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Amurcon site plans denied with PUD violation charge

Site plans for a proposed low-income apartment complex near the Pickwick subdivision were unanimously denied by the Canton Township board Tuesday night without a discussion of the details.

The denial was based on the arguments of township Attorney Dave Berry, who maintains that zoning of the property no longer is proper for apartment construction because the Pickwick Planned Unit Development agreement has been broken.

Representatives of Amurcon Corp. were never given an opportunity to

present their plans, which call for construction of Independence Square Apartments, a 168-unit complex south of Warren and east of Lilley roads.

Amurcon attorney Daniel Stella indicated that the Southfield-based firm may file a lawsuit over the vote.

The firm, which is building another low-income apartment complex near Joy and Canton Center roads, has already won approval from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for federally subsidized rents.

Township officials promised Pickwick residents some months ago that they would do everything possible to stop construction of the apartments, even if it meant fighting a lawsuit.

ATTORNEY BERRY maintains that apartments cannot be built on the 18-acre parcel in the Pickwick development because the zoning of the land has reverted to single-family homes.

The Pickwick agreement stipulates that apartments in the development

should be constructed before single-family homes. Since the required sequence of construction was not followed, Berry said the zoning of the Amurcon parcel reverted to the single-family use that existed before the 1971 Pickwick development agreement was signed.

Stella argues, however, that the agreement has not been broken. He said that the township has waived the right to that argument because of the amount of time that has elapsed since single-family homes in Pickwick were built.

Pickwick residents who attended Tuesday's meeting applauded the site plans' denial.

A court reporter recorded the discussion of the proposed Amurcon project. She was hired to prepare transcripts of other township board action concerning the Canton House liquor license. A lawsuit is pending in that case.

Police probe bizarre deaths

On July 3, Bonnie Jewell Crackel, 31, walked into the Canton police station and filed a complaint charging that her husband, James, had assaulted her.

Sgt. Dennis Joker of the Canton police said they were in the process of seeking a warrant for assault against the 32-year-old Crackel.

Five days later, she lay dead on the lawn of a friend, shot in the head by her husband, who also shot himself twice in the head and died a few hours later, police said.

The murder-suicide followed a stormy counseling session Sunday night at the home of a mutual friend, the Rev. William Carter, of 38495 Ann Arbor

Trail, said Livonia Detective Sgt. Richard Ericson.

Crackel and his wife have been separated for about a month, Ericson said. He had custody of the three children, James Jr., 12, Scott, 8, and Jennifer 2, living with them at their home at 6622 Carriage Hill, Canton. Mrs. Crackel was living with her parents in Plymouth.

The Rev. Carter said he had tried counseling them on several occasions in an effort to get the couple back together. The Rev. Carter said she told him she wanted to see the children, but would not go to her husband's house when he was there. Crackel was upset over the breakup of their marriage, the Rev. Carter said.

Crackel came to the Rev. Carter's with the children about 6:30 p.m. Sunday. She came to the house about an hour later. Sgt. Ericson said she wanted to talk to the children alone, and an argument ensued.

The Rev. Carter said Crackel didn't want his wife to leave, but he advised him to let her go and that he would get together with them at a later date.

Larson is named newest trustee

Stephen Larson, 34, has been appointed to the vacant seat on the Canton Township board previously held by Trustee Lynne Goldsmith.

Mrs. Goldsmith, whose unexpired term ends in November 1980, resigned last month in order to move to California.

Fourteen persons had submitted formal applications for the vacant trustee post. But it took the Canton Township board only about two minutes Tuesday night to award the appointment to Larson, who serves as vice president of the Forest Brook Homeowners Association.

Larson was nominated by Treasurer Jim Donahue. He received the three other votes needed to win the appointment from Supervisor Noel Culbert, Trustee Robert Greenstein and Trustee Carol Bodenmiller.

"Obviously, I was surprised," said Larson, after the vote was taken. "There were people with a lot of qualifications, and no one expected it to go that quickly."

Larson described himself as a "complete unknown" in Canton political circles.

Husband jailed in shooting

A Canton man is being held by police following a shooting incident involving his wife after a family quarrel last Sunday night.

According to Canton Sgt. Dennis Joker, Robert McMaster, 33, of 2042 Franklin, was arraigned Monday before 35th District Court Judge James Garber and is being held in lieu of \$25,000 bond. McMaster pleaded not guilty at the arraignment.

McMaster has been charged with assault with attempt to commit murder and possession of a firearm during a felonious act. Joker said police are seeking to transfer the man to the forensic center in Ypsilanti.

According to police reports, McMaster shot at his wife, Henrietta, about 11:45 p.m. as she ran out of the house, but the bullet did not strike her.

Police arrested McMaster after being called to the scene by neighbors.

No pre-trial examination date has been set.

"She left the house with him following. When they got to the driveway I heard a shot. Before I could reach him, he put the gun to his head and pulled the trigger."

When police arrived, Mrs. Crackel was dead. Her husband was taken to St. Mary Hospital, where he died about 4 a.m. Monday.

Canton police said they had been called to the Crackle home a couple of weeks ago where she charged her husband had beaten her. She later called police and refused to press charges. Sgt. Ericson said the children were playing in the back yard of the Rev. Carter's house at the time of the shooting.

"Apparently no one knew he was armed. A .32-caliber gun was found near him when police arrived."

The Rev. Carter, who is a minister at Main Street Baptist Church in Plymouth, said the children were now stay-

Board rescinds license approval

Philip and Lucie Haddad lost township board endorsement of their application for a restaurant liquor license Tuesday night in a formal hearing before the board.

After hearing testimony from the Haddads and opponents of a Canton House liquor license, the board voted 5-1 to change the recommendation before the Michigan Liquor Control Commission (LCC) from approval to denial.

Trustee Eugene Daley was the only board member who voted against rescinding the recommendation given by the former township board to approve a liquor license for the Canton House

restaurant at Ford and Lilley. A court reporter recorded the proceedings to comply with a request of Wayne County Circuit Judge James Hathaway for a formal transcript of the discussion.

A lawsuit over the matter is pending before the judge. In May, Hathaway dissolved an injunction that prevented the township board from changing Canton's recommendation before the LCC.

Canton residents couldn't have cared less about Skylab's fiery plunge back to earth Wednesday.

Despite massive media coverage of the event, shoppers in Plymouth and Canton showed more emotion in getting caught in Monday's rain than watching for falling Skylab debris.

"Skylab? What is Skylab?" asked one woman as she steered her kids into the Kmart on Ford Road. When informed about the spacecraft, she said, "Oh, that."

Although others knew more about Skylab, none of the dozen people interviewed said they would spend Wednesday hiding in a basement or scanning the skies for chunks of Skylab fragments.

Arthur Somerville of Westland was the only person upset over the incident. He said the government of the United States should be sued.

"How would you feel if it (Skylab) fell on you?" said Somerville. "I bet you don't want to die."

LEIGH LANGKABEL of Plymouth and John Heid of Plymouth Township took a more lighthearted approach. They spent Monday morning whistling a faddish Skylab tune.

According to the custom T-shirt

trade, even the tongue-in-cheek humor about Skylab which surfaced in many parts of the country failed to find a market here.

June Olson, owner of the Shirt Works in Plymouth, said she received only one order for a custom Skylab T-shirt. And that order was placed about a month ago.

"It's just a passing thing," she quipped of Skylab. "People don't want to spend money on things like that."

Frank McMurray, who sells State Farm insurance from an office in Canton Township, said he received a funny call from only one client

BUT MOST OF the people inter-

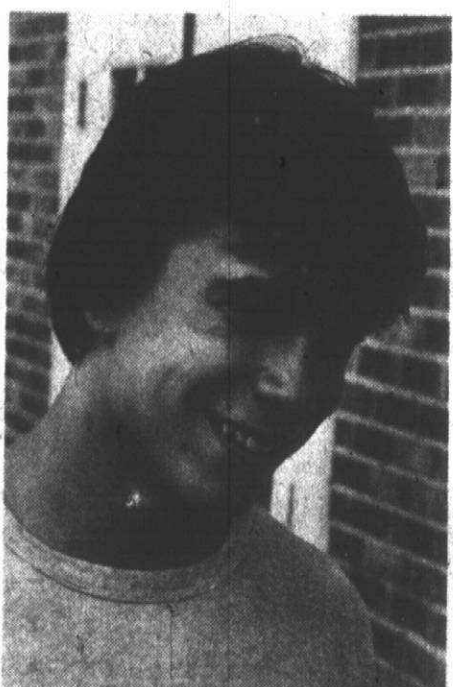
viewed by the Observer on Monday didn't care much about Skylab's much vaunted re-entry or the possibility of property damage or personal harm.

"Nothing ever happens in Canton," she said. "Well, almost."



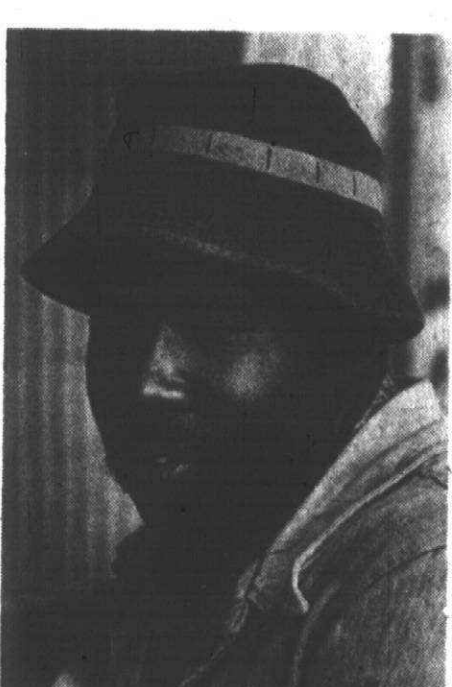

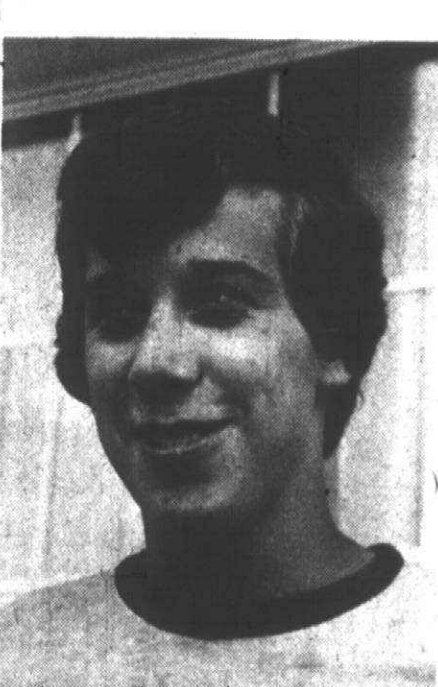

Newer residents seen as best tax backers

Residents of new subdivisions in the Plymouth-Canton community are stronger supporters of school millage requests.

That was one of the conclusions drawn by Florence Beier, administrative assistant for community relations for Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, in an analysis of the June 11 election when voters approved an additional 1.5 mills.

Robinwood Dr. bridge screen bid moved up

The Michigan Department of Transportation took bids yesterday to screen the bridge carrying Robinwood Drive over M-14 west of Plymouth.

The department had originally taken bids on the project, estimated to cost \$30,000, in October, 1979.

The bid letting date was moved up to July 11, however, at the request of State Rep. Robert Law, R-Livonia. Plymouth Township Supervisor Thomas Notebaert and Trustee Gerald Law had asked for the state representative's help in speeding up the project.

"It was felt the bridge posed a potential safety hazard without this screen," explained Law. "Yet the people in that area were unable to receive any satisfaction from the transportation department."

"This project has been pending for almost a year and the department agreed to take an earlier bid which will speed up completion for early this fall."

Law is a member of the House Appropriations' subcommittee on transportation.

out has increased as our student population grew. Additional operating millages and bond issues have passed 50 percent of the time since 1967 and renewals have passed 90 percent of the time," said Mrs. Beier.

"Precinct-by-precinct charts show that new growth areas tend to have more positive votes than older areas, where fewer parents of school children vote."

"Targeted campaigns by citizens appear to have had a favorable effect on positive votes, especially as evidenced in Precincts 6 (West Middle) and 10 (Hulsing Elementary) in the most recent election."

She added that the Citizens Election Committee, chaired by Deanna Huff, had a major impact on the outcome of the election. Especially significant, she noted, was the effort to gain the support of a broad range of school employees and the distribution of low-key and low-cost publications.

Mrs. Huff said that she believed the question-answer brochure to be one of the most effective publications used in the campaign.

Also used were post cards, personal notes to neighbors, musical reminders, book markers, and special messages to pre-school parents.

Mrs. Beier felt another factor which was helpful was a variety of activities held at the individual school buildings during the weeks prior to the June election.

AN ANALYSIS of millage election history of Plymouth-Canton Schools since 1967 shows nine of 10 renewals being approved, eight of 14 requests for additional millage, and three of six bond issues being approved.

In 1967, when enrollment was 8,264, some 2,275 went to the polls. In 1976, enrollment was 6,682 and voter turnout was 14,254, and last June voter turnout

was 6,080, with enrollment pegged at 16,100.

Since 1974 when the school district first began year-round school, four of six requests for additional millage have been approved. During that same time, all five renewals were approved.

For the 12 years (1971-78) that the

controversial modular scheduling system was in use at the high schools, five of nine requests for additional millage were approved and all six renewals passed.

The last bond issue to be approved by voters was a proposal for almost \$10 million in 1974. Before that, voters had

turned a \$14 million proposal in 1973 and a \$21.5 million proposal in 1972.

Prior to that, bond issues had better luck as voters approved an \$11 million issue in 1968 and a \$5.5 million proposal in 1966. In 1959 two bond proposals totalling \$4.5 million were defeated and from 1949-55 voters approved four

separate bond proposals totalling almost \$5 million but ranging from \$245,000 to \$3 million.

An analysis of voting days shows that the largest positive vote margins (70 percent or higher) were gained on two Monday elections and on one Thursday election.

Members must pay annual dues of \$160 in addition to a \$200 initiation fee and a refundable deposit of \$300.

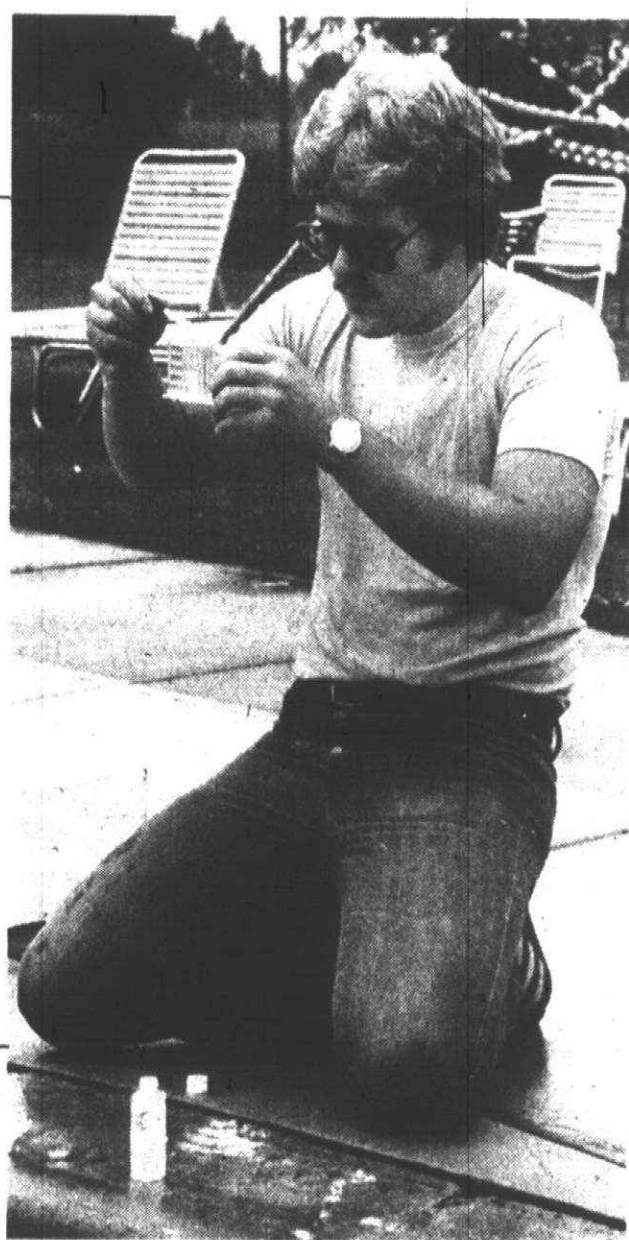


Swim team member James DeWitt, 7, picks up kick boards after practice.

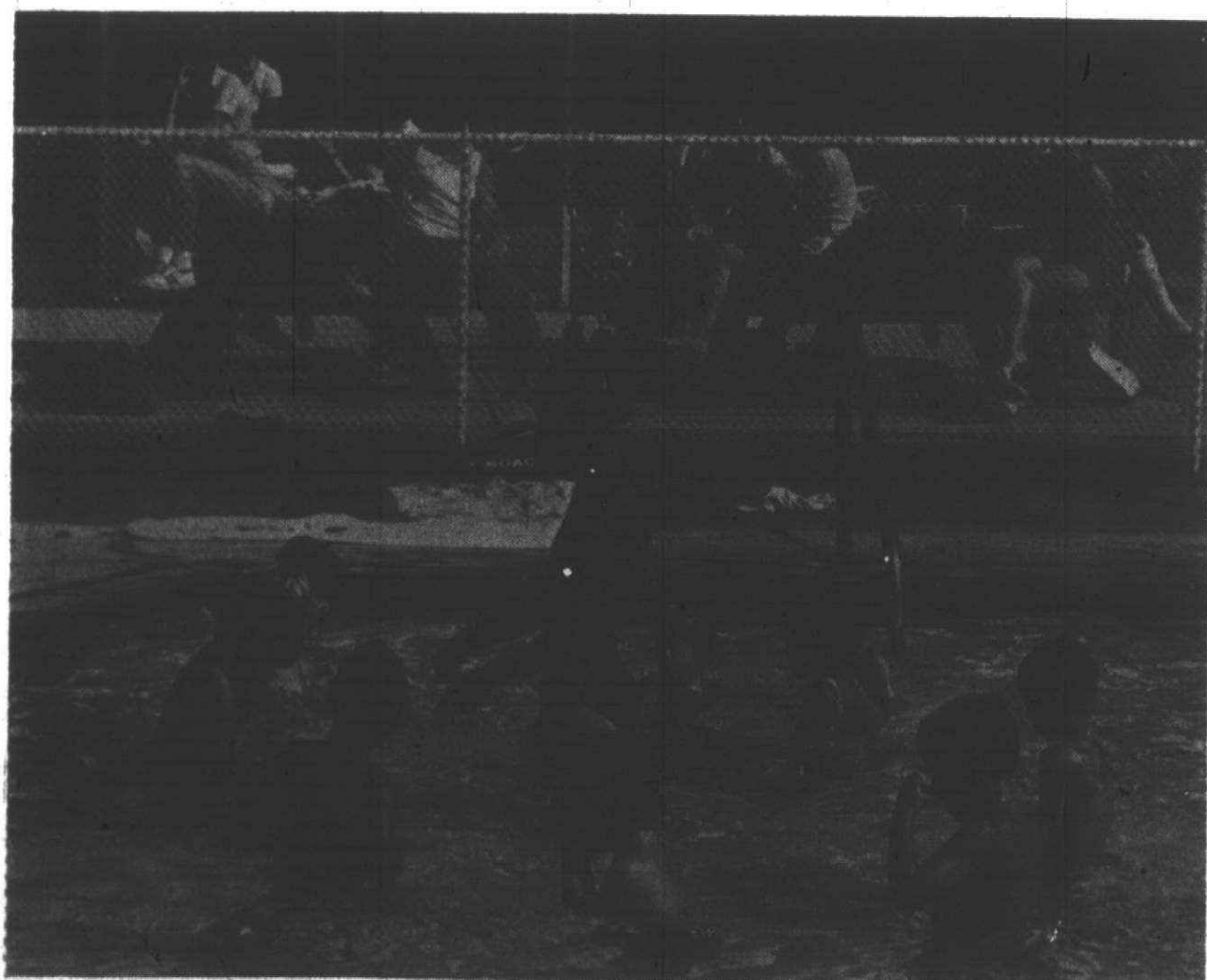


Youngsters get some swimming tips and practice with kick boards while instructor Marion Stanwood looks on.

Swim club manager Rob Jenner tests the pool water, a procedure that must be performed frequently.

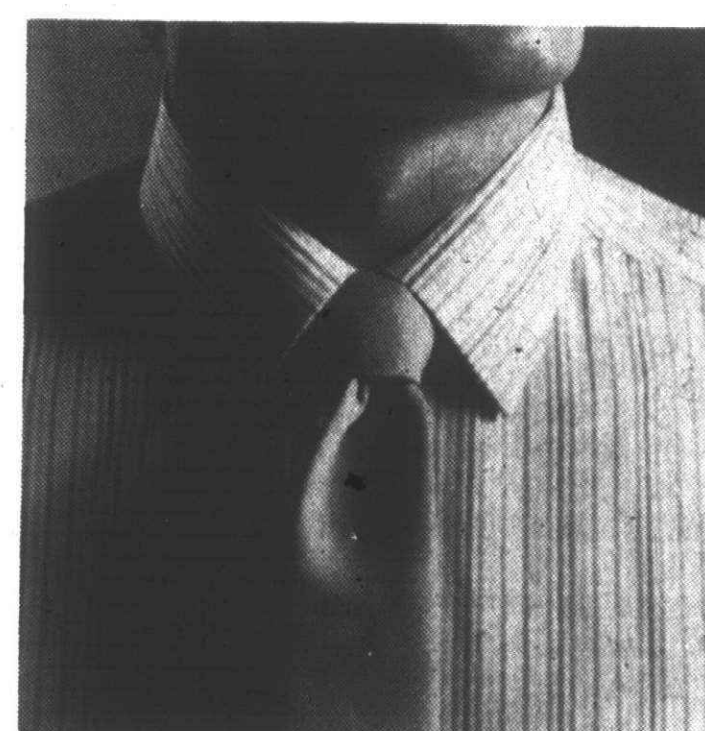
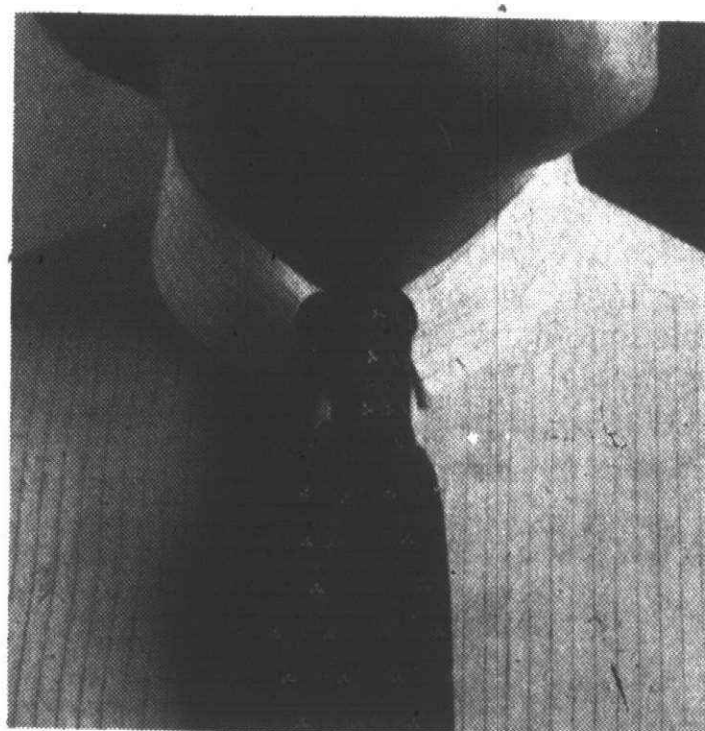
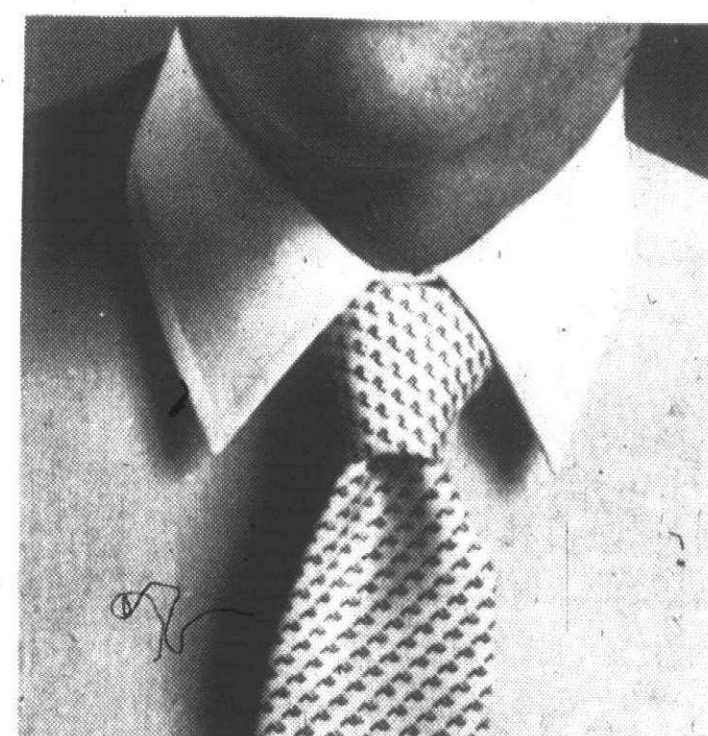
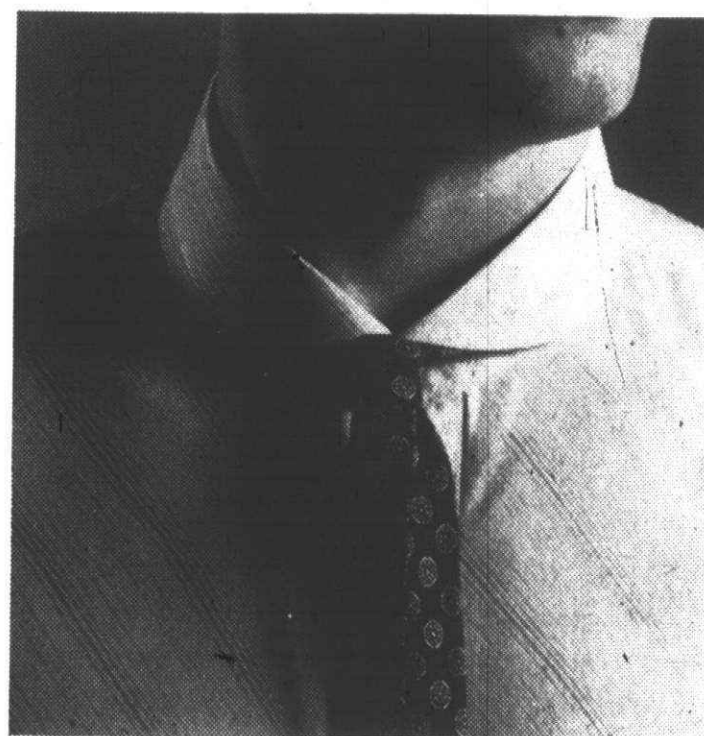

School board selects officers

Unanimity prevailed at the annual organizational meeting of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

Monday night school trustees elected all officers by 7-0 votes.

