


Health and safety issues caused by standing water have residents of a Michigan Avenue mobile home park worried.

Residents along M Street at Sherwood, a park sitting just east of Haggerty Road, say water has been pooling

in their yards and elsewhere since early spring. They believe runoff from an adjacent new mobile home development is causing the problem.

"My yard is constantly flooded," said Joe McMillan, who has been at Sherwood for more than two years. "My yard hasn't been dry since the winter thaw."

rganizers of Canton's second annual "Petals and Paths" garden walk want to prove that people don't have to wander farther than a neighborhood yard to enjoy a lush herb, vegetable or flower garden.

The garden walk is planned for 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, July 8, through six residential gardens.

Approximately 140 people attended last year's walk.

Garden walks help inspire people who already have gardens and people who are just thinking about growing them.

"People can see how different people garden in the surroundings that are available to them," said Donna McDonald, vice president of the Canton Garden Club. "Every gardener has a little uniqueness to their setup."

People will get to see a variety of gardens on the Canton walk, McDonald said. Two will be in woodland settings, several in subdivision settings and one in an open setting on a large parcel.

Tammy Waldrop, who lives on Geddes near Canton Center, said she's hesitant to describe herself as "obsessive" about gardening. She moved more than 100 gallon-sized potted plants nearly four years ago when her family moved from Sterling Heights to Canton.

"I'd rather think of it as a passion than an obsession," Waldrop said

Softball center rezoned

The evolution of Michigan Avenue in Canton is continuing.

The township board of trustees Tuesday approved rezoning Canton Softball Center, which comprises 70 acres along the state thoroughfare. The parcel, just east of Beck Road, went from a general to light industrial designation.

It makes it easier to add recreational facilities," said Canton Supervisor Tom Yack.

General industrial zoning allows for intense uses such as manufacturing, refineries and landfills, he said. Parcels designated for light industrial typically feature more office uses, distribution and warehousing.

The township acquired Canton Softball Center from Aaron Jade in early 1999. Since then, the township has worked with private developers in an effort to bring soccer, golf and ice facilities to the site.

None has materialized - yet.

The township and High Velocity Sports signed a purchase agreement for approximately 10 acres at the center more than a year ago. The Troybased company would build soccer and golf domes.

The purchase agreement, which calls for Canton to receive \$100,000 per acre, was recently extended by the board. According to company officials, ground will be broken this summer for the golf dome.

Even if that development falls through, Yack said, the township won't give up on creating a sports park.

"We would like to pursue athleticrelated facilities that would act synergistically with the softball center," he

commented. If a project can't be worked out in a timely fashion, he said it could be used

for light industrial or commercial developments.

The township would likely receive much more than \$100,000 per acre for either use, Yack said. But, he added, making profit off of a land sale isn't the township's goal.


Hill said the parade is gaining

and tries to make her gardens as maintenance-free as possible. Nearly all of her plants are perennials, meaning they come up year after year. And because they're planted so thick, weeds don't get a chance to pop out, she said.

largest airport.

It was approved that year by the Michigan legislature to help Wayne County repay approximately \$147 million it owed the state - most of that for indigent medical care, sources said.

"This tax has served its purpose; it's time to repeal it," said Patterson, R-Canton Township, who serves as House associate speaker pro tempore. "This action benefits all Michigan residents who use Metro Airport for business and family vacations.

"To continue this tax would be outrageous," he said. "Couple that with the lack of adequate parking at Detroit Metro, and travelers should be furious."

Patterson's bill was introduced last week and referred to the House committee on tax policy, of which he is a member, for

Patterson claimed the tax has brought the county \$13 million to \$18 million annually over the last decade. "The purpose for which the tax has been enacted has been served. If money is being used for other than what it was intended, I think it is abusive to taxpayers."

Patterson, a first-term state legislator and former two-term Wayne County commissioner from Canton, said that people parking at the airport "assume it (the tax) is being used for capital improvements.

"But it is not being used for that" and had "never been intended for that," Patterson said.

20 co-sponsors

He predicted he would "have no problem getting co-sponsors for this bill." Indeed, 20 others, all Republicans, signed on, including Reps. Laura Toy of Livonia and Andrew Raczkowski of Farmington Hills.

Said Patterson: "Everybody that uses the airport knows a 30-percent tax is excessive."

Tom Naughton, Wayne County chief financial officer, said the bill, if passed, "would have serious ramifications, there's just no question.

"I'm not sure I understand the motivation (behind the bill) but ultimately it would harm the



constituents that Bruce Patterson represents," he said.

Naughton said the revenue helps operate the county jail, the courts and county clerk's office; helps pay the prosecuting attorney's office staff and also pays "a portion of our juvenile justice programs."

Mandated coverage

It also helps fund the county's mental health and community health programs, including mandated coverage for poor people treated by local hospitals. Other funded programs include bloodpressure medications, respiratory disease control, immunizations, dental programs for children and restaurant inspections, Naughton added.

"Obviously, if we were to lose \$14 million in our operating budget, we'd either have to find some source of replacement revenue or roll back services in some of these areas," Naughton said. The revenue is generalpurpose and not restricted by charter for specific uses, he

The county would be "looking at a local match, at contributions to those local programs" if the excise tax is repealed, he said.

First-term County Commissioner Lyn Bankes, R-Livonia, voted for the excise tax when she was a state representative, but can't support its repeal now because of the county's almost \$11-million deficit.

The commissioner said the county doesn't share in revenues from the Detroit casinos, "we don't get any flexibility in taxing ability due to Proposal A, and we don't even get to collect the full amount of taxes because the Headlee Amendment is holding down taxes to about 2.8 per cent."

'Very sympathetic'

Saying "I really hate paying that tax," Bankes stated she is very sympathetic as to what (Patterson's) trying to do, but I can't see where we can make up the revenue loss in the budget."

However, she said, "I'm not going to close the door on it.'

She said she supported the tax originally because, in 1986, Wayne County was in a financial crisis.

County Executive Edward H. McNamara "inherited an \$87million indigent-health debt" from his predecessor, William Lucas, "because doctors and hospitals were not capped as to how much they could charge in emergency rooms" for treating the poor.

She said the 30-percent excise tax on parking "was not out of line, as I understand it, with other airports."

The tax money does not go to Metro Airport, said spokeswoman Barbara Hogan. The county general fund gets all the tax collected at on-airport parking sites, she said, plus 80 percent of that from off-airport sites. The remainder, she said, goes to Romulus, which surrounds the airport.

Told of Patterson's bill, Romulus Mayor William Oakley cracked, "That's because he doesn't have any constituents in Romulus, obviously."

Oakley said the city gets "shy of \$1 million" a year from the parking tax. But his problem is more with the county and the new, huge parking structure being built at the new Metro midfield terminal project.

"We're going to lose a lot of revenue even if they (legislators) don't repeal the law," he said. citing the 18,000-vehicle structure.

"They'll have a 100-percent expansion of parking with the new terminal," he predicted. "In theory, they will double their parking."

He said state Sen. Loren Bennett, R-Canton Township, earlier proposed revising the tax "so that some of the communities that suffer the greatest noise would share in the revenue instead of it being used for airport operations." But the bill died for lack of action, Oakley

said. He suggested sharing parking revenue with Romulus, Dearborn and Huron Township.

"They (county officials) create a nuisance and they're now making money that should be shared with other people," he said.

Oakley said he figures Bennett and Patterson "are after the same thing: They want to whip the county around. And sometimes I'd like to be holding the short end of the whip myself."

Supports sharing

State Rep. William J. "Bill" O'Neil, D-Allen Park, another former Wayne County commissioner who is now also on the House tax policy committee, supports sharing revenue with Romulus: "They're the ones that have to put up with the most by having the airport there."

He proposed reducing, not eliminating, the parking tax.

The constantly wet ground is in January, said Sherwood resicausing more serious problems as well, he adds.

"The back of my trailer is sinking into the mud," McMillan commented. "I can smell the mold from the dirt underneath my trailer.'

Property Manager Jim Willis doesn't believe the standing water is being caused by the adjacent park, which he also oversees.

"I think it's a natural phenomena," he said. "But we intend to investigate the problem and try

to come up with a solution." Willis said soil underneath the park is primarily clay and doesn't drain well. He said surveys will be done to determine where the water is coming from and where it's collecting.

"It will take some time," Willis explained, "perhaps a month to figure out what the problem is and correct it."

The Manufactured Housing and Land Development Division of the Michigan Department of Consumer and Industry Services is responsible for inspecting mobile home parks in Wayne County. Attempts by the Observer to contact the division for comment on the situation were unsuccessful.



dent William Long. Problems arose early this spring when landscaping was done around the homes.

"We didn't have a problem until they started laying sod," said Long. "When they started watering it, the water came down all the way to the street in front of our house."

Neighbor Bruce Roll, who has been at the park for six years, savs water sits on his yard for days. "It creates big puddles on the

lawn," he said. Prior to the development, the

area behind M Street was a

vacant field.

"There was a little bit of a drainage problem before because of the fields," said Roll. "But it would drain down and dry up. Now you can wait two weeks after it rains and it's still wet."

The problem is worse at Nanette Olson's home. She has added cement tiles to her yard to provide a path to her storage

"When they water their grass it floods," Olson said. "On a nice day. I can't send my grandkids out to play because it's so wet."

