had a bad driving record and propensity for drinking and was likely to be drinking on night of accident and shouldn't have been entrusted with motor vehicle on the highways."

The owners of the bar, the complaint

alleges, were negligent in hiring employees who were "careless" in serving people who were under the legal drinking age and appeared to be intoxicated.

"Defendants failed to require that identification be shown by a group of young men on the premises who were not obviously of drinking age," states the complaint.

Carl Ranno, attorney for bar owners Wuestenberg and Welch, did not contest 14 charges against his clients at a Nov. 29 hearing before the LCC. Seven charges were for selling alcohol to minors and seven charges were for allowing seven minors to consume alcohol on the premises of the Anchor Inn.

When asked why the Wilsons were included as defendants in the lawsuit, Jack Cook replied, "It's not my idea. I

suppose it has something to do with (collecting from) AAA, the insurance carrier."

Cook said he was acting on the advice of his attorney, Sheldon Erlich, of the Lopatin, Miller, Binds and Freedman law firm in Detroit.

Cook said learning that the parents of another boy killed in the crash were named in the lawsuit "is as much news to me as it is to you. I lost a son, but I don't know how you put a price on that."

Mrs. Cook said earlier that she was pleased the bar owners lost their liquor license and indicated the bar owners were the main targets of the damage suit. "There is a reason for everything that is being done legally," she said.

BLOOD SAMPLES from the six accident victims were analyzed by the Michigan Department of Health last August. The blood sample of the Cooks' son was reportedly destroyed during transport to the laboratory in Lansing because of "an apparent mistake in packaging," according to a Livingston County Sheriff's spokesman.

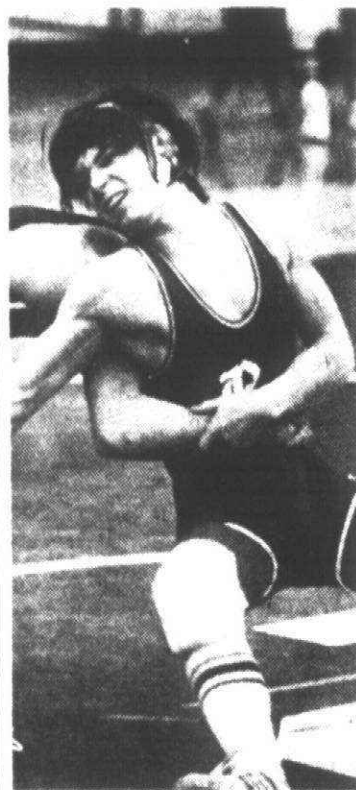
Aside from Cook, only one of the six youths' blood samples showed an alcohol content below the legal intoxication level of 0.07. Wilson, the driver, had a reported 0.15 level, the highest of the group.

Attempts to contact Mr. and Mrs. John Wilson for comment on the lawsuit were unsuccessful.

## Police arrest two men in Little Caesar stickup

Canton's Little Caesar pizzeria must have been born under a bad sign, and we're not talking about the revolving Roman with the pizza pie on a spear.

Early Sunday morning the problem-plagued pizzeria was relieved of \$88 when two "weird acting" men held up the store with a stiletto at 1:38 a.m. and threatened to use a gun.

Minutes later, two men were apprehended and charged with armed robbery by officers from the Canton Township and Wayne County police departments. The money was recovered.

On Nov. 1, the pizza parlor was damaged when three sticks of dynamite, allegedly placed on the building by 17-year-old Robert Jay Blackburne, exploded against the rear wall.

Charged with armed robbery in Sunday's robbery were Michael R. Spears, 24, last known address Carson City, Nev., and Harry J. Mates, 39, of 11625 Butternut, Plymouth. Both are being held in Wayne County Jail on \$50,000

bond set by District Judge Larry Emmert.

THE CRIMINALS' TAKE would have been much greater than just \$88, according to store manager Gary Haney, if he had not become suspicious of the two men who, he said, spent a long time loitering in the lobby, telling employees they were waiting for friends to arrive before they placed their pizza order.

"I kind of felt it (a robbery) was gonna go down," store manager Haney said. "I threw \$900 from the register into a dish in the back room, to be on the safe side."

Those suspicions were soon confirmed when Spears reportedly produced a stiletto and told Haney that his friend, Mates, had a gun in the pocket along with his hand.

"The guy with a knife just started pulling money from out of the drawer," Haney said. "He kept an eye on me, so I don't think he even realized he wasn't hardly getting anything.

He probably grabbed a wad of ones and thought he really had something."

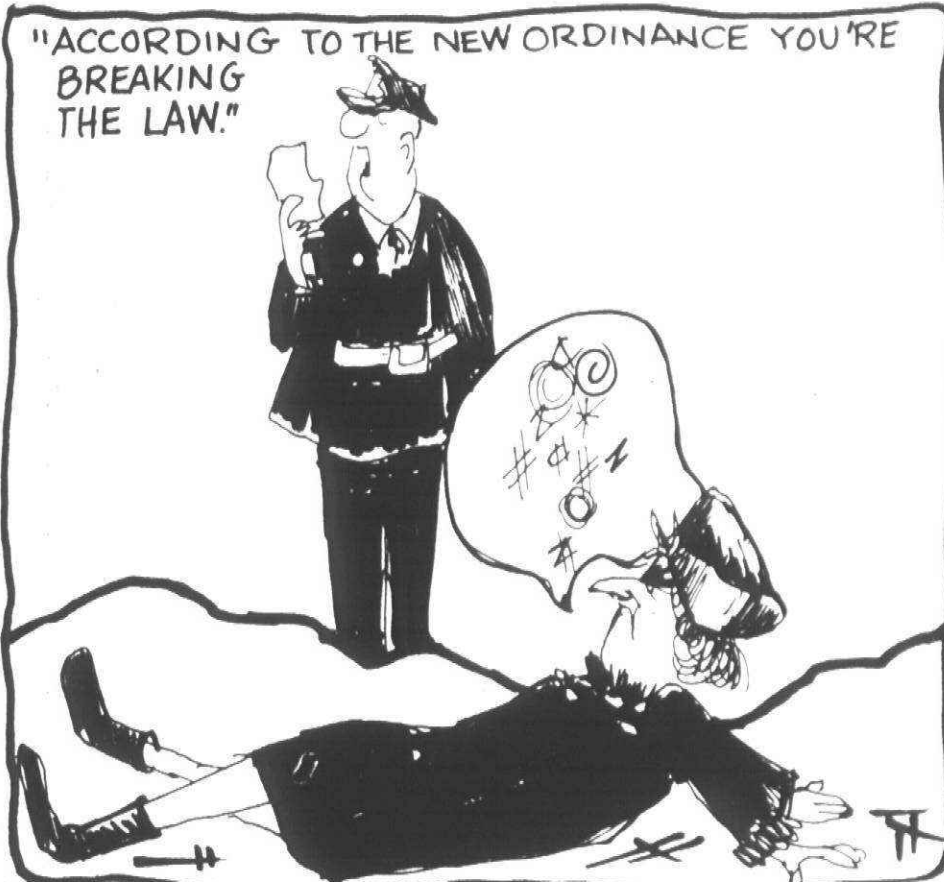
Canton police cruising in the area responded to the robbery call phoned in by the employees. Canton Ptl. George Sharp and Jim Hanna spotted a 1969 Ford with its hood raised on the east side of the building at Ford and Lilley.

Two men ran from the disabled car, according to police, and attempted to force Dwayne Denotter, of Whitmore Lake out of his car to make their getaway.

AWARE THAT police were in pursuit, the pair ran west on Ford Road and disappeared behind the Egg Castle restaurant.

Meanwhile, Deputies Ed Rasmussen and John Clark, who were eating in a doughnut shop next to the pizzeria, joined the Canton cops in their search.

Spears was discovered hiding behind a dumpster and Mates was found a few minutes later in the field behind the restaurant, police said.

## Everything from psychics to smut in proposed law

Badmouthing The Man upstairs or calling your wife a blankety-blank in a public place could earn you a 90-day stay in the clinker and a misdemeanor charge under a proposed ordinance introduced to the Canton board last week.

The disorderly persons ordinance covers everything from obscene language to window peeping to the sale of drug paraphernalia in an effort to give Canton police some legal leverage over rowdy characters and shady entrepreneurs.

Although township Clerk John Flodin doubts that every section of the ordinance will be rigorously enforced, he says the proposed law is needed to speed up the law enforcement process and halt time-consuming trips to the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office for arrest warrants.

WALTER J. GUTH, the township attorney who drafted the proposed ordinance, says "99 and nine-tenths per cent" of the disorderly conduct prohibited by the proposed law is also prohibited by a variety of state acts, many of which are seldom enforced.

Although Canton police have never prosecuted anyone for mutilating tombs in a cemetery or wearing their birthday suit in public, Guth says the lack of a disorderly persons ordinance on the township's books forces police to ask the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office for an arrest warrant should they meet up with the disorderly individual.

If the township board approves the proposed ordinance, police would be enforcing local law instead of a state act. That means police could ask a township attorney—instead of the county prosecutor—for an arrest warrant.

"The police can meet a township attorney and come up with a yes or no answer on a warrant in 15 minutes," Guth explained. "The Wayne County prosecutor is a very busy man, and asking him for a warrant can be a very time-consuming process."

The 29-page draft of the proposed ordinance prohibits 162 different types of "disorderly" activity. But Flodin, who heads the township's police commission, says he "doubts" that Canton police will be peeking into every nook

and cranny to make sure everyone is minding their Ps and Qs.

"WE WON'T CRACK down unless there's really a reason to," Flodin said when asked about provisions in the ordinance that prohibits the sale of drug paraphernalia and magazines like "Playboy" and "Hustler."

"But if the police get into a bad situation where a guy's causing a scene or disturbance, this ordinance is a means to incarcerate that person. I believe it will be used in that manner," Flodin said, "rather than seeing how many tickets we can write."

Flodin believes provisions of the proposed law would act as a dose of preventative medicine and discourage entrepreneurs from establishing adult book stores and massage parlors.

Although the township's administration and Police Chief Walter MacGregor favor enactment of a disorderly person law, the ordinance drafted by Guth could take some time to get on the books.

The township board unanimously tabled the document last Tuesday and ordered Guth to revise some sections in the proposed law after Trustee Eugene Daley, former sheriff's deputy, noted some discrepancies between the township ordinance and state law. Possession of a sawed-off shotgun is a felony under a state statute, for example, but only a misdemeanor under the proposed township law.

ACCORDING TO GUTH, the proposed ordinance includes provisions of disorderly person laws already on the books in Livonia, Westland and Garden City. Violations of the act are a misdemeanor, punishable by a maximum \$100 fine, 90 days in jail or both.

Besides prohibiting obscene language and public nudity, the mutilation of tombstones and the sale of marijuana cigarette papers, the proposed ordinance also prohibits:

- Calling a person on the telephone and refusing to carry on any conversation once a connection is made.
- Fortune telling for profit.
- Pretending to be a deaf, blind or physically handicapped person in order to obtain money or assistance.
- Mutilate the American flag or the flag of the State of Michigan.
- Sniffing glue to cause a state of "intoxication, euphoria and excitement."

## 45-15 plan is working at Miller

Miller Elementary School's 45-15 year-round scheduling has made it a good place for children to learn and for teachers to teach, according to the evaluation report on two years of the 45-15 scheduling there.

Plymouth-Canton Community Schools administrators have completed the study of the pilot program at Miller from July 1975 to August 1977.

The evaluation report was presented to school trustees at Monday night's meeting of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education. The report evaluated program information, student achievement, cost comparison, and the impact of 45-15 on education.

The report also indicated that 45-15 scheduling was economically efficient as well as being sound from a curriculum standpoint.

THE SCHEDULING at Miller was changed in 1975 to house 33 per cent more students than the building would normally hold with a September-to-June calendar.

The boundary for Miller's attendance area hasn't changed since 1974, and the net enrollment impact of 45-15 is that Miller now houses more than 900 students in a building which otherwise would only accommodate 690 pupils.

With a 45-15 calendar, students attend schools for nine weeks (45 school days) and then have a three-week (15 days) vacation, throughout the year.

Students and teachers are on four tracks, and only three tracks are in school at any one time.

The curriculum was revised by the introduction of 45-15 but nine-week blocks of time have provided better organization and pre-planning by teachers, explains Sam Ulsaker, administrative assistant for research, program planning and federal projects. With year-round school, he adds, less "review" time is needed because of the frequent and shorter vacation periods.

TEACHERS FIND that the four nine-week blocks of time provide a

## 2 factories build locally

Two new factories are interested in settling down to business in Canton Township.

A new company known as Canton Machine Products received the green light to begin construction at Tuesday night's meeting of the Canton Board of Trustees. The firm, owned by Dan Bryan, received site plan approval the previous night from the planning commission and was placed on the township agenda the following night in a special concession to speed the project along, according to Clerk John Flodin.

Architect for the factory, Ted Dabresse, told trustees the building will have more than 55,000 square feet of

space and will be built in Canton's Industrial Park, south of Joy and west of Haggerty. Dinsmore Realty has been handling negotiations with the township.

Township officials are encouraging business to settle in Canton to expand the community's largely-residential tax base. Trustees have formed an economic development corporation (EDC) to entice business with tax-free revenue bonds. But neither of the two factories discussed Tuesday are included in the EDC plan.

The other business interested in

## Gasoline station robbers nabbed

Plymouth police pulled a page from "Starsky and Hutch" last week in nabbing two men who were attempting to rob a gas station attendant at knifepoint.

Douglas Byron Jones, 22, of Northville, and Daniel Richard Guy, 33, of Farmington, were arraigned last Thursday in 35th District Court on charges of armed robbery. Jones was arraigned on two counts.

Both men are being held in the Plymouth City Jail in lieu of \$50,000 bond. Their pre-trial examination is scheduled for today.

Police said that when they apprehended the two men at the Speedway gas station on Main early Thursday morning, Jones had a knife at the throat of the attendant. Guy was driving the getaway car, according to police.

"It was a good, smooth operation," said Police Chief Timothy Ford. "The officers waited until it was too late to take a hostage, then they moved in for the arrest."

the station had been robbed the night before, and officers had the place under surveillance in case the robbers decided to come back again.

Michael Wilkin, the station attendant, told police Jones was the man who held the knife on him both times. He was unable to identify the second man.

"The first night they got away clean with almost \$200," Ford said. "So just on a hunch we had an unmarked car set up at the station the next night."

Wilkin told police that on Wednesday morning two men came to the office and asked to use the restroom. He said the man with Jones stayed behind him and out of the light and could not be seen clearly.

After using the restroom, Wilkin said, Jones came back in the office, put a knife to his throat and took the money in the cash register. Then he left the building on foot.

The next morning at about 1:19, the events repeated themselves, Wilkin said. The men asked to use the restroom, and then Jones came back to the office, grabbed Wilkin from behind and held a knife at his throat and demanded money.

This time, however, the police were waiting.

"It was just like on TV," Ford said. "Curtis Hill, who was in the unmarked car, radioed in that the robbery was going down right then."

"The regular patrol car pulled into the station and mouse-trapped the getaway car. The guy who was in the office with the knife came running out and tried to get away, but another car cut him off. They didn't know what was going on. And we had them rounded up before anybody got hurt."

# Fundamental skills on rise in local schools

An evaluation of the state assessment tests indicates an improvement in skill levels by students in all schools of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

For the first time in the history of the state testing program here, the district doesn't have any schools categorized as "high need." A high need school is defined as one in which less than half of the students attained 75 per cent or more of the test objectives.

All of the schools in Plymouth-Canton have been categorized by the state as either "stable" or "improving."

According to state guidelines, an individual school is classified as "improving" if it meets these criteria:

An increase of five per cent or more in the number of students attaining 75-100 per cent of the objectives; a five per cent decrease in number of students attaining 0-24 per cent of the objectives.

A school is classified as "declining" if there has been a decrease of five per cent or more in the number of students attaining 75-100 per cent of the objectives or a five per cent increase or more in the number attaining 0-24 per cent of the objectives.

A school which isn't classified as either improving or declining is categorized as stable.

THE MICHIGAN Educational Assessment Program (MEAP) is a

series of tests in reading and mathematics at the fourth and seventh grades given last September.

This is the ninth year the MEAP tests have been given in Plymouth-Canton and throughout the state.

The classifications given individual school buildings—whether improving, declining or stable—are based on students' test performance for a two-year period.

