

# Holidays make homes easy prey for burglars

The holidays kept Canton police hopping with work instead of joy.

From Christmas Eve to New Year's Eve, the police department received reports of 17 robberies — all except five taking place in homes.

The days immediately preceding Christmas were even more hectic for police officers.

Lt. Larry Stewart said nine homes were broken into from Dec. 20-23. The burglars tore open wrapped Christmas packages which were placed under trees and took some of the gifts.

STEWART SAID twice as many home robberies occurred during this

holiday season than during any other week of the year.

However, a sharp increase in breaking and enterings is typical during Christmas week in most communities, he added. Residents are away from home more often, and burglars expect to find expensive items and cash, he explained.

According to Stewart, 90 percent of the robberies occurred in neighborhoods north of Ford Road.

Police suspect that a group of four juveniles were involved in 15 of the 21 home robberies which have taken place since Dec. 20.

Police have not totaled the value of the stolen items. But Stewart said cameras, jewelry, calculators, other small items and cash comprised the bulk of the holiday booty.

He said all the robberies except one took place when residents were away from home. Nothing was stolen in the occupied home after sleeping residents awakened to frighten away the burglars.

Although home robbery statistics increased during the holiday season, Stewart said other types of crime which normally increase at Christmas did not follow that pattern this year.

No armed robberies were reported, in opposition to the typical rise in that type of crime recorded in past years. Reports of family difficulties increased slightly last week, but not at the rate typical of the holidays.

AN UNUSALLY HIGH number of property destruction cases were reported to the police department. But Stewart expressed doubt that the incidents involving pellet guns and broken car windows were related to the holidays.

From Christmas Day to New Year's Eve, 33 persons complained of shattered

car windows from pellet gun shots. According to Stewart, 14 of the complaints were filed Sunday night from patrons of the Super Bowl on Ford Road.

Investigations of business robberies have also kept police busy during the holiday season. Those cases include:

- The Dec. 30 robbery of John Deere Tractor Sales on Ford Road in which 37 snowblowers were reported missing. Police say they have suspects in that case.

- The Dec. 30 breaking and entering of Classy Chassis Car Wash on Canton Center. According to police, wash

equipment was damaged and \$300 stolen.

- The Dec. 26 breaking and entering of unfinished condominium units at The Winds on Haggerty. Three dishwashers were stolen.

- The Dec. 21 robbery of the office of Ernie's Junkyard on Yost Road. According to police, a case of whiskey, a calculator, a police scanner and other items were taken in that incident.

- The Dec. 30 breaking and entering of Mario's Hair Salon near Lilley and Palmer. Police say burglars left that business without any booty after a passing motorist apparently frightened them away.

## Culbert asks Amtrak for rail passenger stop

A proposal to establish a commuter railroad stop at the southern end of Canton Township has been forwarded by Amtrak officials to the company's planning department in Washington.

Allan Edelston, director of state and local services for Amtrak's Washington office, said the proposal of Canton Supervisor Noel Culbert is one of hundreds received by Amtrak each year for local rail service.

Edelston added, however, that Amtrak will always consider the type of stop suggested by Culbert. He expects the company's planning department to make a recommendation on the proposal in about a month.

According to Edelston, any decision to establish a stop near Lilley and Canton's southern boundary will be based on cost estimates of building a platform and projections on the number of commuters who would use service.

THE PROPOSAL to establish a stop for Detroit-bound commuters is part of a transportation package which Culbert has pledged to pursue during the coming year.

The supervisor has also asked the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) to increase the number of buses which serve Canton. At the current time, two buses which run from Canton to Detroit during ear-

ly-morning and late-afternoon hours comprise the township's only mass transit services.

Culbert is scheduled to attend a transportation convention in Traverse City later this month where he will lobby for better bus service in Canton.

"If we can get the service, I think people would use it," Culbert said of mass transit systems. "In Chicago, a lot of people don't even own cars."

Culbert maintains that a commuter trip to Detroit would be cheaper via train than by car when gasoline, parking and auto maintenance costs are taken into consideration.

That belief prompted the supervisor to ask for establishment of an Amtrak stop near Lilley south of Michigan.

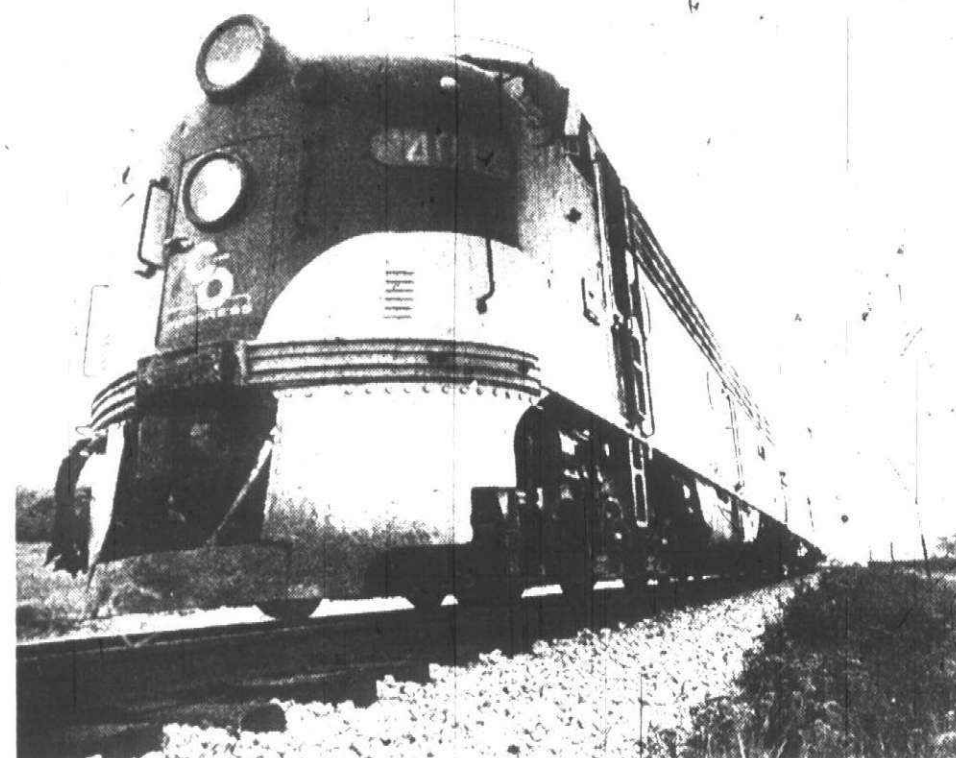
THE TOWNSHIP owns a 10-acre parcel abutting the railroad tracks. Culbert says a simple platform and passenger shelter could be built on the land for Amtrak commuters.

According to Edelston, such platforms can be built and operated by either Amtrak or a municipality. Culbert says his proposal contains no commitment of township funds for construction purposes.

"I don't want to commit on that yet," said the supervisor. "The important thing is to get a commitment for Amtrak to stop there. I have a feeling that they're receptive to the idea."

In a recent letter to Amtrak, Culbert noted that train stops in Dearborn and Ann Arbor are located approximately 12 miles to the east and west of Canton.

"Canton would be an ideal intermediate stop being right in the middle," he maintained. "Canton's population is approaching the 50,000 mark, and most persons commute to work. I think you'll find that many Canton residents would use Amtrak if service was available here."

## Grade idea pulls protests

The proposal to realign the middle school grades doesn't have the unanimous support of all school administrators.

Robert Smith, principal of West Middle School, already has made a personal protest to the school board concerning the realignment proposal.

That objection was followed up by a written letter to the board president from the West Coordinating Council stating its opposition to changing the present grade alignment.

Although still in the discussion stage, the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education is leaning towards moving the sixth grade back to the elementary level and moving the ninth grade from

the high school to the middle school level.

The proposal has been made by Supt. John M. Hoben as a means of meeting rising student enrollment without spending large sums of money on new classrooms.

THE WEST Coordinating Council meets on a monthly basis to represent the interests of the staff, students and parents of West Middle School's advisory councils.

In a letter to Tom Yack, school board president, the council reported that on Dec. 19 it passed the following resolution:

"In that the board of education will

soon be making a decision on a bond issue and a millage proposal, and one of the proposals under consideration calls for moving the ninth grade to the present middle schools and the sixth grade to elementary schools, the council recommends that the board of education be notified that the staff, students and parents of West Middle School would find it difficult to support any millage proposal which does not provide for the continuance of middle schools in the Plymouth-Canton Community School District and the present grade alignment."

Shenay Adams, secretary of the council, added that the group was "concerned about the loss of our middle schools and does not believe that the educational needs of sixth and ninth graders can be met by preventing them from moving on."

"The entire middle school philosophy and program would need a change if we became a junior high school. We like what we have now and want to maintain it."

DR. HOBEN commented, "I don't want to quarrel with them. They are entitled to their opinion."

"But what we are looking at is a price-tag difference of about \$13 million in the size of a bond issue if we don't realign the grades. That's the cost to preserve the present grade alignment, and that's what the school board is looking at."

Earlier Dr. Michael Homes, assistant superintendent for instruction, had commented that a middle school program could be operated for grades seven through nine just as well as it can for grades six through eight.

## Student dies on break

For Cecily "Ceci" Warrick, coming home from college for the holidays meant getting together with friends and family. It meant good times, reflecting on the events of the past year and revealing plans for the future.

Those plans, however, came to an abrupt end Christmas Eve day. Ceci, a tennis star and dean's list scholar, died of a heart attack in St. Joseph Hospital's emergency room.

Ceci would have been 22 on Jan. 5. In May she was to graduate from William and Mary College in Virginia with a degree in business and finance.

She told her friend, Barb Yockey, home from Michigan State University, that she wanted to go to New York City. There she planned to hunt for a job in a management trainee position at one of the town's most renowned department stores — Bloomingdale's.

The picture of Ceci's life was one rich with the color of a successful, though short, career.

One of Plymouth's most outstanding young athletes, her high school and college career boasted of achievements untypical of just one life time.

AT WILLIAM AND MARY she was a house manager at the Kappa Kappa Gamma Sorority. She was on the dean's list and had been selected by the college president to serve on a committee to search for a new college football coach. Additionally, she was the first and only woman of the Varsity Athletic Council.

Years of constant training paid off in those college years when she spent three years on the college's varsity tennis team. During the summers, she worked as a tennis pro at the Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island.

Before graduating from Plymouth Salem High School in 1976, she won four letters for varsity tennis. She won numerous awards and scholarships. Twice she won championships in regional tennis play. In high school dual meets she won 60 and lost none.

One would think this success could have influenced a growing ego, but such was not the case in Ceci Warrick, according to her high school friend, Ms. Yockey.

"She was never one to toot her own horn," Ms. Yockey said.

In fact, until Ms. Yockey was asked about Ceci's high school academic record last week, she didn't know her friend had placed second in her graduating class.

"Did she really?" Ms. Yockey asked. "She was never one to go around talking about her accomplishments."

According to Ms. Yockey, a group of some 15 high school pals often got together during breaks and holidays from college. The tradition was maintained the night before Christmas Eve when the group met and went to a movie.

"Almost everyone noticed how good Ceci looked that night. She was really happy. That's why it was such a shock the next morning," she said.

After the funeral service on Wednesday, the group got together again to weather the shocking loss of their friend.

"People felt a need to talk about it and remember Ceci," Ms. Yockey said.

ANOTHER PERSON close to Ceci's career while attending Plymouth Salem in the mid-'70s was Janet Lawson, girls tennis coach at the time.

"Ceci was a very fine athlete, very serious about her tennis. She never missed a practice."

"I always said Ceci was a lady athlete, one of the highest compliments one can give someone. She played by the rules. Her sportsmanship was excellent."

When Ms. Lawson nominated her for the Outstanding Girl Athlete Scholarship Award, she called it a "pleasure."

"I felt she had all the qualities."

"She set extremely high standards for herself and tried to meet them in everything she did. And in today's world that's hard to do," Ms. Lawson added.

Ceci is survived by her parents, Woodward and Janet Warrick of Plymouth and her sister, Courtney. Services were held at Schrader Funeral Home last week with burial at Riverside Cemetery. Memorial contributions may be made to the Woman's Athletic Department at William and Mary College.

## Predicts outcounty will challenge it in court

# County reform will not come easy, Tungate

Before any Wayne County government reform plan gets off the ground this year, it may face a court challenge by the out-county suburbs.

"I think that's very likely," said Orville Tungate of Plymouth Township, the Democratic Party's 2d Congressional District chairman. Tungate makes his living as deputy county clerk.

At issue would be representation on a county charter commission, which would recommend major reforms like a unified county administration — either an elected executive or an appointed manager.

Both Tungate and his boss, Wayne County Clerk James Killeen, favor a county executive.

A BILL outlining what powers the charter commission would have is pending in the Michigan Senate.

County government reform has been pushed for the past year by Gov. William Milliken, who favors an elected county executive for Wayne. The legislature is expected to act quickly on Wayne County reform after lawmakers reconvene Jan. 9.

As it stands, the county reform bill could lead to a charter commission based on the 1970 census.

The western Wayne suburbs say the 10-year old census shortchanges them, because it fails to reflect the past decade's population shift from Detroit.

"ANY CHARTER commission using the 1970 census would be a disproportionate commission, not representative of the one-man, one-vote principle at all," said Tungate.

"There's been that much of a shift from the core city, even from older suburbs."

The current county commissioner districts, based on the 1970 census, give Detroit a majority on the county Board of Commissioners.

Thirteen of the 27 districts are in the city, plus another three districts encompass inner and near city suburbs that usually vote with Detroit on county issues.

Tungate is surprised charter commission representation hasn't been a major debate in the legislature.

"It does not appear to be that much of an issue in Lansing," he said.

He said the pending county reform bill allows for an apportionment committee to create between 25 and 35 charter commission districts, but they must be based on the 1970 census.

The apportionment committee could order a

new census taken, but it "wouldn't be done any faster than the regular (1980) census," he added. Attempts to base the charter commission on the 1980 census have failed in the legislature.

KILLEEN WOULD chair the five-man apportionment committee which would also include the county treasurer, prosecutor and chairmen of the county Republican and Democratic parties.

Creation of a charter commission has to be approved by the state legislature, Board of Commissioners and county voters. Any new charter would also be submitted to the voters.

The county reform bill is back before the state senate, which first passed the legislation in November. The senate will consider changes approved by the House of Representatives last month regarding the autonomy and makeup of the county road commission.

"There's more emphasis now on protecting the road commission than anything else," Tungate said.

