## Teachers say extension proposal is unacceptable

Plymouth-Canton Community School officials Friday issued a summary of starting and closing times of schools. The only thing that is left uncertain now is when schools will open.

As of Friday, the report was "no progress" in negotiations on a teacher contract extension. The Plymouth-Canton Education Association is considering a school board proposal to continue the old master contract for 90 days if a new contract agreement is not reached by Aug. 31, the date it expires.

Monday, Aug. 27, is the proposed school starting date.

PCEA spokesmen said last week they would not work without a contract, and agreement on a new contract within the next week would be "a miracle," according to PCEA president John Ryder.

According to the school board negotiating team, the proposed contract extension would "maintain all provisions of the current agreement, including

current wages, fringes, grievance procedure, membership deductions, and all other provisions. There was a slight modification in the use of sick leave days to insure against 'blackboard flu' type incidences."

According to the PCEA, "The board has offered its version of a contract extension with three stipulations attached which make the offer totally unacceptable at this time."

Negotiations continue this week.

## The Center to continue despite liquor OK loss

Construction of an \$8 million recreational complex proposed in Canton Township probably will begin despite denial of the developers' liquor license application.

That's the prediction of the architect of The Center, proposed for a site near Haggerty and Ford roads.

Last week, the Canton Township board voted 5-2 to deny a one-year extension of the liquor license allocation

granted two years ago to developers of The Center. The allocation expired in June.

Architect Ned Apigian told board members two weeks ago that the developers would probably file litigation against Canton Township before beginning construction — if the liquor license application was not extended.

Following the vote at last Tuesday's township board meeting, however, Apigian said that chances for a lawsuit were dim. He said he was reassured by a prediction of township Clerk John Flodin that Canton would receive 10 additional liquor licenses following the 1980 census.

Liquor licenses are allocated to communities on the basis of population. Canton currently holds three liquor licenses which have not been allotted to businesses.

"I just didn't want them to give the three liquor licenses away, so there would be none left for us," Apigian said. Clerk Flodin and Trustee Eugene Daley voted against the motion to deny Apigian's request for an extension of the liquor license allocation.

THE RESOLUTION to deny the extension included a statement of Trustee Robert Greenstein concerning his views of the project.

The Center was first proposed during Greenstein's term as township supervisor from 1974-76. Greenstein maintains that the developers plan on building only a bowling alley even though site plans call for four movie theaters, tennis courts, bowling lanes and a bar.

"The general conduct of the petitioner is such that it is unclear whether he has a legitimate intention to do what he says he will," the resolution stated.

Apigian insists that The Center will be built in full accordance with the site plan, which was approved in June, 1977.

He said construction of the complex has not started because of the expiration dates of variances and special approvals granted by the township board and Zoning Board of Appeals.

"I show you a picture of an airplane, and you say it's a fish," Apigian said to Greenstein. "But just because you say it's a fish, doesn't mean it is."

"We have every intention of building this thing."

## Shell seeks nod for gas station

Shell Oil Co. representatives, who have been battling since January to win the approvals needed to build a station in Canton Township, were granted a special use permit last week by the township board.

Shell still must obtain site plan approval before the station can be built.

Lack of car repair facilities in the original plan proposed by Shell for the northwest corner of Ford and Haggerty almost stymied the project last winter. The plans were later changed at the township board's insistence that three repair bays be included.

Last week, Trustee Robert Greenstein unsuccessfully urged Canton Township board members to deny Shell's request for a special use permit because the station would not include diesel fuel pumps.

Greenstein said the owners of high-mileage, diesel-fueled cars cannot buy the fuel in Canton Township. The trustee maintained that the township board is "honor-bound to follow the lead of our illustrious president" to adopt energy conservation tactics.

But Al Erwin, a Shell Oil representative, said his firm does not market diesel fuel in Michigan.

He pointed out that the concession to build service bays in the station would increase construction costs from an estimated \$125,000 to \$250,000.

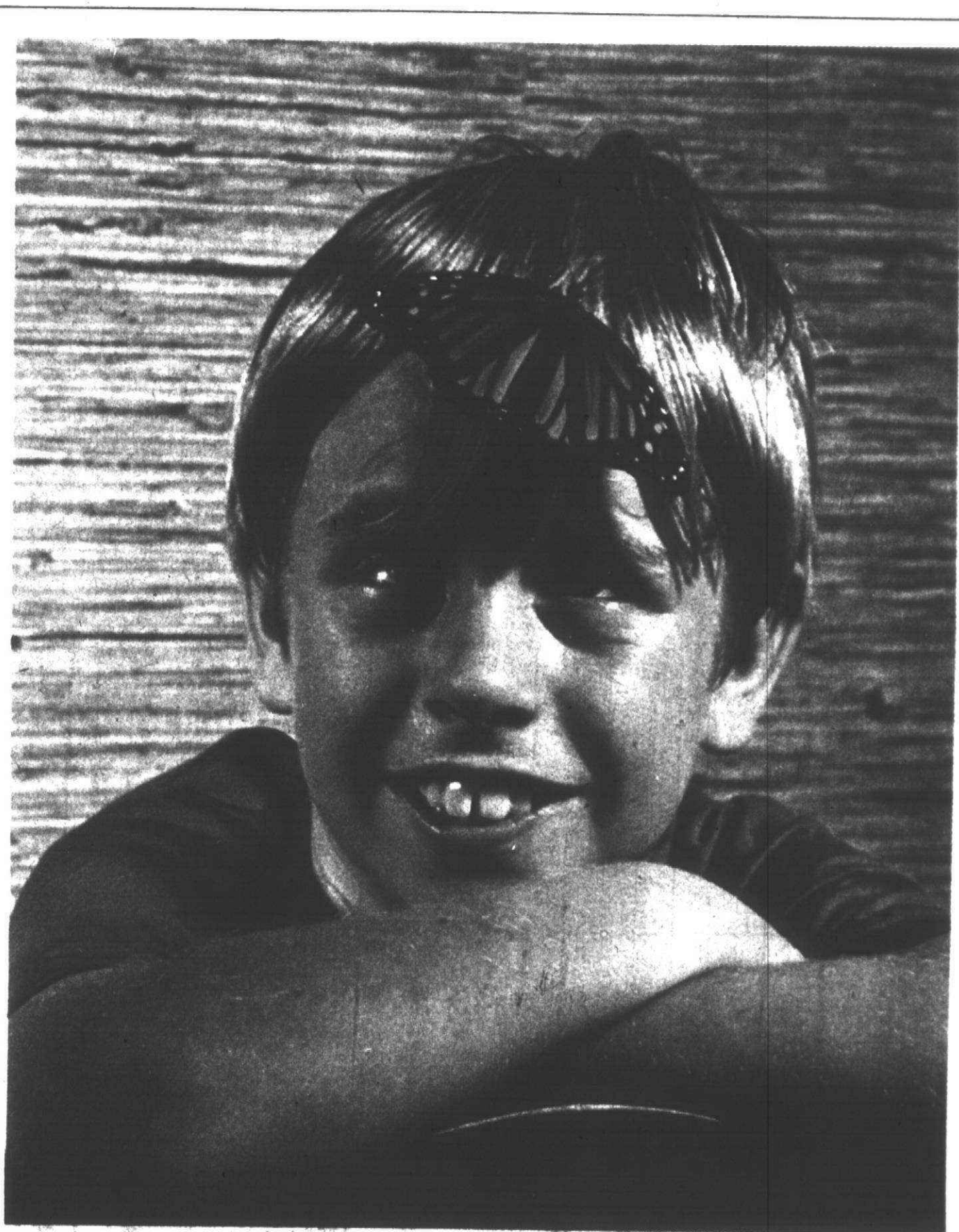
Shell's Houston office had agreed to the concession last winter after township board members indicated they would not rezone the corner of Haggerty and Ford from C-3 to C-2 for a station that would not include repair facilities.

Board members maintained at the time that car repair facilities are practically non-existent in Canton Township.

Last week, Erwin asked for the special use permit that is needed to build gasoline stations in C-2 zoning districts.

"I just don't think it's fair to single us out," Shell attorney Frederick Steinhardt said of Greenstein's insistence.

## Butterflies flex their wings in Canton 4th grader's room

Talk about bugs!

Enough monarch butterflies fluttered around Richard Hitchcock's bedroom in Canton Township this summer to fill an insect lover's dreams.

In all, about 150 butterflies hatched in the 10-year-old's bedroom where they learned to flex their wings before flying to freedom through an open window. About 30 of the insects filled the room at one time.

Richard, a fourth-grader at Eriksen Elementary School, brought the monarch caterpillars home in a box on a return trip from Manistique in the Upper Peninsula where his family vacationed last month.

Richard said his mother, Joan Hitchcock, was responsible for collecting "the gobs of caterpillars" from milkweed plants near a lake. Richard discovered more monarch caterpillars in a field near his house and brought the insects home to join

their Upper Peninsula cousins.

The caterpillars wove their cocoons in their cardboard box, and most hatched a few weeks ago.

Richard, who helps his mother make curiosities from dead butterflies ordered from an insect company, said he has never captured live butterflies before.

"It was fun," Richard said of his close-up look at the insects' transformation from caterpillar to brightly-colored butterfly.

## Master plan hearing draws critics and praise

The 1976 master land use plan and its proposed revisions pleased some and angered others when the audience had its say during the Wednesday night public hearing.

Required by law, the hearing was conducted at Plymouth Salem High School by the Canton Township Planning Commission prior to considering adoption of changes in a master land use plan first approved in 1976. The planning commission is also developing revisions to the township's zoning ordinance which would provide legal implementation of the master plan goals. No such revisions were made in the zoning

ordinance following the adoption of the land use plan in 1976.

It became evident during the public hearing that those who didn't like some of the original master plan provisions like them no better in 1979.

Most of the objections from members of the audience were about the planned zoning of areas in which they owned land. Many of the zoning proposals had been contained in the 1976 plan, although some changes in the addendum also drew criticism. Protesters indicated they believed the area where their property was located should be zoned commercial instead of whatever

other category had been designated to it.

Gerald Richter of Farmington Hills, who represented owners of land on Ford Road, told the commission he believed it would be impractical to alternate commercial and residential-zoned property along the road.

