

# Royal Holiday resident charged in murder

A 21-year-old Canton Township man is charged with three felony counts in the .22 caliber shooting death of Roger Hogan, 25, of Romulus.

Hogan was shot five times Monday evening in his home on Cherry Street after reportedly talking to an acquaintance, Robert E. Little, Jr., 21, of Canton. Little, police said, was interested in purchasing stereo equipment from the victim.

Little was arrested by Wayne County Sheriff deputies at his home in

Royal Holiday Mobile Home Park, Lot 182, within hours of the 11 p.m. shooting. Det. Robert Pond said Little was identified by a witness as the killer.

He was charged Tuesday with first degree (premeditated) murder, assault with intent to commit murder, and possession of a firearm in commission of a felony.

Pond said the witness to the shooting, Ms. Jeannette Costa, 23, of Romulus, told police she was at Hogan's home when the shooting

occurred and was also shot at one time by Little. Pond said Ms. Costa heard Little shoot her boyfriend twice on the basement stairs, saw Little come upstairs and shoot once in her direction, and then saw him head back downstairs where three more shots were fired.

Det. Pond said Little and Hogan knew each other for several years and that preliminary investigation reveals "no argument, no drinking and, at this time, no motive."

Pond said Little had a discussion with Hogan about buying stereo equipment and then left the house. He came back armed with a concealed .22 caliber pistol, according to police.

The two men talked in the basement, Pond said, and Little headed up the basement stairs, with Hogan following behind.

"He (Little) turned around at the top of the steps and fired two times,"

the detective said, "Hogan fell down the steps or staggered down."

Upstairs, according to police, Ms. Costa, crouched next to a china cabinet in an attempt to hide. Little fired at her from a distance of approximately three feet, Pond said, and missed. The girl reportedly dropped down as if she was hit and Little headed back down the basement steps and fired three more shots at Hogan. In all, Hogan sustained five bullet wounds.

Ms. Costa left the house and called sheriff deputies from a neighbor's home, Pond said. After placing the call, according to police, Little allegedly caught her outside and beat her with the pistol. The accused then fled, according to police, and was arrested at his home by deputies when he was identified by Ms. Costa as the assailant. No pistol was recovered by police.

Little was placed on \$50,000 bond by 34th District Court Judge Henry Zabrowski and faces examination Jan. 11.

## Board overwhelmingly approves golf club buy

Canton Township trustees voted Tuesday to commit \$1 million towards the purchase of the 18-hole Fellows Creek Golf Course.

The course will be paid off through issuance of 20-year bonds and most township trustees believe the course will take in much more money each year than the estimated \$85,425 annual bond obligation.

Trustee Robert Myers, the sole dissenter in the 6-1 vote, said he doesn't believe a golf course will benefit most of Canton's residents. "Higher priorities," according to Myers, were establishing a library or purchasing a permanent senior citizen and recreation building.

Trustee Lynne Goldsmith—often Supervisor Harold Stein's most persistent adversary—seconded Stein's motion to buy the club from principal owner Whitney Ballantine through a 20-year bond program.

STEIN SAID he expects Canton will make more than \$125,000 a year on the course. The estimate is based on an appraisal prepared by Edward J. McDonnell Appraisal Co. of Farmington Hills.

The appraisal places the market value of the Fellows Creek property at \$1,200,000.

Canton Trustees learned last week that a federal recreational grant will cover \$200,000 of the \$1 million purchase price.

The purchase has not been formally accepted by Whitney Ballantine and the rest of the current golf course stockholders but trustees said that the negotiated asking price was \$1 million.

Finance Director Michael Gorman explained that Ballantine signed an agreement with his real estate agent stating that \$1 million is the selling price on the already-developed course at 2936 Lotz, between Palmer and Michigan Ave. "We have an option on it until Dec. 31, so he has to accept our million dollar offer," Gorman said.

Goldsmith said she supported the golf club purchase because of the accountant and appraiser's consensus that it will be a source of surplus revenue for the township.

"That's what did it," she said. "If I didn't think it would pay for itself, I wouldn't have been so enthusiastic."

HOWEVER, Myers remained convinced the purchase wasn't a good idea.

"I know I come across as a very negative individual," he told the other trustees, "but if the board was people-oriented in their approach to government, I wouldn't have to vote against many of these motions."

"I have no idea whether the golf course will be self-supporting or a money-making proposition," Myers said.

"I think there are better things to do with \$1 million of the taxpayer's money than tie it up for 20 years in a golf course."

"It seems to me that the township board is no longer people-oriented. We spend money like it's coming out of the taxpayer's pockets, not ours."

Other board members replied that if the township makes money annually on the golf course, they couldn't see

how Myers could say the township board was spending taxpayer's dollars.

STEIN SAID ANY money taken in above the bond payment will be diverted to other recreation programs. A management firm will run the golf course, not Canton Township, but Stein would not say what company or individuals are being considered to manage the club.

The bond sale will be financed through Canton's Building Authority. Citizens have the opportunity to petition for a referendum on the bond issue within 45 days of Tuesday's vote. The bond sale must be approved by the state Finance Commission.

## Bullard's furniture is closing

One of Plymouth's most colorful figures is going to retire and Main Street may never be the same.

Standing in the middle of a conglomeration of chairs, benches, tables and maps in all manner of disrepair, A.M. Bullard admitted that he has come to the end of the trail in business and from now on was going to do nothing.

"I've had 30 wonderful years here at 271 N. Main, but the time has come for me to take things easy and I can't think of a better way than just doing nothing."

As he looked out of the dust-covered windows, he recalled that Plymouth hasn't been the same since Daisy Air Rifle left.

"There are only a few of the old-timers still here. There's Wendell Lent and Perry Richwine and a few others, but I miss Ernie Allison and the Chevrolet dealership. Old Main Street was a great place and I enjoyed every minute I spent here."

THE OLD furniture dealer is not a native of Plymouth. He is a self-styled "down east Yankee" who passed his 74th birthday last September.

Born in "Yankee" country, he came to Michigan in 1924 to work in the Graham-Paige Motor Co. in Wayne.

When Graham-Paige left he opened an appliance store in Wayne, but didn't like it and turned to his first love—antiques.

At that time, he took over the present store from Harry C. Robinson, the old auctioneer who used to drive stagecoach through the area.

"Robinson was a fine lover of horses and he left me a large number of famous pictures," he said. Then picking up one of his dusty frames, he brushed off the glass and said, "Here's Dan Patch, one of the most famous horses of all time. He paced the mile in 1:56 right after the turn of the century."

When the Robinson store became available, Bullard turned away from antiques, saying you can't make a living by selling antiques.

"They're a hobby, and I stressed used furniture and sold pieces to many of the families in Plymouth. In fact, they came from all over and business was fine."

ONE OF HIS prize pieces these days is an old record book of his sales and he's forced to laugh every time he

## Police stay mum on Dec. 8 killing

A week after the body of David Lee Cischke was found by police tracking dogs in a snow bank behind the Plymouth Seventh Day Adventist Church, Washtenaw County Sheriff's detectives remain tight-lipped about the apparent ambush murder.

Cischke, 26, was a part-time caretaker for the church at 4295 Napier Road, near Warren Road, just outside Canton Township's western boundary. He lived in a house on the church property.

He was found last Wednesday in a snow-covered field 300 feet behind his house, according to police, five days after he was reported missing.

Detectives said he had been shot a number of times with a small calibre weapon sometime during the evening of Dec. 8 after returning from his full-time machinist's job at Garden City Auto Parts.

Investigating officers said the heavy snowfall of Dec. 8 hampered attempts to follow tracks at the scene and locate the body. Det. Sgt. Charles Anderson said no arrests have been made and officers are pursuing a number of leads.

"I HOPE THEY find whoever did this," said Audrey Cischke, of Redford Township, the victim's mother. "I don't know who would want to hurt him. He was a good boy and always had a smile for everyone."

Two of Cischke's brothers also said they had no idea why anyone would want to kill their brother. "There's no reason at all," said his brother, William, of Redford. "Everybody loved him."

"We have a lot of suspects as a matter of fact," Det. Anderson said. "We're checking out everybody who looks decent or good."

Police said four bullet casings were found in the door of Cischke's house and that shots had been fired from inside and outside of the house.

Cischke was apparently shot outside the house, Anderson said, and fled into the field to the rear of the house to escape his assailant.

The house was ransacked, and the phone inside was dangling from the hook, sources said, but Cischke's van was left undisturbed in the driveway.

William Tyler, assistant manager of Garden City Auto Parts, called Cischke a "good worker. He was here every day on time. He was a pretty good guy." Tyler added that Cischke, who was divorced late this summer, was not in any trouble "that I know of."

ALTHOUGH CO-WORKERS said Cischke probably got home "about 9:30 or 10 p.m.," Thursday, Dec. 8, police said they "wouldn't definitely pin it down" to that time.

Police refused to specify the type of weapon used in the apparent murder or the number of bullets found in the body. Anderson said Cischke had been "shot repeatedly" by a small calibre gun.

The Washtenaw County Medical Examiner refused to release any autopsy information on the case.

A. Anderson said that anyone with information that may help the investigation should contact him or Det. William Gillis at 971-8400.

## Parents respond to Anchor Inn lawsuit

John Wilson of Plymouth issued a statement this week responding to allegations made in a lawsuit concerning the death of six Plymouth area youths last July near the Anchor Inn in Pinckney.

The Dec. 15 editions of the Canton and Plymouth Observers reported the liquor license of the Anchor Inn had been revoked, and included an account of a lawsuit filed by the William Cook family against the John Wilson family and the Anchor Inn.

The news account did not include Wilson's reaction to the lawsuit. The Observer regrets the omission and apologizes for any personal embarrassment caused by it.

The following is a letter to the editor from the Wilson family:

"LAST THURSDAY, the Plymouth and Canton Observer published an article on the front page of both newspapers reporting that the Anchor Inn in Pinckney has lost its liquor license and also that a \$1 million dollar lawsuit has been filed against Plymouthites Mr. and Mrs. John E. Wilson for their apparent negligence in entrusting their car to their son, Bradley Wilson, who along with five other boys was killed on the morning of July 23.

"The Observer in the news article reports on a lawsuit filed in Wayne County which intimates that Brad Wilson had a 'bad driving record' and a 'propensity for drinking.'

"The truth of these charges will someday be settled in our courts. The Wilson family knows these charges are not true, but choose not to discuss the

validity with any public media, particularly when such inept reporting as illustrated in the Observer's article of Dec. 15 presented an incomplete story that inferred false opinions and tend to destroy people's real character by not reporting both sides.

"The Observer news article simply explains that 'attempts' to contact Mr. and Mrs. Wilson for their comments on the charges in the lawsuit were 'unsuccessful.'

"I understand the reporter felt our phone number was a private listing, so he could not make contact. This is untrue. Any information operator would have given him the Wilson phone number.

"What a tragedy that such a one-sided news article was permitted to be published."

"MY SIXTEEN-YEAR-OLD son has been depicted as a booze guzzling, dangerous delinquent driver.

"This, as so many people in the Plymouth community know, who were privileged to have known Brad, have shared his friendship, his infectious happiness, his sixteen-year-old ideas, his leadership qualities, his true and human feelings for all those people who touched his life, is not the Brad as pictured in the news article.

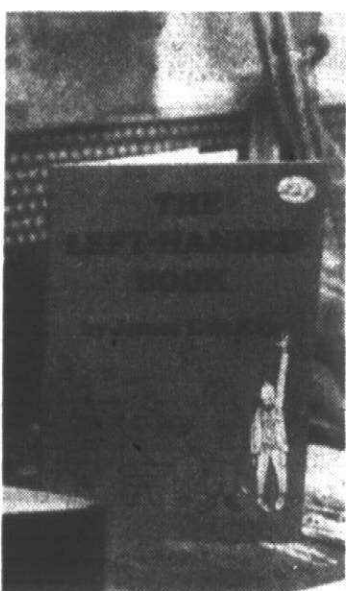
"It is unfortunate that some readers of the Craig Piechura story will never know Bradley Wilson.

