## Interim zoning pits developers against officials

Questions about the legality of a proposed interim zoning ordinance combined with alleged pressure from powerful land developers have caused some Canton officials to have second thoughts about passing the temporary measure.

The interim ordinance is scheduled to go before the Canton Township Board of Trustees at a regular meeting set for 7 p.m. Tuesday in the administration building.

The purpose of the ordinance is to halt development that is not in accord with proposed master land use plan changes and concurrent zoning ordinance revisions.

Those proposed changes, however, can not become official until public hearings are held in August and the

township board resolves to adopt them.

The adoption of an interim ordinance to stave off inconsistent development appears to be a measure with no legal precedent — and that's what is making some township board members nervous.

SUPERVISOR NOEL Culbert, who voted in favor of submitting a draft of the ordinance to the Wayne County Planning Commission for recommendation, said Friday he is "undecided" on how to vote on the actual interim ordinance.

Culbert's comments followed a Thursday night meeting with township attorney Bert Bergoyne, Trustee Carol Bodenmiller (a strong supporter of the ordinance), newly appointed Trustee

## Complaints flood Wade after rain

Cleaning out storm drains and placing bales of straw around construction sites are two of the measures Canton Township officials have initiated to prevent a third occurrence of flooding in residents' homes.

Canton's planning consultant firm — Wade, Trim and Associates — is also preparing to conduct sewer system dye testing on about 30 houses.

Nearly 100 people told Robert Wade at a Thursday night meeting that they can't afford any more damage from rainstorms and want prompt relief from the flooding problem. The meeting had originally been called to garner volunteers for the dye flooding tests.

A majority of those present were from the Windsor Park and Carriage Hills subdivisions, where home and street flooding was worse than any other area in the township.

Also attending the meeting were Wade, Trim engineer Hugh Kennedy and Canton Township Supervisor Noel Culbert.

WADE, WHO was verbally attacked on several occasions by the angry homeowners in the audience, told the crowd that he would be "happy to answer" any questions about the flooding if members of the audience would calm down.

The planning company, following a heavy rain April 13 in which residents experienced the flooding problems, sent letters out to about 90 homes asking people to attend the meeting and volunteer for the test.

Wade, Trim hoped to get a sampling of some 30 homes in order to comply with the United States Environmental Protection Agency's request for reports on sewers and drains.

But audience members said they feared the studies would take a too long and in the meantime, basements would continue to flood.

"I'm not going to go through this ordeal every time it rains," one member of the audience said.

## Glass artist colors his world

Some people look at the world through rose tinted glasses, as the old saying goes. But Tim Iovan sees his future through a stain glass window.

Iovan was born and raised in Redford. For most of his life, he's worked in the glass business with his father.

Now the 1976 graduate from Thurston High School manages his own glass shop.

Iovan Glass, on Plymouth Road at Inkster, specializes in stain glass.

But Iovan adds, "I'll do anything with glass — residential or auto work. I like to have a wide range of business."

Iovan's first interest for stain glass dawned on him like love at first sight.

"I saw a Tiffany lamp in the window of a friend's stain glass shop. I was amazed by the colors in the lamp. It was really beautiful."

I love seeing beautiful works of art — something somebody has made. When I saw that lamp that day it really turned me on."

Iovan said that he owes his inspiration to his father.

"I was with my dad at the time, and he said, 'Get into it. You can do it. Take classes — you'll probably really like it.'"

"He gave me the boost I needed."

Iovan enrolled in two five-week courses at Steven Franks Studios in Livonia, but only under one condition. "I didn't want to take the classes alone. So I told my dad I would if he would. After all, he could probably learn something from it too," said Iovan.

It turned out that his father had to drop the classes. Iovan found himself learning the craft solo.

Under the instruction of a profes-

sional stain glassman, Leo Weeg, Iovan realized that his previous experience with glass got him to the head of the class. He had projects cut and finished sooner than most of the students.

Although his shop has only been in operation for five months, Iovan is heavily involved with project orders.

"I take as many orders as you want to give me. But I say to myself 'leave yourself room to work.'"

"If customers show me exactly what they want, I can give them an estimate on the cost and the time (Continued on page 2A)

## Crackels' deaths follow violent married life

Beatings, murder threats and physical violence characterized 13 of the 14 years Bonnie and James Crackel were married, according to Bonnie Crackel's sister.

That marriage ended July 8, when James Crackel shot and killed his wife on the front lawn of a mutual friend's Livonia home. Crackel then turned the 32-caliber gun on himself and later died in St. Mary Hospital.

Marie Van Vleck, Bonnie's sister, said Crackel had held a gun to his wife's head on "many, many" occasions and had threatened to kill her or members of her family if she left him.

While Mrs. Crackel had sought a warrant July 3 against her husband, police said its issuance would probably not have prevented the shootings.

MRS. CRACKEL, 31, had moved from the couple's home on Carriage Hills Drive a few weeks after Crackel attempted to push her from a moving car on the freeway, Mrs. Van Vleck said.

According to the sister, Mrs. Crackel filed for divorce after moving in with her parents, David and Anne Ingall of Plymouth.

Police said Mrs. Crackel had gone to the Livonia home of the Rev. William Carter to see her children — James, Jr., 12, Scott, 8 and Jennifer, 2 — who were staying with their father during the separation.

Carter said he had tried counseling the Crackels on several occasions in an effort to get them back together.

Mrs. Van Vleck said that the two younger children were playing in the backyard at the time of the shooting. All three children are now staying with Crackel's brother, in compliance with the couple's will.

"I liked him a lot," Mrs. Van Vleck said of her brother-in-law. "But he had this Jekyll and Hyde personality. 'He tried to change, but he just said that he couldn't live without her.'"

"She (Mrs. Crackel) tried desperately to get him psychiatric help. But she just couldn't get him to go to the doctor."

MRS. VAN VLECK said her first concern now is for the welfare of the children.

But her second concern is for other women who are living in the type of fear that she said her sister knew for years. Mrs. Van Vleck has established a memorial fund that will be given to First Step, a Westland spouse abuse agency.

Deborah Benjamin, a social worker with First Step, said Mrs. Crackel's story is a classic example of spouse abuse.

She said that most men who abuse their wives are extremely possessive and view their marital relationship "as the most important in their life."

"A woman who makes a move to leave upsets his whole stability," Ms. Benjamin said. "Many women are severely threatened when it comes to the issue of leaving. That's a really big factor with women who stay in a relationship."

Mrs. Van Vleck theorizes that her sister may have left Crackel earlier if it had not been for the threats of violence.

She said Crackel threatened to hire a man to kill her sister or members of her family if she ever left. She said he also threatened to kill himself.

ACCORDING TO Mrs. Van Vleck, physical violence was a mainstay of the Crackel marriage.

"At first, he wasn't that way a lot. It just got worse through the years," Mrs. Van Vleck said. "Then, it got really, really bad when she decided she would leave. It turned from meanness to insanity."

"She told me once that she didn't want to be alone with the children," Mrs. Van Vleck said. "He provided very well for them materially. Anything in the world she wanted, he would buy her."

Mrs. Van Vleck said that while Crackel never physically abused his children, he threatened them with violence on several occasions.

She said her sister filed reports of spouse abuse in all the communities where the couple lived, including

Northville, Plymouth, Westland and Canton.

But Mrs. Crackel had not pressed charges against her husband until five days before her death. Mrs. Van Vleck said her sister confided that Crackel assaulted and raped her July 3 when he invited her to their house to see the children.

According to Mrs. Van Vleck, a marriage counselor had advised Mrs. Crackel against taking the children from her husband by force for fear the action would trigger an outburst of violence. Mrs. Crackel had filed for temporary custody of the children in court.

According to Sgt. Dennis Joker of the Canton Police Department, the assault warrant for Crackel's arrest had not been issued by the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office on July 8 when Mrs. Crackel was killed.

Joker and Robert E. Sage, deputy chief of the out-county prosecutor's office, said police agencies usually give beaten women a "cooling-off period" before processing warrants for their

husband's arrest unless a weapon was involved.

Warrants can be issued in one day. But Joker and Sage said that 90 percent of the women who say they will press charges against their husbands later change their minds.

Sage said processing of spouse abuse warrants usually takes a week.

Neither Joker nor Mrs. Van Vleck believe the lives of the Crackels would have been saved by the issuance of the warrant.

"If we had had the warrant, he could have just posted the bond and been out," said Joker.

Mrs. Van Vleck said her first thought when notified of her sister's death was that the warrant had been issued. She thought that Crackel had been arrested and released and that the warrant had triggered the shooting.

"I don't know why it takes so long," she said. "But I don't think anything would have changed if the warrant had been issued."

## Short Takes

### Polluting landfill?

Although Bi-Products Systems of Michigan has not pursued plans to get approval of a sludge composting site in Canton as of late, the company is reportedly still disposing of sludge from the Detroit Wastewater Treatment Plant at the Woodland Meadows landfill in the township. According to Supervisor Noel Culbert, tests done on groundwater by the landfill site have revealed that the water is polluted. Details will be in the July 19 edition of the Canton Observer.

### Topic of Canton

A special meeting has been called by Supervisor Noel Culbert beginning 7 p.m. Wednesday, July 18 at the administration building. The purpose of the meeting is for the general public to hear the needs and concerns of various Canton Township departments. Such subjects as police and fire millage and a budget presentation have been scheduled for public input.

### Corn for a day

Applications for anyone who wants to become the king or queen of the Canton Sweet Corn Festival Aug. 12 can pick up applications at the Canton Chamber of Commerce offices, 5773 Canton Center, or participating merchants. Contestants must dress like some portion of a corn plant (that's right) for a judging scheduled for 3 p.m. the day of the festival. There will be winners in four age classifications ranging from one year of age to infinity. There is no entry fee.

### A flood of subjects

That's right — Canton's July 11 flooding problems will be one of the topics under discussion when the Canton Township Board of Trustees holds its regularly scheduled meeting beginning 7 p.m. Tuesday, July 17 at the administration building. Other subjects include the possible adoption of an interim zoning ordinance (see story above), cable television and the rules for the use of landfill. The Canton Planning Commission meets Monday night beginning 8 p.m. in the administration building. On the agenda will be a move to take site plan approval for a large home improvement store out of table.

### HEADLEE AVERTED?

An attempt to avert the intention of the Headlee Tax Limitation Amendment, approved by voters last fall, continues in Lansing. State senators are particularly concerned about a provision which requires the state to pay for any program or service it mandates local governments to perform.

A bill now is being considered by the state Senate which contains a number of mandated programs which, if passed, would be exempted from the Headlee requirement. Sen. Robert Geake believes the bill deliberately attempts to create loopholes. See story on Page 3A.

# Commissioner says interim law vital to Canton

Steve Larson and planning commissioner Dan Richardson (who first proposed the interim law).

Those officials attending the meeting said Bergoyne's law firm is split on whether the ordinance would be legal, with Bergoyne one of the attorneys who is hesitant about the law.

Mrs. Bodenmiller, who also serves on the planning commission, said she intended to vote for the ordinance no matter how the other township board members vote.

Several township officials have indicated they believe Culbert's vote will be the one to pass or shoot down the ordinance.

"I voted yes on submitting the ordinance (which was approved by the Wayne County Planning Commission last week) because I thought it was a good idea. But I added some provisos," Culbert said.

The supervisor, however, said he was concerned with the liability both individual board members and the township could incur by passing the ordinance.

"Developers are going to file law-

suits against it if we pass the interim ordinance. I'm not sure it's worth risking. The township is not going to develop that much in four months," he said.

But one of the first tests of the ordinance, should it be approved, is already brewing on the township planning commission level.

**PLANNING COMMISSION** Chairman Robert Padgett has requested that the commission reconsider a site plan which was tabled last week.

The site plan was submitted by Republic Development Corporation for a 75,000 square foot store called Canton Home Center, to be built on an 11-acre parcel of land on the south side of Ford Road between Morton Taylor and Oakview.

According to Canton Planner James Kosteva, the site in question is now zoned commercial, but would be zoned residential (multiple dwelling) under the proposed master land use plan addendum and interim zoning ordinance.

Kosteva said the land had been designated for residential use on the 1976 master land use plan and zoning ordinance. The property was rezoned for commercial use in January 1978, in conflict with the current master plan.

"The site plans were tabled last Monday for 60 days because the commission felt they would like to wait until after the master land use plan public hearings," Kosteva said. A hearing on the plan is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. August 15 in Plymouth-Salem High School.

According to Mrs. Bodenmiller, commissioners had been getting "all kinds of pressure from Republic and other developers saying we're violating their civil rights" since the site plan was tabled.

Mrs. Bodenmiller said she received a call Wednesday night from Padgett. Although Padgett had joined commissioners Richardson, Thom Carmen and Mrs. Bodenmiller in voting to table the site plans, he apparently reconsidered.

"He told me he was going to pull the site plan off the table, even though this Monday is not a time we normally do site plans," Mrs. Bodenmiller said.

Padgett could not be reached for comment on his decision. Because site plans are not normally considered at special meetings, a two-thirds majority will be required to take the subject from the table.

The final site plan approval still rests with the township board, since the

planning commission serves only as an advisory body.

According to Kosteva, the township board could run into legal problems if it denied a site plan without good cause once it had been approved by the planning commission.

