

Getting drunken drivers off road a priority for St. Patrick's Day

In the days leading up to St. Patrick's Day, MADD has honored a Canton police officer for his efforts to nab intoxicated motorists and the Canton Police Department has continued its partnership with Wayne County to nab serious and repeat drunken drivers.

Canton officer Edward Johnson was honored Thursday at MADD's Annual Lifesavers Luncheon at the Burton Manor in Livonia.

The Lifesavers Luncheon (celebrates) police officers who are committed to making our roadways safer by removing and arresting drunken drivers in our communities," said luncheon sponsor Terry Cochran, attorney and senior partner of Cochran, Foley & Associates, PC, of Livonia.

Johnson, who was nominated by officials within the township department, was recognized along with dozens of other officers from Westland, Wayne, Plymouth, Livonia and Inkster.

With MADD traditionally honoring a township officer

each year, Canton Public Safety Director John Santomauro said the organization's acknowl-

edgement is appreciated. "Absolutely," he said. "Particularly with something as important as drunk driving enforcement."

With Monday's informal holiday known for alcohol indulgence, Canton has continued


its participation in "Operation Last Call," an initiative through the Wayne County Sheriff's Department designed to track down and arrest some of the area's most serious drunken

During phase one of the project, 40 officers from a collection of area law enforcement agencies, began looking for repeat and other dangerous drunken drivers that failed to appear in court or had violated parole or probation.

During a press conference Friday, Wayne County Sheriff Warren Evans said officials targeted nearly 200 people that have been charged with felony drunken driving, meaning they have been convicted of an alcohol related driving offense at least three times or have caused a serious injury accident while intoxicated.

"With one of the biggest drinking days of the year just around the corner, it is important that we take as many of these ticking time bombs as possible off the road before St. Patrick's Day celebrations begin," Evans said Friday.

Extra precautions key to preventing fires

For many, the brand-new overhead sprinkler system would have sufficed in the area of fire protection, but Esther Strommer needed something more.

Strommer of Northville is the office coordinator for the new H&R Block office on Michigan Avenue west of Canton Center Road. Having dealt with personal tragedies involving structural fires, including the death of her father in a house fire 30 years ago, Strommer said she wasn't content with the sprinkler system inside the new office, despite the fact that it met township standards.

"I wanted to take extra precautions for the employees," she said, referencing the two fire extinguishers she had installed in the front and rear of the office space.

John Oltman, a Canton Fire Department inspector, visited the seasonal business Thursday to offer a how-to session on using the extinguishers in the event of an emergency.

When mentioning the overhead system, Oltman praised Strommer for adding the extinguishers.

"It's great that you are going above and beyond," he said. "My job is to keep fires from happening so I enjoy this." In addition to tidbits regard-

Eric Bloom can't cure his wife's multiple sclerosis but he can ride his bicycle from California to Georgia in an effort to help fight the disease.







Sinking her teeth into a writing career

Local author's first book about vampires

There was never much doubt about what Dakota Rebel wanted to do with her life. Shortly after the age of 10, the native of Jackson, Mich. knew she wanted to grow up and be a writer.

"I just kinda always knew I was supposed to be a writer,"

Rebel has written prolifically since she was a little girl. Over the years, she has written hundreds of stories, including several longer manuscripts, which she jokes will never fall under anyone's eyes. But slowly, she has grown into a much more confident writer, completing novels and shopping them around to publishers.

Now at the age of 27, Rebel, who moved to Canton about 10 years ago, is on the verge of her dream -- being able to write for a living. Just a couple weeks ago her first book became available through an online publisher called Total-e-Bound Publishing.

The e-book, which can be downloaded from the Total-e-Bound Web site (www.totale-bound.com), is titled Sweet Dreams, and is about vampires, which you might says is one of Rebel's favorite subjects. In fact, just as there was never any doubt about her wanting to write for a living, Rebel never really had any doubt that she also wanted to write about vampires

The book is about protagonist Veronica Duff, a vampire hunter with the U.S. Army, whose mother was killed by a rogue pack of vampires years earlier. The story makes a turn when Duff starts having dreams about a sexy vampire who claims to be in love with her. She tries to convince herself he's not real and the dreams are harmless.