An analysis of the test results done by Sam Ulsaker, administrative assistant for research, planning programs and federal projects, shows an increase in student performance in both reading and mathematics since 1974.

In reading, almost 56 per cent of the

fourth graders attained 75 to 100 per cent of the reading objectives. This proportion rose to almost 61 per cent in 1975, 67 per cent in 1976 and to 72 per cent in 1977.

In mathematics, about 80 per cent of the fourth graders attained 75-100 per cent of the objectives in 1974 and this performance rose as follows: almost 84 per cent in 1975, 89 per cent in 1976 and almost 85 per cent in 1977. (The decline from 1976 to 1977, Ulsaker noted, was due to some new questions on metrics being added to the math section of the test.)

For seventh graders, almost 68 per cent obtained 75-100 per cent of the reading objectives in 1974 compared to 70 per cent in 1975, almost 70 per cent

in 1976 and 78 per cent in 1977.

In mathematics, almost 64 per cent of seventh graders reached 75-100 per cent of objectives in 1974 compared to almost 69 per cent in 1975, 67 per cent in 1976, and almost 61 per cent in 1977.

The statewide proportion of students at the 75-100 per cent level is: Fourth grade reading, 61 per cent; fourth grade mathematics, 77 per cent; seventh grade reading, 66 per cent; seventh grade mathematics, 47 per cent.

## Hospital staff in limbo on jobs

Confusion reigns in the personnel office on the grounds of Wayne County General Hospital in Westland as workers there cope with the transfer of the county psychiatric facility to state operation and funding.

A spokesman for the office said about 380 jobs are affected by the transfer. That eventually will mean a decrease of about 325 jobs from the county payroll. A total of about 550 jobs could be affected, however, if the Reuther Long Term Care facility is eventually closed.

"The situation is very confusing because of the extension of operations at the Reuther building," said the spokesman. "Everything is in a state of flux. It changes hourly."

Faced with a \$13 million operating deficit and unable to agree with the state on funding for the psychiatric hospital, the county board of commissioners approved takeover of the hos-

pital by the state, which occurred Dec. 1.

Although the exact number of jobs, level of operation and funding to be provided by the state at the psychiatric hospital now housed in building D is unknown, county personnel officials do know that 286 employees at the facility have been offered jobs by the state.

Of that number, nearly 85 have accepted the job offers and another 30 are expected to accept them by Friday. By Monday all employees must either accept jobs with the state, be reassigned within the county or be laid off.

Handling personnel operations for the State Department of Mental Health are Ivan Estes and his assistant, Ted Stein. The state also is offering jobs to employees at the Reuther and general hospitals, both located on

the same grounds as the psychiatric facility.

About 40 non-medical employees from the general hospital budget were laid off Dec. 1. Those employees included personnel from skilled trades, equipment operators, general administration and general services.

Some of those who were laid off were later reassigned within the county, which means they "bumped" other county employees out of their jobs by having a greater seniority rating.

A spokeswoman for the personnel office added that each bumping procedure actually ends up affecting three jobs in a kind of domino effect.

Operational and maintenance workers at the hospital complex are unionized as members of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME).

An estimated 150 people will be tak-

ing demotions in order to continue working for the county. All are hospital attendants who are accepting custodial and food service positions.

The demotions will be reflected in pay cuts. Those psychiatric hospital employees who accept jobs with the state will be "redlined," meaning they will work for the state at the same pay rate they received from the county. However, their pay rate will remain at the same level until other state employees working in the same classification reaches that level.

While the county payroll will be reduced by 325 jobs when the confusion ends, the exact number of workers to be laid off won't be known until Monday because some employees will either bump other workers or fill positions which now are vacant.

Meanwhile, many employees are unsure what their job future holds.

## Planning body loses Matzo, gains Shefferly

Citing "philosophical differences in planning concepts" with present members of Canton's Planning Commission, A.D. "Gus" Matzo has resigned from the advisory board less than a month before his three-year term expired.

Matzo was reportedly disappointed in the planning commission's approval of The Center, a \$5 million recreation complex proposed for the corner of Haggerty and Ford roads. Appointed by former supervisor Robert Greenstein, Matzo gained the reputation among some of his fellow board members as being opposed to new development.

The Canton Township Board of Trustees Tuesday approved Robert J. Shefferly of 44782 Hanford to replace Matzo in a three-year term that expires Dec. 31, 1980.

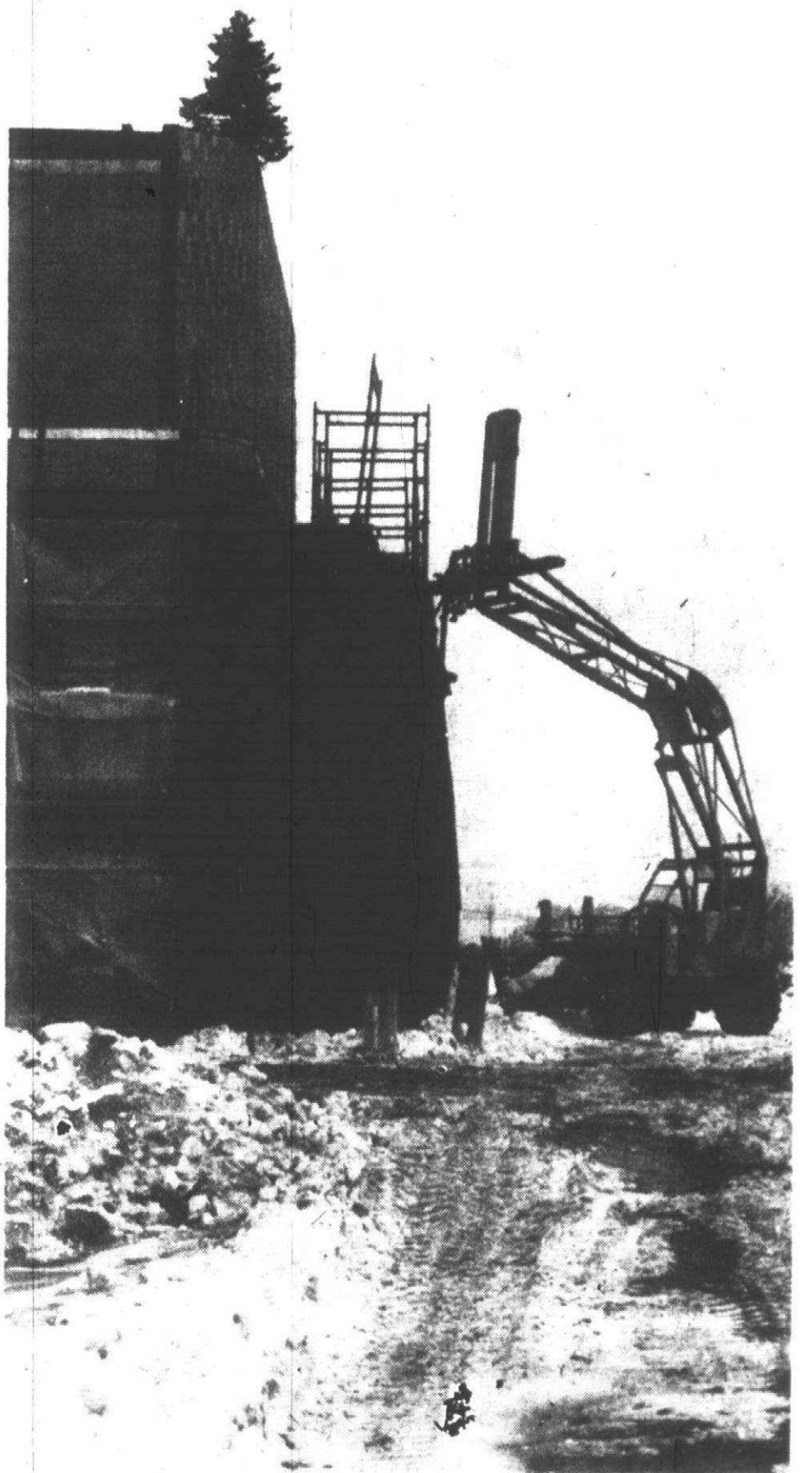
Shefferly, administrative assistant to the national advertising manager at the Detroit News, served as a planning commissioner in Canton for about five months in 1974. He resigned when Supervisor Robert Greenstein took office.

"During Mr. Greenstein's campaign, he stated he wanted all of the planning commissioners to resign if he was

elected," Shefferly said in a letter to trustees. "I agree with the philosophy that the leader elected by the voters should have a free hand so that he can be judged on his accomplishments at the next election."

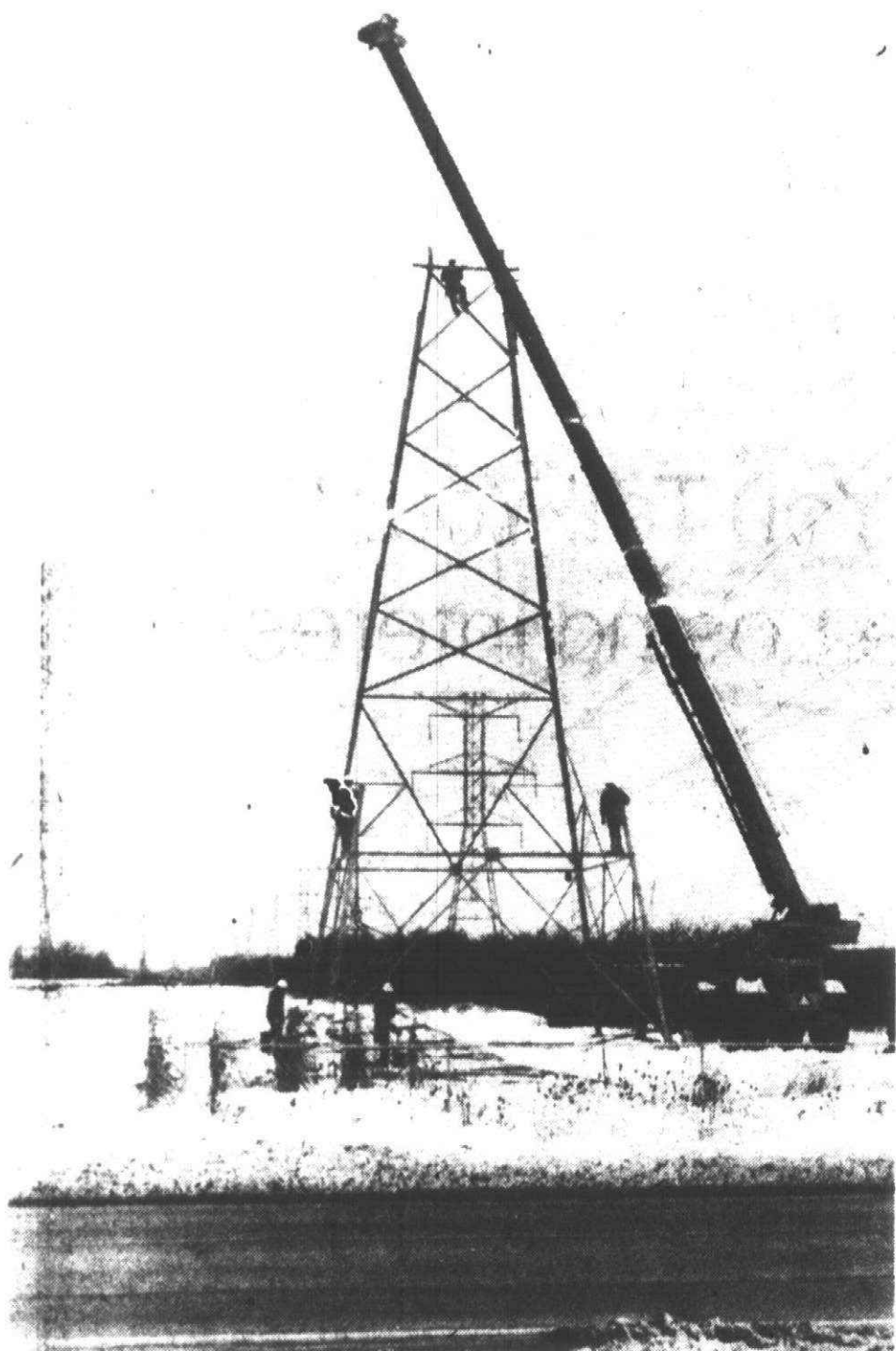
Shefferly received unanimous approval from six trustees present at Tuesday night's meeting. Trustee Lynne Goldsmith was absent.

"My feeling is that we must prepare our people for hardships ahead caused by the energy crisis," Shefferly said in applying for the appointment, "by organizing and planning for a total community that the majority of Canton citizens can afford."

## Catholic Central looking to purchase new school

The word is out. According to the Catholic Central Alumni newsletter, The Aluminator, the school is beginning a fund drive to raise money to purchase a school "at some later date."

The piece in the newsletter is a plea to raise several million dollars in pledges in the next three years. It adds that more details will be revealed by the first of next year.

This in itself might not be of any consequence to Redford except that Marshall Junior High, in the South Redford school district, was leased on Nov. 10 for five years to Catholic Central with a five-year renewal option.

South Redford Superintendent Jan Jacobs was surprised by the information and said CC had not made any offers to purchase Marshall. In addition, he added SR's position at this time is to lease facilities, not sell them.

"We've made a five-year lease with a five-year option to lease," he stressed. "They have not made any options to purchase the property."

The primary factor for the leasing was based on declining enrollments in the South Redford district. Beginning next school year, Marshall and Pierce

Junior High Schools will be consolidated at the Pierce location, which had been determined as the more centrally located site. Marshall was also the only junior high potential renters showed interest in.

One of the main reasons that Marshall was chosen as the site of Catholic Central's move is that it is easily accessible to the new I-96 expressway, a convenience to students who primarily live in the western suburbs of Redford, Livonia and Farmington.

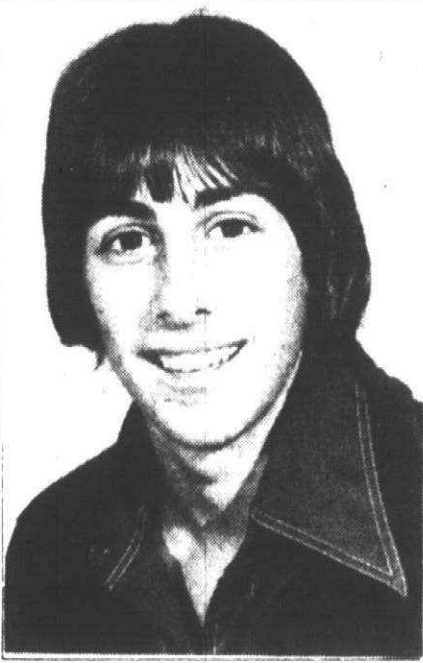
The rent for the first five years of the contract is set at \$430,000. If Central should decide to stay at the site after 1982, the rent for the next five years would be \$650,000.

"We're all in this situation to keep our options open," Jacobs continued. "No one has a crystal ball. Our indications are that enrollments will continue to decline."

So the question remains: Has Catholic Central found a choice piece of property to purchase or are they merely preparing for future undetermined or undisclosed plans?

Catholic Central spokesmen were not available for comment at this time.

# Year-round school a success

framework which allows for better organization of materials, according to the report.

The three-week vacation periods provide breaks at appropriate intervals and time to prepare the instructional program for the next nine-week period.

Thirty-five per cent fewer absences occurred for the 10-month period on the 45-15 program than did for the same period on the traditional calendar.

Crossing guards, aides, supervisory personnel, clerical staff, and cafeteria workers have the opportunity for year-round employment. Maintenance staff has the same work schedule all year. Additional funds are required to employ 12-month non-certified staff members, and constant wear-and-tear

on facilities creates a heavy workload for maintenance staff.

On the 45-15 calendar school, administrators have some special considerations to handle. Such school activities as open house functions, concerts, teacher training, parent orientation, and teacher-parent conferences must be scheduled to accommodate each track. Kindergarten registration, teacher evaluation, transportation, and personnel assignments cause complications.

**ON THE AVERAGE**, Miller students are above their grade level achievement—as measured by the Metropolitan Achievement Test (MAT).

Students also like going to school on the 45-15 plan, according to the attitude questionnaires given in January and June of 1976 and June 1977. After their second year on the program, 68 per cent of Miller students had a positive attitude toward the 45-15 school year.

