## Board plans millage hike in police fund

Canton's Township Board is proposing a slight increase in the local tax rate for police services.

The board unanimously adopted a resolution Tuesday calling for a levy of 3.65 mills for police (\$3.65 per \$1,000 of assessed property valuation). That represents an increase of 0.40 mills (four-tenths of a mill).

Formal adoption of the township's tax rates will come later this month.

Prior to the board's resolution, Police Chief Jerry Cox had outlined his "priority needs" for the police department, including new patrol cars, radio and phone equipment, and devices to monitor the safety of prisoners in holding cells.

"Our facilities are inadequate, and staffing is insufficient," Cox told the board. "Most of the issues have been raised before. Most haven't been dealt with. Some have become worse."

The increase in police tax could boost police department revenues by \$230,000, said finance director Mike Gorman.

THE TAX discussion occurred during hearings on the proposed tax levy for police, fire and general fund accounts for the 1983 budget, which goes into effect Jan. 1.

According to Gorman, next year's budget is "the tightest" Canton has ever had. It calls for comparable service levels, but no raises.

The police and fire department operating expenses are paid from separate taxing funds. Currently budgeted are \$1.5 million for fire services and \$1.6

million for police protection.

The general fund budget, which covers most of the township's operating expenses, is budgeted at \$3.4 million.

In the past few years, the demand for police services has increased. Cox often talks about patrol officers being spread thin in handling a larger workload.

Two hours were set aside for public comments Tuesday about the proposed tax rates for police, fire and general fund budgets. Only a few residents made comments, and a handful remained for the entire discussion.

Last year, residents had expressed satisfaction with current fire protection, but feared cuts in police services.

THE FOLLOWING millage rates are proposed for the 1983 budget:

- 3.06 mills (\$3.06 for every \$1,000 of assessed property valuation) for the fire fund. Last year's levy was 3.15 mills.

- 2.24 mills for general fund, a reduction from last year's rate of 2.32 mills.

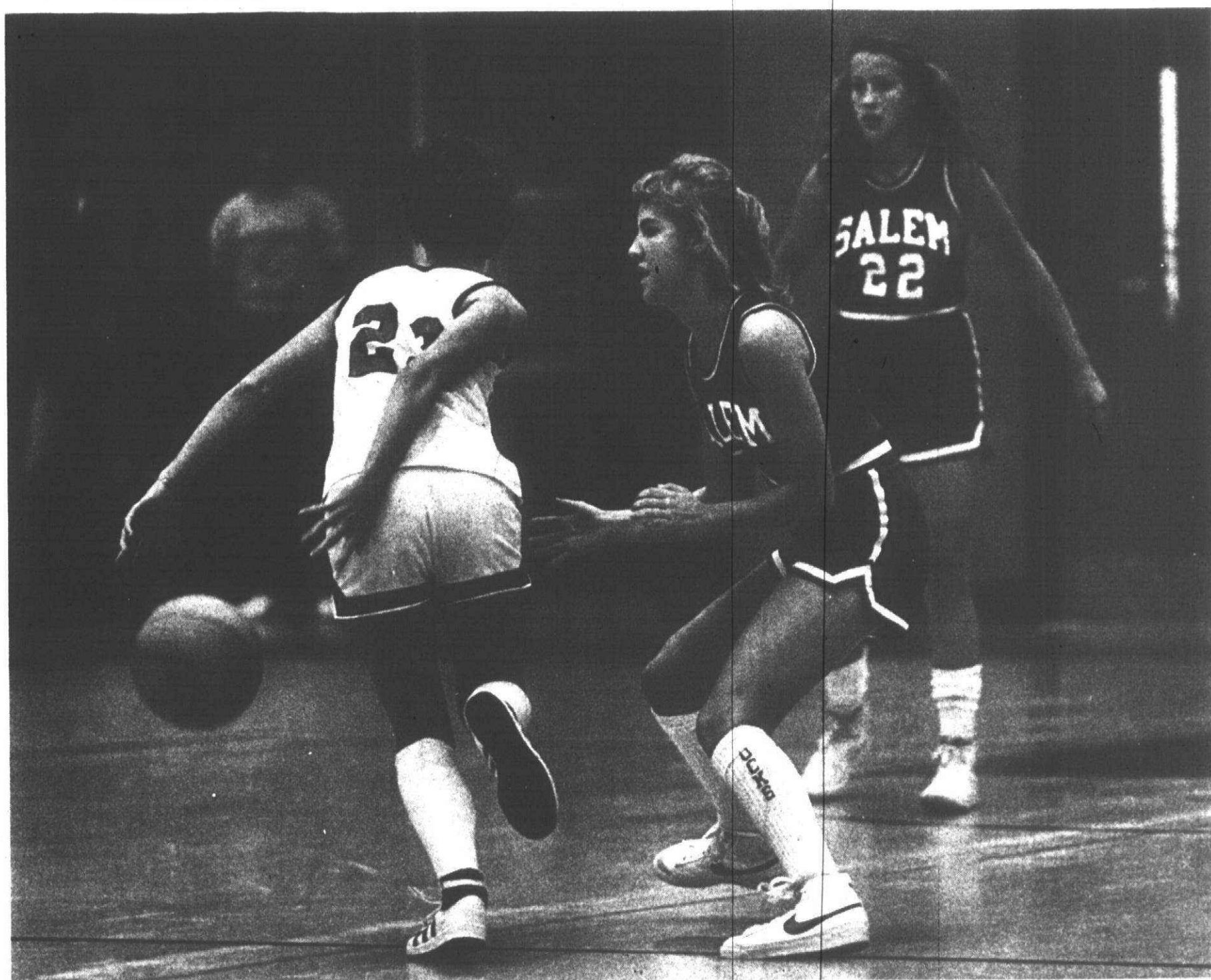
- 3.65 mills for police, an increase of 0.40 mills.

The township's total tax portion will be 8.95 mills for police, fire and general fund, said Gorman. This doesn't include school and county taxes.

A public hearing on the proposed new police tax rate Sept. 21, said Gorman. Adoption could come at the Sept. 28 meeting.

The tax rates for fire and general fund probably will be adopted Sept. 14, said Gorman.

## Wall Street spurt rubs off

## Market rally helps local brokers

The stock market rally isn't limited to Wall Street — local brokers report the rally has caused a boom in their business.

"Business is up considerably, pretty much due to the market's recent rally," said Tom Tybinka, a senior vice president and branch manager of the Prescott Ball and Turben company's Plymouth Township office.

"We've had a lot of calls from people who have been removed from the market for some time," said Tybinka, a stock broker for 10 years.

Another local brokerage firm experiencing a boom is Manley Bennett McDonald and Company of Plymouth (MBM).

"Our business has increased proportionally. Our phones are ringing and people are doing business,"

said Jack Vernier, a registered representative for MBM.

The Wall Street rally started Aug. 13. Before then the average daily volume for trading had been 52.3 million shares. Since then, the market has set and broke records, with the one-day peak of 132.7 million shares on Aug. 26.

THE RALLY indicates increased optimism in an economic recovery, brokers said.

"There's an old saying that the stock market is a barometer of future business conditions — it runs about six months ahead," said Vernier, a stock broker for 35 years.

If the saying is true, the stock market players are buying now in anticipation of an upward trend in the economy.

"The pessimism was so thick up until two weeks ago, you could cut it with a knife," said Vernier.

The Federal Reserve Board's decision to lighten up on the "tight money" policy is a major reason for the market rally, said Tybinka.

"The easing of interest rates has played a big part in it," he said.

The stock market players are gambling on the prospect that lower interest rates will result in increased consumer buying.

The stock market is a continuing battle between the bull (the optimists who buy) and the bears (the pessimists who sell), said Vernier.

"This area (Plymouth-Canton) tends to be bullish."

Stock ownership in this area is higher on a pro-rated average than other areas in the state, Vernier added.

"The auto industry and Burroughs have been

## Teachers' pay raise motivates recall move

Editor's note: Four school board members in the Wayne-Westland School District face a recall election on Sept. 14. The following stories discuss both sides of the recall issue. Wayne-Westland Community Schools service the southeast portion of Canton Township.

The recall campaign against Wayne-Westland school board members Mary Arbour, Mildred Batterson, Kenneth Marshall and Donald

Rusnock is based on one factor, maintains Rose Mary Miller, chairperson for Taxpayers United Together.

"The issue is a teachers' contract, a contract that was voted on too soon — when the district wasn't in a position to afford it," Miller said.

That teachers were given a pay increase at a time when others in the private sector were forced to take freezes or make concessions rankled many in the community.

Some believe the proposal for a local community college, which drew strong protest, or scattered sentiment that certain board members were

merely rubber stamps for school Supt. Timothy Dyer, are also factors contributing to the demand for recall.

Dissatisfaction with Dyer, himself, has also been cited as a motivating factor.

However, the teacher's contract

"was the straw that broke the camel's back," Miller said.

"On Oct. 26, five school board members voted for a contract 10 months early for teachers with a seven to nine percent raise," she said. One (Thomas Barrett) has been re-

moved by voting (in the regular June election).

"A LOT OF" thought went into the recall because we realize recall is a serious business," Miller said. "We can't fire them. Our only recourse is to recall them."

The community college proposal brought more people into the recall camp, but that issue arose after the board had approved the two-year extension of the teachers' contract, Miller said.

Teachers and Dyer aren't targets of TUT at all, Miller maintains.

"It's not a vendetta against teachers. It's not a vendetta against anybody," Miller said. "They (board members) have to realize they're responsible to the public. When you attend board meetings regularly, you tend to know what can be afforded and what can't."

"I've said 100 times Dr. Dyer has been a good superintendent," Miller continued. "If it was Dyer we wanted, we would have got advisory petitions around to get him out. We wouldn't fool around with a recall."

## 4 school trustees fight removal from office

Four Wayne-Westland school board officers are organizing a campaign to fight their removal from office.

The four are the targets of a recall campaign initiated earlier this year by the Taxpayers United Together (TUT) organization.

The board members — Kenneth Marshall, Donald Rusnock, Mary Arbour, and Mildred Batterson — are

grouping together as "KIDS," an acronym for Keep Independent-Defend Students."

Purpose of that group is to discuss educational issues during the next four weeks.

At the same time, the four have gained support from "SOC," or Save Our Community, a group of PTA leaders and parents who will be involved in soliciting campaign funds

and workers, writing letters to newspapers and helping out in the campaign.

THE TONE of the campaign — from the board members' viewpoint — became clear when the SOC committee held the last of four meetings.

Marshall said about 105 came to the first three. An estimated 25 were at the most recent one.

Attending were Marshall, new

board president, and Arbour, vice president.

They talked about what they felt were the issues involved in the recall campaign: public concern over the school board's extension of the teachers' union contract last fall, proposal of a local community college, and school Supt. Timothy Dyer.

In a position statement, SOC officers have said that recalls are destructive and will ultimately harm local educational and property values

and the education of children.

"A recall election is certainly not intended to be the vehicle by which we express our disagreement over one issue," the committee said.

WAYNE MAYOR Patrick Norton warned the group he hopes the district doesn't follow the political history in neighboring Taylor, which has had eight or nine recalls in the past 13 years.

Norton, stressing the importance of

opposing the recall to protect local educational and property values, said the Taylor schools "started to go" after the numerous recalls.

The second and third recalls in that district were organized by the custodians' and teachers' unions, respectively, he said.

"You don't recall someone for a mistake," Norton said.