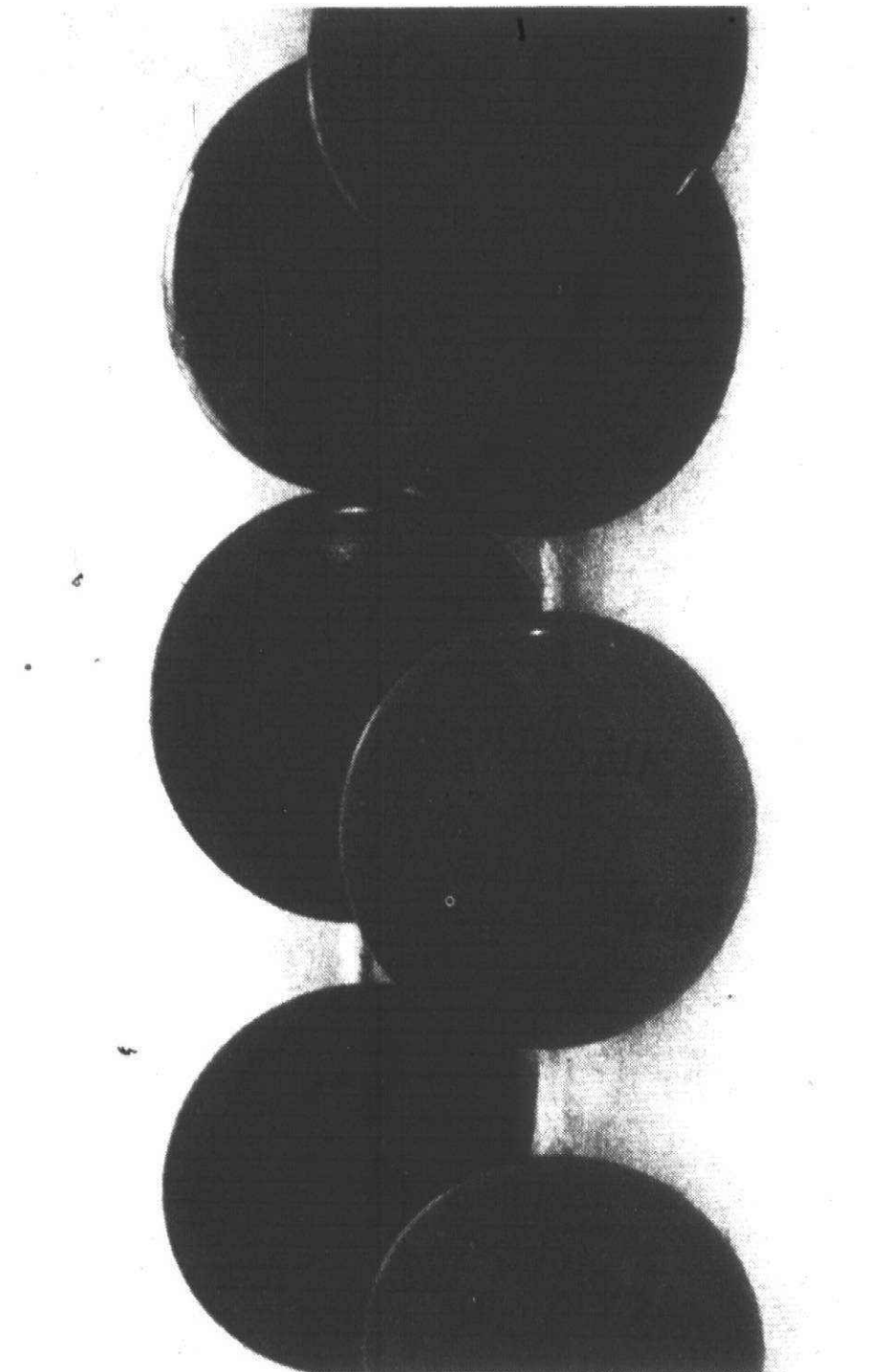

## New shop opens for southpaws

Left-handers take heart. No longer is there any reason for you to feel embarrassed trying to get along with tools or utensils designed for right-handers. There's a new shop in Plymouth that is ready to change those disappointing moments for you. And it matters little whether you are an elderly lady who spends most of her time knitting or a bartender who get all twisted up trying to use a right-hand corkscrew.

THIS LITTLE store, almost hidden away on Main Street, has any number of things designed just for the southpaws. And although it has been opened

only two weeks, the unusual center, named The Potpourri Shoppe, already is building up a clientele.

The shop is quite an addition to the specialty shops for which Plymouth is gaining quite a reputation. It is being operated by Anne Valentine and Ida Silver.

Anne, a Westland resident, is the manager of the shop that is a glamorized old home at 728 S. Main Street, and the one who decided on Plymouth for their venture, because it was such a nice place.

Picking up a notebook, she called attention to the spirals for loose leaves. "You see," she said, "the left-handers always were getting their sleeves caught in the spirals. That's remedied now with the spirals on the other side."

WALKING THROUGH the displays there seems to be something for every left-hander. There were the corkscrews and left-hand can openers.

"Did you ever see a left-hander trying to use a right-handed can opener?" Anne asked. "They get their hands and arms twisted. There's no need for that any more—here is a left-handed can opener."

## 'Jaws' excites Canton firefighters

"Jaws" may be last year's movie but it's the hottest thing going in the Canton Fire Department.

The "Jaws" that has everybody excited is not a killer shark but a hydraulic power tool purchased by the township for Canton Rescue to help free people trapped in a wreck.

The \$5,360 unit arrived at the fire station Tuesday and Lee Gray, an instructor with Michigan Fire Rescue, the company that sold Canton the unit, taught Canton firefighters the proper way to use the tool.

It didn't take the group long to start using their Christmas present on a pair of junked cars—smashing, ripping, bending vehicles in the process. All this destruction had an instructive purpose, but fire fighters obviously enjoyed being able to do legal vandalism on the autos.

**THE AWESOME** Hurst Power Rescue Tool, known by its nickname "Jaws of Life," features twin forged titanium arms, capable of opening and closing with a force of six tons at its

tips. The tool has a potential spread of 32 inches, and is used to pry open jammed doors, raise steering columns from trapped motorists, or even lift a car or truck off the ground.

A pair of power shears that comes with the unit can be attached to the arms to cut through to a trapped accident victim. And heavy chains can be attached to the arms of the unit to pull crushed steel away to free a motorist or passenger.

The "Jaws" tool is powered by a cage-mounted, gasoline powered Chrysler motor connected to the Jaws by pressure hoses.

Even though the rescue tool weighs a whopping 65 pounds, it is recommended that only one man use it at a time. Gray explained that experience has shown that the greatest danger with the machine, is the possibility that one person will hold the machine while another presses the button to activate the Jaws.

"THIS MACHINE was designed to save a trapped motorist in the quick-

est possible manner but, like any powerful tool, if it's used wrong it can take a life," Gray said.

Gray spent much of Tuesday instructing fire fighters on the machine and encouraged them to ask questions for their own sake.

"I don't mean to sound like a hard guy, but there are people who didn't care to listen who have lost their fingers."

He told the class that the first thing they should do is put contact paper over the windows to catch the glass which is broken out before the jammed door is attacked.

Gray and two volunteers used the jaws to split the top "Nader bolt" located in a car door's lock. From there, they worked down, splitting the bottom hinges and removing the door in a little more than a minute.

The power shears were used to cut through the front support posts of the roof. A bite was also made in the roof, on each side of the car, at a point about halfway between the windshield and the rear deck. Canton Fireman Bill Grady was ordered to give the roof a karate chop along side the two

cuts. From there, three men literally peeled the roof back, which allows easy access to a person trapped in the front seat.

There are two methods of removing the steering column from a victim's chest or legs and both were demonstrated. One method involves placing the Jaws on the floorboard and opening it up; the other uses a chain attached to the bumper and the steering wheel.

At the demonstration, Supervisor Harold Stein got into the act. He donned a helmet and gloves and learned how to use the machine. Stein said he considers the lifesaving unit a necessity in a modern fire-rescue department.

After the training demonstration Fire Chief Mel Paulun said the tool is expensive but said that Canton's proximity to the I-275 expressway makes the purchase justified. Paulun also mentioned that two airports are in the Canton area—Mettetal and Willow Run—and noted the power shears can be used to cut through heavy airplane metal in event of an air crash.

## Where the elite meet to eat

New York has its Sardi's; Washington D.C. the Sans Souci; in Canton Township it's the Cyprus Gardens. All three are restaurants that have become THE social hub of the community.

A place to meet people for lunch, bump into the movers and shakers of the community and, hopefully, overhear the latest local scuttlebutt.

Spyros "Steve" Stylianou, the proprietor of the above-named Canton restaurant has reason to raise a glass of red wine in a toast this week. This week marks the first week he can serve liquor in his establishment and this month marks the close of a very successful year for the transplanted Cypriot.

In 1975, when the restaurant first opened, it was little more than a coney

island snack bar. With this year's remodeling and revamped menu, Stylianou reports an 85 per cent increase in business at the restaurant. And he isn't about to stand still or rest off his laurels.

"One night in the week—I'm going to call it Ethnic Night—there will be live Greek music," Stylianou explains. "I have some friends who play in a band."

BUT STYLIANOU stresses that he isn't trying to turn the restaurant into a nightclub.

"I don't want to lose our reputation as a family restaurant just because we have our liquor license," he said. "We're not a bar. This is for people who enjoy maybe a little Greek wine, some Ouzo or a beer with their meal."

Many of the people eating in the restaurant Monday said they didn't need a new reason to go to Cyprus Gardens and didn't care that Stylianou is now licensed by the state to handle Ouzo and other dangerous substances.

"I come here because its very friendly; the minute you step in that door Steve takes time to say hello to you," said Herbert Mida of Belleville, a regular. "You get a good portion for your meal and the food is very good. Sure, I might have a highball with dinner, but that doesn't make a difference to me. You get that close contact with people and the proprietor here and that's rare these days."

Other regulars who were eating at Cyprus Gardens Monday for lunch were Supervisor Harold Stein, who ate his shish-kebob alone, and a contingent of off-duty Canton cops.

Most mornings, the restaurant at Sheldon and Ford roads is filled with construction workers from Canton subdivision sites. Builders who operate in Canton, meet monthly for a meeting in the restaurant where they plot their takeover of the former soybean fields. At night, some of the remaining farmers come in after working up an appetite in the field.

Journalists from four area news-

papers have been known to break bread and munch on lamb at the restaurant. Meals are usually followed by a hour-long publicity pitch from Stylianou, a tireless promoter ever in search of more ink on his establishment.

The Canton Chamber of Commerce is located next door to the restaurant and Chamber President Mary Pernia and Secretary Mary Dingelday can often be found there devouring their way to the bottom of a salad filled with beets, Feta cheese and an occasional pepper. Business people are wine and dined there by advertising types.

IF YOU'RE ONE of those people who believe the police officers are never around when you need one, next time you need one, be at the Cyprus Gardens. In one afternoon, officers from the Canton department stopped in, later two Wayne County sheriff's deputies sat down and a group of State Police troopers weren't far behind. Employees from Meijer's, Kroger's and Kmart also came in in droves.

And a good majority of the people who came in were greeted by their first name at the door by Stylianou and vice versa. Counting the 10 years he worked in a Dearborn restaurant, Stylianou figures he must know close to 10,000 people in the Detroit area by their first names.