The interim zoning ordinance, if passed Tuesday night and upheld in a court challenge, would allow the township board to deny the site plan for the Canton Home Center.

Both Bodenmiller and Richardson said they planned to continue to push the interim zoning ordinance. They have gained some support from Trustee Robert Greenstein, who originally voted against it.

"If certain changes are made, I will vote for it," Greenstein said.

"But it really is a legal question." The trustee said he was convinced the interim ordinance would work after a long session with its creator, Richardson.

Greenstein said he would still be reluctant to vote for the ordinance unless Culbert also did so, because of the

"personal liability that may be involved."

"Culbert is the head of the township and he should take the lead in this," Greenstein said. Both Culbert and Greenstein are attorneys.

Although the ordinance's strongest supporters, Richardson and Mrs. Bodenmiller, said they feared the proposed master land use plan would be gutted before it is even passed if temporary measures are not taken, neither has given up hope.

Richardson said he planned to make a door-to-door effort to get residents to attend the Tuesday meeting to support the interim ordinance.

The planning commissioner said the ordinance is needed for the following reasons:

- The existing zoning ordinance (passed in 1967) is outdated and fails to reflect the existing master land use plan.

- The population of Canton was only 8,000 when the existing ordinance was passed, but the population is now more than 40,000. Thus, few persons now living in Canton had input.

- Canton is absorbing the greatest amount of growth of any community in

the Detroit metropolitan area. It is under tremendous pressure to develop.

- In terms of the need for an emergency zoning ordinance, the proposed permanent zoning ordinance changes more than 60 per cent of the master plan — which clearly points out a comprehensive rezoning.

- Under the current zoning ordinance, people are piled up in northeast Canton. This subjects northeast Canton to intense urbanization and blighted strip commercial conditions along Ford Road.

Richardson said he believes one of his major concerns, a continuous strip of commercial development along Ford Road, will be realized if the interim zoning ordinance is not passed.

The commissioner said enough businesses could get site plan approvals in key lots before the permanent zoning ordinance is passed that a checker-board effect would be created.

Once those key lots are developed commercially, Richardson said, it would be unfeasible to carry out his concept of alternating commercial uses with other zoning uses to prevent a strip of businesses along Ford Road similar to that in Westland or Garden City.

## Second flood angers residents

Wade said the EPA studies would not be completed for about another year.

Residents charged that the flooding was caused by overbuilding in Canton and the trash that has been allowed to collect in township storm drains. Other than saying both reasons were possible, Wade and Kennedy refused further comment.

Culbert said two drains near the area north of Ford Road, which was hardest hit rain on both occasions, are being cleaned out. He said he would have to seek Board of Trustees approval to authorize any further cost of drain clearing.

**THE SUPERVISOR** shares the feeling of some residents, that the debris and mud in the storm drains is the major cause of the flooding. He said he did not believe the drains had ever been cleaned since they were installed about 10 years ago.

"About five years ago, the crew tried to clear the vegetation like cattails out of the drains and almost got shot. People said they liked having the cat tails in the drain," Culbert said.

The supervisor said he personally believed the storm drains were the cause of most of the flooding. At the meeting, Culbert also said he believed the township has reached its sewer capacity.

"The tests Wade, Trim is conducting will give us the evidence we need to prove it," he said.

The Wade, Trim representatives were more reluctant to attribute the flooding to any particular cause.

The audience was told that the street storm sewers and storm drains were the responsibility of the Wayne County Road Commission, while the main drains came under the jurisdiction of the Wayne County Drain Commission.

The cost of cleaning out the storm drains is being paid by Canton Township. According to Culbert, the cost for cleaning out two drains will run about \$40,000.

The supervisor's office received around 130 calls about the flooding after the July 11 rains. Culbert said he believed damage to homes amounted to "well over \$100,000."

it'll take to finish. For something simple, like a sun catcher, I usually say three weeks," he said.

Iovan said that he assists customers in coordinating colors for their projects.

First, the customer should have an idea where they are going to put the project when it is finished. The

lighting of the room or area in which it will be placed helps enhance the beauty of the glass, according to Iovan.

The various types of glass are also important because they reflect light differently. Texture and grains of an opal essence give a dark background, while a cathedral essence will bring in light, said Iovan.

Besides working on customer's projects, Iovan also plans on holding classes of his own.

"I get a lot of students in here. So I'm trying to work with them more."

I plan on starting some six-week courses in the fall. I already have about 25 people interested," Iovan said. He added that the courses would be open to any age group.

## Senators haggle on Headlee

A state Senate bill implementing the Headlee tax amendment — which would require local governments to pay for state-mandated programs — has some municipal officials steaming as the legislature breaks for the summer.

Some say the bill, now in the state House Appropriations Committee, is violating the intent of the original amendment by narrowly defining the types of programs which the state requires of local governments.

Michigan Municipal League officials claim it's hard to imagine a mandated program the state would have to pay for under the bill.

State Sen. Robert Geake, who opposed the bill, thinks the bill has deliberately set out to create loopholes for the legislature to avoid paying for programs it requires of local governments.

"I agree with Headlee that the legislature has really cheated the voters out of the tax relief they believed they were getting when they voted for the amendment," Geake said Tuesday.

And tax critic Richard Headlee, who spearheaded the drive for the tax limitation amendment which was passed by voters in November, has blasted legislators for the new bill, calling it unconstitutional.

Headlee interprets the bill as a loophole in the tax limitation amendment which would allow the state to force local governments to increase costs.

"For instance, the state could mandate that local governments increase the amount of overtime pay it gives to its firefighters," Headlee said last week.

"While local governments would be forced to increase property taxes to cover the increased costs, state politicians would reap the benefits of favorable public opinion from the action.

"We want state government out of local government's business," Headlee said, repeating a theme of last year's campaign.

**THE TAX LIMITATION** amendment, Proposal E on last November's ballot, prohibits the state from requiring any new or expanded activities by local governments without full state financing.

Another section says the state is prohibited from reducing financing for any existing activity or service required of units of local government under state law.

The Senate bill exempts from reimbursement all local services not specifically required by state law but which are traditionally provided by local governments, including police and fire protection, emergency medical services, libraries, parks and the like.

State Sen. Doug Ross, D-Oak Park, one of the sponsors of Senate Bill 460 — which passed the Michigan Senate last week by only one vote — says the proposal is in line with the way the Headlee amendment was written.

"The legislature must implement the amendment as passed. We did that with the first section regarding property taxes," Ross said.

"The second part deals with who will pay for programs. It's an internal squabble between state and local levels of government — a tempest in a teapot. But either way, taxpayers will foot the bill.

"Local officials want to go beyond the wording of the amendment so that any time the state mandates a program, it should pay."

The sole provision in the Headlee amendment which was favored by almost all school and municipal officials in the state required local governmental units to be reimbursed for programs mandated by state and federal officials.

SB 460 would nullify much of that provision.

**STATE SEN.** Geake said he voted for a number of amendments to the Senate bill, all of which were defeated. The amendments, he said, would have maintained the original meaning of the Headlee amendment.

"It was left to the legislature to define mandated costs," Geake said. "The bill was drafted by Democrats who had opposed the (Headlee) amendment."

The Senate bill gets around the Headlee intent of making the state pay for new programs it requires of local governments, he said, "by its definition of necessary cost, by its definition of service, by its definition of state requirement."

"It appears the state could require a number of things and still require local taxpayers to pay for them.

"I think the bill deliberately sets out to create loopholes for the legislature to avoid paying for programs."

**IN A RELATED** matter, a recent report of the Michigan Tax Association says that constitutional amendments have an inherent weakness.

The report, by John M. LaRose, executive assistant of the Michigan Tax Association, says such amendments fall prey to what can best be described as difficulty in communication.

The problem, LaRose said, is in making sure voters understand the intent of the amendment drafters and that the intent of the drafters and voters are made known to the legislature.

To write a petition of only a few words to change complex public policy is to invite ambiguity when attempts at implementation are made, he said. To write long, detailed petitions is to further confuse and irritate voters, he added.

"Such a peril is faced by the recently enacted constitutional provision requiring the costs mandated to local governments by new activities and services be reimbursed by the state," LaRose said.

The kicker is that state law doesn't require essential services such as police and fire protection and emergency medical units.

Richard Headlee has claimed that the intent of his amendment was to get the legislature out of the business of local government. The drafter intended that activities and services be broadly defined, LaRose said.

All costs mandated by state law, including new interpretations of state law, should be appropriated and disbursed before the activity or service could be legally binding under Headlee, he added.

**"THESE INTERPRETATIONS** make sound political sense," LaRose said. "However it doesn't appear the left hand is aware of what the right hand is doing since what is given by the bill in one section is restricted or taken back by another."

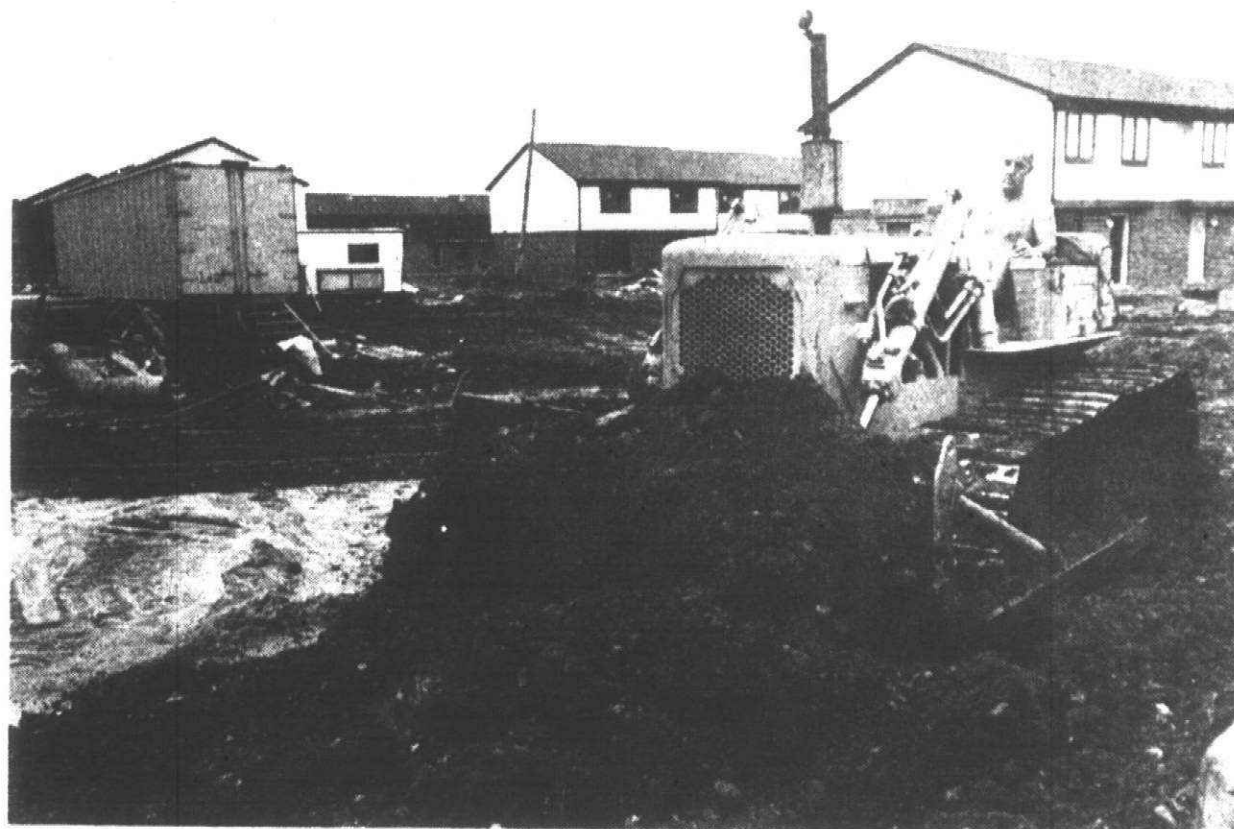
Costs resulting from a state law which applies to a local government is exempt from reimbursement. Also exempt are increased costs to local units which are only incidental to the main purpose and objective of the state law.

"I can't imagine the Michigan legislature would allow such a broad, non-specific exception to creep into any language of a constitutional amendment designed to accomplish just the opposite," LaRose said.

"It doesn't require any imagination to conjure up visions of abuse that these two exceptions would allow. Also exempted are court-mandated costs to local governments, state laws which would result in off-setting savings to local units, and additional duties which can be performed by existing staff with no appreciable increase in costs. The bill also exempts costs which can be recovered from the federal government or other sources.

**"THERE ARE** some exceptions that are warranted and others which many will find debatable, including the courts. But the ones I've specifically mentioned are simply outside the parameters of common sense in any attempt to determine what the drafters intended or what the people thought the amendment would accomplish.

"Alternative ways to spend public money must be examined. We may have to go without some programs and reassign priorities. Otherwise the bottom line may be that legislators would stop creating requirements for local governments. All these alternatives hurt. They were meant to."

## Fan's seeing too much blue at the old ballpark

Down at Tiger Stadium on 78 different days this year you will find a considerable number of disgusting, sloppy, totally inexcusable actions that are a lot of fun to watch. And you don't even have to worry about listening to any disco music.

