Father sentenced to life in prison for baby's death

A Westland man was sentenced to life in prison Monday for killing his infant son in December 2011.
Antonio Pepalonia Brandon, 23, was sentenced Monday by Wayne County Circuil Judge Wayne County Circuil Judge at the trial that resulted in ed at the trial that resulted in ed at the trial that resulted in counts of felony child abuse. Brandon was convicted of killing his son Kayden Stranging Kayden's twin brother Cameron.