The other major ongoing debate has been over a charter commission's authority to recommend a county executive or county manager form of administration. The bill now provides that voters be given a choice between an elected county executive or appointed county manager.

BOTH KILLEEN and Tungate favor county reform that would make the Board of Commissioners a "purely legis-

lative and oversight" body. All the county board's current administrative powers should be "invested in an executive," Killeen said.

But black representatives on the county board and in the state legislature oppose a county executive. They say it is being pushed to wrest newly won political clout from Detroit's black majority.

"It's obvious (Detroit Mayor) Coleman Young sees (a county executive) as a threat to his political power," said Killeen, a Democrat who lives in Grosse Pointe.

"No matter who the elected county executive is, he has to deal with Coleman Young. He's proven to be very adept at dealing with the governor and president (Carter)."

While they agree with Milliken on the need for a county executive, Killeen and Tungate oppose the way the Republican governor has pushed reform on the county.

Milliken has held up all state aid for the financially troubled county until the legislature and county board approve a

reform plan.

"There have been no statements from the governor," said Tungate, regarding "what he's going to do for us" once a reorganization bill is approved.

MILLIKEN'S REFORM demands have been "purely political," Killeen said, adding the governor has "backed off every position except the charter commission."

Milliken had wanted a county charter commission to consider changes in the offices of clerk, treasurer, prosecutor and sheriff, all of which were created by the state constitution.

"But Attorney General Frank Kelley ruled last fall that the legislature couldn't empower a charter commission to tamper with the constitutionally protected offices."

The pending county reform bill does permit the charter commission to recommend the offices of clerk and register of deeds to be combined.

Killeen said Milliken has been "exempt" from pressure regarding the county's fiscal woes "and has been no help at all in resolving the problem."

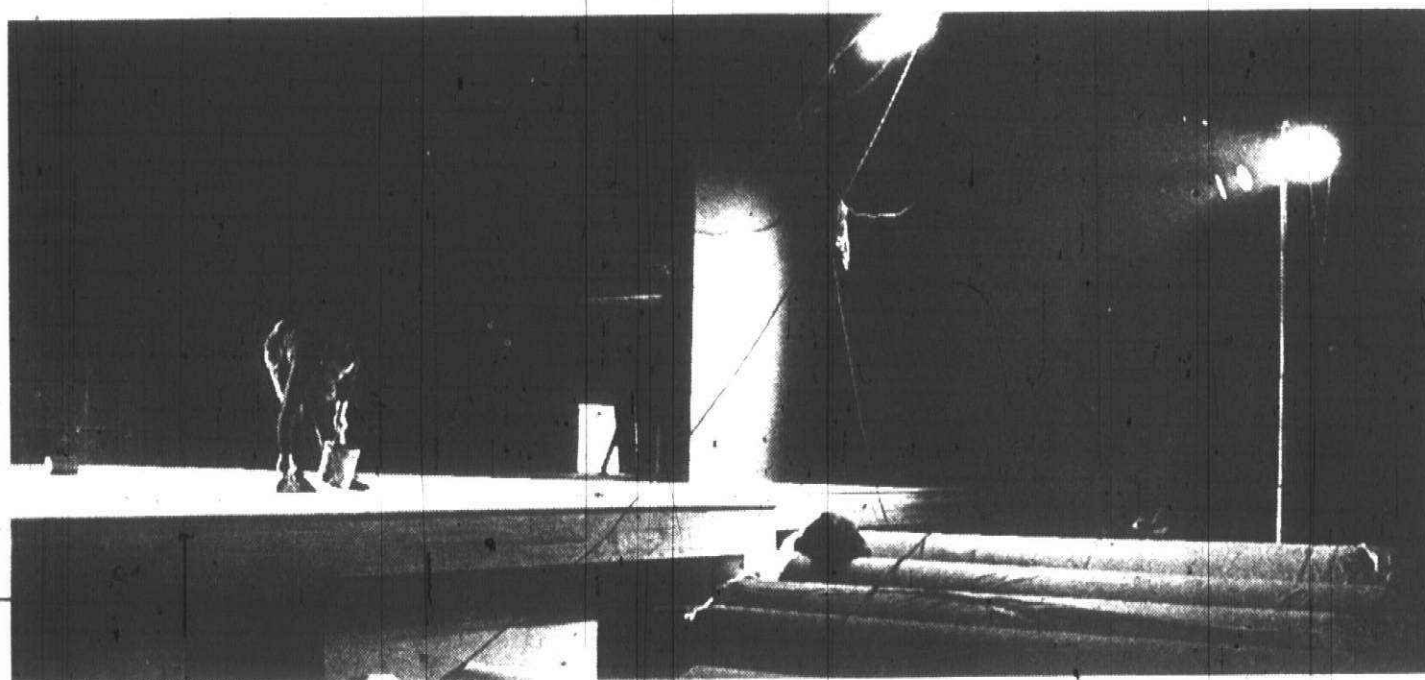

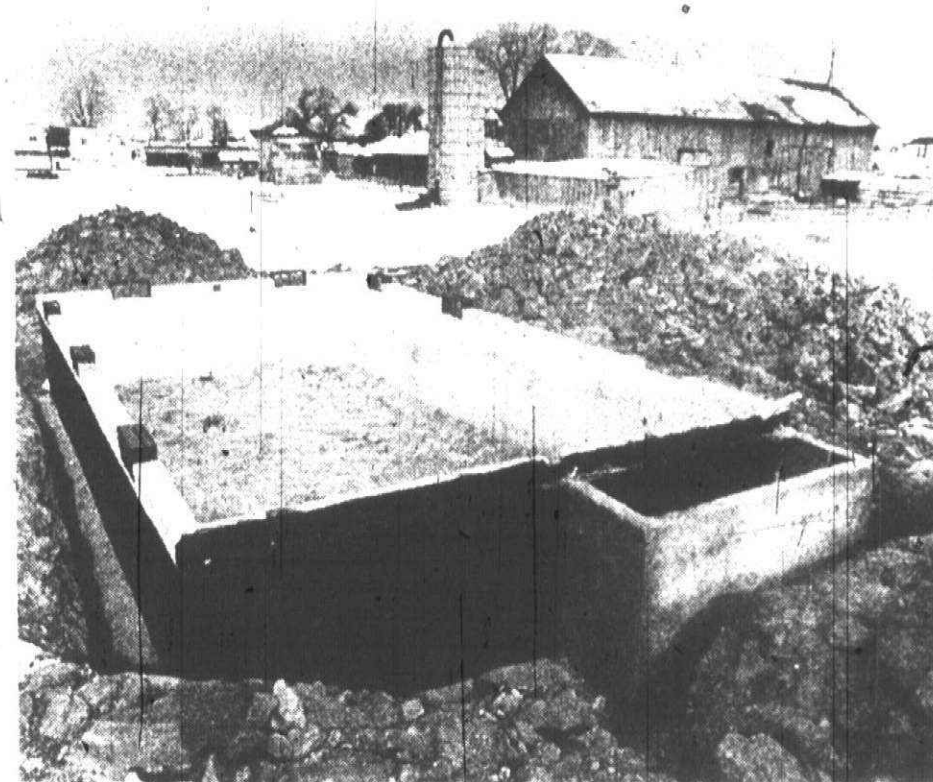

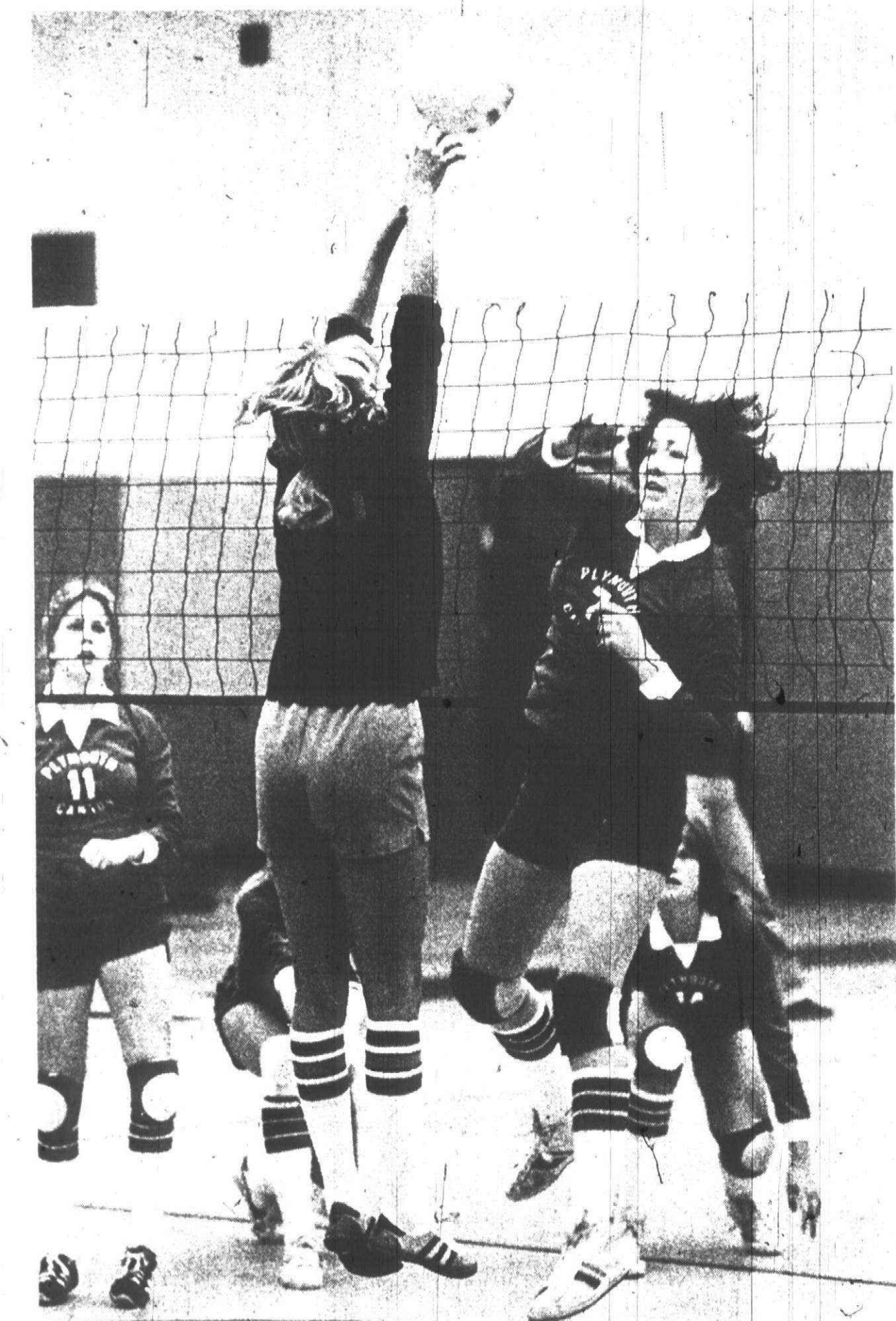

The main virtue of the egg scrambler, according to its commercial, is to save children from the trauma of having to view "slimey egg whites" on their plates.

We had always believed there must be some higher authority behind the decision to make eggs with both a white and a yolk and find it acceptable to maintain that status quo at least until the shell is broken. In all likelihood, this machine does its job with fervent efficiency, although we have no witnesses to attest to that fact.

It leaves only the question of "Why?" We don't want to know how.

Sneer we may, but there is no denying that some of these commercials are amazingly effective. There was one promotion for a set of knives in which the skill of the hands using them was breathtaking. This remarkable proficiency was further amplified by showing someone trying to cut a tomato and turning it into mush with an ordinary knife; then flashing to the advertised version turning another tomato into sliver-thin slices with nary a squirt.

We once had a fleeting (very fleeting) desire for a mop that wrings itself out completely via a roller system uniformly flattening the blue mop head.

This year, we toyed with the notion of getting a different Ronco gadget for everyone on our Christmas list, but fear of immediate reprisal was too great.

But there's always next year. And who knows what they'll come up with next.

## Auto inspections: A brown cloud over us

The Michigan Legislature will be in a kind of "no win" position in 1980 as it takes up a dull sounding, but potentially divisive, issue called I.M.

I.M. stands for auto inspection and maintenance programs. It seems that at least part of the state fails to meet standards of the federal Clean Air Act. Portions of Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties are failing to meet ozone and carbon monoxide standards, and the rest of southeast Michigan is failing to meet ozone standards.

By 1982 the state must come up with an inspection and maintenance program. In other words, besides getting checkups for the kids and shots for the dog, we will next have to line up to get our cars inspected.

To those who are bothered by impure air, it will be welcome news. A car driven 12,000 miles a year emits about 1,000 pounds of hydrocarbon and car-

bon monoxide pollution. Multiply that by 2.4 million cars and we have 1.2 million tons of the stuff floating around in our air.

If you doubt it, stand on a high hill in western Oakland County and look to the southeast. On a clear day, you will see a brown cloud to the east and south close to the horizon. And it's not a very pretty brown, either.

**BUT WHOA!** says the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments. There is more to this than meets the eye and nose.

SEMOG, in general assembly, argues that to pass a law to apply only to the seven southeast counties is discriminatory.

"Such discrimination could drive population and business out of the region as they seek to register cars or business vehicles elsewhere — at a time

when we need to attract new business and jobs into this area.

"Unless I.M. is adopted statewide, about 48 percent of the cars in Michigan would go untested."

Richard Grow of the East Michigan Environmental Action Council reports that "typically two-thirds to three-fourths of the cars pass on first test (in other parts of the country which have I.M.) and repairs to the failures run \$25 to \$50."

**AND SO OUR** friendly state legislators, those nice people who like to do good things for their constituents, are faced with doing something that is going to hurt.