"As a builder, I do not feel it is good sense to have living quarters so close to the main artery," Richter said.

"I talked to mortgage people who said they did not feel it would be appropriate. We've been waiting for the property to be zoned to the proper commercial use so we can turn it into a

theater. It makes more sense than high urban residential zoning (as outlined in the master plan)," Richter added.

The property Richter was concerned about is west of Manton on the south side of Ford Road.

BEA NOON of Birmingham, who said she was representing property owner Kenneth Porter, also urged the planning commission to reconsider a zoning change for a parcel on the south side of Ford Road west of Morrison. "It is my partner's opinion that C-1 zoning is the correct zoning. We feel it is hazardous to the lives of people to have residences there," she said.

In both cases, the property owner representatives disagreed with the master plan's intent to prevent a strip of unbroken commercial development.

Developers were not the only ones to object to potential zoning changes included in the master plan proposal. A longtime Canton farmer strenuously objected to the farmland preservation program embraced in the 1976 and updated land use plan.

According to the farmer, 99 percent of the property owners at a public hearing when the 1976 plan was under consideration objected to it. "Canton is not a farming community anymore,"

he said. Duane Bordine, another farmer, called the plan a "gross injustice."

But mixed in with objections to the plan were statements of support for some of the goals.

Support came from the Plymouth-Northville-Canton-Novice League of Women Voters. Carol Dugan of the league said here organization supported the addendum "in regard to the Ford corridor."

Another resident said, "most of the people speaking here tonight are property owners who don't even live in the township who are motivated by greed."

## Short Takes

### Dump rules

The Canton board has decided once and for all what residents may bring to the township's dump on Lilley south of Michigan. The policy was adopted because of the number of residents who have complained about the landfill's unclear rules. According to the policy, residents may bring a truckload of household material to the dump each month for no charge. Not permitted are more than two tires, auto bodies or tree stumps. Before you go, make sure a driver's license with a Canton address is in your pocket.

### Sheldon weeds

If Sheldon Road between Warren and Ford has looked more attractive lately, you can thank residents of Carriage Hills subdivision for cutting the unsightly weeds which usually line the road. Trustee Eugene Daley brought the matter up at a recent township board meeting and wanted to know who to thank. A member of the audience piped up and said residents of Carriage Hills were responsible.

### Legal contract

Attorney Judd Hemming has been awarded a contract to review Canton Township ordinances. Hemming was named temporary township attorney when Supervisor Noel Culbert first took office last November. A member of the selection committee said Hemming was chosen, in part, because he only charges \$45 an hour.

### John's week

John Donahue, age 9 days, could probably care less. But the Canton Township board has declared Aug. 12-19 John Robert Donahue Week in honor of the baby's birth. John, the first child of Treasurer Jim Donahue and wife Paula, was born Aug. 11 after keeping township officials on the edge of their seats for weeks. The birth of the baby, who was due July 24, was anticipated every time a telephone rang at township hall. "I don't recall when the birth of a child has had such an influence on government," remarked Clerk John Flodin. Trustee Robert Greenstein said he's just "glad that it's over."

There has been no blaring of trumpets, torch light parades or congratulatory resolutions by the City Commission, but August is the month of a birthday that has been overlooked for far too many years.

This is the month that marks the 75th birthday of the ice cream cone that is a favorite delicacy of all ages from coast to coast.

It was back in 1904 that America — which had already given the world the telephone, the airplane and the horseless carriage — came up with the ice cream cone.

The cone was born on the hot midway of the World's Fair in St. Louis in 1904. The yellowed pages of history have two versions of the actions that brought it about.

## Rally features Angela Davis

One version has a nameless concessionaire who was selling a flat, sweet cake which he baked on a griddle before the eyes of his customers.

During one of the afternoon lulls he rolled one of his warm cakes into a cornucopia shape. For a moment, so the story goes, he didn't know what to put into it.

The vendor in the next aisle was selling ice cream. With the cornucopia in his hand the cake baker leaned over and begged a scoop of ice cream for the open end of his creation. And the ice cream cone was born.

UNFORTUNATELY, ACCORDING to the historians, neither man saw that it was a great day in concession history. But two other men — fair employees — were taken with the idea.

When the fair closed they went to Cincinnati and began an experiment with baking cones. They used a small hand oven and turned out hand-rolled

sweet sugar cones. They met with instant success and it is too bad that their names are lost in history.

In those days of long ago it wasn't long until automation got in to the act. It happened in 1910 when a Frederick A. Bruckmann, of Portland, Ore., out 3,000 cones an hour.

Imbued with this success he sold machines to other cities and a new industry was born. These were the fore-runners of the Dairy Queens and Red Barns, that one sees along the business sections today.

The real splurge in the business, according to business history, came in 1928 when Nabisco, Inc., bought out Alexander McLaren, who had the rights to the Buckmann machines for many areas around the country.

During the reign of the McLaren company a new feature was added to the cone. It was the nesting ring of extra thickness around the outside of the cone near the top. These permitted the

cones to be packed one inside the other for shipment.

The Nabisco company then started manufacturing three types of cones. There were the waffle cups that came in assorted colors and flavors, waffle cones and sugar cones. This proved a big boost in the popularity of the cone as one Nabisco plant baked more than 300 million cones a year.

Probably no one knows the exact date on which to say "Happy Birthday." It was in August and millions of the cones will be lifted in celebration this year.

According to the latest business survey shows that 786 million gallons of ice cream are consumed every year. If this were to be sold in cones it would amount to about 194 cones being enjoyed by every man, woman or child.

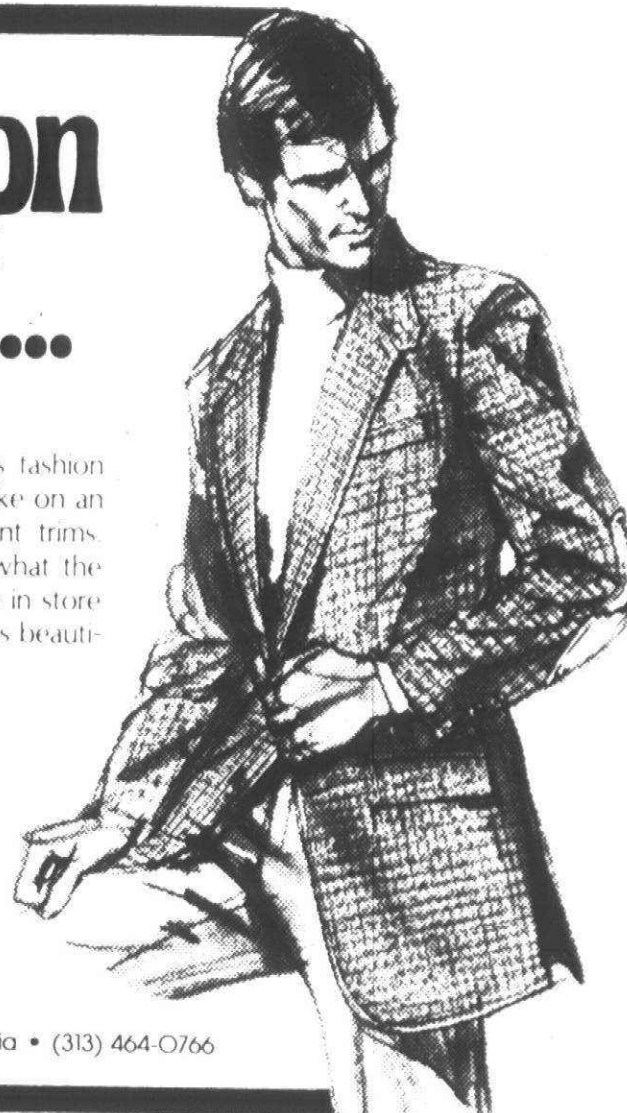
So, even though the exact date of the cone's birth is not known, let's say "Happy Birthday."

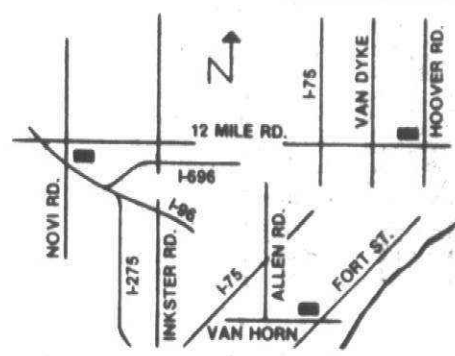

## The judges

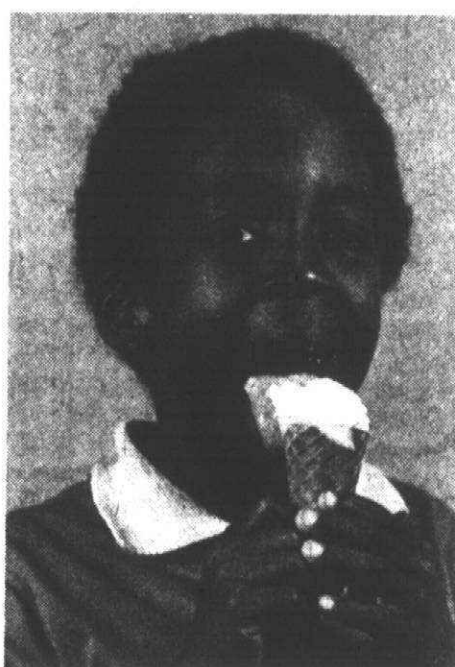

## Experts select the best ice cream around

It was 75 years ago this month that the culmination of cool Yankee know-how and ingenuity — the ice cream cone — splashed on the American scene.

And in honor of that widely appreciated accomplishment, the Observer staff set out to discover "the best ice cream cone" in the Plymouth-Canton area.

The judging was narrowed down to three categories — the best chocolate ice cream, the best strawberry ice cream and the best "house specialty," which was selected by ice cream parlor employees.

The five entries included: Baskin-Robbins 31 Flavors, Friendly Family Restaurant, Stroh's Old Fashioned Ice Cream, Cloverdale Farms Dairy and Meijer's Purple Cow.

The judging was done by only the best qualified experts in the field of ice cream. The connoisseurs were found among the ranks of children — ages 8 and 9.

