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Entire Stein slate swept out; Greenstein tops trustee race

In an upset Tuesday, Canton attorney Noel Culbert yanked the Democratic nomination for the supervisor's seat away from incumbent Harold Stein by an overwhelming vote.

Culbert got 1,663 of the 2,740 Democratic votes cast for supervisor, while Stein won only 1,077.

Voters turned their thumbs down to the entire Stein slate which consisted of the incumbent supervisor, incumbent Treasurer Anne Bradley, trustee candidate Frank McMurray and trustee candidate Robert Schaezel.

IN THE DEMOCRATIC race for two trustee seats, former Supervisor Robert Greenstein was the top vote-getter.

Greenstein, who lost his supervisor's job in the 1976 election, made a political come-back with 1,433 votes.

Carol Bodenmiller was the second top vote-getter in the Democratic trustee race with 1,136 votes.

Democratic treasurer candidate Maria Falkiewicz—a newcomer to Canton politics—beat incumbent Treasurer Bradley by a slim 1,377 to 1,239 margin.

Less than 23 per cent—or 3,972 of Canton's 17,340 registered voters—participated in the primary election.

Asked whether he considered the turnout light, Clerk John Flodin commented, "I can't even think of the adjective. Less than 23 per cent of the people of this township made quite a decision today."

The decision made by voters indicates a clear dissatisfaction with the administrative policies of Stein and Bradley.

Stein carried only four of the township's 17 precincts. Bradley did slightly better by carrying seven precincts.

The incumbents' slatemates—trustee candidates McMurray and Schaezel—took fourth and fifth places in the five-way Democratic race for two trustee nominations.

Democratic trustee candidate Larry Bowerman took 952 votes—184 shy of the tally won by second-place winner Bodenmiller.

McMurray got 913 of the Democratic votes cast in the Democratic trustee race, and Schaezel won only 646.

In the Republican trustee race, write-in candidate Sally Mundo failed to win a place on the November ballot.

She needed 15 per cent of the votes cast for the only certified Republican trustee candidate on Tuesday's ballot—Gary Roberts—to win a position on the November ballot.

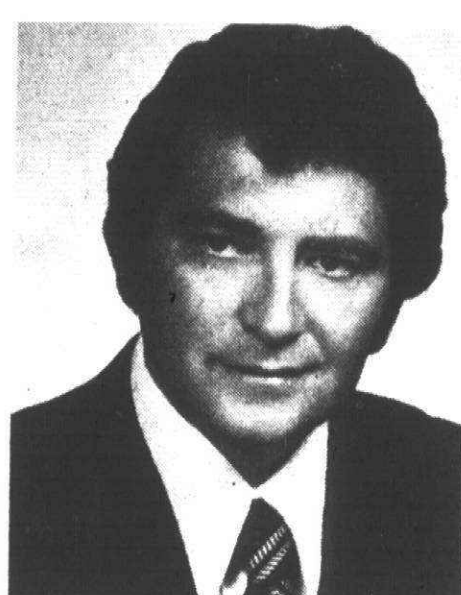
Roberts received 540 votes, and Mundo got only 11.

As a result, Greenstein, Bodenmiller and Roberts will battle it out for two trustee seats in November. Mundo said she will definitely not stage a write-in campaign in the general election.

"Look how hard the primary was," said a disappointed Mundo Tuesday night. "I'm not a glutton for punishment."

Three voters in Precinct two cast

write-in ballots for write-in candidates other than Mundo. Robert A. Binkowski received one write-in vote, and David Ferguson received two.

THE CERTIFIED Republicans in Tuesday's primary election were all unopposed and are ensured spots on the November ballot.

Canton police officer John Longridge, was the only Republican supervisor candidate, won 547 votes. He will

face Culbert in November.

Republican treasurer candidate Jim Donahue garnered 544 votes and will battle it out with Falkiewicz in November for the treasurer slot.

Incumbent clerk Flodin, a Democrat who was unopposed in his bid for reelection on either major party ticket, got 1,720 votes.

The vote totals will not be official until they are certified this week by the township board of canvassers.

Bad blood flows in race

"I guess I concede," said a calm Harold Stein, Canton's outgoing supervisor, shortly after 11 p.m. Tuesday night.

"No question about it, we're defeated."

Twenty-three per cent of Canton residents cast ballots in the state-wide primary.

All four members of the Stein slate were denied spots on the November general election ballot. At least two other members of the Stein Slate—outgoing treasurer, Anne Bradley and trustee hopeful Frank McMurray—were not as graceful in defeat as Stein.

Both Bradley and McMurray blamed local newspaper coverage for contributing greatly to their loss.

"According to your paper I have

done nothing for Canton Township," said Mrs. Bradley. "I only put in 40, 50, 60 hours some weeks without asking for anything."

"I went to seminars and meetings at night and didn't put in for it. It's all because I wanted to do a good job. The township doesn't have enough money to pay me for all the work I did."

"In a way, I'm glad. I can relax. I don't have to worry about the township any more."

McMurray said he was angry at all three local newspapers for printing "garbage, facts misquoted and lies" allegedly put out by his political opponents.

"SO I LOST three times (in bids for local office)," McMurray said. "Stack my hours up against any other candidate and see who has the best record

of community involvement. The scale is way out of balance."

"The voters have lost a lot of good servants. They (political opponents) passed out BS articles around the township, ripped down our signs and got on the phone and make up lies and you papers print it."

"Well, if that's what the community wants, so be it. They talk about us being a slate. Look at Greenstein and Bodenmiller. If that's not a slate, I don't know what is. We tried to run a clean campaign and they knock everybody running. The papers should get down to grass roots reporting instead of listening to all the bullshit."

McMurray wondered if critics who labeled him as someone too closely tied to the business community were against the free enterprise system, too.

Supervisor Stein said that the election results showed him that the people who support his programs didn't turn out to vote.

"I would think that people who followed what I was doing would come out to vote," Stein said. "If you don't get enough people out who support your program, you lose."

Stein said he didn't know if he'd endorse the Democratic nominee, Noel Culbert, in the general election against Republican candidate for supervisor, John Longridge.

When asked if she'd support Democrat Maria Falkiewicz in her bid for the treasurer job against Republican James Donahue, Mrs. Bradley replied, "I wish her well. God help her."

THE WINNERS, understandably, were in better spirits.

Culbert said he knew the race would be close or "or a landslide." As it turned out, the vote was close to a landslide, with Culbert outpolling Stein nearly 2-1.

Culbert admitted that many people voted for him more as an anti-Stein gesture than a pro-Culbert move.

"It was a combination of anti-Stein sentiment and pro-Culbert sentiment," Culbert said. "But Stein got in on an anti-Greenstein vote before. I'd say the anti-Stein faction was strongest. There was a moderate pro-Culbert vote."

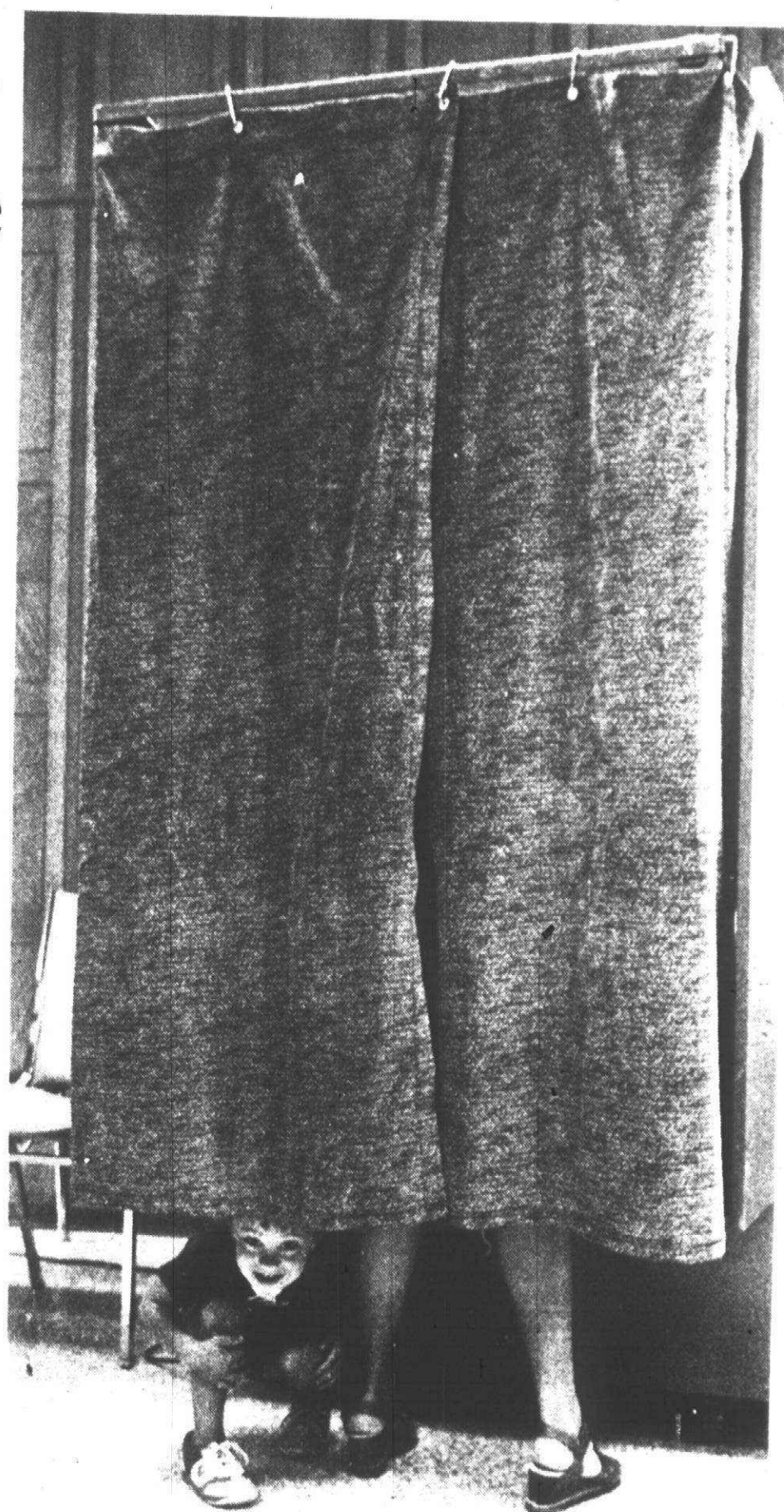
The overwhelming victory, Culbert said, was the result of a coalition of support from people such as Robert Greenstein, Republican trustee candidate Gary Roberts and county commission candidate, Robert Myers, a current member of the Canton Township board.

"Every guy Stein ever crapped on in two years was out there campaigning hard against him. That's a lesson to be remembered."

Positions on the issues made the difference, according to Culbert. Culbert accused Stein of showing "total disregard for the homeowner and the problems that confront him in construction."

But even more persuasive, Culbert said, was a cry for less spending. The purchase of Fellows Creek Golf Course, 132 acres of industrial land and the township recreation building was not popular with voters, according to Culbert.

Culbert said he "likes" his Republi-

Cat burglar run tops 20 in week

More than 20 burglaries and three attempted break-ins have been reported since July 31 in Canton Township.

The bold, nighttime burglaries of homes in the northeast section of the township have occurred while homeowners slept in their beds.

Police Chief Walter MacGregor vows to "catch the bums" but urges residents to take a few precautions.

In nearly every robbery the thieves entered through the family room door-wall or a window in the family room. Chief MacGregor suggests that people leave a light on in the kitchen and family room at night and wedge a bar or broomstick between the sliding door latch and the post between the two doors.

Approximately \$9,300 in valuables and \$900 in cash were taken in the burglaries to date. Twelve color television sets were stolen, four of which were large consoles, according to police, leading them to suspect at least two thieves were involved.

The burglars hit homes on Old Bridge, Brookshire, Sunderland, Wagon Wheel, Honey Lane, Beechwood, Edenbrook, Manton, Savory,

Addison, Collingham, Copeland and Bannockburn. Six homes were broken into Sunday, Aug. 6, which prompted police to alert homeowners.

One person reportedly saw an intruder and frightened the man away. Chief MacGregor said police have no solid leads in the case.

Voters say no to library

Voters in Canton Township spoke loud and clear about one thing Tuesday—they don't want to pay any additional property taxes.

Voters in every precinct except one resoundingly defeated a proposition to hike their tax rate by one mill (\$1 per \$1,000 assessed valuation) to finance the establishment of a Canton Township library.

A total of 1,901 residents voted against the proposition. Only 1,111 voted for it.

Horse abuse charge dropped as racing crowd backs Walton

A cruelty to animals charge against a Canton race horse boarder has been dropped in 35th District Court.

Bobby Joe Walton, 8623 Holly, produced a written "clean bill of health" from Dr. Douglas L. Engers, of the Territorial Veterinary Clinic.

"In my opinion the horses appeared to be in good condition and have hay, grain and water provided to them daily," the doctor wrote. "Shelter is provided for the horses to be housed in."

Walton's attorney, Robert Delaney, also produced affidavits from owners of race horses boarded by Walton on Geddes Road. The horses are also used for breeding.

Horse owners Paul Dixon, Max Feisel and John Hoft said in sworn statements that their horses were receiving proper care.

"Regardless of anyone else's opinion, my horses are well taken care of at all times and (I) am completely satisfied with the job that Bobby Walton is doing for my horses," Feisel said.

Delaney said that the misdemeanor ticket issued to his client for failing to adequately feed, and provide water to the horses hurt Walton's business badly and was unjustified.

A WOMAN who lives next door to the horse boarding area, Carolyn Neuhart, of 48613 Geddes, was instrumental in getting Canton Township to issue the citation against Walton.

She said that since Walton rented the Geddes property from Kelly Wheatley, he was rarely around to adequately care for the horses. She complained to the township's animal control officer, John Swalley, she said, because the horses were receiving little water and hay.

Walton admits that he had to bring water to the property in barrels because a well on the site was inoperable. Walton said he has contacted a well digger and expects to have a working well before fall.

Walton's attorney, Delaney, refuted

the Michigan Humane Society's critical report, written by Bill Gregg. Delaney said Gregg "has no experience in examining horses."

In a May inspection, Gregg said the horses appeared to be "slightly thin."

Upset in Plymouth Twp. too

Plymouth Township voters went to the polls Tuesday night and charted a new political course.

In the major upset of the election, incumbent Richard Gornick lost the seat on the township board he has held since 1972. He finished a distant third behind Barbara Lynch and Gerald Law, two political unknowns.