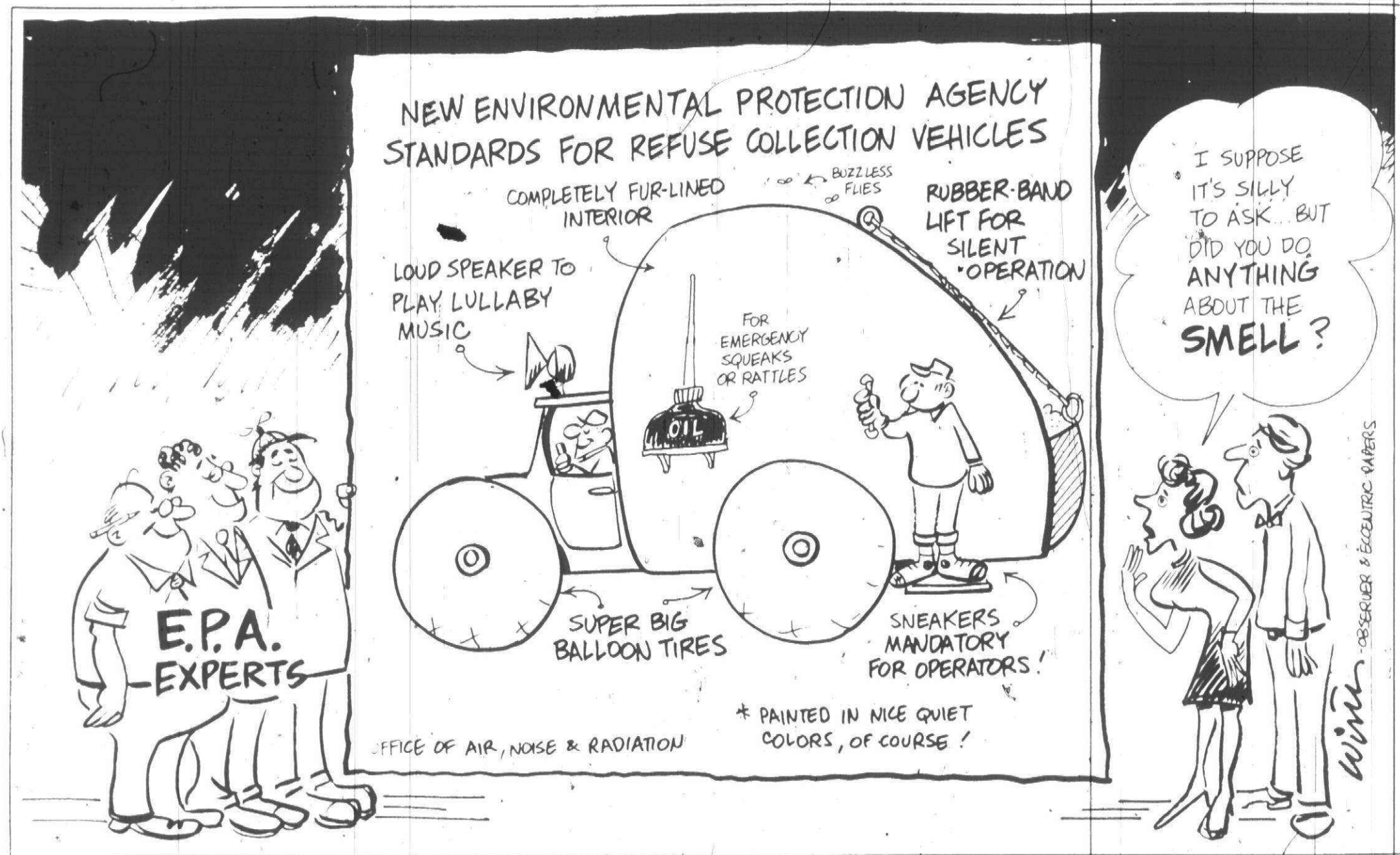
About half the population of the state is going to get hit by an I.M. program, and its leaders are saying, "If we have to do it, make the rest of the state do it, too."

The western and northern half of the population will respond, "Hey, that brown cloud is over metropolitan Detroit. If they go down, why do we have to be dragged with them?"

Comes the reply from SEMCOG: "The air is also dirty in Grand Rapids, Lansing, Flint and other Michigan cities."

The last statement is a little misleading. The average person, plopped down blindfolded in a series of Michigan cities, would pick metropolitan Detroit as having the worst air. He wouldn't need federal emissions standards to tell him that.

Those of us who have travelled the Great Lake State know that southeast Michigan dwellers pay more for insurance, far more for housing and infinitely more for parking than do our fellow Michigamians. If we alone must put up with I.M., it will be nothing new.

## 'Bureaucracy in action'

We in the community newspaper business have a tendency to become "hometowners," taking the side of the local folks almost automatically in any conflict with Lansing or Washington.

Well, today we have reason to be "towners" and to think Washington is a bit daft. An area mayor forwards us this letter from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency with the comment: "Bureaucracy in action!"

We'll share it with you.

"THE U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has issued standards limiting the noise levels emitted by new truck-mounted solid waste compactors, commonly referred to as refuse collection vehicles or garbage trucks, manufactured after Oct. 1, 1980.

This regulatory action has been taken by the administrator under the authorities granted and the responsibilities imposed by the Noise Control Act of 1972, as amended by the Quiet Communities Act of 1978. The purpose of this letter is to bring to your attention the highlights and important implications of these rules.

We believe that the following points may be of particular interest to you:

- This regulation complements the existing federal regulation, which became effective Jan. 1, 1978, requiring quieter medium and heavy truck chassis. A key reason for issuance of noise regulation for refuse collection vehicles is to extend the benefits of the reduced truck noise, by also reducing the noise of the related compaction components, to the persons adversely affected by the noise of these special-purpose vehicles.

- This regulation *does not* affect refuse collection vehicles currently in use. Trash haulers do not have to replace their fleets. . . . The shift to quieter vehicles will begin taking place in October 1980, when newly manufactured vehicles offered for sale will have to comply with the EPA rules.

- This regulation applies after the effective dates of this rule only to new compactor bodies mounted on newly manufactured chassis.

- "People living in the cities are more likely to be disturbed by garbage truck noise than those living in suburbs or rural areas. This is because of the higher densities of population in urban areas, the longer amount of time that garbage trucks spend in front of each urban residence, and the 'canyon effect' of noise in urban streets. This regulation will provide a significant reduction in exposure to noise from garbage trucks for most urban Americans. We estimate that more than 19 million Americans are affected by noise from garbage compaction operations. We believe this regulation will result in a 74 percent decrease in the extent and severity of the noise impact by 1991.

"We have enclosed a Press Release announcing the issuance of the regulation, a copy of the Notice of Rulemaking, a Fact Sheet summarizing the major provisions of the regulation, a 'Background' that provides background information on the development of the regulation, and a list of Questions and Answers that address the major issues surrounding the regulation.

"Additional copies of the regulation, or related documents, may be obtained from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Public Information Center (PM-215), 401 M Street, S.W., Washington, D.C. 20460.

"Sincerely, Henry E. Thomas, Director, Standards and Regulations Division."

To this, our informant, Livonia Mayor Ed McNamara, quips:

"I understand the EPA is now considering requiring fur-lined garbage cans."

Let's take a quick look at what could happen.

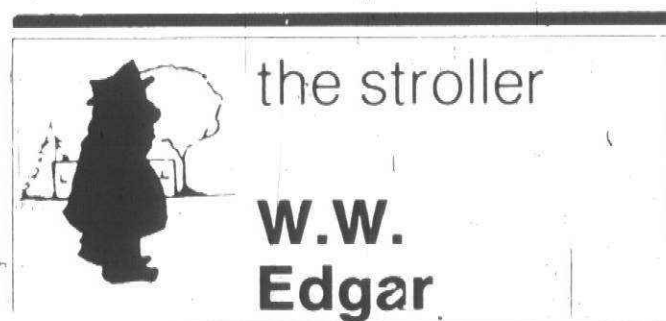
**IN NEARLY EVERY** decade when there was a crisis or a dire need for something somewhere, someone stepped forth with the answer to the problem.

And that is not all.

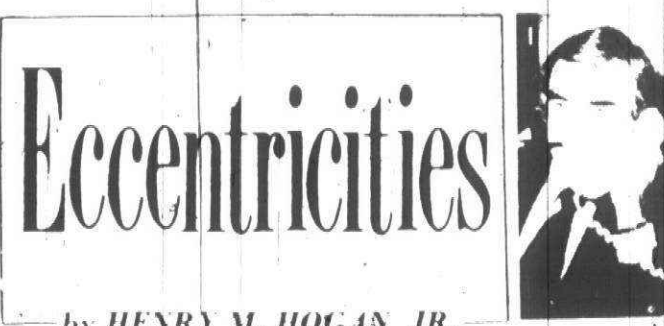
**DON'T FORGET** this is an election year. That will be exciting. We'll still have the trouble in the Middle East to keep us interested.

Being his mother, I was naturally apprehensive of his reactions as Yaakov Meir sat contentedly on his father Byron's knee while rabbis and male friends snipped a lock from the long, golden curls unfurled on his shoulders.

I observed the ceremony from the opposite side of the room among the women guests. Separate seating is prevalent at Chassidic religious functions in order for both men and women to better concentrate on the religious duties being performed.

THE LINE WAS LONG since we belong both to Young Israel of Southfield and the Lubavitch move-

ment.

Realizing the importance of the occasion, Yaakov Meir was both willing and cooperative. He looked like any other 3-year-old except for his "payos" or sidecurls which remained uncut according to the biblical injunction: "You shall not cut the corners of the head."

The men began to dance and Yaakov Meir was hoisted onto his father's shoulder to lead the entourage. Tzitzis (ritual fringes) swung from beneath Yaakov Meir's suit coat. He began wearing the four-cornered garment beneath his shirt on this third birthday.

Each corner has fringes representing 613 commandments (mitzvos) to which a Jew is bound by the Torah (Five Books of Moses). Each morning he dons them with the appropriate blessing.

YAAKOV MEIR'S LONG blond hair never impaired his masculine identity during the last three years. Whenever anyone referred to him as a girl, Yaakov Meir would hastily correct them. When he was 2, he nearly sent two very elderly ladies into severe shock.

"Such a sweet, little girl," the gray-haired matrons cooed.

Despite his protestations to the contrary, the ladies kept repeating their feminine gendered statement.

"Me a boy!" he shouted for a final time, deftly pulling down the front of his diaper to reveal his evidence of being a fully equipped male.

LIFE WILL CONTINUE to be traditional for Yaakov Meir.

In September when he enters the Lubavitch Cheder in Farmington to begin his formal education, he will walk together with other boys and girls entering for the first time and pass under a prayer shawl (tallis).

Candies will shower him from an unseen source, and he will be told the candies are from the angels who want to reward him for coming to learn.

When he is seated at his desk, a book containing the Hebrew alphabet will be opened before him and a drop of honey placed on the first letter, Aleph. The rabbi will tell Yaakov Meir to touch and taste the honey.

Commenting on its sweetness, he will be told to remember it because "Torah is sweet and learning is sweet."

Yaakov Meir will never forget his first haircut, and his trips to Sam Hornung's Barber Shop won't be anything like it. I still remember his brother Avram Zalman's first haircut three years ago, but it wasn't quite as bittersweet. It took place one week before the birth of Yaakov Meir, so I knew I would soon be holding another baby in my arms.

This time, being an over-40 mother of six, when they placed Yaakov Meir in my arms after the festivities, I closed my eyes to savor a memory. I could feel the downy, soft, tiny baby head with flaxen ringlets that once rested on my shoulder.

Now, I placed a shorn and tired birthday boy's head on my shoulder as he shut his eyes and went to sleep.

# Partly sunny —this summer

We told him that we would have our son take care of it out of his savings, rather than charge our insurance company and he said he thought it would be only \$30 or \$40.

Less than 20 hours after the accident the "gentleman" appeared with a bill for \$85 which included car rental, plus mileage — also a piece of molding that the garage man assured us he couldn't find anything wrong with — but this same "gentleman" insisted be replaced.

We are proud of our son for doing the right thing, it means the examples we have attempted to set for him have been the right ones. However — now we have to attempt to convince him that this couple does not represent the majority of the people in Plymouth or in society — that another person probably would not have taken advantage of the situation and would even said at least one "Thank You" to him for taking the responsibility for his actions.

The lesson these people have demonstrated — that it doesn't pay to be honest — is one we would rather have avoided for our son and other children, but I suppose this sort of thing is a fact of life and something they have to know about.

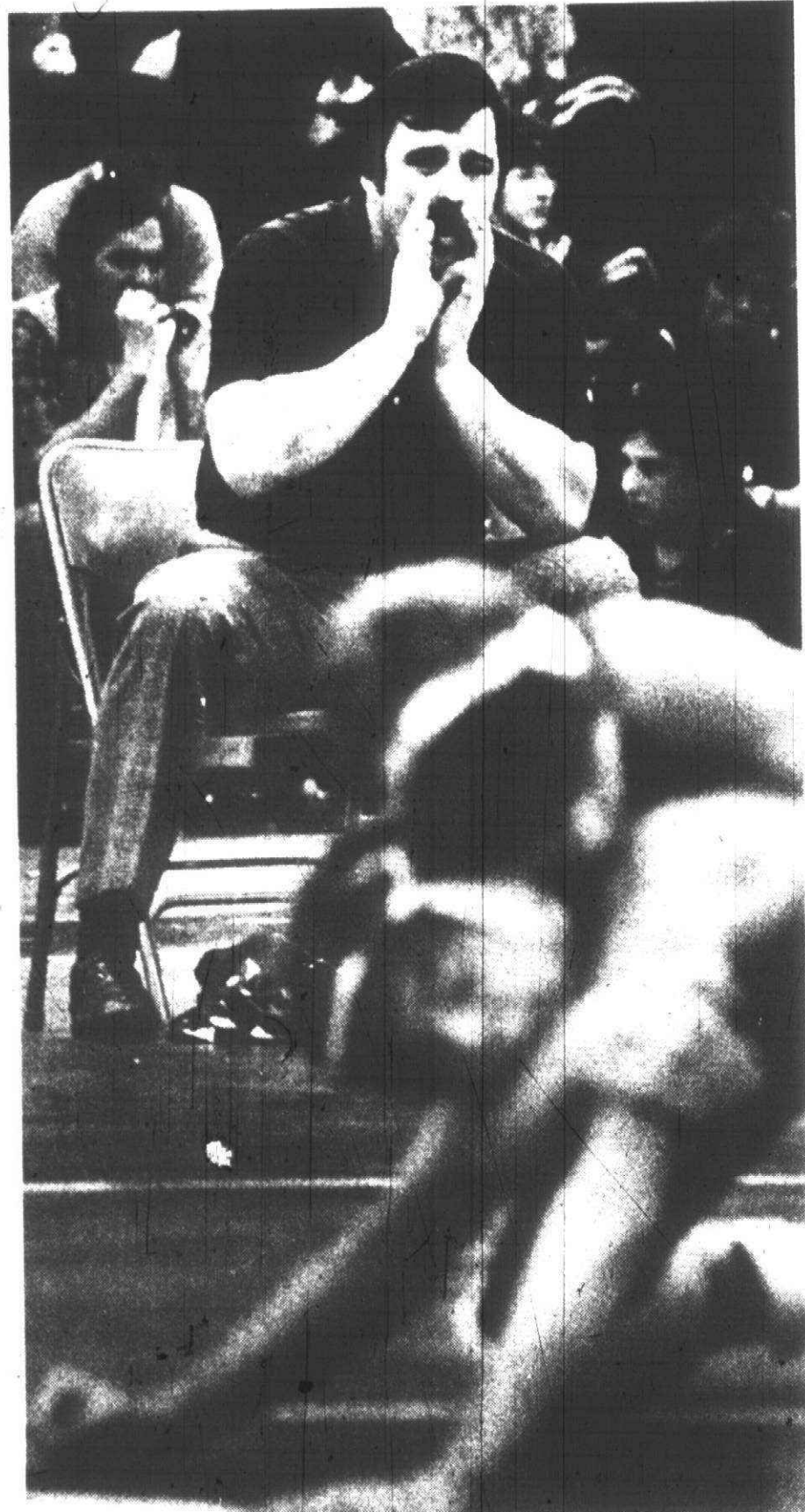

The Plymouth Salem wrestling team successfully defended its Canton Civitan Invitational crown Friday by outpointing second place Warren Lincoln, 206-158½.