The five judges carried out their responsibility with the utmost seriousness and concentration, with few exceptions.

Only one child took exception to the contest's timing because of a conflict with her afternoon bowling schedule.

And another volunteered after certain fears were laid to rest.

"If I was gonna be on TV, I would never come," she asserted.

**BEFORE AN AUDIENCE** of parents, siblings, guests and journalists, the children consumed a total of 15 pints of ice cream before the winners were selected.

"I've always wondered what a 15-scoop tummy ache was like," one mother commented.

"It saves me from giving him dessert tonight, and tomorrow and ...," a father added.

With studious concentration, the judges began with the chocolate category, which they agreed took careful delineation. They explained it was the most challenging competition because the brands were similar in taste.

Of the five judges, only two reached a consensus for the top ranking chocolate selection. Both Jerry Kocis and LaMarchial Crayton said Baskin-Robbins had the best flavor in this category. The other three voted for Stroh's, Meijer's and Friendly's. Two judges ranked Meijer's last and two ranked Cloverdale's at the bottom.

To explain why she chose Meijer's as having the best chocolate cone, Heather Kelly reasoned: "I don't like chocolate and this doesn't taste like it."

Conversely, she said she selected Cloverdale's for the worst chocolate scoop because "It tastes the most like

chocolate ice cream."

Jerry said he liked Baskin-Robbins the best because "It was the chocoliest. But there wasn't a big difference in all of them and it was hard to choose."

**BY THE TIME** the strawberry category was before them, the judges had grown sophisticated enough to test for color and texture as well as taste. They all agreed this category had enough variation in quality to ease decision making.

Surprisingly, the tabulation showed an overwhelming consensus for Baskin-Robbins strawberry with all five judges voting in agreement.

Two of the five judges felt its selling point was it "had more cut-up strawberries" than the others.

Although no consensus was reached as to the worst strawberry offering, two of the judges ranked Cloverdale's last and two ranked Friendly's last.

"It was bitter," said LaMarchial about Friendly's.

"It hardly had any strawberry flavor," said Jerry about Cloverdale's.

The final category included each ice cream parlor's house specialty, a flavor store employees assured were children's favorites.

The variety alone elicited excited responses before tasting began.

In this category, Baskin-Robbins offered its grape ice; Friendly's offered its black raspberry; Stroh's suggested its rainbow; Cloverdale's offered its blue moon; and Meijer's offered its own rainbow flavor.

Three of the five judges selected Baskin-Robbins grape ice as the best overall. The other two votes were split between Meijer's rainbow and Stroh's rainbow.

**BUT EVEN** though Andy selected Stroh's rainbow as the best, qualifying his response with "great," he said he "loved grape ice" and placed it second.

"It had a real grape taste," Heather said.

Another near consensus was reached on the worst ice cream in the bunch. Four judges ranked Cloverdale's blue moon as the least desirable, qualifying their stand with such adjectives as "icky, horrible and disgusting."

Heather, however, took a more gracious stand and said it merely had "no taste at all."

At the end of the judging, which lasted almost two hours, some of the judges remarked on continuing with other selections, to the chagrin of their parents.

"I could keep going another 14 hours," Andy said.

LaMarchial, however, felt his stamina could only last "to the end of the day."

# Camping trip to remain treat for sixth grade only

Plymouth-Canton sixth-graders will continue to go to camp.

That decision was made, in spite of a few adverse comments from teachers, at Monday night's meeting of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

Discussion stemmed from a report which surveyed teachers on what was the best age for the camp experience. The study committee, organized to determine if fifth-graders or sixth-graders should go to camp, was headed by Tom Workman.

Committee comments included the following:

Sixth-graders are physically more adept; (the program) fits with middle school philosophy; builds a rapport with sixth-graders and teachers that fifth-graders have with their self-contained teachers; almost 30 years experience supports that sixth-graders are at the correct age level; not enough fifth-graders per building to warrant two camps per building; fifth-grade teachers do not expect nor want to go to camp.

Of eight teachers responding to the survey on the camp experience, several questioned its value.

"The constant demand of responsibility for children 24 hours a day without a break is not healthy for anyone," wrote one.

Another said, "I feel camp is a week off for most kids. I have seen many teachers come unprepared for camp. Example: A teacher planned on teaching first aid, but brought no first aid materials."

Still another teacher reported, "It is an outdoor experience that cannot be repeated and is needed by most of the students; some parents will not take the time to give their kids this experience."

# Safety laws drafted in effort to stop fires

The death of a 6-year-old boy in a house fire last June has prompted the proposal of two township ordinances aimed at fire safety.

One of the proposed laws would mandate inspections of homes for possible fire and building code violations before the house could be sold.

The other would require installation of smoke detectors in all homes in Canton Township.

According to Fire Chief Mel Paulun, a house fire which took the life of 6-year-old Anthony Prince last June was possibly caused by faulty electrical wiring — a defect that could have been discovered by a mandatory building inspection.

Paulun said the older home at Sheldon and Warren roads was not equipped with a smoke detector.

UNDER STATE LAW, all homes constructed since Jan. 1, 1975 must be built with smoke detectors. Paulun has been pushing for a township ordinance which would mandate installation of smoke detectors in all homes.

Supervisor Noel Culbert said he will introduce proposed smoke detector and building inspection ordinances to the Canton board on Aug. 28 for discussion purposes.

If both ordinances are passed, Culbert said township inspectors would check for the presence of a smoke detector at the time the pre-sale inspection of the home is made.

Culbert said the inspection would probably cost homeowners \$15 to \$20.

"But the intent is not to make money off the inspections. The intent is to catch things before they happen."

"I think the Prince death really touched this off," he said. "It's the older homes like that that the ordinance is aimed at. Probably 90 percent of the people in Canton wouldn't have to worry about code violations."

According to Culbert, several communities in the area including Dearborn and Detroit require inspections of homes as a condition of sale.

tence for diesel fuel pumps.

"We drive up and down Ford Road and see gasoline-only stations. We're going full-service, and now you want diesel pumps."

In the end, board members approved the special permit 6-1, with Greenstein dissenting. Erwin promised that the proposed Canton station would be among the first to sell diesel fuel once his firm begins marketing the fuel in Michigan.

Erwin must return before the board with a request for site plan approval before the station can be built.

# Levin speaks on energy, Carter and SALT II

To try and assess where Chrysler Corporation went wrong, would be too much like "finger pointing" and "Monday morning quarterbacking," and would evade the real issue of trying to solve Chrysler's present economic problems, United States Senator Carl Levin said in an exclusive interview with Sliger Home Newspapers.

"It would be a complete mistake to engage in that sort of backward process, which would only result in recriminations and disunity within Chrysler throughout the nation."

"The impact of the company's economic problems is massive, whether it could result in the loss of 300,000 jobs, as reported in a report released by the Congressional Budget Office, or in 700,000 jobs, as reported earlier."

"It is therefore extremely important for Congress to consider Chrysler's predicament as a national problem, instead of just Michigan's, and work to find a method to insure the company remains solvent," Levin said.

The senator did put part of the blame

on the federal government, which he criticized for a lack of a "workable energy policy that should have been developed years ago" and would not have resulted in the almost overnight disappearance of Chrysler's Recreational Vehicle sales, which has occurred this summer.

Levin also knocked the mileage requirements instituted in recent years by the Environmental Protection Agency, which he said have "fallen unequally on Chrysler" since the nation's number three automaker has "not enough of a diversified fleet of automobiles" to distribute the mileage requirements through its operations like Ford and General Motors can.

"If Chrysler goes under it would result in a \$13 billion loss in taxes paid to the U.S. Treasury, and would be a very serious national setback which would put us behind many, many years economically," Levin said. "But I do feel our economy could survive the loss of Chrysler," he added.

Levin, who was in Michigan following the adjournment of Congress for its annual summer recess, was interviewed at length about several current issues,

including Jimmy Carter's chances of winning the Democratic Nomination in 1980, the recent Congressional censure of Representative Charles Diggs, (D-Detroit), and the probable passage of the Strategic Arms Limitation Talks, (SALT II), and Carter's energy proposals.

"I believe in government by the people," Levin said, referring to Diggs' recent re-election despite his conviction of misusing Congressional funds. "If the people want a man like Diggs representing them in Congress, they have a right to keep him there. I may not agree with them, but I will not do anything to deny them that right."

In fact, Levin said he "urged him (Diggs) to step aside, and refrain from voting until his appeal was finished. I also asked him to do all he could to expedite his appeal, since a long drawn out court battle would not be fair to Diggs or the people he represents in my estimation."

Another problem Congress has been, and will be attempting to deal with is the passage of the Salt II accords, which Levin said might be hampered by the attachment of a number of

"reservations, understandings and concurrent resolutions" by the Senate would slow the treaty's passage and possibly make it unacceptable to the Soviet Union.

"There is a real question as to whether or not the United States will be able to accurately keep track of the Soviet's production and experimentation of nuclear weapons," Levin said.

"We must be sure that the Soviets are not violating the treaty in any manner. Just recently, U.S. intelligence operations reported that the Soviets were conducting missile tests and coding information they were receiving electronically from the missiles so that we could not understand the results."

Levin said if the Salt II accords were brought up for a vote in Congress this week, they would "go down to defeat and would be a very serious blow to nuclear arms reduction efforts" throughout the world.

"I think Salt II as it stands now is a good pact. In one area in particular, that is, the limit of 10 nuclear warheads per missile, the accords go a long way to reduce the danger of a devastating nuclear war between our two nations."

Levin explained that the maximum number of 10 warheads for each missile would eliminate 6,000 Soviet warheads, some of which he said were already in construction and would have to be destroyed. Each warhead would be 100 times more devastating than the atomic bomb used in Hiroshima, if they were ever deployed, Levin said.

"I do think our country should modernize its atomic weaponry whether or not Salt II is ratified, in order to insure our nation's freedom and global position," he said.

The cost of such nuclear modernization and the energy package outlined by Carter in his recent energy speech, will be high but must be undertaken in order to prepare the U.S. for the future, Levin said.

"Carter's energy proposals make sense to me, generally. I think the key part of any energy package must be the windfall profits tax, without which it would be very hard to fund the alternative energy programs."

