"Most major thoughfares are ei-

ther unimproved or underimproved. The Plymouth-Canton school system has resorted to year-round scheduling to accommodate the growth in school age children.

"CANTON HAS expanded into full time police and fire protection. At this time, these departments remain behind national standards for patrolmen or firefighters per 1,000 residents.

"Finally, Canton's sewer capacity has forced itself to purchased limits, possibly endangering capacity for needed industrial clients.

The three main areas recommended for residential density reduction include land east of I-275 south of Ford Road; land adjacent to the lower Rouge River; and land along Michigan Avenue west of Canton Center Road.

The method of reducing density is to increase the minimum lot size. According to Kosteva, the master plan proposes that lot sizes in these areas be increased to a 70-foot minimum with a requirement that side lots be a minimum of 15 feet.


Other master plan changes will have an effect on the use of land along Ford Road. The proposed land use plan seeks to prevent development of an unbroken strip of commercial establishments and instead cluster the businesses according to their regional or local nature.

RESIDENTIAL LAND use is proposed from Oakview east to Lilley along Ford road, as well as east of Willow Creek subdivision on the north side of Ford.


The plan also projects extensive commercial use of land along Canton Center Road north of Ford Road, primarilly to meet the needs of the residents in the four major subdivisions in that area.

Nearly 200 acres more have been designated for industrial use in the master plan revision.

About 160 acres were added in the area of Warren Road both east and west of I-275, with the remaining expansion proposed along Ford Road east of Lotz.

New wells drilled

According to Culbert, the landfill's management had refused to allow township officials on the site.

Richard Leszcz, assistant manager of the landfill, was unavailable for comment.

The water collected on Thursday will be tested for several elements including nickel, cadmium, mercury, copper, lead, zinc and ammonia. According to township engineer Robert Wade, those test results could indicate that sludge is causing the pollution.

Approximately 300 to 400 tons of sludge have been dumped daily at Woodland Meadows since March by Bi-Product Systems of Michigan.

The firm views the dumping as an interim measure until a composting site can be put into operation.

Bi-Product Systems has proposed a sludge-composting operation on Michigan near Sheldon to meet terms of a three-year contract with the City of Detroit for the disposal of sludge from the Detroit Wastewater Treatment Plant.

The city is under court order to decrease the amount of waste being dumped into the Detroit River.

The dumping of sludge at Woodland Meadows has been approved by the DNR and the county health department. However, both agencies are empowered to rescind the special approv-

IN JULY, tests conducted by an Ann Arbor laboratory for Canton Township showed differences in the amounts of chlorides, sulfates and total organic carbons in the two wells at Woodland Meadows.

Township engineer Wade called the test results "very broad indicators." But he added that the results could indicate that the sludge is polluting the underground water table.

A portion of the bond would be retained for a five-year period under the ordinance to insure that storm drains in the subdivision are properly engineered.

Township engineers have pinned part of the blame for widespread basement flooding on April 13 and July 11 to clogged storm drains.

Block grant OK'd


Township officials are seeking appraisals of land in Dye Brothers subdivision for purposes of buying the area and converting the land into an industrial park.


The appraisal work follows a recent announcement that Canton's application for a \$120,000 federal community block grant has been approved.

Township officials have earmarked an expected three years of block grant funds for purchasing Dye Brothers land. Homeowners who live in the 50year-old subdivision near Michigan and Sheldon will be relocated.

According to finance director Mike Gorman, this year's grant is the second Canton has received for the Dye Brothers project. The township received \$120,000 last year.

Wayne County distributes block grant funds for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), to communities with less than 50,000 population.

Truck drivers in America No bosses— they love it

Out of the setting sun comes riding the modern American hero, the stuff of which song and story are made: Strong, sinewy-forearmed.

And plagued by hemmorhoids.

Meet the truck driver.

D. Daryl Wyckoff is a Harvard professor who has met more of them than most of his co-workers. These experiences leavened the responses to a nationwide survey of truckers done in December 1977 and January 1978 and became the basis for his recently-published book, Truck Drivers in America (Lexington Books, 176 pps, \$15.95).

The book comes to some rather startling conclusions. Ninety-eight percent of all company truck drivers enjoying union membership were satisfied with their jobs, for instance, along with 85 percent of the non-union members. You don't encounter that kind of job satisifaction level even among \$800,000-a-year baseball players, for God's sake, let alone truck drivers.