Re-elected were Tom Yack as president, Richard Arlen as vice president and Steve Harper as treasurer.

Elaine Kirchgatter was elected board secretary, a position held last year by Flossie Tonda.

AT THE BEGINNING of the annual meeting, Yack presented a proclamation and lifetime pass to all school activities to outgoing Trustee Joe Gray.

Gray commented that there were plenty of ups and downs during his six years on the board. "It was a lot of fun and a lot of work and effort. I will always remember the times of great discussions, agreements and disagreements. In leaving, I hope that the spell-

ing bee which was started this year will be continued and that the reading program will always be a high priority item."

In other action at the organizational meeting, the board established the second and fourth Mondays of each month as the time for its regular meetings which will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the central office at 454 S. Harvey, Plymouth.

Yack was appointed as the board's representative to the Metropolitan As-

sociation for Improved School Legislation (MAISL) — a group of nine school districts which have combined to hire a lobbyist to promote legislation favorable to education.

Yack also was named as the board's representative on the Community School Advisory Committee.

Mrs. Tonda was named to represent the board on the Rural Life Committee and Carol Davis will represent the board on the Title IX Committee.

THE BOARD also appointed the firm of Plante & Moran as school district auditors for the 1979-80 fiscal year.

It is the practice of the board to deal with one auditing firm for five years, and then change to another firm. Last year was the first time Plante & Moran was appointed as auditors.

Approved as legal counsel for the coming year were the firms of: Draugelis, Ashton and Scully of Plymouth for general counsel; Thrun, Maatsch & Norberg for financial and election matters; and Clark, Hardy, Lewis and Fine for labor relations matters.

Fairlane Associates of Dearborn was reappointed as insurance counselor and agent of record for the school district. The board voted, though, to notify Fairlane that next year it planned to appoint an insurance counselor who would be banned from doing business with the district so that the firm would have to choose to be either counselor or an agent.

While discussing insurance arrangements, Superintendent John M. Hoben informed the board the district has received an \$11,190 rebate on a self-insurance program with the Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB) and earlier had received a \$90,000 rebate from Blue Cross.

endorsement of the liquor license listed several reasons for the action, including:

• The stand that parking in the shopping center where the restaurant is located is inadequate. Board members maintain that the consumption of alco-

hol in the center would further aggravate the traffic problem.

• The allegation that the restaurant is unsuitable for a liquor license because of the number of children who frequent other stores in the shopping center.

• The belief that the small restaurant leased by Haddad does not increase the community's tax base.

Trustee Robert Greenstein, who is an attorney, questioned Haddad about the amount of money he has spent in anticipation of receiving the liquor license.

Peter Bundarin, an attorney representing the couple, said the Haddads, who came to the United States from the Middle East, do not speak English well or understand the procedure involved in obtaining a liquor license.

Haddad told Greenstein that he has spent about \$3,000 to remedy building and fire code violations in his restaurants. Although the violations were discovered as part of the LCC's review of the restaurant, Greenstein maintained that the violations would have to be remedied regardless of the couple's liquor license application.

THE CURRENT township board indicated in the past that it would reconsider the Haddads' liquor license application. Approximately 400 residents signed petitions in opposition to the license.

At Tuesday's hearing, the Haddads presented petitions signed by about 620 customers between April and July who endorsed the serving of liquor at the restaurant.

Although the Haddads' petitions will be sent to Judge Hathaway, township board members criticized the documents by saying that the majority of signatures did not come from Canton residents.

Bundarin took the position that the current township board is bound by decisions made by its predecessors.

"We aren't sitting on a new application, but a proposal to take away permission that's already been granted," Bundarin said. "I take the position that the actions of the township board are continuous."

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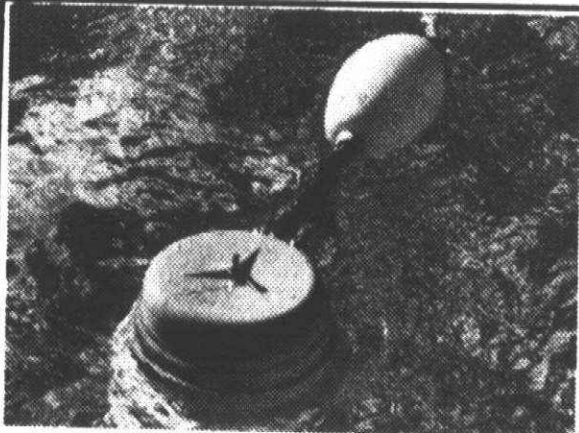
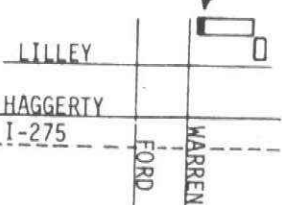
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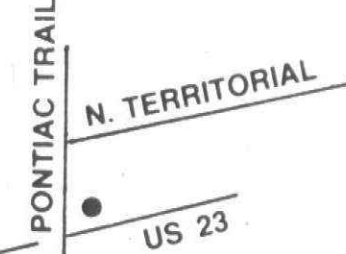
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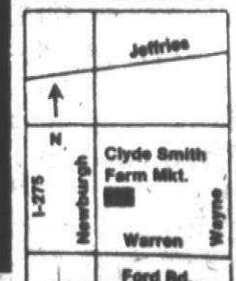


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Plymouth student tours British Isles with choir

If you make smart cracks around Kathy Renas about accounting majors being dull people, you had better watch out.

After recently completing a 31-day tour of the British Isles with the Eastern Michigan University Madrigal Singers, she further confirmed that she definitely doesn't qualify as a dull person.

Ms. Renas is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Huston Prall of Kellogg Street, Plymouth.

THE TOUR included performances at the Cork International Choral and Folk Dance Festival in Cork, Ireland, and at the Canterbury and Coventry cathedrals in England.

In Cork, the Madrigal Singers — one of only two American choirs invited to sing in the festival — competed with choirs from Bulgaria, Hungary, W. Germany, Ireland and England.

The EMU choir captured a top award (the Ruth Ralston Prize) for making the outstanding contribution to the festival of any of the choirs or dance groups attending.

Some 70 adult choirs, 35 youth choirs and numerous dance ensembles participated in the festival.

While in Cork, the choir also premiered a work by Leslie Bassett, Pulitzer prize-winning composer from Ann Arbor, at the Seminar on Contemporary Choral Music, which was held in conjunction with the festival.

In Dublin, the Madrigal Singers received a stunning review from Charles Acton, the top music critic in Ireland who writes for The Irish Times.

RENAS, A JUNIOR at EMU who used her knowledge in accounting in her role as assistant business manager for the Madrigal Singers, also sang with the University Choir before being

accepted into the Madrigals this year.

She also was active as a student in the Plymouth Salem High School music program, playing in the band and orchestra while also singing in the choir.

Renas said she joined the Madrigal Singers because she wanted to go overseas to see the different cultures that she would encounter on the tour. She added that she also enjoys singing in a small group like the Madrigal Singers.

"I really enjoy singing with a small group, rather than a large group like a choir, and I love madrigal music. When you have a small group doing madrigal music, it's really fulfilling."

Ms. Renas said she really enjoyed the tour. "I enjoyed it tremendously. I think you are always going to have your ups and downs, but there were a whole lot more ups than there were downs."

The high point of the tour, she added, was performing at Cork. "That's where I felt we really got it together, and finally felt like a close-knit group."

Her only regret was that the tour was so quick. "It seemed to go so fast. I'm ready to do it again, and maybe I'd be more calm this time around and would enjoy it and would catch a lot more."

"Five weeks was a good amount of time to be there, but it seemed like I was just getting into the flow of things and it was time to go home."

Acknowledging the rave reviews and high critical acclaim the group received overseas, Ms. Renas said she doesn't fully realize what it all means.

"I'm really proud that I was a part of that. I don't think it has hit, it's kind of something far out that I'm not sure I grasp. But it's really great. I'm really ecstatic I got to be a part of it."

SC recount fruitless

Richard Hayward of Livonia and Michael Burley of Canton will retain their newly-won seats on the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees.

A recount conducted last week failed to change the results of the June 11 election that showed Hayward a one-vote winner over Thomas Moore of Northville for a two-year trustee term. Burley won a six-year term by 27 votes over Robert Ficano of Livonia.

The Wayne County Board of Canvassers Friday confirmed Hayward's election by three votes over Moore. Burley's margin decreased one vote to 26. The Board of Canvassers had conducted the recount on the Six Mile and Haggerty Road campus last week.

The Burley-Ficano race was recounted in all 122 precincts of the community college district. Moore requested a recount in 14 precincts — all of those in the Northville School District, where paper ballots are still used, and three in Livonia. The Plymouth-Canton and Garden City school districts complete the Schoolcraft area.

The recount cost Ficano \$610, at \$5 per precinct. Moore paid \$70 for the recount.

THE RECOUNT result assures the trustees selection of board officers last week will remain the same.

William S. Miller of Plymouth is back in town after attending the 64th annual Kiwanis International convention in Toronto.

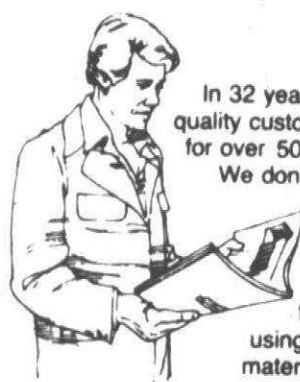
Miller is a member of the Kiwanis Club of Plymouth, and is active as the group's vice-president.

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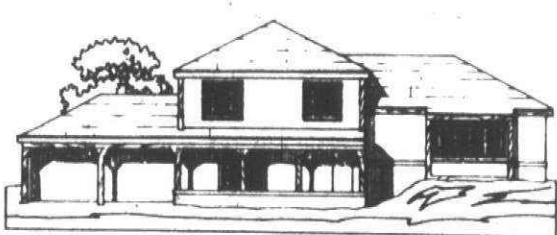
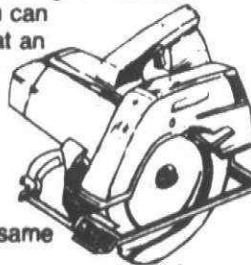


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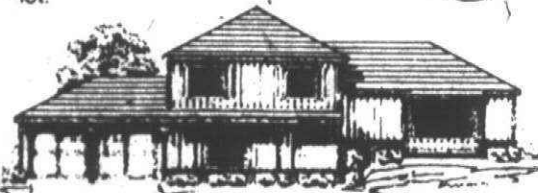

The Plymouth area Scouts are members of council contingents sponsored by Detroit Area Council.



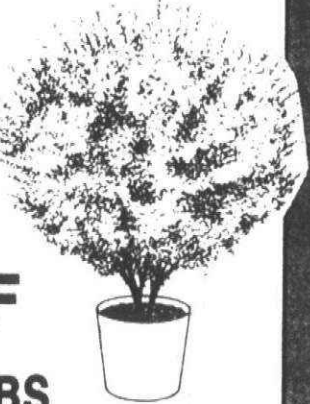
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Photon Sources Inc. sells stock

The shares sold were a combination of treasury and newly issued stock which increased the total number of outstanding shares from 520,000 to 600,000.

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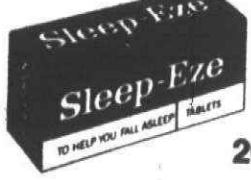
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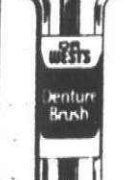

The Bottom Line Counting profits

Ronald Loisel of Plymouth is stepping aside as author of "The Bottom Line" as he has decided to seek election to the Plymouth City Commission. Replacing him will be Daniel Herriman, his partner in a local consulting firm for small businesses.

Net profit on sales is a good measure of profitability.

This ratio measures what the business takes in and what it spends in doing business. The ratio depends mainly on operating costs and pricing policies.

Net profit might go down because prices were lowered in hope of increasing total sales volume or because cost has been increasing while prices remain the same.

But increased dollar sales volume is not always reflected by a corresponding increase in net profit. This may be a result of not raising retail prices sufficiently to offset corresponding wholesale price increases.

IF THE COST of goods-to-sales ratio is not increasing, prices have not been lowered to generate increased sales volume and net profit is decreasing.

Most likely some operating expense or total expense also has grown out of bounds. During periods of rapid price increases, the gross profit ratio should be watched closely, and any decline in this ratio should be investigated promptly.

Compare expense and operating ratios with prior years to establish reasons for increased expenses or to determine if individual expenses are in line with similar expenses.

The gross profit ratio must be compared with prior years' ratios every month during the year. A former gross profit of 45 per cent may have decreased to 41 per cent or even less. Correspondingly, the total operating expense ratio would have increased.

The end result of these factors is that the entire increase in sales volume could be dissipated and the net profit be lower, even with increased sales volume. Increased dollar sales volume is not necessarily reflected in a corresponding increase in net profit.

Social workers impersonated

The Michigan Department of Social Services warned Wayne County residents against admitting into their homes unidentified individuals who claim to be Social Services workers.

Following receipt of a report that a 72-year-old Dearborn Heights woman had been robbed by two females posing as DSS workers, department spokesperson Margaret Anzinger said DSS staffers making home visits have been asked to wear identification badges.

The official Wayne County DSS badge includes both a photograph and signature of the department employee.

County residents receiving assistance should ask to see an official badge before admitting anyone claiming to be a Social Services worker, Mrs. Anzinger said.

"Also, clients should note — and preferably write down — the name of the person," Mrs. Anzinger said, "and the photograph should be viewed carefully to verify that it is of the person trying to gain entry to the home."

Anyone having a similar experience with individuals impersonating Social Services workers should report to the appropriate police department or telephone DSS at 256-1560.

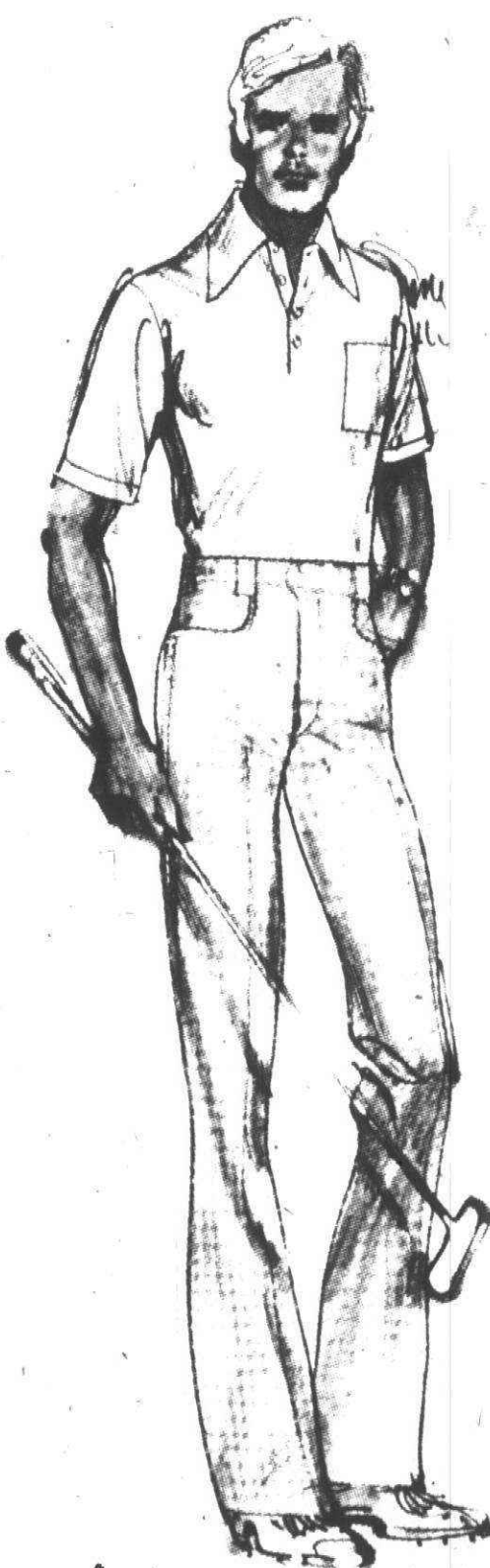

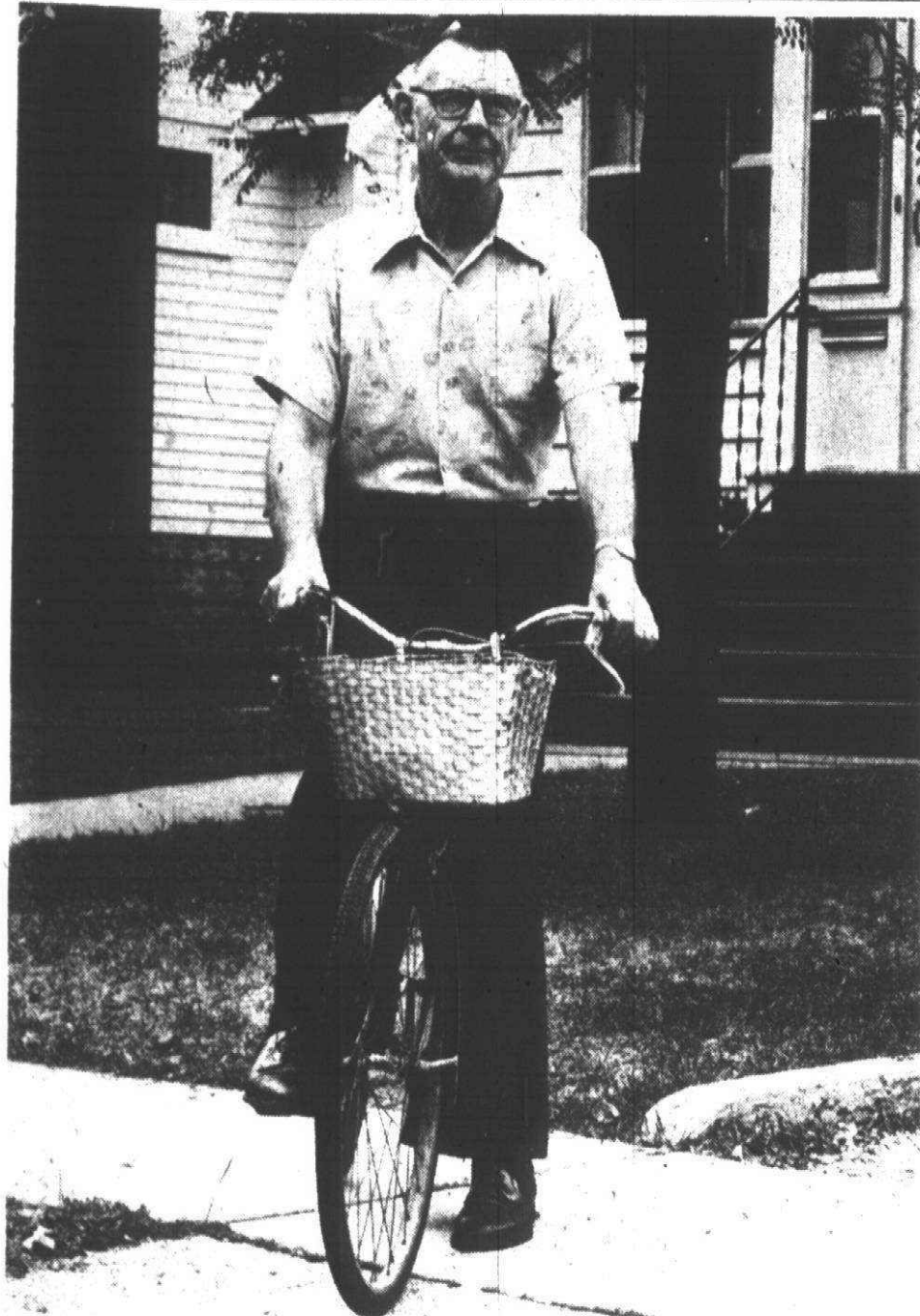

Cyclists hit the streets

Bike sales respond to energy crisis

It is an ill wind that doesn't blow somebody some good.

The truth of this old saying is prevalent in Plymouth today as the energy crisis is playing havoc with the gasoline market and folks are turning to bicycles as a mode of travel in many areas.

The trend toward the bicycle is most noticeable at Jerry Loiselle's shop on Ann Arbor Road, where the sales have taken a substantial jump in the past few weeks.

According to Loiselle the trend is not limited to the Plymouth area. He has a store in Detroit which also is boasting an increase in sales.

WITH THE GOVERNMENT warning people to cut down on their gasoline

consumption, people are turning to the bicycle for more than the ordinary travel during the week to such places as the shopping malls and the grocery stores. And they are turning more and more to the bicycle for recreation.

"It is surprising," Loiselle said, "to see the number of folks who ordinarily travel out of town to the various resorts for recreation now are riding bikes to the parks in and around the city and township."

There is one drawback to the trend toward the bicycle, though, and that is the lack of bicycle paths leading to the various shopping centers.

"The riders now must face the danger of traffic to go shopping, but they'll soon catch on," he said.

Several years ago, the county commissioners took note of the need for bicycle paths and had them installed

along Hines Park. Now there is a need for them within the city limits.

Shopping by bicycle is nothing new for some Plymouth residents. It is a common sight to see Fred Hadley pedal his bike in the downtown business district. He now is being followed by several others and it may not be long until much of the downtown shopping will be done on bicycle.