It's good business to be nice to people, Stylianou explains, but he makes it clear that he also thinks it's nice to be nice.

"My son goes to Mifler School, so I invite his class in for a free lunch—35 kids and their teacher. I'd like to invite the whole school, give them free food and drink. The class I already had in wrote me nice letters and they took home the ala carte menus to their parents, maybe it will give me a little bit more business."

Steve and his wife, Rita, and their five children moved into a new home in Canton's Willow Creek subdivision this year.

That's one more reason why Main Street won't be the same. Bullard and the used furniture business have been a fixture for three decades and before that it was Robinson's, who not only was a dealer but a famous auctioneer as well.

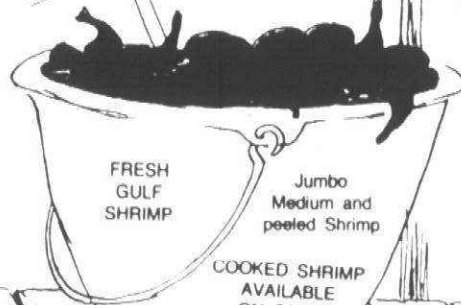

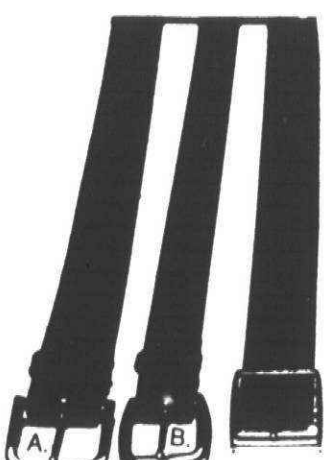

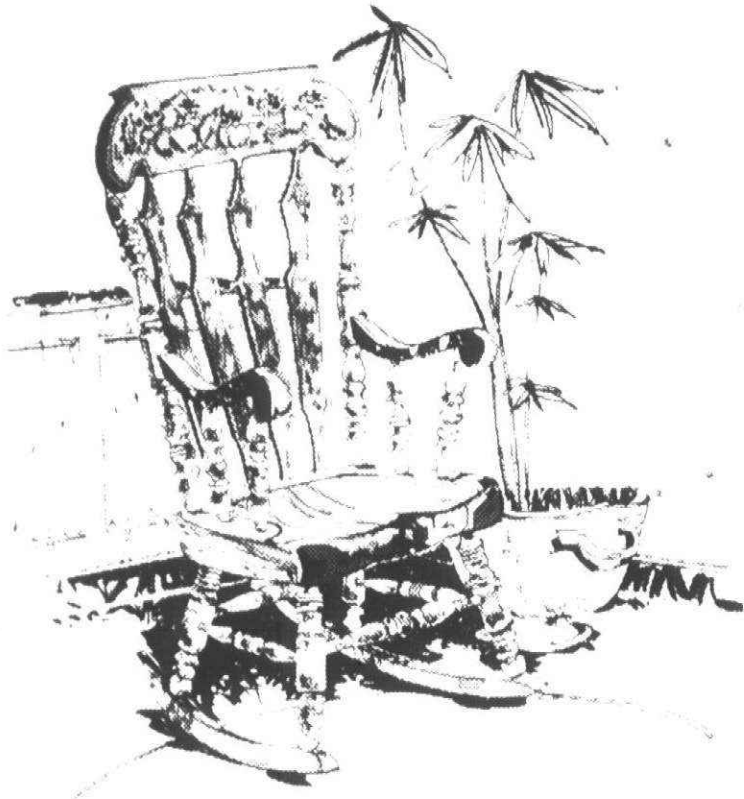

Some people in town were a bit unhappy over a recent column on the City of Plymouth's obligation concerning individuals in the Pilgrim Non-Profit Housing Corporation.

The private individuals for a number of years now have been trying their best to put together a housing project for senior citizens at Ann Arbor Trail and Mill Street. For many reasons a successful project never got off the ground, and the land continues in a fallow state.

One of the main objections to the column was that the private individuals are not investors, but guarantors of a loan. That is, they have "co-signed" a loan and agreed to meet principal and interest payments in case of default.

There has been no default on the loan yet, as all interest payments have been met. But the future is not bright because the vacant land isn't generating income to meet interest payments or other obligations such as property taxes.

The other objection made by the loan guarantors is that they had always received encouragement from

city officials to proceed with plans to develop a housing project on the Pilgrim Towers site. Although most Pilgrim individuals feel the city isn't legally obligated to assume personal funds they have invested, the do feel a moral obligation exists.

AND THE PILGRIM individuals aren't totally without arguments supporting their side of the long saga.

But in unravelling a complicated story we must begin at the beginning. At the time the Pilgrim individuals were first approached by a city official, or vice versa, Plymouth did have

## Holiday fire water needn't be dynamite

Take heart.

While there's no 100-proof cure for an 80-proof hangover, a noted stomach specialist has come up with five ways to ease those morning-after miseries.

Dr. Mitchell A. Spellberg, acting director of the division of gastroenterology at Chicago's Michael Reese Medical Center, writing in the December issue of Harper's Bazaar, prescribes these timely tips:

- Don't put your faith in the hair of the dog. Another shot is likely to make your hangover worse. In fact, says Spellberg, most home remedies have limited, if any, success.

- Fizz preparations that contain aspirin may ease a headache, but they irritate the stomach lining. Instead, swallow some chipped ice, which cools the stomach and reduces nausea, or sip some plain ginger ale.

- Coffee is not a magic bean: The caffeine may help keep you awake, but coffee can't sober you up. A potful won't straighten out your cerebral cortex, which is another way of saying your judgment will be too fuzzy for you to drive safely. Sleep it off or take a cab.

- It's all in the timing, so limit your alcoholic intake to about an ounce of 80-proof an hour. That's the average body's detoxification limit. Of course, you're better off knowing what your limit is.

- Food slows the rate at which alcohol enters the bloodstream, and can give your stomach a fighting chance. Just be sure that what you eat isn't spicy.

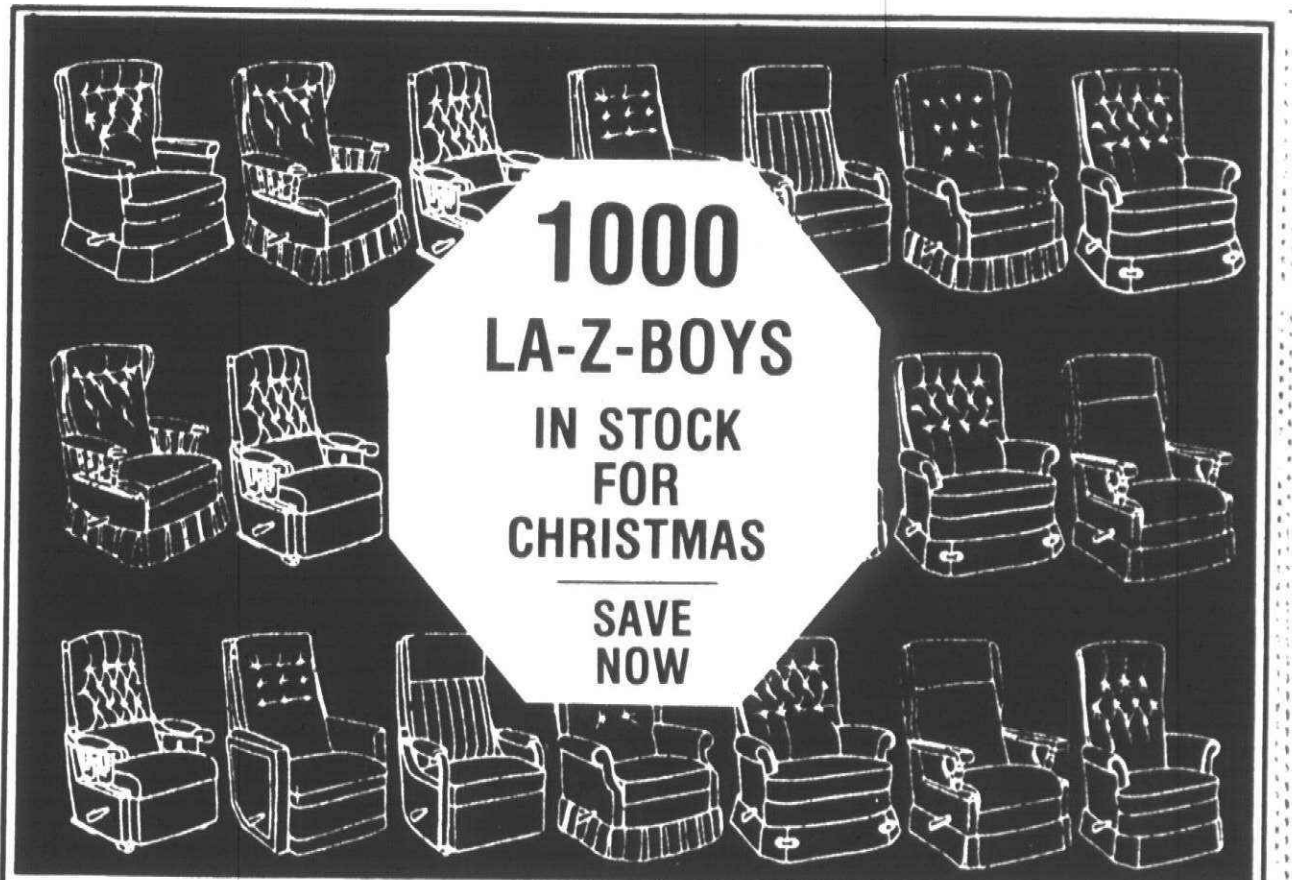

# Instructors worried about satellite's future

Schoolcraft College's long range plan has been to operate a main campus in Livonia and to set up satellite centers where appropriate.  
But at least one trustee and the leadership of the Faculty Forum are warning that the Garden City center in the former Harrison School is turning into a second "main campus."  
And they don't like it. There were arguments over several Garden City issues when the board of trustees met last week.

**THE VOTE** was 7-1 over the procedural matter of holding one meeting a year in the Garden City center. Trustee Mark McQuesten dissented on the motion to hold a special meeting there at 8 p.m. Wednesday, Jan. 11. The center is at 6701 Harrison, three blocks east of Middlebelt and north of Ford Road.  
"If there is any purpose to holding a meeting there, it should give people a chance to meet with us," said McQuesten. "In two years, no one from Garden City has come to see us there."

## Military nominees announced

Steven B. Horton of Plymouth Township has been nominated to a U.S. Military Academy by U.S. Sen. Robert Griffin (R-Mich.).  
Horton, son of Mr. and Mrs. Smith Horton of Plymouth, was one of 50 outstanding young Michigan men and women to compete for appointment to the nation's four service academies for the academic year beginning next July.  
The 50 nominees were selected from 489 applicants—53 women and 436 men—on the basis of grades, character, extracurricular activities, leadership potential, and the recommendations of high school principals and teachers.  
Griffin nominated 20 candidates for two vacancies at the U.S. Military Academy, West Point, N.Y.

Board Chairman Paul Kadish said he was "very much disappointed that no one shows" when the board meets in Garden City.  
Secretary Nancie Blatt and treasurer Harry Greenleaf said the board should meet "around the district." Trustee Rosina Raymond said "we need to get out of our ivory tower"—a reference to the Administration Building with its bell tower at 18600 Haggerty, Livonia.  
Garden City is something of a sore point, however, among the trustees. Although the center has more activity than any place but the main campus, Garden City voters have been the poorest supporters of Schoolcraft's property tax millage proposals.