The hotly contested clerk's race drew to a close with Esther Hulsing sweeping to a clean victory over Trustee Lee Fidge and Frances Ardanowski. Incumbent Supervisor Thomas Notebaert and Treasurer Joseph West ran unopposed.

As the early returns started coming into township hall, it became apparent that the dark horses were collecting a major share of the votes.

When the final unofficial totals were counted, a subdued Gornick shrugged his shoulders and offered an explanation for his ouster.

"There was a low voter turn-out and whatever level of support I had wasn't

there. I had a certain degree of complacency with my incumbent status, so I didn't campaign that hard."

Gornick said he had no problem with Law's election but charged that there was a "great deal" of money spent to get Mrs. Lynch elected.

MRS. LYNCH took her victory in stride, however, and denied that she spent large sums of money.

"We worked very hard," she said. "And we anticipated we would do very well in this election." She said she felt that she got the nod because "the township was trying to tell the board that it needs an open-minded approach."

Law also was elated with his victory but was not surprised. "I'm very happy. I ran on a shoe-string. I walked many miles and knocked on many doors."

"I've received no contributions of any kind from special interest groups. I will represent the individual homeowner," he said.

Mrs. Fidge said she was beaten by the established political power in the township. "It was money and it was clubs. It was a popularity contest not an issues race," she charged. "It will be an interesting two years."

Mrs. Fidge did not have to give up her position as trustee to run for the clerk's job. She was elected in 1976 and still has two years to serve on the board.

Mrs. Hulsing could not be reached for comment.

Because all the candidates in the township ran on the Republican ticket, the primary winners will run unopposed in the November general election.

Unofficial totals for the clerk's race were: Mrs. Hulsing, 1,272; Mrs. Fidge, 575; Mrs. Ardanowski, 159.

Totals for the trustee race were: Mrs. Lynch, 849; Law, 756; Gornick, 662; Charles Childs, 516; Brian Kidston, 507; Greg Dean, 291; Gary Pickering, 78; and Woodward Burbank, 78.

Maria Falkiewicz, Democratic nomi-
nee for the office of treasurer, cred-
ited her campaign workers for suc-
ceeding in upsetting incumbent
treasurer Bradley.

She said that her position on fiscal
matters are very similar to her
Republican opponent, James Donahue.

"We agree on many things," said
Mrs. Falkiewicz. "It's up to the people
to decide. I work very hard and I care.
As far as voting for me, I'm offering to
do the best I can for the position. And I
don't take on anything I can't handle."

Like Culbert's comment that a broad
coalition helped elect him, the sole
Republican trustee candidate, Gary
Roberts, attributed his success to sup-

port from Donahue, Greenstein, and
Myers.

Roberts said that the Republican
affiliation means nothing in township
races. To demonstrate that fact he
produced a flyer he distributed which
urged people to vote Democratic even
if they supported him because he was
running unopposed. The flyer urged
people to vote for Culbert for super-
visor and Myers for county
commissioner.

"We're going to get drunk," Roberts
said. "The Stein Slate is done and I'm
so happy. It's the end of one-man con-
trol in the township. People will voice
their opinion again because they'll
have representation on the board
instead of the land developers and land
speculators."

William Joyner and Frank Yonish
will face each other for the Wayne
County Commission seat in the 27th
District in the November general
election.

Joyner (D-Plymouth Township), the

polled 2,424 votes. Yonish, the sole

2,903 votes.

Yonish ran strong in Plymouth
Township, where he netted 1,345 votes
to Joyner's 296. However, Joyner out-
polled Yonish in the City of Plymouth
and Canton Township.

The closest Democratic contender

for the nomination was Frederick
Montgomery, who pulled 1,143 votes
throughout the district.


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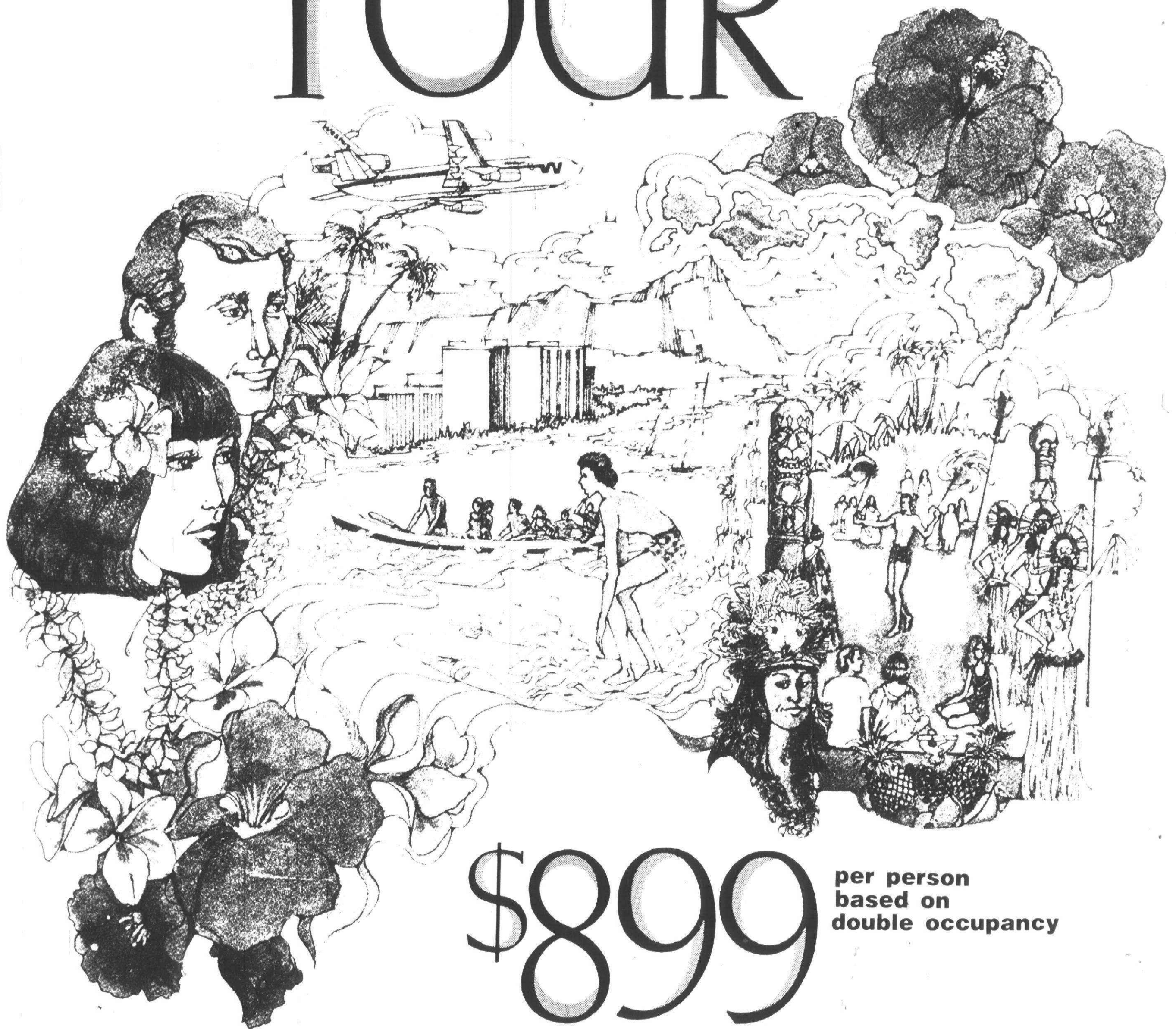
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Precision Spring breaks ground on new \$4 million plant in Canton

Ground will be broken for Precision Spring Corp.'s new \$4 million plant in Canton Township today.

The township Economic Development Corp. has promised the Detroit-based firm that it will allow tax-free bonds to finance construction of the 100,000-square-foot facility at 40500 Van Born.

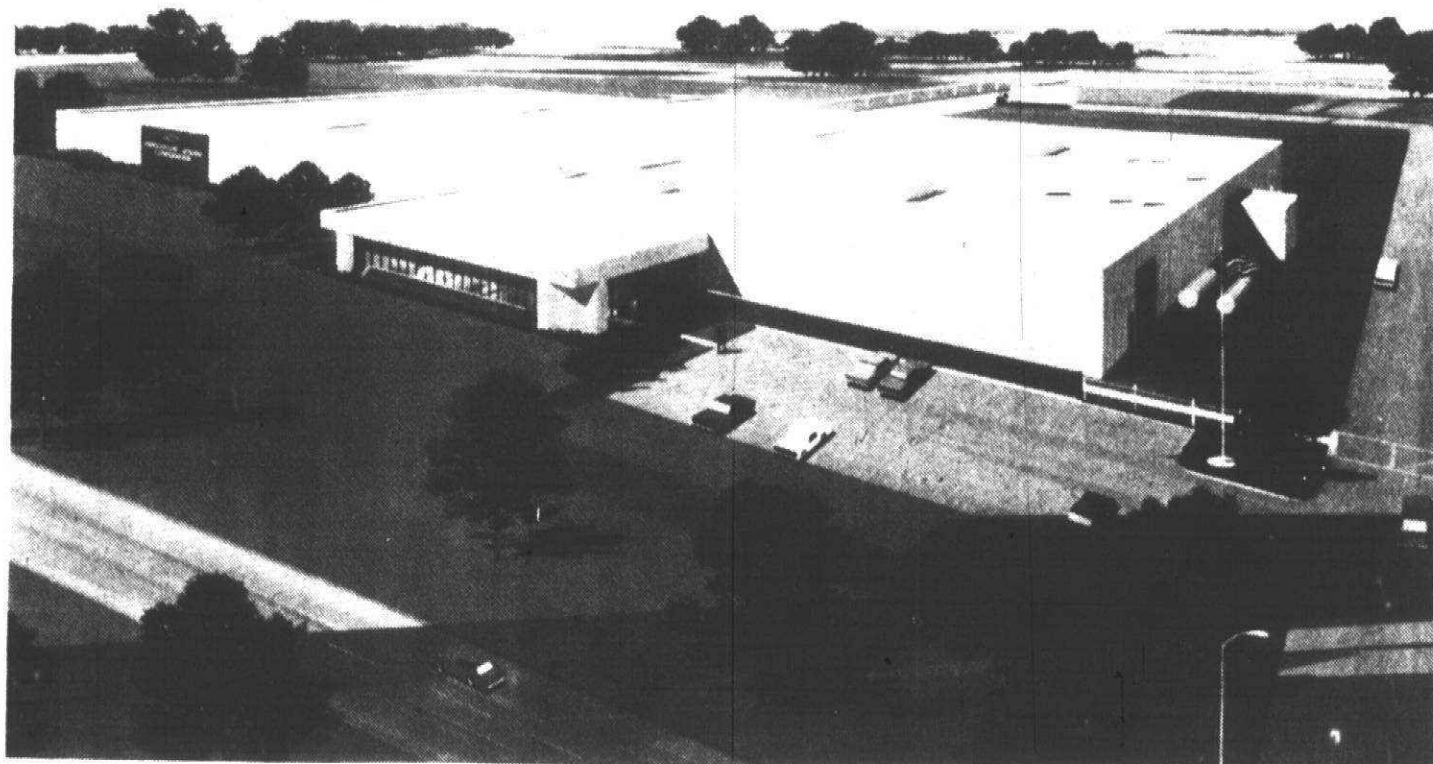
The new plant will supplement manufacturing activities of Precision Spring's headquarters at 15400 Woodrow Wilson Ave. in Detroit.

The 46-year-old Precision Spring Corp. is a major supplier of automotive springs to General Motors, Ford and Chrysler and produces a wide range of other metal products.

About 100 employees will be transferred from the firm's Detroit headquarters to Canton when the new plant is completed in the fall of 1979. Canton plant manager Donald Boyes expects more employees will eventually be hired for the new manufacturing plant.

Construction of the new plant for Precision Spring Corp. (shown above in an artist's conception) is expected to be completed in fall 1979.

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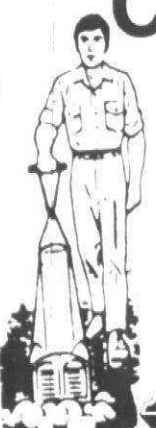
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MESC cuts hours

Pork blade steaks will help keep the food budget in line. Either broiled or braised whole or cut into strips they are delicious when featured in a favorite casserole or Oriental dish.

Not to be overlooked is ground pork. Whether served in patty-form on a bun, in meat loaves, in balls with a savory sauce or in a stuffing for green peppers or cabbage rolls, ground pork is both delicious and economical.

Proper storage a meat 'must'

Whether your purchase is an economical pot-roast or a top-of-the-line steak or roast, the soundest way to protect your investment is to store it properly.

Meat should be brought home promptly and stored in the meat compartment or coldest part of the refrigerator.

Prepackaged meat may be stored in the refrigerator for not more than two days or it may be frozen without rewrapping for one to two weeks. Fresh meat, not prepackaged, should be removed from the market wrapping, wrapped loosely in waxed paper or aluminum foil and refrigerated for not more than two days. If meat is to be stored for a longer period, it should be wrapped securely in a moisture-vapor proof wrap, labeled and placed in a freezer.

Blender can prepare baby foods

With a blender or a food mill you can prepare foods for your baby, or a family member on a special diet.

Observe the utmost cleanliness for your hands and utensils, and use only fresh food since canned or frozen foods are generally salted or sugared.