THE MODERN BICYCLE is a far cry from the old days when there was only one speed and you had to pedal all the harder to make time. Now the latest models have several speeds (as many as 12) and eat up the ground in good fashion.

While Loiselle was not too surprised by the trend to bicycles in the Plymouth area, but he was when he saw the movement in Detroit.

More and more, the bicycle is com-

ing into use in the residential sections and it no longer is an uncommon sight to see free-wheelers pedaling east on Jefferson Avenue toward Belle Isle and Grosse Pointe.

For recreational purposes, the Plymouth residents do not have far to travel as the bike paths installed by the county now are located along Edward Hines Drive and one can pedal his or her way to Northville or east to Ford Road.

The trend also will be a boon to the bicycle clubs that have been pedaling along with almost a limited membership for many years.

Now, with more bicycle pedalers, the club memberships are bound to increase and it is likely that bicycle tours will be revived.

At least Jerry Loiselle, who has been watching the bicycle market for years, thinks so.

Pursell joins legislators in talk on gifted program

Developing state programs for gifted children was the focus of a two-day national seminar last month in which U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) reiterated his support for programming for the gifted.

"There is no finer or important issue than helping this part of the population. Developing the gifted and talented is an important way to help bring out the creative genius of this country."

On June 21, legislators met to formulate recommendations for education for gifted and talented students using federal and state agencies as the leadership in implementing these concerns.

Participants focused on curriculum development, individualized instruction for gifted children and involvement of a school's total staff in developing school

programs for the gifted and talented.

They also suggested states step up their funding to train teachers for the gifted, and added that parent support should be sought at all levels.

Pursell was joined by U.S. Sen. Jacob Javits (R-New York) in addressing some 140 members of state boards of education at the conference which was coordinated by the National Association of State Boards of Education through a grant from the U.S. Office of Education.

Javits added the need to incorporate such programming for the outstanding artistic and musically talented. He encouraged states to consider the needs of minority and disadvantaged gifted when planning special programs.

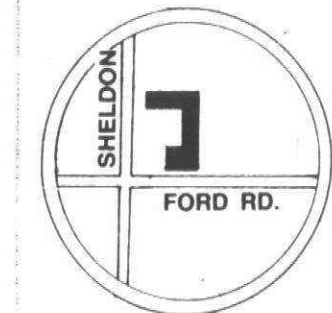

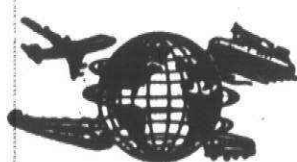

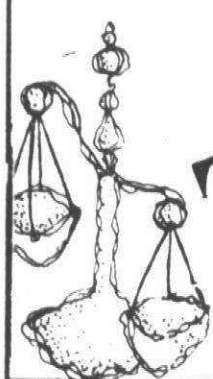

Is there happiness in the lettuce patch?

Deficiencies in specific nutrients are no more common in vegetarian populations than in meat eating populations. However, since Vitamin B-12 is low in most plant foods, Dwyer suggests that strict vegetarians use fortified soybean milks and fermented soybean foods, which are known to be high in vitamin B-12 or they should take B-12 supplements.

Eating a vegetarian diet has been credited with minimizing obesity, cancer, coronary artery disease, dental problems, adult-onset diabetes and other diseases. Unfortunately, Dwyer said, very few of these are verified with scientific proof.

However, some generalizations can be made based on available data, she added. For example, vegetarians, especially those who abstain from all ani-

mal foods, generally have lower weights for their heights than non-vegetarians.

Some studies also suggest a possible association between vegetarian diets and a lower level of arterial disease and, the studies show, some people had less incidence of circulatory disease.

It also is true that vegetarians who consume no animal foods generally have the lowest blood cholesterol levels. Cholesterol buildup in the arteries has been implicated in the risk of coronary heart disease.

Although some forms of vegetarianism do increase risk of malnutrition and serious disease, careful planning based on up-to-date nutrition guidelines can avoid the health risks of vegetarianism and maximize the benefits.

If you have considered a vegetarian diet due to obesity you will be interested in a report by Dr. Johanna Dwyer, the Director of the Frances Stern Nutrition Center at the New England Medical Center Hospital.

With careful planning, she says, it is possible to be a vegetarian and enjoy a nutritionally sound diet.

In a recent issue of Contemporary Nutrition, Dwyer stated that vegetarians make up probably less than one percent of the total population in the United States today. While it is not a widespread eating style, vegetarianism has grown more prevalent in the last decade, particularly among adults.

ACCORDING TO DWYER, reasons for being vegetarian are generally philosophical, religious or health-relat-

ed., rather than cultural or economic.

Dwyer stressed that for strict vegetarians, planning is essential to prevent the deficiency diseases which might occur.

There are some individuals who have practiced various forms of vegetarianism on a long-term basis and have demonstrated excellent health and rarely suffered from insufficient energy intakes, she said.

However, the children in some of the newer vegetarian groups are smaller and grow more slowly, possibly because pure vegetarian diets are so high in bulk that children may feel full before they eat enough calories.

Plant foods can be combined in a way to achieve satisfactory growth as long as calorie intakes are adequate, Dwyer said.

Heart study nets \$11,000 subsidy

The Michigan Heart Association has granted \$11,000 to the research department at the County General Hospital in Westland.

Recipient is Dr. Daisy McCann, hospital research director. The grant will enable Dr. McCann to continue her two-year investigation of the cause of heart attacks and strokes.

According to Dr. McCann, clotting within the blood vessels has long been suspected of causing both heart attacks and strokes.

More than 200 individual volunteers will participate in the study and be fol-

lowed up by the doctor for a period of approximately 18 months. These volunteers are patients treated at the hospital with suspected or actual heart attacks or strokes.

If the patient agrees to participate in the study, blood samples are taken at the time of admission and on subsequent visits to the hospital out-patient department.

The Michigan Heart Association approved the grant and expressed confidence in Dr. McCann and her co-workers, who were called "leaders in a continuing fight against heart disease."

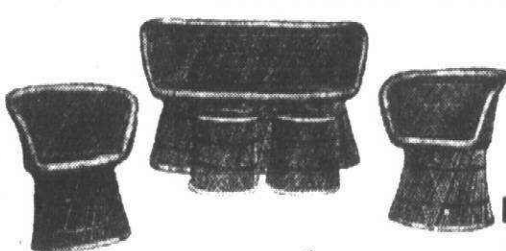

He has received the Phi Beta Kappa, National Sciences Foundation Fellowship and the Bownocker Fellowship from Ohio State University.

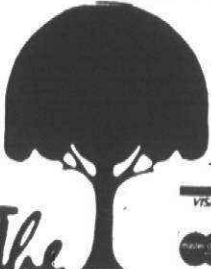
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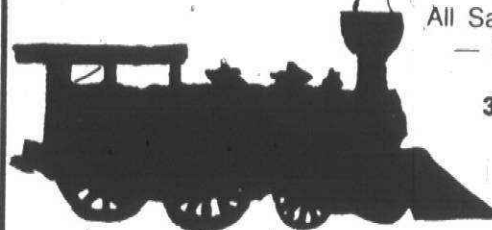
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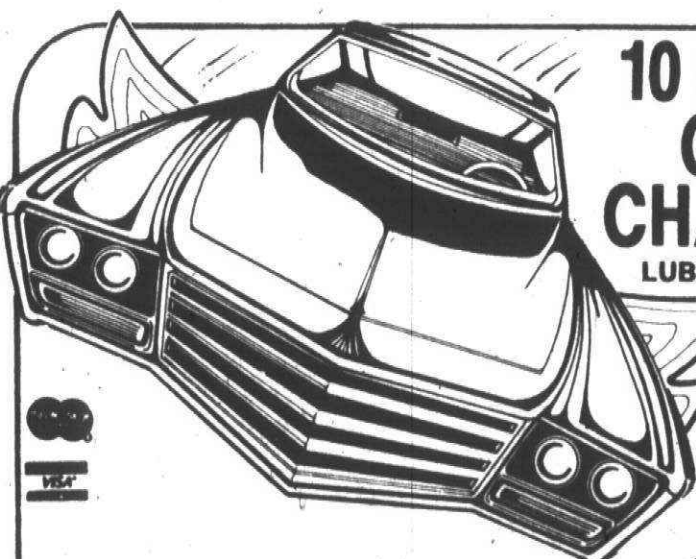
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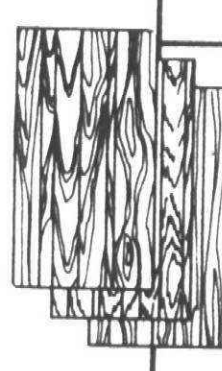


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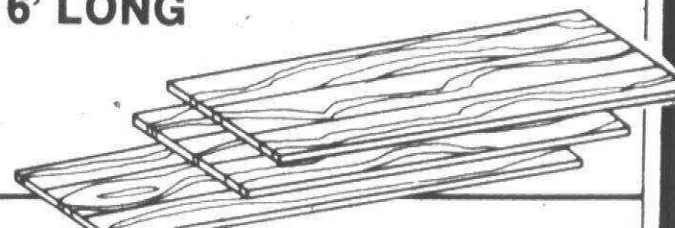


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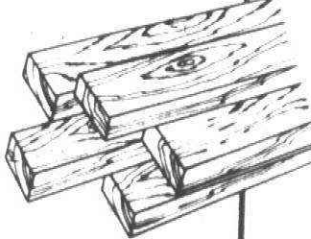

Trustees emerge as individuals, not slate

Six months have slipped away since those who won a place on the Canton Township Board of Trustees took their oaths of office.

Since Supervisor Noel Culbert, Treasurer James Donahue and trustees Carol Bodenmiller and Robert Greenstein took office, several issues of vital concern have come before the board.

The new board members have been accused of block voting on some of these issues. Although the four adamantly insisted they were not running for office as a slate (in fact Donahue ran as a Republican), they do seem to come to the same conclusions on many subjects.

That isn't necessarily bad. The new board mem-

bers have never been secretive about their feelings on such matters as growth control or business regulation. They told the public what they believed during the election and they are now voting in a manner consistent with those beliefs.

It doesn't bother us a bit to see board members vote the same way. They were elected by a majority. It seems only right that their votes reflect an attitude that is shared by a large number of people.

But, as the board members become more comfortable with their roles as elected officials, we are beginning to see them emerge as individuals rather than the four who always vote the same way.

They can still be counted on to hang together on

such matters as growth control, farmland preservation or sign regulation.

When some of the more ambiguous issues come around, however, the new officials are becoming increasingly independent.

We don't always agree with the stand of a particular board member, but we don't see any evidence of one person controlling the board, either.

If Greenstein is the puppetmaster his opponents during the '78 accused him of being, his hold on the strings is slipping.

He has been outvoted on several occasions by the same people who were labeled his puppets. And, should the other board members think he's gone

overboard on an issue, they don't hesitate to tell him about it.

The introduction of a new appointed trustee to fill the seat left vacant by Lynn Goldsmith's resignation should add even more spice to the various disagreements and debates going on at board level.

Sure, the little private agreements to vote the same way on an issue will still go on. Sure, the four newer officials — and maybe even the newest trustee — will stick together on some major issues.

But block voting or slate decisions appear increasingly unlikely as new officials stretch their political wings.

Legislators don't want to pay piper

A lot of Michigan folks admit to confusion over what the Headlee tax amendment means.

But one section's meaning rings clear.

The state government has to back up state mandated programs with bucks. For years the state has been mandating programs for local governments and telling municipalities and school districts they would have to fork over funds.

That rubbed a lot of local officials (and residents) the wrong way.

Many a conversation over a coffee or brew revealed that while some local officials had qualms over the tax amendment, they applauded the section dealing with mandated programs.

But now the waters have been muddied by passage of a state senate bill which, if it becomes law, would amend the proposal. Under the senate bill, the state could mandate programs which are traditionally provided by local governments and require the local unit to pay.

In short, if Senate Bill 460 becomes law, the Headlee amendment's most forthright section will be undermined. The section of the amendment which many persons understood and agreed with would be written off the books.

Those who opposed Headlee, and that includes me, find themselves in an uncomfortable position.

On the one hand, we feel that state government's ability to mandate and force local governments to pay is a sound concept. Such mandating forced parochial local governments to respond to the interests of persons on a regional basis.

But on the other hand, we feel that the voters' sentiments were clear on this issue and those sentiments should be supported — like it or not.

Although Headlee passed by a slim majority, it was a majority nevertheless.

State Senator Doug Ross, D-Oak Park, an SB 460 sponsor, is circumventing the reality of voter sentiment when he peddles the argument that "taxpayers will foot the bill" either way.

It's obvious that taxpayers will foot the bill. They always do.

If I were a state senator opposed to Headlee, I too might be tempted to pull such a stunt. It is the duty of state officials to live with the uncomfortable reality which voters have mandated.

Voters have determined that they want decisions on how money is to be spent made closer to home — at the local level.

Voters felt, when plunking for Headlee, that if state officials had to dip into their own coffers to pay for mandated programs, they would be less eager to mandate.

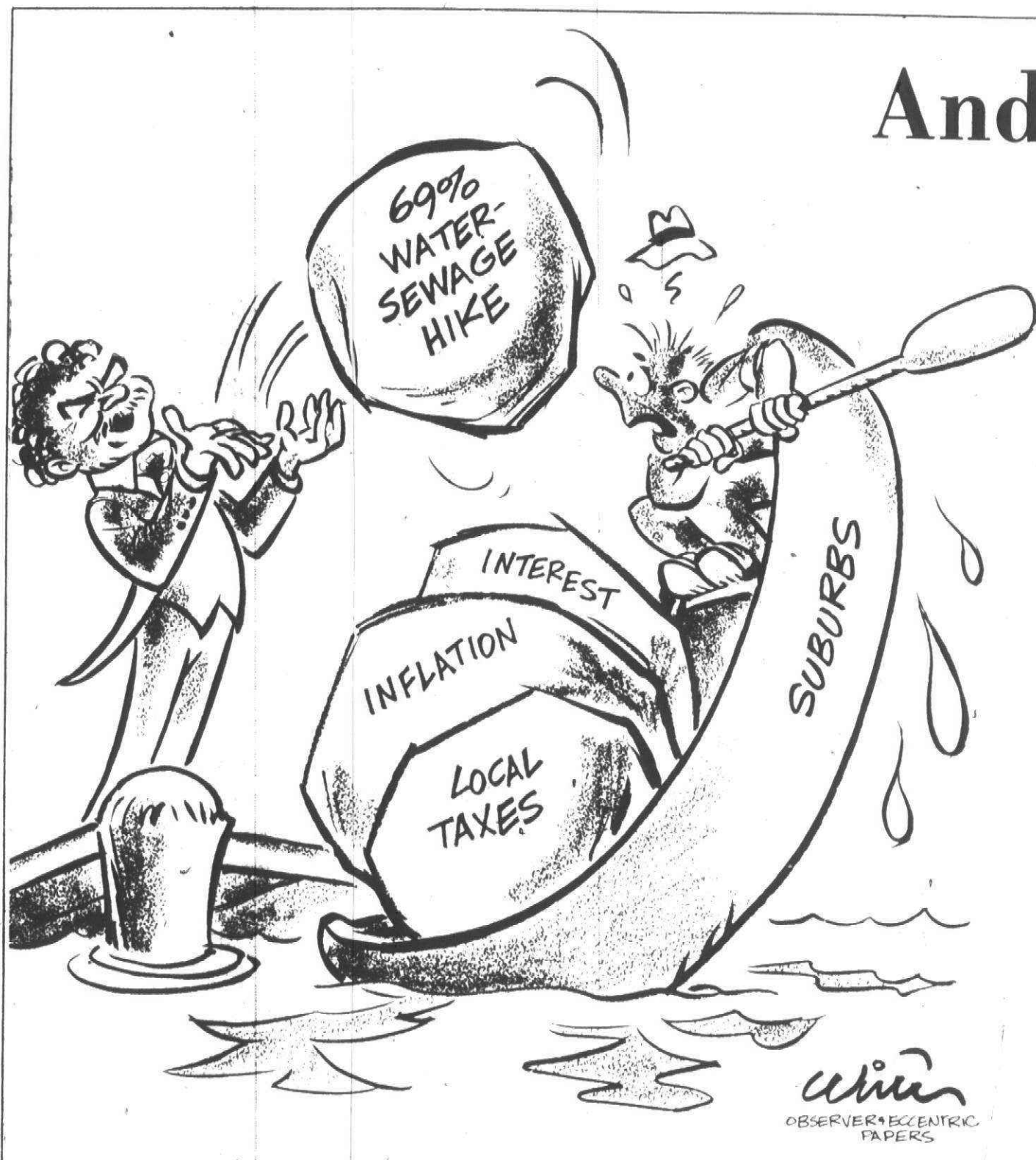
Farmington Hills insurance executive Richard Headlee is clear on what his group was talking about when piecing together its proposal.

"We want state government out of local government's business," he has said.

The Headlee amendment has caused considerable confusion since implementation. The ill-conceived amendment will be sure to cause even more confusion in the future.

Hopefully, in years to come, Michigan voters will wise up and realize that the Headlee amendment was a bad idea and throw the rascally proposal to the wind.

But until that time, those in opposition must swallow hard and live with this big mistake.



And up go rates for suburbs

Detroit's water and sewage system serves, besides the Motor City, 75 suburban communities.

When it faces trouble, so do the suburbs. That's the situation right now as Detroit struggles to comply with a federal government lawsuit to bring Detroit's sewage treatment plant into compliance with anti-pollution regulations.

A series of rate increases for suburban customers has been taking place over recent months and now comes another. If U.S. Judge John Feikens gives his approval, it will mean on Jan. 1 hefty increases in suburban rates.

This is on top of hikes, which went into effect last week, of up to 25 percent. Before that, there were others.

Experts estimate if everything happens the way it appears to be heading, the suburbs will find Detroit water and sewage systems costing an average of 69 percent more come 1980 over 1978.

Robert Fredricks, chief deputy drain commissioner for Oakland County, told the Board of Detroit Water Commissioners at a recent public hearing that during the past 10 years increases to suburban communities have been "staggering."

Fredricks said wholesale sewage rates have jumped almost 1,000 percent since 1969. Since 1975, they increased more than 430 percent.

A family of four in the suburbs, says John Hubert, finance director for the Wayne County Board of Public Works, can expect to pay up to \$25 more next year for sewage treatment.

A similar family living in Detroit will see its bill increased from \$12 to \$16.

All of which is just one more of the joys of suburban living.

Winners try all the time

At luncheon the other day, the conversation turned to baseball and the absence of .400 hitters despite the fact that the ball game has been livened.

Although they never were plentiful there was a time when the Detroit Tigers boasted four hitters above the .400 mark. In this elite group were Ty Cobb, Harry Heilmann, Heinie Manush and Bob Fothergill, all of them outfielders.

At that time, Detroit was an envied team because it had a .400 hitter sitting on the bench. It had never happened before and it hasn't happened since.

The goal for the present day hitters now is .300 and if a player reaches that status he can demand a place with those in the high salary brackets.

IN THE MIST of the conversation, one of the chaps at the table cut in with, "What would our lives be like if we were judged on the same basis as the ball players?"

His question went unanswered for a few moments and then he explained, "don't forget that a .300 hitter is a fellow who comes through with a hit only one third of the time — even less than that."

"How far would we get in life if the best we could do was to succeed only one third of the time? We wouldn't last very long on any job. Yet, we glorify the batter who hits less than every third time at the plate."

He didn't mention any names, but it was plain that he was thinking of Rusty Staub, the Tigers designated hitter, who is striving to reach .300 and yet he collects \$200,000 a year and wanted his contract extended until 1984.

While this chap was explaining his stand, The Stroller recalled the days when he was a daily denison of the Tiger press box, noting the progress of the team and a discussion he had with "Wish" Eagen, the well respected scout for the Tigers.

WE WERE DISCUSSING the relative merits of the young outfielders and the shortstop prospects in which the Tigers were interested. As we peered over the lists, The Stroller noticed that one of the shortstop prospects had played errorless ball for the season on the farm club.

"He wouldn't be my choice," Eagen said, and The Stroller couldn't help asking, "Why?"

Geographic views

Michigan 51 years apart

During Michigan Week, I reported on unearthing a 1928 National Geographic Magazine article on "Michigan, Mistress of the Lakes." The modern state was pretty much in shape 51 years ago, and the changes have been marginal.

No sooner was this newspaper off the press than friends were saying, "Did you see the June National Geographic? An article on 'Michigan.' Naturally, they were interested in a comparison."

To tell the truth, I think the Geographic has changed more than Michigan has. But I'll get into that later.

Michigan's fur-trading history, its exhaustion of timber, its 19th century leap into mining, its 20th century leap into manufacturing, its magnificent recreation — anyone must write about those things in any year.

HERE'S WHAT is different:

- The 1928 map showed such stalwart towns as Birmingham, Rochester and Plymouth. They have been dropped from the 1979 map in favor of Livonia, Warren, Dearborn, East Lansing and Portage. I imagine a few noses are out of joint at that.

- The 1928 article calls Detroit a "city without slums." The new article gives a couple of columns and many pictures to a "crime-ridden, riot-torn pool of industrial pollution" and to "Motown's renaissance, symphony, dining out spots (one of the best towns in the country) and amateur theater."

- Dockside shots of a commercial lake trout catch in 1928 are replaced with dockside shots of sportsmen's coho and chinook salmon catches.

- Both articles note Michigan is an ethnic melting pot. The new one gives a couple of paragraphs to the white southerners who arrived in World War II (Ypsituckians, as we say in impolite society).

WHILE THE NEW Geographic is unafraid to deal with race relations and the PBB disaster, one thing bothers me about it.

The article by Noel Grove is entitled "The Two Worlds of Michigan." It refers to Detroit, with its race and poverty problems and its renaissance, and then all the rest of the state. There's a line about "Detroit's neighbors — Flint, Saginaw, Ypsilanti, Lansing, Kalamazoo" — as if they were suburbs.

Outstate Michigan is discussed in terms of Grand Rapids, the Holland Tulip Festival, the Traverse City Cherry Festival and then the wilderness. The new Geographic has an arty picture of Kalamazoo's downtown mall, but the 1928 magazine also had pictures of a paper mill, celery fields, and peppermint, not to mention Manistee's salt mines and Saginaw's sugarbeet fields and refineries.

Much of Michigan's great strength lies in its out-state cities, not just Detroit and Grand Rapids. If there were a way to measure culture in relation to population, I suspect Ann Arbor, Kalamazoo and Midland would far outshine Detroit.

He wrote not of war, but people caught up in it

If you are a cancer victim, you might not want to read "A Private Battle."

Then again, you might.

If you are a Cornelius Ryan fan, like me, "Battle" is a must.

Ryan authored three fabulous World War II volumes, each taking some six to eight years to research and write.

"The Longest Day" deals with June 6, 1944 when the Allied armada invaded Normandy. The book was later made into a magnificent film, with the screen play by Ryan.

His "The Last Battle" recounts the final weeks in Berlin and Hitler's demise.

"A Bridge Too Far" is a classic study of a major offensive, dubbed Market-Garden. A total disaster, it was to be a thrust through Holland into Germany, a master plan of British Field Marshal Montgomery.

Ryan has said he didn't write about wars, but rather the people who were caught up in them.

NOW COMES "A Private Battle," an unusual and absorbing work. It is co-authored by Ryan and his wife Kathryn, who, it turns out, was his constant associate in the production of the other books.

This one deals with the cancer which caused Ryan's death. The disease hit him as he turned 50, at the peak of his career. The Ryans had completed some four years of research for "Bridge." Its writing was about to begin.

But the project was delayed nearly a year as Ryan researched cancer, much as he had material for his books.

He interviewed experts in Europe and the United States, always hoping to stumble across a treatment which could arrest and cure the disease.

Kathryn was sympathetic to his quest. What she didn't realize was that her husband had begun to keep secret notes and tapes on all facets of this deadly experience.

AS THE CANCEROUS CELLS gradually took over his body, Ryan led the frantic effort to pull together the thousands of pieces of research and get "Bridge" done.

Ryan suffered greatly. Apparently his sheer de-

termination to complete "Bridge," plus the unending devotion and help from Kathryn are what kept him alive.

Only a few months after the job was finished, in November of 1975, Ryan died.

Some weeks later, as Kathryn and Ryan's secretary Anne Bardenhagen were sorting through Ryan's personal belongings, they came across the tapes.