Plymouth Canton, the host team, finished a distant third with 97 points followed by West Bloomfield, fourth, 82½; Redford Thurston, fifth, 82; Dearborn, sixth, 64; Birmingham Seaholm, seventh, 19½; and Bishop Borgess, eighth, 0.

"We felt we could win the tournament," said Salem coach Ron Krueger whose team has now won its last three invitational tourneys in as many weeks. "Canton and Warren Lincoln did good jobs. Warren Lincoln has an outstanding team."

Salem's Jeff Brown (at 119 pounds) was voted most outstanding wrestler of the tournament. Brown pinned all three opponents on the way to the championship as well as picking up his 100 and 101st victories of his high school career.

"Brown did a great job," said Krueger. "He is the first wrestler I have ever coached that has surpassed 100 victories."

Salem dominated the field as it placed 10 matmen in the finals.

Jim Schultz (105) of the Rocks won the title by beating Bob Trandele of Warren Lincoln in the finals, 14-3. Teammate Mark Ross (126) won his second straight invitational by defeating Bob Chick of Lincoln, 7-3.

JERRY VALCHINE of Salem (138) won the title by wiping out Kevin Ault of Thurston in the finals, 16-2, while Jeff Powers (185), wearing a mask, gave Salem its fifth individual championship by beating Mark Ericson of Thurston, 8-4.

In the 198-pound weight class, Stan Snider of Salem captured the title by pinning Mike Carr of Lincoln at 2:35 of the second period.

Canton had two individual champs. Tim Racer (132) of the Chiefs had an outstanding tourney. He defeated Allen Peshe of Thurston in the finals, 10-3. Canton's Dave Vaughn (167) took control of his final match and beat Salem's Steve Szilagyi in overtime, 6-4. The two wrestlers went into the extra period tied, 4-4.

"Our kid's tough," said Canton coach

Dan Chrenko. "I thought Vaughn could win it going in. Racer was a pleasant surprise. He did a real nice job."

One of the toughest weight classes was 112 pounds. Ron Schings of Warren survived to take the crown with a pin against Marc Boyea of Dearborn at 4:55 of the third period. Canton's Tom Harreld was third. He beat Harry Newton of Thurston in the consolation finals, 1-0.

At 98 pounds, Ken Kaercher of Warren posted a 7-2 decision over Scott Pazner of West Bloomfield. In the consolation final, Salem's Jeff Vojcek won a close match over Todd Barlett of Canton, 4-2.

SALEM'S SCOTT was beat by Barry Bausano of West Bloomfield, 7-5, in the finals at 155 pounds. It was a tight match the entire six minutes.

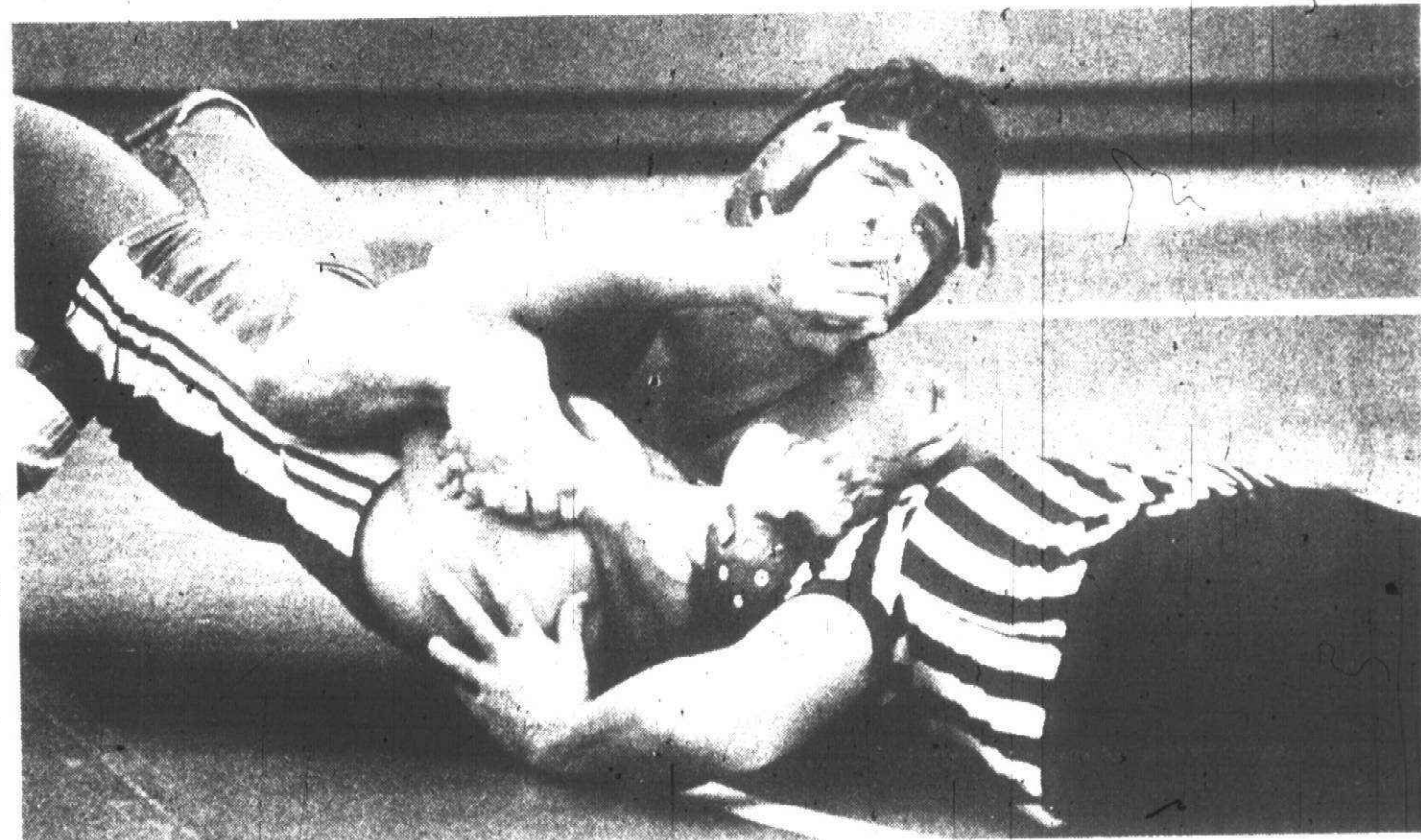

"We practiced four days and had a scrimmage against Stevenson and Clarkston. It's hard to do anything new during this time."

Salem was impressive in a 64-45 victory over rival Canton (2-2) in the Holi-

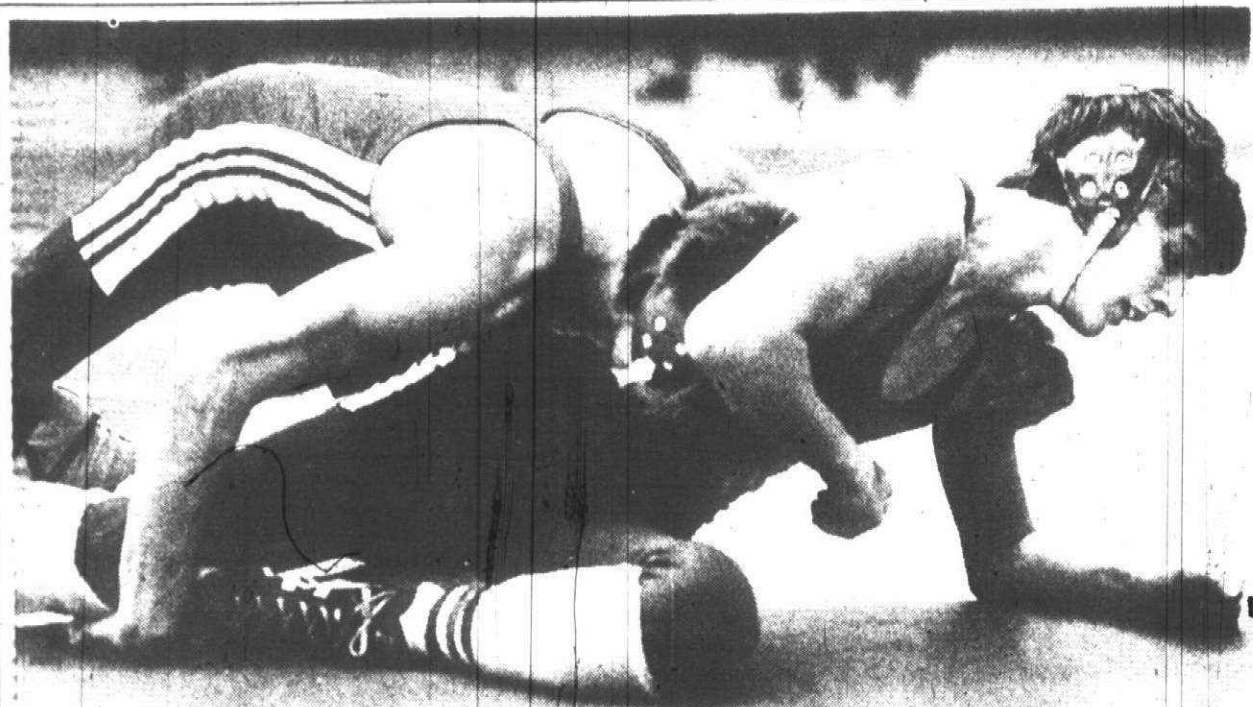
day Classic. Center Howard Monk was sharp along with forward Jim Emerson. The two players combined for 34 points and 20 rebounds.

Krueger said his team is in good physical shape for the tourney. Bruce Bachman will return to wrestle at 132 pounds after suffering a broken nose.

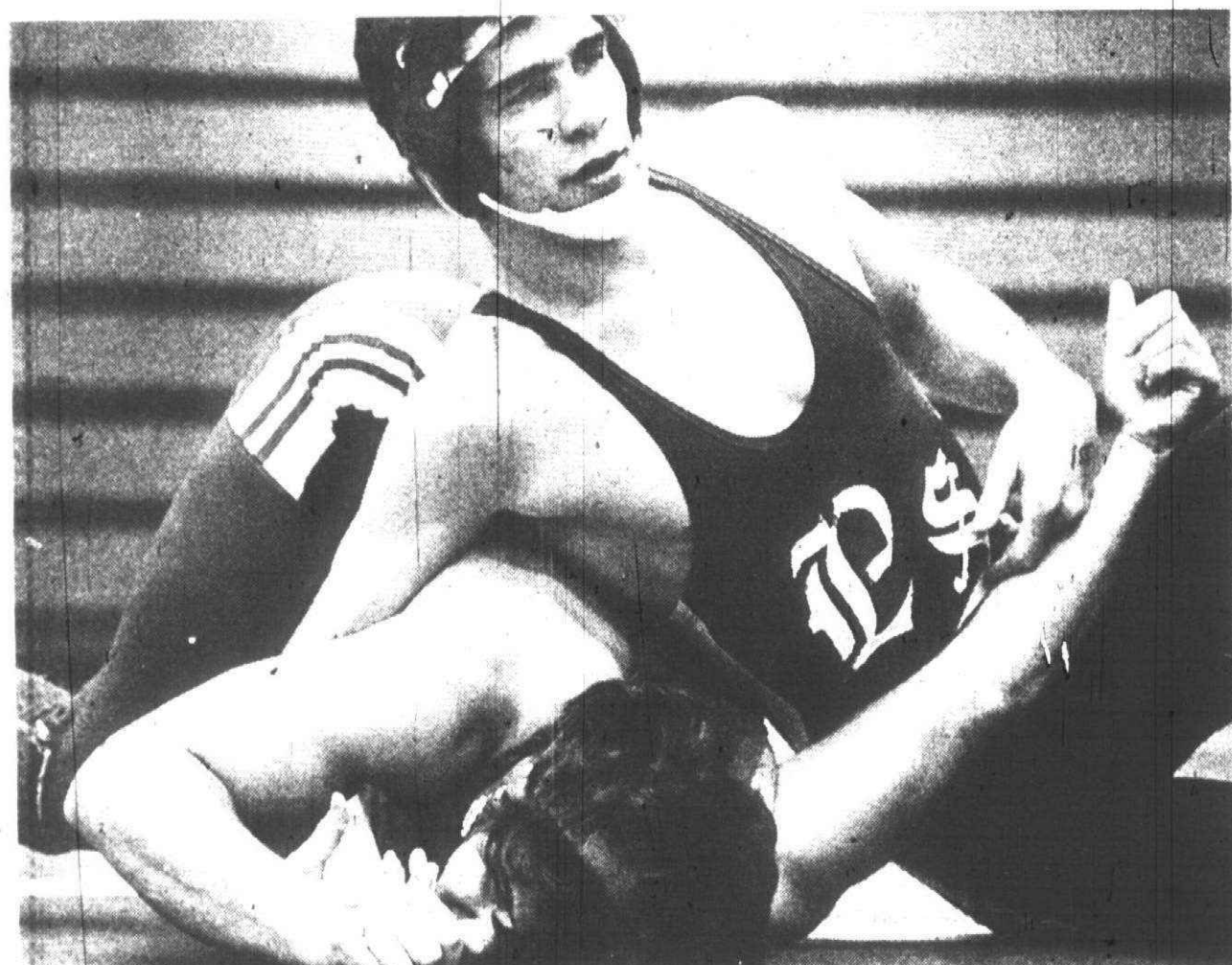

# Super Sewer cost grows

It's going to cost Plymouth Township just a little more to help pay for the design of the regional sewer system known as Super Sewer.