When a second vampire joins the dreams and threatens her life, she's forced to admit that they are both very real and very

dangerous. The story follows as she must figure out how to

eliminate both vampires. Unlike many mainstreams vampire stories, Sweet Dreams doesn't exactly fall into the horror genre. That's because the other main element of Rebel's stories, and especially this book, is eroticism. Rebel says the category most associated with her book is "graphic romance" or "erotic romance." The term she likes to use is "smut erotica." Her characters just happen to be vampires.

"I don't know. There's just something about them. They are romantic and dangerous. A perfect combination," says Rebel.

As one might guess, Dakota Rebel is just a pseudonym, and not her real name. That is something she would like to keep private -- her 9-year-old daughter goes to school in Canton and her boyfriend is a local school teacher. She would rather neither of them have to answer questions about the graphic nature of her stories (she has also several stories published in Total-e-Bound anthologies).

"My daughter knows that I write, and she knows she can't read it. She's not certain why, but that it's an adult book," Rebel says.

Rebel said the audience for her genre of book are women between the age of 18 and 50.

"There is a surprisingly broad group of women that enjoys

Rebel, who still has a day job, said she plans to stick with her publisher. She believes e-publishing could be the future of the industry. Plus, she is very happy with the company's editors, who she thinks have helped sharpen up her skills.

In fact, she is now writing more prolifically than ever, whipping out stories as fast as her fingers can type.


"One of the books I wrote in one day. If the idea is there and I can type fast enough, I can get it done quick," she said, noting Sweet Dreams took her about a week to write.

Rebel, who can often be found with her laptop computer typing away in the Rusty Nail (a longtime bar on Ford Road) has no doubt there will be more books in her future.

"The books are just flying out of me. I think I've found my niche," she said.

said. "Since Pat was diagnosed, I figured this would be a good way to raise funds to help her and anyone else."

According to the National MS Society, MS is a chronic, often disabling disease that attacks the central nervous system. The advancement and severity of the condition is unpredictable and varies by individual.

Bloom, who retired from Ford Motor Company in 2007, began his MS fund raising efforts in 2004 when he joined "Team Ford" and participated in his first Bike MS ride, which is organized through the MS society.

"I decided that this was what I was going to do to help," he said, adding that he's been in training for the 2,900-mile Fast America South venture for months.

Patricia Bloom, 51, said living with MS has been challenging but that she's grateful to be in remission.

"When I was first diagnosed, I was crying and angry and thinking 'Why me?' But I have gone on to accept it and learn everything I can about MS," she said, while recalling the



International investments should be 20 percent of portfolio

Dear Rick: I presently use a financial adviser and I am not sure he is doing a good. job. My accounts are down

substantially this year. My present portfolio has less than 5 percent in international investments. Do you think this is enough? I am a long-term,

moderate risk

It is not surprising that your accounts are down this year. The market — since last October — has been difficult and it's not surprising your account has taken a hit. Just because your account is lower than it was at the beginning of the year doesn't mean your adviser is doing a bad job.

However, I do believe your exposure in international investments is a little light.

We do not live in an American economy, we live in a world economy. Ford and General Motors, cross country borders like you and I cross city lines. In fact, last year General Motors sold more cars abroad than they did in the United States. Ford has more employees abroad than

they do here. We live in an ever-changing world and I believe for an investor to have a well-balanced and diversified portfolio, he or she must have a significant amount of international exposure. My recommendation is at least 20 percent in international investments. It is important to diversify into different asset classes, large companies, both growth and value; small companies, growth and value; international real estate and emerging market funds.

I cannot stress enough how important it is for investors to have well-balanced and diversified portfolios. This is a strategy that will be successful over the long run.

Dear Rick: I am a relatively new investor. My question to you is I just received a proxy statement from one of the mutual funds. My gut instinct is just to throw it away. What do you think?