Mosquitoes have become a nuisance from all the standing water, she adds.

"It's a shame," Olson said, "you can't sit in your backyard and enjoy it."

Roll agrees.

"I've been bitten four or five times in less than 10 minutes in the evenings." he said.

All of the aggravation makes Olson want to leave Sherwood.

"I'm going up north to find (land)," she said.

Soggy conditions are causing some homes to sink. One had to be elevated so that an entrance door would work properly, said

The sinking has led to cracks in his ceiling and plumbing problems, he adds.

"We're all worried about our homes getting ruined," Long

Lawn maintenance has also become an issue.

Residents say they don't get a regular opportunity to mow or weed whip their yards because of the water problems. Roll said he was sent a \$35 bill by park management for having to cut his lawn.

"I've been here for six years," he said, "I've always mowed my

Willis, who works off site, said Roll's bill was waived as of Mon-

"I've told them not to charge anybody if it's wet," he added.

Willis said he was not aware of drainage problems at Sherwood 'until a week ago." He said he would send a letter to residents stating that the problem would

be fixed. "We want them to know that we're not ignoring them," Willis

said. But that's exactly what residents say has happened since

Many said management has been notified numerous times about standing water. Olson said promises were made before to address them.

"It's a bag of empty promises," she added.





Livonian earns role as extra in HBO's "61"

As a youngster, Adam Smelewski's had visions of playing for the Detroit Tigers.

Smelewski got as far as Class A semi-pro in Wyandotte, but the 27-year-old Livonian has a chance next month to do the next

best thing. He'll have a bit part in the upcoming Home Box Office original movie, "61," story which

Mickey Mantle. The film, with baseball scenes scheduled to be shot next month at old Tiger Stadium, is being

directed by Billy Crystal. Over 2,000 hopefuls showed up June 24 at Wayne State University to audition for roles.

Smelewski, a sales representative for General Fastener in Livonia, made the final cut as one of the extended cast of 54, which includes players, coaches and umpires.

"You stood in line and if they liked your form or the way you threw you got picked," Smelewski said. "I went out to right field and they hit one flyball and one groundball — that was it.

"The first cut was narrowed down to 300, then they lined 35 up at each position. I was in right field. It was a one-shot deal.

"Crystal was there all day. He made the final decisions."

Smelewski was a pitcher in high school. As a high school junior, he helped Lincoln Park coach Tom Noland notch his 600th win during the 1990 season.

After graduating from high school, Smelewski became an outfielder in Class A ball. He now plays outfield in softball

leagues in Redford and Canton. "I'm a huge baseball fan," Smelewski said. "Just walking around with the ghosts of Tiger Stadium will be a thrill. I really know a lot about baseball in the 1980s and '90s, but I'll have to do some research on baseball in the 1960s."

Players who auditioned were expected to portray the look of Major Leaguers during the early 1960s when Maris eventually broke Babe Ruth's 60-homer plateau. That meant no facial hair, also closely cropped, crewcut style hair.

Shooting is expected to last 11 days and start the first week of August. Baseball extras such as Smelewski will receive \$200 per day and \$50 for meals.

"We've been told we'll be there all day - 12 hours," Smelewski said. "The casting director is going to call us. We could be Senators, Yankees or Tigers.

"One guy got picked simply because he looked like Al Kaline."

Smelewski, who learned about the tryouts on the radio early this spring, will have to take some of his remaining two weeks of vacation to perform his role. "We have to commit 11 days,"

he said. "One of those weeks I was taking off for deer season, but I can sacrifice that. "My wife (Maureen) is just

ecstatic. It's like a dream come





lime to check milkweed leaves for Monarch butterfly eggs

Summer is a great time to let kids care for an animal that is legal to have in your possession. Something like a frog, a garter snake, or an insect can

~provide a lasting flearning experilence. Let them

know that it will be released in *late summer though.

Just recently my family and I collected a couple monarch but-

terfly caterpillars. We found them feeding on some milkweed plants. One learning opportunity

was to recognize milkweed. As the caterpillars were feeding, we could see the white,

milky sap that became exposed. The sap is what the plant was named after. It has chemicals in it that accumulate in the caterpillar, and later in the adult but-

terfly, which make the insect

distasteful. Fortunately for us, too, the plants were blooming. They have a wonderful fragrance that is reminiscent of lilac.

If you have not smelled milkweed, you should try it! Monarchs depend on milkweed as their food source.

Adult females test the plant to be sure it is a milkweed before they lay their egg on it. Tiny caterpillars do not have the energy to search for the proper food after they hatch from the egg.

Different species of caterpillars eat different species of plants. If they all ate the same kind of plant, that plant would soon die off and the caterpillars would not have any food to eat. So through time caterpillars

adapted to eat different kinds of plant food.

Milkweed is the food for monarchs, so we collected some stems with leaves and put them in a jar of water. It is important that the jar of water be covered so the caterpillars do not fall into the water. Make sure the leaves stay plump.

If they eat all the leaves, go back and get some more. We put our water jar in a larger jar and then an onion bag over the larger jar. Inside the jar will be little green "beads," these are fecal material from the caterpillar.

Here is another aspect of learning about wild animals all living things must get rid of waste. Fecal material from cater-

pillars is called frass. When the caterpillar has reached its full size it will begin to roam.

This wanderlust is necessary in order to find a site to make a

chrysalis. Unfortunately, we spread out the onion bag too much, and when one caterpillar decided it was time to wander, it crawled through one of the openings. We

searched but could not find the

caterpillar.

Two days later, I opened the drapes to the door wall, not far from the caterpillar jar, and found the escaped caterpillar. It crawled to the upper framework and formed a chrysalis.

In about 10-14 days we will have the opportunity to watch it emerge as an adult monarch butterfly.

If you have a frog or snake, be sure to release them before fail so they can prepare to survive winter, but discuss some of life's processes while you have them.

Livonia Stevenson graduate finishes third at Mich. Open

Steve Polanski worked up ğuite an appetite this week. For three rounds, the Livonia

Stevenson High graduate, who will be a red-shirt sophomore this fall at Texas Christian Unieversity, nearly had the Michigan Open field devoured.

In Thursday's fourth and final round, Scott Hebert charged ahead from two strokes back to win his third title in four years on the par-72 Bear course at Grand Traverse Resort & Spa in Acme.

🖫 The 31-year-old Hebert, a native of Gladstone who plays on the NGA Hooters Tour, shot a final round 68 to finish with a 10-under 278, one shot off the course record he set in 1997.

Plymouth Salem High product Jeff Roth, a former Open champion himself, shot a final round 70 to finish five strokes off the pace. The Flint Golf Club pro has finished sixth or better nine straight times.

Hebert pocketed \$14,500 for first place, while Roth took home °\$9,000.

Polanski, the 1998 state Class A individual medalist and 1998 Michigan Amateur runner-up, took third with a final round 76-

"To take third place in the Michigan Open is solid," said the 19-year-old, who earned top

amateur honors at the Open for the second straight year. "Sure, it could have been better, but nobody expected it.

"Even with the lead (after the third round) I was relaxed as ever. I don't think there was any pressure on me. I knew Scott (Hebert) was going to fire a good round. I was just going to see what happens.

Polanski said he hit the ball during the final round as well as he did the previous three rounds when he carded scores of 70-68-

He finished more than a respectable 4-under for the tournament.

"I had more bogies on the last day than I had the entire first three rounds," he said. "I got a couple of bad breaks and four or five putts rimmed out. But that's

Polanski was encouraged by his run to become the first amateur to win the Michigan Open since 1975.

The previous week at the Michigan Amateur held at Bedford Valley in Battle Creek, he failed to make the 64-player cut for match play.

"There was a total difference from last week to this week,' Polanski said. "In Battle Creek I just didn't like the greens or the course. I hit the ball great this week and I hit well last week.

"But this week I made putts. I was familiar with the course

He was given a medical redshirt season and will have four years of NCAA eligibility remaining.

Polanski's schedule doesn't lighten up any this month, but he is glad to get a short break.

This week he'll compete in the Golf Association of Michigan Collegiate Championships in Traverse City (where he is based with his family during the sum-

Then he'll try and qualify for the U.S. Amateur at the Gailes in Oscoda. He'll also play in the Western Amateur in Benton Harbor and the Northern Amateur in Chesterton, Ind.

"After four rounds you're drained," Polanski said. "I ate a lot this week. I did a lot of walking."

Sounds like the hunger pains just won't go away.



Myron Covington has a natural talent for photographing people. Whether it's his children playing outside their Canton home or an artist demonstrating needle work at the African World Festival in Hart Plaza, Covington focuses right on the heart of a person.


Father's pride: Justin (left) and Alexander are two of Myron Covington's favorite subjects.

But this jovial, good-natured man has a big heart himself. A single dad raising four kids, Covington makes it quite clear "his family comes "I never thought I'd end up being Donna Reed,"

said Covington. "My friends like to tease me. They'll say, 'Myron, where are the pearls and high heels.' But I really enjoy photographing my kids. You have to let children do their own thing

when you're photographing them. You want to put them in a comfortable environment in a backyard or park, just let them be children."

A drafting and wood shop instructor at Willow Run Community Schools in Ypsilanti by day, Covington teaches commercial photography in adult education classes at the Breithaupt Career/Technical Center in the Detroit Public Schools at night.