Thus was born the idea for "A Private Battle." Ryan's secret tapes and notes prove absorbing from two standpoints.

They tell what a cancer victim feels while he battles for his life. There are the indignities — and kindnesses — of the medical profession. And the tapes relate many behind-the-scenes happenings as "Bridge" was being fashioned.

THE METHOD OF PRESENTING "Battle" is interesting. Under "Cornelius" comes excerpts of his tapes. This is followed with "Kathryn" as she recounts her memories of that period.

Here is a sample:
CORNELIUS

"This is Saturday, February 24, 1973.

"For nearly 10 months I have been on estrogen therapy. I have suspected for almost a month now that the estrogen was no longer working. Three days ago (Dr.) Willet Whitmore confirmed my fears. Cancer has overridden the treatment once again.

"My legs, where the pain is mostly concentrated, feel as if they are made of rubber. At times I am almost afraid to stand in case they cannot support me.

"I am afraid to take pain-killers during the day. I need an absolutely clear mind in order to work on the book. I am finding that the more intensely I concentrate on Market-Garden, the less pain I feel."

KATHRYN:

"He stubbornly refused to take Percodan for relief. Daily the pain continued. It no longer racked him from late afternoon and through the night. By then it was a constant presence he fought doggedly against, even as he turned out more handwritten pages daily than he had ever done before."

THROUGH ALL THIS, and a number of hospital stays, the Ryans refused to let down in the project of wrapping up "Bridge."

Ryan's hallmark was his research. He and his wife conducted hundreds of interviews with people involved in the battles about which they wrote. They talked to soldiers, generals and civilians. In this way they amassed thousands of first-hand experiences, complete with remembered comments spoken at the time of the action.

Ryan books are laced with quotes of people who were there. It's a technique that makes history come alive; Cornelius Ryan was a master of it.

Sheer heroics of people almost certain to die were often topped with humor. When death looked a soldier straight in the eye, he might toss off a line befitting a Bob Hope.

In a glider drop during Market-Garden, German anti-aircraft fire turned the sky black. One fragile ship continued to head steadily for its appointed landing zone as others around it were being destroyed in flames.

Dutch civilians in the fields were so joyed at seeing that lone Allied glider keep coming, they ignored the German fire and stood waving at the aircraft. With their fingers they signaled "V for Victory."

One glider-borne soldier yelled to his buddies, "Hey, look, they're giving two-to-one odds we won't make it."

Such antics appeared to have helped Ryan through the ordeal of completing "Bridge." And thank goodness for that.

NOT LONG AFTER "Bridge" had been published, I was in Europe ready to head home. I long had anticipated Ryan's latest book and was anxious to devour it, much as I had his two previous war volumes.

As you might recall, the bridge that couldn't be captured from the Germans was in the city of Arnhem.

Fate had me flying from Amsterdam on a Dutch Airlines plane. As I scurried toward the loading gate, I spied a rack of books, "A Bridge Too Far." I quickly purchased a copy.

This would be my reading during the seven-hour flight home.

While boarding the plane, I notice on the ship's fuselage its name, *The City of Arnhem*. I blinked and felt a little chill.

In minutes we were in the air, gently circling into the flight pattern. I sat quietly in my seat, the copy of *Bridge* in my lap, looking at the Dutch countryside.

Speaking to myself, I said, "Down there, not many miles away, is where it all happened."

Reading "Bridge" that day was one of my life's most memorable experiences.

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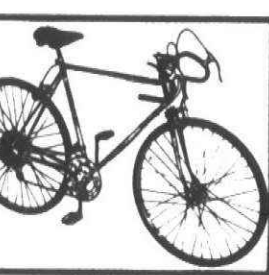
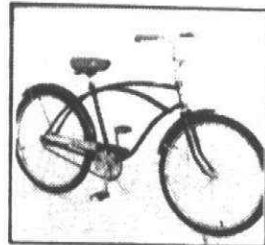
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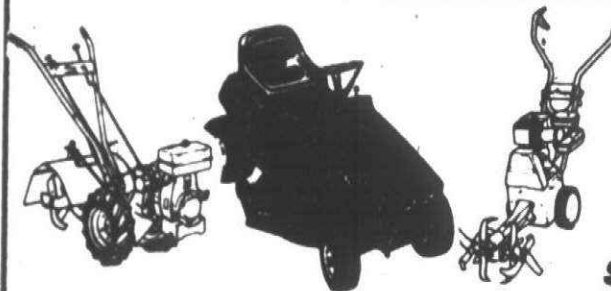
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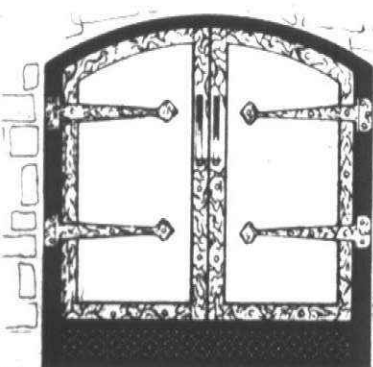
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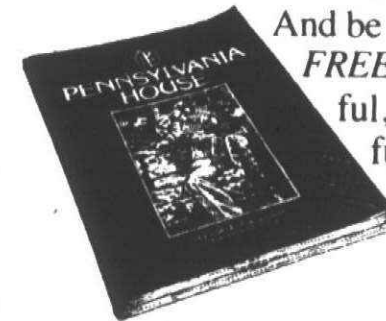
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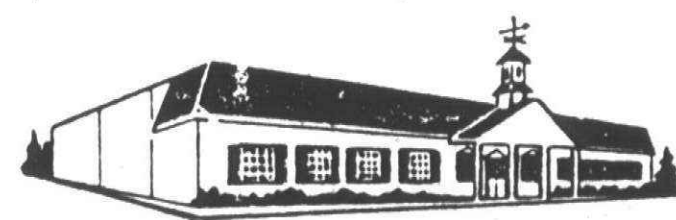
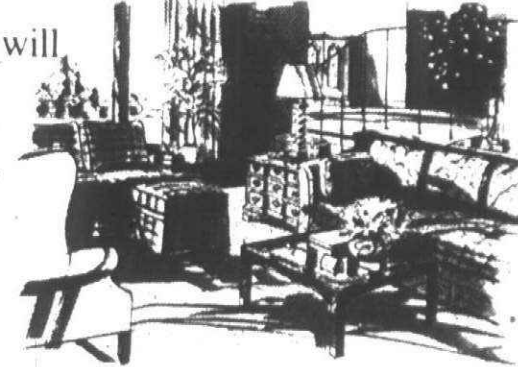


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Plymouth — Past & Present

Good ole days?

One of my recent columns included a reference to Czar Penney who owned a livery stable on S. Main Street at the turn of the century.

The Penneys were apparently fond of the unusual name, Czar. They named a daughter Czarina.

Czarina Penney is one of the little girls in the photo. She is in the front row, carrying the parasol. Beside her is Madeline Bennett (Wood). In the second row are Camilla Ladd and Norma Baker (Cassady). In the third row, behind Norma, is Carrol Adams, the only boy in the class. He had long curls, just like the girls, but notice his derby-like hat.

The picture was taken in 1897 when the population of the village of Plymouth was about 1,300. The children were members of a private kindergarten class. Nursery schools, and kindergarten classes in public schools, had not yet made their appearance in the Plymouth area.

The class met at the First Presbyterian Church, but the photo was taken in front of the high school, just across Church Street.

The teacher, standing at the right, is Martha Williams. She was one of several Williams girls who taught. The girls are dressed so much alike that they appear to be in uniform. The walk they

are standing on is made of boards.

ANOTHER PHOTOGRAPH shows Miss Anna Smith's third grade class in Plymouth elementary school, circa 1900. Miss Smith taught here for 40 years, serving in four different school buildings located on the same site.

The girl in the front row (fourth from the left) is Norma Baker (Cassady). The boy in the back row (seventh from the right) is Walter Ebert, who lives on Farmer Street in Plymouth. Ebert worked at the local roundhouse for the Pere Marquette Railroad for 43 years, retiring in 1954. For 20 years, Ebert was a foreman at the roundhouse, in charge of repairing steam locomotives.

One interesting feature of the picture is the number of children Miss Smith had in her class — a total of 61. That is more than three times the average number of pupils in one of today's classes.

There was a difference, however. In Miss Smith's day, a teacher could count on the support of parents if she had any difficulty with any of the children. The rule then was: "If you got a spanking at school, you got another one when you got home." Today if you chastise a child in school, even justifiably, you may expect a visit from a lawyer, or from an angry parent threatening to punch you in the nose.

Note the Lord Fauntleroy collars on some of the boys, and the suspenders on others. Several of the boys are wearing the high-button jackets typical of the Edwardian period.

IF YOU THINK Anna Smith had a problem managing 61 pupils, consider the working conditions of those who taught in Plymouth in 1916, right after

the high school burned and before the replacement for it was completed.

The school was destroyed on March 30, 1916 — not, as some residents thought, by German sympathizers, but because of a problem in the furnace room. During the remainder of 1916, and part of 1917, classes were conducted at several temporary locations in the village.

These included: John Gale's store at the corner of Main and Penniman Avenue where the National Bank of Detroit now is located; the Christian Science Church, then at the corner of Main and Dodge Streets; the Knights of Pythias Hall, the building on Amelia Street that later housed Millard's bugle factory; and, Mrs. Kate Allen's carriage house

on Penniman Avenue.

It must have been difficult to keep the attention of the students at all of the temporary locations, but the conditions under which the teacher worked at Mrs. Allen's carriage house were especially adverse, as the final photograph indicates.

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

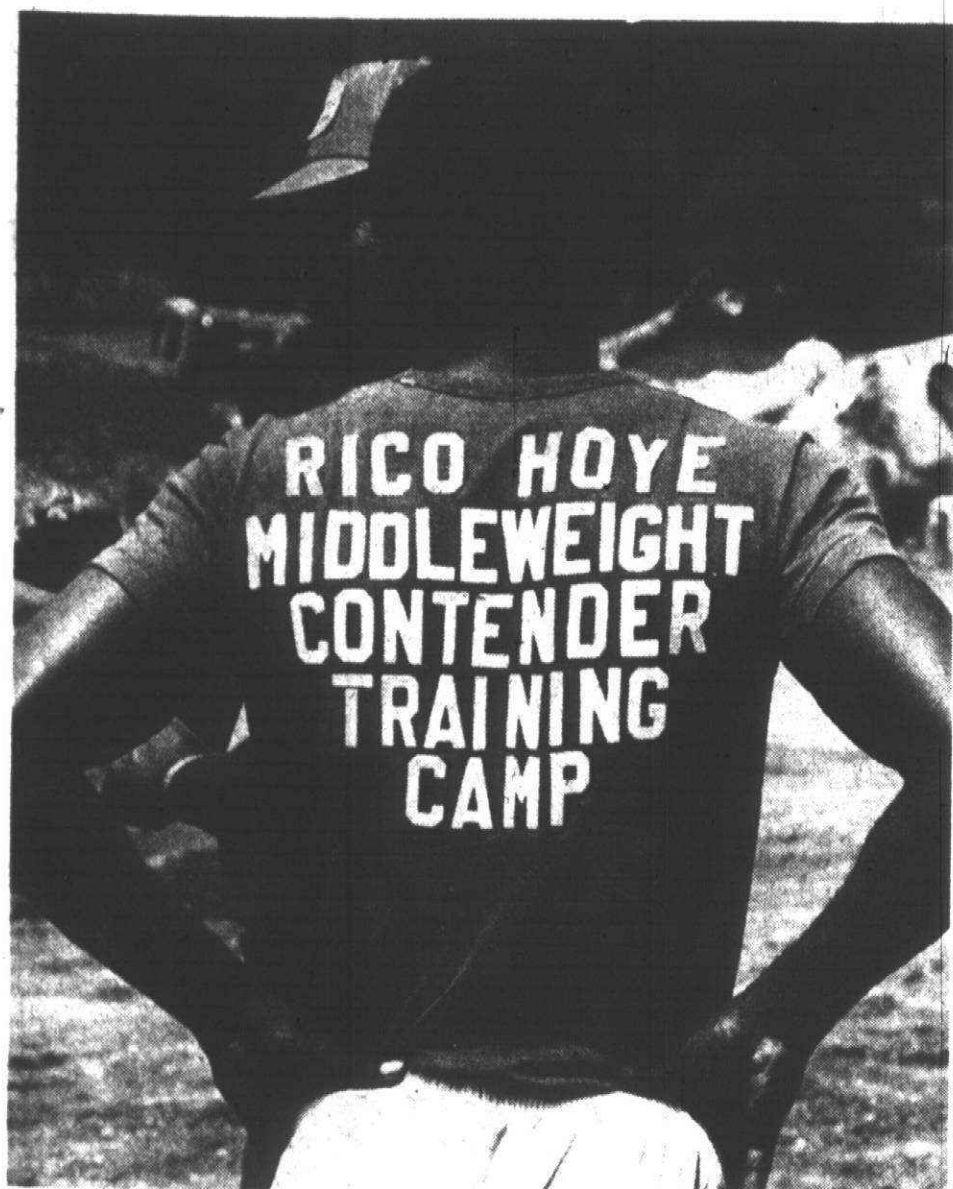

Rico Hoyer of Detroit will continue his comeback effort Thursday night at the Center Stage Nightclub in Canton Township.

The middleweight boxing contender is on the double main event when he tangles with Sammy Floyd of Bay City in a scheduled 10-rounder. In a six-round junior middleweight bout, unbeaten Nathaniel Akbar of Detroit will take on Willie Brown of Akron, Ohio.

Six bouts are on tap for the third "Olympia Fights" at the Canton nightclub. The first bout starts at 8 p.m.

Hoyer, 25, boasting a 31-2-1 mark, has been training vigorously for the past five weeks at the Real Life Farm and Day Camp in Canton Township owned by Jim Frazier.

The Detroit middleweight, who will weigh in at 160 pounds when he fights, is being trained and managed by the veteran Al DeNapoli, who has been in involved with boxing since the 1930's.

DeNapoli trained light-heavyweight world champ Bob Foster during his glory days in the late 1960's. DeNapoli has a lot of faith in his current project — the sleek and powerful Hoyer.

"Rico can fight for the middleweight title and win it," said DeNapoli. "He's been coming on strong. Rico has more ability than 90 percent of the boxers today."

The Real Life Farm, complete with horses, goats, ducks and sheep, provides a tranquil atmosphere which is perfect for boxers, according to DeNapoli.

"THIS IS A beautiful place," he said. "This is the ideal place for fighters. The atmosphere is peaceful and the air is good."

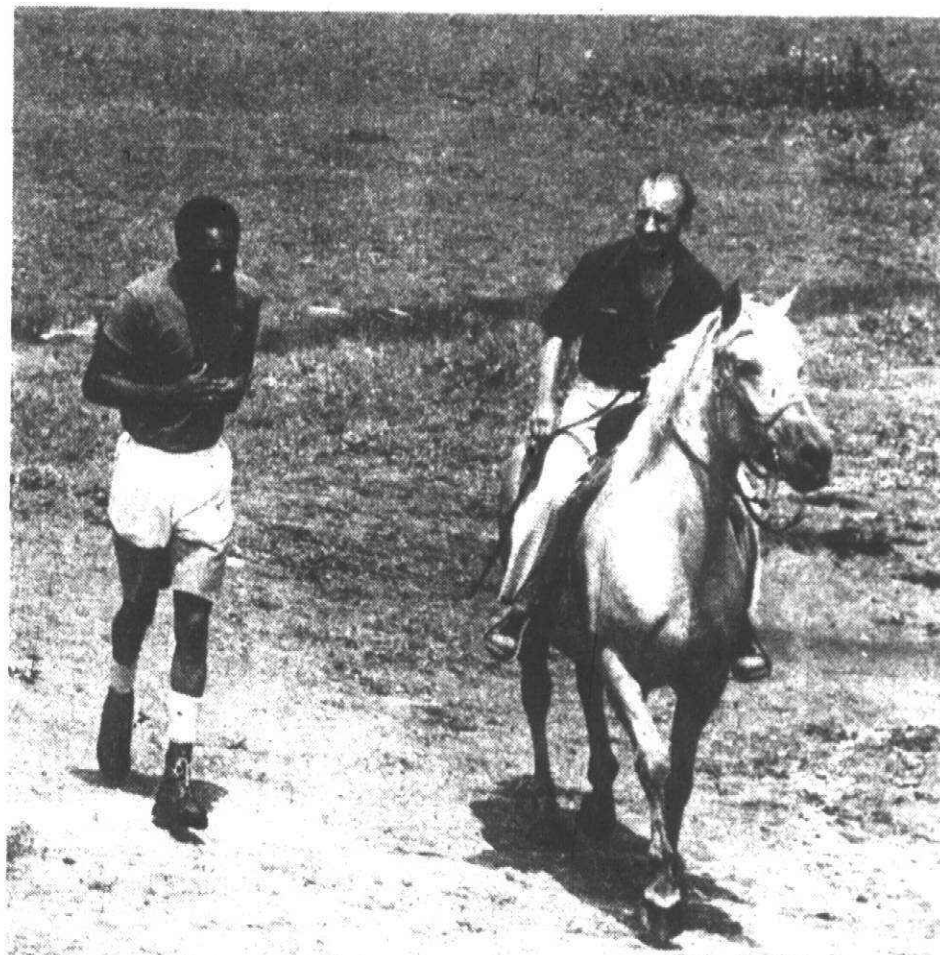
"My boxers can chop wood here, do their roadwork and relax without social problems."

"A training camp is confined but that's what is needed. A boxer is around people he enjoys. A place like this strengthens your heart."

"This is a place where world champs are made."

Hoyer has been training under DeNapoli for almost a year. The Detroit boxer has won his last seven fights since suffering a broken ankle when he was playing touch football.

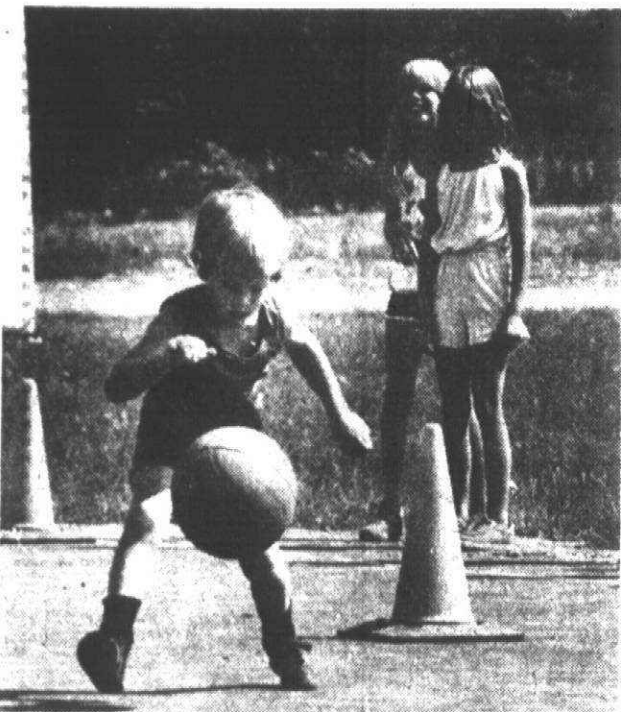

There is something entirely unexpected happening in the bowling world and if the present trend continues, it won't be long before the number of sanctioned bowlers in the women's ranks will outnumber those of the men.

In the latest membership figures, released last week by the Women's International Bowling Congress, there were 4,206,165 women bowling in 146,441 leagues last season. These are close to the figures due to come from the American Bowling Congress within the next few weeks.

The trend is showing itself in the Detroit area where the women boast close to 130,000 members and are only a few thousand short of the men's membership.

This is true in the outstate areas, too. In Bay City, as an example, the sanctioned women bowlers now outnumber the men and the women are also gaining rapidly on the men in Saginaw.

THE DETROIT women did themselves proud in the WIBC sanctioned competition, according to the official results released over the weekend.

The Detroit Express team, captained by Penny Behn, landed in fifth place in the team game competition with an 1135, but topped the nation in the team series category with a 3258. Anita Cantaline and her Jac-Ro team landed third with 3190 and Cora Flebig's Luxury Lanes team landed with 3156. The Bonanza No. 2 team took over ninth place with a 3105.

That gave the Detroit area women four of the top 10 places in the nation and by far the best showing of any city in the country.

In the ranks of the 300 shooters Michigan placed three. Gerry Beattie, of the Detroit All-Star leagues landed on the list with Lorraine Carroll, of Grand Rapids, and Mary Mills, of Saline.

JOE NORRIS, considered by many as the best bowler ever turned out of Detroit, is still going strong

despite his 71 years.

Now a resident of San Diego, Calif., he recently posted an 1875 count in the all-events of the state tournament. He had 635 in the team event, 628 in the doubles and 612 in the singles.

Among the veteran bowlers still campaigning in the Detroit area Joe Paulus, a former president of both the Detroit and National Bowling Proprietors associations, recently rolled games of 258, 290 and 257 for an 805 series that established an all time record in the Detroit Athletic Club League.

JIM JESSON joined the coveted ranks of the 700 shooters last week in the summer league at Westland Bowl. He put together games of 225, 266 and 234 for a 725. In the same league, Larry Williams had a 255 in 613.

BEV ROSE, a 130 average bowler, ran up a 486 count in the Guys and Dolls League at Woodland Lanes. She had games of 191, 137 and 158. Keith Zlonkebiz, a 149 average bowler, fashioned a 226 game and Keith Sanders, with an average of 186, had a 236 in 609.

GERRY DYKE never has time to throw a practice ball, but he rolled the high game in the senior citizens league at Plymouth Bowl. He rolled a 235 game to take the honor while Stanley Stock took high series with a 597.

In the Monday league at Plaza Lanes Linn Reid posted a 172 average for the season to top all rivals. Jo and Verne Ballard captured the Class D championship. Husband Verne finished the last few weeks with an injured leg, but his wife, Jo, went on bowl both high game and high series.

To top things off Elmer Newman bowled a 613 series which was the only double century series bowled in either league. This was his second year in the league and it was a prestigious year as he became the lone bowler who could reach the coveted 600 circle.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 1700.1 OF CHAPTER 98 OF TITLE VIII, BUILDING REGULATIONS, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH

THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

Section 1. Section 1700.1 of Chapter 98, Title VIII of the Plymouth City Code is hereby amended as follows:

1700.1 Agency Designated. Pursuant to the provisions of the Michigan Plumbing Code, which consists of the IFOCA Basic Plumbing Code, 1978 edition, the plumbing official of the City of Plymouth is hereby designated as the enforcing agency to discharge the responsibilities of the City of Plymouth under Act 230 of the Public Acts of 1972, State of Michigan. The City of Plymouth hereby assumes responsibility for the administration and enforcement of said Act through its corporate limits.

Section 2. This ordinance shall become operative and effective on the 24th day of July A.D. 1979.

Made, passed and adopted by the City Commission of the City of Plymouth, Michigan, this 2nd day of July A.D. 1979.

Livonia crushed Wendy's with a six-run outburst during the third inning. The big hit of the rally was a two-run double by Sergison.