**THE FACULTY** Forum Senate, in a unanimous position paper, noted the medical records program was shifted there last fall and the law enforcement program may be moved there.  
"The movement of whole programs to Garden City makes Garden City another main campus," it said.  
"It is regressive to drain money away from the main campus to duplicate services at the Garden City center. The quality of education at the main campus will decline, to provide a less-than-adequate education at the Garden City center."  
The Forum advocated teaching "basic courses" at the center but opposed placing entire programs there.

President C. Nelson Grote warned the board against commenting on the Forum statement because the union has filed a grievance over the transfer of the medical records program. "Until this is settled, it would be inappropriate for the board to comment on something that will go to arbitration," he said.

**IN ANSWER** to a complaint last fall from medical records students protesting the transfer of their program to Garden City, the board voted to subsidize a child care service there.  
The college will underwrite child care at the Red Bell Nursery in Westland at \$1.20 per child-hour. Estimated total costs will be \$115 per child per semester or a grand total of nearly \$700.  
Schoolcraft students who use the service will pay 50 cents an hour per child, same as at the main campus.

## Cops get cars

Plymouth patrolmen will be pulling speedsters over to the side of the road with a little more style within the next few months.  
The department is slated to purchase two new police cars from Colony Chrysler-Plymouth. A delivery date was not specified.  
The city commission unanimously approved buying the new cars at a cost of \$5,562 apiece.  
"I hope they get here real soon," said Police Chief Timothy Ford. "We have at least one car a day laid up for repairs and maintenance."

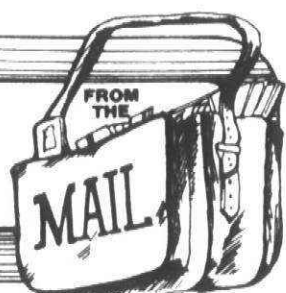

If anyone at Schoolcraft College is in doubt, "the college is open unless it's closed" on snowy days.

Apparently questions arose during the Dec. 9 snowfall when Schoolcraft stayed open while nearby schools and other colleges closed. Student Joe Ficorelli and the head of the faculty union told the board of trustees there was little campus activity that day, and most schools, including Wayne State University, cancelled classes.

President C. Nelson Grote said radio and television stations won't announce which schools are open—only the closings—and people should assume the college is open if they don't hear otherwise.

"IN MY BEST judgment, if people had made a reasonable effort they could have got here," Grote said.

"The only person who can announce a closing is the officer in charge—myself or whomever I designate. Administrators are involved in making the decision. Our policy is that we should be open if possible.

"We monitored the weather (Dec. 9). There was a full crew working on (campus) snow removal. At 5 a.m. it was OK. At 6:10 they advised me it was beginning to drift, and they had

some concerns about whether they could keep it open."

prote said he was able to get out his residential street, an unplowed cul-de-sac. "I came out to the campus personally. I did not make the judgment from bed," he said.

The president said he drove Six Mile, I-275, the Seven Mile hill and Haggerty Road at that hour. The roads were passable although the campus was "marginal... but we still had another 1 1/2 hours to go."

"THE VICINITY of campus" determines whether or not to close the school, said Grote. Citing an April 1975 arbitrator's decision about a staff complaint with keeping the campus open during a storm, Grote said, "The fact that other secondary schools with buses chose not to open, or another administrator with the same facts decided differently, is irrelevant." Board chairman Paul Kadish said "there is a policy, although there are those who question the judgment."

OTHER trustees and the union felt differently.

Trustee Rosina Raymond said, "We were the only ones open in April of 1975. I think everyone's too anxious to

stay open."

Trustee Mark McQuesten added, "I agree with Rosina. I said to myself, 'Don't go to work. It's an unnecessary

risk'... he went anyway.

"The radio was warning people to stay home and not to travel," McQuesten added.

# Remember birth, also words

Sometimes, to start a discussion or to crank the mind into operation, a question is used to stimulate thinking. Like, "if you knew you were going to die in 12 months, how would you change your life?" That question gets at quality of life. Most people end up saying they would not change hardly a thing.

Let me ask this brain stimulator: "Since Christmas is one of two great celebrations by Christians, and we do things at Christmastime that we do not do other times of the year, why shouldn't we do our Christmas thing all year around?" Or put it another way: "Why don't we act like Christmas all year around?"

There are two implied questions: first, is our behavior at Christmas heightened faith activity; and second, is our Christmas celebration really an expression of our faith? Your answer like mine may be yes and no. Yes, Christmas is based on my faith; and no, some of the things I do in December do not express my faith. You figure out your own answer. There may be a follow-up question asking, "if they are not faith expressions, then why do we do them?"

LET ME TELL the basic story in questions and answers—as if the question never heard of it before. "Why such a huge celebration called Christmas that lasts for at least four weeks?" Christmas is derived from Christ Mass. Mass is a religious celebration. Christ is the title given to a man who lived almost 2,000 years ago.

"Why is this celebration held at this time of the year?" Dec. 25 is the traditional date (not necessarily exact date) when the man called Christ was born. "What was his name?" His name was Jesus, the son of Joseph and Mary of Nazareth, in Israel, a tiny province of the Roman Empire.

"What does the title Christ mean—was he a king or emperor or president or leader, and who gave him the title?" This is the central question: why do we call Jesus Christ and celebrate his birthday?

First, it needs to be understood that Jesus was not a governmental leader. He was a rather obscure man from a rural province with no educational certificates or public opinion poll credentials or anything like that. He was, in fact, rather revolutionary in what he said. Not that he opposed the government, but that he questioned and challenged religious leaders. You should know he was tried for subversion.

judged guilty, and executed nine months later.

"Sounds more like Jesus was a small town radical than a man who should be remembered centuries later; so why the massive celebration?" Christians, those who follow Jesus, claim that he was spokesman for God, that in some way the will of God was presented through his life, and this wisdom is eternal truth. Those who have faith in God, as known through Jesus, believe they are living in another world right now—a world called the Kingdom of God.

"WOW! KIND of peculiar, radical isn't it? How do you know?" We believe that in searching for God, we really find God in the life of that one man—others as well—but especially in Jesus. We know, first, because of the Resurrection, but that is a story for next March. Put it this way: after Jesus died, his followers and disciples believed that he was still alive—this was the big Act of God.

"Now, I am confused. If Jesus was a rebel, going after the 'big men' and siding with the poor and all, how come the celebration today is by all the wheels and leaders and respectable people? Something must have happened over the centuries to change it

all?"

Good question. I guess my answer has to be a little confusing because over the years the "right" people came to like the stories and myths and delight of Christ Mass. The fact that the man Jesus was a radical leader seems to have been forgotten, but the celebration goes on. The Christian affirmation is that Jesus is Christ the Messiah. He brought to us the will and purpose of God. Christians affirm that if there is any way to find God, it is in the man Jesus who became Christ. And the extension of that is to say his birth was climactic for the world. So we celebrate Christmas.

Why don't we do our Christmas thing all year? It is simple: because we indulge ourselves at Christmas remembering the birth and forgetting the words—and the death.

We like the joy and wonder and ignore the challenge. And that makes us exploitable. So be it. Might I suggest that our wonder and joy be tuned to the "coming of God" which is remarkable instead of angels and lambs and incense? Might our celebration reflect the profound wisdom that Christmas conveys instead of the superficial tinsel that passes for Christmas?

The Christmas Eve Mass televised from the church has always thrilled me, and I would like to be one of the worshippers.

But the message that struck home the hardest when I visited the Bethlehem Church is the marvelous way in which God brings His Eternal Love to the world and your life and mine. Truly, "CHRISTMAS IS LOVE".

## Christmas—when holy becomes real

Two movies of recent vintage have addressed themselves to the question of how God involves himself in human affairs.

In a manner both off-beat and simple, George Burns sends messages to John Denver in the film, "Oh God." George Burns as God has a delightfully old-shoe quality about him.

By contrast, the posters from the film "Star Wars" assault us with that movie's own prayerful benediction, "May the Force always be with you." The Force is as mysterious and distant as George Burns is available and relaxed. Somehow, "Star Wars" stretches our imagination to believe that God is involved even now in a gigantic struggle for domination and power on the level of the galaxies. How does the distant become available? How does God become experienced in the human heart?

The Christian's answer to all of this has always been Christmas, the Incarnation, the En-flesh-ment of Christ. One of the old illustrations that borders on being a cliché concerns changing the letters and spaces in a typed sentence so that what once read "God is nowhere" is made to read "God is now here."

Perhaps it is better said by William Sloane Coffin, who writes:

"My lifelong battle with the divinity of Christ was largely resolved when I reversed the questions. Instead of asking to what degree is Christ Godlike, I began to ask, to what degree is God Christlike?"

On a simpler scale, it is fascinating to watch children attempt to bridge the distant with the near at hand.

One of our prized Christmas possessions is the nativity scene which sits in the corner of our dining room. This year it has become our small daughter's turn to be fascinated with the figures.

She moves them around, reassembling them piece by piece.

But there are intruders into the manger scene, for along with the Kings and Wisemen there now appear Ernie and Bert, Big Bird and the Cookie Monster and a host of other Sesame Street people.

The question as to whether the Sesame Street characters belong in a manger scene is academic. To a three-year-old, it is simply an attempt to bridge a world that she knows with a story that is just beginning to become important.

I trust that in our scattered homes there are countless traditions and experiences that help address the same question—how does the holy become real.

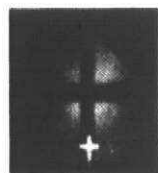

# How do we celebrate this special birthday?

Johnny finally rolled off to sleep the night before his birthday with excited thoughts of anticipation. He could hardly wait to be greeted by his mother and father and sister as he hurriedly dressed the next morning. But to his great surprise there were no "Happy Birthdays" floating around. "Well," he thought, "they are just keeping a surprise for later—perhaps at noon."

He rushed off to school. He thought the morning would never go by. At long last noon came—and went—still no word. "Well," he thought, "they are planning a surprise for dinner—maybe some of my friends will be invited in and we'll have a big time."

Slipping home quickly after school he found nobody there. His heart dropped, but then he thought, "I'll bet they are out planning something real exciting and different for a surprise." So he went off and played with some friends, until the great "looked-for" hour of dinner came. Still nothing out of the ordinary—everyone acted as normal as ever.

Then as a last resort he thought, "They are really doing a good job of cover-up and suspense. They must have planned an evening party with some of my friends invited in."

THE AFTER-DINNER hour was the most trying he had ever experienced. First he curled up in a chair and tried to read. Not being able to concentrate at that, he uneasily shifted from one activity to another, anxiously awaiting that great surprise. But to his dismay, no one showed the least interest in him. His father just sat there in his easy chair reading his evening paper.

After about an hour, anxiety turned to despair. Johnny became so frantic he burst out in tears and stomped up the stairs to his room. Father dropped his paper and started after him as he

said to mother, "I wonder what's bothering Johnny?"

Entering Johnny's room, father found him flung across his bed crying his eyes out. Upon being questioned, Johnny sobbed, "Don't you know today's my birthday and you didn't celebrate one bit?"

His father replied, "Why, of course, we celebrated your birthday; we couldn't forget that! This afternoon your mother and sister and I went downtown. I bought mother a new purse; mother bought me the most beautiful necktie; and we both bought your sister some fancy ice skates. We had the best time celebrating your birthday."

HOW UNBELIEVABLE this sounds. Yet hundreds celebrate Christ's birthday this way. What an excellent time this year to really celebrate Christ's birthday on Sunday in church.

Let's get the Christ back into Christmas. We think nothing of getting up on Easter morn at 6 or 7 a.m. for an early church service. Why can't everyone plan to center his Christmas around his church and celebrate Christmas in its rightful place. Deep down in our hearts we will have a better feeling if we have given a gift to Christ through the church of our choice.