It was getting close to the final hour last week when Plymouth Township Board Members received notice from the Wayne County Department of Public Works that the study would cost the township another \$3,800.

Just three weeks ago, the board had authorized some \$104,714 for the expense. Twenty-one communities in Detroit's far western and downriver area have been asked to participate.

The notice had been labeled "Urgent, Action Required by Dec. 31," as members called a special meeting Thursday to take action. It was approved unanimously with a 6-0 vote. Trustee Lee Fidge was absent.

According to Clerk Esther Hulsing, the additional sum was requested because "I guess they estimated too low in the beginning."

The Dec. 31 deadline for action by involved municipalities was set to fulfill federal Environmental Protection Agency requirements and to avoid jeopardizing the loss of federal and state funding support of the project, officially called the Huron Valley Wastewater Control System.

ACCORDING TO county estimates, the township already has exceeded its sewer treatment capacity in the Rouge Valley Interceptor by about 42 percent.

Township officials are looking at the Super Sewer plan to

treat the township's expected sewage increase from future growth.

Duane Egelund, director of engineering for the county public works department, has promised township officials that no action would be taken on its capacity level until more studies were done to confirm the estimates.

When the financing agreement was presented three weeks ago, township trustees also requested they have some say in the rate structure for the system.

Although individual communities will finance construction of the system, the regional sewer will be owned by the Wayne County Board of Public Works.

The interim financing agreement had stated that the county will set the rates.

Two alternatives for Super Sewer are under discussion at the present time.

Under one alternative, the system would stretch south from Oakland County's White Lake Township to Sumpter Township, where it would turn east to Brownstown Township, Gibraltar and Trenton.

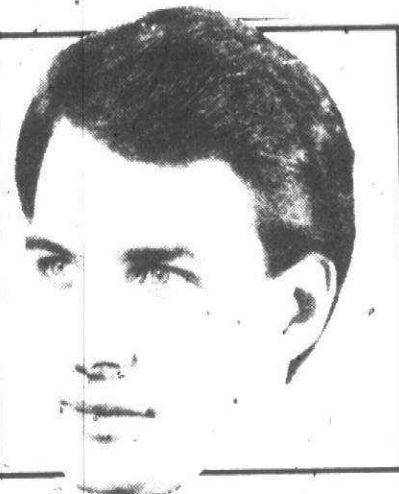
Under the other alternative, the system would end at Joy Road at its most northerly point. Plymouth, Plymouth Township and other communities north of Canton would be served by existing sewer systems. Sewer capacity for those communities would be expanded through withdrawal of Canton and other Super Sewer communities.

As yet, it isn't known whether Plymouth Township will have use of the new system. That decision won't be made until planning is completed in July 1981.

## The Bottom Line

### Keep records safe

No matter what kind of business record-keeping you select, the records must be protected from disaster. A firm can barely survive if all its financial, legal and operating records are lost through fire, flood, or theft.

The case for record protection is overwhelming. But how can a business owner with moderate financial resources protect that business against loss?

FIRST, study the alternatives.

Valuable papers which are seldom used can be put in a safe deposit vault at low cost. They may be kept on the premises if storage facilities thoroughly protect them against damage.

Current records of accounts receivable and payable should be reproduced regularly and preserved in a safe place. Similar precautions should be taken for leases, contracts, and insurance policies. Remember that safety measures must protect all materials, both up-to-date and of long-term value.

After assembling the materials and papers to be protected, contact a warehouse, bank or other safekeeping institution and describe your space needs. They'll quote you a price for bulk storage of records. Then you should draw up a plan by which records may be continuously copied and sent away for safe storage.

Microfilm can also be used — on contract, with rented equipment, or internally with purchased equipment. The determining factors are cost, volume of work and control requirements.

The great advantage of microfilming is space-saving. This factor can be especially important if storage space is limited or expensive. If space isn't at a premium, however, full-sized records can be stored more easily and less expensively.

MEANWHILE, it's important not to overlook the role of a business counselor to help prove claims for loss and help reconstruct any records lost or destroyed by a catastrophe.

You'll do yourself a service by having a consultant on a regular monthly basis. If your record-keeping follows a consistent form, the counselor will be able to reconstruct what has happened since the records' destruction.

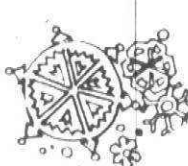

## Hello, hostages

A Blues spokeswoman said the company was assured by the Iranian consulate in New York that the hostages, held eight weeks since the American embassy was seized by Iranian students, would receive the greeting scrolls as long as they didn't carry political messages.

## Five injured in car crash

Five men were injured in a head-on crash between two cars on Mill Street in Plymouth early Sunday morning. While all were taken to St. Mary Hospital in Livonia following the collision, only one remained hospitalized as of Monday.

According to Plymouth police, a car driven by Scott Alan Stacey, 27, of Canton, crossed the center line while heading south on Mill and struck another car in the east-bound lane near Wilcox Street about 1 a.m.

The other car, driven by Andrew S. Gellner, 19, of Northville contained three passengers. They are: Dan Carr, 18, of Northville, Andrew McLaughlin, 18, of Novi, and James O'Meara, 18, of Northville.

Only McLaughlin was held over Sunday for head injuries. He later was taken to St. Joseph Hospital in Ann Arbor for observation by his family doctor.

According to a hospital spokesperson, the other young men were treated for minor cuts and bruises.

## Ridership is up for the county's small bus systems

By MIKE SCANLON

You've probably seen them scooting around town like a horde of ungainly bugs, those vans with the cute SEMTA slogans painted on the sides. The infestation will proliferate in years ahead.

In Wayne County, the vans are operated by five small bus systems with a combined \$2.9 million annual budget.

Last month, the vans provided 31,000 trips for short-distance travelers. Michael Dewey, small bus systems manager for the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA), figures that is more or less a drop in the bucket.

"WE HAVE DONE a great deal of research and survey work to find what is called technically 'latent demand,' the number of people who would use the system if it were convenient," said Dewey.

The studies have determined that even after the largest of the five systems quadruples its vans, from 20 to 80, "we don't see ourselves meeting more than 3 to 5 percent of the latent demand, theoretically."

The five Wayne County systems combined have a current fleet of 160 buses, most of them vans with 12- to 16-passenger capacities and some of them equipped to handle wheelchair-bound riders. The SEMTA board already approved increasing the fleet to 444 vehicles within a few years.

DEWEY SAYS adding buses will make using buses more tempting, and is thus likely to fuel an upward spiral in rider numbers.

The pendulum has begun to swing back, helped along by a problem spelled O-P-E-C. Ridership in November for Wayne County's largest small system showed a 64 percent increase over last year.

The primary service offered by all five present-day systems is door-to-door transportation, a sort of tailor-made transit system that differs significantly from the more familiar "line-haul" bus network.

"The basic purpose of small bus systems is to provide transportation to small volumes of people in all sorts of directions," said Dewey.

**THE FIVE** Wayne County systems are:

The Nankin Transit Commission (NTC), with 13 vans covering Garden City, Westland, Canton Township, Inkster and Wayne; WACART, or Wayne County Essential Transportation, which operates 20 vans in areas of the county not now served by other small systems; and municipally-operated systems in Harper Woods, Redford Township and Trenton.

In addition, SEMTA operates a taxi

fare-subsidy program in Livonia, Plymouth and Northville.

For funding purposes, WACART includes five NTC vans in its fleet total even though the NTC operates the five.

WACART is scheduled to get 60 new vans by the end of next summer. Trenton is involved in a study to determine the feasibility of expanding its systems into other downriver towns, perhaps to include Woodhaven, Riverview and Gibraltar.

(SERVICE WILL expand to include the Grosse Pointes by March, Dewey said. Dearborn and Taylor are under study for small bus service possibly to begin in 1981.

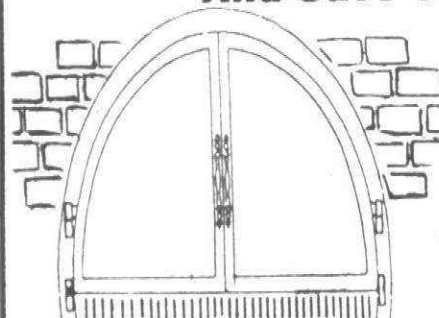
Service provided by most of the existing five systems is basically divided into door-to-door short-distance travel — often reserved for handicapped people or senior citizens — and a "feeder route," or shuttle system that delivers groups of commuters to clustered bus stops where they can catch big buses downtown.

# Soviet pianist to sub

Pianist Oxana Yablonskaya, who emigrated from the Soviet Union in 1977, is making her Midwest debut with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra on Jan. 3, 4 and 5 at Ford Auditorium.

She will perform Tchaikovsky's Piano Concerto No. 2. Madame Yablonskaya will replace Gary Graffman who was forced to cancel because of illness. The program remains as scheduled with Herbert Blomstedt on the podium in his Detroit Symphony debut.

During 1978 and 1979, Madame Yablonskaya played return engagements with the El Paso Symphony (scene of her U.S. debut) and the Norfolk Symphony, made her London orchestral debut in Royal Albert Hall, and in Paris, her recital debut.

In summer 1979, she was guest soloist at the Flagstaff Festival and at Temple University Music Festival in Ambler, Penn., where she played with the Pittsburgh Symphony under Skrowaczewski.

MS. YABLONSKAYA was born in Moscow in December 1941. She began to play the piano at the age of 5 and was enrolled in the Moscow Central School for Gifted Children,

which is attached to the Moscow Conservatory. She studied with Anaida Sumbatyan until she was 16, and to whom she feels she owes her basic musical training.

From 16 to 21 she worked at the conservatory with Aleksandr Goldenweiser, and from 1965 to 1975 she taught at the Moscow Conservatory. After graduation, she was introduced to the outside world at the Marguerite Long-Jacques Thibaud Competition of 1963 in Paris, where she placed second.

In 1965, she won first prize at the Rio de Janeiro competition, and in 1969, she won second prize at the International Beethoven competition in Vienna.

She received scores of invitations to appear in Europe, including the prestigious Vienna Musikverein. But, she was never allowed to accept them. She was kept close to home playing only in the Soviet Union, Poland, East Germany, Bulgaria and Yugoslavia.

### A backstage man heads state theater group

Picture the great Shakespearean actor Laurence Olivier standing alone in the spotlight, quietly and patiently quoting 10 of the most quoted words in the English language: "To be, or not to be: that is the question."

And when he is finished with the soliloquy and the awesome silence is replaced with thundering applause, you realize why someone would spend years studying, practicing, praying to be an actor.

The sheer majesty of great theater.

EVEN FOR the amateur, the roar of the crowd has been an irresistible world to which he can go and become anything he wants to be. The audience believes him and will show their appreciation. It is a world of bright lights and being the center of attention.

But as easy as it is to picture the actor, it is somewhat harder to understand the man who stands in the wings.

He is a man who receives no public acclaim. A man who will spend weeks designing and then building a set, only to see it torn apart within hours of the final curtain.

How do you describe this man who spent months raising money for a tiny community theater group, trooping from local store to local store?

He produces, he directs, he does all the things no one else wants to do. But without him you have no play, you have no theater group.

He's a man like Fred Button.

"I LOVE theater," he says. "I've only been in three plays and each of those were bit parts. I just don't belong out on stage. I belong behind the scenes doing my thing."

"I don't need a lot of applause. For me, the turn on is designing a set, building it and seeing it fulfill the writer's dream."

"A set is not meant to be a piece of art; rather, it must complement the action, be functional."

Recently elected as president of the Community Theater Association of Michigan (CTAM), Button has been

doing his thing for the Wayne-Westland Civic Theater for 15 years.

"I and my wife were invited by friends to a theater club meeting," he recalls. "We liked it and have been doing it ever since. It got so it became a family affair."

"Our two daughters would do children parts while my wife took to running the box office. Now the girls are married and they have come back with their husbands."

In his 15 years, Button has done just about every job there is within the group. From president to treasurer, from chairman of the play-reading committee to soft-drink concessioner.

Why do it all?

"You do it because as a team you want to succeed," he says. "To make a play good — I mean really good — everyone must do their job. They must do it to the best of their ability."

"When it is finished and the audience has been entertained, you feel that sense of pride. You have taken a smattering of words on paper and

turned it into something alive and beautiful."

AS PRESIDENT of the CTAM, Button takes the lead for some 95 member groups in their 28th year as an association.

Working primarily as a helper for new groups, the CTAM provides instruction on by-law and constitution writing, bookkeeping methods and lists of agencies and suppliers who will be needed.

Most importantly, the association helps organize that first season.

"All too often a new group will try a play like 'Man of La Mancha' in their maiden year," Button says.

"It is simply too hard; too many people, too expensive. We steer them toward shows that have fewer technical problems, less costumes, a single set. They need to establish themselves within their community as a viable and profitable art group."

"Nothing is worse than to lose a lot of money on one show and disband. Anyone trying later to get civic aid will be faced with the past failure and not stand a chance."

IN ADDITION, the CTAM sponsors two competitions each year, for playwrighting and high school acting.

The playwrighting contest provides prizes from \$25 to \$100. "We use it to stimulate new play production and creative writing among the community theaters," Button says. "Many of the plays written will be produced somewhere in Michigan by one of our members."

"All too often, community theaters only will do large box office plays for fear of losing money. But by doing a play written by a local resident, they often can make up the difference."

The high school actor's scholarship competition, held in mid-April, will feature young men and women from over 20 schools. Each contestant is required to perform before judges with a rehearsed audition piece.

The winners receive a \$1,000 scholarship to the college of their choice.

Contest rules for both the playwrighting and the actor's scholarship competition can be obtained by calling Button at 323-2606.