Teachers, too, ended the pilot program pleased with year-round school. Positive responses to the attitude survey came from 79 per cent of the teachers.

Miller parents indicated they favored 45-15 with a 67 per cent response in June 1976. (A survey of all parents in the six extended school year schools now is being completed.)

**FOLLOWING THE** recommendations coming out of the pilot program at Miller, Extended School Year (ESY) calendars were implemented in six buildings, starting last August, in the Plymouth-Canton district. Evaluation of these programs also will be an on-going process.

Copies of the Miller final evaluation may be obtained from the school administration building, 454 S. Harvey, Plymouth. The report was compiled by Ulsaker and Shirley Spaniel, principal of Miller School. They were assisted

by Lolly Buikema and Joyce Reefer, who served in succeeding years as assistant principals at Miller.

**MRS. SPANIEL** told trustees Monday night that the switch from 45-15 to ESY has resulted in some negative attitudes among teachers.

"Under ESY a lot of the start-up and take-down duties now have to be done on weekends, and parent conferences are having to be held in the evenings. This has taken a lot of family time away from teachers."

## Trustees accused

# Secret meeting held?

Four members of the Plymouth Township Board of Trustees held an impromptu luncheon meeting last month which the other trustees believe may have been in violation of the state Open Meetings Act.

Present at the noon-time gathering were: Supervisor Thomas Notebaert, Clerk Helen Richardson, Treasurer Joseph West, Trustee Frank Millington and Wayne County Commissioner Royce Smith (D-Belleville).

Trustees Lee Fidge, Richard Gornick and Maurice Breen all said they were not informed about the meeting until after it had taken place.

The unscheduled meeting came to light at Tuesday's regular board meeting when Mrs. Fidge questioned reimbursing the trustees who were at the lunch for their meals.

Although both Notebaert and Mrs. Richardson claimed that no official action was taken at the lunch-meeting, Mrs. Fidge said she received a letter

within the next few days informing her that, as a result of the discussion with Smith, the township was asking the Wayne County Board of Commissioners to delay action on a township sewer bonding request.

The letter was signed by Notebaert.

"AS FAR AS I'm concerned, that request to the county was an official action," Mrs. Fidge said angrily. "And there were only four board members there to make the decision. That's getting close to violating the 'sunshine law' if you ask me."

The Open Meetings Act—or "sunshine law"—as it is called—was specifically written to prevent public officials from meeting behind locked doors and in back rooms. The act became law last spring.

Gornick and Mrs. Fidge demanded an explanation for why they were not told about the meeting before it took place.

Notebaert replied that there simply wasn't enough time to notify every

trustee because the meeting wasn't planned. He said that Smith and Millington simply happened to be at the township hall the day of the meeting.

The four township officials and Smith, he said, then went to lunch where they discussed "Royce's possible job of heading up Supersewer," a reference to a large sewer treatment system which, if completed, would serve western Wayne and Washtenaw counties. Smith earlier told the Observer that he is actively campaigning for appointment to the top administrative position.

In addition to denying there was any official township business discussed during the lunch, Notebaert denied that there were any letters sent as a result of the meeting.

"The letter Mrs. Fidge is talking about had nothing to do with our conversation with Commissioner Smith. It was sent out before we talked to him," Smith said.

## Schools selected for Rand study

Plymouth-Canton Community Schools have been selected by the U.S. Office of Education as one of 50 school districts throughout the U.S. to participate in a study of the delivery of special education programs and services and their financing.

The study will be conducted by the Rand Corporation out of Santa Monica, Calif. The time of the study will be next Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

THE OBJECTIVE is to improve decision-making on special education programming and finance by providing accurate and current information on the cost of alternative types of educational placements for children of different ages with various physical and mental handicaps.

The study also will produce improved cost analysis methods and budget planning tools for use by state and local education agency personnel

and others concerned with financing and administering special education programs.

Plymouth-Canton Schools will provide detailed budget and statistical data on pupils, personnel, and facilities. In addition, the Rand personnel will be conducting individual interviews with special education staff members. About 15 members of the pupil personnel services staff from throughout the district will be selected for these interviews.

The results of the collection and analysis of data from our district along with that from other districts throughout the country will be compiled in a final report which will be submitted to the U.S. Office of Education.

All 50 districts who participate will be identified in the study but the data presented won't be identified with any single district by name.

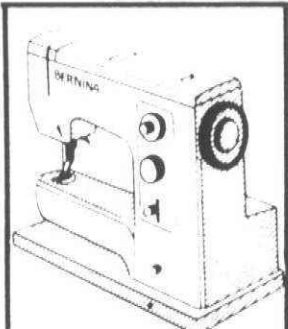

# Sen. Faust leads effort to save Reuther facility

Thursday the Wayne County Board of Commissioners is expected to approve keeping the Reuther Long Term Care facility in Westland open until mid-January, leaving continued operation of the facility beyond that time up to state legislators.

The action will allow 180 patients to remain at the facility which the county expected to close by mid-December.

Patient transfers to other nursing homes will remain dormant unless funding is denied by state or federal agencies.

In late November, the board approved a \$700,000 allocation to close out county operation of the facility. Plans, challenged by lawsuits on behalf of Reuther workers and patients, were to sell Reuther to the state for use as a psychiatric hospital.

County board chairman John Barr and some key state legislators are

optimistic the legislature may appropriate \$1.8 million to fund Reuther for the next six months while they lobby for increased Medicaid and Medicare payments which would allow the Reuther hospital to operate without a deficit.

However, State Senate Majority Leader William Faust (D-Westland) a supporter of the special grant for Reuther, said chances of the legislature approving it are "small to none."

"Obviously some of us are going to work toward that. I don't think there'll be anybody opposed to the proposition as such," said Faust. "The problem will come from the appropriations committee trying to decide where they'll get the money."

Other key legislators supporting a special state grant for Reuther include House Speaker Bobbie Crim (D-Davison), House Appropriations Committee

Chairman Dominic Jacobetti (D-Negaunee), Senate Appropriations Committee Chairman Jerome Hart (D-Saginaw) and Senate Mental Health Subcommittee member Joseph Snyder (D-St. Clair Shores).

"If we fund this, Oakland and Macomb counties will be right behind because they've got similar problems," Faust, whose district includes Garden City and Canton Township, said. Legislatively (state support for long term care facilities) can't be done until there's a proposition that has a chance of passage.

Faust said a recent court ruling will cost the state \$500 million for a teachers' pension fund which in effect eliminates funding long term care facilities.

"There's a very old law that says the state must provide care for destitute people," said Faust. "Indeed, we would have to assume care of those

people, but not necessarily at Reuther."

Despite Faust's grim forecast of its chances, Barr and State Rep. Morris Hood Jr. (D-Detroit) said they expected the legislature to pass the special appropriation before next week's Christmas recess. Barr added that he would negotiate with state and federal agencies to get higher Medicaid reimbursement for patient care at Reuther.

Although the Reuther facility was built four years ago, negotiations on funding the long term care hospital began six years ago when plans were finalized to build it.

The county decided to close the facility after failing to reach an agreement with the state departments of mental health and social services to fund the hospital for the actual cost of patient care.

Actual patient cost is \$108 per day; however, Medicaid payments are \$60 per day. The difference lead to Reuther's annual \$3.5 million operating deficit.

Medicaid payments are made for those who are disabled and under 65 years old. Eighty-five per cent of the patients at the Reuther facility are Medicaid recipients.

Medicare provides full cost of patient care for elderly patients at the facility, accounting for less than 15 per cent of the patient population.

Other insurers and private payments make up the balance of the cost payments.

Barr said if Reuther is reclassified as a chronic disease hospital requiring constant patient care, instead of a long term care facility, the payments will be increased. The Reuther hospital currently provides such care, which is described as being between a skilled nursing care facility and an acute care hospital.

The Michigan Hospital Association also is expected to join in negotiations with state and federal officials to

increase cost reimbursements because there are other facilities in the state who provide care similar to Reuther and could be expected to benefit from any increase in payments.

If the Reuther facility continues operating, about 40 patients elsewhere are expected to have the first opportunity to fill any vacant beds. Capacity of Reuther is 240 beds. Monday's census listed 180 patients.

In a meeting Monday, attorneys representing the county and Reuther patients would not agree on plans for transferring patients out of Reuther.

Patients attorney Sharon Nader Sloan from Wayne County Neighborhood Legal Services said both sides will file statements in federal court today postponing legal proceedings.

"We're not even asking that it be dismissed," said Wayne County legal counsel Al Suchy. "We're asking that it be adjourned until we see what happens (with funding)."

Ms. Nader Sloan added that neighborhood legal services will offer their help "to get Washington to fund the Reuther facility and to explore other funding sources."

## Help groups a hit to pair who hit bottle

Alcoholism brings pain and misery not only to the alcoholic but also to the men, women and children whose lives are involved with the family member or friend who has a severe drinking problem.

These people don't have to learn to cope alone with alcoholism. They can become part of the fellowship of men, women and children who have lived or are living in the same situation. They can join Al-Anon and Alateen where, by talking and listening to others, they can receive comfort, hope and friendship.

"Al-Anon won't tell you how to keep your alcoholic from drinking, only how to control yourself," said Susie. (All names in this story have been changed.)

"One of the purposes is to learn that alcoholism is a disease and that it is the alcoholic's problem, not ours," said Fay. "We learn we are also powerless over alcohol. It's bigger than we are."

"The alcoholic is powerless over alcohol, so why should we try to help?" "When you are ready to surrender to that belief, it takes a heavy weight off your shoulders," she said.

Fay and Susie have been members of the Al-Anon group who meet at Crittenton Hospital conference rooms one and two at 8 p.m. on Thursdays almost since the group began in the early '70s. Both their spouses are members of AA and no longer drink.

THEY BOTH lived under the influence of alcohol for years, raising their families, assuming responsibilities that they otherwise wouldn't have had to assume.

Tod is also a member of Al-Anon. He's belonged for five months. His situation is different.

Tod's wife does not belong to AA. She still drinks. She has also left Tod and has filed for divorce.

Tod is left alone to do the shopping, washing and paying bills while caring for his many children, the eldest still a young teen, and working full time.

Yet Al-Anon has been able to help these people, even though their situations are different.

"I didn't know my wife was an alcoholic. She was a binge drinker and didn't drink in the house or when she was with me."

"She wasn't home much so I had to start doing her job as well as mine. I even encouraged her to go out since she blamed me for our having so many children," Tod said.

Over the years, he became introverted, keeping in his feelings of anger and resentment.

"The children liked her better because she was more fun to be with. Yet I spent more time with them," he said.

Only after realizing that he was becoming "nuttier and nuttier" did Tod join Al-Anon. His therapist suggested he go.

"I'm going to Al-Anon because I'm neurotic. I'm going to lead a more peaceful life, not necessarily a happier life."

"I blamed myself for my wife's unhappiness, and she blamed me for her faults. It was a vicious circle. I felt worse and worse."

"I'm a hell of a lot happier now," Tod said.

HE'S HIRED a housekeeper to help him care for his children, something he wouldn't have done before since he thought he had to do everything himself. He has another sitter come in from 4-6:30 p.m. until he gets home.

"The older children could babysit, but I don't want them to think they have to take over their mom's job."

He's enjoying people now and has changed his priorities, learning to tackle the important things first.

"I even pray differently," Tod said. "Before, I asked God to do things for me. Now I pray more frequently and tell God to let things happen and we'll work it out together."

Religion isn't a part of Al-Anon. Belief in a higher power is.

"Al-Anon isn't a religious program but it's spiritual," said Susie. "We learn to turn our lives over to a higher power." We try to find the same peace and serenity the alcoholic is searching for. We can only find it by controlling ourselves.

Part of the Al-Anon and Alateen program is the Serenity Prayer. The words are "God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, courage to change the things I can and wisdom to know the difference."

THE SERENITY PRAYER is the first thing said at an Al-Anon and Alateen meeting.

There aren't any Alateen meetings in this area right now, although there are people standing by to fill the need for any one between the ages of 11 and 18 who want to meet.

The people who worked with Alateen before are waiting for the need to start the program again.

"We know the procedures, the ins and outs, and are ready to serve Rochester kids who need Alateen," said Hank, who helped with Alateen before. Hank is his real name.

"Alateen can be very touchy," he said. "We don't encourage kids to sneak out of back windows and come to meetings if the parents don't want them to come. But we do want to have contact with them."

To learn about Alateen, call Hank at 651-6130. If you don't want to attend a meeting in this area, you can call Al-Anon and Alateen Information Service of Oakland County at 647-0021 for a time and place schedule of other meetings.

Those attending Alateen don't have to worry about what the adult sponsors hear, according to Fay. There is so much talk that no one remembers who said what.

"Kids often feel that if one of their parents is an alcoholic, it's their fault. They need to learn that nothing they did caused the problem," she said.

THE SAME IS TRUE for adults. Fay said it is common for an alcoholic to blame his drinking on other on other people, especially spouses and parents. This often leads to poor self images for those living with the alcoholic.

One thing Susie learned to handle by going to Al-Anon is her husband's sobriety.

"Every time something didn't go right before, I laid it at the door of his drinking. When he soaked off that door I had no place to put these things," she said.

Men and women at Al-Anon meetings share these things. They talk or listen if they don't want to talk, about their experiences. They learn that others have suffered or are suffering through similar situations.

"I was ashamed that my wife was with another man, but I learned the women in the group had similar problems. There were commonalities," Tod said.

In addition to saying the Serenity Prayer, the group discusses one of the 12 steps that are also discussed at AA meetings.

They also discuss the tradition that goes with that step. For instance, the second step says they "came to believe that a power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity." The second tradition is "Our common welfare should come first; Personal progress for the greatest number depends upon unity."

No one is in charge at Al-Anon meeting. Someone is selected at each meeting to be the leader the next week.

"And the leader pulls back persons who may start gossiping," said Fay. Anonymity is respected. No one has to give his or her real name.

There are no fees for Al-Anon or Alateen, only private contributions. Coffee is served as well as lots of conversation.

"We don't make judgments and don't advise either," said Fay.

# Goal-based curriculum planning moving ahead

Goal-based curriculum planning is moving ahead in Plymouth-Canton Schools with workshops involving all teachers.

Program goals for physical education are nearing completion under the leadership of the Curriculum Coordinating Committee and Barbara Bowman, director of elementary instruction.

Programs for which staff will be establishing goals are: Art, biological and physical sciences, business education, health education, home economics, industrial education, language arts, mathematics, music, physical education, second language.

# Construction leaders anticipate good 1978

While most business economists are predicting a good year for car sales, banking, retail sales and services in 1978, the construction industry is the most optimistic.

This is a change from recent years when construction spokesmen were the bearers of grim news and dismal predictions.

"I foresee a continued upsurge of activity in all four categories which comprise the building industry," predicted John Tocco, president of Crock & Tocco, Inc., an Oak Park-based firm. He said that total non-residential

construction spending in southeast Michigan will climb to the \$500 million mark in 1978. It represents dramatic increases from the \$385 million spent in 1976 and the \$445 million spent this year.

Residential construction is also surging, especially in southeastern Michigan. Tocco predicted 28,000 housing units will be built in 1978, an increase from the 18,900 built in 1976 and the 22,000 put up in 1977.

Tocco, quoting the rationale of Herbert Stein, chief of the Council of Economic Advisors under President Ford,

cited a number of factors behind the continuing residential construction boom:

• "There appears to be no credit crunch or serious rise in long term interest rates."

• "There is no indication that the Federal Reserve Board will take any sudden action to put the economy in a tailspin."

• "The slow growth of business activity would tend to free money for mortgage credit."

• "A continued rise in consumer income, some of which will go into

savings deposits, making those funds available to the housing market."

**PUBLIC WORKS** construction and institutional building are also promising, Tocco said. Predictions for public works construction are bolstered by expectations of more than \$1.7 billion in anticipated federal dollars in the coming years.

"I must stress here," Tocco said, "that while our construction industry can use those federal dollars—especially when they appear to have 'rescued' our sinking industry—all of this money will be of no real help in

the long run if we cannot awaken the sleeping giant of private capital investment at the local, state and national levels."

**BUSINESS CONSTRUCTION** is the most uncertain component of the building industry. Tocco said industrial work already on hand would guarantee a good first half in 1978. The last six months were left in a mist, however.

Contributing to the uncertainty are the Carter Administration's plans for the coming year, the effect they will have on energy usage and the uncer-

tain outcome of the president's consumer advocacy proposals.