In his last 17 years at the center, Covington's seen several of his Breithaupt students go on to successful photography careers. The six level commercial photography program has turned out successful lensmen such as Felicia Hunt-Taylor who formerly taught in the visual communication department at Center for Creative Studies. Ron Harper went on to become director of photographic and visual communications for the Detroit Police Department. Most recently, students Debra and Leonard Walters each received \$10,000 scholarships to study at CCS. Covington is proud of all of his students, former and present, and that's why he annually exhibits with them at venues such as the Southfield Civic Center, Swann Gallery in Detroit, and the former Urban Park Gallery in Greektown.

"That's what I enjoy most is teaching," said Covington. "That and the completion factor, watching my students finish an art work gives me satisfaction."

Viewing the installation at the museum pleased Will Phillips, exhibit preparator for the Emerging Artists Program at the museum. The exhibit's 104 works concentrated on children of color.

"It was an excellent exhibit," said Phillips. "The program is designed to give artists who haven't had a chance to present their work in a professional environment like a museum or gallery. We're booked through 2001 now but we might have a spot before then to invite them back."

"His outlook on life is basically that of a four-year-old. I try to understand his sense of humor," said Thomas. "Max sing your ABC's."

"A, b, c, d, e, f, weee," sang the precocious


puppet. "Max appeals to the sense of humor of a 4-year-old," said Thomas so quickly that it's hard to tell where Max finished speaking and the big guy takes over. "He does silly mischievous things. It's apparent by listening to the two that the fun hasn't stopped since they formed a duo in 1991. Thomas sang and played guitar a long time before he met Max though.

Instead, Thomas went on to earn a bachelor degree in economics and construction management at Michigan State University but continued to play guitar in coffee houses on the East Lansing campus. Before long, the two (with a little help from a ventriloquism book) were performing at venues such as the Youtheatre at Music Hall Center for the Performing Arts. During the school year, they "amoose" elementary students in classrooms all over Michigan, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois and Wisconsin with programs that inspire reading, respect, responsibility and self esteem.







Niagara-on-the-Lake

Stage set for romance, drama

The Shaw Festival is about the theater of ideas, taking its cue from the playwright who anchors the festival, George Bernard Shaw. But this year, the most popular production and the most successful is as light as a feather, as uncomplicated as a spring romance and as simple as a love letter.

The Shaw Festival at Niagaraon-the-Lake, Ontario, is dedicated to performing the plays of Shaw and his contemporaries. Since Shaw lived from 1856 to 1950, that covers a broad period. The mandate has been extended to include works dealing with the time period of Shaw's life as well. This year the plays of Shaw, Oscar Wilde, Thornton Wilder, Noel Coward and others are featured at the festival's three venues in what is proudly called "Ontario's most beautiful city.'

Here's a sampling of what you'll see:

She Loves Me

This chamber musical was scheduled to close Oct. 29 but ticket demand has extended its run until Dec. 2, and rightly so.

Before Jerry Bock and Sheldon Harnick combined their talents to create the big musical "Fiddler on the Roof," they collaborated with book writer Joe Masteroff to adapt the play that became Ernst Lubitsch's movie "The Shop Around the Corner" into a musical. This play and the movie are also the inspiration for the recent "You've Got Mail."

A young man and woman work together at Maraczek's Parfumerie in Budapest before the war. They immediately dislike each other, not realizing that they are pen pals who are falling in love by post.

The Bock-Harnick score has none of the memorable tunes that made "Fiddler" so popular, but the songs here are perfectly fit to the situations and to the many characters who each get their moment in the spotlight. This is an ensemble piece built around the work family of the parfumerie.

Director Roger Hodgman and designer Patrick Clark have done an excellent job of turning the tiny Royal George stage into

1930's Budapest. Hodgman's cast is uniformly excellent, delicately defining their characters as something other than one-dimensional

types. Ben Carlson is especially appealing and in fine voice as Georg Nowack, the hard working store manager in love with an ideal. Glynis Ranney is a waiflike woman with a comic spirit and a big voice as Amalia. She really comes into her own on the knowing "Vanilla Ice Cream" number.

These two are surrounded by a fine supporting cast. Patty Jamieson is funny and touching as the deceived Hona. Cameron MacDuffee, with slicked back hair and mustache, is both charming and reptilian as the unreliable Kodaly. Jay Turvey is

not workshops? Published authors will lead workshops for many writers who would like to improve or advance their skills by participating in the fourth annual Cranbrook Retreat for Writers; said Tom Murdock, director of special summer programs at Cranbrook Schools in Bloomfield Hills.

More than 50 participants are expected at this year's retreat, which consists of three-hour workshops daily from July 11-15. Writers at any level can enroll

in workshops with one specific instructor for the week, but each group must have at least seven and not more than 14 participants in order to initiate better communication within groups. Writers can create new works or receive feedback on old ones.

"It's really a great chance to express yourself in a supportive environment," said Liz Lent, public relations coordinator. "It's just invaluable advice and feedback that they give you."

Award-winning authors Toi Derricotte, who was born in Detroit, Thomas Lux, Daniel Mueller, Richard Tillinghast and Robin Williamson, a graduate of the Center for Creative Studies in Detroit, will present workshops on poetry, fiction, nonfiction and art.

The retreat helps keep writers active, said Murdock. Cranbrook is an ideal place for the workshop, he believes, especially since the school has produced several well-known authors, including fiction writers Edmund White and Thomas McGuane and war writer Ward Just.

Although many people visit Cranbrook, they do not really get to know the school. Murdock believes the retreat also is a good way for the community to get to know the school better.

"This is a really short way to come in and make a connection,"

Local teachers and teachers from across the nation are among those who will attend the workshop. Their attendance is important, Murdock believes, not only for their professional lives but also for their personal fulfill-

"I think sometimes they have to do something towards themselves," he said.

Writers from different backgrounds and levels of experience come from all over the country to attend the workshop, said Lent, who attended twice herself. People who have never published anything can benefit as much as those who are more experienced, she believes.


The Arkitect watch, which retails for \$85, is a great solution for a guy heading to his first job, or one who simply wants to capture the new-fash-

It's only natural for men to turn to watches to express their style. After all, besides ties, what accessories can they change at a whim? Except for shoes, that is.







Plan a visit to wineries in France

lanning a trip to France? Want to discover wines at the source? All you need is a fax machine to send a request in English to visit at a specific time on a specified day (not weekends). Consider this column a guide to visiting wineries in France, the Rhone Valley and Provence, two beautiful regions with great wines.

Producers prefer morning visits around 10 a.m., none between noon and 2 p.m., then appointments until 5 p.m. Eat lunch between noon and 2 p.m. as the French do. We suggest a maximum of three winery visits per

Maps

Detailed maps are essential; Michelin are the best. Buy a Michelin Green Guide of the region to locate the top sites (other than wineries).

Wine Picks Pick of the week: 1998 Clos du Val Ariadne \$25.50, a complex blend of semillon, sauvignon bianc and viognier is a superb summer wine. Generally, we recommend that white wine

In the northern Rhone Valley, where red wines are made almost exclusively from syrah, the most famous name is E. Guigal, located in the sleepy town of Ampuis, an hour drive south of Lyon. Other nearby producers are Jean-Michel Gerin and Rostaing.

An hour south of Ampuis, along the Rhone River, are the sister cities of

Tain l, Hermitage and Tournon. There you can visit Paul Jaboulet, Delas Freres, and J. L. Chave in nearby Mauves-sur-Rhone.

The Michelin Red Guide helped us locate our accommodations in Tournon at the modern Hotel les Amandiers, \$60 with breakfast,

In the southern Rhone, we like to stay in the centrally located historic town of Vaqueyras at Le Pradet (\$60 with breakfast), a pretty hotel just out of town. It is set back off the road with a marvelous mountain view of the Dentelles de Montmirail.

Famous region

The most famous region in the southern Rhone is Chateauneuf-du-Pape with a city of the same name. At caveau (wine shops) in the town, you can taste and purchase wines from nearly every producer. Our favorite producers to visit are Chateau de Beaucastel, Domaine Bois de Boursan, and Domaine Pegau.

For lunch, the star is La Mere Germaine in the center of Chateauneufdu-Pape.

When you are tired of wine visits (and this can happen), drive to the small villages with wine names you should get to know. Gigondas, Sablet, Seguret, and Rasteau are near Vaqueyras.

In addition to wine, Rasteau has colorful houses, Roman baths, and a good view of the Dentelles. Seguret appears to be glued to the side of a rocky cliff. There, include La Table du Comtat for a special lunch or din-

It has an excellent list of local Cotes-du-Rhone wines and affords magnificent vineyard views.

In Vacqueyras, walk into the town through the main arch until you reach the church and plaza at the highest point. Near the church is the

"I'm not a great cook, but I can throw together a salad," Rosenberg said. "Besides, fresh vegetables and fruits are so plentiful this time of year. It makes good sense using them in a

Fruit salad? Vegetable salad? Sarah finally decided to combine the two and make a Strawberry Spinach Salad.

Brian Sommariva of Plymouth, who just completed his freshman year at Michigan State University, also needs a dish to pass for a Fourth of July celebration with friends.

At first he planned to ask his mother to make something. But . . . what the heck! He could do it himself, he decided.