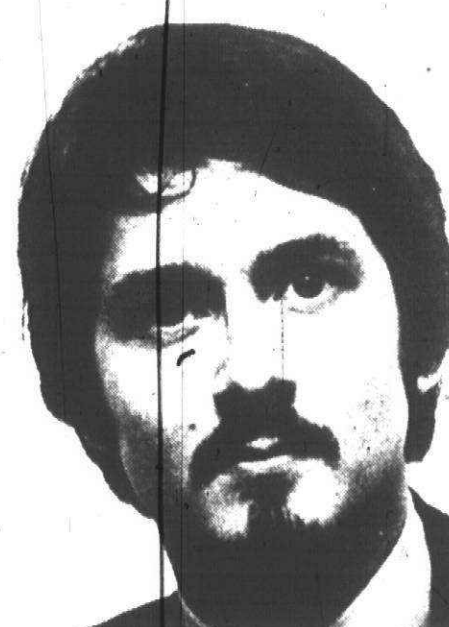

### How Farmington Players lasted through 19 years

The Farmington branch of the American Association of University Women never would have believed that its small, dramatic study group would one day grow into the Farmington Players, one of the longest running amateur theaters in the Detroit area.

The group was formed in 1951. Initially it performed shows in various schools and churches. Meetings were held in individual's homes. Then in 1955, the Farmington Players were able to lease an old dairy barn on 12 Mile Road.

"The barn came complete with stalls, hay lofts and a milking room," said long-time member Ellie Jorgensen. "Of course, we began fixing it up right away so that it now bears little resemblance to a dairy barn."

Today, the playhouse contains a prop shop, costume room, basement rehearsal area, a meeting area and an auditorium which seats 178 people.

"THE EARLY SHOWS had pigeons to contend with," laughed Walter Jorgensen. "When the farmhouse was sold in 1965 the Players were given the option to buy the barn. Twelve members put up their own money to purchase the property."

Through the hard work of its dedicated members, the Players were able to transform the old barn into a modern facility.

"We're very pleased with the fact that we are entirely self-supporting," Mrs. Jorgensen said. "We receive no grants or gratuities. Nobody gets paid for anything. Everything we do is for the love of it, and we do it ourselves."

In addition to transforming the barn into the theater, the Players recently fireproofed the entire building and replaced the auditorium chairs with theater seating.

The group now has 125 members. Approximately 50 participate on a given show.

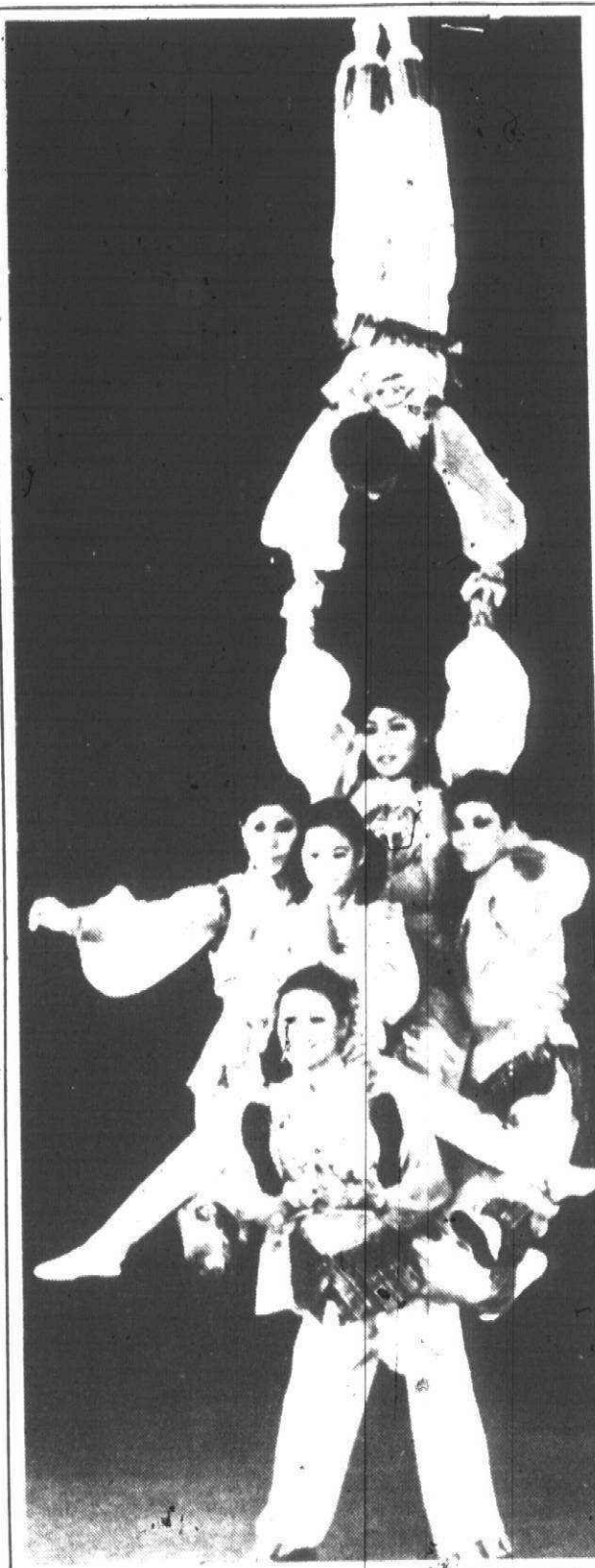

### Depression photographer's work featured

The Detroit Historical Museum, recognizing that 1979 marked the 50th anniversary of the start of the Great Depression, has a special exhibition, "Dorothea Lange: Her Collection." The show is traveling nationally by arrangement through the Smithsonian Institution. It was organized by the Oakland (California) Museum.

This major retrospective of Lange's works cover the years from 1919 to the 1940s, including her documentary photography with the Farm Security Administration in the mid and late 1930s.

Lange, who died in 1965 at the age of 70, is best remembered for her photographs of Depression victims, especially the landmark image, "Migrant Mother."

Photographing people as they were — living and working — was the most noteworthy aspect of her work. However, she was also sensitive to the needs of her subjects and felt it was her responsibility to make their plight known through her work.

Not only did the directness of her photographs awaken the nation to the dire straits of the poor and homeless but the simplicity and strong composition of her work have also profoundly affected American photojournalism.

According to Robert Kothe, the museum curator handling the installation of the exhibition, Lange's work should be of particular interest to photographers and historians of photography.

"Also," he said, "as the nation pauses to reflect on the 50th anniversary of the beginning of the Great Depression, it is significant to note that many of our images of that period in American history have derived directly from the photography of Dorothea Lange."

The exhibit will be at the Detroit Historical Museum until Sunday, Jan. 13. The museum, at Woodward and Kirby in the Cultural Center, is open from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday; 1 to 9 p.m. on Wednesday; and 1 to 5 p.m. on Sunday. # Kensington farm will be closed

With no explanation, the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority has announced the closing of its controversial Children's Farm and Village at Kensington Metropark.

HCMA offices were closed at deadline time, and no official could be reached to explain the reason.

HCMA Director David O. Laidlaw sent out a written announcement that the five-county parks authority has purchased the assets of the privately-owned Children's Farm and Village for \$550,000 effective Dec. 26.

"Operation of the farm has been suspended effective this date," said Laidlaw.

Opened in August of 1976, Children's Farm and Village was a joint project of a private corporation, headed by Peter Cristiano Jr., and HCMA. It was to be a \$2 million development.

Using 100 acres of HCMA land at the north end of Kensington Metropark near Milford, the private company was to pay HCMA 10 percent of its revenues with a guaranteed minimum of \$25,000 a year. At the end of 25 years, HCMA was to take title to the development.

It was to have farm animals, historical barn, restaurant, corral and several rides — including swanboats, a train and ponies. Charges for the farm were separate from vehicle admission charges into the metropark.

The project came under attack when the train ride came under discussion. Nearby Milford Township residents said it had the trappings of an amusement park. The Michigan United Conservation Clubs attacked it as an "inappropriate" use of public property.

And in August of 1978, state Atty. Gen. Frank Kelley filed suit in Oakland Circuit Court to block its development.

HCMA defended the development as a good way for it to raise capital to buy more park land. HCMA lost a 1976 bal-

lot bid to double its quarter-mill of the property tax it currently collects. It sought the "farm" plan as a method of raising capital as more and more of its existing tax revenue went to operations.

Contacted at home Monday, John Sterling Jr., HCMA's public information officer, referred all questions to Don Beem, HCMA's chief of natural resources. Beem could not be reached for comment on the reasons for closing and the status of Kelley's lawsuit.

# Wine scene is undergoing change

The New York wine industry is undergoing a change. There is some strong evidence to that effect.

Over the last few years a number of new wineries are being bonded. They are concentrating their efforts on producing not the old time native American but the relatively new French Hybrid and even some European vinifera wines.

These small growers used to sell their grapes to the giants of the New York industry: Gold Seal, Widmer, Great Western and the giant Taylor Wine Company.

Now, because of a supportive change in the bond fee structure within the state, they are more able to go out on their own.

THE TRADITIONAL powers continue, for the most part, to make their wines from the labrusca, native American grapes. The little vintners seek to extend their capabilities, and the future looks brighter than it did not so long ago.

Taylor's recent excursion into the California varietal market is seen as a marketing move only by its new owners, and Widner's holdings in California have produced nothing very exciting over the years.

The trend toward quality wines began more than 20 years ago when Dr. Konstantin Frank demonstrated that vinifera grapes could be grown successfully in that bitter climate around the Finger Lakes.

He continues today to produce beautiful Rieslings and Chardonnays in Hammondsport and even manages a bit of Cabernet Sauvignon and Pinot Noir.

AND THEN, less than 10 year ago, Walter Taylor broke away from the family to establish Bully Hill Vineyards and has consistently produced superior French Hybrid-based wines.

More recently, Benmarl and High Tor began producing hybrid wines up the Hudson, and a small winery on Long Island has shown success. But it is in the area of the Finger Lakes that the real action is developing — the center of wine-growing efforts in the state, from Penn Yan with its Boordy Vineyards (founded by Philip Wagner, father of the French hybrid concept) to the south where Glenora Wine Cellars, Heron Hill Vineyards and the Stanley Wagner Vineyards are among a group of wine growers who will now produce their own hybrid wines.

They will tend to be white wines — reds do not do well in such a cold climate — and tend to be expensive.

Aurora, Vidal, Seyval and Vignoles produce significantly less vigorously than labrusca, but they command a considerably higher price per ton.

In the past these quality vines have sold cheap and been blended in with Catawba and Concord to reduce the naturally musty taste of native American grapes. Now they will have their own labels or receive vineyard designation on the labels of others.

IF THE PRICES can stay above \$1,000 a ton, they may be able to hang on long enough to change the drinking habits of eastern America.

It is probably too much to hope highly for the vinifera market to prosper much, however. Less than a ton of Chardonnay per acre is not uncommon.

But maybe that is as it should be. French hybrids offer an alternative to European wines and they are not without interest.

While we can't yet sample most of these New York efforts, the scene is not dissimilar here in Michigan. While we don't have a Taylor to contend with, we do have a growing, small winery business doing well with hybrids — and a bit of vinifera.

Your total distance for the trip is 50 miles. Weather forecasts give a five-day outlook for fair skies and temperatures at or below zero. You are wondering how to prepare for the trip.

WOULD YOU...

A. Confine your plans and preparations to yourself and your companion.

B. Seek out professional advice on preparation, but keep the essential details to yourself.

C. Prepare for the trip by seeking out known professionals for advice on clothing and equipment necessary to insure your safety and enjoyment, arrange a deadline for completion, and establish emergency action to be taken in the event of bad weather or injury that could cause unforeseen delays.

D. Take no action other than getting your skis and clothing together and starting out. The weather is fair and the outlook is good. The trip can be made in a day.

### TO SURVIVE...

C is the proper action to take. Any time you plan to take a trip of this type, always contact the people who are acknowledged professionals in the activity. They will be able to provide you with definitive guidance on what the necessary precautions are to insure a safe and enjoyable excursion.

B would be the same as C except the plans should be made known to someone close to you who will be aware of when to expect you home. Also, your plans, including the route of travel, should be made known to the local forestry or game management agency responsible for the area you intend to travel through.

A and D provide totally unacceptable alternatives in the preparation of your trip.

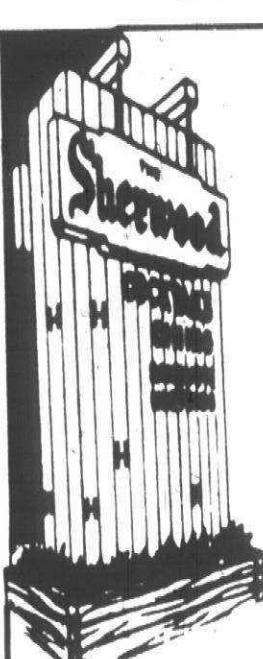

# They produce minute movies

The interior looks more like someone's idea of a combination garage-factory room than a studio.

Dampness from the concrete floor seeps into everyone's shoes and the noise of the sound crew setting up manages a flat echo through the rooms.

It's the beginning of another assignment for Artistic Studios, a Farmington Hills firm specializing in set designs. Under the direction of Artistic owner Gary Papierski, the crew works through the morning putting together a secretary's office for a Highland Appliance commercial.

Alongside personnel from O'Dea Productions and W.B. Doner Advertising Agency, Papierski's crew labors to put up the blue curtains against the newly painted blue wall in what used to be the front office.

Amid a cacophony of sound checks, pounding hammers, ringing phones and voices, Papierski manages to seem unhurried.

After 14 years of designing for J.L. Hudson's, a job which included a yearly chore of dealing with Thanksgiving parade floats, he left to design offices, sets, fashion shows and to decorate malls.

**HIS CREDITS** include offices for auto executives, white sale windows which look like Victorian bedrooms, a space capsule for an appliance store commercial and a walk-through newspaper for an Oakland county daily.

A few years ago when Jonathon Livingston Seagull was a bird to be reckoned with, Papierski delivered to Walt Disney studios a six-foot-high Jonathon float.

After four months in his Farmington Hills office and 1½ years in the set designing business, Papierski seems to have the knack of creating an orderly product out of chaos.

That chaos takes the shape of persons milling around, seemingly without

an aim. Gradually, the office walls take shape and the film crew begins to set up shop.

Inside a partitioned-off office Carol Branstom makes up actress Darcy Dean, who'll play a bored secretary in the Highland commercial. It's a chore that Ms. Dean looks upon as a minute long movie.

Dressed in a blue print blouse and leaning against a desk, Ms. Dean and Ms. Branstom share a laugh over the secretary's frumpy hair style with flipped up bangs.

"I hope you don't recognize me on the street after this," Ms. Dean laughs. After trying New York, Ms. Dean came to Detroit to do commercials.

**"THEATER ISN'T** where the money is. Commercials are faster and more fun," she adds.

Ms. Branstom, another actress who turned to commercials from the theater, nods her head in agreement.