And few truck drivers use drugs. The amphetamine, Benzedrine, have-the-wife-get-a-diet-prescription syndrome seems mainly mythical.

Wyckoff, who has a doctorate in transportation, was the author of two previous books on the trucking industry, one on owner-operators and another on how to manage a trucking business. This is the kind of thing you tend to expect professors from Harvard to write. A book just about truck drivers is not

"Nobody had really sat down and tried to figure out what was on the truck drivers minds," said Wyckoff when asked what prompted him to write the book. "Including the people who I thought would be most interested — the Teamsters."

Most drivers take the greatest job satisfaction in the fact that they are alone — they have no bosses. And, ironically, many truck drivers also find it to be the most difficult part of their work.

ANY FREEWAY habitue used to the apparently uncontrollable sadism truck drivers seem seized by at the sight of a subcompact Chevette won't be surprised to hear nearly 87 percent of truckers who haul hazardous cargo have no formal driver training. This may be a good thing.

'It turns out the guys who went to the truck driver schools had worse safety records as a group," Wvckoff said.

And while Wyckoff says the lack of supervision



appears to either attract or create "free spirits," he adds "by and large, these guys are pretty solid characters.

"The thing that was a very pleasant surprise, by and large unsafe practices weren't anywhere near as rampant as people think."

I wouldn't know about that.

Five years ago I was stuck hitchiking in the desert 20 miles outside Reno, Nevada, for 26 hours. A trucker picked me up, a guy from Idaho hauling 42,000 pounds of ice cream cartons who had been a Green Beret in the early '60s

He was wearing panty hose and open-toed sandals.

"I ain't no funny boy," he told me in Georgiaese. "These are just more comfortable.

A couple hundred miles down the road he blew a tire and limped into a service station where — God almighty! — there suddenly arrived about 15 or 20 Hell's Angels, replete with grease-caked, cut-off colors and women who looked as if simply laying eyes on them would require a pencillin shot later. Most of the men were carrying long guns of some kind on slings over their shoulders.

The trucker took one look at this sight, grabbed a .357 revolver he kept in the back of the truck, and headed toward them in his panty hose and opentoed sandals. I took one look and headed for the men's room. I was joined by the gas station attendant.

Neither of us wanted the other to know why we were there. I combed my hair. He washed his hands. Shots did not ring out, and, whistling casually, we peeked out the door and saw the Angels were gone and the driver was puttering around his flattened tire. I don't know if the attendant collected for the Angels' gas. I don't know if he cared.





If that isn't enough to dampen your spirits, another Southfield ordinance regulates garage sales. It costs a buck to get a permit and you could only peddle your books for five consecutive days.

I'D BET my rare edition of "Fanny Hill" that Oakland County Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson (Mr. Clean) would padlock your garage the first day of the sale. He'd confiscate all erotic reading material and, at least, he'd have plenty to do on Sunday.

In any event, you wouldn't be able to sell new dirty books. You'd have to raid your basement for old Playboy magazines, "Sex and the Single Husband," "Everything You Always Wanted to Know About Sex and a Lot More," and "The Comfort of Sex by Joy."

If you're bent on catching an X-rated movie in Southfield on Sunday, you can always get a jury to decide if it affronts contemporary community standards by appealing to prurient interests. But don't bother. Obscene flicks have been declared a public nuisance in "no sin city."

I'm still waiting for Mr. Goodnews to lighten my heavy heart. If you can't smoke, drink booze, coffee or diet pop, eat fattening sundaes with whipped cream, hot fudge and peanuts, dine on Michigan meat and dairy products or indulge in a little pornograhic pleasure, what's left to smile about?




Students, parents and volunteers who participated in a Safety Town program sponsored by the Plymouth-Canton School District gather for the final pro-

Lawyer questions rights behind bars

only form of punishment received by criminals.

"As a lawyer," says Peter Westen, a University of Michigan law professor, "I frequently see cases involving allegations of medical mistreatment in prison.

"Prisoners claim that they were denied pain killers on purpose because a prison official wanted them to suffer. Or that a prison physician amputated a limb unnecessarily - or refused to amputate a limb that was gangrenous. Or that a prison physician waited two hours before operating so that the patient would suffer a while."

Withholding of medical treatment in these circumstances may not be a product of sadism by prison physicians, but rather a product of the way society - including prison officials - view prisoners, observes Westen.