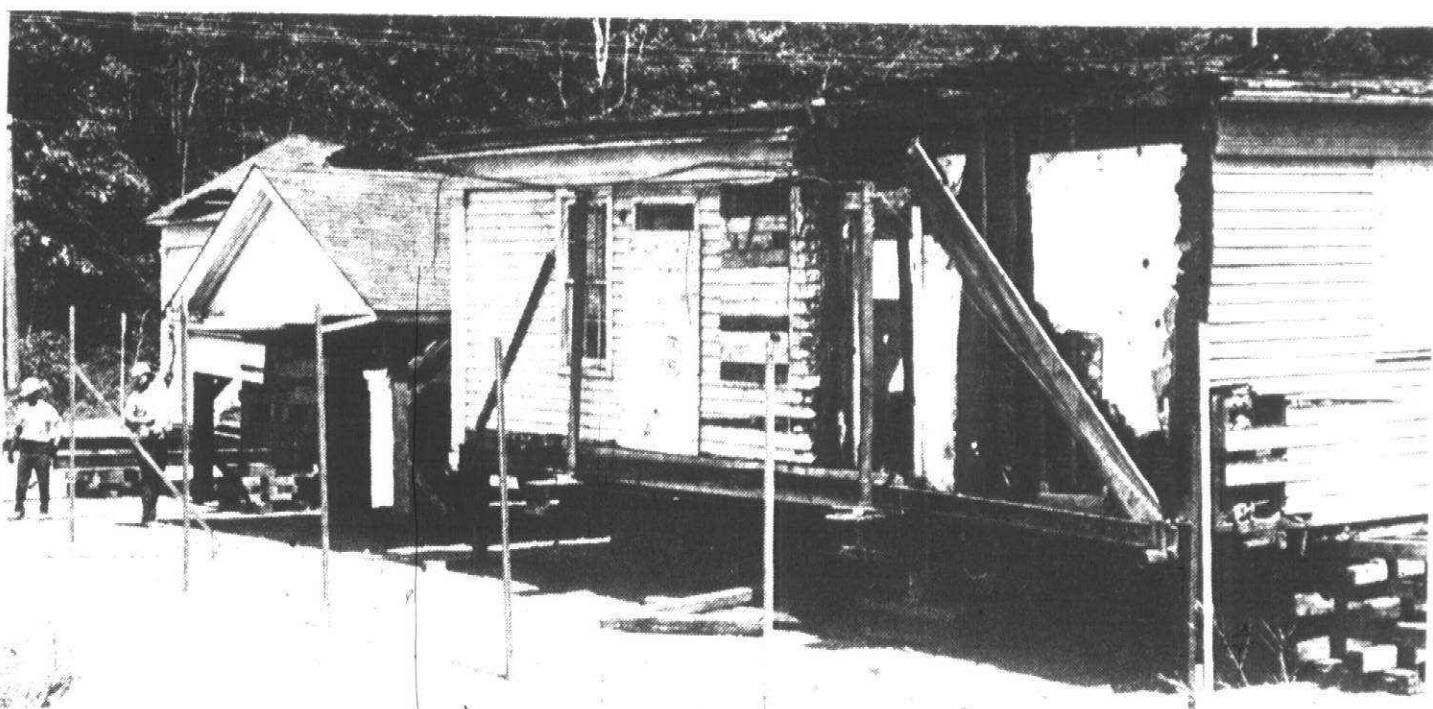
Add the food to the blender with a small amount of liquid. Blend until smooth.

The best rule for storing is to freeze rather than refrigerate. Food in small amounts can be frozen in a clean ice cube tray or paper cupcake liners. When frozen solid, store cubes in moisture-proof containers or freezer bags.

Food may be kept in the freezer for up to one month. Reheat in a glass custard cup in a pan of hot water.

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In Kensington Metropark

Suit filed to stop amusement park

Attorney General Frank Kelley has filed suit in Oakland County Circuit Court to block the development of a privately-operated amusement area in Kensington Metropark, which borders Oakland and Livingston Counties.

"I'm certainly not opposed to amusement parks," Kelley said. "The placement, however, of large, carnival-type, mechanical rides within Kensington Metropark is totally inappropriate. The rides are glaringly out of place with the natural beauty of the park."

Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority (HCMA) officials disagree with Kelley's raising the specter of a "Six Flags over Kensington."

"It sure in the world isn't an amusement park. And it's most certainly not another Cedar Point," said HCMA Director David O. Laidlaw. The developers of the amusement area, the Kensington Children's Farm and Village Corp., agree.

According to Laidlaw and HCMA plans, the development of 120 acres includes the restoration of an existing barn, the construction of a farmhouse, restaurant and other farm buildings. The "village" part of the project calls for construction of scaled down buildings for an old-time town hall, fire house and candy store, for example.

Instead of the Gemini, the Jumbo

Jets and the Blue Streak, the Kensington development calls for a late-1800s vintage, scale model railroad and nine other rides whose size has been limited by an earlier consent judgment.

Instead of "Six Flags over Kensington," Laidlaw and others contend, the development will be quaint, demure, discreet and will enhance the HCMA's largest park.

THE CONTROVERSY has relatively recent but volatile roots.

The private company, the Kensington Children's Farm and Village Corp., began operations at the park in 1975 when it leased 120 acres in the park's northeastern section.

General manager Peter Christiano Jr., who could not be reached for comment.

That action, in itself, was not popular with persons who owned homes on property bordering that section of the park. They filed a suit in Oakland County Circuit Court challenging the lease.

The firm now operates a children's farm and is scheduled to build the village section of the development. The train ride is now operating behind a 700-foot "buffer zone" to minimize noise and to placate area homeowners.

In addition to the Kensington Area Property Owners Association and the

attorney general, the Michigan United Conservation Clubs (MUCC) have joined the fray.

Thomas L. Washington, executive director of the MUCC, has charged that the HCMA is trying to commercialize the metropark.

"In addition, it is our belief that this lease by the HCMA of public parkland to a private, profit-oriented corporation is not authorized by the HCMA's enabling legislation," he said.

The attorney general has taken the same view.

HCMA OFFICIALS do not deny charges of commercialization. Rather, they defend it and try to put into perspective.

They say it makes sense. They say it allows them to focus their attention on acquiring new park land.

They say the partnership between HCMA and the corporation is a low-cost, low-risk way to raise capital, to finance a capital improvements program which would be left ignored and under-financed otherwise.

Under the terms of its agreement with the Kensington Children's Farm and Village Corp., HCMA will get 10 per cent of the annual revenues from the project. At the very least, the regional parks system is guaranteed \$25,000 annually.

Moreover, at the end of the lease, the completed children's farm, the old-

time village and the rides will become the property of the HCMA.

THE AUTHORITY is financed by a mill property tax levied in five counties—Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, Washtenaw and Livingston.

HCMA operates 10 metroparks, which form a parkway along the Huron and Clinton Rivers. The park system includes:

- Metro Beach Metropark, which is located along Lake St. Clair near Mt. Clemens.

- Stoney Creek Metropark, which is located north of Utica and northeast of Rochester along 25 Mile Road.

- Marshbank Metropark, which is located 1.4-mile north of Commerce Road and about six miles south of Pontiac.

- Hudson Mills Metropark, which is located 12 miles northwest of Ann Arbor.

- Dexter-Huron Metropark, which is located seven miles northwest of Ann Arbor.

- Delhi Metropark, which is located five mile northwest of Ann Arbor.

- Lower Huron Metropark, which is located near Belleville, 15 miles from Ypsilanti and 22 miles from Ann Arbor.

- Willow Metropark, which is located near New Boston in Wayne County.

- Oakwoods Metropark, which is located northwest of Flat Rock in southwestern Wayne County.

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
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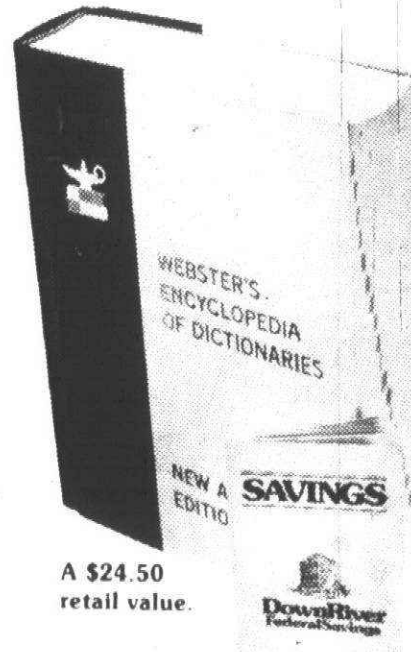
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The Stroller

A tip to the losers

Another election day has passed into history. The votes have been counted. The winners have been fete at victory parties. There was joy in the camps of those triumphant.

But what about the losers? Were they shocked at the results? Are they suffering from the agonies of defeat?

The Stroller would like to know. He has good reason to be interested. You see, he was a loser one time in a bid for the people's vote. And he'll never forget the stunning blow to his pride.

But he found a way to overcome the shock. Now he would like to pass along a tip or two to those who failed to convince the taxpayers they had the answers to all the current troubles.

IT ALL CAME about more than two decades ago when The Stroller listened to what seemed like an army of friends and entered the race for the mayor's chair in Livonia.

He had served on the commission which wrote the city charter. He had gained the confidence of the public. They voted him in a four-year term on the first city council. They followed this, even during a political upheaval, by voting him a second term.

So why not make a bid for the mayor's office?

All through life, The Stroller had managed to reach the top. He was head of his class in school. He learned the machinist trade and eventually became the shop superintendent. He entered the field of journalism on a small, four-page weekly newspaper. With a smile from Lady Luck, he landed in Detroit and in due time became sports editor of the Free Press.

Always he managed to get to the top, so it didn't take much coaxing when his friends asked him to enter the race for mayor.

For more than a month he campaigned vigorously. He attended all sorts of meetings. He visited people's homes. He even spoke at neighborhood rallies in people's basements.

All the while he was given the impression he had better than an even chance to unseat the incumbent trying for a second term. Even the night before election day, he was given an ovation at a mass rally.

THEN CAME the big day. He had

visions of landing on top again. Even as late as mid-afternoon, as he was making the rounds of the polling places, he was given assurance that all was well.

In fact, one of the few labor leaders told him he was wasting his time traveling around to the polling places. The Stroller took his advice.

Shortly after the polls closed, he made his way to election headquarters to await the returns. When the precincts reported, The Stroller was running last in a field of four. Folks asked, "What happened?"

The Stroller didn't have the answer. It was a stunning blow to The Stroller's pride. If there had been any ego in his makeup prior to that moment, it vanished in the night air.

A loser for the first time! What to do?

FINALLY, WITH that inborn Pennsylvania Dutch stubbornness, he vowed the defeat wouldn't stop him. So he made a decision he never has regretted.

He decided the time he would have given to the office of mayor he would now give to charity by becoming involved in worthwhile causes. He became affiliated with the March of Dimes and, as national bowling chairman, raised several million dollars that helped Dr. Jonas Salk develop the vaccine which conquered polio.

He volunteered his services to the Felician Sisters, who were in the process of establishing St. Mary Hospital. He served on the board at Madonna College and on the advisory board at Schoolcraft College.

NOW WHEN HE rides down Levan Road and sees St. Mary Hospital and Madonna College, he has a feeling of pride that far outweighs anything that might have happened had he been serving in the mayor's chair.

So his advice to the losers is not to back away from public service. Don't become disheartened because you didn't get the people's votes.

There are many opportunities available to be of service. Just become involved. Often the rewards are far greater than anything you would get by depending on the taxpayers' moods when they get behind the curtain in the polling places.

The Stroller found that out long ago.

GOP readies to pick Milliken's slate

Michigan Republicans had little work to do Aug. 8 as far as picking the top of the ticket is concerned.

The GOP's real work is ahead, at the Aug. 25-26 state convention in Detroit's Cobo Hall. That's when local delegates will select candidates for lieutenant governor, secretary of state, attorney general, state board of education, three university boards, and the state supreme court.

All but three of those posts on the Nov. 7 ballot are held by Democrats, who will probably (though not certainly) renominate incumbents. So the GOP has a lot of work to do.

THE WORK will start next Wednesday at 8 p.m. when precinct delegates, elected in Tuesday's primary, meet in district conventions. There they will pick delegates to the state convention. Meanwhile, they will be looking over the field of declared candidates.

William G. Milliken, renominated without opposition for governor, will be keynote speaker at a joint session of the 18th and 19th congressional districts in Avondale Senior High's cafeteria, 2800 Waukegan, Auburn Heights, Waukegan runs between Auburn and Road and South Blvd., east of I-75.

At 7 p.m., Milliken will be honored at a reception, refreshments being provided by the Oakland County Republican Women's Council.

The 2nd District-Wayne will meet in Bentley High School, Five Mile between Farmington and Merriman roads in Livonia.

The 12th Congressional District, which includes the eastern portion of the Rochester community, will meet in the Macomb County Republican headquarters, 2 Crocker Blvd., Mt. Clemens.

The 17th District will gather in Bot-sford Inn, Grand River north of Eight Mile in Farmington Hills.

Such meetings are public, though rarely attended by non-delegates. Fights in these post-primary district conventions are rare. (The late January conventions, when district officers are picked, are another matter, however.)

THREE GOP ballot spots may be considered sewed up.

Milliken wants Eastern Michigan University President James Brickley for lieutenant governor, to replace James Damman, former state representative and councilman from Troy. Damman is likely to sink into obscurity.

Barbara DuMouchelle of Grosse Ile is seeking a new eight-year term on the state board of education. She is a former teacher and township treasurer. There being no known scandal involving her name, Mrs. DuMouchelle will likely be renominated.

Justice James Ryan, who was appointed by Milliken to fill the supreme court vacancy created by the resignation of John B. Swainson, won the remainder of Swainson's two-year term in 1976. Ryan is assured of renomination for an eight-year term.

AFTER THAT it's wide open.

State Rep. Mel Larsen, a bright young Republican from northern Oakland County, has let it be known he would like a chance to topple Secretary of State Richard Austin. Such a post could be a stepping-stone if Milliken is defeated this year or retires in 1982. Larsen will probably face a challenge from other ambitious young men.

There's someone to be picked to run against Atty. Gen. Frank J. Kelley. A year ago, most Republicans would have said Oakland County Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson was a shoo-in. But Patterson may have burned his bridges behind him Tuesday when he challenged incumbent Sen. U.S. Sen. Robert Griffin in the GOP primary. So the attorney general nomination is up for grabs.

On the state board of education, Democrat Annetta Miller will face the voters the same time as Mrs. DuMouchelle, James F. O'Neil, a former state board member and Schoolcraft

College trustee, is campaigning for the GOP nod.

On the University of Michigan Board of Regents, Democrats Paul W. Brown and James L. Waters must face the voters again.

On the Michigan State University Board of Trustees, Democrats Patricia M. Carrigan of Farmington Hills and Don Stevens of Bloomfield Hills are up for reelection.

And on the Wayne State University Board of Governors, Democrats Leon H. Atchison and Max J. Pineus will see their terms expire.

Republicans will pick one candidate for a state supreme court race which will be a tough one. Democrat G. Menen Williams, at 67, says he's in great health and wants another eight-year term. The former six-term governor will be a formidable opponent for any Republican nominee, but without doubt there will be someone who wants to take him on.