"The American oil companies have reinvested less of their profits into producing energy, their main source of income, than any major industry in the

world. Instead, they keep on grabbing up all that money and diversifying their business, buying hotels and resorts, which have little or nothing to do with producing energy."

"So while we as Americans are forced to pay more and more for gas and heating oil, the huge oil monopolies just keep getting richer and richer."

Levin said the American people will probably lay the blame for the lack of a strong energy policy on Jimmy Carter, whom he said has a "50-50" chance of winning the Democratic nomination for president.

Levin agreed that Carter's biggest threat to a second term in office lies within his own party, in the person of Senator Edward Kennedy, (D-Massachusetts).

"I can't imagine Jerry Brown as much of a political threat to Carter," Levin said. "I just won't believe that the American public will buy what Brown is trying to sell. But if Kennedy decides to run, Carter will be in trouble."

# School boards, unions square off in region

Teacher strikes in Michigan school districts may be the rule rather than the exception this year, and that could prove the first major test of the Michigan Education Association's drive toward regional bargaining.

That's the opinion of both teachers union and board of education officials monitoring progress of school bargaining in Oakland and Wayne counties and throughout the state where most teacher contracts will expire by Aug. 31.

"It looks terrible. Progress is not being made anywhere," says Connie Math, who heads the MEA's Oakland

County Coordinated Bargaining Committee.

"Everyone's still talking general issues — not economics and fringes. It looks very, very bleak as far as settlements being in by Labor Day," she said. Labor Day week marks the traditional opening of school in most districts.

"There could be 10-20 strikes in Oakland County alone," she added. Twenty-one of 26 unions belonging to the MEA in Oakland County have unsettled contracts.

THE HEAD of the Wayne County MEA agrees it is doubtful many of the 21 unsettled districts there will reach

agreement on teacher contracts by Labor Day.

George Alpervitz cautions he speaks only for districts represented by the MEA. Teachers in the mammoth Detroit Public Schools belong to a different union — the Detroit Federation of Teachers — which is also working toward a new contract.

Coordinated bargaining has slowed negotiations, Alpervitz says, but forecasts: "In the long run it's going to produce settlements more quickly than in the past."

Teachers are seeking unified clout to gain mutual goals. School boards are

trying to get the most for their money. Taxpayers are generally reluctant to shell out any more in the form of taxes.

Harry Bishop, associate executive director of the Michigan Association of School Boards based in Lansing, predicts from 40-60 teacher strikes throughout the state. Last year there were 27.

Bishop, in charge of labor relations for the MASA, is "pessimistic about the progress of negotiations prior to the Labor Day weekend. I would not be at all surprised to see one of these coordinated bargaining units engineer an areawide strike," he said.

He calls the few settlements which have come in "some of the highest I've ever seen." He fears some will mean teacher layoffs and program cutbacks in light of spiralling inflation, declining enrollments and Headlee-initiated state aid rollbacks.

ATTORNEY CHARLES FINE sees "a tremendous reluctance for unions to reach agreement" this year. His Birmingham based law firm of Clark, Hardy, Lewis, Fine and Asher advises approximately 20 school boards in Wayne and Oakland counties on labor relations.

"They don't want to be the first," he says. Fine said local unions are intimidated by the coordinated bargaining process. He sees them all playing a waiting game through Labor Day.

School will start on time in most Oakland and Wayne County districts, he predicts, "but maybe not all."

He doesn't see Wayne County striking on a countywide basis, but says what Detroit Public Schools teachers do could be "a catalyst to the whole thing" since the two unions vie for leadership in Wayne County.

The AFT has less influence in Oakland where it represents just two of 28 teachers unions.

## Here's round-up of negotiations

Bargaining progress has been described as slow by teacher and school board representatives throughout Wayne and Oakland counties.

Here's the status of school districts covered by the Observer & Eccentric newspapers with less than three weeks left until classes are scheduled to resume in most districts:

### OAKLAND COUNTY

- Birmingham — Negotiators will step up bargaining this week toward an Aug. 26 target date to reach tentative contract agreement. The target date is earlier than the Labor Day target date of past years. Unresolved issues include salary, fringe benefits and class size. Spokesmen from both sides say talks this year are showing earlier progress than in the past. Negotiations affect 640 teachers. There are roughly 11,100 students in Birmingham schools.

- Bloomfield Hills — Settled. Teachers will receive a 20.9 percent salary increase over two years.

- Farmington — Cost of living allowance and a 6 percent pay hike top the list of demands Farmington teachers are after. Both sides say the contract will be settled without a strike. Farmington teachers went on strike in 1974. About 770 teachers and 13,270 students make up the district.

- Southfield — Teacher transfers, class size and salaries are among the few issues left to be resolved, say teacher and school board representatives. Southfield schools contract with its 723 teachers expires Aug. 24. The district's 11,434 students are scheduled to start Wednesday, Sept. 5, pending an agreement.

- Walled Lake — It's slow going in Walled Lake where new head negotiators for both the teachers union and school board cite problems. Contract talks are further hindered by cutbacks in staff and programs due to the failure of two additional millage elections this spring. Tentative agreement has been reached on just three of 26 issues after more than 12 full-table bargaining sessions. The district's contract with its 588 teachers expired June 30. About 10,500 students attend Walled Lake schools, scheduled for a Sept. 5 opening.

- Warren — Ongoing contract. This district which services the southeast corner of Troy is not bargaining. Its two-year contract doesn't expire until August 1980.

- West Bloomfield — Full table bargaining is scheduled this week after several weeks of informal sessions. Most issues were covered in informal talks, say both sides, including class size, fringes and salary. The school board has OK'd a tentative calendar which calls for a Sept. 19 opening day — a full two weeks later than the

district's usual post Labor Day opening. The idea is to shield the district's more than 5,500 students from either a local or countywide strike, say school officials. They hope an opening date which is more acceptable to teachers and the community will be part of a tentative agreement. About 280 teachers are affected by the contract which expires Aug. 31.

### WAYNE COUNTY

- Clarenceville — Negotiators report slow going with no attempt to deal with financial issues in this, one of the area's smallest districts with students from Livonia, Farmington and Redford Township. There has never been a strike in the Clarenceville district, where 127 teachers and 2,350 students are involved.

- Garden City — Bargaining sessions are being held two or three times a week. Both sides report that they feel an agreement will be reached by the time school is set to open. One issue remaining is class size.

- Livonia — Ongoing contract. This large district has two years to go on its current teachers contract. It has voted against involvement in regional bargaining.

- Plymouth-Canton — The situation in this growing district which expects 16,600 students this fall is described as "very, very iffy." A pre-Labor Day school opening is giving the district less bargaining time than in others. A contract by the Aug. 27 opening for extended year students and Aug. 29 for regular pupils is considered unrealistic. The district's 800 teachers may well return to work without a contract.

- Redford Union — Bargaining is just underway in this district of 358 teachers and 6,112 students. There has been some agreement on simple issues, although no details have been announced. Money questions are not yet up for review.

- South Redford — Full-fledged bargaining has just begun in this district of 3,923 students and 204 teachers. Early sessions have been termed productive with no major issues yet attacked. Settlement is considered a long way off. The South Redford Education Association rejected joining regional bargaining by one vote.

- Wayne-Westland — This large district of 1,100 teachers and 3,923 students reached tentative agreement on a contract earlier this month — the first time the district has reached a tentative pact before the current contract expired. The current pact expires Sept. 3. No details of the agreement will be released until after teachers take a ratification vote, scheduled today.

## Hydroplane 'family' works together as a true team

One weekend it could be St. Petersburg, Fla. Another, Decatur, Ill.

For the Sun Plastics Coating Racing team based in Plymouth Township, the sport of hydroplane racing is an "expensive hobby" according to Joe Tate Jr., owner of the boat "Low Friction."

Tate, his father Joe Sr., and son Mark, 19, form the family racing team which travels across the country.

Joe Sr. is the master mechanic and the foundation of the racing Tate clan. Joe Jr., president of the company, is the owner of Low Friction and still does some driving himself. He has been involved with Indianapolis-type auto racing and has competed against Bill Muncie, driving king of the unlimited hydros.

Mark, a graduate of Westland John Glenn High School in 1978, is the main driver now — one of the top in his class nationally.

The Tate family travels almost eve-

ry weekend to locally held APBA races.

"Mark used to follow me around the circuit," said Joe, Jr. "and then sort of took off on his own."

Young Mark started his racing career when he was 10 years old. He raced outboard boats until last year when he then started competing in inboard events.

TO COMPETE AS an inboard driver, Mark had to take a written and oral test and compete in one race before a board of review.

"They give tests for safety reasons," explained Joe Jr. "Inboard hydroplanes used to be extremely dangerous. I saw many guys killed."

Mark moved up to the inboard circuit after winning 22 of 24 outboard events last year.

"It's a real thrill to be out there," said Mark. "I don't really recognize speed when I'm racing — only when I'm side by side with somebody else."

He races on oval courses and averages a speed close to 80 m.p.h. The boat often reaches speeds near 100 m.p.h.

"I get a lot of enjoyment out of doing it," said Mark. "It's a hobby."

"We've been in two races the past two weeks and have won about \$300," said Joe Jr. "There's not a lot of money to be made."

The Tates, residents of Canton Township, work on their engines in their garage at home. The team uses three engines, one which blew up two weeks ago on the trailer before the Nationals in Dayton, Ohio.

"We blew an engine in St. Pete but that was in the water and not on the trailer," said Joe Jr. shaking his head.

"Any time you run on methanol (a colorless flammable liquid), you're bound to have some engine problems," he said.

"AT DAYTON we busted a cam in three places. It was unbelievable."

# Stemberger helping own cause

Despite a new environment and two new positions, Brian Stemberger is handling the situation better than expected.

The Plymouth Canton graduate and Eastern Michigan standout is enjoying a banner season in his first year of professional baseball.

Signed by the Toronto Blue Jays in mid-June after being selected in the 13th round, Stemberger has made the most out of his Utica, N.Y. stay in the Class A New York-Penn. League.

In fact, Stemberger is tearing up the league with his hot bat. The 6-3, 195-pounder leads the league with a .373 (as of Aug. 15) which includes five homers. Stemberger is being used primarily

as a designated hitter (DH) — a position he has never tried in his entire baseball career.