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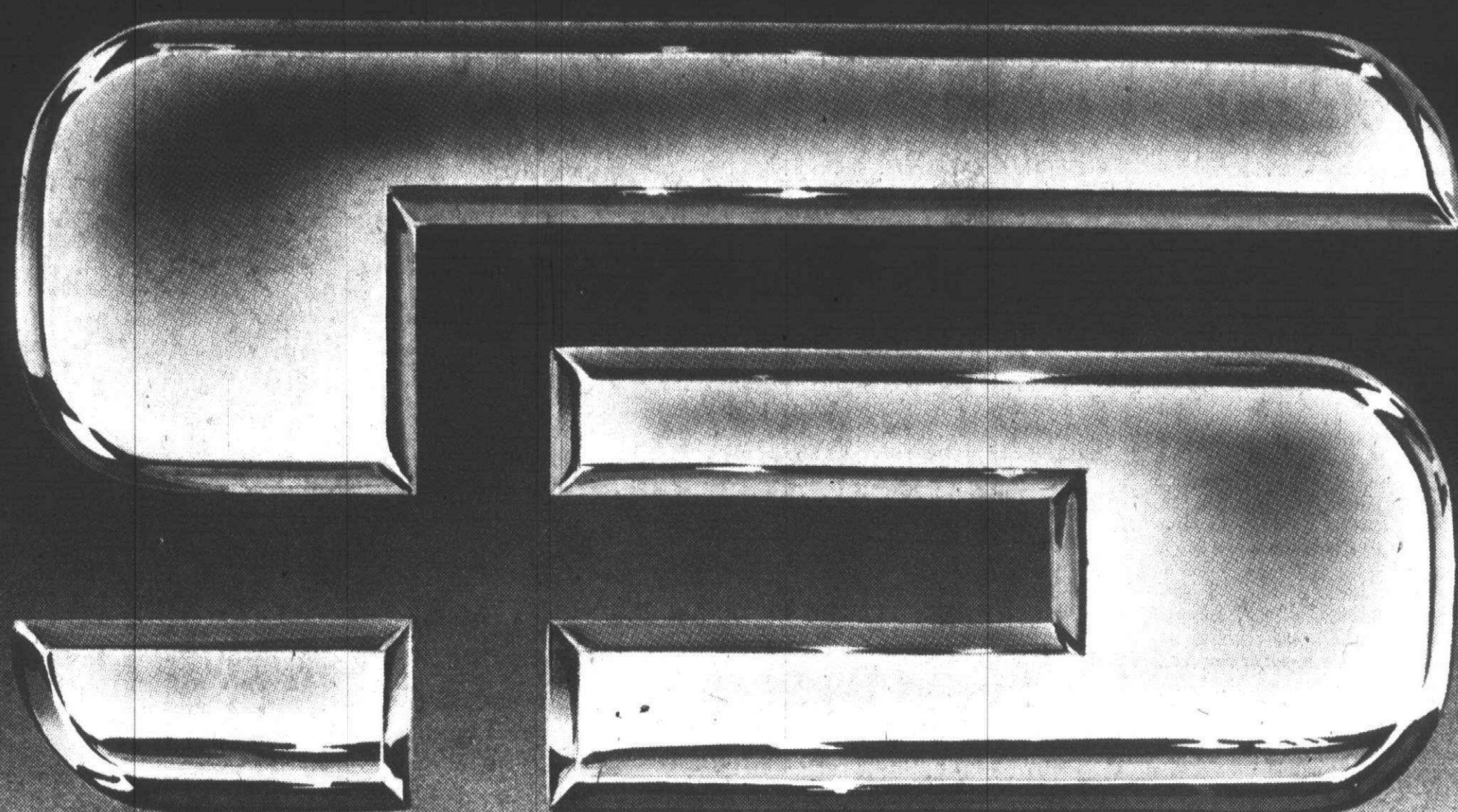
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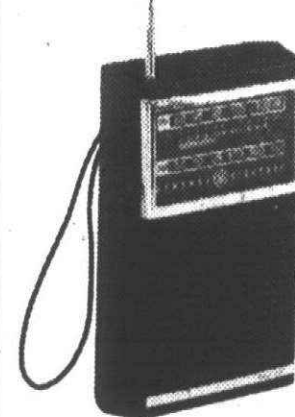

It's Christmas in July for local glass-blower

Don Schneider's heroes are some unknown Egyptians who lived more than 4,000 years ago and Joseph Locke. Schneider is a craftsman, an artist whose medium is glass.

His voice is filled with awe and enthusiasm when he speaks of those Egyptians who mastered the art of combining six or seven colors of glass so many years ago. The process today requires an artisan with vast technical knowledge of temperatures and stresses.

"They formed them on sand molds and cooled them in hot sands," said Schneider. "They are absolutely beautiful. How did they do it?"

His other hero, Joseph Locke, was an English glass designer who worked in both England and United States. He was the master artist whose excellence in design and color has never been duplicated. His pieces are priceless and can be seen in museums.

SCHNEIDER'S studio is in his house on Deer Street in Plymouth. As he blows crystal clear Christmas tree ornaments, he reveals his fascination with glass as an art medium.

"Gravity is the best friend and the worst enemy of the glass blower," he said as he twirled a glass rod in the flame of a water-cooled torch. "It works with you and against you all the time."

He said the rods have been prepared beforehand. One end has been closed and a starter bubble formed.

"Blowing glass is just like blowing up a balloon. Unless you stretch a section to get it started, you can blow your brains out and nothing will give."

When he judges the glass has reached the right temperature, he removes it from the flame and — still twirling — puts the open end of the tube in his mouth and blows.

"GLASS IS A very poor conductor of heat so there is no danger of burning

your mouth," he explained as he melted, then twisted the molten glass at one end of the glass ball.

Pressing the glass against the metal section of the torch, he flattened and smoothed the bottom of ball.

Using a pair of tweezers, he picked up a small piece of colored glass from his work table. He held it in front of the flame and attached the almost flowing fragment to the exterior of the ball. Then, holding the ball in the flame, he used an awl-like tool to push the color toward the center of the ball.

The glass skin stretched and held, leaving a trumpet-like indentation. He repeated the colored glass insertions several times. A few twirls of the ball in the flame and all cloudiness inside the sphere disappeared.

The open end of the tube was melted off and smoothed and the ornament was ready for its silver or gold filigree hanger. The delicate blown glass bauble reflected a myriad colors.

Although each Christmas ornament is a thing of beauty, Don Schneider is prouder of his paper weights, pitchers, vases, bowls and glass tumblers. He uses his creations throughout his home. Even his belt buckles are made of glass.

SCHNEIDER SAID he was very pleased with public reaction to the blown glass ornaments. "They have been accepted by the very best gift shops." He does not sell pieces from his home, nor does he attend arts and crafts shows. He does have two partners whose hobby is glass design.

Greg Green is an engineer and Mark Keuman is an area supervisor for Taco Bell. Both share his love of working with glass.

Schneider started out as a music major, earning degrees in music theory, brass group and music education. He taught music at the Friends School in Detroit and in the Ann Arbor Schools.

He was interested in crafts and tried his hand at rug hooking. He was doing

some rug hooking at Greenfield Village and the Henry Ford museum and visited the other craftsmen. As he watched a glassblower at work he said he would like to learn how to do it.

He was encouraged to try his hand and soon signed up for a class. That was the beginning of his love affair with glass.

He became a student of the history of glass. He visited glass plants, museums and the Smithsonian Institution.

"The Toledo Museum has a fine collection," he said. Schneider learned that early glass blowers and makers were confined to islands. None were allowed to escape and reveal their glass-making secrets.

Glass blowers were entertainers at one period of history. Their movements and the rhythm of their actions were related to music and they sang as they worked.

DURING THE Bicentennial year, he was a glass blower at the Henry Ford Museum and sometimes the village.

He recalled a strange happening one day at the museum.

"This chunky kid, 8 or 10 years old, was watching me. I heard him say, 'Gee, I'd like to do that some day.' It was the strangest sensation. I could remember watching the glassblower at the museum and saying the very same words.

"There he was, chunky like I was, wearing the same kind of glasses. It could have been me 20 years ago."

One day a man was looking over the glass exhibits and watching him work. He spoke with some knowledge of glass and mentioned Joseph Locke's work. After some conversation, he said he was Locke's grandson, Kenny Locke.

Schneider couldn't believe it. "But we went over to the glass exhibit and

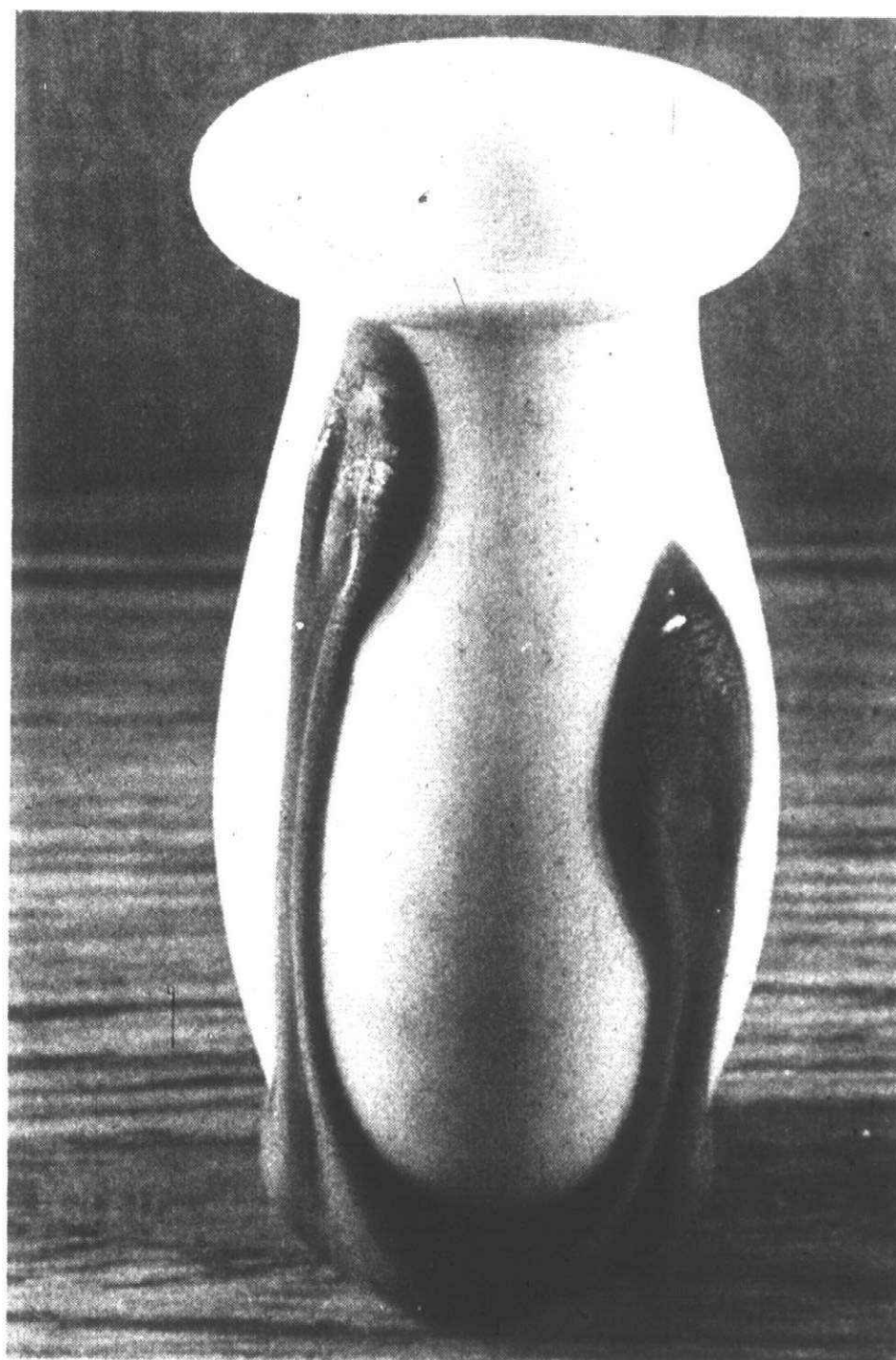

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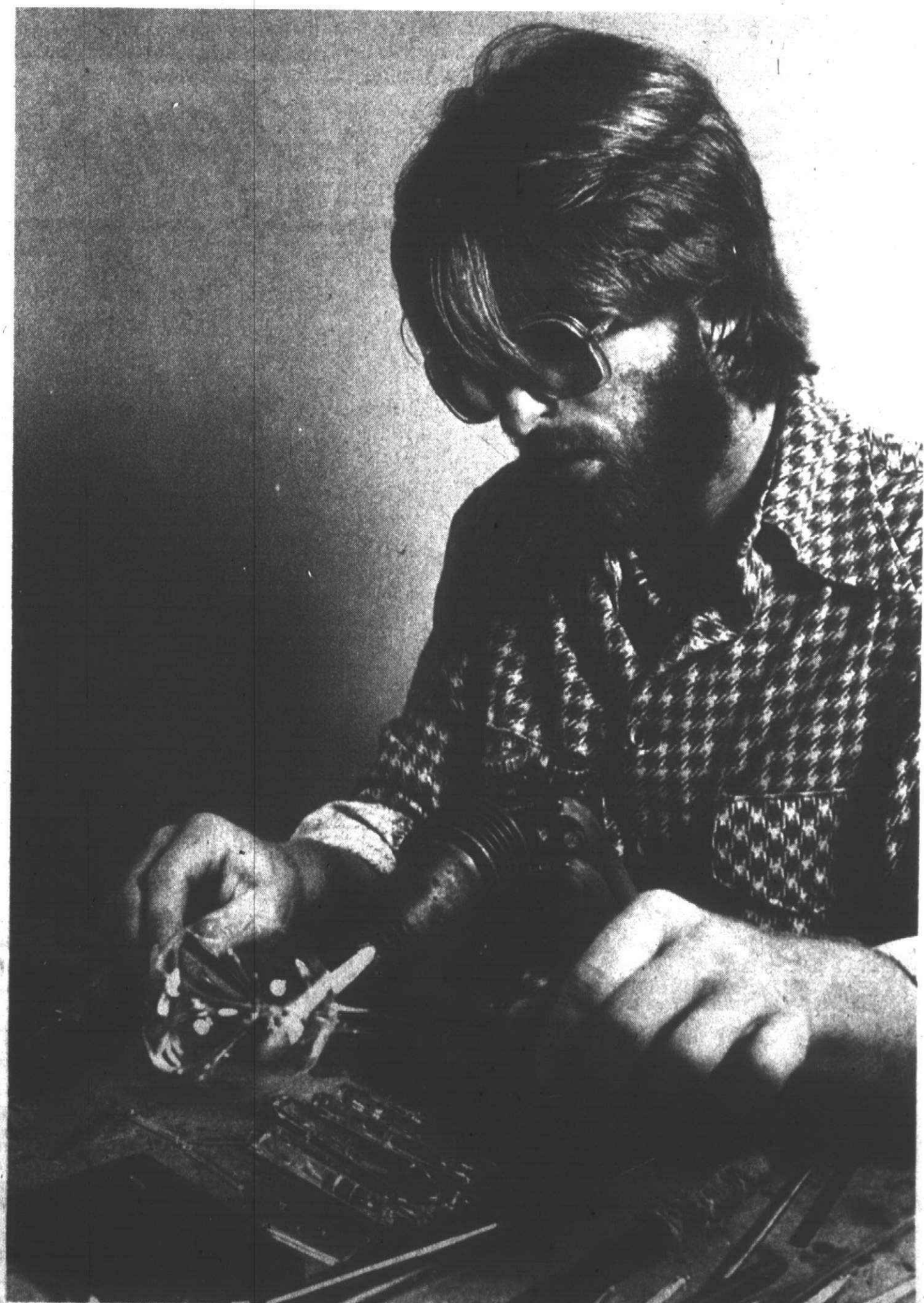


The white glass vase is decorated with silver nitrate pulls.

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Arcade Mirror Works carries on tradition

Bob Sigmon is just 23 years old but his one-man business bears an old and prestigious name. The Arcade Mirror Works has been on Joy Road in Plymouth Township only eight months. But for 50 years before that, it was on 12th Street at St. Antoine in Detroit. And before that, the Arcade Mirror Works was in Ohio, where it was founded. Sigmon had never heard of the cold pour silvering process for mirrors until a little more than a year ago. A friend of his mother had taken an antique mirror downtown to be re-silvered. Bob

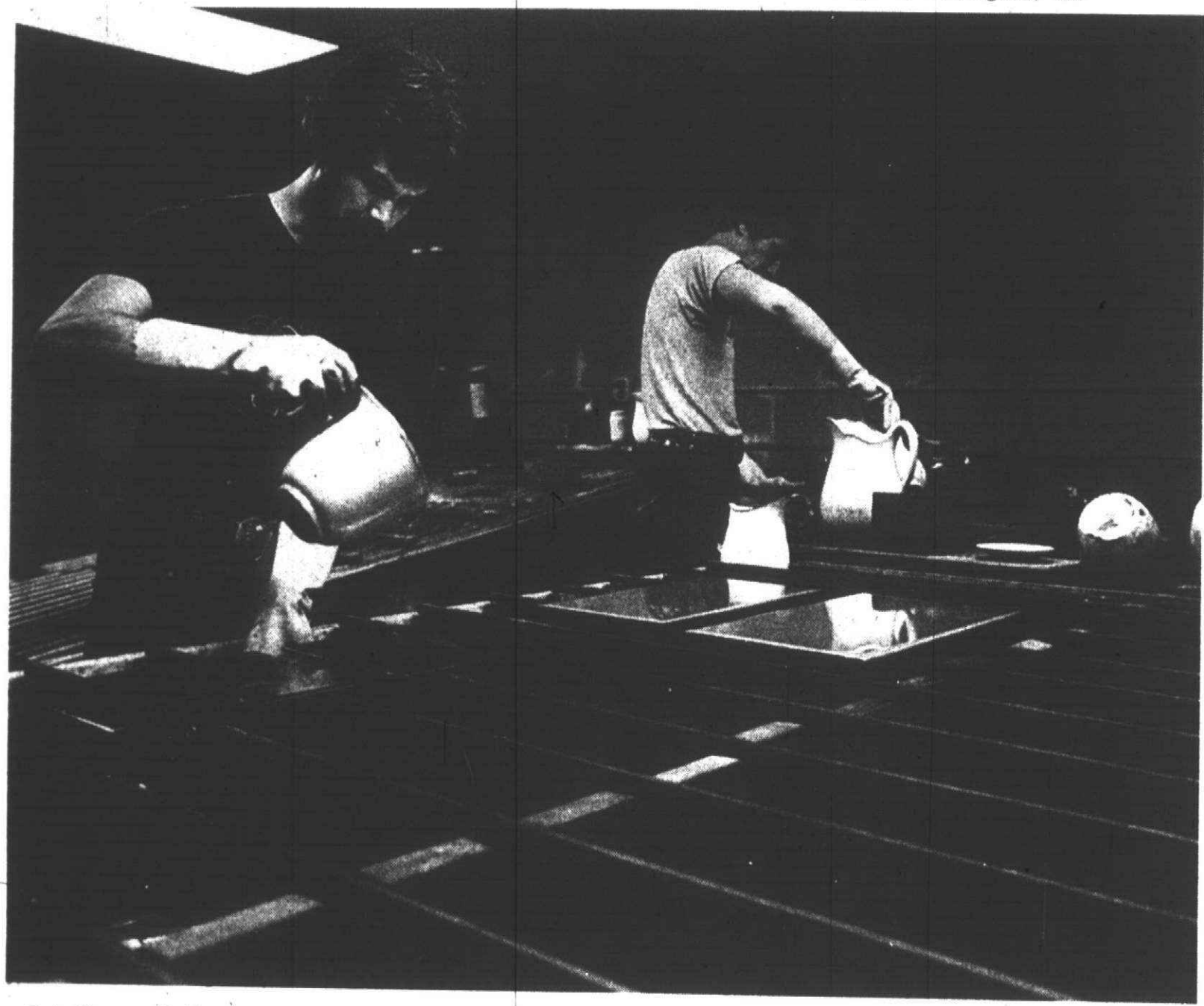
was recuperating from an automobile accident and he accompanied her. The friend was lamenting because this would be the end of an era. The Arcade was going to close down and there would be no other plant in the state that could re-silver those thick beveled edged mirrors in antique dressers, buffets and writing desks. Making mirrors had become a mass production process — 30 feet a minute. With the closing of arcade, the hand process would become a lost art.

MEL WEIGHILL, owner of Arcade, was past retirement age. He had taken over the business his father-in-law, a Mr. Martin, had started many years ago. Sigmon was fascinated by the old plant and its owner. He spent days and weeks with him learning the process. After he had bought the business and moved everything to Joy Road, Weighill came out and worked with him for the first month. Since then, he has been on his own. "There they are," said Sigmon, "the

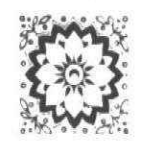
same chamois, the same formulas Mr. Martin experimented with until he found the right ones." He also uses the same granite and china pitchers used by the founder. "They are just right for pouring. This

one is all patched up. I hope it stays together because it could not be replaced." The mirrors he receives for re-silvering are pocked and scarred. Many are cut in unusual shapes and most are

made of thick glass with beveled edges. "If people would just remove the mirrors from the frames when they are refinishing furniture, they would save themselves a lot of grief," said Sigmon (Continued on page 9C)

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Jewish couple recounts bitter life in Russia

Arno Sosenky displayed little bitterness when he discussed his 10 years in Russian labor camps before members of the Sisterhood of the Livonia Jewish Congregation.

But the anger is there nonetheless. When questioned in an interview, he said quickly: "I was angry. Of course I was angry. You are always angry when you are imprisoned for no reason. I am still angry."

With his wife, Celia, the 70-year-old Sosenky was trying to convey to women who had spent their lives in the United States something of what it meant to live in Russia from the '30s to the '70s.

Although teachers, politics, war and a totalitarian society kept them from living life in an ivory tower. They met following World War II and after Sosenky's second imprisonment. They have two children.

A year ago the family was reunited as they all settled in the same U.S. city, something not even enjoyed by most Americans.

Their hometown is Oak Park. The couple still is teaching. Sosenky teaches Russian and German at the Oak Park branch of the Jewish Community Center. His wife has been an instructor at Wayne County Community College. It delights her to have something to do.

"I go to my class as to a holiday," she said. "All my life I worked."

The Sosenkys' lives were typical of many who lived in Europe at a time of territorial grabs and wars.

Of Russian-Jewish parentage, Sosenky grew up in Germany, but left in 1933 when the Nazis came to power. It was a wise move. Only 18 of a Jewish population of about 25,000 were left in his home city after the war.

The family went to Russia, where Sosenky worked for a newspaper and did radio broadcasts. But the fact that he had spent so much time in Germany aroused the interest of the Russian secret police. Before long he was sentenced to three years in a labor camp without a trial.

"Physically and morally it was a very hard time for me," said Sosenky.

"I had to cut wood and dig."

MRS. SOSENKY meanwhile was growing up in Roumania, which had been annexed by the Soviet Union. Like other Roumanians she became a reluctant Soviet citizen. She also became a teacher.

"When World War II came I was living with my parents," she explained. "We had to evacuate our home. As we were leaving my father took off his straw hat and waved to our house. He said we'd be back in six months. It was eight years before we came back."

Her husband spent the war in a labor battalion building airdromes and roads. "Formally we were soldiers, but in fact there were the same practices and suffering as in the labor camp."

When the war was over he took a job teaching at the college level. But in 1948 began a campaign against the Jews because of a supposed plot of Jewish doctors to kill Stalin.

"It was also the time when everything Russian had to be better than anything from the west," Sosenky said.

He then made two mistakes. He told someone he liked Beethoven better than Tchaikovsky. He also mentioned that the Austrian coat he had purchased was a very satisfactory coat.

Those were two of the accusations in his trial, along with an accusation of Zionism. It was enough for a 10-year sentence in Siberia.

"YOU CAN imagine it was a very, very hard time for me," he told the Sisterhood members.

"We were building a city at a place where they had found oil. It was a very cold area. But this time I worked as a bookkeeper, so it was easier for me. The food was bad and you only got bread when you fulfilled the norm (quota.) There were times the prisoners were so hungry they ate grass."

Hardened criminals shared the camp with the political prisoners. On one occasion one of these men swiped Sosenky's monthly ration of sugar out of his pocket. On another occasion he closely missed death.

That brush came when he opened a barracks door and found a man dead on the floor in front of him. The criminal types had decided to kill the next person to walk through the door. Sosenky missed being that person by only a minute or two.

While he did not experience anti-Semitism during his first imprisonment in the '30s, he felt it strongly during his second sentence.

"It became worse and worse," he said. "If a Jew wanted better work he would never get it."

Sosenky was released after only seven years for good behavior.

"My husband forgot to tell you," interjected his wife, "that three years after he was released he got a paper which apologized (about the imprisonment) and said he was innocent."

It is her belief her husband lived through the camps because of his love for music.

"He survived thanks to his ability to transform himself into another world," she pointed out. "He could listen to Beethoven in his mind so he supported

himself spiritually. And any support was a help. Life was a hard struggle."

MRS. SOSENKY was critical of food shortages in Russia.

"You can't buy food for more than a week," she said. "You can only buy one chicken at a time. After 60 years of Soviet power, they haven't been able to resolve the problem of feeding their own people."

Leaving Russia was not an easy matter, according to the speakers. "It took a year and a half until we had all the documents needed to make an application," said Sosenky. "When our son applied to leave, he was fired from his position as a teacher of physics."