I recognize that proxy statements can be confusing and seem somewhat meaningless, however, they are not. It is first important to understand why companies send out proxy statements. As a shareholder in a mutual fund you are a part owner of the fund. Because of that you have rights as to how that mutual fund is managed. Therefore,

when you receive a proxy statement it is seeking your vote on certain aspects of how the business of the mutual fund is handled. A proxy statement can be to approve the actions of the board of directors, to elect members of the board or even to raise fees. I believe that you can learn a lot about your mutual fund by reading the proxy statement.

For the average individual it is difficult to analyze and understand some of the issues that are being voted upon. However, one issue that is important to understand is whether the mutual fund company is trying to raise fees. My general view is that whenever a mutual fund company wants to raise fees the answer is no. Unless the mutual fund company can provide a compelling reason I will always vote against higher fees. Too many mutual fund companies want to raise fees in order to pad their pockets and not to improve the return to their investors.





Independent 'mad at both parties' challenges McCotter

Ted McAvoy is mad at both

major political parties. "I think they've failed the American people," he said. "We prop them up after they have failed. Political parties maintain their own agendas, not ours.'

That's why McAvoy is running as an independent in the contest for the 11th District Congressional seat. Incumbent Republican Thaddeus McCotter is seeking a fourth term. Former Novi City Manager Ed Kreiwall and Tom Spencer, a minister and Air Force veteran, are competing for the Democratic nomination.

McAvoy, 30, who works in private security, was inspired by the longshot run of Texas Congressman Ron Paul in the Republican presidential primaries. McAvoy saw Paul in a rally last October and became involved in his campaign.

"What he said made sense about our economy and our foreign policy," McAvoy. "What really set me in tone to get involved in politics was seeing so many young people there and they were as inspired as I was."

McAvov, who served in the U.S. Army, said he is opposed to the war in Iraq and McCotter's foreign policy positions.

"He supports our foreign policy, the war, maintaining our empire, deployments in Kosovo, Bosnia," McAvoy said. "When you see a man say it's OK to spend all these billions of dollars on people overseas, then turn around and oppose sCHIP. I didn't agree with everything in sCHIP but fundamentally I thought it was the right thing to do at this time in our history.

McCotter voted against expanding coverage when the state Children's Health Insurance Program came up for renewal last year.

McAvoy said he served in Kosovo during Bill Clinton's administration and said a short term mission there has stretched into years of

involvement.

"I think for many years we had global influence that was positive. We were viewed as positive," he said. "We've passed over the threshold where we are trying to force people to live how we want them to live. Once you do that you lose credibility and that's what we are doing in all these nations."

He said the United States would be better off providing an example to the world and helping countries in need. He said Cuba is an example of diplomatic failure.

"I don't think we should do anything to help the regime down there, but does anyone seriously think that if we had free trade, with our influence on their economy, that he (Fidel Castro) would have stayed in power all these years," he said.

McAvoy said he shares some of Ron Paul's libertarian views, but not all.

'With Ron Paul, I agree with what he says on the federal level. States should be deciding a lot of these issues themselves and shouldn't be dictated to by Washington." McAvoy said. "We have a few differences. I think the government has an obligation to educate. Children are our future. That's something I'll stand by forever.'

"I think a lot of these politicians who are saying your old jobs are gone and get a new one are wrong. That job was here for 70 years, why is it not here now," he said. "If we attack these unfair trade policies, it will come back."

He said raising taxes is not the answer, but he is opposed to making the Bush tax cuts permanent when they expire.

"It's unfair. The only way I would support a tax increase or decrease is if it's fair," he

"It's hard to say how you would vote or not because of the way legislation is written. In the current form, no, I wouldn't support it.'

On immigration, McAvoy said it is a pressing issue. He said he supports a program that would bring forward people to be documented and issued short-term work visas. He said he is opposed to allowing illegal aliens to become citizens, but he also opposes rounding up people and deporting them, which he said would be impractical.