"It's tough to get used to," explained Stemberger about his new role. "I've done better than I thought."

When he reported for minor league duty just two months ago, Stemberger never thought he'd be pitching.

At Eastern Michigan last spring, Stemberger played his familiar position — shortstop.

"When I came here, I knew I'd be tried at a lot of different positions," he said, "but I never thought I'd be pitching."

During his little league and high school career, Stemberger was never on the mound.

"I pitch every fourth day and DH the other three," said Stemberger.

A member of the starting rotation, Stemberger has a record of 2-2 with a 4.20 ERA.

"It's going to take time to get used to pitching. My control has been good — better than I thought."

"I have three main pitches — a fastball, slider and changeup. I have a natural sinker."

The Canton graduate started his pitching career with a 50-pitch limit. He recently threw 103 pitches going seven innings.

As a result of his fine play, Stemberger will report to the Instructional League in Dunedin, Fla., Sept. 15 through Nov. 15. The regular season in the N.Y.-Penn. League ends Aug. 30.

"They'll make a decision in the Instructional League about me," he said. "They'll determine which position I'll

go with.

"They may try me at first base. I have a lot of options. Everything has been so far, so good. I know it's going to get tougher up the road."

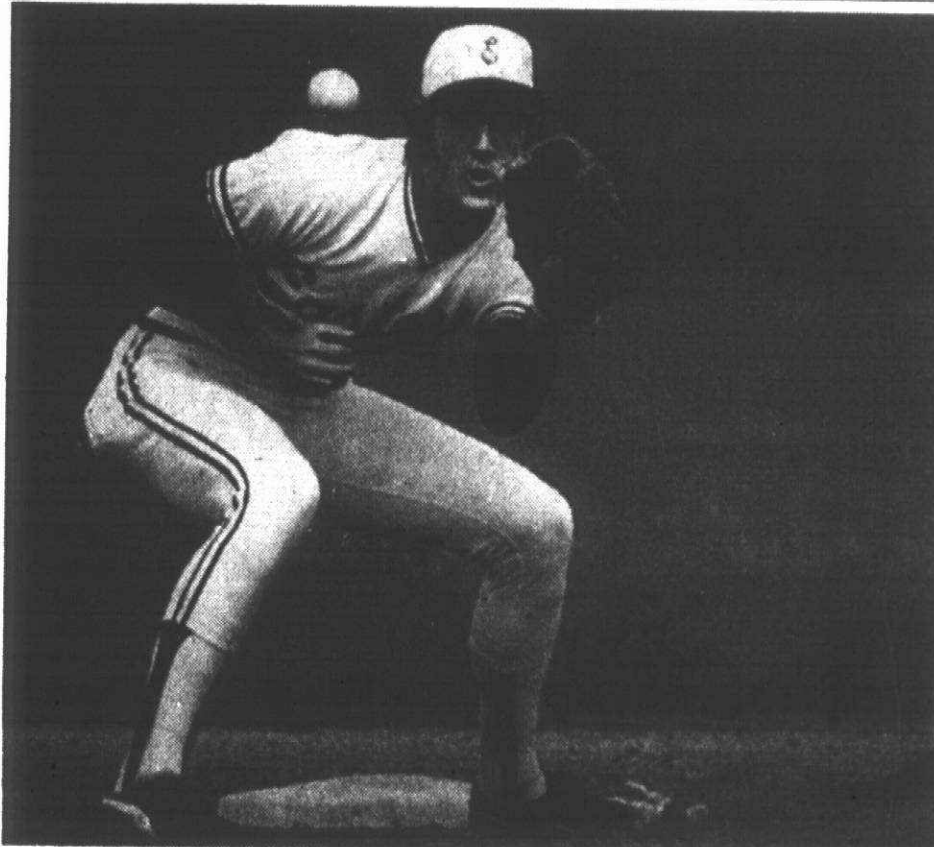
Stemberger is also getting an education in foreign language. The Utica team, who started out slow, has 13 players from the Dominican Republic on the roster.

"Communication is definitely a problem," he said. "We have to point a lot. One of the Dominican players can speak English so he translates for the coach during practice. Sometimes it's like a zoo out there."

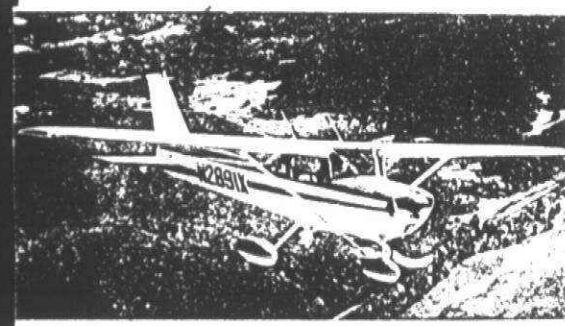

They hired a woman with a tan and a voice so incredibly perfect one couldn't help searching for hidden wires when she began extolling the virtues of Lincoln Continentals.

Then they trucked the media types over to the test track so they could stuff them full of baron of beef. They laid out a fresh fruit tray so elaborate, only Robinson Crusoe could grow used to it.

And what happens?

Why, the ingrates ignore The Voice, they toss back the beef and nibble on nectarines and they all walk over and stare at . . . a 20-year-old car, for God's sake, when they're here in the first place to look over 0-year-old cars.

The big press kickoff for the 1980 Lincoln Continentals and Mark VIs got off to a shaky start because parked in their midst was William Clay Ford's personal Mark I, a sort of ballooned version of a '56 or '57 Thunderbird.

Mark Is are collectors items, and this particular car was what enthusiasts refer to as "cherry." The odometer showed less than 1,500 miles. In the back seat, on the center of the steering wheel and

## A bomb drops, and a little girl races for time

Here's today's tearjerker.

After making 964 paper birds, she died.

I suppose that folding paper birds is the least we can do after wiping out an innocent little girl who believed in legends and knew nothing of wars.

I know a bit about wars, waitresses and paperfolding, but little of legends.

concealed in who-knows-how-many-other places in the car were the initials WCF, all of it in the Honolulu blue and silver colors of the Detroit Lions.

"I think it might have been a mistake to have that car here, it's kind of stealing the thunder" one PR flak said. "It wasn't my idea."

**THE NEW CARS** themselves were pretty interesting for the technically minded, a veritable bonanza for the gimmick-oriented, and the cause of outright salivating among bank loan officers — the sticker price hasn't been set, or so say company officials, but you can expect to shell out 15,000 clams or more per copy.

Let's quickly run down the cars, so to speak. The Mark VIs come with a mini-computer as standard equipment.

This powers the instrument panel digital displays of radio stations and fuel. By pushing a button you can run down a checklist of oil pressure, engine temperature, head and taillights, brakes, and a host of other functions. The computer will tell you how far to your destination, how long you've been travelling, what your gasoline mileage is and what color socks you're wearing, for all I know. All this is available as an option on the Continentals. The speedometer also registers in digits.

With a 351 CID engine, the cars accelerate sluggishly in comparison to the 1971 Dodge with a 383 engine that I drive. I can't tell you how much comfort it gave me to notice this fact. It gave me less pleasure to note that the cars have some 30 percent better mileage than mine.

Speaking of mileage, it creates strange tendencies on test tracks. I mean, test track to me means speed — melt that pedal to the floor and no worry about the nasty troopers coming up to spoil the fun.

No more. Now people go to a test track and they actually set the cruise control at 55 miles an hour and they steer mindlessly around the track to see what kind of mileage they get.

This attitude is infectious.

**AT 80 MILES AN HOUR**, more or less, the big cars start to roll and sway disturbingly through tight curves. At least, it seemed disturbing to the Ford PR flak assigned to accompany the media folks on their test drives.

"Why don't you see now, just for comparison, why don't you see what kind of mileage you get at 45?" he said. I said sure.

The cars were equipped with computers to measure mileage. In coasting from 85 mph to 45 mph, the Mark VI got 204.3 mpg.

Your mileage, as the ads say, may be less.

## Woodstock Nation noted

I don't think it was ever hip for hippies to call themselves that. Just as I'm sure beatniks never liked their collective calling card.

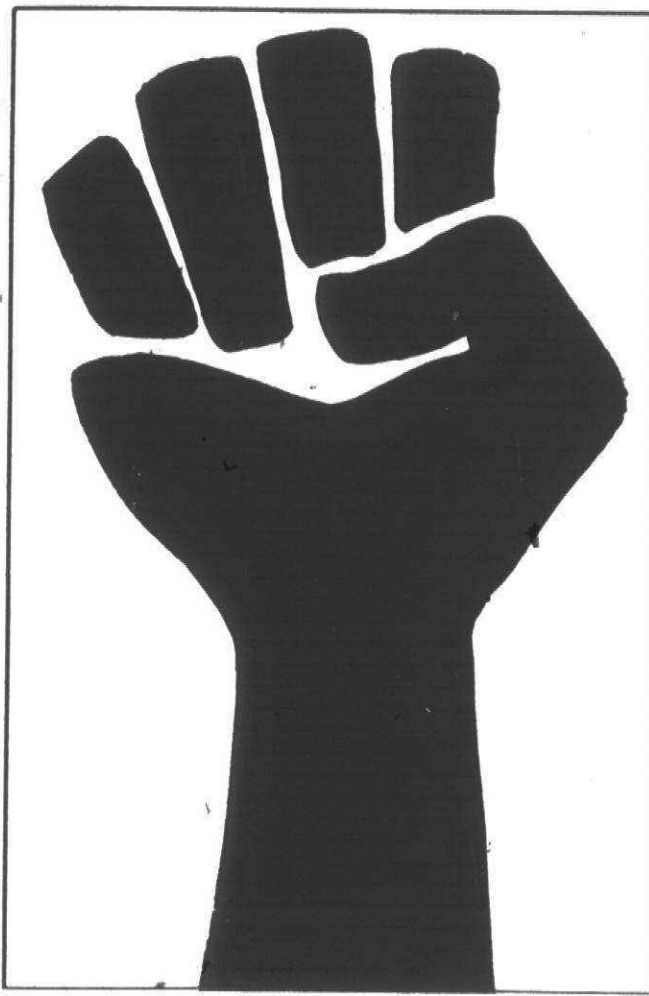
But for all practical purposes I guess I would have qualified as a hippie. After all, I was the first kid on the block to put a black light and day-glo posters on my bedroom wall. I remember there was an orange peace sign on the wall next to a political poster of Donald Duck imitating Uncle Sam's "I Want You" pose. Except Uncle Duck said "Quack!"