Another minister, the Rev. Paul E. Holdcraft, put it this way:

"I would not do away with the Christmas gift, but I would try to teach both adult and child that swapping and trading are not giving, and that the only gift is that which comes from the heart of the giver who expects no material return."

"In other words, we must keep in mind the Bethlehem kind of giving, the giving that carries with it the benediction, that cheers the lowly and discouraged, instead of piling up useless rubbish in the laps of those who already have too much."

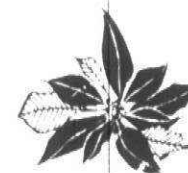

Old question:

Kids of all ages still love to wrestle with the question of the annual nocturnal visit by a saint—or is he an elf—and his distribution of gifts to the deserving.

Back in 1974 a young reader watched a television program about the famous Virginia O'Hanlon letter to the now-departed New York Sun. It didn't satisfy him. Possibly the part about the fairies dancing on the lawn seemed outdated and confusing.

There being no New York Sun to write to any more, he wrote to the Observer. The Observer editors wrestled with the question and finally held a contest among themselves on what we should reply.

By popular request, we reprint the young lad's letter and our winning response.

Editor:

I am in the third grade and I am 9 years old. At school I have a lot of friends and all my friends say that there is no Santa Claus.

Could you please let me know if there really is one? I would appreciate it if you would print your reply in the newspaper.

Thank you.

Dear Reader:

You're growing up and at 9 you're wise enough to understand that there are different kinds of Santa Clauses. You can believe in one or another—or not believe—as you choose.

We suspect the kind of Santa Claus your friends don't believe in is the one who appears in department stores shortly after Halloween and takes kids' orders. This Santa will give a person who has made a mistake a chance to start over and even add a smile and a pat on the back.

Our editors, who range in age from the 20s to the 70s, all believe in this second kind of Santa Claus. We find that increasing numbers of people believe in the Santa of quiet kindness and decency. Now that you're able to make up your own mind, we hope you will believe in this kind of Santa Claus, too.

No overtime there

No good reporter passes up a chance to peruse a politician's financial records—not after the kind of paperback rights deal Woodward and Bernstein got.

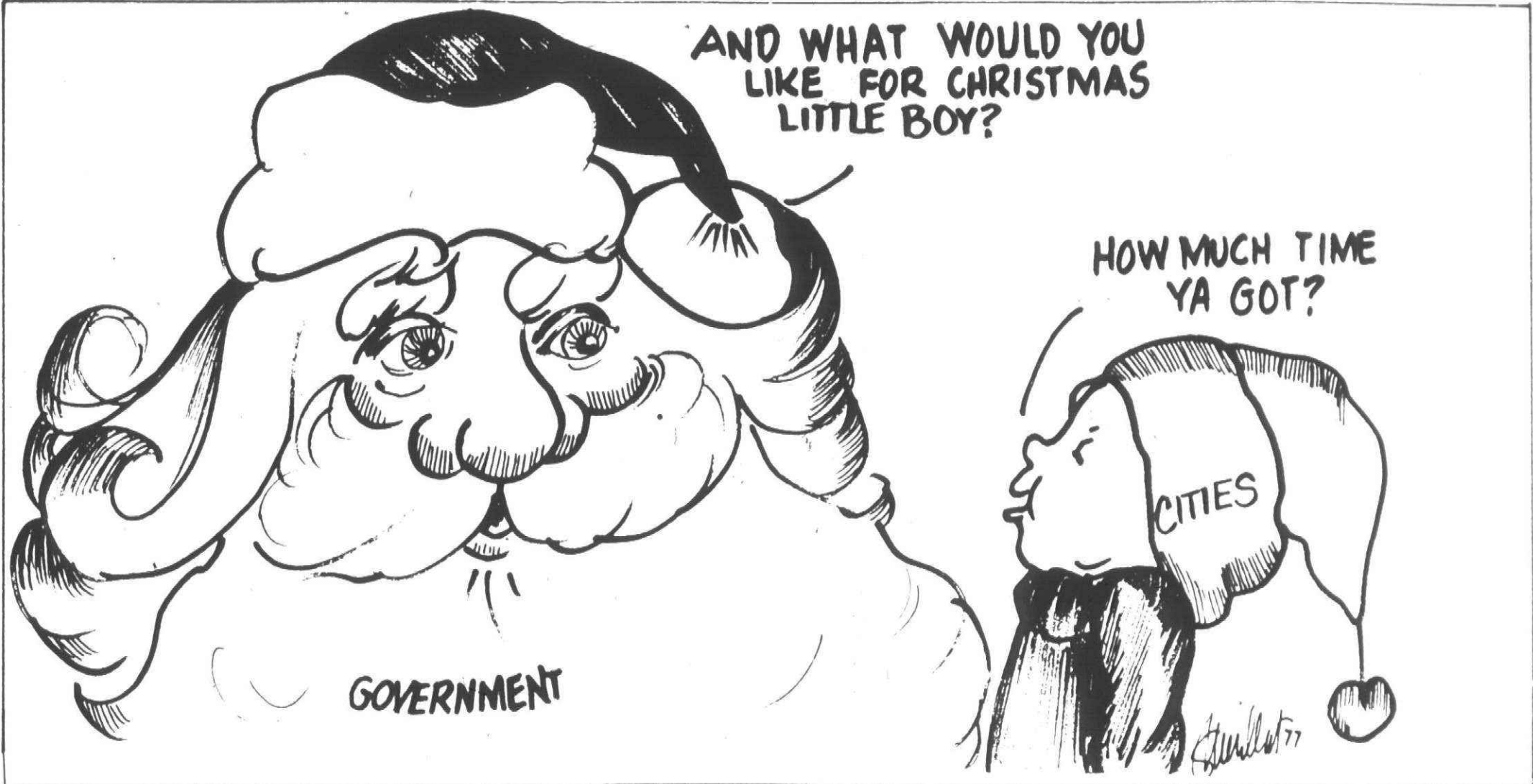

How 'tree stumps' bailed out big cities

Time was when Detroit politicians used to sneer at anything outstate as being "tree stumps"—outstate being defined as anything north of Ten Mile and west of Middlebelt.

Outstate was defined as rural and agrarian, and not interested in "people." Detroit politicians imagined they saw mammoth gravel pits full of hostility outstate. It was the enemy.

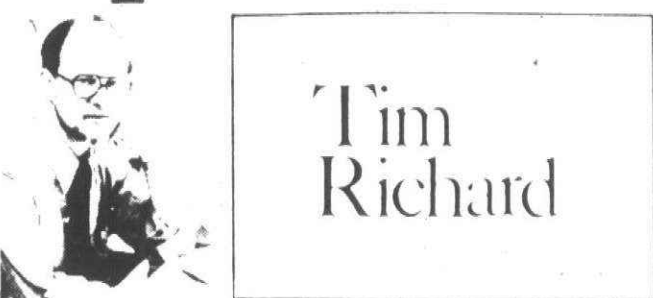
Nowadays, some of Detroit's best political buddies are outstate politicians. It seems they have a common interest—putting the squeeze on everyone else.

IT HAPPENED that the Michigan House of Representatives, after rejecting it once, voted approval of a \$12 million a year aid package of which the City of Detroit will get \$8 million.

The vote was 58-47. If you're quick at math you'll figure the 58 was just two votes more than the bare minimum needed for passage.

It wasn't just those nasty, property-loving Republicans who opposed it. Democrats like Tom Brown of Westland, Bill Keith of Garden City, Joe Forbes of Oak Park and Sal Rocca of Sterling Heights lined up with such Republicans as Jack Kirksey and Bob Law of Livonia, Sandy Brotherton of Farmington, Ruth McNamee and Jim Defebaugh of Birmingham and Rick Fessler of Union Lake.

Indeed, 10 of Observer & Eccentric area's 12 state representatives opposed the package, with



John Bennett of Redford absent and Roy Smith favoring it.

ROY SMITH? He's that fellow who used to be the Republican Ypsilanti Township supervisor before going to Lansing. His district, with all the gerrymandering that went on, now takes in much of the Plymouth community.

It seems the troops in Lansing took care of the eastern part of Roy's bailiwick. Ypsilanti is something of a state-impacted area, what with Eastern Michigan University, the forensics unit of the mental health department, the women's prison, a state police post and what-all out there.

"It's a game of compromise," said Smith. "You do something for me if I can do something for you." He should know.

Rep. Martin Butz, a Republican dairy farmer who hails from Rockford, said Detroit Reps. George Montgomery and Bill Ryan had been good to farm and rural interests and he didn't see anything good about "a one-way street all the time."

Some governments promote economy

Economic development is a cherished goal.

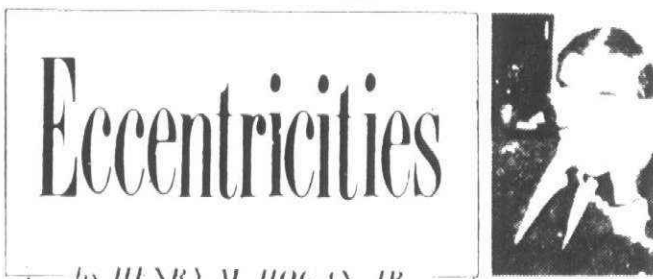
If a community can attract new business, it means more jobs, more tax base and more taxpayers. More jobs mean less spent on unemployment benefits and welfare.

Rarely do new businesses come to a community by accident or luck.

The State of Michigan, like the states surrounding it, has economic development staff members constantly romancing large manufacturers to situate in the state.

Laws have been passed allowing communities to set up economic development corporations to finance new plants with government-backed bonds. Other laws have been passed to give tax incentives to encourage choosing this state over a competing one.

The mayor of Detroit has recently proposed setting up an Economic Development Corporation for the City of Detroit and funding it to the tune of a million dollars a year, including a salary for the director of more than \$100,000 a year to help build up its tax base.



of the Super Bowl football classic to the Pontiac Silverdome in 1981.

Last year when Super Bowl was held in Pasadena, experts figured the economy of Los Angeles was improved by the sum of more than \$125 million during the five days preceeding the game. This came in the middle of January when the economy is not red-hot anyway.

It is predicted that if Super Bowl were held in this area, it would bring in \$60 million to \$80 million in a five-day period.

THE FINANCE committee of the county board

approved the expenditure, but it was scuttled by the full board when a group of commissioners led by representatives from Royal Oak and Southfield successfully pushed an amendment which cut out the extra money.

The irony is that Southfield, in particular, probably would have profitted from the appropriation more than any other city in Oakland County because it has the most developed tourist facilities. Detroit is getting a new face, and its economy is turning around because it is aggressively doing something about it.

Possibly the Oakland County Board of Commissioners is not sophisticated enough to recognize that pump-priming or investment in projects that could have a great effect on the economic development in the county is beneficial.

If that is true, the people who elected them should tell them that we all prosper when the area prospers.

# Unlike Buckeyes, Ohio gets clean win over state

Unlike the outcome of the Buckeye-Wolverine gridiron clash, Ohio scored a clean victory over Michigan in the competition for the \$500 million Ford transmission plant.

But it is not the disappointment of defeat that lingers as much as the episode itself. From this normally pro-business viewpoint comes a feeling of anxiety for what the future might bring if Ford had introduced a new procedure for planting its plants.

Providing assistance for taxpayers is one of government's most important functions. And to the degree that business and industry offer hope of a healthier economy and higher tax base, it is not unreasonable to assume that the extent of cooperation might surpass that offered the individual homeowner.

Yet the method chosen by Ford to decide upon a plant site smacks ever-so-slightly of tossing a side of beef into an arena of hungry lions.