## Weimer fund reaches \$1,000

The fund started last month in Mr. Weimer's memory for his endless dedication in helping students at the Centennial Educational Park.

Students who owned these items have not been located by the Weimer family. The items include a purple heart medal from England or France, old scrap books, old pictures, and books and maps from the 75th infantry division of World War II.

## Men nabbed in gas theft

Two Detroit men, treated for burns at a local hospital, were arrested for theft of gasoline from a plane at Mettetal Airport.

Canton police believe a fire erupted when the two used a cigarette lighter to see while siphoning gas early Saturday.

Arrested for a misdemeanor larceny charge were Jeffrey Finch of Ulster, and Fred Woody of Winston. Both are 18.

They were released on \$100 cash bond and ordered to appear in 35th District Court within 20 days, said Canton police Lt. Dennis Joker.

ACCORDING TO reports, the Canton Fire Department was notified of a fire on the grounds of Mettetal Airport on Lilley south of Joy shortly before 4

a.m. Saturday.

Firefighters found a charred boot, a plastic container and a plane with a slightly scorched wing, said Fire Chief Mel Paulun.

Small ground fires were quickly extinguished, said Paulun. Canton police notified local hospitals to look for someone who might come in for emergency treatment of burns.

A short time later, Finch and Woody came into St. Mary Hospital in Livonia, said Joker. They were treated for burns on their legs, then released to police.

Penalty for the larceny charge is 90 days in jail or \$500 fine, or both.

"They (board) realized they should do something soon," said Gorman. "They have to start planning for it."

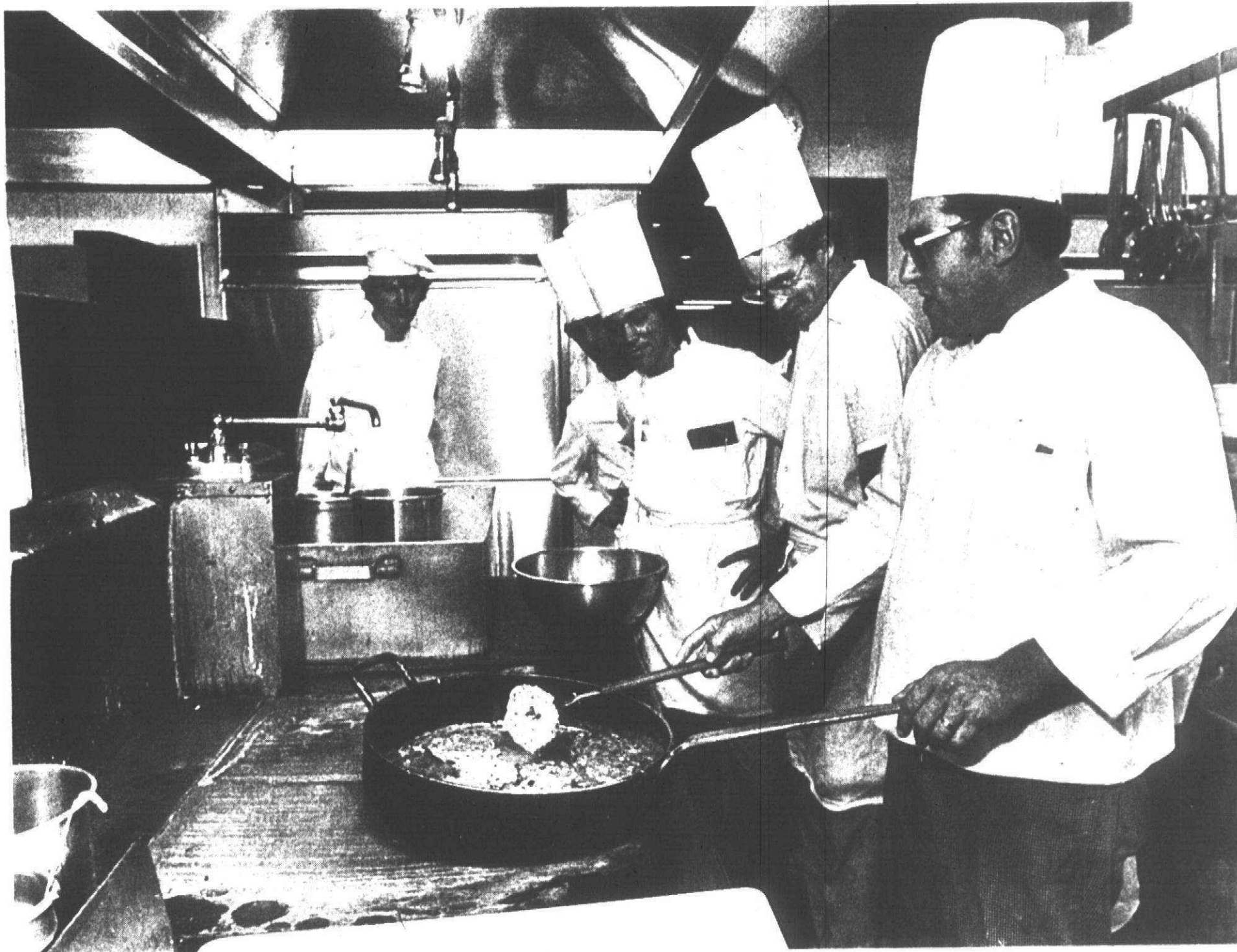

## College's new addition is a cook's delight

It's a cook's dream. Scores of 20-quart mixing bowls, five-gallon containers of ingredients and dozens of ovens are scattered between kitchens separated for pastry, meat slaughtering and quantity food production.

Every inch of the 7,500 square feet of culinary space is being used by the 120 full-time Schoolcraft College students studying to be professional chefs.

THE NEW \$1.3 million Culinary Arts Building, an addition to the original cafeteria in the Waterman Campus Center, brings the structure's size to 12,000 square feet, said Robert Breithaupt, the certified executive chef who directs one of Schoolcraft's most popular and famous programs.

"Prior to this year, we were only able to handle 30 new students a year. We had a 3½ year waiting list. Now we can handle 120 full-time students, 22 co-op students, 60 apprentices and 15 in continuing education," Breithaupt said.

In an era when expansion is rare, Schoolcraft's culinary addition is the first major construction on the campus in almost a decade. The culinary addition is at the north end of the campus at 18600 Haggerty, Livonia.

A visitor couldn't doubt for a moment the professionalism whipping through the kitchen. The atmosphere is alive with talk of fluffiness, quality and perfection.

The former cafeteria kitchen, where all classes were once taught, is now used only for quantity food preparation — its original purpose.

BY MID-MORNING about 15 stu-

dent chefs clad in white jackets and toques scurry around the 700-square-foot kitchen busily preparing lunch for the college community.

One hovers over a frying pan with 15 German pancakes while another prepares an egg-based dish. Chatter fills the air.

"This is all a hands-on experience. Everything is geared to simulate the industry," Breithaupt said proudly.

The curriculum includes courses on quantity production, advanced (a la carte) dining room procedures, French service, baking and pastry procedures and laboratory work.

"It's a two-year associate's degree program with two 16-week semesters a year," explained Breithaupt, a 35-year veteran chef and assistant dean of applied science. Each course is eight weeks long.

Future chefs get a taste of meat cutting in the kitchen's butcher shop. Whole steer, veal and lamb arrive for students to cut up, Breithaupt said.

"Our only requirement is that the animal must be dead and gutted," he added.

JOB OFFERS abound, the chef said, from restaurants around the state, as well as several from neighboring states.

If culinary arts students decide to further their education, they have the option to transfer their full credits to Grand Valley State College or portions of them to Michigan State University, Cornell or University of Nevada for degrees in hotel, restaurant and institutional management.

"Most of them will go into industry as line cooks, saute or broiler cooks or assistants to chefs. Some may even go to Europe," Breithaupt explained.

Breithaupt is quick to point out that while neighboring community colleges like Henry Ford and Oakland Community College have culinary arts programs, theirs are more management oriented. Schoolcraft's is entirely career oriented.

It's no longer a man's world in the kitchen either. "We're running about 50-50 men and women," he said.

Consumption of their delectable delights isn't confined to students. The general public may stop by the Waterman Center between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. for lunch and sample a diverse menu at reasonable prices.

## Canton cop shop

**BIG SMASH:**Someone threw a brick through the car window of a Mannington resident, as he drove with his wife on Joy between Lilley Road and Main Street Aug. 27.

very good to employees in encouraging them to buy stock. The companies have programs which encourage the employees to buy."

**BOTH VERNIER** and Tybinka said they believe the rally will continue, although there will be ups and downs.

"We think the rally will continue. It will have its dips — the market breathes in and out," said Vernier.

"Currently, it's been a blue chip market. It's like an army — the generals, like General Motors and IBM, have been moving forward, and a lot of the soldiers haven't done anything yet."

The "soldiers" would include such local interests as Prab Robots, Patrick Petroleum and National Bank of Detroit, said Vernier.

"If the market follows a normal pattern, there will be a spillover from the leaders — from the generals to the soldiers. It's already happening."

While the rally's outlook is promising, Tybinka underscores it won't be a straight uphill situation.

"Nothing goes straight up. There will be corrections. It's the old two steps forward and one step back idea. There is a digesting of the activity," he said.

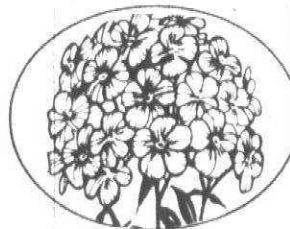
The trend of the current rally supports Tybinka's projection. Activities during the week of Aug. 23 are a prime example.

On that Monday, the Dow Jones Industrial Average gained 22 points, but Tuesday it dropped 16 points. It gained 17 points on Wednesday and Thursday, but finished out with a nine-point drop on Friday. The Dow average gained 14 points for the week.

The stock market has experienced similar sudden movements in the past.

On Nov. 1, 1978, there was a one-day gain of 35 points after then President Carter took measures to stabilize the value of the U.S. dollar.

A one-week drop in the market occurred in October 1979 when the Federal Reserve Board announced a "tight money" policy. The market dropped 59 points that week.

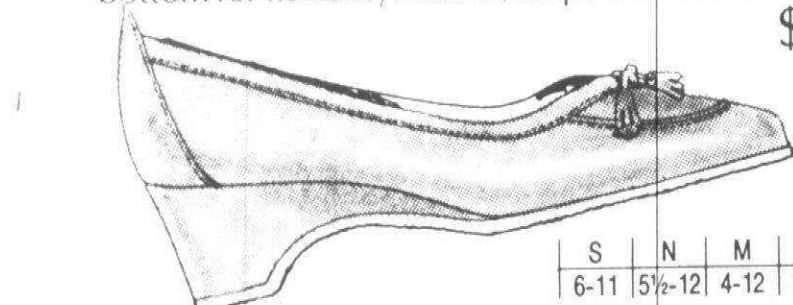

### Former radio director agrees

To the editor:

I must admit, I am surprised.

I never really thought anyone in the community thought enough of the high school radio station, WSDP, to criticize it like Observer columnist Dennis O'Connor did in his Sept. 2 column.

I also am surprised that someone out there in the professional world of journalism saw the station the same way as I have for the past few months.

O'Connor is right in criticizing WSDP for its seeming inability to serve the Plymouth-Canton community the way I, and many other people, know it can. I was the news director last year and now have graduated to become a professional news reporter at the highly-respected public radio station at Eastern Michigan University, WEMU. I'd like to offer an insider's standpoint about the things that go on at WSDP.