I'm still not sure of the political message, but it disturbed my dad, which was enough at the time. A year later I succeeded in being classified a conscientious objector by the draft board.

I tossed out the hippie posters a few years later when I got into a 'let's leave the past behind' mood, but I was reminded of them last week during all the news reports commemorating the 10th anniversary of Woodstock. At the risk of being accused of being overly sentimental, Woodstock was an important event in mass culture. Granted, it was not as significant as we thought at the time, but it was a symbol of a profound change in national direction.

I was 17 in 1969 and wanted to go to Woodstock in the worst way.

I had made some money and gained 20 pounds



that summer working at a cafeteria inside a factory. But I didn't want to take my car to New Bethel, N.Y. figuring it would conk out on the other side of Niagara Falls. All week we tried to find somebody who had a reliable car. Since most of us delivered pizzas on weekends, nobody had a reliable car.

So we did the next best thing. We went to New York City on a class trip the following spring and went to the opening day performance of the movie "Woodstock" at 9 in the morning. (We had to be back at the hotel at noon to go to the U.N.)

And in the summer of 1970 I attended the local equivalent of Woodstock — the Goose Lake Rock & Roll Festival (and drug convention) in appropriately named Grass Lake.

But still we hadn't been to Woodstock. We had to experience it vicariously through a couple of high school classmates — Gene Branni and Paul Eckstein — who were lucky enough to make the pilgrimage. I remember I regarded them highly enough to write a feature story on their excursion in the high school paper.

"**THREE DAYS** of peace, love and music" was the way the festival was described at the time. You couldn't get away with that claim in today's cynical atmosphere. But people like my classmates, and another friend who went, say that the Woodstock participants really were friendly and really did share their food and shelter and that the music was fantastic.

But that's not what brought them to Woodstock. They wanted to see some naked girls and be part of an historic spectacle.

I talked to some people my age last week about their impressions of the festival at the time compared to their view of it 10 years later. None of them wanted me to use their names for fear they'd be called wilted flower children.

Bill (might not be his real name), my friend who actually went to Woodstock, said he didn't go to hear the music but to "see the spectacle." He was visiting a friend in New York and heard disaster reports about the unprecedented traffic jam and figured that was the place to be.

"I went when things were sounding good, when I heard they were expecting one million people. That's when I decided to go. I bought a ticket to the festival in New York City, which I didn't have to use because by the time we got there the festival was open to anyone."

Bill saved a copy of the New York Daily News with the glaring headline blaring: "Traffic Uptight at Hippie Fest."

Images of the festival remain intact. Images of nonchalant naked couples, O.D. tents for LSD casualty cases, white blues singer Joe Cocker contorting his body on stage, volunteers making thousands of peanut butter sandwiches, and a busload of Brooklynites singing their neighborhood song "Be Bop Bo."

**TIME HAS** a strange way of capsulizing and compressing the past. For example, just the week before Woodstock were the murders by the Charles Manson family. Ten years ago last month Neil Armstrong walked on the moon. Somehow those events didn't seem related at the time but are almost inseparable upon historic reflection.

I could quote some of the lyrics of the Woodstock singers who talked about how "we've got to get ourselves back to the garden." But those words seem painfully naive now.

No, the lyrics that come to mind right now were sung by Iggy Pop, lead singer with a local band called the Stooges that played the Goose Lake Rock Festival.

Iggy sang a snotty little ditty that went like this:

"Well it's 1969, OK  
All across the U.S.A.  
Another year for me and you.  
Another year with nothin' to do.  
Well last year I was 21.  
Didn't have a lotta fun.  
Now I'm gonna be 22.  
Said 'Oh, my,' and 'Boo-hoo'  
This is 1969 baby."

That, to me, announced the end of the summer of love. And this is 1979 baby. But the point we shouldn't forget or be ashamed of is that at one time Woodstock Generation meant something sincere. And sincerity has been in short supply in the Me Generation.

# Wayne County money problems go on—and on

A four-day work-week plan may have to be in effect before the state Municipal Finance Commission would approve a \$22 million loan to alleviate Wayne County's growing debt.

Commissioner consultant Anton Presecan, hinting that the county's credibility with the state is low, said last week, "maybe before borrowing is approved the plan may have to be in effect."

As it has the past three years, the county requested Municipal Finance

Commission permission to borrow money against next year's anticipated tax revenues to get the county through its fiscal year.

Presecan noted the county's promises to put its financial house in order the past several years, in return for borrowing authorization, never materialized.

The commission "wants to see a real plan," Presecan said.

LAST WEEK the county Board of Commissioners approved a plan to cut the work-week to four days for about 3,500 employees. The plan, however, has to be negotiated with American Federation of State County and Municipal Employees Council 25 which represents most of the employees affected.

And union agreement with the cut-back appears unlikely.

"Our members aren't going to buy a four day work week," said Eugene Gui-

do, staff representative for AFSCME. "The county hasn't given the unions anything our members will accept," he added.

Guido said the exclusion of some county departments from the cut also gives it little chance of approval.

Departments that operate 24-hour services such as the county jail, County General Hospital in Westland, public works division and the youth home were deleted from the cutback.

The four-day week, which could start soon if the unions agree, is expected to save the county about \$2.2 million by Nov. 30, the of the fiscal year.

Board of Auditors Secretary Leonard Proctor told commissioners last week that the county has enough cash in the bank to meet its payroll through this week.

The Municipal Finance Commission demanded the county present a plan to alleviate its projected \$19.5 million

deficit before it would consider the \$22 million borrowing authorization.

The commission also wants a detailed breakdown of the \$19.5 million.

As of Friday, Presecan said the commission hadn't received either, thus making it unlikely the commission would hear the county's request Tuesday. The commission meets weekly.

Besides those employees paid through county general fund revenues, Circuit Court and Common Pleas Court employees face layoffs.

Nearly 80 Common Pleas employees received lay-off notices last week and its estimated that 700 circuit court employees may have to be laid off in mid-October if neither the Michigan Legislature or finance commission come to the county's rescue.

Earlier this month, Gov. William Milliken vetoed \$5.5 million for state takeover of county probation services and continued operation of circuit court.

Milliken insists the county receive no financial aid until the legislature acts on county government reorganization. The legislature is not due back in Lansing until mid-September.

## Do victims abuse compensation law?

Wayne County victims of crime who took advantage of a two-year-old crime compensation law last year on the average found a \$1,400 silver lining in what had been a dark cloud over their heads.

Some 250 county residents — most of them Detroiters — were awarded \$332,000 in compensatory funds from the Michigan Crime Victim Compensation Committee. The dollar figure represents 68 percent of the total awarded in Michigan.

The recipients of the monies had previously filed at the county prosecutor's office a five-page form detailing the crime against them and the severity of injuries incurred. Awards were determined by the insurance and the amount of wages or supplemental earnings at a

victim's disposal.

"The prosecutor (Wayne County prosecutor William Cahalan) supports this program," said Mike Freed, the office manager in the prosecutor's office. "And we encourage local police departments to send out the forms to crime victims."

Freed said the forms should be available at all local police agencies, but said the prosecutor's office probably makes a greater effort than local police to encourage crime victims to fill out the forms.

"In Detroit," Freed said, "victims come to the prosecutor's office to file their complaint. We have people here who can assist them in filling out the form."

IN LIVONIA, however, police captain Jim Mogan conceded that the compensation forms are rarely picked up

and that victims of crime are not encouraged by officers to file the form.

Mogan said the forms are supposed to be kept on or near the front desk at the police station, but said "they probably get stuck in a drawer somewhere."

There is no policy in the Livonia department to encourage officers to inform victims of crime about the law. According to Mogan:

"An officer who is filling out a report is so busy and concerned with the report itself that he probably forgets all about the (compensation) forms."

"I don't think people (residents) even know about it," Mogan added. "The law could probably use a little publicity."

THE CRIME compensation program was established in October 1977. Since then 957 persons have qualified as crime victims and received cash awards totaling \$1.2 million. Another

1,291 applicants' appeals were denied.

To qualify for compensation victims cannot be personally responsible for their injuries or make a substantial contribution to the injuries they suffered.

An example of a claim that was denied: The bank robber who applied for compensation after he was shot during a hold-up attempt.

Wage figures are used to determine how serious financial hardship is and to judge how much money the crime victim loses as a result of injury. Maximum award for lost pay is \$100 per week.

Funds for the awards come from state appropriations. So far nine people have qualified for and received the maximum award of \$15,000.

According to law, claimants must file within 30 days of an incident.

# Caribbean connecting

Aboard the sailing yacht Vela, the rope burns our hands as we hoist the huge sails under the hot Caribbean sun.

We have been under motor power for at least half an hour now, cutting a white swatch through the turquoise sea, but the 1,880-square-foot main sail and the 800-square-foot fore sail will pull us faster through the banks here in the Bahamas.

It may sound like we are working very hard, but the truth is that we have just eaten sausage, bacon, omelets and fresh hot bread for breakfast, and we are about to bake slowly in the morning sun until lunchtime.

After that we will take the dinghy to some uninhabited sand beach, and scuba dive or swim for the rest of the afternoon until we are sunburned medium rare.

The outline of our ship against the cloud-puffed sky may be reminiscent of 19th-century sailing days, but a sailor's life was never like this.

What we are doing here in the Berry Islands of the Bahamas is what the owners of this shop call "Vacations Under Sail." The 36 passengers and crew spend the morning under sail in waters that are generally too shallow for big ships, and the afternoon on the beach of lonely islands while the cook creates a great dinner and chills the wine.

It is the wrong kind of vacation for people who like dining and dancing or shopping amid colorful markets, and it probably isn't adventurous enough for the kind of sailor who likes to lean over into the wind with a pulling wheel in his hand.