IN A PROCEDURE termed "a bit unusual" by the director of the state's office of economic expansion, Ford invited several states to bid for the new plant. And the company outlined nearly two dozen requirements, including land for the site, utilities, highways, tax incentives and local financing.

What Ford got was: a land package worth more than \$5 million, including site improvements; about \$5 million worth of roads, and manpower training funds estimated in the millions. In addition, the Ohio Legislature passed special legisla-

tion providing tax credits for a new industry's machinery. It is estimated the new law will save Ford some \$2 million annually in taxes.

Ironically, it is estimated the economic-incentive package offered by Michigan matched Ohio's.

Presumably, the business-searchers in Michigan, Ohio and the other states competing for Ford's business know the value of such an installation.

So it should be conceded that the Ford transmission plant is worth everything that government offered.

BUT WILL THE PUBLIC always see it that way—in good times and bad?

In my opinion, Ford may not have had one of its better ideas when it opened the public bidding box. It is acting very much like the professional athlete who has just played out his option.

Even if the competition doesn't get out of hand, free land and millions of dollars in tax incentives are easily related to rising cost of land and increasing assessments by individual taxpayers who continue to pay without incentives.

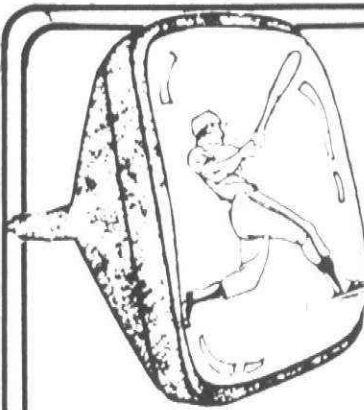

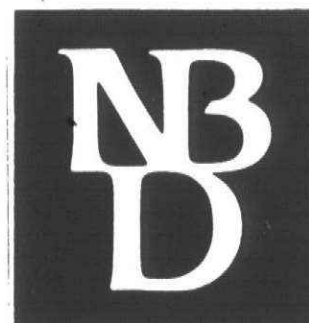

# Damman visits roots, runs for senate

Rochester has a special meaning for Lt. Gov. James J. Damman. Seven years ago, when he was a Troy city councilman, Damman announced his candidacy for the State House of Representatives in Rochester because he was running against two persons from that area of the house district.

Monday evening he was back, this time visiting the American Legion Hall with old friends and new supporters as he seeks a seat in the U.S. Senate.

Damman, 44, is seeking the Republican nomination to succeed Sen. Robert Griffin, who is retiring.

"THEY TOLD me nine years ago

when I announced my candidacy for the Troy City Council that it would be good experience, though of course I couldn't hope to win. They told me the same thing seven years ago when I ran for the legislature," he recalled.

Damman served a term on the council, then won two terms in the house before Gov. William G. Milliken invited him to be his running mate as lieutenant governor.

Rochester also has another, less happy meaning for Damman. It is the residence of Elizabeth Howe, who in 1974 was Oakland County Democratic chairman. Mrs. Howe scattered letters all over the state alleging that Damman, as a Troy official, had some funny land dealings with a Lincoln Investment Co.

The upshot was a series of newspaper stories and a formal, detailed investigation by the state attorney general. Damman was cleared of any wrongdoing, but the attorney general never commented on the morality of it all. The cloud has hung over Damman's head ever since.

DAMMAN NOW lives in Barry County, with a Lansing mailing address.

While his list of supporters doesn't include the big-money backers of Milliken and Griffin, he does list eight state representatives and two state senators. Among them are Reps. Wilbur Brotherton of Farmington and James Defebaugh of Birmingham.

## Now deck the halls for a sweet-smiling Yule

The presents are bought, the cookies are made, the cards are mailed.

It's time to bring in the Christmas tree and deck the halls with the sweet-smelling evergreens that put the finishing touches on the season.

Betty Smith, who came to the Northwest Branch YWCA in Redford township last week to teach women how to make door swags, centerpieces and candle-holders, teaches several natural crafts but puts her greens workshop at the end of each Christmas preparation season.

"The greens are perishable, but they're really nice to have in the house when it's time for Christmas," she said.

The scent of evergreens permeated the entire building as Mrs. Smith and her class began work on their decorations.

First the women selected boughs from a huge pile the instructor had provided.

"We use four basic kinds of evergreens," she said, "red cedar, regular cedar, white pine and balsam. These are the ones that hold up best, and they make for fuller decorations and have a better fragrance."

THE WOMEN who elected to make door swags started by wiring large balsam branches together for the base and then adding some of the other varieties for accent.

Mrs. Smith showed them how to arrange the pieces together so that the decoration would fit between the door and the storm door.

Then she demonstrated the making of huge red velvet ribbon bows to adorn the finished decoration.

"This is the simplest kind of bow there is to make," she said, adroitly twisting loops and then tying them together to form a big rosette.

A few big cones, the long variety produced by the balsam trees, completed the projects.

THE CENTERPIECES and candleholders, similar except for size, start with a base that holds a hunk of oasis, the porous material that holds water to keep plantlife fresh.

Balsam and cedar should form the main portion of the holders, Mrs. Smith suggested, with small boughs of the feathery pine put in last to add an airy touch.

Red or green velvet bows and candles in corresponding colors completed the sweet-smelling decorations.

Mrs. Smith, who lives in Wyandotte, has been teaching assorted natural crafts, including the making of apple dolls and pine cone wreaths, for several years, working with groups in the Downriver and Northwest YWCAs.

Two workshops in the Redford facility brought to more than 80 the number of women who had decked their own halls under her watchful eye.

"By the time I finish, my fingers go like this," she said, holding her hands in claw position, "but I like the work."

"The decorations are not difficult to make and they add a lot to the season."

## Once a piece of clay

# Dolls could become antiques

Their serious young faces with big eyes that seem almost to focus on the children staring in at them, can be seen through the holidays on the display shelves of the Redford Township Library.

They are porcelain and ceramic dolls made by Redford resident Katerina Smith, who not only fashions their heads, but their bodies and clothes as well.

Owner with her husband Charles of the oldest house in the township (1831), Mrs. Smith has a feeling for the past, which in the last five years has bubbled to the surface in the form of these handmade dolls that were a part of American households between 1865 and 1920.

Often in olden times, heads, feet and hands were sold to housewives, who then made the bodies. These women would be astounded had they come back to the Botsford Inn recently and seen one of these dolls, now called an antique, on sale for \$4,000.

"Some even go up to \$5,000 or \$6,000," explained Mrs. Smith. "They are so expensive to collect, I decided to learn to make them myself. It is really fun."

SO THOROUGH WERE HER studies that she now writes articles on her dolls for Ceramic Arts and Crafts magazine. One included in the January issue is on draped dolls, which have different clothing than the porcelain ones.

The doll is dipped in glue and her clothes drip right through onto the doll, making her stiff. Her ensemble is then painted with acrylic.

Mrs. Smith also teaches doll making both in her own home and at Ceramics by Marilyn at Seven Mile and Merri-man in Livonia.

"Making dolls is not as difficult as it sounds," she said. "Tonight I'm working with a group of Girl Scouts and they do a good job."

It is hard to believe that the faces of these lovely little creatures with their flawless complexions start as an egg-shaped piece of clay stuck at an angle on another piece of clay, the neck.

"You mark off a T in the middle of the egg to keep things in proportion," reported the dollmaker. "Then out two pieces of paper to show what eye shape you want and where you plan to put them, and you pin them on the clay."

"I model the nose off the doll on a piece of foil. Then I score the back of the nose and press it into position."

MRS. SMITH MAKES two coils for the two lips and then presses them on the egg. "You form them the way you want to with the back of a spoon, tool or finger."

Ears are also coils of clay that have been made ear-like by the skills of the craftswoman.

As models, Mrs. Smith usually uses pictures of old dolls, or "a child who doesn't wiggle."

She cuts holes in the clay eggs to

make room for the blown glass eyes she will put in later.

"They aren't making the old blown glass eyes any more," she indicated.

But fortunately for aficionados of what Mrs. Smith describes as the number three hobby in the country, "several businesses had huge stacks of them" for use by dolllovers. "One man has been in the glass eye business since 1920, and most of the eyes come from him."

Once formed, the porcelain heads are fired.

Then fine sandpaper smooths them off, and painting begins. Often Mrs. Smith starts by brushing on some flesh tones, so the face won't look a flat white, and draws in the shape of the mouth. After the first firing she might add the eyelashes and eyebrows, and add more color to the mouth.

She especially likes to create what those in the field call pouty mouths, because it calls for special effort on the lips.

The firing is no longer a problem for her, but the first time she fired heads it was Disaster City.

"I put all the heads too close together," laughed Mrs. Smith. "It came out like one big pancake with 10 heads."

Bodies on her dolls might be leather, porcelain or stuffed sawdust covered by cloth. Leather is difficult, she said. Composition bodies can be bought, but she usually makes a porcelain body.

If not dropped, the dolls could last "forever," she said.

"They have dug up pottery dolls from Egyptian tombs," she observed.

While most of her dolls are originals, she has also made molds of old antique dolls. Once she borrowed one of these dolls as a model, took it apart all over her sink, and later discovered that that type of antique is worth \$4,000.

THESE MOLDS HAVE LEAD to the creation of a new kind of dollhouse doll made of porcelain. Mrs. Smith calls them "terrific." Miniature versions of the old dolls, they have heads that swivel, thereby allowing them to drink in the beauty of the dollhouse.

Mrs. Smith, who sang professionally all over the country before meeting her husband and settling down in this area, believes that dollmaking "keeps me out of trouble."

She added: "So many techniques are used—modeling the clay, China painting, sewing and even making leather shoes—that I don't get bored. It's kind of an addiction."

She estimates that she has made about 500 dolls, given away a lot and sold about 350. With appreciation of dolls increasing, she and other artisans have begun to produce dolls as printmakers produce prints.

She makes a set number and then destroys the mold.

"Handmade dolls are a popular collector's item," she said. "These are in the \$65-\$350 price range, so not as expensive as antiques."