However, when the Sosenkys applied they continued to receive their pensions until the time they left the country. They followed their son to Oak Park with their daughter and son-in-law.

"You have to be happy living in such a wonderful country," noted Mrs. Sosenky. "Here it is not perfect. You have your negative sides. But in comparison with other countries it's good."

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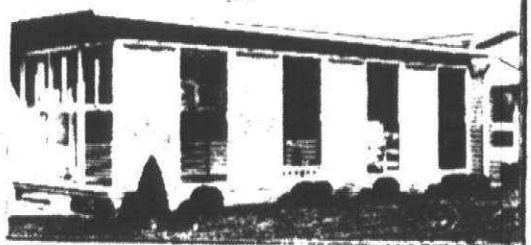
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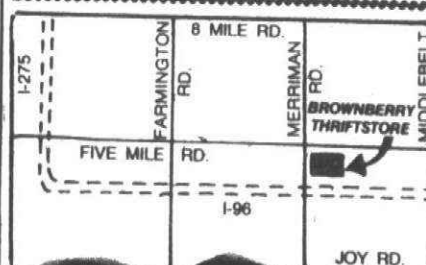

"They had pictures of him in his stained leather apron. When he was experimenting, he'd use anything he could find around the house. They said he'd even use peanut butter."

Schneider's sense of history adds to

his pleasure of working in the old house on Deer Street.

"You know this was the village cobbler's house many year's ago. When his first wife died, he remarried and had five or six more children. Velda, the youngest daughter of his second family, married a Dr. Kelly and this workroom was part of his office."

As he plies the ancient craft of glass blowing, the 30-year-old craftsman and the old house seem in harmony — a perfectly natural combination.

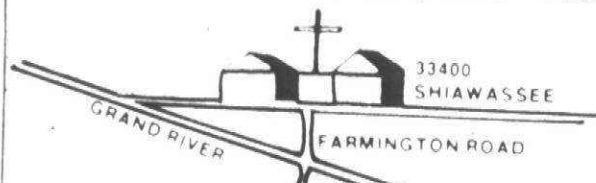

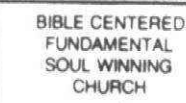

as he displayed a mirror marred by stripping compound or some refinishing tool.

FIRST STEP in the re-silvering process is the removal of original coat.

"It has to be stripped by hand. The glass has to be absolutely clean." After loosening the paint and silver, he washes it clean and the sediment is caught in a holding tank.

Because 100 per cent silver is used, the residue is saved for recycling.

The surface of the glass is polished

with a buffing compound then washed down with distilled water. It is then washed with a tin solution to sensitize the glass.

"The side to be silvered cannot be touched," said Sigmon as he moved to the next tank.

Pouring a tin precipitant into a pitcher containing the silver, he then poured the solution over the glass. It looked like clear water, but the glass soon acquired a silvery glow.

"The first coat has to set for two minutes," he explained. He waited the allotted time then washed it with more distilled water before pouring more sil-

ver from the pitcher. Drippings from this stage of the process also are saved so the silver can be recycled.

WHEN THE TWO coats of silver have been applied, it's difficult to distinguish which side has been silvered. Both sides reflect images.

Because, the young craftsman explained, "this is 100 per cent silver and would tarnish just like silverware when exposed to the air," the coating has to be sealed from the air.

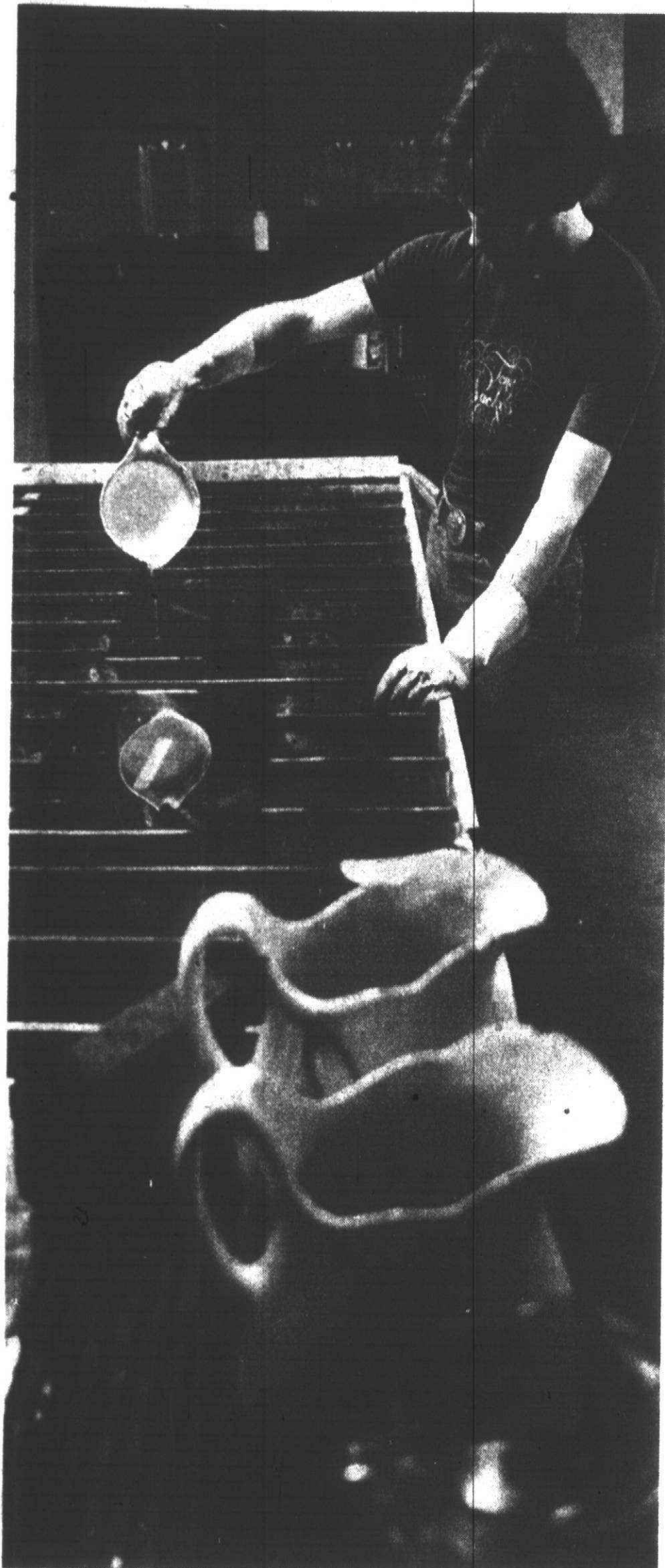
He first applies a coat of special varnish that will not react with the silver. When this is dry, a coat of grey

paint backing is applied.

Final step is removing any paint or varnish the glass surface has acquired over the years. The glass is then buffed, polished, wrapped and ready for pickup.

He promises to have mirrors re-silvered within one week of the day they have been dropped off at his shop. He does not pick up or deliver.

He has extended his business to silk screening on glass which he then backs with silver. These are decorator pieces for homes and offices and each is special ordered.

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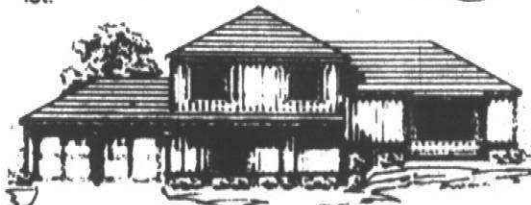


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Great for 'bibliophiles'

Little Professor shows how to franchise

If you want to go into business for yourself, one way of making the venture a little less scary is to consider a franchise operation.

This year, almost a half-million businesses in the U.S. will be franchises. This is an increase of more than 25,000 from 1978, according to the U.S. Department of Commerce.

A Livonia-based company, Little Professor Book Centers, Inc., will have a part in this growth. The company has increased its franchise outlets more than twofold in the past two years.

There are now 125 Little Professor Book Centers in 36 states, and 15 more are in the works. States which have the most are Michigan, Ohio and Florida.

In 1978, franchising encompassed 32 percent of all retail sales.

LITTLE PROFESSOR is a good example of why franchises are becoming more popular.

The company gives advice whenever its franchisees run into problems. In addition, it provides, through computers, a variety of services an individual could not hope to emulate without a great deal of hard work.

It also has a division, Book Distributors, which has a warehouse stocking thousands of titles ready for immediate shipment. The company offices and headquarters are at 33200 Capitol.

Bibliophiles (book lovers) who contemplate opening a book store are advised to spend six months to a year working in a book store, to study accounting and inventory control, to choose a location carefully, and to be prepared to have little time for reading.

They will be much too busy keeping track of inventories, meeting publishers' representatives, sending out orders and returning books.

THIS INFORMATION comes from the American Booksellers' Association, which offers help and training for the would-be bookseller.

Little Professor franchise officials say their systems and computers can cut down the work — and the worry.

Booksellers, and others, have to keep in mind the fact that while many people dream of owning their own businesses, many who do take the plunge find themselves over their depth and in trouble. Eighty percent fail, according to some estimates.

Reasons for this high failure rate include wrong location, poor management and under-capitalization, according to James C. Jongeneel, vice president of license development for Little Professor Book Centers.

FRANCHISING, he says, cannot completely eliminate failures, but it can cut the odds to as low as seven percent, in the case of Little Professor outlets opened in the past two years.

Said Jongeneel, "The general concern of a franchisor is to maintain his image."

It does not help anyone's image if a store does not succeed, although some franchisors, just as some businesses are better — and more concerned — than others.

A prospective franchisee must first get the approval of a five-member committee. Particular attention is paid to the matter of capitalization.

In the case of a store of average size (1,600 square feet), it takes \$64,500. Of this an average franchisee should have about \$40,000 in equity capital.

For this he gets help with a site location. The prospective franchisee names the city, and experts from the company will suggest several locations after a demographic study and site analysis.

A company representative will assist the franchisee's lawyer with leasing negotiations, and advice will be given on store layout.

ONE PIECE of advice is that it will take time (six months to a year) to build up a business that will pay, so the book seller had better have something to live on in the interim.

The franchisee receives \$25,000 worth of books, advice on how to lay out the store and on where to buy fixtures and decorations. About \$18,000 is for this, with an additional \$8,000 for leasing and legal expenses.

The company charges \$4,500 for site location, lease review, store layout and design, renovation planning and training.

Training is usually given over a period of at least two weeks in Little Professor stores in Ohio and usually one week in the person's own store.

The franchise fee is \$10,000.

Franchisees get continuing help and advice in return for payment of a monthly fee, which is a percentage of gross income. This is known as a royalty.

Continuing help includes access to a Watts line for the daily ordering from the Book Distributors warehouse.

BOOKS ARE chosen by three experts who deal with publishers' representatives and have the responsibility of deciding what books are likely to sell well.

Some 430,000 titles are in print, and publishers put out about 40,000 more each year. Including large and small, it is estimated that there are between 700 and 800 publishers in this country.

Making wise choices about what to stock is particularly important in the book business while most books are returnable for a full refund, the book sellers have to pay the freight both ways. And books are heavy.

If the store owner wants or needs a book that is not in stock in the Livonia warehouse, he is free to buy elsewhere. The company will even tell him where he can get the book.

ONE OF THE company's big aids in keeping track of inventories is a computer card which goes into each book as it is packed for shipment.

Half of the card is kept by the store owner as a record of exactly what has been sold (it eventells how many copies that store owner has sold in the past), and half goes home with the customer as a bookmark.

In addition, the company issues weekly microfiche lists of currently popular books and stock status at the warehouse, along with other useful items about the book business.

Books containing this and other information are sent out quarterly. These contain, among other things, a list of currently popular books in 41 different categories, from animals to zoology.

MIKE O'LEARY is among the 80 employees of the company in Livonia. He is franchisee service director, and is a former English teacher and book store manager.

O'Leary reports that books on psychology (self-improvement), diet and beauty are popular throughout the country. "People buy the hard covers in these," he said. "They don't want to wait for the paperbacks."

But a book dealer should be prepared to wait for his business to grow, cautions Jongeneel. It usually takes three to five years for a book business "to come to maturity."

This is unlike a fast food business, which he says is usually very popular and does well at first, then

levels out. Jongeneel formerly worked in this type of franchising.

One thing in favor of a book store operator is that it is not difficult to get help. People will work for love of books. One store owner, in a college town, had 200 applicants in response to his request for an assistant.

SURVEYS HAVE shown that people with education and discretionary buying power buy books.

While these are of all ages, the biggest group of customers is in the 20-44 age range. These facts are important in the demographic studies.

During times of depression or recession, people buy more books.

Right now the book business is improving, but Jongeneel a native of The Netherlands, points out there is room for improvement. Countries such as Denmark and Holland have a higher consumption of books in English than the U.S. does.

Today Little Professor is the largest franchisor of book stores. Other well-known and larger book stores, B. Dalton and Walden, are company-owned and operated by conglomerates.

THE LITTLE Professor company was begun in

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1961 in Dearborn in a bookstore owned and operated by Frank, Tony and John Fera.

So well did their formula work that they opened more stores, and people wishing to open their own stores consulted them. In 1967 and 1968 four stores were opened and sold. In 1968, the Feras started the franchise system, under the Little Professor name.

A wholesale division was needed and Book Distributors was formed in the fall of 1969. Computers were introduced and the operation was expanded by the Feras.

In 1972, it was purchased by the present owner, Maple Press Co., of York, Pa., a major manufacturer of trade, text and technical books.

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Merrill-Lynch bullish on Plymouth

No firm that came to Plymouth in the past few years had a more optimistic view of the future than the Merrill-Lynch brokerage firm that opened offices in the Markham Building, close by the C&O railroad tracks a week ago.

"We came here to satisfy the needs of the people of Plymouth and the surrounding area," Tom Kelly, the youthful general manager pointed out, "and we are prepared to do just that."

Seated at his desk in the most unusual office in

the city Kelly explained that there were four brokers on the job at the moment and that this number would be increased to 10 by year's end.

ONE OF THE main reasons for the optimism, according to Kelly, is the fact that the brokerage business has changed greatly in the past decade.

"There was a time when a broker in most any office, handled only one or two stocks. Now a brokerage firm is much like a supermarket. We have all kinds of stocks and bonds and can care for young and old alike."

Along with that he said that he 'fell in love' with the old Markham Building the first time he saw it, and is happy to have obtained an office in it.

To keep a link with the past the office is set apart by large hand-hewn pillars and the railings are all roughly hewn, all of which gives it the most unusual appearance.

Opening of the branch in Plymouth, Kelly stated, is the move by Merrill-Lynch, Pierce, Fenner and Smith, the largest firm of its kind in the country to expand in Michigan.

Thus far the firm has two offices in Detroit. They are in the Fisher Building and Ren-Cen. There also are branches in Ann Arbor, Southfield and Dearborn. Another is soon to open in Mount Clemens.

KELLY EXPLAINED that his first task here was to send out literature to all the families asking what they wanted in the way of stocks and bonds.

"We wanted to find, first hand, what was required so we could prepare to meet the demand of both the young and old and offer advice to those who are looking forward to retirement. For the young, there are plans to build up a nest egg for the future."

"Just name it and we have it," he said. Kelly confided that another thing he liked about Plymouth was the challenge it offered. Though he is only 32 years old he was brought up in the IBM firm that gave him the background he needed for the brokerage business.

Along with that, Kelly said, he liked the friendly atmosphere he found and that it seemed like a great place to live and work and become part of the community.

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Senior life-saver recognized

Tele-Care, recipient of one of eight National Association of Counties (NACo) awards given in recognition of outstanding programs by Wayne County, has amassed a long list of life-saving incidents, according to Dorothy Jane Gaitskill, project coordinator for the County's Office on Aging.

The NACo award will be presented at the annual NACo conference in Kansas City July 15-17 to Richard E. Manning, D-Redford, chairman of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

"A daily contact with seniors living alone adds to their sense of security and, in many cases, puts a little light in their secluded lives," Ms. Gaitskill explained.

"The Wayne County Office on Aging developed the Telephone Reassurance Service for senior citizens throughout the county and allows older persons who live alone or are temporarily alone to live independently."

"A DAILY telephone call from one of our 26 sites located in key areas of the county is of particular value since those who live alone are in special jeopardy from falls, strokes, and sudden illnesses. A telephone call at a prearranged hour once a day provides a regular check on the person's well-being."

"If the phone call is not answered as prearranged, appropriate steps are taken to discover the reason. If a medical crisis is discovered, the older person's doctor is called, relatives are notified and other action taken."

According to Ms. Gaitskill, more than 2,400 seniors are contacted daily, and she added, "some of the callers are senior citizens themselves." Three bilingual sites utilize Arabic, Ukrainian, Polish and Spanish languages.

Seniors wishing to receive Tel-Care services are advised to call 326-9190 in Westland. "By contacting these locations," Ms. Gaitskill said, "seniors may avoid long-distance phone charges."

AMONG THE LIST of emergency interventions attributed to the Tele-Care service these few may indicate some of the problems confronting seniors:

Westland — Man blind and crippled. Tele-Care caller asked if he could use cane. When cane was delivered, it was discovered that he had probably had a stroke. His cousin was called and he was taken to Veterans Hospital. He is doing well at home now.

Highland Park — Woman had seizure at time of call. Tele-Care caller notified neighbor who called Highland Park Police. The police entered the residence in time to save the client's life.

Belleville — When the 90-year-old woman did not respond to her Tele-Care call or to her neighbor, the Tele-Care caller contacted her son. Her son found her unable to get out of bed and had his mother hospitalized.

Grosse Pointe — When woman with crippling arthritis did not respond to the daily call, the Tele-Care caller notified a neighbor who had a key. Police were called to break the chain on the door. The client had had a stroke. She was hospitalized for two weeks and later taken to a nursing home.

River Rouge — A woman, 62, paralyzed from the waist down, answered the phone after it had rung repeatedly. She had fallen out of her wheelchair and asked the Tele-Care caller to send someone to help her. Frightened, she asked that the caller not hang up until help came. The police were notified and rushed to the aid of the client.

Wyandotte — When the 64-year-old woman did not respond to her call, the emergency number was called (her neighbor). The client was lying on the floor, having fallen and broken her leg.

A 70-year-old emphysema patient answered her Tele-Care call by asking for help. The caller notified the police who came immediately and administered oxygen.

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Catholics plan new home for aged

There is going to be a birthday party Sunday. The cake will have only one candle, but the youngest person there will be 64 years old.

There will not be any birthday presents, but everyone at the party has received a large gift that lasted an entire year.

The occasion is the celebration of the opening of Villa Marie, a senior citizens' residence on the grounds of St. Edith Catholic Church, Newburgh south of Six Mile, Livonia. And the main celebrants are the elderly who have been glad to live there since the residence opened its doors last July 15.

Villa Marie is one of nine retirement centers being built by the Detroit Archdiocese. They are made possible through an endowment from the estate of William Ryan, a multimillionaire, close associate of Henry Ford, and an inventor in his own right.

He stipulated that each home be built on at least five acres of land donated by a church. St. Edith had the land available and largely through the efforts of the Rev. John VanAntwerp, pastor, one of the homes was built in Livonia.

Thirty-six people moved in on opening day, and today there are 100 residents. More than 600 applied for residency and those now living there were chosen from among the 300 interviewed.

"We have 40 people on our list who need a home right now," said Sister Mary Lucille, O.P., the busy administrator, "and there are 100 who can wait until next year."

VILLA MARIE has a minimum age requirement of 62, and its oldest resident at this time is 97. She is Eva Howell, and she's the subject of Sr. Lucille's favorite story about the residents of the home.

"When Eva applied to live here at Villa Marie, she had been living in a high-rise in downtown Detroit," the administrator recalled. "Everything was seemingly more convenient than it would be here and Eva's daughter had doubts about her mother's moving into our facility."

"So when I interviewed Eva, I told her that her daughter had some reluctance about her moving here. 'Well, Sister,' said Eva, 'my daughter has lived her life, and I'm living mine.'"

The retort convinced Sr. Lucille that Eva would be just fine for the life at Villa Marie. Her application was accepted.

POTENTIAL APPLICANTS must be totally self-sufficient to live in the sprawling complex of one-floor apartments. Three meals are provided every day in the comfortably furnished dining room. A lounge resembling the sitting room of an elegant country estate is not far from the dining room, where residents gather to watch television, play the piano, play cards or just engage in conversation.

While there is no structured program, the women and men (two-thirds of the residents are women) may participate in any one of the several ongoing activities. The Livonia school district provides classes in crafts, current events, music appreciation, ethnic studies, and dancing for exercise. A pool table in the recreation hall is in constant use, as is the beauty shop.

"We have beauticians and a barber all week long and it's constantly busy," said Sr. Lucille. "All our people do their own laundry, too," she said.

"At first I feared scheduling problems with only two washers and two dryers, but our people have worked it out just fine."

MYSTERY TRIPS, dinner theater outings, strawberry picking (they've

picked 72 pounds), shopping trips to the nearby shopping center, and a monthly birthday party sponsored by neighboring parishes keep the men and women busy. Most residents are Catholic, but in accordance with another stipulation from William Ryan, the home is non-denominational.

"The people who want to live here at Villa Marie are those people who have chosen to give up their homes for a number of reasons," she explained.

"They have nowhere else to go. They want to continue to live in a socialized setting and yet retain their independence."

Residents of Villa Marie, she continued, may not be in wheelchairs or use walkers unless injured while at the home, and they cannot live there if they are bedridden or have a serious disease requiring nursing care.

If health problems arise, residents are on a "buddy system." Residents will check up on a sick neighbor or friend several times a day. All have their own doctors and dentists, and find their own transportation to keep medical appointments.

SISTER MARY, co-administrator of the center, is a medical technologist, and helps residents with some of their needs. For example, she takes blood pressures regularly. "This is one of our most common problems here, said Sister Mary. "The other problem is arthritis." Our meals are all low salt and our desserts are altered for those who have diabetes. Those are the only changes we make in diet for people.

When emergencies arise, the center uses the services of St. Mary's hospital.

If a resident becomes too ill to care for himself, arrangements must be made to move him to another facility.

The home houses several persons who have cancer but still can tend to their own needs. One of them, the Rev. Thomas Edison, was the first to die while at Villa Marie.

"Our residents look at it with a beautiful attitude," Sr. Lucille said. "When Father Edison died here, it was a

beautiful experience and strengthened everyone's outlook. It reinforced the thinking that death is a continuation of life. Almost everyone here went to his funeral. The people here have a strong faith and they accept life as it is."

RESIDENTS COME from all walks of life. There are registered nurses, a pharmacist, engineers, a purchasing agent, grocery store owner, teachers, bank tellers, postal clerks, and a chef. People are of many nationalities and of varied financial backgrounds.

"I feel strongly that financial resources should not be a factor," said Sr. Lucille. "If people become very ill and must be moved to a nursing home, they will need every penny they have."

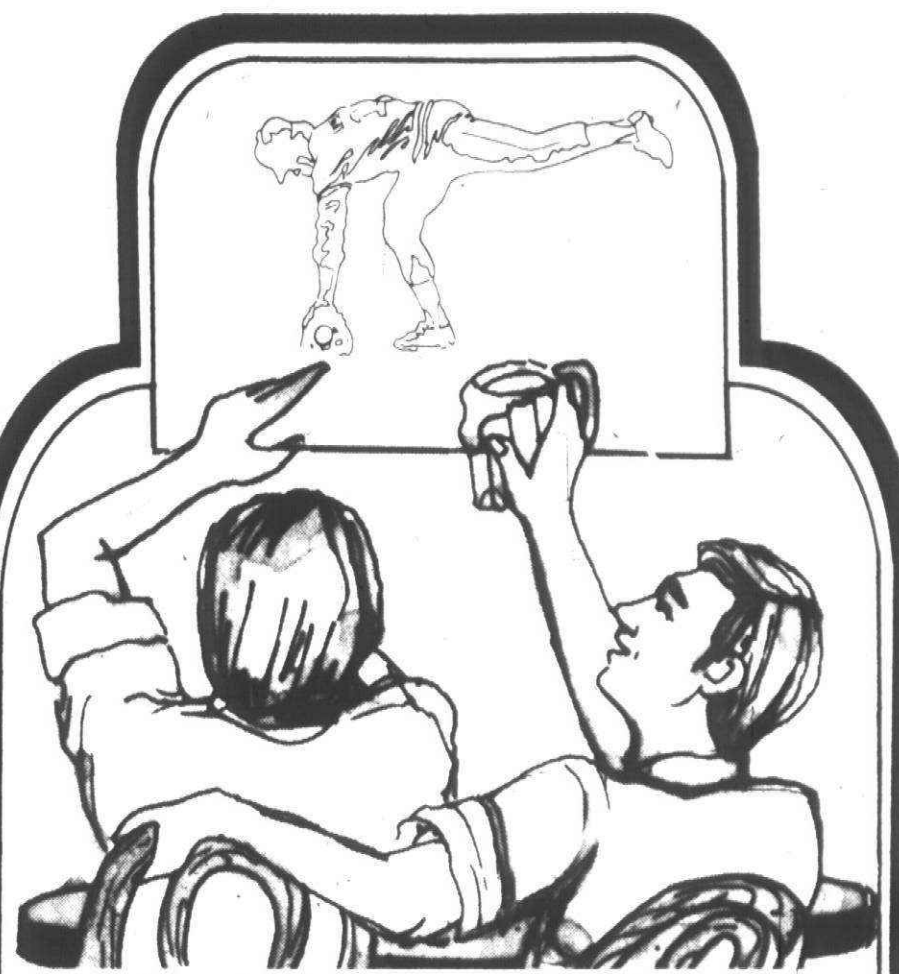
The rent at Villa Marie is \$195 a month, including all meals, all utilities, and full use of all facilities. The only additional cost is that of a telephone if a resident wants one, and most do.