"Along with other prison officials, prison physicians may come to have low regard for a prisoner's humanity because the physician recognizes that the prisoner, by definition, is someone deserving of punishment," says the U-M constitutional law scholar.

One of the significant ethical questions facing prison officials, according to Westen, is whether the officials should intervene and force needed medical treatment on a prisoner who chooses to die.

Westen examined this question in a paper dealing with the following hypothetical situation: A woman prison inmate suffering from potentially fatal blood pressure refuses to allow the prison physician to administer life saving medical treatment. Should the physician intervene and force treatment?

THIS IS an area not clearly covered by law, according to Westen, because existing laws often are not applied in the prison context.

"There are laws, both civil and criminal, that purport to regulate the responsibility of prison physicians for the life and health of inmates under their care. There are criminal laws, for example, against aiding persons to commit suicide and against punishing inmates by misusing (and withholding) medical treatment, and civil laws requiring physicians to take reasonable

Imprisonment itself is bften not the il juries rarely impose civil liability." Arguing in favor of intervention by

the physician in the hypothetical case, Westen contends that inmates, placed in a childlike, dependent role in prisons, may not be ready to take "responsibility for life and death decisions."

"I am prepared to assume," he says, that "if the woman in this hypothetical case were not in prison, the physician would have no obligation to intervene and force life-saving treatment on her, and would not be obliged to seek a court order authorizing him to save her life."

But incarceration presents a new dimension on the matter, says Westen:

"Prisoners are persons who have been stripped of even the most elemental autonomy. They are not allowed to keep simple aspirin in their cells. If they want aspirin, they must seek it from a prison official; if the official decides to give it to them, they must swallow it in his presence to ensure that they are not selling or misusing it. They are not allowed to keep thermometers in their cells because it is feared that they might use them as weapons.

"In short, we treat prisoners like we once treated slaves, and like we now treat children. We control everything they do - when they eat, what they eat, when they sleep, when the lights go on, what they see, what they read.

"Having denied this woman the autonomy to decide for herself whether to take aspirin, the prison cannot easily explain her now dying by saying she is free to do whatever she wishes with respect to life-saving treatment."

Medical intervention also seems justified, says Westen, in view of the possibility that prison conditions may have contributed to the woman's mental state prior to her refusing medical treatment.

"I am prepared to assume that she alone is responsible for her criminal conduct and for the necessary consequences of her criminal sentence, including any depression resulting from close confinement.

"But It is also possible that her state of depression is unnecessary and is caused by conditions for which society is responsible - such as improper diet, overcrowding, absence of opportunity for physical exercise, inadequate visiting privileges, lack of minimum levels

Students to survey community

surprized if a teenager shows up at your door or calls you on the telephone with a few questions about the quality of life in your community.

It will all be part of a "community audit" to be conducted by students in Gene Kramer's sociology class at Plymouth Salem High School.

Kramer is working in conjunction with school psychologist Patricia Reese on the project, which is supposed to teach student about the intricacies of, sociological surveys by actually performing one.

According to Ms. Reese, the completed survey will "be as good as any done

During the fall season, don't be too by University of Michigan." The results will be available to community organizations, governmental offices and individuals.

Kramer says the questions that will eventually be asked of school district residents of all ages have not yet been formulated. "We plan to wait until class starts and let the students pick the questions."

Area groups and organizations, however, are also being asked to let Ms. Reese and Kramer know if there is any specific area of interest they would like the survey to explore.

The two faculty members say they aren't sure yet whether the survey will encompass_all the school district or be divided so that different questions are asked of residents in different communities

"This is the first time we're doing this," Ms. Reese says, " so we'll probably do a general survey." In either case, the students will have to survey about 400 people in order to get reliable results.

Kramer says the students will perform the survey by making phone calls, going door-to-door, or both methods in order to get responses. To make sure the students don't make up replies -aproblem even professional polling companies contend with - the faculty members will make spot checks of some of the homes surveyed.

The survey questionaire will probably contain some 100 questions and take about 20 minutes to complete, Ms. Reese says. The responses will be tabulated on the school computer, with help expected from students in computer programing, typing, graphic arts and other fields.

Students who want to take the course will have to hope they get lucky, since those who elect to take sociology are divided up into six classes.

GRAND HAVEN - It's the sand and the river channel that tie the town of Grand Haven to Lake Michigan. Yachts cruise up and down the Grand River to the lighthouse point, from where a great spread of sand turns left along a lake full of colored sails.