"I couldn't handle the rejection," Ms. Branstom says of her trip from the stage to a backstage role taking care of everyone's hair and makeup.

Too young to play the character parts she craved and too old to flap her eyes around ingenue roles, Ms. Branstom decided to give it up.

"You're limited as to what you can do," she says.

That was about 20 years ago and on this morning she applies Ms. Dean's make-up much like any average working woman would — no fancy tricks, just putting the proper colors in the proper places.

Pacing around the set in a trenchcoat and plaid suit, Detroit area radio-television veteran Rube Weiss of Oak Park waits for filming to begin.

Weiss, a veteran of radio shows such as "Hermit's Cave" and "Lone Ranger," wears a flat plaid cap with a visor.

"I don't know if I like you in the hat," producer Dea says to Weiss.

"I'LL TAKE it off for you," offers Weiss.

He is among a number of radio performers who slipped into television work during the early 1950s.

Detroiters also remember Weiss as a long-time Hudson's Santa Claus. Weiss received the keys to the city from Mayors Miriani and Cavanaugh.

He quit riding the Claus float down Woodward when he discovered to his dismay that some persons have a mind to lob a few rocks at old St. Nick.

In the Highland commercial Weiss plays the boss who waits until the end of the day to give his secretary a couple of dillies worth of paperwork.

He dubiously eyes the dolly stacked high with paperwork which he must

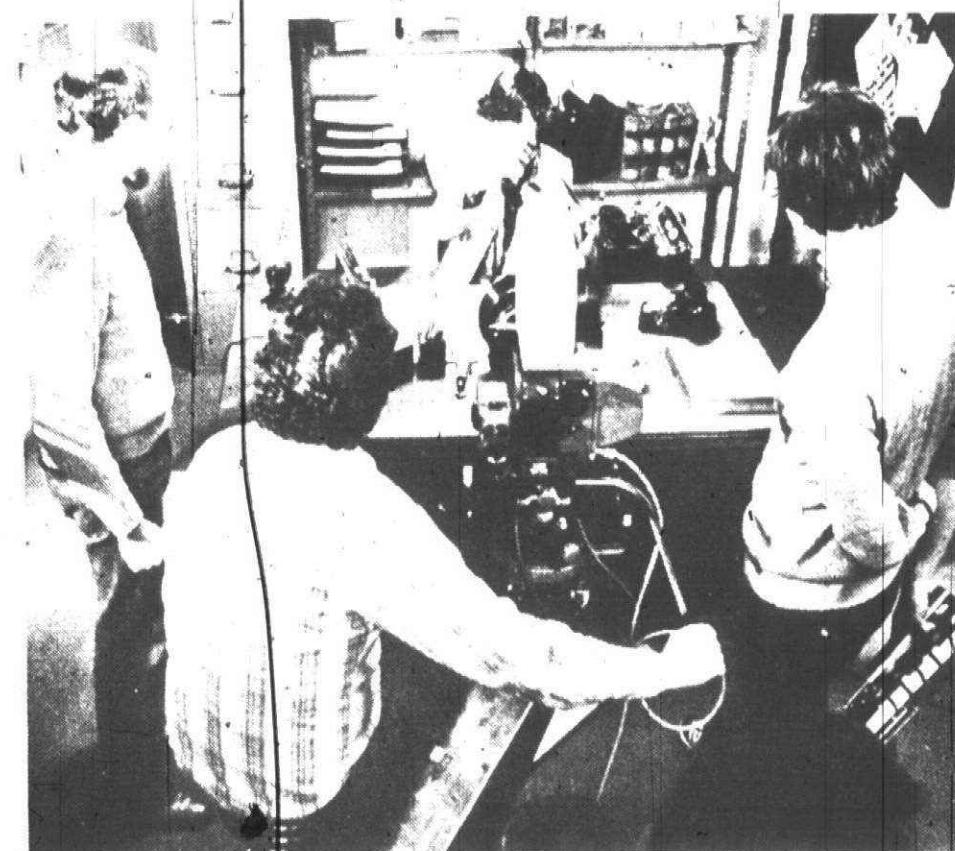
wheel onto the set for the skit. A test wheeling of the dolly reveals that none of the papers and boxes will stay on the contraption.

A trio of production aides work with the prop, re-stacking boxes and stuffing papers in strategic places.

They are almost ready to begin when the wall behind the secretary's desk collapses in a pile of loosely attached bookcases.

After the wall is replaced, Ms. Dean goes through her tired secretary motions, rolling her eyes when her name is called on the intercom.

Soon all will be relatively quiet. Filming will begin. Roll 'em.



With all in readiness, the camera crew shoots a commercial with actress Darcy Dean at center stage. (Staff photo)



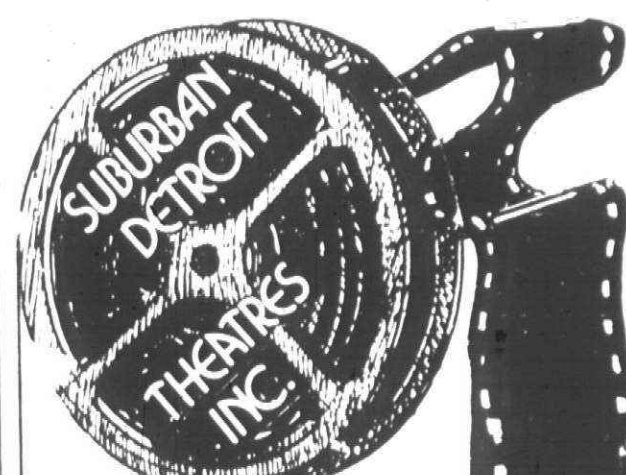

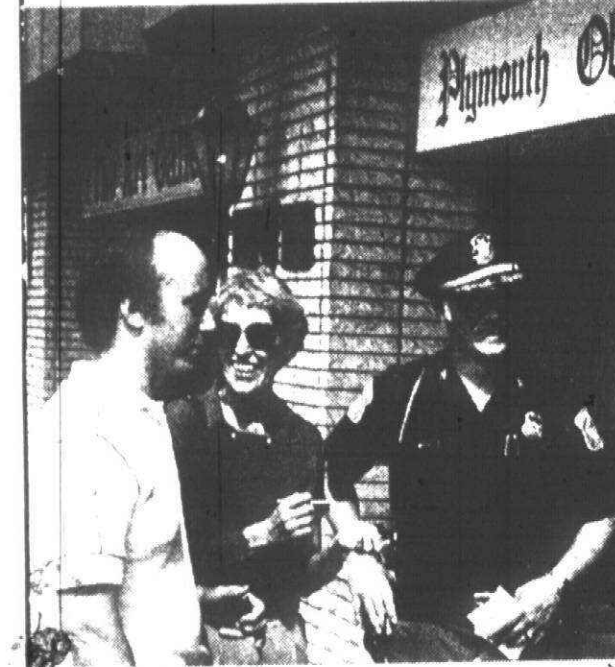

## Retiring after 32 years

# Grads sing farewell to Nelson

By BETTY MASSON

Although Fred Nelson prefers the music of Bach, Beethoven and Brahms, he's willing to learn about modern musicians from his students.

Maybe that's why so many of his former students came to his last concert at Plymouth's Centennial Educational Park to wish him well on his retirement after 32 years of teaching vocal music. The concert was held just before Christmas.

"I felt good at the last concert," said Nelson, "but the concluding number was 'The Lord Bless You and Keep You.' Old graduates were invited to come up and join the choir, and seeing so many good kids come back and sing, it really got to me."

Nelson conducts five PCEP vocal groups, the Madrigal Singers, the Swing Ensemble, the Triple Trio, the mixed chorus and the choir.

ALTHOUGH IT WAS his last concert, Nelson is not retiring until the end of the semester, Jan. 28. Working in Plymouth is the only job Nelson has ever had, and he is the "Old Guard" of the school system, having been a teacher here longer than anyone else presently in the schools.

A graduate of the University of Minnesota at Duluth, he joined the Plymouth schools in September 1947. At that time Central School housed students from kindergarten through grade 12.

He led the junior high school band and helped the high school band director, Paul Wagner.

For a few years he was also assistant conductor of the Plymouth Symphony, under Wagner and Wayne Dunlap. He played bass in the symphony as well.

He led the Plymouth Civic Chorus, which provided the music for the symphony's presentations of "The Messiah," the Brahms Requiem, "The Child-

hood of Christ" by Berlioz, and an opera, "Down in the Valley," by Kurt Weill. He was in the chorus when the latter was presented.

When he arrived in Plymouth, Nelson also took the job of organist and choirmaster for First United Presbyterian Church.

"Suddenly I realized that I was working seven days a week," said Nelson. So he gave up his work with the symphony in the early 1950s.

In 1951, he received his master of arts degree in music from the University of Michigan.

He is still director of music at the church and plays the organ for the occasional service, as well as at weddings and funerals.

"At the Christmas Eve service this year a baby was baptized," Nelson said. "He was the grandson of one of my former students."

OF HIS CAREER, he said, "It's been a joy to make a living making beautiful music."

Nelson feels he has had an advantage over teachers of more conventional subjects. "When a kid elects vocal music, it's because he wants to be there," he said.

"Although, occasionally, it's because he wants an easy credit, too," he added. "Kids today are more creative and questioning than they used to be," he said.

"Today, they ask questions about why things have to be done in a certain

appreciation from a former student. One, now a successful Plymouth businessman, recently wrote to say he would have dropped out of school if it had not been for Nelson and his music."

NELSON, a young-looking 59, and his wife, Betty, are looking forward to his retirement.

"Inflation is the only frightening thing about retiring," he said. In a pinch, though, music could still help out. He may decide to give some piano lessons.

One reason he did not retire last June was because he wanted to see a group of 15 students through a new piano-teaching course at the high school. The students worked with tiny, electronic pianos, with Nelson giving them instructions through earphones. "It worked out very well," he said.

The Nelsons are hoping to do a little traveling. They have visited Hawaii several times during summer vacations and plan to return there some time, as well as visit friends in Arizona and California.

Nelson will continue to make music on piano and organ, direct the church choir and do crossword puzzles.

The Nelsons have two sons, William, who teaches English and social studies at West Middle School, and Jim, who sells, repairs and teaches how to fly hang gliders in Benzonia. They have an eight-year-old granddaughter, and both his mother and Mrs. Nelson's mother live in Plymouth.

way. They are more ready to make suggestions. Some are unworkable; but some are very good."

Nelson also finds today's students are more creative than their parents were.

"We've performed a number of student compositions in recent years," he said. "I think this is a good sign."

Nelson introduces his students to the music of the old masters with a suggestion. "Let's find out what's good about it and why it has lasted," he tells them.

On the other hand, "Modern music is one of the problems of getting older. I tend to depend on the kids to tell me what is good."

Not only does he listen to them, but he'll even buy albums by such moderate moderns as the Carpenters and Chuck Mangioni.

As far as those who say rock music is "bad" for kids, Nelson's observation is, "I can remember my mother saying the same thing 40 years ago to me about Benny Goodman."

IN WORLD WAR II, Nelson says perhaps the tuba saved his life. He played this instrument in the Army Band for five years and never left the U.S.

Although his favorite composers are the "three Bs," he says it is just recently he has come to appreciate Mahler and Bruckner.

"I used to think their music was wandering," he said. "Now I think it's beautiful and makes sense."

Even though few of his students have gone on to make a career as performing artists, Nelson feels his job has been rewarding.

"Ten years later," he said, "those kids who were involved in music in high school will be the intelligent consumers."

And occasionally he gets a note of

## Marriage can offer wholeness

Most people are more like pretzels than well-rounded circles, says a top marriage counselor.

"And the way I look at it," says Walter Connor of the Birmingham-based Psychological Institute of Michigan, "is that marriage is our best opportunity to lose our pretzelness."

"It is the best opportunity to learn to love."

"But if we don't learn, we wind up more pretzely."

Connor, a psychologist, spoke at Newburg United Methodist Church recently as part of the church's "University of Life" series.

He pointed out that people come into marriage completely different individuals with components in their makeup, both neurotic and irrational.

"If all of us had good parents who loved us properly, we'd grow up to be

whole people, full of wholeness, self-esteem and self-love," he stated. "We'd be like circles instead of twisted."

NOTING THAT today the "natural permanence" of marriage is gone in society's view, Connor cited several statistics on divorce rates.

"One third of marriages now end in divorce," he said, "and by 1985 half of the people in this country will be children of mixed marriages."

He listed reasons why "it's safe to say only one marriage in 10 fulfills its potential."

One is expectations, Connor said.

"We expect to be made happy when we marry," he continued. "That did not used to be true. You got married for good reasons and you stayed married because that was what the community expected."

Breakup of the community is another factor listed.

"Until recently," Connor said, "most activity took place in or near the home. But with the industrial age and with increasing mobility, the family was taken out of the community."

"Family members no longer had their needs being met by a large number of people. Husband and wife have to be all things to each other, and that's an emotional overload."

The changing role of women, changing values of society, stress and differing cultural backgrounds also were cited as reasons for the increasing shakiness of marriage.

HOWEVER, said Connor, most marriages can work if the couple is willing to seek the necessary understanding of self and partner.

"I see love as an accomplishment,"

he said. "It's something a couple does because they want it and are willing to work at it."

Too often when "pretzels" marry they turn their relationship into a power struggle, according to the psychologist.

"But in marriage you can't have winners or losers," he added. "You both have to win or you both lose."

Connor said couples with good marriages "give to the one with the greater need at the moment," and they understand which need is the greater.

"It's that mystical kind of thing that operates in a couple that has learned to give to each other," he added.

The speaker was asked if the women's movement was making a mark on marriage.

"I think it will," he answered. "It's more fun to be married to a woman than it is to be married to a child."