If you happen to hit a slow day, you can usually rely on the game to provide at least mild amusement. But what we're mainly talking about here is the bleacher section, Ron LeFlore's favorite part of the ballpark.

The Detroit Baseball Club is the corporate front for a man named John Fetzer. He owns what everybody else calls the Tigers, when they're not calling them something even worse. This summer, the baseball club has turned the bleachers into a sort of pay-as-you-go Stalag 17.

A misguided move that is only a small part of the larger, even more misguided reconstruction that buck to a corporation established by Detroit. In return, the former owners acquired a 30-year lease

and renovation financing of about \$13.5 million. Some of this financing came through federal grants awarded because of the city's involvement, but \$8.5 million took the form of bonds.

Somewhere, the bondholders are clipping their coupons in security and comfort. Maybe they worry about the problem of hiring good help, because they sure don't worry about the bonds — upwards of 1.5 million people continue to push through the ballpark turnstiles, rain or shine, pennant or cellar, year in and year out. Each of them ponies up 50 cents to pay off the bonds every time they enter the park, a sum included in the ticket price and called a surcharge.

Oh yes. The baseball club has that lease. You should have such a lease.

The club pays the city's corporation a sliding scale of rent, based on how many people attend during the year. Club officials are very coy about telling you just how much the rent is, but that doesn't really matter.

IT DOESN'T MATTER because none of that money is going anywhere. Right now, the rent money helps pay off the bonds, but when they're retired it will go into a fund. The fund will be around awhile — the 30-year lease has three 10-year options to renew. By the time they all expire, the patina of age may have given Ron LeFlore the same misty glory as Ty Cobb.

All that while, the rent fund will be used to fix up Tiger Stadium in whatever way the baseball club and the city's corporation decide is nice.

This is like paying rent to the landlord who uses the money to build a pool in the backyard that you use to sell tickets to the neighbors so you can get money to pay your rent. Nice work, if you can get it.

Still, Tiger Stadium is an aging structure and this arrangement just may have saved it from the scrap heap.

Fetzer's organization will never threaten the Little Sisters of The Poor when it comes to benevolence. Ask Willie Horton. Ask Les Moss. If it was

cheaper to tear down the park than to fix it, the wrecking ball would be on the scene so fast there would be a parade of cops writing speeding tickets in its wake.

AND IT SEEMS to me a better than even bet than when the time came to build a replacement stadium, Coleman Young would have twisted enough legislative arms to get the same sugary deal for the Tigers that the Lions made a beeline for in building the taxpayers' \$54 million Silverdome. The current arrangement is chicken feed by comparison.

But back to the bleachers. Some structural renovation is taking place, but the noticeable work will be the replacement of the old wooden benches with new, aluminum benches. They will be — blech! — blue. They will probably also be very cold in the spring and fall.

The ball club says workers refuse to expose themselves to winter weather in the unprotected upper deck bleachers, so the replacement of those bleachers has to take place in the summer.

I have my doubts about that. A lot of construction workers would be on their way to the dentist if their eyeteeth would get them a job in the usually unemployment-filled winter.

COINCIDENTALLY, it is also during the summer that most people say, 'Hey, let's go see a ball game.' Not many drop everything for a two-night doubleheader on Christmas Eve.

When your father wasn't old enough to have a mustache, there were 11,211 bleacher seats. That's how many there were last year, too. This year, because of the renovation, there are 3,428.

But wait — it's worse than it sounds. Of those, only 1,385 are in the upper deck. Now, anybody who attends Tiger games knows that the upper deck bleachers are the place to be. Retirees and a very strange man named Dirty Dinky Davis are about the only people who sit in the lower deck by choice.

This means that while the Tigers are selling no more than 3,428 bleacher seats per game, about an even 3,400 of those ticket holders end up packing themselves onto upper deck benches that supposedly hold only 1,385 people.

You can easily wait an inning and a half in the beer line, and no more concession stands are included in the renovation.

The bleacher renovation is supposed to be finished in September, so maybe everything will be back to normal for the World Series.

This will give you a lot of happiness as you watch it on your television — but look at the bright side. At least the beer at home doesn't cost a buck, and you don't have to wait in line in the restroom.

The grinder was a thing to behold and there is a reminder of those days now in the lobby of the Mayflower Hotel where Charlie Langel has restored one of the bits of machinery that was so fascinating in the long ago.

There were other things about the old-time grocery store that made it far different from the supermarkets we have today. For instance, many of them were heated with an old pot belly stove. In many cases each stove had a railing around it for the men to rest their feet while sitting in the chairs to discuss the happenings of the day.

Along with the pot belly stove was the old-time cracker barrel from which you helped yourself and then had the bag weighed at the counter. But the things The Stroller liked best were the old-time pickle barrels and the mackerel tubs.

IT WAS ALWAYS fun to reach down in to the pickle barrel and draw one of

the delicacies. And, it seemed, the deeper your arm went in to the barrel, the more tasty were the pickles you pulled out.

It so happened that in our home we had a Sunday morning ritual — large mackerel for breakfast. Other mornings we would have the usual oat meal or a scrambled egg or two.

But on Sundays, things were different. It was mackerel time, and The Stroller, as a youngster, often was given the task of reaching into the brine and selecting the mackerel. Mother then had a special way of preparing it, so that Sunday was a special day.

Such things as reaching into the pickle barrel or the mackerel tub wouldn't be allowed today. Authorities claim it would be dangerous to one's health, and it would not be sanitary to have one person after another dip his or her hand into the brine. It is the same with the pickle barrel.

But, somehow, we all survived those days and even now as he writes these words, The Stroller would like nothing better than to make one more stab in to the pickle barrel and then sit down to a Sunday morning breakfast of salt mackerel.

# House cuts tax proposal on 'windfall' oil profits

Here's how area Members of Congress were recorded on major roll call votes in the days before the July 4 recess.

## HOUSE

**WINDFALL PROFITS** — The House adopted 236 for and 183 against, an amendment reducing from 70 to 60 percent a proposed tax on "windfall" oil company profits. Such profits will occur when federal price controls are lifted from domestic oil, allowing today's artificially depressed price to rise to world market levels. The amendment also set a 1990 expiration date for the tax. As approved later and sent to the Senate, the windfall bill (HR3919) was weaker than the version sent to the floor by the Ways and Means Committee but tougher than President Carter's proposal.

Supporters of the amendment said a lower tax rate would encourage domestic oil production. "Your constituents

may think (a tax) is necessary to protect them from profits that will be made by decontrol, but your constituents also want more energy," said Rep. Henson Moore, R-La.

Opponents favored a higher tax, with the revenues used to find new energy supplies. "When (the oil companies) get these profits in their hands, they might decide that something else, not energy at all, would yield a better return," said Rep. Joseph Fisher, D-Va.

Members voting yea wanted oil companies to keep a larger share of windfall profits resulting from decontrol of oil prices.

Reps. William Broomfield, R-Bloomfield Township, voted yea.

Reps. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, David Bonior, D-Mount Clemens, William Ford, D-Taylor, William Brodhead, D-Detroit, and James Blanchard, D-Pleasant Ridge, voted nay.

adopted, 263 for and 152 against, an amendment cutting \$500 million from the \$73.6 billion fiscal 1980 budget for the departments of Labor and Health, Education and Welfare (HEW). The cut applies to HEW programs where audits show excessive fraud and waste. The amendment was attached to HR 4389, later passed and sent to the Senate.

Rep. Robert Michel, R-Ill., the sponsor said: "I think it is important that we continue to hold HEW's feet to the

fire on the matter of waste, fraud and abuse."

Rep. David Obey, D-Wis., an opponent, said the amendment would only penalize states because HEW would pass the cut through to state allotments for Medicaid and Aid to Families with Dependent Children. "My own state is going to lose \$18 million in federal sharing money this year," he said.

Members voting yea favored the amendment.

Pursell, Broomfield voted yea. Bonior, Ford, Brodhead and Blanchard voted nay.

**RHODESIA SANCTIONS** — The House defeated, 147 for and 242 against, an amendment to require President Carter to lift the embargo on U.S. trade with Zimbabwe-Rhodesia on Dec. 1. Later, the House passed a bill (HR 4439) giving Carter discretion to lift sanctions as early as Oct. 15 if he so chooses. This issue will be resolved in conference with the Senate, which has voted to immediately end the sanctions.

Rep. Eldon Rudd, R-Ariz., a supporter, said: "The U.S. should provide this opportunity for the new nation to demonstrate its strength."

Rep. Stephen Solarz, D-N.Y., an opponent, said lifting the embargo would allow the Soviet Union to portray itself as the champion of majority rule in southern Africa, "while simulta-

neously portraying us as the defenders of minority domination."

Most members voting yea are sympathetic to the new Rhodesian-Zimbabwe government of Bishop Abel Muzorewa; most member voting nay want to take a harder line against his government and continue the U.S. trade embargo against the African country.

Broomfield voted yea. Pursell, Bonior, Ford, Brodhead and Blanchard voted nay.

## SENATE

**VIRGIN ISLANDS** — By a vote of 35 for and 43 against, the Senate rejected an amendment to delete \$20 million earmarked to the Virgin Islands government during the current fiscal year. The amendment was offered to a supplemental appropriations bill (HR 4289), later passed and sent to conference with the House.

## Hoye's comeback continues as Floyd's manager disputes decision

Detroit middleweight boxer Rico Hoye raised his professional record to 32-2-1 Thursday night with a close 10-round split decision over Sammy "King" Floyd at the third "Olympia Fights" at Center Stage in Canton Township.

It was the eighth straight victory for Hoye since suffering an ankle injury while playing touch football.

The Hoye bout was the first feature match of the six-bout card at the Center Stage Nightclub, which drew 658 fans.

In another middleweight bout, Detroit's Nathaniel Akbar knocked out Willie Brown of Akron, Ohio, at 1:04 of the first round in a scheduled six rounder.

The victory for the 25-year-old Hoye was not easy. In fact, the outcome of the bout was in doubt until the judges' decision. Many fans thought Floyd had scored an upset victory, but when the announcement was made, the decision was booed vehemently.

Floyd's trainer, Dean Oswald, called the decision "foolish" and "ridiculous."

"I think it was a farce," Oswald said after, near the entrance to Floyd's dressing room. "The crowd knew it. What's frustrating is that 'King' trained so hard for this and gets something like this."

"To win here, you have to knock the guy out. I think there are judges around far more capable than the three they had out there tonight."

WHEN HE ANSWERED the bell for the 10th and final round, Floyd threw his hands up in triumph, signaling to the crowd that he had the match well in hand.

The 10th round, however, proved to be Floyd's worst. Hoye pressed the attack and landed several good punches.

Floyd, whose record is 11-4 in his professional career, dominated the first four rounds, landing an occasional punch but never staggering Hoye.

Floyd was the more aggressive of the two boxers but seemed to tire in the later rounds. Hoye had trouble with his footwork in the first two rounds and slipped to the canvas three times.

"I had new shoes on and couldn't get many good punches off," said Hoye after.

eward. "There was no rosin in the ring."

"I lost nine pounds in 10 days and felt a little weak going in, even though I got stronger later on," Hoye said.

The Detroit boxer, who prepared for the fight at the Real Life Farm and Day Camp in Canton Township, got down to the 160-pound limit the day before the bout.

"Floyd was cagey, kind of awkward tonight. He slipped good back and forth and was in good condition."

"I'm going to start training Monday (today)."

Hoye's manager-trainer, the veteran Al DeNapoli, said "Rico didn't do anything well."

"He should have won more impressively, but you can't take anything

away from the other fighter."

"HE WAS STRONG (Floyd) and took some shots. Rico just wasn't himself tonight."

Oswald said he is going to file a complaint with Michigan State Boxing Commissioner Chuck Davey of Birmingham.

"The people who assign the judges should look into the matter more. We need some revamping and better control," Oswald said.

"I think Davey is doing a good job, but maybe he should come out here and see more cards like this."

"I think you should be able to fight anywhere in Michigan and be given a fair shake."

It was the second close decision at Center Stage for Floyd. On the first

Center Stage card in early May, he lost a tough match to Melvindale pro Mickey Goodwin.

"I fought Floyd one time and that was enough," said Goodwin, who has lost only one pro bout.

In the first fight on the card, Dujuan Johnson, a junior welterweight, raised his mark to 3-0 with a technical knockout over Donzell Smith of Philadelphia in the first round.

In another junior welterweight bout, Detroit's Earl Stringer defeated Levant Williams in the fifth round on a technical knockout.

Heavyweights Joe Louis Jones of Detroit and Larry Simms of Cleveland fought to a four-round draw.

## DiPonio stymied by lefty hurler

Plymouth Salem DiPonio ran into a lefthanded buzzsaw Thursday night.

Meanwhile, George mopped up as he allowed just two hits and four balls out of the infield.