"The Carter energy program clouds the future because business does not know if there will be adequate supplies of energy in the future, or what form it will take if it does exist," Tocco said.

And while Carter had promised to cut back the federal bureaucracy he has not yet done so.

"A growing bureaucracy tends to discourage business expansion, because business costs related to dealing with the bureaucracy tend to increase," he said.

## Fund drive tops goal by \$2,000

The Plymouth Community Fund annual donation drive, completed last week, was the most successful in the city's history, according to fund officials.

Daniel LeBlond, this year's campaign chairman, announced donations of \$252,515—more than \$2,000 above the 1977-78 goal of \$250,000.

"We are at 101 per cent of our goal," said a happy LeBlond. "This is the first time in 33 years that's happened."

The final figures were reported at a

voluntary lunch at the Hillside Inn last Friday.

The contributions by division were as follows: Daisy Proctor, chairman of the retail business division, announced collections of \$15,786; the education division, chaired by Earl Gibson, donated a total of \$8,902.

Barbara Prey, who chaired the government section, reported a final figure of \$2,336; the industry and commuter division, chaired by John Czabaj, reported a whopping \$211,476; Roger Haslick, head of the professional division, received donations of

\$4,500.

Residential chairman Dale Yagiela collected \$5,254; while Larry Kennedy, chairman of special gifts, reported donations of \$4,260.

"We had a good, hard-working group of people this year," commented LeBlond. "And without them this could not have been possible."

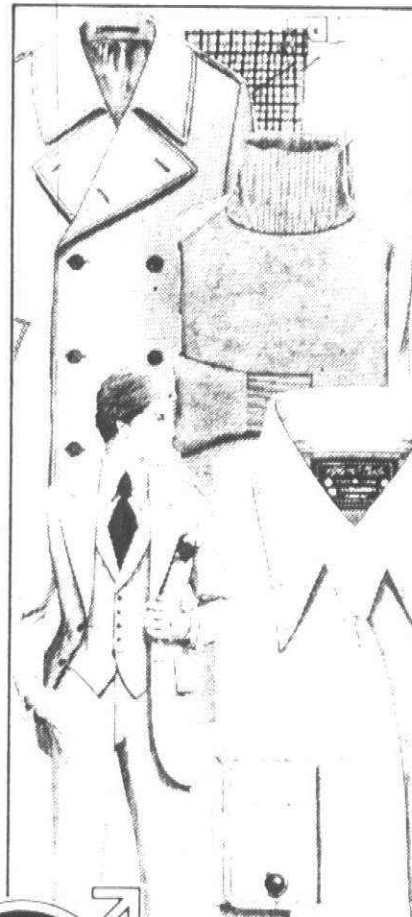
"But most of all, my thanks go out to the people of this community who have contributed so generously to the Community Fund. The organizations we sponsor will now be able to receive their full share of the budget."

# Continued growth seen in 1978

By MICHAEL MATUSZEWSKI

Even though the national economy would be bucking statistical odds, business economists are predicting a good year for 1978. The economy will continue to grow, but probably not as fast as this year.

D. Dean Kaylor, senior vice-president of the National Bank of Detroit, explained that the average business recovery ended after 39 months. That recovery, which began in March 1975, is 33 months old.

For that reason "the overall economic view of 1978 is being described in terms of 'uncertainties,'" Kaylor told a joint meeting of the Economic Club of Detroit and the Greater Detroit Chamber of Commerce earlier this week.

Kaylor highlighted three specific areas of uncertainty which could tarnish 1978's bright expectations. These are the Carter Administration, the dollar's uncertainty abroad and inflation.

"AFTER ALMOST a year, there are few clear indications of how economic policy under the new (Carter) Administration will evolve," he said.

Early in his tenure, President Carter proposed a \$50 tax rebate to stimulate the economy. It was withdrawn. Later, a comprehensive tax reform plan was the hot item in the capital. It also has been shelved.

"As a result of the President's determination to attack a large number of politically sensitive issues early in his administration, it appears that the business community has adopted a 'wait-and-see' attitude," Kaylor said.

IN ADDITION to the business community's bewilderment, the comparative weakness of the dollar on the exchange markets and a growing foreign trade deficit could bring clouds to the economic crystal ball.

Kaylor said there are some indications that the rate of increase in the American foreign trade deficit could slow down in the second half of 1978.

"The Japanese have already moved to reduce the flow of electronic prod-

ucts into the U.S., some progress is being made to slow the import of steel; the flow of oil from Alaska is increasing; and the price of coffee is falling.

"All of these should help to reduce our imports next year," he said.

INFLATION is the last dark cloud on the economic horizon.

The fall of the inflation rate—from 8.9 per cent to 5.3 per cent this year—is not expected to continue. In fact, Kaylor said, the rate of inflation will creep up to about six per cent in the coming year.

This year's drop in inflation was due primarily to the levelling off of food prices.

"In view of higher farm supports and acreage curtailments announced this fall, it is doubtful whether the moderation in inflation due to stable food prices can continue through the new year," Kaylor said.

Increasing energy costs and the "pressure on business to raise prices to protect profit margins from rising costs" will add to the pressure behind the expected rise in the rate of inflation.

IN SPITE OF the uncertainties, Kaylor predicted a good economic year.

He said there were a number of positive strengths "to indicate continued economic growth, including:

- "The improved financial condition of corporations, banks and individuals.
- "An ample supply of credit.
- "A high level of consumer confidence, as indicated by a nearly three-point rise in the November confidence index.

- "A high level of growth in both employment and real personal income. More than six million people have been added to the employment rolls since the start of the recovery (March 1975).
- "A high level of help-wanted advertising, indicating a continuing need for skilled labor.
- "No signs, at this time, of excesses or overheating in the economy."

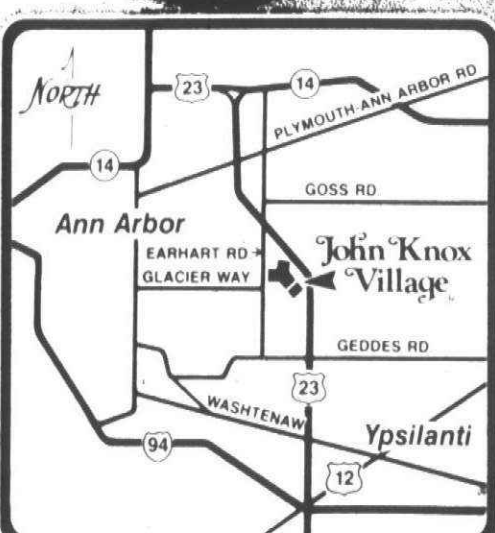
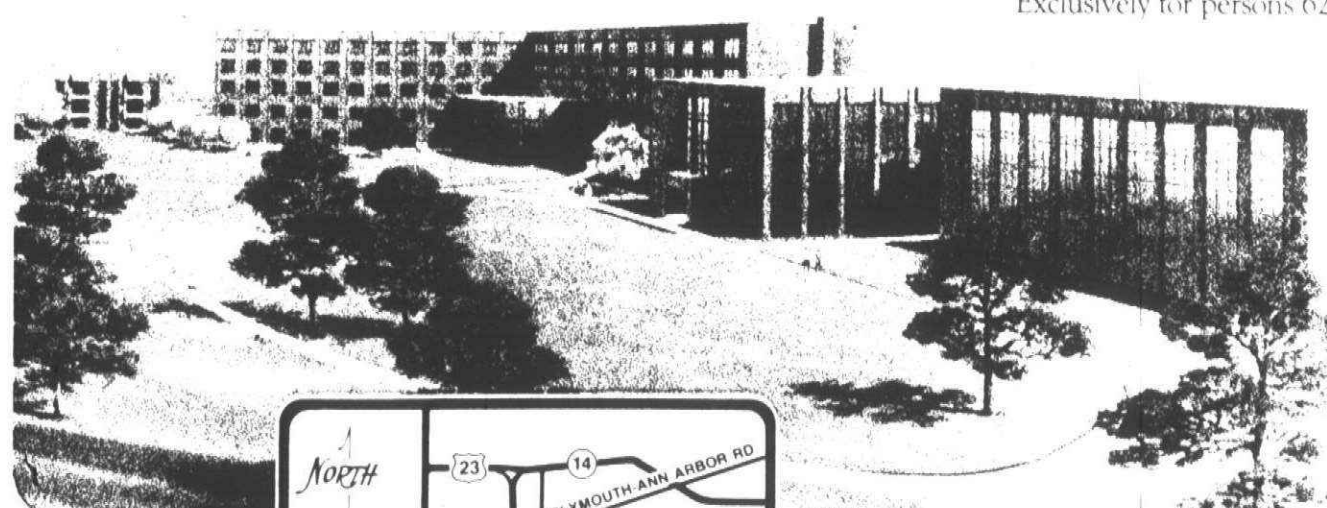

## Roche opens hq in GOP senate bid

George Roche held eight press conferences in Detroit and outstate cities to announce his candidacy for the U.S. Senate, but his committee will operate from the suburbs.

Roche, 42, on leave of absence as president of Hillsdale College, is seeking the Republican nomination to succeed the retiring Robert P. Griffin, also a Republican.

"Friends of George Roche" will operate from Suite 100 at 755 W. Big Beaver, Troy.

In his first bid for elective office, Roche held conferences in Detroit, Flint, Lansing, Grand Rapids, Marquette, Alpena, Traverse City and Kalamazoo.

Roche has gained national attention with his speeches attacking federal funding of education and his refusal to fill out forms supplied by the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare asking about Hillsdale's race and sex composition. (He insists the Baptist-related college has never had

barriers since its founding in 1844.)

While Roche resists being ideologically labeled, he has become the darling of conservatives in the GOP.

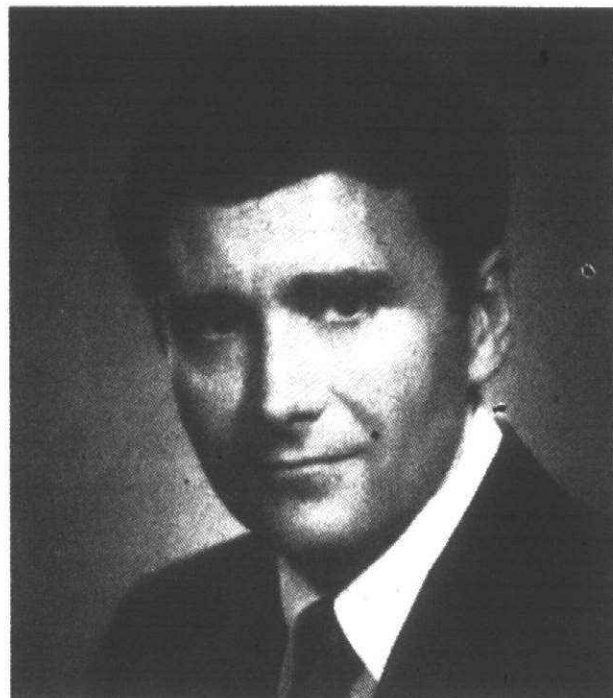
His announcement statement emphasized "inexpensive and available fuel supplies" and "finding alternate domestic energy sources." It indicated he will back Ford-style expansion of energy production rather than Carter-style conservation.

"In foreign affairs, I will insist upon an American defense posture second

to none, and I will wholeheartedly support our allies in the Middle East, Asia, Europe and indeed throughout the free world," he said.

Before joining Hillsdale in 1971, Roche was a senior member of the Foundation for Economic Education in Irvington-on-Hudson, N.Y. He was educated at Regis College at the University of Colorado.

Roche is author of "Education in America," "Legacy of Freedom," "Frederic Bastiat: A Man Alone," "The Bewildered Society" and "The Balancing Act: Quota Hiring in Higher Education."

## Power announces on pioneer turf

Standing in front of the state historical marker erected in the memory of his Quaker ancestors and their Underground Railroad activities, Philip H. Power made it official.

The board chairman of Observer & Eccentric Newspapers will seek the Democratic nomination for the U.S. Senate seat being vacated by Republican Robert P. Griffin.

Power, 39, who lives in Ann Arbor, said he will run "as a citizen politician with deep family roots in Michigan. In 1824 Arthur Power, my great-great-grandfather, came as a pioneer to this land and founded what later came to be called Farmington.

"My attitude toward politics comes from the old-fashioned notion that the proper role of the citizen politician is somebody who comes out of their own community and their own trade to bring the responsibility of public service a little common sense.

On major issues, Power said he would sound little different from other Democratic candidates, but he added: "Because of my newspaper experience, I understand local communities and real people better than any other candidate.

"I am the only candidate with a business background. I have learned to be tough-minded, to use common sense and to insist on results. The senate could use a dose of all three."

Power had formed an exploratory committee some months ago and was generally considered a candidate long before Monday's official announcement in front of Farmington city hall.

Later in the day he formally opened his state headquarters at 17500 W. Eight Mile, Southfield. Chairwoman of his organization will be former U.S. Rep. Martha W. Griffiths, now a Farmington Hills resident, but the active campaign manager will be Rosalie Whelan.

While Power has been administrative assistant for a congressman and a top aide in several gubernatorial campaigns (including wife Sarah's successful bid for the University of Michigan Board of Regents), this is his first candidacy for elective office.

His twin campaign themes will be improving Michigan's economy and "making ideas work" instead of "rushing around the state proposing one new federal program after another."

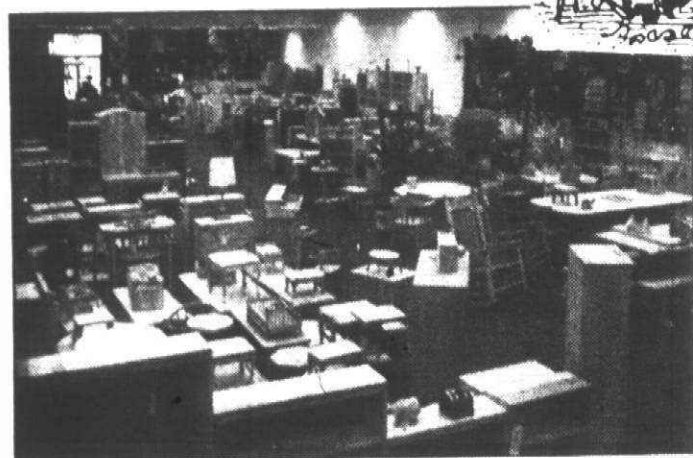

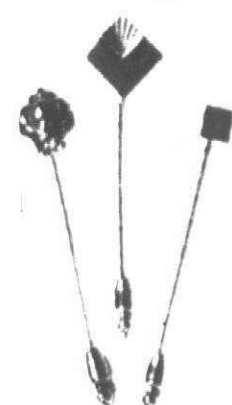

# Daniels Den



By EMORY DANIELS

Monday night's Plymouth Canton Board of Education meeting was refreshing. It was one of those rare moments when I received a report which actually was readable.

Educational reports generally fall into two categories: readable and non-readable. The readable reports are usually optimistic in nature. To date, I have yet to figure out whether the non-readable reports are generally pessimistic because I can't read them, or of course.

By "non-readable" I don't mean they cannot be read. In fact, non-readable reports usually are easy enough to read—they just don't say anything. At least, it's hard to figure out what they say.

It isn't that the writers of the reports have secrets to keep, or deliberately hide their real meanings. It's just that writers of educational reports are, unfortunately, educators. They are professionals who have spent their entire working lifetime writing to other educators.

They use words and phrases educators understand because they have special meanings. But the layman can read the same passage without any meaning being gained, because the words have no special meaning to laymen.

The following passage serves as a good example of words meaningful to educators but of little meaning to me. After reading the entire passage, and

these before and after, I am left with no knowledge which I didn't have before reading the first word. (Key words are put in bold type by myself for illustrative purposes.)

"The Goal-Based Curriculum Model emphasizes an **interdisciplinary** approach. It is concerned with **fostering the integrity** of the local school district's own programs. Its purpose serves to **facilitate the identification** of district and classroom needs and provides a **model for responding** to those needs. It is the responsibility of the teacher to **elaborate the instructional objectives** necessary to meet the course and program goals. In no case, should program goals or course goals be used to limit teacher freedom to **respond to spontaneous opportunities** for learning."

All of the above words are readable. They have special meanings to educators, but have little particular meaning for laymen whose day-to-day lives don't bring them into contact with interdisciplinary approaches, fostering integrity, facilitating identification, models for response, elaborating objectives, or response to spontaneous opportunities.

