## Ski trails planned

A proposal to establish a cross-country skiing program at Fellows Creek Golf Course could transform the township-owned facility on Lotz near Michigan into a year-round recreation area.

Mike Gouin, superintendent of the township's parks and recreation department, hopes to negotiate a contract with Michigan Wilderness Consultants for ski instruction and rental in time to begin the program next month.

Gouin says the program would probably be offered two days a week this year. It could include three or four clinics in cross-country instruction, ski rental and open skiing.

The township board approved the concept of a cross-country skiing program at the golf course last week.

"CROSS-COUNTRY skiing wasn't really popular until two or three years ago," Gouin said. "But in urban areas, there hasn't been many trails. The golf course is a natural."

Gouin claims many golf courses in the area offer cross-country skiing programs during winter months.

Although details of Canton's cross-country program are not final, Gouin suspects the township will offer the program only when there is an adequate snow base in order to protect the golf course grounds.

He says temporary fences may be erected around greens to protect those areas of the course.

Gouin believes a cross-country program could be a money-maker for the township-owned course.

The township's liability insurance would cover the program, he said. A salary for a full-time person who would oversee the safety of the golf course grounds would comprise the only expense.

Gouin said the firm he hopes will offer cross-country instruction and a ski rental service at Fellows Creek has sponsored similar programs throughout the state.

## Joyner wants county to have executive job

Bill Joyner is convinced a county executive is the means to pull together the 27-member Wayne County Commission and overcome the image of terrible mismanagement and fiscal waste.

But the second-term commissioner from the 27th District, which includes Plymouth, Canton and Plymouth Township, knows he's fighting an uphill battle to implement the fourth county executive position in the state.

This Thursday, Joyner will address the commission on the subject, calling for a 13-member reorganization task force for the sole purpose of a six-month investigation of a county executive.

ALTHOUGH MOST commissioners recognize that reform of the county's management is essential, politics, Joyner emphasizes, is the major obstacle to establishing a county executive.

Reduction of the number of commissioners, the elimination of other county jobs such as drain commissioner, and the usual Detroit-suburban infighting are the political fears beneath the opposition, Joyner explains.

"Commissioners are afraid of losing what power they have, but we don't have one strong figure that can weld that 27-member commission into a dynamic force," he says.

"We're legislators, not executives, and we need that third balance of government. I'd like to take a hard look at this and put it to a voice of the people."

JOYNER'S recommendation includes a task force comprised of four

commissioners, split between Detroit and the suburbs, four representatives of the business community, two representatives of the media, and three representatives of the volunteer community.

"As long as the public and private sectors are being included, then we should include leaders of the volunteer sector (from such groups as the Jaycees, Civitans, Optimists, scouting, etc)," he wrote in his letter requesting an agenda item.

Whether the county executive would be elected or appointed might be decided in a referendum on the entire question, he suggests.

While Oakland County voters elect their executive, Washtenaw's top county official is appointed. Bay County voters, who approved a ballot question for an executive in November, will elect the state's third county executive in January.

Although Joyner admits that a small minority of commissioners support the concept, he's convinced that demonstrated support from the populace could make a difference.

Despite cutting back to a "threadbare budget," the county still is \$15 million in debt, Joyner explains. Voters want a change, but they must make the demands of their representatives.

In the 27th District, for example, Joyner represents 165,000 persons, about 65,000 more than he should under state guidelines. The district, largest in area in the county, includes Plymouth, Canton, Plymouth, Sumpster, and Van Buren Townships, Belleville, Wayne, and part of Northville and Westland.

## School may become landmark

The Salem Stone School at North Territorial and Curtis Roads may be deeded to the Salem Historical Society to be preserved as a historical landmark.

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education is expected to vote tonight on transfer of the deed to the historical society. Last year the school board took similar action when it transferred the deed to the Canton Center School to Canton Township for use as a historical museum by the Canton Historical Society.

At tonight's meeting the school board is expected to decide whether to continue busing at Sunflower Subdivision in Canton, and whether to approve an increase in meeting allowance for school trustees. The board also will act on a resolution of appreciation for Margery Mitchell for work she has done with students at the Plymouth Historical Museum.

The board also will hear a report on the statewide student testing program for 1978-79 school year. The meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the upstairs conference room of the administrative offices at 454 S. Harvey, Plymouth.

THE SALEM STONE School was annexed to Plymouth-Canton Community Schools in September 1965.

During the past four to five years, notes Supt. John M. Hoben, the school district has received several inquiries from persons interested in purchasing or leasing the school.

Salem Township officials, however, report that the building cannot be occupied because it is located on a small piece of property (74-by-74 feet) and Salem requires a minimum of two acres before any site can be used.

Because the school has been vacant for the past few years, adds Hoben, it has been taken over by vandals and motorcycle gangs and has been in a constant state of disrepair.

When the district negotiated with private individuals in the past to sell the school, Salem Township took the position the building should be razed because it interfered with the sight of motorists at the intersection and was a hazard.

At one point, builder Angelo DiPonio offered \$6,600 for the property to turn the school into a community center. Other offers to purchase have been made by developer Bud Gould of Plymouth and local architect Tivadar Balogh, both who intended to use the building for offices.

But these negotiations broke down when Salem Township made it known the building could not be occupied

because of the two-acre site requirement and traffic hazards.

Hoben reports that the building will not be used as a school and he will recommend deeding it to the Salem Historical Society if Salem Township concurs with the transfer.

"Because of the nature of the South Salem Stone School building and its

size and land surrounding it, its projected use would be very minimal to the school district," he said.

Irene Lyke, secretary of the historical society, says it is the group's goal to restore the building to its original condition and maintain it as a historical site.

THE SCHOOL district has temporarily been busing students from Sunflower Subdivision to Plymouth Salem High for safety reasons while construction was in progress.

The administration now is recommending that busing be stopped, and the school board is expected to give its blessing to that move.

## Money is deer for Miller kids

When Santa leads his team of reindeer across the sky this Christmas eve, children at Miller School won't be looking for Prancer, Dancer or Vixen.

They'll be hoping that Santa chose a very special reindeer to head this year's trip around the world.

The reindeer they'll be seeking for doesn't live in the North Pole or in Santa's private stables. He's a special resident of the Detroit Zoo who will soon become Miller School's adopted pet.

The kids are scraping nickels and dimes together in hopes of raising enough money to enroll in the zoo's adopt-an-animal program.

For \$15, they can adopt and feed a small reptile for a year. And for \$1,200, they can adopt a gorilla.

But the Miller adoption program, which will replace the school's traditional practice of exchanging inexpensive gifts, will focus on none other than Santa's faithful helper—the antlered reindeer.

THE REINDEER adoption papers will cost Miller students \$300, says assistant principal Joyce Reeder.

The sum will buy enough food to feed the animal for a year and entitle the students to name one of the zoo's 20 reindeer, according to Pat Morris, coordinator of the adopt-an-animal program.

Although \$300 may seem like a lot of money for elementary school kids, Ms. Reeder says the school's 765 students have spent more than that amount to participate in Miller's traditional exchange-a-gift program.

The kids are being asked to contribute what they can to the reindeer project.

"In the true spirit of Christmas, we thought it would be better for the kids to give without thinking of getting something back," Ms. Reeder said of the school's efforts to eliminate the gift exchange.

"We have felt for a long time that some kids have been dissatisfied with the gift they got. They may have felt that the gift they gave was better than the one they received."

Besides, adopting a reindeer has its advantages over giving and getting a 50-cent gift.

The kids will be scouring the sky for their very own reindeer this Christmas eve.

And even if they don't find him, he'll always be at the zoo to shake antlers at his new-found patrons on school field trips.

## Hugh Jarvis spreads the marketing word to national audience

Hugh Jarvis of Plymouth has been featured twice so far this year in a national trade publication retailers of gifts and decorative accessories.

Jarvis was one of the major sources of an article on marketing plans in the November issue of "Gifts & Decorative Accessories," the international business magazine for businesses involved with gifts, china and glass, home accessories, greeting cards and social stationery.

It was the second appearance this year in the same magazine for Jarvis who was featured in the July issue for the design of his new store at the Twelve Oaks Mall in Novi.

JARVIS WAS one of five retailers from across the nation selected to participate in a roundtable discussion article on planning for gift markets.

Among the more significant contributions Jarvis made in the article was how and why small retailers should develop a market plan for the local area being served.

Jarvis also used an example of how a proper market plan can make \$500 worth of merchandise look like \$5,000's worth with the right display and presentation.

Other members of the roundtable discussion, "How to Cover a Gift Market," in the magazine were: Jack Landes, president of Sigma Marketing; Bettye Hogg, senior vice-president of Vincent Lippe Inc.; Paul Ungrodt, Jr., president of Crown House of Gifts in Ann Arbor; and R.A. Marshall, president of R.A. Marshall Imports.

Jarvis, president of Hugh Jarvis Gifts of Michigan which is headquartered in Plymouth, also operates stores in downtown Plymouth, Dearborn, Westland and in Novi.

THE NEW SHOP at Twelve Oaks was featured in the July issue because it was selected by the magazine as winner of a bronze plaque award for gift shop design.

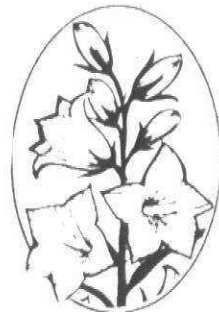
The following month Jarvis travelled to New York City to accept the award at the magazine's merchandising achievement banquet on Aug. 15 held in the Plaza Hotel.