A pasta salad with vegetables is his choice for an easy and inexpensive side dish. A good choice, according to him, because he likes pasta and so do his friends.

"I'm glad I can do my share for the celebration. Besides, I'm moving into my first apartment this fall and I'll have to do my own cooking. I figure why not start now."

Great greens

Here are some tips from "Salads: 150 Classic and innovative Recipes for Every Course & Every Meal" by Leonard Schwartz with Sheila Linderman, (Harper-Callins Publishers, 1992, \$23).

- Greens should be stored in the most humid and warmest section of the refrigerator in plastic bags that have holes in them to allow for air circulation.
- it is best to clean greens as close as possible to the time you are going to use them. However, once washed and dried, though not dressed, they will keep for another 24 hours if stored properly.
- To wash greens, fill a sink or large put with cold water. Trim the greens and tear or cut them into the size pieces you want. Put the greens into water and stir them with your hands to loosen the dirt. The dirt will sink to the bottom and the greens will float. Scoop the greens out before draining water. Place in a salad spinner to dry, or in a clean dish towel to absorb the moisture.

STRAWBERRY SPINACH SALAD

- 1 package fresh spinach
- 3 cups fresh strawberries
- 2 small red onions
- 1/2 cup sliced almonds

Wash and dry spinach; tear into bite-size pieces. Thinly slice strawberries. Thinly slice onions and separate into rings. Cover and chill each item separately until ready to serve. Combine ingredients. Add orange dressing and mix. Serves 6 to 8.°

ORANGE DRESSING

- 1/2 cup of orange juice concentrate, thawed
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar 1/8 teaspoon salt

Combine all the ingredients in a container with a lid. Shake until mixed. Recipes submitted by Sarah Rosenberg.

PASTA SALAD

- 2 cups cooked elbow macaroni
- 5 medium cucumbers, peeled and cubed
- 5 medium tomatoes, cubed
- 1 large red onion, chopped
- 2 teaspoons fresh parsley, finely chopped
- 2 teaspoons fresh chives, finely chopped

In large bowl, combine all the ingredients. Add dressing and mix well. Serves 12.

DRESSING

- 1 cup low-fat yogurt
- 2 tablespoons prepared mustard

Light up your holiday with grilled vegetables



BEVERLY

As a vegetarian, grilling can be an exciting experience. Many foods and combinations are available to please any palate. "Just because you are a vegetarian, it does not mean that you can't enjoy barbecuing," said Shelly Gardynik, of Farmington Hills. Gardynik has a charcoal grill and a special pan to stir-fry vegetables over the coals.

"I don't cook much," said Linda Minns of Franklin, "But when I do, I grill - even in the winter." Minns prepares portobello mushrooms, red peppers, zucchini, eggplant, carrots,

potatoes, onions, corn, and even asparagus on her gas grill. She simply seasons the veggies with olive oil and basil and presto - she has a tasty meal.

Easy

"I grill two to three times per week. It's so easy, I don't mess up kitchen, and everything tastes better when it's grilled," said Minns. You can also use a non-stick vegetable spray or a grill basket so that your vegetables won't stick to the grill or fall into the

What tastes better - food cooked over a charcoal or gas grill? Taste tests have shown that most people cannot tell the difference between food cooked on a charcoal or gas grill. Charcoal grills have the advan-



tage of being more portable and less expensive than gas grills. But gas grills are easier to light and you can control the cooking temperature better.

Grilling safety tips

Place grill in a well-ventilated, open area, outdoors, away from overhanging branches and the

Follow manufacturer's directions for lighting when using either charcoal and gas grills; never use gasoline or kerosene to light a grill.

To avoid flare-ups: reduce heat, raise grill rack,

cover the grill, or move dripping food to a cooler part of the grill.

For excessive flare-ups, remove food from racks and mist coals with a squirt bottle of water. (Spray above the flames to avoid putting the fire out com-

Protect hands by using long-handled utensils and

oven-mitts. Never leave a lighted grill or fire unattended. To extinguish a charcoal fire, douse with water or replace the grill hood. Dispose of all ashes and coals

after they are cold. Using wood chips

You can also grill with wood chips. For mesquite, flavor, soak wood chips in water for 30 minutes, then spread over hot coals.

For gas grills, place chips in a disposable aluminum pan to keep ashes from clogging the vents. Cover the grill for best results.

Grilling creates a friendly and relaxing atmosphere. So fire up the grill, relax and enjoy the holi-

Picnicking can be a basket of fun for families



LOIS THIELEKE er, blue skies, fresh air and a gathering good friends and family all just seen to say, 'Let's have a picnic.'

A picnic in the park, at the lake, listening to a concert or in the backyard, they should all

be special. A picnic basket filled with homemade food certainly beats fast food sandwiches or a bucket of convenience food. Make a picnic enjoyable without the fuss. Pack the picnic basket/cooler with nutritious food that everyone will enjoy.

Warm weath- Make sure you practice all the the meat to make them more carrots, eggplant, snowpeas, food safety rules so no one gets

The key to a great picnic is to get organized so that you have everything you need. Make a checklist of food and equipment needed. Choose a food menu that is easy to handle with the least amount of "drag along" equip-

Do some of the food preparation at home before packing the basket. For example, make you hamburger patties or kabobs at home so they are ready for the

Meat kabobs could be made at home and put in a marinade in the refrigerator to help tenderize. The acids in vinegar, wine, fruit juice or commercial marinades break down the protein in

Always marinate in the refrigerator; remember the two-hour food safety rule (no food out of refrigeration more than two hours, even less time when it's really hot.) Throw the marinades away so you don't have a bacteria problem. Meat kabobs are up to the chef and tastes of the guests. Try ham cubes, sausage, shrimp, scallops, turkey, chick-

en, steak and, of course, lamb. Make separate meat and vegetable kabobs. Tomatoes and mushroom skewered together with thick chunks of meat will cook too quickly and fall off the skewer. The softer vegetables only take a few minutes to cook. Good vegetables to put on a skewer are zucchini, asparagus, sweet potatoes, green onions, squash, leeks and bell peppers. Make fruit or vegetable kabobs that cook at the same rate otherwise some may be really charred and others uncooked.

Fresh fruits are always a big hit with picnickers that have a sweet tooth. Frozen grapes, strawberries and all kinds of melons are especially good at picnics. Pound cake, angel food cake cut into cubes and served with fresh berries are popular. Cookies or brownies are also favorite finger food deserts. Quick breads such as banana, nut, rhubarb, strawberry, lemon or blueberry are all easy to take along. These can be served with cream cheese or sliced cheese for a dessert.

If possible, pack two baskets or one basket and one cooler. Use a separate cooler for drinks so that the one containing perishable food won't be constantly opened and closed.

Take along only the amount of

food that you will cook and eat. Picnics are not a time to plan leftovers unless you have a lot of ice or access to a refrigerator. Pack clean, soapy sponges,

cloths, wet towelettes, and paper towels for cleaning surfaces and Wrap raw foods securely to

avoid the raw juices coming into contact with other foods. Don't store the cooler in the

trunk; it could get too hot. Keep the cooler in the shade at the picnic. Don't open and shut it a lot or your ice will melt.

Don't use the same platter and utensils for raw and cooked meats. When you take food off the grill, put on a clean platter.

Freezing individual portions of juice will help insulate the cooler

and keep foods cold. Don't forget to take some trash bags along to clean up after

Picnics can vary from peanut butter and jelly sandwiches to cheese and champagne and all

points in between. Picnics are supposed to be fun, relaxing, easy and festive. Appreciate the wonderful weather by being outside and together





Share the health with eggplant

There's hardly a healthier sandwich to be found than savory vegetable spread on a hearty, whole grain bread.

Vitamins, minerals, dietary fiber and cancerfighting phytochemicals abound in these wholesome sandwiches you can enjoy at home, work or school. Spreads are also an easy way to incorporate more vegetables into your diet. Organizations such as the American Institute for Cancer Research emphasize that eating five or more servings of vegetables and fruits each day helps lower cancer risk.

Beans are a favorite staple in veggie spreads. Sample a spread made with cooked white beans, roasted red peppers, minced garlic, lemon juice, chopped fresh parsley, salt and pepper. Whirl in a blender until smooth, then chill at least 30 minutes to allow the flavors to meld. This spread has virtually no fat and plenty of zip.

For a Southwest flavor, use pinto beans seasoned with coriander, oregano, paprika, garlic, lime juice, salt and hot sauce to taste. Hummus, a traditional Middle Eastern spread, is made with chick peas and flavored with sesame tahini, olive oil, lemon juice, cumin, coriander, cayenne pepper and salt.

A colorful roasted red pepper spread can be made by placing drained, water-packed roasted red peppers in a blender and combining with fresh chopped parsley, capers and garlic cloves

If the mixture is too thin, blend in a tablespoon or two of fine bread crumbs.

Meaty mushrooms can be paired with leeks in a flavorful spread. Sauté sliced leeks (white part only) with minced garlic. Then add chopped mushrooms, oregano, salt and pepper.

Cook about five minutes, then puree the mixture horseradish.

Make lentil spread with lentils that are still warm from cooking. This way, they will more readily absorb the flavors of toasted sunflower seeds, oregano, Dijon mustard, red or white wine vinegar and salt. Puree all the ingredients, adding water to achieve a spreadable consistency.