**ACTUALLY**, educators don't have a monopoly on non-readable writing. Some of the worst examples of non-readable writings in this area can be found in city or township hall in the form of applications for federal or

state funds. Fund applications are written by people who want money to those who give out money. And the givers and receivers of federal funds also have a very special language which only they can understand.

I swear you can almost read an entire application (they're always 20 pages or longer) and not know what the money will be spent for if the giver

actually decides to give. The only certain thing you can garner from the application is that the proposed project meets the criteria of whichever act authorizes the money. That's what applications talk about—criteria and legislative intent.

But the education system won't collapse if reports were written to be read by the general public.


The resolution also states that Piston management used bad judgment and poor timing to move the team from Detroit "at a time when the downtown area is experiencing a continuing revitalization."

# Give police priority in new hirings

We hope the recent rift over hiring policy between the Canton Board of Trustees and the Canton Township Police Officers Association will be settled amicably outside of the courtroom. It is heartening that both sides are talking to each other and report they wish to avoid a lengthy court fight which would result in a deepening split. Besides, the year-long court fight about the makeup of the Canton Zoning Board of Appeals has shown how stubborn pettiness can be costly to taxpayers and disruptive to community service.

But, there are no easy answers to the police hiring controversy, and hopes for a quick resolution may be overly optimistic. Both sides present a good case.

Canton administrators such as Clerk John Flodin, head of the police commission; Supervisor Harold Stein and Police Chief Walter MacGregor, argue that all existing "part-time" officers—including the 14 officers who received full certification at the Criminal Justice Institute last year—should be tested by the Michigan Municipal League if they want to hold full-time jobs in the Canton Police Department.

**THEIR ARGUMENT** is now that voters have approved establishment of a full-time police department, only the "most qualified" individuals who apply should be hired.

That argument sounds admirable on the surface, but it is a backhanded insult to the people presently policing Canton streets. Are board members implying that there are less than qualified officers working part-time in the township? If so, then a review of those individuals is overdue and dismissal proceedings should be initiated. But no one has come forward with charges of unprofessional conduct by Canton's current officers.

And why is it OK for a less-than-qualified officer to work part-time but not full-time? Board members undoubtedly would respond that they are not alleging that the present officers are unqualified but that it is better to be safe than sorry.

But that statement doesn't wash. No test, no matter how sophisticated, can determine if a police officer is going to be honest or emotionally stable. At best, the tests can determine if an officer has average intelligence, knows the law and is physically fit.

Fourteen Canton officers already completed tests of that type when they were enrolled in the Criminal Justice Institute. They were told by the township that once they passed the academy, they would hold rank as regular-employed, part-time police officers empowered to enforce any law of the State of Michigan and Canton Township. To the department's credit, sergeants enforced a go-slow, "low-profile" during the first year because the rookie officers still had a lot to learn from experience.

Now those officers, who believed in the department enough to ignore insults leveled at them, are being told to get in line like anyone else when the full-time jobs open.

**CERTIFIED OFFICERS** on the force now have a great case for unfair labor practices if they are essentially treated as non-employees and forced to reapply for a full-time job. If it will help clear the air and the consciences of the Canton trustees, maybe those officers should take the MML exam, but results should be placed in the employee's file, not used as a determining factor for employment.

Not all 14 certified officers will be able to work during the day, so there will be openings for other applicants who take the MML exam. But the Observer believes that the 14 officers who hold certification should get priority in filling the 10 patrol positions that are opening in 1978.

## Christmas cards lose personal touch

As is true of many traditions, the tradition of sending Christmas cards has changed radically since the first card was sent out back in 1842, a little more than 135 years ago.

The first Christmas card was designed and sent out by a 16-year-old boy, William Maw Edley Jr., on Dec. 9, 1842, in England. It really wasn't very Christmasy. It had four separate scenes on the front. On the upper right, there was a picture of a young couple dancing, and on the upper left, there was a picture of a family sitting down to a holiday dinner.

On the lower right, there was a picture of some poor people receiving gifts on a lady's doorstep, as was the custom of the time, and on the lower left was a skating scene.

There was a border of rather non-Christmas characters, but the message at the bottom said: "Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to You."

**IN THIS COUNTRY**, the first Christmas cards were designed by Louis Prang in Boston in 1873. Christmas cards were frowned on by religious

groups other than Catholics and Episcopalians until the 1900s. This is why most of the earlier cards did not have religious themes.

Up to the 1900s, it was the custom to hand-deliver them with a calling card. The inside contained a handwritten note conveying the wishes of the season.

Today, almost all Christmas cards are delivered by mail, and instead of containing personal notes, our names are printed across the bottom inside.

While we would all like to individually add a specific message of the season to each person to whom we are sending a card, we are forced by the

hectic pace of Christmas time to rush through the mechanics of sending them out.

**UNFORTUNATELY**, because we don't send Christmas cards out early enough, practically all of the cards arrive within a two-week period, and it is difficult to find time to appreciate each card as it arrives.

On occasion, we are critical of the merchants who start the Christmas season after Halloween, claiming it commercializes Christmas. But we really would do a better job of conveying our season's wish if we ourselves followed the merchants' lead and sent out our cards earlier.

It would allow the person who receives the card time to appreciate it and it would allow the sender extra time to jot down notes which would really make the cards more enjoyable.

It would be impossible to continue the old-fashioned custom of hand-delivering but I do think the old custom of hand-signing the cards goes a long way toward bringing back the personal touch at Christmas.

All went well until he got about three blocks from the church building.

Then, because of a sharp wind that had come up, he encountered a big drift. There wasn't much time to make a detour, so the brave little guy

plowed right into it. The first step was fine. The second wasn't bad.

But the third! He lifted his right foot and shoved it into the snow. To make matters worse, the wind kept howling, and the drift became larger. It was almost up to his waist.

**UP AND DOWN** the street he looked, hoping someone would come along to rescue him. But there was no one in sight—and he was about 50 yards from the closest house. Time was fleeting.

Suddenly there came a tap on his shoulder. Sure enough, it was a man who had seen his plight from his kitchen window. He managed to move through the drifts—and like an angel from heaven, he came to the rescue.

In short order, he had The Stroller out of the drift. What's more, he walked with him to the church building and arrived just as the strains of the first hymn rent the air.

As The Stroller walked in the door, all eyes turned to him. He leaned over to the Sunday school teacher and whispered, "Present."

# Bankers join '78 optimists

The banking industry has joined the chorus of optimistic economic outlooks for 1978.

"Prospects for another profitable banking year seem excellent as we near the threshold of 1978," said Dean E. Richardson, chairman of the board of Manufacturers Bank of Detroit.

"We are optimistic," he told a joint meeting of the Economic Club of Detroit and the Greater Detroit Chamber of Commerce. "The availability of credit through the banking system should be adequate to encourage another full year of economic growth."

He said there has already been enough monetary and fiscal policy stimulation to guarantee a continued expansion of the economy in 1978.

That expansion, however, will be slowed, Richardson warned. The slowdown will be caused by an expected increase in inflation through the next year, he said. Inflation could be explained by increases in the social security tax, a boosting of farm price supports, the continued upward spiral of energy costs and possible price pro-

tection for American-based industries.

The effect of all those complex factors will be seen in increased mortgage rates, higher prices for most goods and services and a slowdown in the rise of personal incomes.

Mortgage rates are likely to rise by 1/4 to 1/2 per cent during 1978, Richardson predicted.

"We also believe," he said, "that the growth and availability of consumer installment credit will slow down in 1978."

He used the example of the auto loan, which makes up a major portion of installment lending, to illustrate his point. He said auto sales are determined primarily by personal income. Personal income, which has increased during the past two years, will continue to increase in 1978, but at a slower rate, Richardson predicted.

Higher prices for most goods and services will be the major factor in cutting the rate of increase and "will further reduce discretionary income," he said.

"Consequently, the demand for auto installment loans is expected to be somewhat less."

# Science Center packs for move to new home

The Detroit Science Center will begin the task of completely transferring itself on Dec. 16 from the storefront which has been its temporary home since 1970 to its new building in the Detroit Cultural Center. The last day the storefront, at 52 East Forest, will be open to the public is Dec. 15.

The \$5 million new building at the corner of Warren and John R. is scheduled to open in January.

The structure itself consists of three floor levels: ground, plaza, and exhibit hall level. A 250 tiered seat space theater on the ground level with a 67 1/2-foot hemispherical projection dome will be the highlight of the building. Programs in three-dimensional depth are made possible through a 70 mm Omnimax projector with a fish-eye lens. The effect is to give the spectators the illusion of being suspended in space.

# Government pay ups productivity level

Minimum resources to serve a city's needs are destined to continually increase, according to a research paper to be presented tonight at Oakland University.

Relief for the fiscal distress of city governments can come only from the availability of new sources of revenue, the authors predict.

"Public Sector Unions, Productivity and Pensions" is the latest in a series of regional fiscal research papers in the Metropolitan Fund's year-long study, "Financing the Metropolis." The paper will be presented at 7:30 p.m. in the Oakland Center at Oakland University by the authors, Dr. Marvin Johnson of the University of Wisconsin and Dr. Bernard Jump of Syracuse University.

A citizen panel will discuss the paper and its implications for southeast Michigan.

NOTING THAT local government spending has increased at an annual rate of 10.6 per cent over the past six years, Dr. Johnson points out that

steadily rising public labor costs have reached rough parity with private wages in recent years. At the same time, he notes, private sector productivity has far surpassed public sector productivity.

In fact, Johnson says, "The cost of services in the public sector must increase indefinitely because the level of compensation in the public sector depends on, and increases with, labor productivity in the private sector."

"The rather ominous conclusion has to be that, for reasons beyond the control of both union and government officials, cities will continue to be faced with the problem of providing needed services with ever more expensive labor inputs."

Faced with increasing wages and fixed labor requirements, the only ways cities in southeast Michigan can prevent municipal expenditures from rising is to provide fewer and lower quality services by employing fewer people," Johnson concludes.

COAUTHOR Jump will discuss the

problems of public sector pension systems, including consideration of the relationship between public and private pension plans, the nature of distress signals which can indicate when pension plan funding is inadequate, and the need for identifying and understanding those danger signals.

This paper is the fourth in a year-

long research project during which the Metropolitan Fund will examine fiscal requirements of the region in the next decade, identifying disparities in the fiscal and servicedelivery processes and recommend action to obtain equitable and adequate financing for public services throughout the metropolitan Detroit region.

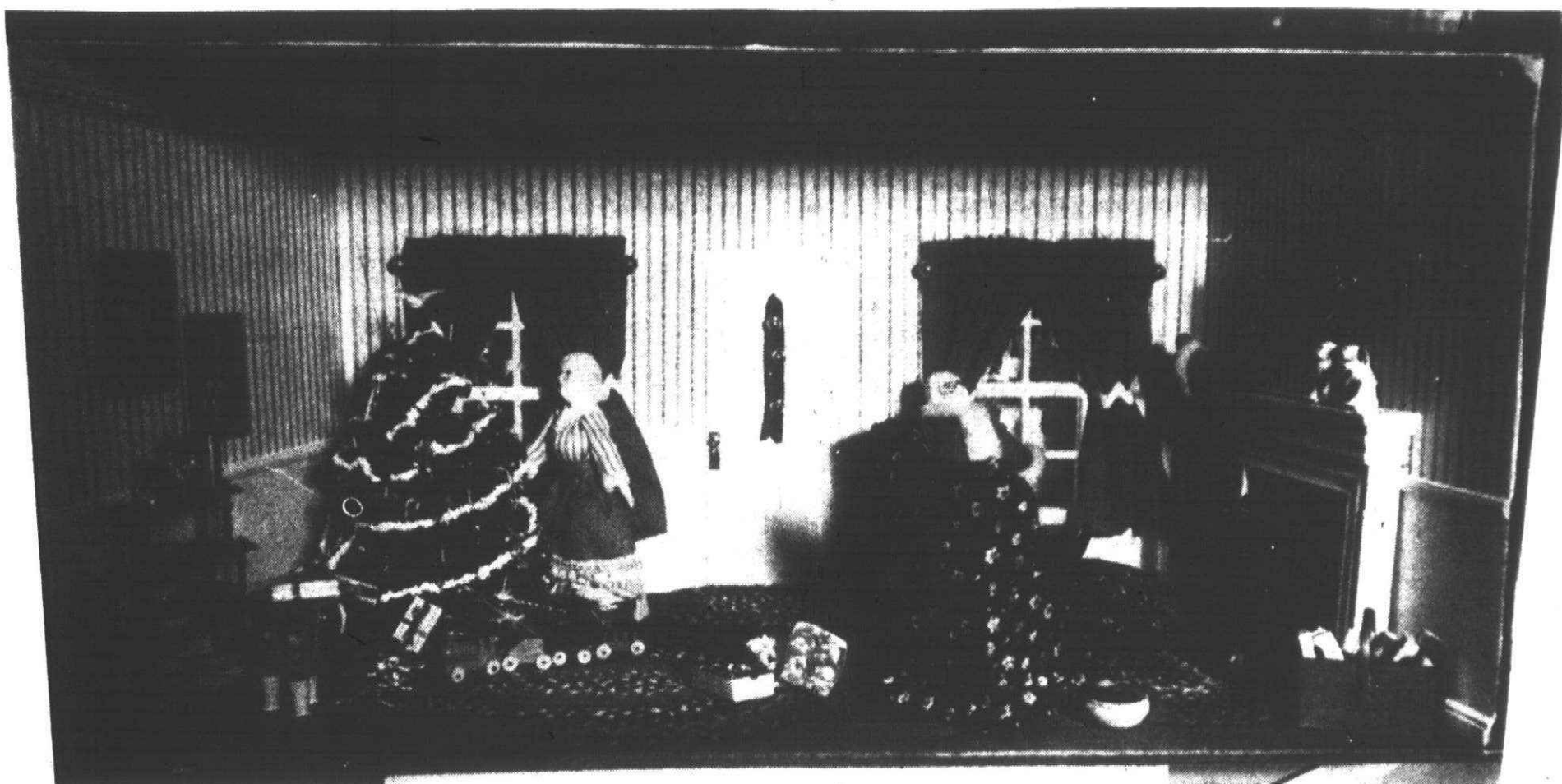

## Holiday cheer in miniature

They'll have themselves a merry little Christmas in at least one room of Pamela Palmer's house.

That room's occupants are Mr. and Mrs. Santa, who stand about six inches tall.

Santa's resting from his labors in a doll-sized armchair, and his still-busy helpmate is trimming a tree, a scant eight inches in height, with the tiniest bits of popcorn and cranberry you can imagine.

Thimble-sized toys, a train and a couple of soldiers, and some little wrapped boxes surround the tree, and miniature bells hang on the scale-sized door. There's a box of minuscule ornaments open on the small braided rug.

Over the graceful fireplace hangs a holly wreath, complete in every detail, and a couple of china pug dogs, hardly bigger than your fingernail, sit atop the mantelpiece.

Through the brightly-curtained windows you can see outside to a snowy world that adds to the Christmas picture.

THIS CHRISTMAS room, of course, was created by Mrs. Palmer for looking into instead of living in. But to this Livonia homemaker and her family—husband William, daughter Tracey Jean and son Michael—it's as much a part of home as people-sized rooms in their subdivision ranch house.

So far that matter, are the country store room that Mrs. Palmer has filled with countless goodies, and the set of doll house rooms she has furnished with miniatures and populated with charming little china folks.

For Mrs. Palmer, thinking little has become the pathway to her favorite hobby.

"I guess I started enjoying miniatures when I went to a convention with my mother," she recalled. Her mother, former Livonian Lucille Funk,

had a friend who was a miniatures enthusiast, and the fever was catching.

Mrs. Palmer started collecting furnishings and dolls and building rooms. Before long her one bedroom dollhouse was bursting at the seams, so a few more rooms were added.

Now there's a kitchen and laundryroom too as well as a den, all furnished in scale model tables and chairs and featuring a population that includes Grandma and Grandpa as well as the typical nuclear family members.

Small Tracey finds the doll rooms in her parents' bedroom a constant mecca.

"She very good, through," said her mother. "She never takes things out when I'm not there. Actually, she's as interested in the rooms as I am."

WITH THE EXPANDED doll house in order, a country store was the next big project in Pamela Palmer's small world.

"I collected things for about a year," she said, "and once I got the box to put it in the assembly went pretty fast."

For that crowded room, she went into the flooring business, using tongue depressors to make her planks.