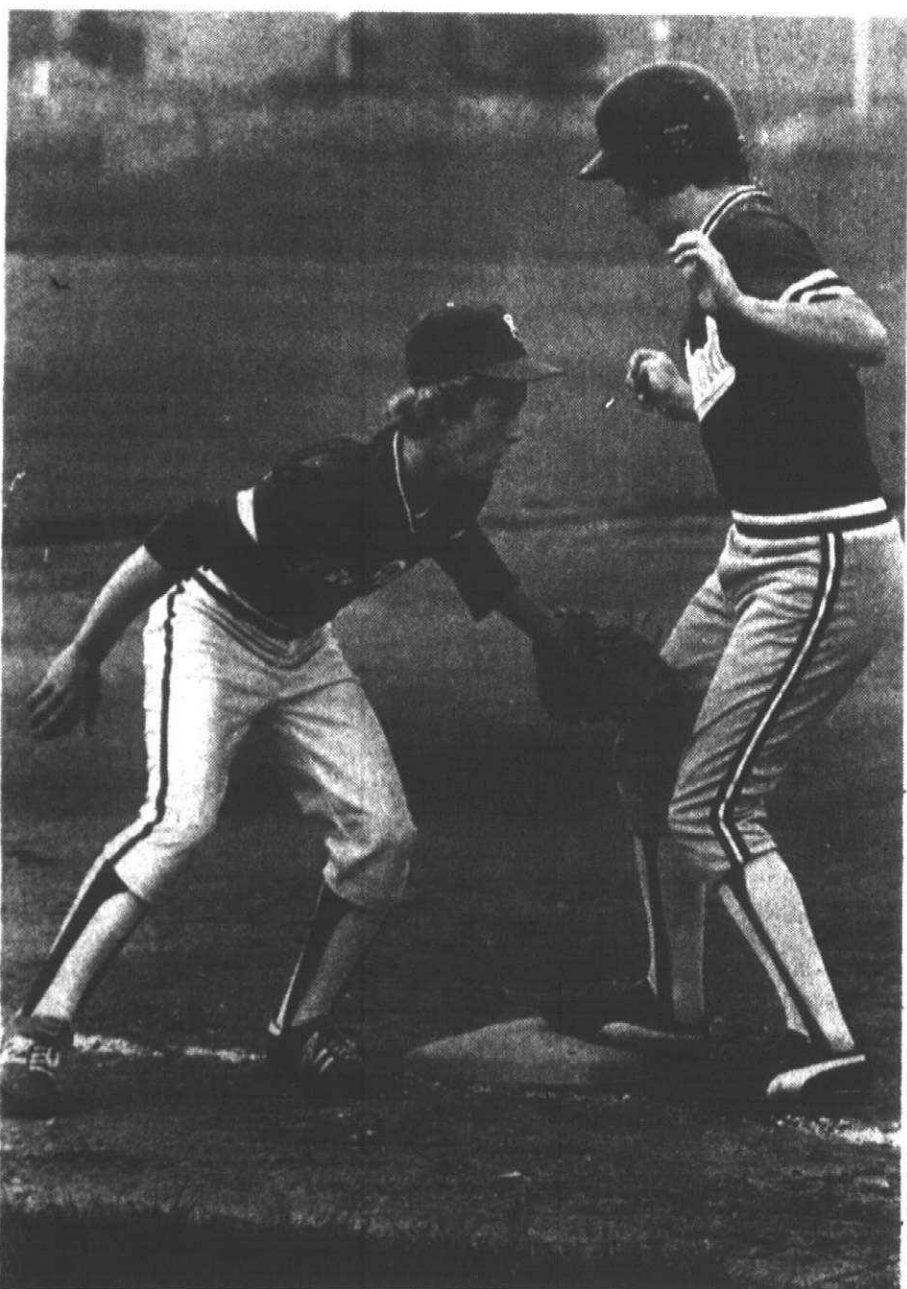

## Thoroughbred racing season opens

Long distance runner eyes big race

Peggy Acton's goal of running in the Boston Marathon has been temporarily delayed.

Earlier this year Mrs. Acton qualified for the 26-mile, 385-yard event by winning the Delta College (Saginaw) race for women 26 and over. Her time was a sparkling 3:27.27.

That time met the women's qualifying mark of 3:30. But because of the volumes of applicants the world-famous Marathon attracts, officials were forced to recently lower qualifying times.

Mrs. Acton was an innocent victim.

The 43-year-old Rochester housewife has not, however, abandoned her plans to conquer the hallowed streets of Boston. If anything, she has been spurred by recent developments.

She plans on another qualifying attempt this October at the Detroit Free Press International Marathon. Mrs. Acton is hoping to sheer off some seven minutes which will send her to Boston.

"Seven minutes is a lot of time to cut off — it's almost half-a-minute for every mile," said Mrs. Acton. "I don't know if I'll be able to do it, but I'm working awfully hard at it."

"If I don't do it this year, I'll be out there again sometime next year," she

said. "My goal is to run in the Boston Marathon."

A mother of four children, Peggy Acton decided to start running about three years ago. And, instead of it hurting her family life like she feared, she has found something both she and her husband, Ed, can enjoy together.

She says jogging and conditioning have given her "more energy" to do things "than before."

DECIDING to become a serious jogger was only the first step to a rewarding avocation for Mrs. Acton.

It began with a class at Oakland University taught by Dr. Fred Stransky, who is an expert in exercise physiology. From there, she began running 10 to 15 miles per week, and eventually became an assistant to Dr. Stransky, as well as teaching her own class in conditioning and running for women.

"It's important to start slowly," she advises potential runners. "If you can walk a mile in 15 minutes and feel comfortable, then you are ready to start jogging slowly."

She adds that flexibility and stretching exercises are important before running — "just five minutes to stretch out the muscles."

Her class is composed of women who are mostly over 40, with many looking to lose some pounds before running

seriously. Thus, Mrs. Acton stresses diet and nutrition as prerequisites to healthy exercise.

Jogging has always been a pleasure activity for her. Only in the last year did she begin to race competitively, with the help of a couple friends — Keith Shuert and Dick Bates. She learned to pace her running to make it through a race in decent time.

"I really didn't think I was that competitive," she said. "But, the first time I raced, I noticed a kind of funny feeling in my stomach — I was really excited."

"I don't like it as much when preparing for a race. I know I have to run more and the pressure is greater. But, I've set a goal for myself to run in two marathons a year."

AS A DEVOTEE of running, Mrs. Acton is aware of the criticisms that have developed over the past few years from doctors who found people were getting hurt from the presumed healthy exercise.

The initial wave of enthusiasm wore off when it was realized that some persons, notably heart patients or those who were overweight, were suffering heart attacks from jogging. But Mrs. Acton notes that much of the problems were due to improper instruction and lack of awareness on the part of doc-

tors and runners alike.

"I see a lot of people who start up too fast, or who get injured and then run on injuries," said Mrs. Acton, who recently took a second-place at an 11-mile race at the Silverdome.

"If you are 35 or over, and have a weight problem, check with your doctor first, and also read up on the subject of running, aerobics and diet. Also, find a good pair of shoes which are specifically designed for running. They cost from \$25-30, but are needed to help prevent injury."

Jogging can be a year-around event that the whole family can participate in. And, as Mrs. Acton proved, raising a family or being over 35 is no excuse for someone who wants some enjoyable and needed exercise.

"We're all capable of doing so much more than we do," she said. "I hope to be running for the rest of my life."

Already her interest in running has led to other sporting events which many only read about. Besides the usual golf, tennis and other sports, Peggy and a couple friends spent a fortnight on a whitewater backpacking trip down the Colorado River.

It was an experience which she says she will never forget, and something she might not have done a few years ago. Neither was the Boston Marathon.

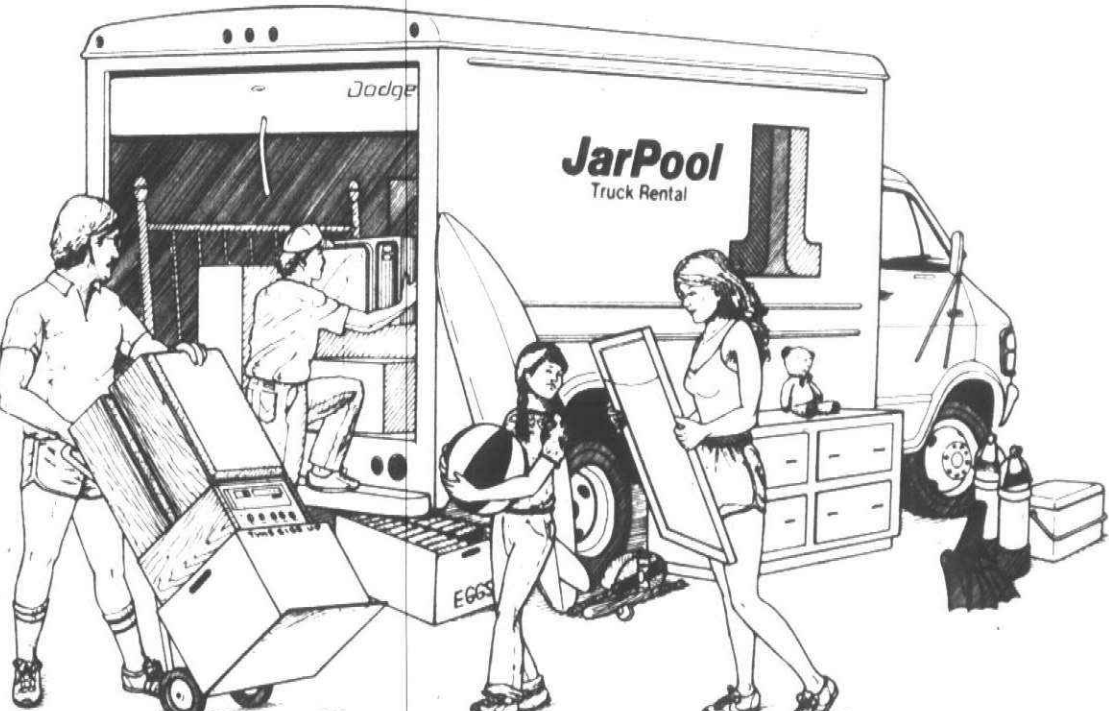

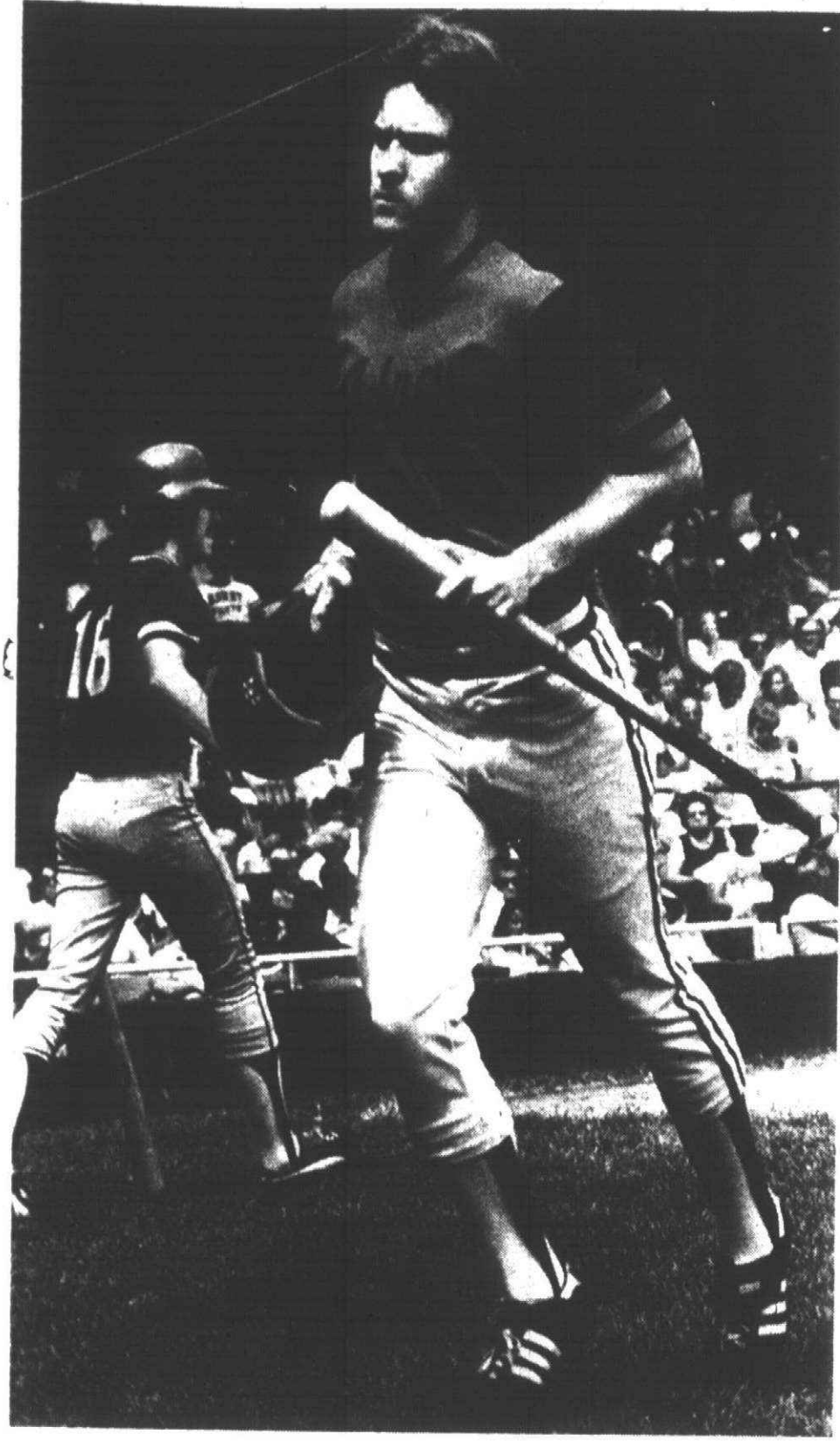

## Stewart on tennis:

## Mental aspect is key

By DAVID W. STEWART

When you are not playing tennis well, do not let your opponent know how you are feeling.