Mash cooked split peas with a bit of olive oil, Parmesan cheese, cottage cheese, basil, salt and pepper to make a tasty spread. Serve on a crusty whole grain roll or on a toasted, split whole grain

SAVORY ROASTED EGGPLANT SPREAD

- 1 large eggplant
- 1 peeled, seeded tomato, chopped
- 1/4 cup chopped parsley
- 1 tablespoon minced green onions 2 teaspoons fresh lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon olive oil
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon ground black pepper

Place the eggplant in a baking dish and bake at 400 degrees F for 45 to 55 minutes. Cool, then cut the eggplant in half and scrape the insides into a bowl. Process in a blender or processor, leaving slightly chunky. Stir in the remaining ingredients.

To serve, spread on a hearty whole grain bread or focaccia. If desired, top off the sandwich with sliced tomatoes, roasted green or yellow squash slices, pepper strips or onions.

ANNABEL COHEN'S GRILLED MUSHROOMS KABOBS

For each kabob:

- 6 large white button mushrooms, stems intact Pesto vinaigrette for basting mushrooms (recipe below)
- Vinaigrette:
- 2 tablespoons prepared pesto
- 2 tablespoons olive oil

1/4 cup balsamic vinegar

Heat grill to medium-high. Soak mushrooms in water for 30 minutes. Combine vinaigrette ingredients in a small bowl and whisk until smooth.

For each kabob, thread 4-6 mushrooms on an 8inch or longer skewer (if using bamboo skewers, soak them in warm water for an hour before using). Place the kabobs on the hot grill and cook for 10 to

15 minutes until tender, brushing with the vinaigrette every few minutes. The vinaigrette is sufficient for basting up to 12 mushroom kabobs. Serve hot.

Making pizza on the grill may seem time consuming, but it really isn't. Once the dough is made, the pizzas take minutes to prepare. A food processor makes preparing this quick dough a snap. Make this recipe red and white patriotic with fresh tomatoes and tofu Mozzarella cheese.

GRILLED PIZZA BY ANNABEL

Toppings: Tomato sauce, fresh chopped vegetables, cheeses, etc.

For pizza dough:

- 2/3 cup lukewarm water (105-115 degrees F)
- 1 1/4 ounce package (2 1/2 teaspoons) active dry yeast
- 1/2 teaspoon sugar
- 2 tablespoons olive oil plus additional for oiling
- 1 3/4 to 2 cups all-purpose unbleached flour
- 1/4 cup finely ground yellow cornmeal
- 2 teaspoons kosher salt

Make dough:

Proof yeast: In a large bowl stir together 1/3 cup water, yeast, and sugar and let stand until foamy, about 10 minutes. Place 1 3/4 cups flour, cornmeal, and salt in a food processor fitted with a steel blade.

Add the yeast mixture and process until mixture forms a ball, adding more water, 1 teaspoon at a time, if the dough seems too dry. Add more flour, 1 tablespoon at a time, if the dough is too wet or sticky and process for 5 to 10 seconds more. Don't over process or

the dough can become tough.

Put dough, in an oiled deep bowl and turn to coat with oil. Cover the bowl with plastic wrap. Let dough rise, in a warm place for 1 hour, or until doubled in

Heat grill to medium. Remove the plastic wrap and punch the dough down to remove some of the volume. Form dough into 4 balls and stretch each ball into an irregular round shape.

Lightly brush one side of each dough round with olive oil. Carefully transfer it, oiled side down, to rack of grill. Lightly brush top with some oil. Grill crusts. until the undersides are golden brown on bottom, about 3-4 minutes.

Brush the tops of the rounds with olive oil and flip them over with 2 metal spatulas. Lightly cook the other sides. Top the dough with your toppings of choice. Lightly brush or drizzle the tops of the pizzas with some more oil and grill, covered, about 5 minutes more or put in 250-degree F oven to keep warm.

PAELLA A LA VALENCIANA

- 1 pound firm tofu, cut into cubes
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 4 green onions, chopped 1/4 cup olive oil
- 2 medium tomatoes, peeled and chopped
- 1 (10 ounce) package frozen peas
- 1 (9 ounce) package frozen artichoke hearts
- 2 teaspoons paprika
- 11/2 cups basmati rice 2 teaspoons salt
- 4 cups vegetable broth
- Pinch of saffron

here's not much stopping Bernadette Diroff, 73, of Westland when she decides to pack up and go on the road — particularly not her heart condition.

Diroff's bypass surgery 11 years ago never prevented her from traveling to visit four of her nine children in Sarasota, or her sister in Palm City, Florida, for six weeks each winter. Nor does it rein in visits to her home state, Minnesota, where more family reside.

Today, she's in the midst of planning a two-week trip to Ireland in early September, and the day after she returns, she's off to Toronto to take in *The Lion King* with her friends from New Dawn, a support group for widowed spouses that meets at St. Edith Church in Livonia.

"I'll go anywhere and do anything, unless its strenuous," said Diroff, a widow. "I always have my medicine with me, and I carry water in the car or in the plane. I try to keep real close to my times (to take medicine)."

Additionally, she watches what she eats and has a dosage of nitroglycerine tablets on hand.

"I get out almost every day to do something," Diroff said. "I haven't had any problems, and I thank God for that."

Chronic pain

Cathy West of Westland won't let chronic pain prevent her from traveling to her favorite getaway in South Haven. She has managed the discomforts of fibromyalgia, a muscle disorder, and degenerative spine disease since her diagnosis in 1989. Then, in 1996, she broke her tailbone in an auto accident.

West can no longer ride in a car, but manages 60-minute stretches in a van or truck. "It's easier for me to slide into a vehicle than sitting down into a car because of a couple of broken lower disks in my back," she said. "It's more difficult to get up and out."

West follows a few common-sense precautions to make her trips comfortable. "I try not to travel when the traffic's heavy, so I don't get stuck in traffic where I'm unable to get off the freeway to take a break," she said. "I also try to not travel during holidays."

Travel clinics

Travel medicine clinics in local hospitals, as well as medical experts in internal medicine and infectious disease, are busy inoculating travelers, offering country-specific guidelines and connecting people with reputable medical clinics and physicians who may be located near numerous travel destination spots.

Those who live with chronic illnesses or underlying conditions, such as coronary heart disease, diabetes, fibromyalgia and pulmonary conditions such as asthma or emphysema, are not exempt from enjoying vacations or taking business trips. In fact, many doctors encourage travel — domestic or international — providing people respect their limitations, use common sense and prepare well.

"Ultimately, in the ideal world with the sun shining, it's 'safer' if they don't travel," said Dr. Jeffrey Sanfield of St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor. "But that's not how you do this."

Emotional and spiritual aspects of life are just as important as the physical considerations in dealing with a chronic illness.

"I worry about some patients who, because of their conditions, don't do anything," Sanfield said "If it costs you the ability to do X, Y or Z, the disease is winning. If the condition takes away your ability to do a large percentage of what you would have done otherwise, then even if you don't die from it, it has compromised you a great deal."

Sanfield, a diabetes specialist, counsels his

patients about variables such as altitude, time zone changes, diet and, especially, the correlation between climate and transport of medications.

"If your medication is temperature-sensitive, carry a travel cooler," he advised. "If you're going

into the bushes of Africa, you could get into a situation where the extreme could occur. That extreme would be nature damaging the insulin. They (diabetics), in essence, wouldn't have their therapy."

It's equally important to use common sense when

choosing a destination. For example, if you're thinking of soaking up the rays at any of the world's sunniest beaches, it's wise to protect your skin.

"Medications can photosensitize you," Sanfield

"Medications can photosensitize you," Sanfield said. "When the sun hits the skin, the skin may burn like fire or itch like crazy. It can ruin the whole trip. We tell them to sun-block at little. It's common sense."

African safari

The time of year that you travel may make life on the road somewhat easier, advised Karen Jeppesen, a patient of Dr. Sanfield under treatment for Type I diabetes for seven years.

Rx Travel Tips

Here are some tips recommended by medical personnel to make your trip a happy one:

■ Be sure to carry your personal physician's phone and fax numbers plus an e-mail address if available wherever you travel.

■ Consult with a travel medicine specialist at your local hospital (sites listed below) and obtain contacts for reputable medical care while traveling abroad.

Carry a copy of current medical records, and recent discharge papers, as needed. Leave the originals at home.

■ Bring an extra written prescription for medications.

■ Pack extra supplies of medication and supplies in carry-on luggage. Include a list of telephone and fax numbers, plus e-mail addresses if available, of your physician, specialist, hospital and pharmacy.

■ Consider transport insurance to cover expenses in case an emergency trip home.
■ Carry drinking water.

"The only thing that stops me, even though I'm a diabetic, is me," she said. "The diabetes doesn't stop me from doing any thing. It's my own fear that stops me."

By the third trip, she had given up syringes and bottled insulin in favor of an insulin pump, which mechanically regulates dosage. She advises carrying an extra prescription and a letter from a physician while traveling for customs and other medical personnel who may give emergency treatment.

"Take extra supplies," she said. "Hand-carry them

"Take extra supplies," she said. "Hand-carry them at all times. During my second trip, I [broke] a bottle of insulin, so all I had was my back-up bottle. The tour guide contacted a doctor in South Africa, so I was able to get another bottle of insulin."