There was a near tragedy involving that room, but everything turned out all right.

Mrs. Palmer had the room assembled and on brackets in her kitchen. A small bump during a family meal caused the brackets to give way.

"I sat there and watched it go," she recalls, "and it scattered all over the floor."

"After I cried, I looked over the damage and found that all that was broken was the front glass and one little gumball machine. I got it put

together easily, and now I don't take any chances—I keep it on the counter."

THE CHRISTMAS ROOM is assembled in a special kind of box with walls angled outward for a three-dimensional effect. The innovation Mrs. Palmer tried in that one was a false back wall with a light and Christmas cards with outdoor scenes to make the viewer think he's looking out the window.

She hurried to finish that one up this fall so it could be displayed for a time in Muriel's Doll House of Plymouth, the source of many of her miniature furnishings.

But the room came home in plenty of time for family Christmas.

Mrs. Palmer, who calls herself a "craft person" and finances many of her miniature purchases by selling handmade items like macrame and quilted Christmas wreaths, makes some of the items in her little rooms.

She's braided the rugs, crocheted

bedspreads and wound string on balls and material on tiny cardboards for the store. She also has dressed some of the dolls. But most of the items in the rooms, including the decorated Christmas tree, were purchased ready-made to scale.

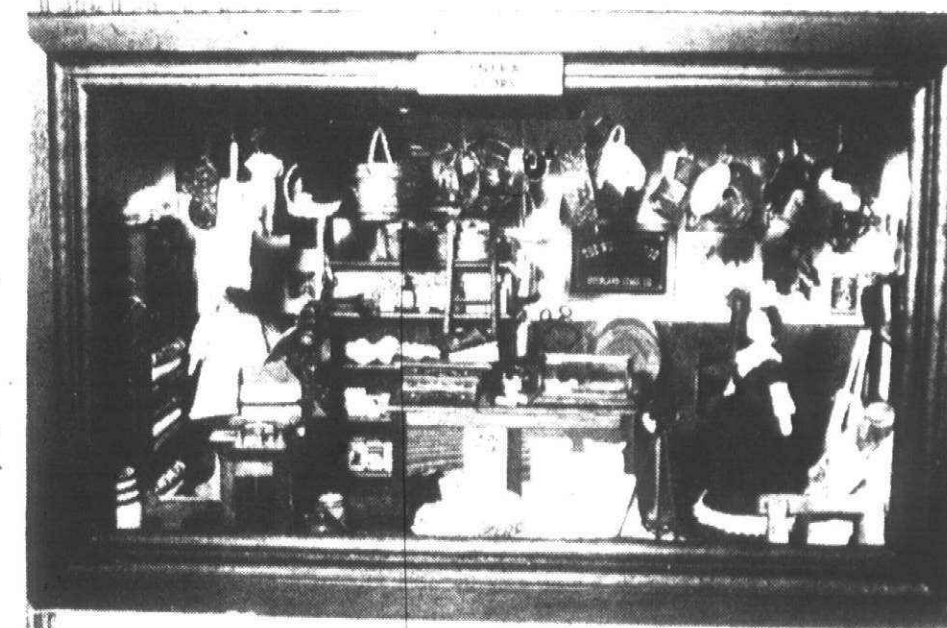
She's now assembling a little ice-cream parlor. She has the little wire chairs and tables and some of the people, and she's trying to figure out how to make the counters.

THIS DESIGNER of little rooms has yet to sell one of the creations.

"It takes a lot of time to collect the things, and by the time I finish I've put so much of myself into them I can't think of parting with them," she said.

"The funny thing is that as a child I never played with dolls; I was always with my three brothers playing cowboys and Indians."

"But I've always loved interior decorating, and I guess that's what I find so much fun in the miniatures."

## Assault victim needs extra TLC, support

The last thing the victim of a sexual assault should feel is blame, but that's exactly the emotion

But police, psychologists and educators agree family, friends and schools can do a whole lot to reduce the trauma.

Robert Turner, Livonia police chief, and Charles Ruckhaber, psychologist for the city's school district, directed some explicit words at the subject after a Livonia girl was attacked in the dark hours of a recent winter morning.

"It was absolutely not her fault," Turner said of the young girl involved. "The poor kid is the victim of circumstances and criminal action. People should show her kindness, because she's been through enough hell."

Dr. Ruckhaber agreed. He said: "Obviously the girl was victimized, and there is no reason she should be blamed. Unfortunately the first reaction of the victim of sexual assault is often shame. She wonders if she somehow could have prevented it."

Turner believes there is not much chance this youngster could have escaped the assailant who forced her into his car, saying he had a knife.

"The only thing I could suggest to someone who is confronted by a knife is to run," he stated. "But I hesitate to mention it because if the attacker is homicidal he could chase and stab the individual. She couldn't overcome him." The best thing is to stay away from strangers."

DR. PETER MENDRANO of the Medrano Clinic in Farmington Hills believes that both a victim's friends and parents can have a vital role in her recovery after a sexual assault.

"I think the best approach of her peers would be to protect her, in a sense," he said. "Be with her. Give her the peer experience she needs. When the rest of the students see her interacting with her old friends, the uniqueness of the situation would be lessened."

"The sooner she gets back to her former situation, the better. She is the same girl as before. She should be treated the same as before."

The psychiatrist noted that most people regard sexual assault as a terrible thing. "To the victims it is terrible too," he explained. "But they may find a way to deal with it providing we don't interfere. We can help them by our support, acceptance and understanding, and by being with them when we are needed."

Diane Vincent, director of Common Ground in Birmingham, has had plenty of experience counseling and offering crisis intervention services to women who have been sexually assaulted.

"People who have been assaulted feel shocked," she began. "Depending on how they are handled, they may feel guilt or depression. Most victims need support. They need to be reminded by family and friends that it is not their fault. The behavior of people toward them shouldn't change. They should be warm and concerned."

"But they shouldn't ask the woman to go over details."

She thinks that when a girl tells her parents about a sexual assault they should listen and be supportive. They should not panic or start laying blame on her.

"Parents very often over-react," she said. "They get so hysterical and bent

out of shape that they escalate the emotional crisis. If they respond in a calm and concerned way, emotional damage is a lot less likely."

"However, if people experience difficulties from the experience, if they become fearful, withdrawn or excessively embarrassed, they should get therapy. Otherwise they will find it difficult to make an adequate adjustment, or achieve emotional intimacy."

Ms. Vincent added that families of a victim often need as much support and crisis intervention as the woman herself.

WHILE DR. RUCKHABER feels that experts should deal with any emotional problems from the assault, he said that the schools can also be supportive and caring, and sensitive to the individual involved.

"The Livonia School District has an outstanding attitude toward helping youngsters with emotional difficulties," he said.

Dr. Medrano thinks sexual assault should be discussed in schools. "I feel it would be beneficial to bring up the issue, so boys and girls could exchange ideas, and let each other know what they think," he said.

BUT AT THE MOMENT such discussions are not included in the curriculum of the Livonia schools.

"To my knowledge nothing is done on a planned basis," said Esther Heuser, director of curriculum.

"We are about to introduce a course on human growth and development into the junior high schools, but it doesn't have that kind of component (sexual assault). Perhaps we need to review the need for it to be included in formalized instruction."

She added that prevention is taught to students to help them avoid trouble.



# Barefootin': The answer to all our problems

"The trouble with this world is that nobody understands the need to go barefoot."

That's the philosophy of Hye Holland, 69, who heads Credit Control Inc. Ironically, he started out in the ladies' shoe business in 1930 when his customers didn't see the need to go barefoot either.

Holland of Southfield, past president of American Collectors Association, about two years ago wrote an article, "Whatever Happened to Free Enterprise?" in the association's publication.

"Most people think better if they're barefoot," Holland contends. "It gives them one less encumbrance to boggle the mind, and topple a great thought which might have become a virtuous idea. No socks, no shoes, no red tape—just barefoot."

Holland maintains it might not be a bad idea to remove the collective shoes and socks from the feet of elected U.S. officials. At the very least, he claims, it would enable them to run faster from what he regards as their "unique responsibilities."

"I SUPPOSE one or two of you, as children, set up a lemonade stand on a busy corner on a hot summer day BC (Before Cars)," Holland quipped. "With joy, you viewed the 18 cents you had earned. That, without benefit of rules and regulations, was known as free enterprise."

Funk and Wagnalls Dictionary lists "free" as "not bound by restrictions, physical, governmental or moral," says Holland. "Enterprise" is defined as "any projected task of work; an undertaking, boldness, energy and invention in practical affairs."

The description, Holland claims, agrees with the practice of going barefoot and is contrary to what's happening in the country today.

"Let's say we have an enterprising 10-year-old in this day and age," he conjectures. "It's highly unlikely he'd want a lemonade stand. If he did, first he'd have to get a social security number."

"Then, he'd have to check prices with the Fair Trade Commission and tariffs with the Interstate Commerce Commission before deciding on a suitable corner for the stand. He'd have to obtain a license to sell lemonade, and he wouldn't be able to build his own stand since carpenters have a strong union."

BUSINESS wouldn't be as good as it could be for the young entrepreneur, Holland contends. Most people are driving cars instead of walking. The vendor has to charge 15 cents or more per glass for his product because the price of lemons, sugar, ice and water have all gone up.

Out of his \$20 a week earnings, the boy would have to pay social security, withholding, state and city taxes and enough to cover the license fee for which he borrowed money from his mother, Holland quips.

The example is hypothetical, of course, but it illustrates a point about free enterprise, says Holland in a more serious vein. He maintains for more than 40 years, U.S. citizens have turned increasingly to the federal government to solve their problems.

"As government enlarged its dominion over our affairs, it has become increasingly apparent that concentrating power in Washington is inefficient, wasteful and destructive to

our freedoms of enterprise," Holland contends.

Holland believes government has created woes in our economy by taking more than 35 per cent of our gross national product. It took 186 years for the federal budget to reach \$100 billion, nine more years to reach \$200 billion and only four more years to reach \$300 billion, he claims.

"TWO YEARS ago," Holland recalled, "one out of every six workers in the country was employed by federal, state or local governments. Clearly, we have more government than we need, want and are able to pay for."

"Big government is big business. It's also bad business because of what it's done to our economy and our personal freedoms. It's spread to any area not specifically denied it."

A little inflation, like a little pregnancy, will grow until something bursts, Holland believes. You can't put tight handcuffs on a man without having his hands swell, and you can't shackle his ankles and tell him to run, he maintains.

The federal regulatory process was set up for valid reasons, Holland concedes. But, he claims, it has become enormously complex, cumbersome, inefficient. It's also overly protective of the industries it regulates at the expense of the consumer, he says.

"To pay for rising costs of public programs, we've transferred increasing sums from the most productive part of our economy—the private sector—to the least productive—the government," Holland contends.

INVENTORY and depreciation after-tax corporate profits have been

on the decline, he said. Capital investments have been at the lowest level of any major industrialized country in the free world, he adds.

"It's imperative we make better provisions for our future," he asserts. "Greater federal spending and more controls aren't the answer. There's a better way than wage and price controls."

Holland believes the government's regulatory system must be overhauled. He admits that would be difficult because of the "benefiting special interest groups which are more powerful and united than their opponents."

"We continue to need individual and business tax reforms and elimination of waste and inefficiencies caused by excessive regulations," he contends. "We must choose to either restore a more competitive open society or commit ourselves to central government making our economic and personal decisions for us."

"Whatever became of free enterprise? It's still alive and breathing, but gradually the tentacles of bureaucracy are suffocating it. Let's take our shoes and socks off and start thinking."

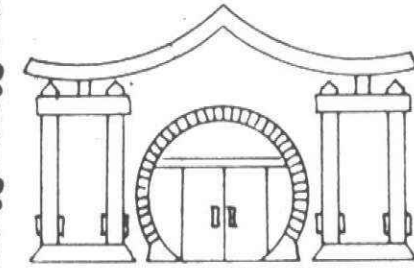

# Arts legislation needs help

It's a safe bet that if the " \$ for Art " legislation proposed by State Rep. Ruth McNamee (R-Birmingham) ever comes out of committee and on to the floor of the house, it will be by public pressure.

Mrs. McNamee's proposed legislation, HB 4249, outlines a policy for integrating art into state buildings with provisions for a state fund that can receive bequests, donations and grants and the organization of a commission on art to administer the programs.

Also included in the bill is a plan for the acquisition of art for display in public buildings as well as and the establishment of a state art fund. "The art may be an integral part of, or attached to, or detached within or outside a building," according to the bill.

The amount of money for art in new buildings costing \$250,000 or more shall not exceed one per cent of the total appropriations for construction when included within the amount of the project.

An amendment specifies that work of Michigan artists will be given priority in the selection process.

THE BILL WAS introduced in March, and referred to the Committee on Appropriations. Mrs. McNamee asked that it be referred to a committee that would hear testimony. It was then referred to the Committee on State Affairs.

It was actually presented twice to the Committee on State Affairs with Chairman Rep. John Kelsey. Testimony in favor of the legislation was

given by artists, artists groups, architects plus a letter from Donald W. Thalacker, director of the Art-in-Architecture Program of the U.S. General Services Administration.

Thalacker said he hoped Michigan lawmakers would lead the nationwide movement among state governments to enact " \$ for Art " legislation.

He mentioned that in addition to contributing to a cultural heritage, "Quality works of art increase in monetary value at a rate greater than nearly any other commodity."

HE CITED A Louis Harris nationwide poll which indicated that 64 per cent of the American people will be willing to pay an extra \$5 in taxes—if the money went exclusively for cultural efforts such as visual arts.

Adding that public-sponsored and placed art can help to rejuvenate a city (he was quoting former President Gerald Ford) as the Calder sculpture did in Grand Rapids, Thalacker urged the legislators to support the bill.

In spite of strong support, the bill hasn't come out of the Committee of Appropriations to which it was referred. It wasn't tabled, but it wasn't voted out of committee either.

Concerning the bill's future, Mrs. McNamee said, "It's very tenuous. It's still hanging on by a string, alive, but terribly ill."

It would take 10 votes to move it out of the committee, and while the needed number is within one or two, it is still in limbo because it lacks support.

In the meantime, the Oakland County Board of Commissioners has passed a proclamation which sets a

county policy for displaying art in public buildings and supporting similar action at the national and state level.

The impetus for the county policy came from Marlow Belanger, chairman of the Oakland County Cultural Council.

MRS. BELANGER SAID, "We are the first county in the state to adopt such a policy. There was no policy before even to accepting works donated."

Not only does the county policy contain a provision for the inclusion of art works in remodeled or new county facilities, it states that new buildings will contain a provision for use of art in the construction specifications.

This first step toward the goal of establishing art in public buildings was immediately followed by a second which, hopefully, will have even broader ramifications.

Mrs. Belanger wrote letters to all of the county arts councils and groups urging them to actively support HB 4249 by writing letters and making their feelings known to state legislators.

The implications of the county's new policy are going to be noticeable soon. A traveling exhibit of art from Puerto Rico will be on exhibit in the county complex from Feb. 19 through March.

There will be a slide show and lecture, and possibly some actual art, from the Matisse show at the Detroit Institute of Arts, in the county complex on Jan. 22.

Mrs. Belanger has already arranged to have a number of shows from the Smithsonian Institution in the county buildings later on in the spring and through next year.

## 'Amahl and the Night Visitors'

"Amahl and the Night Visitors," a popular opera for children, is on stage at the Music Hall Saturday and Sunday Dec. 17 and 18.

There will be a 2 p.m. matinee each day plus a 6:30 p.m. performance on Sunday.

The one-act "Amahl" is the first opera created specially for television. It became an instant hit when it was first beamed into the nation's living rooms in 1951. The story deals with a heart-warming encounter between the three kings and a crippled shepherd boy, shown at right. He is played by 13-year-old Michael Wantuck from Bloomfield Hills.

# Plymouth grapplers butcher opponents

Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton wrestling teams showed their dominance over two Livonia schools, Franklin and Clarenceville, with overwhelming victories in a double-dual meet Tuesday night at the Salem gym.

Against Franklin, the Chiefs younger wrestlers, Paul Mooney, Tim Racer and George Hamblin came through with clutch victories to gain that triumph.