The sand is a blanket for the campers at Grand Haven State Park and for the bathers and boaters on a long stretch of beach spotted with bikinis and brightly colored sailboats.

It's the height of summer here, with freshly picked fruit running down everybody's chin and sunlovers desperately getting their summer's worth before they start thinking about Labor Dav

August, and the fuel crisis, make this a good time to plan a few days in the west Michigan country around Grand Rapids, Grand Haven and Holland. Soon these areas will be busting with harvest festivals featuring corn, tart cherries, melons and other good stuff. That means roadside stands and freshly picked food at good prices.

It also means that the salmon are beginning to line up at the mouth of the rivers, getting ready to swim upstream to spawn.

The fishermen are waiting at the month of the Grand River at Grand Haven, where boats tie up downtown at the municipal marina. The marina is adjacent to two of the town's tourist attactions: the musical fountain, and the historical museum which occupies an eld railroad station.

Several miles up the Grand River at Grand Rapids, people are already beginring to watch for the salmon from the Fish Ladder, which was designed for the city by Lowell sculptor Joseph Kinnegrew.

The Fish Ladder is adjacent to the rapids, where Grand Rapids businessmer have been known to pull on their high rubber boots and go fishing during the lunch hour.

Joseph Kinne and Alexander Calder are two very well-known names in Grand Rapids these days, because sculpture has become a trademark in this city.

Grand Rapids once was known for its furriture design, but the furniture makers abandoned the city long ago for cheaper labor markets in the south. The arts, under the leadership of the Grand Rapids arts council, are leading the city out of the economic slump that followed.

Fish Ladder across the river. You can enjoy several works of art on the plaza and adjoining streets, cross the bridge to a small earth-sculpture park where the Gerald Ford Museum is being built beside the river, and walk upriver to the Fish Ladder.

On your way out of town, you might like to drive up to another important people place: an earth sculpture by international artist Robert Morris. Grand Rapids has the first earth sculpture Morris built in North America.

NORTH OF THE city, you'll find an interesting area of reconstructed shops and restaurants in the town of Rockford

'Breaking Away,' about growing up, touches the heart

"Breaking Away" (PG) is about four teenage boys approaching manhood in Bloomington, Ind.; it's about what it feels like to grow up as an outsider in your own home town; and it's about a bicycle race. It's a bright, exhilarating film that will pedal itself right into your hearts.


The story was written by Steve Tesich, an Indiana University graduate who came to Hollywood via Broadway. This probably accounts for the strong sense of place and the feeling of real people expressing themselves in sincere and natural ways.

"Breaking Away" has the advantage of fresh faces in its youthful principals and a fresh locale. The film was shot in and around the campus of Indiana University in Bloomington, with its lush foliage and rolling hills.



Paul Dooley is excellent as Dave's father, bewildered by his son's infatuation with the Italian bicycle racing team. To emulate his idols, Dave Italianizes everything around him. He listens to Italian operas; he changes the cat's name from Jake to Fellini; he persuades his mother (Barbara Barrie) to serve zucchini and pasta for dinner; and he acquires an emotional "Italian" temperament.

All this drives his father crazy and tests his mother's peacemaking abilities. "Can't he just be a little miserable?" his father asks. "I was miserable when I was his age." The warm, humorous portrayal of Dave's homelife, accomplished without patronizing the parents or making them appear stupid, is one of the film's major assets.

Within a wider social context, the most interesting relationship developed in the film is that between the university students and the "townies."

At Bloomington, they are called "cutters," apparently because so many locals worked in the limestone quarries. (University of Michigan has the Indiana limestone - note Angell Hall - but not the cutters. Everybody knows that the townies of Ann Arbor either owm apartments or bookstores.)

TENSION ARISES from the schism and hostility between the cutters and the students. The social friction, the flagging unity among the four friends, and the misunderstanding between Dave and his parents are all brought to a head when the boys, representing the town, are invited to participate against the college teams in the Little 500 Bicycle Race, a

Like two teenagers, John and Anne Gable walked hand in hand along the beach of the Maine coast. Wouldn't it be wonderful, they told each other, if they could spend their lives like this?

That was several years ago; now they are about to make the wish come true.

Gable, 35, recently resigned his position as assistant chief designer for Pontiac Division of General Motors to become a full-time watercolorist. Scenes of the Maine coast have long been his speciality. The Gables sold their hilltop home on Bloomfield Township and began packing.