For the past 10 years, WSDP has been striving to serve this community. Station Coordinator Jeffery Cardinal has been there the entire time, and, as O'Connor says, brought respectability and stability to the station. He has been a good community public relations man, and he paid his dues at the station.

Unfortunately, his general aloofness

and inability to relate to and trust most of the student workers made him an unpopular coordinator. The resultant conflicts created an atmosphere of disillusionment among many of the staff members. Why try and change something if you think nobody cares or will just shoot you down?

WSDP is not a professional station, but if an atmosphere of professionalism and positiveness was introduced, WSDP can learn how to serve the community as best as it can. For as long as anyone there remembers, there has been a United Press International (UPI) teletype machine at the station. And, for as long as anyone remembers, the only way there has been to put together a newscast is to rip the news copy from the machine and read it on the air.

Appointed news director in the middle of last school year, I was determined to institute some changes to accommodate our area listeners and better cover local events and happenings. I soon learned that most staff members either did not care enough or did not have the time to voluntarily rewrite stories from the local papers or follow up those stories or develop new stories.

Only now is the news department being turned around, under the competent guidance of Plymouth Canton High School senior Tom Ford. Public meetings now will be covered, local stories will be followed up and local newsmakers will be interviewed. There now is

an incentive for the staff member wishing to keep their on-air music show: If reporters do not do their job, they will lose their on-air shift, which is high priority among staff members.

Never in recent memory has the station coordinator indicated how news should be covered — or broadcast. The hour-long afternoon edition has been a WSDP regular for years. Students there hardly know or think of putting together something more compact.

The station's format is much more difficult to discuss. Jeff Cardinal always has determined what the format will be, and his reasons for the present multi-music format are that different types of music will attract all different types of people.

That may seem logical, but as O'Connor points out, it doesn't work.

First, as O'Connor says, multi-music formats are just not appealing. Nobody seems to know when to tune in for their favorite type of music. Many of the jazz deejays do not know the first thing about the music they play. I know, I was one of them. A result of this is that jazz is not very popular among our listeners.

The plain fact is that while other jazz stations (like WEMU) get many requests, a jazz deejay at WSDP is lucky to get five requests in a year.

A problem with the single-music format is that easy listening is popular among listeners, but one has to keep in mind that WSDP also is a station where

high school students may work in an atmosphere that is conducive to their needs as well. On-air deejays like to play the music they know and like, and for many staff members, that means more than just easy listening.

There always are students who want to play good old rock and roll, and I believe there would be mutiny, or at least mass resignations, if that was taken away.

While underwriting for public radio stations only has been recently introduced, WSDP has never taken advantage of it. According to former Program Director Glenn Bar, WSDP's Advisory Committee suggested Jeff Cardinal look into underwriting as a feasible, logical source of money in these times of financial crises. WSDP does not have one program on the air now that is at all underwritten in any part.

Summing up, O'Connor now is suggesting changes at the high school station that student staff have been advocating for a long time. The station has been striving to serve the Plymouth-Canton community for 10 years, but never has seemed consistently pointed in the right direction.

Maybe an open-minded, local radio veteran who is a good motivator of high school students is what WSDP needs.

## Realtors look at housing

# Interest rates to drop with federal deficit

This is the third of a three-part series of interviews with area real estate brokers. Mel Durbin of the Durbin Co., Bob Gavey of the Chamberlain Companies, Steve Pew of Max Brook Inc. and Dick Weir of Weir, Manuel, Snyder and Rank were interviewed by Observer & Eccentric editors Ron Garbinski, Kathy Moran and Dennis O'Connor.

**DO YOU** anticipate a turn around in home buying with a lower interest rate soon? Do you anticipate a lower federal deficit?

**DURBIN:** You have to be careful on that because the lower interest rate without the money is no good.

**WEIR:** The lower interest rate isn't going to happen unless the deficit comes down. The government has to get its "act together" and get themselves operating inside their income before anything else can happen. You say, "When is that going to happen?" Who knows?

**PEW:** When Wall Street and (Federal Reserve Chairman Paul) Volcker combined feel that Congress is finally starting to get their "store in order," then I think Volcker will finally say "OK, I'll start easing this thing." That puts him up on some throne as some omnipotent god. He is not the total answer, obviously. It is a combination of Wall Street, bond interest rates, all these kind of things.

**GAVEY:** When consumer confidence comes back and people feel more confident about their jobs and confident about selling that smaller house to buy a larger house, you will see more of an increase in the market.

**PEW:** I agree with most prognosticators who say that Michigan is going to be slower to come back than most other states. I think the country is going to turn around, but I don't think it will happen in a hurry.

**Does that go back to your one-industry town concept?**

**WEIR:** We still are a one-horse town. We're dependent on the auto industry. It's not only here. I was down in Arizona. The largest copper manufacturer in the nation, miner and smelter, was shutting down all of their mines and all of their smelters. This was big negative economic news for Arizona. That's their leading industry after tourism. The reason they were shutting it down was because the demands for housing and automobiles were so small that they couldn't sell copper for the cost of mining it.

The lack of sales of automobiles from this state has finally gotten to Arizona hitting them in their copper industry. This has happened in housing. It has hit the lumber industry in the northwest. Tires are down. Steel is down. Glass is down. The reason being is that one out of six or seven gainfully employed people in the nation owe their jobs to the automobile industry either directly or indirectly.

When this industry goes down, just like C. E. Wilson said, "What's good for the nation is good for General Motors." It's reported that what he said was, "What's good for General Motors is good for the nation." It was a deliberate twist and it gave him a very bad "black eye" that he did not deserve. But what is good for the nation is good for General Motors, or the automobile industry.

**PEW:** We are sitting here, right today, looking at the cuts for higher education. (Recently) I was in the University of Michigan Graduate School of Business Administration to talk about U-M pulling out of the real estate education program. That's just "small potatoes" compared to the whole graduate school of business administration. I think we forget what a terrific and tremendous resource that University of Michigan is.

When you start talking about budget cuts in the state of Michigan, and \$85 million has to be cut out of the budget, is that going to make Michigan just another university instead of one of the top four or five in the whole country it always has been? These interest rates have a very big effect on all of us.

**WEIR:** Everything we are saying about the nation, we can repeat about the state. The state is broke and that's all there is to it. It hasn't got the money.

We're talking about automotive people being laid off and companies closing down, what's going to happen to real estate firms? What's going to happen to smaller brokers?

**PEW:** You are looking at four smaller brokers. We are small businessmen.

Small businessmen due to the fact that you have offices here and offices there, offices all around. What's going to happen to that one office broker or that one office that

may have three or four salesmen working for them? Are they going to go out of business?

**WEIR:** Not necessarily. It depends on how good they are. If he's got four real good salesmen, he will sell enough real estate to pay the bills and stay in business. If he has four poor salesmen who don't sell, he will go out of business. Big or small has not much to do with it.

**GAVEY:** We are just going to learn to run our businesses more efficiently. We're already doing it like any other entrepreneur. Our country is going to get more productive. We always have. We are going to do it again. Our industry will. The automobile industry will; it is in the process. The Japanese imports have hurt us.

The net result is that we are going to have better cars. We are going to have increased productivity which has been a problem in this country during inflationary times, when everyone wanted more, but expected to give less. That is going to change. The companies that don't change won't survive.

**Is there a psychological barrier to the public accepting creative financing terms?**

**DURBIN:** Another problem we are running into is that the public, either through lack of education or whatever, has not accepted any of the new alternatives such as variable rate mortgages, equity sharing mortgages where the lender shares the profits. So we're back to our basic instruments that we have been using for three years.

**WEIR:** Uncertainty. They are tied to treasury bills or abstract figures. They are decided by an interest rate or some index or another that can go up or down. If you have one and you buy a house that has a 70 percent mortgage and it goes down, your mortgage rates go down. If you buy a house and have a 14 percent rate, and the rates for that index goes up, your mortgage rates go up. It's the uncertainty the public doesn't like. The public can't print its own money to cover it.

**GAVEY:** You have 40 or 50 years of people who have had a fixed rate 25 to 30 year mortgages. They knew what the interest rate was going to be, what the monthly payment would be and that was it for as long as they had that mortgage.

**WEIR:** I see a retreat in this area. Years ago, the maximum mortgage that you could receive around here was from an outfit called Birmingham Federal Savings & Loan and it was for 60 percent of the appraised value for 20 years. That was it. That was most money you could borrow on that house. The homeowners had a healthy investment in their house. There was a shorter term on the loan and a higher percentage of each monthly payment went to principle rather than just interest. It meant they acquired a large equity in the property on top of their downpayment. It was a healthy thing. Requirements of the marketplace over the years changed that 60 percent mortgage up to as high as 95 percent and the term from 20 to 30 years.

One way in which they could make more money available, which would be a benefit around here, would be to get them to loan at a fixed rate for 20 years with a 60 percent mortgage. We could do business with that. I'm not suggesting this would be a help nationwide, but it might help Birmingham, Michigan. That's maybe one way they might be able to do something that's a little bit less inflationary.

**DURBIN:** The average home is only held only eight years. If you have a 20 year mortgage, and it is paid off, you have had 2½ buyers. In reality, what happens is every eight years, either someone assumes it or it is paid off. The length is not the key factor. The amortization and the constant monthly payment is.

**Are we going to see more shared equity and more pension investment in mortgages? Are we going to see more of those concepts?**

**PEW:** Yes, the federal government is starting to loosen up some of that pension money toward mortgages. That's an uncapped source at this time in terms of residential mortgages. They have been lending in large commercial ventures.

**WEIR:** There will be some trades. But it will not be a large part of it. It is something a seller will do if he has no alternative.

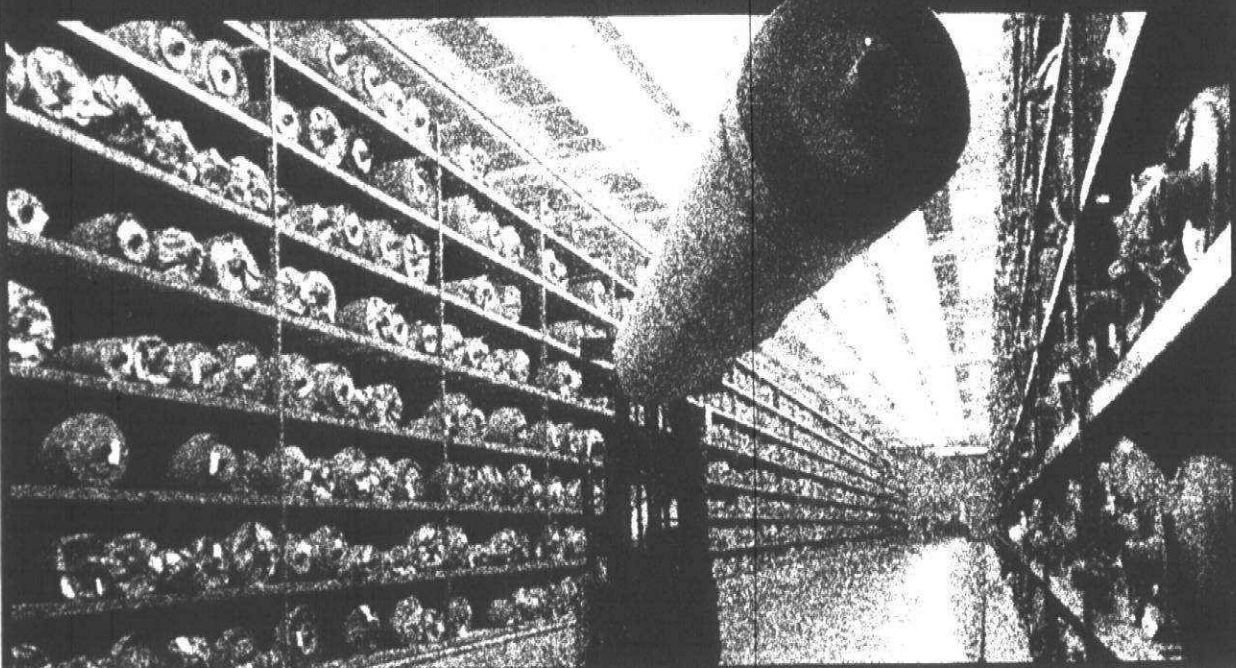
**What you are saying is all these different methods of creative financing are really short-term reactions to the marketplace?**

# Road board looks to feds for funds

Several freeway projects in Wayne County will get some of the \$2 million the federal government is sending to Michigan, according to Gov. Milliken.