Twelve Oaks is a two-level mall with four major tenants (Hudson's, Penney, Sears, and Lord & Taylor) and 140 smaller shops.

The shop in the mall is different than his other stores, Jarvis notes. One difference, he says, is customers tend to come as couples to shop. Another is that traffic is divided between those who come in only to purchase a greeting card and those who are looking for a gift.

In designing the Novi shop, Jarvis notes, changes were made based on the lessons learned in the other five Jarvis shops in the metropolitan area. The Novi store took only two weeks to build from the time the concrete was poured.

With economies realized in design and construction, Jarvis hopes the Novi store will become profitable before it reaches its full potential about three years away.

# Dionne Quintuplets: A look at life in a fish bowl

They were the Dionne quintuplets and the public loved them to death.

Today, at the age of 44, only two of the women are still alive. All that stands of the Dafoe Nursery Playgrounds, where they were kept apart from their parents as a tourist attraction, is the Quint Museum in Callender, Ont.

Ms. Vada Steel of Detroit collects all kinds of material relating to the famous five girls names Annette, Yvonne, Cecile, Emilie and Marie. Her collection is on display at the Southfield Burgh Museum, from 2-5 p.m. on weekends through Dec. 10. The museum is located at Berg Road and Civic Center Drive.


Like her husband who collects antique bottles, Mrs. Steele started collecting only five years ago. But in the space of five years she has accumulated an incredible collection of quint curios.

She has postcards, calendars, picture books, and scrapbooks on the quints. Posters from movies starring the Dionne quintuplets Sears-Roebuck dolls of them. Radios with the quints' picture on the front. Lamps with their likenesses carved into the base.

But perhaps the most remarkable piece in the collection is a Chinese painting of the quintuplets which depicts the famous five as Orientals. Mrs. Steele bought the painting from the owner of a Chinese restaurant located just outside Callender, Ont.

RATHER THAN showing an example of Chinese ethnocentrism, the paint-

ing shows how the whole world was captivated by the quints.

Pierre Berton, author of a new book called "The Dionne Years—A Thirties Melodrama," writes that an Indore

Brahman interviewed in India wanted to know what Oliva Dionne, the quints' father, ate to produce such fertility.

What made Mrs. Steele pick the Dionne Quintuplets as a collection to pursue?

"Well, what really got me started was I was born six months after the quints were born in the same year—1934," she explains. "My mother liked the name Annette, the name of one of the quints, and I'm French Canadian,

like the quints. My middle name is Annette and that's where it comes from."

Mrs. Steele grew up with the quints, in a way. She was not, of course, a playmate. Nobody played with the quints.

They were housed in the Dafoe Nursery Playground which was open year-round. They stayed in the nursery, where tourists filed past a one-way glass that permitted them to see in. Or the girls played outdoors in a special playground.

A card from the Canadian tourist attraction is on display at the Southfield museum. Rules for the public are listed:

"Maintain silence and keep moving. Do not speak to the children. As the center of the playground is open, the hours mentioned must necessarily be, weather permitting. The children do not appear in the playground if it is raining."

THE SAD SIDE to the quints' lives has come out recently in books and magazine articles. But, to millions of Americans and people the world over,

the Dionne quintuplets were the only good news happening through most of the '30s and the war years.

It has been said that more "good news" feature stories about the quints were written than any other single subject.

Mrs. Steele's collection bears that statement out. The quints are pictured on the cover of *Click*, *Life*, *Parents*, and *Time* magazines and books chronicle every birthday as if it were equivalent to the Pans peace accord.

The quints and the doctor who delivered them endorsed everything from "Musterole—for chest colds" to Colgate dental cream. Palmolive soap. Quaker Oats. Karo syrup and Sears Roebuck quilt dolls with real lashes, complete with a bed to tuck them in for \$4.49.

There's a special blend of pipe tobacco in the museum display which shows a picture of actor Jean Hersholt who played the doctor who delivered the quints, Dr. Allan Roy Dafoe, in a movie.

He's the same doctor who permitted the hospital to become a tourist trap where the quints were viewed like fish in a fishbowl until they were seven years old.

He was described by Hollywood as a man "without an enemy in the world." But author Berton writes that Dafoe was without an enemy in the world "unless, of course, you counted the two sad-eyed people who lived in the farmhouse across the road, the parents of the world's most famous babies, Elzire and Oliva Dionne."

### Reuther care facility gets two-month extension

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners has provided for two more months operation of the Walter P. Reuther Extended Care Facility in Westland. It was slated to close Nov. 30.

The facility, operating on borrowed time since last March, received a \$599,350 supplemental appropriation from the Board of Commissioners to continue through Jan. 28.

The appropriation was Nov. 28, when the county board also requested the State Department of Social Services and the County Board of Institutions to reduce personnel and patients in compliance with a phase-out program.

The Board of Institutions govern the entire hospital complex.

The facility, which opened in 1974, cares for some 169 chronic disease patients on a long-term basis.

Jarrette Simmons, chairman of the board of commissioners, said the State Legislature is still considering the purchase of the Reuther Center valued at \$11 million for use as a psychiatric hospital.

"However," she said, "if they decide not to buy the facility, and we cannot come up with another permanent source of revenue, the state has promised to provide funds for interim operations and four to 45 days following their decision."

The new restaurant will be open 3-10 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday; 3-11 p.m. Fridays; 2-11 p.m. Saturdays; and 1-8 p.m. Sundays.

And, for those who never seem to have any cash on hand, Master Charge and Visa are accepted.

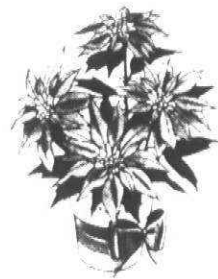

# Court to hear drinking age dispute

The Michigan Committee for the Age of Responsibility (MICAR) will be in Wayne Circuit Court today asking Judge Irwin Burdick for a preliminary injunction against the 21-year-old drinking law approved Nov. 7.

MICAR's complainants are several students under 21 and cocktail lounges that cater principally to young persons.

They seek a permanent injunction against the Liquor Control Commission and the attorney general from enforcing the law, and a declaration that Proposal D violates several articles in the Bill of Rights of the U.S. Constitution.

The defendants' brief was not available at press time.

THE MICAR suit goes far beyond campaign arguments of whether Michigan's lowering of the age of majority to 18 in 1972 resulted in more auto accidents.

Handling the case are attorneys Avern Cohn and Stephen Wasinger of Honigman Miller Schwartz and Cohn, Detroit.

The present liquor control act, approved after the repeal of Prohibition in 1933, "Specifically does not regulate the use of alcoholic beverages for sacramental purposes, nor does it restrict a parent's right to give alcoholic beverages to children of whatever age for use in their homes," the lawyers' brief argues.

The old law does not regulate alcoholic beverages for medicinal, chemical or scientific purposes, or wine for sacramental purposes, the lawyers said.

But Proposal D, scheduled to take effect Dec. 22, will prohibit those uses and thus "violates the rights of plaintiffs to free exercise of religion" guaranteed by the First and 14th Amendments, the MICAR suit contends.

PROPOSAL D, they argue, creates two "irrational stereotypes...one subclass composed of all adult citizens over the age of 21, and another class composed of all adult citizens under 21 years of age."

And using the drinking-accident statistics against the backers of Proposal D, the MICAR suit states the new amendment deprives the rights of persons who "have a well below average incidence of alcohol-related traffic accidents, namely females below age 21."

The suit says Proposal D creates "an irrefutable presumption of unfitness (to drink) in violation of the due process and equal protection clauses of the Fourteenth Amendment."

"Because it prohibits parents from giving alcoholic beverages to their children of whatever age, even in their home for family consumption or religious purposes, Proposal D infringes the fundamental rights of parents to the care, custody and nurture of their

children," protected by the Ninth and 14th Amendments.

LICENSED taverns and cocktail lounges, MICAR says, will suffer economic harm.

Persons under age 21 who hold licenses or work in licensed places will lose their jobs, they add. There are no figures given for how many persons under 21 own or share ownership of liquor licenses or are bartenders.

MICAR contends Proposal D is further unconstitutional because it

allowed the residents of one state, by a bare majority of the voters, to abridge rights guaranteed by the U.S. Constitution.

In law, the U.S. Constitution takes precedence over a state constitution. This principle was applied when the courts in the late 1960's ruled Michigan's legislative, county boards and even one community college apportionment systems in violation of the U.S. constitution.

four minutes and sat out the rest of the first period.