A 1901, seven bedroom home in Kennebunkport awaits them. And soon, John and Anne Gable and sons, Tommy, 4, and Christopher, 2, will be walking the Maine coastline again, but this time they will be able to look up and see their home, complete with a newly converted studio on the third floor.

'Some people talk about a mid-life crisis," Gable said. "For us, this is a life crisis. I have no complaints about GM. I worked there for 10 years. But, the problem was that more and more as I became involved in painting, I found I couldn't do both. Now, to improve as a painter, I need to live in the environment I paint - and that has always been the coast of Maine.'

HE PAUSED, SMILED, and then to explain himself, said, "Anne and I are both safe people - this isn't really our nature. But, I told the people at GM that I couldn't afford to spend 20 more years there and not know how my painting would go. We're not the type to just take off."

to be a car designer. He didn't catch his first glimpse of his now beloved Maine coast until many years later. The first coastline he saw was in California, where he attended the Art Center College of Design in Los Angeles.

His first introduction to the kind of painting he does was through the work of an artist, Ted Kautzky, who had a strong impact on him - the total strength of which is just now coming to light.

GABLE WILL continue with watercolors. It's the medium he functions best in for the kind of paintings he likes to do. He begins by sketching the scene and carefully recording the colors. Then, he takes a photograph. Although he trusts his eye for color (rather than the film's), he uses the camera to record composition and location. Gable is a realist painter - his sites are real places, the harbors, snug coves and small villages along the rugged coast. He likes to catch the atmosphere of a foggy morning or the peace that descends on the water in the late evening when the small boats are moored, sails down.

Gale won't repeat a painting although he has

ever, paint the same locale from another viewpoint. He is considering having lithographs made. One has been done so far, but he isn't totally satisfied with it.

His work is in several corporate collections -Ford Motor Co., Budd Company, Toledo Eidson, Norwood Savings and Loan of Chicago and National Bank of Detroit.

In their new home, the Gables will be less than two hours from Boston where Gable's identical twin lives. The wide assortment of cultural activities in Boston plus the atmosphere pleases the Gables - they plan to take advantage of the proximity of the city.


"Roston has an area that's paintable," Gable said "but the type of subject matter I want to paint is in Maine."

He knows he could return to his former career at almost any point in his life - but, that's the kind of rationale he doesn't indulge in.

Since an article he wrote of how to do automotive illustrations was published in an international trade publication, "Car Styling," he has had many offers. But, his commitment to life as a fulltime painter has been made - and he intends to pursue it with a total effort.

The Gables know they're taking a gamble on his talent. It may scare them a little, but the thought of never trying frightens them even more.





Garage sales set stage for cast of characters

They walk toward you with great determination and confidence. For most of them, this is a familiar path.

They are often alone, but sometimes they travel in groups of two or three. They are mostly women, but an occasional man will appear.

They represent all age groups and a wide span of economic circumstances. And, at one time or another, their ranks include nearly everyone.

They are the pursuers of one of the last vestiges of the American dream the Garage Sale.

Here in this summer business and occupation stalk the last of the independent entrepreneurs, the last holdouts of the sole proprietor.

Its proliferation is testimony to the vast appeal of salesmanship, the exchange of goods and the give and take of the market place.

Or, as Tom Green of Livonia put it, "I just want to get rid of my stuff."

Who are these people, and why are they buying all those things?

ANYONE who has hosted a garage sale will recognize quickly a cast of characters, the ones who appear at sale after sale. They can be spotted easily once their characteristics are known.

First there are The Professionals, the group most responsible for the success or failure of the sale, the people to whom the greatest number of goods will be sold.

But also expect to see The Anonymous Junker. The Specific Looker, and some folks like Antique Annie, Second-Hand Russ, Resale Rhonda, Collectible Connie and Macho Mannie.

And don't forget another big group The Innocents.

Dorothy Winkelman of Dearborn is typical of The Professionals.

Like many of her fellow shoppers, Ms. Winkelman has a set routine on Thursday mornings. She works like other dedicated shoppers.

"We go to the newspaper office to get the ads and we keep a map in the car," she said. "We plot a course for the day and one drives and one navigates."

Marie Leright of Livonia, also a frequent shopper, said she goes "every week, usually with friends.

"We check the ads before we start out and keep lists of what we need," she added.

THE PROFESSIONAL isn't a spur of the moment shopper but she isn't rigid in her habits either.