On health care, McAvoy said he is opposed to a government health program but favors some government assistance to low-income families to pay for private health insurance.

McAvoy realizes his chances of being elected are slim.

He will be going door to door and he has a Web site. He has received some contributions.

"The real issue is that my issues that I feel we need to address will come forward and that Thaddeus McCotter will have to address them at some point, in an interview or perhaps we'll have a debate," he said.

"I would like to see him change on some of these, but I don't see that happening."



Wayne-Westland district investigates possible bond request

Wayne-Westland school officials will begin researching the possibility of a bond. proposal for next year after getting the go-ahead from the school board Monday evening to do due diligence.

The board resolution opens the door for **Superintendent Greg Baracy** to work with the district's architect, bond counsel, construction manager, technology designer and financial adviser in preparing an application for preliminary qualification to submit to the state Department of the Treasury.

"The district is in the position of having a window of opportunity to replace a small part of the bonded debt and restructuring the 1998 bonds," Baracy told the board. "This resolution would let us continue to conduct further inquiries and do due diligence. We could then come back with a proposal for replacement of the 1998 bond and the amount that fell off."

In question is .34 mill which will drop off this year as the amount needed to pay off the \$108 million bond decreases. The bond will be paid off by 2020, however, by refinancing that bond for a longer period of time and replacing the .34 mill, the district could issue a \$50 million bond at "almost no

cost to citizens," Baracy said. According to Baracy, the

impetus for the request comes from parents who have asked if the district can do more improvements at their schools. He added that air conditioning has been parents' No. 1 request.

"Many of our schools were built in the 1950s when air conditioning wasn't a priority," he said. "Air conditioning and parking are two issues we hear a lot about. Back then they didn't make parking lots for 400 cars."

Baracy added that initially a citizens committee had recommended \$250 million in projects, which was pared down to the \$108 million bond request.

"Significant things were eliminated and air conditioning was one of them," he said. "That was 10 years

"I remember being on the bond committee, we looked at the needs and found them overwhelming," said board President Skip Monit. "There were real basic things we needed to deal with, we couldn't go for the extras."

Baracy said it will take a year to prepare a bond proposal and the request will depend on residents.

"If we're going to do anything, we're going to have to do it ourselves," he said. "The state will not fund these kinds of capital projects. They have to be funded by the district."

We drive the customers in their own personal vehicles and park it in the driveway so they don't have the hassle of getting


a taxi ride home and then trying to find a ride back to the bar or restaurant the next day to get their car," said Cook, 49.

The Designate operates from 5 p.m. to 3 a.m., with Cook noting most of their business occurring from 9 p.m. to 3 a.m. All team members must have a chauffeur's license, participate in drug screenings and take Breathalyzer tests before

and after their shift. The cost of most runs is between \$40-\$60, according to Cook.

"Basically, the fee structure is about how much it would cost you to take a taxi cab home and a taxi ride back to your car the next day," Cook said. "We seem to see a marked increase in the number of runs in the Plymouth-Canton area."







The opinion of your article ("Don't misplace blame for bad news on taxes," Observer, March 6) that the voters are responsible for their property tax increases even though home values have gone down is not correct, misleading and does not tell the whole story because a few important facts have been left out:

1. Proposal A amended the Michigan Constitution to require that property is to be assessed at 50 percent of the usual selling price, known as True Cash Value.

2. Taxable value of a property can increase only if it is lower than assessed value.

These facts are confusing and your article just compounds the confusion. So let's clarify them in terms that people can understand. The people of Michigan should expect that their assessed property values are to be a reflection of actual sales prices from comparable neighborhood homes. So, based on the decline of actual home sales prices over the last two years, assessed values should have dropped to or below their taxable value.

When the taxable value is no longer greater than the assessed value, the inflation rate or 5 percent, whichever is lower, is not allowed to be applied. When the tax rate is not applied, the taxable value cannot be increased and your taxes should not go up.