U.S. Transportation Secretary Drew Lewis is sending \$2 million to Michigan which was turned back from other states, Milliken said.

The Michigan Department of Transportation immediately announced it would advertise for bids for:

- Screening of the Livernois bridge over I-75 freeway in Detroit.
- Under-bridge lighting at several

I-94 structures in Detroit.

- Pavement repair on I-74 in Oakland County.
- And shoulder reconstruction on I-94 in St. Clair County.

THE ANNOUNCEMENT came days after spokesmen for the Wayne County Road Commission said they were awaiting federal funds for resurfacing work.

Freddie Burton, managing director of the semi-autonomous agency, told the county Board of Commissioners

public works committee that he is awaiting money to do some major resurfacing work.

"The federal highway department (U.S. Department of Transportation) should be sending the money soon," Burton said. "We have from now until the end of the year to get the desperately needed repair work done," he said.

Asked for details on which projects might be considered, Louis Sugo, road commission information officer, gave a different story. Sugo said receiving ad-

ditional funds is "highly unlikely."

"We never have enough federal funds to do all the projects, and with the attitude in Washington it's doubtful we'll get any more," he said.

Of the road commission's \$100 million annual budget, about 30 percent comes from gasoline and weight taxes, and the remainder from other sources, Sugo said. He declined to be more specific except to say that a "healthy portion" was from the federal government.

COMMISSIONER Richard Manning, D-Redford, questioned Burton about debris scattered along area freeways.

"I get general complaints about the litter on the freeways. I think we should address the problem more stringently," Manning said.

Burton replied that participants in a summer youth program do cleanup work.

He added that the road commission gets \$15.7 million for upkeep of state highways and hasn't had an increase in several years.

"We grossly overspent our budget on last winter's snow maintenance," he said.

"As far as mowing the grass on the expressway rights-of-way, we sprayed a chemical on the grass to retard its growth so we've only needed to do two cuttings," he added.

The Intergovernmental Relations Commissions of the Women's Conference of Concerns and the National Education Fund will co-sponsor the seminar to encourage women to participate in 1982 campaigns for candidates of their choice.

The seminar, at 18100 Meyers, will run from 8:45 a.m. to 5 p.m. Price is \$35 for one day, \$70 for two days. Preregistration by Sept. 9 is required by calling Bernadine Denning at 494-1730.

"Anyone who goes to this seminar will walk away knowing how to get into a campaign, get

credit and get results from their work," said Ann Beser, a training program veteran.

The seminar will cover how to get a working role in a political campaign, campaign fund-raising, communications and direct mail, telephone and voter contact activities.

Even though the seminar is designed to increase the numbers and influence of women in public life, this program is open to men who are committed to increasing the peer-support networks for women in public life.

Local commentators will be on hand to discuss campaign traditions and practices in Michigan.

# MEA surprised at school strikes

Teachers from more than 200 Michigan school districts were without contracts when school starts today.

"We're going to start this year with about 250 districts unsettled, and we usually begin school with 200 districts unsettled," said Keith Geiger, Michigan Education Association president.

"We were surprised at the number of strikes before Labor Day. I guess we underestimated the school boards' desire to write bad contract language," he said.

MICHIGAN HAS 529 Michigan school districts. But by pure coincidence, more contracts expired this year than last year, Geiger said.

"There's no excuse for any district not to be settled by Labor Day," Geiger added.

"They can have marathon bargaining sessions all weekend to reach agreements," he added.

Teachers in Southfield and Troy struck Tuesday.

West Bloomfield teachers were out Thursday and Friday but reached agreement over the weekend. Only one class day was lost. It was the first settlement in Oakland County.

Geiger said teachers aren't interest-

ed in strikes, but in several districts the school boards are forcing them onto picket lines.

"If there was ever a time when school employees aren't interested in strikes — it's now," he said. "But some boards just don't want to settle. They're pleading poverty or trying to take away things that aren't necessary."

GEIGER POINTED to school boards' tactics of using the state's poor economic times to "gut non-economic issues." He said that in out-of-formula districts (those which receive no state aid), school boards are asking for what the union calls unreasonable concessions.

## Fire 'em — Headlee

Pointing out that public employee strikes are illegal, Richard Headlee, Republican candidate for governor, said striking school teachers should either return to the classrooms or be replaced.

Headlee said, "No contract, no work may be OK in the competitive private sector, but in the public sector where civil servants have a public trust, our children must come first."

Headlee called the strikes a bad example for teachers to set for young people.

"Public employee strikes are illegal and a particularly bad example for teachers to set for young people," Headlee said. "Public service is an honor and a duty. Public employees know the rules when they are hired. Public employees who withhold services should either return to work or be replaced. Anarchy is not acceptable."

"One issue is academic freedom. Now the boards have the right to decide which textbooks should be used, but not how to teach, and that's what they're after," he said.

Furthermore, Geiger said many school boards are hoping to change the seniority-based transfer and layoff system and transfer or layoff people as building principals see fit.

NON-ECONOMIC issues appear to be more important this year than economics, Geiger said.

For example, the West Bloomfield settlement provides for "job sharing," in which two teachers voluntarily can share a full-time job.

"Teachers are only looking for a 6-8 percent salary increase," he added.

Some teachers in in-formula districts are asking for one-year contracts, or for multi-year contracts that can be reopened after one year for salary adjustments, Geiger said.

Each district negotiates separately. A few years ago, there was a movement for regional bargaining, but that's illegal in Michigan, he said.

"The only way it's legal is if boards of education agree to bargain at the same table. But I think boards resist that idea because they're afraid of numbers," he said, adding, "we'd be better off bargaining together because we'd see a settlement much quicker."

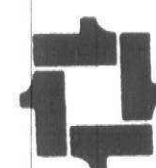

# Fish more active as weather cools

Fishing is improving as the weather cools, and the best catches of the year will be after Labor Day.

In the shallow waters of Lake St. Clair's Anchor Bay, Goose Bay and Muscarnoot Bay in Macomb and St. Clair counties, fisherman are catching good numbers of perch in the 8-12-inch range. Try fishing in three to four feet of water for best results.

Chinook salmon are showing up in the St. Clair River. Fisherman out drifting for walleye are finding chinook salmon taking bait.

In Oakland County, fair to good catches of bluegill are being taken on Lake Louise and Big Lake.

Kent Lake is giving up some fair

catches of crappies. I tried Kent myself over the Labor Day weekend and found my usual spots dry. Finally, in a windswept spot on a dropoff near the I-96 freeway, I hit the jackpot with a near-limit catch of nice perch at midday. It proves that if one technique fails to work, try another.

Largemouth bass are being caught on Lakeville, Maceday, Lotus, Loon Lakes and Lake Orion. The bass are running from one to two pounds of good eating.

YOUNGSTERS who want to get into nature during the upcoming weekends should stop by the nature center of Oakwoods Metropark near Flat Rock.

A junior naturalist discovery program for boys and girls ages 9-13 will be held on Saturday, Sept. 18 from 10

a.m. to 2 p.m. Naturalist Glenn Dent will lead the young naturalists as they explore the forest, lakes and streams around the nature center.

Participants should bring a lunch and drink to each session. The program is free, but register in advance by calling the nature center at 697-9181.

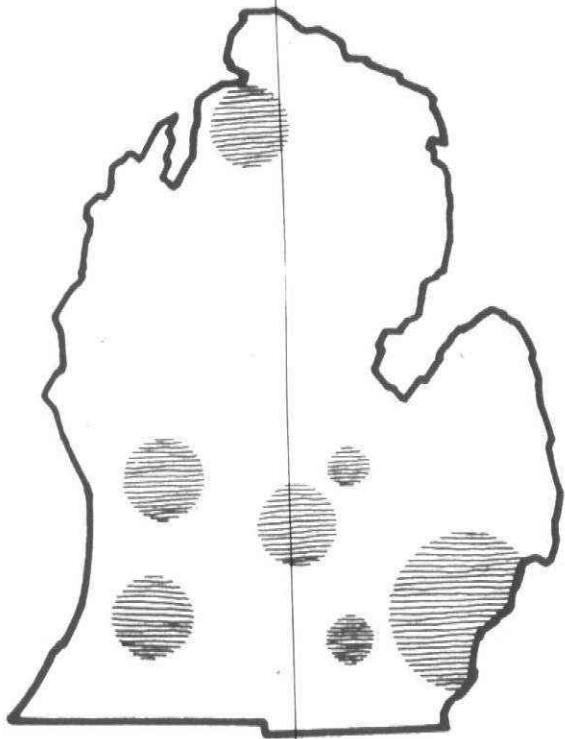

Congress says 'si' to Cuban radio, nuclear freeze

Here's how area members of Congress were recorded on major roll call votes recently.

HOUSE

RADIO TO CUBA — The House passed, 250 for and 134 against, and sent to the Senate a bill to set up a government radio station to broadcast anti-Castro programming to Cuba. Radio Marti, named after Cuban patriot Jost Marti, would broadcast on AM or FM frequencies from a site in the Florida Keys. It would cost \$7.5 million in fiscal 1983, and it would be run by the same agency that oversees Radio Free Europe and Radio Liberty.

Supporter Toby Roth, R-Wis., said Cuban leader Fidel Castro "will have to recognize that we are going to be calling him to account for his actions. . . . All dictators fear uncensored information that is received by their people."

Opponent Ted Weiss, D-N.Y., said "the Cubans will recognize Radio Marti propaganda for what it will be, carefully packaged half-truths," and that

the station will damage U.S. standing in the Caribbean and Central America.

Members voting "yea" wanted to establish Radio Marti.

Rep. William Broomfield, R-Birmingham, voted "yea."

Reps. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth; David Bonior, D-Mount Clemens; William Ford, D-Taylor; William Brodhead, D-Detroit; and James Blanchard, D-Pleasant Ridge, did not vote.

STATES' RIGHTS — By a vote of 250 for and 154 against, the House adopted an amendment preserving the right of states to exceed federal standards in certain areas of pesticide control. Thus states can continue to request whatever health and safety data they desire from pesticide manufacturers, without fear of being limited by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. They also can take as long as they wish to register a pesticide for use within their boundaries.

The vote occurred during a debate on a bill extending the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act for two years. The bill was passed and sent to the Senate. Pesticide manufacturers, agribusiness interests and the administration were among those wanting to limit states' rights to regulate pesticides.