"When I find something I think I can use, I pick it up," said Carol Shaw of Canton, leaving a Livonia sale. I always have specific things in mind, but you never know what you are going to run into."

For Ms. Shaw, garage-sale shopping is a hidden profession.

"I take off work every Thursday to go to the sales, and I miss it when I don't go," she said.

"I guess you could say this is a hobby for me. In fact, I tell my friends I'm going sailing."

Professional garage shoppers are glad to talk about their excursions, to sale holders or fellow shoppers or anyone who asks.

They don't mind a bit of dickering, since after all their ultimate goal is to locate goods at small prices.

"For the average person, it's the only way to afford things," said Gloria Neher of Livonia.

Cindy Scaglione of Livonia reported she was looking for baby clothes. "Just because it's used, it doesn't bother me, and when you're raising a family, it helps." And Pat Moore of Westland added, "If I buy things at garage sales

HOW ABOUT the rest of the garage sale cast of characters. For one thing, they aren't as open and are not likely to identify themselves by name.

Anonymus Junker buyers come and are gone quickly. They don't want to be noticed or remembered. These are the ones who have stores and are buying strictly to stock their shelves.

Antique Annie arrives alone, early, on the first day of the sale. She talks little, but with piercing, knowledgeable eyes scans the merchandise rapidly.

She then selects the very best old items and pays and leaves. She's an antique dealer.

Second-hand Russ shops all day Thursday. He is slightly friendlier than Antique Annie and is not looking for the same quality merchandise. He has a second-hand store.

He will sift unhurriedly through all the boxes and tables and pick out a large quantity of china, glassware and appliances. Then he sets before the seller a sum of money less than the total marked price of the goods.

He doesn't dicker. You take his price or he leaves your goods.

Resale Rhonda will appear at any time She will pick out her choices item by item and haggle over the price of each one.

Rhonda needs to make a buy out of each item she selects, because she is buying for resale at her own garage sale. Her profit depends on the low price she can get for what she buys.

SPECIFIC LOOKERS are the garage shoppers who make themselves known by requesting their need immediately.

For example, Collectible Connie doesn't wish to waste time or get involved in pleasantries. She asks about the specific item she seeks, be it dolls, watches or trains. If her specialty is over the background of the items she is buying.



Money given to the Good Hope Literacy Council in Canton will purchase adult level reading material and support for the council's tutor training workshop.



Driving needn't be a ga

Good news for Americans suffering through their love affair with the automobile: There are legal ways to beat gas-guzzler taxes aimed at cutting the nation's gasoline consumption.

There are ways - intriguing and promising - of stretching gasoline with mixtures, including water, or replacing it with electricity.

Any-minute technological breakthroughs - to quote their inventors - may take the whimsy out of still other alternatives to gasoline and the internal combustion engine.

There's pig power. There's a windup car. There's putting tequila in your tank. There's woodpile propulsion. There's zero-cents-a-gallon sunshine.

Some unconventional fuels and cars have proven get-up-and-go galore. Otrher ways to beat the taxes perhaps are just being born in chemistry labs and home workshops.

MANY MAY PROVE to be like the 100-mile-agallon carburetor or like the power pill dropped in the gas tank that turns water to gasoline - both apparently only machine shop spectulation.

In 1917, Alexander Graham Bell proposed an alternative fuel. "Alcohol makes a beautiful, clean and efficient fuel, and where not intended for consumption by human beings, can be manufactured very cheaply in an indigestible or even poisonous form.

Today, experiments blend alcohol with as little as 72 percent gasoline. The mixture is called gasohol and improves mileage.

According to one researcher, "There's ma evidence that the best motor fuel by far is pla rotgut mountain moonshine." But putting teq the like in your tank is touchy. A Frenchma apple brandy gave his car the gallops, but rec gummed up the carburetor.

Successful tests also have been made of genized water and gasoline, though cars nee cial emulsifying equipment.

ELECTRIC CARS still await the super ba that will assure trips of more than 40 to 75 without a recharge.

Diesel engines, long admired by engineers, be coming into their own due to their superior age. Other gas-guzzler alternatives:

Steam - powerful, but cars need better b heating fuel; sunshine - Naval Academy stu built a battery car that draws electricity from tovoltaic cells spread across the hood; coal inventor says a pound of pwwdered coal powe modified car 10 miles; wood - carbon mon and other gases fuel cars efficiently, but gasating burners in the trunk restrict driving to from woodpiles;