Daniel Ryan, who serves on the center's board of directors and is also a resident, explains: "We can do it this way because there is no mortgage on these buildings," he said. "It cost \$1.5 million to build this center but, because of William Ryan's endowment, the entire complex is paid for. Otherwise, the rent would be double just to pay the interest charges."

Ryan (no relation to William Ryan) has for years seen his life revolve around senior citizens and their housing requirements. For 25 years he was the public welfare director for the city of Detroit. He knows the needs of the citizens and is dedicated to that cause. Even though he is retired, he spends 50 percent of his time in related duties.

"At the time of his death," continued Ryan, "William Ryan willed his entire estate to the Archdiocese of Detroit for the sole purpose of building senior citizen retirement centers which foster a kind of campus living."

Fr. VanAntwerp, pastor of St. Edith and chairman of the board of Villa Marie, was instrumental in seeking the money for the center to be built in Livonia. He began his quest in 1972.



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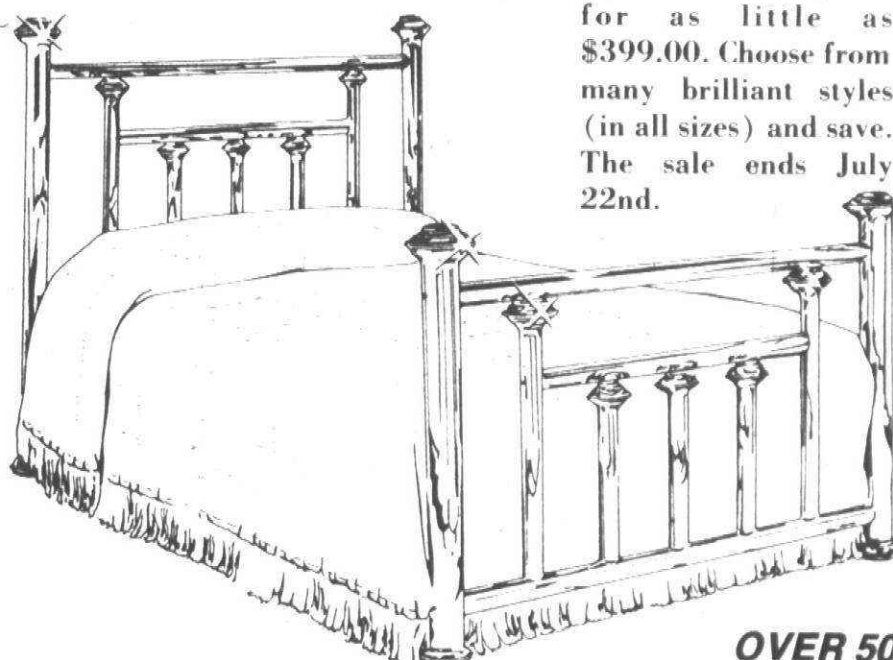
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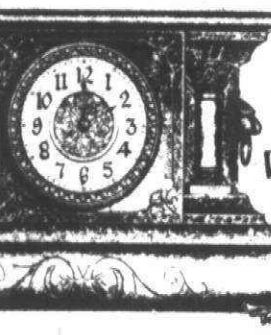
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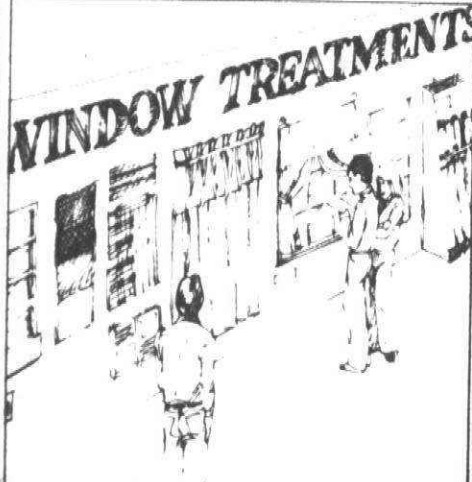
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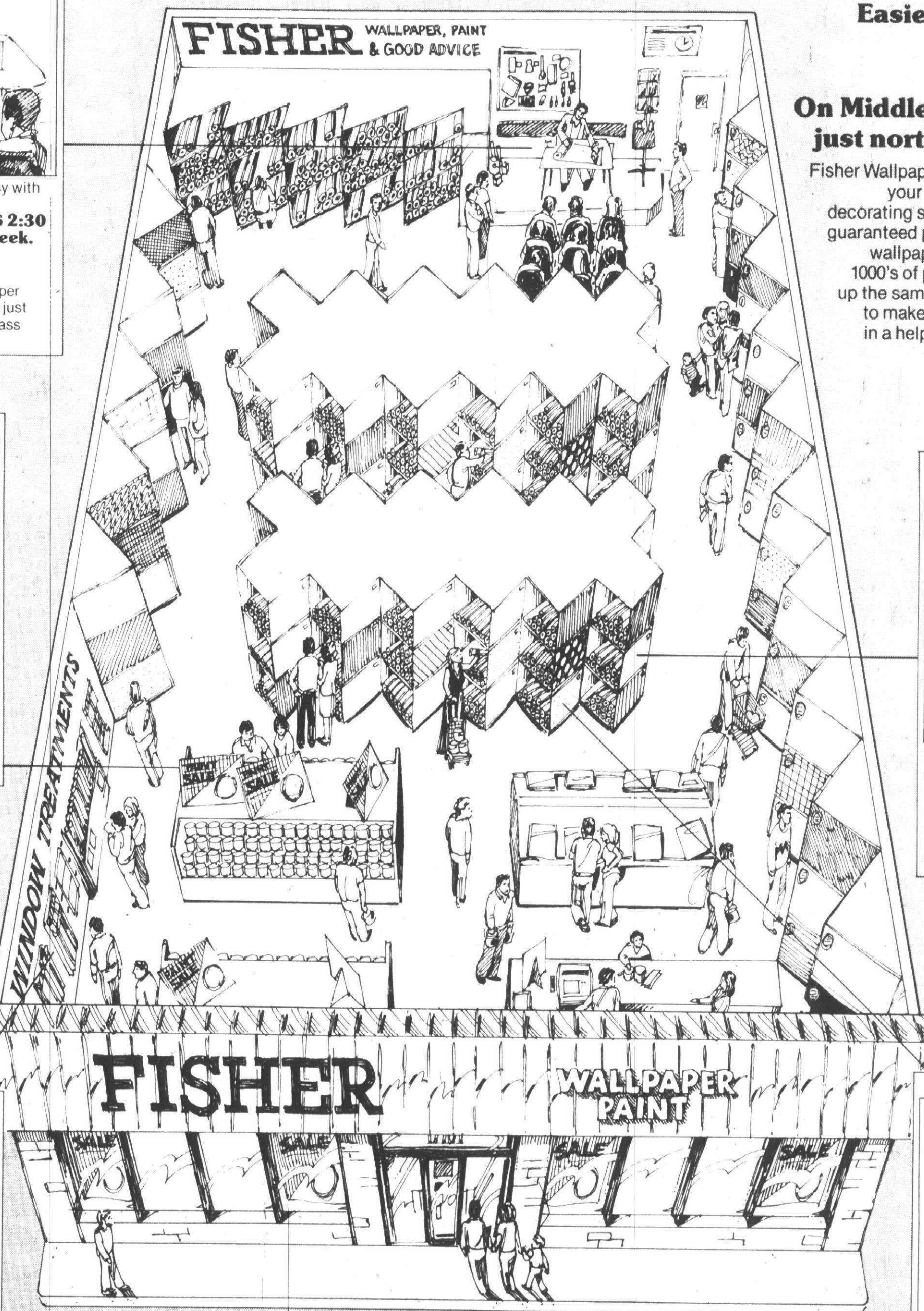

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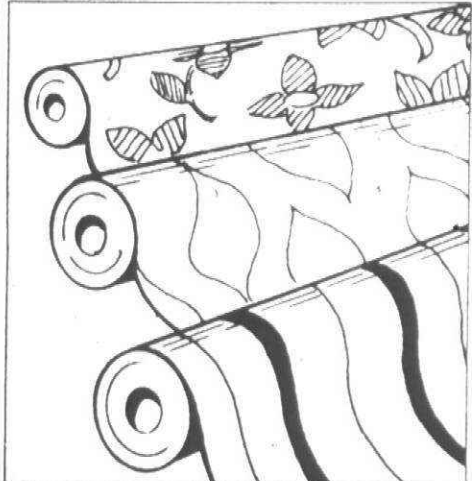
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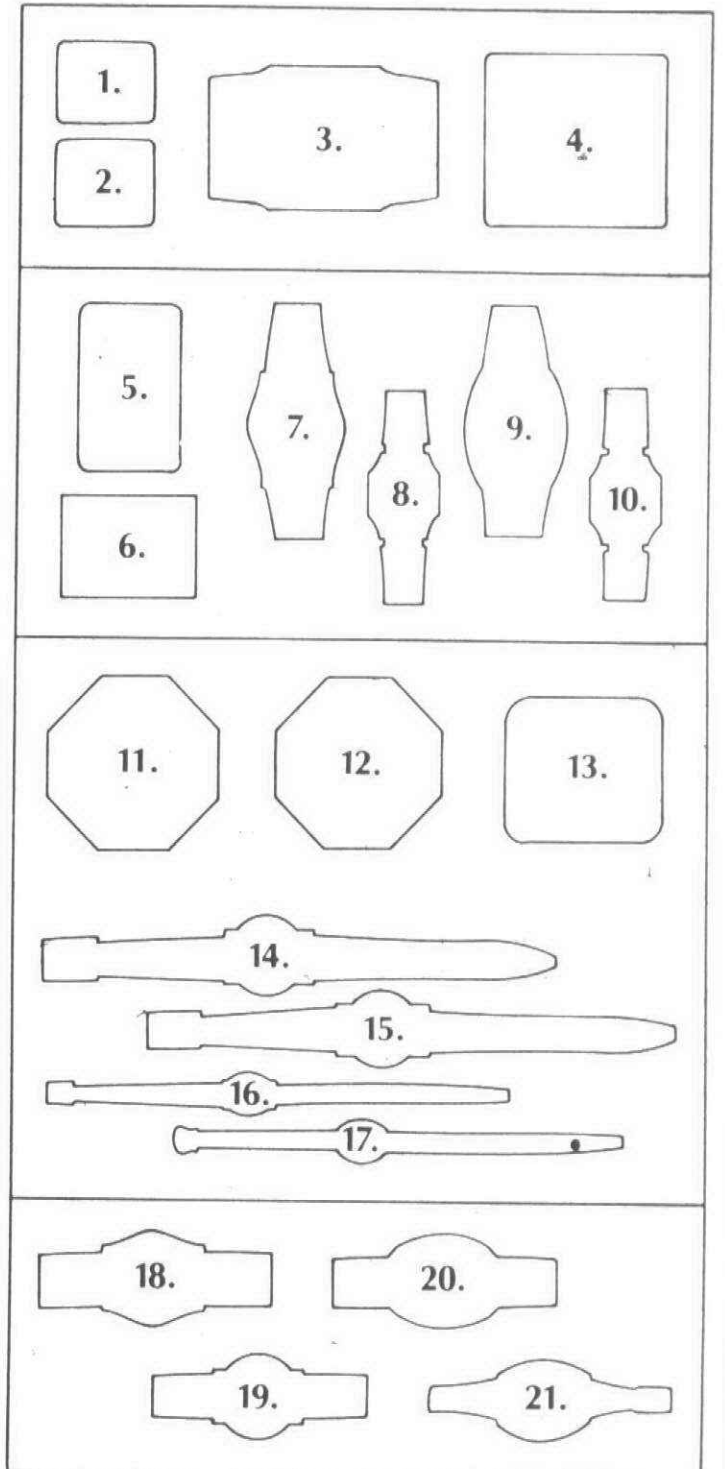
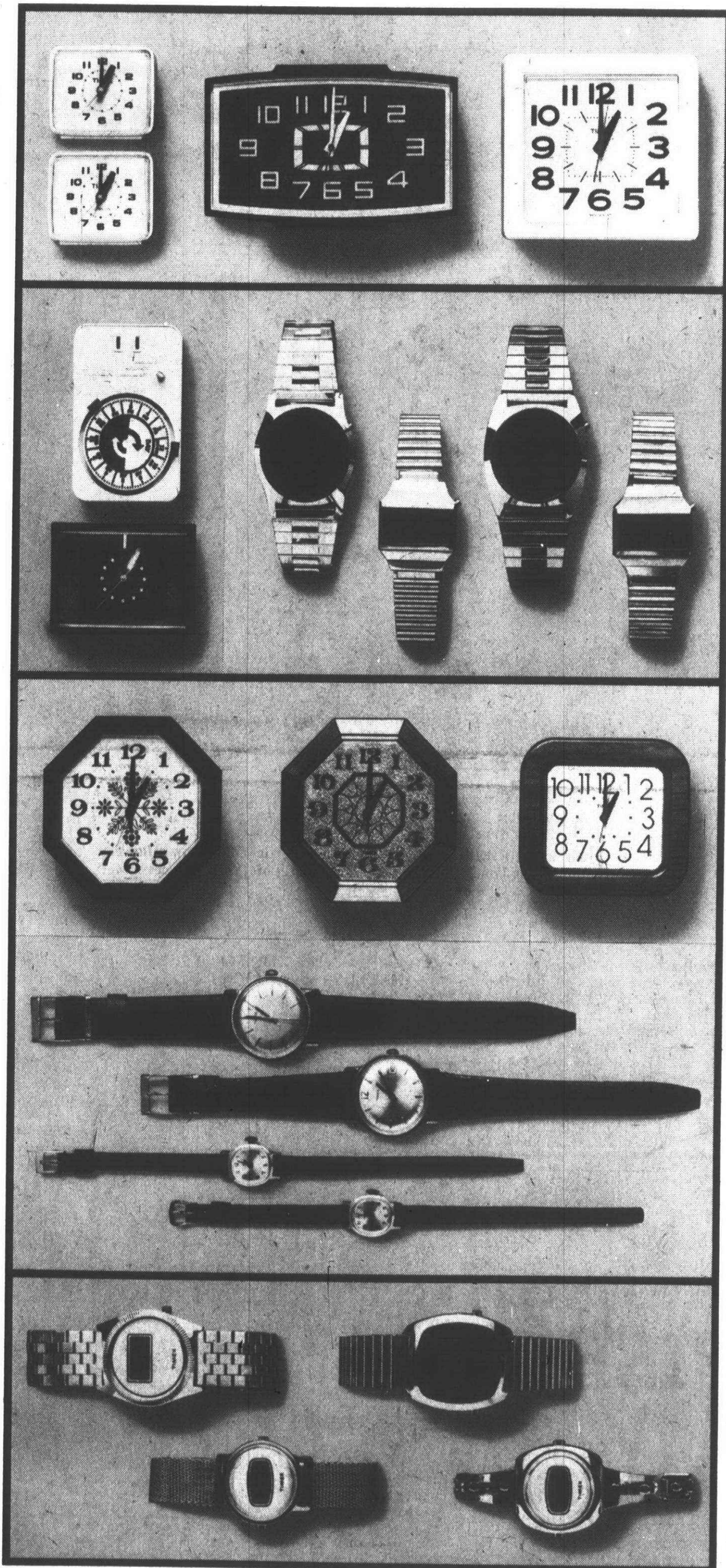

Great Lakes ship lore lives on canvas

He didn't want to look at his watch. It would only make the time until sunrise seem longer. It was the evening of Nov. 18, 1958, and Frank Mays was clinging to a raft, precariously riding the crests and troughs of 30-foot waves on Lake Michigan.

The Carl D. Bradley had broken in two and sunk. Four of the crew scrambled onto the raft made of 55 gallon drums with boards on top and bottom. Mays and Elmer Fleming were picked up alive the next morning, the other 33 crew members perished.

Now, painter James Clary of St. Clair had the watch, given him by Mays when he saw Clary's painting of the Bradley that tragic night.

Clary, one of eight artists featured in the marine and wildlife print and painting exhibit at Somerset Mall, July 12-22, treasures the watch. He's an avid collector of maritime history and

memorabilia as well as a maritime artist.

Mays, who recalls the events surrounding the tragedy, said that when he heard the first sound indicating something was wrong, "things that stuck in my mind were watch and wallet."

He went and got them and put on his life jacket.

Mays said when he heard the second bang, "I knew something was wrong. The aft end went down and came up. I still believe she broke from underneath. When I looked up, I couldn't see the aft end."

By this time, Mays was up on deck with other crew members.

"When a ship starts to go down, seamanship tells you to go to the high side. They did, but I didn't. I went to get the raft ready. I was untying the oars when she went down. When I came up out of the water, my arm touched the raft."

Even though Clary had talked extensively with Mays, now an officer for a cement company in York, Pa., he still asks more each time they meet.

Clary, a self-taught artist, has, expectedly, an almost insatiable curiosity about all events of this kind. He has done paintings of ships in three different series — Great Lakes, Feared Lost, and Classic Ships.

The Bradley falls into the Great Lakes category. Clary said he calls the Great Lakes Museum his second home, because he spends so much time there researching.

One of his paintings, "The Battle of Lake Erie," was purchased for \$20,000 and donated to Baldwin Wallace College in Ohio.

Most of the originals, acrylics about 24 by 30 inches, are in collections, but the lithographs are available.

Many of these, ranging in price from \$45-\$450, will be in the Somerset Mall show.

Presently, he is working on a painting of the Greater Detroit with the 1938 Detroit skyline behind it.

This was an excursion ship and, Clary said, 1938 "was the company's prime year."

He also is planning a painting for his classic series of the ship Red Devil. This, he said, was a down east schooner which, because of some kind of a pla-

gue aboard, wasn't allowed to land in any port in the world for a long time.

In the classic series, rather than reproducing an actual ship, he paints from his historical background and imagination and works in the many stories, fact and fiction, surrounding it.

The Bradley was different. He wanted it to show, as closely as possible, what happened to the ship that cold,

windy evening on Lake Michigan.

Mays willingly talked about the disaster. He is pleased that Clary chose to paint it. In all of the published stories about the Bradley and the Clary painting, he finds a thread of immortality for his comrades whom he saw for the last time that night when the Bradley was requested to make an unscheduled last trip for the season.

It takes persistence to be junker

Budget buying doesn't mean buying only inexpensive items. It means getting the most for the money you have to spend. Getting your money's worth involves knowing value and recognizing that a bargain isn't what you pay but what you get for what you pay.

Be honest when you shop. Don't pretend to the salesman that you can afford to spend more than you can. Decide in advance and frankly state what you can pay. Then search until you find good design that fits your needs. It can be done.

Whether you are starting to furnish your first apartment or are redoing what you already have, remember it's the idea not the dollar that's important. Use your imagination. Plan to do as much of the work as possible, for besides saving money, you will find real pleasure and satisfaction in doing it yourself.

THERE ARE MANY WAYS to furnish on a budget and make do with things that have dual purpose possibilities. Watch the paper for floor model furniture sales — these pieces may have a scratch or two on them, but these might appear in your home from everyday use anyway.

Check your local area for a railroad-damaged goods outlet, you can often find furniture and appliances with slight damage selling at great discounts. These damages can usually be repaired with little cost or skill. Also, auctions or unclaimed furniture outlets may offer good buys in unused furniture. The bargains will astound you.

The satisfaction of making something useful, even beautiful, from someone else's discards isn't altogether unreasonable either.

The number of worthwhile items that can be salvaged by someone with a good eye and a little imagination are many. Second-hand and Goodwill stores abound in such items. Some people discard furniture simply because they are tired of it and have no one to give it to. When moving from one home to another, it is often easier to "give it to Goodwill" than to sell it.

One with a perceptive eye will see numerous possibilities in many items. For example, old iron gates make handsome headboards. Ornately carved table legs may form the base for a

new, handsome, glass-top table. An odd piece of wood carving may turn into a decorative wall shelf or bracket. Discarded window frames placed against a windowless wall and filled with plants, lighted from behind will create the illusion of a garden room.

OLD WOOD SHUTTERS have myriad uses. They can conceal unsightly radiators or other obtrusive objects, serve as room dividers or be used on a wall that doesn't have a window at all.

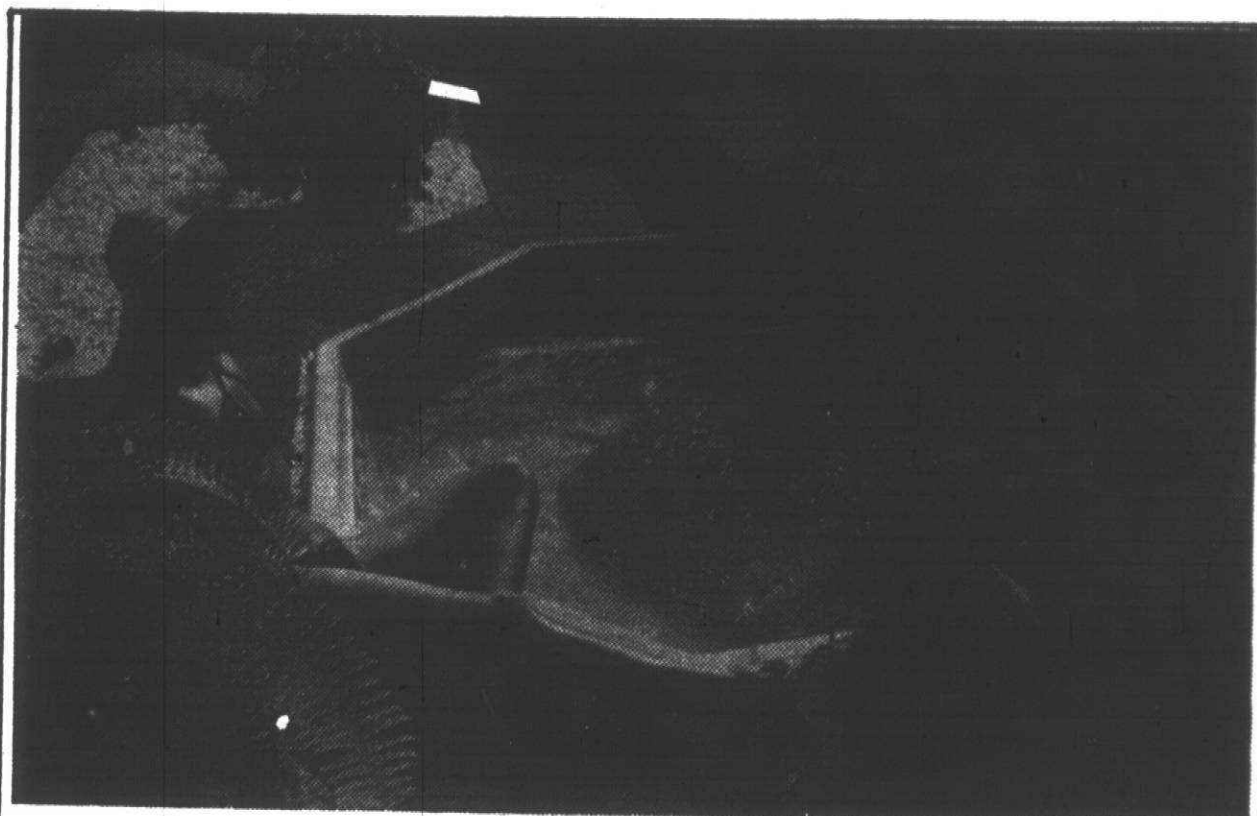
Large pieces of furniture can often be taken apart and used for a variety of purposes. Old radio cabinets, for example, have many options.