Many players get enraged at themselves or their opponents when they can't get their first serves in or their forehands are continually going everywhere but where they want.

Some days you just can't seem to get your game together.

So what do you do when you have a bad day? The most important part of your game to change is your mental attitude. Never let your opponent know how you are feeling.

If you get frustrated and you kick balls instead of picking them up, throw your racket into the backstop or do any one of a number of things that indicate to your opponent that something is wrong, then your opponent's game will get better.

Your opponent will become more sure of himself or herself because he or she knows the madder you get the worse you are going to play. And the more errors you make, the more points you lose.

A match is never won by who hits the greatest number of winners but by who makes the least number of errors. This rule of tennis holds true even at the world class level.

So what happens when you have a bad day? Your percentage of errors increases, you destroy your game and your opponent walks off a winner.

The next time you miss an important shot, do one of two things — either laugh at yourself or become expressionless. When a player laughs at himself and makes light of his mistake, his opponent can become unsettled. The next time you lose a number of crucial points, laugh openly at what a klutz you are.

Act confident — act like you are going to win. Act like the loss of an important point doesn't bother you in the slightest.

**MAYBE YOU** are the type of person who can't laugh at yourself. If this is the case, don't show any emotion at all. Stop all the gestures and the words and phrases you have been muttering and ignore your opponent.

Be cool, be calm, act confident, and you will be amazed at the effect this attitude will have on your opponent. The person across the net wants to know what you are thinking and feeling. When no reaction can be seen, your opponent starts to worry about what is going on in your head instead of playing his or her own game.

When this happens, the

number of errors start to increase with the person on the other side of the net — not on yours.

Always remain calm on the outside regardless of how you are tearing yourself apart inside. A calm exterior has an amazing effect on your psychological perspective. If you act calm, you feel calm.

You can't be unhappy long if you grin and laugh to the outside world. This is certainly true on the tennis court.

**SOMETHING** else happens when you get angry — you will start to feel tired. The more angry you become, the more tired you become. The result is that of being a loser instead of a winner.

How many times have you felt down, tired and angry and have been a winner? Only a very few times — if at all.

A winner is confident. When you are confident, you feel it and your opponent feels it. A feeling of confidence affects the entire complexion of the game.

You can raise the level of your game by feeling confident, and you can make your opponent lose his or her confidence. Your opponent's level of play will deteriorate right before your eyes.

It is all in how you feel.

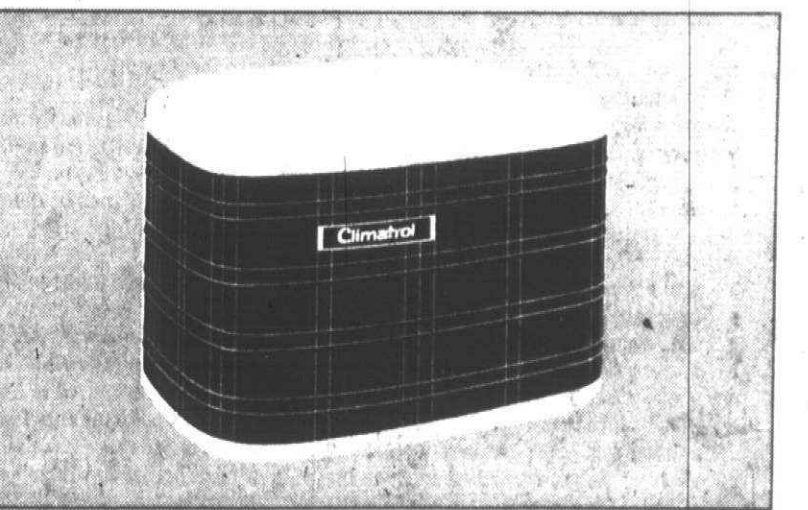

# Township buys computer help

The Plymouth Township Board has awarded a contract to Livonia Public Schools for computer service to the township's water and sewer department.

Livonia Schools, which has an advanced data processing system, will process 5,060 water bills and statements for \$13,332 annually plus postage, according to the contract.

In the past few months, the township has been looking into whether it should purchase such a service or buy its own computer equipment to do the work in the township.

The school system was selected after a committee recently compared other offers made by Burroughs Corp. and Accounts Computer Service Co. of Plymouth Township.

The motion, made by Trustee Maurice Breen and supported by Trustee Lee Fidge, was unanimously approved by board members.

The board previously had accepted the purchase of an extensive Burroughs computer but rescinded action June 12 when trustees requested more information about other company offerings. When the original decision was made only Burroughs and IBM were quoted.

Township Supervisor Thomas Notebaert described this school system's offer as "the least expensive way to go in the long run."

According to Breen, who served on the computer study committee, Livonia has experience in this type of work. It also processes the water bills for the city of Livonia.

He added the contract with Livonia schools was "a way to ease into the computer age without too much disruption to office functions."

Additionally, the school system has offered to train township personnel when Plymouth Township decides to secure its own office computer.

The board's decision received support from a representative from another company vying for the service bid.

William Morrison, of Accounts Computer Service Co., said: "I think you'll find the transition a lot easier than going into your own right away."

# Schoolmates to gather for Patchin reunion

Reunions are a tradition for high school classes. But it takes a special elementary school to inspire reunion efforts from its alumni.

Patchin Elementary School in Westland is just such a school. Its busy reunion committee is now calling for all parents, teachers and students involved with the institution to gather for a picnic in Plymouth Township Park at 11 a.m. Sunday, July 29. The park is on Ann Arbor Trail west of Sheldon.

In a effort to put a collective finger on why Patchin was so special, three former students sat down recently to talk about their school days. It was a conversation that evoked the ankle sock, saddle shoe, long-skirt days of the '40s and '50s.

Their recollections were far different from what a student who entered the school when it opened in a log cabin in 1834 would remember. The land was donated by a farmer named Abel Patchin, who had no formal education himself, but nonetheless respected it.

Originally situated at Newburgh and Warren, the school moved to its present location at 6420 Newburgh in 1852 when it became a three-room white clapboard structure. A third version, a three-story brick building, was built in 1921 and used until 1960. Later part of it was torn down, but another section was left standing and surrounded by a new building dedicated in 1965.

**IT WAS THE SMALL** number of students, the closeness of the students and the quality of the teaching that made Patchin unusual in the opinion of former pupils Connie Ward of Garden City, Gordon Smith of Plymouth and Mary Alice Strothers of Livonia.

They also looked back fondly on school romances, the school bell, the annual picnic and even the maypole and the merry-go-round on the school grounds.

"We knew the name of every kid in school," said Mrs. Ward, who with the other two estimated that from 200-250 children attended Patchin in their day.

This small number produced "a closeness you don't get in schools today," in the opinion of Mrs. Strothers. She added: "And we lived here all our

lives. Most kids move a lot so they don't get that closeness.

"I think we enjoyed school more than kids do today. The work was presented differently. We had dedicated teachers. They took a real interest in each of us. I remember our eighth grade teacher telling us 'I'll make ladies out of you girls before the end of the year.'"

Smith recalled that Mrs. Penwick made him practice and practice his penmanship. "We really learned it," he acknowledged.

"Mrs. Hauk, our eighth grade teacher, was so dignified," put in Mrs. Ward. "She could command, but I don't remember her raising her voice. She could shame you for not doing your homework or talking in class."

Smith pointed out he could still remember the preamble to the U.S. Constitution and the Gettysburg Address, which Mrs. Hauk required her students to memorize. Hardly were his words out of his mouth when three voices in unison intoned "Four score and seven years ago" to remind each other they had not forgotten.

**A TEACHER NAMED** Mr. Dickerson made his mark on the memory of Smith in a striking way.

"If you were talking or messing around, boom," he said with a laugh. "Mr. Dickerson threw an eraser at you. That guy never missed."

Smith also found the kindergarten teacher unforgettable.

"Everybody loved Miss Jones," he reported. It was because of Miss Jones that he burst into tears when the school burned down in his kindergarten year.

"I thought I might not go to school again and see Miss Jones," he said. Fellow kindergartner Mrs. Strothers, who lived across the street from school, also cried as firemen fought the blaze. But her tears were for the loss of her crayons.

But Smith didn't lose Jones. School resumed in a home on Cowan Road, and the school was restored the following year, 1946.

Trying to sum up Patchin's appeal Mrs. Ward said: "It was a different era, and it was a country type school, but not THAT country."

Mrs. Ward added, "Nobody got out of

eighth grade who couldn't read, believe you me."

So great an impression was made on Smith and Mrs. Strothers by the small enrollment, closeness and dedicated Patchin teachers, that ironically they have turned to private schools to find the same qualities for their children.

**SMITH**, who is now sales manager of Saxon's Garden Center in Plymouth, seemed to have a wonderful ability for instant recall for the funny, the exciting and the mischievous side of school.

He remembers that students sometimes slipped out into the hall to give a healthy tug at unauthorized times on the rope that tolled the school bell. This revered bell, which hung in a belfry on the third floor, almost disappeared after that part of the school was torn down. But Wilfred Green, a student with a sense of history, saved it until the PTA decided to turn it into a monument at the front of the building.

Smith also mourned the passing of those thrilling and probably dangerous pieces of schoolyard equipment of yesteryear, the maypole and merry-go-round.

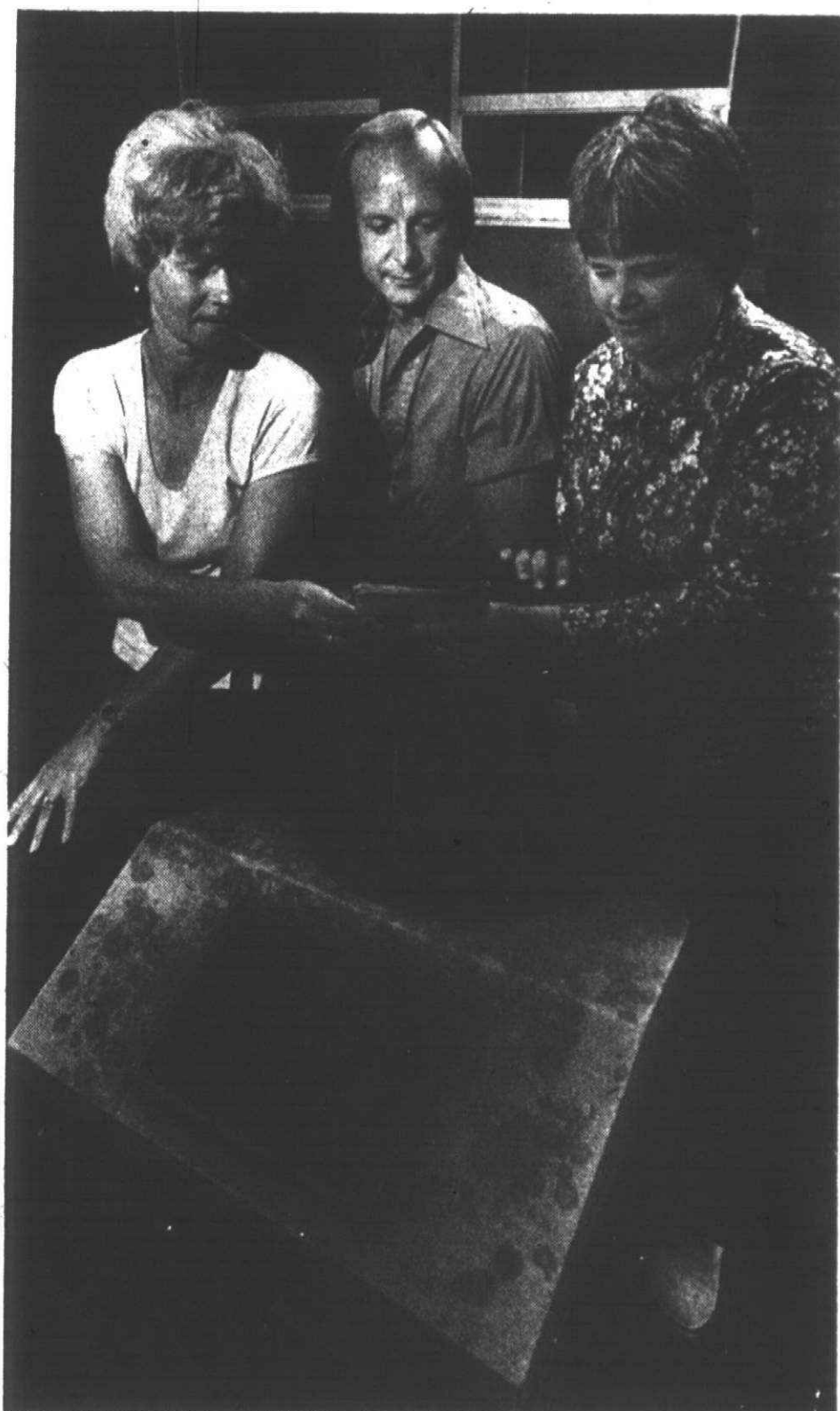
For those who never had the privilege of slamming into a cold steel maypole while trying to swing on its dangling metal handles, the maypole is a challenge. Grab the handles, run a little, then lift up your legs and swing free. At the same time be careful not to rocket into another student or scrape your knees on the ground.