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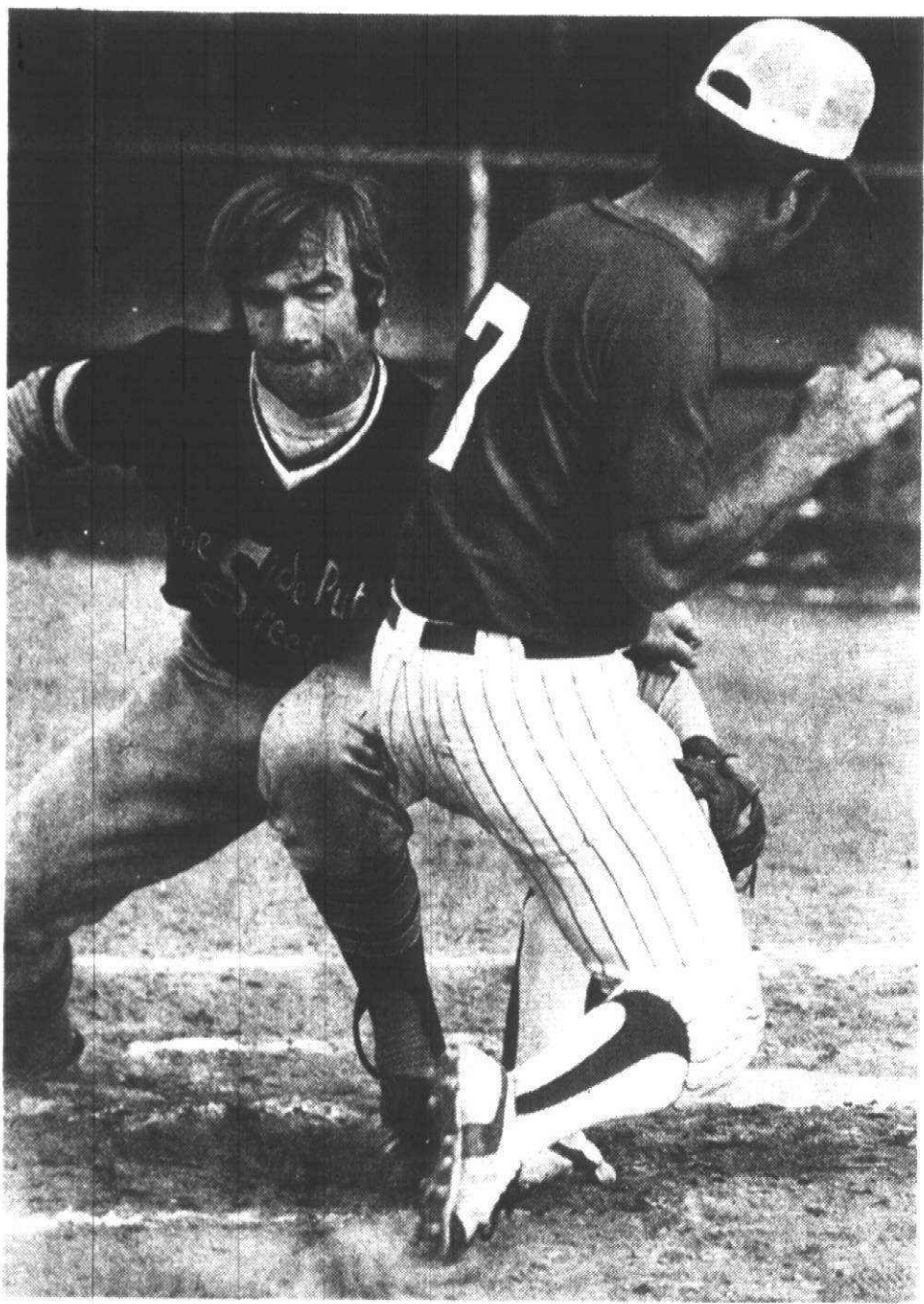

But it's not surprising, is it? Everyone knows the school maintenance department doesn't know how to take care of the Centennial Park outdoor facilities anyway.

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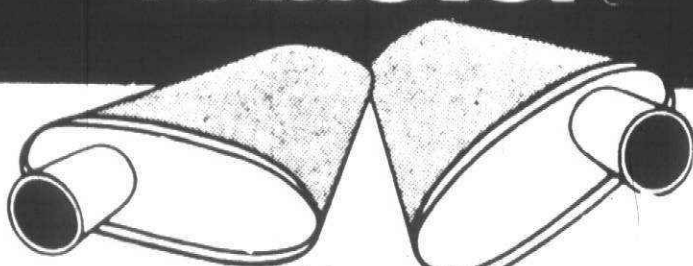
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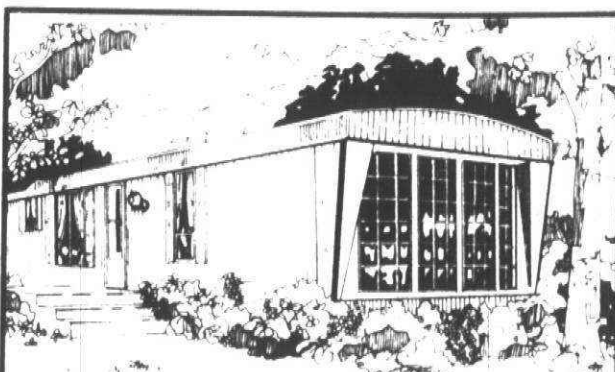
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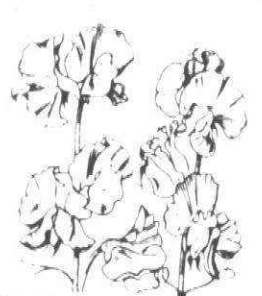


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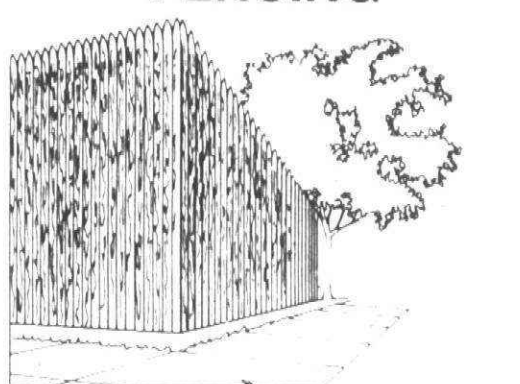
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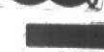
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O&E golf tourney coming

Entry deadline for men is Sept. 5 and for women Sept. 7.

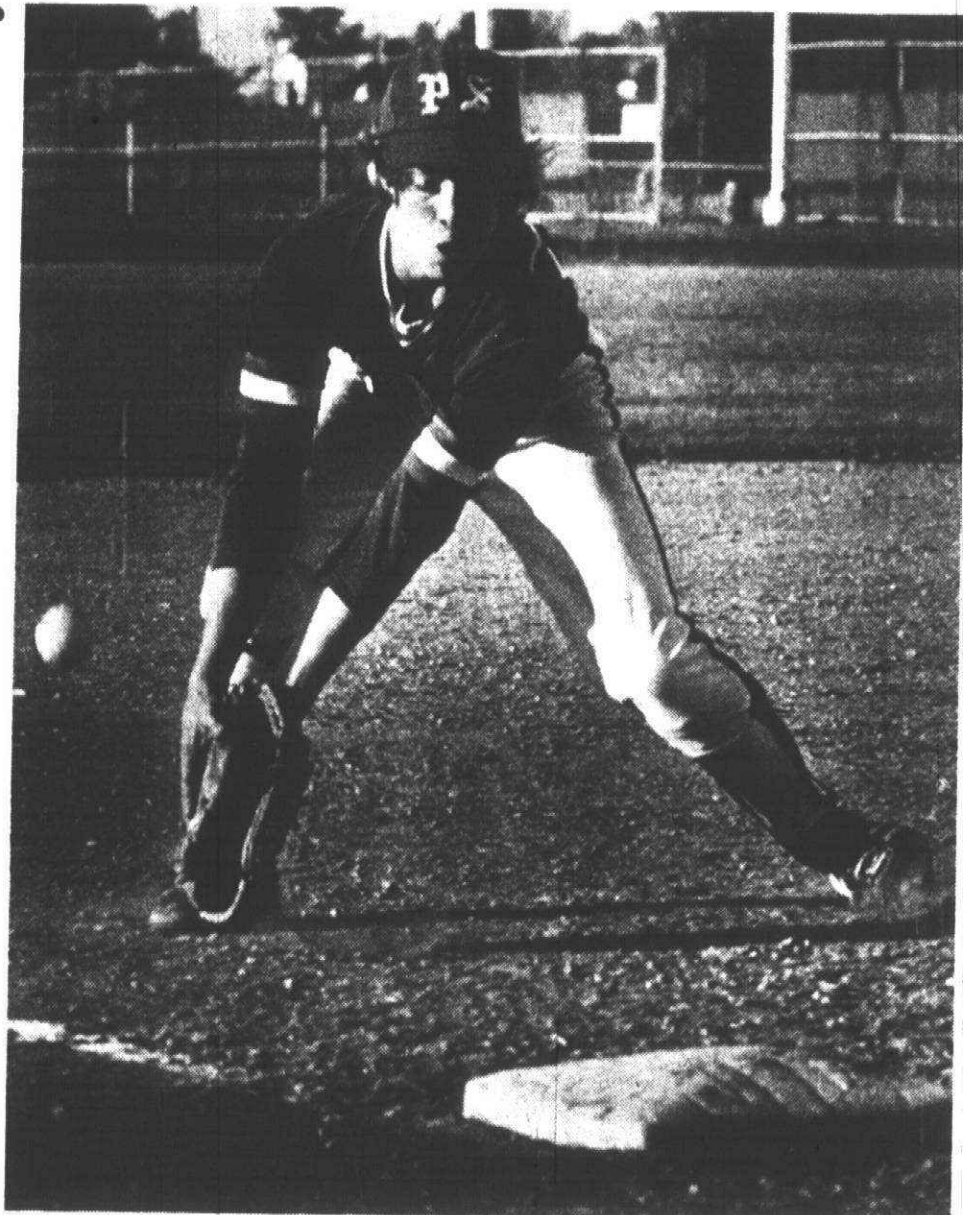

IN MICKEY MANTLE action, two Northwest Suburban district qualifiers advanced to the nine-team Coldwater

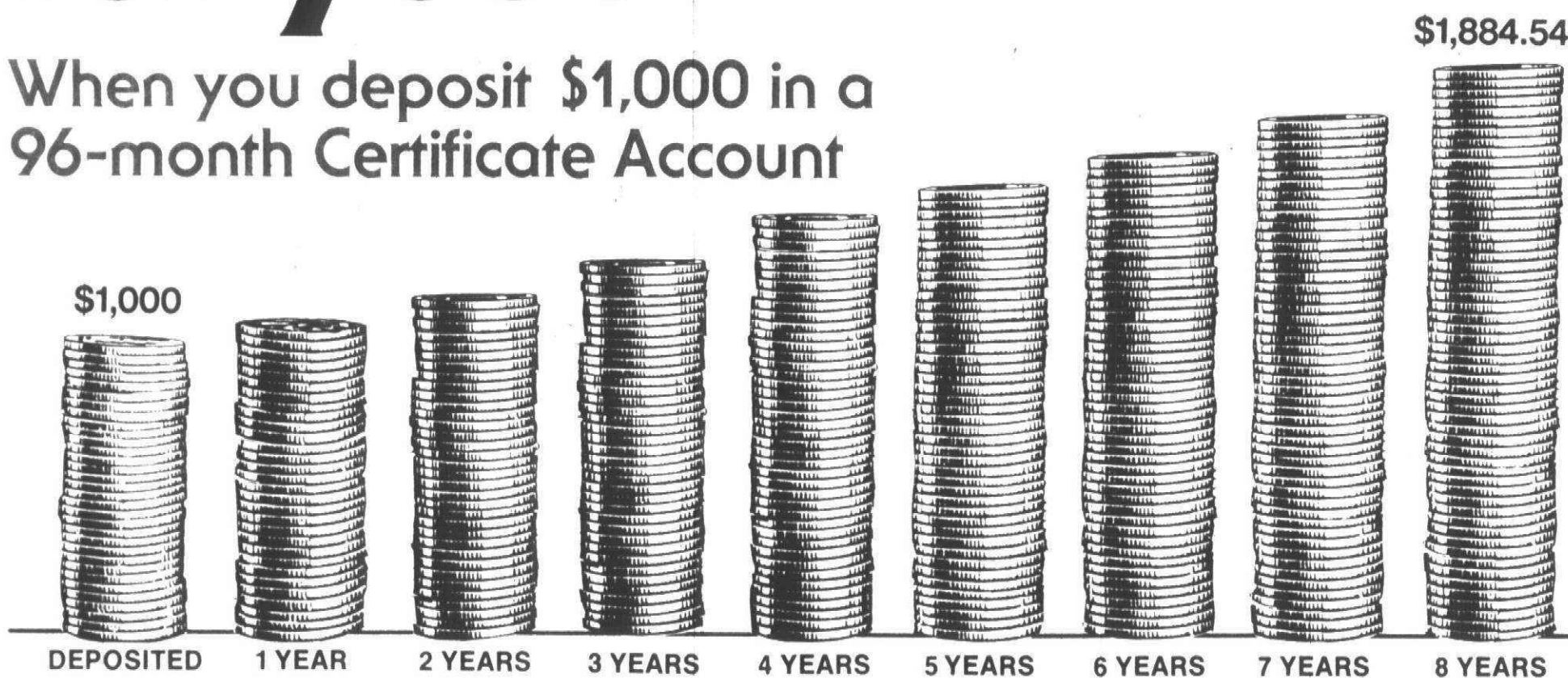
Regional. No 15-16-year-old team survived regional competition.

Time for non-partisan township races is now

It's about time the state legislature realized that partisan politics have little or no place in township elections.

In Plymouth and Canton townships, candidates are running under party affiliations for all the wrong reasons. In Plymouth Township everyone who ran in the primary as a Republican, mainly because it's a steadfast tradition to be Republican in Plymouth Township.

In Canton Township, out of 14 candidates in the township primary ran as Democrats—again because of tradition. Canton is a Democratic town.

Now does this mean that tall candidates toe the party line? What party line? The national Republican and Democratic parties have no platform dealing with local sewers, local park land, local police, and local zoning.

You should vote for candidates for local office because of their positions on decisions affecting your community. You should vote for them because of their involvement in community affairs. You should vote for them on the basis of their record or their promise of a new direction. Not because they're on the same side of the ballot as your favorite candidate for governor or senator. This situation is especially unfortunate in state primary elections such as the one we just went through. In Canton, how many people would have liked to vote for the Republican candidate for township supervisor but could not do so because they voted for the Democratic candidates in the state races?

If there is indeed a secret cell of closet Demo-

crats in Plymouth Township, it's too bad that they couldn't vote for any of the township GOP candidates when they decided to vote for a Democratic candidate for senate and governor.