It is the right kind of vacation for

people who like to spend a week in a bathing suit and an old hat, wrapped in a gold-and-blue environment of sun, sand and sea.

SAILING SHIPS have made familiar high-masted skylines on these waters ever since Columbus sailed here in 1492. Ponce de Leon was here, followed by pirate ships and slave ships and trading ships of many nations.

On a navigational chart, there are two major colors marking the 700 islands of the Commonwealth of the Bahamas. One color marks the deep waters of the passages, channels and sounds that carried sailing ships and modern cruise ships into these palm-fringed islands.

A second color marks the bans that cradle the 2,000 cays (pronounced keys), tiny shale and coral islands in shallow waters where only smaller boats are comfortable. Private yachts anchor within 100 yards of the shore but the 110-foot-long Vela must anchor as much as a mile out to sea.

There usually are a few two-masted sailing boats on every day's horizon, but it is unusual to see a junk-rigged sailing ship like this one.

Cruise sailing is the kind of travel pioneered by the famous Windjammer Cruises, but the Caribbean Schooner Cruise Yachts make a different shape against the sea. The Vela, and her soon-to-be-delivered sister ship, Lyra, have metal hulls with a main deck and a sun deck dominated by two huge brown sails designed after those worn by a Chinese junk.

These sails provide maximum power while leaving the deck clear of traditional rigging.

Nobody but the captain knew where



we were going when we sailed out of Nassau early Sunday. Captain Bill Curry, a Seattle sailor with a lot of slanted wooden decks and rigging in his background, plans the week's cruise day by day, according to weather.

The itinerary is always geared towards the out islands and the deserted beaches that you don't see from the settlements or even from a regular cruise ship.

We have covered about 150 miles in our six-day run. Each morning, at sunrise, the Vela rocks lightly at anchor as the sun makes a pale golden corridor across the sea. Two women finish their morning yoga exercises, and a man is on his last pushup as the sun begins to burn the rails white, sending golden rays down to where the fish swim under the green water.

The chef, John Goddard, starts sending breakfast smells up from the galley. As we eat, the crew silently starts the engine and gets us under way, with the captain maneuvering his electronic steering gear from the sundeck.

Later, a white wake follows the dinghy across the turquoise sea to some golden sand beach. Seaman Seville Pierre stands tall and black and proud like a living figurehead at the front of the boat and Seaman Rupert Archibald makes a fringe of black beard against the cloud-puffed blue sky at the back.

The crew members wear the dignity

of people at work but the rest of us look a little silly in our crooked sunhats and dripping shirts, with the gleam of sun oil everywhere. This is a hot-sun world.

The most populated stop has only a few thatched-topped tables on the beaches. Most have nothing but seagulls.

THESE ARE EXCELLENT waters for scuba diving and fishing if you arranged your gear in advance, but most of us are content to snorkel around the easy shallow waters or the more difficult reefs nearby.

When I saw the world this was for

the first time, I entered a new world of sand and coral and underwater grass. The outline of a sting ray made its shape known against the sand bottom and another swam by on ghostly wings only 20 feet away.

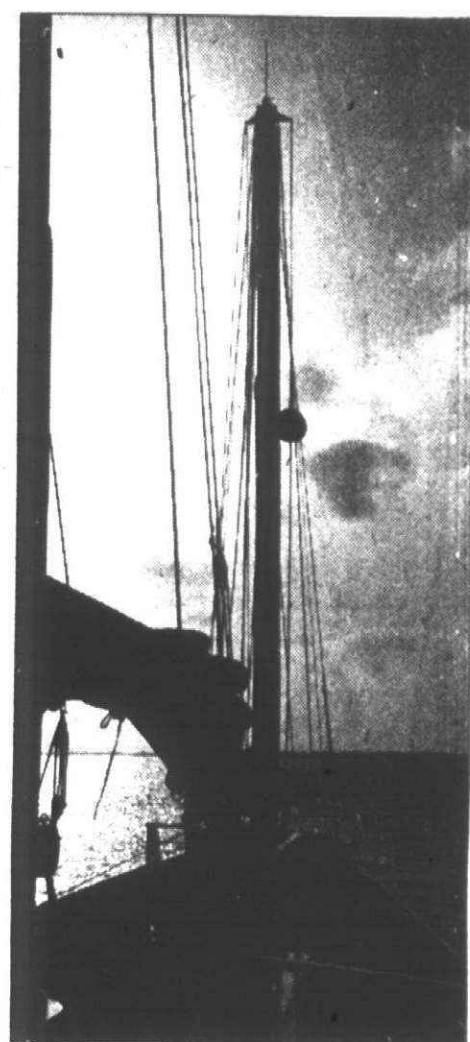
Nobody who swims here is afraid of them, or of the little barracuda that sometimes make black shapes against the water. Most of the time, in the shallow waters suitable to greenhorns, translucent fish with purple heads race across an ocean bottom scattered with shells.

There is no night life aboard the Vela. After a dinner washed down with water glasses full of good wine, the passengers gather around the card tables or on deck to talk or sing or party or muse in their own way. Nobody sees a shirt and tie or a skirt until the Vela nudges the dock at Nassau again Friday night at dinnertime.

A week of this sailing life costs roughly \$460, including a meals, wine and a tiny air-conditioned room with upper and lower bunks.

The bar, which operates casually out of two coolers and a stand-up bar in the dining room is extra, as is the tip. You can't spend money on anything else until you get back to Nassau and walk 20 feet to the Native Straw Market. Nobody but you is responsible for your pocketbook after that.

## Don't bother me, I'm working on a tan

GREAT HARBOR CAY, Bahamas — It is hard for me to take this island seriously. I know people live here, and that they live real lives, but I feel as if I am on a movie set.

Errol Flynn should come over the horizon any minute in a pirate ship. From the plankboard circular bar set under the palm trees, a fine golden sand beach circles out with arms of blinding white to points of land on either side.

Thatched-roofed tables dot the beach, where a few people look out across a clear green sea masted with sailboats against a blue and white cloud-puffed sky.

A small dinghy carries a group of people past the few bathers to a white yacht near the shore. A three-master comes in, a splendor of sails around the tip of the island. Far out on the emerald sea our sailing cruiser is anchored with its sails down, a 19th century shape against the sky.

All of this is rippled by warm water, a ruffling breeze and a sun that will blister us all by sunset.

This is the most populated place we have seen this week. Obviously there is a small air strip out of sight beyond the trees, because a small plane just landed. We can see a few telephone wires in the distance; apparently there is a settlement two miles away.

AT FIRST GLANCE this shoreline looked like a resort area, but the hotel has been closed and the condominiums are almost empty.

Several times during our cruise we have heard of investors who started and abandoned projects on these cays.

The tiny circular bar above the beach apparently serves some population, however, because the people sitting around it look like characters out of an Ernest Hemingway short story.

There is a man in a white-panama hat; a girl in a skimpy bikini; a very fat woman drinking gin; a young teen-ager painting her finger nails; and an assorted collection of sunburned, sand-dusted passengers from the sailing yacht Vela.

Our conversation is about the boat load of people we saw on the beach yesterday. They were on a day trip from Club Med in Nassau. Many of the women were bare-breasted.

IF ALL OF THIS sounds slow and slightly out-of-focus, it is because we are all slow and slightly out-of-focus after several days of sun. By now we have learned to wear shirts when we swim, and keep our hats on in the water. All of us are sunburned.

When Jackie Lains, the Girl Friday of the ship's crew, delivers a picnic lunch to the beach, we eat as if we have never eaten before.

# '4 Girls 4' ends Meadow Brook season

## Continuation of 'American Graffiti' gets its own way

"More American Graffiti" (PG) bursts on the screen with bold colors, multiple images, quick cuts and intercuts and a pulsating sound track.

At first, the energetic effects seem both an asset and a liability. The problem is that while the film immediately engages our senses, it doesn't stir our emotions or prod our intellect.

The effect is similar to watching a rock concert on a television screen; you might be entertained, but you don't really feel you are part of it.

"More American Graffiti" is that way. You sit back and admire the technical bravado and remain even more distanced from it — at first.

That is the antizing quality about this film. But in spite of the dazzling display of cinematics, the jumping forward and back in time, and the episodic nature of the action, the film hooks you.

**CHARACTERS APPEAR** for a few minutes here, only to be put aside while the film catches up with the lives of some other characters there, yet it all holds together.

These are the same characters who first appeared in George Lucas' "American Graffiti." In this continuation, ('sequel' is too demeaning, considering the caliber of sequels we've seen), produced by Lucas but written and directed by B.W.L. Norton, we follow their lives into the troubled '60s from about '64 to '68.

The new "Graffiti" does not broadcast itself as a Vietnam war movie, but the scenes of Terry "the toad" Fields (Charles Martin Smith) in Vietnam are as hard hitting and incisive as any footage in films solely devoted to the subject. Moreover, "Graffiti" makes use of its perspective on the late '60s to uncover the humor, dark as it may be, in events.

While "the toad" is fighting in Nam, anti-war activists are burning their draft cards. The high school sweethearts, Laurie and Steve, are married and squabbling. When Laurie becomes unwittingly involved in a violent campus clash between students and police, her straight-arrow, Republican husband rushes to her rescue only to suffer the humiliation of being mistaken for an agitator.

The humor and the violence both share an irrational component that binds them together, making this a more complex film than its predecessor. "More American Graffiti" goes its own way, even though it draws on the same characters and the same pop culture environment.

**THE FILM UTILIZES** the music of the '60s to provide a kaleidoscopic view of that culture. It effectively establishes the mood, from Country Joe's "Fixin' To Die Rag," to the Doors' "Light My Fire," to the Byrds' "Turn, Turn, Turn," and concludes, fittingly, with that summary hymn of the era, Bob Dylan's "Like a Rolling Stone."