Also, consider working through dietary needs to complement dosage schedules and time, altitude and climate changes.

"When I was doing shots, I needed to eat at certain times," Jeppesen said. "I ordered a diabetic meal on the plane, and the airline made sure I ate first. They made arrangements to store the insulin on the plane ... We had a cooler on the tour bus that had snacks in it."

Eating on time

Jeppesen, who also travels to Europe — Ireland, Spain and Budapest — finds culinary differences among cultures not to be a problem. In Africa, her tour group dined on fruits, vegetables and game differed from what she ate at home. In Europe, she asked for sauces to be left off her meals, and restaurateurs offered fresh fruits for dessert when her condition was made known.

"One thing that would be a problem for someone who's on a shot regimen is the (European) dinner hour that's much later," she said. "In Spain, the restaurants don't even open until 9 o'clock."

Making her third 15-hour flight to Africa was even easier as Jeppesen wore an insulin pump.

"You're not as regimented as to the times you have to eat," she said. "An additional preparation I made when traveling with an insulin pump, because it is a newer device, was to make sure I had a phone number I could call for Mini-Med (the maker of the insulin pump)."

Physical exertion in varying terrain and altitudes may affect energy-level as well as how your body metabolizes medications.

"I had to stop and check periodically where my blood sugar was," said Jeppesen, who did a lot of walking and some rock climbing in Africa. "I didn't let it stop me from doing anything. It was easy to adjust my insulin ([when I wore the pump) for the additional activity, but I always carried glucose tablets in case I had low blood sugar. I could do anything that anyone else could do by taking precautions."

Discuss medication, vaccinations with your doctor

t's important to talk to your doctor about the effects of medication one might expect while traveling.

"Tagamet, Zantac and things that help to reduce acidity in the stomach, heartburn and peptic ulcer disease also decrease your host defense," said Dr. Rapheal Kiel, an infectious disease and travel medicine specialist at Oakwood Hospital.

"That's your ability to ward off infections from the things that you eat. So, if you're eating something that might be slightly contaminated with some bacteria, and you don't have the acidity in your stomach, you could be more prone to develop infections like salmonella. There are vaccinations that we can give for people who are reducing stomach acidity to heal an ulcer or to prevent reflux or heartburn."

Kiel emphasized making early consultation with

medical professionals when planning an extended trip.

"Vaccinations make take a couple of weeks to

take hold in the body," said Kiel. "It induces antibodies in the system, and the protection doesn't come immediately. It's important to see a doctor at least three weeks before a trip."

While it's rare, it's a good idea to check out whether a vaccination may have effects on an underlying, chronic illness.

"If they're allergic to something you're going to vaccinate them for, there could be a potential problem," Kiel said. "An egg allergy might cause a problem. Or, there's an oral typhoid vaccine to vaccinate against salmonella disease. These pills contain bacteria ... and if you're taking an antibiotic for something like a sinus infection and try to take this vaccine in oral form, the antibiotic actually kills the bacteria."

Jet lag

Counseling about jet lag and altitude and designing individual travel summaries are daily occurrences for Dr. Susan Knoll, who heads the International Travel Clinic at Botsford Hospital in Farmington.

"Jet lag is an important part of any discussion we

have with every patient because of the changes of west to east and east to west," she said. "We also provide a patient summary for every area to where they're traveling. It describes the exact altitudes they'll be climbing to and the risks to patients depending on their pulmonary status and their age. We see many people going to Nepal and discuss the use of masks, especially for the dusts that may be in the atmosphere, but also for altitude sickness and medication recommended for the treatment of this."

Knoll says the number one treatment for altitude sickness is to "come down."

"If you experiencing severe side effects from altitude, traveling to a lower altitude is important," she said. "Side effects are extremely variable. They can start with fatigue, nausea, vomiting, sleepiness and dizziness, but it can proceed into severe pulmonary or respiratory distress and mental status changes."

Don't be grounded by sickness. With a little advance planning, and help from your doctor, you'll be healthy enough to weather the unexpected.

Intacs change the way we see future eye treatments

Art Gresser couldn't believe his eyes when he looked out of the window a couple of days after outpatient surgery with Birmingham ophthalmologist Carl Clavenna, M.D.

"Yesterday I looked out my window to see what the weather was like, and I could read my neighbor's address," said Gresser, 29, on a recent Monday. "I've never been able to do that without

"Today, I'm looking at a clock about 30 feet away, and I can see it clear as day," he added in a telephone interview from Tri-County Title in Livonia, where he is an escrow officer. "Everybody is excited for me."

The change in Gresser's vision is due to a new form of surgical vision correction, in which plastic, crescent-shaped corneal ring segments, or Intacs, are

inserted into the eyes. The Intacs correct mild to moderate nearsightedness, a condition in which people can see close objects better than distant ones.

Intacs, explained Clavenna, of Clavenna Laser Eye Institute of Birmingham, are much like contact lenses, only they are inserted into the eye instead of over the eye. Once in the eye, Intacs cannot be seen or felt.

Intacs mechanically reshape the eye's cornea, which is the transparent tissue in front of the eyeball covering the iris and pupil, said Clavenna. Once inserted, the Intacs flatten the cornea, so that light rays are correctly focused on the retina.

Prior to the surgery, Gresser's vision was 20/200, which is legally blind. That means he had to be 20 feet away to see something that a normal eye can see at

A few days after the surgery, Gresser's vision was 20/30, and a week later, it was 20/15, according to Clavenna, who saw Gresser in follow-up appointments. Gresser's vision may even reach 20/10, said Clavenna of his patient.

"I have found that with Intacs, it just keeps getting better and better," said Clavenna. "Many people say the colors are more vibrant.

A new option

Intacs were approved by the Food and Drug Administration a year ago, a little after LASIK, the popular new treatment that improves vision through laser surgery.

Intacs differ from LASIK in that they can be surgically removed and so are

not permanent, as is LASIK. If removed, vision returns to what it was before the Intacs surgery. usually within a week, said

Clavenna, a Birmresident, ingham opted for Intacs last year to improve his own nearsightedness. He now has 20/10 vision, which is better than the 20/20 vision of the normal eye.

"At the time I did it, I was the only one doing this in Michigan, so I went to Kansas City to have it done," he said. Now there are probably "half a dozen at most," who do surgery in the state.

Clavenna offers LASIK, Intacs, eye glasses and contact lenses at his practice, and believes patients should "look at all the





options." But he does see Intacs becoming a more popular choice as more people find out about them.

Intacs also differ from LASIK in that they cannot correct farsightedness.

"We get great results for farsightedness with LASIK," said Clavenna, who believes LASIK will continue to be popular for both near- and far-sighted

TEMPORAL ARTERITIS


There is a condition rheumatologists treat, that on first appearance has nothing to do with muscles or joints. The condition is temporal arteritis and t is characterized by excruciating headaches, pain in the jaw, and the possibility of sudden blindness.

The cause of this condition is an inflammation of small arteries, the blindness associated with temporal arteritis occurs from occlusion of the artery to the retina of the eye. A hallmark of temporal arteritis is an enlarged and painful temporal artery, which is the blood essel often prominently seen at the side of the face near the temples. A biopsy of this artery often

reveals the underlying inflammation that identifies the condition. Treatment consists of high doses of steroids, beginning with 60 mgs of prednisone a day with

tapering of the dose requiring months. At times, temporal arteritis and polymyalgia rheumatica merge, that is the muscle aching of polymyalgia may be seen in temporal arteritis, and the onset of blindness to retinal artery closure can occur in a patient who otherwise appears to have polymyalgia rheumatica. Because of this overlap, rheumatologists often take responsibility for treating individuals with pure temporal

It is important to prescribe large doses of steroids as soon as the diagnosis is known. Such therapy will prevent blindness from occurring, and if is has already begun, steroids given quickly and in large doses may reverse damage already done

A DECAY PROBLEM FOR OLDER PATIENTS

While it is true that most adults are less susceptible to tooth decay than they were during their childhoods, they may be more prone to experience a kind of tooth decay known as cervical caries. Therapy helps the brain heal

Researches have shown for the first time in humans that rehabilitation therapy may help a stroke survivor's brain rewire itself, leading to regained use of a previously unused limb. The study appears in this month's Stroke: Journal of the American Heart Association.

"This result has been a goal in neuroscience for decades, and while it has been shown in animals, it's the first time it's been shown for humans," says one of the study's authors, Edward Taub, Ph.D., of the University of Alabama in Birmingham.

For decades it was believed that once brain cells died after a stroke, they were gone forever. Recent research is finding that the brain is much more "plastic" than previously thought. "Plasticity" refers to the brain's capability to rewire its circuitry to perform tasks it was previously incapable of doing due to severe injury.

This finding offers hope to researcher, who believe that it may be possible to stimulate or manipulate brain areas to take over the lost functions, a process known as cortical reorganiza-

Researches used a procedure called focal transcranial magnetic stimulation to map the activity of the cerebral cortex, the thin layer of gray substance covering the surface of each hemisphere of the brain. The cerebral cortex is involved in higher mental functions and in the production of general movement and behavioral reactions.