Admittedly, they can pick from the primary survivors in November. But by then it could be too late to make a difference.

THE REASON township races are non-partisan is that there were problems in the old system. But that's no reason to stick with the present system and all its inadequacies.

Back in 1964, the state constitutional convention eliminated the old spring elections that most townships used to conduct. It dated back to the old farmer's fiscal year concept whereby local elections were held in March and new office holders started April 1, the beginning of the fiscal year.

Non-partisan township elections should be held in November on odd years, as it is done in most cities around the state. But it'll take a state-wide effort.

Every candidate for township office in Canton told the Observer that he favored non-partisan local races. Plymouth Township politicians should welcome a switch to non-partisan elections, if for nothing else than to relieve the Republican monopoly. They'd only stand to gain votes from the few secret Democrats who couldn't vote in the primary.

Drum up support on the state-wide level if you support such a switch. It'll only make local elections more representative.

Dad never pushed Nancy

If you ever had watched a Tom Mix movie, you'd know that the best route for a cattle drive from Texas to Colorado back when the six-shooter was king was by way of the Goodnight-Loving trail. It meant suffering the burning sun of Carlsbad and eating dust north through Santa Fe and on to Durango, but somehow the job got done.

Any guy with smarts in later years would have tarried in the Pecos Valley of New Mexico at the settlement of Roswell, the seat of Chaves County. Your assumption is going to be that he would ask for lessons in roping and other cowboy skills, but you're wrong.

If your name were Jack Nicklaus or Arnold Palmer and you missed the cut in the national PGA tournament during the same week when a 21-year-old seniorita from Roswell was winning the European women's open, you would ask for golf lessons from Domingo Lopez.

Only because I might get there before you, you would find him whacking the dings out of my car at the East Second Street Body & Fender Shop, which he owns. Between whacks we would be out back punching 2-iron shots off the hardpan.

Nancy Marie Lopez says of her father, recalling when tagged along with mom and pop to the Roswell golf course age of eight, "Daddy just put the ball on the ground and told me to hit it into the hole way down there."

Few pupils in any subject on any campus anywhere in the world ever have taken an instructor so literally.

DOMINGO LOPEZ was a golf not even before he moved to Roswell. His prior home had been in Torrance, Calif., just a short extension of an oil refinery pipeline from my town of Long Beach, and it was in Torrance that Nancy was born Jan. 6, 1957. At the time, her dad was a three-handicapper and one of southern California's better amateur players.

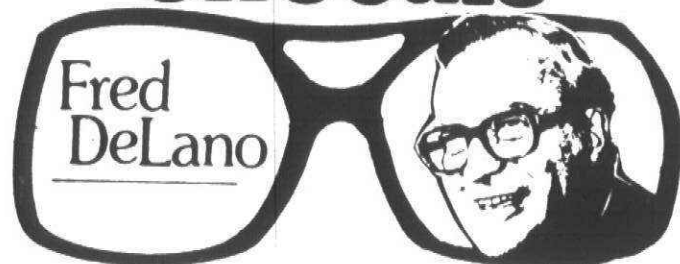
Neither Domingo nor wife Marina, who died last year, ever forced golf upon their flashing-eyed beauty of a daughter. Her natural instinct for the sport simply came to the fore as easily as perspiration surfaces through the pores.

First thing one knew, she had grown into a college beauty and owned the national collegiate women's championship while at the University of Tulsa.

But behind this success was a philosophy of her paternal tutor which Nancy puts in these words:

"He never pushed me. He would encourage me to do better, but he would never get mad at me when I didn't. He'd say, 'It makes no difference how you play. We'll always love you.'"

Today, my own golf-minded daughter, 17, is playing her final round in the Southern Michigan Junior Amateur tournament over Ann Arbor's trying 6,900-yard Leslie Park course. I weep to think I don't have the wisdom of a Domingo Lopez and never have spoken such words myself.

THE LOPEZ LASS will be going after her ninth tourney title in a year's time next week when she tees it up in the Lady Stroh's Open at the Dearborn Country Club. If you need the element of non-jock local importance to whet your appetite, it's in the fact that the charitable beneficiary of the gate receipts will be our own Leader Dog School for the Blind at Rochester.

Betting one player against 125 others is asinine, and there's no prediction here that Senorita Lopez will come home the winner. The field exudes class. The big names of the tour all will be there—Stacy, Baugh, Stephenson, Rankin et al.

But if you want to watch one gal who attacks a golf course with audacity, who gives every putt an even chance, who has a picture-book swing, and yet who has the natural rapport with an audience of a Lee Trevino, then catch a few holes of Lopez in action.

Out in Roswell, the natives tell tall tales of "Pecos Bill," a legendary folklore character said to have been raised by coyotes. He was thought to have been one of them until folks found out he had no tail.

As a cowboy, Pecos Bill roped and saddled a mountain lion and never was thrown until he rode a Kansas cyclone.

When Nancy gets home, the tales of her accomplishments all will be tall but they will be measurable in LPGA statistics and bank accounts. She's far and away the top candidate as 1978's sports-person of the year.



Housing industry should take some high tax blame

Most things in the American economy are inflationary, but some are more inflationary than others.

One of the most inflationary is housing. And when you get to the bottom line, the housing industry is as much responsible for the "tax revolt" in Michigan as the free-spending bureaucrats.

Those conclusions leaped out at me recently as I heard a talk by Ned S. Hubbell, who heads a Michigan counseling firm devoted to educational public relations and opinion research.

Hubbell gives a speech he calls "A Profound Transformation." He talks and shows slides about the decline in births, the growth in the number of older folks, the changes in family size and housing.

"ANOTHER FACTOR—the price of homes—will tend to support increased apartment-style living and the trend to smaller families," he says.

"The median price for new homes went up from \$23,000 to \$45,000 between 1970 and 1975—a 95 per cent increase—and is projected to reach \$70,000 in the 1980s.

"During these same years that home costs rose 95 per cent, median income went up just 40 per cent. It is estimated that only one-fourth of American families can afford a median price new home.

Interestingly, many families who are buying homes report they are planning smaller families in order to meet these costs."

So says Ned Hubbell, working with national figures.

Closer to home, I can recall reports to the Economic Club of Detroit during the oil crisis recession that showed 47 per cent unemployment in the building trades in southeast Michigan.

At the same time, prices continued to soar 15 per cent annually.

The industry, the tradesmen and the building suppliers are all working together to send housing costs up faster than the rate of inflation in the rest of the economy. If it costs the workers jobs, if it costs the builders sales, it makes no difference.

IN THE EARLY '60s, school people complained constantly that their costs were rising faster than property tax revenues, which were tied to stagnant assessments.

A rural township supervisor once told me he found a rolled-up paper in an obscure drawer that turned out to be the 1880 assessment roll. He picked out a certain farm, looked up the 1880 assessment and compared it to the 1960 assessment. It hadn't changed!

So in the early 1960s, the school folks had a good argument for tying school revenue to something more dynamic than stagnant assessments.

The new Michigan constitution in 1964 was to correct this. All assessments were to be pegged at 50 per cent of true market value, which meant that assessments—and therefore revenue—would rise with inflation.

Unfortunately, inflation in the construction industry took hold at almost exactly the same time. As new housing prices soared faster than our paychecks, they dragged prices of existing housing up with them. And our tax assessments rose with them.

If you've heard the Dick Headlee and Robert Tisch pitches, you've heard them rant about "bureaucrats" spending the dough faster than we can earn it. That's political talk. The truth is that the construction industry, the building trades and the materials suppliers had a hand in it.

'Reforms' the voters want

Congress and the state legislatures fiddle around with "reforms" every time they go into session.

There are tax reforms, lobbying reforms, welfare reforms and the like. Seldom are they really reforms—merely shifting of financial responsibility from a greater number of voters to a lesser number of voters to please the most number of voters.

George Gallup, in his polling, has come up with the six real political reforms that most Americans want. Because they affect the people who would have to pass them, these reforms have been very slow in being enacted.

THREE REFORMS revolve around how we elect our president:

- Seventy-five per cent of the public favors doing away with the Electoral College by amending the U.S. Constitution to provide for direct popular election of the president. Such a bill passed the House of Representatives in 1969 but was filibustered to death. The present system allows a person with fewer popular votes than his opponent to be elected president.

- Sixty-eight per cent of voters would like a nationwide primary to be held on the same day in all 50 states so that voters could nominate presidential candidates for their parties. This would end nomination by political conventions and confusion with the many state primaries held over a six-month period.

- Sixty-eight per cent would like to shorten the campaign season, which now extends from the first primaries in January to the general election in November, exhausting the candidates, boring the public and costing a lot of money. The public favors moving election day to September.

THREE OTHER major political reforms the public would like to see are: eliminating the tenure of representatives in Congress to a maximum of 12 years (60 per cent in favor); having the government provide a fixed amount of money for congressional campaigns with contributions from all other sources prohibited, (the ban to include use of the candidates' own funds (57 per cent); and allowing Americans to initiate federal legislation

when a group equal to three per cent of the number who voted in the last presidential election signs a petition requesting such a referendum (57 per cent).

The restriction on the length of time a congressman can serve would again make him a citizen representative instead of allowing him to look at it as a job and a way of making a living.

It would allow more able people a chance to serve.

It also would have a tendency to lower the age of Congress and make it perhaps more in tune with the will of the people.

AS FOR GOVERNMENT-supplied funds for congressional campaigns, a candidate must either be wealthy or look for contributions from those seeking political favors under the present system.

If the government supplied and limited the funds spent, no one would have an undue financial advantage in an election, less would be spent, and possibly the electorate will pick the best qualified person.

The last political reform, allowing for public initiation of federal laws, would allow the people to make law if their desires were bottled up in Congress for political reasons.

Had this been law, Gallup says, 65 per cent of the voters would have abolished mandatory school busing to achieve racial balance, and 57 per cent would have passed the Equal Rights Amendment (including more men than women), and 77 per cent would have approved tougher gun controls.

All of these reforms, approved by a majority of the voting public, would make us a purer democracy. However, the congressmen who would lose some power would have to approve them.

In response to your recent article on Carol Levitte's resignation from the Citizens Committee for United Services (CCUS), let me correct some errors which were caused by Ms. Levitte's characteristic of spouting off before researching the facts. (Had Ms. Levitte attended any of the meetings of her committee in the last two months, she would have seen how wrong she was.)

She claimed that the Direction and Course Subcommittee of CCUS had "arranged for someone from Ford Motor Company to put together a package to sell the people the idea of consolidation." Balderdash!

We have been fortunate to obtain the volunteer services of Oz Olstad, a Plymouth Township resident and a Ford Motor Co. expert on surveys and random sampling. His expertise will help us—not to push for consolidation, as Ms. Levitte imagines—but to aid in formulating and implementing a random survey of Plymouth city and township voters on questions relating

to governmental services, tax levels and structures.

This survey, which may poll as many as 1,000 registered voters, will represent the first time our community's citizenry will be asked their attitudes on a wide range of local governmental issues.

Although such a survey could cost \$25,000 if conducted by a professional marketing survey company, CCUS will spend a maximum of \$600 for the project thanks to the efforts of many volunteers like Mr. Olstad.

As to Ms. Levitte's claim that some CCUS members don't "want the committee to do too good a job on unifying services because then people might not want consolidation"—again, balderdash!

Although I'm one CCUS member who raised the concern that unifying any services might affect the possibilities of eventually consolidating the city and township, all the committee members have felt our prime objective is that of providing necessary governmental services with the best quality and at the lowest possible cost. No

one on the committee has ever said anything like what Ms. Levitte claimed.

It is unfortunate that Ms. Levitte became so lost in Fantasy Land. (Equally appalling is Plymouth Township Supervisor Tom Notebaert's echo: "I assume there is some pressure being brought to bear in favor of consolidation," when he knows that is not the case.)

It is also unfortunate that Ms.

Levitte quit before finishing the relatively easy task assigned to the committee she chaired. Now the rest of us must not only finish our appointed tasks, but we must also assume her duties and counter her misinformed grumbling as well. I wonder what the motives for her fictionalizing are.

Buggy crops?

Is the weather bugging you right now? Chances are it's doing the same to your garden crops.

Insect specialists (entomologists) at Michigan State University point out that many chemical pesticides break down rapidly as the temperature outside increases. Thus the pesticides are effective for shorter periods and must be applied more often to keep mites and insect pests under control.

Spraying more often is not an easy solution, however. Hot weather increases the chance that pesticides will burn tender plant foliage.

To avoid chemical burn of plant tissues and to achieve safe, effective pest control, the MSU experts have these tips for pesticide use:

- Spray when weather reports call for no rain for at least 12 hours.
- Spray in the early morning when there is no wind and temperatures are cool.

Clang Clang!

Many Americans who yearn for the "clang, clang, clang" of a trolley are finding it harder and harder to hear that unique sound.

The sad fact is that these picturesque electric streetcars are a vanishing breed and in most American cities the only place you're likely to see one is in a museum.

Not so in Pittsburgh. Happily in this city, which is headquarters for many of the nation's largest corporations, one can still see a trolley line in operation. Actually Pittsburgh's trolley lines are a 26-mile remnant of a system that once covered much of the nine-county region now known as Penn's Southwest and once had over 600 miles of track.

Star-studded season planned by symphony

Kicked off by a \$1,000 donation from Burroughs Corp., the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra's 1978-79 season will be opened by the internationally famed bass-baritone William Warfield and will include a performance of Gilbert and Sullivan's "H.M.S. Pinafore."

Fran Lang, president of the symphony society, said more than 800 membership pamphlets have been mailed to persons in Plymouth, Canton and surrounding communities.

Meanwhile, Mrs. Lang said, symphony board members are beginning to call on business and industry for funds.

Besides the Burroughs gift, Ford Motor Co. contributed a \$500 corporate gift, and the Michigan Council for the Arts is expected to add about \$3,000.

WAYNE DUNLAP, conductor for 28 of the symphony's 33 seasons, will be at the helm again.

Dunlap issued a call for players of all string instruments. Auditions may be arranged by calling Mrs. Lang at 453-5064 or by attending the first rehearsal at 8 p.m. Monday, Sept. 18, in Central Middle School, Main at Church streets.

Membership prices are unchanged from last year, ranging from \$250 for pillar to \$30 for supporting family

memberships to \$8 for senior citizens.

Single ticket prices also are unchanged: \$3.50 for adults, \$1.75 for senior citizens and free for K-12 students. The lone exception will be the performance of "The Mikado," when prices will be \$5 for adults and \$2.50 for seniors and students alike.