The Patchin merry-go-round was powered by the child who settled at its middle. With his hand he pulled back and forth on a handle, a little like a man pumping a handcar down the railroad tracks. He also pumped with his feet.

"The faster and harder you pulled, the faster the merry-go-round spun around," noted Smith. "I used to get sick on it. When the kids got sick they were sent home. We played that game a lot. We'd eat our lunch and go get sick on the merrygo-round."

**WERE CHILDHOOD** romances part of the Patchin ambience?

"There were always romances," said Smith, smiling. "I liked Nancy Pickett

all the way through school. We'd walk home together. She once fell out of our barn and broke her arm."

"My romance was with Carl Weihman," mentioned Mrs. Strothers.

"When I arrived in sixth grade I was nervous," said Mrs. Ward. "I thought it would be difficult to start out in a new school. But since I was a new girl the boys liked me for a while."

"It was a little longer than a while," commented Smith gallantly.

Information on Patchin may be obtained through Anne Koch at the Wayne Historical Museum. She was willing to explain the confusion that has existed in the past about the spelling of its name. For a number of years it was spelled Patchen.

According to Mrs. Koch a man

named Ron Colopy who lived on property once owned by Abel Patchin became interested in doing research on the former owner. A packet of written materials unearthed in the Wayne museum revealed several papers signed by Patchin. This cleared up the confusion.

All three former students were looking forward to renewing old acquaintances at the upcoming reunion picnic. "I'd like to see Nancy Pickett," remarked Smith. "I haven't seen her since high school."

They advised participants to bring their own food, drinks and athletic equipment.

"We'll get a good old Patchin school baseball game going," declared Mrs. Strothers.

# Zucchini squash wears many guises

## ZUCCHINI APPLESAUCE

2 medium (or 2 lb.) zucchini peel and dice  
2 medium cooking apples, peel, core and dice  
½ cup water  
¼ cup sugar  
2 whole cloves  
½ teas. salt  
1 tablespoon lemon juice (optional)  
½ teas. cinnamon

### Regular cooking:

In large saucepan bring to boil zucchini, apples, water, sugar, cloves and salt. Reduce heat, cover, then cook 20

minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove cover and continue cooking until all liquid has evaporated.

Discard cloves. Mash mixture until smooth. Stir in lemon juice and cinnamon. Cover and refrigerate. Yield: About 2½ cups.

### For microwave oven:

Place zucchini, apples, sugar, cloves, salt in ¼ cup water in 2-quart casserole. Cover and cook 6-7 minutes or until tender, turning once. Mash mixture and add lemon juice and cinnamon.

## CREAM OF ZUCCHINI SOUP

(Serves six. Delicious hot or cold)  
1 onion chopped  
¼ cup butter  
3 cup chicken stock  
6 medium zucchini  
1½ cups light cream  
1 cup white wine

Saute onion until soft and golden. Add the stock and zucchini, a few celery leaves, a sprig of parsley and a dash of thyme. Simmer until zucchini is soft. Puree in blender and add cream and salt and pepper to taste.

## ZUCCHINI YEAST ROLLS

½ cup zucchini, cooked and mashed  
¼ cup sugar  
¼ cup shortening  
½ teas. salt  
½ cup scalded milk  
½ cake compressed yeast  
½ cup lukewarm water  
2½ cups flour

Combine squash, sugar, salt and shortening with milk. Heat to lukewarm. Dissolve yeast in lukewarm water and add to milk mixture. Add flour and mix well. Dough will be soft. Let rise in warm room until double in bulk. Knead and shape into pan rolls and let rise again in warm place. Bake in 400-degree oven for 15 to 20 minutes.

The flavor is very delicate in these rolls.

## ZUCCHINI PANCAKES

3 cups grated zucchini  
¼ cups grated parmesan cheese  
1 egg  
3 teas. minced parsley  
1 clove garlic, minced  
½ teas. salt Pepper ¼-1 cup biscuit mix.

Mix all ingredients together in a large bowl to make a fairly thin batter. Drop by spoonfuls onto oiled skillet. Flip pancakes when bubbles appear on the upper surface. Cook other side until

golden. Serve with butter and syrup or sour cream. Makes eight servings.

## ZUCCHINI BARS

¾ cup butter or margarine  
½ cup brown sugar  
½ cup sugar  
2 eggs  
1 teas. vanilla  
1½ cups flour  
1½ teas. baking powder  
2 cups shredded zucchini  
1 cup shredded coconut  
¾ cup chopped nuts

Cream butter until light and fluffy. Beat in sugar, add eggs one at a time. Beat in vanilla. Stir in flour and baking powder. Mix in zucchini, coconut and nuts. Spread evenly in a greased 15x10x1-inch baking pan. Bake in 350-degree oven for 30-35 minutes.

**FROSTING:** Beat together 1 cup confectioners sugar, 2½ tablespoons milk, 1½ tablespoons melted butter, 1 teaspoon vanilla and ¼ teaspoon cinnamon. Spread over warm layer. Cut into squares. Makes about 36 squares.

## ZUCCHINI CAKE

4 eggs  
1½ cups corn oil  
3 cups sugar  
3 cups finely grated zucchini

Beat eggs until light yellow. Add remaining ingredients and mix well until blended.

**Sift together:**  
3 cups flour  
1½ teas. baking powder  
1 teas. baking soda  
1½ teas. cinnamon  
1 teas. salt

Add to first mixture and blend well. Add one cup chopped nuts and one cup chopped raisins (optional). Bake in well-greased tube pan 1½ hours or a 9x13-inch pan one hour at 350 degrees.

**FROSTING:** Cream together one three-ounce package cream cheese, two cups powdered sugar which has been sifted, one tablespoon butter. Spread on top of cooled cake.

For chocolate cake, add two squares unsweetened chocolate.

For a more natural food, use the following instead: 1½ cups safflower oil, 1½ cups honey and 3 cups wheat flour.

## ZUCCHINI DROP COOKIES

1 cup grated zucchini  
1 teas. baking soda  
1 cup sugar  
½ cup sugar  
½ cup shortening or butter  
1 egg, beaten

2 cups flour  
1 teas. cinnamon  
½ teas. ground cloves  
½ teas. salt  
1 cup chopped nuts  
1 cup raisins (optional)

Mix together first five ingredients. Sift in flour and cinnamon and stir to blend. Stir in nuts and raisins. Drop batter by teaspoon on a greased cookie sheet.

Bake in 375-degree oven for 12 to 15 minutes.

Zucchini is high in protein, low in calories, sodium, fat and carbohydrates. It is a good source of vitamins A and C and potassium. Mrs. Fidge shreds or grates zucchini for freezing, in two and four-cup bags.

# Felicians visit with Pope in Poland

A letter inviting Pope John Paul II to visit Madonna College in Livonia is on its way to the Vatican with the warm greetings of two Madonna administrators who just crossed paths with the Holy Father twice in Europe.

Sister Mary Danatha and Sister Mary Lauriana, for 11 years Madonna's president and academic dean team, were close to the pope at Czestochowa and later had the opportunity to greet him in Rome in the course of their recent three-week trip.

By the time they were starting home they were thinking about an invitation to bring the pope to the college, operated by the Felician Sisters, an order that had its beginnings in Poland. The letter was sent off by Sister Mary Francilene, current Madonna president, even before last week's official announcement that John Paul II would travel to the United States in September.

"I think he will come to this part of the country," said Sr. Danatha, "and we're not that far away." "This could be his stop for a pause to refresh himself," added Sr. Lauriana.

## THE TWO EDUCA-

TORS — Sr. Danatha now is director of cooperative education and Sr. Lauriana vice president for development — returned late in June from a journey designed to "touch base with our heritage."

Both are second-generation Polish nationals. Sr. Danatha's parents came from Wadowice, the home town of the pope, and Sr. Lauriana's father was from a small village near Poznan. And, as Felicians, they have ties to Krakow, where their religious congregation was founded, and to Rome, where their motherhouse is located.

So the long-planned trip held excitement for both, even before it turned out that Pope John Paul II would be in Poland at the same time.

They worried just a little that their tour, which was planned by Palmar Travel Agency and took them all over Poland and to Rome and Lourdes, might be disrupted because of the crowds bound to see the Pope.

But it was only at Czestochowa that there was any change.

"They told us the Holy Father would be there at the same time we would," Sr. Lauriana said, "and we had the choice of accepting lesser hotel accommodations or going to a different place."

"Everyone chose to be

where the pope would be."

It worked out that their bus took them into the town where a monastery houses the Black Madonna painting, said to have stopped the Tartar invasion in the 16th century.

"The roads were blocked, but we had an escort into town," Sr. Danatha recalled. "We could look out and see all the thousands of people walking. There were so many there — there was an excitement you cannot forget."

THE TWO SISTERS said they had front row positions for the pope's motorcade appearance because "the Poles have a great respect for the religious and they lifted the ropes for us to go through."

Pope John Paul II, they said, spoke at the shrine "and talked of great love for those who are ill and those who care for the ill."

"He was bestowing a special blessing on those who help the sick," Sr. Danatha added.

They were particularly moved, they said, by the feeling in Czestochowa of excitement "but with love and adoration," and by the pope's actions like joining in singing with the people.

"He is so human in his approach to people," said Sr. Danatha. "He is very tender, gentle, calm," Sr.

Lauriana added. In Rome, the nuns said, they again managed to be close to John Paul II when he appeared in St. Peter's Square at the end of a rainstorm.

"When he was close, I said to him, 'Warm greetings from Livonia, Madonna College,'" Sr. Danatha said. "He asked what we were doing in Rome, and when I told him we were Felician sisters, his face really brightened."

THE TWO ENCOUNTERS with the pope were high points of the tour, but for the two teaching sisters, there were many other memorable times.

Especially there were the meetings with relatives. Sr. Lauriana, in pre-visit correspondence with cousins, learned that she had an 81-year-old uncle "still very much alive."

"My relatives were so happy to see us," she said, "but compared to my father who came to this country, they are so poor. What we could not understand was the lines at the markets to buy meat — people would wait two, three hours and still don't get any meat."

"And there is a great shortage of children's clothing — none are made there now, so there is inspection of the luggage of everyone who leaves the country so no

children's clothing will be taken out."

All the relatives, the nuns said, were experiencing their first visit

from someone from the United States.

"But after seeing them," mused Sr. Danatha, "I was glad to see them." (Continued on page 11B)

# Standards to remain high for Hawthorn workers

Child care workers in Michigan will continue to be called upon to fulfill certain education and age requirements because of efforts made by child care workers and nurses at Hawthorn Center in Northville.

Upset by plans of the Michigan Civil Service Commission to lower these standards, about 150 child care workers and about 30 nurses at the psychiatric facility for emotionally disturbed children formed the Coalition of Concerned Child Care Workers.

Led by Ann Lindamood of Plymouth, it fought the proposed changes mainly through a letter writing campaign.

The group objected to the civil service plan to rescind the minimum requirement of 58 semester hours of college education, without replacing it with any minimum education requirement.

It also found fault with the commission's intent to drop the requirement that a child care worker be 20 years old or over. In a statement on the issue, it pointed out that this could lead to having a 17-year-old patient being supervised by 18-year-old workers "who themselves may have never been beyond the care and supervision of their own parents."

CONTACTING CHILD CARE workers throughout the state, the coalition asked them to write their state legislators and officials at the state Department of Mental Health and Civil Service Commission.

Their efforts were successful. The Civil Service Commission recently announced a revision of its plans.

"There are two levels of child care workers," it announced. These are "individuals completing one year of college and individuals completing two years of college plus one year of experience in a DMH facility."

Because the education requirement would add a year or two to the age of a child care worker entering the field, as well as broadening the worker's background, the coalition was satisfied with the changes.

In a statement made before the Mental Health Advisory Council, Hawthorn child care worker Gary Heckman pointed out that while child care workers sometimes sort clothing and make beds, they also spend a great deal of time with the children at the facility where they work.

Heckman explained that these workers "assist children in learning basic self-care and social skills, planning their time and helping them cope with day-to-day problems. They must also make skillful judgements on when to intervene and when to set limits on behavior."

To do this the child care worker should have "a basic knowledge and understanding of the normal growth and development of children as well as an awareness of the deviations which may occur in this usual pattern," the coalition statement noted.

SUCH EDUCATION must be obtained in college, the statement concluded. Without education standards, the level of care would be reduced to custodial care, "thereby seriously inhibiting, or possibly preventing, the recovery of the children being treated."

In opposing the reduction of the age requirement, the coalition pointed out that this would mean the hiring of 18-year-olds who have not yet acquired the independence and maturity learned by being on their own.