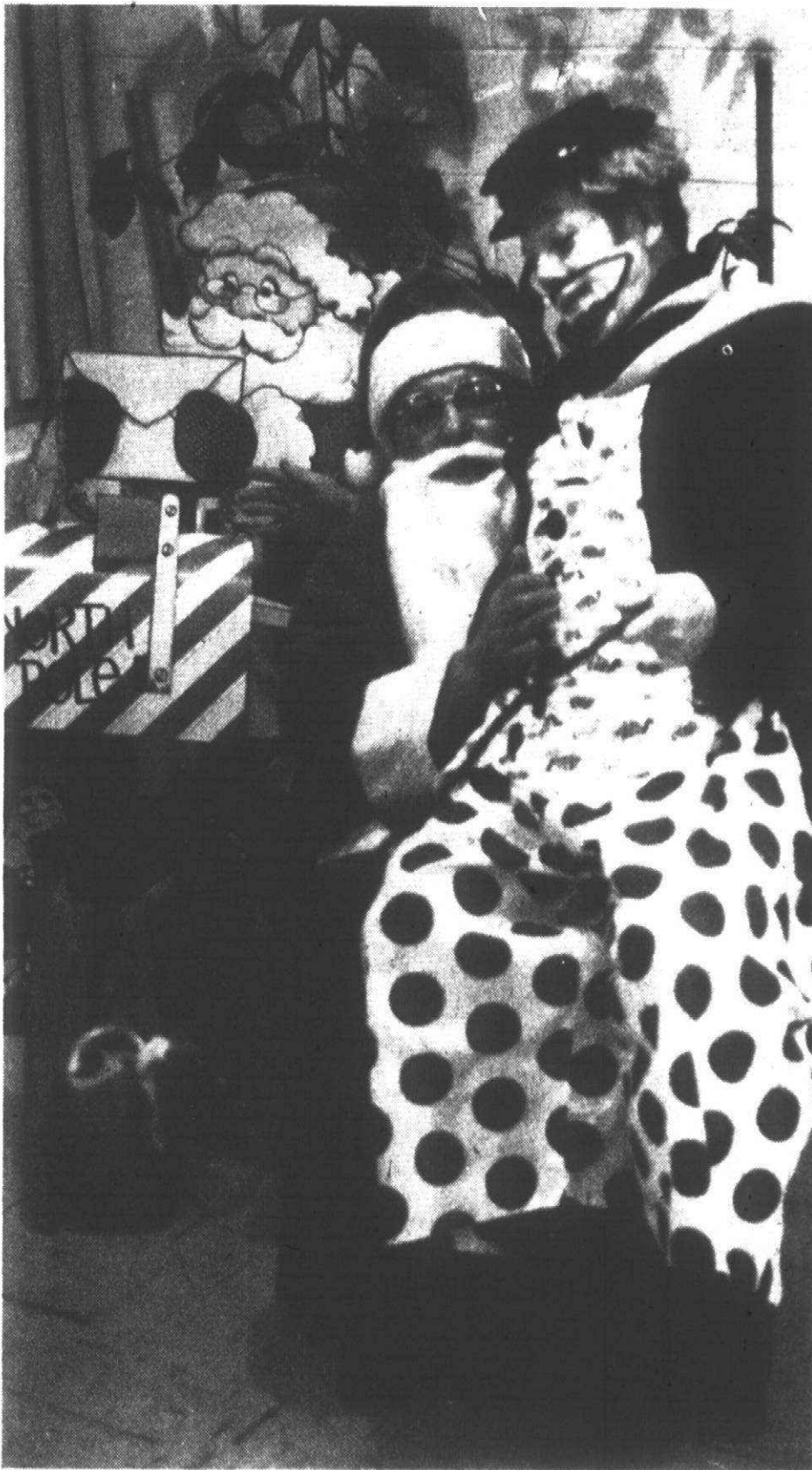

# St. Mel will offer adult education

## Workshops aimed to aid seniors

"Our ultimate goal is to affect public policy and give 'cradle to grave' education," said Beatrice Scalise, a consultant at a recent workshop for the Council for Action of Aging, in Schoolcraft College's Harrison Center in Garden City.

The workshop, entitled "We Care, We Share," was held to increase the knowledge and ability of the volunteers. The council itself was established to upgrade the abilities of per-

sons who deal with the aging population in each community.

"We plan to become incorporated," Mrs. Scalise said. "There has been such a favorable response and so many people have become involved that we feel it is a must to become a non-profit organization."

The council, which started with a dozen members, now has more than 60. Each month a different city hosts the meetings to share costs.

"A workshop presented in this fash-

ion brought more people together so they would learn more," Mrs. Scalise said. "The program shared a lot of valuable information over the two days."

There were more than 16 speakers on such topics as community resources, legal client needs and funding. During the afternoon there was a panel discussion on effective state lobbying.

On the morning of the second day,

positive thinking and activities for senior citizens were discussed. The sessions were on reality, personality conflicts and cliques, exercise programs and travel tips. In the afternoon the panel discussion dealt with community relations.

More than 100 persons from throughout the area registered for the entire workshop. The group mainly consisted of convalescent home workers, adult education teachers, nurses and others who work with the aging.

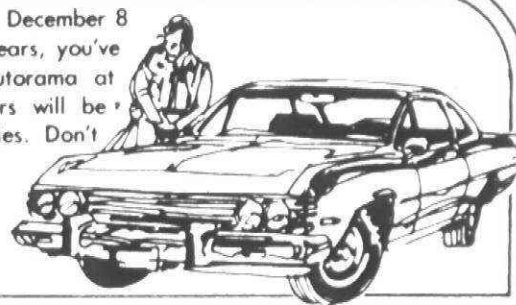



Guard Eckles, however, tipped the shot into the basket during this

sequence and the head official ruled the basket good, giving Canton the victory.

Despite the controversy, there was no better Christmas present for Canton coach Casey Cavell than this last-second victory. The Chiefs have had their problems pulling out the tight ones and this change-of-pace could be the secret ingredient for Canton's future success this season.

"It has to help us tremendously since we haven't won in two weeks," Cavell said. "This was probably our best team game of the year. I think a big fact was we were under control

during the game.

"We started to penetrate offensively and worked hard under the boards against their big guys."

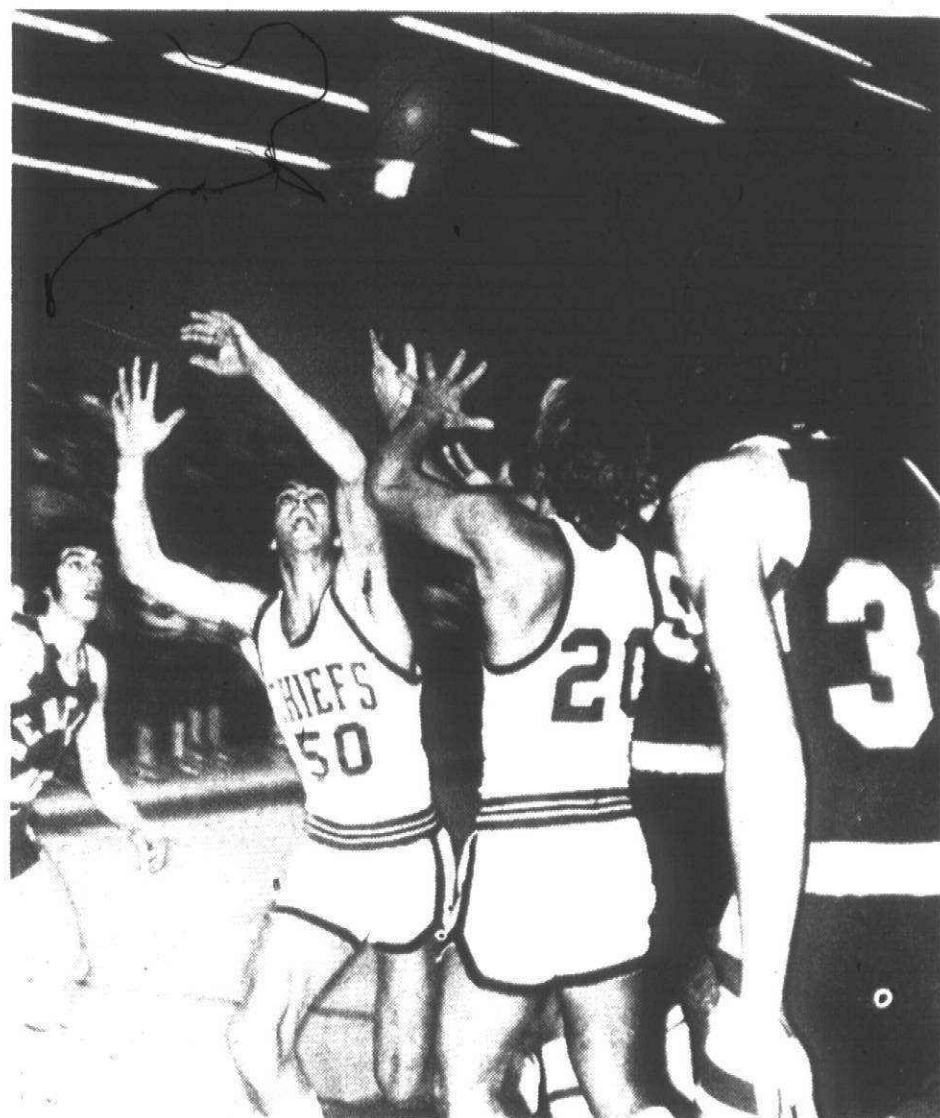

"Debbie is an outstanding ballplayer who shoots well from out and drives well," said Stevenson coach Liz Embree.

**Kathy Dillon, Plymouth Salem.** Named the Rocks' Most Valuable Player the past three seasons, Dillon, with a 39 per cent accuracy rating from the field and 57 per cent from the charity

stripe, led the team in scoring this year with 284 points.

She also grabbed 133 rebounds from a guard position.

Dillon, a senior, owns Salem records for most points in a single season, most assists and most steals in a season and career scoring.

"Kathy is a class athlete. She was our team leader on and off the court," said Salem coach Debbie Hatcher. "Kathy plays aggressive ball and is our finest competitor."

**Carol Crissey, Ladywood.** Crissey, a senior and all-around performer for the Blazers, averaged 14.6 points, 5.3 assists and 3.4 steals per contest this fall. She was a 42 per cent shooter from the field, 70 per cent from the line.

Crissey was named to the all-Catholic League team and the all-Northwest Division squad.

"Carol is a good penetrating guard who passes well," said Ladywood coach Ed Kavanaugh. "She's a good possibility to play college basketball."

**Sue Pastula, Redford Union.** A three-year varsity letter-winner and selected by her teammates this season as most valuable player, Pastula averaged 13.5 points per outing with a shooting percentage of 43 from the floor and 60 from the line.

The senior, an excellent rebounder, came up with 356 caroms during the recently-concluded campaign. Pastula has been selected for the all-Suburban Eight League team the last two years.

"Sue is a very coachable young lady and our blue-chip ball player," said RU coach Ken Dersey.

**Linda Spicer, Redford Thurston.** After missing last season with a knee injury, Spicer came back this fall to captain the Eagles and average 16 points and 18 rebounds per game. The senior totalled 281 points and 347 rebounds this season.

"Linda has a super attitude about the team and herself," said Thurston coach Jane Robey. "If she had played basketball beginning her sophomore year, I feel she would have been one of the finest ball players in the area."

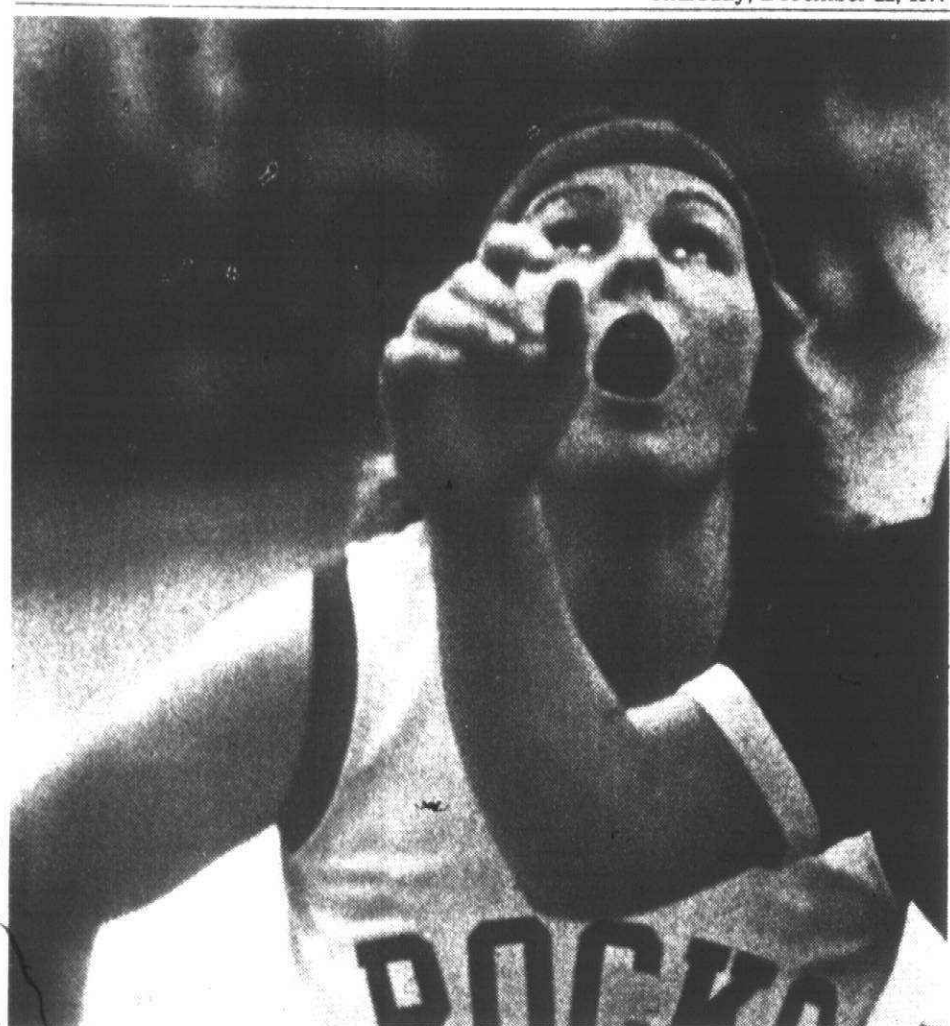

Clor, a three-year varsity performer, was named to the second team all-Catholic League honor squad this season.