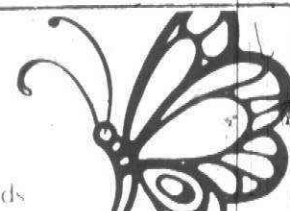

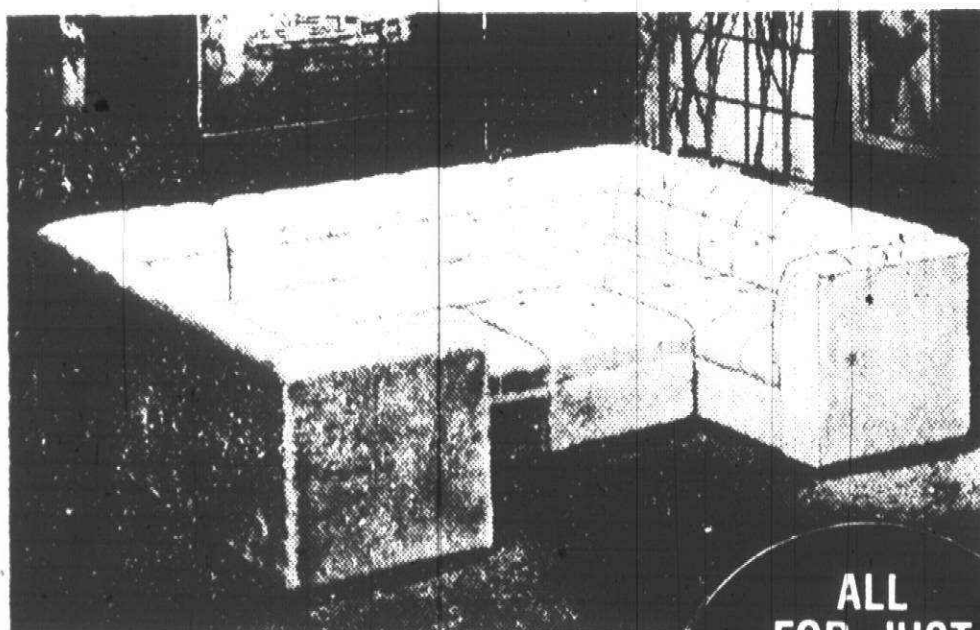

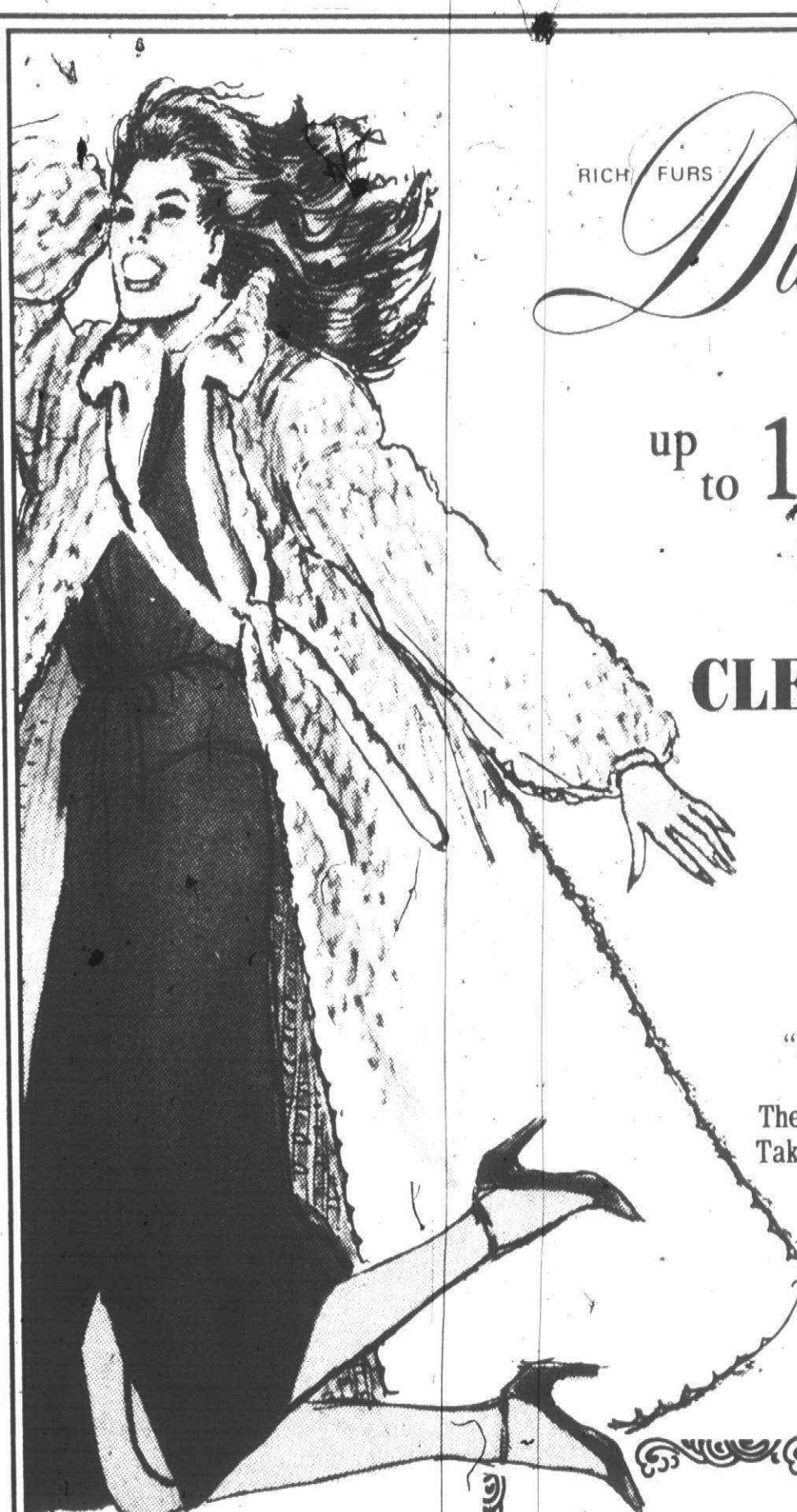

## Teens, adults rap on bereavement

"My mother was killed in a vicious way," said the young man in his teens. "I didn't cry for a year and a half. That's how long it took to sink in."

He was one of the participants in a session for bereaved children and parents.

The meeting was called by Schoolcraft College's women's resource center and the idea was to let young people understand it is acceptable to show feelings of grief. But the sponsors had not expected such a dramatic and painful outpouring.

The teenager explained his mother was shot when she ventured outside their home to investigate some noise.

"All I wanted to do was find the guy who did it," continued the speaker. "I wish I had walked out of the door in front instead of behind her. I felt guilty. I felt I chickened out."

"My dad took out his frustration on me. I got the crap kicked out of me. Relatives didn't want to get involved even if it meant me spending the night in the street."

The other young people in the audience had not gone through such or

shocking tragedy. But their emotions at the death of their parent were as anguishing as they were varied.

And when the session was over plans were set in motion for a Schoolcraft workshop that now is scheduled to begin Tuesday, Feb. 5. The evening course will be titled "Minus a Parent, Minus a Mate," and will cost \$30 per family. Those interested may call the women's resource center, 591-6400, call 430.

**HOW DOES** a young person feel when a parent or loved one dies? This question was put to them by Sandra Prochazka, a social worker who works at Associated Counseling Services of Plymouth. Together with Livonian Antoinette Albano, also a social worker, she was moderating the meeting. Hurt, afraid, annoyed, cheated, lost, overwhelmed, lonely, shocked, guilty

depressed and abandoned. These were some of the feelings mentioned.

Relief was another emotion one of these youngsters had experienced. "I was glad the pain was over," he explained. "He had a tumor."

"I couldn't believe it happened to me," reported a boy. "I cried all the time when the subject came up. I also felt cheated. Why did my dad have to die?"

"I didn't want to talk about it," said a girl.

"Why didn't I see him more?" wondered someone else.

Children have always had to face the death of a parent. But at an earlier time it was expected that both children and adults would smother the kind of feelings expressed at the meeting.

**"IT'S FUNNY HOW** things change over the years," said a woman. "My father died when I was young. My mother was told to get rid of everything that reminded her of him. As a result I grew up without hearing any mention of him. I feel that was wrong."

Another woman spoke up: "I never knew my mother, grieved. She never showed it. A psychologist told me I should let my child see I was grieving."

Another participant declared: "It is still not part of society to grieve. That's why we're here. A child psychologist told me to remove all the toys my husband gave my daughter. If she wanted to talk about him, I was supposed to change the subject."

"I was told not to cry in front of her. That wouldn't happen now. Today you're supposed to express your feelings."

A man observed: "It helps children through the grieving process." "Things are better than they were 20 years ago," observed Mrs. Albano.

**GRIEF WAS WHAT** still consumed

the young man whose mother had been killed.

"When I was 14 my dad remarried," he said. "I thought that was great. Her and I were good friends. But she got sick and died. It made it rough for my father. I tried not to let the situation get out of control. I did all the cleaning and laundry. Everything was going fine."

"Then came the date of her birthday. I was cooking dinner. He didn't like how I did it. It all started again to the point that we almost killed each other."

Late February I got kicked out of the house. My dad married again. They asked me to the house. But she began telling me who to pick for friends, and to be in at 9 p.m. I rebelled against her. Right now I don't know where he's living."

Mrs. Prochazka told the group: "Parents get overprotective with their kids after a death occurs. They are determined not to lose anyone else."

A woman responded: "I didn't want to keep him home from school to keep me company," she said. "I didn't like

myself for doing it. I was lonely. I wanted someone to bitch at."

**THE CHANCE TO EXPRESS** themselves moved several participants to press for more meetings of this kind. The February sessions were set up in answer to this expressed need.

"Talking and listening in a group helps to overcome the loss," said a girl. "It helps you cope when you know what others are going through. I would like meetings like this to continue."

"My father died a year ago," noted another girl. "I felt depressed. I really can't talk about it at school. I break down in tears. I feel left out of discussions because I have only one parent."

"It helps to come here where everyone is in the same boat. You don't feel you're an oddball. It helps you let your feelings out and talk more. It feels better to get it off your chest, and hear the problems of someone else."

The mood was summed up by a 13-year-old boy. "I'm glad I came," he declared. "At least I don't feel any more that I'm the only one with this problem."

## Learn to work with the aging

One hundred residents of the community will be given the opportunity by Madonna College to learn skills needed to work with the aged while earning college credit at the same time.

In the last five years over 500 men and women, ranging in ages from 7-17, have donated hundreds of hours working with the elderly, in a "Volunteers to Assist the Aging" program at the college.

Hands-on experience is provided through visits with elderly residents of long-term facilities or with the aged isolated in their own homes.

In addition, guest speakers will share their insights and experience with the class during five weekend seminars beginning Jan. 11 and ending April 12. Friday sessions will be from 6-9 p.m. and on Saturday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. State officials estimate almost half of

Michigan's elderly live in Wayne and Oakland counties.

"The program was not only designed to recruit volunteers to work with the elderly," said Sr. Colleen Morris, director of the gerontology department, "but also helps people understand their own aging parents. Credits received for volunteer work can be applied toward a bachelor or associates degree in gerontology."

Partial tuition waivers of \$88 will be awarded to all persons, reducing the fee from \$175 to \$87. Applications are now being accepted. Interested persons are urged to contact Sr. Colleen Morris, Madonna College, gerontology department, 36600 Schoolcraft, Livonia 48150; 591-5094.

# Seminary, work takes student up in air down Dayton way

Margie Schleichter of Canton is a commuter student. But she doesn't fit the picture of one campus-bound by car or bus.

Mrs. Schleichter is studying for the ministry, and she takes a plane to Ohio every week for classes at Dayton United Theological Seminary.

She takes classes three days a week at the seminary and then flies home to round out the week with homework assignments and home life as wife to Gordon, Wayne State University faculty member, and mother to Marcia Jo, 7, and Andy, 4.

Beginning her winter term this week, she and her family will continue the routine they began in September so she could complete her last year of classwork toward a degree in theology.

It works this way. At 8:30 a.m. Mondays, Marcia Jo boards a school bus and then the rest of the Schleichters get in the family car and head for Metropolitan Airport.

Margie, books and homework and a change or two of clothing in hand, is dropped off at the airport, where she boards a plane for Dayton. Gordon goes on to the WSU campus, puts his son in a nursery school for the day, and goes to his job in instructional technology in the WSU College of Education.

He and Andy are back in Canton by the time Marcia Jo is home from school.

By Wednesday afternoon Margie is through with the week's classes and back at Metro. Gordon picks her up there before Marcia Jo gets home.

**COMMUTING BY AIR** to complete a study program begun 10 years ago seemed a reasonable move to Margie Schleichter.

Working toward ministry in the United Methodist Church, she picked the Dayton school because it was the closest for students of that denomination and because it offered block scheduling that would permit her to be in class only part of the week.

"We figured it out carefully, and found that using the commercial airlines — of course making reservations far ahead and taking advantage of economy fares — cost very little more than driving," she said.

"And I'm not the only commuter there," she added, explaining that one of the roommates in the suite she rents for days in Dayton also comes from a nearby area to take classes. "Quite a few of my classmates commute one way or another," she said.

She hopes to complete classwork this year. Then ahead of her will lie an internship that can be served in this area before she is ready for ordination.

**HER THEOLOGICAL** studies began a decade ago at Southern Methodist University in Dallas.

Daughter of a Methodist clergyman who served a number of western Michigan churches, she decided to go to seminary after earning her bachelor degree and spending some time teaching.

"I didn't know then what I was going to do with a degree in theology," she said. "At that time women were not encouraged to go into the ministry, and I really couldn't see myself as a Christian Education director."

"But I was interested in the studies the seminary offered me."

After completing two of the prescribed three seminary years, she decided to return to Michigan and resume teaching.

"I didn't realize how much the teaching field was tightening up right then," she recalls. Unsuccessful at landing a job, she enrolled at Michigan State University, and while there she met Roger Schleichter.

After they were married, Gordon served in the Army at Fort Benning, Ga.

Margie gave birth to Marcia Jo and did volunteer work in an army chaplaincy Christian Education program.

With army service completed, they returned to East Lansing. Roger earned his doctorate in instructional development and technology. Margie completed a master's degree in communications. Andy joined the family.

"My thought in earning the MA was that it would help me use my theological background as a lay person in church work," Margie said.

**BUT PART OF** her course work was with the United Methodist Church's commission on the status and role of women, and because of that project she was named last January as a delegate to national UMC meeting in Dallas.

She thinks now it was attending the Consultation of United Methodist Church Clergymen on the subject of the status of women that finally brought about a career decision.

So last spring, as her husband began his job with Wayne State and the family prepared to move to Canton, she decided on the seminary.

"I guess I finally said yes to the call that had been pounding at me for years," she said.

The seminary year comes now because the family situation is appropriate and "I have a very supportive husband," Margie said.

"His hours are fairly flexible so he can work with Marcia Jo's schedule," she explained, "and it's easier now with Andy in nursery school than it would be if he were in kindergarten."


Problems have been few, except that homework for the time being has to take precedence over homemaking.

And Margie Schleichter is convinced that the career ahead is one that will make worthwhile a great number of air miles.