Rep. James Scheuer, D-N.Y., a supporter of the amendment, said the measure "would eliminate this erosion of states' rights and . . . permit a state to protect the health and environment of its citizens."

Opponent William Wampler, R-Va., said pesticide manufacturers need uniform nationwide laws

to effectively market their products, and he said the lessening of states' rights only would have prevented "arbitrary or capricious" regulation by individual states.

Members voting "nay" wanted to make states subservient to the federal government in certain areas of pesticide regulation.

Pursell, Bonior, Ford and Brodhead voted "yea."

Broomfield voted "nay."

Blanchard did not vote.

NUCLEAR FREEZE — By a vote of 204 for and 202 against, the House adopted a "nuclear freeze" proposal that was backed by the administration. It calls for freezing U.S. and Soviet arsenals after the two nations have negotiated mutual arms reductions. The measure is non-binding but has high symbolic importance. Buy adopting the pro-administration language, the House rebuffed liberal-sponsored efforts directing the U.S. and the Soviets to freeze their arsenals at current levels.

Supporter John Rousellot, R-Calif., said a freeze at current levels "would only legitimize Soviet superiority in numerous areas of nuclear and conventional force capabilities" and would undercut ongoing arms limitations talks with the Soviet Union.

Opponent Thomas O'Neill, D-Mass., said "freezing the strategic nuclear forces would not put the U.S. in an inferior position to the Soviet Union. . . . I think it is simple logic. We do not reduce arms by

accelerating the arms race. We first have to stop the race and then reduce arms."

Members voting "yea" favored the administration's more lenient approach to the nuclear freeze issue.

Broomfield voted "yea."

Pursell, Bonior, Ford, Brodhead and Blanchard voted "nay."

SENATE

SENATE GYM — By a vote of 50 for and 48 against, the Senate voted in favor of completing the gymnasium under construction as part of the new Hart Senate Office Building. As a result of the vote, an amendment to delete \$736,400 for the gym was ruled out of order. The vote occurred during debate on a 1982 appropriations bill that was later passed and sent to the Senate.

Eight Mile repair set

The Michigan Department of Transportation has awarded

Stolaruk Corp. of Southfield the contract for removal and texturing of existing surface on Eight Mile Road at the Grand Trunk Western Railroad. The bid of \$548,482, also covers repairing and resurfacing concrete joints of one mile on Eight Mile from Southfield to Telegraph roads. Work is to be done by June 1983.

# Education winks at its worst enemy

**I**N ALL THE politics I've covered, I never have heard a member of the education lobby cuss the social services lobby. And I've covered a lot of politics.

The education lobby is teachers, teachers unions, school administrators and school boards. They need money to operate. Although they tend to weep copiously, for the most part I agree with their positions and respect educators.

The social services lobby is concerned with the 1,001 programs that used to be called "welfare." Today's programs are so extensive that "social services," despite its ring of jargon, is perhaps the better term to describe them.

**WHAT HAS** happened over the last two decades is that social services have become a larger and larger portion of Michigan's state budget.

In the early '60s, I can recall seeing pie charts where education, both K-12 and colleges, got a bit more than half the pie, and social services were in for about 11 percent.

Each year — in prosperity or recession — social

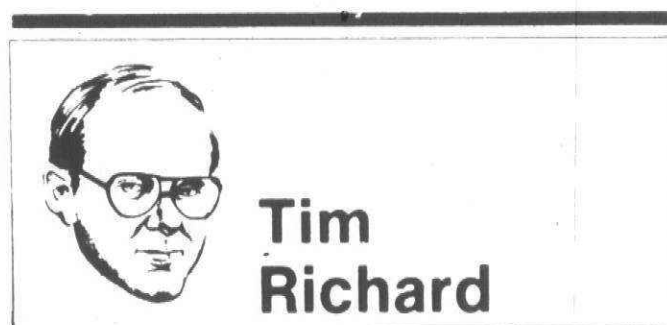
services' slice of the pie grew, and education's shrunk. The figures have been disrupted a good deal with this year's budget cuts, but the last batch of figures showed that education had slipped below the 30-percent mark and social services had risen above 30 percent.

One can't dismiss that as the result of the current depression. The change has been steady for 20 years.

**WHAT BRINGS** this topic to a head is Gov. William G. Milliken's current executive order cutting state spending by \$150 million — the fourth cut of the fiscal year.

In round terms, the governor proposed taking about half the amount from K-12 education, a quarter from higher education and a quarter from revenue sharing with other local units of government.

To quote from a legislator's memo to city and school officials in his district: "(Budget Director Gerald) Miller said July auto sales were 'a disaster' and Michigan's economy is 'extremely weak.' He

also said the Department of Social Services is having 'continual problems,' probably indicating need for a higher supplemental appropriation in September."

A House committee, to be sure, rejected the governor's proposed cuts. Our beloved local lawmakers will bargain for some modifications. But the truth is they will save the schools little, because there is little except school money left in the current budget for the fiscal year ending Sept. 30. Education will continue getting it in the neck.

**A LOT OF** people in public life have offered pro-

posals to reduce social services costs.

A minor party candidate says we should rely on private charity.

A Berrien County commissioner and legislator pushed a ballot proposal to reduce Michigan's welfare rates to those of surrounding states.

Others advocate that general assistance (helping mainly able-bodied men) be eliminated in Michigan because other states don't pay it at all.

Brooks Patterson has a program for prosecuting welfare fraud.

The point is that the education lobby never talks about social services. It's as if there were an unwritten law that educators are never to point the finger of blame at social services. It seems to be OK to blame mossback legislators, unenlightened voters, regressive tax structures, President Ronald Reagan and the military for cutting education money — but never social services.

The mood in the Legislature is that education has been cut too much and needs help. Unfortunately, the education lobby is reticent about going after its own worst enemy.

## Scouts devise programs to meet changing needs

**M**ORE SINGLE-PARENT families. More families with two wage-earners. Other non-traditional family units.

Social changes have been tough on kids. They also have been tough on organizations that help kids, such as the Boy Scouts of America.

Scouting has been organized around the traditional family. Cub Scouts (ages 8-10) are still watched over by Den Mothers. Boy Scouts are led by men, cutting the apron strings with overnight camping trips.

So in 1979 the Boy Scouts of America ran a national survey of scouts, non-scouts, parents of both, professionals, volunteers, and members of chartering groups (PTAs, churches, service clubs).

**THE RESULT**, said Walter J. McCarthy Jr., president of the Detroit Area Council of the Scouts, is a new package of programs to help kids in those non-traditional families.

McCarthy, the Birmingham resident who is chairman of Detroit Edison Co., reported that this month the new package is being unveiled. The new developments:

- Tiger Cubs, a fun program for 7-year-olds. An adult "tiger" and a "tiger cub" participate as a team. The tiger may be a mother, father, aunt, uncle, grandparent, older sibling or even a neighbor. Tiger Cub groups will be organized by existing Cub packs but function independently. There is no uniform; an emblem may be ironed on a shirt or blouse.

- "Prepared for Today," an activity book to teach children ages 6-11 skills to cope with being left alone at home and in the neighborhood. An adult and child go through the book together. The child learns how to handle emergencies, fix a simple meal, care for younger children and deal with a

stranger at the door or on the street. The book will be available to Cub packs, Scout troops, churches, schools, social agencies, housing organizations and neighborhood groups.

- An improved second-year Cub program. The fourth-graders are offered such contemporary activities as computers, communications, law enforcement and cooking.

- More marketing of the Explorer program. Said McCarthy, "Exploring is an exciting program for young adults. It is co-ed. It stresses career interest activities. And it offers tremendous flexibility to participants and advisers alike."

"But Exploring is often referred to as Scouting's best-kept secret." In the region, there are only 4,500 explorers.

**THE IDEA** for a marketing survey came from Robert Gaynor, vice president for personnel of AT&T Long Lines and a veteran volunteer in scouting.

Some 19,000 questionnaires were sent out and 10,000 returned, an excellent response, say pollsters. It meant people are still highly interested in the scouting movement. The survey showed:

Adults and youngsters alike still hold to scouting's ideals of patriotism, reverence for God, leadership training and emotional development.

Boys and adults want more family activities, more outdoor activities and more camping opportunities.

An obstacle to membership in the Boy Scouts is competition for time.

Scouting professionals were pleased to learn the movement has a good overall image, even among non-participants.

It deserves a good image.

able. Children under 12 were admitted free. I was part of the record-setting 67,000 persons who attended on Sunday.

It had everything that is expected of a state fair — rides, live entertainment, cotton candy and special exhibits. The fair attracted its share of politicians, religious zealots and dubious salesmen.

On Labor Day (Monday), Kensington Metropark near Milford had a five-mile bike hike. Naturalist Mark Szabo took groups out at 9:30 a.m. and 1 p.m. for a two-hour trip. Again the price was right — for \$2, a carload of people could enter the park. That's the only charge I paid during the day.

Bikers made frequent stops as Szabo pointed out various plants and animals that could be seen on the route. Scenic Kensington provided an excellent background for an enjoyable romp with nature. This is part of a 30-year-old nature program at Huron-Clinton Metroparks.

**IT WAS AFTER** an interesting weekend that I collapsed in front of the television late Monday afternoon. There it was again, for the 17th consecutive Labor Day — the Jerry Lewis Muscular Dystrophy Telethon. It was just ending, and the telethon was in trouble. The telethon ended up with the smallest collection in five years, \$3 million under last year.

But Detroit-area collections were different. Detroit people, battling a depression that caused a 16-percent unemployment rate, pledged \$2,145,011. The generous people in this area contributed only \$90,484 less than last year. Detroit ranks second only to New York in money pledged this year. New York is about eight times the size of Detroit.

It's all enough to make one think at the end of a long holiday weekend. Living in "concrete city" is not so bad after all.

## Fun weekend spent in a 'concrete city'

**I**LIVE IN AN urbanized suburban city. At times, it can be depressing.

The derisive term "concrete city" seems too true. Only on rare occasions can the stars be seen at night. Houses are too close together. Most yards are small.

Friends in outstate Michigan and other states do not envy me for living in the metropolitan Detroit area. Unfortunately, "murder capital" and the riots of 1967 still plague the reputation. The current downturn in the automobile industry hasn't helped.

Anyone reading this knows it's not easy to live in the Detroit area in 1982. We don't need more reminders of our woes.

**BUT THERE** is another side to living in this area that's not readily apparent. It requires a little probing and even exploring. Take, for example, the past Labor Day weekend.

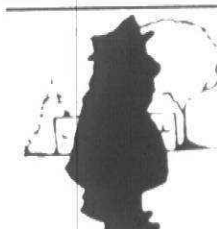

## Memories of U-M's Fritz Crisler

**O**NE BY ONE, the Old Guard is silently leaving the sports trail, and with each passing, The Stroller is left with a flood of fond memories.

On the first day of his recent vacation, he heard that his friend H.O. "Fritz" Crisler, former athletic director at the University of Michigan, had lost his long battle with cancer. The Stroller's thoughts turned from the beauty of the St. Clair River to a hot afternoon more than a decade ago in Michigan Stadium.

At the time, Fritz was enjoying his retirement, and we both sat there in the sun watching the famed stadium floor being covered with artificial turf.

We were alone in the vast 100,000-seat bowl when The Stroller asked Fritz what he thought of the move to eliminate sports from the high school programs around the state.