In particular, Taub and his colleagues monitored the area of the cortex that controls an important hand muscle, comparing the activity of the injured part of the brain with the unaf-

fected portion. They examined 13 stroke survivors - 10 men. three women – before and after a 12-day period of movement ther-

Treatment results

Before treatment, the area of the cerebral cortex controlling movements of the hand muscle was considerably smaller on the damaged side of the brain than on the non-affected side. After treatment, the size of the active area capable of generating movement in the damaged hemisphere was significantly enlarged, corresponding to a greatly improved motor performance of the hindered arm.

"These results show the potential for the improvement of impaired function after neurological injury by the use of appropriate techniques," says Taub. "This also opens the possibility of being able to produce this effect by other rehabilitation therapies or by pharmacological means.

In follow-up examinations up to six months after therapy, brain activity remained at a high level and the area of activity in the two hemispheres became almost identical. The improved motor function also continued over this period of time.

The treatment, called constraint-inducted movement therapy, involves restraining the arm less affected by the stroke for 90 percent of waking hours for two or three weeks. On the weekdays during the period, six hours of therapy are interspersed over seven hours, with one hour of rest. The effectiveness of this therapy, according to Taub, results from the fact that it requires the continual use of the affected extremity for many hours a day during a period of consecutive weeks.

One day before treatment, the patients scored an average of 2.2 on a test that tracked arm use in 20 common and important activities of daily living and an average of 3.7 one day after treatment. A score of 2 indicates slight use; 3, half as much use as before stroke; and 4, threefourths as much use as before

By the first day after treatment, there was 37.5 percent more activity in the damaged part of the brain than in the healthy part of the brain. This represented a near-doubling of the active area of the brain on the affected side.

According to Taub, the reorganization reflects either an increase in the excitability of neurons already involved in the development of affected hand movements, an increase in the amount of excitable tissue in the damaged hemisphere, or both.

Take precautions to have safe, healthy picnic lunch

Ants, bees and mosquitoes aren't the only bugs that can ruin your summer picnic. When planning an outdoor feast this Fourth of July holiday, take precautions to prevent bacteria such as E. coli and Salmonella from causing food-born illness.

"The key is to keep hot food hot and cold food cold," says registered dietitian Fay Fitzgerald, Heart Smart coordinator at the Henry Ford Heart and Vascular Institute."

Hot food should be kept at least 140°F either in a warmer or thermos. On the grill, chicken should be cooked until its juices run clear; red meat should be cooked until it is no longer pink.

As for cold food, place items in a cooler full of ice at least 40 degrees Fahrenheit or lower. Food such as meat, chicken, fish and eggs should remain in the cooler until you are ready

Before eating, it is a good idea to wash your hands or wipe them clean with premoistened towels with antibacterial hand soap added - especially if you handled raw meat before grilling," said Fitzger-ald. "Also, do not reuse a uten-

sil that has touched raw meat." Fitzgerald offers the following tips for a heart-healthy pic-

■ If grilling, choose low-fat meat or chicken breast and marinate to tenderize. Fish usually does not need to be marinated for tenderizing. However, low-fat fish may dry out unless brushed with a marinade or oil as it is cooked.

Salads such a potato or coleslaw should be prepared with low-fate or fat-free mayonnaise. This will trim 50-100 calories from each half-cup

■ Pack prepared cold sand-

wiches. Choose whole grain. breads, lean cuts of meat and cheese and spread with mustard, low-fat or nonfat mayonnaise. To keep the lettuce and tomatoes crisp, store them in a separate baggy and add when

■ Prepare Sloppy Joe filling and carry in a thermos. To serve, simply spoon onto whole grain buns.

■ Provide plenty of fluids, especially on a hot day. To prevent dehydration, drinks should not be alcoholic or caffeinated.

Watermelon makes a great dessert and provides lots of fluid. Other desserts that carry well are brownies and cookies.

No cost screenings available for women

Underinsured women can now receive the cancer screenings that may save their lives through a national program coordinated locally by the Barbara Ann Karmanos Cancer

No-cost mammograms and cervical cancer screenings are available to eligible women through the Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Program (BCCCP). The program is designed for women ages 40-64 with a low to moderate income and limited or no health insurance. It is estimated that 90,000 women in Wayne County qualify for this program; however, only 2,000-3,000 enroll in this program annually.

One in eight women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in her lifetime, and often the disease is not detected early enough to cure or control. An estimated 178,000 women in the United States were diagnosed with breast cancer in 1998, and

43,900 died of the disease.

Many women cite cost and lack of transportation as two reasons they do not receive annual screenings for breast and cervical cancer. Among these are The Detroit Medical Center, Garden City Hospital, Henry Ford Health System, Karmanos Cancer Institute, Oakwood Hospital, and St. John Health System.

Rosacea not so rosy for sufferers Datebook from page D5

NEW DATA

More than 13 million Americans over age 30 suffer from an embarrassing but treatable facial disorder called rosacea, and most of them do not know it. Now a new survey has found that this little-known acne-like condition also inflicts serious damage to people's personal lives.

"Rosacea has become especially widespread as the large baby boom generation enters the most susceptible age," said Dr. Jerome Z. Litt, assistant clinical professor of dermatology at Case Western Reserve University. "Without proper treatment, its effects on facial appearance usually become increasingly severe and can significantly interfere with one's self-image and social interactions."

Rosacea usually begins as a redness on the cheeks, nose, chin or forehead that comes and goes. Over time, the redness becomes ruddier and more persistent, and small

dilated blood vessels may appear.

Left untreated, bumps and pimples often develop, and in advanced cases the nose may become bumpy and swollen from excess tissue. This is the condition that gave comedian W.C. Fields his trademark bulbous nose. In some individuals, the eyes are also affected, appearing watery or bloodshot.

Emotionally effected

While the physical effects of rosacea are distressing enough, for many of its victims the psychological and social costs may be even worse.

In surveys of more than 1,900 rosacea patients by the National Rosacea Society, nearly 70 percent said the disorder had lowered their self-esteem, and 63 percent reported difficulty in establishing new relationships. Nearly 60 percent said they had experienced rude comments, stares and jokes, and more than 40 percent had even avoided or canceled social engagements because of their facial appearance.

effects of rosacea is early diagnosis and treatment," Dr. Litt said. "Because the initial symptoms can be mild, many people with rosacea think they simply have a temporary complexion problem and fail to realize that they have a chronic medical disorder that should be treated before it gets worse."

Fortunately, today rosacea can be effectively controlled with antibiotics and lifestyle changes to avoid factors that aggravate the condition. More than 90 percent of survey respondents said that compliance with long-term medical therapy prescribed by their dermatologists had reduced their symptoms, and 76 percent said this had also improved their emotional well-being.

Check out insurance coverage before travelling

Most health care providers always cover emergency care during travel. Yet, it's best to contact your provider's customer service representative to ask about riders, notification requirements and how to submit medical bills incurred while traveling.

Blue Care Network offers the Blue Connect program, an arrangement with "sister" Blue 'HMOs across the nation providing some "away-from-home" services to its chronically ill members traveling in the United

"We've found that most members with chronic conditions that require daily care are very coginizant that they should plan ahead of time when they travel," said Helen Stojic, spokesperson for Blue Care Network.

"We encourage them to call our customer service office, the same office they use for other health care questions, to find out about out-of-town services. Sometimes we can give them information right then and there to connect them with resources in other states. In some cases,

we can help them set up in advance a doctor's appointment

or a way to pick up oxygen." Prescriptions for covered drugs are available through any of thousands of pharmacies nationwide that accept the Blue Care Network identification card. Most will accept the card, and in rare cases, may ask you to pay

first and offer a receipt. International travelers are also covered in emergencies, but not necessarily in non-emergency cases. You'll pay for medical care upfront and then submit the bill to Blue Care Network. Dialysis or an oxygen refill are covered services, but you still must pay first and submit the

Traditional and PPO plans offer varied coverage. Contact your customer service representative at Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan.

Other HMO programs, such as HAP or Omnicare, have similar plans for domestic and international travel.

"HAP offers worldwide health

care coverage for medical emergencies and accidental injuries," said HAP spokesperson Denise Hardaway. "If there's an admission to a non-HAP-affiliated hospital, the individual or someone [he or she] designates must notify HAP within 48 hours [using] the phone number on the back of the HAP card."

To fill a prescription in Michigan, visit one of more than 1,700 HAP-affiliated pharmacies. Throughout the United States, HAP is affiliated with national pharmacy chains, such as K-Mart. Send bills for out-of-pocket prescription costs to Member Services Department, labeled with name, address and ID number for reimbursement. If you have a question about coverage while traveling, call toll-free (800) 422-4641 or log on to www.hapcorp.org and click on the Member Services link.



If they encounter any type of medical condition, we would cover it ... For those with chronic problems such as a patient on dialysis, we recommend they make arrangements beforehand to have a treatment done wherever they're visiting.

"First, they should consult with a physician before taking any type of trip to make sure medications are up-to-date. If they're asthmatic, they may want to let them know exactly where they're going. If the climate is different, they may want to recommend an inhaler or something they may normally not need in this area.'







Many people are living paycheck to paycheck and can not seem to save any money. They are caught in the renting rat-race. With no money saved, they believe owning a home is impossible. That just isn't true. There are many cre-

Selecting the proper hose

BY POPULAR M ECHANICS

The plumbing system in your new home is a lot like the electrical system. In both cases, you have a fixed array of supply conduits that deliver water and electricity to where it's needed most.