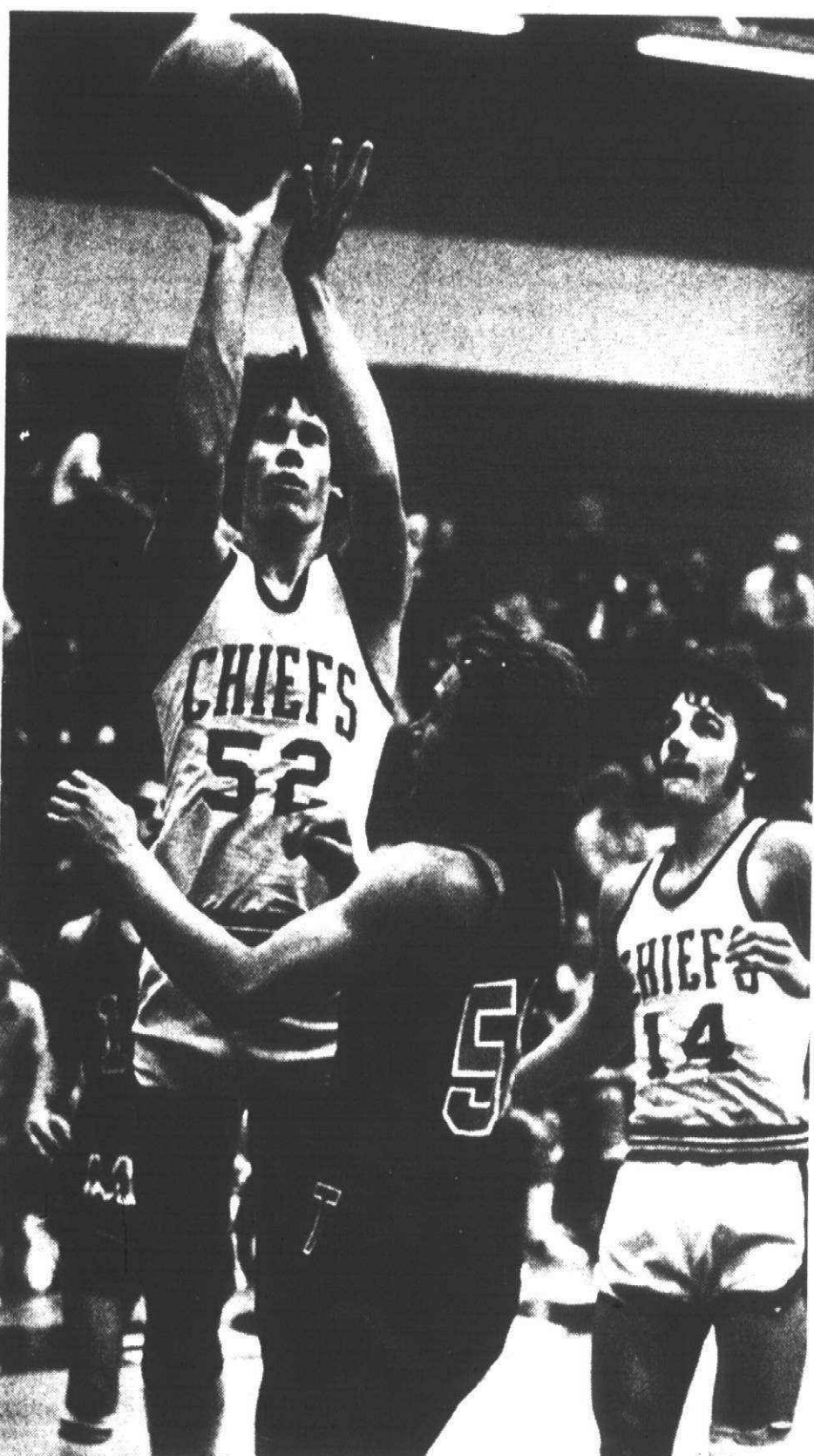
Back in the lineup at the start of the second quarter, the rugged all-state footballer immediately picked up No. 4 and went to the bench again.

## Chiefs' fast break too much for Mott

There's nothing like a good, crisp fast start to spark a team to victory.

Plymouth Canton posted a quick 16-4 first-quarter lead before coasting to its third straight victory of the young season — this time over Waterford Mott, 75-60, Friday night at the Canton gym.

It wasn't what one would call an elegant win. In fact, it was no doubt Canton's worst showing on the basketball court this season. The solid first period was enough, however, to guide the Chiefs to an opening Western Six League triumph.

Canton now takes its perfect 3-0 record on the road for the first time this season, facing Southfield Lathrup tomorrow night in a non-league affair.

Canton played some tough defense of its own in the first quarter, limiting Mott to only two field goals in 15 attempts. But that strong defense wore down later in the game, as Canton showed signs of laziness with 23 total personal fouls.

Mott converted on Canton's foul trouble, shooting a sizzling 24 of 29 at the charity line to keep the game from getting out of hand.

The Chiefs were in control, nonetheless, maintaining a 10 to 15-point spread throughout the final three periods.

All five of the Canton starters reached double figures, led by Butch King's 18 points. Junior forward-guard Dave Visser continued to improve his play with 14 points.

Floor leader Russ Mandle added 12, while Mike Leary and Mike Gollnick chipped in with 10 points each.

Joe Gwinn and Tom Schaefer paced Mott's attack with 12 points each. Dave and Mike Miller netted 10 apiece.

Bell played all but one of his 13-member squad. Junior Brad Westin dressed but sat out the game with a sore back. The Canton mentor was able to experiment in both the third and fourth periods with his reserves, as the Chiefs stayed well ahead as the seconds ticked off.

The only regular player who missed a chunk of action was sixth-man Jay McKinley, who twisted an ankle in the middle of the third quarter. He is expected to be ready for Tuesday's game, however.

The Canton junior varisty, coached by Pat Cunningham, won its third straight game of the season as well, with a healthy 81-48 victory over Mott's reserves in the preliminary game.

Yes, there was a lot of PRIDE displayed on the court, but no one could match the HEART of each member of the Canton squad that unfortunate Wednesday night.



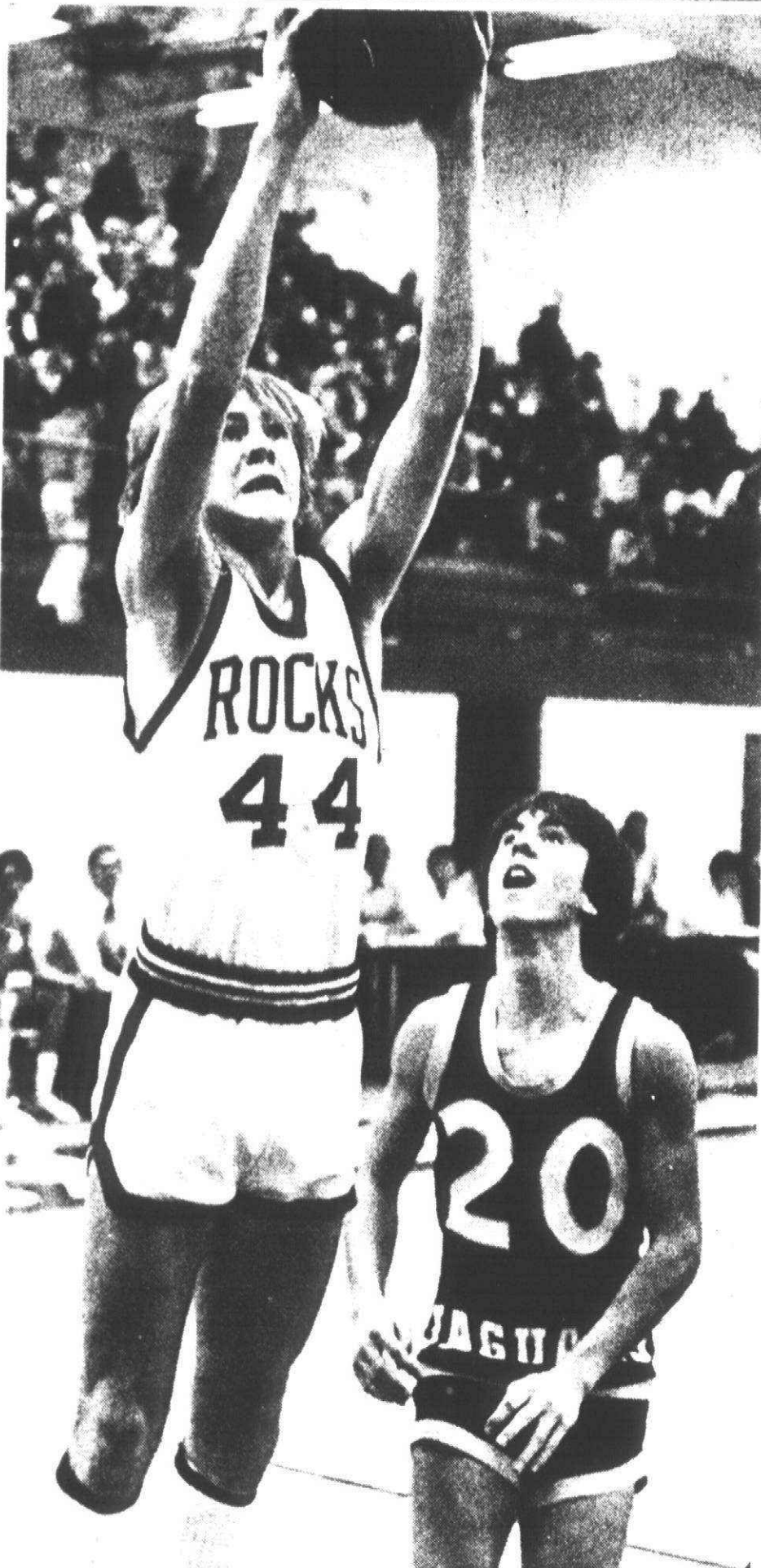

# Tipping the Scales

## Don't ask fatties

June Brown, Detroit News columnist and commentator, recently shared her successful dieting secret with her readers.

"And for once," declared June "I will be able to enjoy a Christmas dinner without having to say, 'I shouldn't eat this—I'm on a diet.'"

It wasn't so much what she ate—or didn't eat—as it was her approach to resolving an old and nagging problem.

What she did was this: she approached slim people and asked them what they do to stay slim. Then she took their plan, modified it, and incorporated it into her personal life-style.

She was pleasantly surprised to find out just how simple it turned out to be. It boiled down to two basics—proper nutrition and an exercise program. Adapting it to her life-style was the trick.

**FIRST SHE** decided on a walking and jogging program—one that fit into her way of life. Secondly, she modified her eating habits. She decided to eat everything she wanted, but in moderation.