He stared out in the open for a moment, then replied:

"**IT WOULD** be a regrettable move as sports provide the last bastion for discipline.

"If we lost the boy or girl at that age, chances are they will be lost forever. And that would be a sad result."

This was a new twist to the problem, and The Stroller asked for a bit of explanation. Fritz was quick to reply:

"When a young fellow goes out for athletics at the high school level, his one ambition is to 'make the team.' He reports with an earnest desire to play and be a vital part of the success of the team.

He'll listen to the coach's program for behavior. If he has any tendency toward bad habits, he will give them up — just to be a member of the school team.

"He will keep up in his studies. He won't carouse around after dark. He will pay attention to his appearance, and he'll pay attention to anything the coach says."

For an instant Fritz looked down at the workmen placing the carpet on the field and continued:

"Without that discipline, there is no telling which path the young boy — or girl — will travel, for there is no level of discipline . . . So sports never should be taken away from a high school program."

**OTHER FOLKS** will recall Crisler as the coach who changed the entire game of football.

It was Fritz Crisler who originated the multiple-substitute rule. This made possible the two-platoon system we have today of an offensive and a defensive team.

It was Crisler who brought about the two-point conversion after a touchdown. And all along, he developed the single-wing back formation with the spinning fullback. In fact, he helped make football the popular game it is today.

Crisler was opposed to the modern system of recruiting. In fact, he retired from coaching for that very reason. He was a great believer that the boy or girl should select the school he or she wanted to attend instead of schools' bidding for their services in the athletic program.

And he was certain the game would be just as good today without the race to lure young athletes to win a championship.

**THE STROLLER** can't tell of his fond memories of Crisler without retelling Fritz's famous story after the Rose Bowl game in 1948, when Michigan won 49-0, equaling the score by a Fielding Yost-coached Wolverine team in the first Rose Bowl contest.

As the story goes, one spectator who had imbibed too freely during the game, walked up to Fritz as he was leaving the field and said:

"You haven't improved a g--- d--- bit."  
So long, Fritz, you never will be forgotten.

## Shooting color change

Summer is all but gone, and fall's color spectacle is about to begin. Foliage in fall becomes a painter's palette and you with your camera are the artist.

Fall colors offer one of the most exciting opportunities for capturing dramatic pictures on film. And you don't have to venture far from home either.

Fall colors will be found everywhere as they creep gently southward from the upper peninsula. Close to Detroit are miles of lovely roads and trails that display rainbows of vibrant colors.

Here are some tips on how you can get better fall color photos:

**SLIDE FILM** will produce the most vivid, brilliant colors. Use either Kodachrome or Ektachrome, and then set the ASA higher than indicated in order to increase color saturation.

For example, when using Kodachrome 64 or Ektachrome 64, set the ASA at 80 or 100. With Kodachrome 25, use a setting of 32 or 40. You may have to experiment a little to determine what's right for your camera, but you'll be pleasantly surprised at the results of the slight under exposure.

Use a polarizing filter, too, to darken the blue sky and enhance colors even further.

**FOR YOU** black and white lovers, don't think the fall color change won't give you pleasing results. Under an overcast sky, the contrasts and tones of fall colors will produce very exciting black and white photographs, usually with a full tonal range, just like the one on this page.

Time of day to shoot? Morning or afternoon. These times will generate maximum shadows and textures and make your shots look more "alive".

Use whatever lens happens to suit you, keeping in

mind that a wide angle lens will give you a greater expanse in your photo whereas a telephoto will "move you in close" to isolate a particular tree or other subject.

With your macro lens or close-up filters, don't overlook that splash of color in a fallen cluster of leaves.

## State receives 8 Mile Road, airport bids

Several bids on local road projects for construction and maintenance have been received in Lansing by the Michigan Department of Transportation.

At \$548,482, Stolaruk Corp. of Southfield was apparent low bidder for removal and texturizing of existing surface on Eight Mile Road at the Grand Trunk Western Railroad. The bid also covers repairing and resurfacing concrete joints of one mile on Eight Mile from Southfield to Telegraph roads. Work is to be done by June 1983.

Another bid of \$74,836 was submitted by The Morrison Co. of Trenton for construction of taxi streets at the Oakland-Troy Airport. Work is to be done by June.

Also submitted was a bid of \$28,450 by the Gale Group, Inc. of Detroit for construction of a special runway lighting, power and control systems at the Oakland-Troy Airport, also for June.

# County clinic plan wins panel's nod

Plans for a modern, out-patient clinic to be built on Wayne County General Hospital grounds by the University Medical Associates, a professional non-profit corporation, were approved in concept recently by members of the county Human Resources Committee.

The plans are subject to a report from the county's corporation counsel due next month.

According to Michael W. Bradley, chairman of the County Board of Institutions, the \$150,000 free-standing, 23,000-square-foot clinic will replace the present "N" building facility, considered old, spartan and unattractive to new patients.

Bradley said the modular facility will accommodate all clinic operations currently housed in "N" building.

Appearing before the Human Resources Committee, Hospital Administrator E.J. Conklin said the professional corporation has agreed to entirely fund the project on the hospital grounds directly north of the existing parking lot. It hopes to complete construction this fall.

The UMA, P.C. is seeking a 99-year, \$1-per-year land lease.

"We strongly believe that this project is paramount to the hospital's viability, since the general medicine

clinics are a principle 'gateway' to the institution," Dr. Conklin said. The clinic will add to the present cash-flow of the WCGH.

The project is actually being financed by members of the MSP program, a corporation of doctors formed a year ago to provide service to the hospital. The MSP (Medical Service Plan) was organized in June of 1981 by staff physicians who opted to work under their own corporate structure rather than continue as employees of the WCGH.

William Isenstein, who explained the concept of the new clinic, is a member of the MSP management team. According to Isenstein only medical doctors may become stockholders in the University Medical Associates, P.C. and the proposed clinic will be staffed by MSP doctors and hospital nurses.

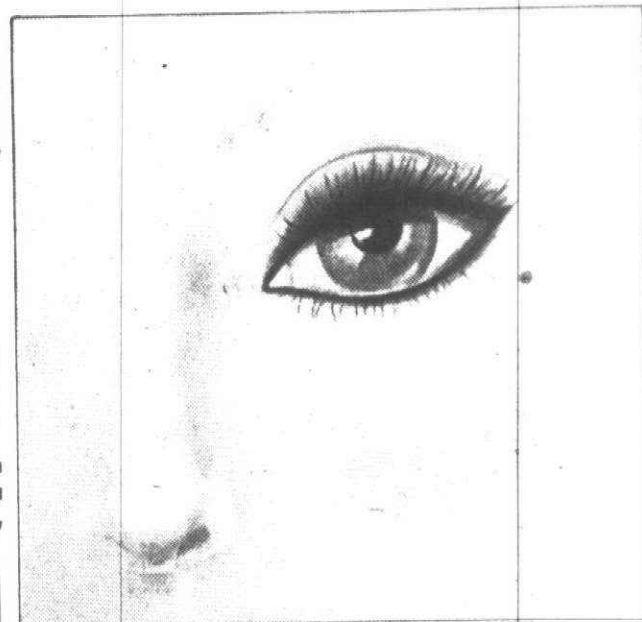

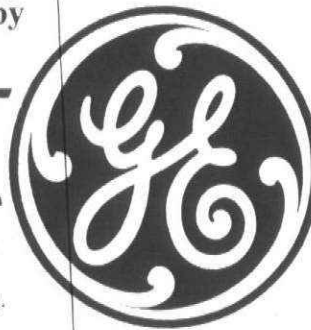

Another co-vice president is Dave Thomas of Canton Township, a geology instructor at Wash-

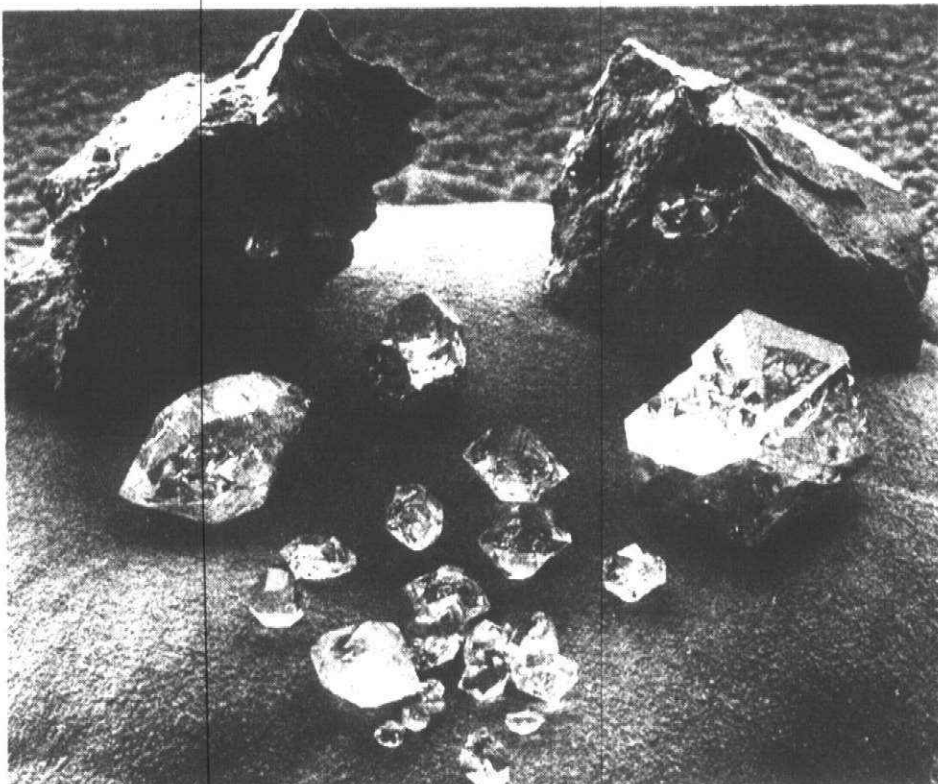
tenaw Community College.