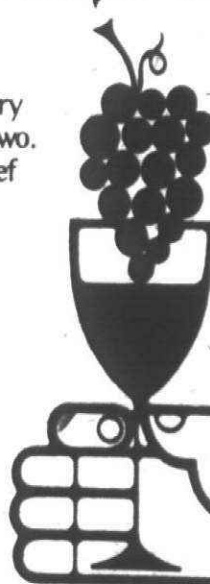

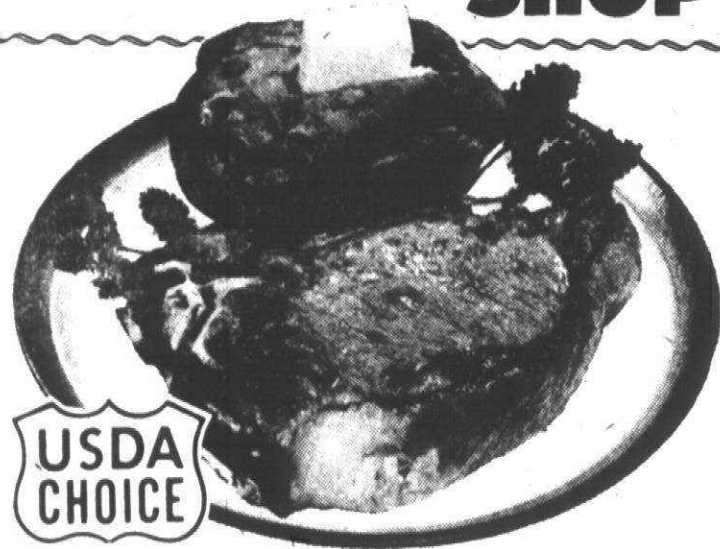

# Bond committee studies school costs

Plymouth-Canton school officials will have three months to determine how much money the district needs for school construction, and building repairs and renovations.

Between \$10-23 million is under consideration by the Bond Planning Committee, formed to determine how to meet an ever-increasing school population.

The total school count

for the coming year is expected to be up 450 students, from last year's first-Friday figure of 16,150 to more than 16,600.

School administrators reported to the Board of Education that \$23 million would be needed; while a Citizens Bond Advisory Committee recommended a bond issue of \$10 million.

The 1980 Bond Planning Committee was offi-

cially established at Monday night's board meeting. The committee is to make its report at the regular board meeting of Nov. 12 or 26 and a bond program will be adopted by the board.

Voters will be asked to approve the final figure at an election tentatively set for Feb. 28, 1980.

Three committee meetings were set up for this month — Aug. 14, 22 and 29.

A construction management firm, Barton-Malow, and a firm of architects, TMP Associates, have been hired to help in planning the bond recommendations. Representatives of these will be on the committee.


Other committee members are chairman Raymond Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business; Florence Beier, community relations; Les Tinson, director of build-

ings and grounds; Gerard Vollrath, supervisor of new construction and renovations; Ed Page, executive director, pupil personnel; Deanne Huff, Citizens Election Committee; and Gwen Shirmohammed, PTO Council.

Still to be named are representatives from the high school, middle school, elementary school and the Plymouth Canton

Education Association. It is expected that the Citizens Bond Advisory

Committee will be represented by Kathy Prince and others.

## Greek revival house to star in tour

An architectural gem.

Lovers of basilica-type Greek Revival houses built in the early 1800s and unique to Michigan seek out Cliff-Calla House on North Territorial as an excellent example of a portico house reminiscent of a Roman Temple.

Visitors enter through a gate in the picket fence to be welcomed at the handsome portico which features four anta piers, or square columns, instead of the more typical round ones. Painted white with a new shake roof, the house and garden reflect the care of owners Marion and Donald Sober.

This house was not always in prime condition, however. Mrs. Sober rescued it from destruction, moving it from the center of Plymouth to its present location in 1971.

At the time, she recalls, the house was being used as three apartments. Earmarked for demolition, it had been stripped of doors and moldings. The Sobers have had to find replacements from other houses being demolished.

"It was just terrible," Mrs. Sober relates, mentioning that she was given \$500 to move the house 10 miles west.

Northville Home Tours visitors will have a rare opportunity to see the inside of this much-admired house on the 13th annual home tour to be held from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday, September 29. While the house is not located in Northville but in the west part of Plymouth near Beck Road on North Territorial, it is included in the tour as an historical treat.

Marion and Donald Sober years ago moved from Ann Arbor to a house at Church and Cady in Northville. They were married and lived in Massachusetts before coming to the Midwest.

He has been one of Northville Historical Society's most devoted workers in Mill Race Village, donating hours of time with Jack Burkman and E. A. Chapman.

Just retired from a career as

manufacturers agent, Don Sober now is joining his artist-craftsman wife in chair caning. They do Shaker caning as well as genuine rush weaving and splint seats. He handles minor repairs.

This is accomplished in the basement built for the home. It is a great improvement over the original Michigan dirt basement. To retain the original look, a cement block foundation has been faced with stone.

The same procedure was followed in the Hunter House in Mill Race Village. That house, too, is a basilica type. It does not have the portico of the Sober house.

"Whoever drew up the plan for this house made it the basilica type, like a Roman temple, with wings extending the length of the house. Historian Talbot Hamlin is the authority who states these houses are exclusive to Michigan," explains owner Sober.

A plaque placed on the front of the house on Heritage Day 1973 says it is the "Old Birch House," a Plymouth landmark, and dates it 1845.

Mrs. Sober points out that there are no written records to tell when Cliff-Calla House was built, who designed it and who first lived in it. It is called Cliff-Calla House in memory of Mrs. Sober's father and mother, Clifford and Calla Burr.

"One can speculate," she says, as research has shown that in the 1820s and 1830s this area was being given land grants to people who migrated from the southern and eastern parts of the country.

"They brought with them memories of grand homes and understandably wanted, as soon as they could afford it, to build their own. One such man must have been the first owner of this house."

"He could have hitched up his horse and buggy and taken the day-long trip to Detroit to visit the architectural school there run by Robert T. Elliot from Rochester, established in 1836. As Elliot came from New York State where there were many Greek Revival houses, he was interested in that style."

It has been explained to Marion Sober

that the columns on the front of the house are square because it was cheaper and easier to build these than round ones. They are nicely tapered at the top, "just like the columns of the Parthenon," observes the owner.

Most unusual are "rabbit ears" over the front door and flanking the windows.

"One historian said they very probably were inspired by the shell-like shields on the corners of Greek temples," Mrs. Sober confides. There is a house like hers in Dexter, too. Especially attractive are floor-length windows that can be raised in summer, she says, to let in cool breezes.

In the late 1800s, when Robert Birch moved from New York State and bought the house, the Sobers think the ell was added. It may have been a barn, they note, as joists are of logs with bark left on, unlike the massive hand-hewn oak joists of the original.

This ell contained the kitchen and hired man's room with a stoop-over attic running the full length. There are eyebrow windows that open and a large tank for rain water that still is there.

"With nine children Robert Birch needed plenty of room. A generous man, he took in a homeless family with three children, making a total of 12," relates Mrs. Sober.

When his youngest daughter, Nancy Warner, visited her, she asked how they accommodated so many. "Three in a bed," she responded.

Home tour visitors will see that the tiny bedrooms are big enough for not much more than a bed. The only closet in the house in those days was located at the top of the stairs.

They'll also note that houses of this period contained no fireplaces but were heated with room stoves. Mrs. Sober can point out patched up holes in the ceilings for pipes. Today there is baseboard heat, a pleasant addition to a house with a past worth keeping warm.

## Marion Sober's art adorns house

By JEAN DAY

"This house has no boundaries" declares owner Marion Sober of the basilica Greek Revival that will be a highlight of the 1979 Northville Home Tour September 29 sponsored jointly by the Women's Association of First

Presbyterian Church and Northville Historical Society.

The artist-craftsman who rescued the house from oblivion means by the statement that it is like the many houses built during the 1800s of this style located throughout the state. This is on North Territorial near Beck.

Antiques ferreted out for the house by the artist and her husband Donald fill rooms with walls hand-stenciled by Mrs. Sober.

In the study-office to the right of the entry are more formal mustard color stencils with a dragon design showing Chinese influence. In the entry is a Chinese laquer reading stand.

In a sitting-tea room behind the office are bird stencils Mrs. Sober calls "more naive" in design. The front parlor boasts a floral stencil. Mrs. Sober says she did all with skim milk mixed with dry paint in two weeks.

But most unusual are the walls of the large room used as a dining room and centered with a Queen Anne table with Empire chairs. Sixteen women from Godey prints have been enlarged almost to life size on the walls. Those on the front wall are from a French engraving and date to 1862.

The military influence is seen on clothing worn by the ladies painted on the back wall from an after-Civil War print of 1867.

"I did them to make the room seem more friendly," smiles the artist. She adds that she is "recycling" to create curtains from elaborately embroidered and tucked petticoats from the past.

A corner cupboard contains some of her collection of sprigware china. A chaise lounge in another corner she says is "early second hand."

This may be true, but it blends comfortably with other fine pieces.

In the parlor is Mrs. Sober's grandmother's doll from 1880 sitting in Aunt Sarah's chair on a tabletop next to a fine hooked rug in with a peacock as the central design. Another hooked rug in the dining room has a horse motif. Friends have told Mrs. Sober it should

be on the wall, rather than the floor.

The present-day kitchen behind the dining room is complete with warm orange cupboards which Mrs. Sober has decorated with meadow flowers done freehand in oils.

Upstairs with the help of her husband Mrs. Sober is creating "Cleopatra's bath" with a barge tub complete with carved pyramid corners.

She's also working on a small bedroom where curtains will enclose the bed in the manner of Thomas Jefferson's.

As visitors descend to the basement they will see exposed stair wall showing horsehair plaster. In addition to her

looms and caning work, Mrs. Sober will have a gallery there of pastel portraits on loan from the families whose children sat for them 25 to 30 years ago.

They include Greig Chapman, son of Mr. and Mrs. E. A. Chapman; Katie Kampf Howe, daughter of Mrs. Theodore Kampf; Robert Shafer, Susan Shafer Carson and Nancy Shafer, children of Mrs. Robert Shafer; Stephanie and Dan Brown, children of Dr. and Mrs. Phillip Brown; Wendy Cummings Hearn, granddaughter of Mr. and Mrs. Glenn Cummings; Elsa Couse Stuber and Barbara Ann Couse Allen, daughters of Mrs. William Chase.

Cliff-Calla House is one of five on the annual tour. Marquis Theatre and the Mill Race Historical Village also will be open. Tickets will be \$3.50.