She did set two rules for herself to follow: no seconds, and no snacks.

The program seemed to work for her but she did feel a need for a supplementary vitamin program, feeling nutritionally deficient at times.

In the opinion of Dr. Art Mollen, a physical fitness expert and author of "Run For Your Life," most people who eat nutritiously and exercise regularly normally do not need vitamin supplements.

June's diet was not necessarily well-balanced, thus the need for vitamins.

**ACCORDING TO** some hasty calculations, June ate about 1,175 calories per day. Her daily exercise program burned up about 654 calories a day. (This is based on 20 minutes of jogging and one hour of walking which she said she did.) Only 520 calories remain for her body to utilize the rest of the day. It is easy to understand why she lost weight so quickly.

The point is this. Whatever way you choose to lose weight—it must fit in with your life-style or it remains a constant, failing struggle. The key to success is really right under our own noses, but we seldom recognize it. If it doesn't fit our life-style, it is difficult to stay with it; thus, it only works for a short time.

And there is another key lesson to be extracted from her way. Don't ask your overweight friends how they have been losing weight. They aren't yet at their goals and haven't withstood the test of keeping it off.

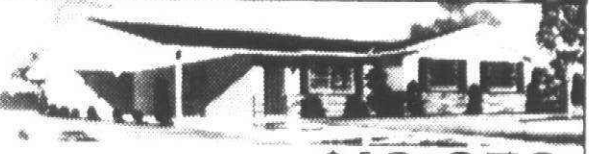

## Compartment fits cars like a glove

One of the least appreciated pieces of equipment on the automobile is the glove compartment.

It also is one of the pieces of equipment which has undergone fewest design changes over the years. Yet, without major design changes, its use has altered dramatically.

Have you ever thought about why it is called a glove compartment? Obviously because its original purpose was to hold gloves, namely ladies' gloves which is why it was and still is located on the passenger side.

When the glove compartment was first designed into cars, drivers were almost exclusively male. Thus designers began with the assumption that the passenger almost always would be a woman. And so the compartment was added as a place for the lady to stash her white dress gloves to protect them from the dust of the road.

Today most roads are either concrete or asphalt, and car bodies have been tightened up to keep dust out. And so it no longer is necessary to pro-

tect white gloves while riding. Dress gloves actually can be worn now while driving or riding, even if dress gloves aren't as much in vogue as in the past.

And so glove compartments are no longer used primarily or exclusively for gloves anymore.

ONE REASON, of course, is that the woman has found her place behind the wheel. The glove compartment no longer is a storage area for her use alone.

The most common use of the compartment in recent years has been for maps. And when you think about it, the need did not exist for a map storage area in early automobiles.

The first cars only traveled at 20 to 30 mph, I've been told. And the road system at the time of the automobile's advent was still dirt and gravel built for wagons, horses and cows.

The early automobiles, then, were used primarily for local travel, i.e., within a five to 10 mile radius. Thirty miles was considered a trip, and 100 miles a major journey. Travel beyond

a familiar area was so infrequent that maps were seldom used. Maps certainly weren't used frequently enough to warrant a compartment.

Today, however, it is almost a daily occurrence to drive beyond one's area of familiarity, and motoring for 100 miles is hardly considered a trip. Maps are used so often that a storage place is needed. So it's a good thing the glove compartment became obsolete for gloves in time to store maps.

ANOTHER COMMON use for the compartment is to store Kleenex or Wipes for families traveling with small children.

In cold weather areas, the compartment also has become a storage area for window ice scrapers and spray cans for windshields and frozen locks.

I also use the glove compartment to store extra fuses and turn signals, a couple of screwdrivers and a pair of pliers. And the older car I drive has an assortment of small parts which have fallen off. I store them just in case the car quits running and a mechanic asks where a certain missing gadget is.

The compartment also includes matchbook covers picked up at restaurants and motels, a booklet listing Holiday Inn and Western motel locations, a list of AMOCO road service stations, and my certificate of registration.

In short, my glove compartment is a portable file system, and a tool bin as well. I couldn't get along without one. But if designers want to revamp the glove compartment, I'd suggest installation of a mini-computer as an instant information retrieval system.

## Winter means using energy

Here are two simple tests to check your weather-stripping needs.

Tape a sheet of plastic film over a window on a windy day. If the sheet billows, you need weatherstripping.

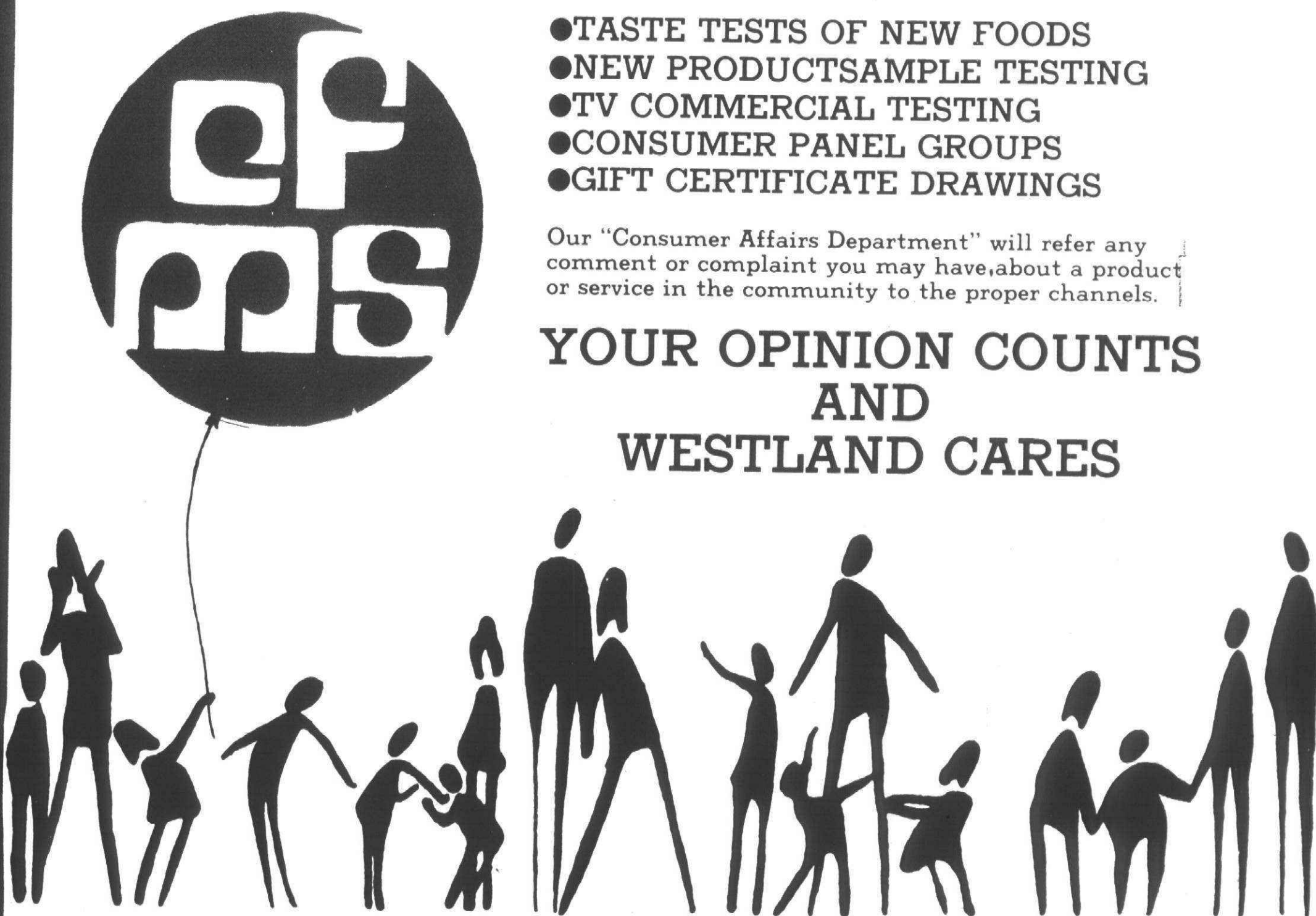

# Oliver arrives, Superman, too, for Christmas

Beginning this Friday, the seasonal tide of holiday movies will reach Detroit, and about a dozen big-name, big-budget films will be vying for your attention. Let's take a quick look at what we can anticipate.

For openers, on Friday we have "Oliver's Story," the sequel to "Love Story," and "Superman." Christopher Reeve stars as the comic book hero, and he's in heavy company with Marlon Brando and Gene Hackman.

On Dec. 20, Clint Eastwood displays his flair for comedy in "Every Which Way But Loose." This is not a "Dirty Harry" film.

After that, a person could get punchy viewing the barrage of movies scheduled to open Dec. 22. These will include the action film, "Force 10 from Navarone," based on Alistair MacLean's novel and starring the late Robert Shaw along with Franco Nero and Harrison Ford.

ALSO IN THE military vein will be Sophia Loren in "Brass Target," a film that suggests a plot against Gen. Patton.

"King of the Gypsies," from the novel by Peter Maas, deals with the occult and features Shelley Winters, Susan Sarandon, Brooke Shields and Eric Roberts.

Weird in a different way is "Invasion of the Body Snatchers." Leonard Nimoy and Donald Sutherland star in the remake of this 1956 classic about a small town whose population is taken over by life forms from outer space.

Romance and comedy are on tap in "Moment by Moment" and "California Suite." In the former film, John Travolta is a denim-clad young man who falls in love with Lily Tomlin, a diamond-clad lady. In the latter—a prestigiously populated comedy by Neil Simon—Alan Alda and Jane Fonda, Michael Caine and Maggie Smith, and Walter Matthau and Elaine May appear in individual skits.