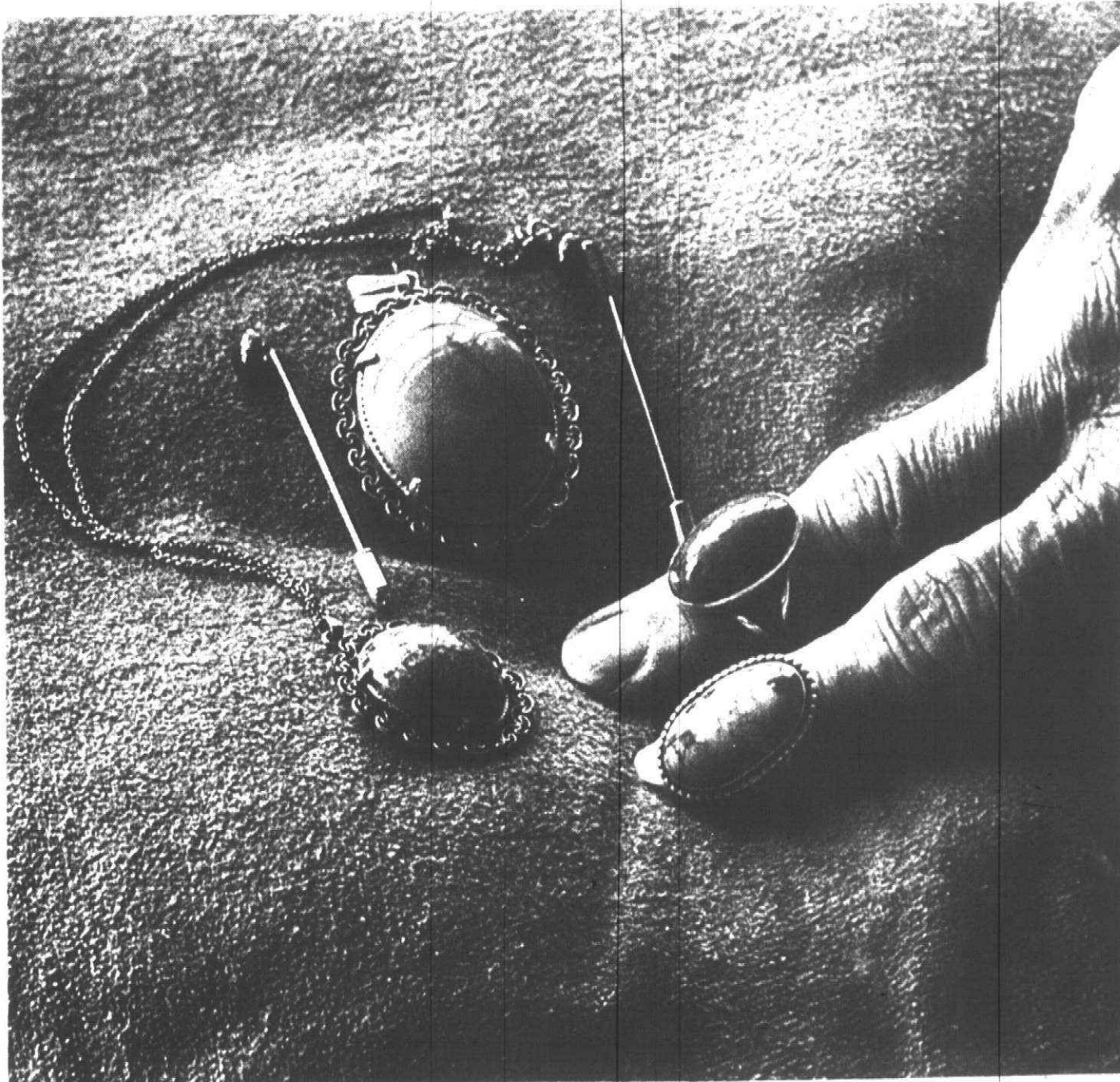

Jan Darrel didn't even unlock the ladder to their pool for the men and women just enjoyed the music and dancing for the remainder of the evening.

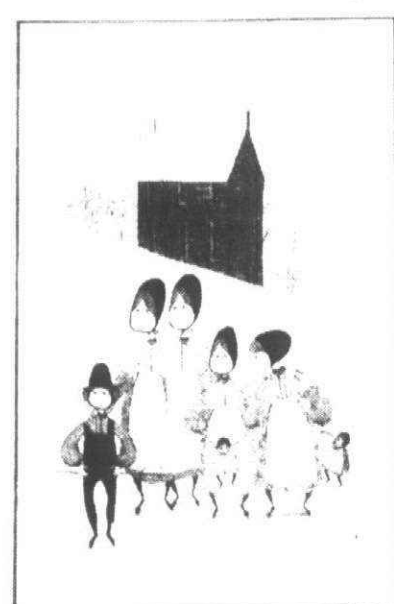

# St. Raphael observes golden anniversary

St. Raphael Catholic Church, an institution built with love and hard work, will celebrate its 50 years in Garden City with a festival Sept. 10-12.

Some 2,000 parish families are likely to join in the celebration. St. Raphael had 25 families when it had its beginnings in 1932.

The anniversary observance will completed Oct. 1-3 with a dinner dance and special Sunday mass with Archbishop Edmond Szoka presiding.

The three-day festival to be held this weekend on the parish grounds at Merriman and Beechwood will include kiddie rides, a moonwalk, game booths, a boutique, a country store and a computer game room.

There will be free entertainment — Dixieland music, magic acts, Irish, Polish and square dancers, the Livonia Senior Citizens Kitchen Band, and Suburban Harmonics. Performers from the American Dance Academy, Ron Plummer Dance Academy and the Robert Lee Dance Studio also will be on hand.

Food from fish to chicken and hot dogs will be served. Festival hours are from 5-10 p.m. Friday, noon to 10 p.m. Saturday and noon to 9 p.m. Sunday.

A PARISH COMMITTEE headed by Jerry Shankin and Mike Olivero

planned the event, the size of which would doubtless have astounded those who met in the spring of 1931 to found the parish. The three men, Salvio Clemente, James O'Hara and an attorney named Hackett met many obstacles to their effort.

But in August, 1931 the Rev. Gerion Stack consented to become pastor of St. Raphael parish. His first three masses were offered on the second floor of the Folker Building at Ford and Middlebelt, the location today of Orrin Jewellers.

Afterwards through the efforts of Ervin Enright, Folker's sales manager, the Stonerock store was obtained rent free for the celebration of services. Others in the community contributed in various ways to make the newly founded parish a success. For example, used car dealer Francis McManus donated an auto to the priests for their transportation.

In 1932 St. Raphael was given parish status. By early 1934 plans were in progress to build a permanent church. The cost seemed astronomical until Florence Cowperthwaite donated land on Merriman, north of Ford on which the first church was built. An activities building, two schools and a convent were also built on the land donated by this benefactress.

A church was finally erected at a cost of \$12,000. The windows were donated by the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, who worked without compensation until a school was established.

Because of other commitments the Sisters of IHM could not continue their work in the parish, so the Sisters of St. Francis took over the responsibility of the school, a commitment they still have.

When Fr. Stack was transferred after eight years, he left behind a well-established parish which was next led by the Rev. Anthony Kirchner. His successor in 1944 was the Rev. John Ross, under whose leadership the parish continued to grow.

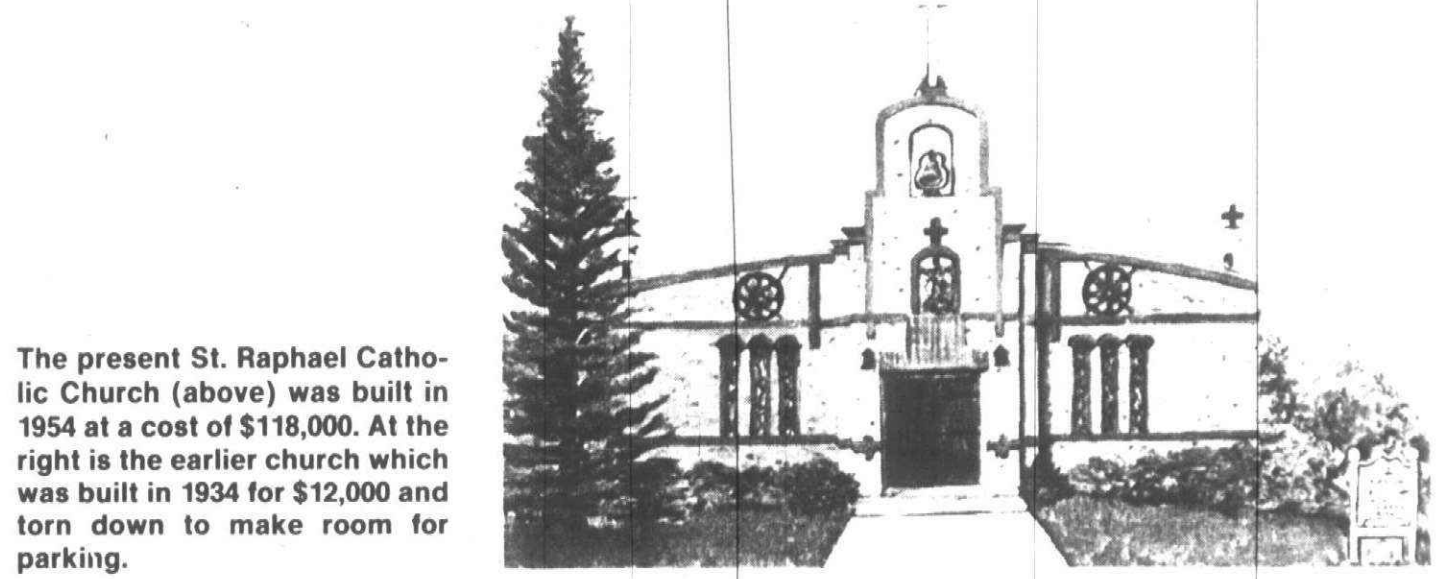
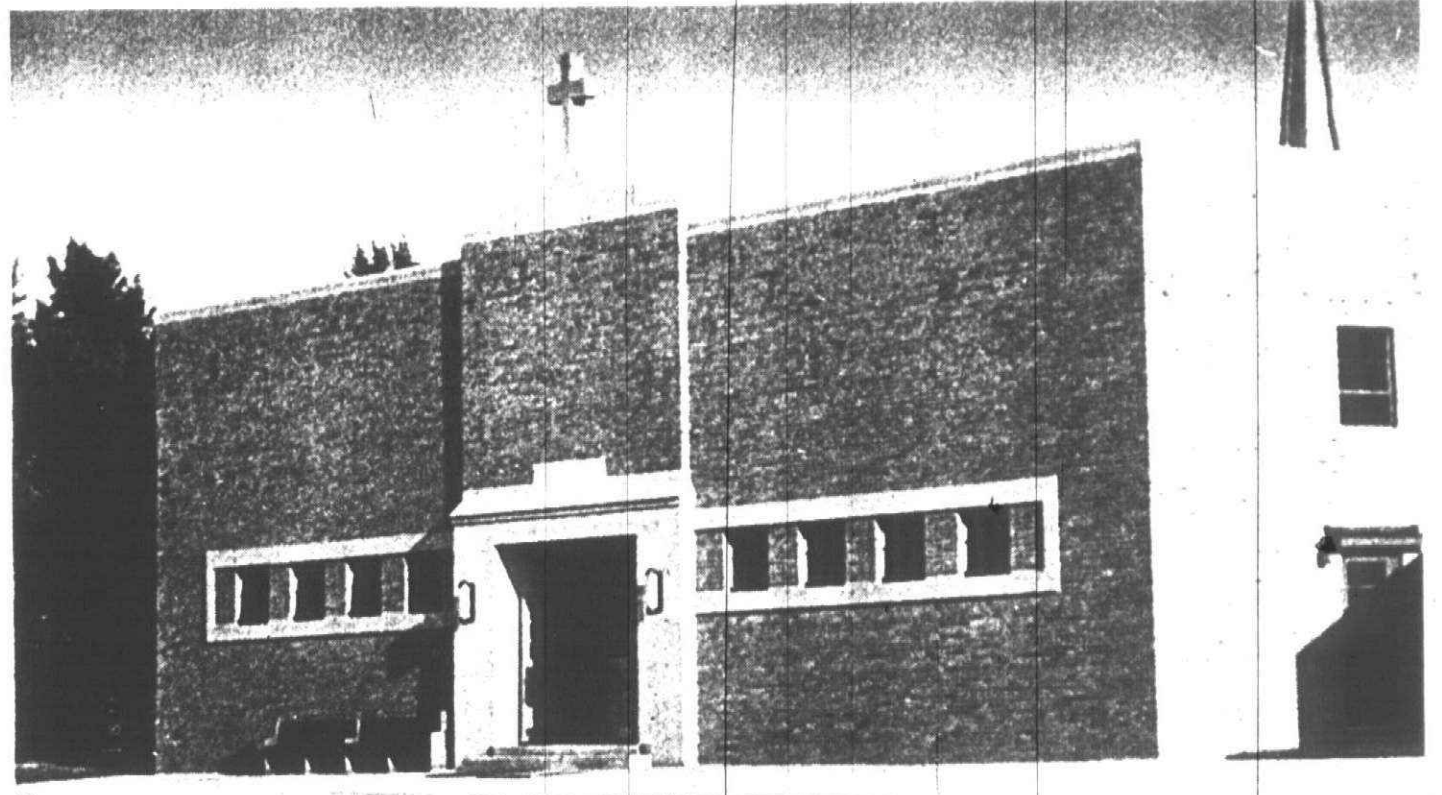
A permanent convent was built in 1952. These buildings replaced two dwellings located on the east side of Merriman, across from the old church, which was later demolished and replaced by a parking lot.