Try placing an old-fashioned china cabinet on top of one. Line the china cabinet with fabric and install interior lighting. Add new hardware to both pieces of furniture and you may have a focal point of great charm. An old cabinet can be turned on its side, top it off with an old door and it becomes a desk! All types of old beds can be restyled, cut down, painted and padded.

Old dressers that are too deep for today's limited space can be cut vertically and put side by side to form shelves. A dresser becomes a chest of drawers when the mirror is removed and hung elsewhere to expand space.

A BUFFET CAN BECOME A CHEST when the legs are removed. A sturdy round oak table can be lowered by cutting the base. Presto, you have a coffee table. A discarded trunk can be painted, glazed or papered and used as any side table.

The moral of the story is, "never pass up a pile of junk." Do consider discards. Take a scrutinizing look and see how many old pieces can be salvaged, restyled and reused. The pieces of furniture to be found and the purposes they can serve are endless.



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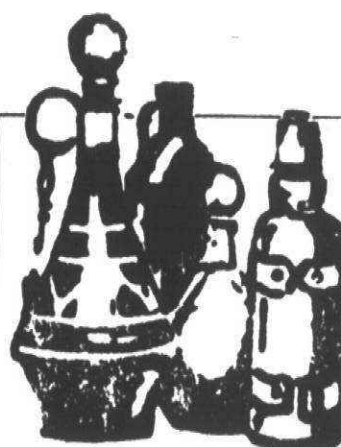
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Trout jumped onto lines near Mio

My friend C.O. Jones and myself headed up to the Au Sable river last week for a much-deserved, long holiday weekend — and some astounding fishing.

Up around Luzerne the natives didn't care about the fishing, though. They were all high on their Fourth of July celebration, a series of big doings that climaxed Sunday afternoon with a demolition derby out at the Lost Creek Sky Ranch.

Demolition derbies, for the uninitiated, consist of taking a bunch of junk cars and smashing them into one another until all but one is incapable of movement.

Jones is the kind of guy who has a bumper sticker that says "Buy a foreign car — put 10 Americans out of work." He was pleased to find that the last five cars left out of an original entry field of 40 were all Chrysler products.

"Glad to see them wrecked," said

in warm weather, they were right. The bugs were in a hurry.

On one night, Jones counted six different species of insect hatches, including caddis and two-inch long stone flies. Usually a night-hatching fly, the stone flies were rising a good six hours before sundown.

The trout were berserk, in an incredible feeding frenzy, and on our first day on the river we both took our limit of five fish within 30 minutes. The rest of the trip consisted of more of the same — you know the fishing is hot when you're hungry and you're still returning 13- and 14-inch brown trout, confident of catching even bigger ones later. A four-pound brown, by the way, was the biggest we saw taken up there.

THE HATCHES are over now, or at least the kind of hatches that resemble rush hour traffic are, but it might be a

good idea to file this story and take a trip up that way this time next year.

Closer to home, there are about 14,000 fish waiting for you out in Lake St. Clair, Lake Erie and southern Lake Huron. In the last five years, the Department of Natural Resources has tagged more than 10,000 walleyes and released them in those lakes. Nearly 4,000 smallmouth bass have been tagged and released in Lake St. Clair.

Anglers who catch any of these tagged fish are asked to return the tags with the fish length, weight and date and location of capture to the Lake St. Clair Great Lakes Station, Department of Natural Resources, 33135 South River Road, Mt. Clemens, MI 48045.

In return, you'll receive information on the date, place and size of the fish when it was tagged.

BUT BACK to the fishing. About four miles out of Luzerne, which is near Mio, is a county park right on the river. The locals at Ma Deeter's Bar told us it's been a cold, rainy year so far up there, and judging from the insect hatches that took place during our visit

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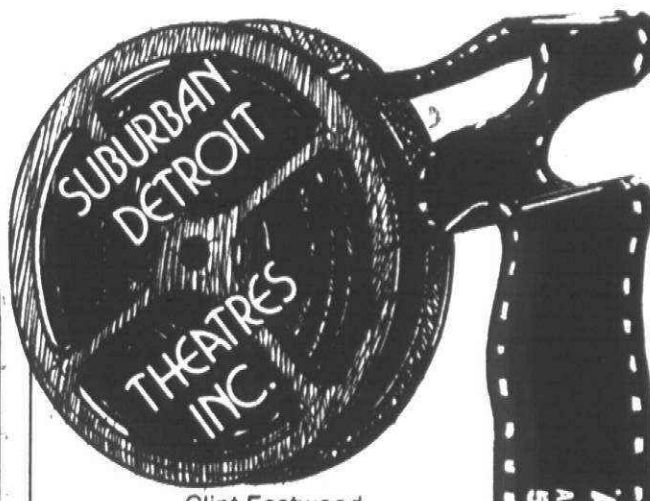

Among local Detroit folk artists, Mike Smith is often thought of as a "folksinger's folksinger." His songs are performed by countless entertainers.

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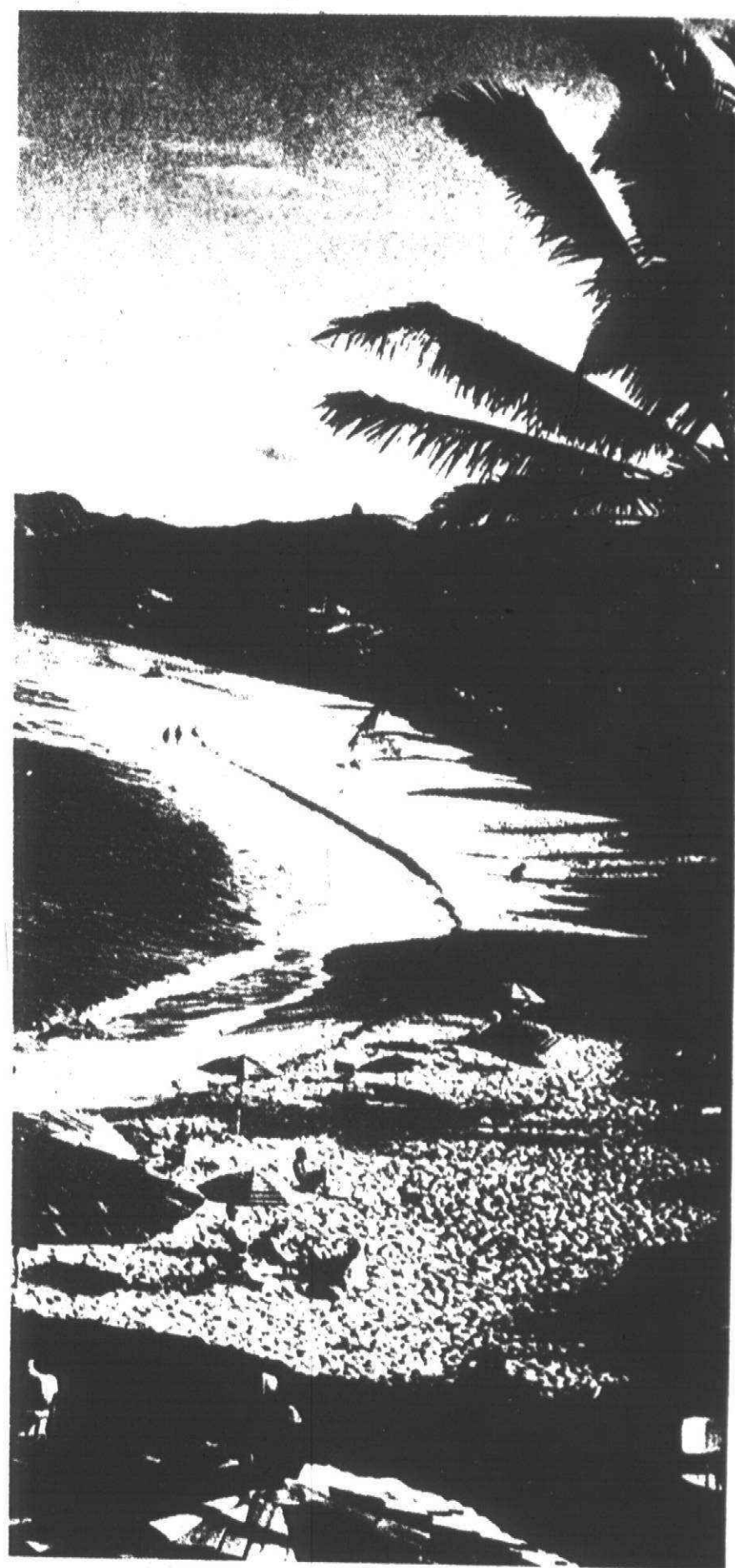
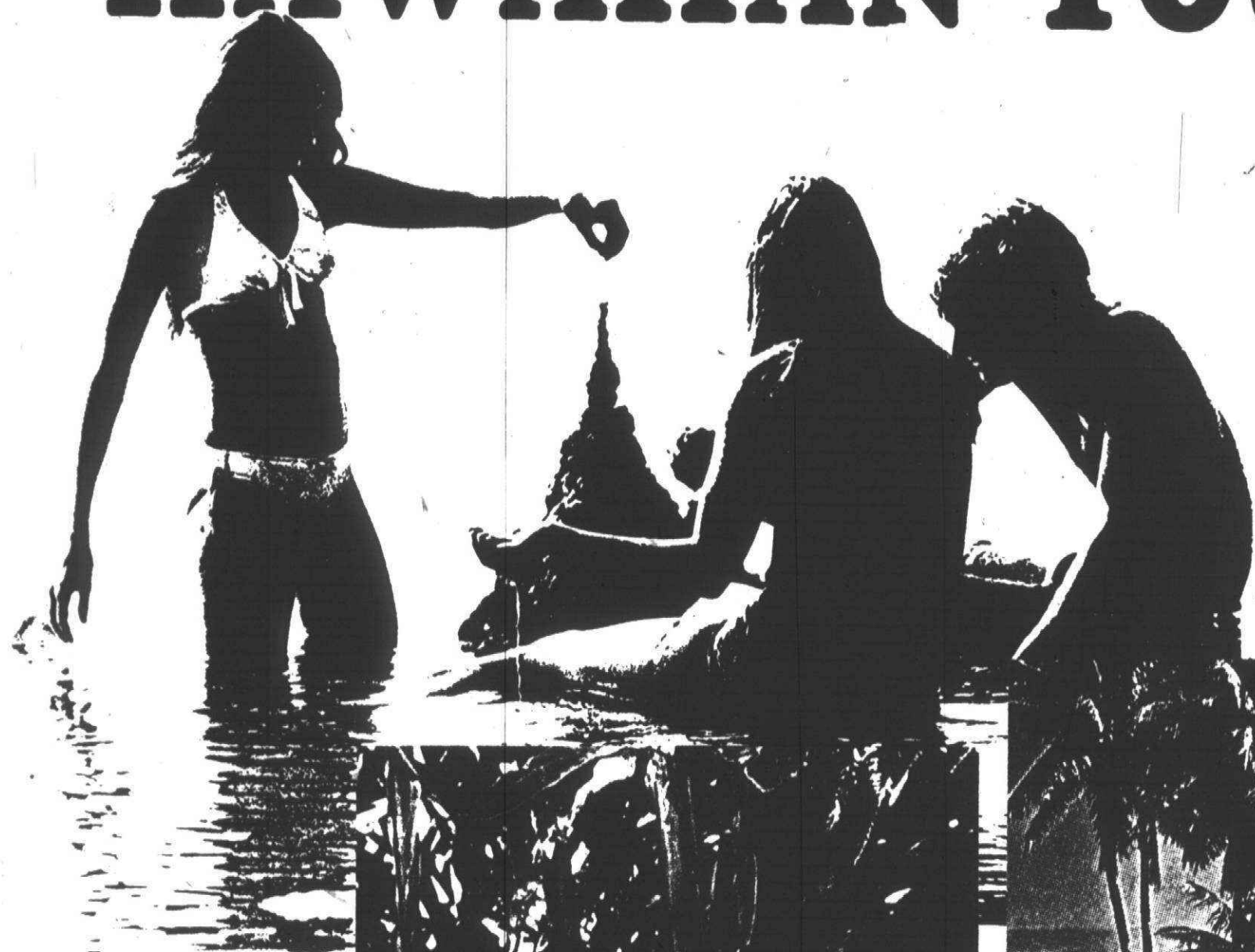

Dream comes true for Con Brio owner

The opening of the Club Con Brio in downtown Detroit is a dream come true for the club's new owner and manager, Scott Reiter.

A 38-year-old musician, composer and Chadsey High School teacher, Reiter has been captivated by the idea of running a swinging, first-class jazz nightclub in downtown Detroit for as long as he can remember.

For the last six years, in fact, Reiter and his wife Patricia have saved for the day when the right club was available at the right location. A year ago, Reiter discovered that the popular Middle Eastern-oriented Cedars Lounge on Columbia at Park Avenue was up for sale, and he made his big move.

Now after months of negotiations, licensing procedures, planning and re-decorating, the spacious, all-new Club Con Brio has opened its doors with top Detroit jazz stars six nights a week.

Strata Associates principals John Sinclair, Frank Bach and Peggy Taube have helped Reiter bring to the Con Brio such first-rate Detroit Jazz Artists as the Lyman Woodard Organization,

(now appearing every Friday and Saturday in July and August), Marcus Belgrave and the New Detroit Jazz Ensemble big band (every Monday), the Ron English Quartet (every Thursday), the Griot Galaxy (every Wednesday), and the Prismatic Band (every Tuesday).

With its layout and 160-seat capacity, the Club Con Brio (which in Spanish means "with spirit") compares favorably in size to such clubs as Baker's Keyboard Lounge (125 seats) and Cobb's Corner (135 seats). Sandwich plates are served from the Brio's full-service kitchen, and bar selections include a variety of domestic and imported bottled beers.

The Con Brio is on Columbia at Park Avenue near Grand Circus Park — one block west of the Fox Theater, one block north of LaCave and the Park Avenue Club. There is free, lighted parking across the street.

Detroit's newest jazz spot is open Mondays-Saturdays from 9 p.m. to 2 a.m., with entertainment starting at 10 each night.

Guest carillonneur performs in concert

Belgium carillonneur Paula Van de Wiele will be at Christ Church Cranbrook for a carillon concert at 4 p.m. Sunday, July 15.

This will be followed by a 5 p.m. organ recital by Evelyn Schutte, organist at First United Methodist Church, Mount Clemens. Both programs are free.

The carillon performance will include American classics from George Gershwin, Jerome Kern, Charles Chaplin and Norman Petty, in addition to selections from Bach, Beethoven and Tchaikowski.

Ms. Van de Wiele will also ring out Schubert's "Serenade" and Mozart's "Figaro's Wedding."

Highlight of the afternoon will be a mother-daughter duet with Ms. Van de Wiele and 10-year-old Anneke playing "Go, Go, Cricket, Leave My Mind."

Ms. Van de Wiele studied at the Carillon School of Mons under George Clement and at the National French Carillon School under Jacques Lannoy. She has played for radio, appeared on TV and made recordings. She has performed in Belgium, France, The Netherlands and the United States, and each year she plays for the National Festival.

The organ recital will comprise sacred music from 18th and 19th century composers. Carillon bells are best heard outside the church at a distance of 200 feet from the tower. The audience is invited to listen from the church lawn.

Christ Church Cranbrook, at Cranbrook and Lone Pine, is an Episcopal Church noted for its gothic architecture. It is adjacent to Cranbrook Educational Community, situated on 300 rolling, wooded acres of trails, ponds and lakes.

Greenfield Village festival continues

Visitors to Greenfield Village know that there is no business like Early American show business during Old Time Summer Festival, a daily event in which minstrels stroll, actors entertain and all the village is a stage.

The festival continues through Sept. 2 at Greenfield Village in Dearborn. It features vintage music and comedy by the Greenfield Village Players, who don period costumes, portray historic personages, dance or simply sing the songs that were popular generations ago.

The Players — for the first time — present variety shows in Town Hall recalling the songs and entertainment of 1879 and 1929, commemorating respectively Thomas Edison's epoch-making invention of the incandescent lamp 100 years ago and the founding of the Edison Institute (popularly known as Greenfield Village and Henry Ford Museum) 50 years ago.

Nearby, Dixieland music plays, and portly Ben Franklin recites sage sayings and looks back on his life. An old-time medicine show peddles pratfalls and the miracle cure-all, Wizard Oil.

JUST DOWN the street, Stephen Foster sings "Swanee" and some of his other compositions, and a new feature, Hermann the Great, revives original magic tricks of the 1890s.

A perennial feature is the Players' rendition of "The Trial," the story of a young woman in 1880 who takes her male employer to court in an attempt to get a job using a new-fangled machine — the typewriter.

Old methods of transportation — whether they are signaled by the clip-clop of horses or the whirr of early machinery — are popular attractions. Century-old antique locomotives carry visitors around the village perimeter. Model T rides recall the era of the horseless carriage, and the sternwheeler Suwanee captures the atmosphere of Mississippi Riverboats.

If these methods of locomotion seem a bit too advanced, there is always the old stand-by of our forefathers — the horse-drawn conveyances, including buggy, carriage and hay wagon.

There is an additional 50-cent charge for the Town Hall variety show, but no charge for other Old Time Summer Festival offerings beyond the regular village admission of \$3.75 for adults and \$1.75 for children ages 6-12. Children under 6 are admitted free.

In addition, visitors have the opportunity of purchasing a special combination ticket for the village and adjacent Henry Ford Museum. The price is \$8.75 for adults and \$3.25 for children ages 6-12. Children under 6 are admitted free.

The exhibition will coincide with some shows in the University Musical Society's "Summer Fare" program in the U-M Rackham Building.

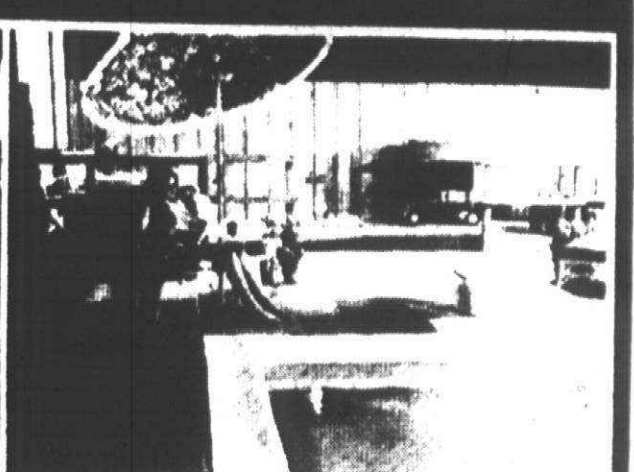
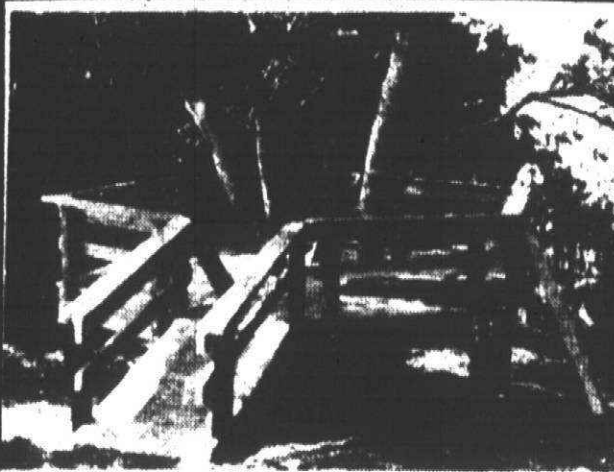
Born in 1935 in New York City, Zenian received a B.A. degree in physics from U-M in 1957 and worked in the research and development field for eight years before directing his attention to art.

Zenian's works are in local, regional and national collections. He has also had many gallery showings and his work is currently available from the Lee Hoffman Gallery in Birmingham.

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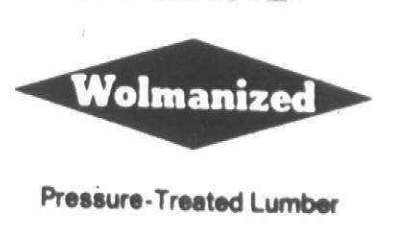
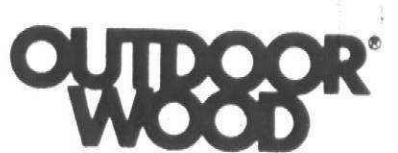
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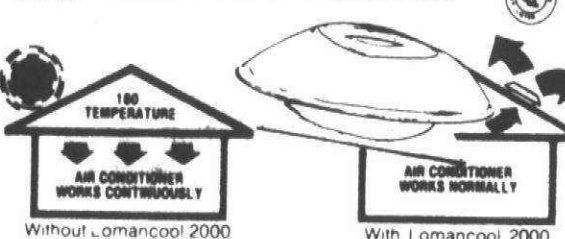
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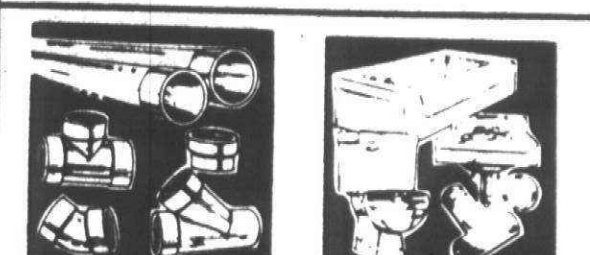
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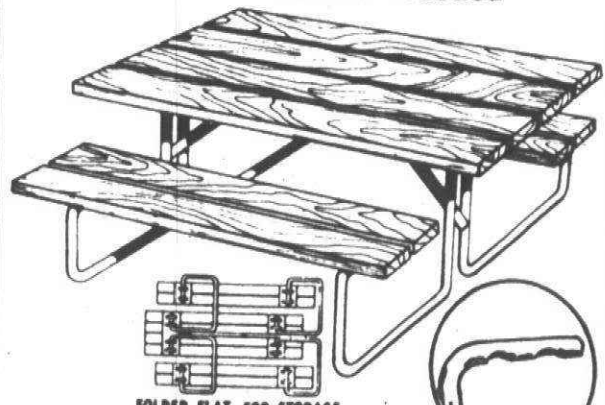


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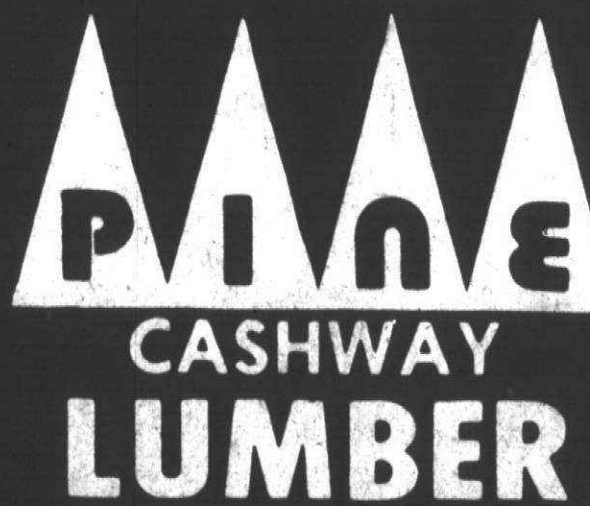
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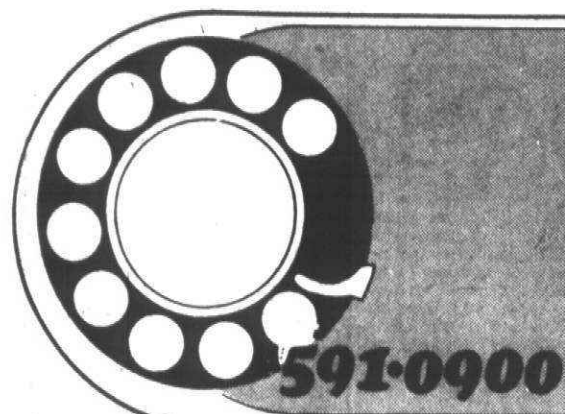