Richard Adams' compelling novel "Watership Down," about a group of rabbits whose tribulations suggest allegories to human history, makes its appearance as a vividly animated film.

TWO MORE FILMS which might open in December (the dates are uncertain) are "Born Again" and "Autumn Sonata." "Born Again" is the story of White House lawyer Charles Colson, from complicity to contrition. At the other extreme in filmmaking is Ingmar Bergman's "Autumn Sonata." (If it were film festival time, we might call these from con to Cannes.)

Bergman matches up two of the world's greatest actresses, Ingrid Bergman and Liv Ullman, in an emotional duel as a talented mother and untalented daughter.

Parents thinking about movies for their children won't find it difficult to make a selection. They can choose "Watership Down" (appropriate for adults and children) or "Superman." I haven't seen "Superman," but I assume it would be appropriate for children. One other contender is not a new film but a re-release, Disney's original "Pinocchio."

# 'Spartans' reveals crisp view of war

"Go Tell the Spartans" (R) just might be the least-heralded, most underrated and best movie yet on the Vietnam War.

With refreshing conventionality, it presents a set of circumstances, actions and events free of moralizing, sentimentalizing or psycho-analyzing. In other words, it uses convention to make matters clear quickly and refrains from subjective commentary.

Credit for this no-nonsense, workmanlike approach must go to screenwriter Wendell Mayes (his other credits include "The Poseidon Adventure" and "Anatomy of a Murder") and director Ted Post.

However, it is Burt Lancaster who is responsible in an important way for establishing and maintaining the sense of credibility. Lancaster gives a solid performance as the crusty Major Barker, a weary professional soldier in charge of a contingent of Americans working with South Vietnamese troops.

THE YEAR IS 1964 and the Americans are present as "advisers." Following orders, the colonel directs his American and South Vietnamese troops to take a village. The wretchedness of this business, the questionable actions of individuals—soldiers and civilians—and the pointlessness of the assignment are elements which anticipate the fiercer, more extensive, dilemma-ridden conflict to follow.

A number of young actors contribute notable performances. Among these are Craig Wasson as an idealistic draftee and Marc Singer as an ambitious officer.

"Go Tell the Spartans" is a gutsy, unpretentious film. Its effect lingers as the final image, a French cemetery overgrown by the jungle, makes a sad and provocative point.

# Detroit

## A gem of an industrial town

A group of tourists peered through the window on the 70th floor. A city of lights spread out in the dark beneath: freeway lights moving outwards, street lights in lacy lines, river lights blinking. A broad river flowed away to the north.

"I've seen the Hudson from this angle in New York," a voice said.

"I was thinking of the Seine in Paris," said another.

"No, it's wider than the Seine. More like the Thames in London, except the buildings aren't right. If you look down the river, it looks a little like the Rhine beyond Cologne, Germany," said still another.

The river in question was Detroit's own.

These tourists from various cities were touring Motown as a vacation destination. In a few days, they toured the city, partook of Greektown cuisine, visited the Hiram Walker distillery in Windsor, watched cars being made at the Ford Rouge plant, went to the Henry Ford Museum and Greenfield Village, and had Brunch with Bach at the Detroit Institute of Arts.

They saw Detroit as city and suburban residents seldom do.

Seeing Detroit as tourists see it is a great winter weekend activity for the Christmas and early New Year season when you are looking for a mini trip without straying far from home.

A one- or two-day trip can cost the price of gasoline, parking and meals plus a few dollars for admission tickets. For those with a Christmas travel budget, it might include a glamorous overnight stay at hotels long identified with the Detroit area, such as the Plaza Hotel, the Dearborn Inn, the Dearborn Hyatt Regency, the newly renovated Radisson Cadillac and the Pontchartrain.

It is exciting to check into a modern big-city hotel, or an historic inn. Merely walking through the corridors does not provide that feeling.

The one ground rule for being a tourist in your home territory is to pretend to be an out-of-towner who having just flew in, and that you have never been here before.

Take a tourist's bus tour of Detroit, as you would do in other vacation cities. If you are lucky, you will get a driver and guide like Andy Wilson,

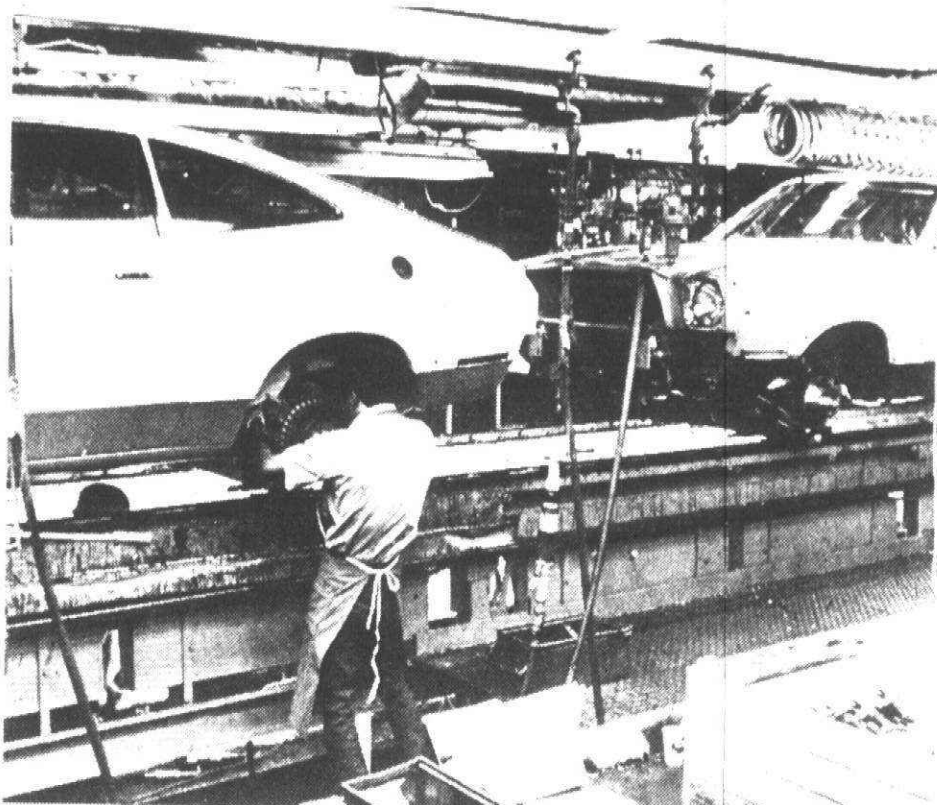
who speaks French and English and knows more about the Detroit area than all the mayors and chambers of commerce combined.

Listen to a tourists overview of Detroit as the bus leaves the Renaissance Center.

"If we turned left here we'd go to Grosse Pointe, which means literally a fat point of land," Wilson says. "That's where Henry Ford lives. We're going left, past those painted buildings, done by local artists. On your left is the Mariner's church, the oldest church in Detroit, which was moved 800 feet to its present site.

"Beyond it is the Civic Center Plaza, with Edsel Ford Auditorium, the Veterans Memorial Building, and beyond that Cobo Hall. That funny looking thing is the Dodge Fountain, the twisted spiral statue is called Eternity. There is a girl sculpted by the famous Marshall Fredericks at the Gas Building and a statue called Transportation at Cobo Hall.

"Straight ahead is one of six trolleys built in England in 1885 and brought here by ship from Portsmouth, up the Detroit River. Detroit means 'the narrow straits' in French. Michigan gets

its name from an Indian word, Michigami, which means big water."

Wilson rattles on about Bob-Lo Island, the new \$22 million sports stadium, and includes statistics like "Detroit has 2,010 churches, synagogues and mosques" and "the Ambassador Bridge is the 10th longest bridge in the world."

"DETROIT IS the sixth largest city in the U.S., with 1,350,000 people in the city and four million people in the metropolitan area. The Renaissance Center was the beginning of a whole new

phase in our history."

Andy paused. "A lot of people who live in Detroit and its suburbs aren't yet convinced that the city is starting to move again. If we could get them downtown here, they would see for themselves."

A bus tour of Detroit can be the beginning of your first day in and around the city. See the Renaissance Center, drive to Windsor, have lunch in Greektown, perhaps tour of one of the two Detroit daily newspaper plants. If it's Sunday, try Brunch with Bach at the Detroit Institute of Arts.



The Music Hall once again enjoys the status of being one of the city's leading performing arts centers.

The second day of your weekend probably will be spent in Dearborn, and will perhaps include a tour of the Rouge Plant, lunch at the Dearborn Inn and visits to either Henry Ford Museum or Greenfield Village.

The museum and village, jointly called Edison Institute, are considered among the 10 top tourist attractions in the U.S. If you have not been there in recent years, you have not seen the expansion and reorganization of exhibits at the museum nor the new buildings added to the Village.

## TRAVEL LOG of Iris Jones



I would like to alert you to a danger which threatens travelers on Italian trains.

My source of information is a bulletin sent this week by the Society of American Travel Writers (SATW) to its members, who are full-time travel writers and editors on newspapers and magazines in the United States and Canada.

The bulletin warns that Italian bandits are using a James Bond-type technique to rob train passengers. The Society's Consumerism Committee has received an alarming number of reports citing Italian bandits who spray an unknown chemical substance into compartments occupied by foreign travelers and then take passports, luggage and money.

The robberies are most common on

overnight journeys between points in Italy and Switzerland when the train itinerary calls for a stop in Milan.