This is what the voters approved and they expect our Legislators and assessing process to apply these rules fairly. But this is not happening. Assessments in past years have increased at much higher levels than what you can sell your house for and have not come down to actual sales levels as we have experienced in the last two years,

i.e., record drops in home prices and record levels of foreclosures.


The assessing process is further unfairly applied against the property owners in two additional ways: 1. Foreclosure home sales are omitted from the assessment process. Why? I don't know ... but I do know that foreclosures are a true indicator of home sales in my neighborhood and across Michigan. 2. The assessor will tell you that a new "2003 assessment book" is now being used to assess older homes as if they were built in 2003. I don't understand this either, but I do know that if my home was built in 1980 and I put a coat of paint on it ... my home is still 28 years old and not 5 years old.

WE voted for fair interpretation and implementation of Proposal A, but we are not getting what we voted for. This is not a "quirk of the state's tax system" that voters approved. Our state, county and local government have found ways to circumvent the intent of the Prop A and the voter, to apply unfair assessment practices to fuel their bloated out-of-control budgets.

If you don't believe this, consider the Plymouth Township trustees voting themselves an exorbitant raise when jobs are leaving the state and the community, young people are leaving the state to find jobs, income taxes increases are forced upon us by out of control irresponsible legislators, in addition to the record drop in home sales prices.

These outrageous salary increases and out-of-control spending are indicative of this state's fiscal dysfunction and drives the necessity for unfair creative tax increases. Voters did not inflict this property tax rip-off on themselves!.





The war continues

Post-traumatic stress disorder brings the horrors home

It's still difficult for Paul Chute to dredge up long-buried memories of fighting in Honduras and The Philippines with the U.S. Air Force in the 1980s. He has to pause to think about the time he was startled from sleep by the click of an M-16 as one of the men in his squad jumped up in the middle of the night after a python crawled into his bed.


"From that point on I started having flashbacks and very difficult issues, but didn't know it was PTSD (posttraumatic stress disorder) but knew something was wrong,' said Chute. "I was having a lot of trouble with sudden, loud noises. Smells started to send me into times of being in the jungle, that mildew smell, that wetness that is constant in the jungle."

It was the beginning of a long journey back for Chute who's since become a psychotherapist interested in helping other veterans. More and more military men and women are coming back from Iraq and Afghanistan with mental health issues. Chute would like to start a support group to help those suffering from

According to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, about 30 percent of men and women who served in Vietnam experience PTSD. Estimates for veterans returning from Afghanistan and Iraq with PTSD range up to 20 percent.

BACK IN JUNGLE


For Chute it wasn't until his return home to Garden City that another incident made it clear he was suffer-



ing from PTSD. He had been discharged from the service in early 1988 and was about to celebrate his first Fourth of July as a civilian at a fireworks display. The loud noises took him back to the jungle.

"My buddies tried to talk me out from underneath the car. After that I didn't do anything even though I needed help," said Chute. "I started drinking more. I worked at the post office carrying mail to pay the bills. Every night I was in the bar right after work. That kept it at bay. My first wife didn't notice because she was in law school. I didn't get professional help until I went to grad school in 1991 at University of Michigan. We were talking and learning about the mental health issues of PTSD."

Chute went through about five years of treatment, but found it difficult to talk to a therapist who wasn't a veteran.



"It's very trauma fixated, being able to put yourself back in the moment then processing the trauma," said Chute, who has a psychotherapy practice in Farmington Hills with his

wife, Ellen. "I know as a therapist that trauma become stored memories and we sever our basic ties. It's not something we call on every day until a significant trigger occurs like the fireworks for me.

"You have symptoms of sleeplessness, anxiety, depression, isolation/withdrawal. You just don't want to be around anybody. It's the most disconcerting feeling to reconnect in the civilian world. I felt so out of place coming back home to a very close group of friends I grew up with, just sitting with them and talking and almost feeling there's nothing in com-

Chute's seen patient after patient with the same symptoms. Some find relief in as little as six months, some take

as long as four years. "There was a certain hyper vigilance for me. For my patients now it is super hyper

vigilance, always on the edge," said Chute. "I see an intense withdrawal. To soothe that I'm also seeing substance abuse, a lot of drinking, lots of abuse of prescription meds."