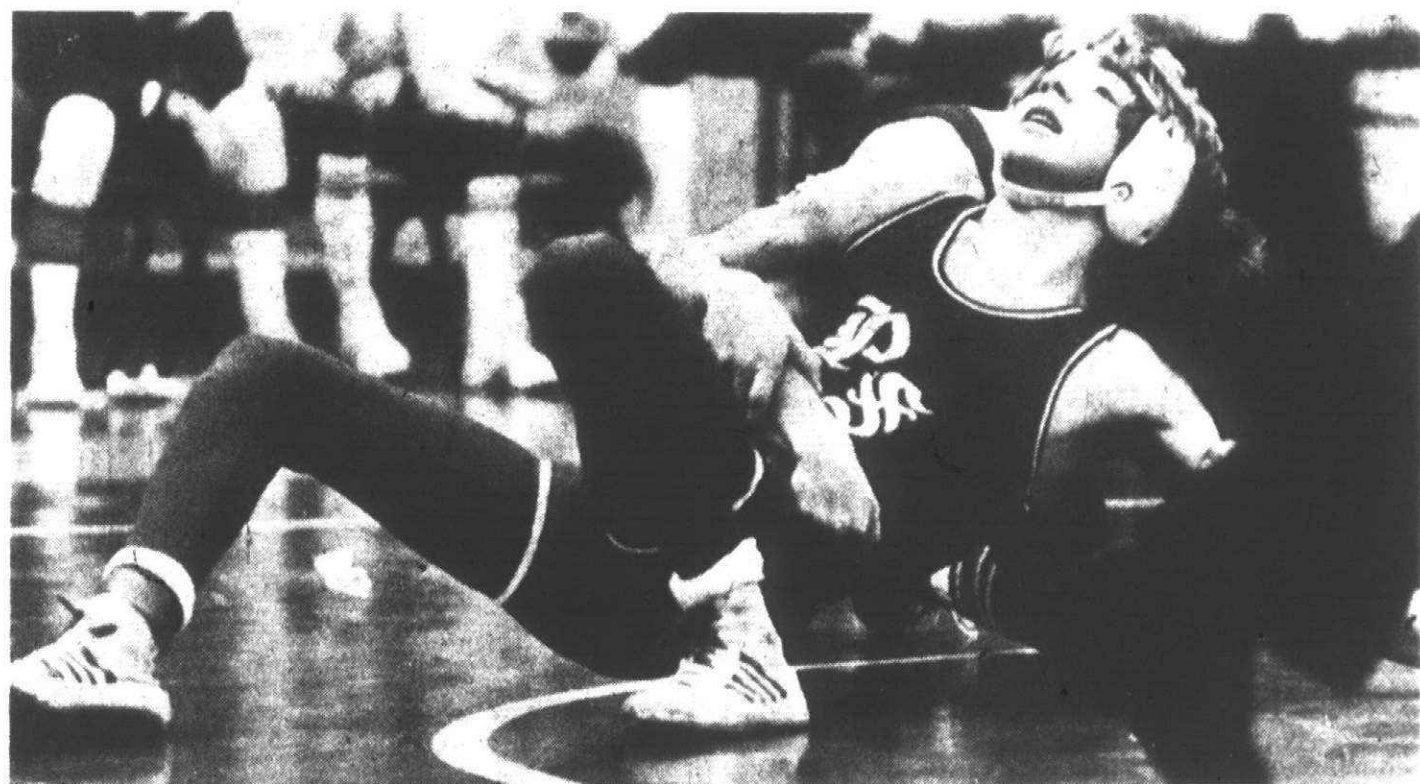
Hatcher said she will join her husband in mid-January and return in mid-June to start work on her summer basketball program.

## King's 33 points wasted

Southfield Lathrup's never-ending basketball jinx over Plymouth Canton stayed in tact Tuesday night when the Chargers edged the Chiefs, 68-66, in non-league action at Canton.

It marked the fourth time in as many years that Lathrup has walked away the victor. Last season, the Chargers nipped Canton by a single point.

The victory for coach Jim Kourtakis' squad was its third straight this season, raising the Chargers' record to 3-1 overall. They resume Metro Suburban Association action tomorrow night (Friday) against Troy Athens.

With only 21 seconds left and the Chargers ahead 68-66, the Chiefs made one last effort to tie the score but outside shots by Butch King and Brent Eckles missed the mark.

A jovial Lathrup coach Kourtakis was very pleased with his team's balanced scoring and team play.

"We had great balance but the game could have gone either way," he said. "It was back-and-forth. Whoever was on top at the end was going to win. It was that kind of game."

Canton coach Casey Cavell reflected the dejection in the Chiefs' locker room after the game, saying he was upset his players didn't control the game.

"We had so many chances to control the game and we just didn't do it," the Canton mentor said. "Whenever we played good denial defense and stopped their penetration, we controlled the game."

"What bothered me was we didn't control it in the second quarter, at the end of the third quarter, and with one-and-a-half minutes to go."

The Chiefs raced to a 22-17 first quarter lead before Lathrup's penetration in the second quarter saw the Chargers grab a narrow 35-34 lead at halftime.

The contest remained close in the second half as neither team pulled farther away than a six-points advantage.

Lathrup's balanced scoring saw four of its five starters reach double figures. Guard Pete McKnight canned 19 points. Jack Dakesian added 14, Karl Taylor 13 and Rowley 10.

The Chiefs' main offensive production came from hot-shooting junior guard King who scored 33 points—one half of the Chief's total output. No other Chief reached double figures.

# Gal cagers sparkle again this year

Another successful girls basketball season officially ended for Plymouth Saturday night when the Salem Rocks lost in the regional finals to Livonia Bentley, 44-39, at the Trenton gym.

Every year at this time I've talked about the tremendous progress both Salem and Canton girls basketball programs have made over the years. This season, indeed, was no exception.

First, we saw a Canton squad, with only two seniors present, whip through its regular season schedule, beating every area team in sight.

Coach Mike McCauley of the Chiefs didn't have a tall team this season but alert playmaking and exceptional quickness on both ends of the court resulted in a 19-0 regular season—the only perfect record in the Observ-erland area.

This year truly saw McCauley's hard work pay off as his program took another giant step forward. Not only did the Chiefs finish with an unde- feated regular season, but the attitude and confidence of the squad was so positive that it should carry through future seasons.

The girls have confidence in their personal abilities and confidence in McCauley to continue the programs' success.

The only unfortunate part of the Chiefs' season came during post-sea- son play. Here, Canton traveled to Detroit Mumford to meet the Public School League champions on a foreign floor.

It marked the first time any Canton team, boys or girls, traveled to Detroit for district competition.

While it was obvious the Chiefs couldn't play with the talented Mum- ford girls, who are still in the tourna- ment, Canton gained a lot of respect and state-wide recognition for its sea- son. And the nine-point setback to the Mustangs was nothing to be ashamed about.

ACROSS the creek, it was a different kind of season for Debbie Hatcher and her Salem squad—and yet it was still successful in its own right.

Hatcher and the Rocks were used to the state-wide recognition and unde- feated season for the past two years, winning the Suburban Eight League hands down in 1975 and 1976.

But it wasn't the same this season.

First, the Rocks lost four returning lettermen at the beginning of the sea- son who didn't return to the club for personal reasons.

So the Rocks had to start from scratch with younger talent.

After some very trying times in mid- season, which included a five-game losing streak, the Rocks finally began to gel and went on to win the Dearborn District and the first game of the Trenton Regionals.

It marked the first time either Plymouth team has won a district title.

Granted, the Rocks' district in Dear- born and regional in Trenton were very weak this year (and nothing com- pared to the competition Canton faced in the Mumford District), but you still have to give Salem credit for its post- season accomplishments, the second-

place finish in the Sub-8, and a final 16-7 overall record.

For this Salem team showed charac- ter and sheer guts in overcoming all the regular season problems and accomplished something no other Plymouth girls basketball team has ever done.

Plymouth Salem's boys' basketball team hasn't played a game in two weeks.


The last time the Rocks played was Friday, Dec. 2 when they murdered Allen Park 81-54 to raise its record to 3-0 for the year.

After two straight idle Tuesdays, sandwiched by last Friday's snow-out of the Dearborn game, Salem found itself without game action for the past two weeks.

The Rocks haven't been truly tested yet this year and will travel to Red- ford Union tomorrow night to battle the Panthers. RU is thought by many to be the Rocks' main competition this year for the Sub-8 title.

How will the the Rocks react to this tough away game after their two-week lay off? We'll find out tomorrow night.

# Chief swimmers finally beat Ypsi

Winning eight out of 11 events, the Plymouth Canton boys' swimming team edged Ypsilanti, 87-85, in its first meet of the season at the Braves pool Tuesday night.

It was the first time in the team's history that it came out of an Ypsilanti meet on the winning end.

The Chief's 200-yard medley relay foursome of Kline, Petersen, Steve Wood and Dave Smith placed second in 1:47.94. They were edged by Ypsi's team by only four-tenths of a second in the first event of the night. "I thought we were in trouble then," said Faunce.

Gaab finished third in the 200-yard individual medley in 2:22.9. He also placed second to Petersen in the 100- yard butterfly with a time of 1:02.4.

Wood was victorious in the 50-yard freestyle with a :24.1 clocking and was followed by Smith in :25.6.

Wood also came in third in the 100- yard freestyle in :52.3.

Smith placed second in the 500-yard freestyle, and Jeff Seiple finished third in the 100-yard backstroke.

John Gray placed fourth in the diving competition with a score of 133.1. Steve Gray, no relation to John, fin- ished fifth.

Canton will host Western Six League opponent Walled Lake Western tonight in its first home meet at 7 p.m.

# Thurston edges Rocks for its own tourney crown

With individual champions in seven of the 13 weight classifications, Redford Thurston last weekend, for the second season in a row, won its own wrestling invitational.

The Eagles put together 205 1/2 points, well ahead of runner-up Plymouth Salem, which totaled 167.

Other area squads in the eight-team field were Plymouth Canton, fourth place, 84 points; Redford Bishop Borgess, fifth, 49; Livonia Churchill, sixth, 42; Livonia Bentley, seventh, 18; and Redford Union, eighth, 14.

The Eagles scored a majority of their points in the lighter weight classes.

Tom Arsenault, 98 pounds; Brian Galdes, 105; Jim Boyer, 112; and

Buddy Ault, 119, all finished first in their respective divisions.

Plymouth Salem was next in line with four champions—Rene Leist, 126 pounds; Jim Ross, 132; Wally Brown, 165; and Bob Dasher, heavyweight.

Scott Collins, a Plymouth Canton grappler at 145 pounds and a state finalist last year, won his weight class at the Thurston Invitational and was named the meet's Most Valuable Wrestler.

Three other area matmen also took titles during the long day of competition. Kevin Ault, 138 pounds, and Bob Cutsinger, 178, both from Thurston, and Kyle Heaton, 155, from Plymouth Canton, earned individual accolades.

The championship match between Cutsinger and Scott Piper, from Plymouth Salem, was especially exciting in that the two had to go into overtime before Cutsinger scored a 3-2 victory.

"I was very pleased with the performance that the boys did," said Thurston coach Jim Urlick. "Of the 13 boys who wrestled, 12 placed. We had six firsts, four seconds and two thirds which is extremely outstanding in any tournament."

"Every boy did an outstanding job as an individual effort," Urlick continued. "We have a team concept at Thurston where when one is wrestling, the others cheer him on."

Thurston placed 10 wrestlers in the finals while the Rocks saw seven grapplers in the championships.

In all, Salem placed 11 of its 13 wrestlers in the consolation and championship rounds.

"Originally I thought if we placed 11 we would win," said Salem coach Ron Krueger. "We placed 11 but didn't get the help from other teams like I thought."

Leist's victory at 126-pounds was his 12th consecutive win without a defeat this season. He pinned his first 10 opponents to set a new school record.

Dasher remained unbeaten with a 6-0 record. He missed the past two weeks because of muscle injuries.

Brown raised his mark to 11-0-1.

Ross currently stands at 11-1, Piper holds a 9-1 mark, and Vipperman is 11-2.

# Provincial Cup to Highlight 1978 Winter Race Schedule

The Winter Meet, that's what it's all been about at Windsor Raceway since the track opened in 1965.

And the 1978 version should be no different, stretching from Sunday night, Jan. 1 to Sunday night, April 9 without interruption.

Windsor will present seven programs per week, Tuesday through Saturday nights at 7:45 p.m., Sunday night at 7 p.m. and a matinee card on Saturday afternoons beginning at 1:30 p.m.

The lone exception will be Super Sunday, Jan. 15 when the card will be presented in the afternoon at 1:30 p.m.

And, as usual, the highlight of the Winter Meet will be the Provincial Cup, a free-for-all invitational which traditionally is the first big competition of the year for the best pacers in North America.

The Provincial Cup, again worth \$50,000, is tentatively scheduled for Thursday night, April 6.

There have been no invitations issued yet and therefore no commitments, but raceway officials have talked privately with several owners and an outstanding field is likely to be lined up by race secretary Terry McDonnell.

Included in the list of possibilities is Governor Skipper, who is almost a cinch to be named 1977 harness horse of the year when the results of the United States Trotting Associations's poll are announced next month.

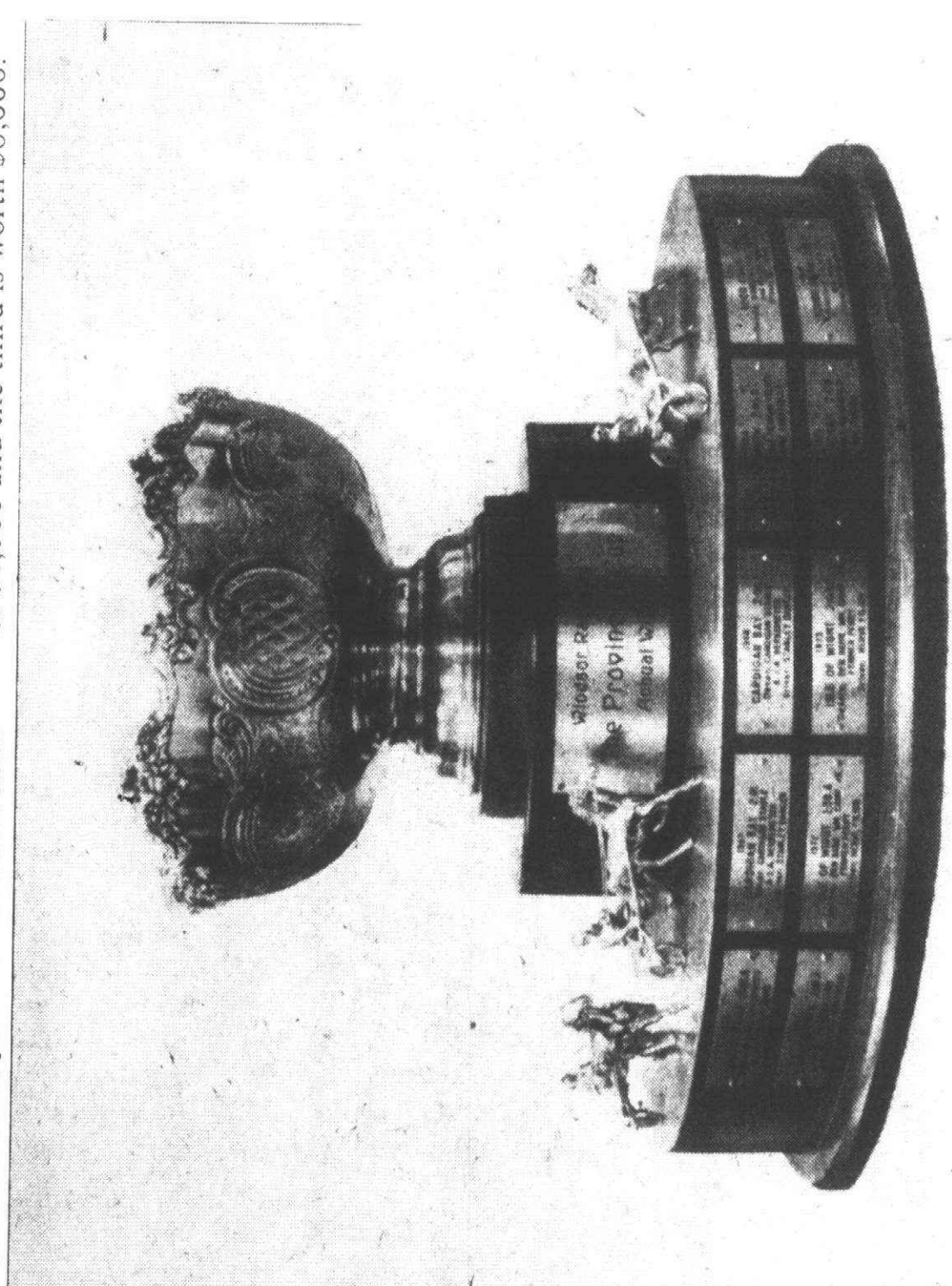
Also expressing interest in having their horses ready for the Cup, after a long winter layoff, are the owners of such outstanding 1977 competitors as Rambling Willie, the sport's newest millionaire; Super Clint and Nat Lobell, two-thirds of the fabulous Jack Kopas-trained trio of outstanding three-year-olds in 1977, and Why Bill, winner of Windsor's last Continental Cup, a Fall Meet highlight.

closing stake event for three, four and five-year-old pacers.