You only deal with the permanent terminals - outlet receptacles for electricity, and faucets and drains for water.

Sometimes, though, these fixed terminals are just not enough. When it comes to powering the circular saw in the backyard, you get an extension cord. When it comes to bringing water to the driveway for the Sunday car wash, you

Hoses are distinguished by their diameter, length and the material that they're made of.

If you're looking to quickly move a great deal of water, you want a hose with a large diameter. Watering the garden or spraying the kids on a hot afternoon, on the other hand, are easily handled with a smaller-capacity version you'll get a little more pressure while sacrificing some of the volume.

Typical garden and utility hose diameters range from one-half to three-quarters of an inch. As to length, you can buy a hose as short as 25 feet, or as long as 100 feet. Like the hose's diameter, its length affects the pressure at the end. There's no point in keeping 100 feet of hose coiled on the side of your house when your garden is only 10 feet away.

Where hoses really start to get different, though, is in their construction. For ease of handling, light weight and economy, most manufacturers offer a basic vinyl hose, usually reinforced with a radial cord.

Serious gardeners, though, look for the addition of rubber in their hose. Although rubber is heavier than vinyl and somewhat harder to handle, it contributes to increased burst strength, durability and longevity.

Composite reinforced rubber/ vinyl hoses make sense for frequent home use and models are available that are designed to withstand the abuse of com-

Joanne McCarthy, executive director of the Plymouth YMCA, explained that swimming safety and instruction lessons will be called off this summer if she doesn't hire someone "right awav.'

The instructors earn between \$8 and \$10.50 an hour. Minimum wage is \$5.15 an hour.

"The problem with swim instructors

is that the high school is no longer giving credit for swimming certification and the kids aren't taking the courses," McCarthy said.

The classes are given at backyard pools around the city and township, because the Plymouth YMCA doesn't have a pool. Residents donate the use of their pools for instruction and their children are given free lessons.

"We get to teach a group of children water safety and swim instruction in the environment they're in every day, their backyard pools," McCarthy said. "It's a win-win situation for every-

The Plymouth YMCA is also looking for sports instructors, as well as other

seasonal workers.

"If a person is thinking about being a teacher these jobs are real helpful to their career development," McCarthy said. "In the past, I've had kids come in as day camp counselors thinking they would be teachers and when they were done they said: 'Forget it." Livonia Civil Service Personnel Ana-

lyst Dave Beecher said seasonal jobs are usually filled quickly; however, the demand for lifeguards is always high. In fact, people applying for lifeguard

positions usually get an immediate interview, even if positions aren't open. To be a lifeguard in the city of Livo-

Let's define credibility

Q. A friend said that I didn't sound credible when talking about my experience. This probably isn't a big deal, but if it makes a difference, what can I do?

A. Actually, it is a big deal. Making yourself likeable AND credible are the two "must do" tasks in interviewing and sell-

Let's define our terms: Credibility is nothing more than being believed. People who present themselves credibly cause interviewers to accept them as who they purport to be. A credible person "feels" less risky. A believable candidate automatically fosters visions of a seamless employment fit.

When employers cannot articulate why they are inclined to pass on an applicant, it is often a credibility problem.

SEARCH

What makes a person credible? Congruency. People often talk about aspects of their experience that simply don't hang together logically. For example, one Production Manager supposedly had experience "running the entire shop floor." When asked if she had ever disciplined anyone, she indicated that those tasks typically fell to someone else. On the subject of scheduling overtime, she said the Materials Manager did it. Later, she spoke cheerfully about doing things of an accounting nature. The various piecesof her presentation did not create a whole picture.

Consistency. Candidates often contradict themselves in interviews and don't know it. One fellow stated that he had recently turned in record sales numbers. Later, after I loosened him up, he said he was coming under heavy

Lifeguard salaries start at \$6.50 an hour. "There's not a critical shortage, but we're always very pleased to get applicants," Beecher said.

People looking for other seasonal jobs, like planting, cutting grass and golf course jobs, usually start at \$9 an hour their first year with the city.

Those jobs fill quickly, because of the relatively high pay rate, Beecher said. Qualifications include being at least 18, having a valid drivers' license and maintaining a good driving record.

"We get a wide range of people applying for seasonal jobs," Beecher added.

"There's a lot of retirees and college students coming back home. We take applications on a first-come, first-serve basis. We do have applications on file so when a position opens up we send a handful of applications to the department to interview them."

Seasonal job applications are still being

accepted, because "it's always good to have a supply of applicants," Beecher said.

Anyone interested in lifeguard or seasonal jobs should apply at the Civil Service Department at Livonia City Hall. Lisa Blackburn, Westland assistant deputy director of Parks and Recreation, said she didn't have a hard time filling seasonal positions this year, either. Most of these employees enjoy working outside and return from year to year.

"We have a harder time filling the parttime positions on a regular basis," Blackburn said. "I think probably because we start at \$5.75 an hour and maybe that's not an adequate salary at this point of time. I have a lot of people who don't call me back, or as soon as they find out the salary they're not inter-

Blackburn said the city of Westland is especially looking for people 18 and older to work past 10 p.m. as cashiers and receptionists at the Bailey Center. Building supervisors earn \$7.50 an hour.

"It doesn't seem to be an acceptable rate, especially when there are big signs in McDonald's that say you can start at \$8 an hour. It's a tight job market," she added.

Saying it's a tight market is putting it mildly, according to Maura Campbell, director of media and public relations of the Michigan Department of Consumer and Industry Services.

"It's generally known, with record low unemployment, and a booming economy right now that teenagers have a choice about what kinds of jobs they want," Campbell said. "There's a bidding war for young labor and they can really afford to be more choosey. It's a good time for young people getting job employment and the employers have to compete with one another."

She also pointed to fast food restaurants that offer perks, like tuition packages; starting their salaries at more than \$2 higher than minimum wage; health benefits; and flexibility with working around sports activities and other commitments. "That wasn't the case a few years ago," she

said. "Unemployment (in Michigan) is less than 4 percent and it's been a record low for vears.

The national unemployment rate is 4.1 percent, according to a report released last month by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Buick Regal could be easy choice

his time, we drive the mid-size 2000 Buick Regal GS. Before we get into the driving impressions, let's take a look at why this model is situated in a "tough sell" zone from the word go, and how Buick's performance related marketing has helped solidify its popularity through the years.

Of all the categories in automobile land, "mid-size" is perhaps the most difficult to impact and, subsequently, stay successful in. Dominated by Ford Taurus, Toyota Camry, Honda Accord,

Chevy Malibu/Lumina and Nissan Maxima, mid-size car sales account for the largest piece of the auto sales pie. Car companies, meanwhile, must impact this segment positively to stay profitable, with many offering more than one mid-size car in a specific family.

Herein lies the concern. Auto builders whose legacies center on luxury and sophistication find the mid-size sale a bit more challenging. Examples include Cadillac (Catera), Mercury (Sable), Lincoln (LS), Olds (Intrigue), and Chrysler/Dodge





Buick's Regal is situated in this same "mid-size" class, and its larger platform heritage automatically delivers upscale buyers who walk into Buick dealerships with a larger car purchase already on their

Early on, Buick buyers were conditioned to fashionable thinking. From the spectacular Centurys, Specials, Limiteds and Roadmasters of the 1930s and 1940s to the Invictas, LeSabres, Electras, Skylarks & Wildcats of the 1950s and 1960s, the Buick name and discreet opulence have been synonymous.

Later, Riviera and Reatta joined the fray, helping evolve the Buick brand name in areas previously unexplored.

The "GS" nomenclature stands for "Gran Sport," first appearing in the high-performance era of 1965. That's when Buick, unknown for "hotrod" style speed and power, introduced its popular GS line to an unsuspecting erformance-minded Happy Days crowd of baby

boomers. Now, on to the present. Buick's reputation for quality built automobiles is still intact. Most recently, the J.D. Power Initial Quality Study (IQS) of 1999 IQS ranked Buick as the top domestic model, and then scored it second behind Jaguar while ranking 37 international marquees. That's some fine company.

The 2000 Regal GS, meanwhile, is a prime example of Buick's

overall abilities in car craftsmanship. Our bright white Regal drove very well, offering excellent performance when called on. The 3.8liter supercharged V6 puts out 240 horsepower and runs on premium-unleaded fuel.

It accelerates to 60-mph in about 6.8 seconds, offers fine interior appointments and the expected Buick quality build, which means perfect fit, no squeaks and that "solid" Buick feeling. The car handles better than average for its size (3,543 pounds on a 109.0-inch wheelbase) and takes corners with authority thanks to the GS stiffer Gran Touring suspension and P225/60R16 tires.

As for other GS notables, front passenger side and front air bags, traction control and a heavy-duty 4-speed automatic transmission are standard. The good looks fit the Century/Regal/LeSabre mold, as all three are not mistaken for anything but a Buick.

Since we spent so much of this column on the history of Buick, we'll condense the test drive to "very good." Priced at the higher end of mid-size offerings at \$27,540 delivered, the powerful GS returns EPA numbers of 18 city and 27 highway, with its final assembly taking place in Canada.

We like Buick Regal GS, just as the notable J.D. Power associates do. If you are shopping in this market, the Regal GS deserves an extra look and a test drive.