The form of treatment Chute uses to help his patients is known as eye movement desensitization and reprocessing. EMDR was developed in 1987 by psychologist Francine Shapiro after she noticed eye movements could help reduce the recurrence of disturbing thoughts.

"It helped me," said Chute. "EMDR uses a series of lights in a synchronized movement, trying to promote a rapid eye movement in a conscious state When we REM in sleep that's the most deep state. With lights we're stimulating and reconnecting to these events, stored memories that need a trigger to reconnect to that in a safe, comfortable environment and

then process and work through it in a safe environment not necessarily to drudge those memories up or unknown incidents, but to unlock it."

Chute knows firsthand from working with patients that untreated PTSD can lead to divorce, substance abuse, intense withdrawal from society, anger, job loss or difficulty finding a job. But it's not always easy for a family to help a member suffering with PTSD. Chute suggests researching the disorder by Googling PTSD. The VA's National Center for PTSD Web site, (www.ncptsd. va.gov) is also a valuable source of information.

FAMILY INTERVENTION

"These guys do not just voluntarily come to treatment. There's some kind of family intervention that brings the individuals to treatment," said Chute. "It's not just men. In Iraq women are taking a very active role. PTSD could show itself immediately, but it can show itself five years from now, 10, 15, 25, 50. When I did my internship working with a Korean War POW at the VA in Ann Arbor, he had raised his kids. Everything seemed to be fine then his wife died and on the way home from the funeral he was in an accident. It took 12 policemen to subdue this man. It can mask itself."

Today Chute continues to do well but is still sensitive to very loud, sudden, shrill noises. He remains in recovery and is actively involved with Alcoholics Anonymous and is not afraid to discuss the disorder.

"PTSD is not something to be afraid of. It is a normal emotional reaction to something that was a very difficult part of your life and it's OK to get help," said Chute. "If I could get enough men or women I'd like to start a group, because the group process among your peers would be the most therapeutic."



Thank you for this letter. I appreciate the fact that you felt compelled to write and let me know your feelings on this subject. And I respect your opinion and have no

doubt that you have been a wonderful and loving parent. However, let me address the points that you have raised.

To begin, I agree that the successes that your children have made in life are a direct reflection of the kind of upbringing that they have experienced. If they were given a healthy dose of love, respect, and support then the odds of their personal success and

happiness are increased. I have no doubt that this was the case in your household. However, let's be clear, the love that you provided was the important factor and not the spankings that were administered.

As was discussed in last month's column, spanking, as a form of behavior management, is not all that effective as a means of promoting the positive qualities and traits that are essential to success and happiness. So, the happiness and success that your grown children enjoy can only be attributed to the support and guidance that were provided and not to the spankings that were given. I would guess that if they had never been spanked, they would have still turned out fine. On the other hand, if they were never given the positive time and interactions, their current lives would be much different.

Secondly, I do not agree with the notion that your children "needed" a spanking. I believe that the idea that needs to be promoted is that there are times in eve person's life in which they, child or adult, need guidance or correction. The forms of this corrective action are varied and are highly dependent on the situation as well as the individual. Logic dictates that such a corrective measure will be selected on the basis of its effectiveness as well as its potential costs. As we have discussed in past columns, spanking falls short for both these criteria. As such, can a spanking ever be truly necessary? Finally, I respect your opinion and do not believe that you have abused your children by spanking them. I believe that you have always done what you have felt was best for your children. This includes spanking. However, my point is that there are so many other forms of behavior modification available that are not associated with the same amount of potential for misuse or come equipped with such a plethora of hidden costs.

My daughter is in the sixth grade and refuses to get her ears pierced. She would rather wear clip-ons than get the real thing. I don't understand this. I have waited for years to take her to do this and feel disappointed each time she gets to the store and backs out at the last minute. I feel like a failure as a mother. What will it take for me to get her to do this? I feel that this is a developmental milestone that she is not reaching. Am I wrong?