The U.S. State Department admits receiving complaints about such robberies. Lacy Wright of the Italian desk says that "Milan is a particularly bad place. We have had reports of thieves who work the trains between Switzerland and Milan."

The Italian Government Travel Office in New York says it has received no first-hand reports of aerosol-wielding marauders on trains, but that they "are warning tourists to be vigilant at all times, particularly of pickpockets at train stations and on board trains."

Complaints received by SATW are not limited to Americans. A German nurse reported that Italians traveling in her compartment left shortly after

the train left Rome en route to Sicily. The next thing she remembers is awakening from what she thought was a deep sleep. Her luggage was ripped to shreds and her possessions gone.

Similar reports have been received on other train routes throughout Italy. Most common robberies occur on overnight train trips while passengers are asleep. The compartment is sprayed and passengers drugged into a deep sleep while thieves loot luggage.

How seriously should a traveler take this warning? My experience tells me that one should be alerted by it but that overreaction is unnecessary. It is generally safer to travel in Europe than in many parts of the United States, although Italy has a bad reputation for robberies.

Check with the U.S. Consulate offices within Italy for the number of complaints on a specific route. A pattern of complaints often takes months to evolve, so it doesn't do too much good to rely on a state department report made before your journey.

## Not just the ozone losing layers

I pass this alert on despite a small warning voice in my head, which says that too many travelers already fear they will not be safe abroad. I can say with some certainty that this should be thought of as a specific problem. Avoid making generalizations based on this warning about European travel.

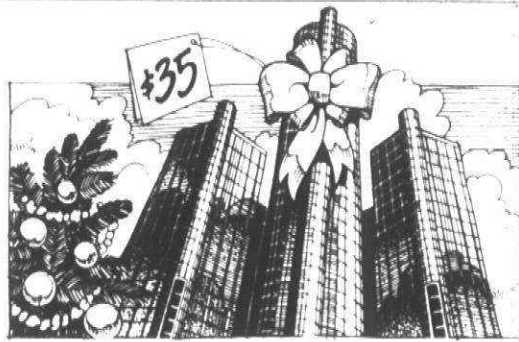

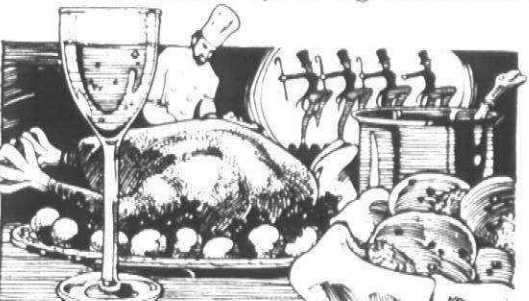

"They must be daffy," one of the diners commented. "Even in my wildest imagination I can't see an automobile going 50 miles on a gallon of any kind of fuel."

Then came World War II and the government asked that the bowling alleys remain open 24 hours a day. This suggestion came about because

there was a bowling center in most every neighborhood and they would provide recreation for the defense workers.

That was fine, except that there were few pinsetters. It even looked for a time as though the bowling centers would have to close.

"If only some one could come up with a plan to set the pins automatically," they said, "then we could save the game."

IT WAS THOUGHT at the time that an automatic pin setter was out of the question.

Then something surprisingly happened. An old gent named Charlie Schmidt, who lived in the mountains of upstate New York, told the world he had solved the problem. He had developed an automatic pinsetter.

Folks were skeptical. Even The Stroller had his doubts that such a machine could be built. As a matter of fact the building of an automatic pinsetter was so important that the work was being done behind closed doors in Brooklyn, N.Y.

This machine was on the market only a few months when another model was developed. Now the automatic pinsetter is taken for granted. The bowling alley without the machines is an oddity.

Always check with the parents to be sure they are willing to accept the responsibility that comes along with owning a pet. If it is assured a pet is going to be the answer, Action, Respect and Kindness (ARK) Humane Education Service, suggests the animal be given before the hectic Christmas day or eve, and have no human hands grabbing and frightening it.

New pets should be checked by a veterinarian, and puppies and kittens require inoculations right away. If you find the cost of caring for a pet too much, and find you don't have the time or the desire to care for an animal, take it to one of the antiercruelty or human society shelters in the area.

Don't abandon the animal on the city streets, freeways or in the country. Take it to a shelter and leave a donation for its care and disposal.

Long after the tree is down and the other gifts are broken, your Christmas pet will be there, giving the greatest gift of all — love, says the Michigan Humane Society.

# CB groups offer security by monitoring radio

A CB radio has recharged the life of Dick Stetter of Livonia. Confined to a wheelchair because of an auto accident, he regards it as a wonderful hobby "that you can do in a chair."

More than that, it gives him confidence. "It makes me feel good to know when I drive my van that I can get help if I need it," he said. "A few Sundays ago, for the first time in 17 years, I drove somewhere alone."

His courage comes from the fact that he knows that there are people out there who can help him if he gets a flat tire or runs out of gas. He doesn't know that one of them is Bonnie Crackel of Canton Township, that another is Henry Binder of Livonia, Charles Van Vleck of Plymouth, Colleen Hepfinger of Westland or John Provenzano of Garden City.

What he does know is that this year, the 20th birthday of CB radio, a growing number of CB enthusiasts have tired of CB chitchat and want to use their radios to help people. They have coalesced into groups to monitor Channel 9 which has been reserved by the Federal Communications Commission as an emergency and motorist assistance channel.

Instead of listening to conversations, they listen for reports from motorists with CB radios calling in about accidents or fires they have seen. Or they may relate their own difficulties. There are many this time of year. Once the location of the trouble is determined, monitors send for appropriate help.

There are a number of these monitoring groups casting a security blanket over the area. One operates in the

Livonia police department, a second in the Westland police department. Other volunteers put in time in the Westland headquarters of the Wayne County Sheriff's Patrol Investigating Patrol at Henry Ruff and Michigan Ave. The Plymouth Hilton Hotel houses another group.

The granddaddy of them all is the Michigan Emergency Patrol which for 11 years has been operating at the Fisher Building in Detroit. With a tall antenna, it has a loud voice. The Redford Township police count on its ears and voice to help them cover the emergency channel.

ONCE AWARE OF WHAT the emergency channel could do for him as well as others, Stetter wasted no time in donating about nine hours a week to the Michigan Emergency Patrol and three hours every other week to the Plymouth REACT Team.

A counselor at Holmes Junior High, he hopes to install a base in the school to teach the students how to be helpful through electronics. "I love the rescue work," he said. "It is so exciting."

While the Michigan Emergency Patrol seems to have the greatest variety and number of calls, there is plenty for him to do on his weekends working for Plymouth REACT in a room donated by the Plymouth Hilton. Surrounded by maps and the emergency

phone numbers of area police and fire departments plus ambulance services, the man who calls himself Diehard waits for the chance to go to bat for someone.

Charles Van Vleck, commander of Plymouth REACT pointed out that from January 1976 to November 1978, the team reacted to 445 accidents, 100

with known injuries, 98 to 574 stalled or abandoned vehicles, 27 vehicle fires, 98 reports of crimes such as breaking and entering or burglar alarms going off, 64 medical emergencies and 68 house, barn or grass fires.

Being of Dutch origin, Van Vleck has adopted the handle Dikehopper. His wife is Tulip. A firefighter for Plymouth Township, Dikehopper knows that 10 minutes can mean the difference between life and death.

HE ADDED: "I can remember the time a woman pulled to the side of Hines Drive and came on Channel 9 asking for help. She thought her husband was having a heart attack. We are instructed in CPR and emergency techniques so I told her to loosen his clothing, and I sent for an ambulance."

"If she hadn't had a CB she would have had to drive around looking for help in an area she was unfamiliar with."

BONNIE CRACKEL of Canton Township turns her home CB radio on at 6:30 a.m. every weekday morning and keeps it on until 8 a.m. "We have pledged that time to Plymouth REACT," explained Hula Girl who is aided in this by her husband, Volcano. Continuing the Hawaiian theme, they have fastened on their son James, 11, the handle Pineapple; Scott, 4, coconut; and baby Jennifer, Papaya.

"My husband got the CB when I was expecting Jennifer," Mrs. Crackel recalled. "It was a bad winter, and we felt that with a CB I could at least call for help if I needed it. I got hooked listening."

"What makes you feel worthwhile when you monitor is when you find you can help even one person."

The same reaction has been experienced by Colleen Hepfinger, known over the airways as Tornado Lady. "It gives me pleasure deep down to help people," she said. "You never know when you might be out there needing help."

Tornado Lady does her monitoring in the radio room of the Wayne County Sheriff's Patrol in Westland, for an operation called Starship Command.

Her home radio is termed a satellite base, while the car CB is called a mobile satellite. "We have home bases all over Westland and Garden City," she said.

While Starship Command monitors Channel 9 every night from 7 p.m. to 4 a.m. like other monitoring teams, it actually gets broader coverage. Members like Mrs. Hepfinger monitor during the day, and often far into the night, especially in winter when more problems occur.

JOHN PROVENZANO who calls himself Big Dago, is a Garden City CB buff, who finds the monitoring job "exciting."

He added: "I love to help; that's my nature."

His most exciting call at Starship Command came one night from a guard at a housing project, who reported lumber being stolen by a man driving a red truck. Provenzano informed the sheriff's patrol and the thief was nabbed.

Completing the CB emergency umbrella over the area are the programs operated by volunteers in the Livonia and Westland police stations.

Dick Mohrlock (Michigan Moose) leads the Westland Community Radio Watch, which for several nights a week monitors Channel 9 and also patrols the streets of Westland.