WILLIAM WARFIELD, star of concert hall, movie screen and television, and the biggest "name" Plymouth has attracted in many years, will appear at the opening concert Sunday, Oct. 15, in Plymouth Salem High School.

An old friend of Dunlap's since student days, Warfield is a professor at the University of Illinois. His program will be announced later.

Warfield is best known for his stunning performance of the song "Old Man River" in Jerome Kern's "Showboat." That sequence was repeated in the recent United Artists movie "That's Entertainment."

Warfield has recorded portions of both "Showboat" and Gershwin's "Porgy and Bess" as well as song cycles by Robert Schumann and Johannes Brahms, Handel's "Messiah" (with both the Philadelphia and New York Philharmonic orchestras) and Mozart's "Requiem."

OTHER CONCERTS and featured performers will be:

- Nov. 19—Cellist Ross Harbaugh in the Dvorak cello concerto and the orchestra in works of Franz Schubert. Harbaugh was heard in Plymouth last season with the New World String Quartet.

- Dec. 10—"H.M.S. Pinafore" with the Manhattan Savoyards. The group appeared in Plymouth last season in Gilbert and Sullivan's "The Mikado." First performed 100 years ago, "Pinafore" irritated the government of Benjamin Disraeli with a song about a first lord of the admiralty who had never been to sea.

- Jan. 28—the traditional family concert. Carla Upton, a Plymouth graduate who soon will receive her degree from the University of Michigan music school, will be soloist in a portion of Grieg's Piano Concerto in A minor.

- March 4—Maria Royce, harpist, will be soloist in Handel's Harp Concerto and Debussy's "Dances Sacred and Profane."

- April 22—Frederick Weldy, winner of the college division in the 1978 Michigan chapter of the Music Teachers National Association competition, will be soloist in Rachmaninoff's Piano Concerto No. 2.



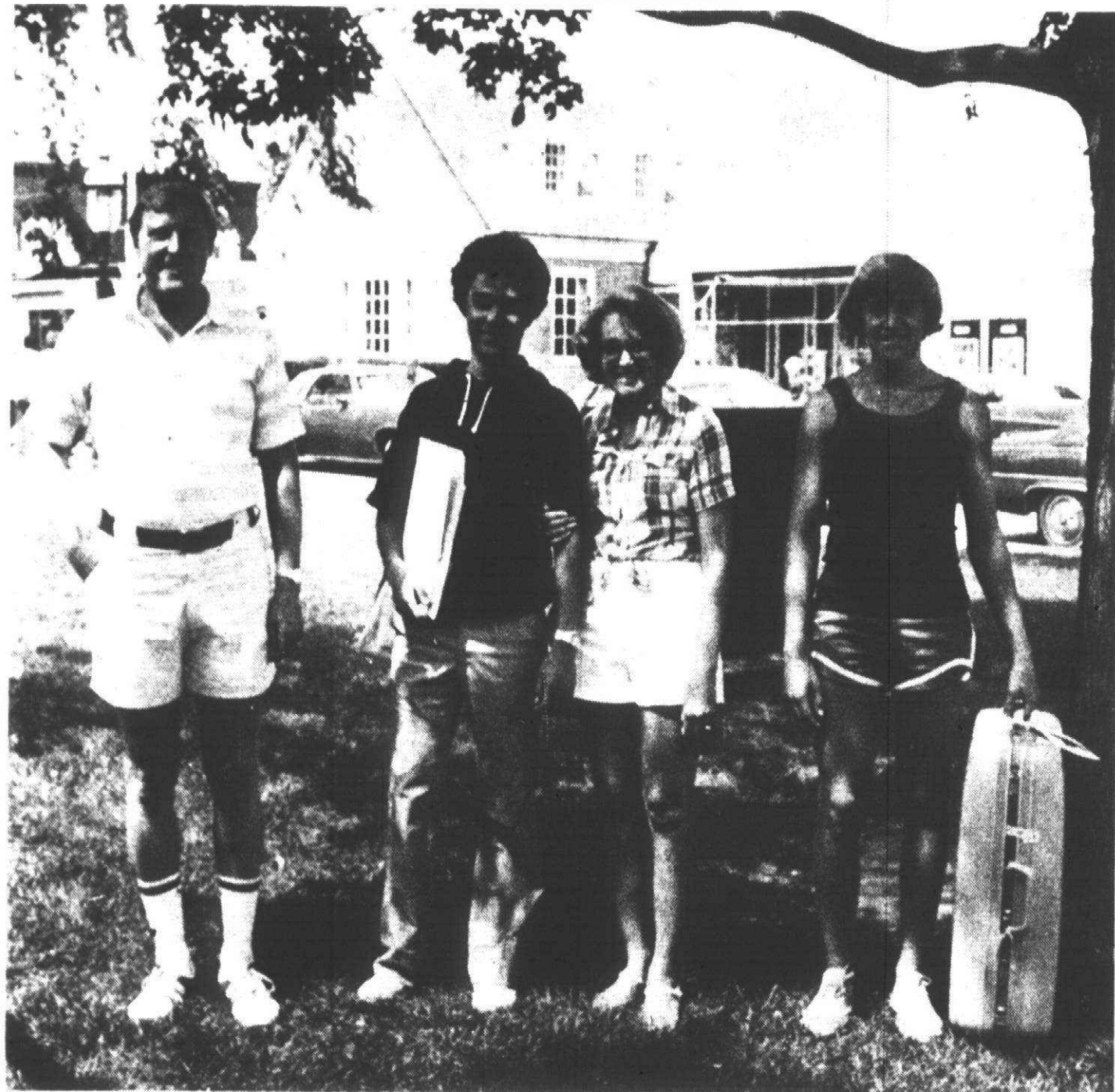

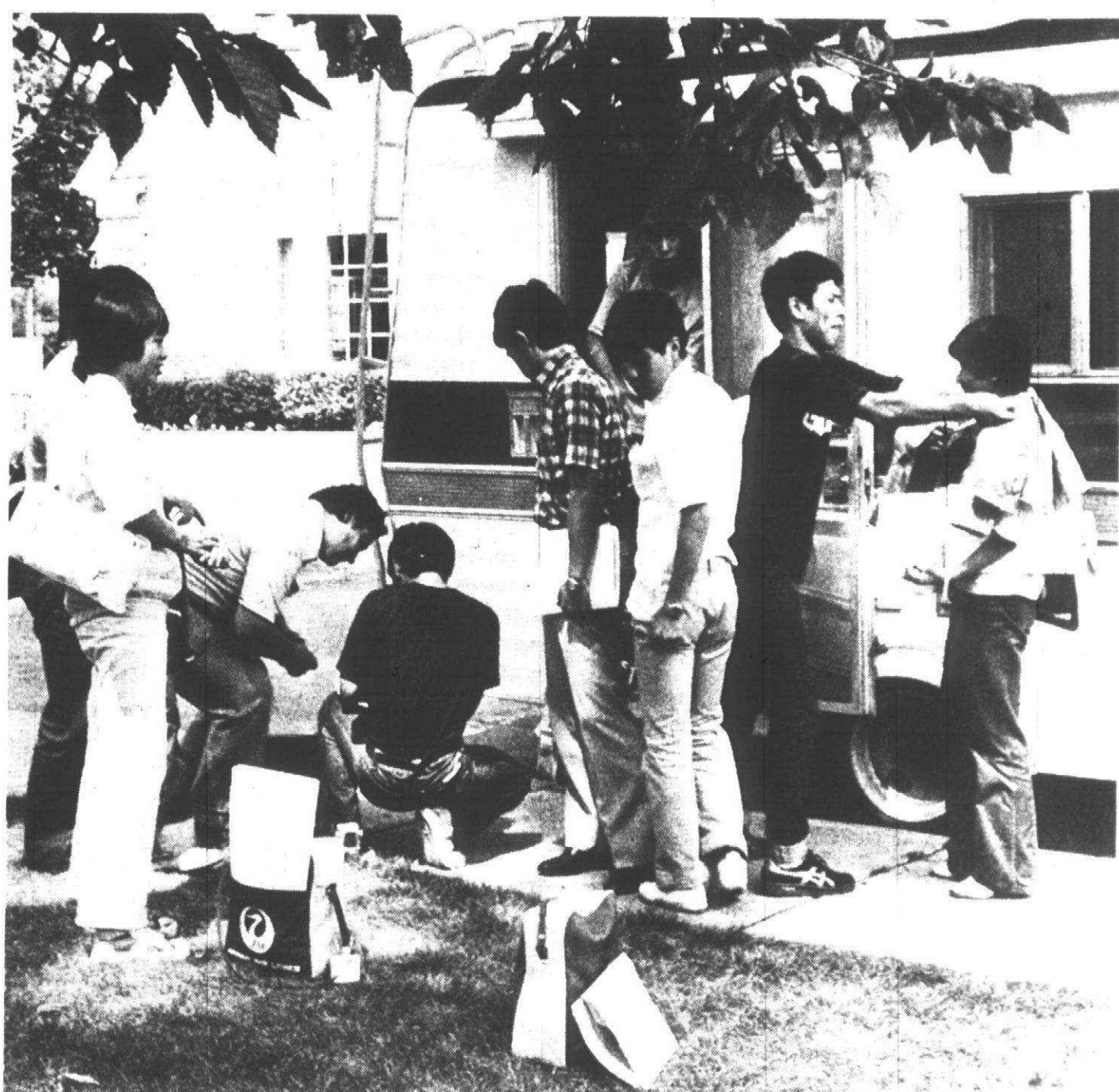

Community host to Japanese students

Fourteen Japanese high school students arrived in Plymouth Saturday afternoon. Fourteen area families awaited them in Kellogg Park.

Several members of the Plymouth Colonial Kiwanis Club had driven to Ann Arbor to collect the students and their chaperones. The visitors had traveled by Greyhound bus from Washington, D.C. by way of Pittsburgh and Cleveland. The word was passed around the park that they would be a little later than scheduled. They were having lunch in Ann Arbor before leaving for Plymouth.

When they came, students and luggage soon were sorted out. Each of the host families claimed a guest and headed for home. The chaperons stayed at the Mayflower Hotel. All would meet later that afternoon for a picnic in Hines Park. It was the first of

many events planned for their five-day visit.

The high school student exchange program was initiated in 1966 by the Minaminihon Broadcasting Co. (MBC) with the cooperation of the Kagoshima Prefectural Government. Geographically, the prefecture includes the southern part of the Island of Kyushu and the smaller islands which string out to the south and mark the boundary between the East China Sea and the Pacific Ocean.

KAGOSHIMA is the largest city and the capital of the prefecture which has a population of 1.75 million persons. The city has been called the "Naples of the Orient." It, too, has a volcano which towers over the Bay of Kinko.

The idea for the student exchange program was not new to Japan. The

first was started more than 100 years ago.

There had been a brief battle between the British Navy and the Satsuma clan. The Satsumas were so impressed by the superior technology of the Western power that they sent their brightest scholars to Europe and United States for personal exposure to modern civilization. When they returned to their homeland, these students where the driving force behind the movement that changed Japan into a modern state.

Suetaka Hatanaka, president of the board of MBC, has been a moving force behind the student exchange. His son, Itsuro, is one of the chaperons. He heads the MBC Travel Service.

John Belser, who chaired the Plymouth visit for the Colonial Kiwanis Club, said the young Hatanaka was an invaluable member of the group because of his excellent English. He is a graduate of Oglethorpe University in Atlanta, Ga.

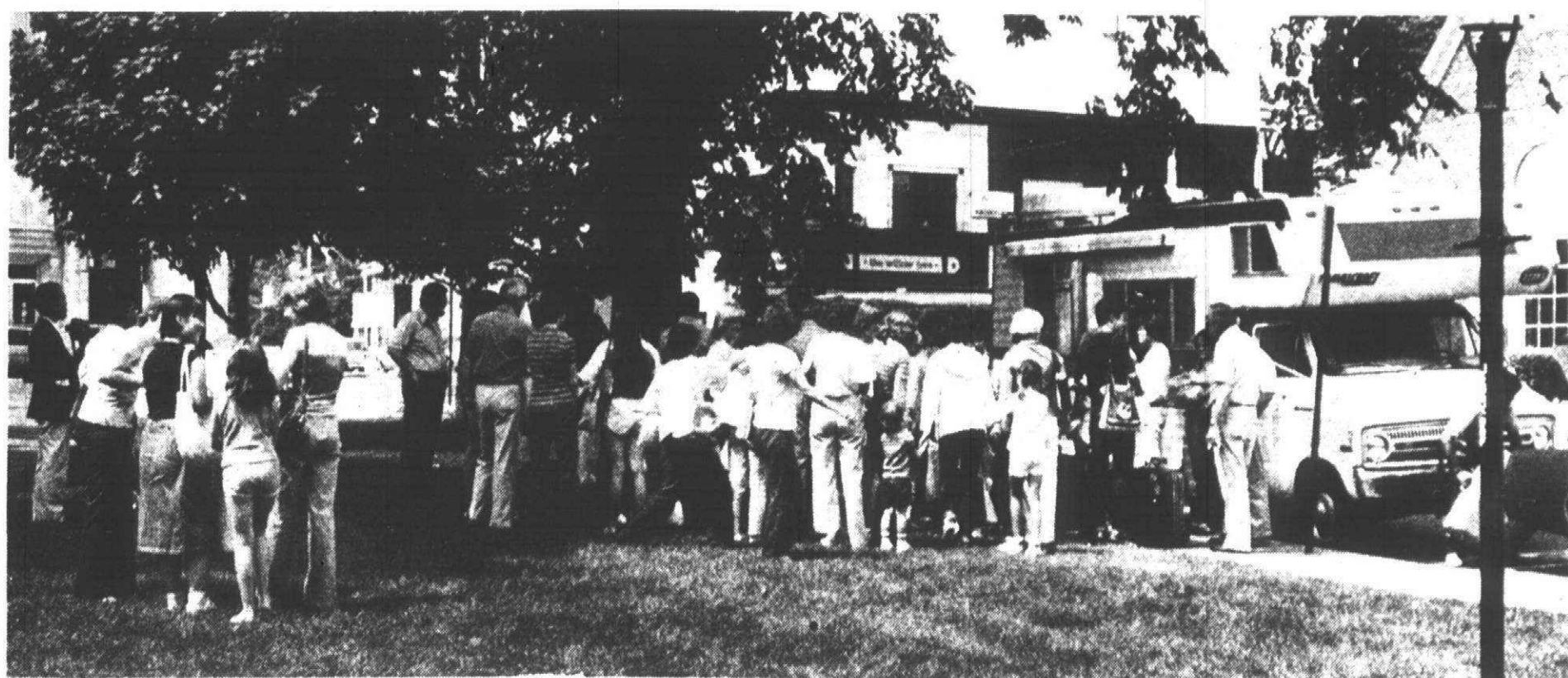

Cooking metric? No need to panic

How long do you cook a roast at 160 degrees C? Can you picture a two-liter saucepan? How do you measure sugar for a recipe that calls for 250 ml of sugar?