Relax. Your daughter will get her ears pierced if and when she's ready and not one minute before. It is not so unusual for kids to resist something that they feel pressured about. And there is little doubt that your daughter feels pressured to get this procedure done.

Why is this so important to you? Why do you put so much time and effort into this matter? From your letter, it almost sounds as if you are using this as some sort of measurement of your parenting or your daughter's maturity (a developmental milestone?). If she gets her ears pierced then you both pass but if she doesn't ... then what?

My guess is that your daughter is a wonderful young woman with many talents and qualities. I suggest that you focus more on these and less on the trivial ones such as how many holes are poked into her earlobes.

However, her reluctance to get pierced needs to be addressed calmly and with respect. Many girls, and boys, are concerned with the amount and intensity of pain associated with ear piercing. Her fears need to be heard and respected. Her decision needs to be solicited and respected. In short, her ears her decision. Respect it.

St. Patrick's parade a half-century tradition

ichael Riordan was just a boy when his mother, Bridget, and father, Jeremiah, shared fond stories of her uncle Father Patrick O'Sullivan, the pastor who led a small parade through the neighborhood surrounding St. Monica Catholic Church on Heyden Street in 1956. The St. Patrick's Day celebration began with Mass and ended with a party in the parish hall.

"My parents came to America (from County Kerry) in the early 1950s. Ireland's booming now, but back then there was nothing," said Riordan of Plymouth. "They were the typical immigrant story. My father worked for the gas company. My mother was a domestic. Everything was church- and faith-centered. They marched around the church there. Parades weren't a big deal. In Ireland it was always a holv day of obligation. Back then the Irish went to their parish priest for needs. In the late '40s and early '50s they always had celebrations with nice invitations, the Irish at St. Monica's on the edge of the Brightmoor

The church's parade was just the beginning of St. Patrick's Day celebrations to come. Each year the crowds grew and by 1959 the United Irish Societies gathered together their clubs and organizations to build upon the tradition, which originated in Detroit in the 1800s but disappeared after the turn of the century. The UIS parade was held in Dearborn and then moved to Detroit. Marchers made their

Tinnitus refers to an auditory perception not directly produced by an external sound. While most of us are familiar with temporary ringing in our ears (usually after exposure to loud noise), tinnitus sufferers experience ringing, buzzing, whistling, or hissing that does not go away. It can range from high

pitch to low pitch, consist of multiple tones or sound like noise. Tinnitus may be constant, pulsed or intermittent. It may begin suddenly, or may come on gradually. It can be perceived in one ear,

Often, the underlying cause is damage to the sensory (hair) cells located in the cochlea of the inner ear, or to cells along the auditory nerve (which connects the inner ear to the brain). ASEPTIC NECROSIS "Aseptic necrosis" carries an ominous sound, but what the phrase means is that an occurrence "bone destruction."

Aseptic necrosis can happen to any joint, but appears most often in the hip or knee. The usually smooth head of the joint cracks turning the usually smooth motion of the joint into socket to a jagged and irregular encounter of bone to cartilage. You feel this change as pain in the groin when he hip is involved, and pain below the knee cap when the knee is affected

The cause of the bone destruction is a closing off of the small blood vessels that provide nutrition to nearby bone and cartilage. Without this nutrition the bone swells and then disintegrates. The blood vessels can occlude because of small bits of cholesterol that break off plaques in larger vessels. High doses of steroids by mouth swell fat cells surrounding the small blood vessels and compress the vessels. Medical conditions such as Lupus cause inflammation of the blood

In most cases of aseptic necrosis none of these causes are present, and your doctor is unable to explain why the condition has occurred. Treatment of aseptic necrosis ranges from watchful waiting to artificial replace

involved knee or joint. In selected cases of aseptic necrosis of the hip, removal of a core of bone eves pressure on blood vessels sufficiently to allow adequate blood to save the joint