"We are working for the community and putting our CB radios to good use," he said.

In Livonia the monitoring team is also matched with a mobile group touring the area on weekend nights looking for signs of trouble.

"I had a car stationed at every Livonia school on devil's night and

Halloween," reported Henry Binder, leader of the Livonia CB Alert Team. "As a result, the vandalism and broken glass was practically zero."

Binder believes the value of the team's monitoring effort is illustrated by a recent auto accident in Livonia.

"There was one serious injury and two medium ones," he said. "We got our call on it nine minutes before a 911 call came through to the police," he recalled. "A nine-minute lead can be vital."

## Snowmobile trails funding may rise

Funding for Michigan's snowmobile trail system maintained by the State Department of Natural Resources may be doubled if a bill now being considered by the state Legislature becomes law.

The DNR now receives approximately \$1 million annually from snowmobile registrations but nothing from taxes paid on gasoline to run machines.

Senate Bill 185 now before the State House of Representatives mandates that three-tenths of one per cent of all state gasoline taxes be used for the trail program. A DNR official said the bill has a good chance for passage.

"DNR officials say that the trail program could receive \$1.2 million in the first full year if the two-cent per gallon state gasoline tax hike takes effect as scheduled Jan. 1 and at least \$1 million without the tax increase," Joseph Ratke, Auto Club of Michigan spokesman, said.

Although snowmobilers can travel anywhere in the more than 3.7 million acres of state-managed forests, there are some 2,300 miles of marked trails in state forests—nearly 100 miles more than last year. In addition, there are 105,000 acres of state park and recreation area lands open to snowmobiling—1,300 more acres than last season.

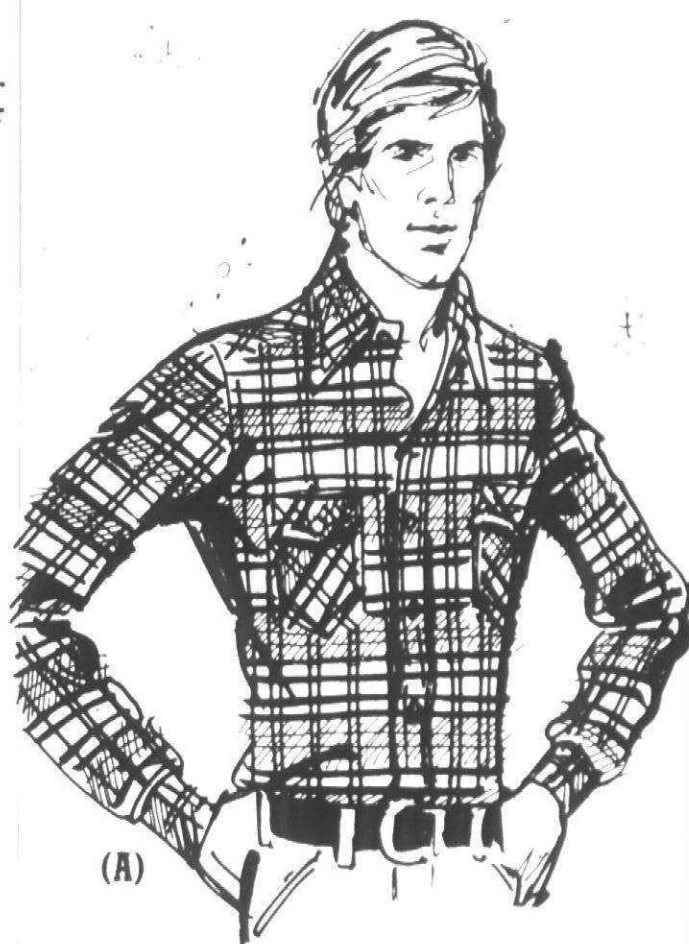

three things: small brown or white paper bags, dry sand, and candles. The votive candles last longest.

Carefully fold down the tops of the bags, about one inch, to form a cuff. Pour three cups of sand into each bag. Place candle firmly in the center of the sand. A piece of foil placed under the bag makes it easier to remove.

The bags can be decorated with crayons, stencils, paints or felt markers to add color. And this project gives the whole family an opportunity to become involved in the tradition.

Over in Arbor-Croft, each family is placing seven luminarias along the curb in front of their home. They also can be used on patios and to line driveways and walks. They are never used indoors.

The "little candles" had their origin in the Spanish territory that became New Mexico. The tradition goes back to the first Christmas when shepherds lit bonfires on the way to Bethlehem.

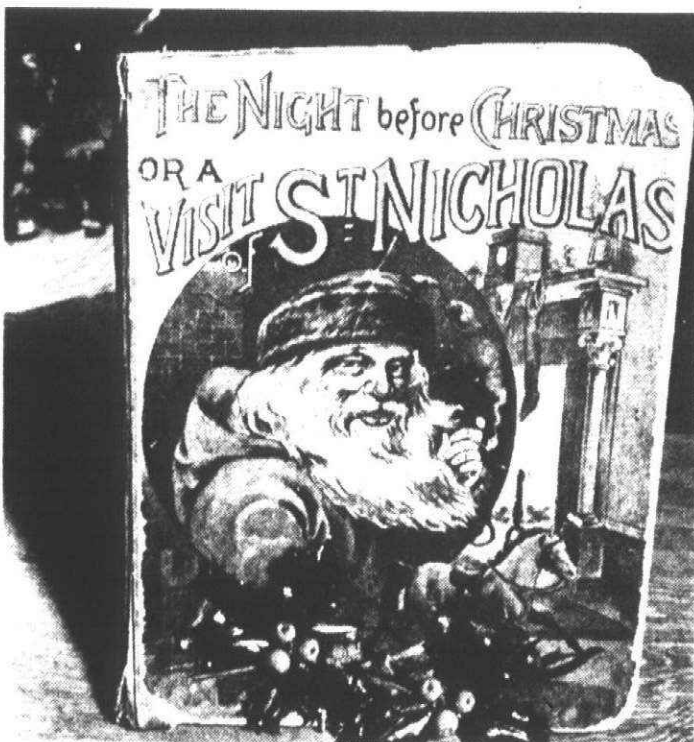

## Community has its own ballet company

The newly formed Plymouth-Canton Dance Theatre has set a deadline of early September for its first community performance.

"We are hoping to have something together for the Plymouth Fall Festival," said Anne Mininberg, whose dream of a community dance company shows signs of reality.

It was after some thorough research and consideration that the Plymouth Community Arts Council gave the project its blessing. PCAC founder Joanne Hulce is a member of the board and will act as liaison person between the arts council and the dance company.

The PCAC has agreed to assist in a study of possible grants funding. Also serving on the dance theatre board are J.L. Hudson, Sheryl Tripp, Deborah Chase and James Kaiser. One more person will be added.

AUDITIONS for membership in the company will be held in late January.

When audition dates are announced, it will be stressed that they will be for persons who are taking at least two classes a week, are at the intermediate level or above, and whose primary interest is ballet.

They will be asked to bring their pointe shoes. Those interested in auditioning can call Sheryl Tripp, 455-4929.

"The company will be an outlet for amateurs who want to perform and who might want to become pros," said Ms. Mininberg. "At first it will basically be a company class until we find their level."

She conceded that "it will take a good amount of time to pull the dancers together and work on basic strengths until we have a presentable body to market."

Once the company has put together a repertoire, it will be ready to take an active part in the community. They envision working with the schools, giving special performances, creative movement sessions and dance education workshops in the classrooms.

THE COMPANY will "start small" and hopefully, grow. Seed money is a necessity and they are looking into the possibility of grants.

The Livonia Regional Ballet Company receives financial assistance from the Livonia Council of the Arts, which is a city organization.

The ultimate aims are guest teachers and choreographers. Until then, the first step is getting a company of

dancers together. With a performance at the fall festival, the next step would be an auditorium performance in December 1979.

Ms. Mininberg, Renee Dubry and Debbie Chase moved into their studio,

Dance Unlimited, on Ann Arbor Trail 2 1/2 years ago. Their students range in age from three to 55.

"The studio still will be my business," said Anne Mininberg. "The dance company will be my cultural

contribution and I hope all the other teachers in the area will cooperate."

Although the company will require primary strength in ballet, jazz and creative movement will be incorporated into its repertoire.

## 'Assist the Aging' course combines study, placement

One hundred residents of the community will be given the opportunity to learn the skills required in working with elderly, and earn college credit, in a special program at Madonna College in Term II, beginning Jan. 8.

In a "Volunteers to Assist the Aging" program, Madonna's gerontology department offers course work for a reduced fee and with volunteer placement in an outside agency of the student's choosing.

Experience is provided through

The program sponsors guest lecturers, active in serving the elderly, to share their insights and experience with the class. This combination of course work, practicum and guest lecturers provide the base of knowledge and applied skills required for those working with the elderly. It alerts participants to the problems in this field, and offers solutions.

The program at Madonna is in its fifth year.

The required course, Seminar on the Aging, meets on Tuesday from 7 to 10 p.m., Jan. 9 through April 24.

The college has awarded a tuition waiver of \$88 to each applicant, so the total cost to the student is \$87.

# Which gasoline is best?

By PATRICK KELLY

It's important that every driver know the different kinds of gasoline available for his car.

Basically, there are four fuels for use in spark-ignited automobile engines. These are leaded premium, leaded regular, unleaded premium (a new comer) and unleaded regular. A fifth type, diesel, is used in diesel engines.

A brief description of each and their application may be of help to drivers who realized the importance of matching fuel with engine.