If you don't know, don't panic. We will continue to measure out ingredients the same way we always have, says Wendy Sanford, manager of consumer service, Corning Glass Works of Canada, Ltd.

You don't have to be a mathematician to use the metric system. We use variations of it everyday in our money system. In fact, calculations will become easier with the elimination of fractions and the need to convert to another measurement (inches to feet to yards) as required in our present system. The metric system uses multiples of ten to increase or decrease a measurement.

The three measuring units most frequently used are meter (m) for length, liter for volume (l) and gram (g) for mass weight. These are all made larger by adding the prefix kilo (k) which means 1000. One kilogram (kg) is equal to 1000 g. For smaller amounts the prefixes centi- and milli- are the most common. One meter (m) equals 100 cm or 1000 mm. One liter (l) is 1000 ml.

The painless way to use the new system is to abandon the old. Think in metric terms. Don't convert inches, pints, and pounds into metric units. Learn the language—think it, visualize it, but don't try to convert to the customary system.

How will metric affect cooking and recipes? Although the way we cook won't change, the appearance of the recipe will, since ingredient quantities

are given in metric units. Only one unit (ml) is needed now where cups, tablespoons, teaspoon and ounces were used before. We will continue to cook, using the same techniques with convenient measuring tools similar in appearance to our present measuring cups and spoons but having slightly different sizes that relate to the liter.

Fortunately, we won't just wake up one morning and find everything metric. There will be time for homemakers to make the switch. For instance, Pyrex brand liquid measures are already being marked in metric units on one side and customary cups and fluid ounces on the other.

Metric conversion is on the move. Already shoppers find packages marked in milliliters or grams in the supermarket. They can buy one liter bottles of soda and kilograms of sugar.

The key to metric is to avoid confusing tables. Learn the new metric language first. Some bench marks are

useful in the beginning but try to meet the metric system on its own terms.

Here are some helpful hints:
1 m—a little longer than one yard.
5 cm—about two inches.
1 l—a little more than one U.S. quart.
250 ml—a little more than one eight-ounce measuring cup.
15 ml—about one tablespoon.
5 ml—about one teaspoon.
1 kg—a little more than two lbs.
500 g—a little more than 1 lb.
100 degrees Celsius—water boils.
200 degrees C—room temperature.
0 degrees C—water freezes.
160 degrees C—oven temperature for roasting meat.

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
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
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
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Ramp for handicapped

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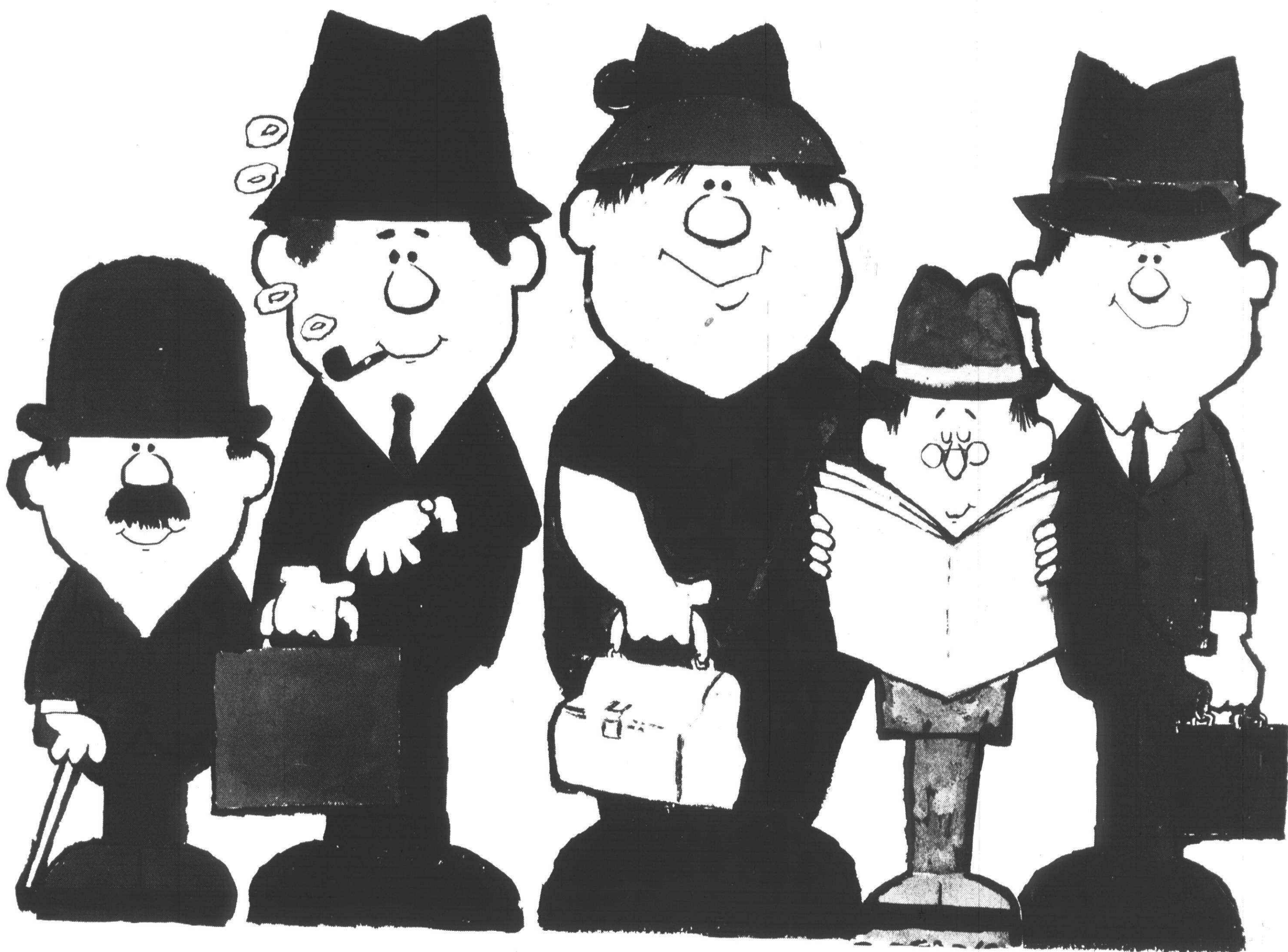
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WHY ARE THESE MEN SMILING?

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The old and the new

Dust off the state's museums for some cheap thrills...

A museum tour of Michigan can lead travelers to such historic haunts as an 1832 stagecoach inn in the Irish Hills, a 19th Century opera house at Coldwater, an 1892 railroad depot in Petoskey and stately mansions once the homes of governors, according to Automobile Club of Michigan.

An Auto Club selection of 17 buildings in 14 towns offers tourists an opportunity to visit the most offbeat among hundreds of museums in the state.

Historic Walker Tavern near Brooklyn (phone 517-467-4414) was a famed stopping place for stagecoaches and pioneer wagons traveling between Detroit and Chicago. Visitors can view the guest rooms used by two heroes of the past—pioneer novelist James Fenimore Cooper and statesman-orator Daniel Webster.

Sara Bernhardt, John Wilkes Booth, the Barrymores and other theatrical greats are depicted in the lobby mural at the 1882 Tibbits Opera House in Coldwater (517-278-6029). Concerts, operas and plays are presented there year-round and the Tibbits Art Gallery on the lower level features changing exhibits.

PETOSKEY'S Victorian-style railroad depot has been restored by the Little Traverse Regional Historical Society (616-347-2620) and is operated as a museum during summer months. Featured are a porcupine quill basket collection and memorabilia of authors Ernest Hemingway and Bruce Catton.

Pine Grove, a Greek Revival mansion in Pontiac, was built in 1844 by Gov. Moses Wisner, who used it as his

official residence while in office. It now is a museum operated by the Oakland County Pioneer and Historical Society (313-338-6732).

Murphy Museum (517-479-9434) in Harbor Beach is the birthplace of another Michigan governor, Frank Murphy. The home was built in 1890.

Oldest of the former governors' homes is the 1835 mansion of Gov. John S. Barry in Constantine (616-435-7316). Lt. Gov. James Wright Gordon built his Greek Revival mansion in Marshall in 1839 in anticipation that the city would become the state's capi-

tal. Although Lansing got that honor, the Marshall home still is known as "the Governor's Mansion" (616-781-5163).

Another famous mansion open to the public is the 1850s Greek Revival Kempf House in Ann Arbor (313-761-4510), with its Steinway grand piano used by the great Paderewski in a University of Michigan concert.

CONCORD'S 1883 Mann House (517-524-8943) has a fine collection of photographs tracing the town's history. Albion's 1869 Gardner House Museum (517-629-5533) contains furnishings from the period, including a chandelier from the abandoned opera house in town.

An exhibit of medical instruments pay tribute to the three generations of doctors who lived in Battle Creek's

1886 Kimball House (616-965-2613).

Marshall's Honolulu House was built in 1860 by Judge Abner Pratt, who served as U.S. Consul to the Sandwich Islands. He was so charmed by the islands that he styled his home in an authentic Hawaiian motif. The home's 19th Century antiques include a folding bathtub which could double as a bed.

Another Marshall landmark is the Gothic Revival two-room Capitol Hill School, which served the city for 101 years. One room of the restored building is set up as a 19th century schoolroom. The other is a children's museum.

The one-room Nottawa Stone School on M-86, four miles east of Centerville (616-467-7761), was built in 1870 and is used primarily during the school year

as an educational experience for area schoolchildren.

THE BEAVER Island Historical Museum at St. James (616-448-2212) originally was a Mormon print shop, where a daily newspaper was started in December 1850—the first daily newspaper printed north of Grand Rapids. The museum collection includes many items from the period when James Strang crowned himself king of the Mormon colony.

The curious contrast of castle and log cabin is found at Owosso (517-725-7610). Outdoor writer James Oliver Curwood's studio, nicknamed Curwood's Castle because of its resemblance to a Norman fortress, is an art gallery. Owosso's oldest house, the 1836 Comstock Cabin, is a museum with furnishings appropriate to the period.

...and head up, up and away in Jackson's space museum

Anything you ever wanted to know about space exploration—and more—will be found in the public exhibits and displays at the Michigan Space Center, located near Jackson.

Nestled at the southeast corner of Jackson Community College in a near-perfect sylvan setting, the center is marked by a Redstone rocket standing as a sentinel before the main building.

Visitors entering the center are greeted in the reception area and then easily find their way to an entrance which takes them through the Transition Tunnel to the main display area. The center of interest here is the original Apollo 9 which was returned to a

safe splashdown after orbiting the earth.

Through windows of the spacecraft visitors can look into the lighted interior to see mannequins placed in the same positions the astronauts assumed in their trips outside the earth's atmosphere.

THE DOMED CEILING of the center structure is composed of ground and recycled newsprint, under which is suspended an actual parachute that brought one of the earlier space capsules back to earth. Other one-of-a-kind exhibits include a mockup of Mariner IV, the original of which flew around

the planet Mars. A full-scale mockup of Surveyor III is also on display and is an exact, detailed replica of the vehicle used in exploring the moon and left there.

The self-guided tour takes the visitor past lighted panels where spacesuits are on display, worn by James McDivitt of the Apollo mission, the Gemini mission spacesuit worn by Jack Lovell and Deke Slayton's spacesuit from the Mercury mission.

Also on display is the Chimpanzee capsule, the Gemini trainer, an exhibit of food used by the astronauts in space and a display of the Russian space-

craft Soyuz link-up with the Apollo. Television sets placed conveniently throughout the tour show continuous films of the actual telecast during the moon exploration, Astronaut Ed White's walk in space and the Apollo liftoff.

The Astro Theatre, at the end of the tour, features a triple-screen presentation of space exploration in the auditorium which seats 80 persons.

The center opened in May 1977 at a structural cost of more than \$750,000. The value of the exhibits, however, far surpasses that figure.

SPACE CENTER Director Charles

E. Gass stated that some of the exhibits are on a loan cycle, so the exhibits will be changing from time to time and other new exhibits will be added. He pointed out that the center also serves to honor those Jackson and Michigan astronauts who were pioneers in the nation's space program.

Alfred Worden and James McDivitt were born in Jackson; Alan Bean was a resident of Jackson for some time; and Jack Lousma's father, Jacob, still lives in Jackson. The other Michigan astronaut, Roger Chaffee of Grand Rapids, lost his life in a tragic fire at a rocket launch site.

As an added interest to Space Center patrons, a gift and souvenir shop is located near the reception area and features more than 120 space-related items for sale.

Admission fees are \$1.50 for adults and 75 cents each for students and senior citizens. Special group rates are available. The center is open seven days a week.

Burlesque dies in dull show

If this was burlesque, we haven't missed much.

Q-time stripper Ann Corio has brought her show "This Was Burlesque" to the Birmingham Theatre for a six-day stay through Saturday. The show opened Monday night to an unpacked house.

The show is touted as the all-new 1978 version of "This Was Burlesque," which Ms. Corio has been starring in since 1962.

Besides Ms. Corio's modest striptease, there are a couple of other strip-pers in the show. And one (Luna) takes it all off, except for a G-string, while swallowing fire. The other stripper, a sultry blonde (Phoenix Flame), twirled her tassels fore and aft.

Vying with the blonde for best of show was comic Jerry Lester, who achieved fame in the early days of TV as host of the late-night live "Broadway Open House." In a shoulder-length brown curly wig, Lester managed to be raunchy and funny as he stripped to a few false bare essentials.

Review

MS. CORIO IS still a stunning woman, with a pretty face, red tresses and a knock-out figure. Her plunging necklines were revealed in a constant change of costume, as Ms. Corio narrated the nostalgic history of burlesque.

Her strip came at the end of the show, when she recreated her famous routine from the 1930s. Dressed in pink crinoline, she teasingly talked to the strains of "A Pretty Girl." Then she removed a few garments to appear fleetingly in a sheer top and bottom. "I'll catch cold," she said, donning a flowing pink ruffled capelet.

Five top bananas, or burlesque comics, appeared in the show. They were better than their material permitted. The skits were incredibly bad, it seemed to me, and one with kids in a schoolroom and Ms. Corio as teacher had humor that would appeal only to an adult with a 12-year-old mentality.