"To require that a person makes responsible decisions and judgements with respect to another person's life without first having done so in his or her own life would seem to be irresponsible," said the coalition.

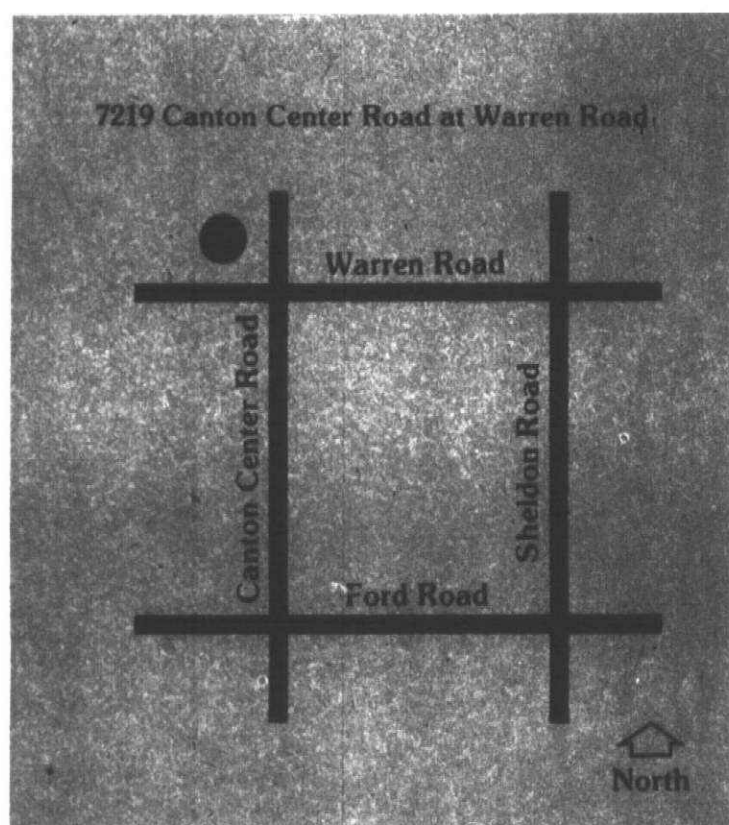

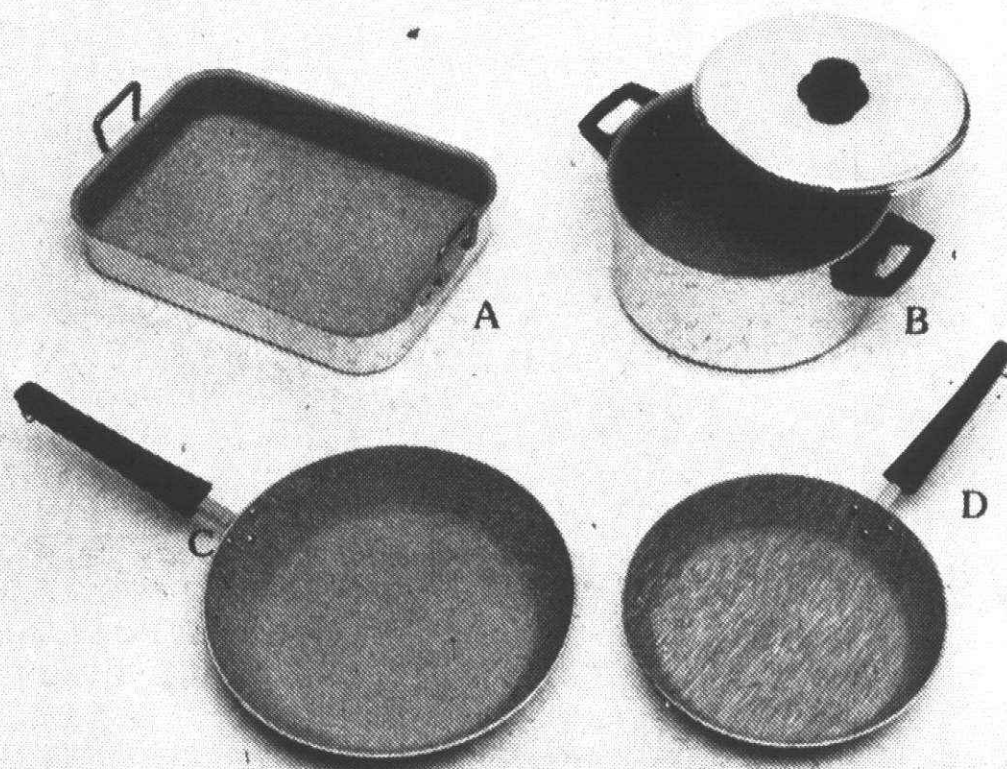

# Ohio trip should include stop at Cleveland

The kids have gone 100 mph on the roller coaster at Cedar Point. They've been kissed by the big wet lips of a performing whale at Sea World. They've even ridden a 19th century steam train at Cuyahoga Valley National Recreation Area.

Now they are in downtown Cleveland, staring up through the curves of a huge black metal sculpture called "The Portal," hearing passers-by comment "it's interesting but what is it?" The sculpture is by Isamu Noguchi, the artist who created Detroit's controversial Dodge Fountain. "The Portal" is a fitting symbol for a city that is following the national movement of renaissance in inner cities.

This area of northern Ohio is a good travel destination for families who want to entertain the kids and also explore an unexpectedly rich city experience. The Noguchi work is as different from the famous oriental collection at the Cleveland Museum of Art as the steam train is from the coaster called Gemini.

Gemini is the look-Ma-no-hands thrill ride at Cedar Point, a natural stop on the way from Detroit to Cleveland.

Other highlights of the park include the 360-degree corkscrew

ride, a gigantic ferris wheel, the new Wave Swinger, as well as live shows and exhibits. For Cedar Point information, call 965-2525 in Detroit.

AS YOU APPROACH Cleveland from the west, you are within diversion distance of the rose gardens of Lorain, the Indian Ridge Museum at Elyria, the Spirit of '76 Museum at Wellington or the campus of Oberlin College, all of which mark the approximate western boundary of the Western Reserve Region.

The Western Reserve is three million acres of land bought sight-unseen by the Connecticut Land Co. in 1796 for \$1,200,000. It was bought to provide expansion ground for Connecticut settlers in what was then called the Northwest Territories.

The life of that time can best be seen in the Cuyahoga Valley National Recreation Area south of Cleveland, where a steam train puffs south past a historic farm and village on its way to Akron. The Cuyahoga Valley Line operates on Saturdays and Sundays through Oct. 30; for information, call 1-216-666-3711.

Hale Farm and Western Reserve Village is a restored Village depicting typical Western Reserve Life from 1800-1850. The collection of farm and village buildings is active

with craftsmen all summer and often hosts special events. A quilt exhibit continues through July 31. Contact Hale Farm at 2686 Oak Hill Road, Bath, Ohio 44210.

Another highlight of the Cuyahoga recreation area is Blossom Music Center, summer home to the Cleveland Symphony Orchestra. You can picnic in groves and under shelters nearby, or on the grass while the music is playing. The seating arrangement is similar to that found at Meadowbrook Music Festival in Rochester.

IF YOU CONTINUE around Cleveland to the southeast, two family-fun places are located in Aurora, Ohio: a small theme-and-amusement-park called Geauga Lake Park and the better-known Sea World.

Sea World is a great deal more than an amusement park, so it is a nice counterbalance for the fun and games of either Cedar Point or

Gauga Lake. The only moving parts in Sea World are the fish and the kids.

A series of water shows runs concurrently like a four-ring circus. A huge area of creative make-your-own-fun play modules takes up a large corner of the park. Sea World also includes sea-related exhibits, an aquarium and some wet beach shared with the ducks.

The most famous occupant is Shamu, a 220-pound whale that shares a large show tank with a pair of dolphins. Shamu is joined this year by Wally the Walrus, an equally wet ham with a moustache.

Also premiering this year is Birds of Prey, featuring performing hawks, owls, macaws, ravens and cockatoos. Trainer Ray Berwick trained birds for the movies "The Birds" and "The Bird Man of Alcatraz."

By the time you've done all that good kid stuff, you will be happy enough to see downtown Cleveland, which is going through the same change experienced by other northern industrial cities. The Terminal Building rises high over Public Square, where the pigeons fly around a bronze statue of city founder Moses Cleveland.

This area is worth a walking tour. Stouffers Inn on the Square is a new version of a historic Cleveland hotel. Its new owners pried off all the plastic, wood and plaster used to cover up the old designs, so what you now see is the restored original building. It's worth a walk into the lobby at least.

The black towers of the Old Stone Church marks the oldest structure on the square, a Presbyterian church with original stained-glass windows designed by Louis Tiffany.

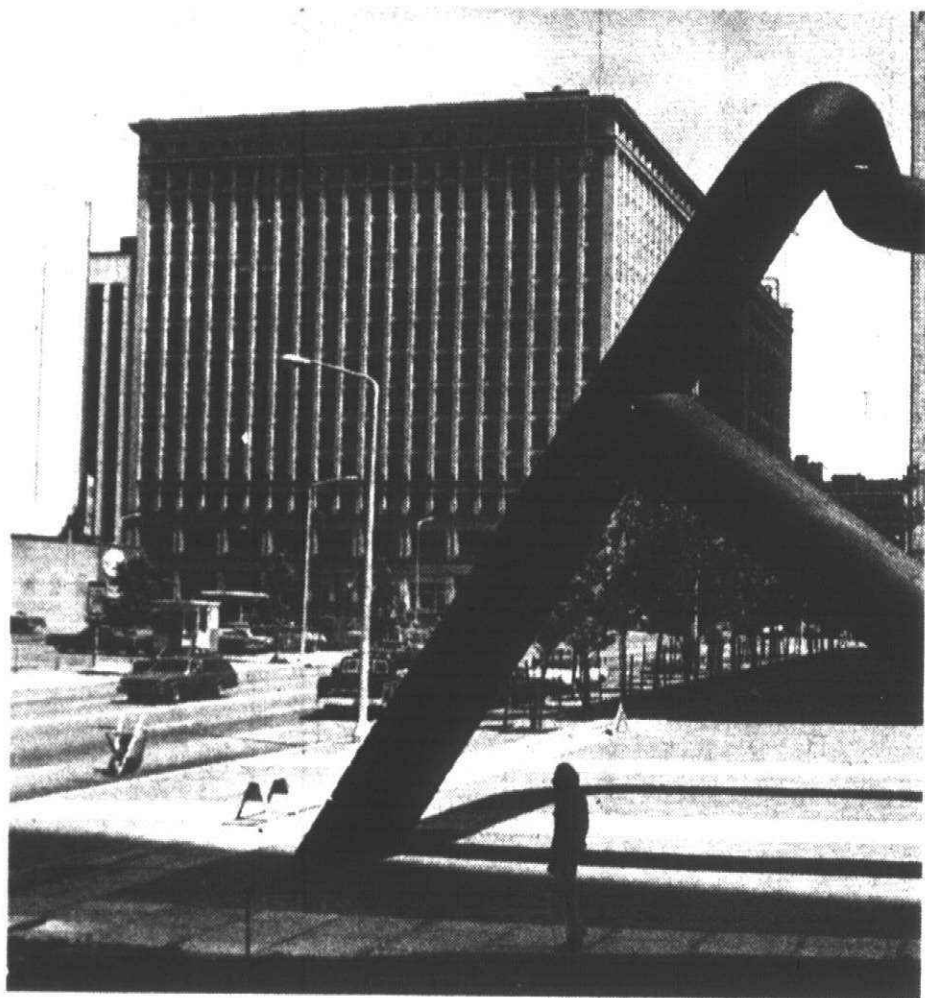
This was the first public square to be lighted electrically and you can see a brush arc light and an old electric lamp from that historic day in 1897. Just down Euclid Street is the "Spirit of '76" site where Archibald Willard did his first version of the famous American painting, and the Old Arcade, which opened on Decoration Day in 1890.

OLD, ELEGANTLY APPOINTED arcades are unique features of downtown Cleveland, where these high-ceilinged shopping centers have been restored for modern use.

You can't see it all, but walk into the Eastman Reading Garden between the two buildings of the Cleveland Public Library and go down to the New Federal Building where Noguchi's "Portal" graces the front of the Justice Center. This also takes you to the Erieview Plaza and the waterfront.

### Roller coasting? Not again. No way.

Step right up folks to the Beast, the Loch Ness Monster, the Gemini. The coastermaniacs are at it again, going around in circles and screaming their heads off at roller coasters around the country.

This craziness used to be unofficial but now the riders have banded together as the American Coaster Enthusiasts (ACE) and they go out of their minds collectively instead of one by one.

ACE was formed at Busch Gardens, Va., in 1978. It had its first convention at Cedar Point last summer and its second annual convention at Kings Island, Ohio, June 16-17.

They came to ride the Beast, now the longest coaster in the world at 7,400 feet. It has the two longest vertical drops, 141 and 135 feet, and it winds up in a two-level 540-revolu-

tion turn, called a helix, just before you drop out of the treed setting into full view of the Little Miami River.

YOU CAN RECOGNIZE A coaster enthusiast easily. Outwardly, he or she is a conservatively dressed, well-spoken person, often a teacher or other professional by trade.