The present church was built in 1954 at a cost of \$118,000. It was completed in time to celebrate Christmas Eve mass that year.

Fr. Ross retired in 1966 after 22 years of dedicated service. He was succeeded by the Rev. Edward Kalinowski who died in 1967 shortly after his arrival. For a short time the parish had no pastor. But in the same year the Rev. Charles O'Neill was appointed.

Under his leadership the church was remodeled, and additions were made to the rectory.

Today the church has a variety of organizations and clubs to serve the needs of young and old. Religious education is provided for young people through catechism classes. Members regard St. Raphael as a vital part of the community it serves.

## Bible class begins another season

The Community Bible Class taught by Margaret Hess of Ward Presbyterian Church, Livonia, will begin its 1982-

83 season next Tuesday.

The class meets 9:30-11 a.m. weekly in the church sanctuary.

It draws students from all over this area and a large number of denominations, including Methodist, Baptist, Lutheran, Christian Scientist, Presbyterian, Roman Catholic, Episcopal, Unity and independent Bible churches.

Its teacher has been leading Bible study in this area for more than 30 years. She is the wife of Dr. Bartlett L. Hess, senior minister of Ward Presbyterian Church of Livonia.

In its program, the class goes through the entire Bible in eight years using a course written by Mrs. Hess. Students may join at any point. The format involves small group discussion sessions for the first half hour and then a lesson by the leader.

THIS YEAR the class will study kings and prophets, including the books

of Ecclesiastes, Song of Solomon, Jonah and Isaiah. The topic for the first session will be "Your Power to Choose," with the text from 2 Chronicles, verses 1-3.

Nancy Adrean of West Bloomfield serves as coordinator for the class, assisted by Lois Chapin of Livonia. Workers in the class now number nearly 100.

The classes are taped each week and Jane Reum of Livonia makes 90 copies of each tape. These are distributed by Marie Jewett of Livonia and a committee which sells some at cost and loans others out to class members and anyone interested.

Some are used by small groups in other part of the country.

Those interested in pre-enrollment may call Chapin, 425-3143. Enrollments also will be taken 20 minutes before the first session.

Study materials will be available for \$1. Care is provided for pre-schoolers at all sessions.

THIS TEACHER'S aim is to make the Bible come alive through a study of historical, geographical and archeological backgrounds. The Hesses have visited biblical lands seven times and have traveled extensively in Europe and the Orient as well as in this country.

Mrs. Hess, author of several books including "Love Knows No Barrier," "Esther: Courage in Crisis," and "Unconventional Women," seeks in the Bible course as well as in the books to apply biblical teachings to everyday situations.

She is listed in Marquis' "Who's Who among American Women" and "Who's Who in the Midwest."

# Salem soars Quicker Rocks roll past Canton

New season, new league, one new coach and a new date for the Plymouth Salem-Plymouth Canton girls basketball match-up.

The only thing that didn't change was the outcome, as the Rocks gave Canton the same treatment as in the past, winning by a 43-26 margin Tuesday at Canton.

In the not-too distant past, local fans had to wait until the state tournament to see a Salem-Canton pairing. But times change, and so do schedules, coaches and league affiliations.

The Chiefs have ended their season with a loss to Salem in the state district tourney year after year. This season, with the formation of the Western Lakes Activities Association (WLAA), which Canton and Salem are both members of, it was determined both schools should face each other more often.

BUT THE CHIEFS lacked the experience and quickness to keep pace with Salem Tuesday. With only one starter returning (guard Sue Gerke) and a new coach (Phyllis Cunningham), Canton may need more time to get its game in gear.

As for Salem, it was a slow start and some rough spots to overcome, but the Rocks played the same tough man-to-man defense that has become their trademark, and that again was a key factor. The Chiefs were bigger and tried to take advantage of their size by getting the ball inside to center Missy Aiken.

But the strategy failed under the defensive pressure applied by Salem's Pam McBride. Inside passes became turnovers — Canton finished with a whopping 37 mistakes.

"We've got good quickness, speed and conditioning," said Salem coach Bob Blohm. "And I thought we played good defense. We got good pressure on the ball and McBride did a good job covering Aiken."

Salem was guilty of 24 turnovers, but shot better and held its own on the boards. Canton didn't get a shot at the basket until more than three minutes of

the first quarter had expired.

SALEM'S DEFENSE throttled the Chiefs offense throughout the first quarter as the Rocks built a 10-1 lead, thanks to six Dawn Johnson points.

The closest Canton got was 12-5 early in the second period on Lou Ann Hamblin's basket. But the Rocks outscored Canton, 9-4, in the remainder of the half to forge to a 22-9 advantage.

The Chiefs never got closer than 11 points the rest of the way.

"We showed how inexperienced our ball club is," admitted Canton coach Cunningham. "We did not play our game. We did not even play the game we played all summer (in leagues)."

"But you have to credit Salem. They

are a quick ball club, and that's something our team isn't used to."

Cunningham's plan was to move the ball inside because "against a man-to-man, that's what we've got to do. But their defense denied us."

Salem's Jacque Merrifield, a senior guard, led all scorers and was the only player in double figures with 11 points. Ann Glonski finished with eight and three players — Michelle Dawson, McBride and Hamblin — each netted six.

Polly Roberts and Hamblin topped the Chiefs with eight points each. Aiken finished with six.

Salem plays at Farmington Harrison tonight at 7:30 p.m. Canton hosts Walled Lake Central at 7:30 p.m. tonight.

## Prep football preview Openers test for local teams

So, at long last it's arrived. Football season is here. The preseason scrimmages are memories, as each and every area football squad gears up for another knock-down, helmet-crunching, hard-tackling season. Whatever teams do those things the best will emerge at the top of their respective leagues.

Which brings us to the "What's New" segment of our first football prediction column. Number one on the list comes under the league category. Last year, there were six different leagues in the Observer area. This season there are three: the Northwest Suburban League (NSL), the Catholic League and the newest entry, the Western Lakes Activities League (WLAA).

What the consolidation means is that Gar-

den City, which will still compete in the NSL, will be much more competitive than it was for the last few seasons — if there is no leftover animosity from the East vs. West days.

There are other changes. Livonia Clarenceville's league, the Metro West, has collapsed. So the Trojans are now an independent. And Canton and Salem, the two schools located right next to each other, will meet on the gridiron for the first time ever.

That game won't be for another week. First, let's see how my co-see the editor, Brad Emons, and myself foresee the week-end's games.

## Death keeps step with technology

Roger Hart, who been a summer staffer with the Observer & Eccentric sports department this year, has covered auto racing as a photographer for the Associated Press for three years. He has regularly followed Indy car races, the NASCAR circuit, and Formula One races.

Death has taken four friends away from me this year.

I use the term "friends" rather loosely. I had never been over to their houses for dinner nor was I in attendance at their weddings.

But the four men who died had shared with me many of their triumphs, and I was truly saddened by their death.

I shouldn't be so selfish as to say the loss was unique to me, but every motor sports fan in the world was taken by their loss.

Death is something that is not uncommon in auto racing. It is accepted as part

of the risks of living in the fast lane. Death is very rarely — if ever — talked about by these men who push themselves and their machines more than 200 miles per hour.

But even though deaths, or serious accidents, go hand in hand with racing, for me, as a fan and an observer, death is still hard to accept.

IN MAY, Formula One driver Gilles Villeneuve died while practicing for the Belgian Grand Prix in Zolder, Belgium.

Villeneuve, from Canada, ran his Ferrari into the rear of a car driven by Jochen Mass while on a practice lap.

The Canadian's car flipped through the air and crashed into a retaining wall, killing the driver. Mass was unhurt in the incident.

Also in May, during the first weekend of qualifying for the Indianapolis 500, Gordon Smalley crashed into the wall at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway at nearly 200 miles per hour. Smalley was killed instantly as the car exploded on impact.

In June, a young Italian Formula One driver, Riccardo Paletti, driving for the Osella team, crashed into the rear of Didier Pironi's Ferrari at the start of the Canadian Grand Prix in Montreal.

PIRONI'S CAR had burned up the clutch on the starting grid, and as the stalled Ferrari sat on the track, Paletti came up from near the rear of the pack and before he could swerve to miss the stalled car, smashed directly into the car's rear end.

Rescue workers, including Pironi himself, tried to pry the Italian from the car as it burst into flames. The flames were extinguished, and Paletti was removed from the car and taken to a hospital where he was suffering from severe internal injuries. He was pronounced dead a short time later.



## Auto racing: High speed gamble

Ironically, the track in Montreal was named after the late Gilles Villeneuve just prior to the race.

And then in late July, Jim Hickman, the 1982 Indianapolis Rookie of the Year, died from injuries sustained in a crash while attempting to qualify for the Provimi Veal, Tony Bentenhussen 200-mile race at the Wisconsin State Fairgrounds Park.

In three months, death had taken four prominent drivers out of the sport.

Inexperience and driver error were the reasons given for all of the deaths.

Smalley and Hickman were relatively young drivers in the Championship Car Circuit that is dominated by older men.

Villeneuve was an experienced driver who, it was said, should have known better, while experts have said that in the case of Paletti's death, an experienced driver would not have made the mistake that cost the Italian his life.

THE FOUR deaths in auto racing has turned 1982 into one of the grimest years in motor sports history.

But also, I think the deaths have shown that the world of auto racing is reaching a turning point.

The technology that goes into building these racing machines has passed the ability of a man to handle them.

Technology has made it possible to build a car that can go faster than what can be safely maneuvered by a man sitting behind the steering wheel. This is what is happening in auto racing today.

The main culprit in this new technology is the use of "ground effects."

The term ground effects means channeling air through the car to actually cause a vacuum that sucks to the car to the racing surface, thus allowing the drivers to go faster through the turns.

Though ground effects don't really add any horsepower or a new top speed, they do allow drivers to go faster in the corners and give the drivers a false sense of security while

going through the turns.

The reason men constantly keep pushing themselves and their machines faster and faster is to please the fans. And if you aren't moving forward you are either standing still or going backwards, and either of the latter two is something you don't say in motor racing.

Speed is intoxicating, and the 200 mph mark has become a magic number.

IT HAS been said many times that people only turn out at motor-sport events to see a crash.

I think this is true, in some instances, with the fans. I believe most racing fans like to see crashes but would not like the drivers to get hurt.

The problem with crashing at 200 mph, though, is that drivers do get hurt — seriously hurt.

But one of the enticing aspects of the sport is the imminent danger that if a man makes a mistake while driving, he could pay with his life — the ultimate price.