"Sandy is a very strong rebounder and she has an excellent shooting touch for a big girl," said St. Agatha coach Mark Decker. "She is a very intelligent ball player—fast, mobile and agile."

Kathy Sochacki, Plymouth Canton. Sochacki, a three-year varsity player, hit 44 per cent of her field goal attempts and 61 per cent from the free-throw line to help the Chiefs to a 19-0 regular season record.

Sochacki, a senior, also is a good student. She has compiled a 3.8 grade point average.

"Kathy has a super attitude and should play college ball," said Canton coach Mike McCauley.

Karen Kowalski, Livonia Churchill. Captain of the team this season, Kowalski averaged 14.8 points and 11 rebounds per game while leading the Chargers to their best season ever.

A senior and two-year letter-winner, Kowalski holds school records for most points in a single game, 27, and most points in a season, 310, both established this year.

Also a volleyball player, Kowalski has a 3.5 grade point average and is interested in either a nursing or accounting career.

Debbie Mays, Livonia Bentley. One of the leaders of the tallest team in the area, Mays, six-foot, had a scoring and rebounding average of 12.3 and 13.2 per game, respectively.

A senior and three-year varsity player, Mays scored 20 or more points in four games this season and blocked 55 shots.

"Debbie is a very aggressive defensive ball player," said Bentley coach Tom Lang.

Micki McLalin, Redford Union. A 36 per-cent shooter from the field and 60 per-cent from the charity stripe, McLalin averaged 9.6 points per contest for the Panthers this year.

## Some surprise! Rocks will win

The good doctor has made a lot of exciting and sometimes daring predictions in his time—but it doesn't look like there will be anything exciting about the following prognostication:

Plymouth Salem's basketball team will win its own holiday tournament Friday night.

Exciting, eh? Daring, eh? Not really.

It has become a yearly habit for the Rocks to win this yule event. And it's highly unlikely that any surprises will occur this time around—not with the way Salem looks at this stage of the season.

The Rocks have won all but one of the holiday trophies and the last three in a row.

A combination of the home court advantage with the experience of nine returning lettermen gives the Rocks the upper hand once again.

This year's draw for the annual competition, which begins tonight (Thursday) and ends with the championship game Friday night, didn't produce much excitement either. It's the same pairings as a year ago.

Here's a look at the way the good doctor sees each individual contest of the tourney.

**Game 1—Thursday, Dec. 22, 6:45 p.m.—Stevenson vs. Thurston**—Last season, the Thurston Eagles were the Cinderella team of the tourney, upsetting these same Spartans in the first round and then giving Plymouth Salem a good run before bowing in the championship.

The chances of Thurston pulling the same upset against the Spartans this season is highly unlikely, however.

While both teams show a lot of inexperience with the loss of many graduates from last season, Stevenson coach George VanWagoner still has his club off to a flying start while Bill Croteau's Eagles are having their problems.

Look for Stevenson to win by 11 points.

**Game 2—Thursday, Dec. 22, 8:30 p.m.—Churchill vs. Salem**—Many people wrote off Churchill at the beginning of the season because of its heavy losses to graduation. First-year varsity coach Fred Price has his Chargers rolling, however, winning all but one of their games so far.

Despite Churchill's fast start, I don't think this can combat the powerful forces from Salem. The Rocks are

once again unbeaten with a 4-0 record going into this tourney.

And with the return of guard Rich Hewlett, who looks to be fully recovered from his collarbone injury during the football season, coach Fred Thomann's squad is by far the class of the tourney.

Salem should beat Churchill easily, say 18 points.

**Consolation game—Friday, Dec. 23, 6:45 p.m.**—If Churchill faces Thurston in the battle for third place, which seems likely to me, look for Churchill to breeze to victory.

**Championship game—Friday, Dec. 23, 8:30 p.m.**—Expect Stevenson to give Salem somewhat of a battle in the tourney finale. But by 10 p.m. that night, Plymouth Athletic Director John Sandmann will present the Rocks with yet another trophy.

**ALL GAMES** will be played at Plymouth Salem High School, located on Joy Road, west of Canton Center Road.

# Jerry Orbach at the Fisher

## 'Chicago' star gets involved

Jerry Orbach, sexy, sloe-eyed star of the musical "Chicago," in real life is a regular guy who amiably gives acting lessons to other members of the cast, talks willingly to the press and community theater players.

This was my impression, interviewing Orbach one afternoon last week during an understudies' rehearsal at Detroit's Fisher Theatre. "Chicago," a musical vaudeville, continues at the Fisher through New Year's Eve.

In "Chicago," which is set in rip-roaring Chicago in the 1920s, Orbach plays the city's most famous defense lawyer, Billy Flynn. He's the fast-talking, high-living mouthpiece who

defends women who have murdered their husbands or lovers.

"The character has some chameleon qualities I like," Orbach said. "He's tough, cynical, practical, with a world-weary sense of humor."

On stage Orbach has his hair slicked down; the character is slicked up, in flashy suits including one in pink pinstripes. He even does a strip tease, down to his boxer shorts, socks and garters, singing "All I Care About (Is Love)" while chorus girls serenade him with Sally Rand fans.

Another Orbach dazzler is the musical number "Razzle Dazzle," where he rumples his hair, dons little eyeglasses and dresses down his suit, emerging as a suspender-shirted, Clar-

ence-Darrow-type lawyer with theatricals for the jury.

Dancers in spangled costumes move to glittering rhythms, contributing to the circus.

**WHAT'S THE MESSAGE** of this show, in which Flynn defends both Roxie Hart and Velma Kelly on murderers' row?

Okay, it's a musical, but it's still got a message. "The message is almost subliminal," Orbach responded. "Our moral values are corrupt in many ways. We sometimes revere people just because they have become celebrities."

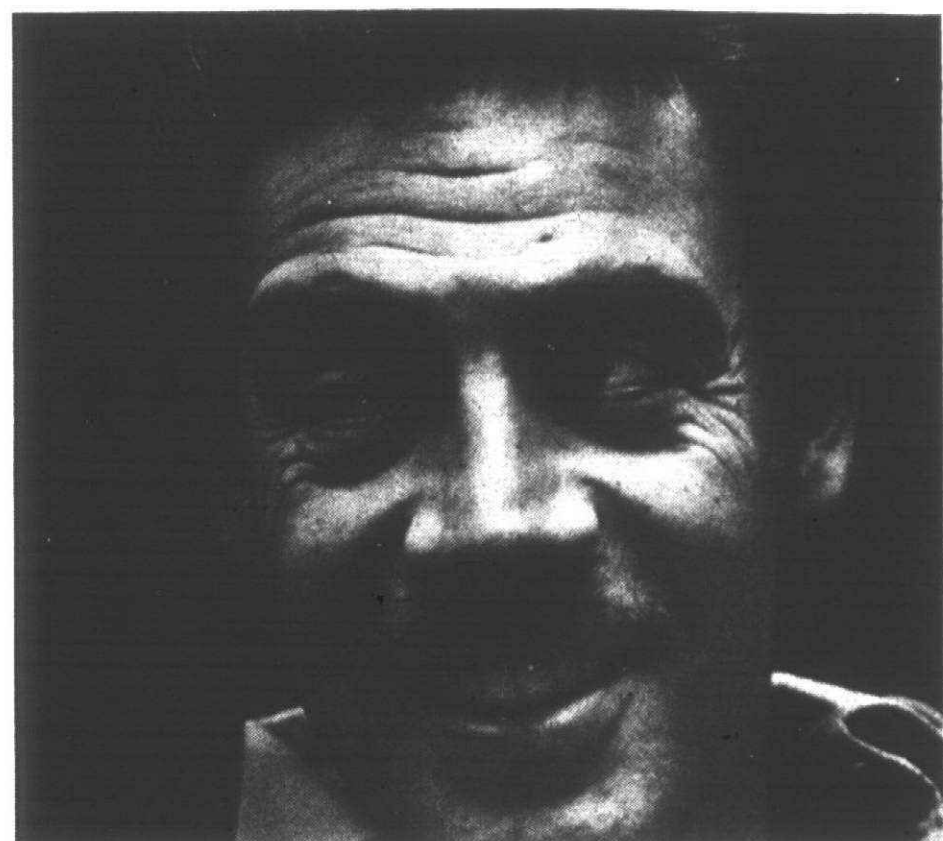
The show delivers its message in a closing song "Nowadays," sung by

Roxie (Penny Worth in the Gwen Verdon role).

"It's a double-edge sword," Orbach said. The song talks about how life is wonderful, with all its pleasures (gin, jazz, easy sex) but how it will all, unfortunately, go in 50 years!

Besides starring in "Chicago," Orbach has been helping performers in the show by conducting acting workshops. Bob Fosse, the director and choreographer of "Chicago," suggested starting the classes to keep the company from getting bored on tour.

"IT'S FUN FOR me," Orbach said. "I never did any directing until three years ago. I never thought about teaching, although I'd done some lectures at universities."

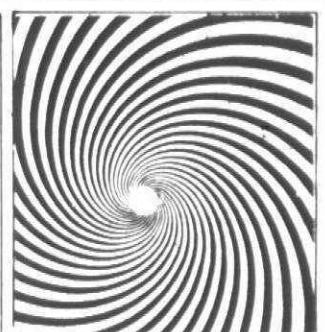


"Chicago," a vaudeville musical, stars Jerry Orbach as mouthpiece Billy Flynn.

## Theaters open in Novi

Hundreds of area residents received a pre-opening view of The Movies at Twelve Oaks Mall last week as the new five-screen complex held a day-long open house recently.

Built by Taubman Theaters and United Artists Theaters, The Movies occupy a prominent location on the lower level of the mall inside the eastern entrance.

The exhibition represents 25 years of sculpture and painting by two senior Michigan artists and is the most comprehensive in-depth study of their work to date.

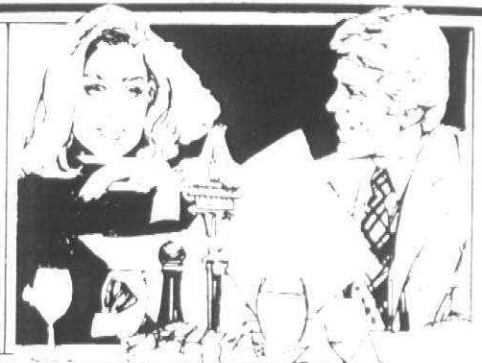
One hundred and fifty paintings and sculptures are in the exhibition on loan from numerous private, public and corporate collections in North America.