Premium fuel is used to reduce knocking noises in engines. It may do this through the addition of antiknock compounds such as tetra ethyl lead or through the refining process that results in a higher-octane product.

Premium usually is required only for engines that have compression ratios of 9.25 to 1 or higher.

Most engines built since 1971 have been built to meet federal clean air standards, so they have lower compression ratios, usually about 8.5 to 1. They usually don't need the antiknock characteristics of premium.

Premium may be used in 1971-1974 cars, but they usually do nothing extra-beneficial for the engines and represent a waste of about five cents a gallon over what the engine can thrive on — leaded regular gas.

Leaded regular can cause engine-damaging detonation ("knock" or "ping") on acceleration, in high-compression engines. Knocking or pinging should be avoided to prevent costly engine repairs.

Most late model cars, even imports, are equipped with catalytic converters, and the use of leaded fuel is to be avoided in them. Use of leaded

gas coats the platinum surfaces in the converters and renders them inoperative.

If your car uses leaded gas, you have more than the two grades to choose from. Many dealers offer more than two grades, while others offer low- or high-octane versions of regular and premium. High-octane gas is no more "powerful" than low-octane gas, it just runs better in high-compression engines — and costs more.

Unleaded regular was used in cars before 1975 to extend muffler and tailpipe life. Chlorinated salts from leaded gas ate up both mufflers and tailpipes.

But using unleaded gasoline denied the valves and upper combustion chamber of the lubrication of lead, so valve life was shortened.

Engines in cars made since 1975 have stellite-faced valves and valve seats to cope with the lack of lead in unleaded gas.

No-lead premium is a relative newcomer. At least one gasoline company is replacing its leaded premium with unleaded premium. If this replacement foreshadows a trend, in a few years, leaded premium may be as hard to find as unleaded regular was a few years ago.

The Automotive Parts and Accessories Association warns against using too low an octane rating fuel on long trips because of the steady speeds and infrequent acceleration.

The money saved by buying cheaper gas can be more than offset by premature engine damage caused by high-speed rumble, the association said. This damage often cannot be detected by ear over the wind, engine and tire noises.

High-speed rumble is really a form of detonation, which can destroy an engine.

Enrolling in evening classes at EMU may be the opportunity you've wanted, whether it is for an occasional class or a degree. Come for career preparation and advancement, for personal enrichment and growth, for a bachelor's degree and all it can mean to you. We'll try to make the process easy for you. You'll find the programs and courses are excellent and demanding, as you would want them to be. Give yourself a present — for Christmas or any other occasion — by signing up for evening classes at Eastern now.

Except that your selection of classes may be limited to evenings, there is no other restriction or difference for you as a student. You may enroll part-time or full time. You have regular access and right to your professor's help and time. You may use the library and bookstore and can get free football and basketball tickets. You may select day classes or mix day and evening classes any term you wish, with no special permission required.

Choose from the 319 evening classes, 272 different courses, listed on these pages.

You can complete your bachelor's degree by attending classes only in the evening. Finish all general graduation requirements and also complete the program you select from the 45 or more areas of study listed on the front page. From art, accounting, and computers, through criminology, history and social work. And new programs will be added from the more than 145 varied programs that Eastern offers.

Academic requirements are the same for day and evening programs and students. You are not segregated into something called the “Evening College” with “quickie” courses and watered-down requirements. Generally, you will have the same faculty. For example, more than five out of six evening classes last winter semester were taught by our regular faculty.

More than 1,800 undergraduate students attended EMU this fall taking only evening classes. About 865 are women and more than 970 are men. A few students are 20 years old or younger, but about 450 are age 21 to 24, more than 700 are age 25-29 and about 400 are age 30 through 65. The number of older students and women is increasing.

Admission requirements are the same for day and evening students, whether new freshmen or transfers. Many of you new evening students are in a group we sometimes call "non-traditional" — That is, you are 21 years of age or older, have a high school diploma or equivalent, and have attempted no previous college work. If you are a mature, motivated person who fits in this group, fill out the application. You will be considered for admission without further requirements. In addition, any adult may request enrollment *for one semester only* as a "non-matriculated" student. Once admitted, you will be given a catalog with full program information and will have an opportunity for advising.

## COSTS

**Fees** for all undergraduates are a \$20 Registration Fee and a \$1 Student Activity Fee.

**Tuition** for undergraduate courses (numbered 100 through 499) is \$26 per credit hour for Michigan Residents (\$65.00 for non-residents).

**Other Fees** include a \$13.50 Health Center Participation Fee for students taking seven or more credit hours and a \$10 Late Registration Fee beginning January 5, the first day of classes. There is no motor vehicle registration fee. See the Catalog and Class Schedule for additional fee information for course adjustments, special classes, applied music, withdrawal, etc. All University fees and charges are subject to change by action of the Board of Regents.

Personal checks, Master Charge, Bank-Americard-Visa, and cash are accepted. Please do not send cash through the mail.

All fees and a **minimum** of 50 percent of tuition are required at the time of registration. (The second payment is due February 23, 1979, including a \$5 installment fee).

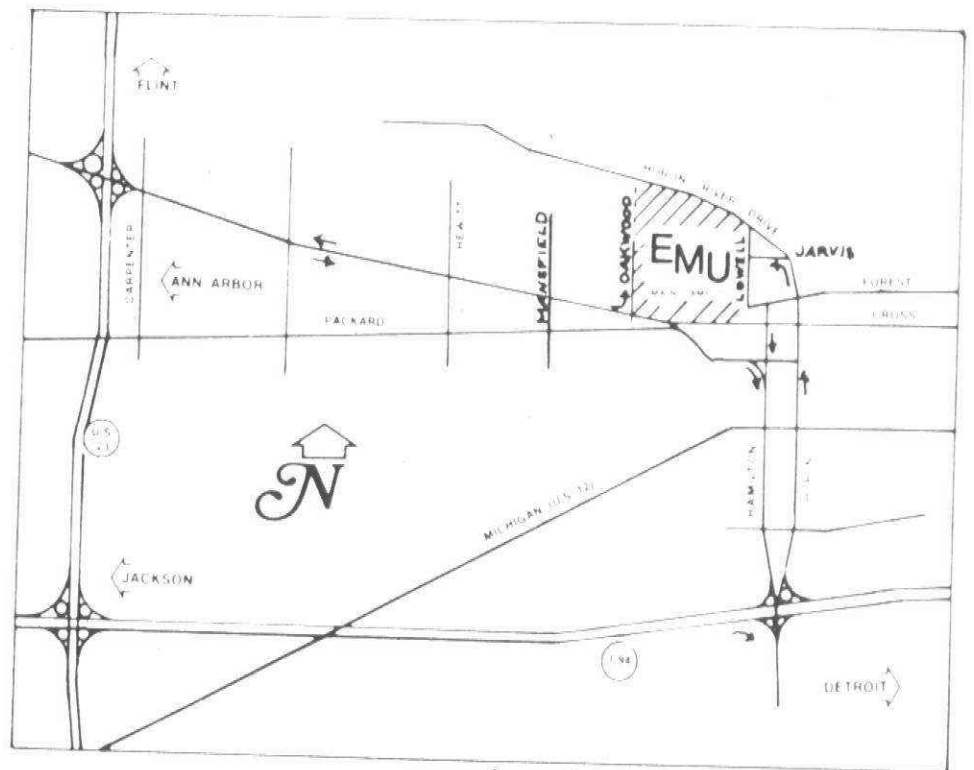

## GENERAL INFORMATION

Most of the evening students attending EMU this fall live within a radius of 20 to 30 miles from campus. However, some students come from as far away as Mt. Clemens, Flint, Lansing, Jackson, Adrian and Monroe.

**FINANCIAL AID** Most financial aid is available only to students enrolled full-time (12 credits or more for winter semester), but there are some exceptions. Direct your questions to the Financial Aid Office, 212 Pierce, phone (313) 487-0455.

**VETERANS BENEFITS** Please contact the Office of Veterans Affairs, 217 Goodison, phone (313) 487-0025, for help in securing veteran's benefits.

**ACADEMIC ADVISING** Evening students often have special needs and opportunities that make an early, thorough advising session important. Advising is available, walk-in or preferably by appointment, in the Academic Services Center, 229 Pierce. In addition to the usual 8 to 5, Monday through Friday hours, the center is open

especially for evening students Monday through Thursday until 7 p.m. during the Fall, Winter and Spring Terms, on days when classes are held. Phone (313) 487-2170. The advisers there can provide a wealth of information and help.

**OTHER HELP** General information about the University is available through Campus Interact, Starkweather Hall, until 8 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays, until 5 p.m. on Fridays, and 9-12 a.m. on Saturdays. Phone (313) 487-1111. And extended similar service is now available in the lobby of Pray-Harrold classroom building two alternating evenings each week.

**OTHER OPTIONS** Flexibility, diversity, and quality are the key characteristics we want for our program offerings at EMU. More

than 13,000 undergraduates attend this fall. Many "day" students also take evening classes. In addition to the 1,800 evening students, there are another 1,800 who go to school part-time — mornings, noons, afternoons, or perhaps just on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We provide programs in 145 areas of study. There are almost 2,000 classes and about 1,000 different courses offered to undergraduates this Winter Semester. Some 30 advanced EMU undergraduate classes are also offered off-campus, most of them at Jackson Community College.

**GRADUATE STUDENTS** About 4,600 graduate students attended Eastern this fall on-campus, and 800 more take classes at one of the 30 off-campus locations. They select from Master's degree programs in 35 areas, Specialist degrees in four areas, and a new Post — master's program in education called a Certificate of Advanced Study.