Mention the Colossus or Magic Mountain and these perfectly normal people begin to change. Their eyes roll around in their heads. They start jumping up and down, saying, "Yeah, yeah, remember the day when..."

Next thing you know they are whooshing and wheeling around in their imagination, going down one of those slopes.

IF YOU HAVEN'T RIDDEN a coaster lately, the scene follows something like this.

You stand in line. You pay money. You sit down and they strap you in. A voice in your head asks, "What am I doing here?" But another experienced voice says, "It looks dangerous but it's really quite safe."

You start moving, click, click, click up a slow rise. Suddenly you realize that some idiot is about to drop you straight down, undoubtedly to your death. You start to scream. When you have survived this danger, you strut around saying how much fun it is.

And if you are a real coastermaniac, you ride every coaster in the country as many times as possible.

MY PROBLEM IS THAT at heart I'm a coward. I first rode one of these death rides years ago, just to experience it. What I can't explain is why I went again.

For years, as my sons were growing up, I let them drag me on wild rides so that they could laugh hysterically at me while I was screaming hysterically at the ride.

For more years, I scared myself to death because I couldn't bear to admit that I didn't like roller coasters.

And then one day I was freed. It was at Six Flags Over Georgia. I was with a group of travel writers approaching the Great American Scream Machine. My ulcers were having ulcers at the thought, when a little voice in my head said, "You don't have to go on that thing if you don't want to."

I dug in my heels, stared down all the little boys who were brave enough to ride 10 consecutive times and said "No!"

I have never ridden a roller coaster since, and when I am chastised for this cowardice I change the subject. My reputation as an adventurer has fallen to zero, of course. In fact, it's enough to make me wonder if I shouldn't try again. I heard today that Cedar Point has opened a junior Gemini, which adults can ride if accompanied by someone shorter than 48 inches in height.

## Agent 007 soars into outer space in 'Moonraker'

Agent 007 flies high in "Moonraker" (PG), the 11th in the James Bond series. This one, like its recent predecessors, bears only slight resemblance to the Ian Fleming story, but it does follow faithfully the slick formula that has made these movies so commercially successful.

Spectacular effects, exotic settings, unique gadgetry and plenty of action assure an entertaining 125 minutes, which may not engage the mind but certainly compel attention. Add the usual array of beautiful women in bondage (the Playboy fantasy), an unusually humorous script and topical material involving spacecraft and the film's bound to attract a viewer or two.

Roger Moore (a well-preserved 51) again is the super-cool secret agent James Bond aided by regulars Bernard Lee as "M," Desmond Llewelyn as "Q" and Lois Maxwell as Money Penny. Also making a reappearance is the 7-foot-2 Richard Kiel as the steel-toothed villain "Jaws."

Lois Chiles is Bond's principal playmate in this film. You may remember her as the nasty heiress in "Death on the Nile," where, among the likes of Angela Lansbury, Peter Ustinov and David Niven, she was distinguished by her striking ability to recite every line in a deadpan voice. She still retains that singular talent.

FORTUNATELY, this is a film in which the production values are more important than the dramatic demands. Location shooting in Venice, Paris and Rio de Janeiro substantially adds to the visual interest. Some choice sequences in Venice include a motorized chase on the canals and a knockdown fight in a glass museum.

Bond is on the tracks of Drax (Michael Lonsdale) is a megalomaniac who has set up a giant space station from which he plans to conquer and rule Earth: first by bombarding it with lethal nerve gas, and then by populating it with his own brainwashed cadres whom he has shuttled to his space ark in pairs.

It takes Bond, Chiles and a detachment of Space Marines to thwart Drax. Chiles dispatches the bad guys with a few Bruce Lee maneuvers. "Where did you learn that — NASA?" inquires Bond.

"No, Vassar."

"Moonraker" does have an ample stock of amusing moments, risque puns and even parodies on other movie scenes and television commercials, including a notable one on Marlboro cigarettes. It all holds together very well under the direction of Lewis Gilbert, who also directed "The Spy Who Loved Me."

This movie is a feast for the junk-movie junkie, but for those who prefer just an appetizer, the first 10 minutes are superb. The spectacular free-fall stunt that precedes the titles is one of the most imaginative and exciting action sequences ever filmed.

## Basement full of artifacts for sale

Whether it's an Ecuadorian pot or a Brazilian basket you are after, two West Bloomfield Township women can fill the bill.

Operating by appointment or private showing, Bobbie Beser and Linda Golden offer cultural pieces from all over the world. They call their home business Artifacts.

The women have continuous shipments of goods coming in. They also acquire pieces from buying trips of their own.

"We don't deal in volume and we try to keep things that are different," said Beser. "We'd rather have fewer pieces, but keep them interesting. In this kind of business, it's sometimes impossible to re-order things."

Each of Artifacts's originators has a basement full of relics and unusual art forms. At present, the concentration is on pottery and baskets. But the turnover is fast, they said, and new items are always arriving.

MUCH OF their pottery is made by American Indians from New Mexico. Beser went on a buying trip last summer to establish contacts with various potters.

"We only carry pieces that are signed. Some of the potters inscribe symbols on their work for identification," she explained.

The different tribes all have varying styles, but none of the pottery is made on a wheel.

Most of the pieces are made by a coil method. Strips of clay are wound into a particular shape and then the entire piece is smoothed out.

"The Indians do their firing in homemade kilns in their backyard," said Beser. "There is a lot of breakage because it's hard to control the temperature."

It's hard to imagine the amount of work that goes into a single piece of pottery just by looking at the finished pieces that are available through Artifacts she said. The pottery goes through many stages before it's ready to be distributed.

THE DELICATE designs common to the Pueblo Indians are works of art in themselves. They are frequently geometric. The pottery is also thinner than most other pottery.

There are numerous variations between the pottery of different tribes. The pieces from the Santa Clara pueblo are generally thicker than those of Acoma.

"The Santa Clara pottery has to be thicker because the Indians frequently carve designs in the pieces," said Beser. "Most of the work from this area is done in black or red clay and has a shiny surface."

Artifacts also imports pottery from the Imlata Indians. One potter they deal with has work displayed in the Smithsonian Institution.

Although most of their pottery comes from New Mexico, Artifacts also carries pieces from Peru.

"Peruvian pottery is more delicate than most," said Beser. "But it is similar to the other varieties in that it is made of the same basic earth tones. The nice thing about all the pieces is that they are compatible with any kind of interior design."

A lot of the pottery is made in the form of planters. Beser presently has a large selection of planters from Ecuador stored in her family room.

FACES OR ANIMALS are carved on the front of the Ecuadorian planters. Each one has its own personality and style.

"No two pieces are alike, but they all have a pre-Columbian flare," said Beser. "The terracotta clay figures are fired in two tones, both shiny and dull."

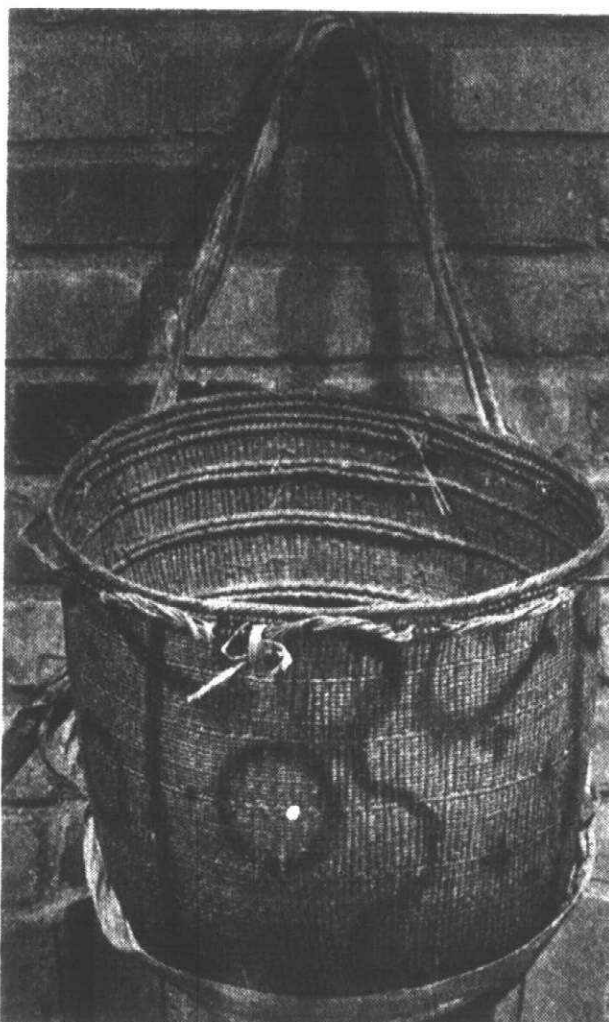
"Part of their charm is the exaggerated features in the design."

The average price of the planters is \$8-\$14, based on the size.

Baskets are also popular items now. Artifacts carries all sizes and shapes. Beser is able to differentiate the baskets of various countries by the material from which they're woven.

"There are two types of baskets that come from Morocco. The ones made from reed are a tightly woven, fine material and the others are made from Palm and are a thicker variety," said Beser.

"Countries use whatever resources are available



to them," she added. "For instance, most of the southern countries make baskets out of yucca."

One of the more unusual baskets currently available at Artifacts is from Ireland. It is called a twig basket because it is made exclusively of small twigs that are woven together. No artificial material holds the pieces in place.

SOME OF THE older baskets come from the Philippines. They look almost lacquered, with a deep brown color with a red cast.

Not only are all of the baskets decorative pieces, but many are also functional. Some of the extra large baskets from Morocco and Indonesia are used as food carriers.

"Even though I don't carry food in it, I have a carrier that sits on the floor in front of the fireplace in my house," said Beser. "They are made mostly of multicolored geometric designs. The colors are also mostly earth tones and they come from several different countries."

Some of the baskets have other materials. For example, a dragon box is a small basket that has leather superimposed on the top.

"We try to represent baskets from all over the world," said Beser. "Most of the pieces will fit in any house."

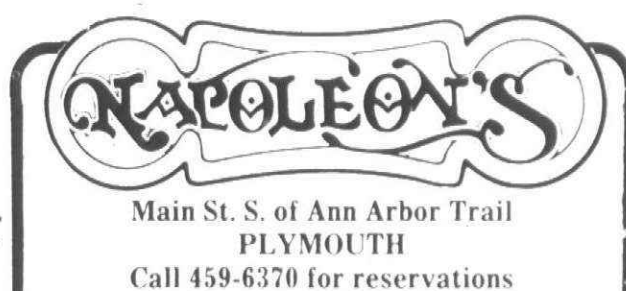
If questions come up about the way certain pieces match particular furnishings or decors, the women at Artifacts are prepared. Golden is an interior

designer and has been integrating the cultural pieces in many of the homes she decorates.

SOME ITEMS available at Artifacts reflect the lifestyles of their creators. Hand sewn fabric pieces from Peru depict agricultural scenes. They're done in bright colors and can be used in a variety of ways.

## It's a bumper crop

Tourists are finding that when they leave amusement parks, their cars often bear bumper stickers that weren't there when they arrived.

Strips proclaiming park attractions automatically are pasted on visitor's cars at many resorts. Since few motorists seem to object, the practice has been spreading.

Some commercially operated tourist sites now post signs in park areas advising visitors to leave their car visors down if they do not want a bumper sticker put on their cars.

"If anyone complains, our lot attendants just peel it off," one park operator said. "But that rarely happens."

SO MANY VACATIONERS prize the brightly colored strips as souvenirs that several resorts charge for them. Whether given away or sold, at least 18 million stickers now adorn the bumpers, trunk lids and rear windows of America's cars, vans and trucks.

The stickers began appearing in the 1930s, when the narrow automobile bumpers of earlier years gave way to wide chrome strips, and fluorescent inks were introduced that were less likely to fade with prolonged exposure to the sun.

The promoters of Missouri's Meramec Caverns were among the first to discover that customers liked to have their cars announce their travels.

Other resorts and hotels began ordering the stickers when they found that by buying large

quantities, they reaped a lot of inexpensive interstate advertising. Political parties and their candidates were soon doing the same.

"The really big growth came with the protest movements in the '60s," said Larry Recht, president of Reflective Screen Printing.

RECHT DOES MUCH of his business in bumper strips and recalled that the Vietnam war spilled over onto car bumpers.

Sticklers insisting "America — Love It or Leave It" were answered by others warning "America — Change It or Lose It."

"Next came the environmental movement, with stickers reading 'Pollution Stinks,'" he said. "A high school teacher came up with 'Have You Thanked a Green Plant Today?' and it became a big seller."

Now there are adhesive-backed slogans for nearly everything. Sports enthusiasts are exhorted to "Give Blood — Play Rugby," or to "Think Snow." There are stickers urging everyone to "Eschew Obfuscation," or "Practice Parthenogenesis."

"Illiterate? Write for Help" is the unhelpful advice displayed on some cars.

"Reunite Gondwanaland" sounds militant unless readers realize that was the hypothetical landmass scientists believe split apart millions of years ago to form South America, Africa and Australia.

The craze has become international. Stickers available in West Germany state: "Die Strasse gehört mir allein — Ich hab genug Steuern bezahlt," which means, "The road belongs to me alone — I've paid enough taxes for it."