Most of the comics were of the baggy-pants variety, and Maxie Furman knew how to deliver a line, if not how to choose one. A routine where he kept taking his pants off had him going down into the audience and clowning with a woman in the front row.

"You weren't embarrassed by 'Deep Throat' were you?" he queried after she put her purse over her face to avoid him. Everyone in the front row was generally good-natured about the frequent audience participation, however, including this same woman.

HER ESCORT was a constant target for joking by the Burley Cuties, six lively showgirls in the cast. (Two couples escaped the share-the-fun routine when, before the show, they protested being seated in the front row, and got other seats.)

Those of us who have not been to burlesque shows before discovered that most of the jokes were, as expected, about sex. But it was disappointing to find this "musical satire" more corny than racy. The constant references to the same old thing was boring.

There will be no extra admission charges above regular fees for the special weekend. For more information, call 849-0299.

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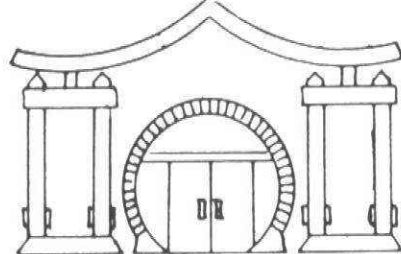
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Hazards abound in summer fun

Lisa, 2½, ran happily across the beach to the circle of stones with sand piled inside. Then she was screaming, her hands charred from charcoal still smoldering at 800 to 900 degrees under the thin layer of sand.

That was three years ago. Today Lisa (not her real name) still returns to Children's Hospital of Michigan for reconstruction of her hands. Some fingertips have been lost.

Summer pastimes hold hidden hazards of accidental burns for many children, warns Dr. James R. Lloyd, a pediatric surgeon who is director of the Burn Center at Children's Hospital in the Detroit Medical Center, and clinical assistant professor of surgery at Wayne State University School of Medicine.

"The average age of children brought to the Burn Center is four to five years, an age when they still need close supervision," says Dr. Lloyd, who has been a member of the medical staff at Children's for 19 years.

"Parents who are aware of potential burn hazards can prevent their children from suffering pain and often disfigurement. Parents have often told me, 'I never dreamed this could happen,' but a moment's forethought can keep a summer outing from becoming a tragedy."

A LITTLE-KNOWN danger of motorcycle riding, for instance, is tailpipe burns, caused when a child riding behind the driver touches his legs to the hot exhaust.

In addition to beach fires which are not drowned before being covered with sand, many dangers are inherent in the backyard barbecue grill. Adults who use gasoline to start a fire sometimes cause an explosion from the rap-

idly expanding fumes.

The same is true when burning brush piles. Or a parent may add starter fluid to speed a slow charcoal fire; the flames can travel up the stream of fluid to the can, creating an explosion as well as fire.

Small children may stumble and fall into a hot grill placed on the ground. Young Joe suffered extensive burns when he fell onto a grill. Both arms, his back, one leg, a hand and part of his face were seared.

YOUNG BURN VICTIMS have been treated at Children's after touching dry ice packed around ice cream containers; for grasping hot camping lanterns and hurricane lamps; for getting into paint stripper used outdoors; for electric burns from lights strung at backyard parties where the loose plug was in contact with damp ground.

The list goes on — a busy mother puts her young infant outside in the shade, forgetting that the sun will move to glare directly on the baby's tender skin. Gasoline spilled on cement while refueling a lawnmower exploded when a child dropped a metallic object into the puddle, creating a spark.

Burns from these and other causes last year brought 600 children for treatment in the Children's Hospital Emergency Room. Some 234 were serious enough to require hospitalization.

"Parents tend to underestimate the seriousness of burns to a child," says Dr. Lloyd. "A burn that covers half the head and face of a one year old affects 8.5 per cent of the infant's body area, while the same burn on an adult would cover only 3.5 per cent of his body. A child's head is much larger in proportion to his body than that of an adult."

ADULTS RESPONSIBLE for children should keep in mind these simple first aid measures for burns:

- Put out the fire and get the child horizontal so the flames don't flare up on the face and hair. Smother the flames with a blanket, tablecloth or coat; use a hose or swimming pool if nearby. Roll the child on the ground if none of these are available.

- Compresses wrung out of cool water, or cool water applied directly on the burn, will usually relieve pain. Do not use ice — it can cause frostbite. Ice can be used to cool the water applied to the wound. A water temperature of 55 degrees is good.

- Remove the burned clothing. If some clothing is adhering to the burns, cut around the stuck portion and do not try to remove it.

- Wrap the child in a clean sheet, tablecloth or blanket, keep her warm and dry and get emergency care. If a doctor's office is closer than a hospital, go there first.

Skilled medical care is necessary to replace lost body fluids, reduce pain and prevent infection, even before the wound itself is attended to. At Children's Hospital 12-bed Burn Center the highly trained burn team includes physicians, nurses, occupational and physical therapists, psychiatrists, social workers and dietitians.

Dr. Lloyd feels strongly that any child who has suffered a burn should be seen by a physician. "A burn involving the entire area of a child represents 10 to 15 per cent of the body area. That is considered a major burn. Even small burns can be life-threatening if they are deep."

The most serious burns are those on the hands, face, feet and genital area. Hospitalization is always recommended for these burns.

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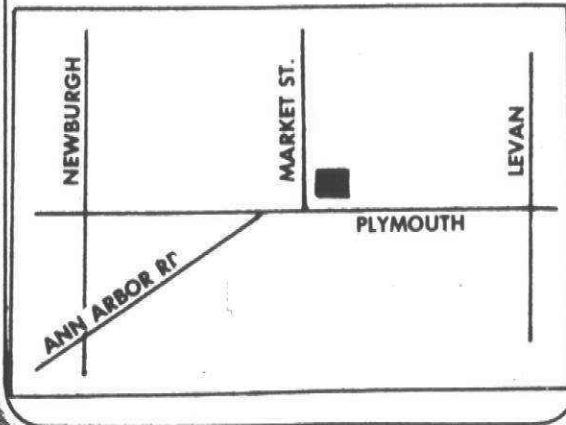
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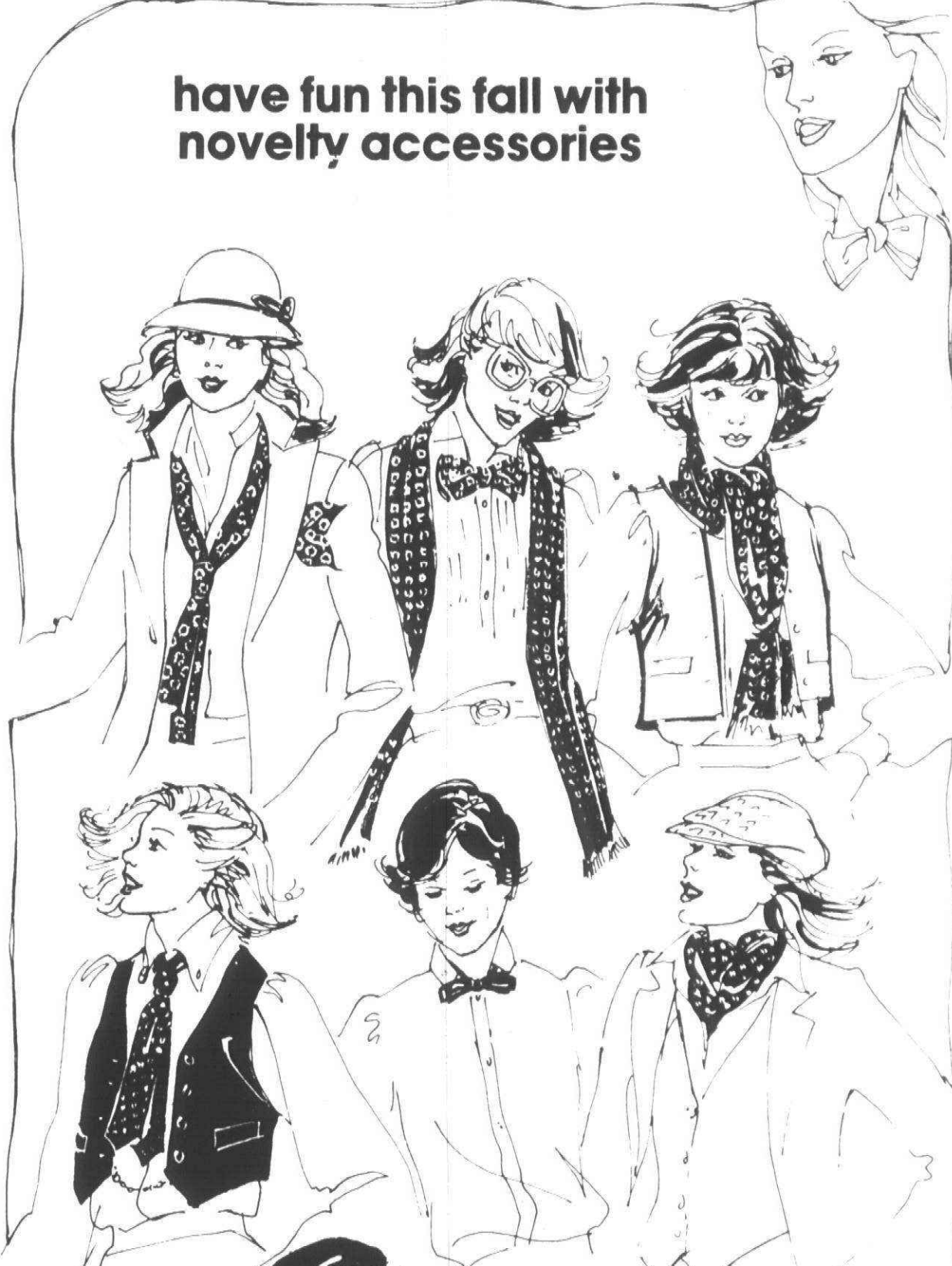
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Federal grant insures Madonna College growth

An institutional development program which began ten years ago at Madonna College will be extended for three years with the aid of a \$950,000 federal grant.

Announcement of the funding by the U.S. Office of Education was made jointly by Sister Mary Francilene,

Madonna president, and U.S. Rep. Carl D. Pursell (R-Plymouth.)

"We look upon this grant as a vote of confidence in our institution and as an assist in the continuation of our growth," said Sr. Francilene. Madonna, a liberal arts college fully accredited by the North Central Association, has tripled its enrollment in the past six years and has served as a national model for integrating career education with liberal arts.

Implementation of the three major activities in the grant will begin this fall. The three activities described in this Advanced Institutional Development plan call for establishing a comprehensive, computerized information component for its planning, managing, budgeting and evaluation system; an expanded effort in the area

of financial development and a program of academic support for older learners, handicapped, and marginal students.

The computerized information system will interface all academic and fiscal operations of the college. It will provide for the progressive control of student information from admissions through registration, scheduling, advising, graduation, and followup. In fiscal control, the system will be used for planning, budgeting, and accounting. Training will be provided personnel for input processing and operation of an IBM System 34 which the college will install.

THE SECOND activity, financial development, is to assist the college in training its personnel and in broadening its financial base, especially endowment. The goal is to increase the current endowment of \$1.5 million to

\$3 million in three years. This will be accomplished by expanding voluntary giving, increasing gifts of cash and annuities from individuals, seeking deferred gifts from estates, and appealing to foundations and industry.

"The stability of a substantial endowment is essential in this era of escalating inflation," said Sr. Francilene. "to insure our independence and effectiveness as a private liberal arts college." Madonna has operated for 31 years on a balanced budget and has the lowest tuition of private colleges in the state.

The grant provides for additional staff people to join the three-year old development office and for them to receive professional training in fund raising techniques.

THE THIRD ACTIVITY to be aided by the federal grant will meet the needs of those formerly excluded from

higher education through special entry level testing, individualized instruction, and curriculum design.

Current figures indicate 58 per cent of the student population at Madonna are 26 and older, 45 students are deaf, and almost 20 per cent are members of minority groups. Madonna proposes to increase its enrollment of these "non-traditional" students.

New testing procedures will be initiated and designed through the Educational Testing Service of Princeton, N.J., to assist in the effective implementation of this program.

Faculty will also have an opportunity to explore creative curriculum design, and update instructional information and teaching techniques through in-service programs.

Willette earns MVP award

Morrell's rallies to cop modified crown

Morrell Builders stymied all its critics with a comeback victory in the Plymouth-Livonia Men's Modified Softball Tournament last weekend at Plymouth's Massey field.

Morrell, regular-season winners in the Plymouth League, edged Earl Keim Realty, 7-6, in the championship. Good Time Bar from Livonia, the pre-tournament favorite, finished third in the 12-team double-elimination event.

Morrell's found itself in the loser's bracket after third-round action but battled back with five straight victories to cop the crown and the first-place trophies.

Rob Willette, Morrell's sure-handed leftfielder, sparked the comeback effort with an outstanding tournament performance. Willette hit 16-for-25 for a .640 average in tourney play and drove in the winning run of the championship game with a single in the bottom of the seventh inning to gain the undisputed Most Valuable Player award.

Morrell scored one in the bottom of the first, but Keim added one in the top of the second stanza to keep the four-run margin, 5-1. Morrell's caught up in the middle innings, scoring three runs in the fourth and two more in the

fifth to take a 6-5 lead. Pete Lomonoco's two-run homer and Al White's two-run single aided the rally.

Keim tied the score in the top of the seventh when Deter singled but scored on a three-base error by center-fielder Steve Robb, who let the ball go through his legs.

In the bottom of the seventh, Steve Karas led off with a single, went to second on an error, and scored on Willette's single.

Winning pitcher Al White also start starred in the tourney, pitching solid ball all seven games.

EARL KEIM, a team which finished fifth in regular season action in the Plymouth League, played heads-up softball throughout the tourney, gaining the runners-up spot after finishing on top in the winner's bracket.

Keim defeated Good Time, 11-7, in the finals of the winner's bracket. One round earlier, Good Time handed Morrell its only loss of the tourney with a 3-1 victory in eight innings. It was the only loss in Plymouth action for Morrell's this season.

After Good Time lost to Keim in the winner's bracket, the former champs faced Morrell once again in the semifinal game. Morrell's gained revenge this time, winning 3-2 in eight innings after trailing 2-0 in the sixth inning.

Morrell's then had to beat Keim twice to win the tourney and turned the trick with an 8-6 triumph and the 7-6 championship result. It took a seven-run fifth inning, sparked by a two-run homer by Lomonoco, to give Morrell's its first victory over Keim.