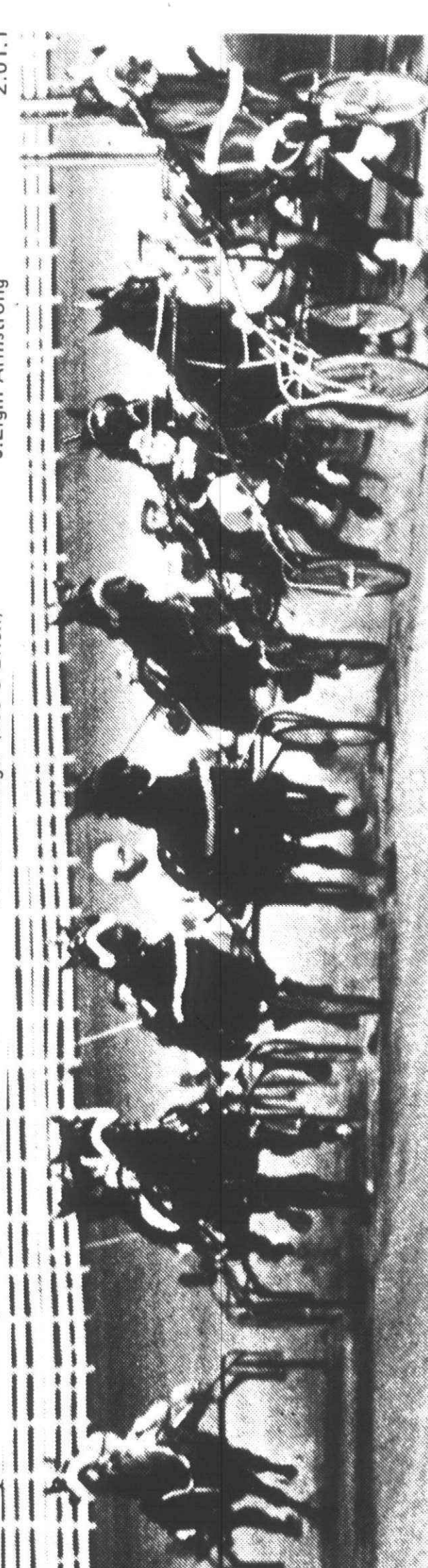
This competition is expected to draw some of the best in training of that age group and will be run in three preliminary legs and a final, plus a consolation final.

And, over the years, there has been no better proof offered than that by Windsor Raceway.

Constructed for wintertime competition, Windsor has time and again proven, with its Tartan racing surface, plentiful snow removal equipment, and outstanding winter backstretch facilities, that there has been nothing faulty about the track's original design.

In fact it took 10 full seasons for the track to be closed because of the weather. And it has only happened three times... on Dec. 2, 1974, Jan. 12, 1977, and more recently on December 9.

Monumental snowstorms were the reason of course, and in each instance, especially the latter two, racing probably could have been held except for the fact all roads leading to the track were so clogged that nobody could get there, including employees.

Back on Nov. 27, when most promoters of attractions in the Metro Detroit-Windsor area were throwing up their hands in horror over a six-inch snowfall and icy roads, Windsor Raceway was open for business and drew a crowd of 2,422 hardy souls.

Raceway officials still chuckle about the three cancellations, too, although the fans who were involved might not.

Each time a few cars struggled through the snow and arrived in the parking lot, the fans, particularly in 1974, basing their decisions on the fact that Windsor had never closed before.

It can happen to the best of them and that's what Windsor is... the best of them for wintertime harness racing.

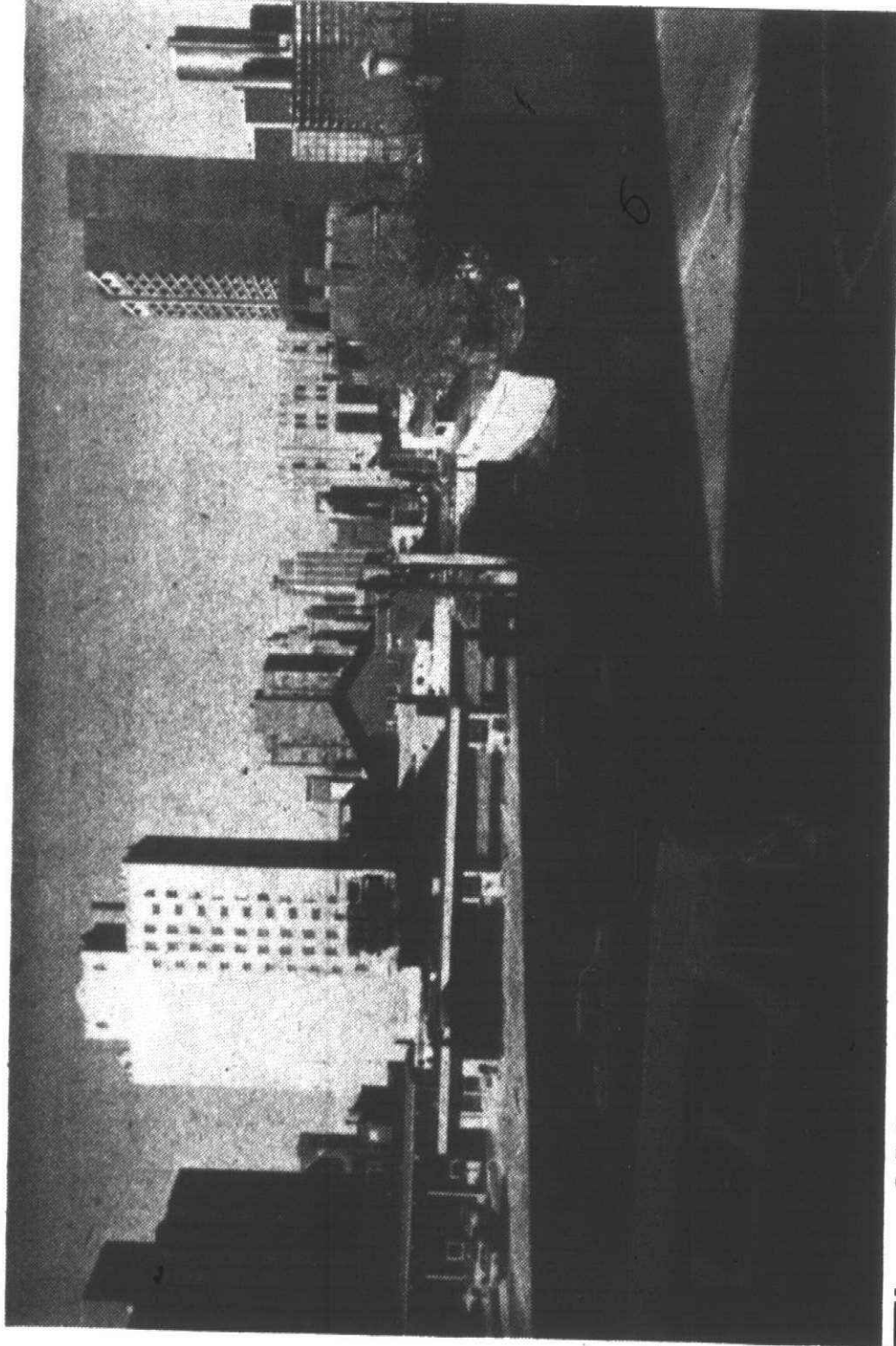

For non-motorists, bus transportation is available through the tunnel either at the Detroit entrance or across the street at the new Renaissance Center.

The Ambassador Bridge is directly linked to all major freeways, including the new Jeffries Freeway that has recently opened to I-275. Windsor Raceway is located only minutes south of the bridge. The preferred route to the track is along the river on Highway 18. It is a dual-lane road, well-lighted and is virtually free of stop lights.

If you have never been to Canada, a visit to Windsor . . . and to Windsor Raceway . . . will be an adventure you will long remember.

Just about 300 yards from the wire, Mel Mite went off stride, causing trailing horses to pull up or go around.

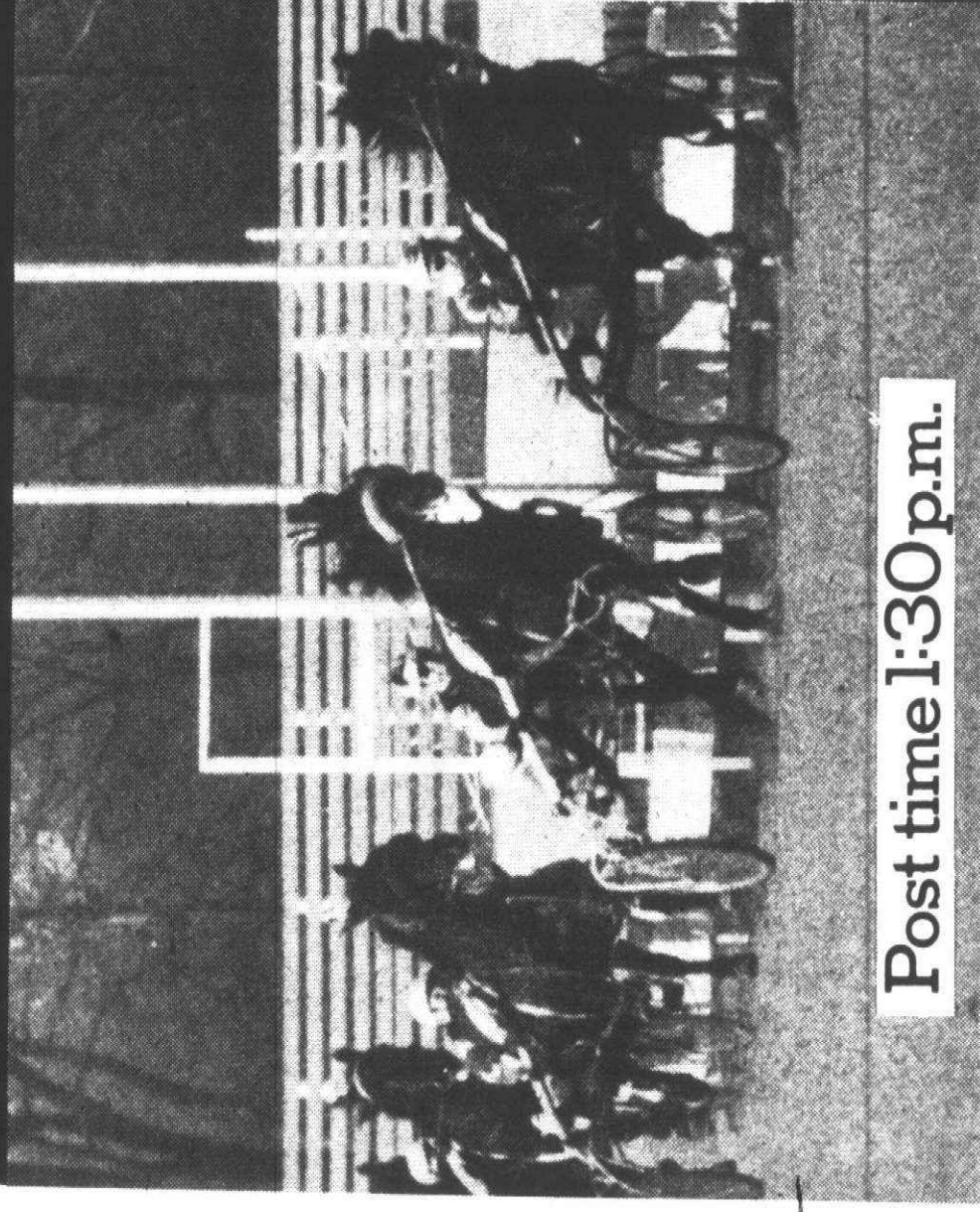
C Bs Queen and Diane Lee avoided the mix-up and came flying on the outside to pass Superb Freight just in front of the finish line.

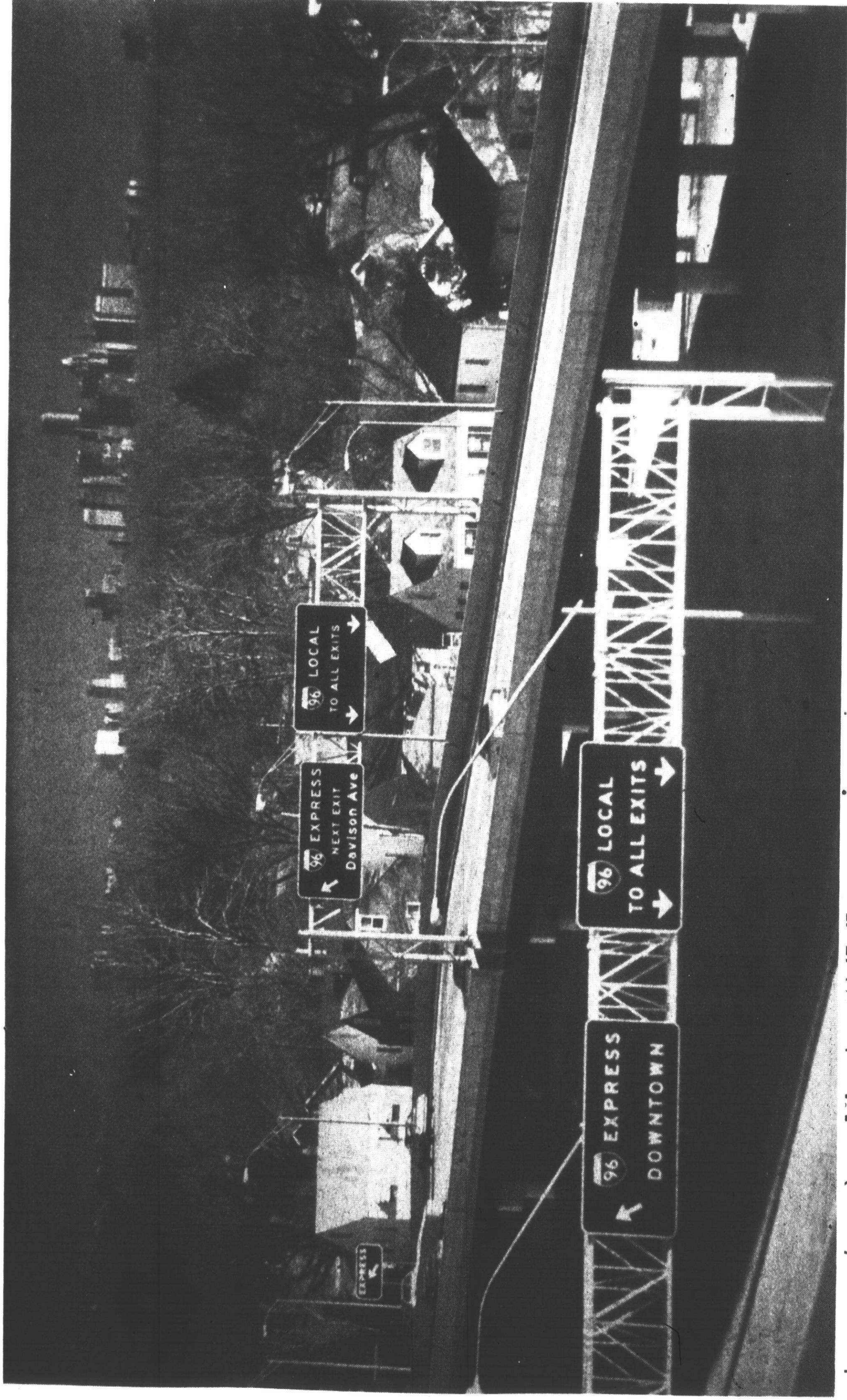
